SAM MILLIRON introduced ELLEN STUKENBERG from the WORTHINGTON RESOURCE CENTER. Ellen has been instrumental in the development of the Worthington Resource Center. The purpose of the Center is to use human resources where needed in the community and to coordinate the needs with the resources. They are located on the second floor of the parish house at St. John's Church on the Village Green. They started three years ago. Because of the growth of the north area they recognized a need. The group felt in spite of the metropolitan area there was still a feeling of community and people



needed somewhere to belong. It was their purpose to be a catalyst to help other organizations and people to get together to serve the community. They do this in three ways: 1) through an information and referral center in which they, either by personal or by telephone, answer questions in the areas of education, cultural and recreational services for children, youth, and older people; 2) a volunteer clearing house which matches area volunteer needs with persons interested [continued under "Middle Column" below]

[continued from Left Column above] in giving their time and talent to help others. They are also part of the Volunteer Action Program which gives them a reciprocal arrangement with other volunteering agencies; 3) they provide services which have not been available before. An example of this is the Worthington Community Counseling Service which has now become independent from the Worthington Resource Center. Still operating under the "umbrella" of the Resource Center is the Youth Employment Service which matches young people seeking after school and part time employment with various business firms and individuals who have jobs to be done. They are also a branch office for the Selective Service System. They have developed a Parent Support Program. Parent Support is a group of parents having a common interest in children who have some learning disabilities. The purpose of the program is to provide mutual emotional support, exchange ideas, and share other pertinent experiences and to promote understanding of their shared problems. This program grew out of a program called "Ground Floor", which is for newcomers who come to Worthington and the north area. They have served over 200 families.
