GLIMPSES OF THE HOURS WELL SPENT.

February Meeting: At the residence of Williams', Andrew Pereny gave us some history on pottery displayed a number of pieces and explained the various types to be used in particular flower arrangements.

March Meeting: At the residence of the Insley's, a garden clinic, Harry O'Brien with a deluge of seed and flower catalogs told us about the introduction of new flowers and answered many questions about what to plant for the coming season.

April Meeting: Due to the Extension Department of Agriculture holding a garden school at the Ohio State University in the Horticultural Building, members were invited to go there.

May Meeting: at the residence of the Waugh's, Prof. Bradfield of Worthington talked on the soil in the vicinity of Worthington, this was very interesting and beneficial.

Special: The Garden Center at the Gallery of Fine Arts sponsored a special program of flower arrangements for the month of May, our Worthington Club furnished the arrangements of flowering shrubs for one week.

June Meeting: In the parlor of the Methodist Church, Mrs. G. G. Thornburg of Grandview gave pointers on the arrangement of flowers for displaying, this was very appropriate at this time as the Garden Club Council flower show was to be held at the end of the next week.

June Special: Mrs. W. D. Williams was appointed Chairman of the Worthington Garden Club table of flower arrangements. Nine Garden Clubs of Franklin County were assigned particular shades to make up a large table display in the rotunda of the Museum, a new feature presentation for this year's show. Worthington was assigned colors in tones of orange to which was strictly adhered. The table was covered with black velvet the contour elevated to form a background, pottery was of ivory and blue. Flowers were of several kinds orange lillies at the back with orange California poppies predominating. To the front and center of the table was a large ivory platter filled with poppies and two ivory candlesticks with orange candles. Comments have never ceased on the remarkable attractiveness of this display and the club is certainly proud of the work of this committee.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I — NAME

The name of this organization shall be—"The Worthington Garden Club."

ARTICLE II — OBJECT

The object of this Club shall be;

To encourage a love for growing plants,

To develop an appreciation of garden design,

To promote village pride in constructive planning and planting,

To aid all State conservation and creation of beauty.

ARTICLE III — OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this Club shall be: A President, A Vice-President, and a Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. The President shall preside at all meetings of this Club and of the Executive Committee, and shall be "ex-officio" member of all committees.

Section 3. The Vice-President shall perform all duties of the President in her absence.

Section 4. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Club; shall keep a list of all members; shall conduct all correspondence, and issue all notices of meetings. Shall collect, hold and pay out the funds of the Club as directed by vote; shall keep accurate books of account which shall be, at all times, open to inspection, and issue receipts for all dues paid.

ARTICLE IV — COMMITTEES

Section 1. The affairs of this Club shall be managed by an Executive Committee, consisting of the officers of the Club, with three others, appointed by the President at the first meeting following the Annual Election. The latter three to be the chairmen of the standing committees.

Section 2. A nominating Committee (of three) shall be appointed by the President at the meeting preceding the Annual Meeting, to present names of candidates for balloting at the Annual Meeting.

Section 3. A Membership Committee (of three) shall be appointed by the President at the first meeting following the Annual Meeting. This committee shall work for the up building of the membership, soliciting new members who are interested in the purposes of the Club. It shall recommend these candidates to the Executive Committee for further action.

Section 4. A Program Committee (of three) shall be appointed by the President at the first meeting following the Annual Meeting, to assign topics for discussion by members at ensuing meetings; to arrange for talks or lectures by invited speakers, and to plan Garden Tours, etc.

Section 5. A Civic Committee (of three) shall be appointed by the President at the first meeting following the annual meeting, to co-operate with the village officials on affairs which are of interest to the club, also introduce projects for village improvement. The Executive Committee may create any other Committees and determine their duties, and these may then be appointed by the President.

ARTICLE V — MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. A membership shall include all members of the family at one residence. All names for membership shall be presented in writing to the chairman of Membership Committee, together with the name of members proposing the name, and shall be voted upon by the Executive Committee.

Section 2. The Chairman of Membership Committee shall inform all members of their election.

Section 3. All members shall perform such duties as are assigned.

ARTICLE VI — DUES

Section 1. Dues of this club shall be one dollar (\$1.00) per year per family, payable at the October meeting.

Section 2. Members admitted in mid-year or after, shall pay one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) the yearly dues.

Section 3. All dues shall be paid within one month of date of Election for new members, and within one month of the October Meeting for other members—or membership shall be terminated.

ARTICLE VII — MEETINGS

Section 1. The Annual Meeting shall be in October, and officers shall then be elected for the ensuing year; these officers shall assume their duties January 1st.

ARTICLE VIII — QUORUM

Seven members of this Club shall constitute a quorum for transaction of business.

ARTICLE IX — AMENDMENTS

Section 1. This Constitution may be amended at any meetings, provided such amendment has been presented for discussion at previous meetings—or

Section 2. This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, but such amendment may be vetoed by a two-thirds vote of the registered membership.
