Worthington Public Library brings Discovery Place to you!

On January 3, 1994 the Worthington Public Library will begin the New Year with a new catalog and circulation

System, called Discovery Place. This system will tie us in with 24

other libraries in Franklin County, and give you access to over 2 million items. All 20 branches and the Main Library of the Columbus Metropolitan Library are included, as well as Southwest Libraries (Grove City and Westland) and Franklin University Library. Worthington Public Library patrons

will be able to review the combined collections of all these libraries, and place reserves on any circulating item

(except videos) on the *Discovery Place* system.

Convenient features include

the ability to renew most items for the same loan period, the option of returning borrowed materials to any of the 25 libraries, and the ease of placing reserves yourself on a terminal in the Library, or from your home or office if you have a computer with a modem. You choose the pick-up location!

New borrowers' cards will be needed for full access to the benefits of *Discovery Place*. Stop in, update your borrower information and get your new card beginning January 3, 1994.

More parking available!

After several months of negotiations, the Library has purchased the bank building at 820 High Street, on the corner of Stafford Avenue. This is a 7,400 square foot building which is similar in architectural style to the Library. We have immediately gained 21 parking spaces! Following completion of the Northwest Library in 1995, the space will be renovated and joined to the current Hartford Street building. This will allow expansion of the collection and seating at Hartford Street, as administrative and technical functions will be relocated to the new building.

New Northwest Library!

In the past several years, the Northwest area of Franklin County has grown rapidly. In order to serve the needs of the families living in this area, a 23,000 square foot library will be constructed at 2270 and 2280 Hard Road. Ground will be broken in 1994, with completion in late 1995. This is a joint project of the Worthington Public Library and the Columbus Metropolitan Library, since the area is served by both library districts. The architectural firm of Design Group, Inc. has been selected to design the building. Principal Jack Hedge has begun design work with library staff and trustees.

Registration is not necessary.


