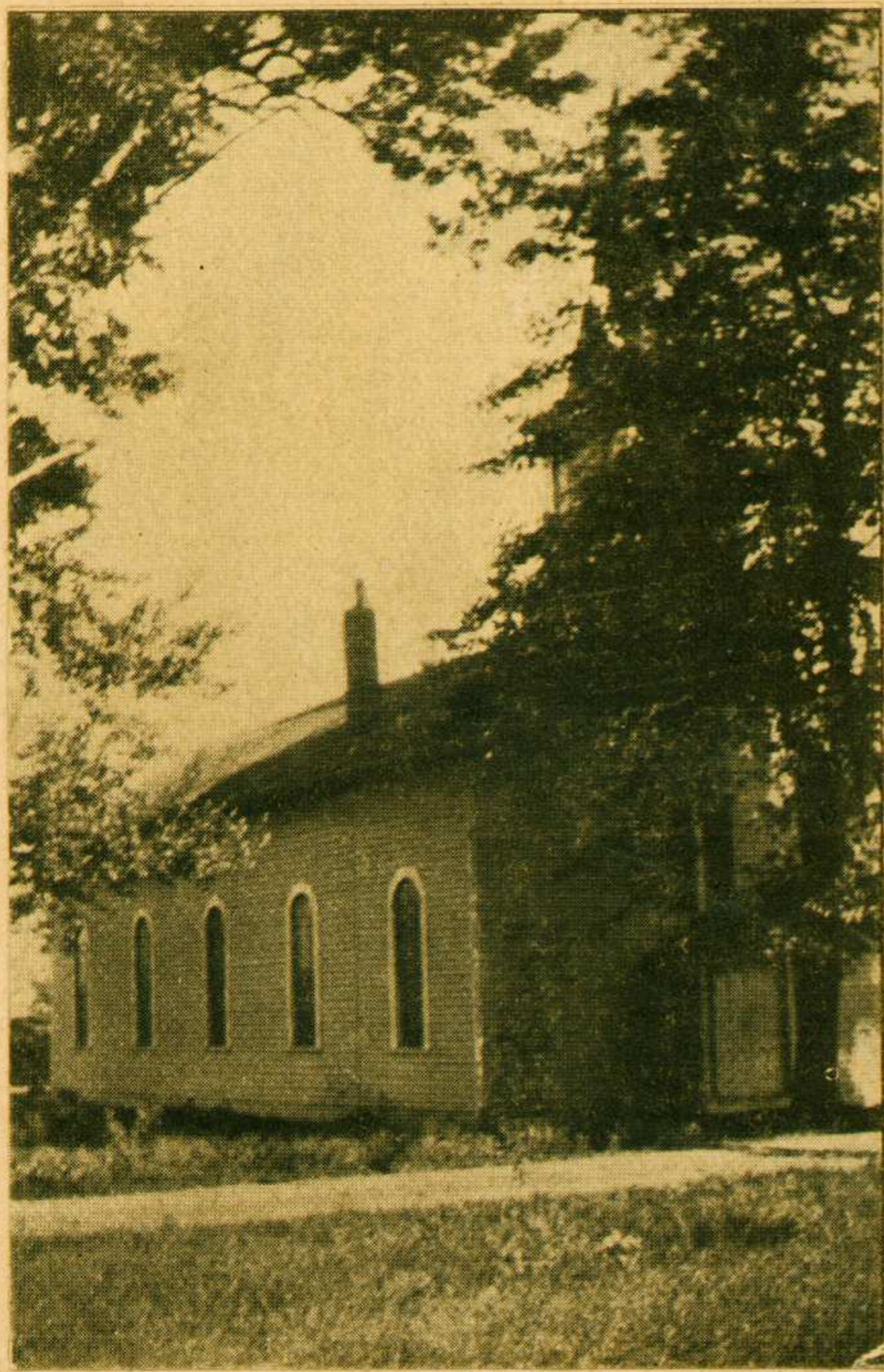

HISTORICAL FACTS

The first record of this church was dated June 18th, 1816.

Work on the present building was started in the year of 1829. It was opened for the first service April 17th, 1830.

The Building was remodeled in the year 1842.

Plans are now being prepared for a new building. The amount in the building fund at present is \$2045.76.

The longest pastorate was that of Dr. H. P. Mac Adam, 1894-1905.

The venerable Dr. James Hoge, at one time moderator of the General Assembly, a father and founder of Presbyterianism in the central west regularly supplied this church during the year 1857.
