## CONSTITUTION

### ARTICLE I-NAME

This organization shall be known as The Activity Club.

### ARTICLE II-PURPOSE

The purpose of this club shall be to assist the children of the Worthington schools in social developement and to co-operate with the school officials in efforts toward vocational guidance.

### ARTICLE III-MEMBERSHIP

Section I- Active membership shall be limited to thirty members. No member may miss over three consecutive meetings without a legitimate excuse and remain on the active list.

Section II-Membership in this club shall be obtained by a majority vote of the active members. The name of a prospective member together with the names of the two active members sponsoring her shall be submitted to the membership chairman on forms provided for that purpose. This may be done at any time. After September first the names



received by the chairman during the year shall be prepared by the membership committee for presentation to the active membership a month in advance of the election of new members which shall take place by ballot at the October meeting. A person receiving the majority on any ballot shall be considered elected and her name eliminated from successive ballots, and balloting continued until vacancies are filled. Three tellers shall be appointed by the president to count the ballots.

Section III-All membership, both active and in-active, must signify in writing, by or at the May meeting, the membership status they wish to maintain for the ensuing year.

Section IV-Upon written request to the membership chairman, a member may be put on the in-active list.

Section V-In-active members who desire to become active shall have first chance at any vacancies on the active list.

Section VI- Resignation from the club shall be in writing to the membership chairman.



#### ARTICLE IV-DUES

The annual dues of both active and in-active members shall be \$1.00, payable in September. All members whose dues are unpaid at the close of the December meeting shall then be notified by the treasurer. Members failing to pay dues for any current year shall be dropped from the list.

#### ARTICLE V-OFFICERS AND DUTIES

The officers of this club shall be President, Vice-president, Secretary and Treasurer. These officers shall perform the usual functions of their respective offices.

The president shall preside at all the meetings.

The Vice-president shall preside in the absence of the president and shall serve as chairman of the program committee.

The Secretary shall keep complete records of all regular meetings. She shall also take care of all correspondence.



The Treasurer shall keep a complete record of all receipts and expenditures and present a report at each regular meeting.

## ARTICLE VI-ELECTIONS

Section I At the April meeting of the election year, the nominating committee, appointed by the president at the March meeting, shall present a list of candidates for the offices to be filled.

Section II A majority of those voting shall elect.

Section III The official term of office shall be for two years.

Section IV New officers shall take office at the May meeting.

## ARTICLE VII-MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held on the fourth Monday of the month. Three members shall be hostesses at each of the meetings. One member to furnish the home, the other two assistances are to furnish light refreshments.

Section III The list of hostesses shall be made up at the May meeting.



## ARTICLE VIII-AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be ammended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the membership, provided that the proposed amendment has been read at the previous meeting.



## HISTORY

The Personality Club was organized in the summer of 1937, by Mrs Mariam Mackay. It was because Mrs. Mackay saw a great need for an organization of persons who were interested in youth, their social and personal problems, that she herself, sponsored by the Worthington P.T.A., called a meeting at the Worthington Library and presented her ideas to a small group of women.

Among Mrs. Mackay's many proposals one of the first attempted, was the remodeling of formals for girls who were in need of them. There was always a demand by girls for guidance concerning proper dress, manners and hostess etiquette. These demands were fulfilled by the best authority obtainable within the club's means.

One of the first projects was a style show. Other interesting projects such as; talks on manners and charm, also several teas where the girls themselves served as hostesses, were well received.

As the boys became interested, they were also included in the programs.



Later, because of the broadening interest of both students and club members, the club was reorganized and it was then renamed "THE ACTIVITY CLUB."

Membership has grown from a few to our present membership of thirty active members. Due to the capacity of most of the homes, the membership remains limited to thirty actives, who still meet once each month.

With complete co-operation of the school administration (we are not a school organization) and all their departments, the club has been able to present many worth while projects. To mention a few of the out-standing ones are: the social dancing classes for all boys and girls from the fourth grade to the twelfth. This always is high lighted by the annual Christmas parties and the dances at the conclusion of the lessons.

In the spring our teas honoring the Senior class, as well as Open House for the Seniors and their parents after Commencement, have been a fine success.

When funds are available they are used to purchase records, radios and various useful equipment for any department



in need. This is done upon request, recommendation or suggestion from the school administration.

Vocational Guidance, Scholarships and advice on every day living are still of utmost importance to the students and club members.

At the present time there are still three charter members who are active in the club. They are: Mrs. H.C. McCord, Mrs Lester Griffith and Mrs. Ellis Halley.

These past fifteen years have been fruitful ones, rich in experience and service.
