ARTISTIC DIVISION

SECTION A — THE ARTISTS — AWARD OF CREATIVITY — Design must consist of some fresh plant material. Painted materials allowed. Accessories permitted. (To be staged in a niche 30" x 40" x 14") Advanced registration by July 30 — Mrs. Frank Warner, 885-8186 or Mrs. Thomas Bickley, 888-4534.

CLASS

1. RENOIR — "An absorbing interest in the human figure and a joy in the use of color and rhythm."
2. VAN GOGH — "Use of color and texture to express concentrated emotional intensity."
3. PICASSO — "Angular lines and inter-locking planes used in a spirit of swift improvisation — to achieve order by confusion."
4. MONDRIAN — "Asymmetrical balance of lines, areas and color — lines are a balance of vertical and horizontal with no curve and no diagonal."

SECTION B — THE ARTISTS MEDIUM — ARTISTIC AWARD — Design must consist of some fresh plant material. Painted materials allowed. Accessories not permitted.

CLASS

5. WATERCOLOR — Using water as part of the design.
6. ACRYLICS — Incorporating plastic in the design.
7. OILS — Design with texture dominant.
8. PEN & INK — Black & White arrangement.

SECTION C — THE ARTISTS SUBJECT — TRI-COLOR AWARD — Design must consist of all fresh plant material. Accessories not permitted.

CLASS

9. LANDSCAPE — An all green arrangement.
10. STILL LIFE — An arrangement in an antique container.
11. PORTRAITS — An arrangement of foliage featuring a single flower.
12. SEASCAPE — An arrangement showing motion.

SECTION D — INFLUENCES ON ART — TABLES — For sponsoring clubs only. Advanced registration by July 30 — Mrs. Frank Warner, 885-8186 or Mrs. Thomas Bickley, 888-4534. Staged on a 40" round card table. Cloth should extend to the floor. Fresh plant material must predominate. Accessories permitted.

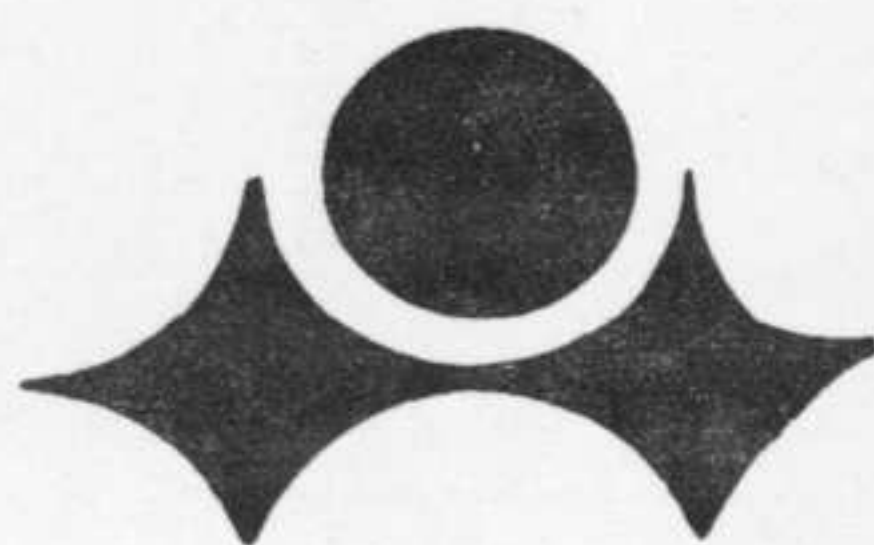

RULES

1. Entries are open to amateurs only.
2. Artistic designs must be arranged by the exhibitor.
3. Specimen flowers and vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor. Containers will be furnished.
4. No artificial or artificially colored plant material or water may be used unless otherwise stated.
5. All unusual plant materials in arrangements should be listed on the back of the entry tag.
6. An exhibitor may compete in as many classes as desired but may make only one entry in a class. Only one member of a household may compete in any one class except in the Junior Division.
7. All exhibitors must register and be assigned a number. They must present registered entries at the door of the exhibition hall to the Staging Committee between 8:00 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. Sunday, August 8, 1971. Entries arriving after 11:00 A.M. will be marked not for competition.
8. Judging will start promptly at 11:30 A.M. Only authorized persons will be allowed in the exhibition hall during judging.
9. In Section M only clean healthy plants will be accepted. Plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession at least 90 days.
10. Exhibits not meeting the specifications of the schedule will be disqualified. Any award may be withheld at the discretion of the judges and show chairman.
11. No exhibit may be removed before 7:30 P.M. on the day of the show.
12. The management will not be responsible for the loss of exhibits or awards not claimed at the close of the show.

AWARDS

AWARDS GIVEN ACCORDING TO NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR A STANDARD FLOWER SHOW.

Awards will be made as follows:

AWARD OF CREATIVITY — 5 points — For best of blue ribbon winners scoring 95 points or more in classes 1—4.

ARTISTIC AWARD — 5 points — For best of blue ribbon winners scoring 95 points or more in classes 5—8.

TRI-COLOR AWARD — 5 points — For best of blue ribbon winners scoring 95 points or more in classes 9—12.

AWARD OF DISTINCTION — 5 points — For best of blue ribbon winners scoring 95 points or more in classes 14—17.

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT AWARD — 5 points — Awarded to the outstanding exhibit in the artistic division Section H and in the horticulture Section I.

AWARD OF MERIT — 5 points — For best of blue ribbon winners in each of the following sections: *Roses—Section J, Specimen Flowers—Sections K & L, Specimen Plants—Section M, Vegetables—Section N.*

SWEEPSTAKES AWARD — One given in the Artistic, one in Horticulture and one in the Junior Artistic and one in the Junior Horticulture. Awarded to exhibitor with greatest accumulation of points.
