ADULT CIRCULATION DEPARTMENT Borrowing Periods:

7 days: Most current fiction; titles in demand, 8m.m. films, phonograph records, periodicals and pamphlets.

28 days: All books not marked 7 days (this includes the majority of the collection); art prints; and pamphlets.

Earphone installations available in the record nook for listening.

YOUNG ADULT SECTION

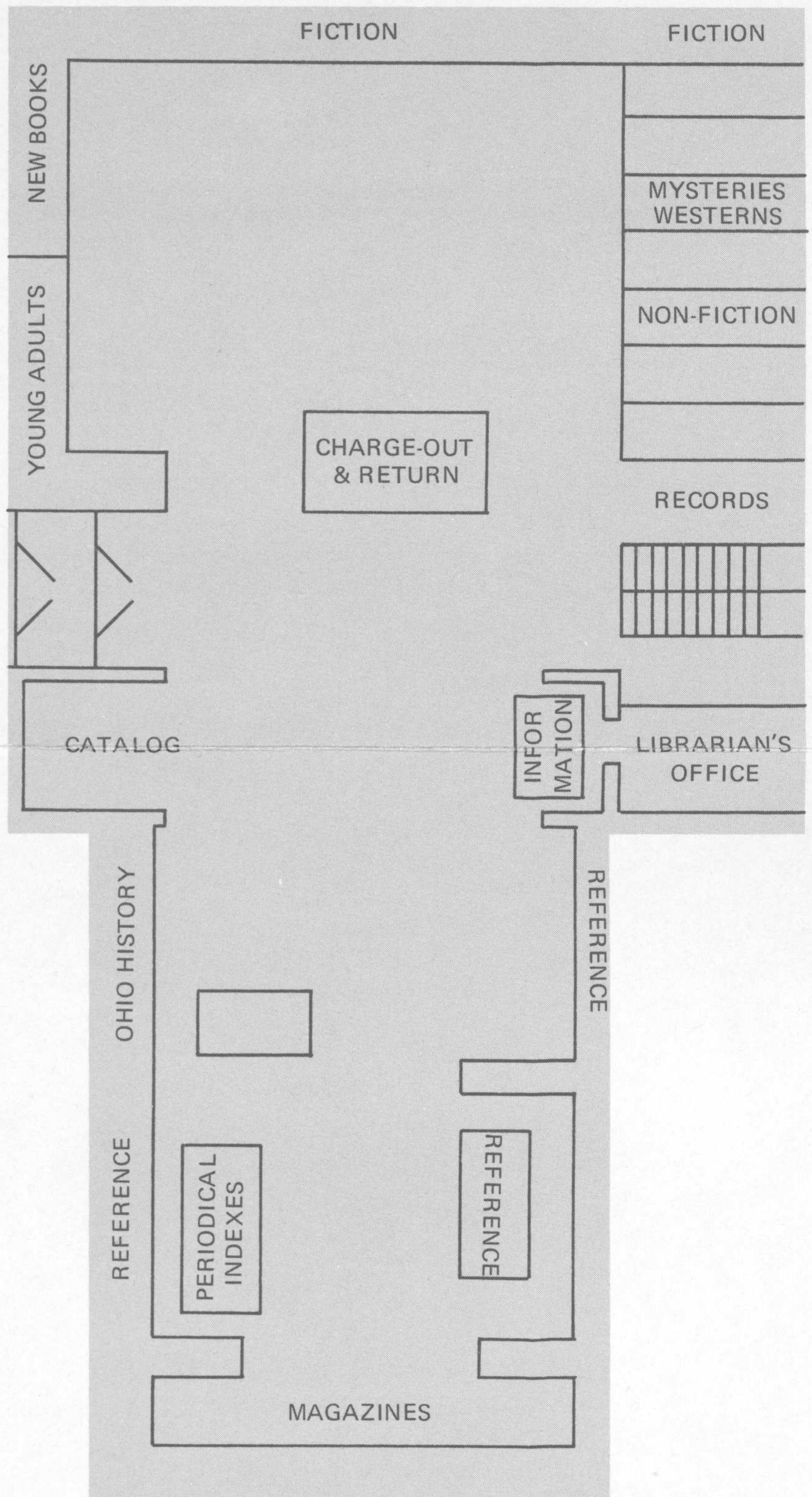
Recreational reading, magazine browsing, college catalogs, assistance in choice of books.

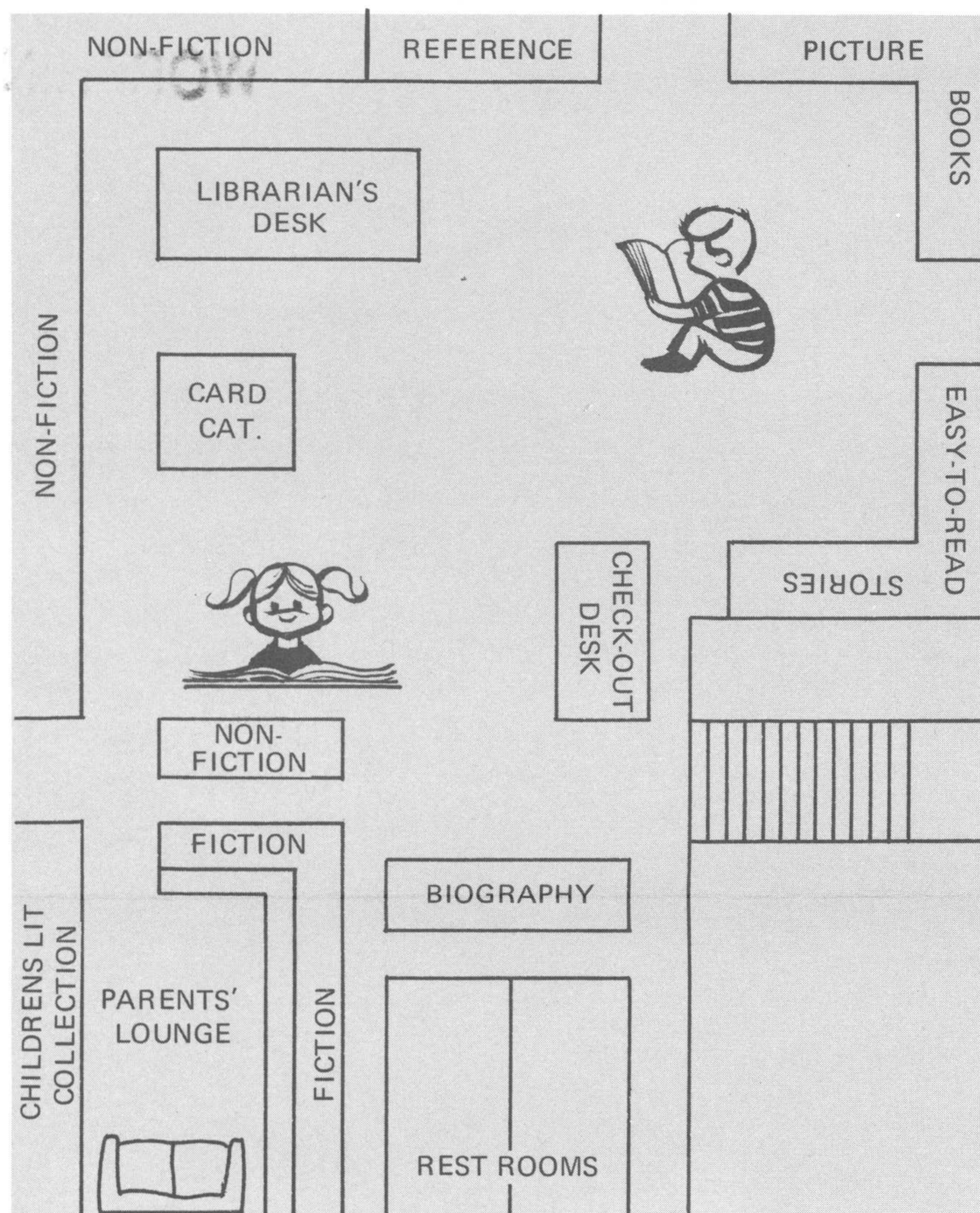
INFORMATION DESK

Issues library borrowers' cards, arranges inter-library loans, accepts requests for reserving books, and for back issues of magazines.

REFERENCE DEPARTMENT

Trained librarians will help you to find information. Available for use in the library are encyclopedias; general and specialized dictionaries; indexes and yearbooks; the Readers Guide to Periodical Literature; and financial services such as Value Line and Standard and Poor's. A coin-operated copying machine is available. Older editions of encyclopedias, located on the second floor, are available for circulation.





CHILDREN'S DEPARTMENT — Lower floor

The Children's Room contains a wide selection of both recreational and informational materials for children through the 6th grade. A trained children's librarian is on the staff to assist. A year-round program of story hours, film programs and reading clubs is conducted — just inquire for a schedule.

The Parents' Lounge provides a quiet and comfortable alcove, where adults may browse through materials that will be helpful in educating and understanding children. The collection includes a complete set of the Newbery and Caldecott Award books, magazines, and books on child behavior, crafts and story-telling.

ABOUT THE LIBRARY —

The Worthington Public Library and all public libraries in Franklin County are supported by the Intangibles Tax levied on dividend earnings, funds from which are distributed by the Franklin County Budget Commission. Any resident of Franklin County may borrow at any public library in the county, including the Columbus Public Library and its branches. Cooperative plans among Franklin County libraries are moving forward, to assure residents the best possible library service.

Since it is chartered as a School District Library, the Worthington Public Library is governed by a Board of Trustees appointed by the Worthington Board of Education. These Trustees appoint the Librarian, who administers the Library. The seven Trustees are residents of the School District and are appointed, one at the beginning of each year, for a seven-year term.
