CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I-NAME

This organization shall be known as The Activity Club.

ARTICLE II-PURPOSE

The purpose of this club shall be to assist the children of the Worth-ington schools in social development and to co-operate with the school officials in efforts toward vocational guidance.

ARTICLE TII-MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE IV-DUES

The annual dues of both active and in-active members shall be \$1.00, payable in September. All members whose dues are unpaid at the close of the December meeting shall them be notified by the treasurer. Members failing to pay dues for any current year shall be dropped from the list.

ARTICLE V-OFFICERS AND DUTIES

The officers of this club shall be a President, Vice-president, Secretary and Treasurer. These officers shall perform the usual functions of their respective offices.

The president shall preside at all the meetings.

The vice-president shall preside in the absence of the president and shall serve as chairman of the program committee.

The Secretary shall keep complete record of all regular meetings.

The Treasurer shall keep a complete record of all receipts and expenditures and present a report at each regular meeting.

ARTICLE VI-ELECTIONS

Section I- At the April meeting of the election year, the nominating committee, appointed by the president at the March meeting, shall present a list of candidates for the offices to be filled.

Section II- A majority of those voting shall elect.

Section III- The official term of office shall be for two years.
