## Background for the class of '57 . . .

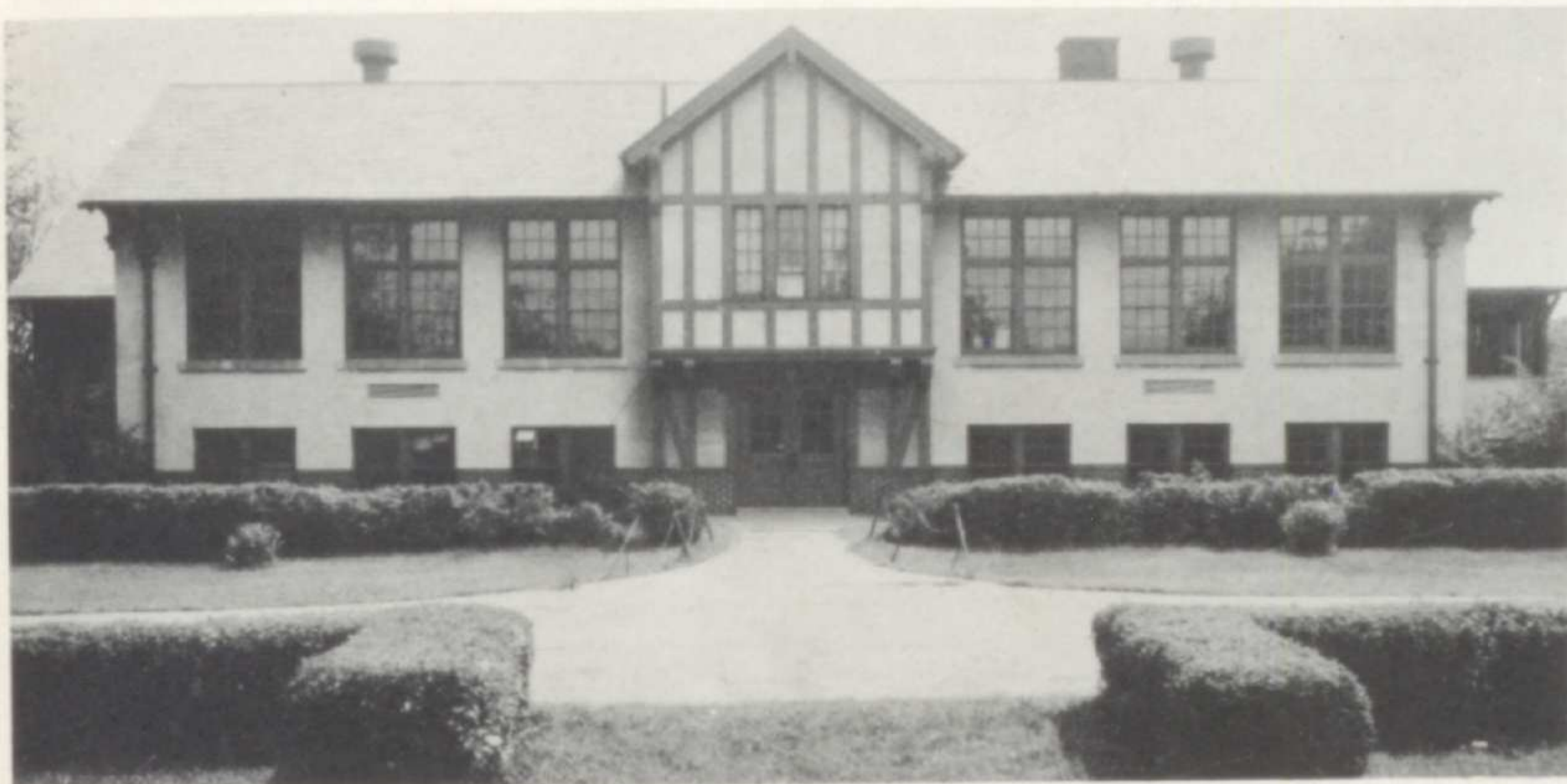

These included Worthington Elementary, located on East Granville Road since 1938; Sharon, erected in 1949 and situated on Foster Avenue; and the oldest structure in the Worthington School District, with a new addition, the 34-year-old Homedale, located on Westview Avenue. Added to our list of notable buildings is Flint School, sited on the corner of Park and Flint Roads, and North Perry School in Linworth. Nearly all of the members of the class of '57 received their primary education in one of these schools.

After the completion of their elementary education, the class of '57 shared the excitement of entering Junior High. Countless experiences and never-to-be-forgotten moments were spent at the Gran-

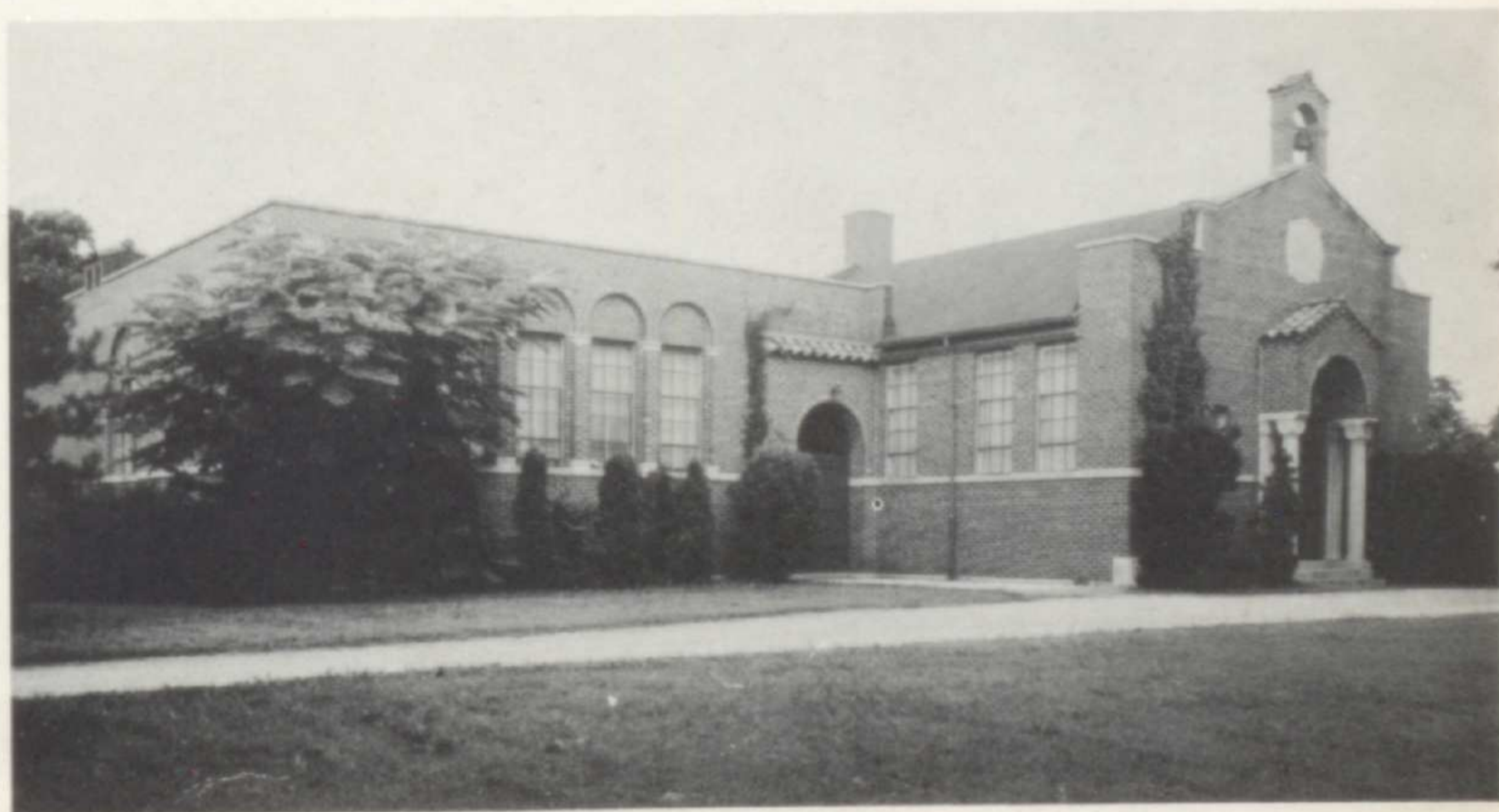
ville Road and Evening Street location.

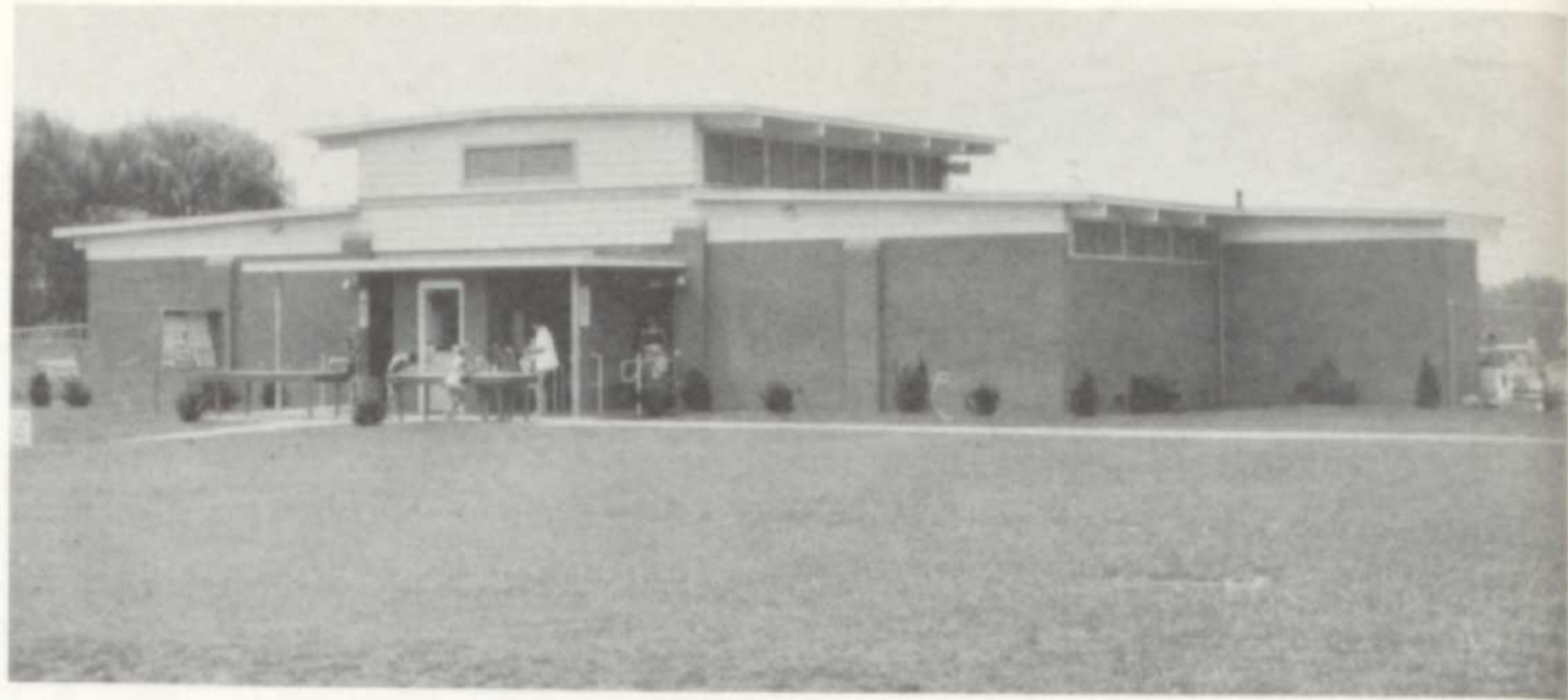
When the class of '57 leaves the foregoing ladder of education behind, they will carry with unreasoning affection the many varied experiences in which they participated.

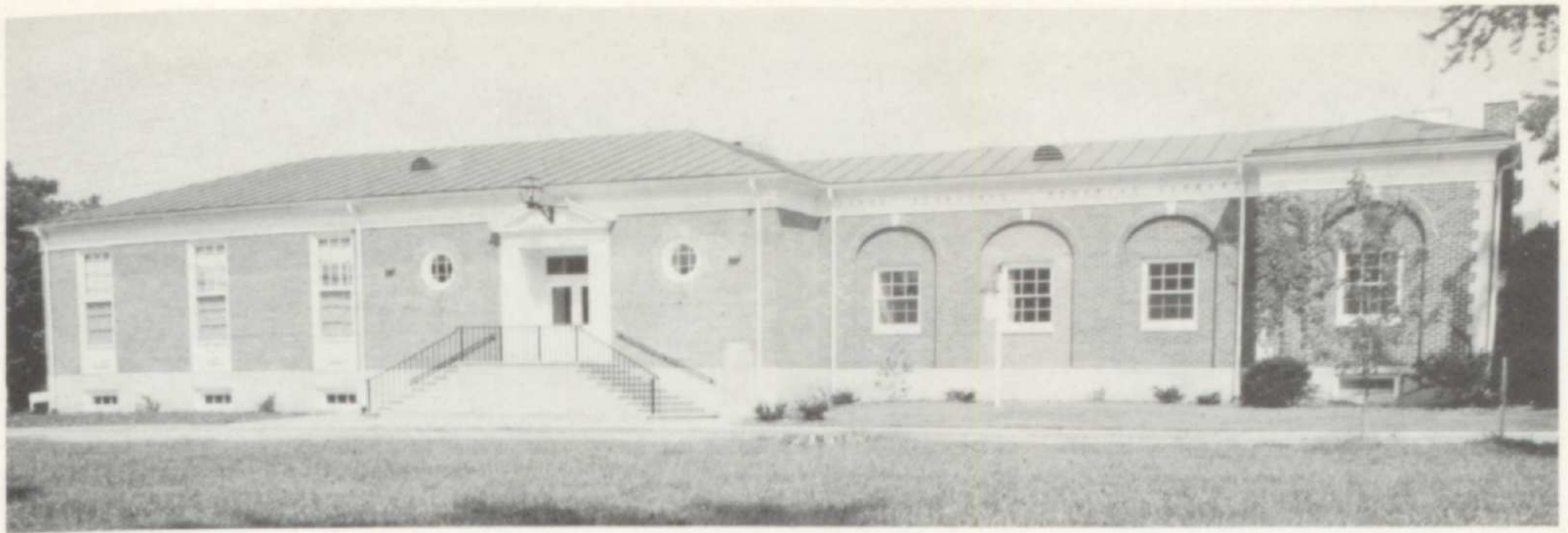

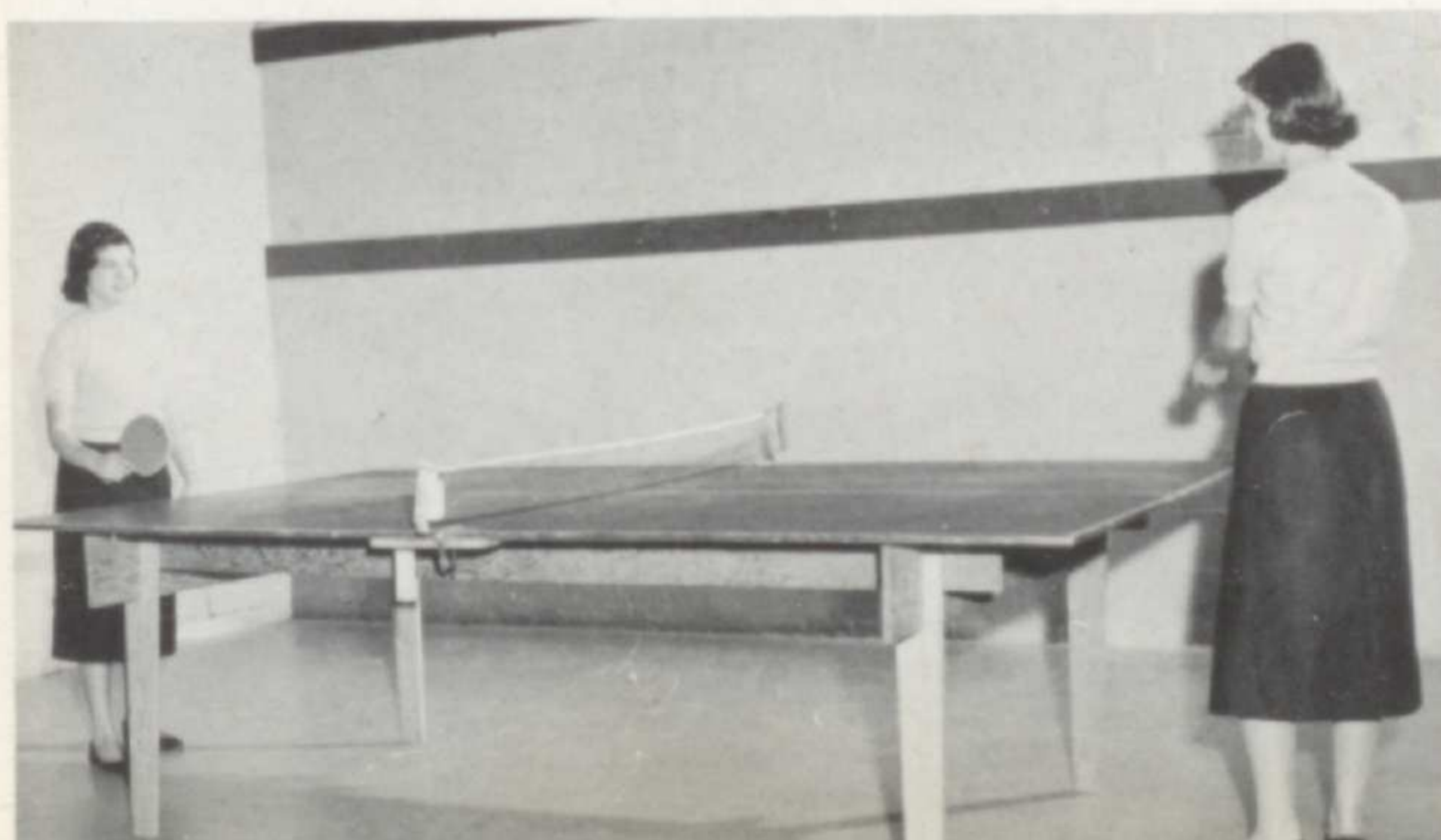

Undefeated! For only the third time in the history of Worthington High School the 1956 football squad went undefeated, untied. The Mid-Six Football Championship was again secured, with the mighty Cards thoroughly trouncing the five competitors.

Opening the season was a preview at Grove City, where Worthington ran up a score of 14-0 in a single quarter. The next game was played against a strong Grandview squad. The Cardinals' strength was unknown, so they pulled what the experts called an upset, 14-6. Unhampered by the muddy grounds of last season, W.H.S. downed Delaware by a score of 40-12. Tearing through the next two games, Worthington defeated London 20-6 and Marysville 19-0. A happy Homecoming was in store for the Alumni as they saw their Alma Mater run up a score of 19-6 against Hilliards. On the next Friday evening the Cardinals ruined Westerville's Homecoming with an 18-14 defeat. Parents' Night was the scene of

another slaughter, with Worthington living up to preview results by again overpowering Grove City by the score, 13-6. On the home field, the 25-12 defeat of Bexley completed the Cardinals' season. 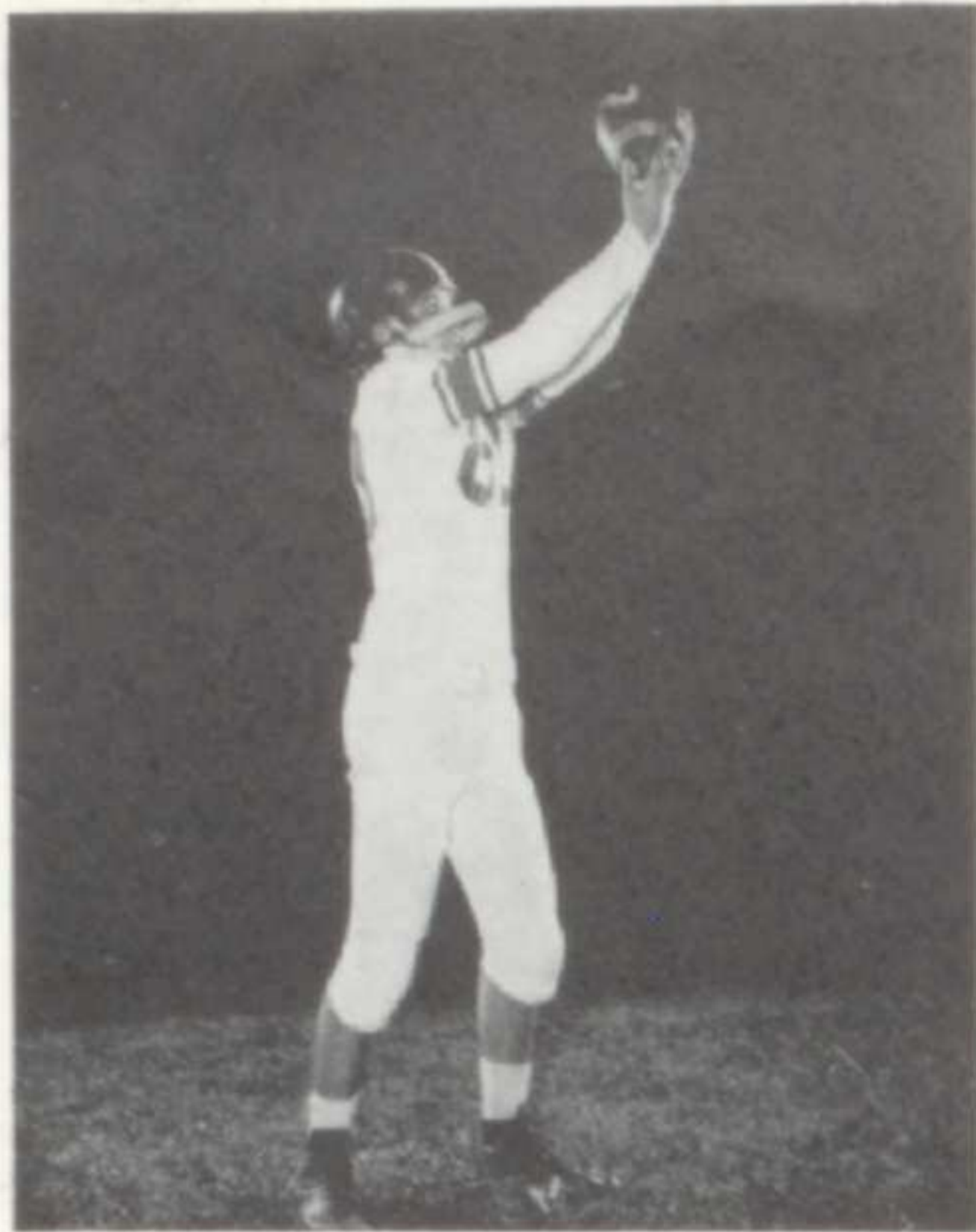

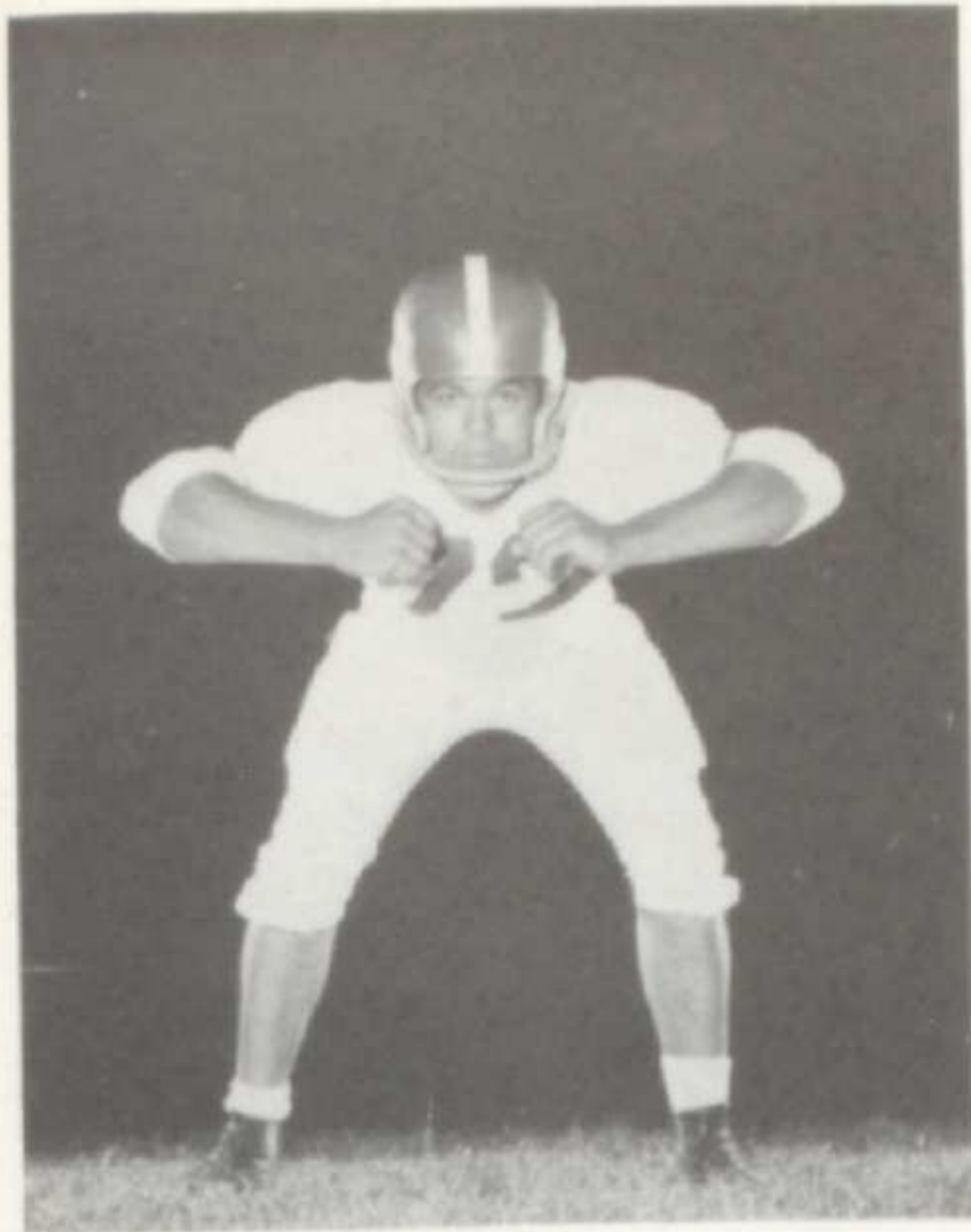

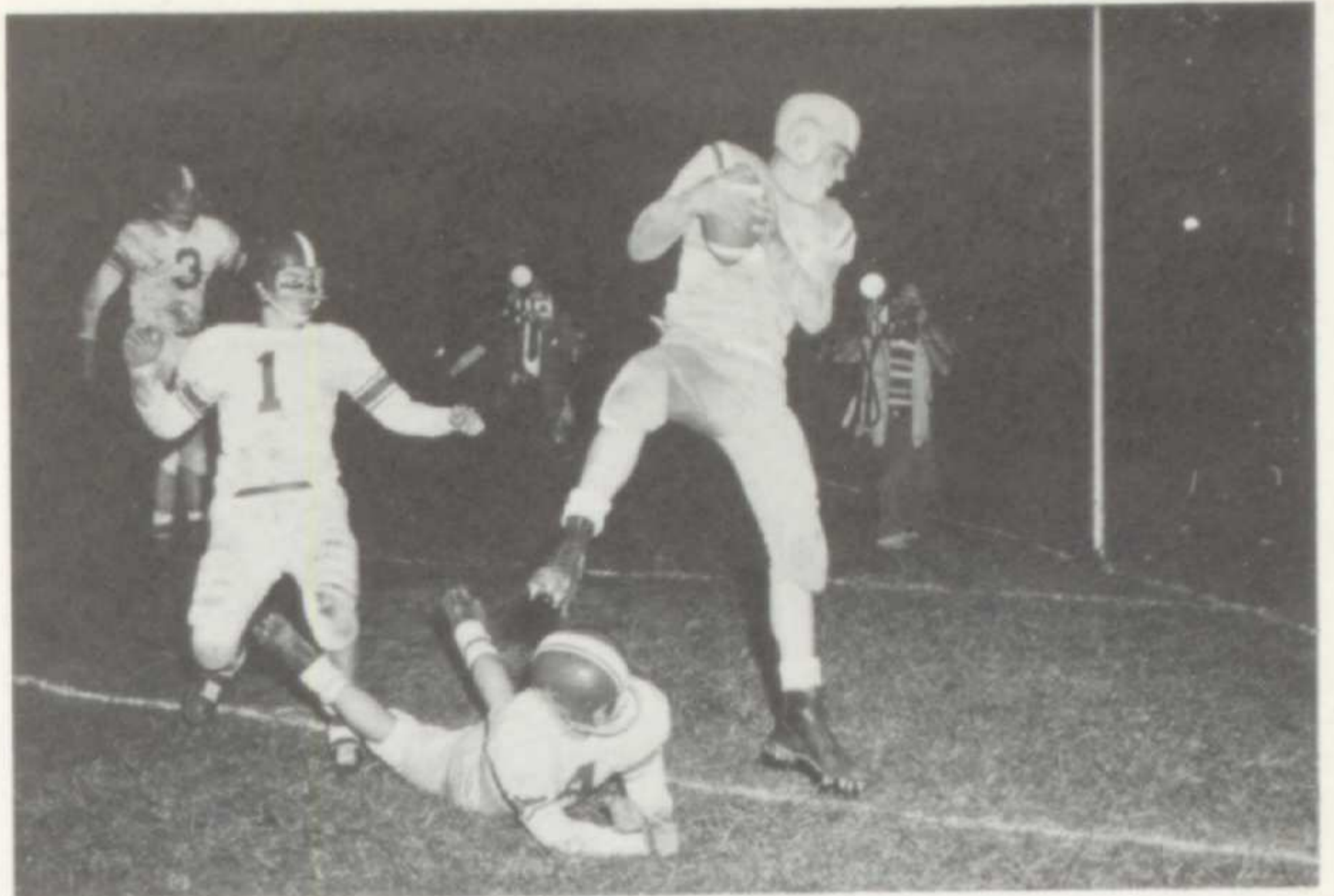



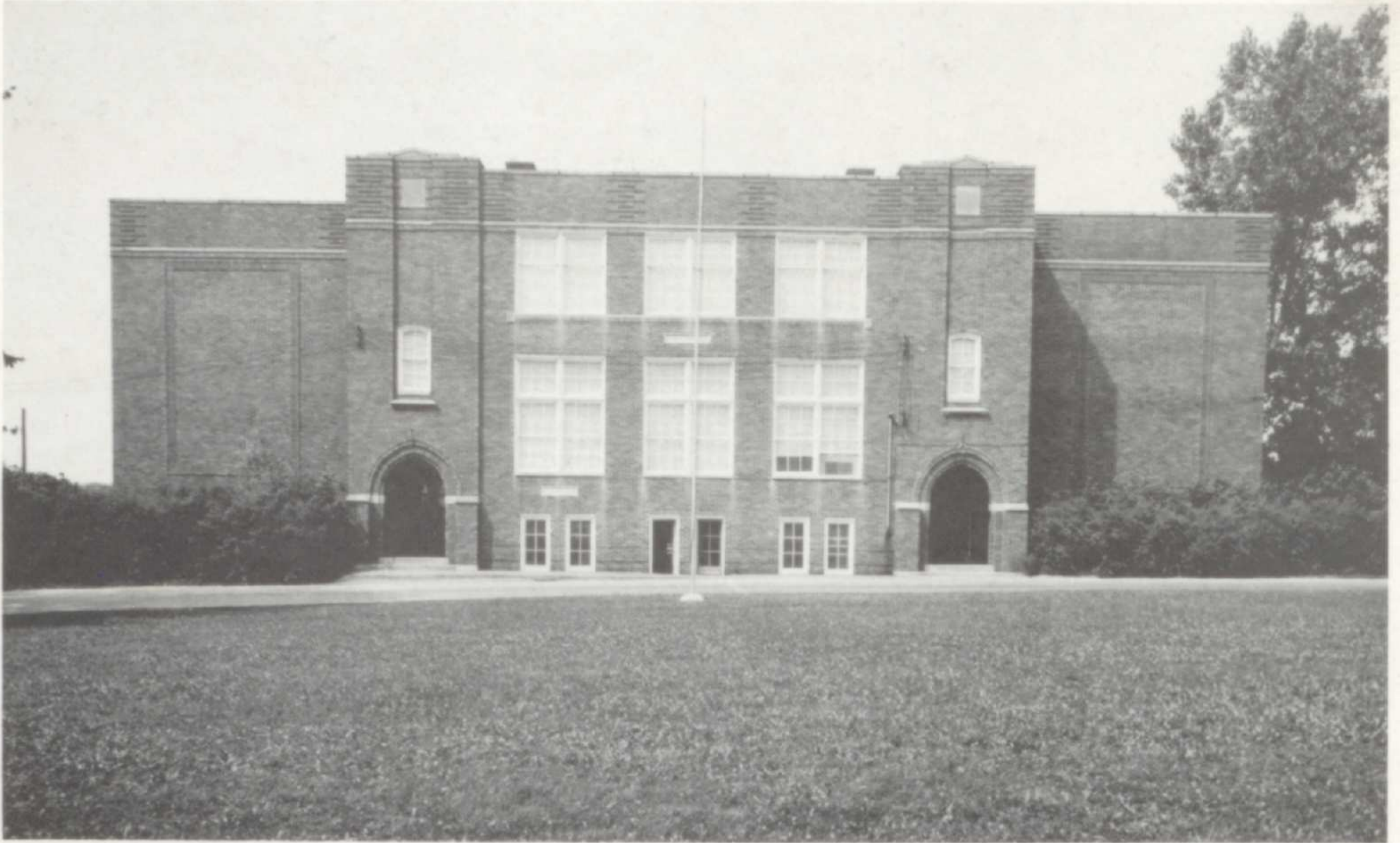

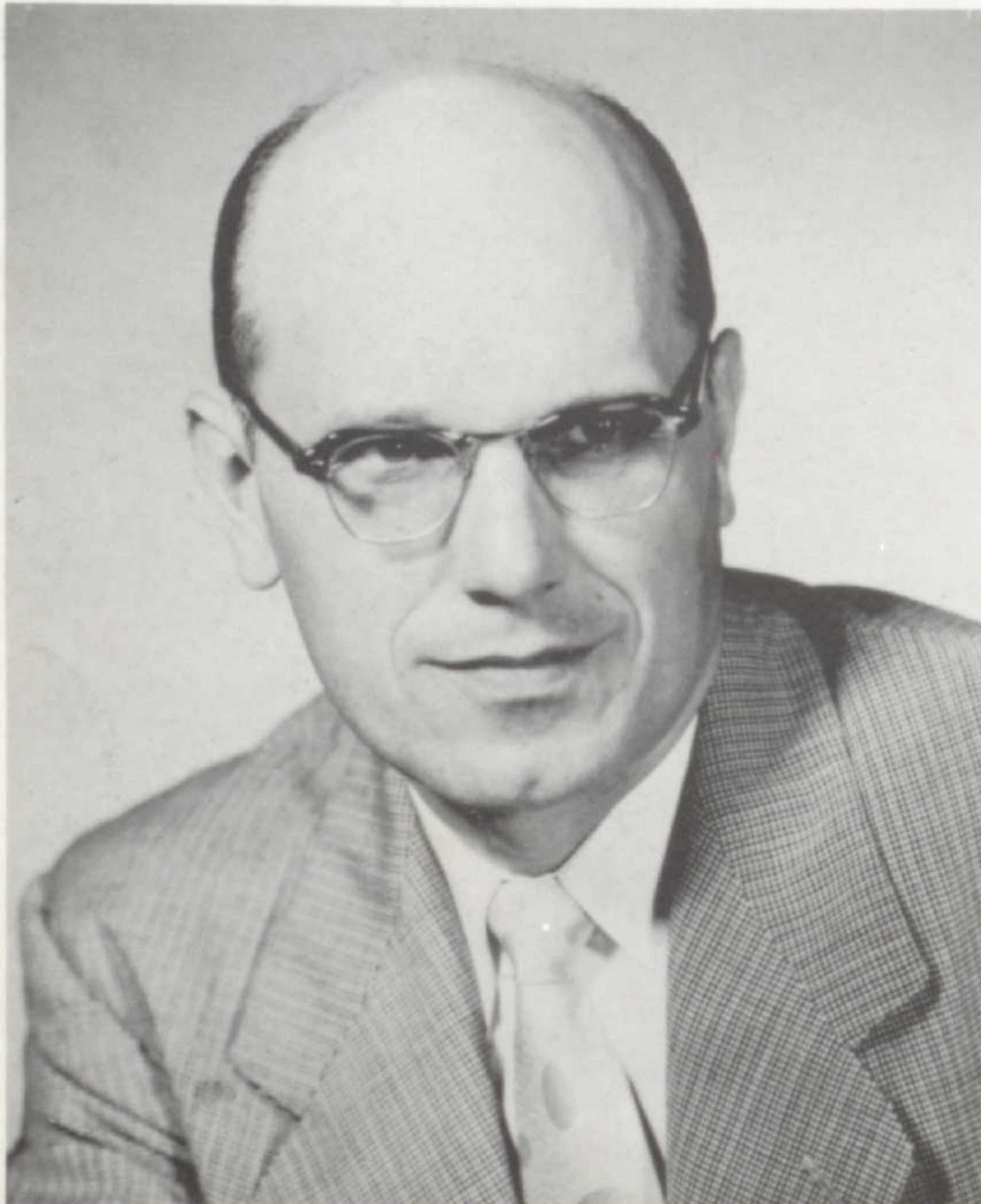

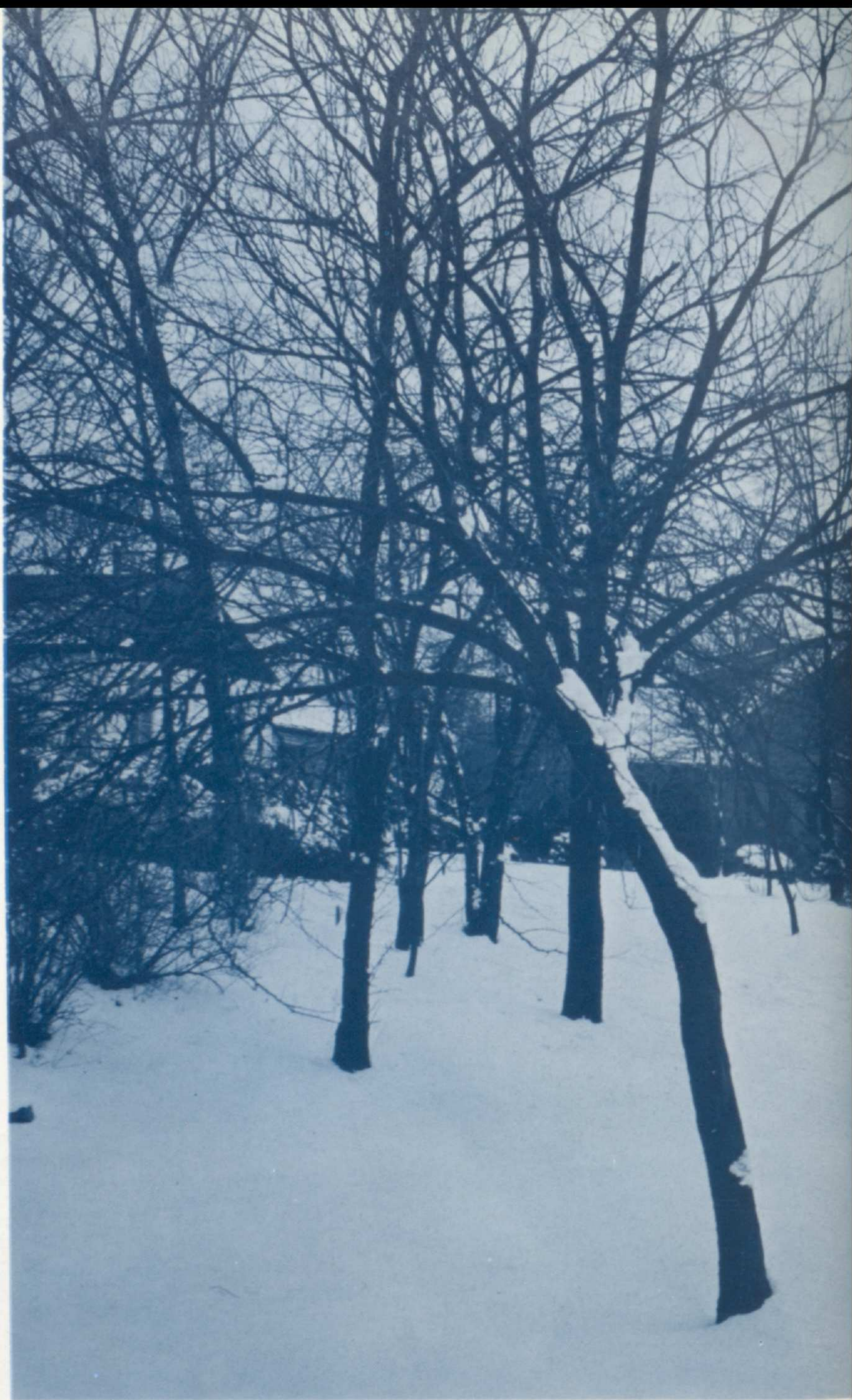

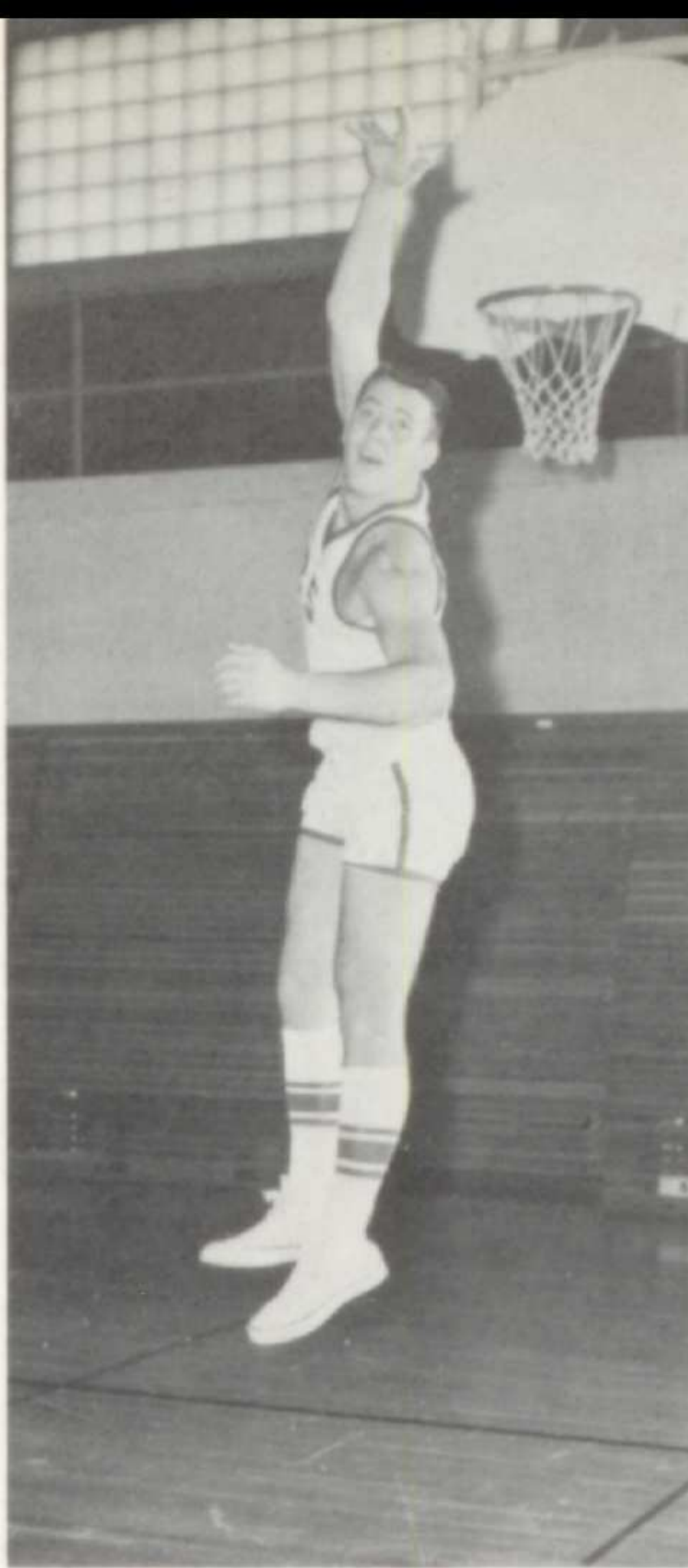

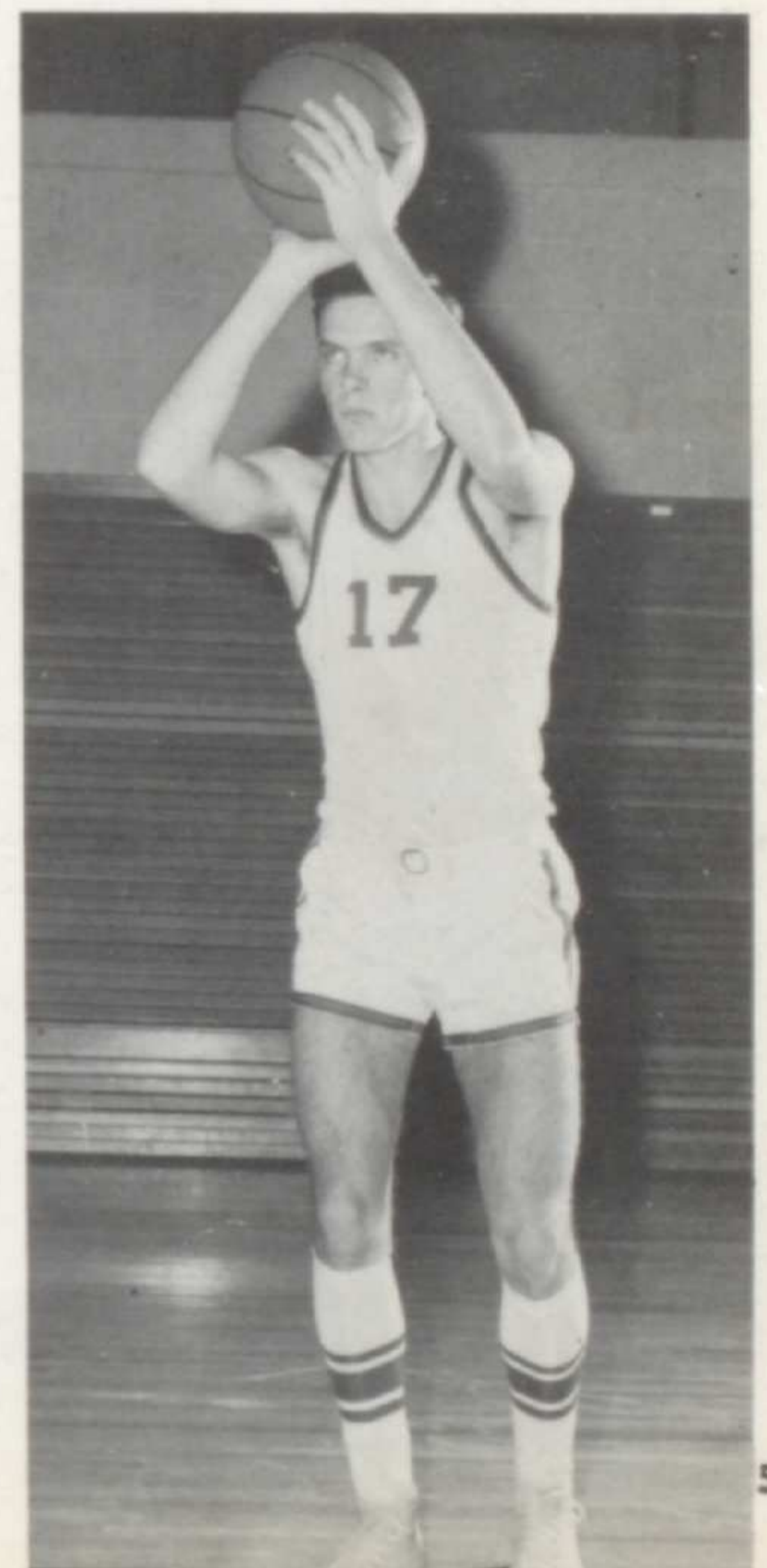

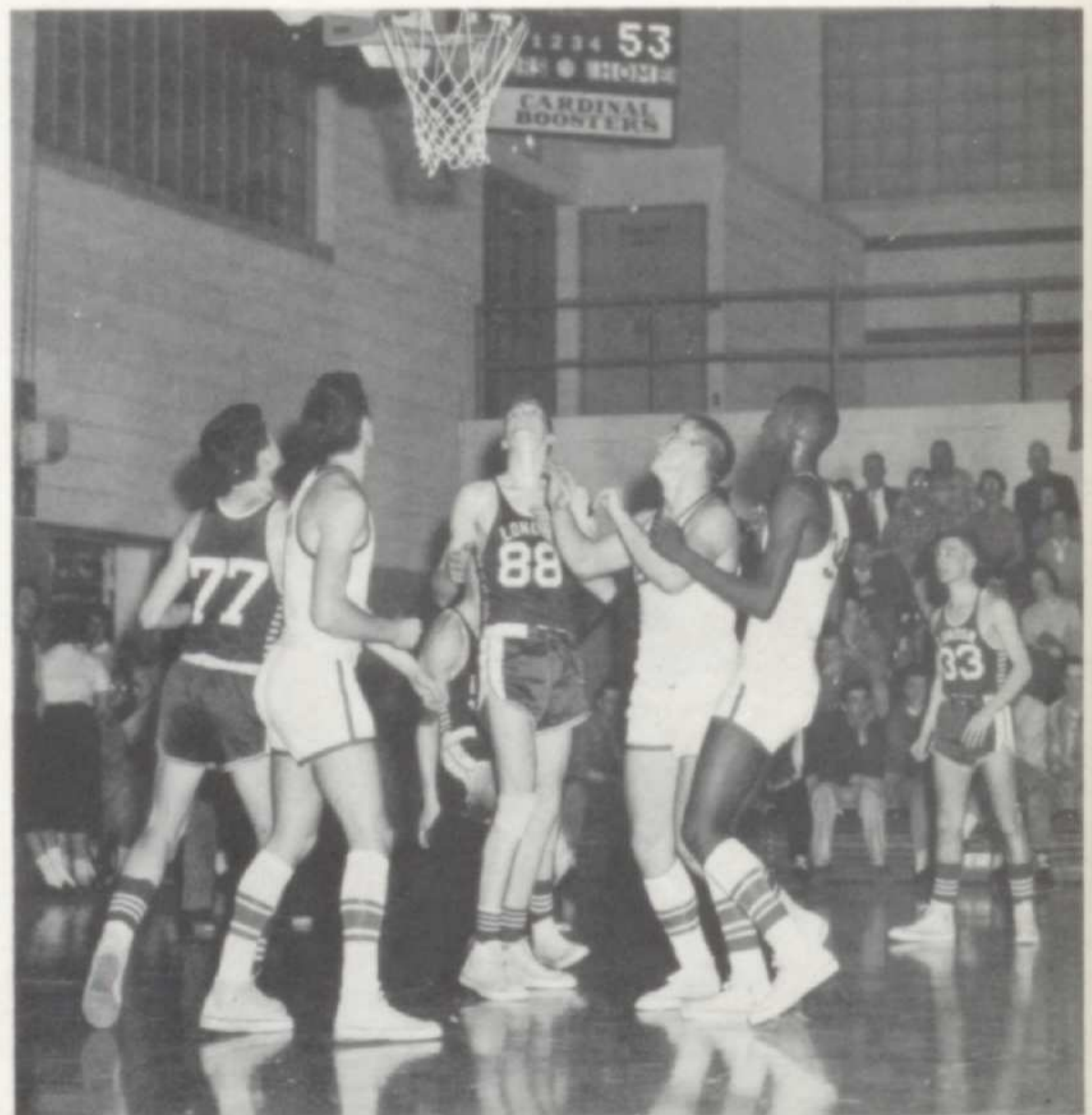

The projects, responsibilities, and studies of the Junior year are varied and difficult. As they worked toward their final year, the Juniors have established themselves as a capable and efficient class.

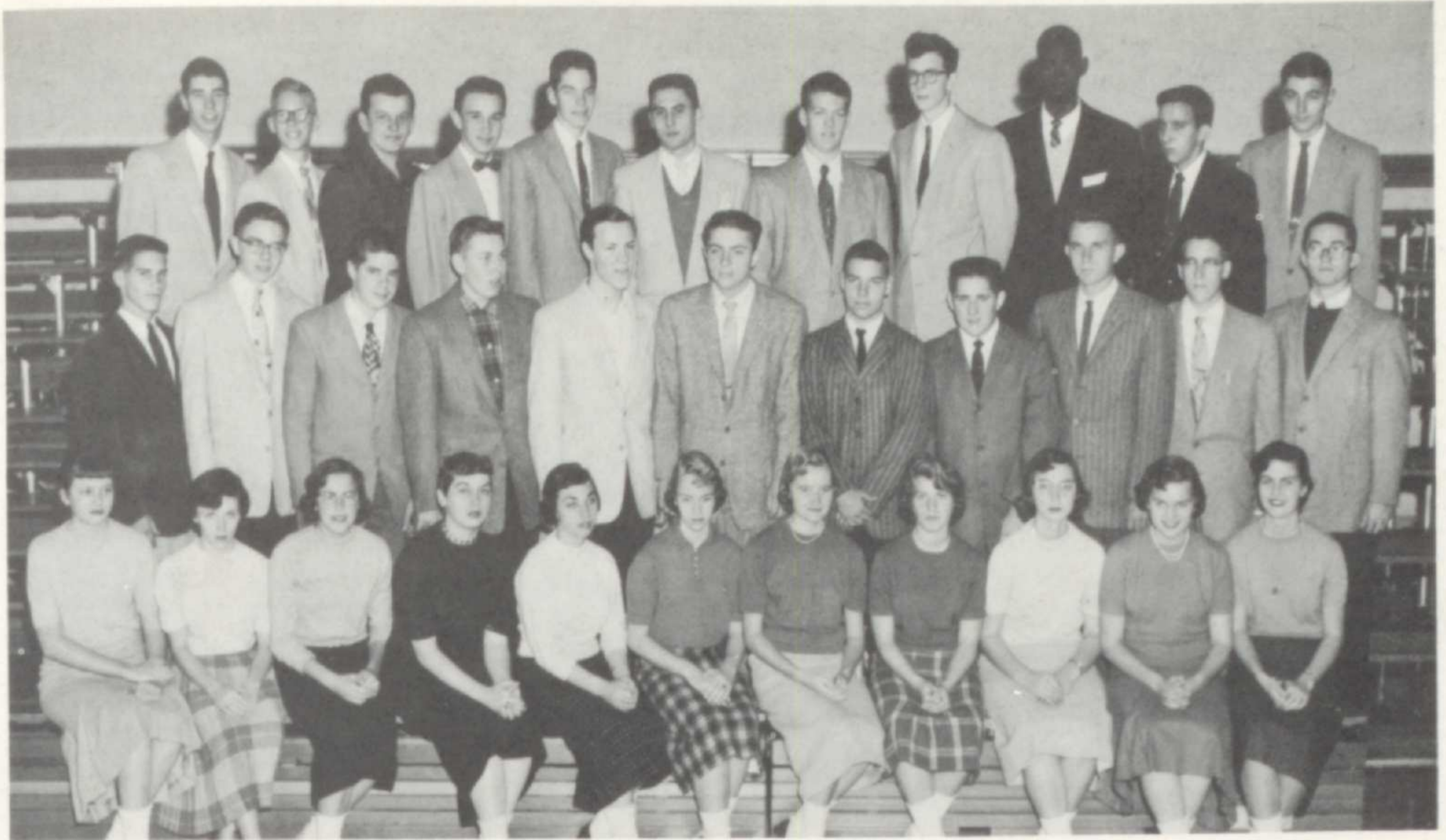

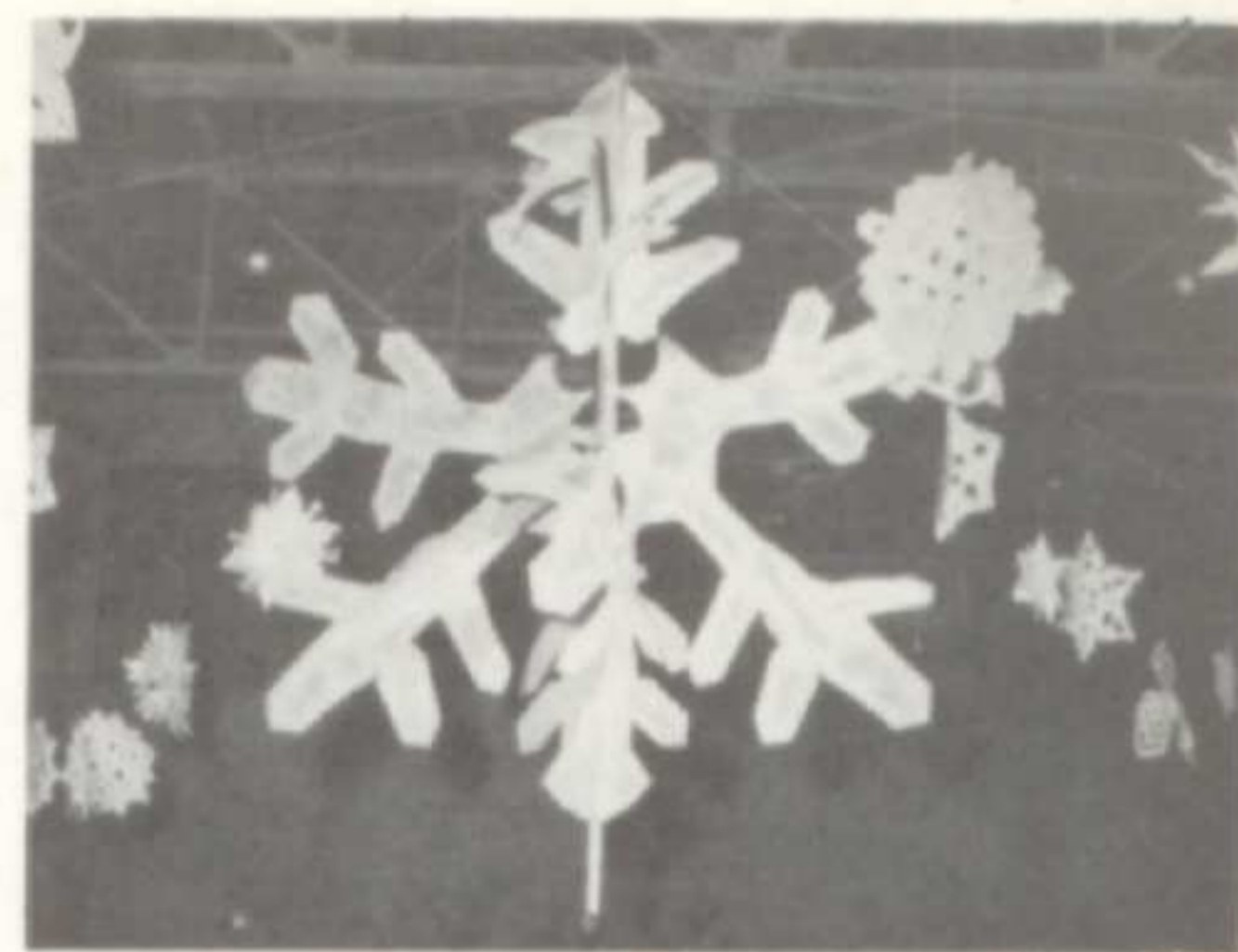

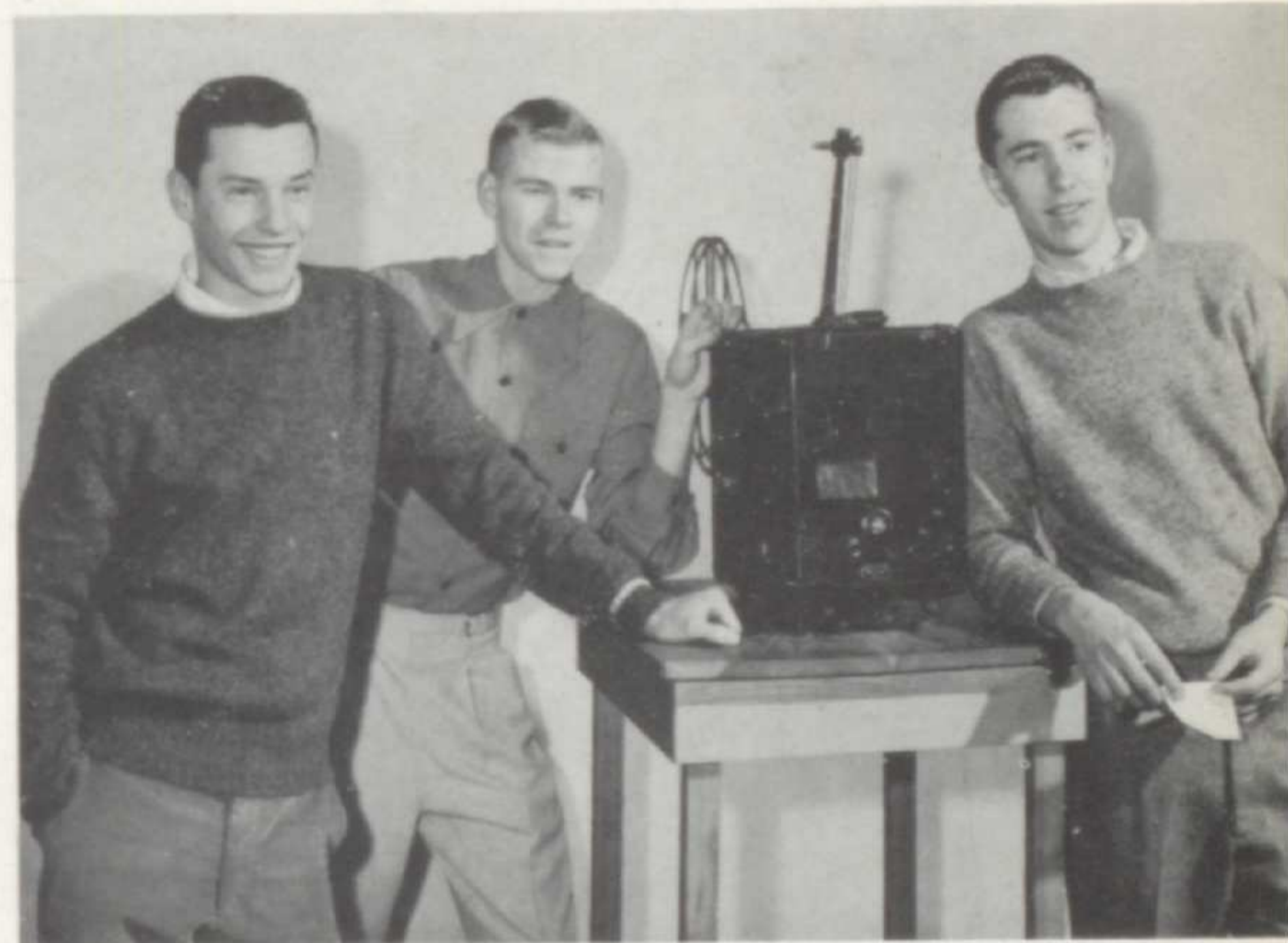

# CARDINAL CORONATION DANCE

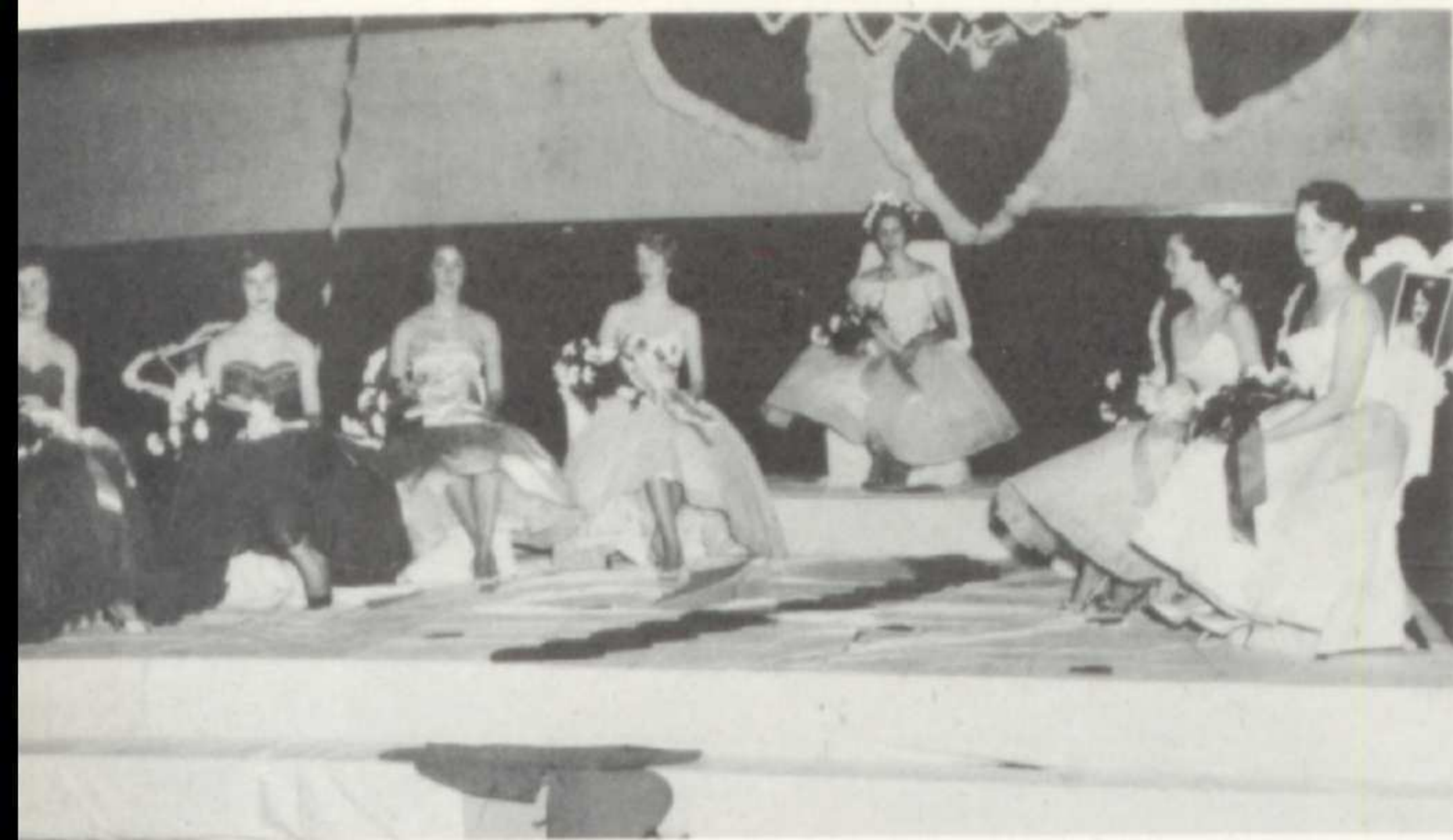

## 1956 TRACK

Worthington's 1956 track team completed a successful season last spring by downing such notable thin-clad squads as West, South, and Grandview. They also secured the top spot in the Mid-Six Meet.

Rated high in the ranks of Worthington cinder men were 1957 seniors — Bob MacVicar, Bill Pullin, Jim Williams, Duane Pelkey, Paul Brown, Terry Campbell, Ken Latham, and Ron Kennedy. As a result of the excellent coaching and advice from Mr. Les Eisenhart, the team finished on top with great hopes for the next year.

Early in the season the Cardinals copped first place, 65 to 40, in an indoor meet at O.S.U. with West. South also bowed to Worthington, 63½ to 35½, that same afternoon. Worthington walked off with 2nd place out of 10 starters in the 3rd Greater Columbus Track Meet, East 57—Worthington 42. They followed with a 5th place at the Denison Indoor Relays. Two losses followed with Marion Harding scoring 88 to 30 and Westerville, 59 to 57.

Six points were obtained by Worthington at the Springfield Relays in April, and four days later they placed 2nd out of 3 at Arlington. Four points were brought home from the Ohio Relays, and a victorious Worthington topped Grandview 67 to 51. Worthington Relays recorded Gahanna 44, Worthington 42, and Marysville 16. A May 1st meet saw Worthington defeating North and Bexley.

In the Marion Relays Worthington placed 4th out of 4. They quickly retaliated with the May Mid-Six Meet which found them on top of the pack with a 75 1/3 point tally, whipping the other five teams by a 35 point margin.

At the Arlington Relays the home school ended as leading scorer with 69 and Worthington 2nd with 43. Bexley edged out Worthington in an end of the season tilt.
