### HOW TO BEGIN CLASSES

With FREE introductory classes for all new students, in any level class, we offer year-round training for a wide range of ages and abilities. Special attention is given to individual development, with an emphasis on correct and practical use of the anatomy. All classes are limited in size to assure progress for each student. All new visitors to class receive a free class before committing to registration. No actual dancewear needs to be purchased for the free class. Shorts and a top are fine!

Ballet: Bare feet (so we can check your toes)

Tap: A pair of hard-soled shoes (no black bottom shoes -

they mark the floor)

Jazz: Thin-soled sneakers, like a US Ked

The complimentary class serves a three-fold purpose:

- The faculty can accurately evaluate coordination and other physical skills, in order to place the student in the most appropriate class, beneficial to developing the student's full potential.
- The student and/or parent have the opportunity to see the studio, meet the faculty and generally "inspect" our program for themselves.
- The student can then determine if he or she enjoys the class enough to participate further.

Once the free class has been taken, simply fill out the registration card and be sure that the back side with the release form has been signed. Be sure that you have been given a copy of the Code of Conduct. Once the registration is paid and the class has been selected with the help of the evaluating faculty member, you may begin class on a regular basis.

# NECESSARY DANCE EQUIPMENT

Ballet: Boys: Black full-length seamed tights (and/or jazz pants), black ballet shoes, white t-shirt. Leg warmers optional.

Girls: Full-length pink seamed tights, pink ballet slippers, black leotard, pink leg warmers (optional). Pointe shoes are personally fitted by the director at the dance shop. Black chiffon skirts (optional) are sold at our front desk.

Jazz: Boys: Jazz pants, t-shirt, white seamless soft-soled jazz oxfords.


Girls: Leotard & tights any color, white seamless soft-soled jazz oxfords. (Beginners in jazz may wear sneakers or ballet slippers. Leg warmers are optional for all jazz dancers.)

Tap: Boys: Jazz pants, tap shoes, white t-shirt.

Girls: Leotard & tights any color, tap shoes. (No leg warmers in tap - the instructor can't see and hear feet adequately.)

### POINTE SHOES

pointe work is reserved for dancers willing and ready to devote daily practice and a minimum of twice-weekly classes as well as year-round study. Only dancers who are strongly trained and who pass a brief technical exam will be considered for pointe work. All dancers interested in pointe must study the pamphlet provided by the studio, Why can't I go on my toes? (This pamphlet is available to anyone, and is also helpful for parents and younger dancers.)




### POLICIES

We observe, along with our Code of Conduct, the following studio policies:

- All class fees must be paid in advance, on or before the first class of each month. There is a \$2.00 per week late fee applied to all late accounts - no exceptions.
- All classes are charged for, and dancers should plan to attend extra classes in advance of legal holidays or vacations.
- All classes must be made up within six weeks of absence in any class on the master schedule. The only exception to this is a sudden or prolonged illness.
- Classes are for dancers only. Observation of classes may be made through the viewing windows at any time, in a constructive and encouraging manner, but no one is permitted in the studios, except by invitation of the instructor.

We assure everyone of a happy and friendly atmosphere in class. Faculty and staff strive for organized, structured class syllabus, with an emphasis on the JOY of movement. The studio reserves the right to dismiss anyone they feel is not able to work adequately with the class or members of the staff and faculty. This right is reserved so that everyone enrolled may have the maximum benefit of the training available to them.


### PERFORMANCES

Opportunity is available to everyone enrolled in classes, on any level of study. Performance is not required, it is optional.



Annual Performances include everyone. These are considered concerts, not "dance recitals." Production pieces are learned during class periods. All dancers are provided cassette tapes of their music for individual home practice, and attend only one major studio dress rehearsal and one stage dress rehearsal.

At Christmas time, we produce two holiday concerts. And the full-length *Story Ballet* in the spring features the more advanced dancers with younger students in the minor roles. More advanced dancers also have the opportunity to audition for and to perform on tour with the Jazz North Dance Company.









### ACHIEVEMENTS






