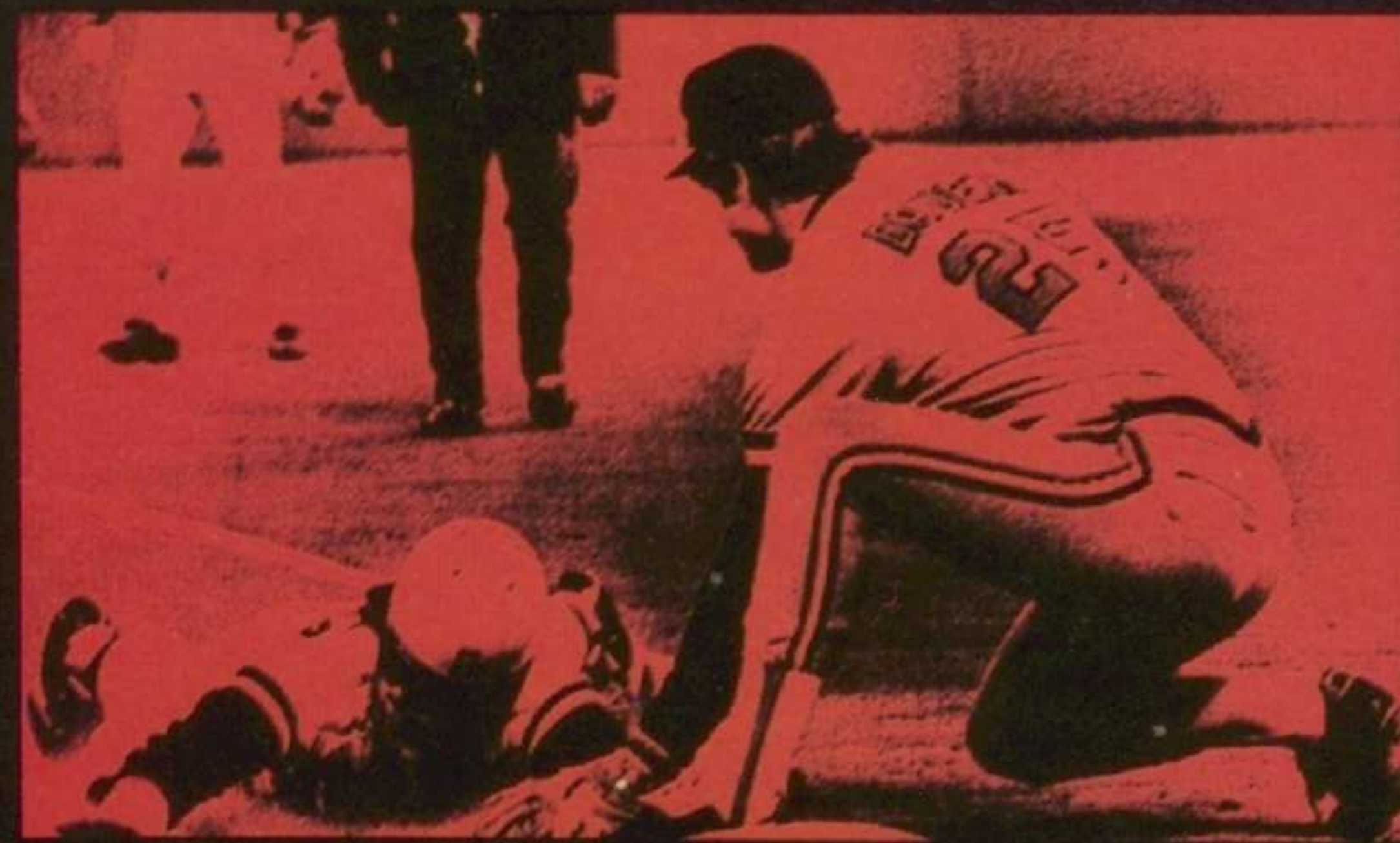

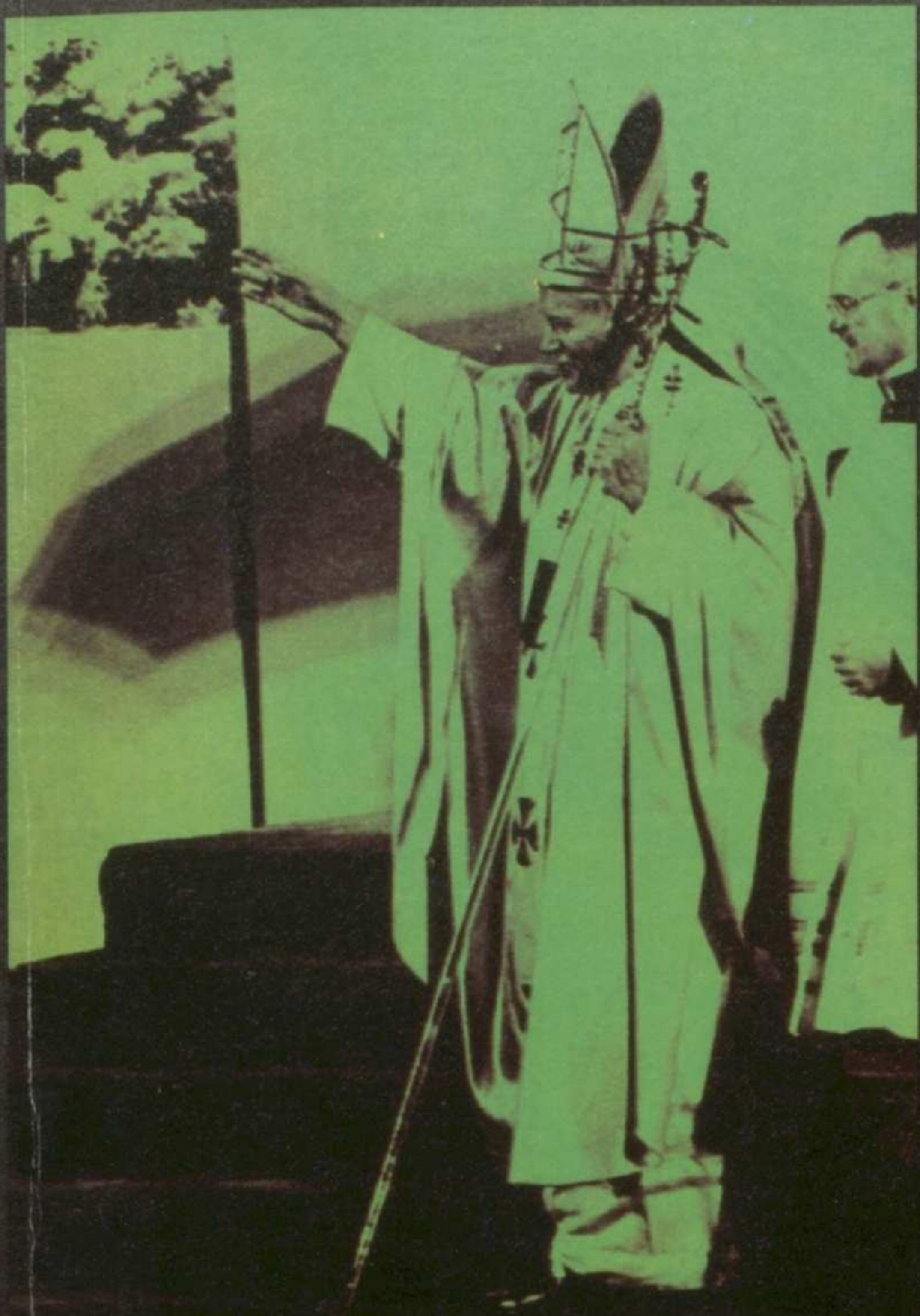

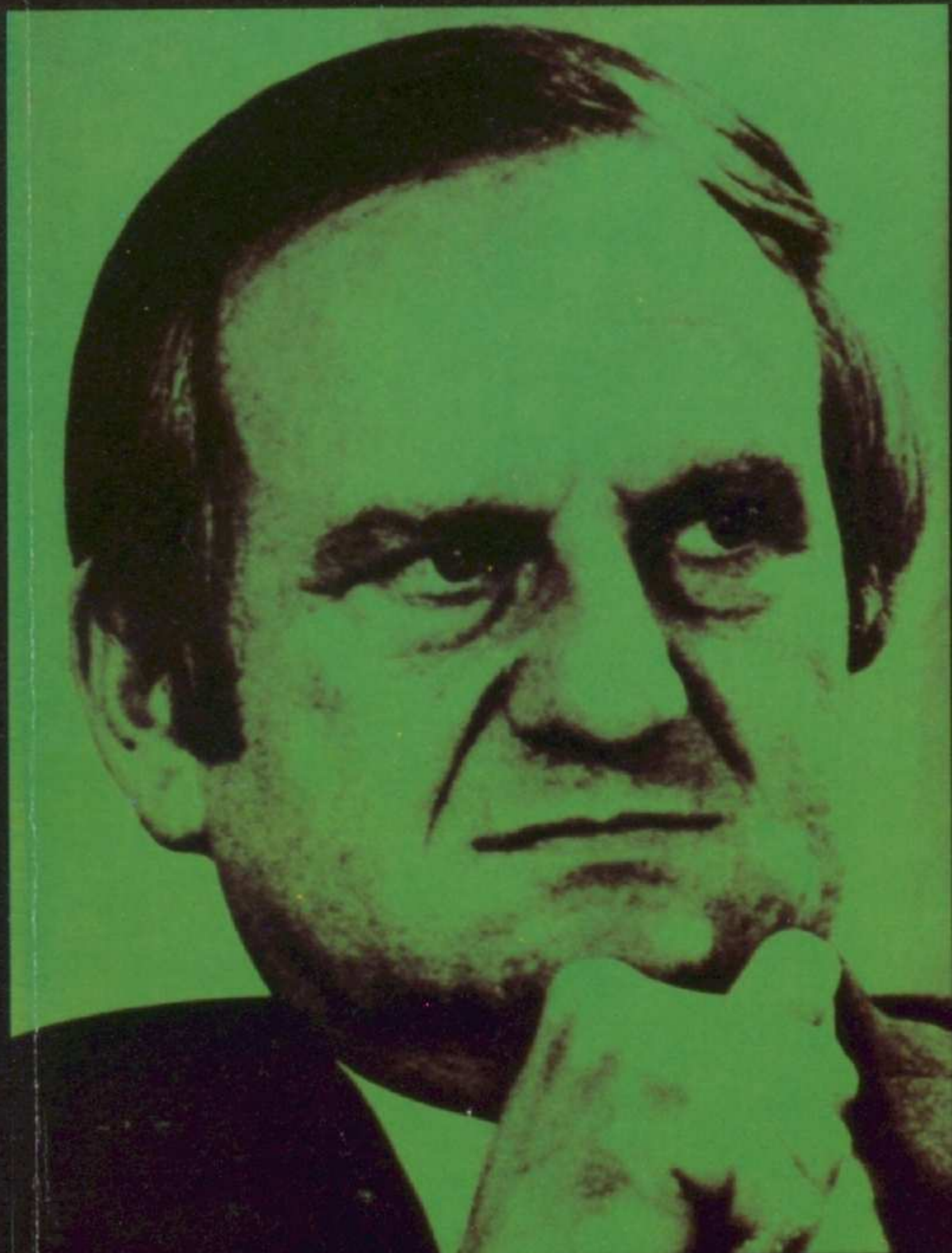

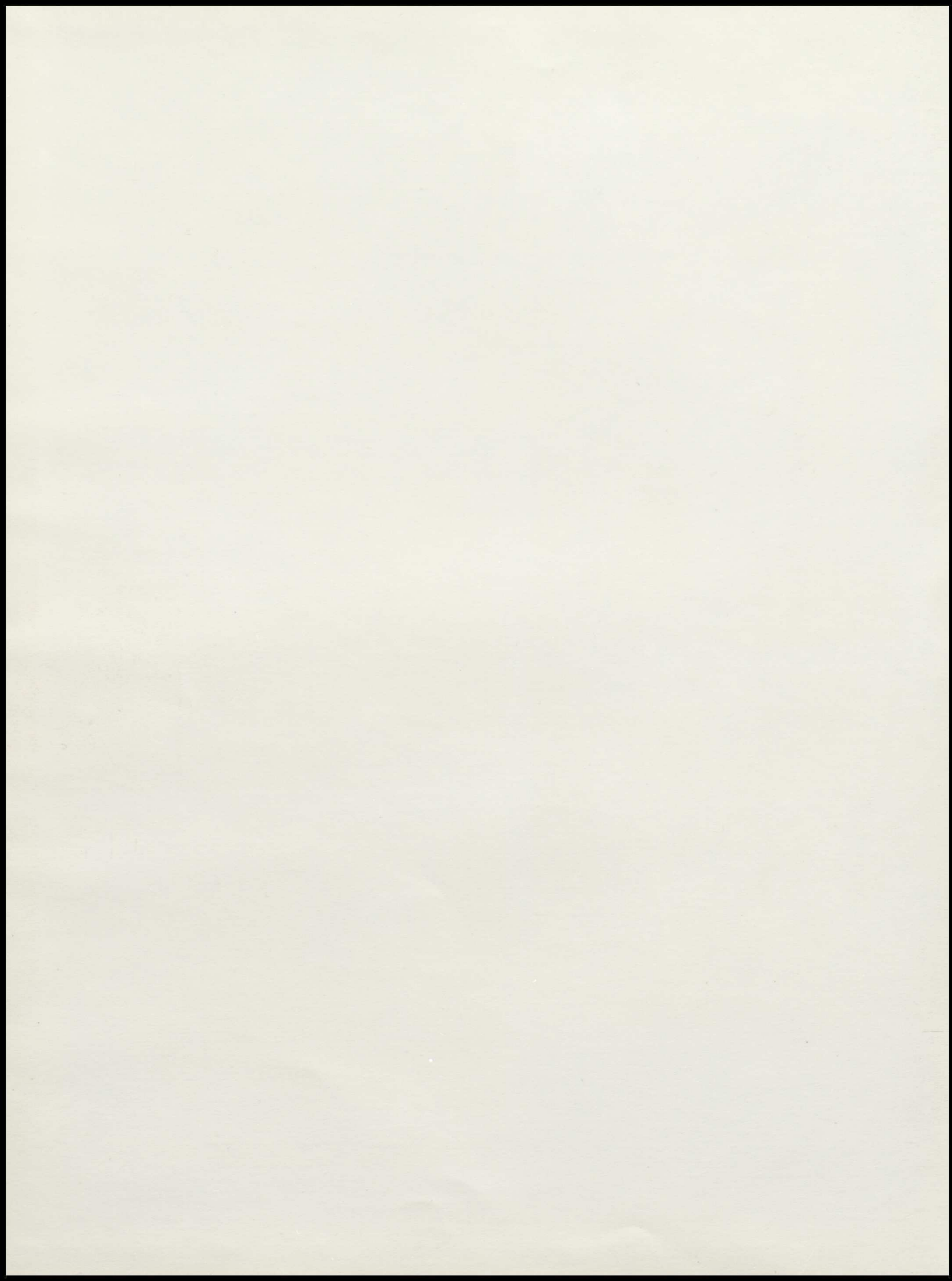

 And your Guide.



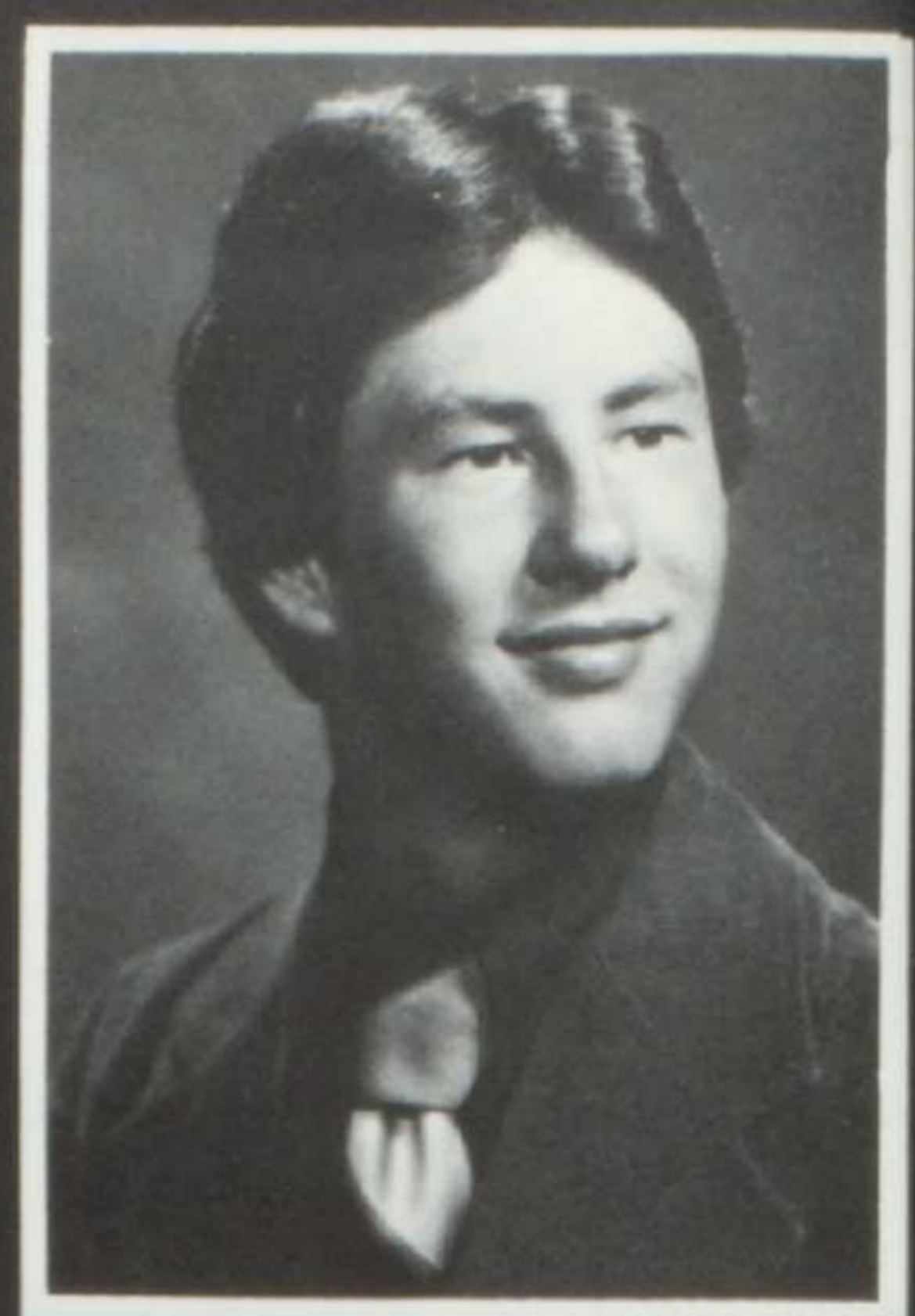

# Front page educational news



Worthington High School jumped into national prominence this year in the educational field because of the work done by Principal Dr. David Cavanaugh and about 40 teachers. These staff members, working at various levels of involvement, spent last year and this year investigating how students could experience greater academic success by assessing their learning styles and by helping students to use their learning strengths.

On the second day of the 1980 school year, the producers of the nationally broadcast program, "Good Morning, America," contacted Dr. Cavanaugh about bringing two students with him to New York to appear on the show. Juniors Cheryl Drake and Tim Thomas, who had experienced the "Learning Style Approach" in Mr. Ballinger's French III class during the previous year, accompanied Dr. Cavanaugh to appear live on September 3, 1979 at ABC's network studios in New York and to answer questions posed by the program's host, Hugh Downs. They explained that a student's learning style was assessed by means of the "Learning Style Inventory," which asks 100 questions about how students learn best. The inventory can identify which of 36 different factors are important to a student as they are learning. The factors are divided into four groups: environmental (describing the conditions of where the student learns), sociological (the people with whom a student learns best), emotional (the feelings important to a student's efforts to learn), and physical (the ways in which the body affects learning).

Dr. Cavanaugh and the two students were aware of what questions would be asked. However, Mr. Downs asked a "zinger," one final question that they were not prepared for. He asked the "real world" question; that is, if a student's learning style is "catered to" in high school, how prepared is that student to enter the "real world" where people don't take a person's learning style into account? Each



one gave an immediate, spontaneous and articulate response. Tim said that by knowing his learning style he knew how to accommodate material to his learning style by himself. Cheryl said that knowing her learning style helped her to make career choices that matched what she already knew about herself through the Learning Style Inventory. Dr. Cavanaugh said that a student who experiences greater success in high school because of this approach is going to be much more able to cope with the "real world." (In an interview published in April, 1980, Fran Tarkenton, former NFL quarterback and now president of his own consulting firm, makes it clear that it is the "real world" that has to change: "Many companies still think of productivity as a function of new plants, new equipment, new technology. But one area they have largely ignored is human resources. They haven't helped people work together more efficiently and get more satisfaction out of their jobs.")

Response to that television appearance came from across the nation. Ironically, "Good Morning, America" was pre-empted locally by the Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon. Only people who had Qube could see the show in the Columbus area.

*U.S. News & World Report*, a national news magazine, did a story on the Learning Style Approach at Worthington High School in its year-end issue (December 31, 1979), "Outlook '80." The article appeared in a ten-page special section entitled "Some Lessons for the Decade Ahead." In addition to highlighting Worthington High School with interviews and photographs of Mrs. Frank's and Mr. Ballinger's classrooms, the article indicated that this Learning Style Approach is not just a local phenomenon. Efforts here are being observed and replicated across the United States. The National Association of Secondary School Principals is following our progress with great interest.

As a result of this national recognition, Dr. Cavanaugh was asked to testify before



a congressional committee in Washington, D.C. on February 5, 1980. Inquiries about this program have come from as far away as France and Germany.

The genesis of Worthington High School's involvement in learning styles can be traced to a key-note address given by Dr. Derrick Nunney, then Vice-President of Oakland Community College in Michigan. Dr. Nunney was speaking before the Central States Conference on Foreign Language Teaching attended by 1500 members from the seventeen-state region. Dr. Nunney explained the concept of Cognitive Style Mapping which is used to assess how students process information. Course material was then provided to students in a variety of cognitive styles, an approach that enabled students to perform at 90% success or better. Mr. Ballinger, a WHS French teacher, heard the address and attended the follow-up workshop. He saw the possibilities of using this approach at the high school level and talked to Dr. Cavanaugh about this approach. Dr. Cavanaugh spent a year trying to track down more information about Cognitive Style Mapping. In May, 1978, he attended a workshop for principals in Kansas City on Cognitive and Learning Styles. It was there that he met Drs. Rita and Kenneth Dunn, who developed the Learning Style Inventory and had written a book, *Teaching Students through their Individual Learning Styles*. Dr. Cavanaugh recognized that this Learning Style Approach was more comprehensive than looking only at cognitive styles and that the explanation of Learning Styles was in a form nearer to application to high school instruction.

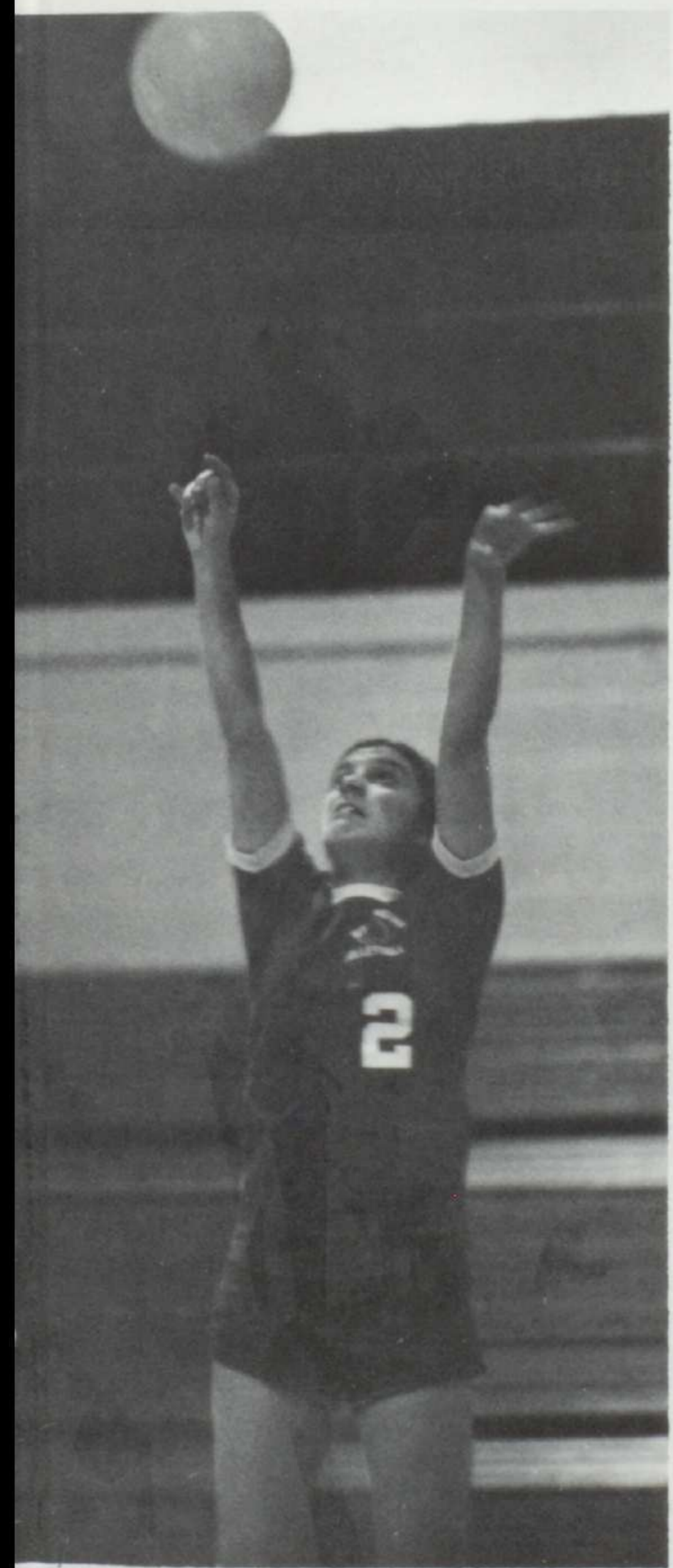
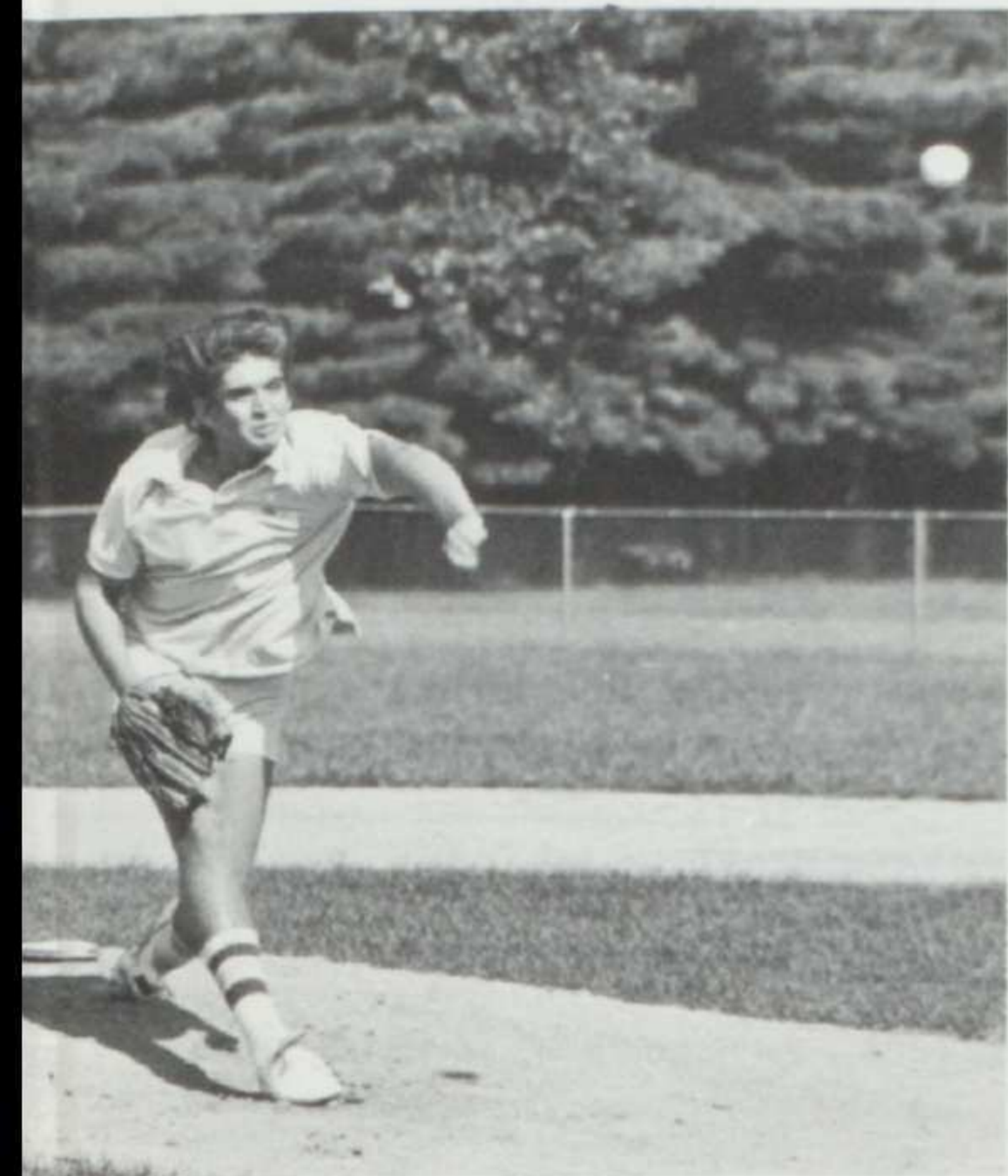
In September, 1978, Mr. Ballinger's four French III classes were the first students to have their learning styles assessed. In October, Dr. Cavanaugh and three high school teachers attended a three-day workshop on Learning Styles given by Drs. Rita and Kenneth Dunn in Washington, D.C. During the rest of that school year, one third of the high school staff met once a month to learn about this approach and to share ideas on how to apply this approach to their classrooms.

Teachers from other schools in the Worthington school district became interested in Learning Styles. In August, 1979, thirteen elementary, middle, and high school teachers went to a five-day workshop on Learning Styles in New York. It was at this point that the Worthington City Schools began attracting national and even international recognition for moving in the direction that many experts feel all of education must go in the future.

# Camaraderie





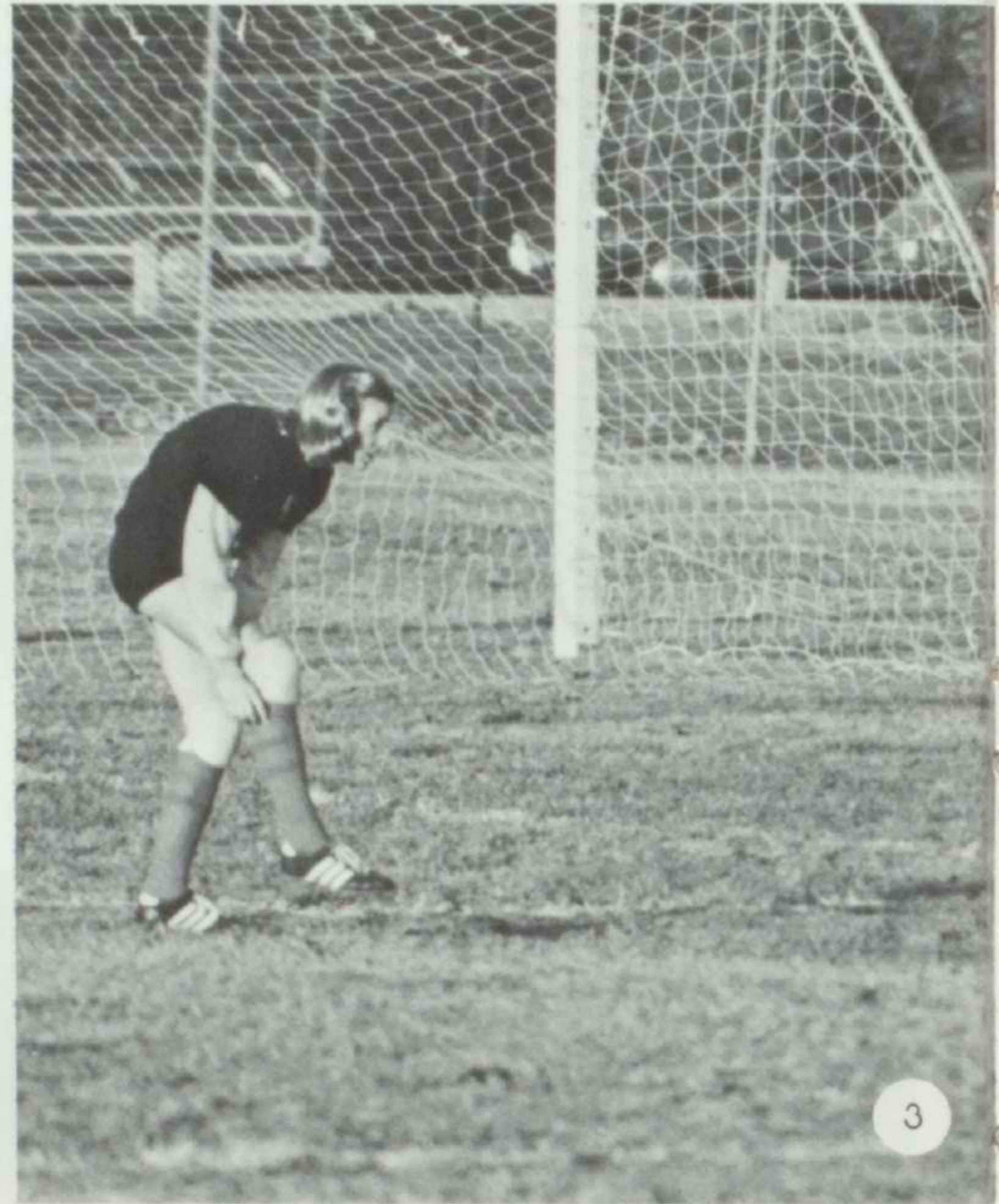
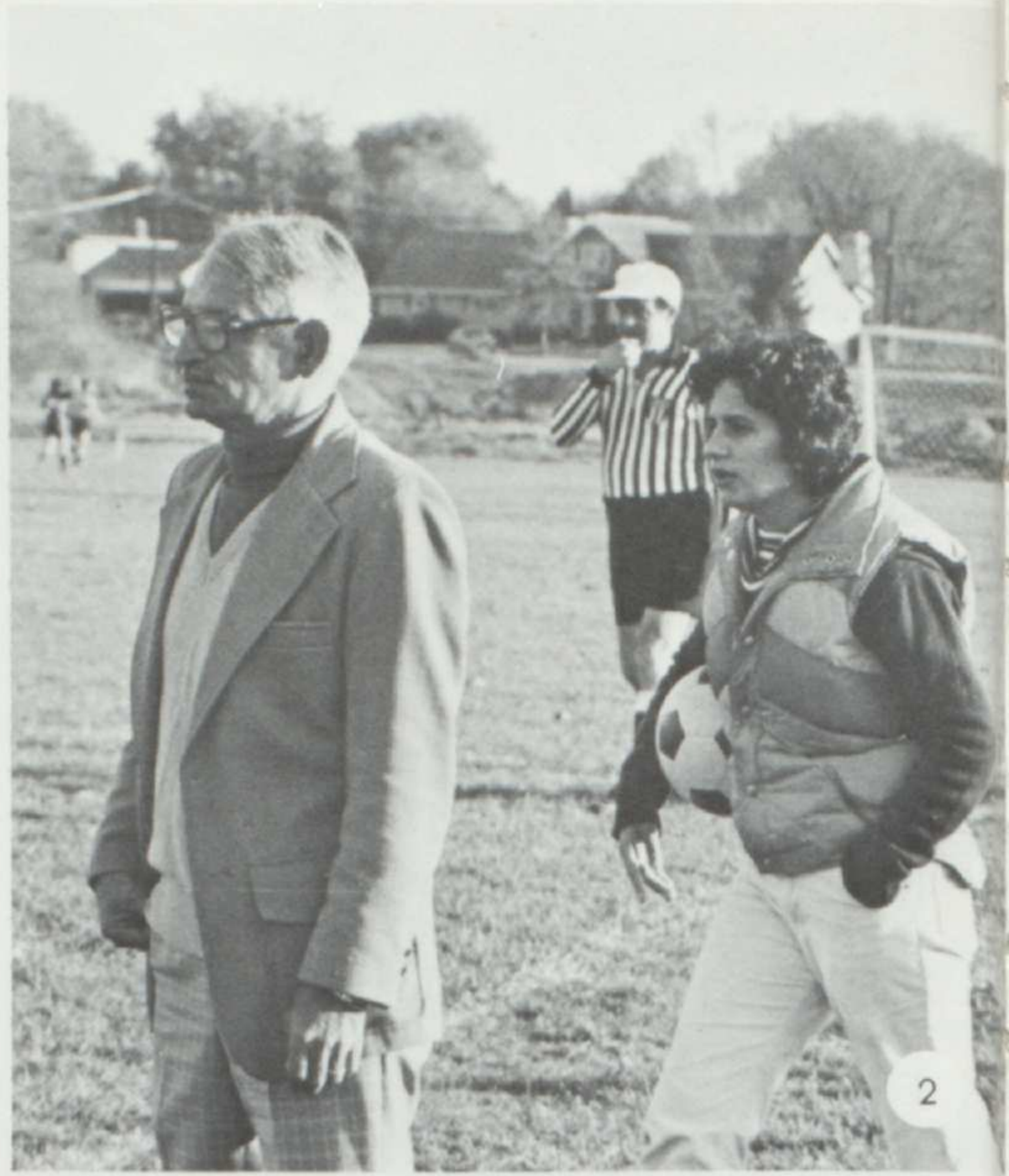

With obvious reason, coach Geri Stephan described the season as "great" and expects an equally successful season in 1980.

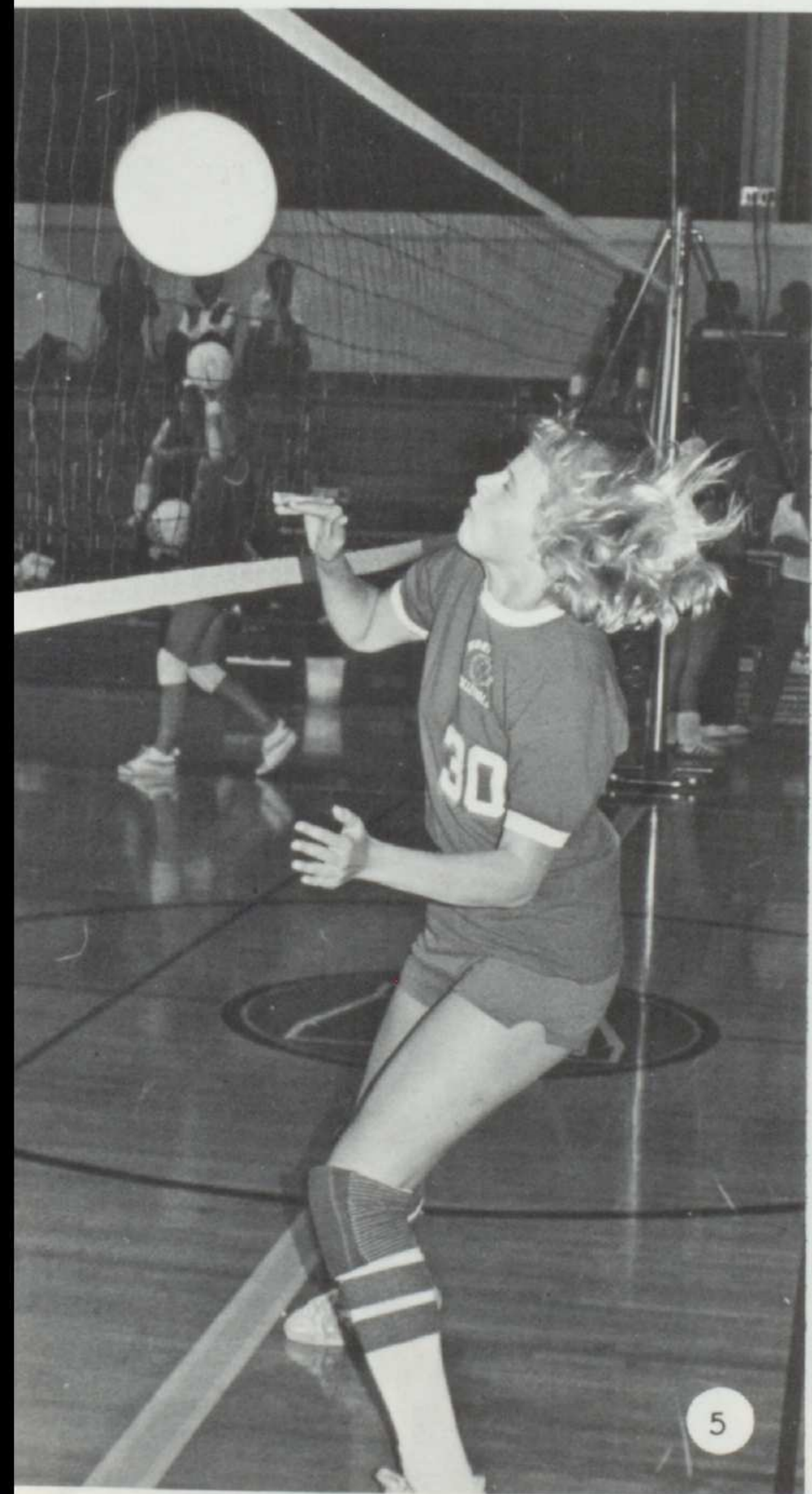
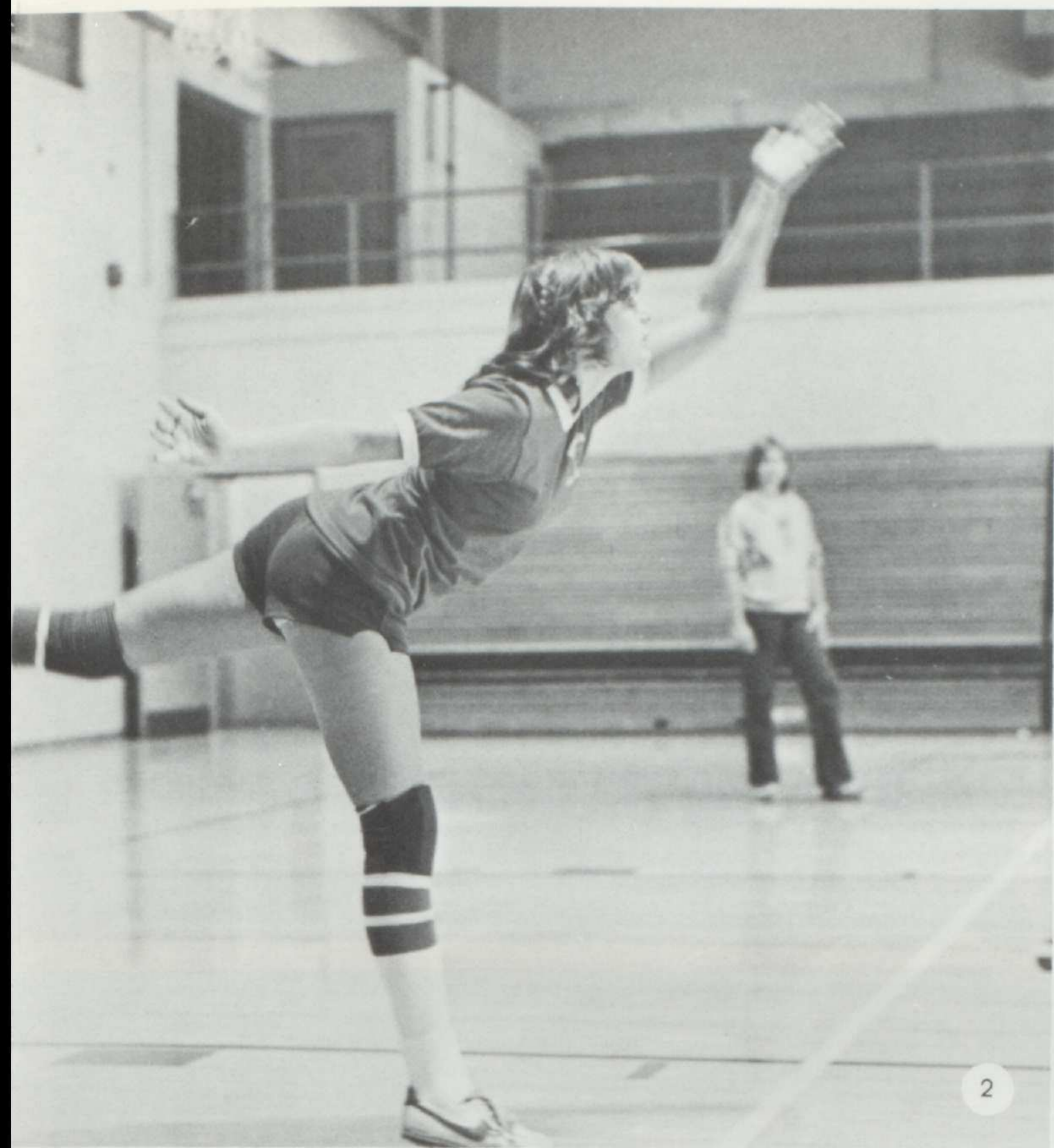
# Spikers are OCC co-champs

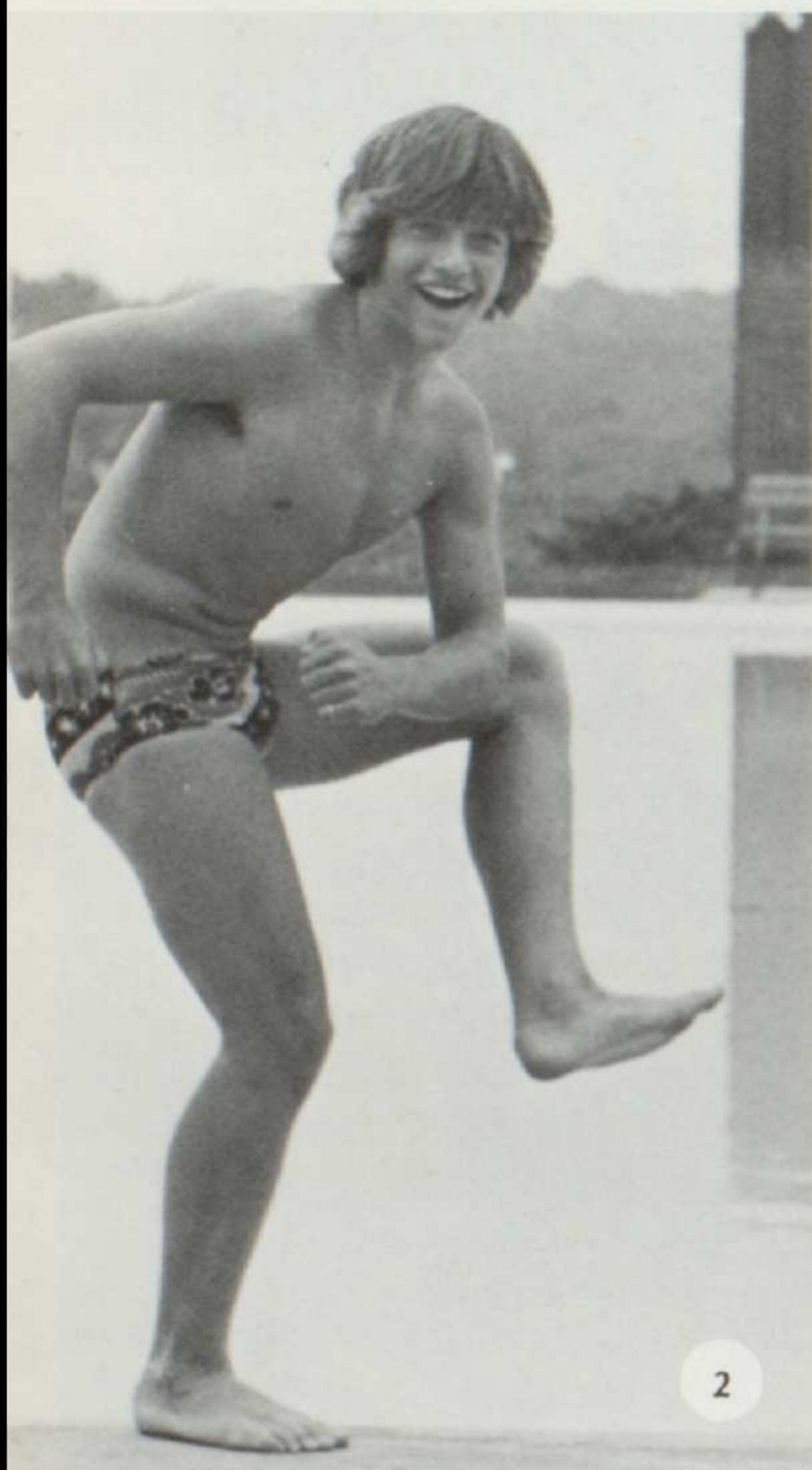
## Girls take time out for track

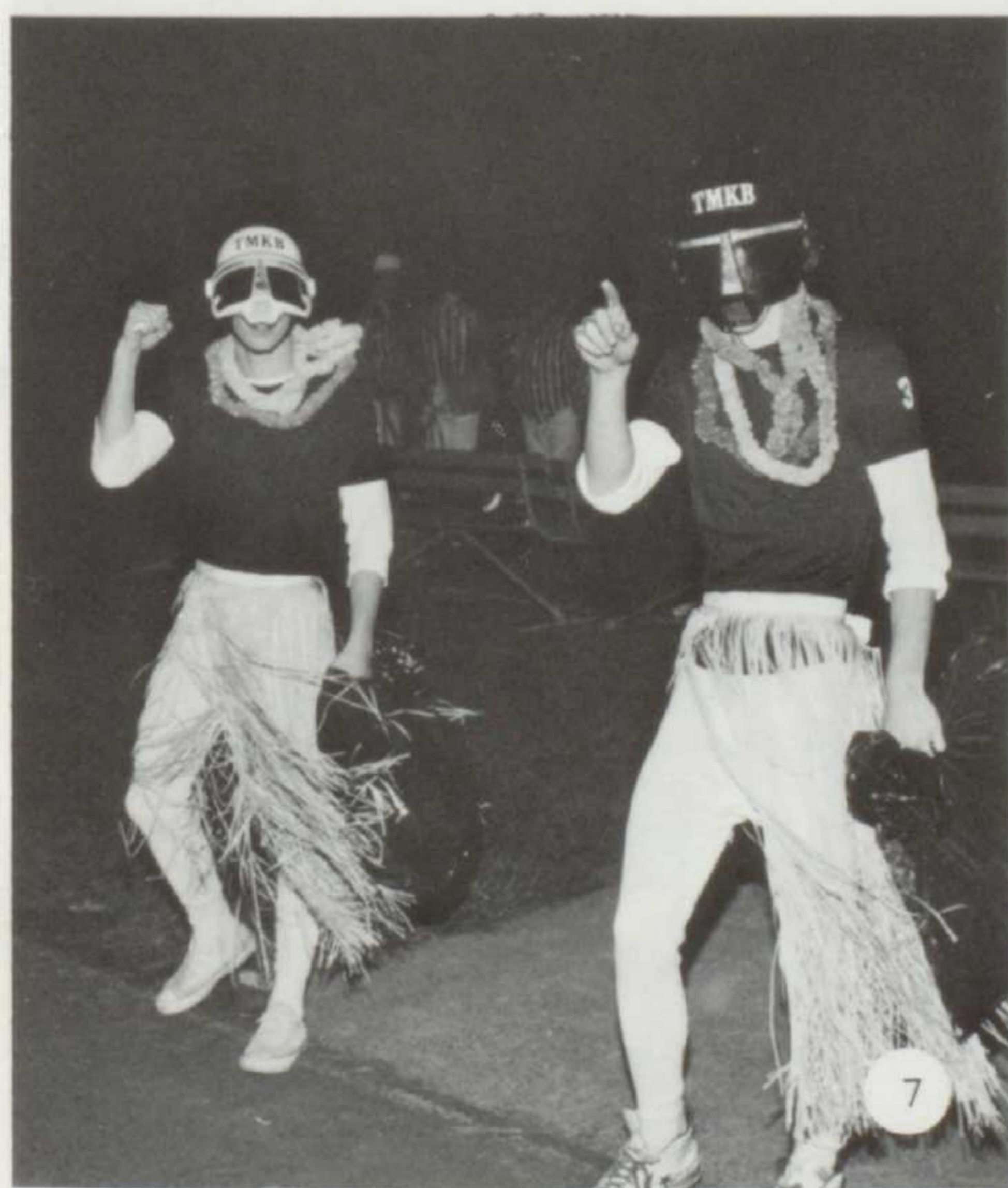

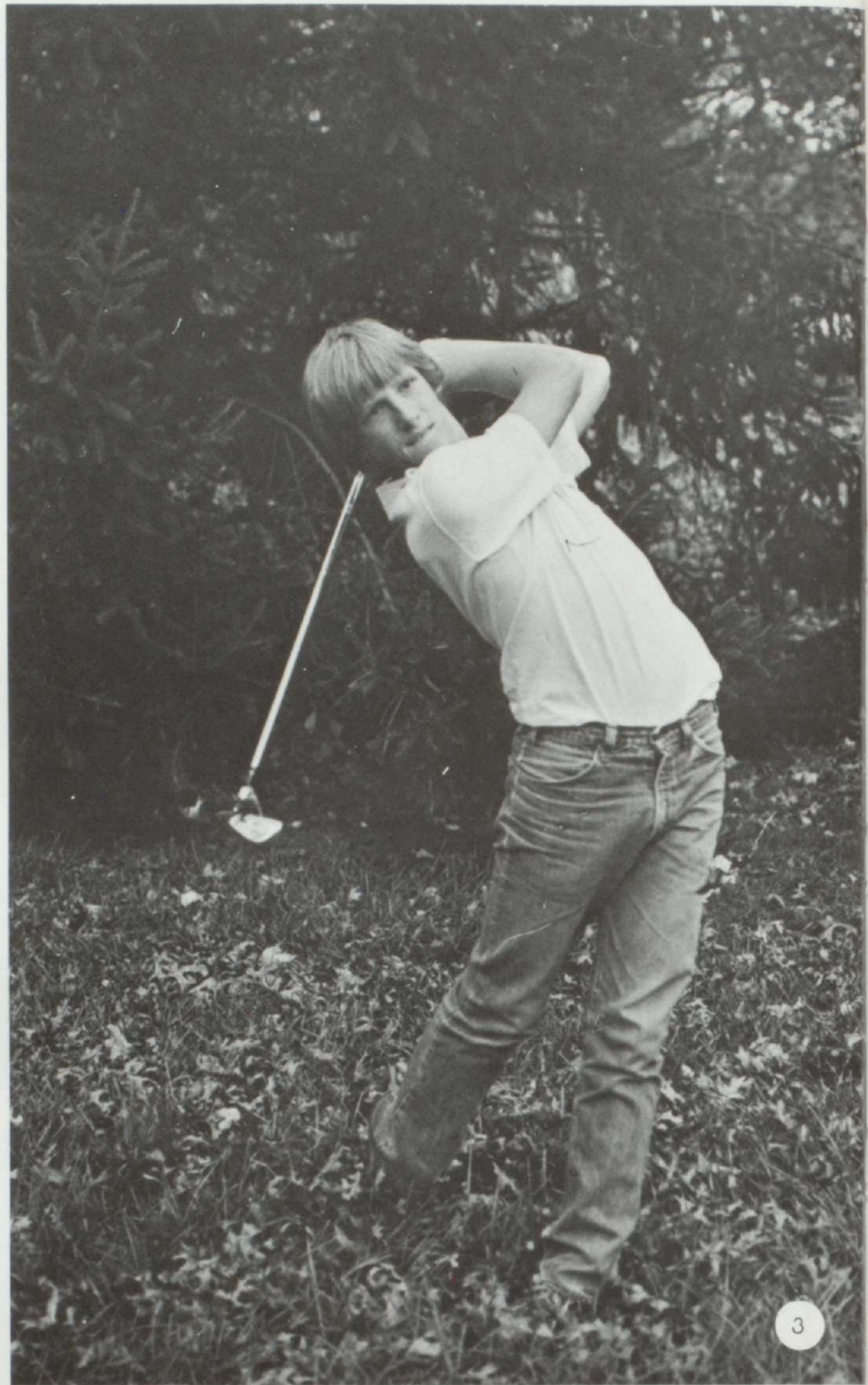

# Golfers take OCC for sixth straight year





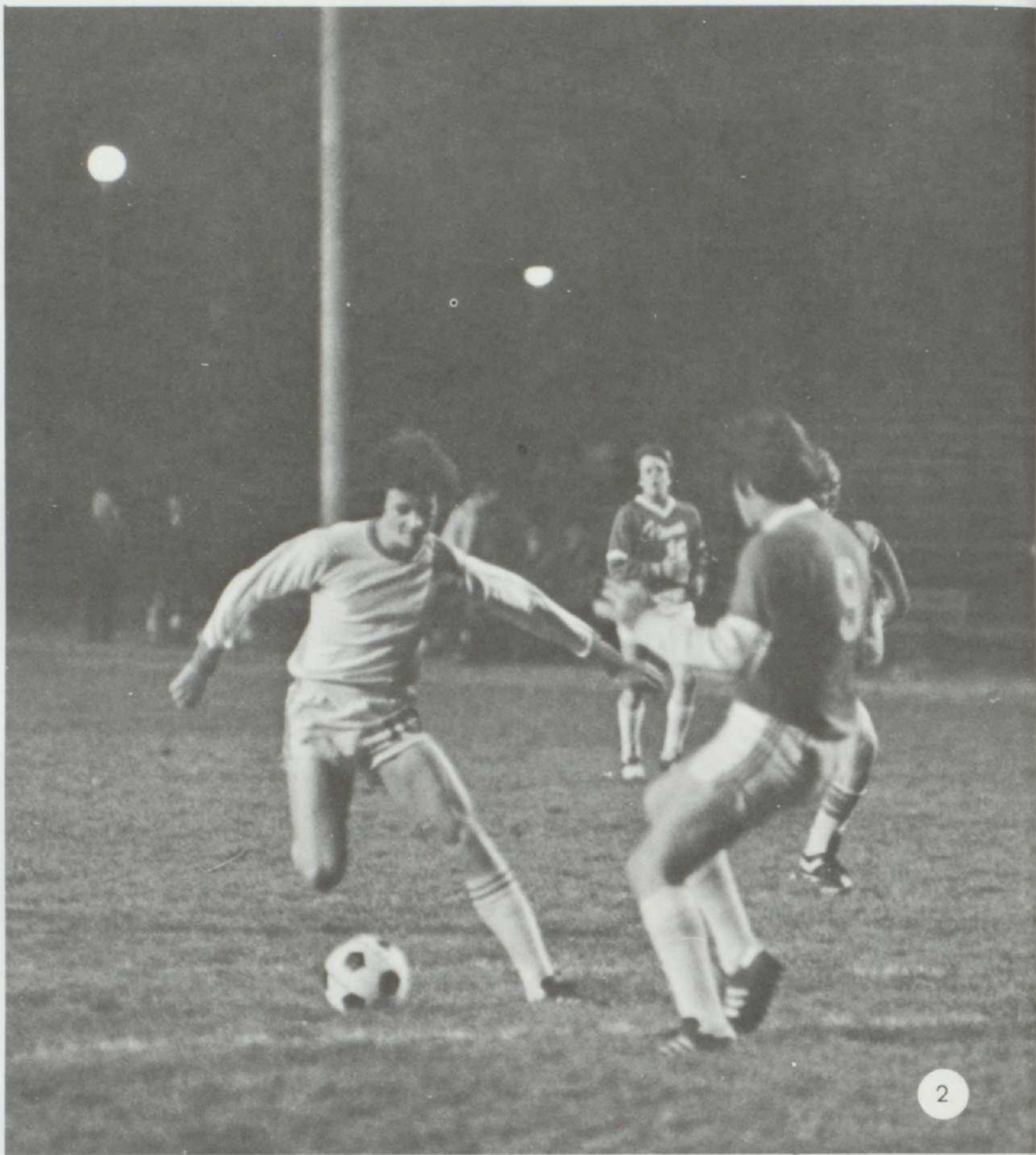
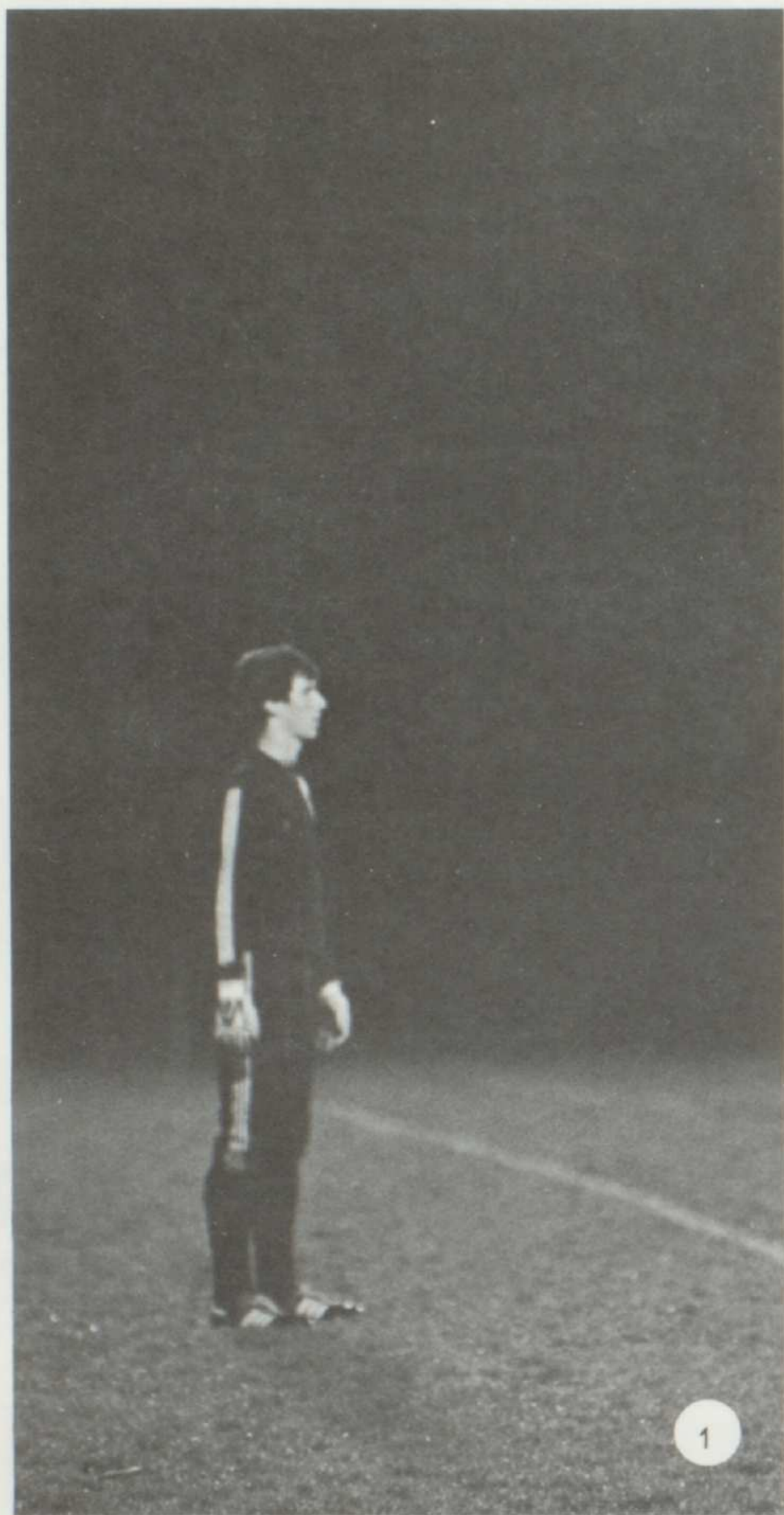


The varsity golf team swung its way into a 23-3 record and an OCC Championship for the sixth consecutive year.

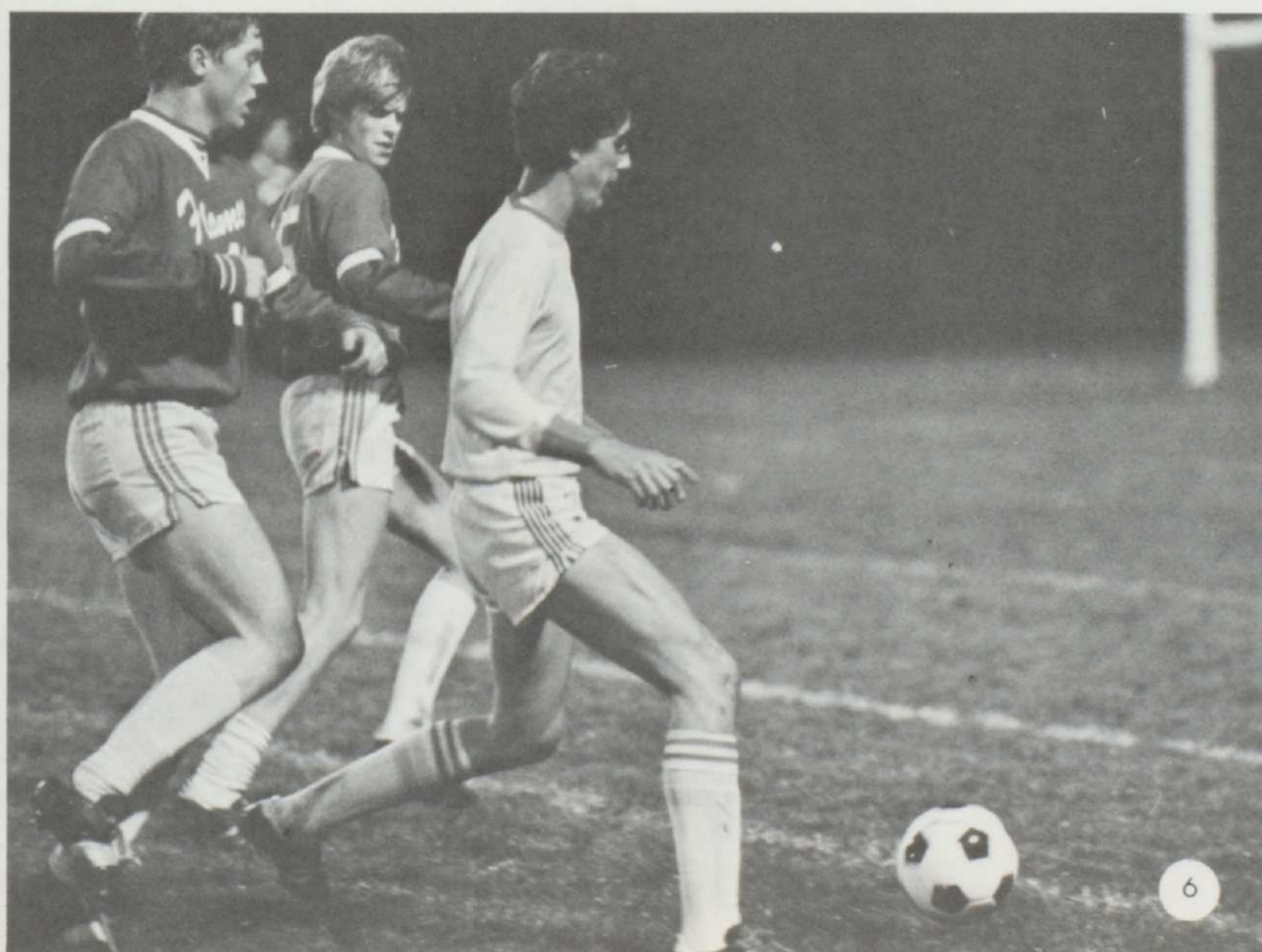
# Down on the floodplain . . .

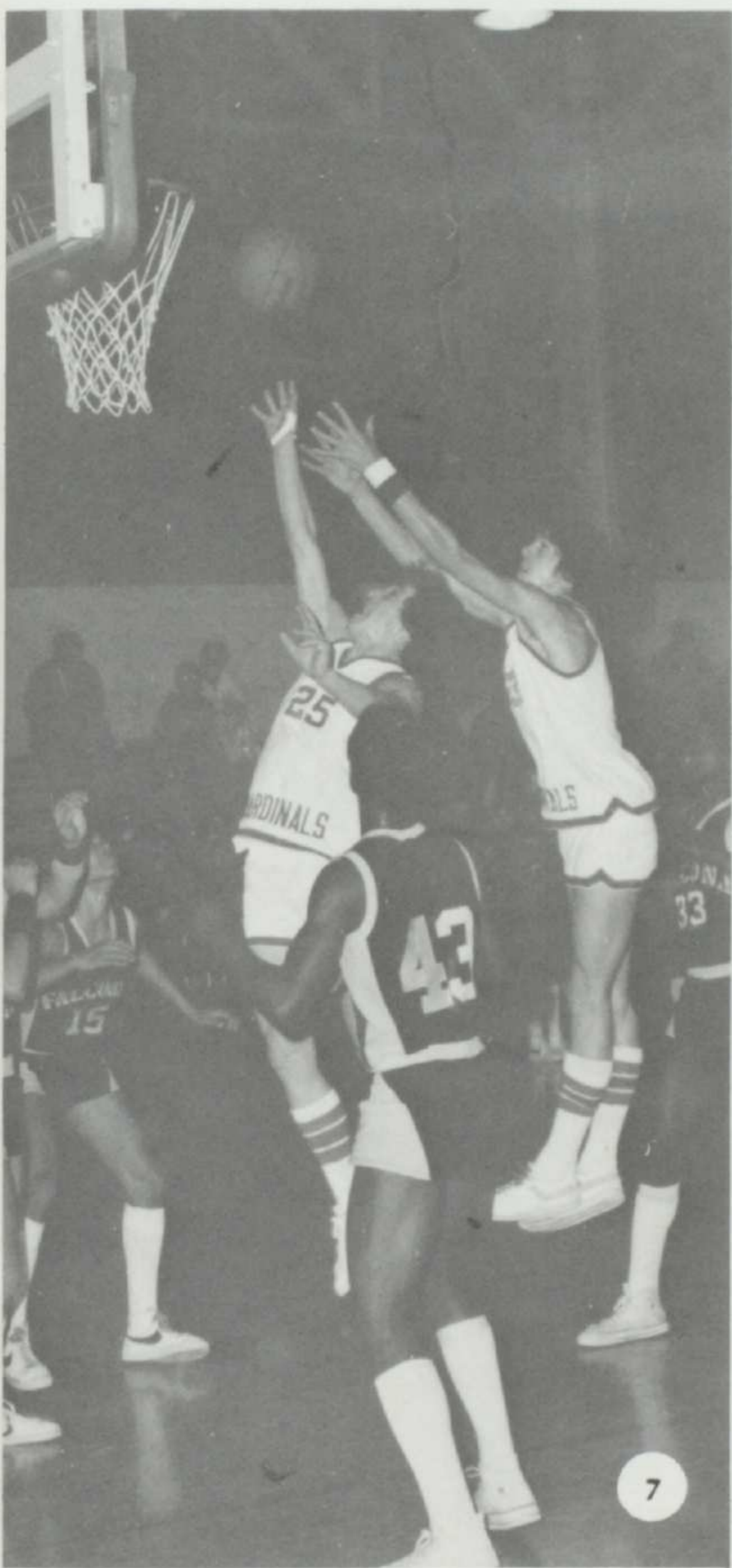

## Daup brings new style

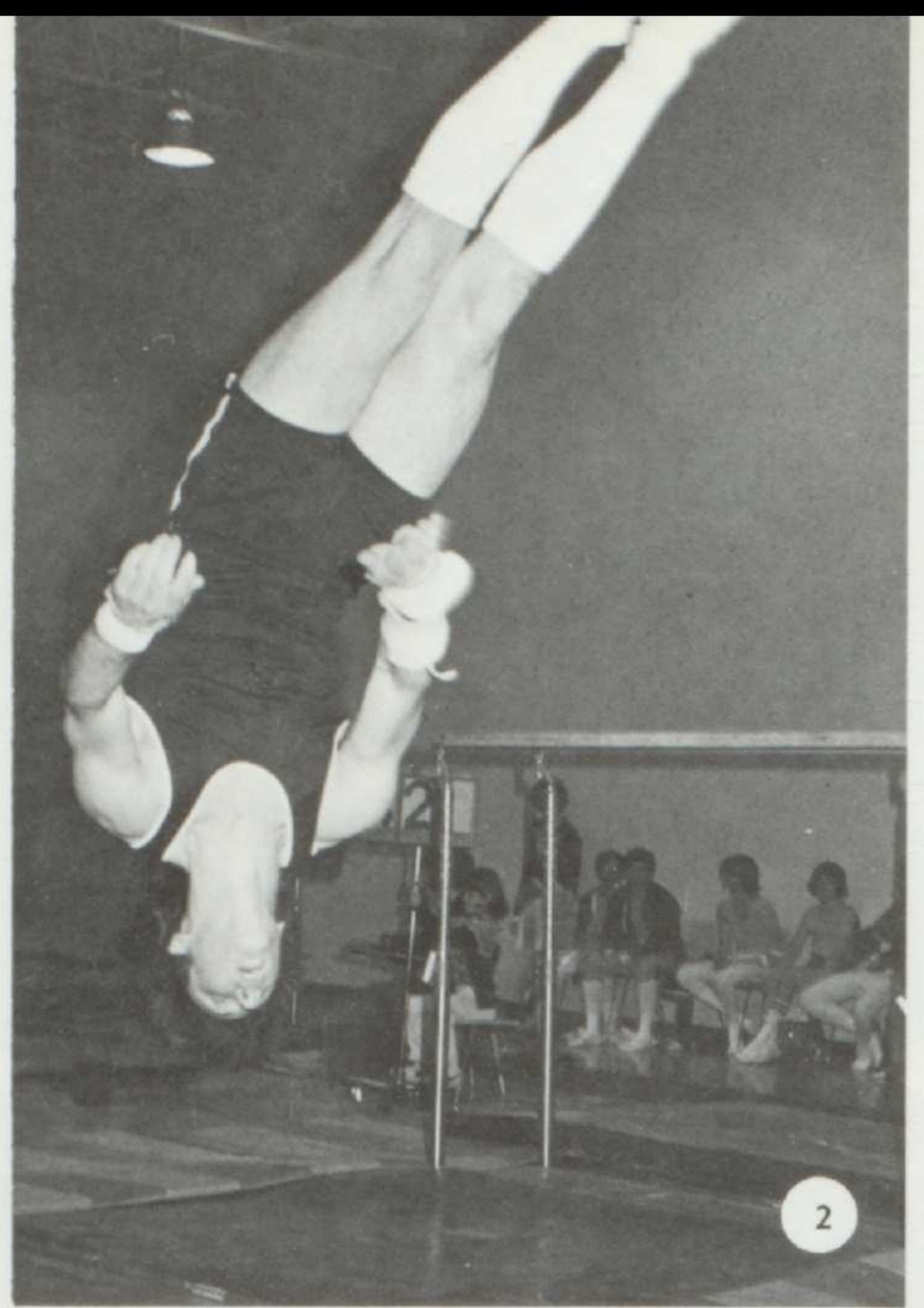

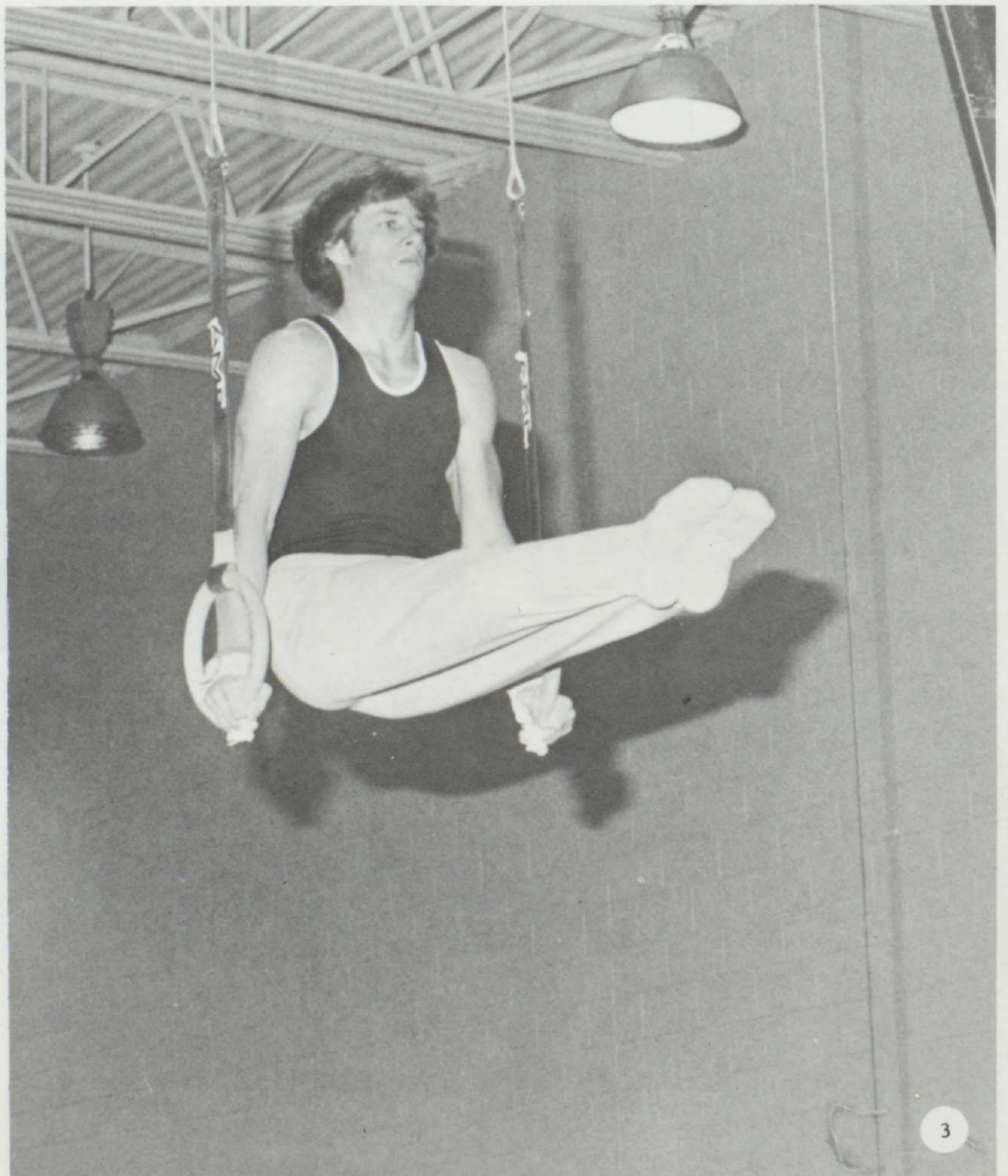
## Gymnasts hit the bars

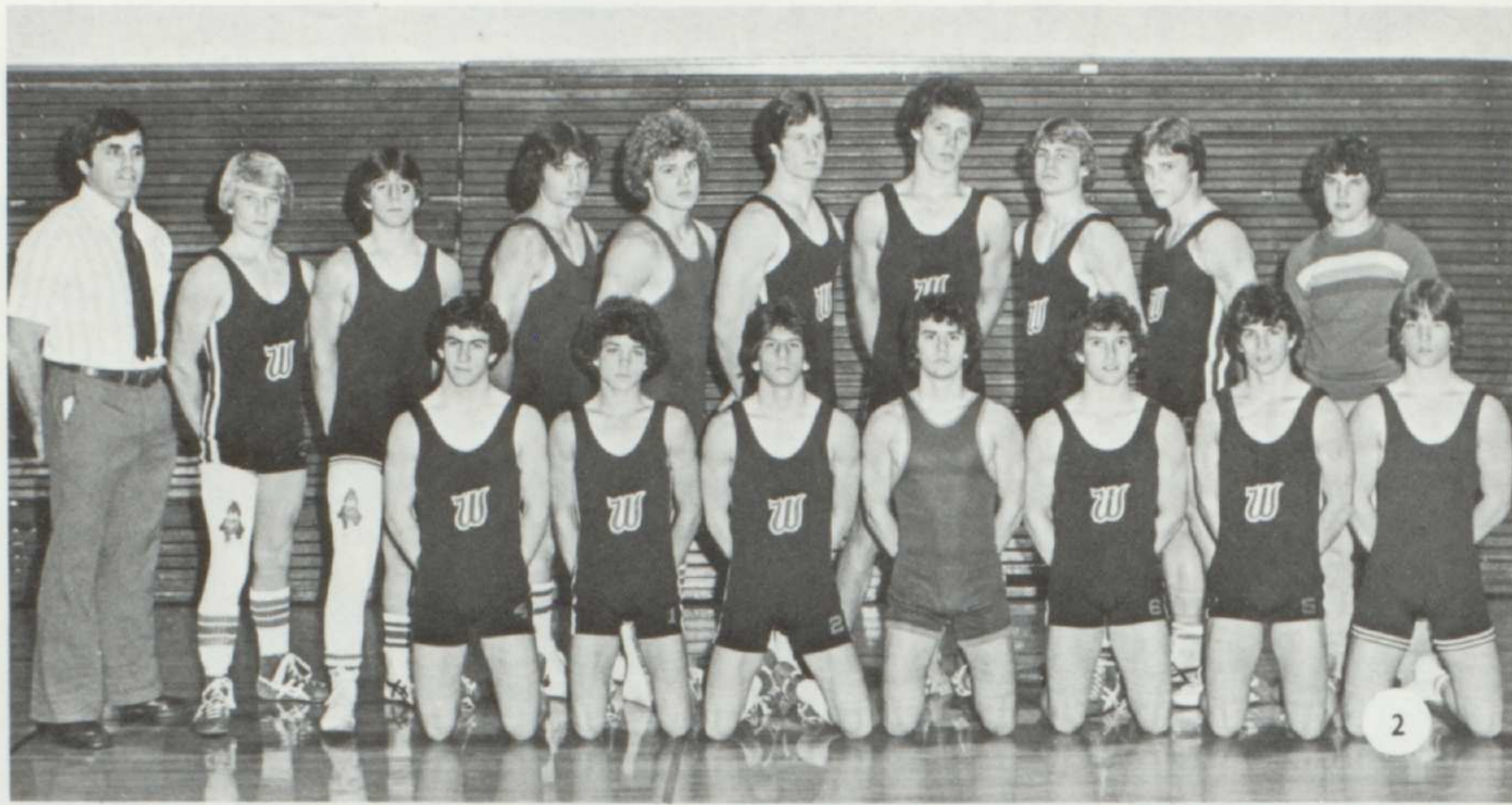
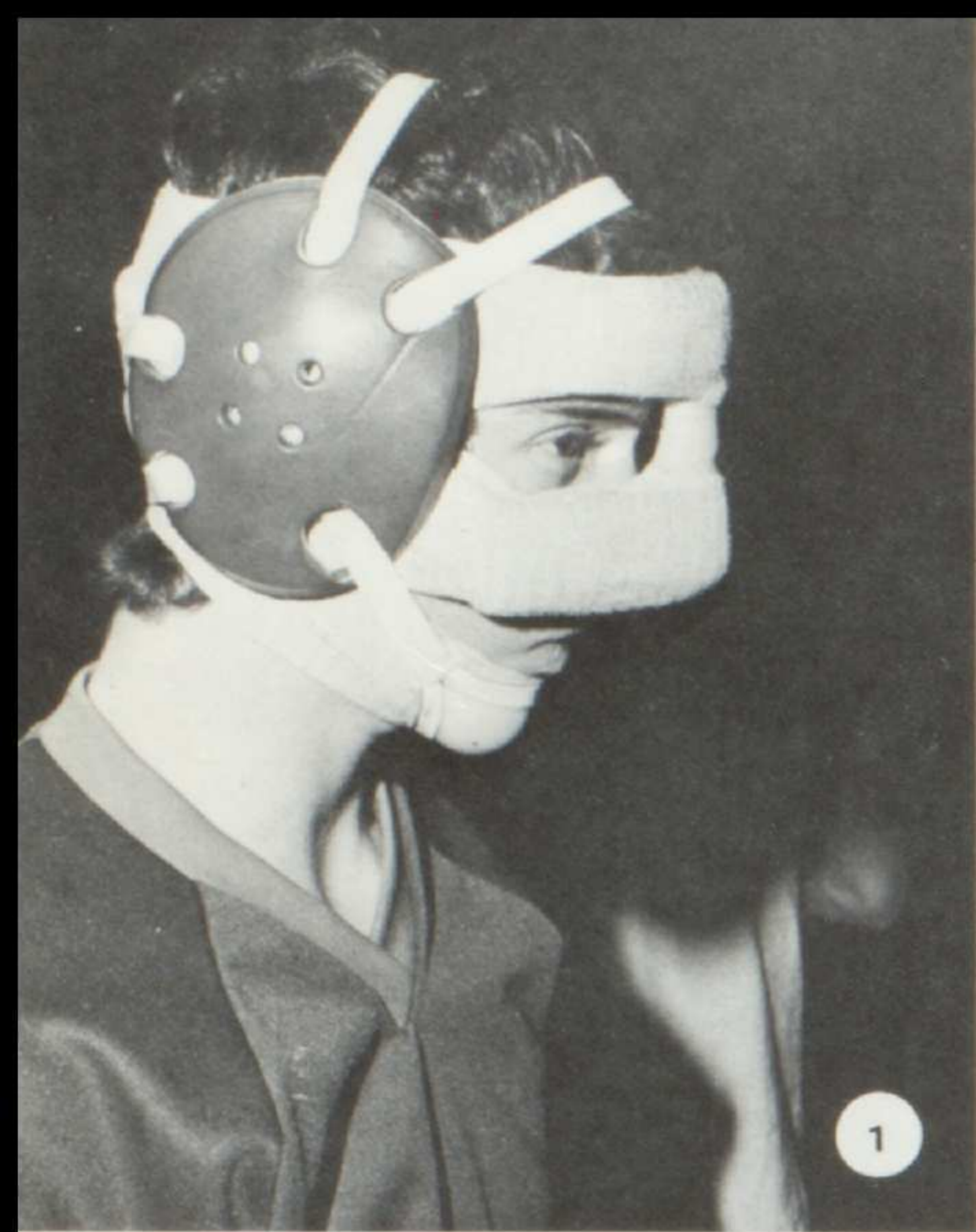
# Pride: a swimming tradition

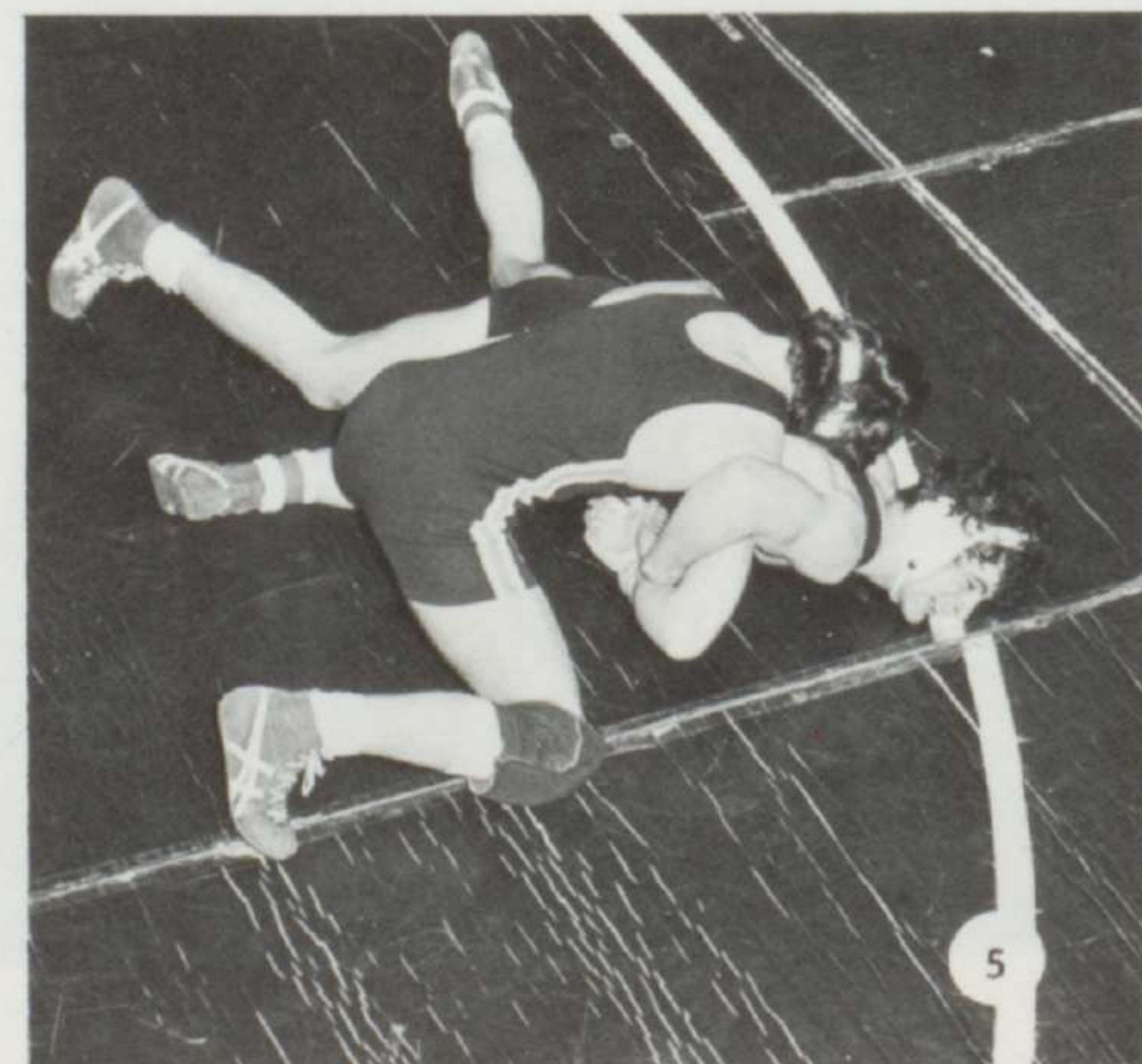
The 1980 team will be remembered all around the state as several of the swimmers have left their marks by posting meet, pool, and all but two school records!



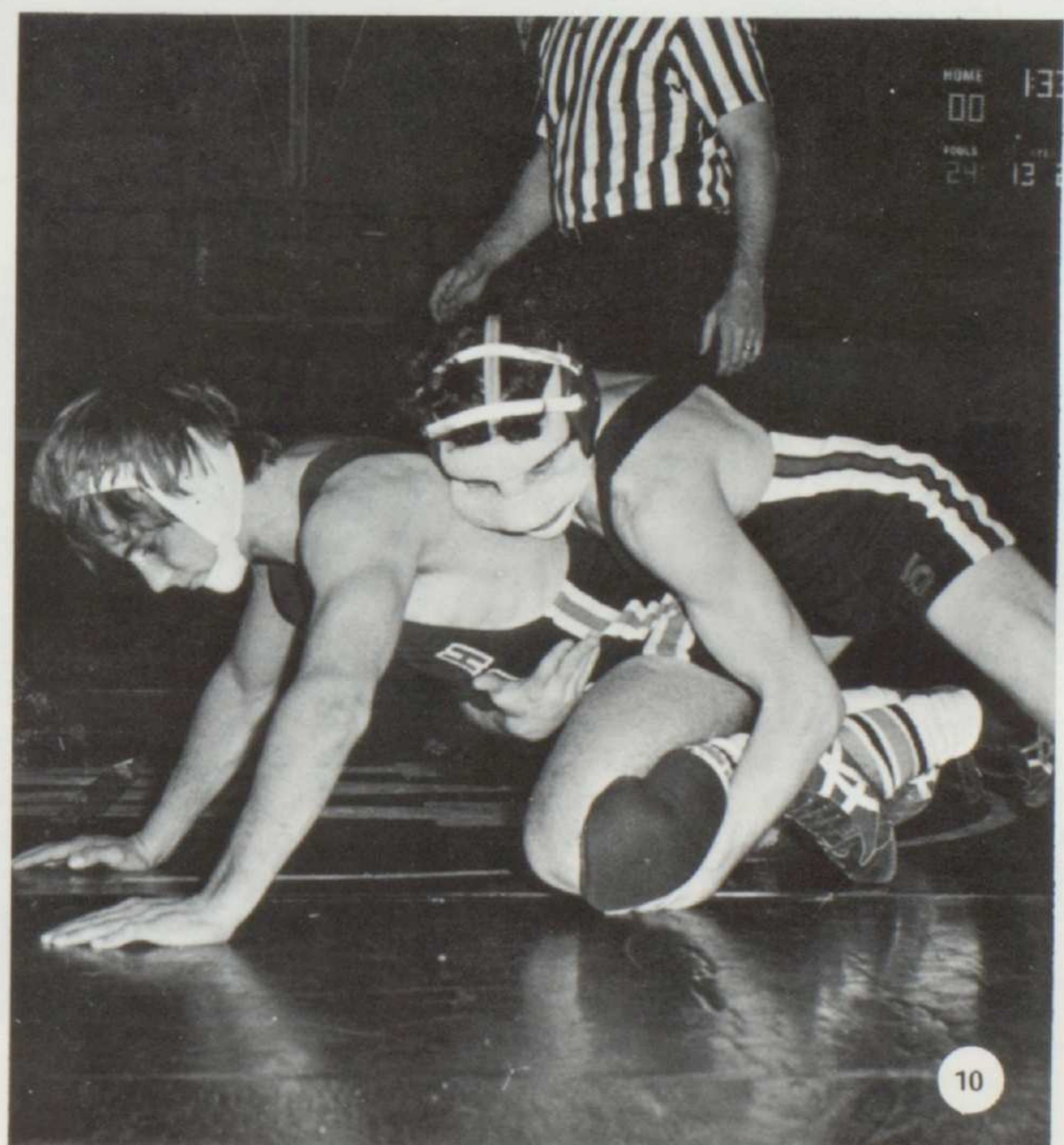
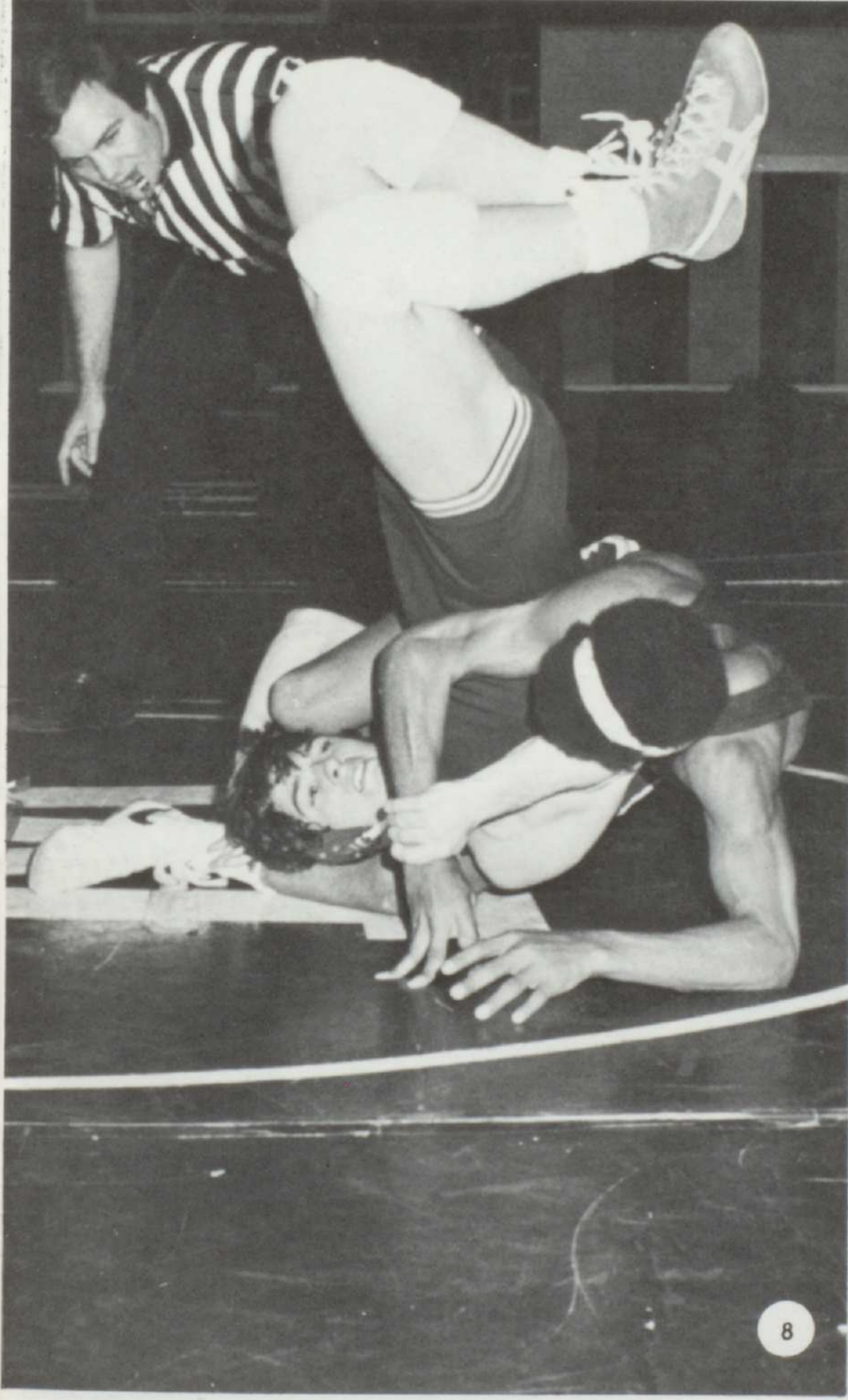
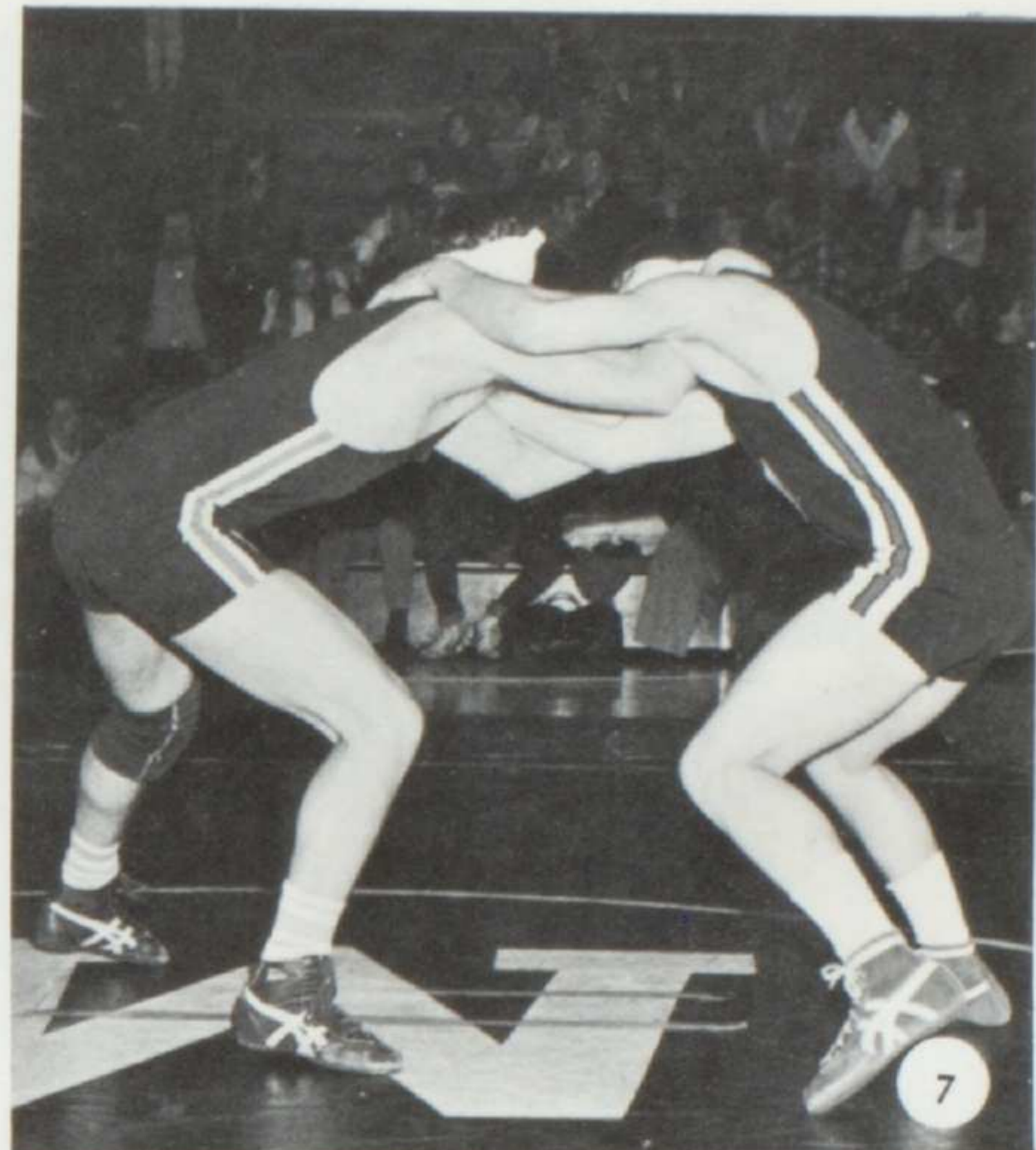
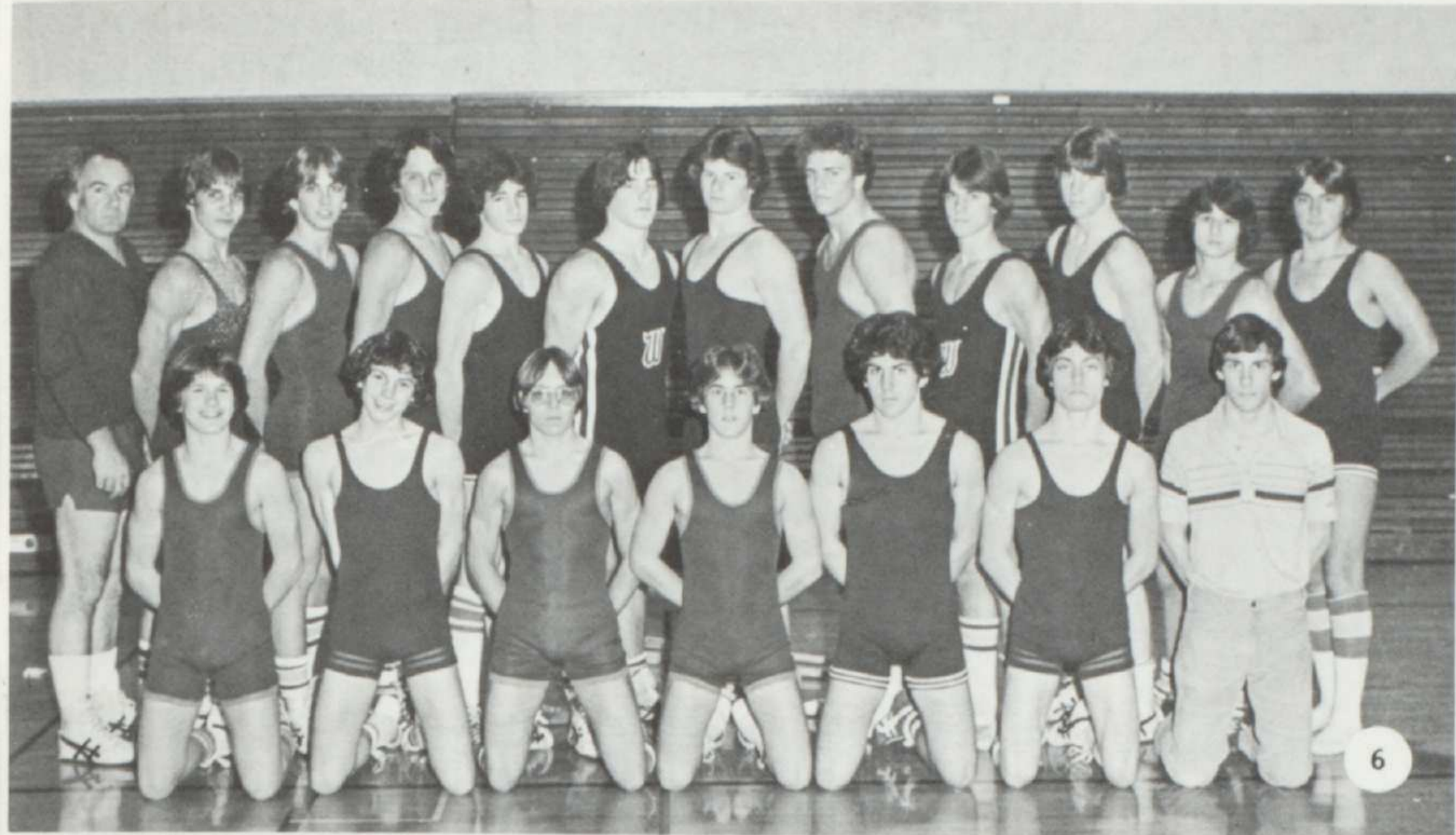

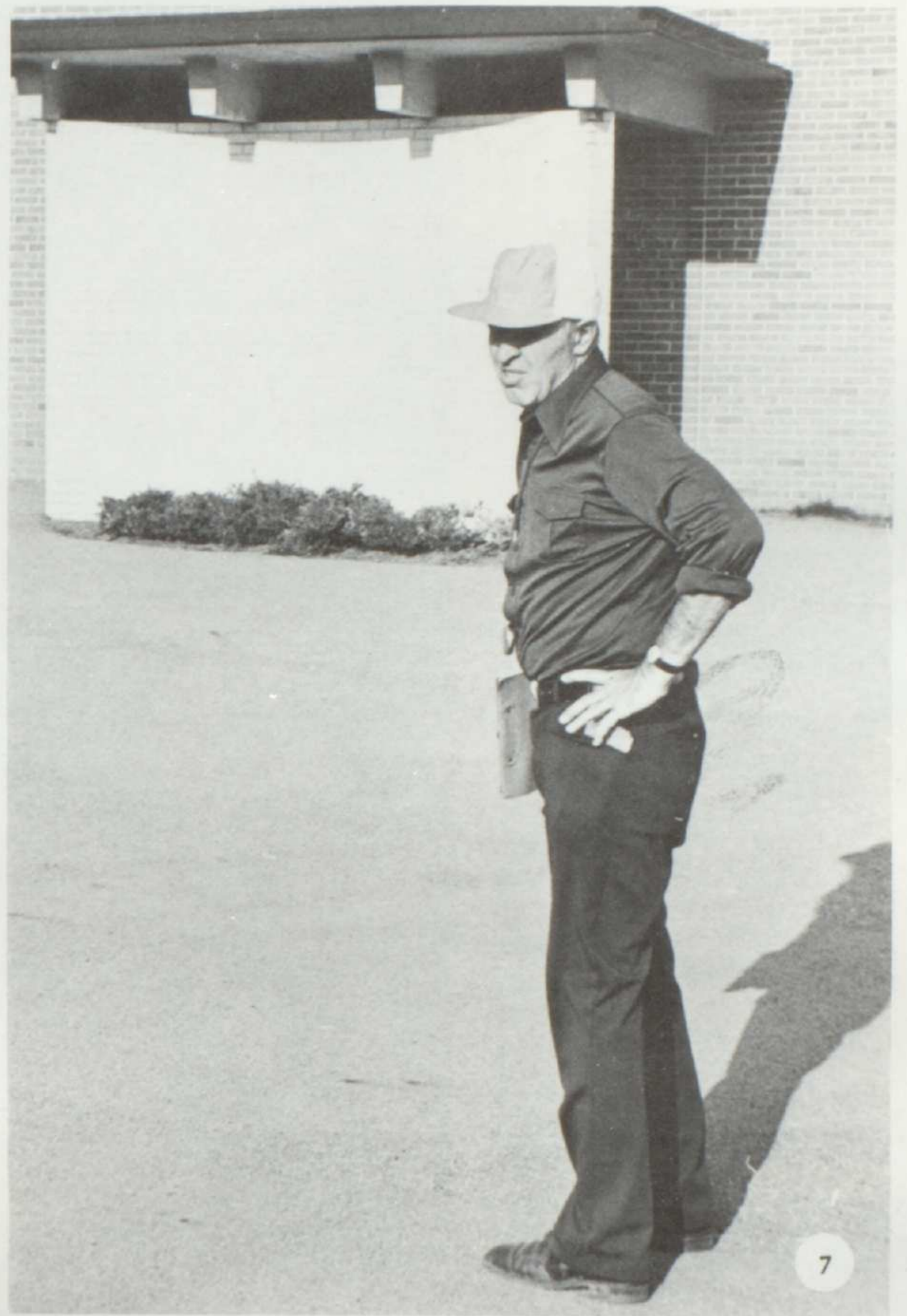
# Track team triumphs

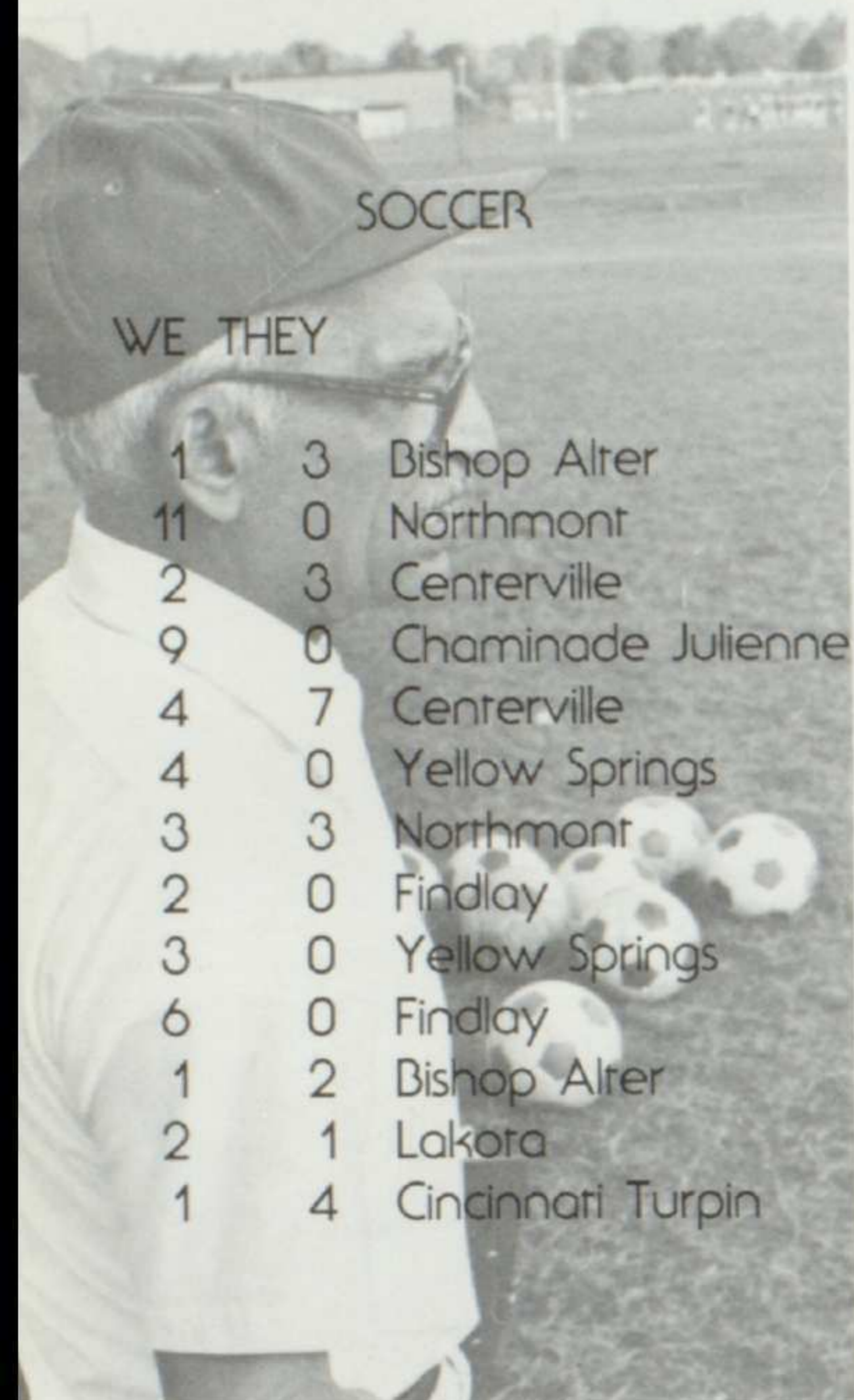

## Motivation Satisfaction

Perhaps the most exciting enterprise concerning mathematics this year was Mr. David Holl's project in his three geometry classes. This was the basis for his Masters degree thesis. His project attempted to use outdoor education as a motivating device for geometry students, by demonstrating that information learned in the classroom can be used in the "real world". His two-month long program directly applied many segment, angle and trigonometric formulas to surveying techniques that the students used in the field. After the program was completed, Mr. Holl found that the attitude of the students toward geometry had dramatically improved. The students were more pleased with their work because they understood it better and this led to the ultimate goal-increased productivity of students which is what it's all about.

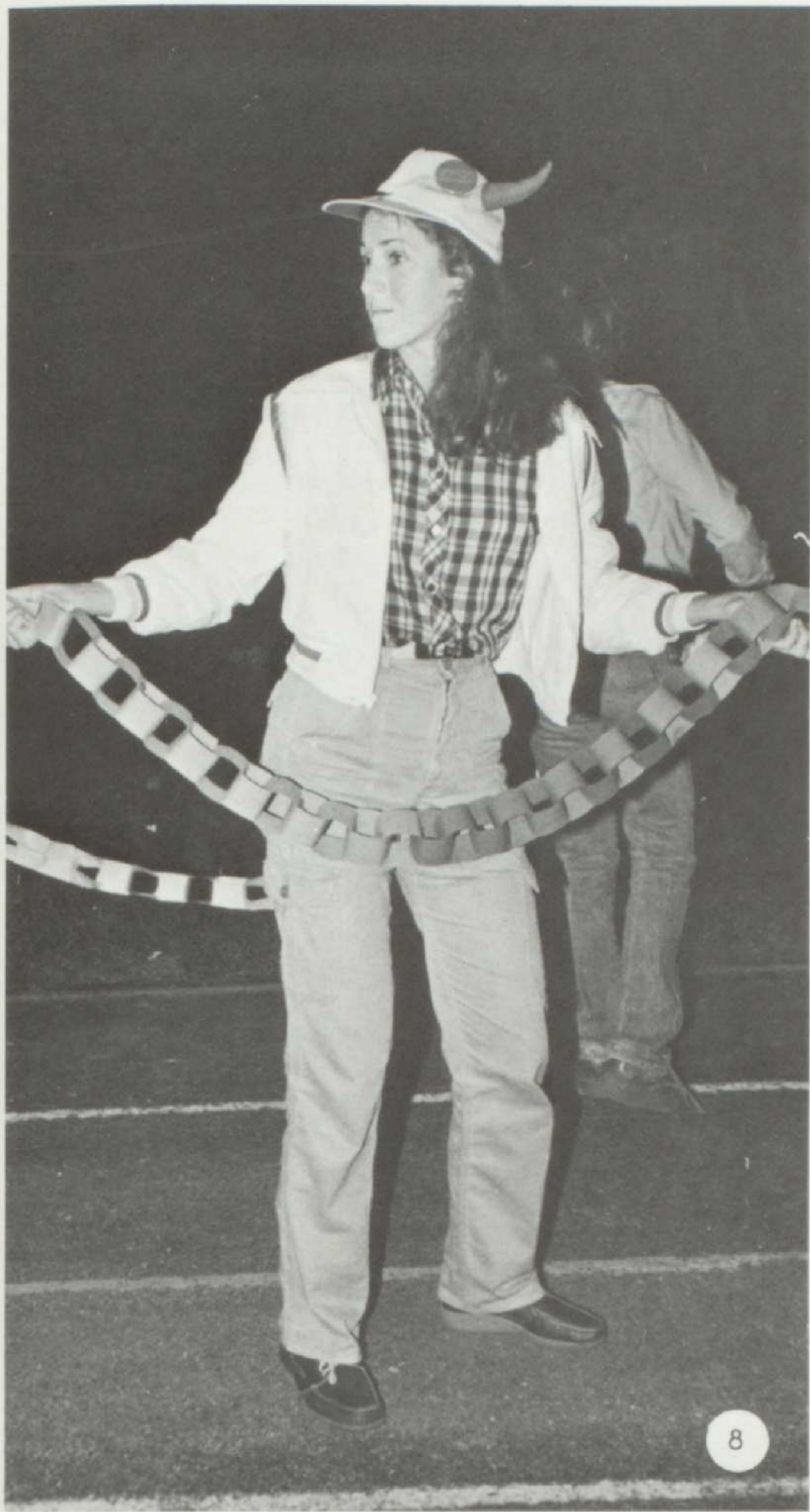

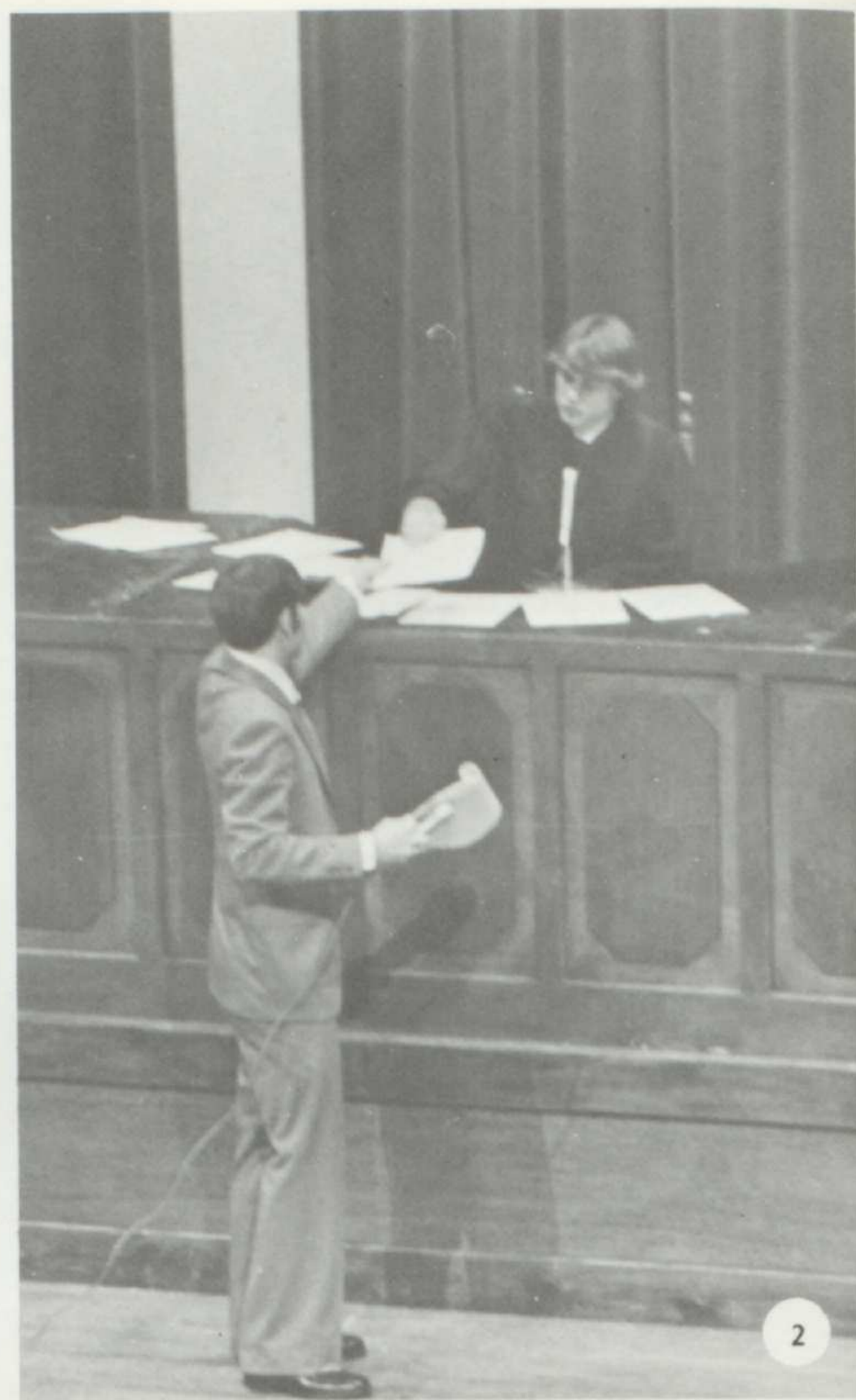
This scene was the dramatic climax

## Order in the court!



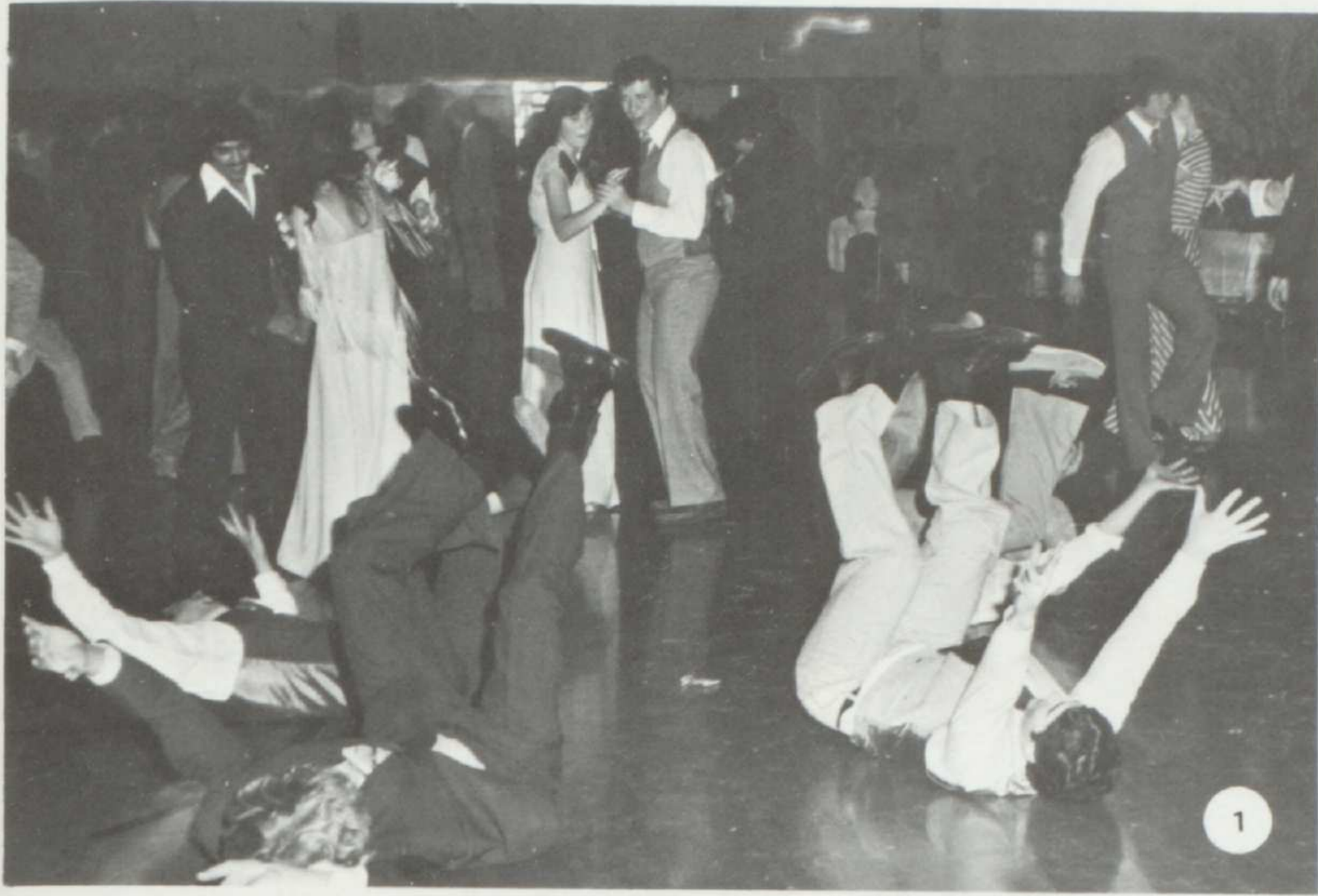

# The Worthington-Caen Connection

On January 30, 1980, seven students from Worthington set out on a dream trip that had finally come true. They were going to France as exchange students. Mr. Ballinger, a French teacher at WHS, coordinated the trip from the American side, and accompanied them as the group leader. The purpose of this trip was to experience, first-hand, life in a different country and to develop language skills. The trip ended on February 22, but the exchange was only halfway finished as the students from France were to come to live with their American friends on April 1, until April 19.

The first five days that the Worthington students spent in France were in Paris, where they saw almost everything there is to see, plus a little more. They saw the Eiffel Tower, le Louvre, Versailles, the Arch of Triumph, and the city's many beautiful gardens. The extra was a place called the Catacombs, which are open only twice a month. They contain the bones of six million people that were dug up from cemeteries and stacked up

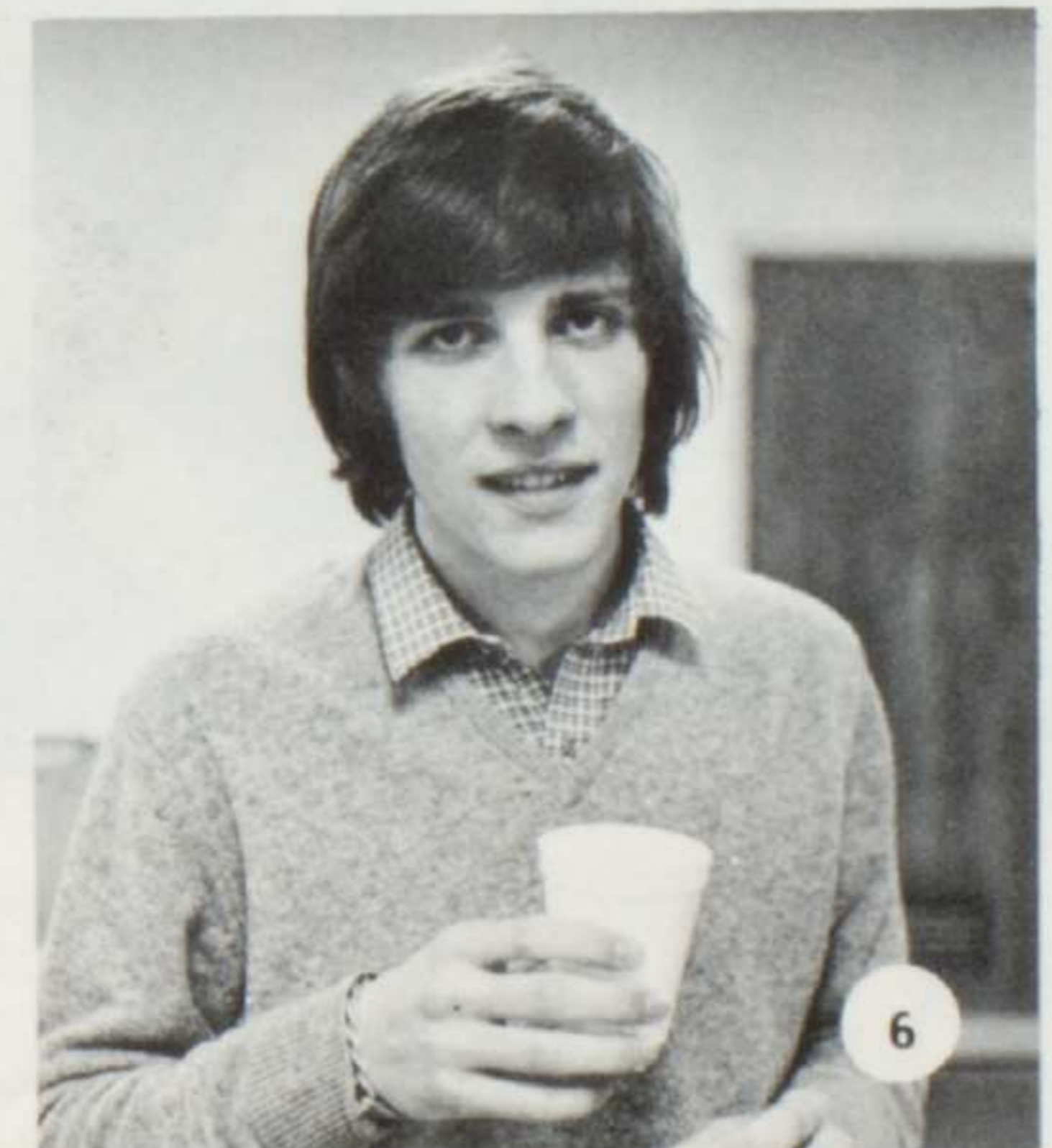
along the walls.

While in Caen, they went to school almost every day and in the afternoon went on small excursions to nearby towns or countrysides, or just in the streets of the city. The Americans noted a lot of differences in the school structure, as well as at home with their French families. The families were very close-knit and everyone did their best to make the Americans feel that they had a home in France. The students from France planned a few things especially for the Americans: one was an all-night party to

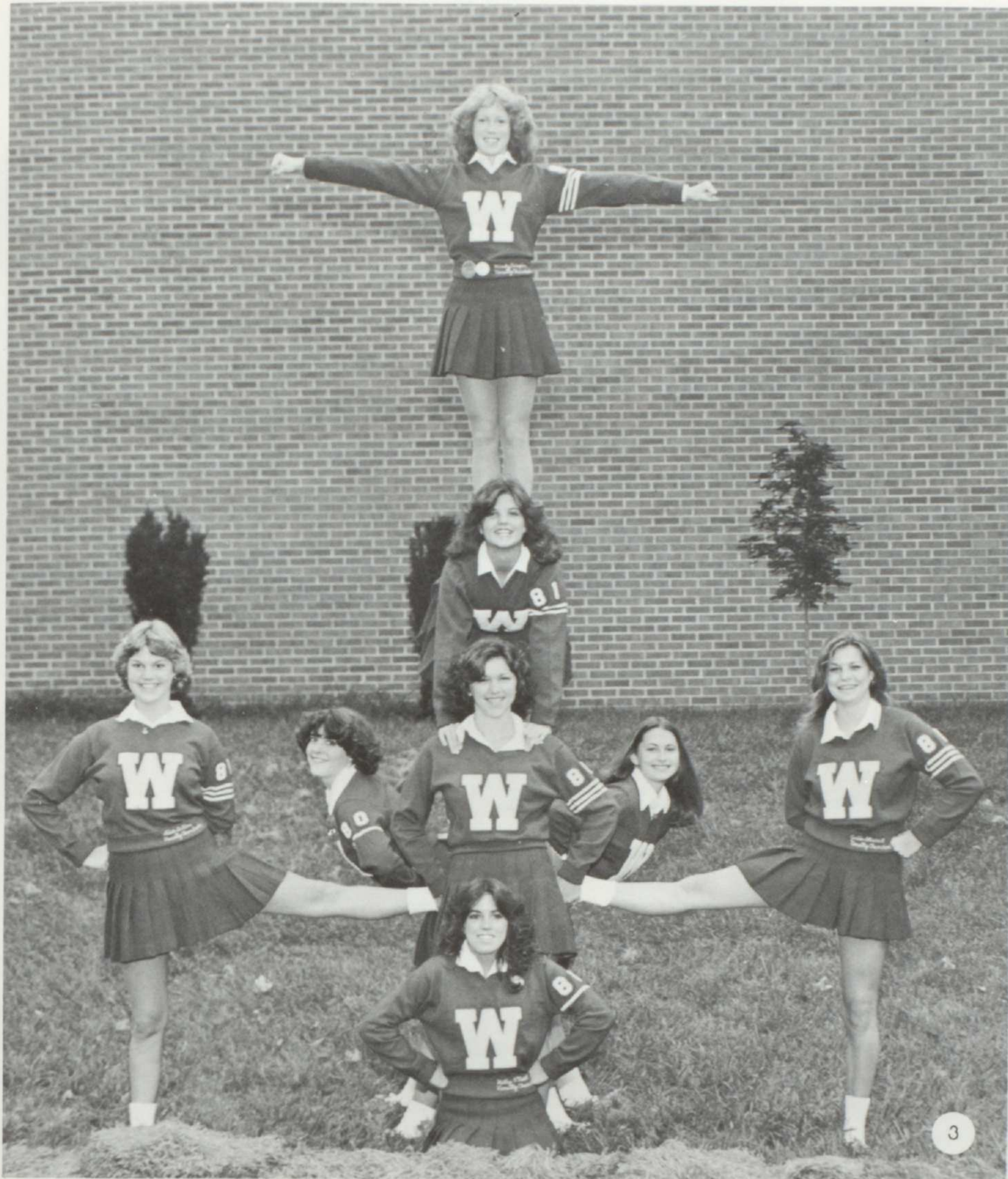

They visited every place in Worthington worth seeing and went to Greenfield Village and the Henry Ford Museum in Michigan. While they were here, as a sort of "revenge," the Americans planned a scavenger hunt for the French. The Americans threw a going-away party for the French, which capped off a memorable experience for both groups.

Despite the fact that these hard core

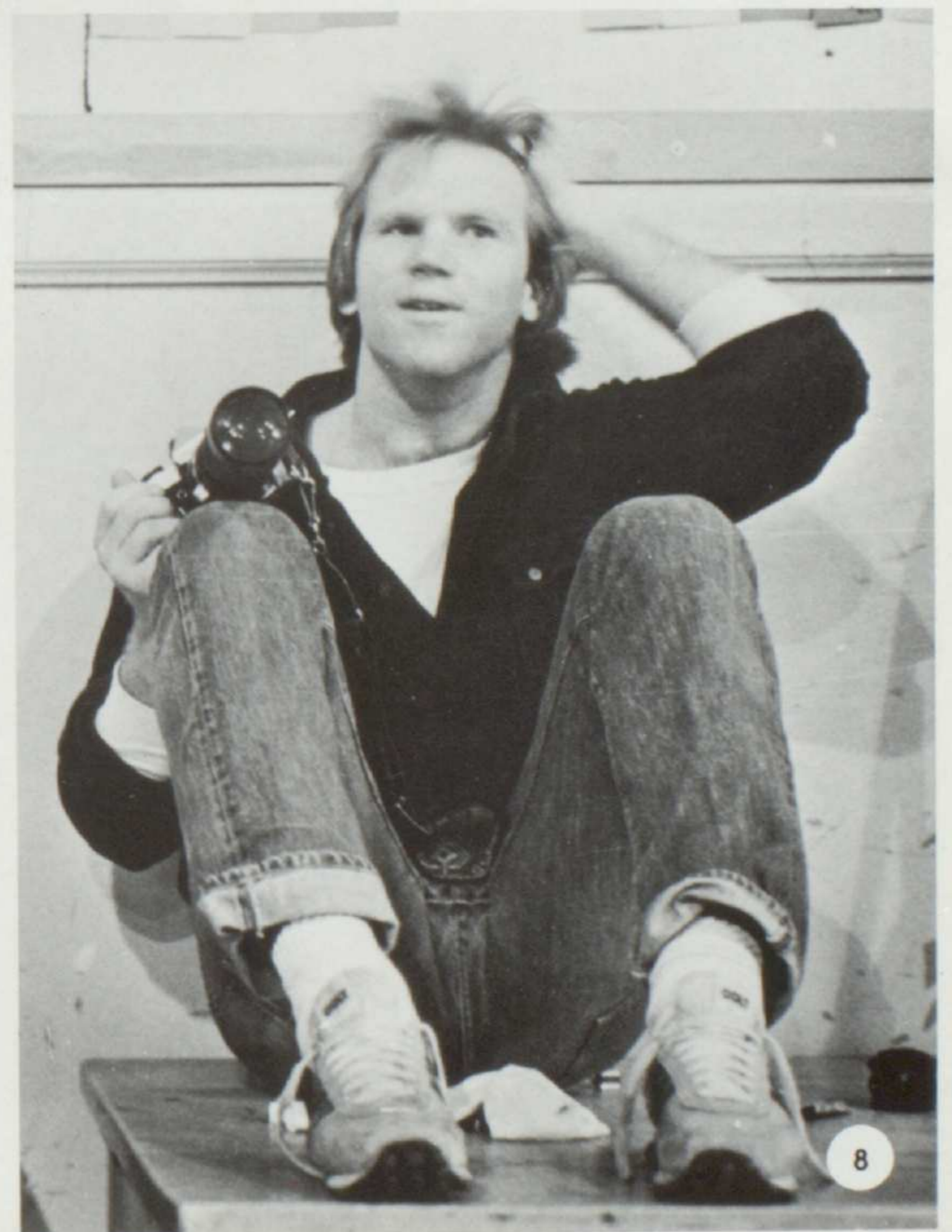
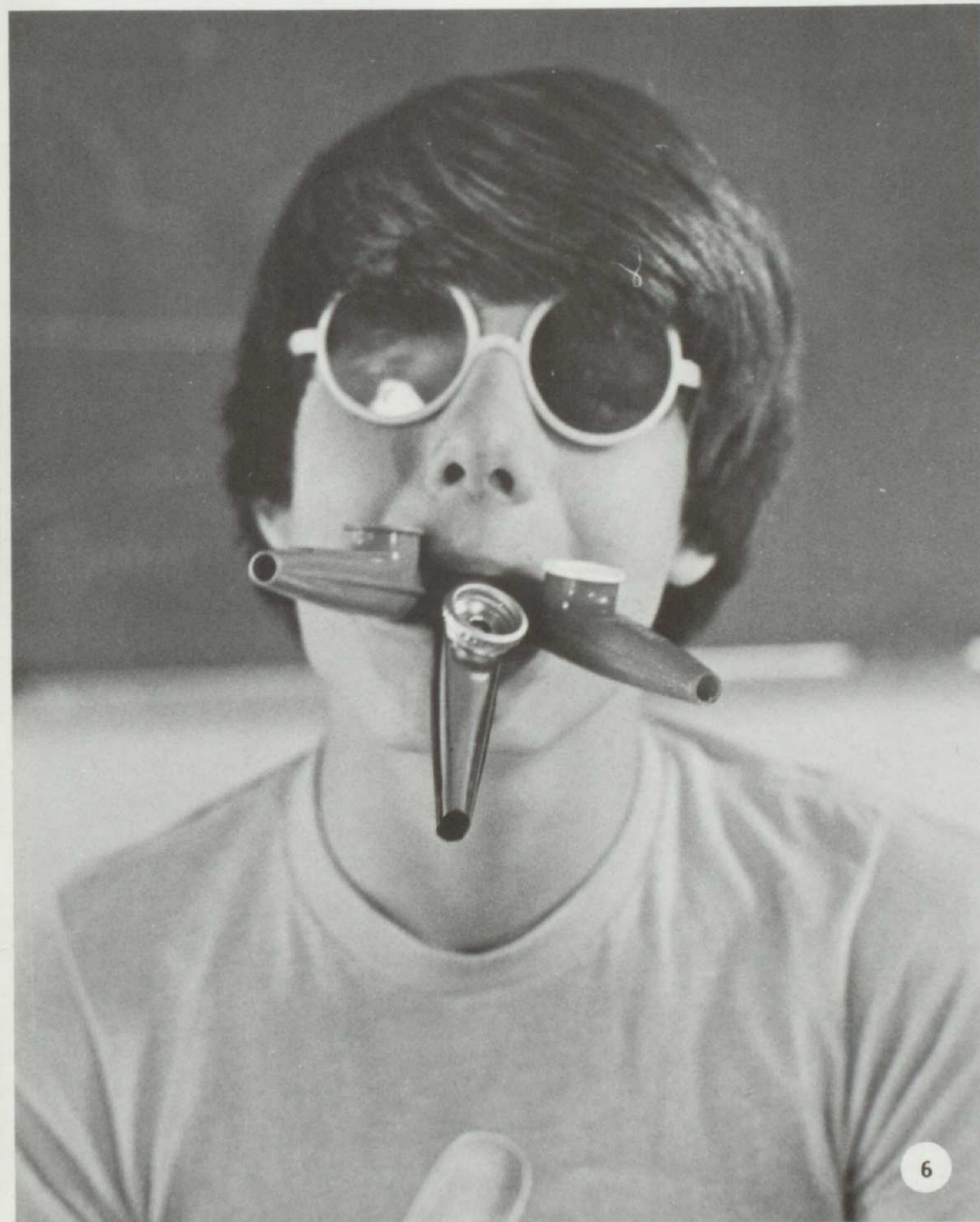

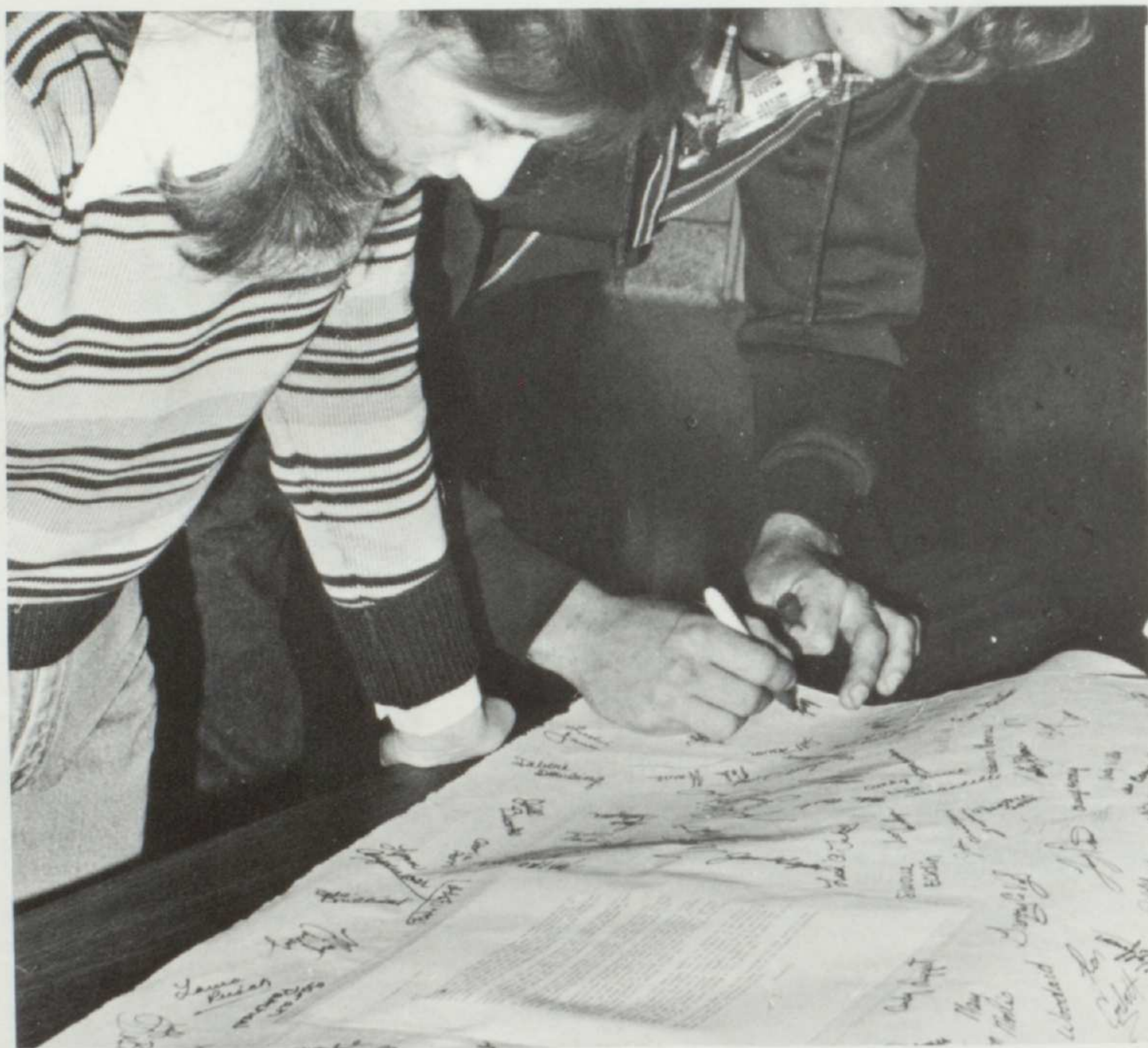
## America held hostage

The January 7, 1980 copy of *Time* in the Worthington Public Library has no cover and page 8 has been harshly ripped out. Page 9 reads "Man of the Year: The Mystic Who Lit the Fires of Hatred." The article, facing sheets, and cover are about Iran's Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini, the spiritual leader who seized the rein of power. He has since shocked the world with what *Time* calls "the shattering power of irrationality."

November 4, the day 62 Americans were taken hostage by a group of students in the U.S. Embassy in Tehran, marked the beginnings of the Iran Crisis. They were still being held hostage in February and the United States was at a stalemate. Khomeini and the Iranians demanded that the deposed Shah Mohamed Reza Pahlavi be returned to Iran for trial, and that the U.S. undergo a trial for its crimes against Iran. The U.S. has not conceded.

These events have left America stunned. Journalists were expelled from Iran and only scant pieces of news have been released. The situation however, has awakened the American citizens again, for it is something that nearly everyone has an opinion on. It has filtered its way not only into the business world, but into schools and homes as well.

Worthington High School is no exception. Comments about Iran are visible on walls and desks, while students can be heard discussing the crisis in the halls.



The topic comes up in classes of all kinds. In such classes as Political Radicalism, where guest speakers are frequent, one of the major questions asked of them is their opinion on Iran. The opinions vary but they seem to range from defensively violent, to simply anti-Iran.

Like the defaced *Time* magazines and the buttons that read "Ship the Shah," there are signs and slogans here and there, and demonstrations against Iranian students on college campuses.

Reports state that many of these students detest Khomeini, but many Americans have united in their distrust of anything dealing with the country.

Though school activities continue on as normal, these months of the Iran Crisis have left a mark in the minds of Worthington High School students. The future is questionable as tension in the Middle East is affecting the United States, from its echelons of bureaucracy to its school systems.

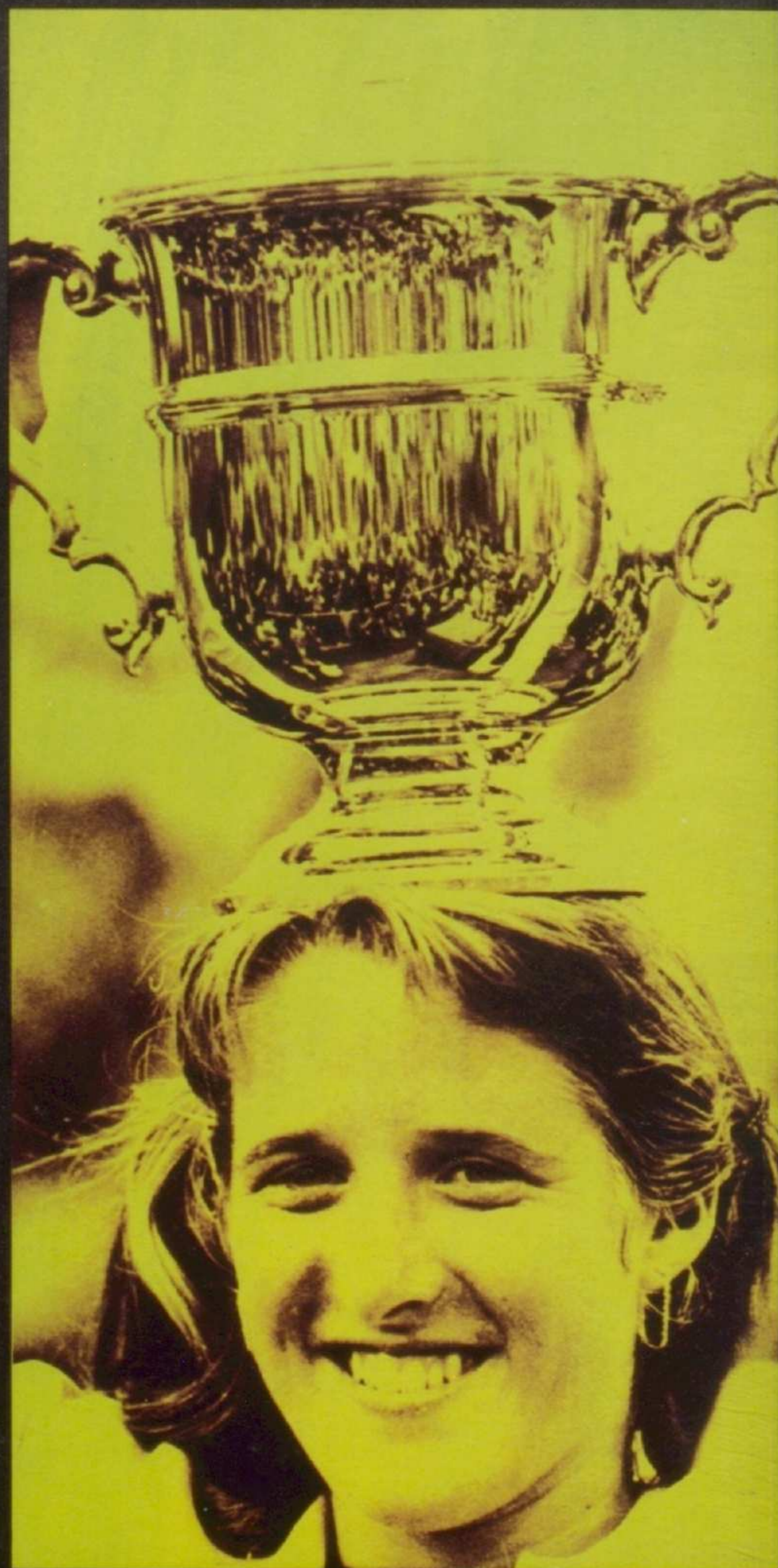

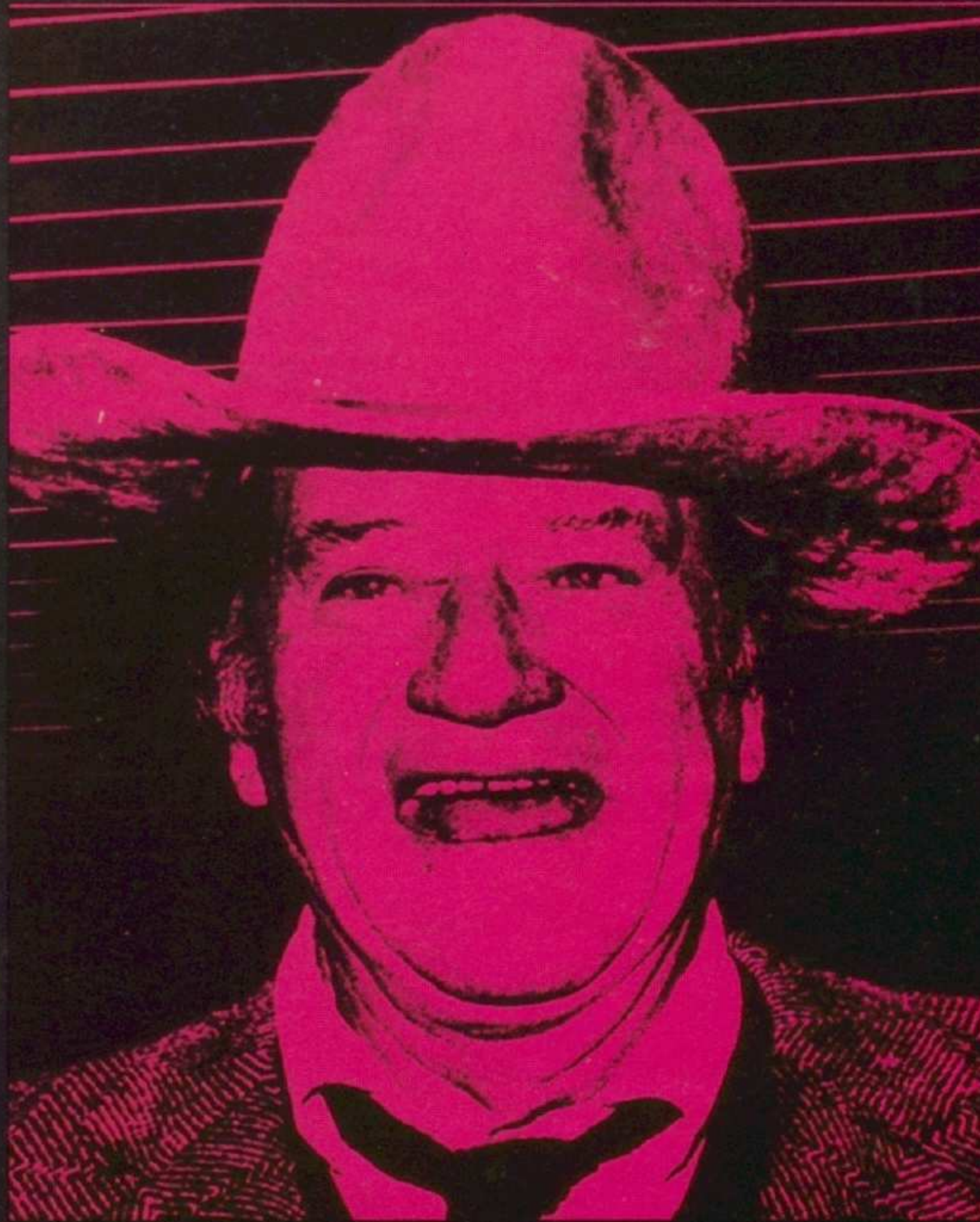
