



# The Northwest Library:

- Was built through the cooperative efforts of the Columbus Metropolitan Library and the Worthington Public Library.
   The two systems split the cost for land, construction and the opening day collection, and will share the operating costs of the new library.
- Is the first Ohio library to be built and operated by two library systems.
- Offers access to the Greater Columbus Free-Net and the Internet through the Ohio Public Library Information Network (OPLIN) at 22 computer stations.
- Provides a collection of over 100,000 new books and 10,000 audio and video tapes, compact discs and bookson-tape.
- Offers the Worthington Public Library's CD-ROM reference network with database access and the Columbus Metropolitan Library's Discovery Place service.

of light on the paint, the open gridwork, the familiar storybook characters in the Children's Department and the inviting Young Adult Area. Browse through the shelves of materials; surf the Internet for a while. But remember: The Northwest Library's striking exterior and light-filled interior may be the most visible features of this special library, but they are by no means its sole distinctions.

Perhaps its greatest distinction is the cooperative nature of the project. The Northwest Library concept resulted from discussions which began in 1992 among the two library systems' board members. The two boards signed a joint development and operating agreement on October 13, 1993. Columbus and Worthington are sharing the start-up costs of the project, and will share operating costs.

The Northwest Library is only the second library in the United States to be built and operated by two library systems. This collaboration between the Columbus Metropolitan Library and the Worthington Public Library is a viable model to other library systems and government entities seeking to better serve growing populations while coping with shrinking budgets.



### The Northwest Library is On-line

n addition to the helpful staff available to answer your questions, the Northwest Library offers *Discovery Place*, central Ohio's computerized resource.

The Discovery Place Libraries Catalog lists materials available at the Columbus, Southwest and Worthington library systems as well as the Franklin University Library. Borrowers have access to a collection of more than two and a half million circulating items, including books, magazines, audio and video materials, with a library card from any of these libraries.

InfoTrac 2000 provides complete articles or summaries from several hundred magazines and newspapers. The Columbus News Index offers access to citations in various local and regional newspapers. Health Index ASAP contains articles or summaries from 150 health magazines and newsletters.

In addition to using these services in the Library, the Discovery Place dial-up service makes these four databases available to customers with a modem-equipped computer at their home or office.

All of these services are easy to use. If you need help finding any information, a library staff member will gladly assist you.
