



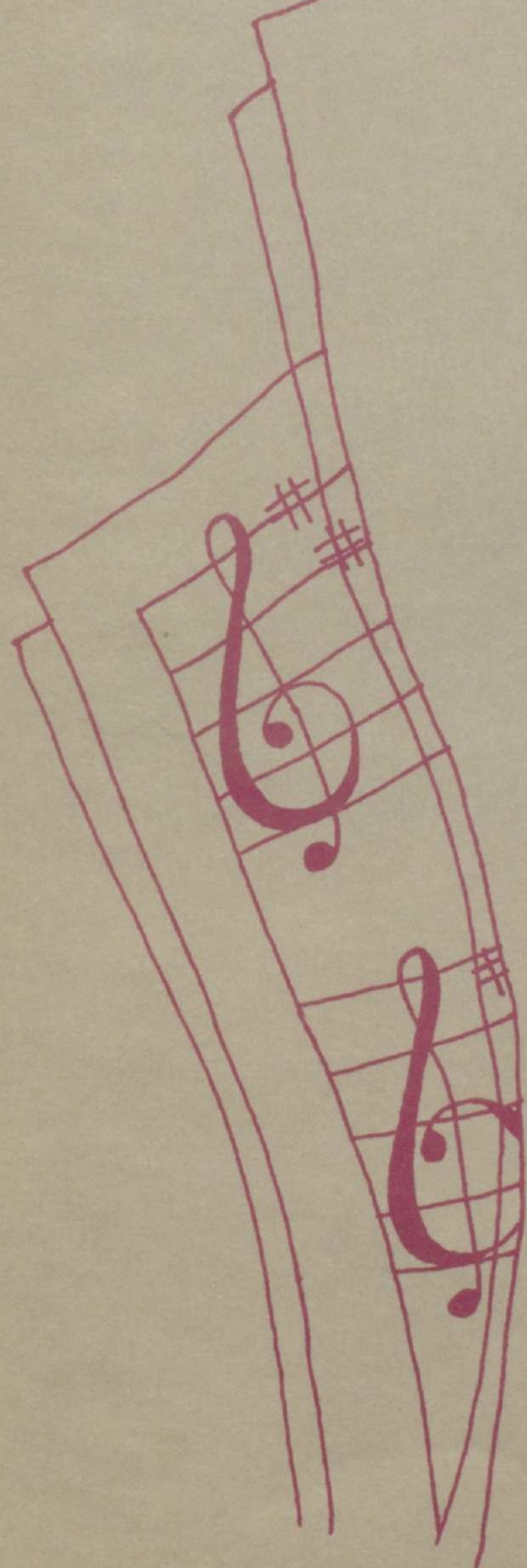




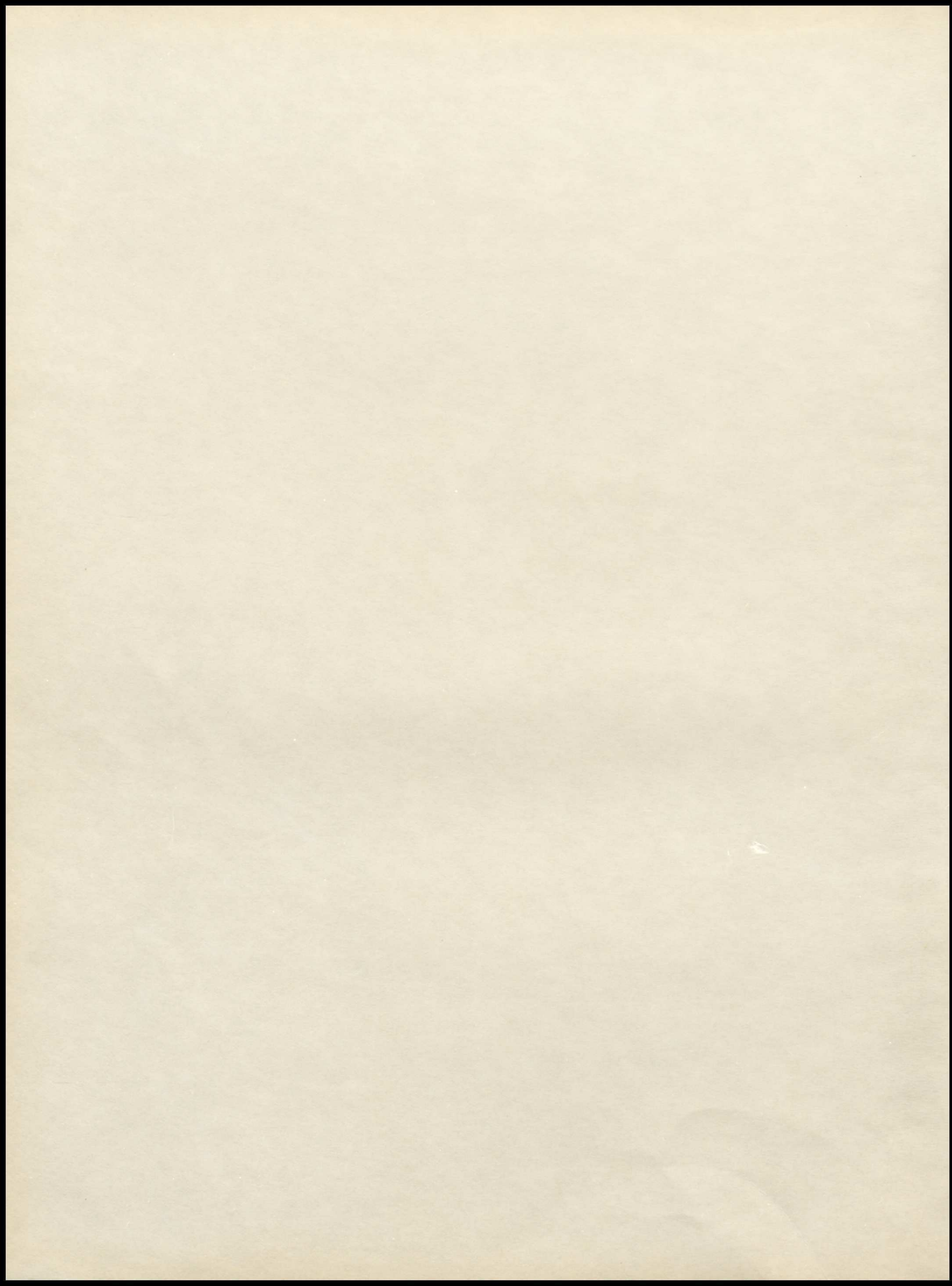

# “Ch-Ch-Ch-Changes”

Many years have passed since the inception of Worthington High School in 1808. The building we know and love is not the original. Even the appearance of this building has changed along with the traditions within.

Worthington High School was founded in 1808. The existence of our school has brought about many traditions and others that don't quite embody the same prestige. Many of these traditions have been misplaced, banned, or collectively dropped by the student body or administration. The graduating class of 1974 would remember the zany antics of a hand-picked group of senior males. This group established a brief legacy known as the "Ten Man Kazoo Band" (a.k.a. TMKB). The original members of this group wanted to create a more spirited school. The group of unique and talented young men performed at pep rallies and during halftime shows. The Alma Mater never sounded quite as good as when played on kazoos. At halftime of the Valentine's Day home basketball game, TMKB dressed up in cardboard heart costumes, played the Alma Mater and threw candy into the crowd. Sadly, this was a short lived activity because some thoughtless fun squelchers believed they were being funny and attempted to de-heart a performer. You may ponder why we no longer see any TMKB concerts. Well, in 1978 The Ten Man Kazoo Band played at the senior assembly and got a little too creative with their encore. If you've never noticed the colossal bell, you probably aren't shocked by the fact that it is never rung. One fateful night the lock was broken off by another group of fun squelchers. After this incident anyone could ring the bell at any time, even during school hours. This forced the administration to remove the ringer from the bell and put an end to another Thomas Worthington tradition.

These and many other Cardinal Traditions have been eliminated over the history of Worthington High School. But don't be discouraged, be inventive and create your own enjoyable and spirited Thomas Worthington Tradition. # "Yesterday"

For the first time in recent school history, hats were restricted from being worn in the building during the school day. This caused pandemonium in the halls of Thomas Worthington. 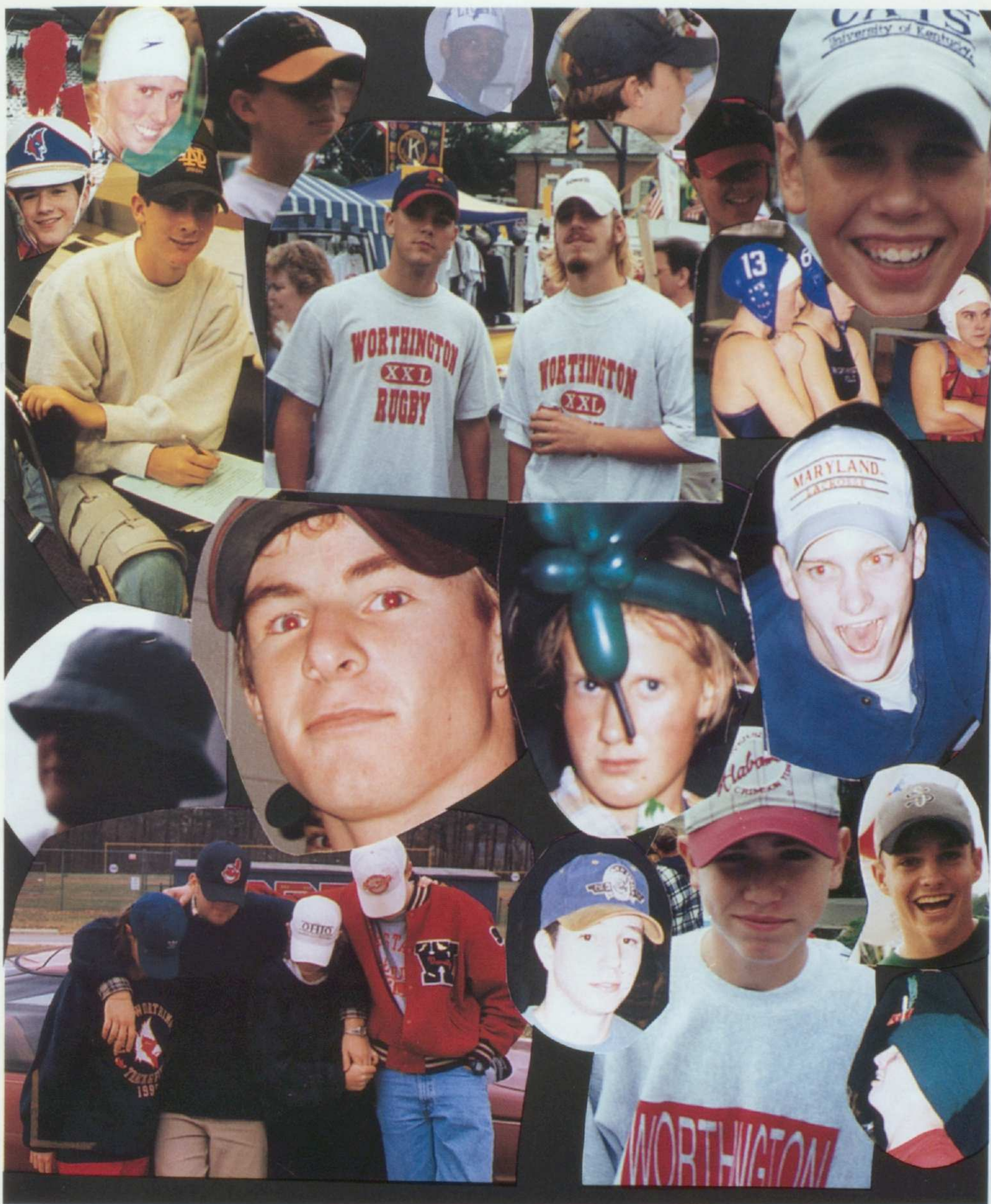

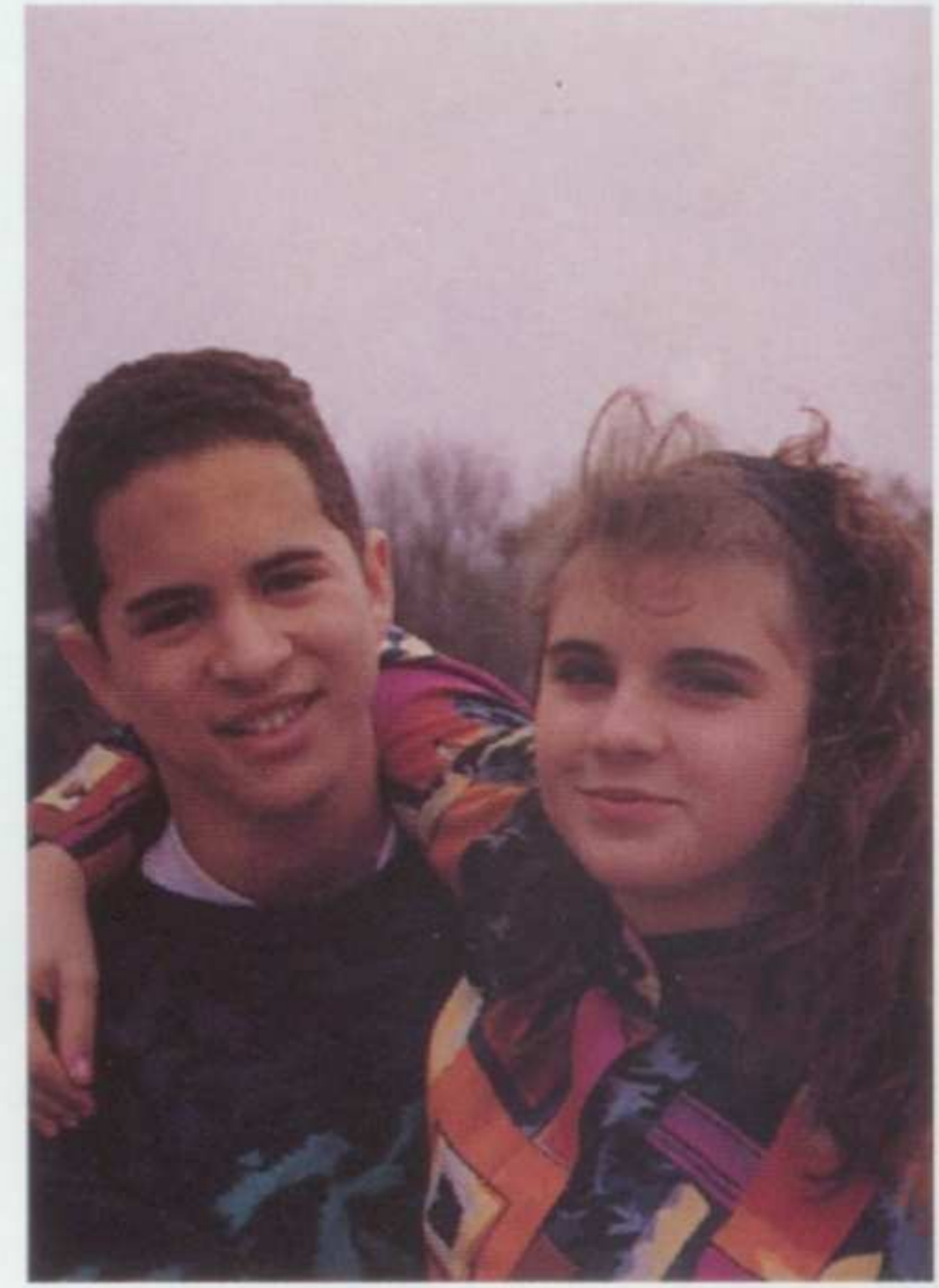


# "Let's Stay Together"

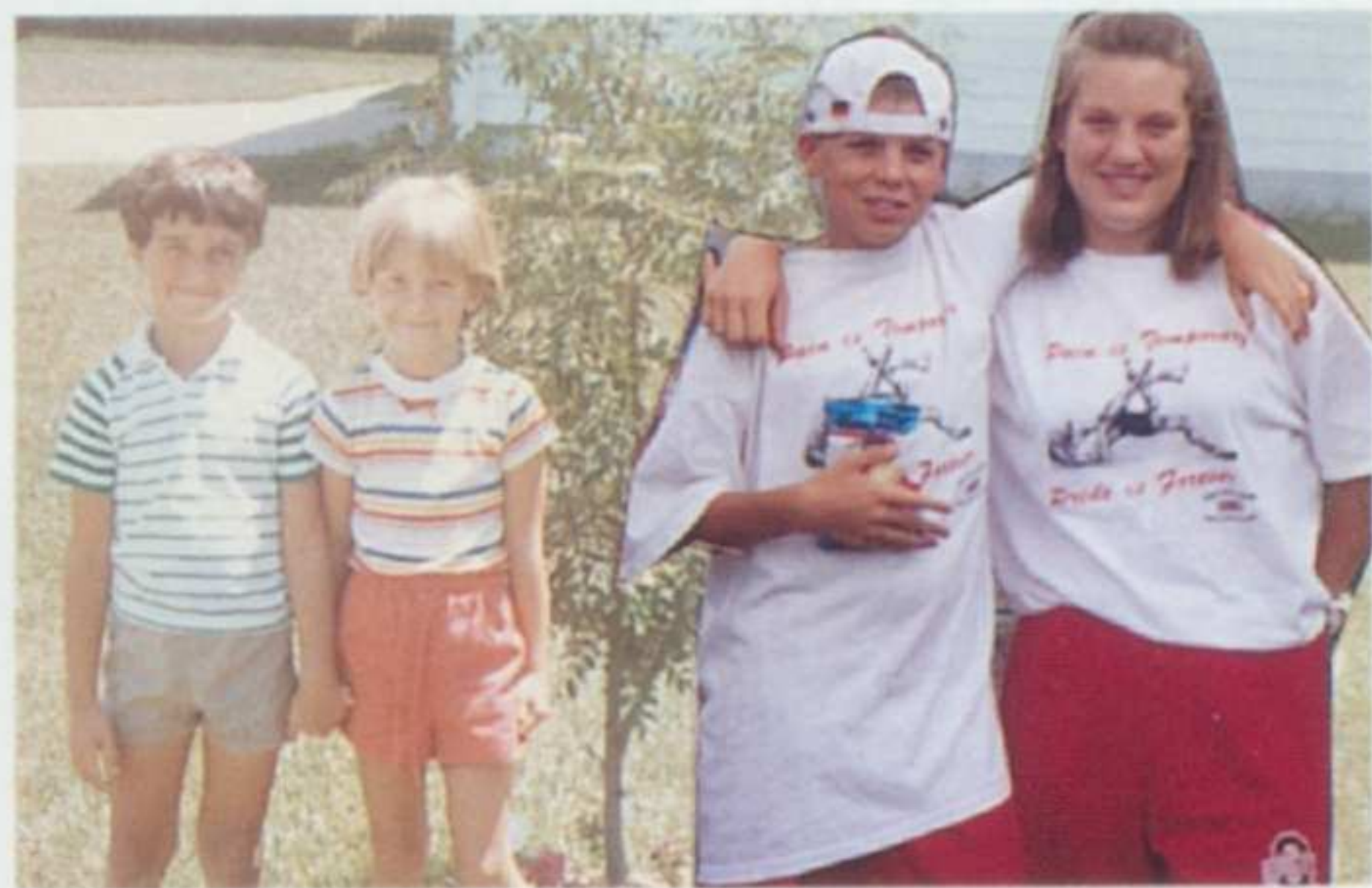

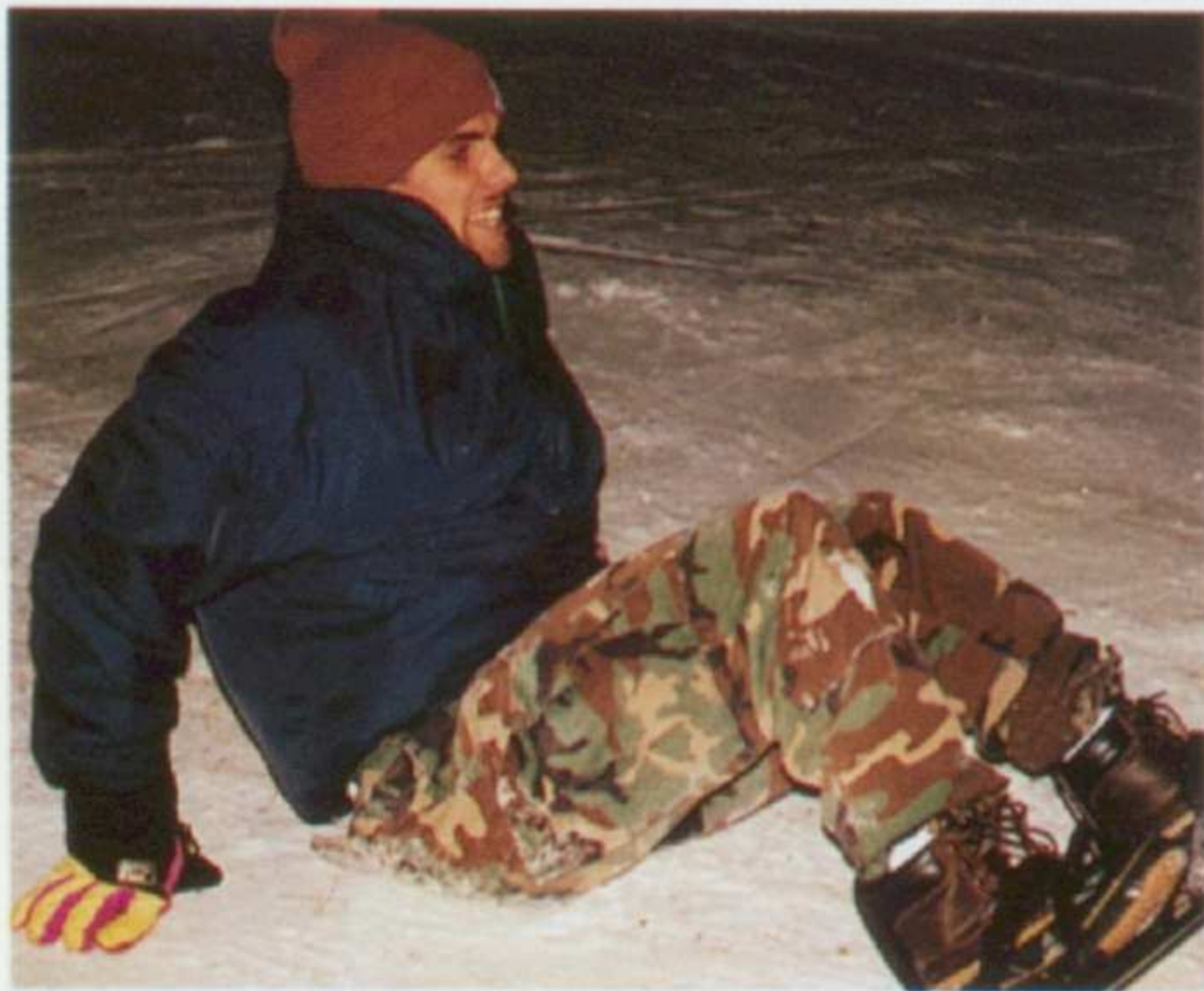
When autumn turns to winter, snow begins to fall. Along with this comes cold, icy weather which forces students to wake up

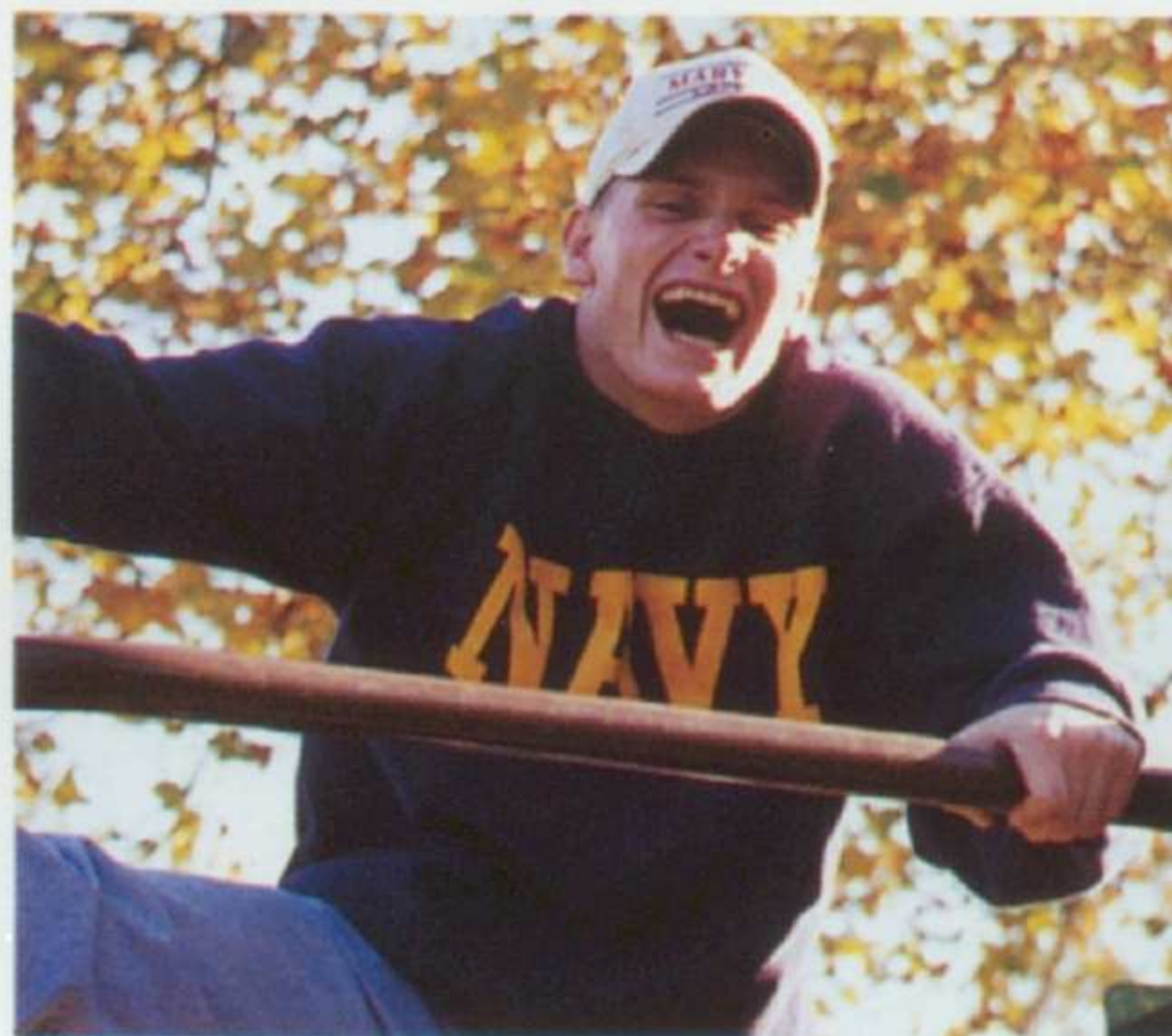

"Slow down, you move too fast, you've gotta make the morning last.....havin' fun and feelin' groovy," hums John Wilson. "That's why I chose late arrival."



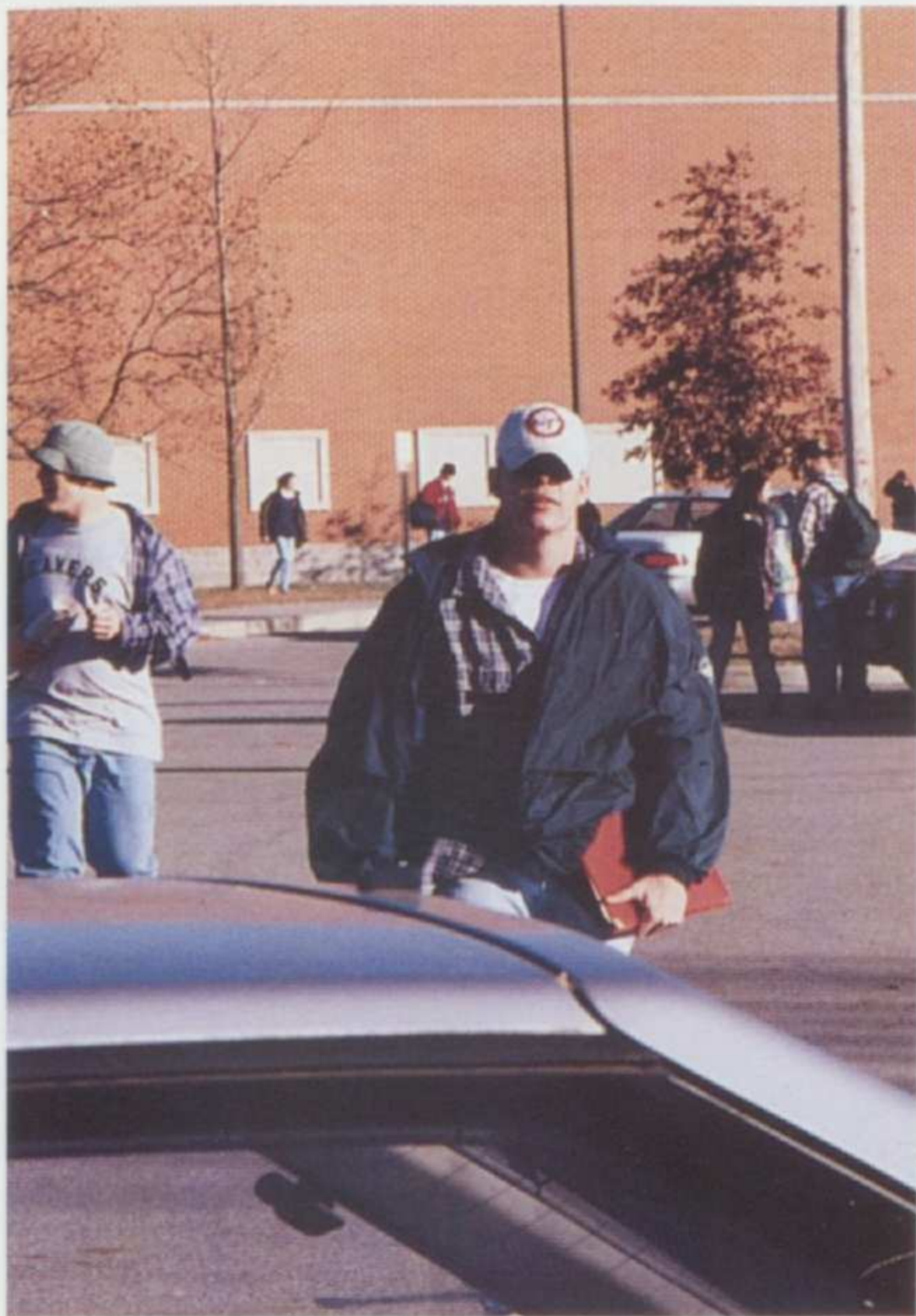

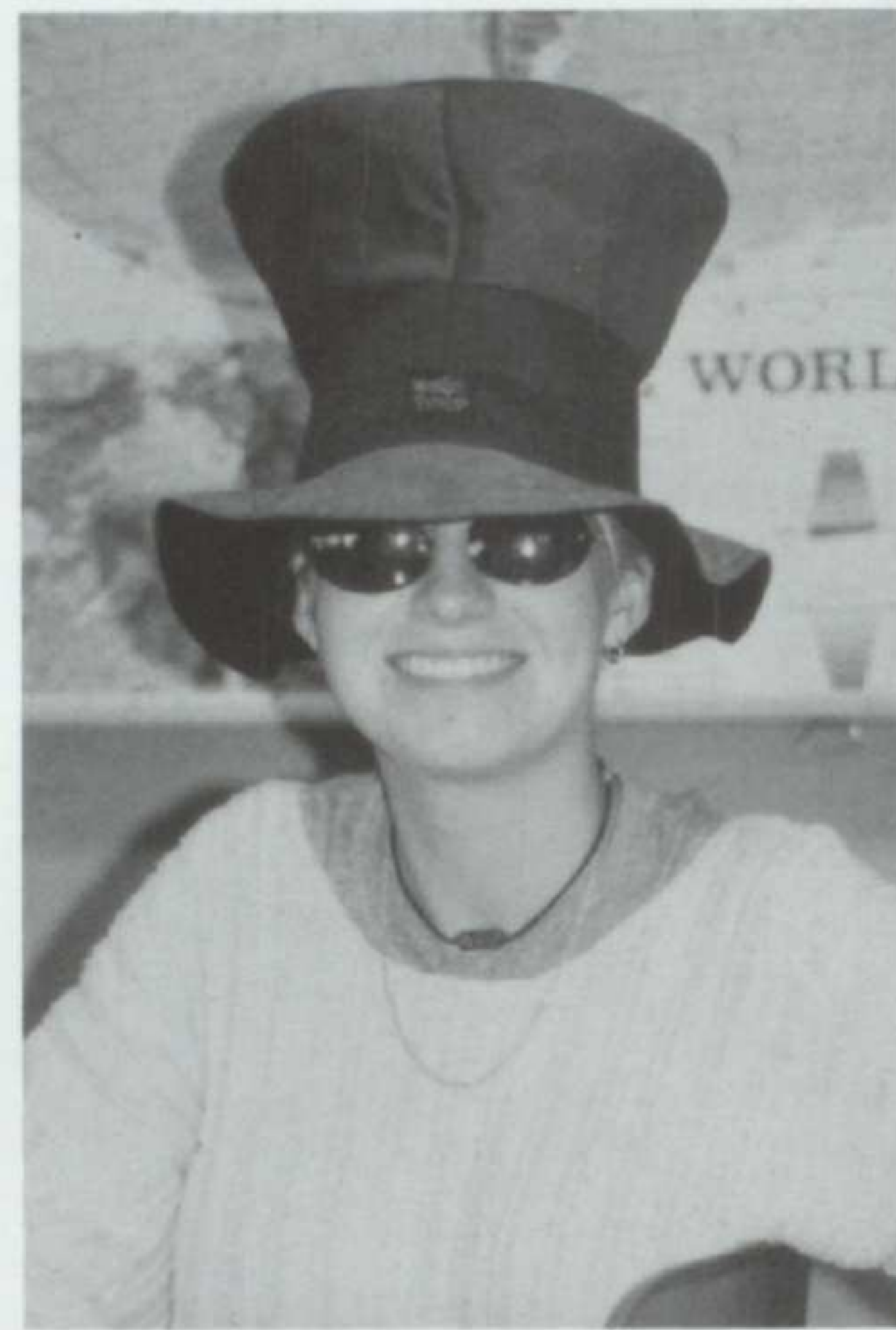

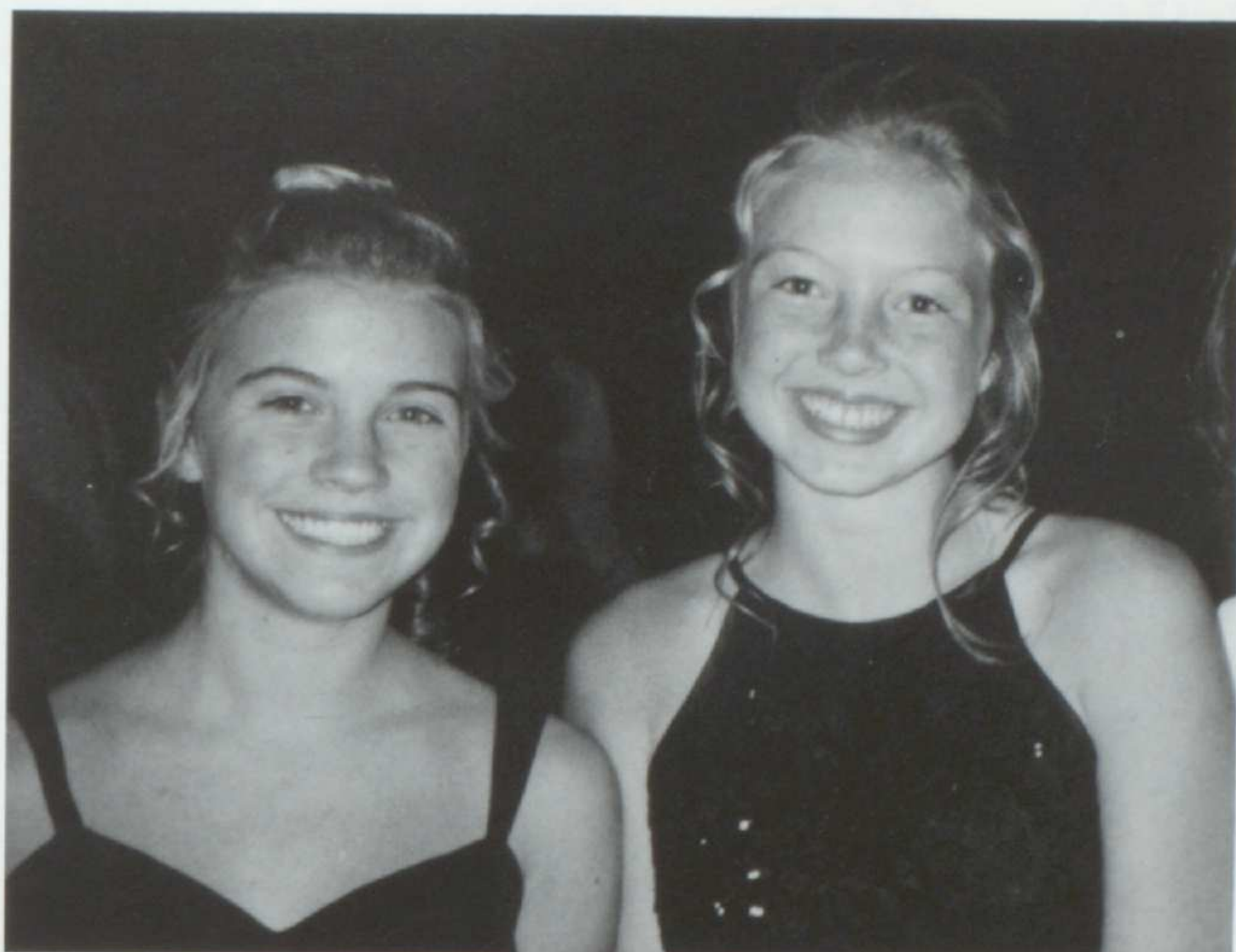

As the one that is found in our auxiliary gym.

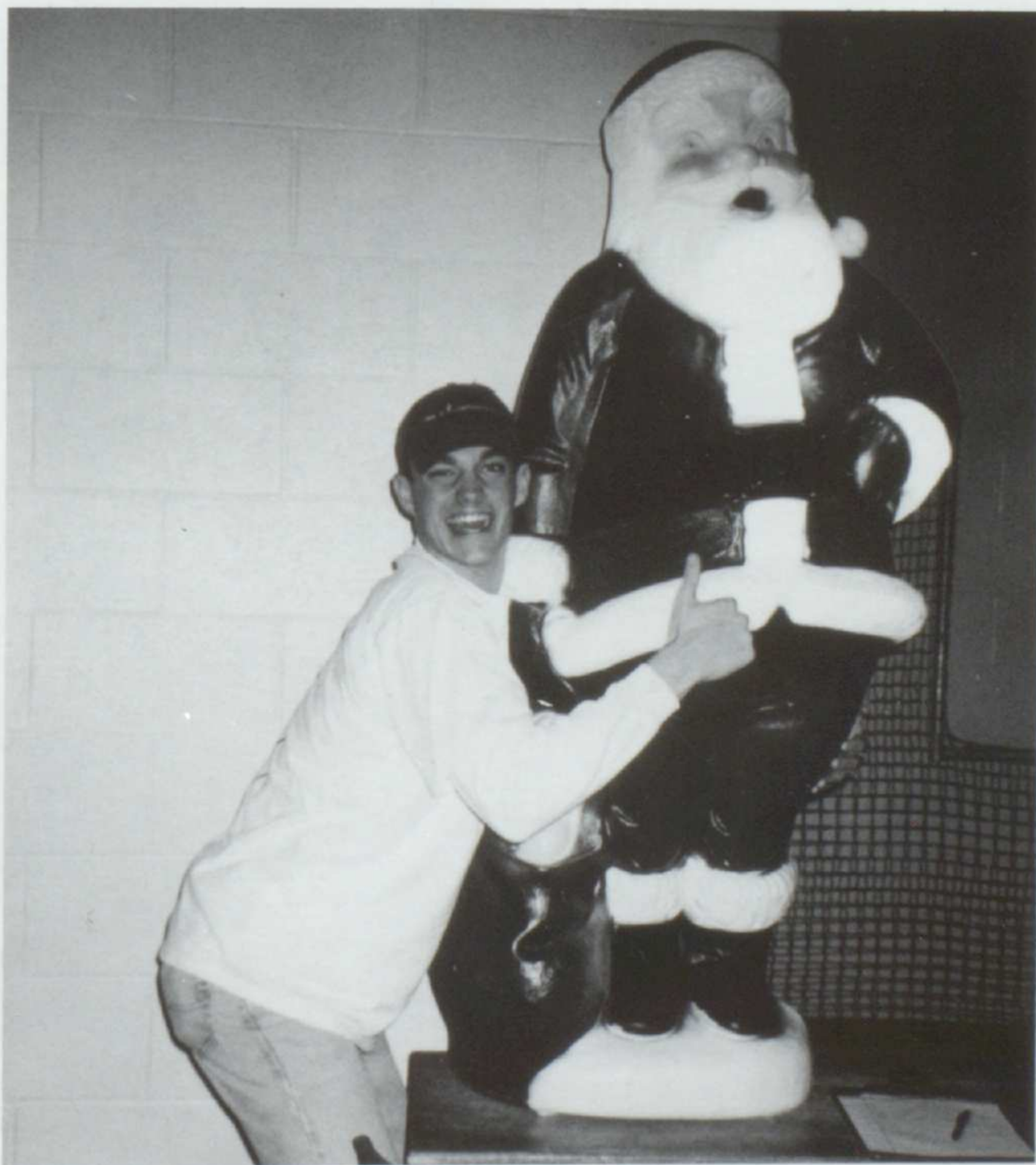
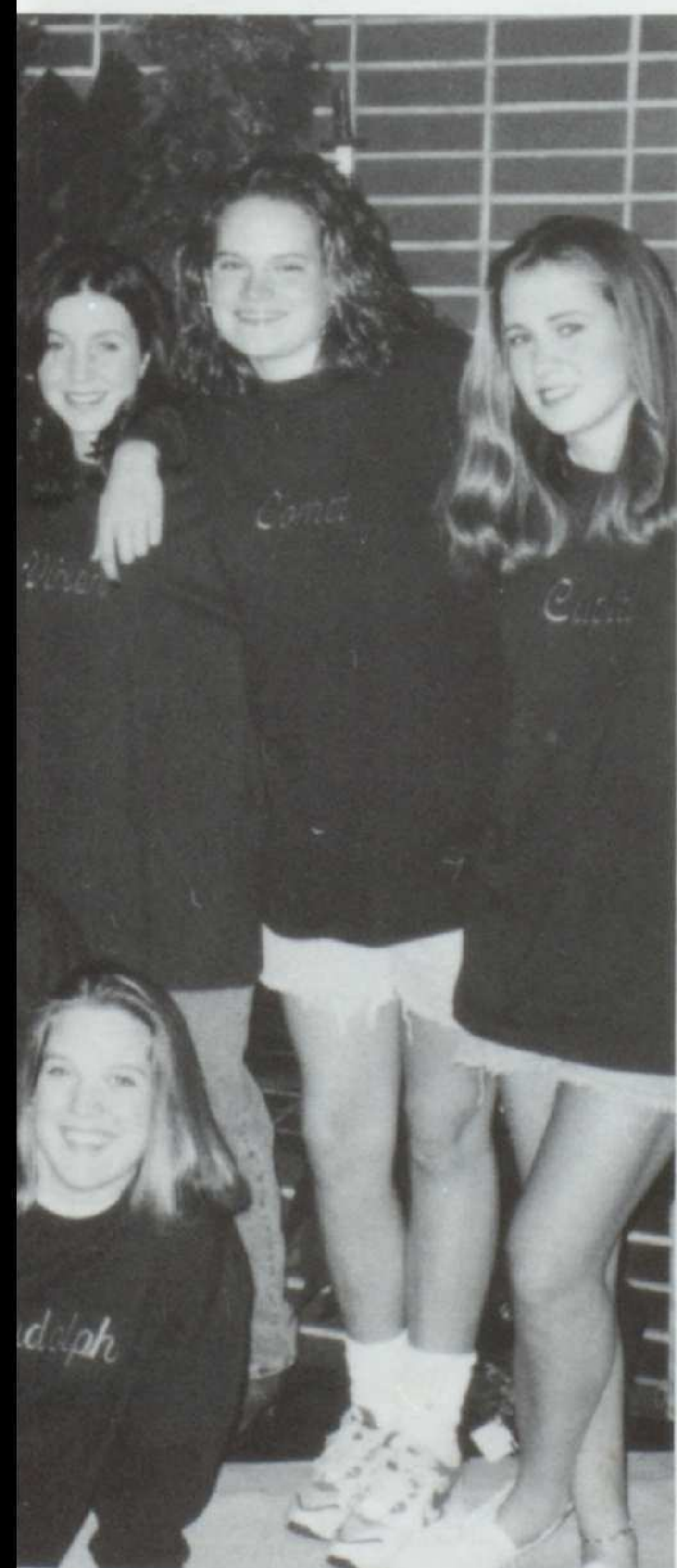
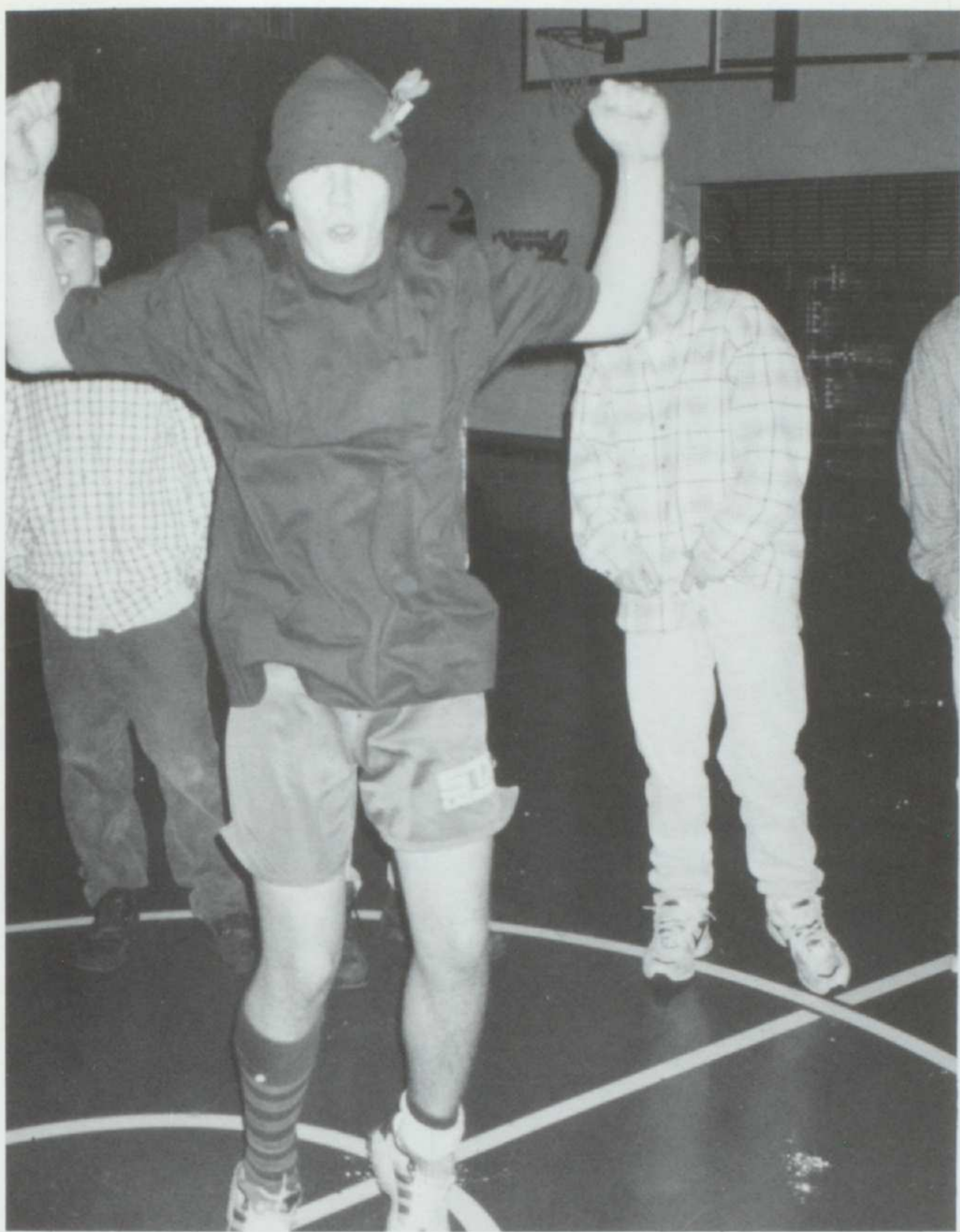

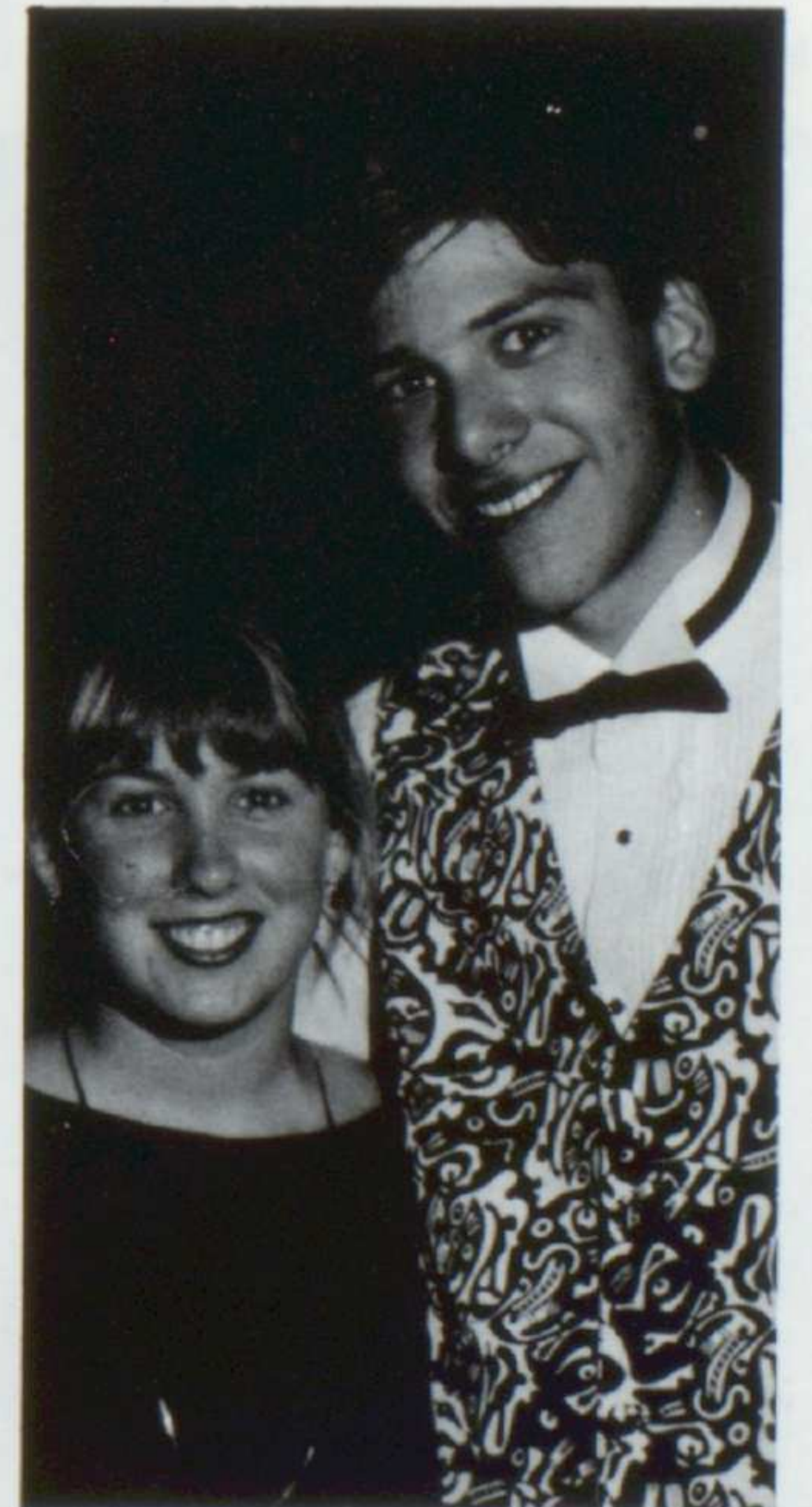

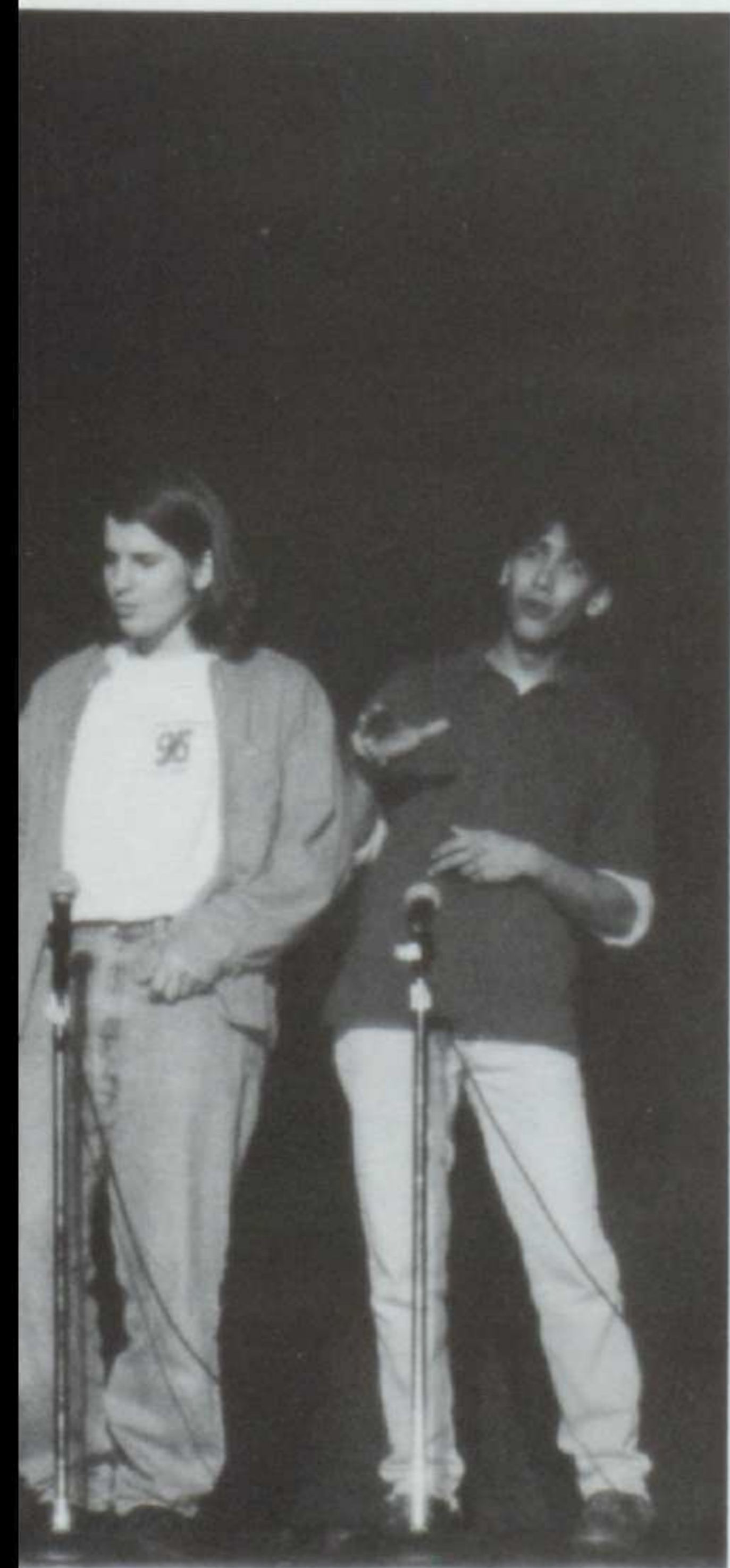
## Rockin' In The "Hottenroth"

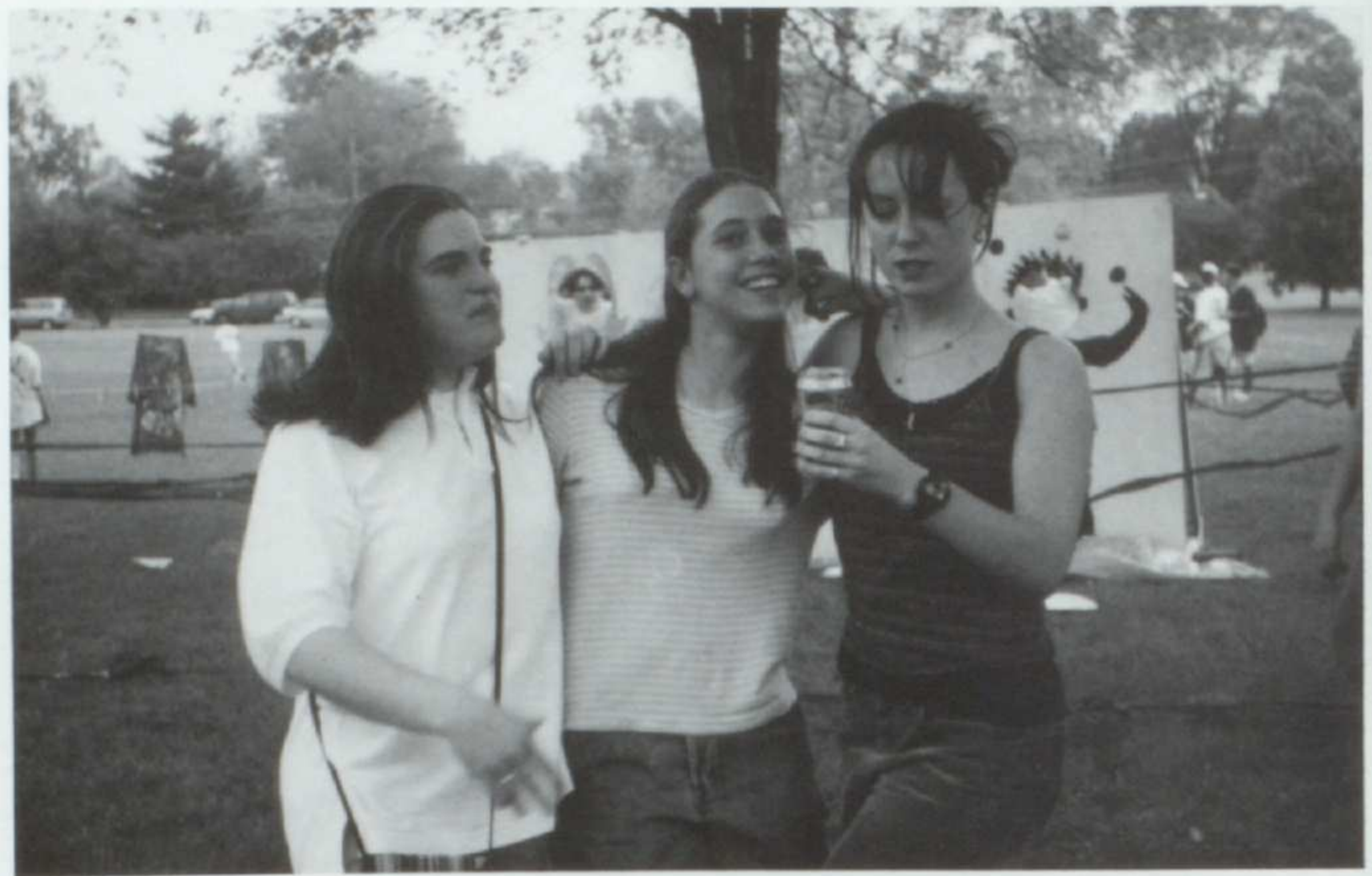
## *Craziness In The Nest*

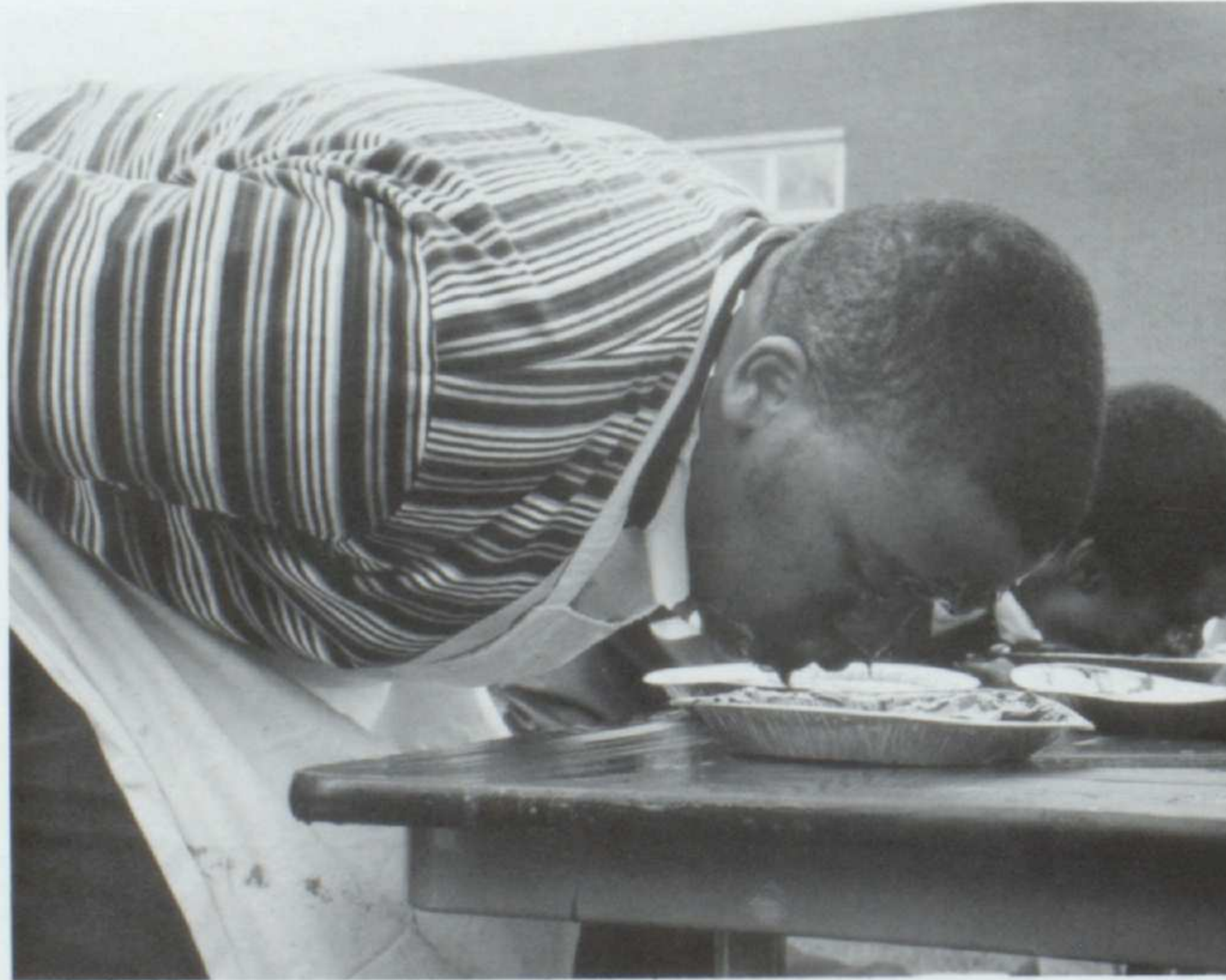
Inside, the 2nd ever

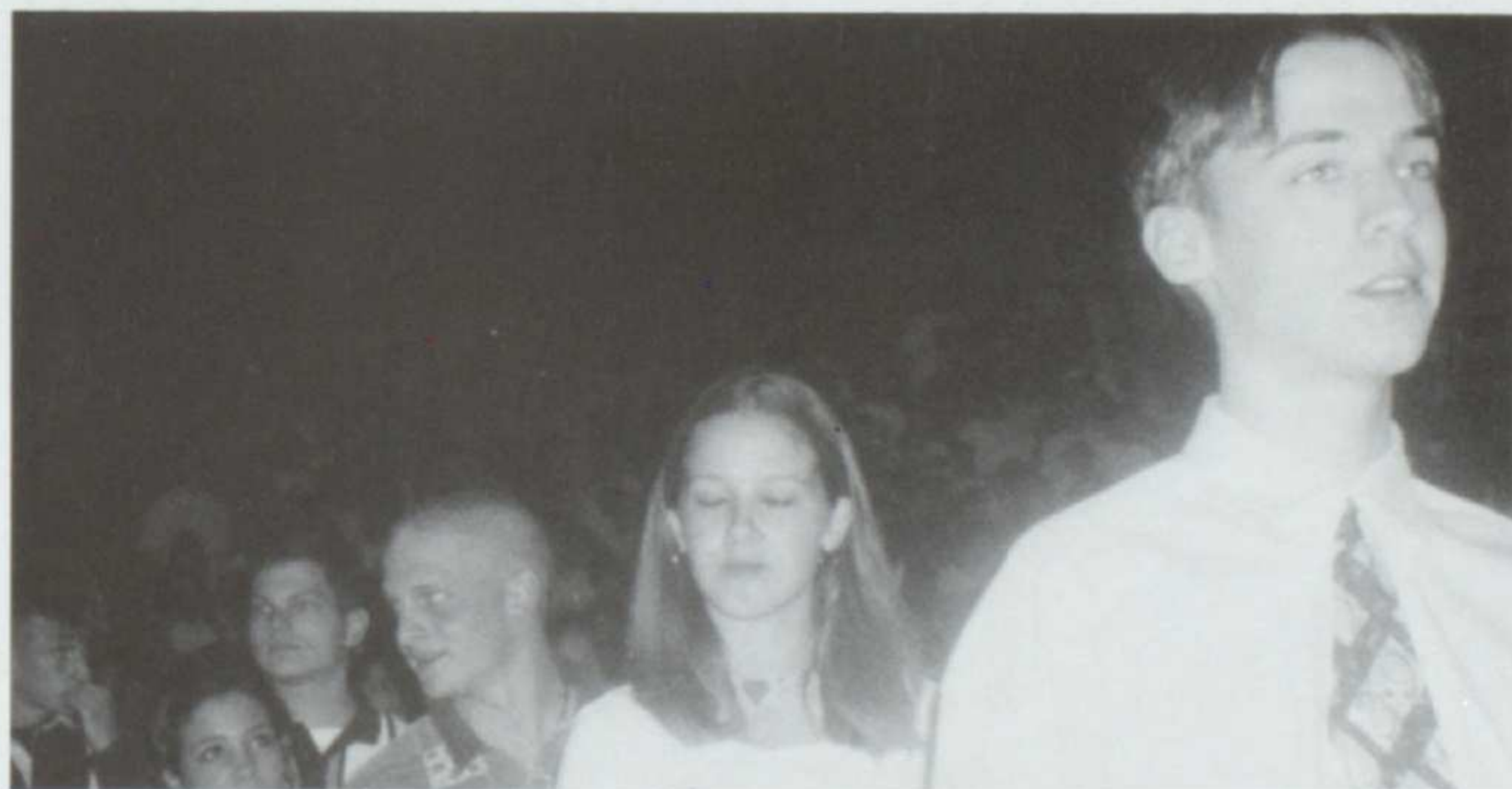
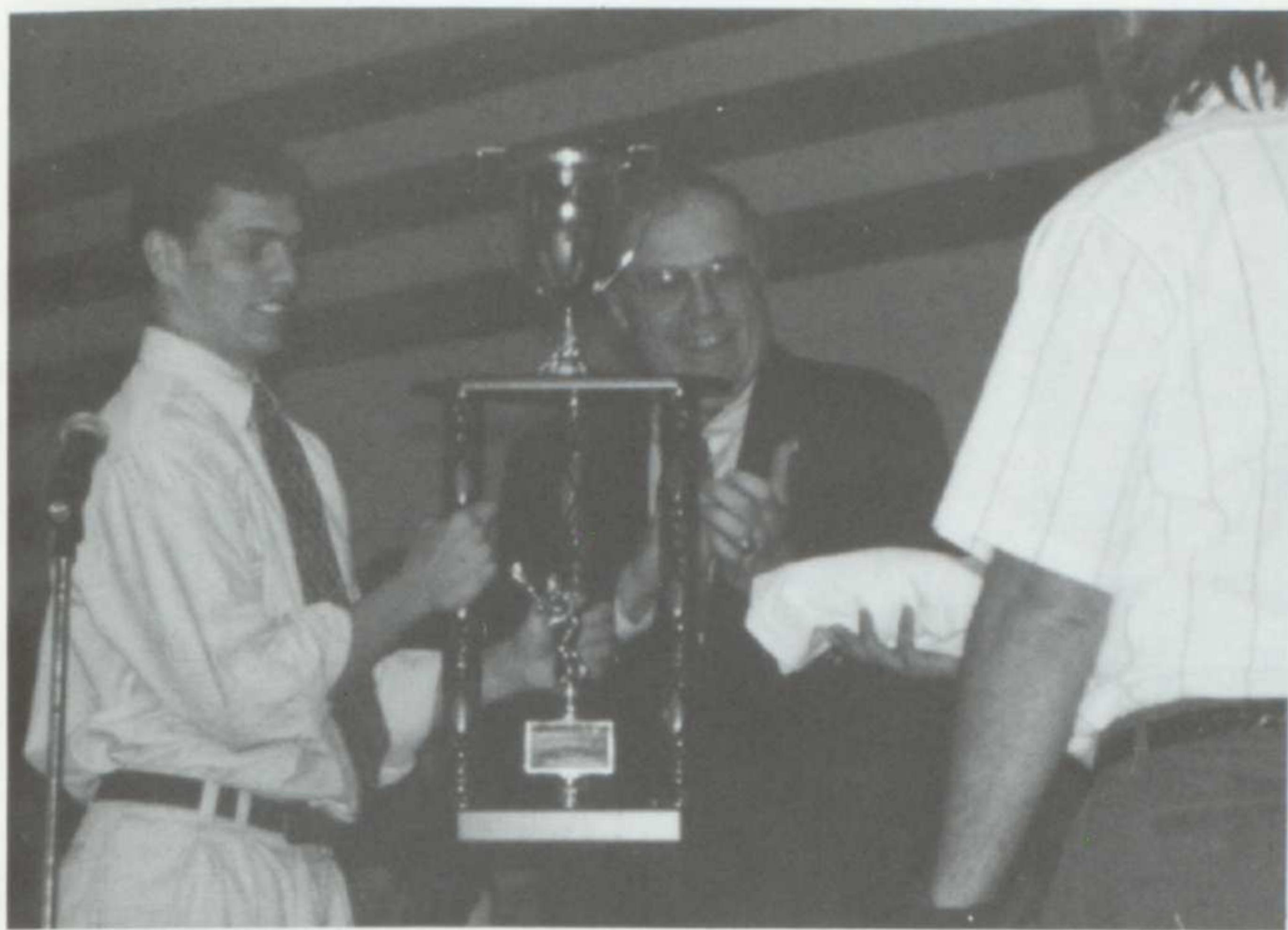


## Proud to be a Cardinal

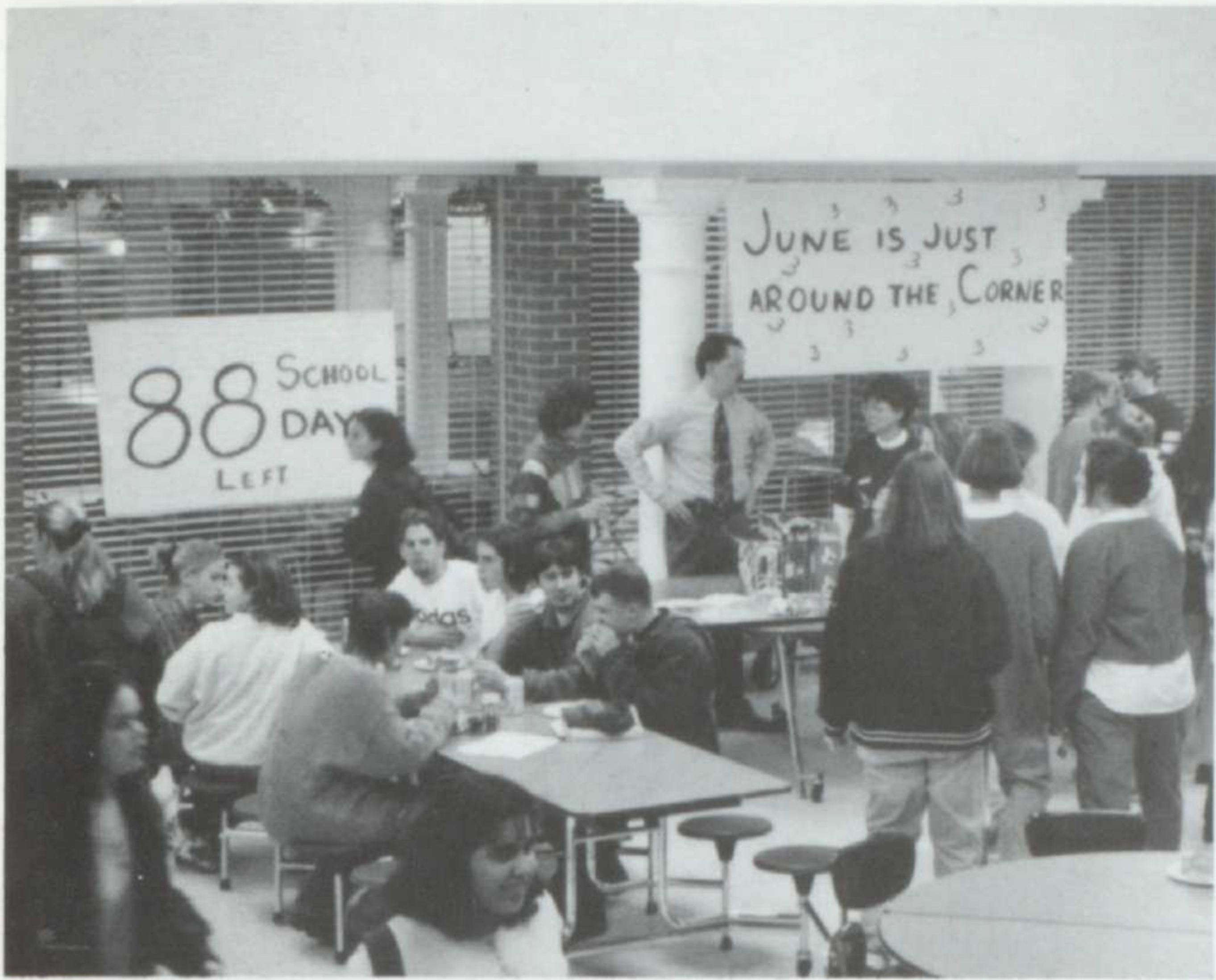

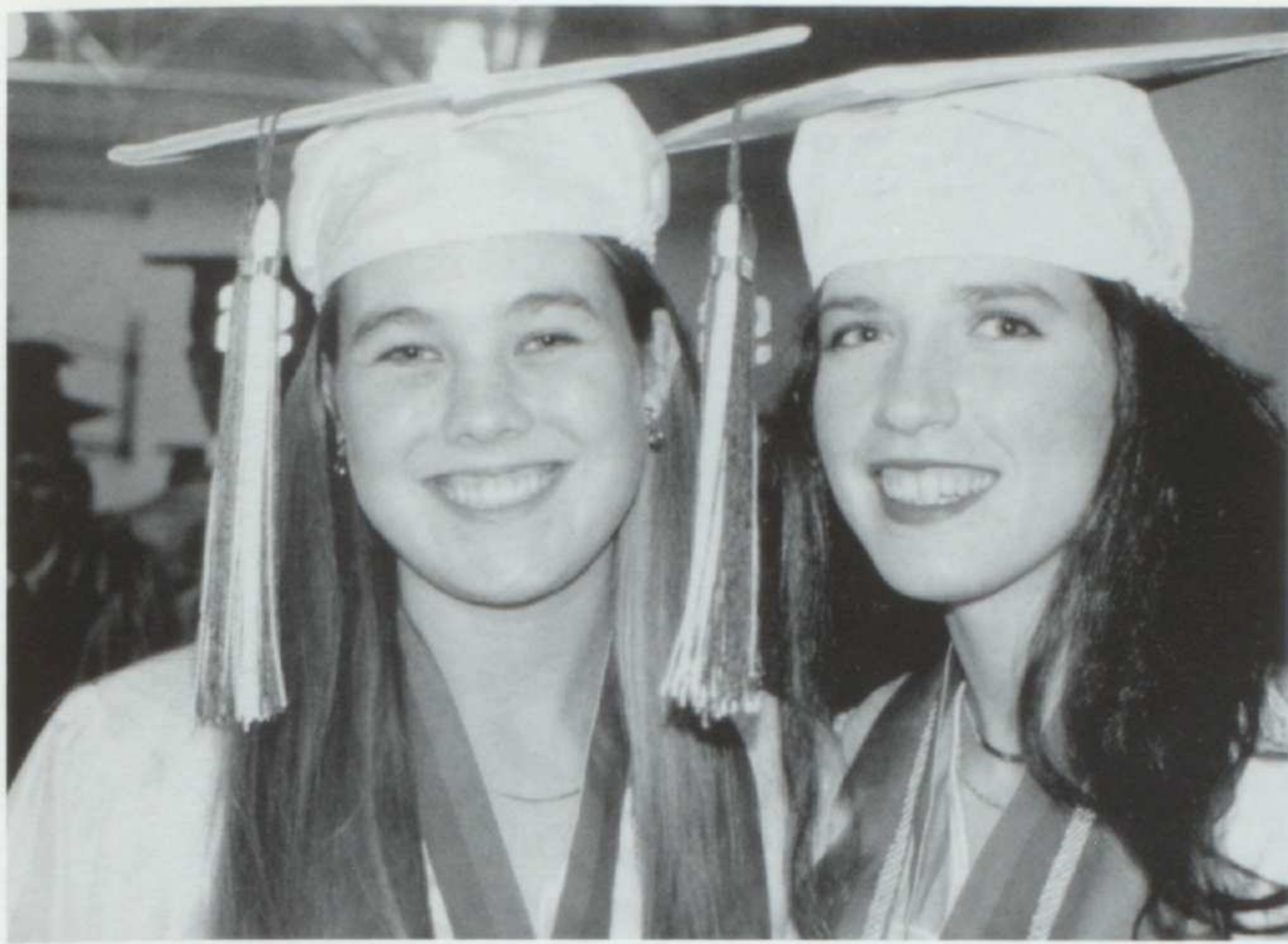

## We've Only Just Begun

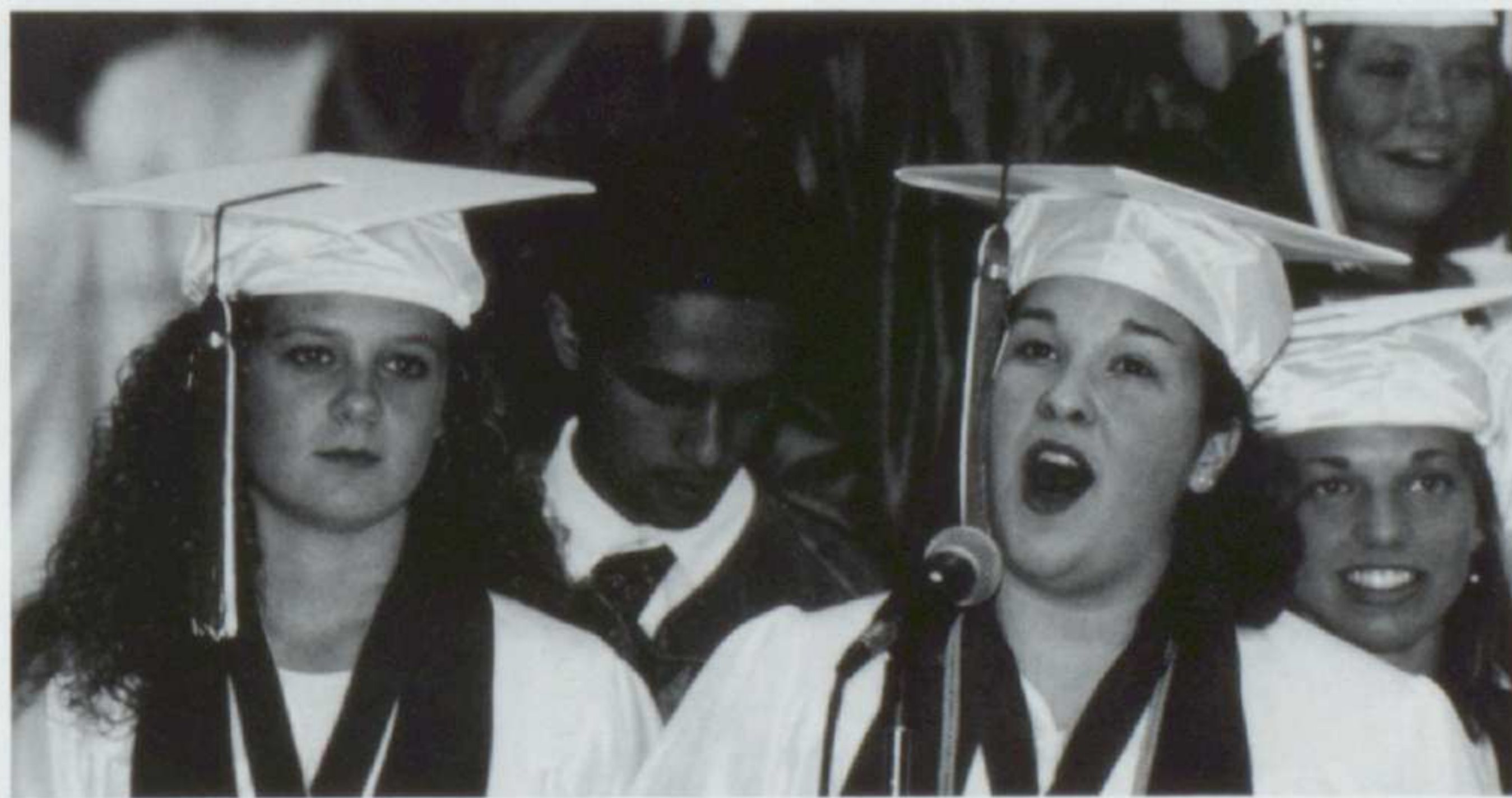

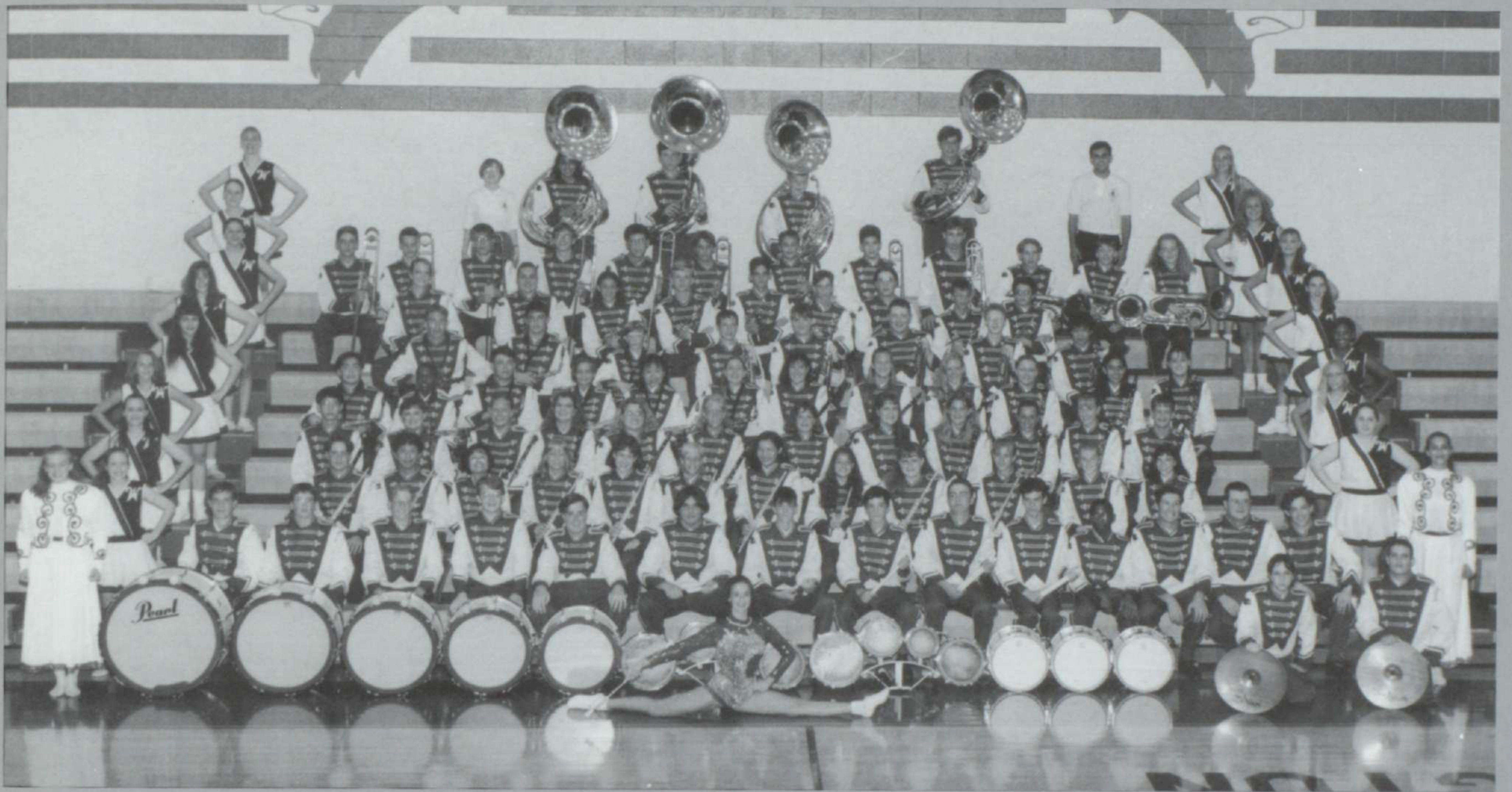

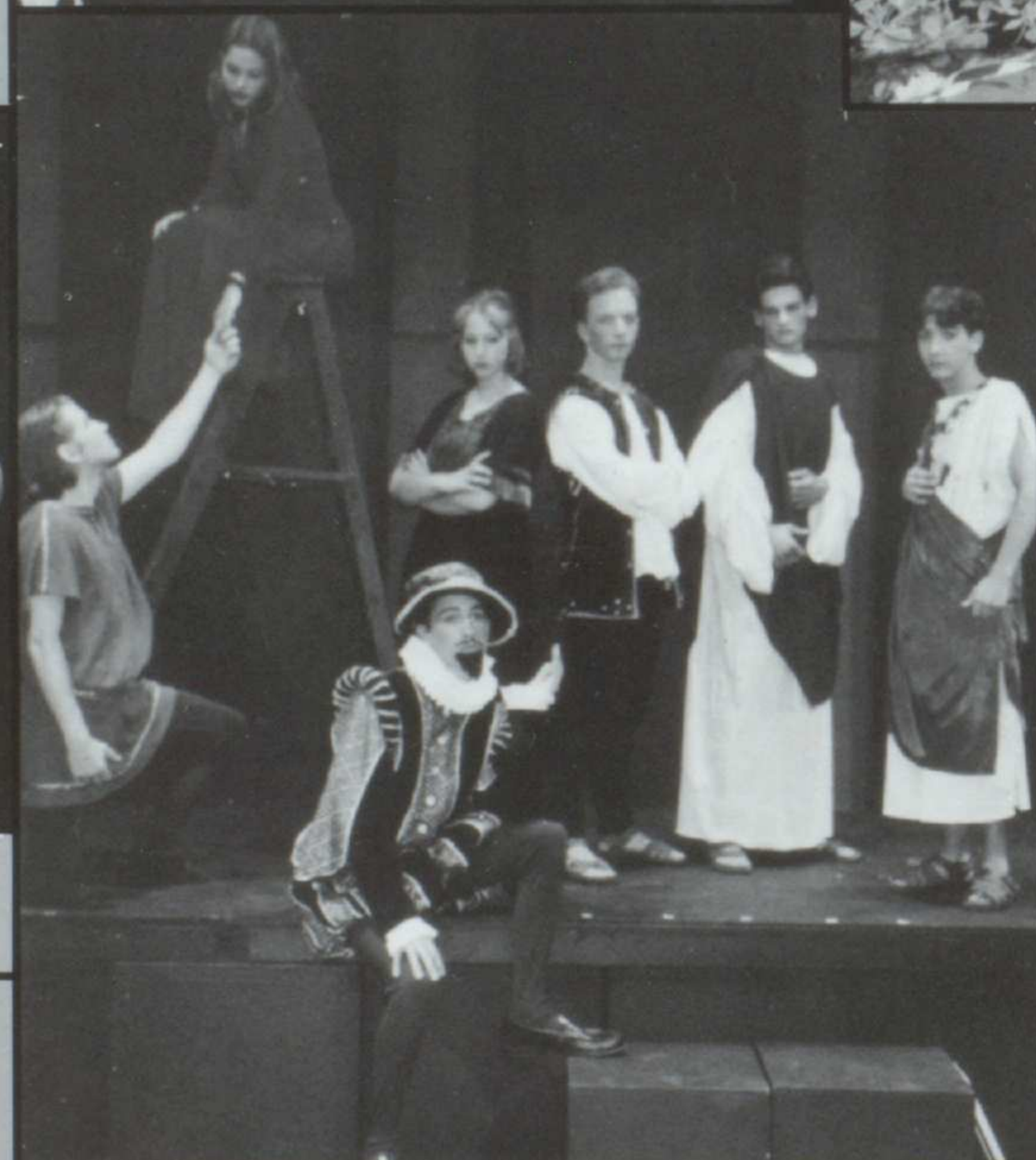

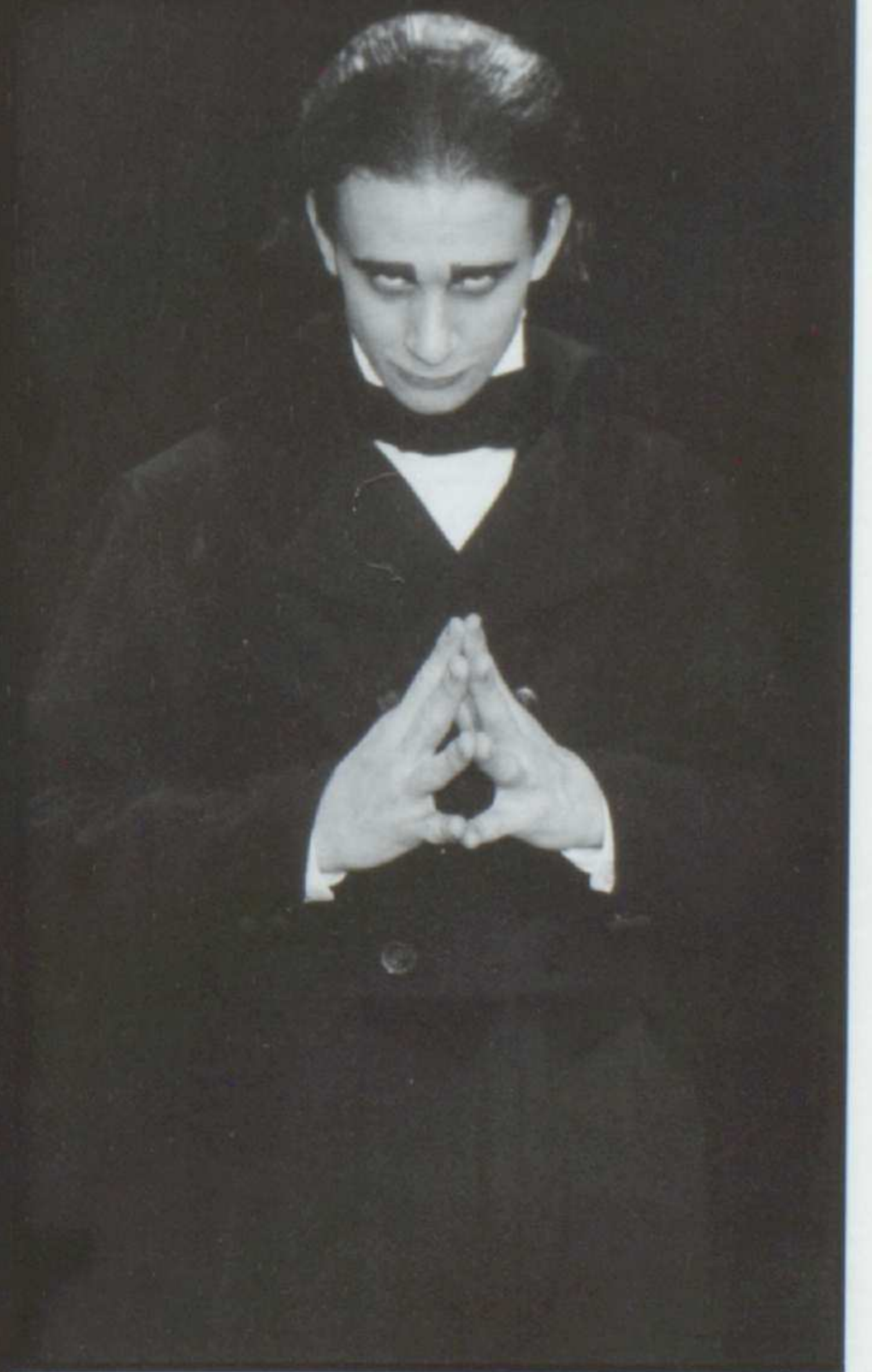

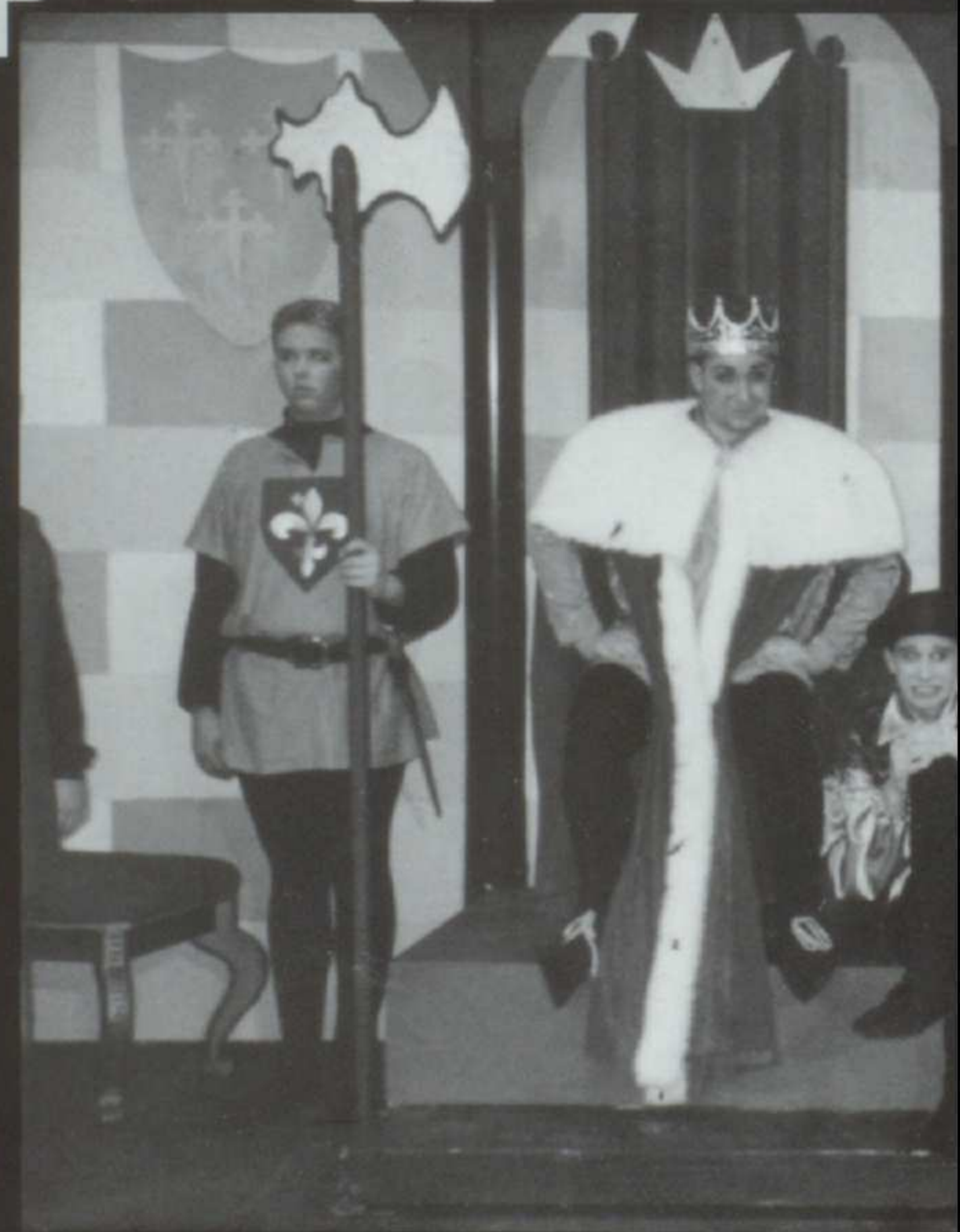

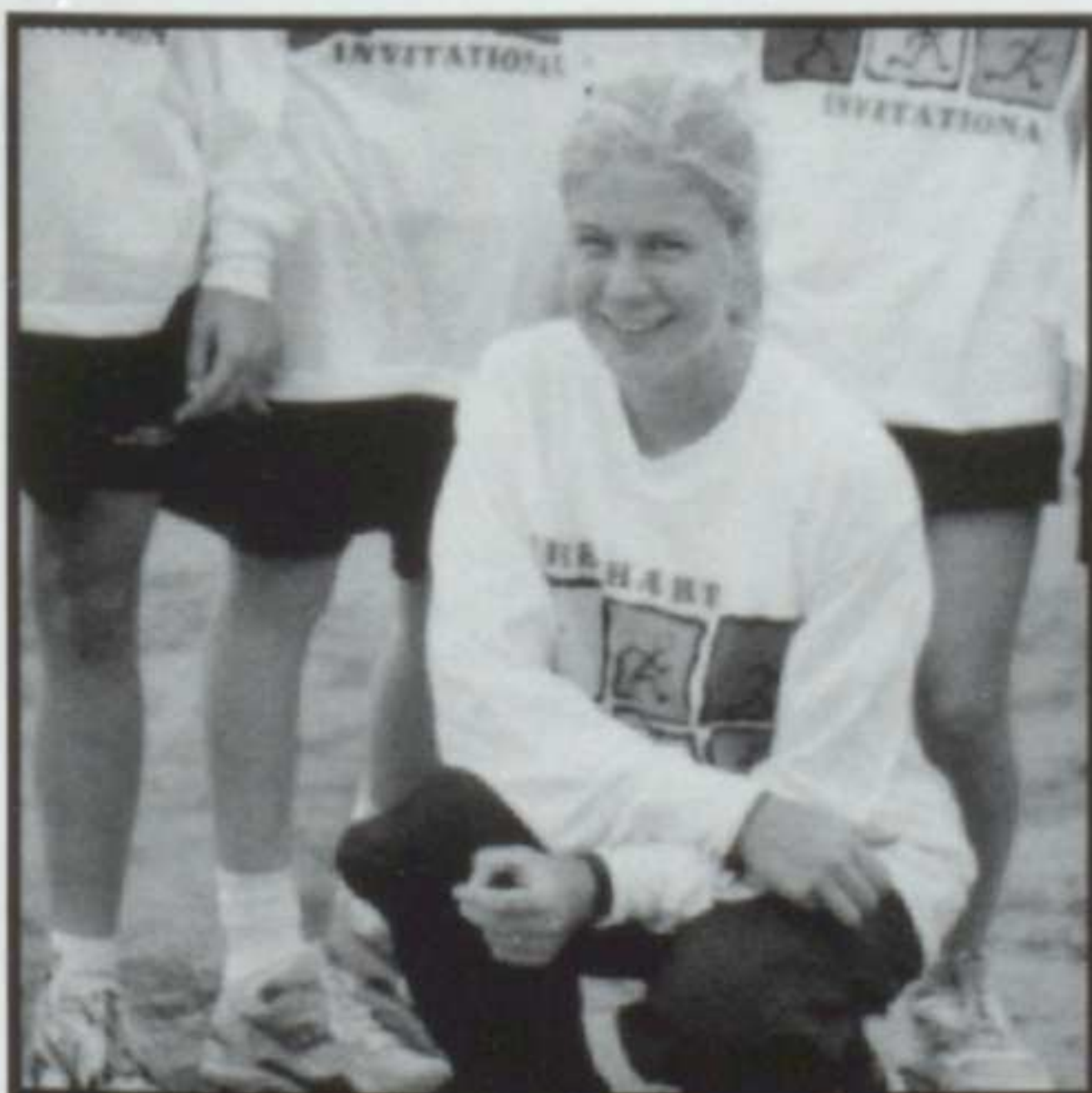

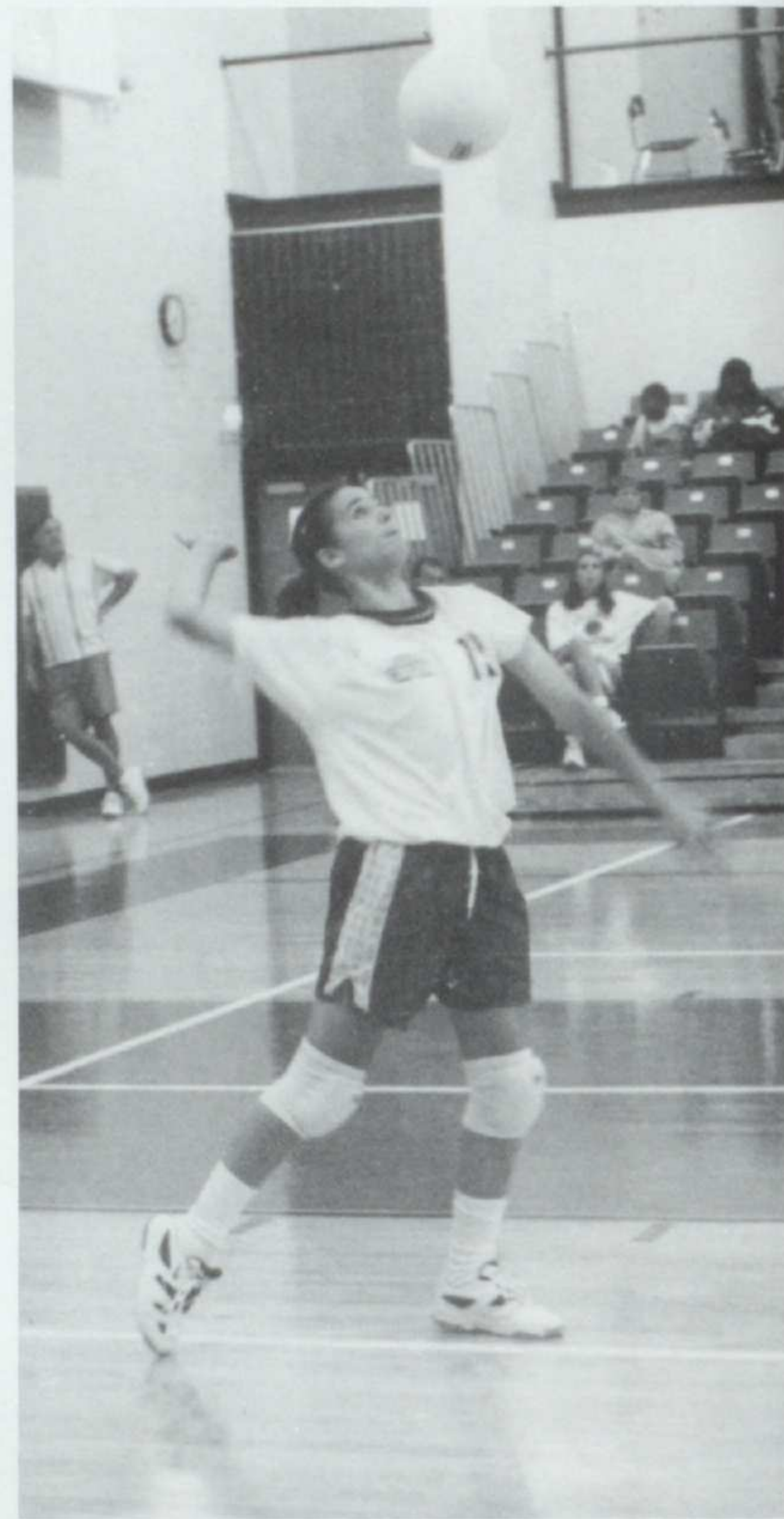

# Golf

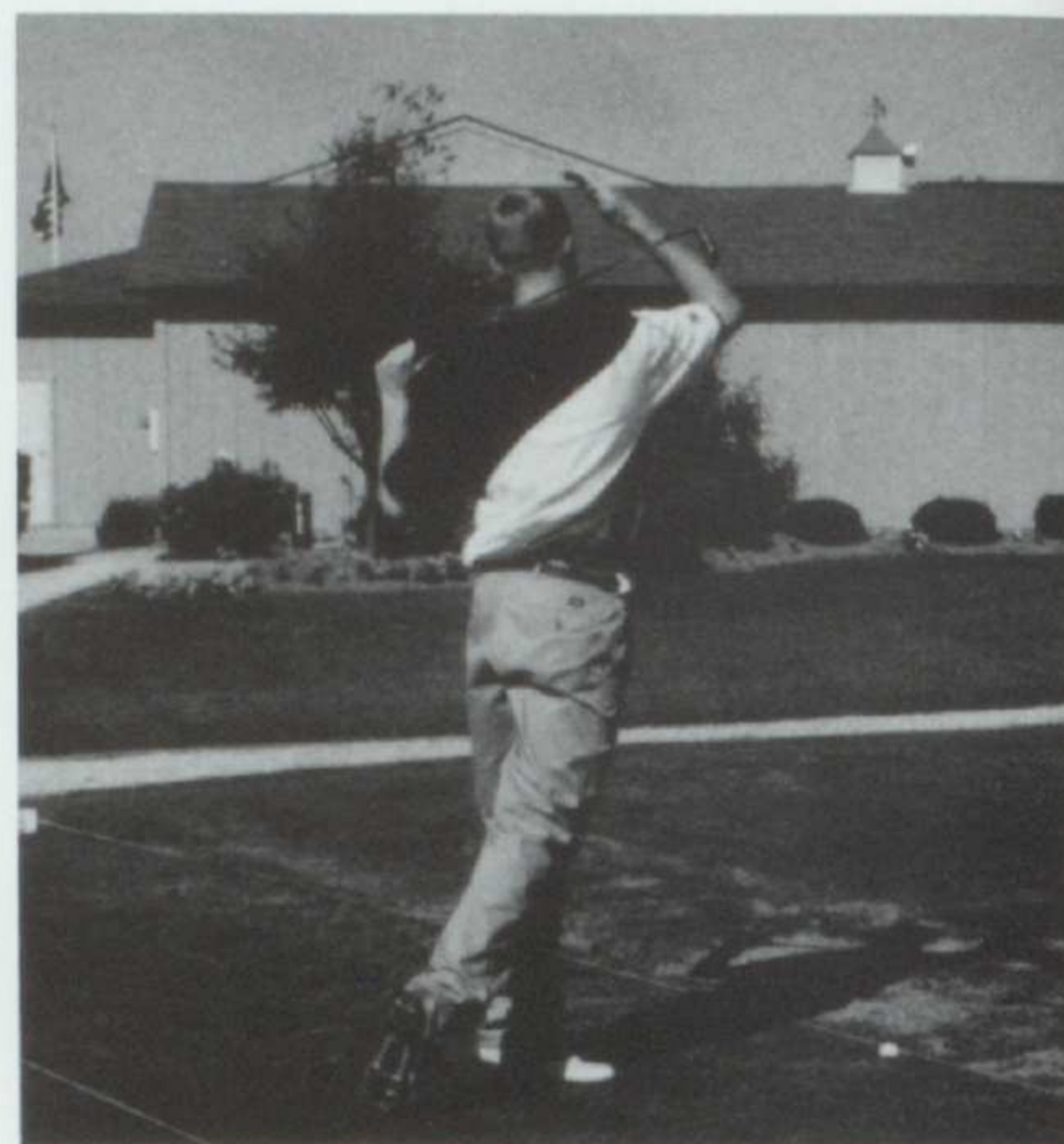

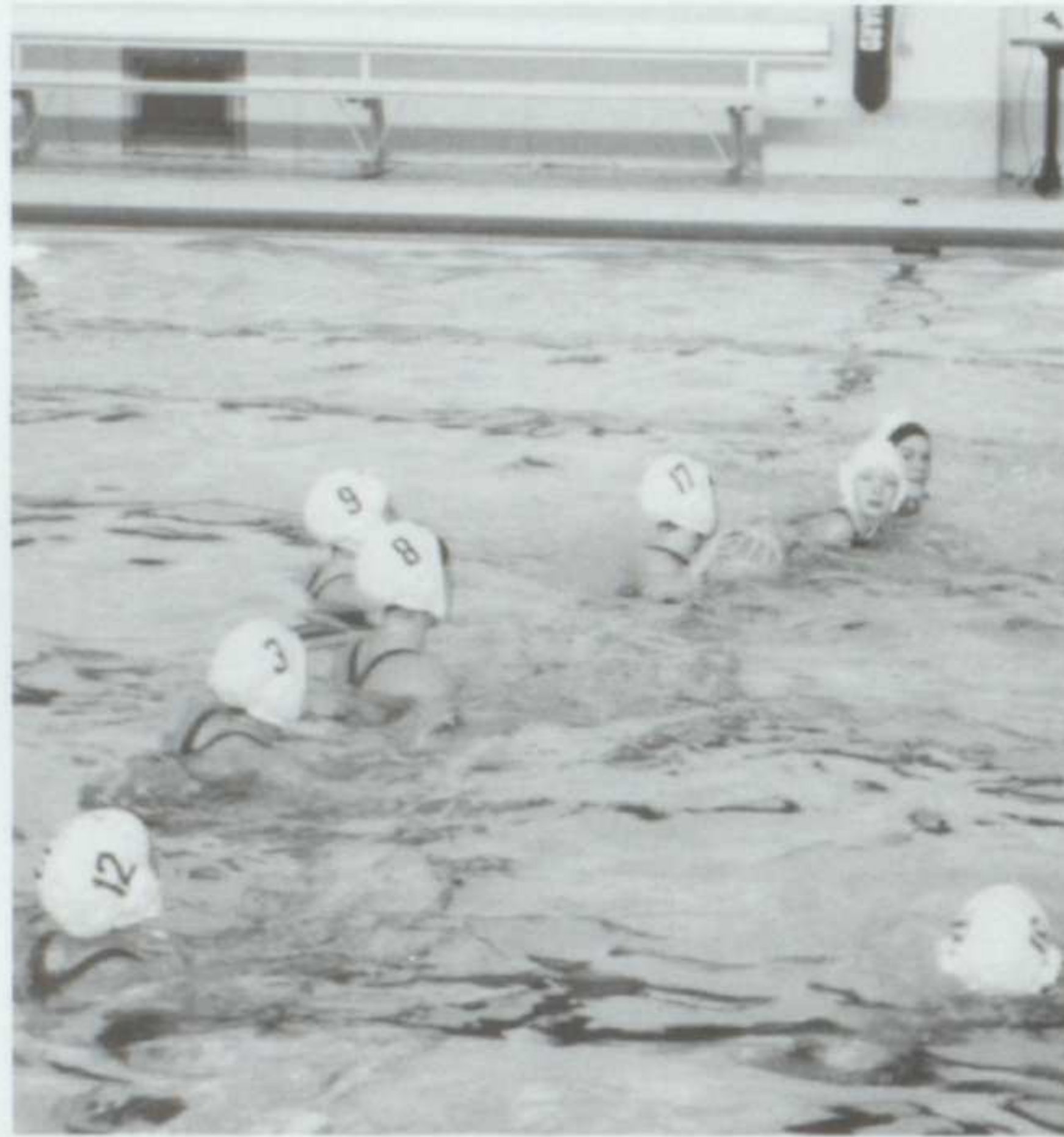


# Water Polo

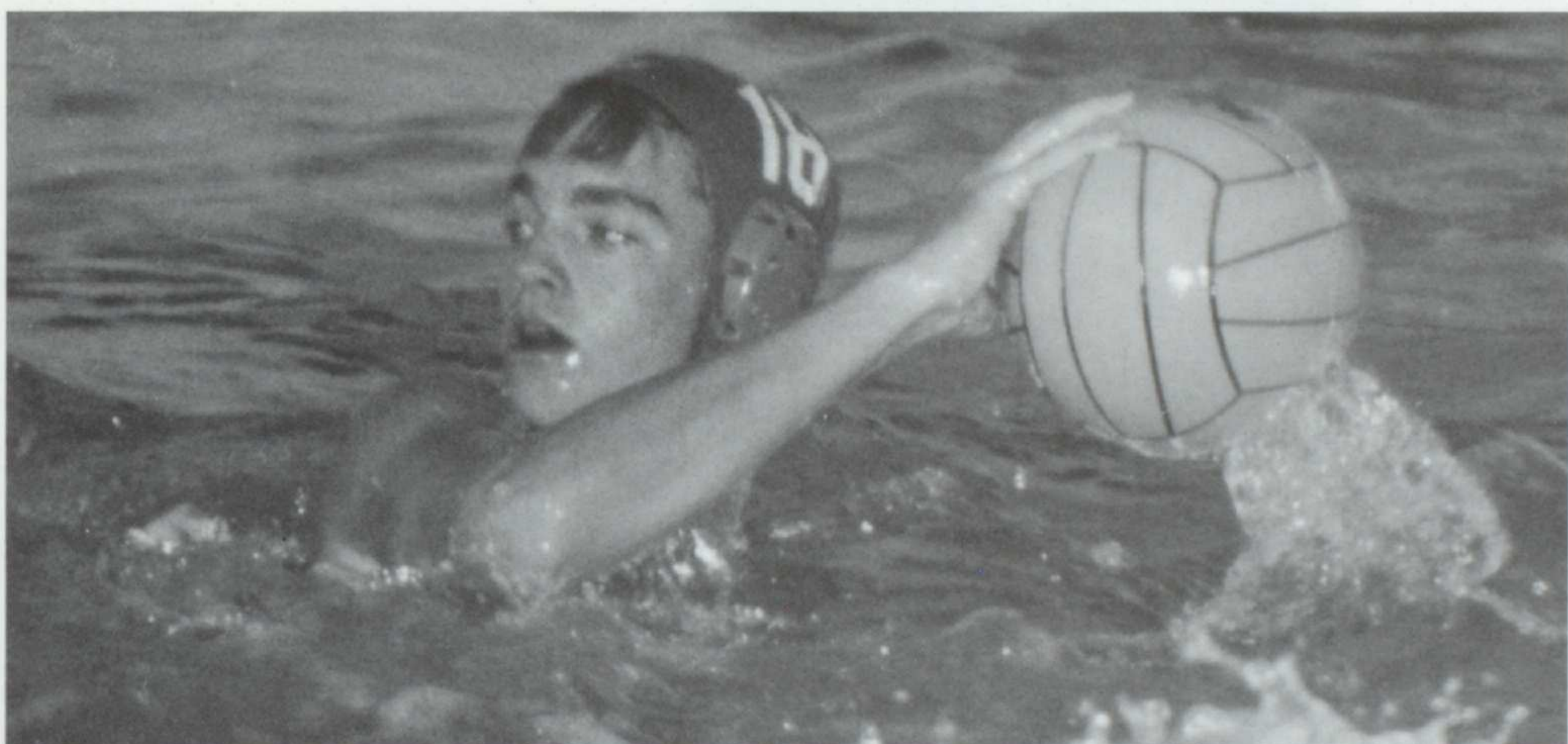

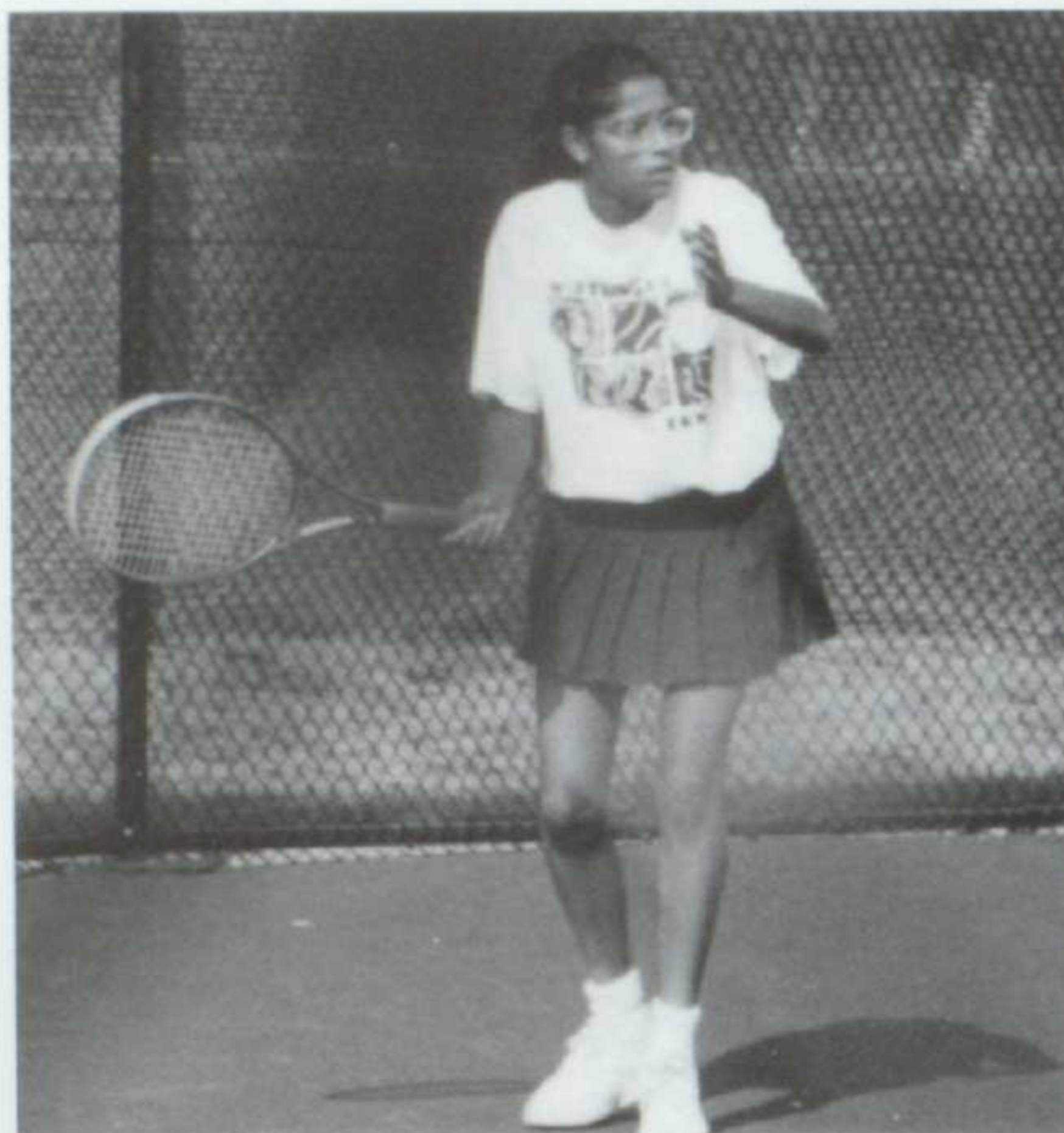


# Girls Tennis

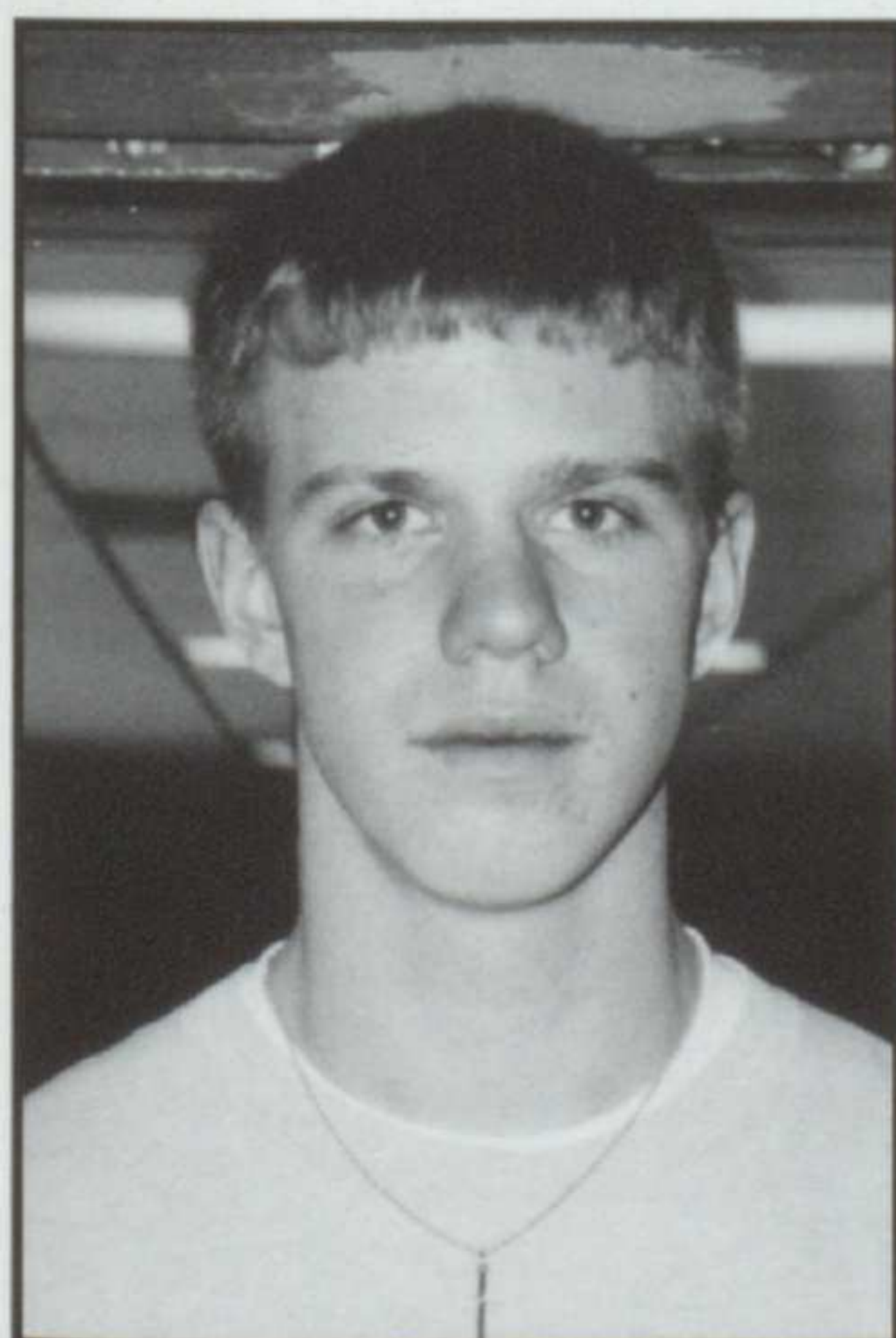

# Boys Basketball

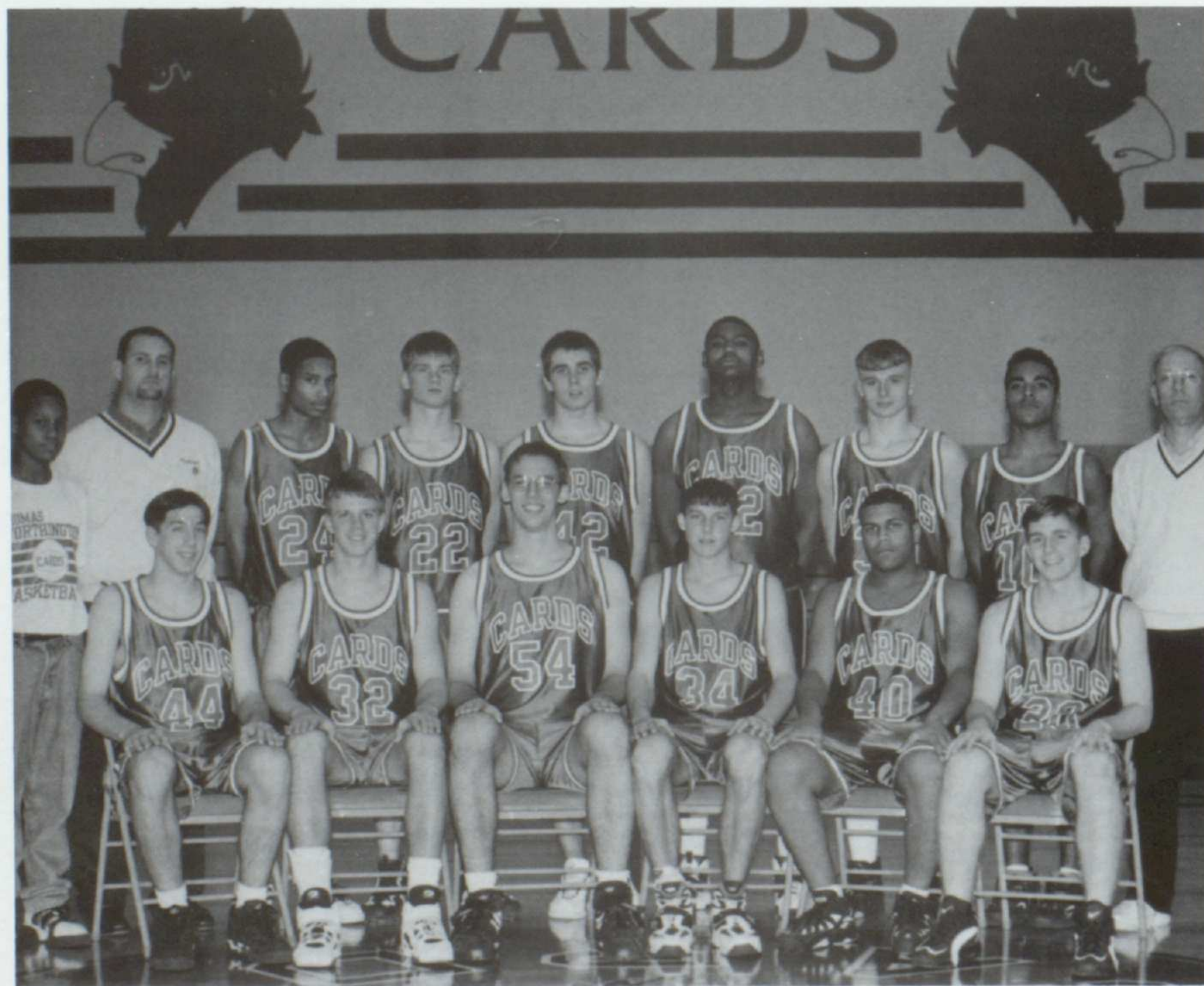

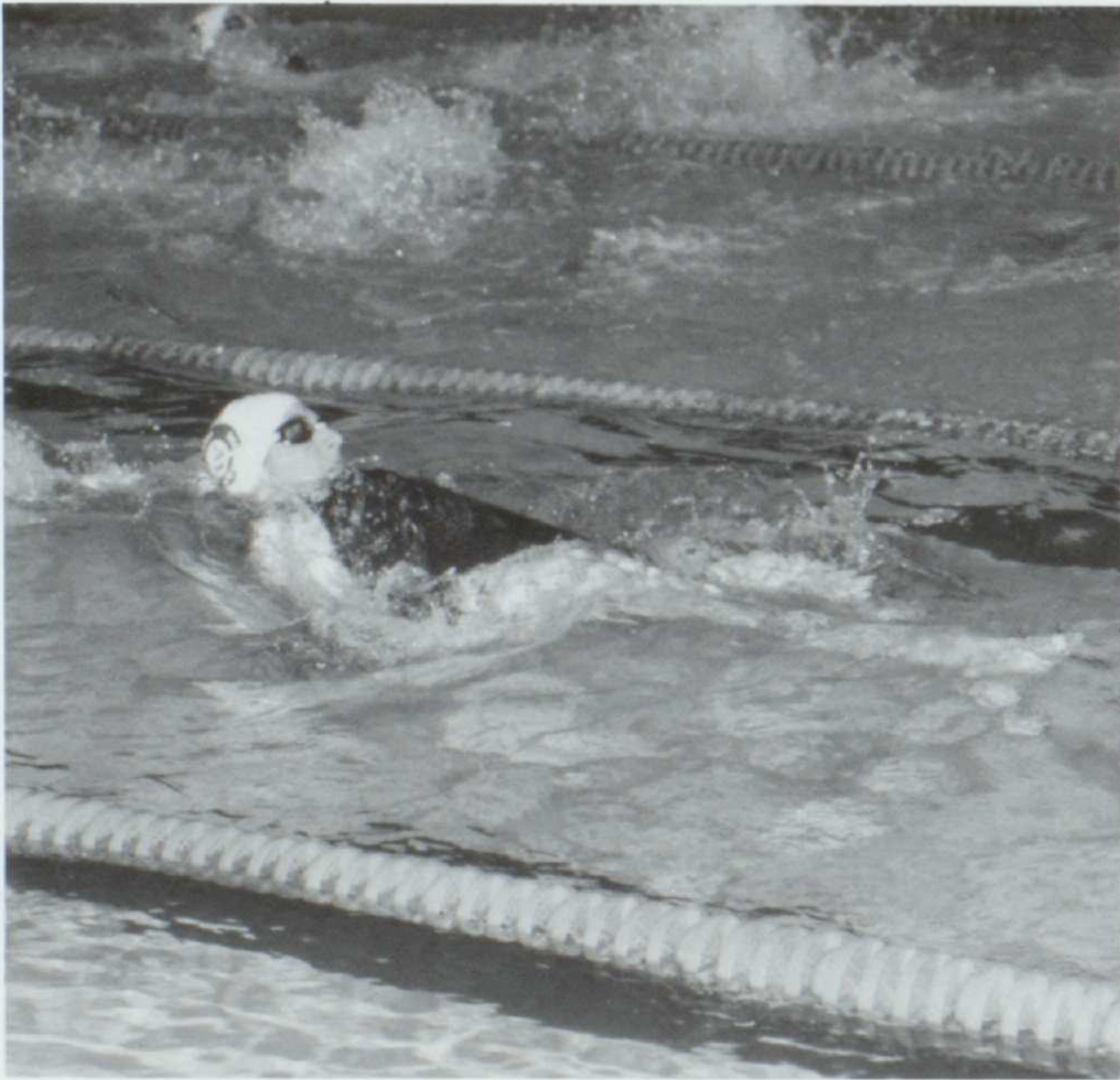
# Girls Swimming

Not only was the swim team a

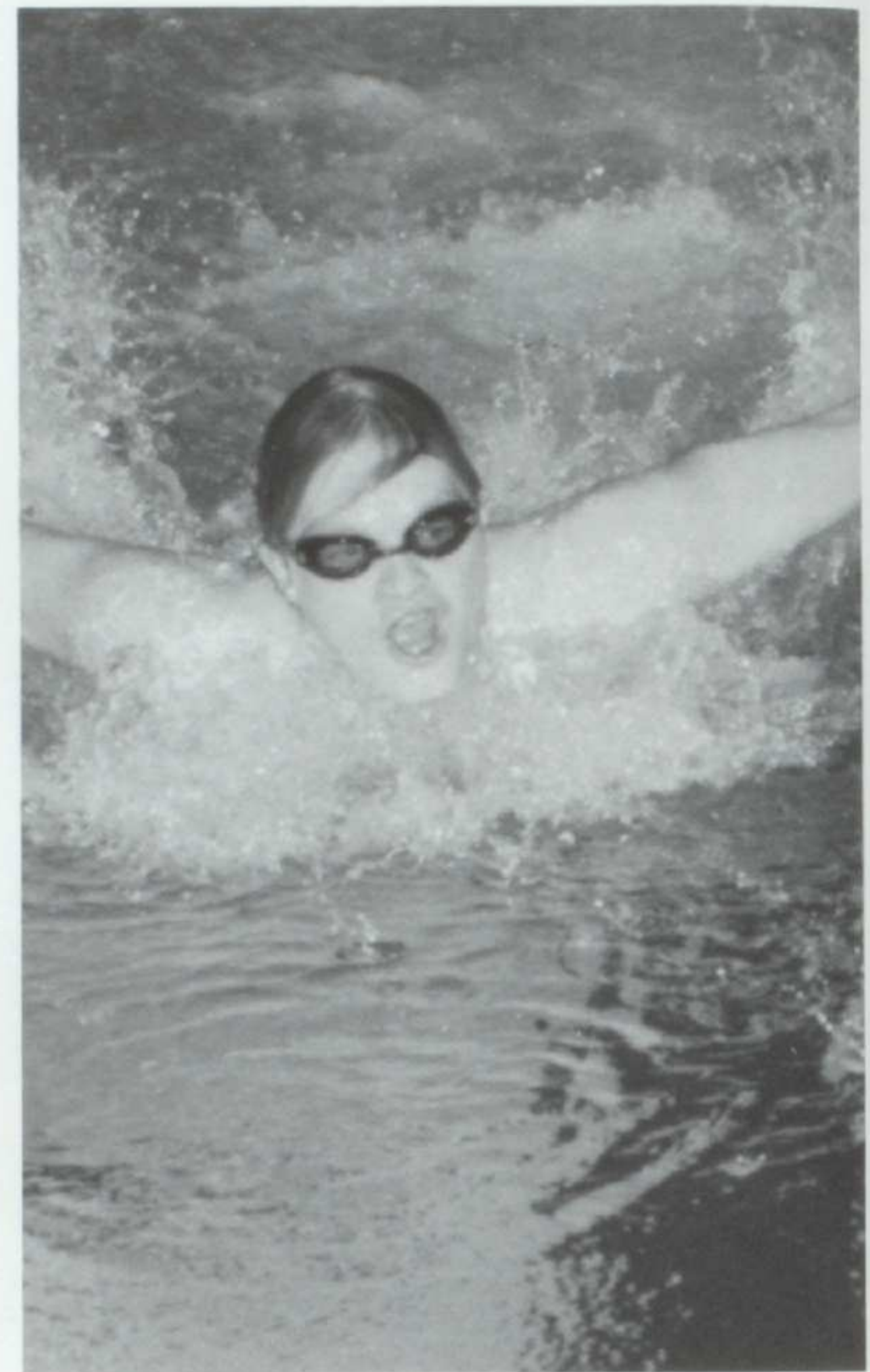

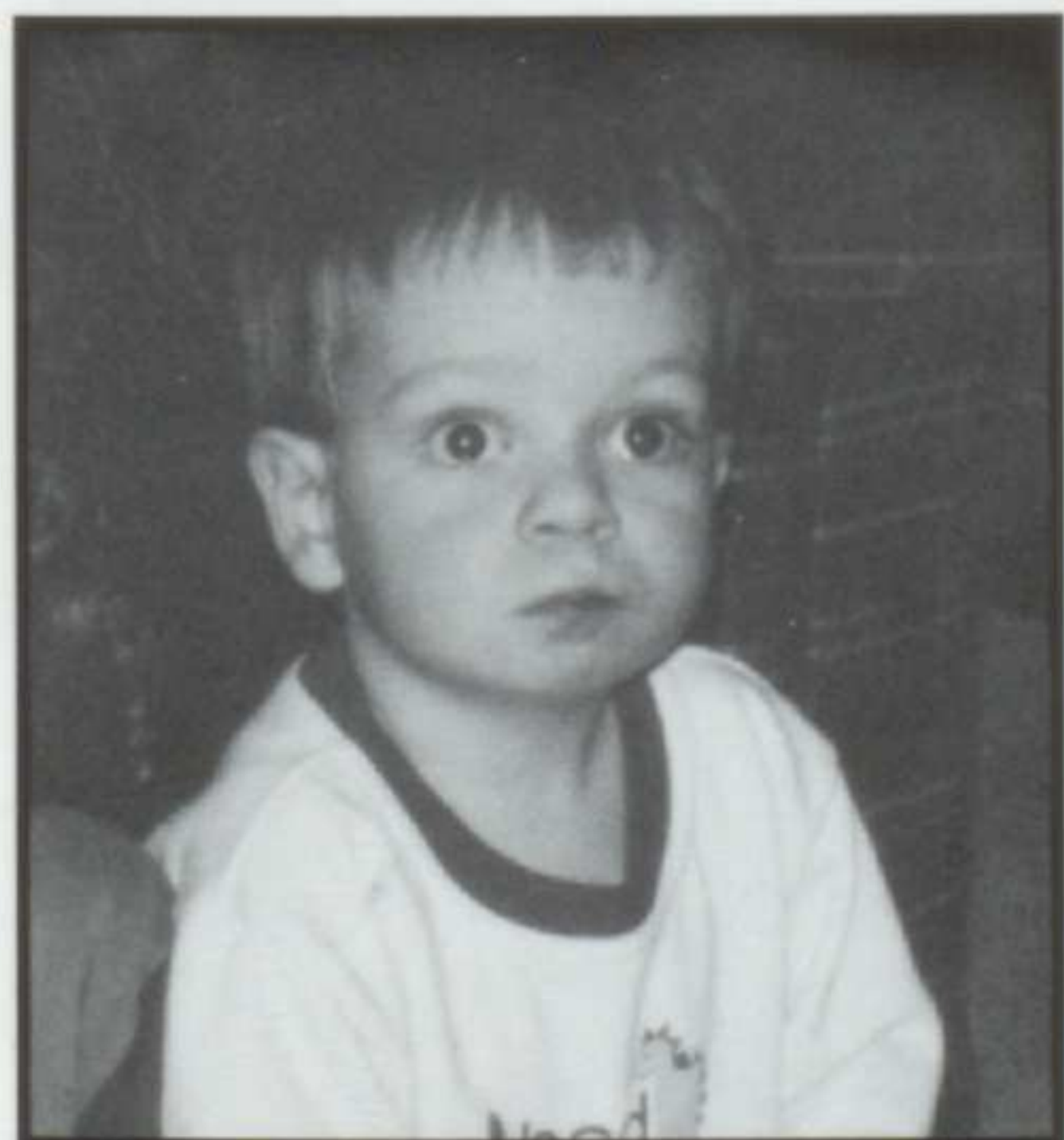

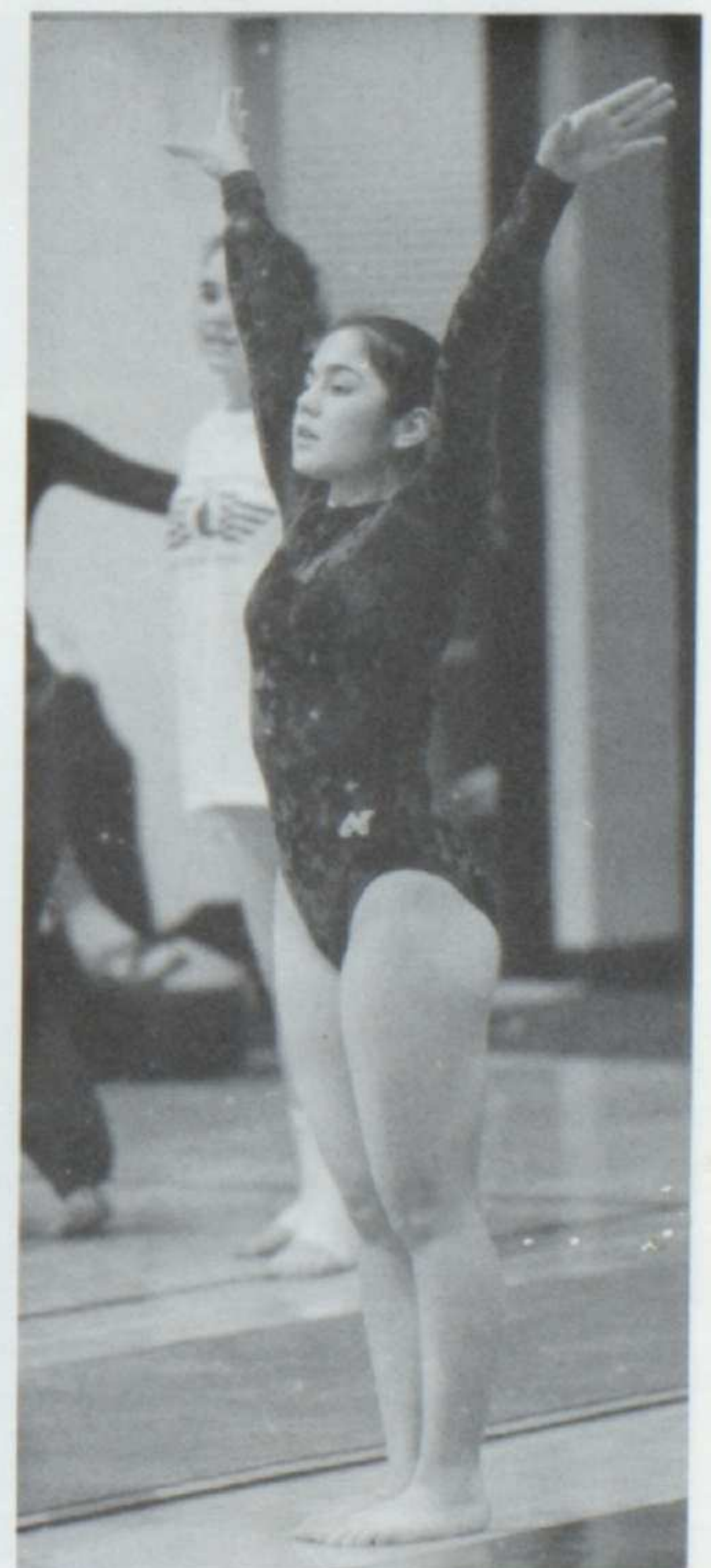

Coach Lyberger said this

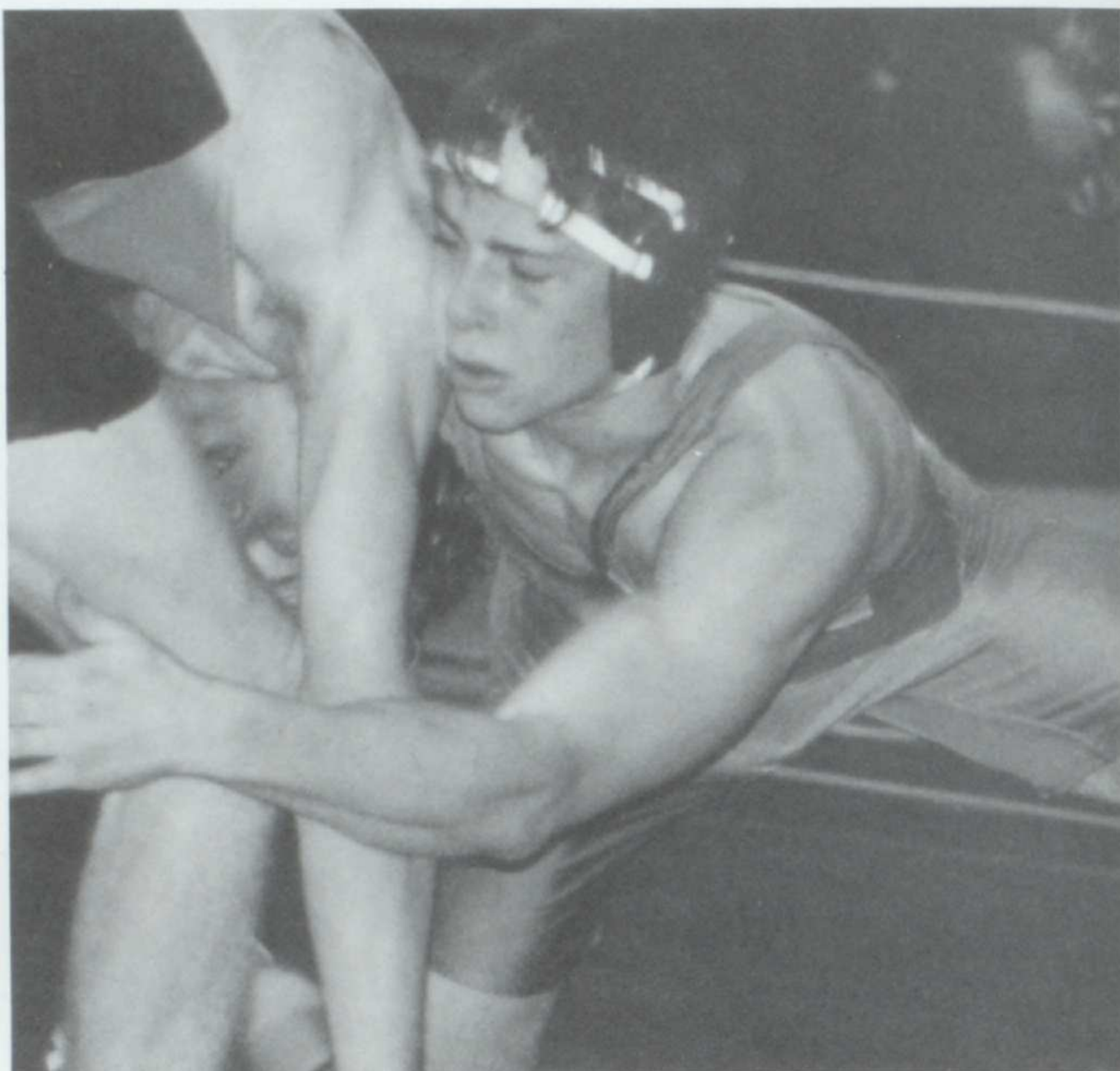

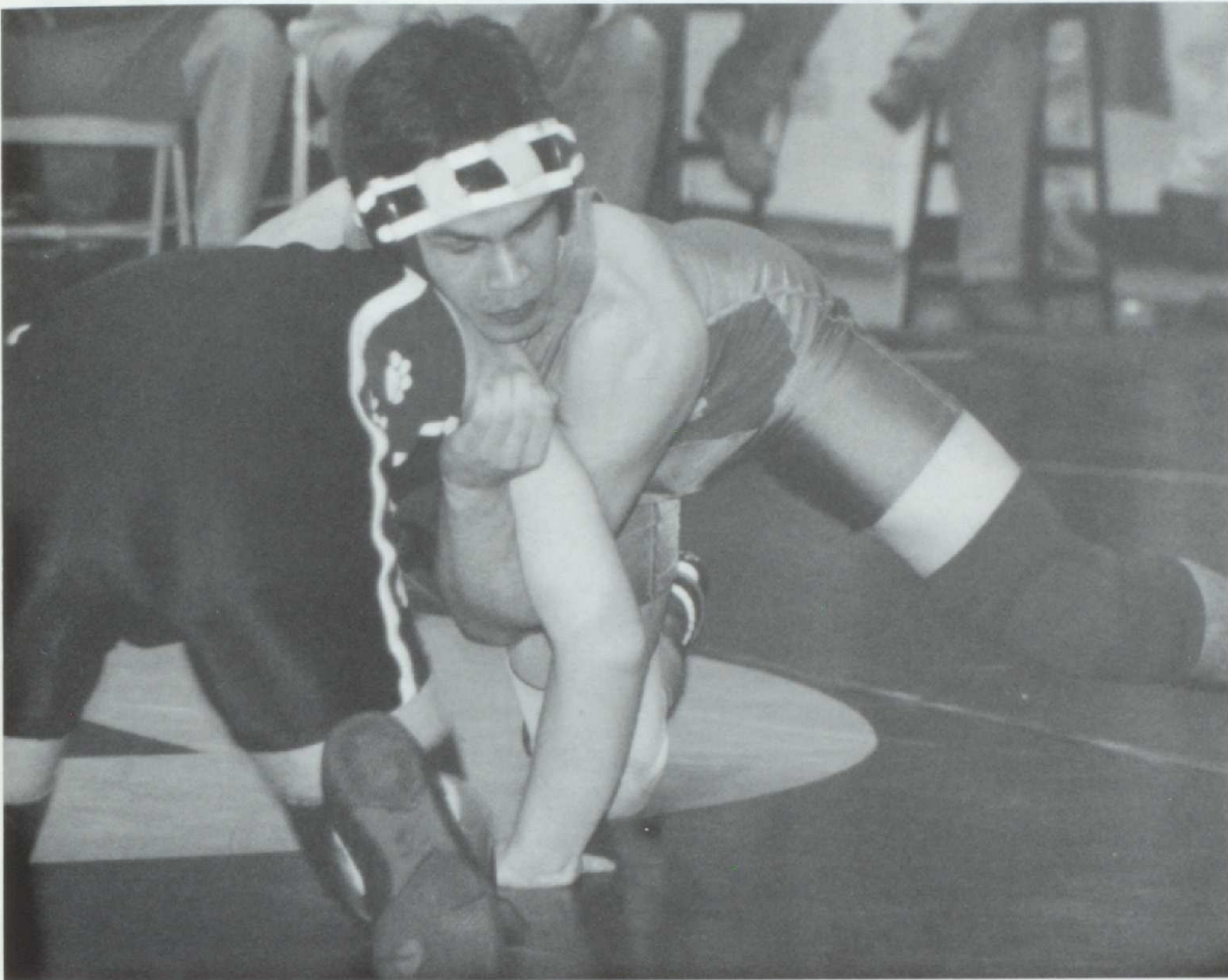

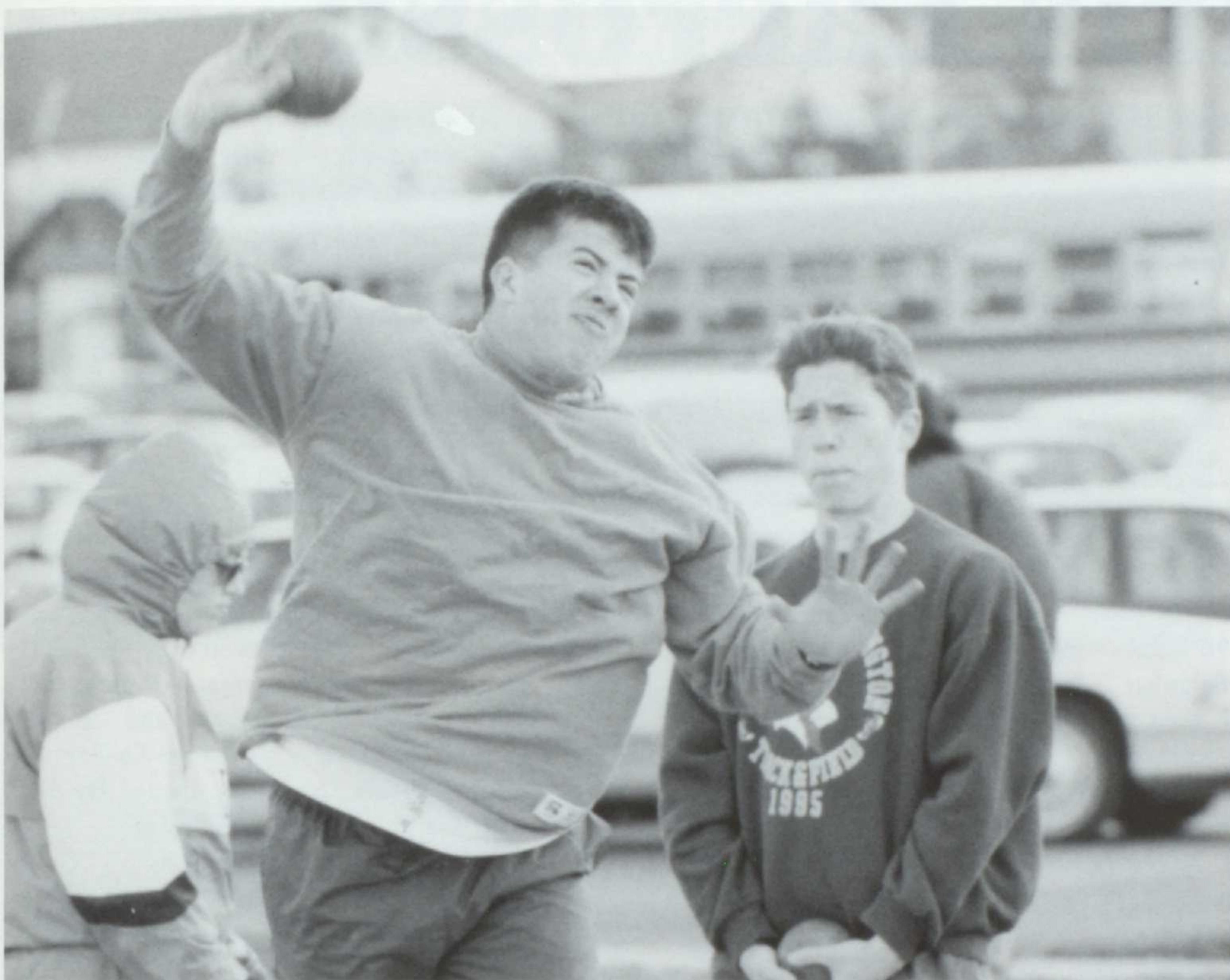

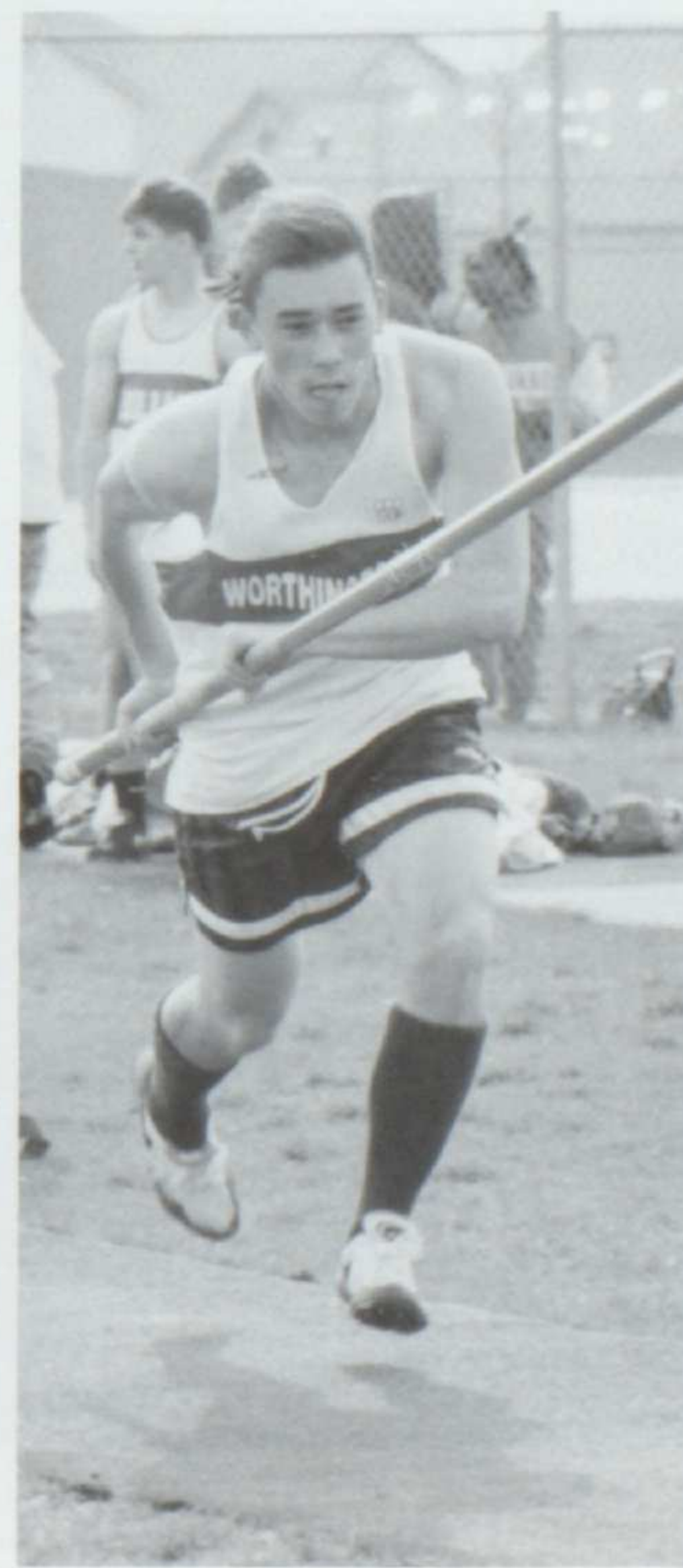

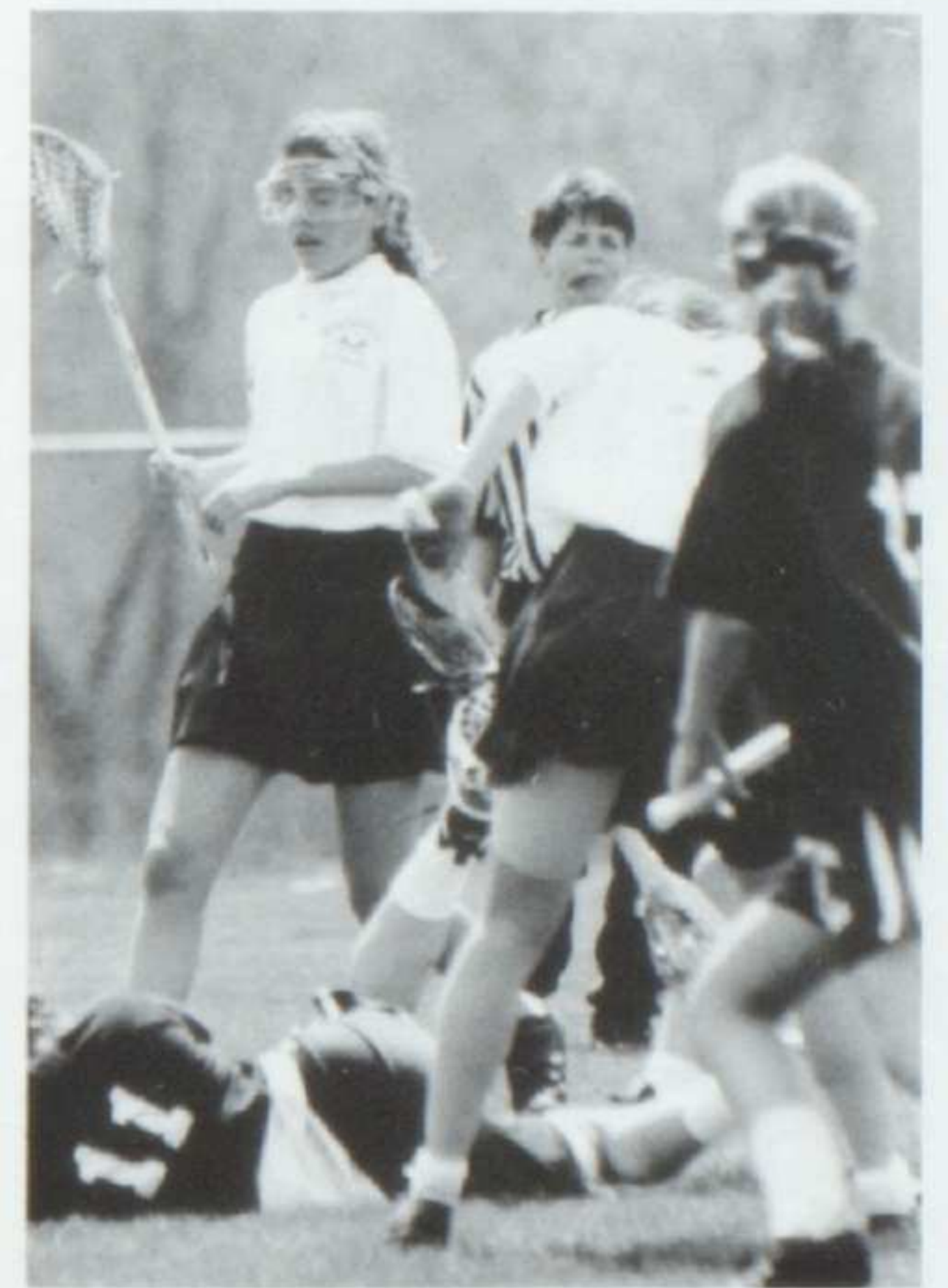

# Boys Tennis

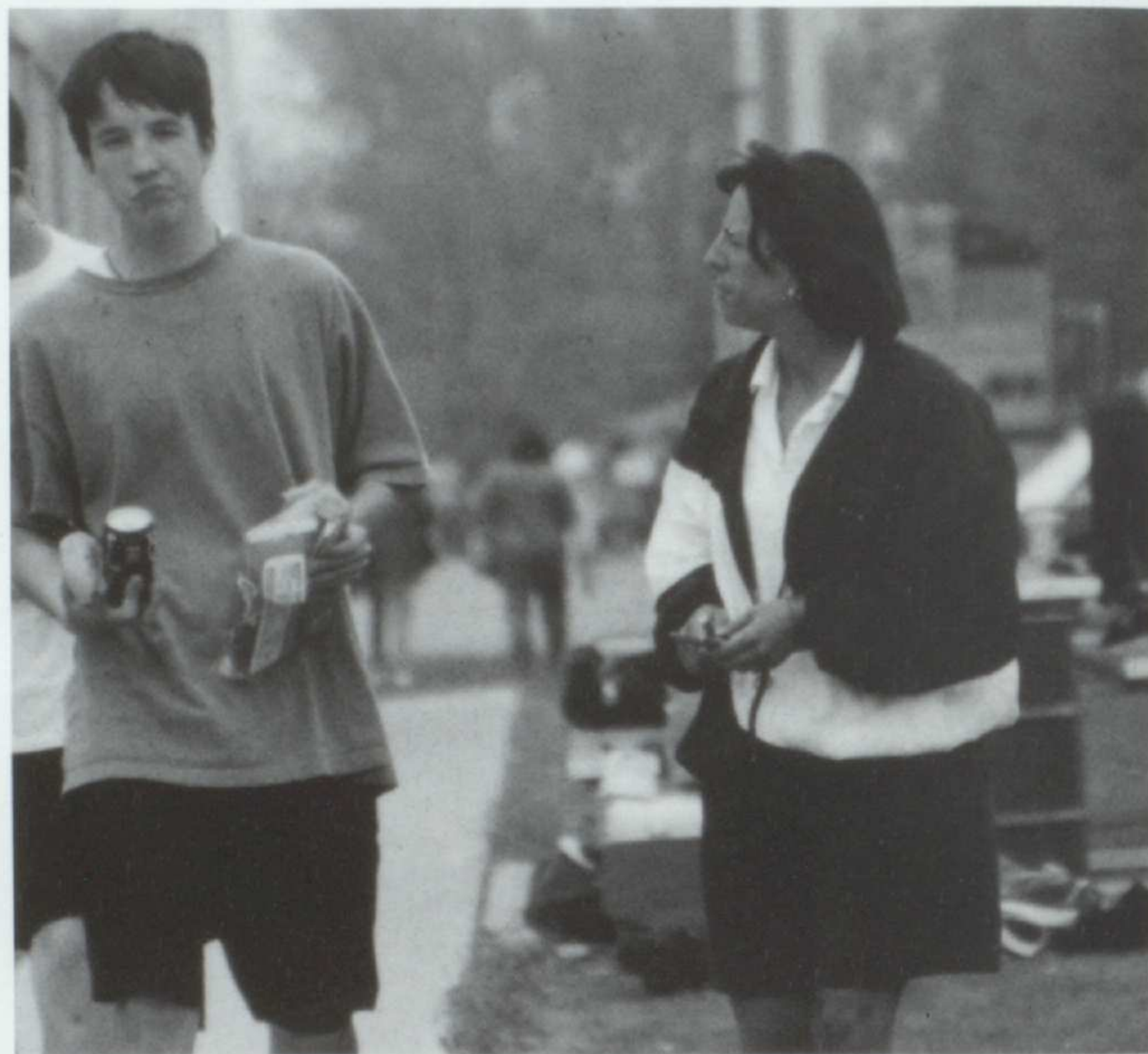

At the banquet, awards were given out to many

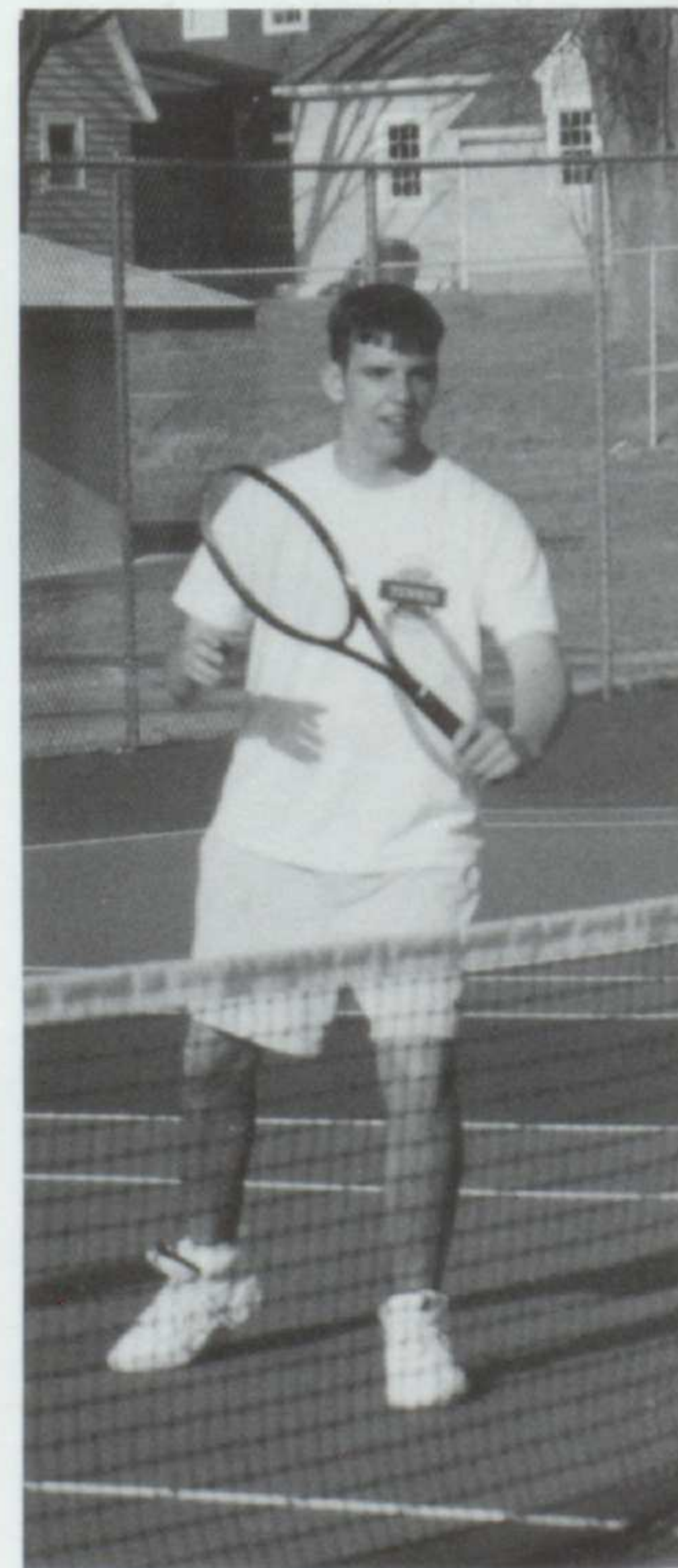

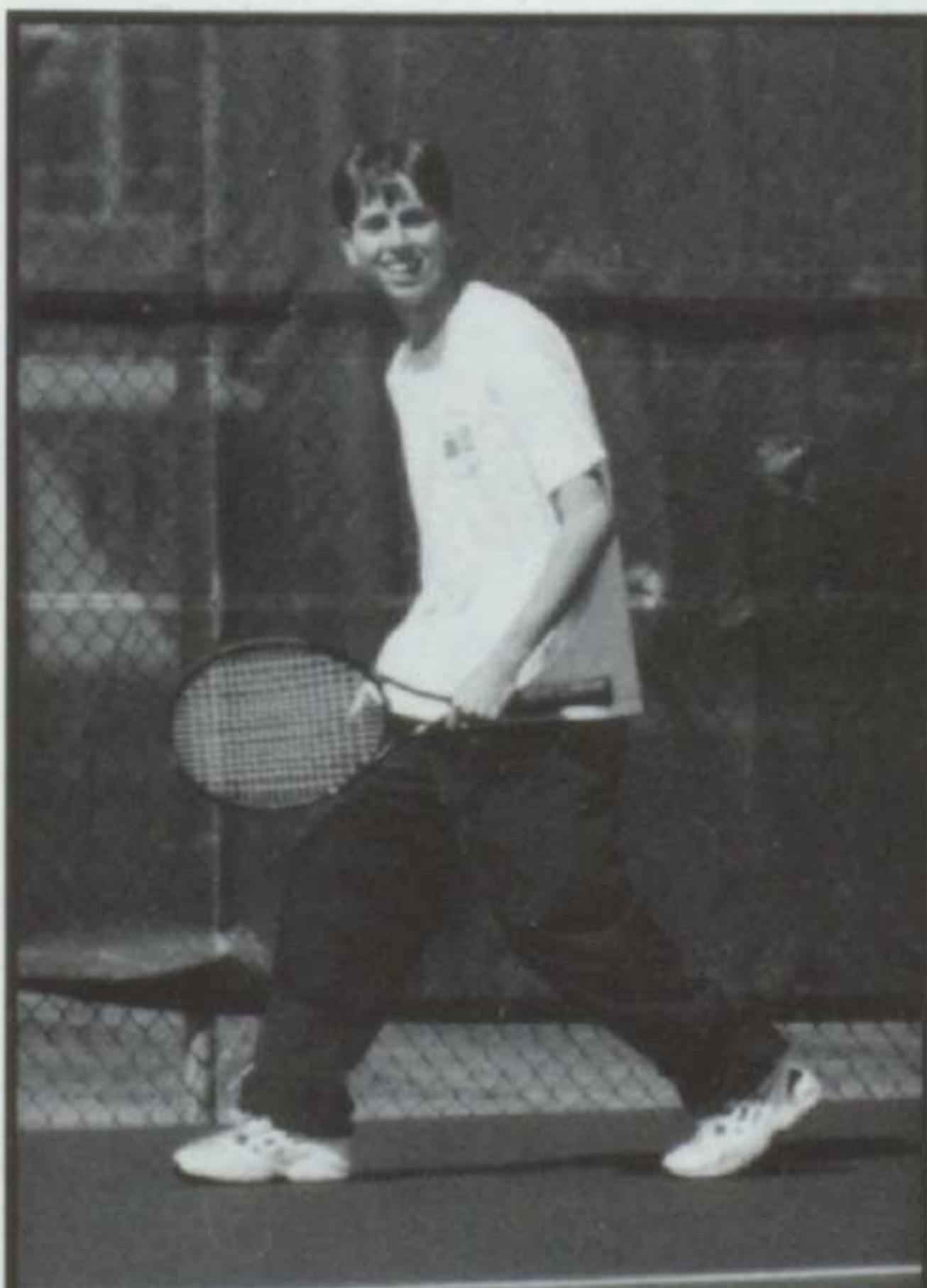

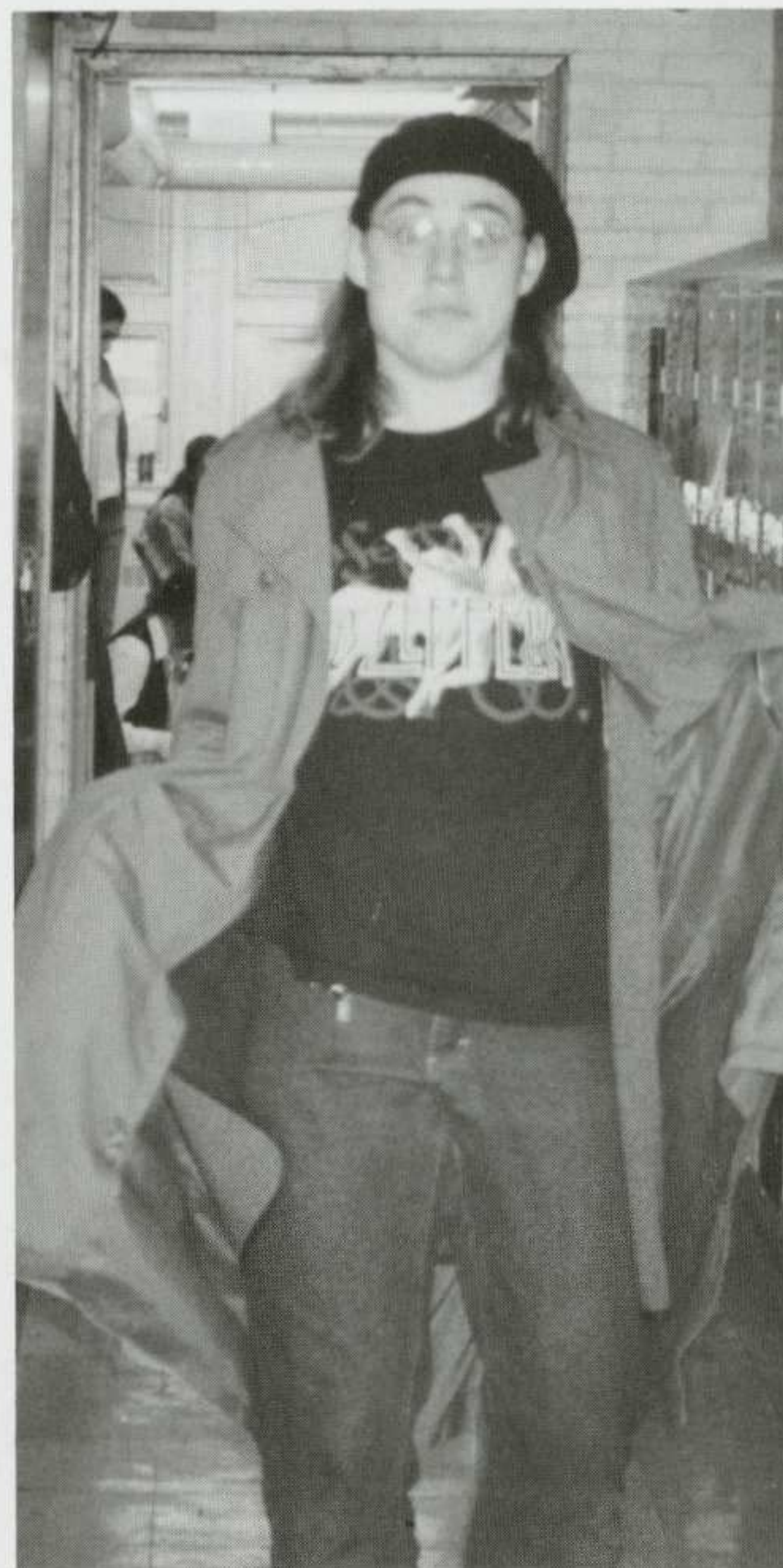
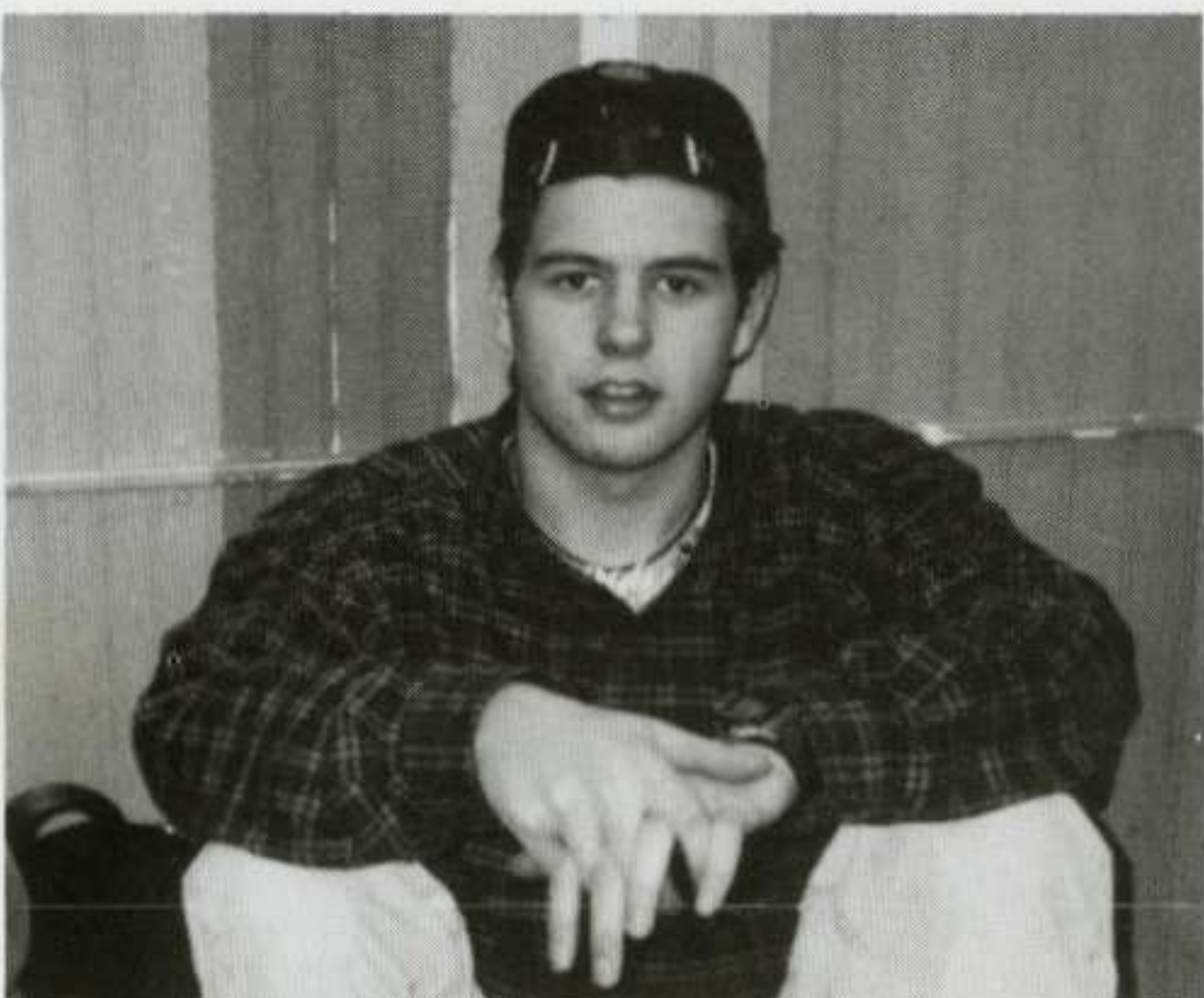
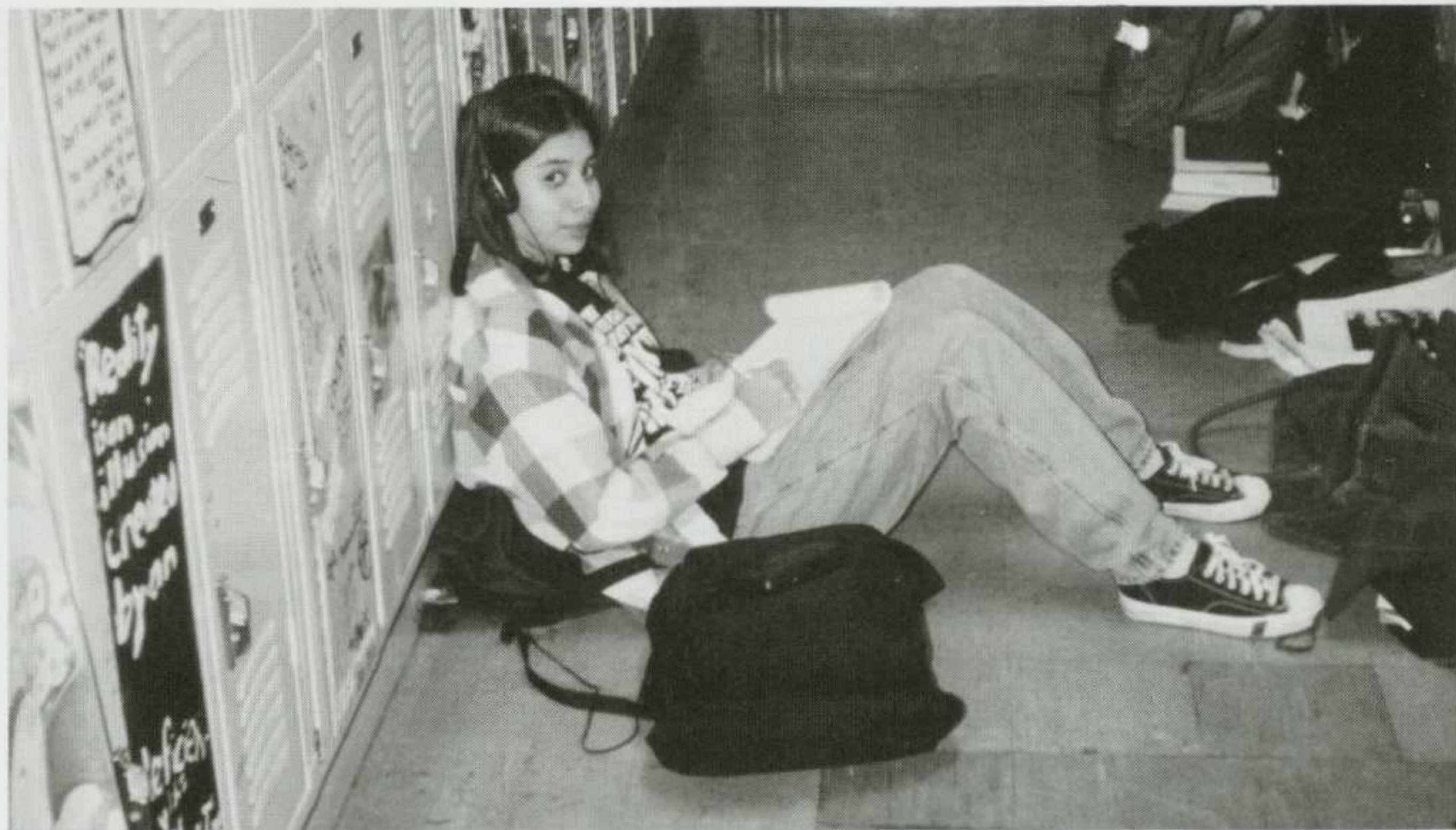


# Linworth

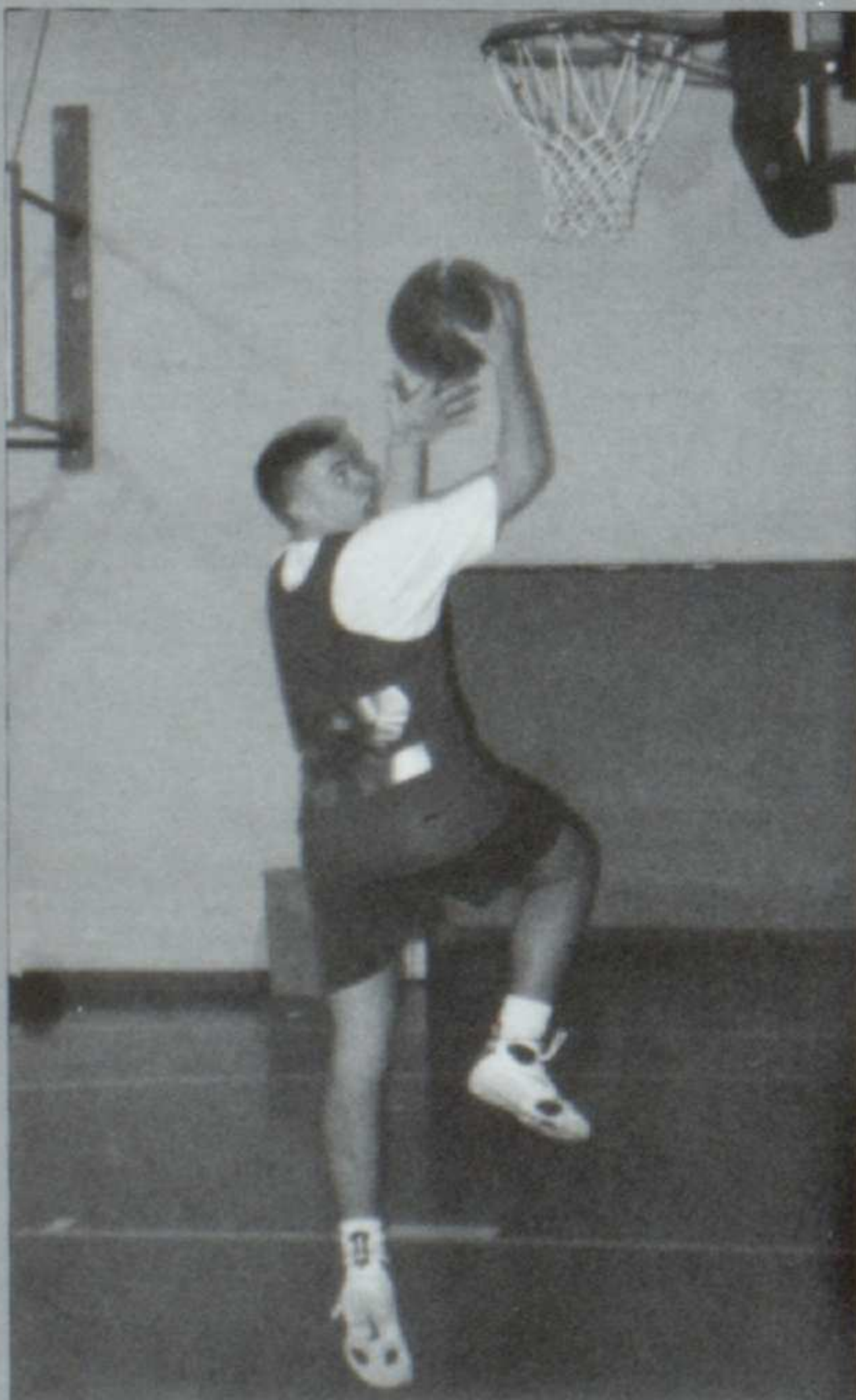

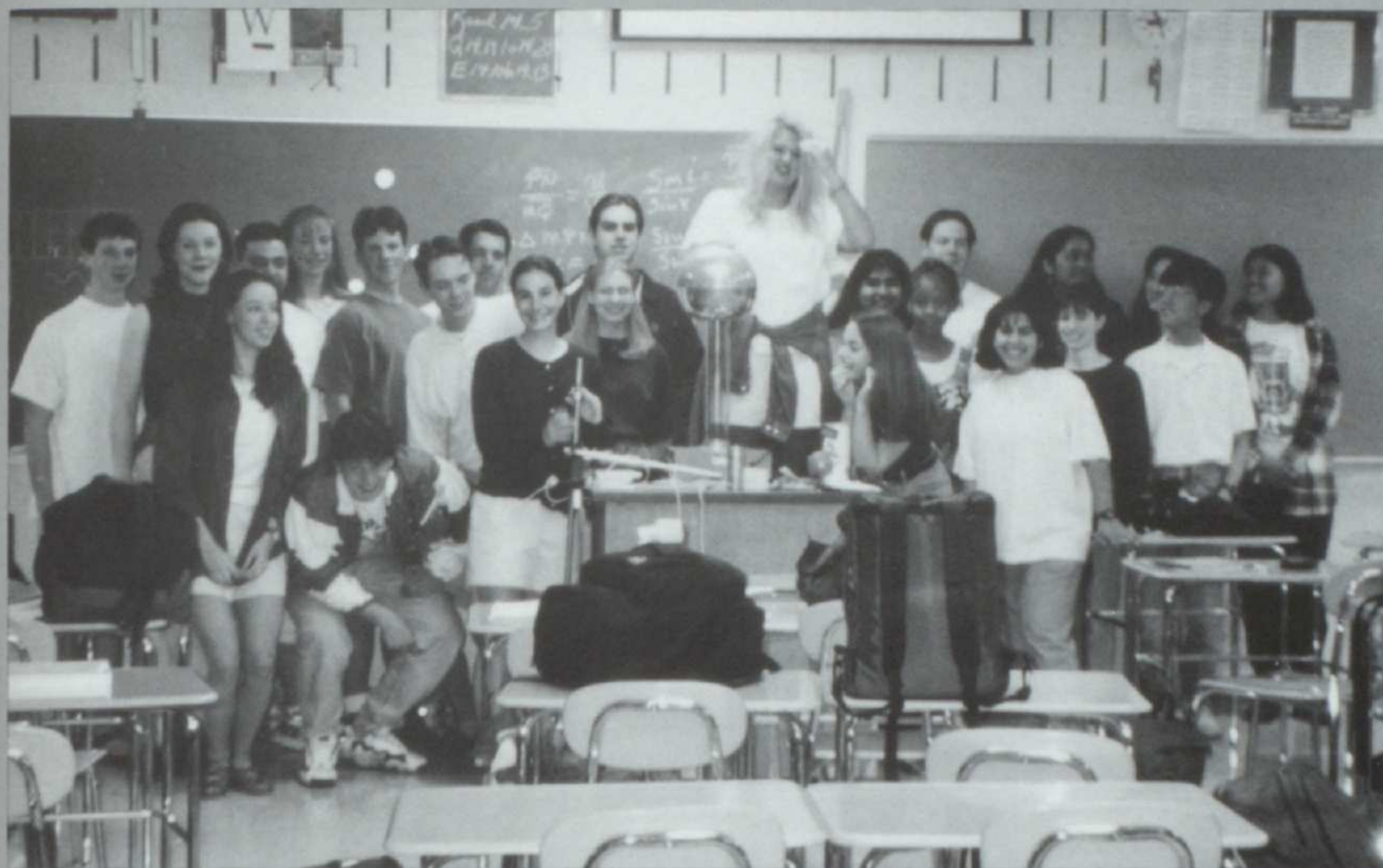

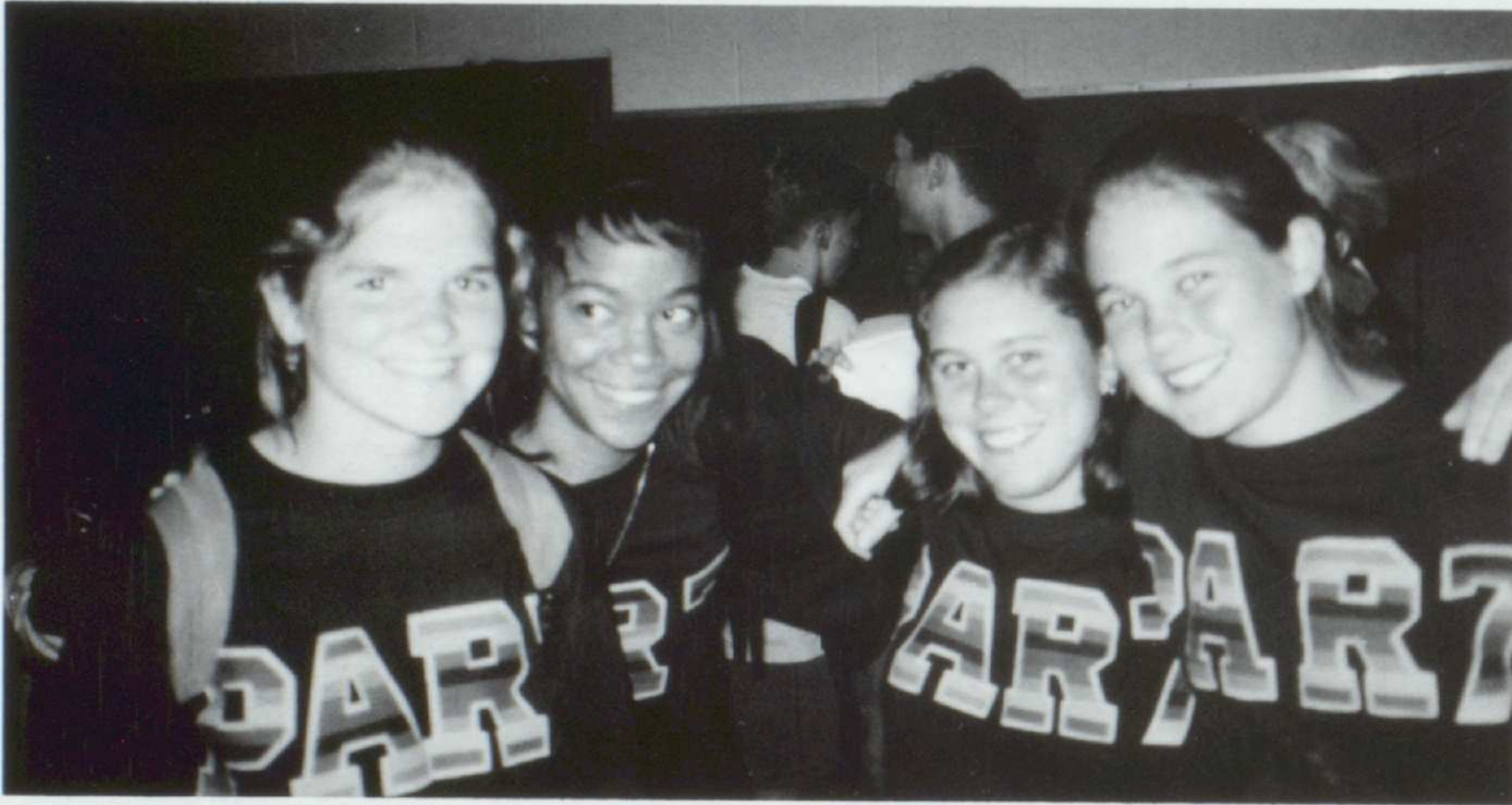
