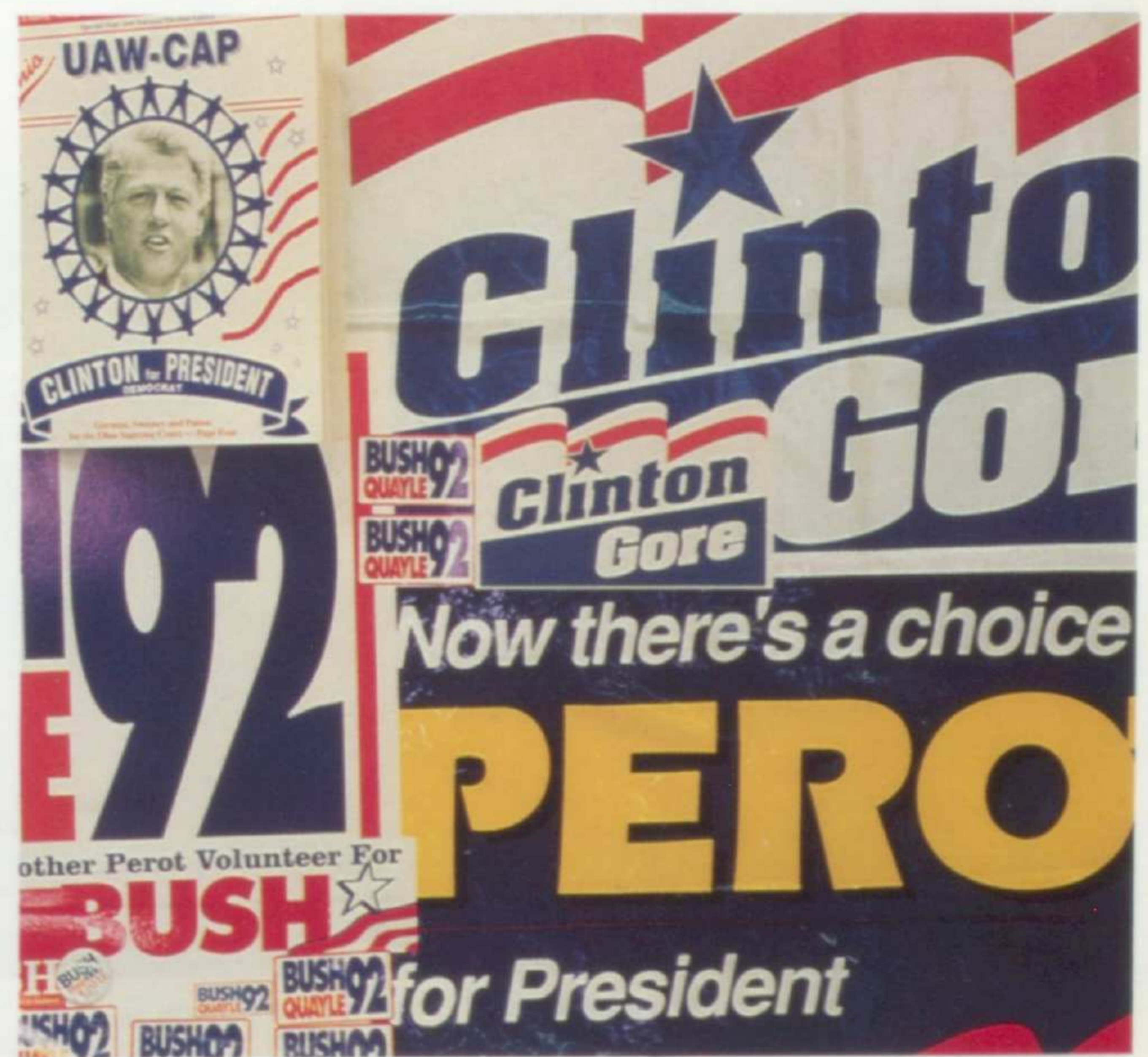

T.W.H.S. RECYCLING

Modern technology is creating an environmental crisis because it ignores the fact that the environment is a fragile cycle. If we are to survive our environmental crisis and maintain the earth as a place fit for human life, we must reduce massive pollution of the biosphere. To assure ourselves of this, we must first recognize that pollution and other environmental hazards are a problem.

Students at T.W.H.S. are becoming more aware of the environment. The new club S.A.F.E. (Students Active For the Environment) wants to change people's bad habits regarding the biosphere. Students and teachers are recycling cans and paper more than ever. S.A.F.E. is trying to make it easier for our students to recycle. One committee consists of lobbying which involves writing letters to government officials throughout the state of Ohio. Another committee is separating the white and the colored paper. They are working closely with Grossman Industries, who is helping the group with the recycling of the paper in our school. In the cafeteria the pop cans are being separated from the glass containers. S.A.F.E. also hopes to work with the O.W.C. (Ohio Wildlife Center) and the F.C.W.A. (Franklin County Waste Authority). There is a committee that will be planting trees around T.W.H.S. and throughout our community. Their final goal is to travel to the elementary schools throughout our district to give presentations regarding the environment and the

newly discovered club. The group hopes that in the future, people at T.W.H.S. will look for recycling places before throwing anything away.

Jamie Pack, senior, is this year's president of S.A.F.E. Jamie attempted to start this group her sophomore year, but at the time the school did not have the budget to start a new club. Many students started to show interest in helping the club get started. During her junior year, Jamie started recycling throughout T.W.H.S.. She attended many workshops pertaining to the environment. Jamie has worked hard with the staff and students, and her efforts are obvious through the success of the group. The staff also consists of Scott Pence (Vice President), Anika Penn (Secretary), and Olivia Bruch (Treasurer).

Jane Brown, TWHS Spanish teacher, is the advisor of S.A.F.E. She hopes that the staff will support the initiative of the students throughout the school year, and for many years to follow. Mrs. Brown along with co-advisor Mr. Bauman, have encouraged teachers to place paper recycling boxes in each of the classrooms.

S.A.F.E. will serve T.W.H.S. like the E.P.A. (Environmental Protection Agency) serves the government. After the recycling takes place, the group will hopefully find other ways to help the environment. Participation in S.A.F.E. will make or break the continuation of the group. Approximately 60 active members have shown

interest in the club and have attended the meetings.

Recycling is the re-use of materials formally discarded. It benefits society by reducing the volume of solid waste. Not many schools have established recycling projects for the collection of recyclable wastes. T.W.H.S. has started working towards solving the problems to save our environment.

BANNED

Senior Shirts of 1993

Senior shirts are one of the few remaining privileges that are exclusive to the senior class. This tradition began in 1969, but the shirts did not gain school-wide recognition until the mid seventies when ten seniors decided to create a spirit club called Ten Man Kazoo Band. T.M.K.B. entertained the student body at pep rallies and other school related events by playing their kazoos.

While the group remained a strong part of the WHS student body, the administration ceased to acknowledge it as a school sponsored club in 1978, when the group engaged in a "vulgar activity" at a spring pep rally. This denial did not stop senior shirts from growing to their current popularity.

However, over the years, the shirts have become one of the most controversial issues between students and staff in the Worthington High Schools. In 1987-88, all senior shirts were banned from school grounds because of "gang-like" activities involving Upper Arlington. However, the shirts made a comeback in 1988-89 as a result of a compromise between the students and the administration. The compromise gave the administration the right to censor senior shirts containing inappropriate material.

Two years ago the "Damn Seagulls" were denied the senior shirt privilege for their blatant use of profanity. This year's senior class is continuing the on going controversy with shirts that have been banned or are in the process of becoming banned. These group include: "Schmegma", the "D.I.C.K.S." and the "Ballsacs" (the "Ballsacs" are the successors of last year's

group, the "Freeballers", who were not banned). Have we stepped over the line on the senior shirt names, or has the administration over stepped their boundaries?

"As long as the senior shirts stay non-marginal there will not be a problem, but as soon as the writing becomes a problem, the shirts will be discontinued." Mr. Butler stated concerning the issue.

Scot McBride, a member of the "Ballsacs," feels, "It should be up to the student government instead of the administration; they are making a big deal out of a little thing."

When Brian Butler, a "Schmegma" group member, was asked about the situation, he replied, "The administration should focus more attention on the real problems in school

instead of wasting time on something as trivial as a shirt."

Tom Starr (D.I.C.K.S.) said, "I am outraged; this is a violation of our rights and we should be able to wear them (the shirts)."

Tim Cunningham (T.M.K.B.) stated his opinion on the situation by saying, "The first amendment gives us the freedom of speech, and when they deny us our basic rights, they deny themselves those basic rights that every American citizen enjoys." He paused as if in deep thought, then continued, "It sucks."

Annex

An Old Tradition Ends as a New Tradition Begins

The Annex, constructed in 1915, was the first high school in Worthington. In 1976, the building was renovated into an art facility. Students think of the annex as a structure that serves as a place for interaction between students and where individuals can relate to one another through their own artistic talents. This historical building exudes feelings of peace, comfort, and openness.

Thomas Worthington's main campus has undergone construction, with the Annex as a major part of the project. After reviewing many suggestions of improvements, the administration decided to add a new theater /arts wing to TWHS. A new addition was inexpensive compared to the cost of remodeling the Annex. Also, numerous problems included an old heating system, peeling paint, and broken windows, which made the replacement of the Annex necessary and beneficial. Administrators plan to renovate the building for administrative offices to take the place of the office space currently used at the Rush

Creek center.

Attached to the lecture halls and foreign language wing, the new facility includes three art rooms, a theater, a new make-up room and a costume room. All of the classes that originally were held in the Annex were moved to the new art center for the second semester of the 1992-1993 school year.

A unique extension was added to the arts wing. A courtyard was designed to beautify an old space. A professional artist, Nina Borgia-Aberie, with the help of students, beautified the courtyard. For decoration, many students designed concrete tiles which were mounted on the geometric sculptures. Not only will these tiles unite the students, but they will also remain a historical landmark forever, just as the Annex has.

Although the Annex may look ancient, many memorable events have been held there and the cherished spirit of this grand old building remains intact.

SENIORS PROCRASTINATE AT TWHS

Seniors throughout Thomas Worthington High School are planning for the future. Although seniors have many options open to them after graduation, many are choosing to attend college. College planning consists of many decisions and much preparation. Students must decide what type of college is right for them. Characteristics such as academics, athletics, size, cost and location are all very important when choosing a school. Students have a broad selection of schools to choose from and once favorites are picked, one must begin completing college applications. Applications require much time and effort upon the student's part. Many colleges require the applicant to answer very lengthy and detailed questions about family, school and other interests.

allow the college not only to learn more about a student, but also how others perceive that student.

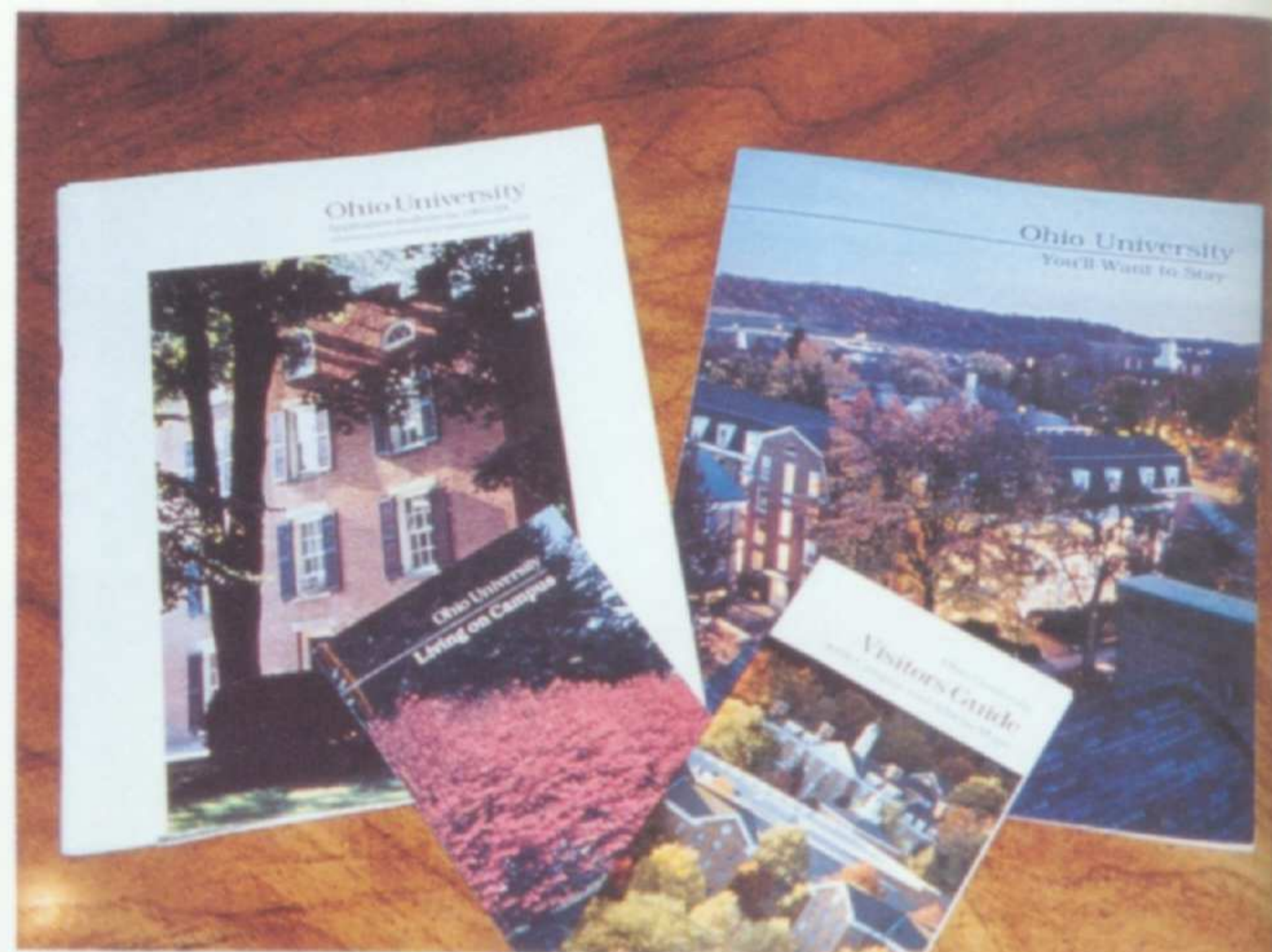

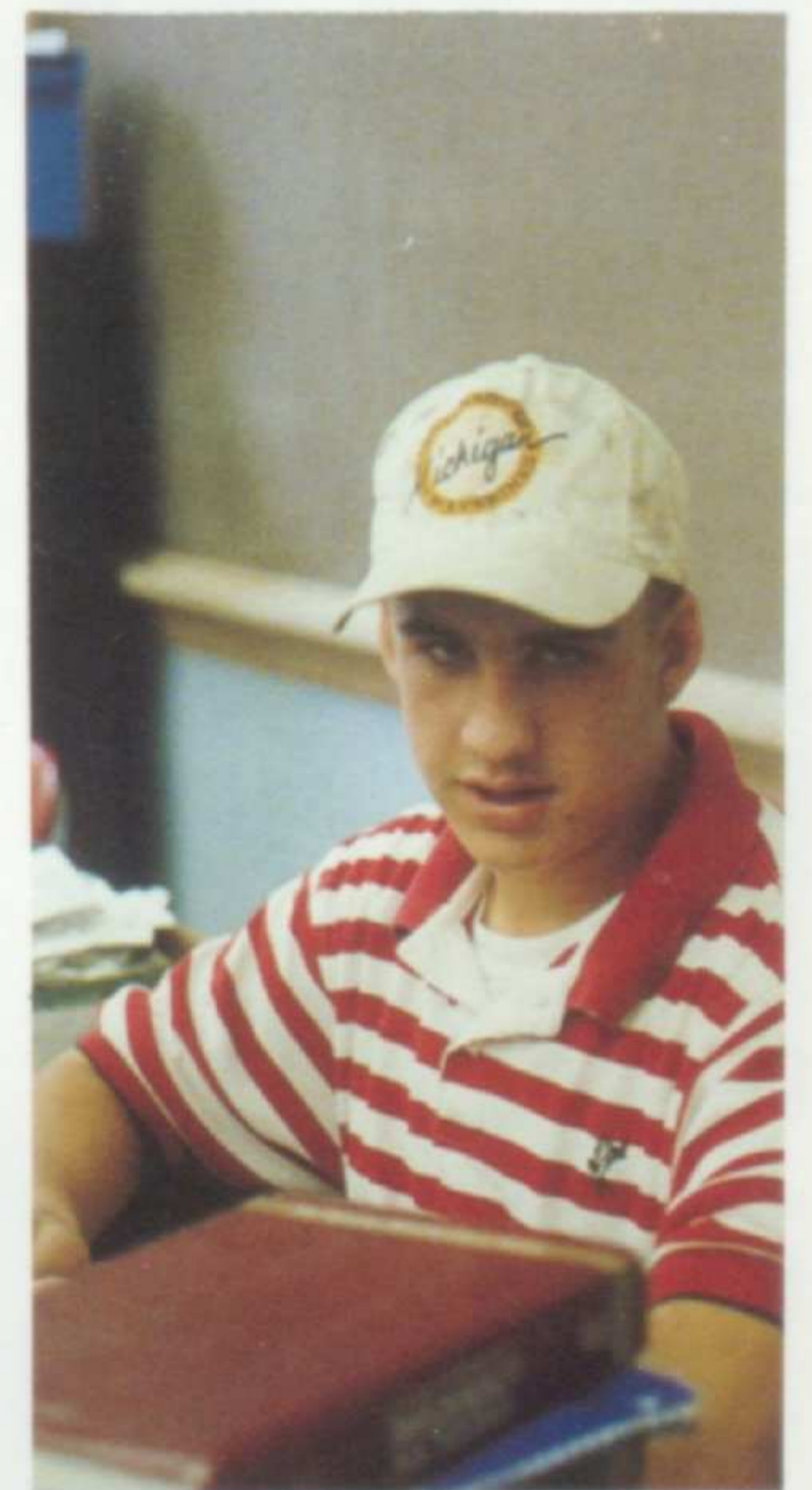

Linworth Students Return Home

The Linworth Alternative Program, better known as the A.P., was established in 1974 to provide students with a different approach to learning. This alternative approach tries to offer more input and responsibility. The goal of Wayne Harvey, the principal, is to "Give students actual experience instead of sitting them in classrooms." This goal is carried out by allowing students more flexibility to explore their future careers through various programs. One program available to seniors only is walkabouts. During the second semester of their senior years, students are permitted to choose programs according to what they are interested in doing. Another program available to the A.P. students is Interim Week which is designed for independent study. The students may study any topic of choice or "shadow" a person for that week. The more relaxed, liberal learning structure is another major learning difference. The building is designed to accommodate this learning style. When the A.P. students learned of their necessary move to "Old Kilbourne" campus, they were extremely frustrated. Although the building wasn't conducive to

the A.P. program, the move was necessary. The boiler went out twice, and the second time it could not be repaired. Along with putting in a new heating system, many infrastructure changes occurred. 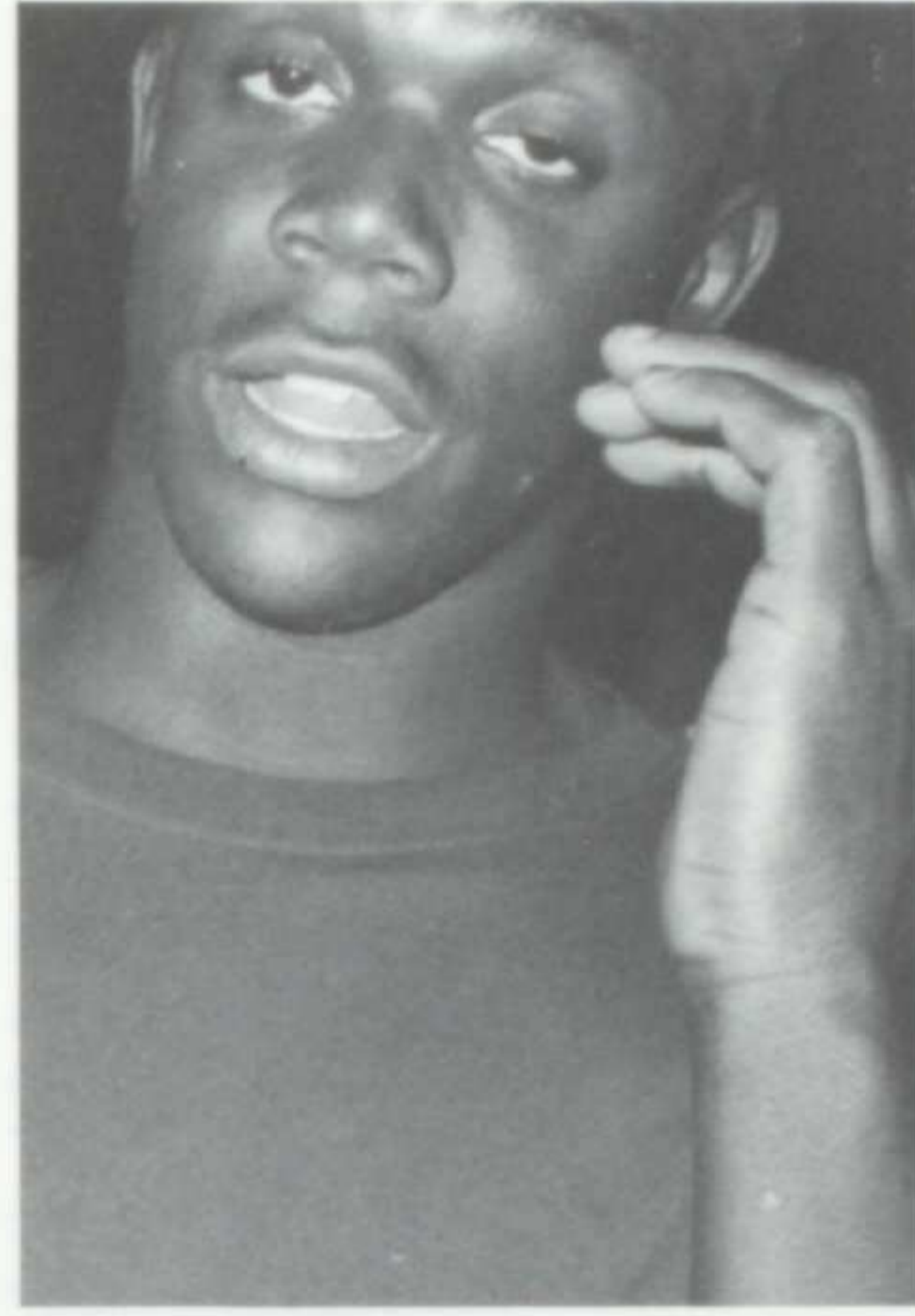

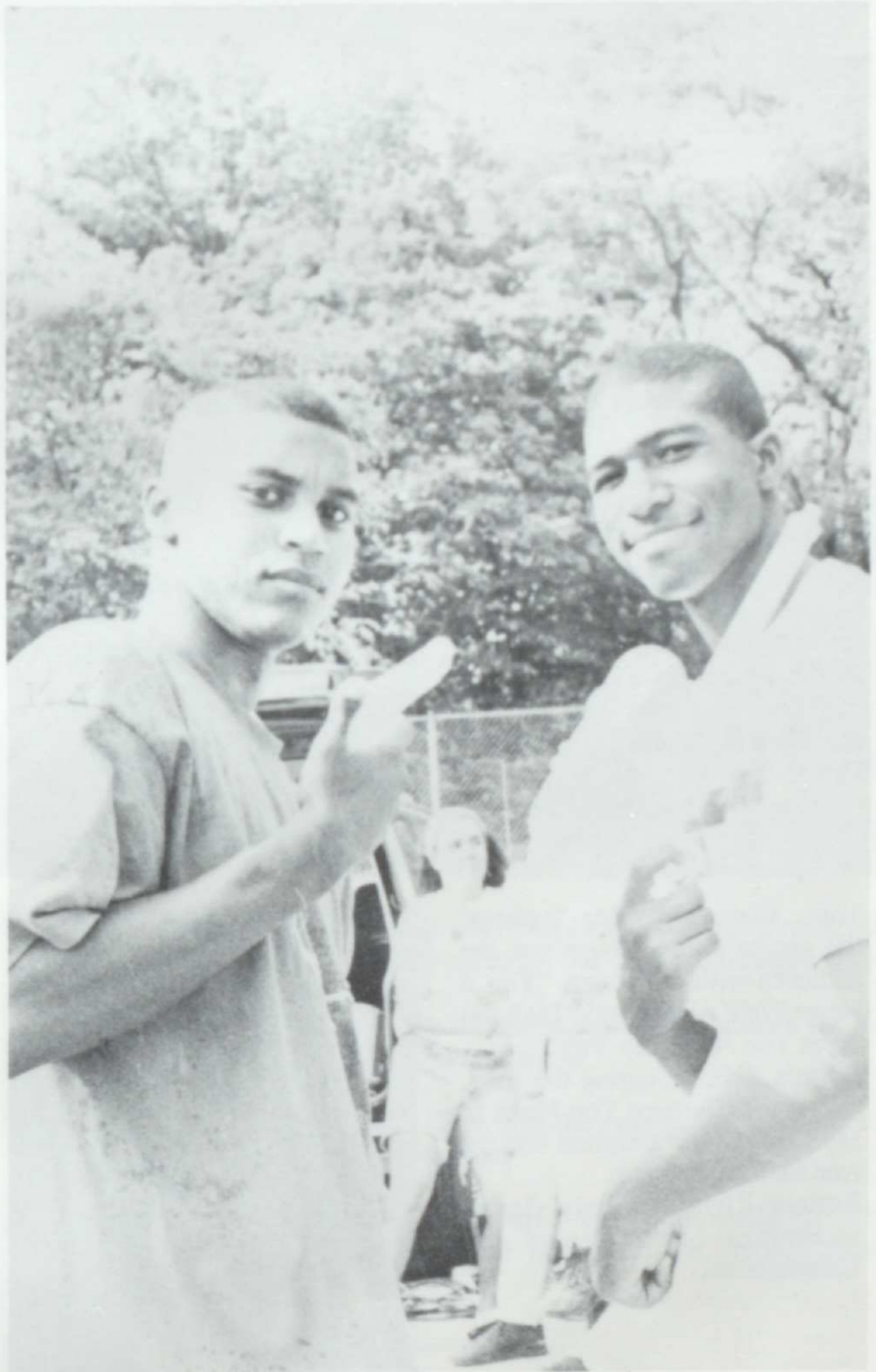

There was enough chow and beverages at the party to feed an army. Subs, pizza, pop, vegetables and other foods were served to the hungry grads.

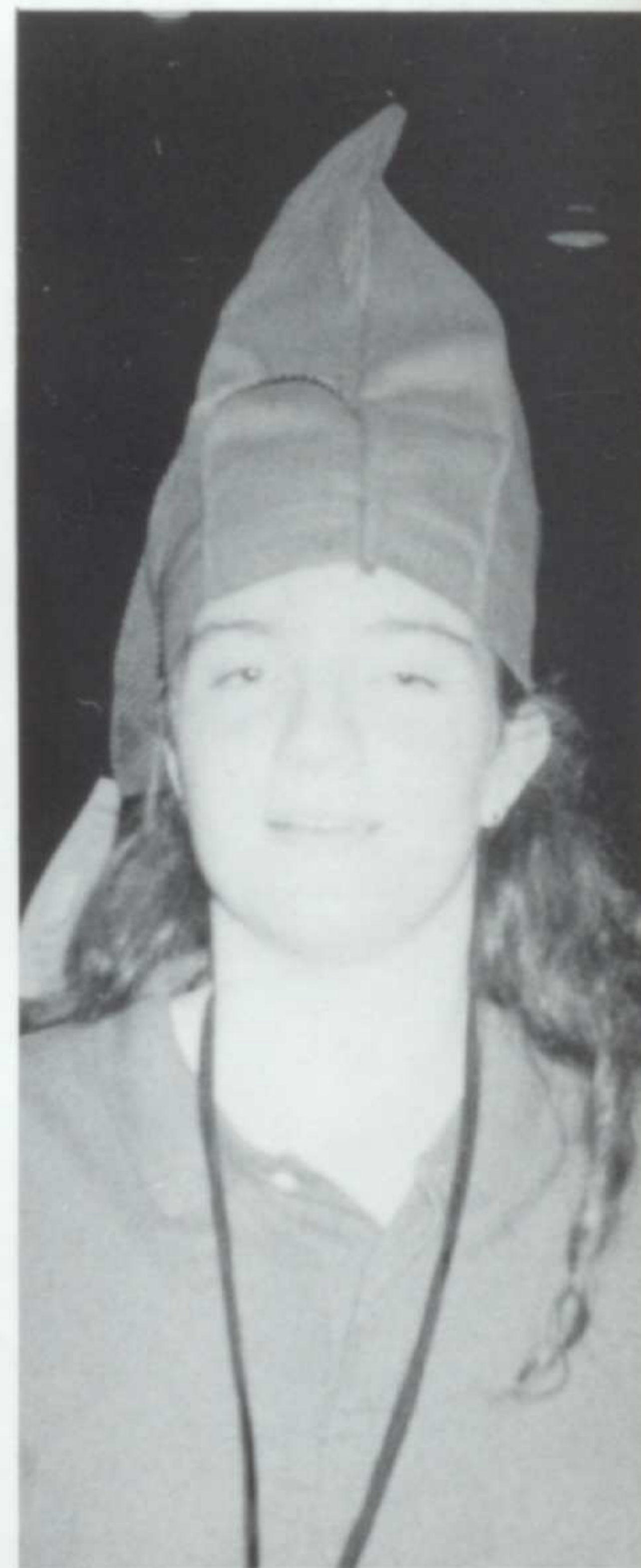

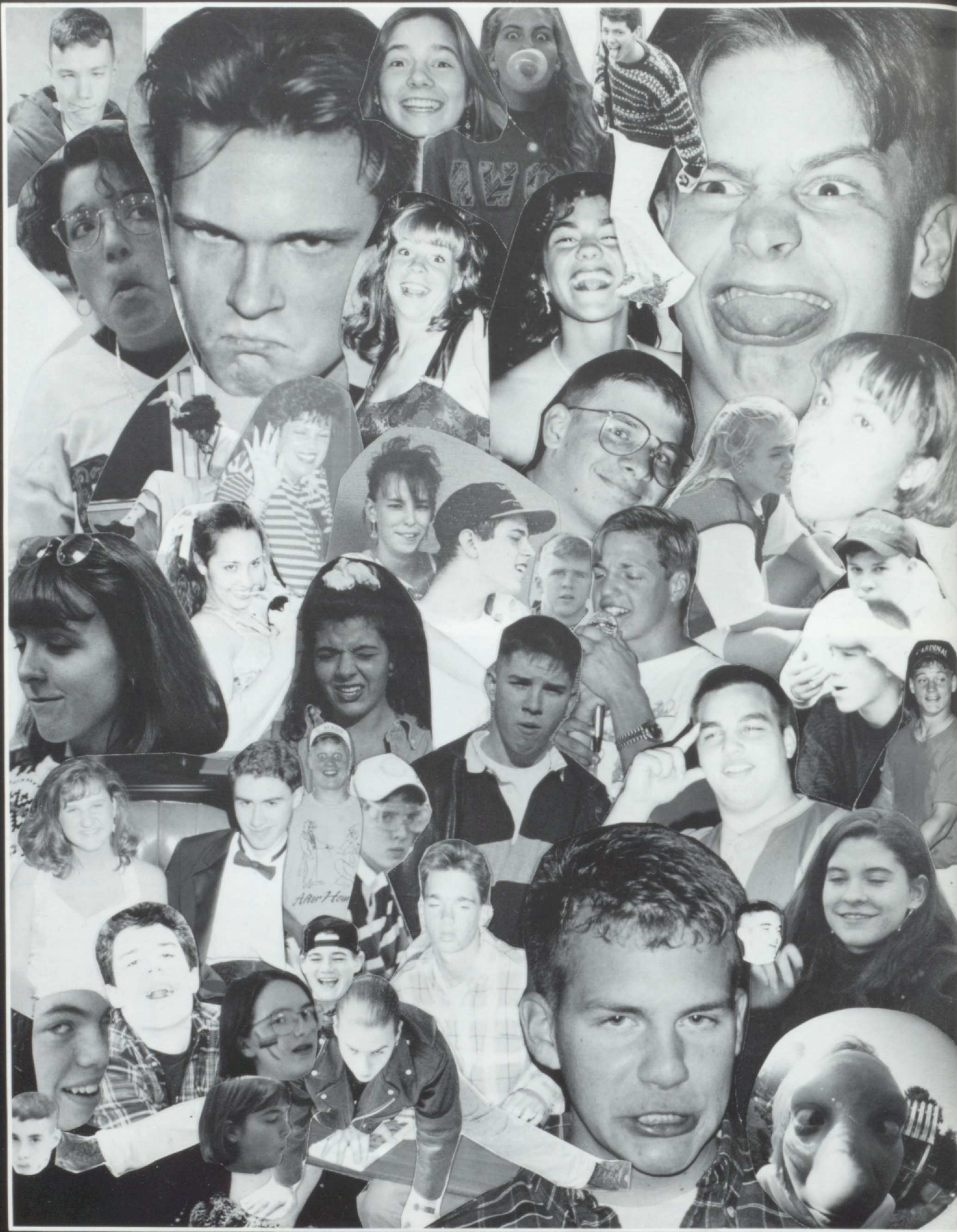

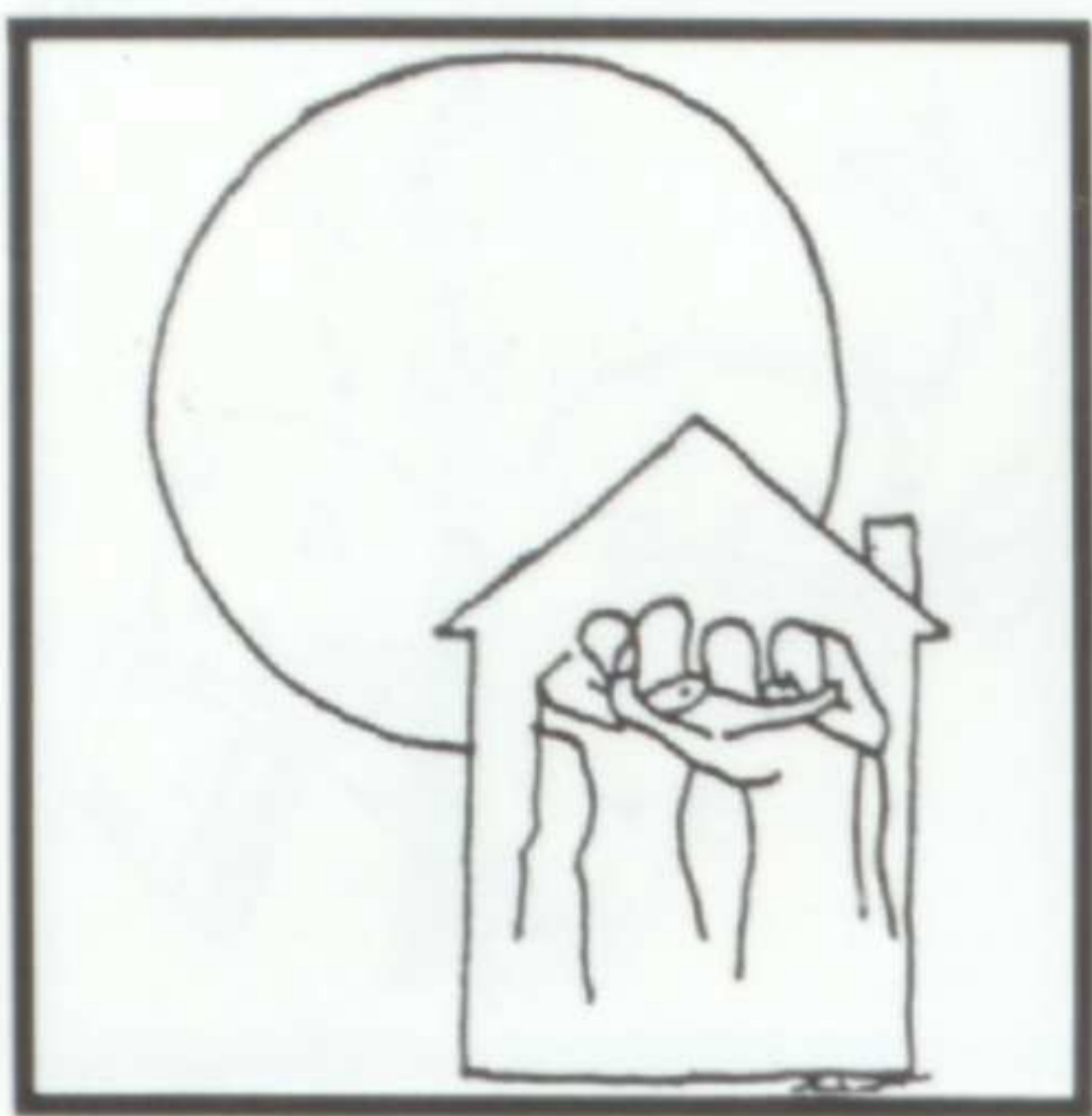

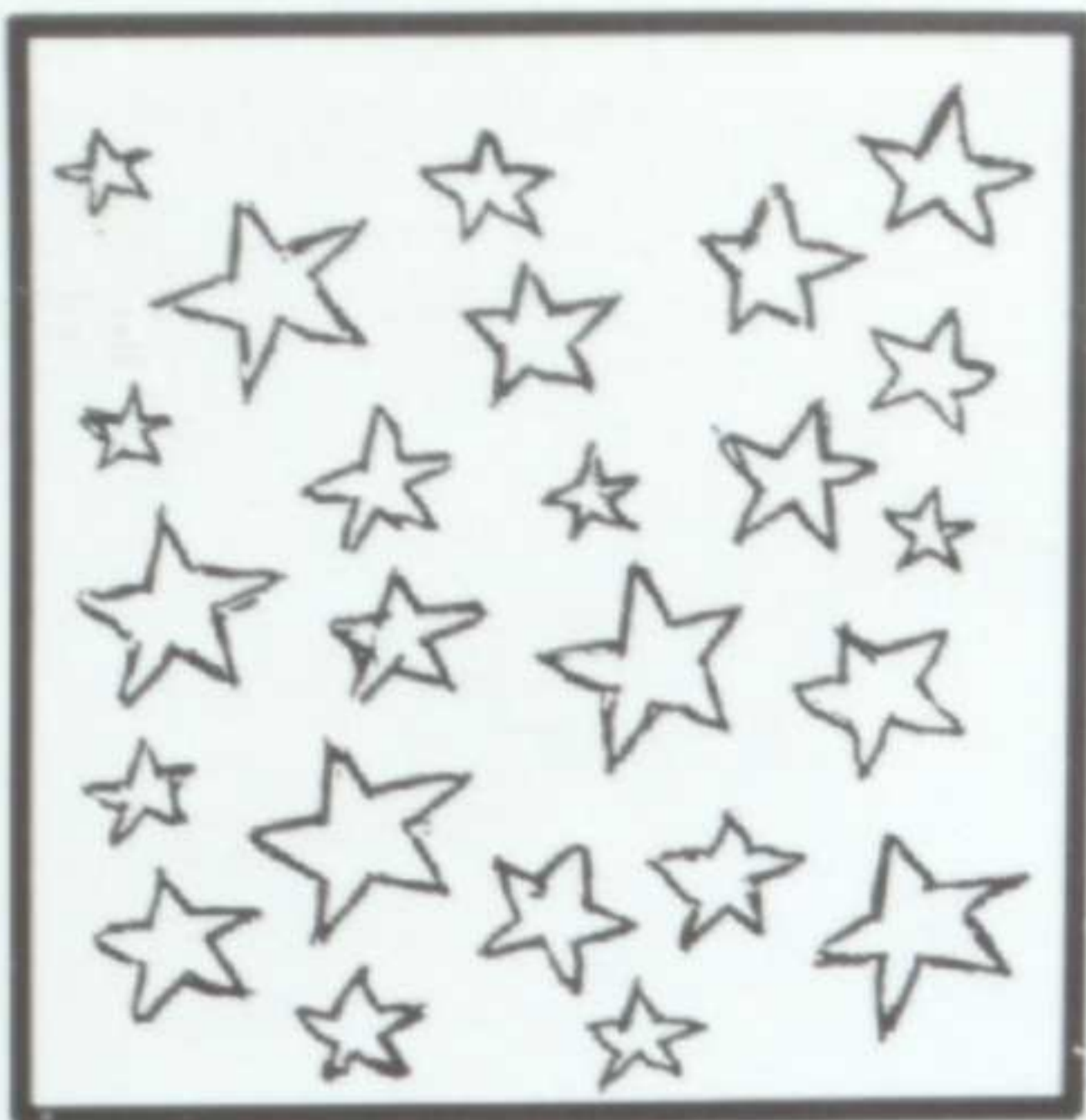

Twelve Angry Women



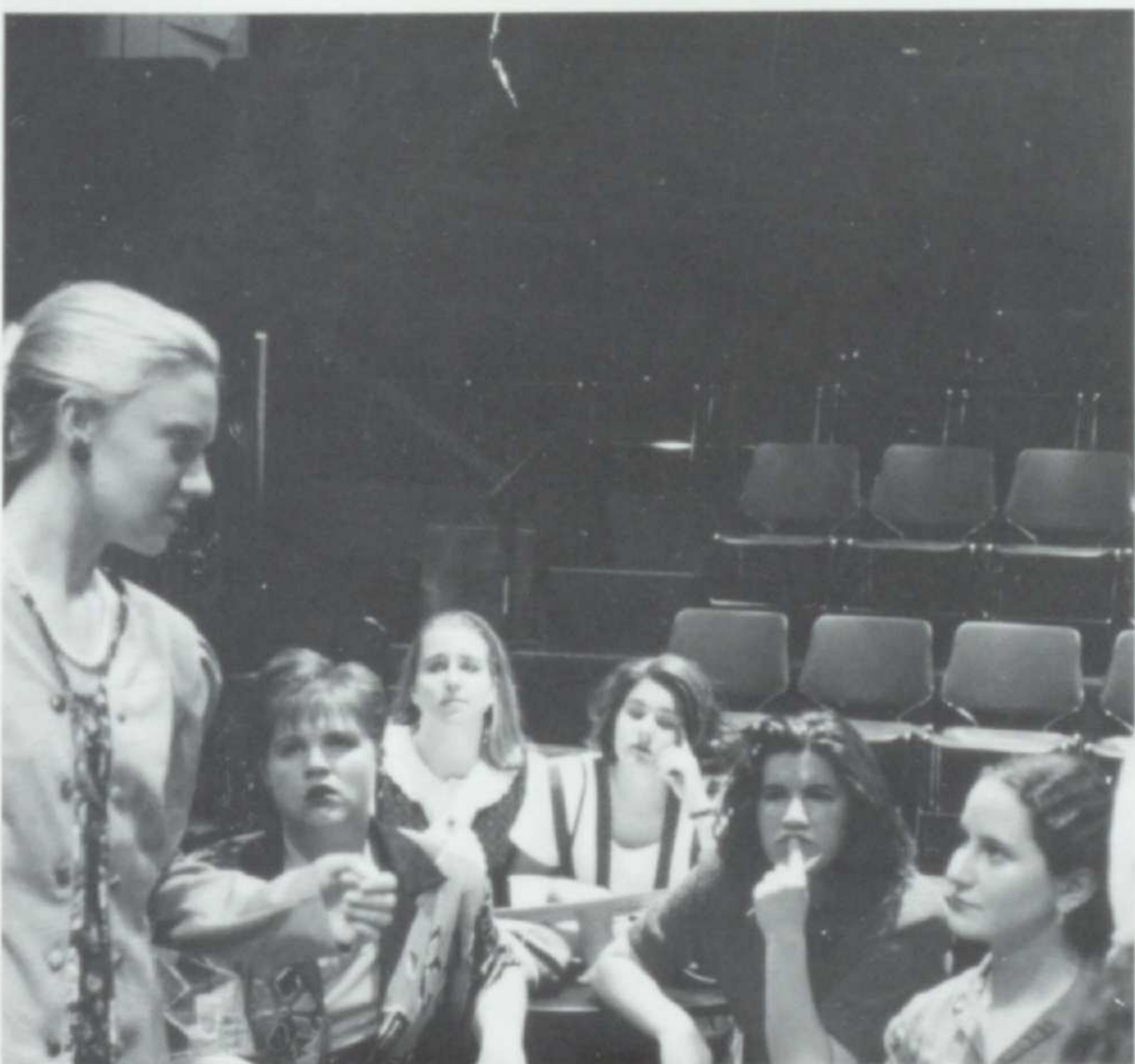

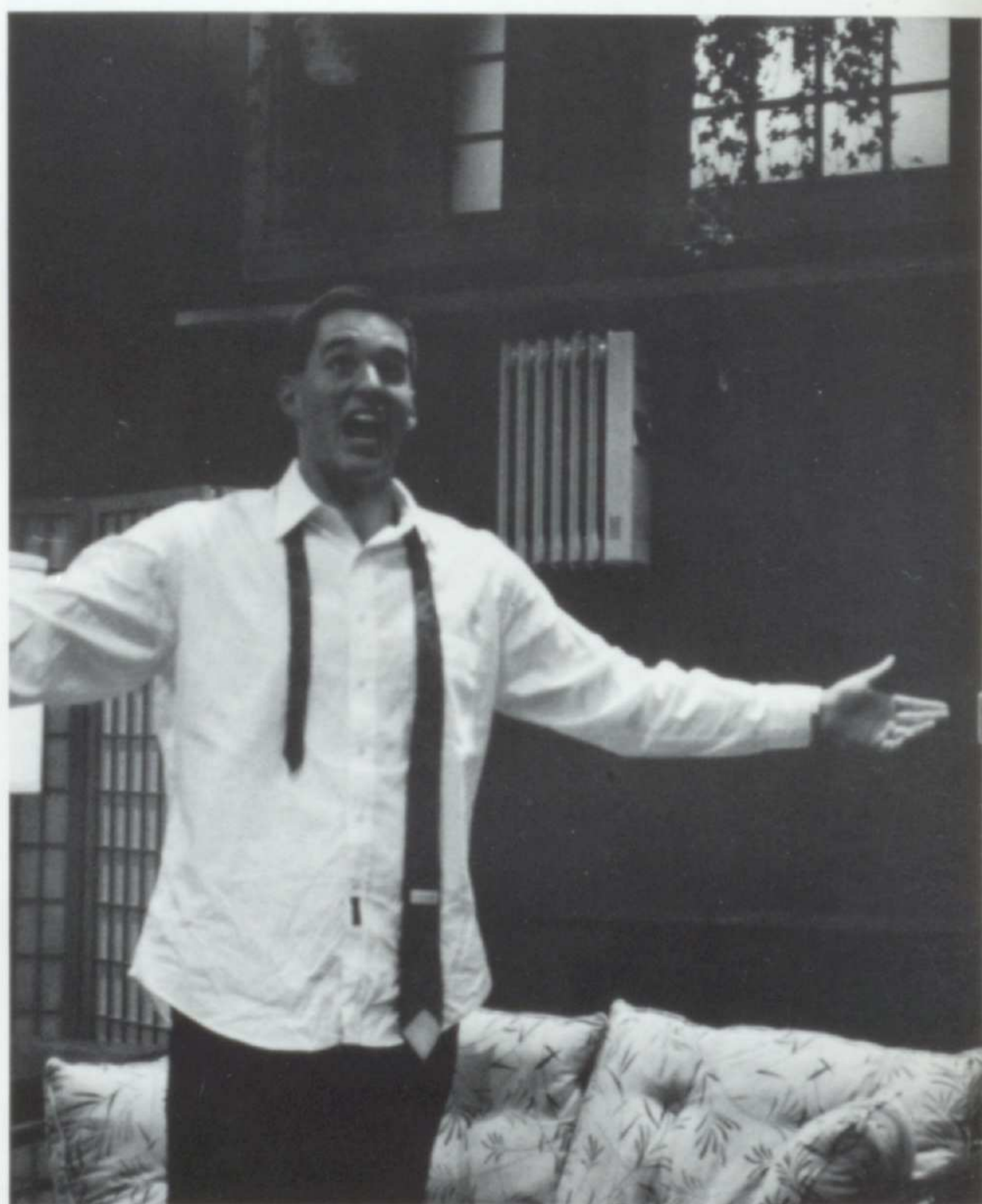
Barefoot in the Park

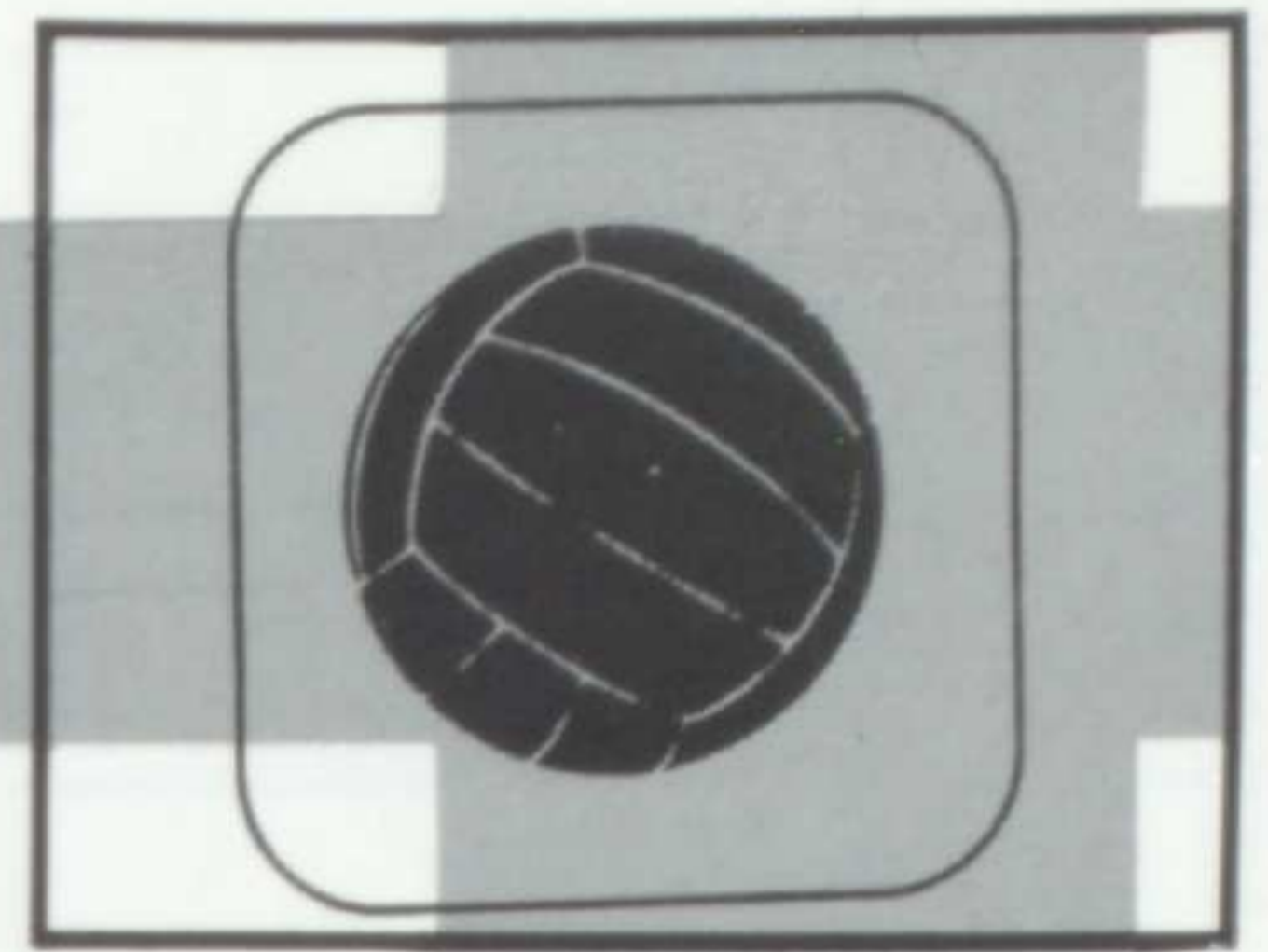

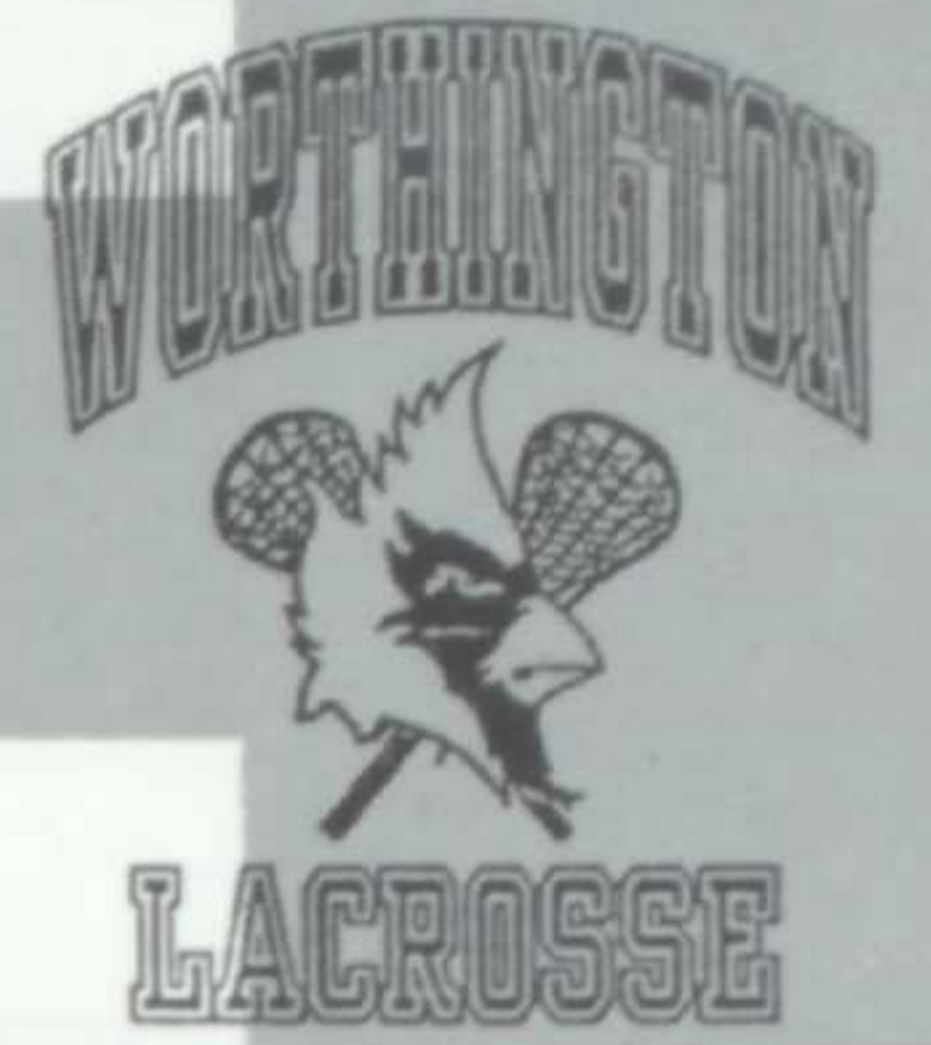

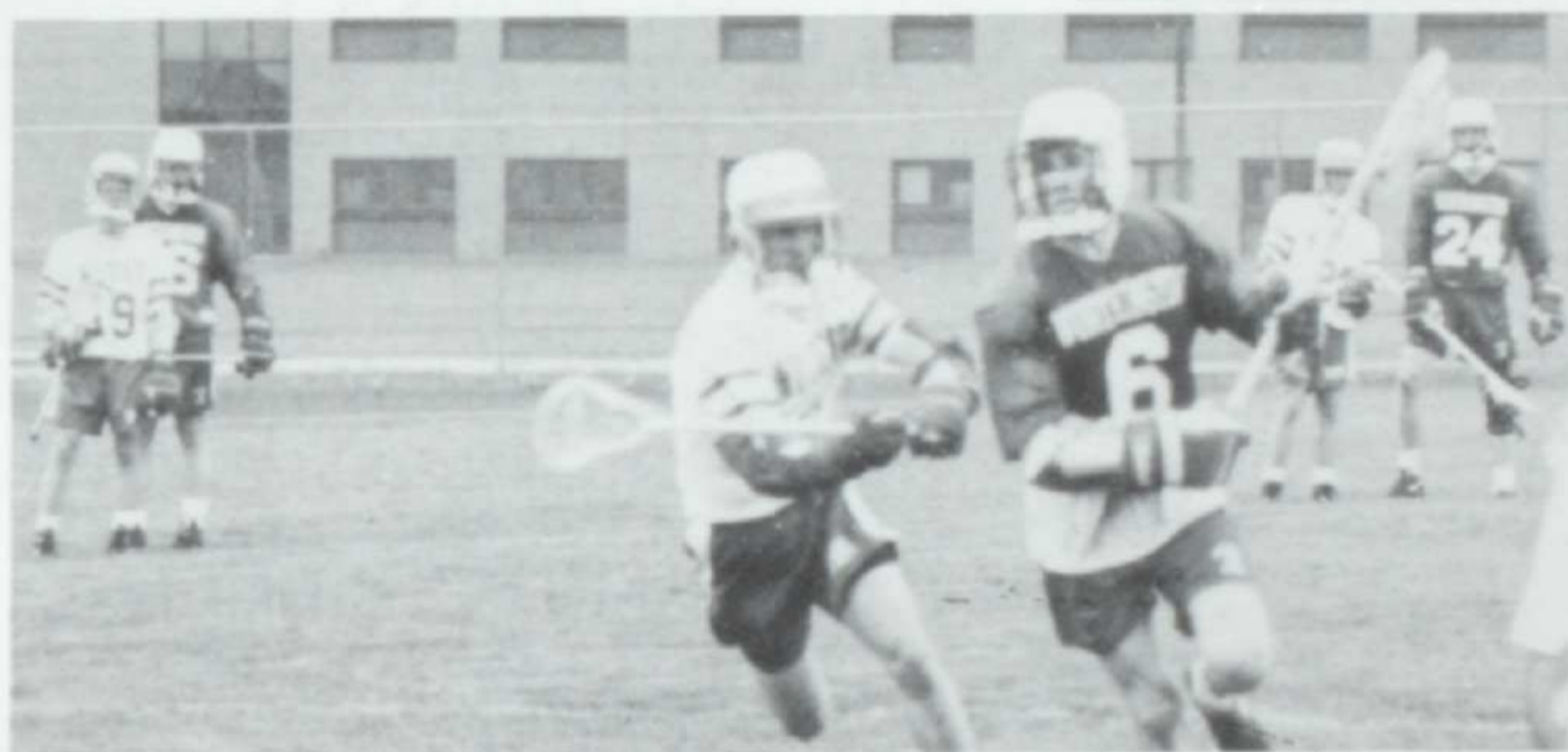

In Memory of John B. Galipault

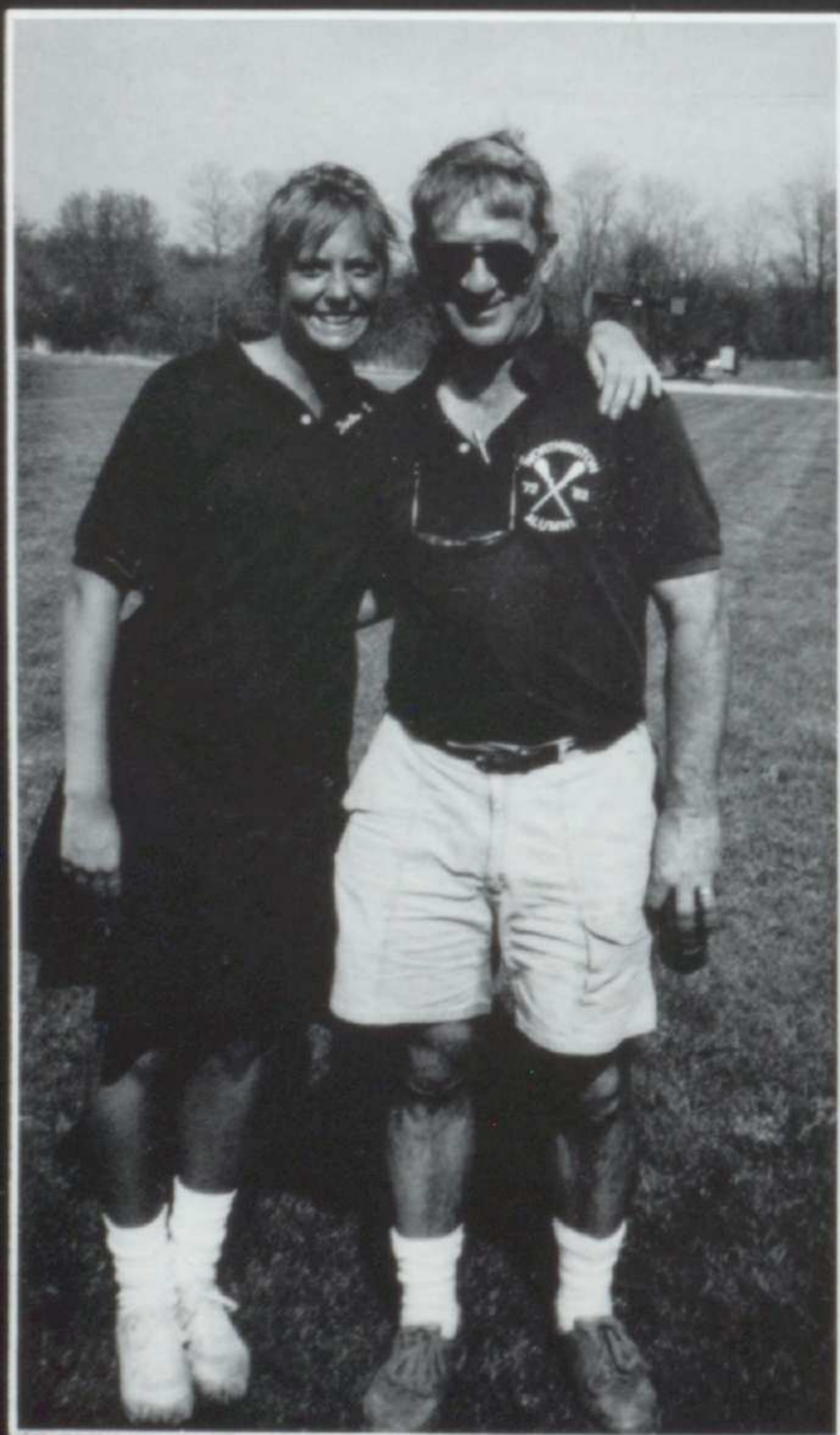
John B. Galipault was instrumental in bringing lacrosse to Central Ohio. His philosophy was to let kids have fun and enjoy the sport of lacrosse. He personally never "cut" any students from his teams.

Mr. Galipault brought lacrosse to Worthington in 1972. He coached the boys' team from 1972-78. In that time, he coached the team to a 73-13 record, including 3 Mid-West Championships, 5 All-Americans, and Coach of the Year honors in 1976. He began the Dublin lacrosse program and coached its first year. He returned to Worthington in 1985, and coached the women's team until 1990. In six seasons, the team accumulated 102 wins, 12 losses, and 2 ties. They also won 2 Mid-West Championships, had 4 second place finishes, and had 7 players honored as All-Americans. In 1991 he started a junior high program for girls, and an elementary youth summer league in 1992. He was the Ohio High School Boys Lacrosse Association Commissioner, and member of the Board of Directors for the Lacrosse Foundation.

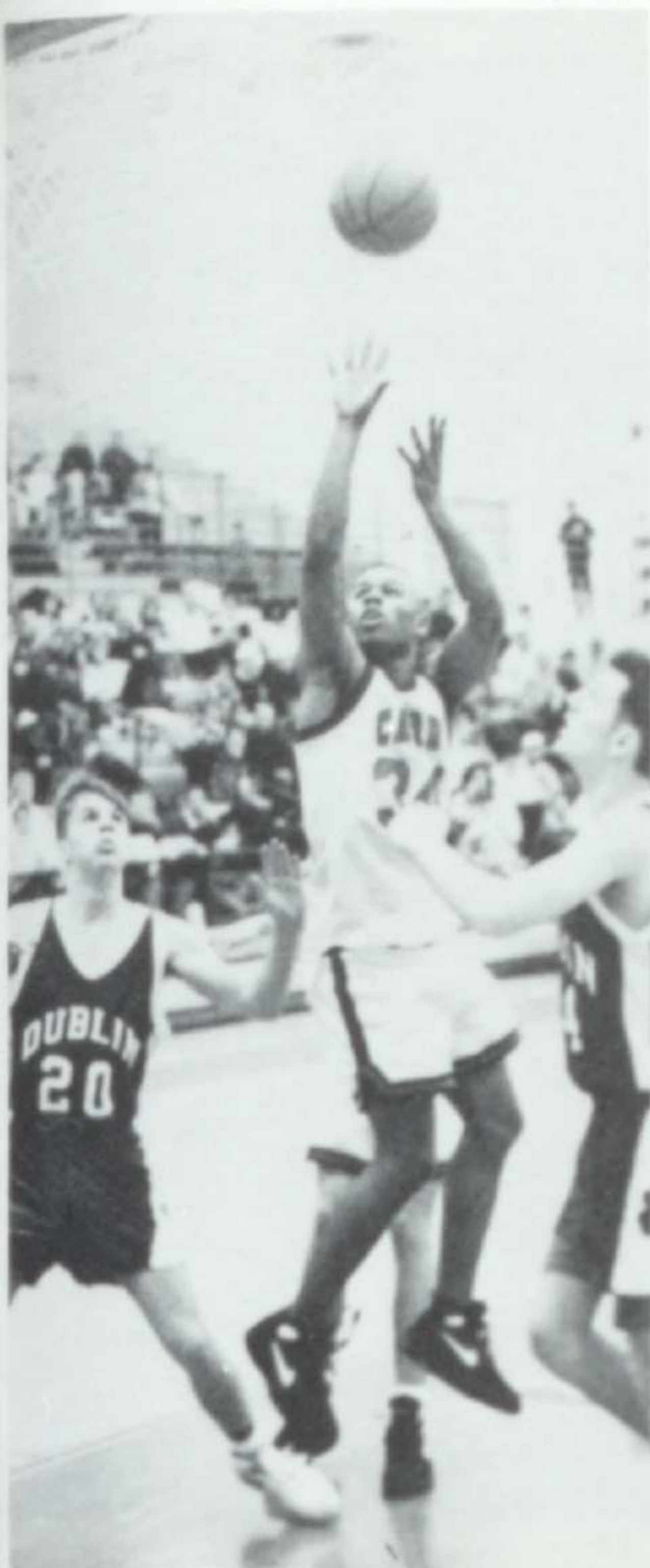

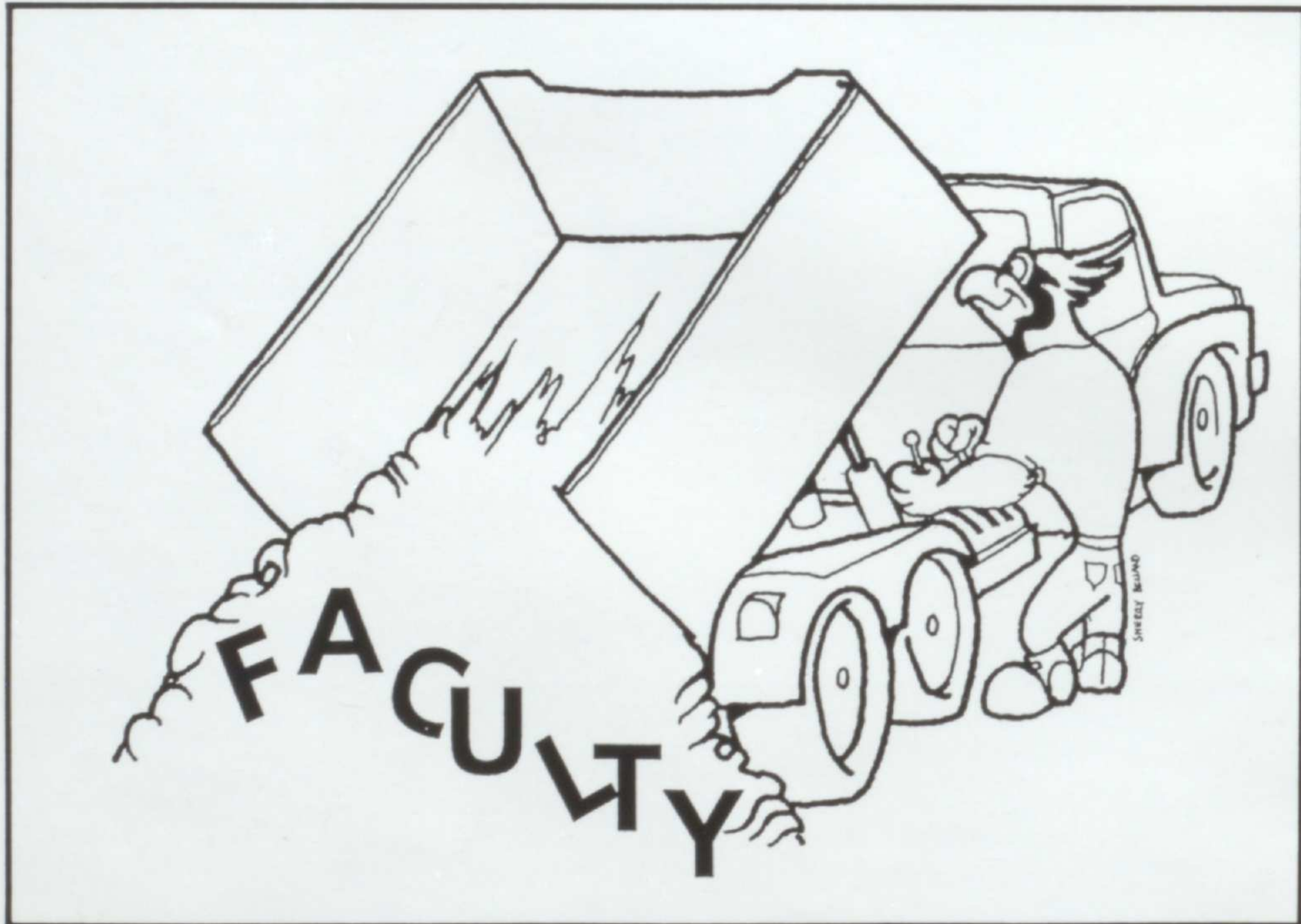
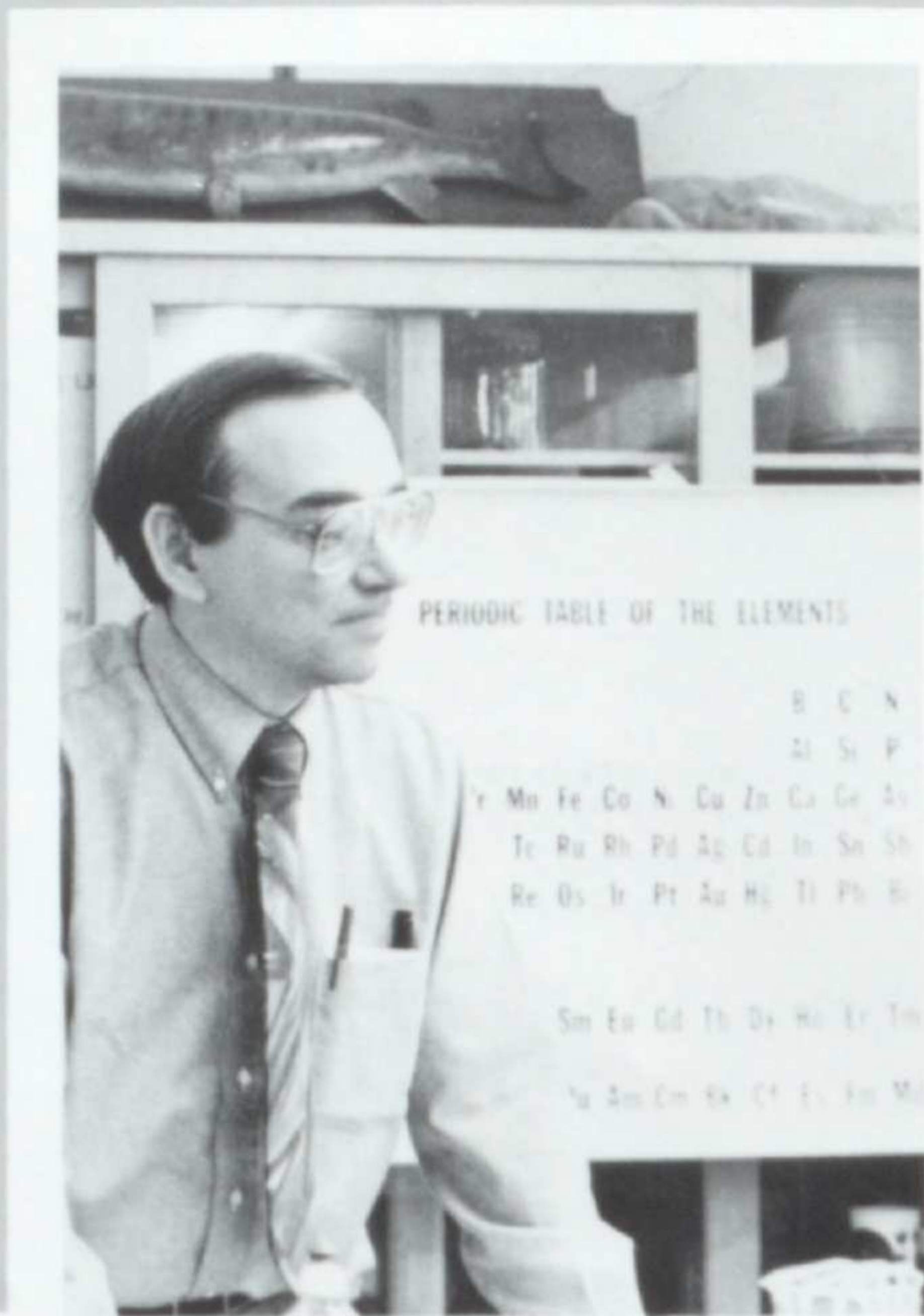

THE NEW TEACHERS' WORKROOM

When Worthington High School was constructed in 1803 it suited the basic needs of everyone except the teachers. Each specific department had only a small work place. Many teachers had to carry their belongings around and shared desks with other teachers. After years of trying to solve this problem, Worthington underwent extensive remodeling in the 1992-1993 school year. Renovations included a teachers' workroom located in place of the old library. The work areas, arranged by departments, now have desks, chairs, cabinets, and drawers for supplies and personal belongings.

Teachers from a variety of departments have found that the workroom has met most of their needs. Mrs. Preston appreciates the new workroom because, she states, "My colleagues are there, and we can talk about the students and new problems that arise; it is very useful. My only complaint is that the room wasn't ready when school started, and I felt somewhat disorganized. Plus there are no wastebaskets-just cardboard boxes!" Mrs. Dawson agrees that it is an ideal work place since her colleagues are there and they can discuss problems. She also adds, "It is a really comfortable atmosphere." Enthusiastically, Mr. Fuller states, "Finally I have my own desk and I don't have to live out of my briefcase anymore. It's a great place to get my work done, but there is no air conditioning!" Mrs. Beattie told us that she had to find a different place each period to work before there was a workroom. There was no place that was her own. Teachers could have chosen to work in the lounge, but it was always noisy and smelled of food. Teachers had to make phone calls to parents in the presence of five or six other teachers; there was no confidentiality. Phones in the workroom allow for more privacy. Mrs. Beattie also says that since teachers have bathrooms in the work space, they do not have to go hunting around for one. The lighting is better, faculty can get more accomplished in a day, and all are appreciative of the advantages of this wonderful new room.
