"We Were Young That Year"

What happened to Nancy and Andy? Most people say it was just an ordinary thing. Something that happens to all of us—the first time we fall in love. But as Nancy says, "When it happens to you, it seems different."

This story of teenage love was presented by the class of 1960 on April 10 and 11, 1959. WE WERE YOUNG THAT YEAR was an imaginative, modern comedy, with simple scenery and contemporary costumes.

Nancy spoke directly to the audience, and the scenes materialize as she describes them.
