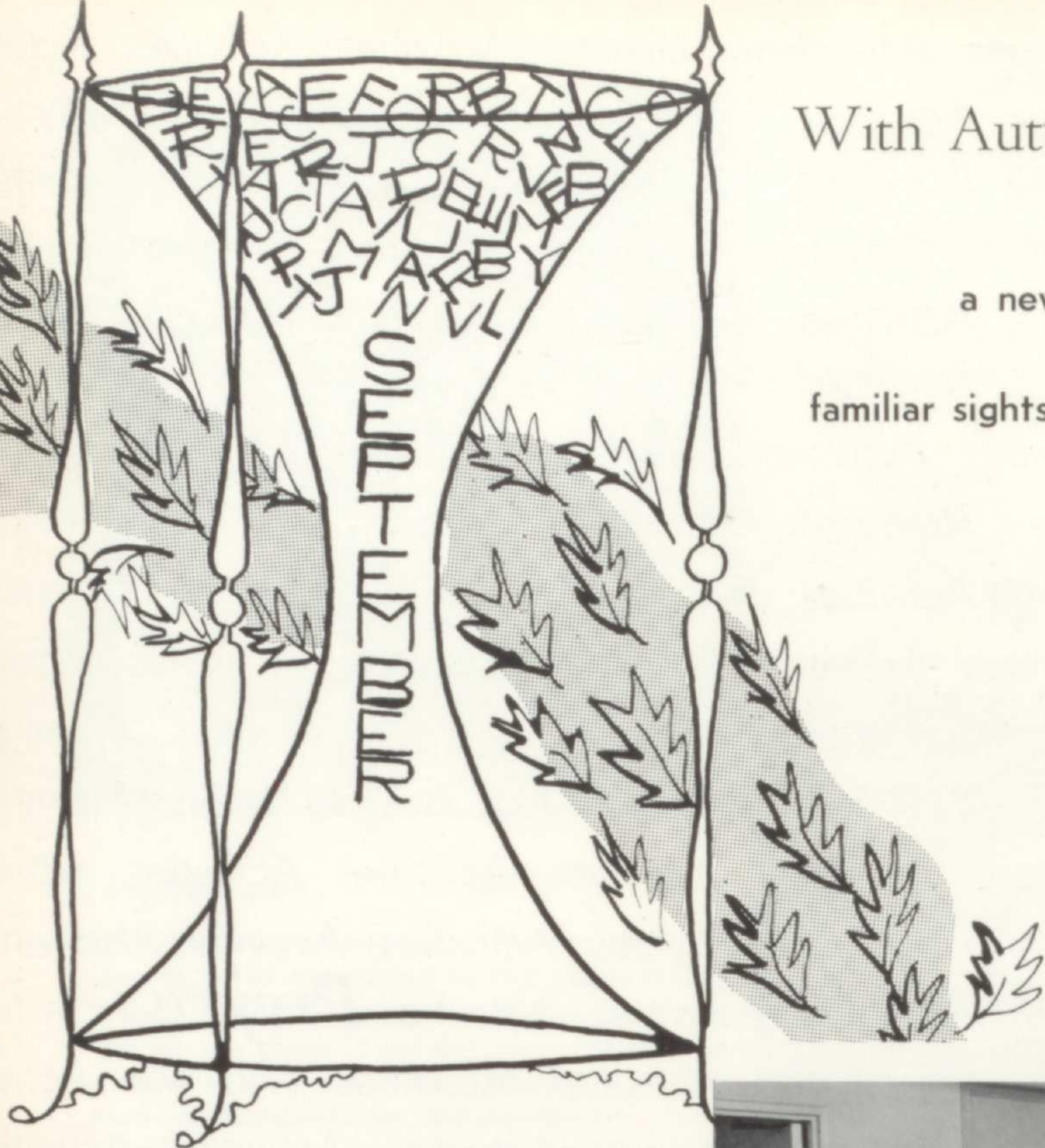

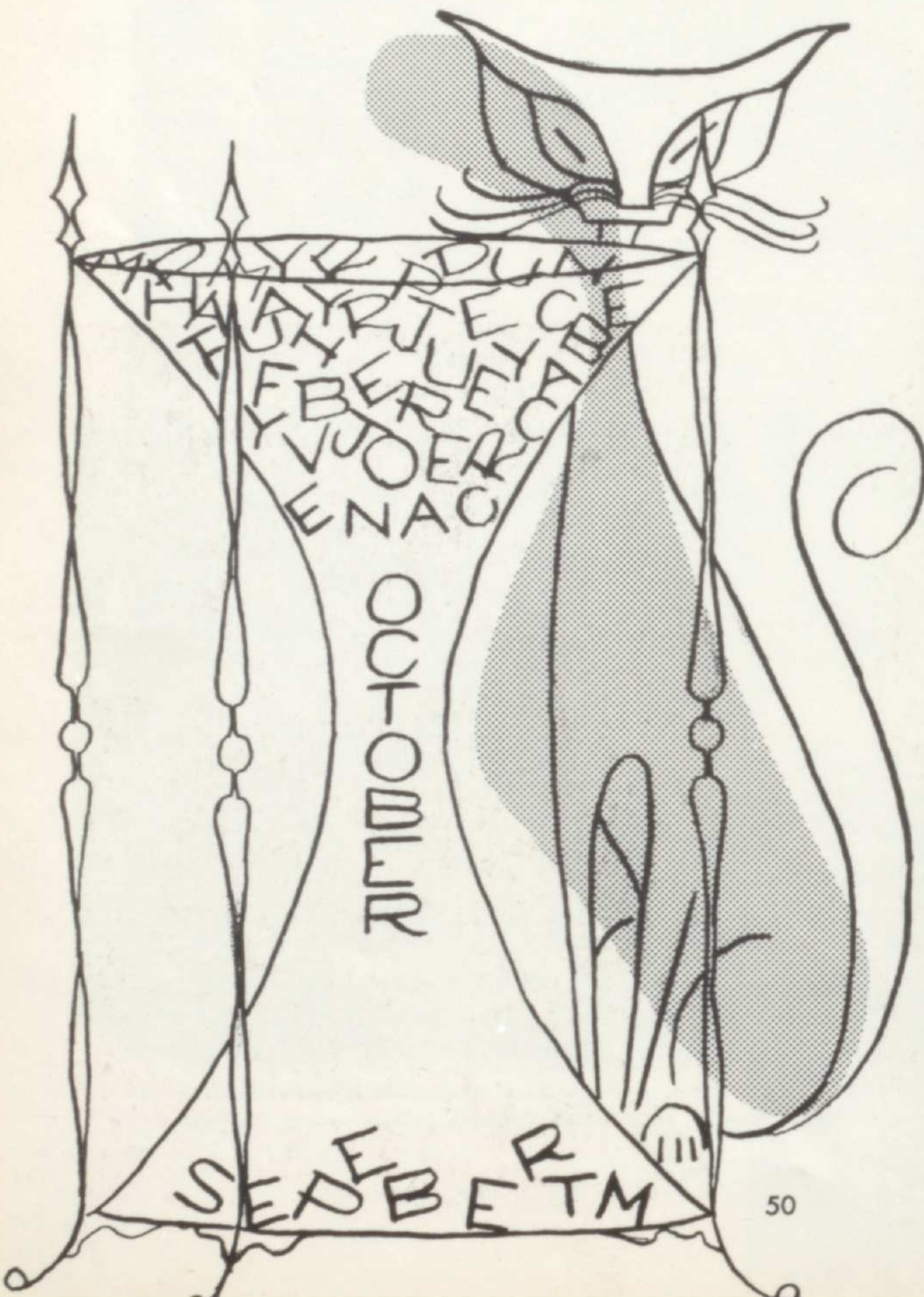


Dennis Jones runs right for large gain.

Below: Quarterback Rick Orwig crashes through the Yellowjacket line.

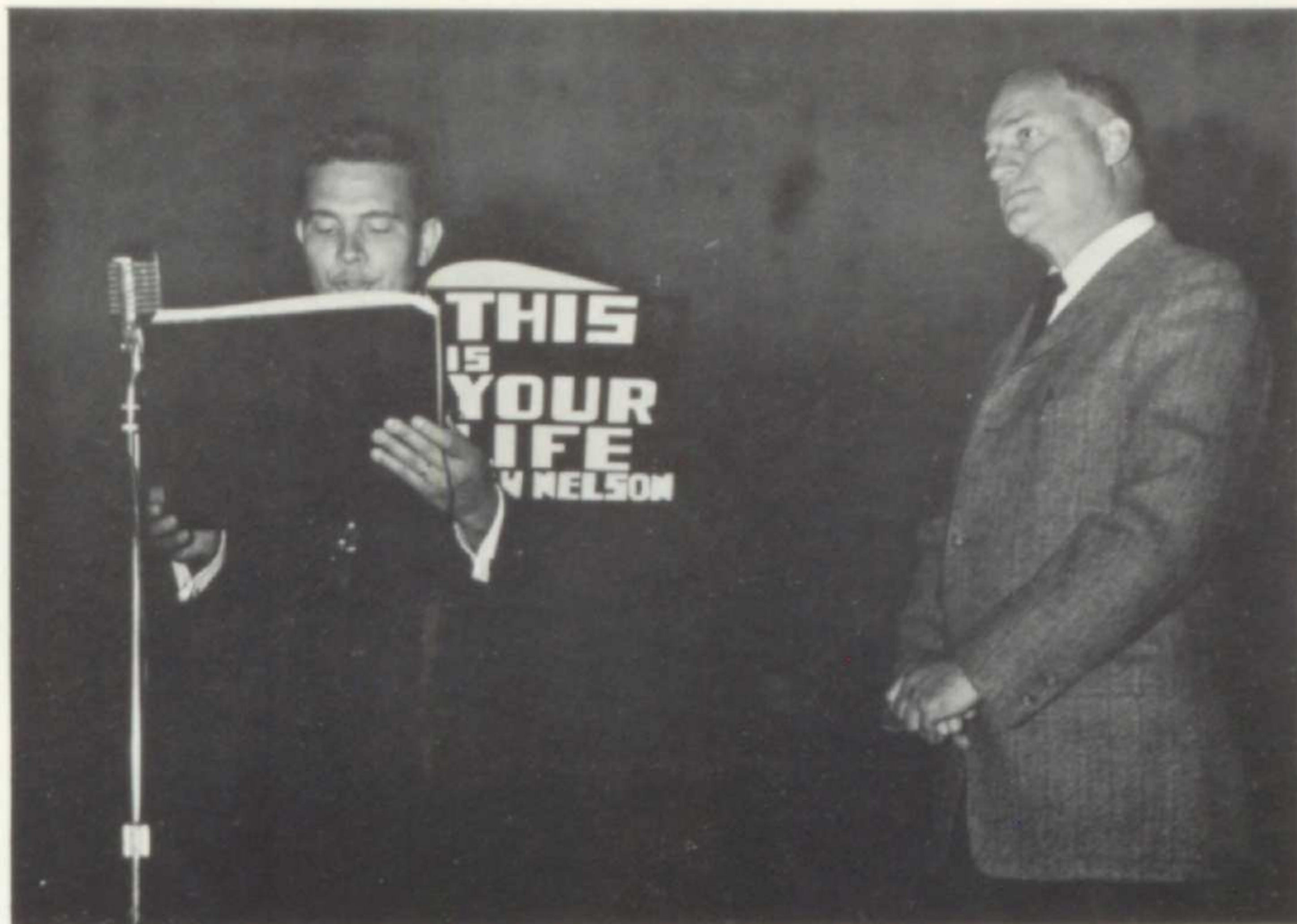

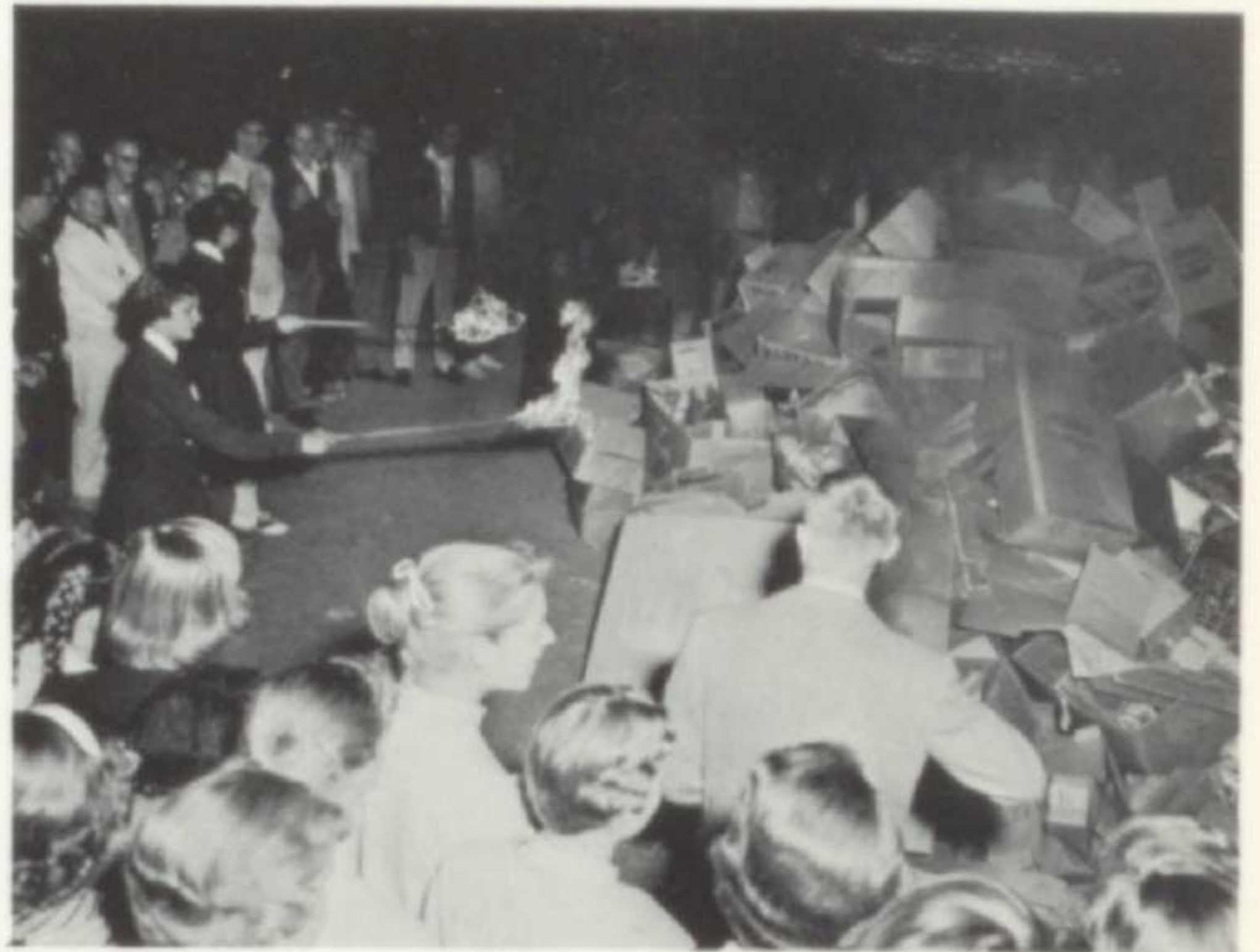

The backstroke record was broken by Mike Cave, and the 200-yard freestyle, by Gene Aleshire.

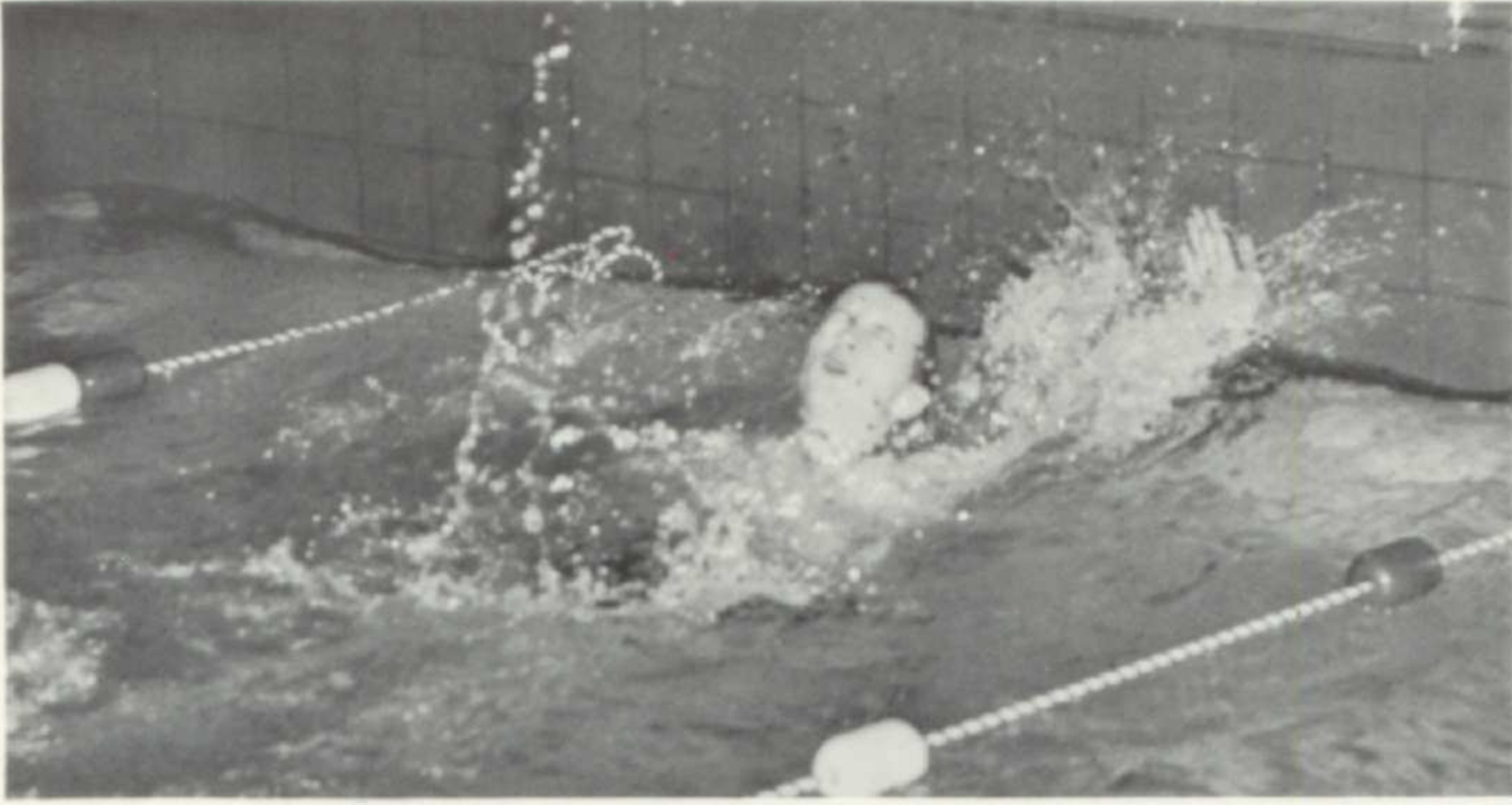

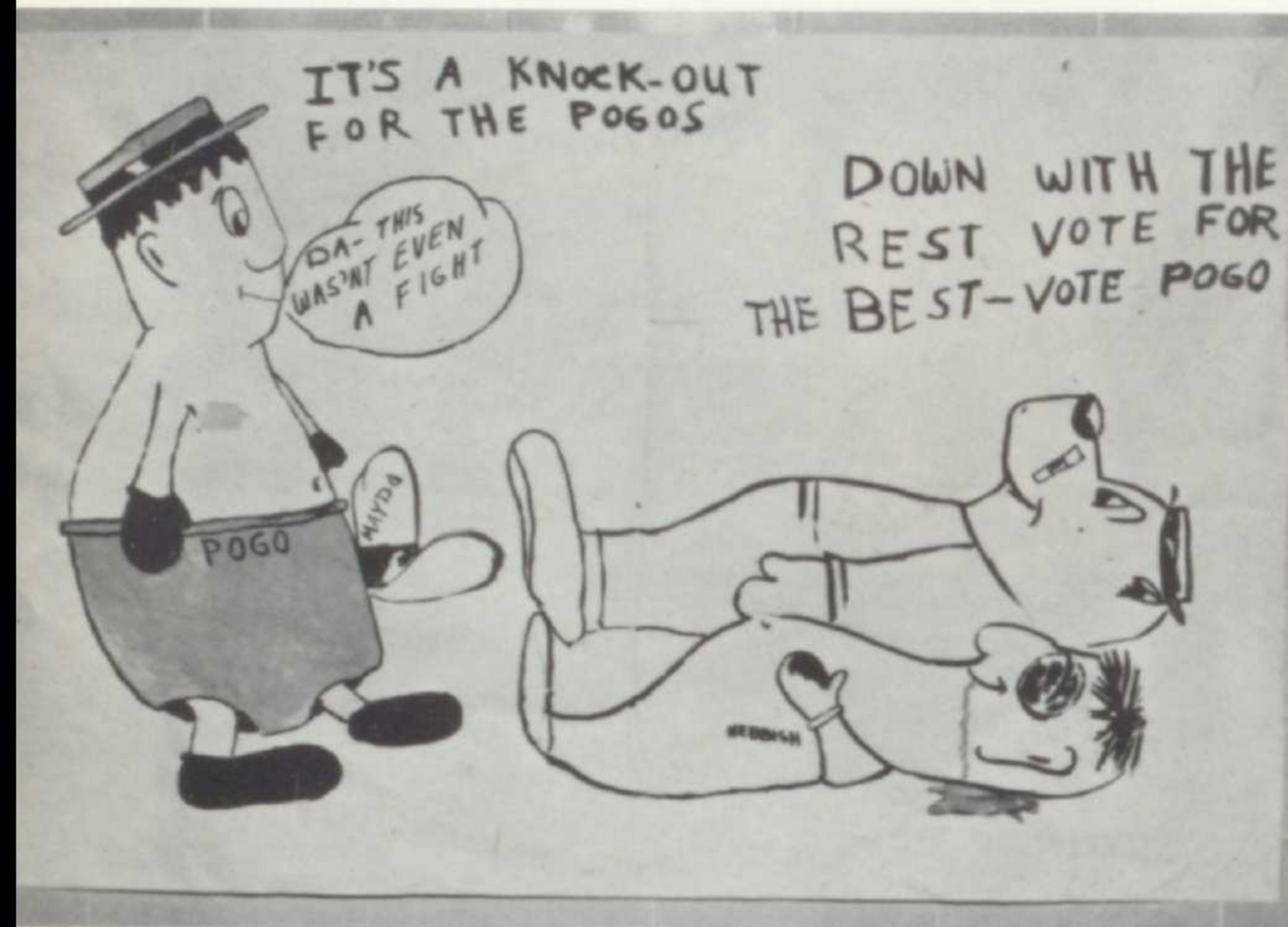
More memories

Worthington National Honor Society

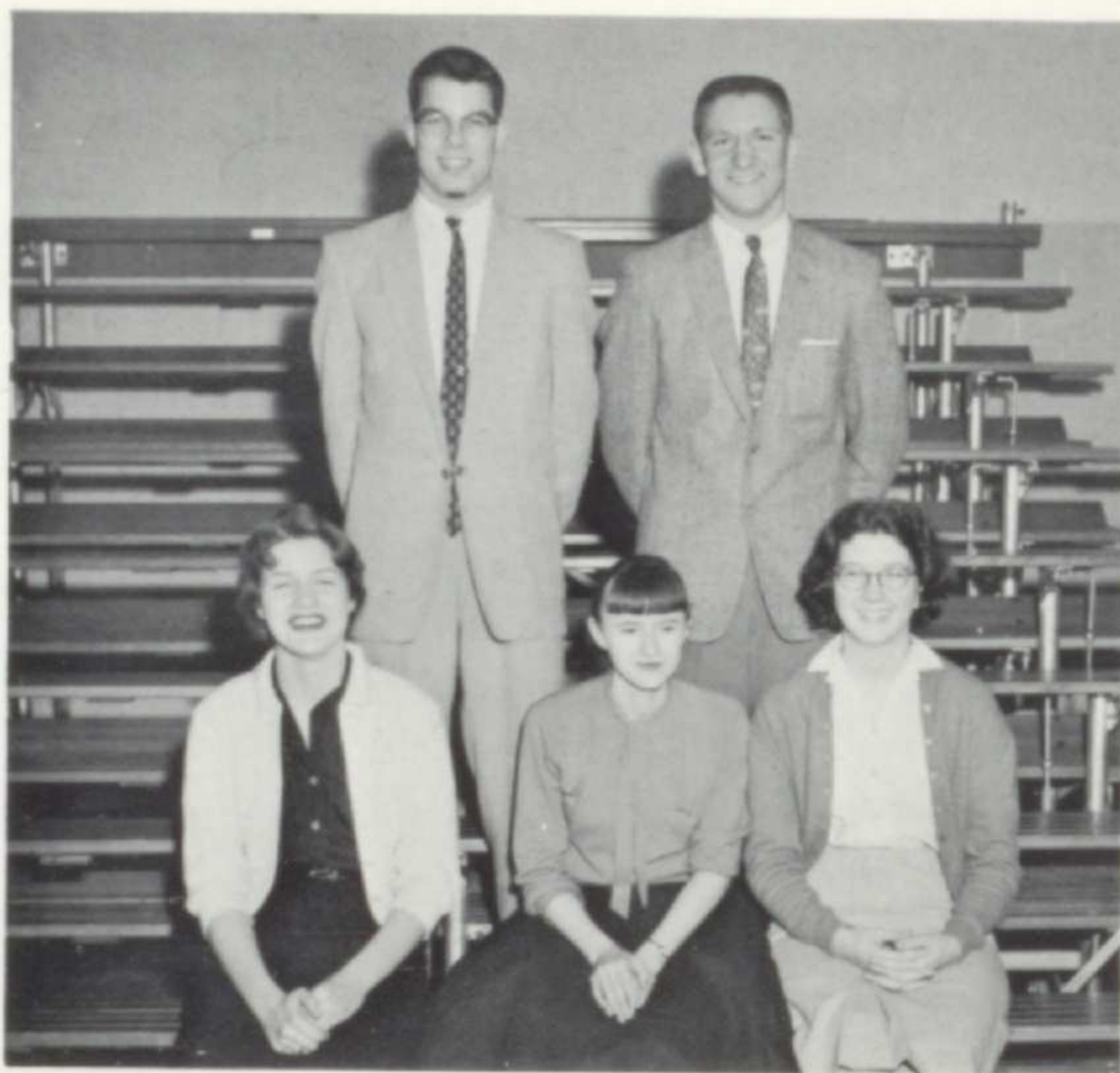
