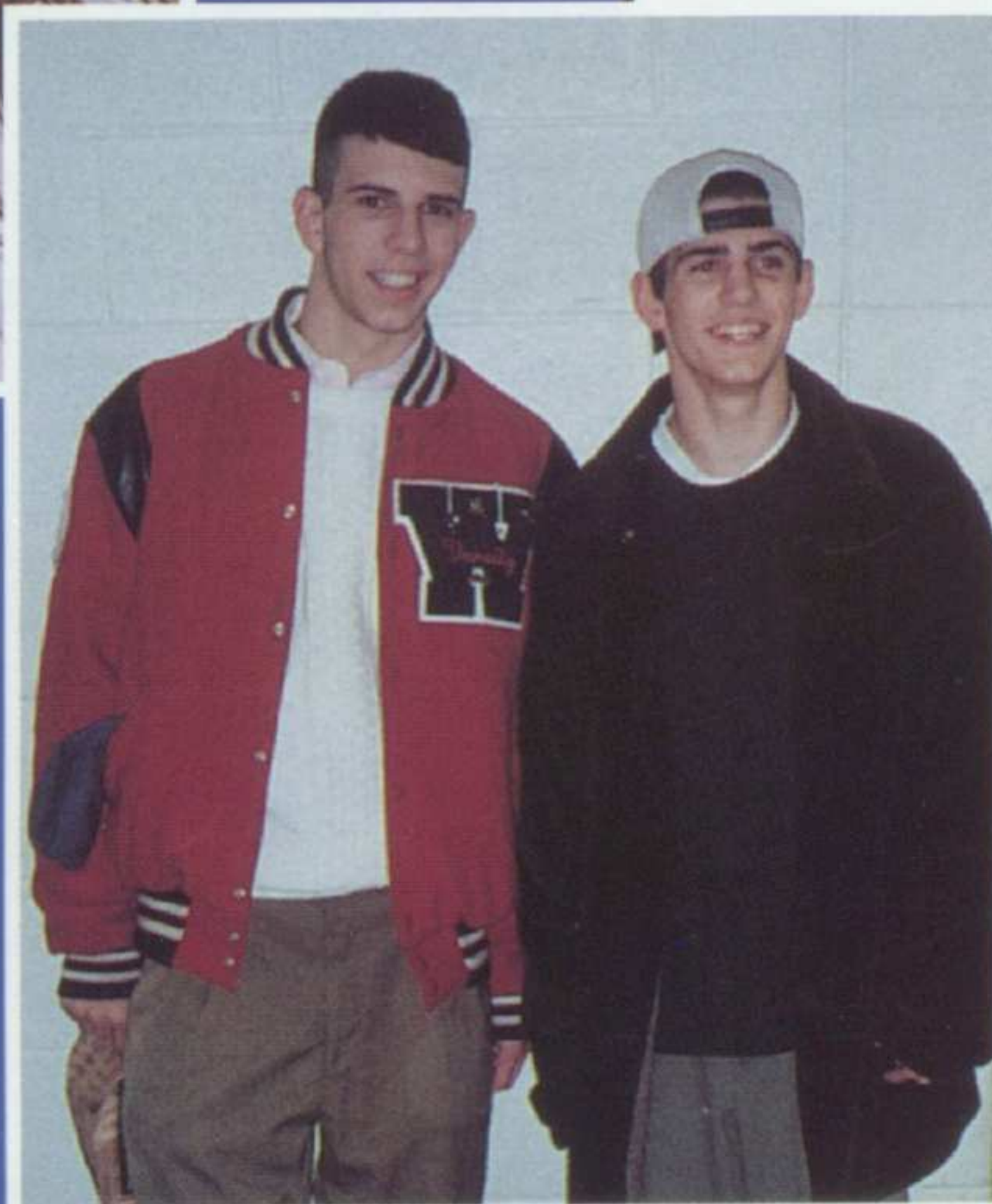

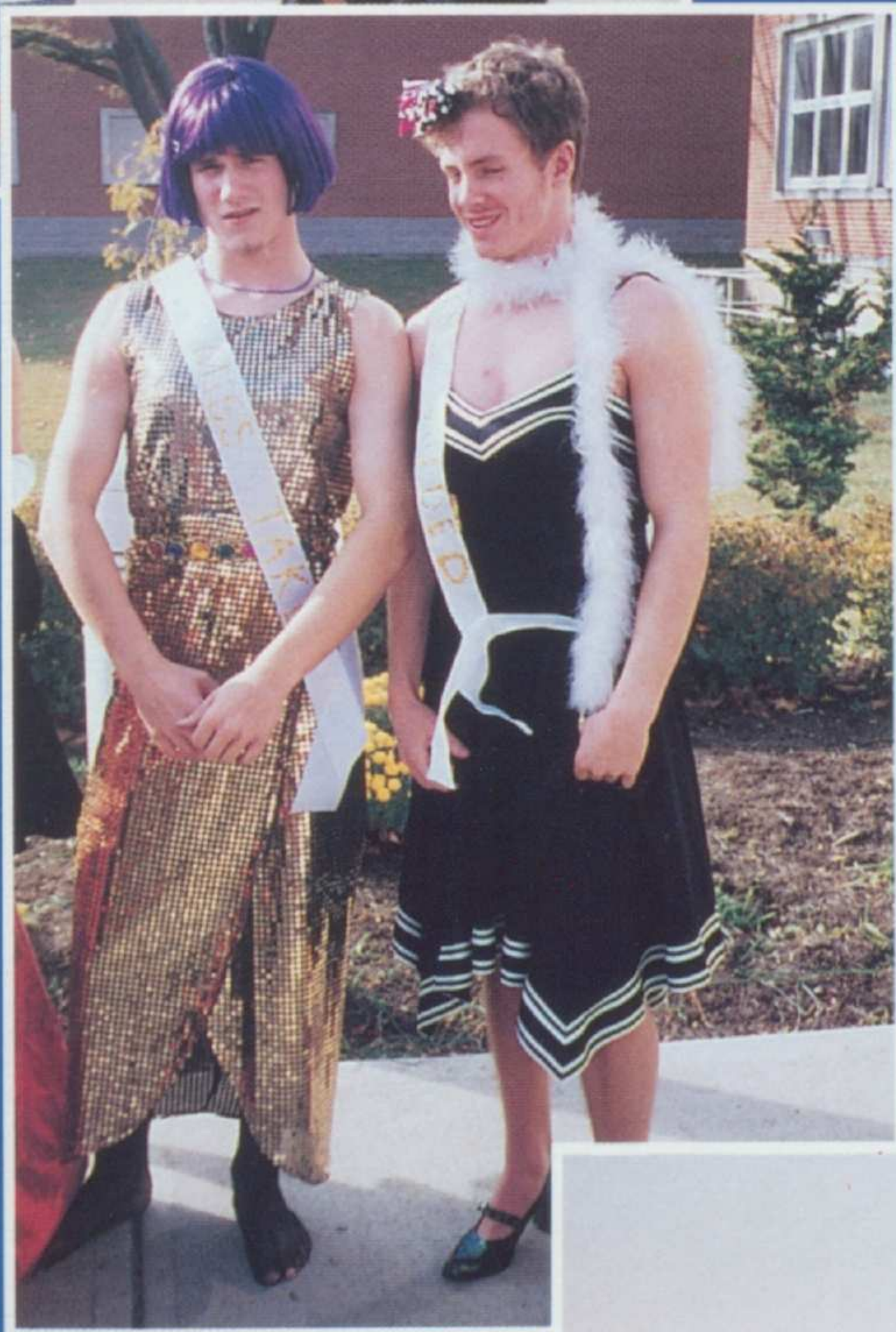
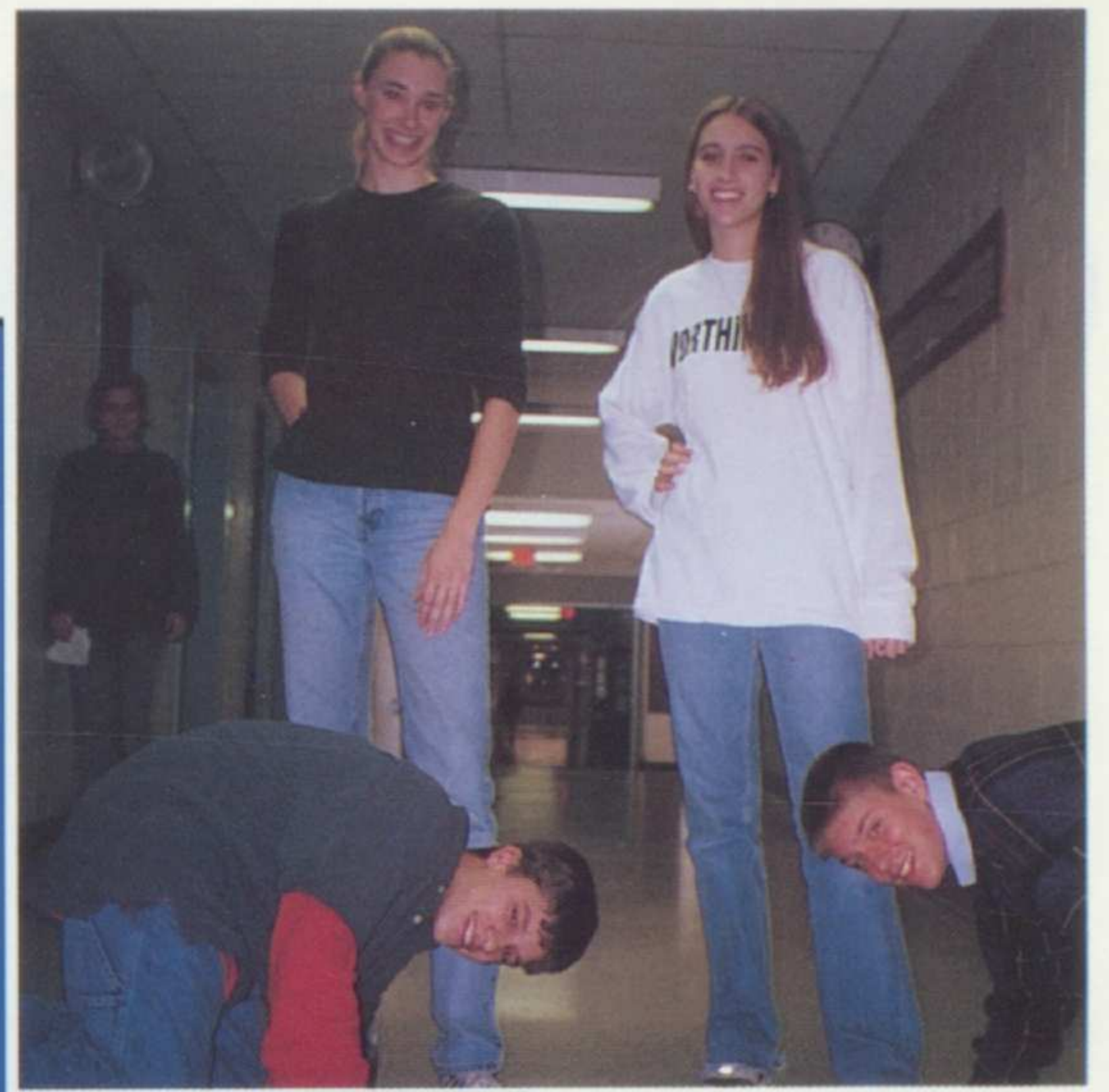
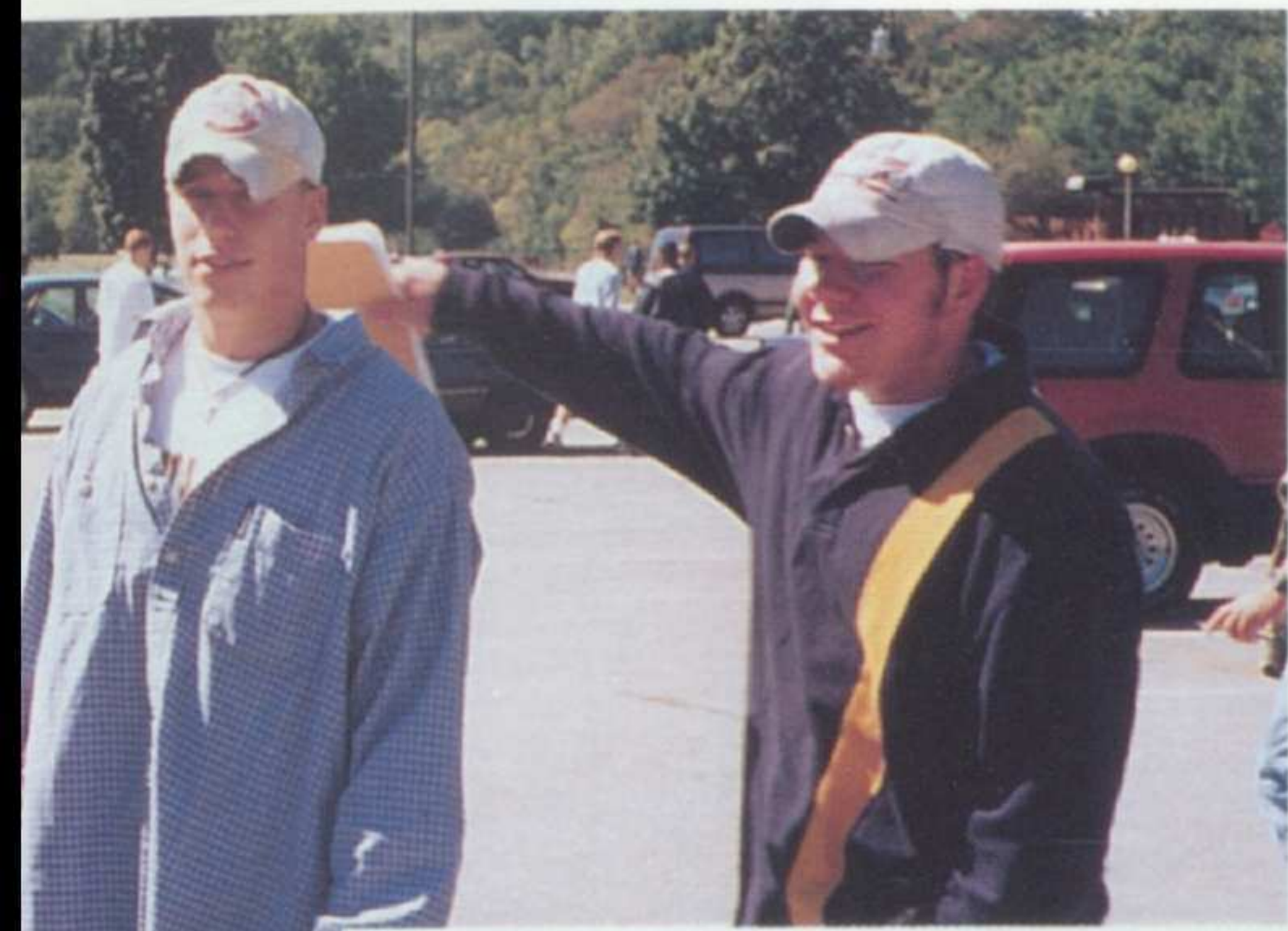

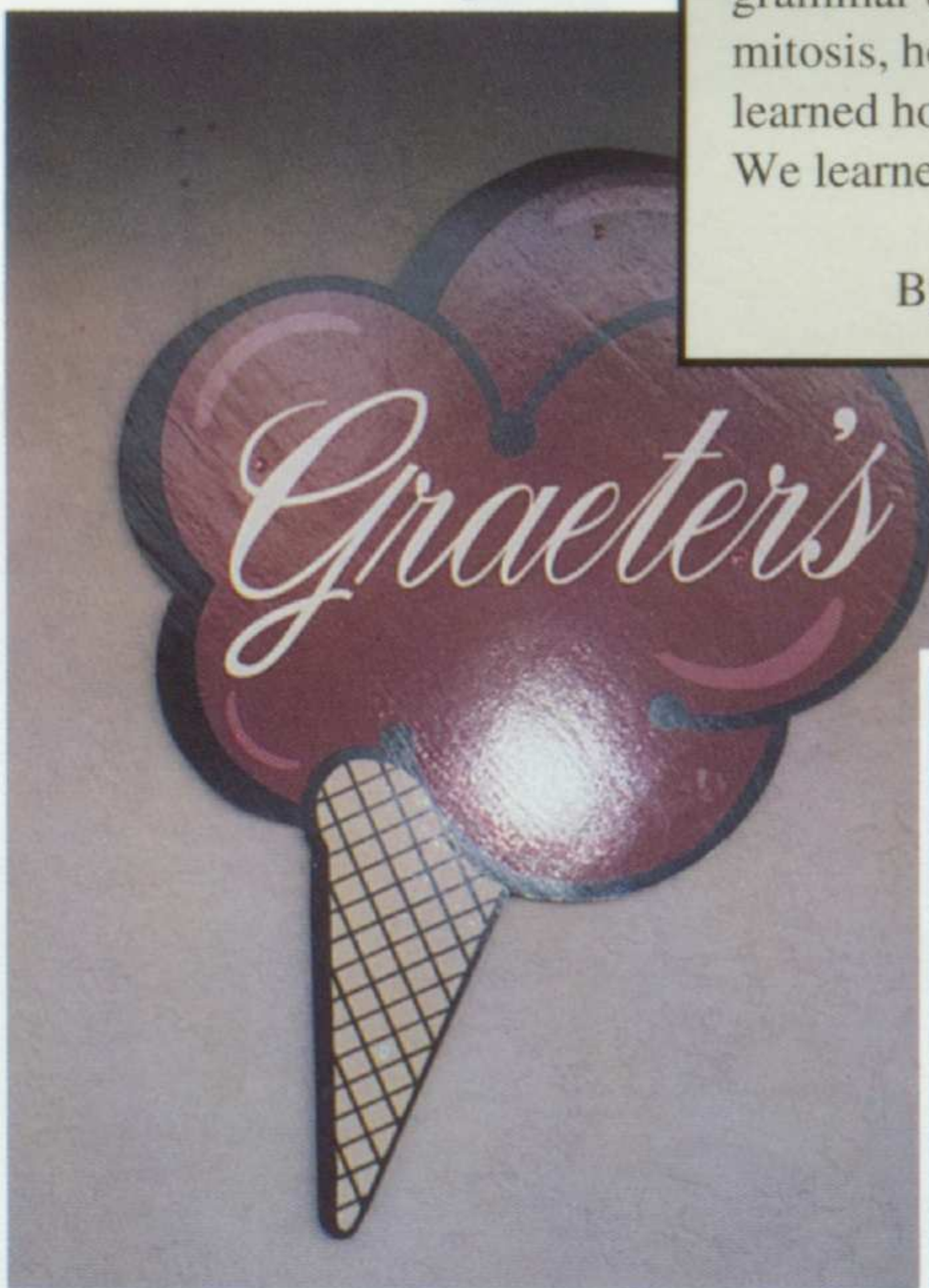

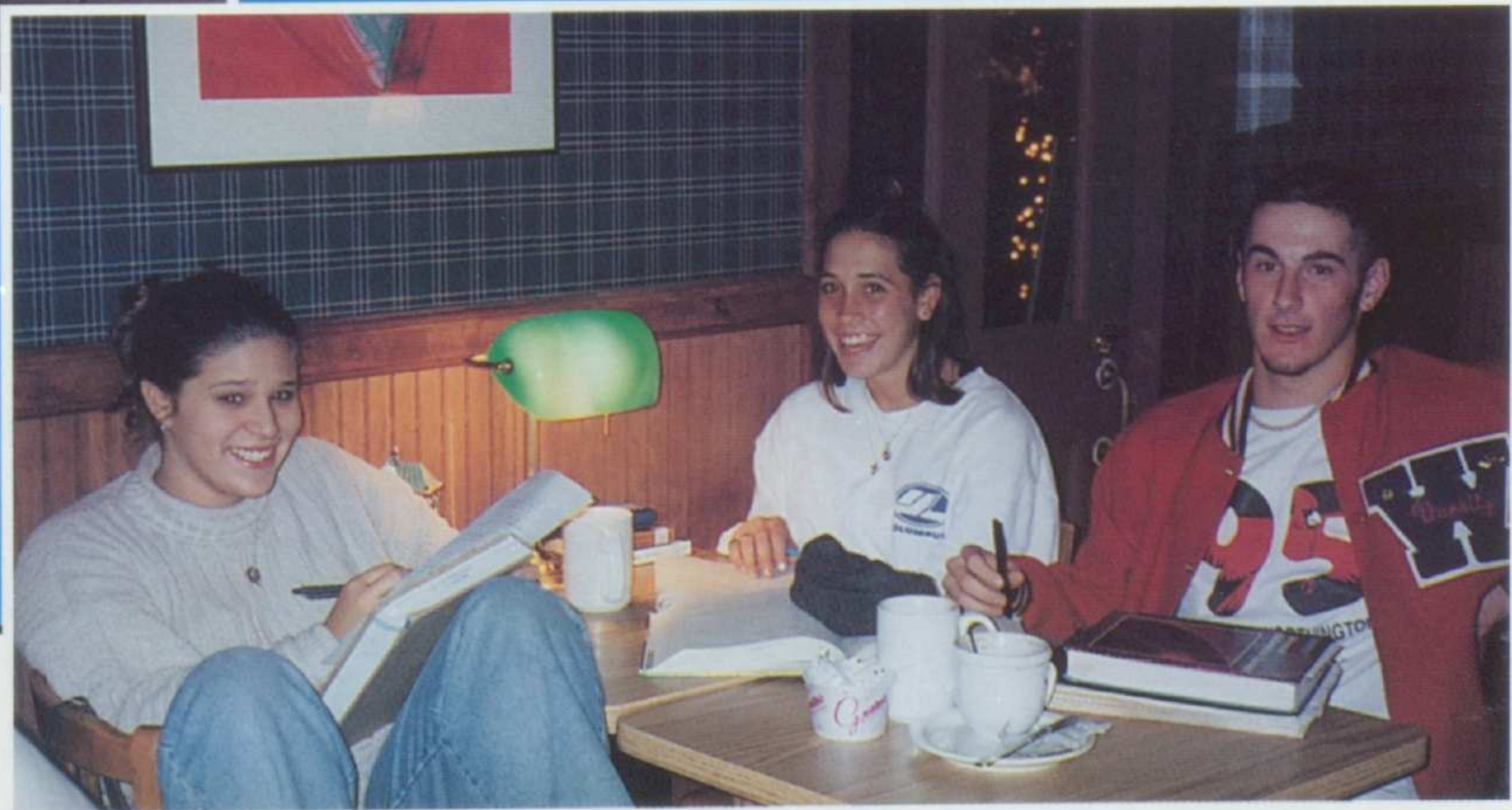

THE MAKINGS OF A MASCOT

Worthington High School adopted the Cardinal as its mascot in 1931. One year later, Ruth Taylor, a 1933 Worthington graduate, wrote the school's fight song which is still sung today. One man who helped with this process, Bob Cotter, a local resident and a classmate of Mrs. Taylor's, thinks the Cardinal was a good choice because of its status as Ohio's state bird.

Worthington High School has changed in a variety of ways since the Cardinal became its mascot. When the Cardinal tradition began, Worthington's only high school was located in the Annex and graduated 18 students per year; today Worthington has two high schools which combined graduate 700-800 students per year.

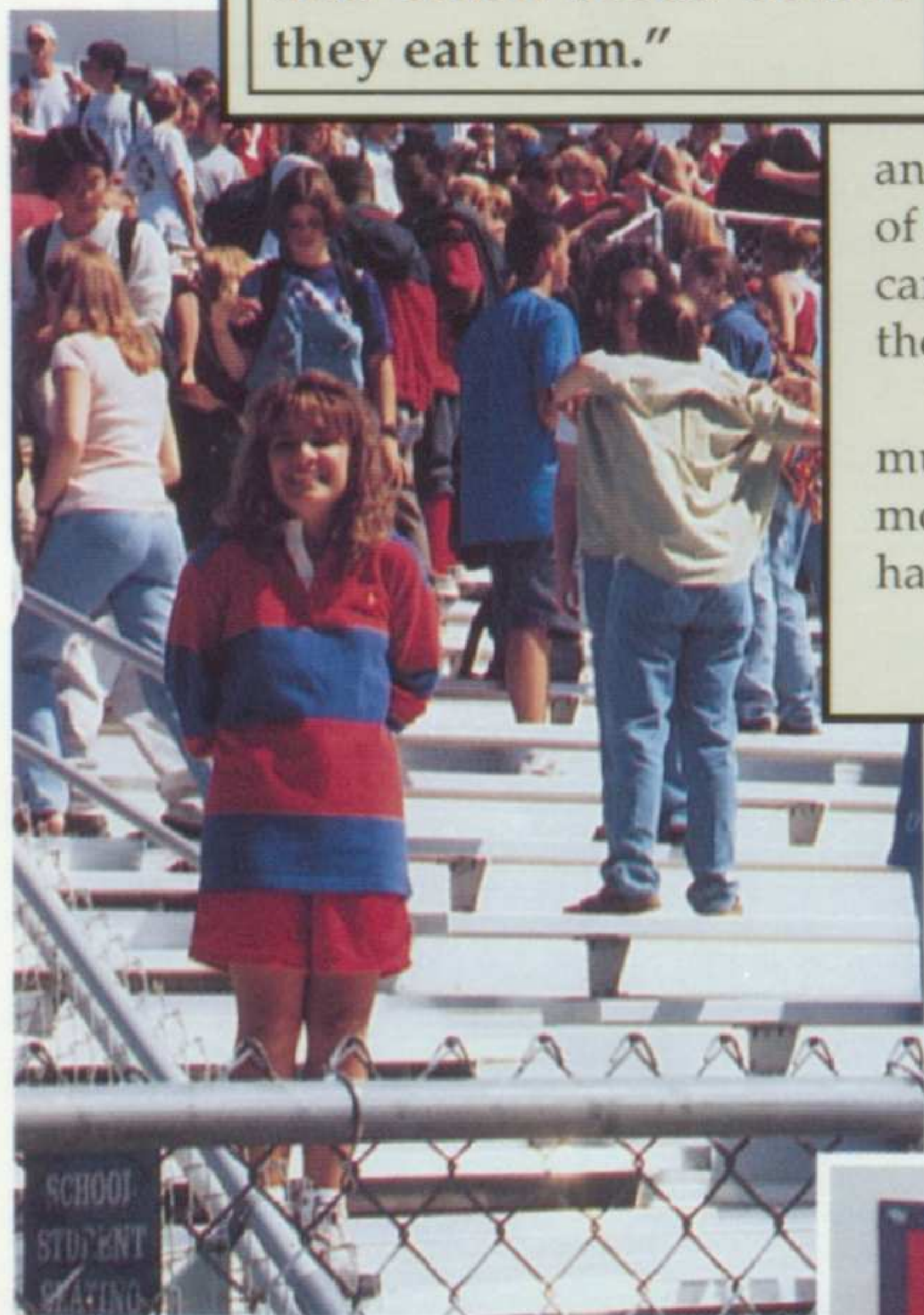
The Cardinal is a good mascot not only because it is Ohio's State Bird, but also for its remarkable qualities. Northern red cardinals are native to Mexico and the eastern half of the United States. They have excellent sight, weigh about 1.5 ounces, and are usually eight inches long. Male cardinals have red coats which identify their masculinity to females and notify bird-watchers of their health. Less aggressive cardinals have brown feathers which hide them from both humans and predators.

Cardinals communicate with short sounds which are combined to form songs. Each bird has a repertoire of eight to twelve songs and sings about 150 songs each day. Northern red cardinals are fierce hunters. These birds peck, bite, and claw at their enemies. They hunt and viciously murder innocent worms and caterpillars, and cut and crush seeds before they eat them. They are very protective of their territory and sometimes attack car mirrors, believing they see cardinals invading their territory. Cardinals cannot understand why their opponents in the mirrors relentlessly attack.

The Cardinal has many admirable qualities, such as its bravery, musical talent, and beauty. It has represented Thomas Worthington for most of this century and is a mascot that any school should be proud to have.

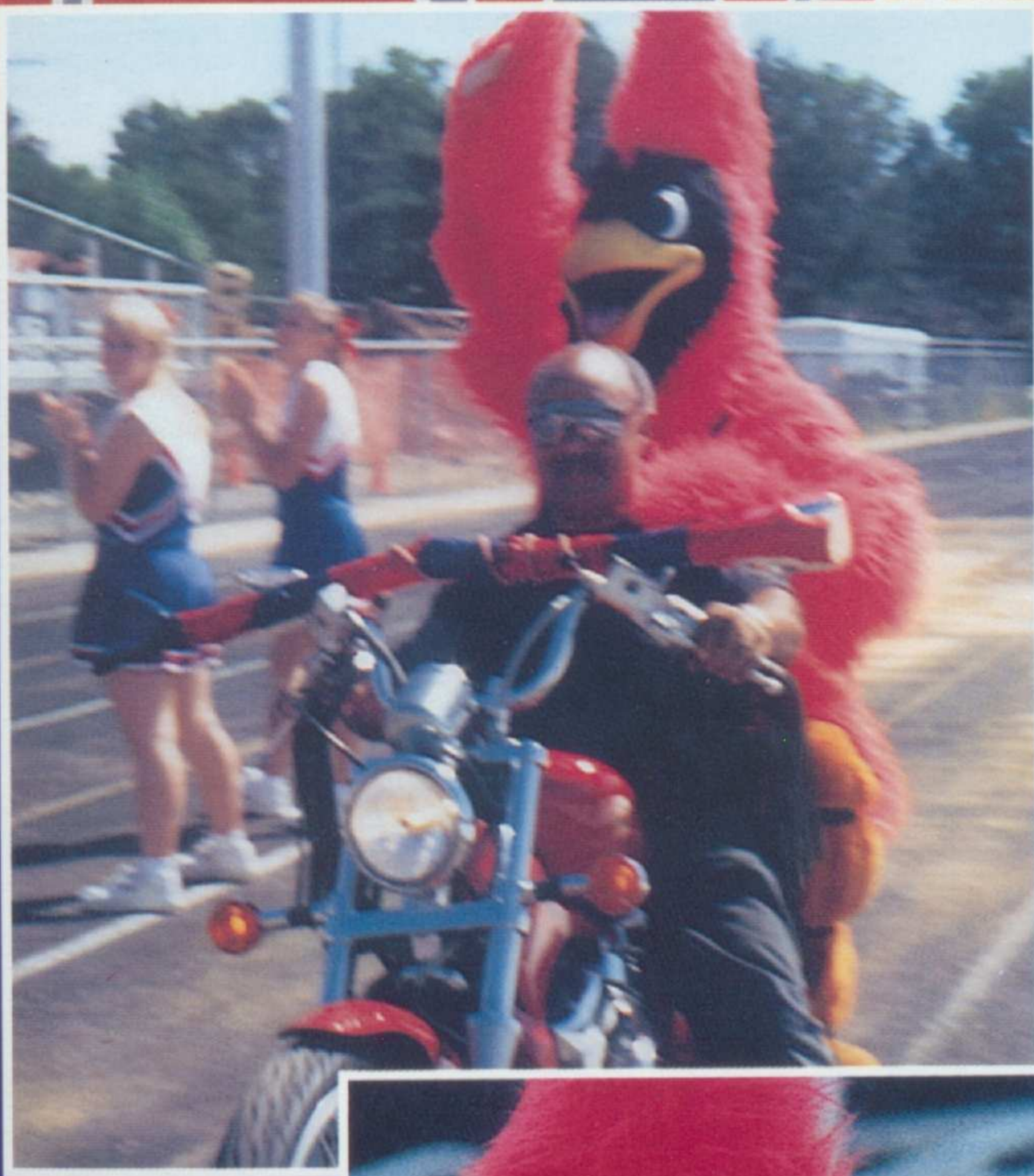

JEEPERS, CREEPERS, WE GOT NEW BLEACHERS!

Before the end of the 1997 school year, construction had begun on the new bleachers. The old bleachers were condemned following the 1996 football season and then removed shortly afterwards. Unfortunately, the spring sport participants were not allowed the luxury of having the home side of the bleachers open. The new bleachers were approved during the 1997 school year by the school board after a suspenseful debate regarding cost. Fortunately, the school board decided to tear down the existing ones instead of making upgrades on the condemned home stands.

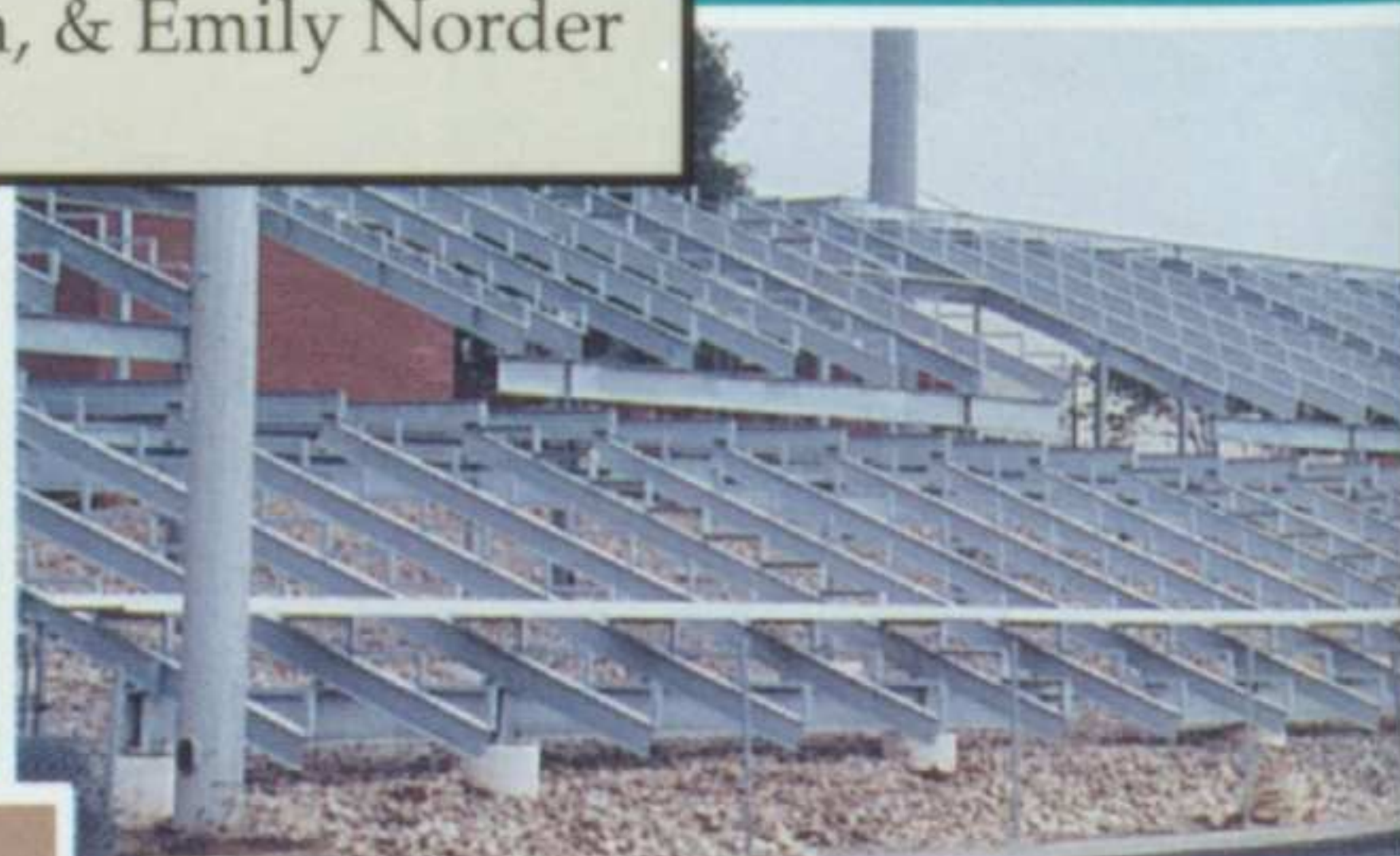
The rebuilt bleachers seat 2,850 people. Regulations due to disability laws require larger walkways, wheelchair ramps, and handicap seating access. Also new to the stadium are designated seating areas such as: band, middle school, high school, general admission, and reserved seating.

The stadium was not an inexpensive project. Outdoor Aluminum, a contracting company from Geneva, Alabama oversaw the construction of the new addition to the school. Unfortunately, the efforts of Outdoor Aluminum to complete the bleachers by the first home football game were unsuccessful. Weather delays caused the inauguration of the bleachers to be postponed until the second home football game.

Overall, the stadium adds to the character of Thomas Worthington High School. The brand new stands are an added sense of pride shared by all athletes who compete on Dow Nelson Field.

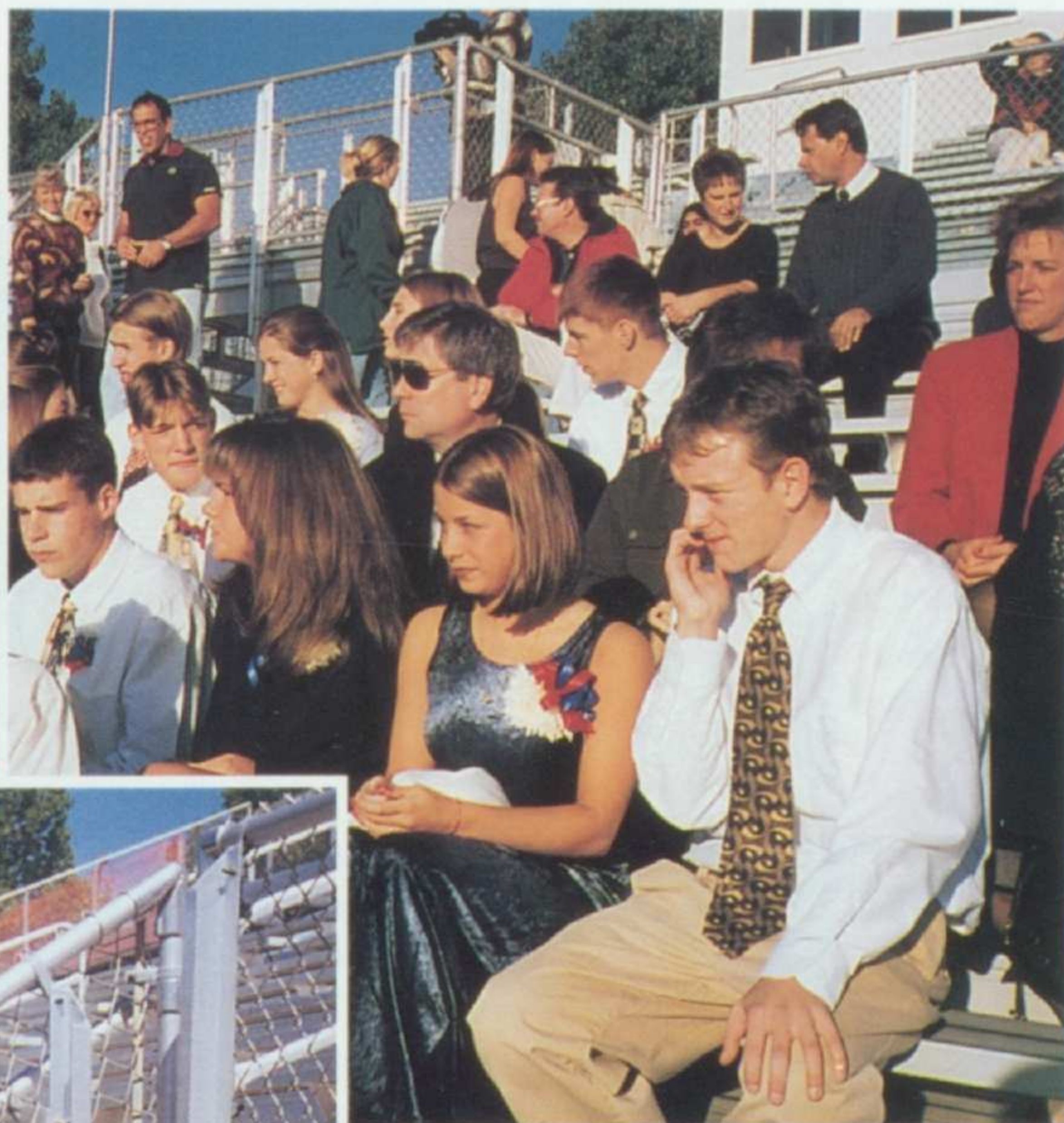
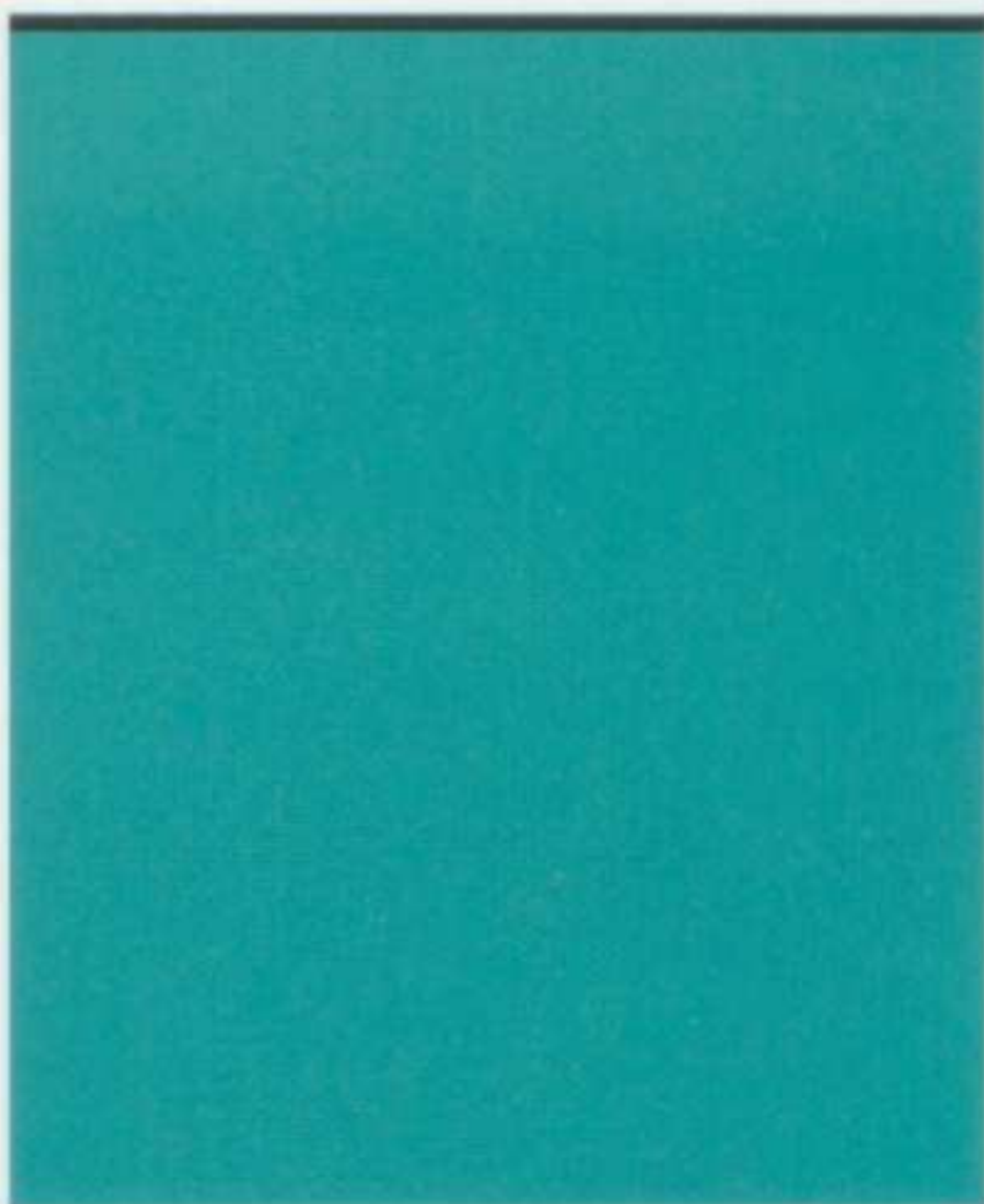
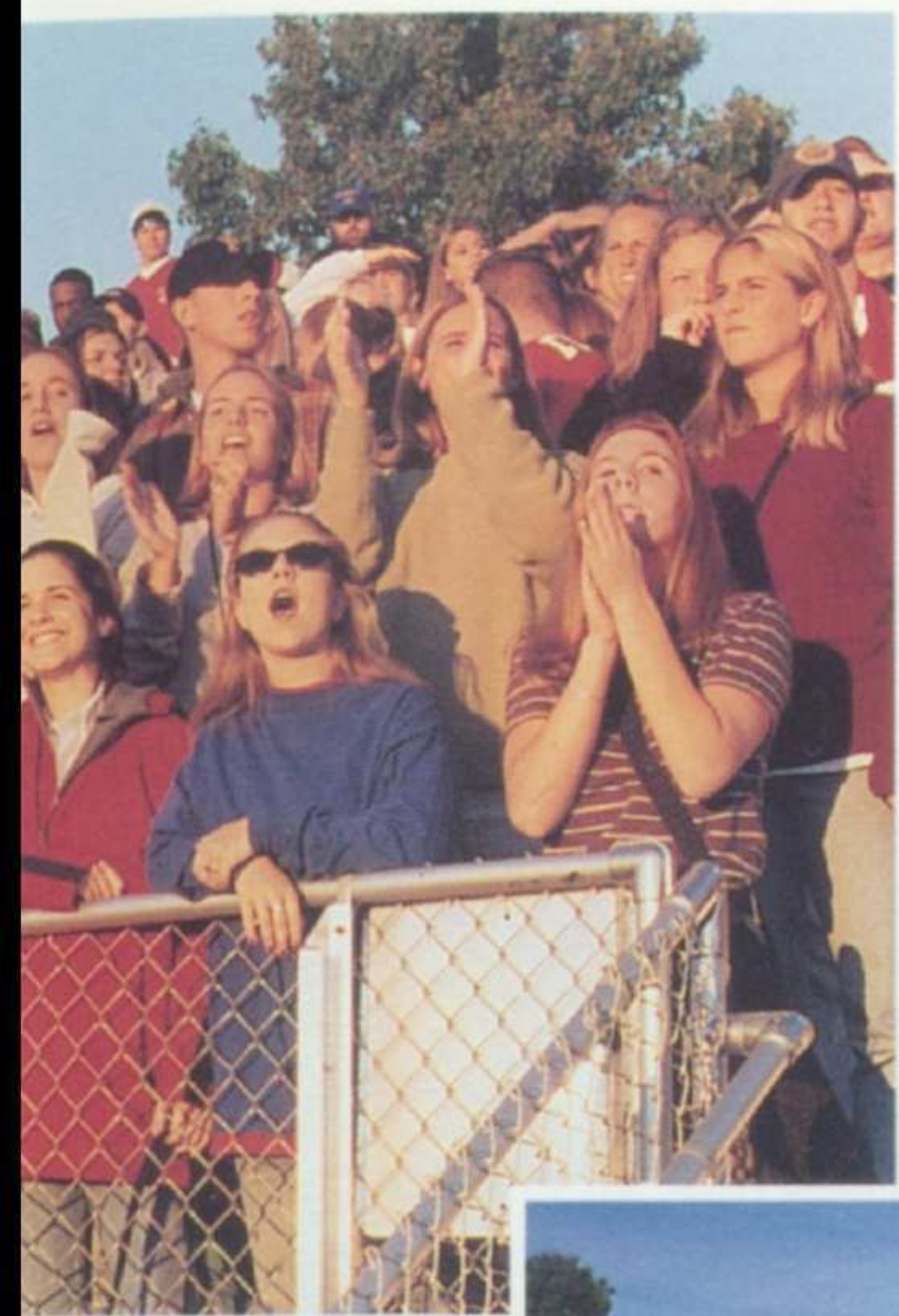

5:00 a.m. Still going! There's always tomorrow to sleep.

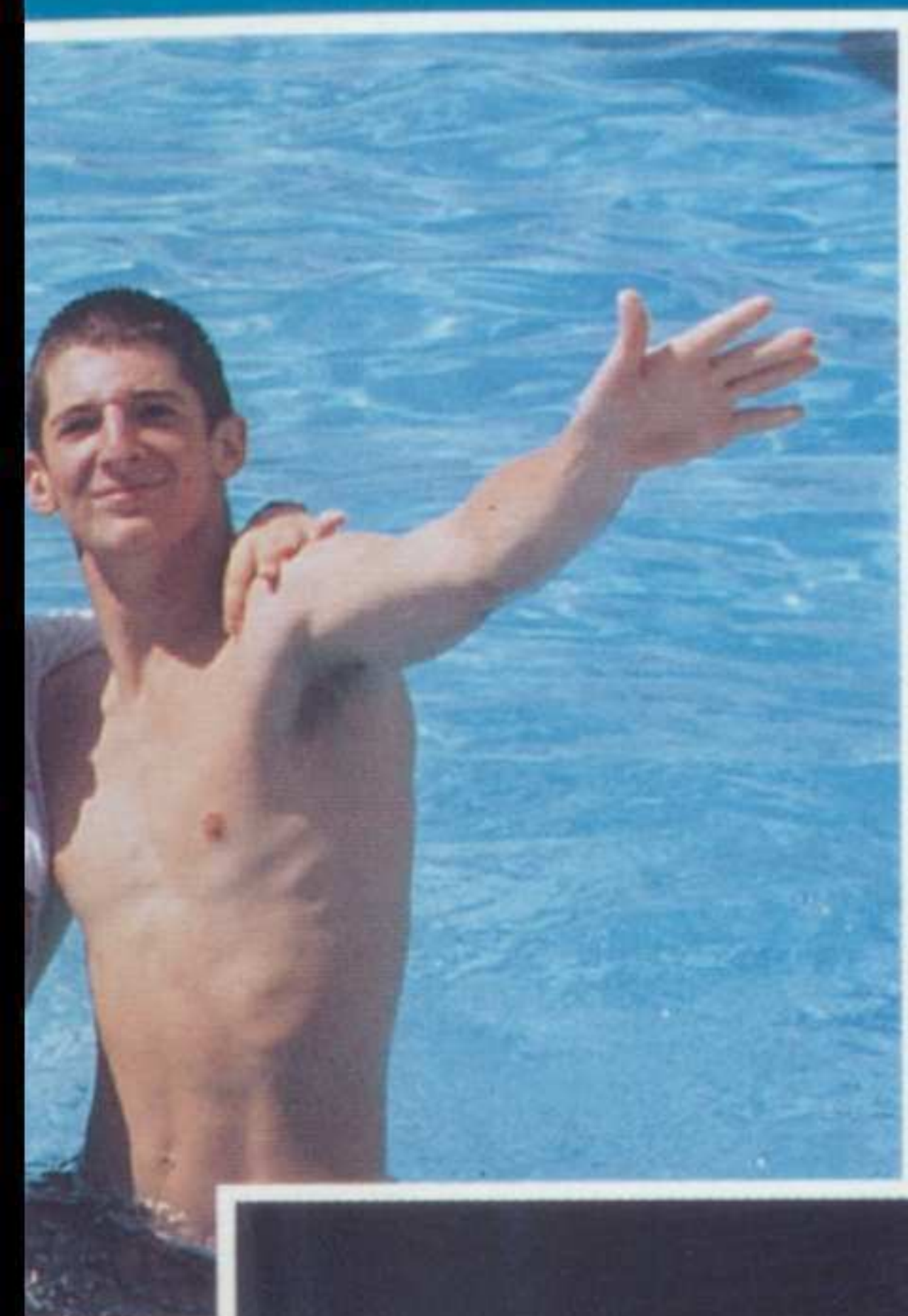

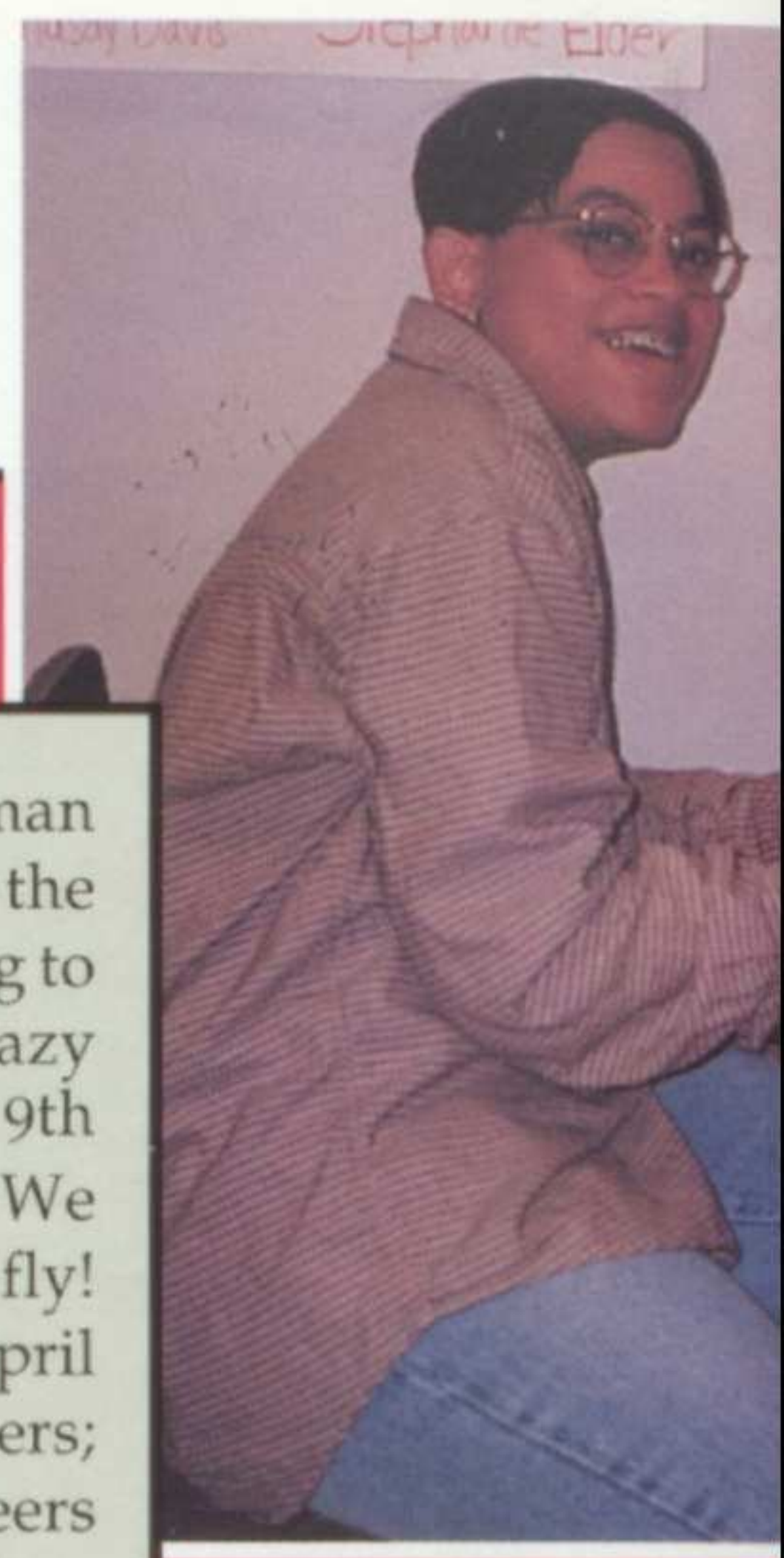

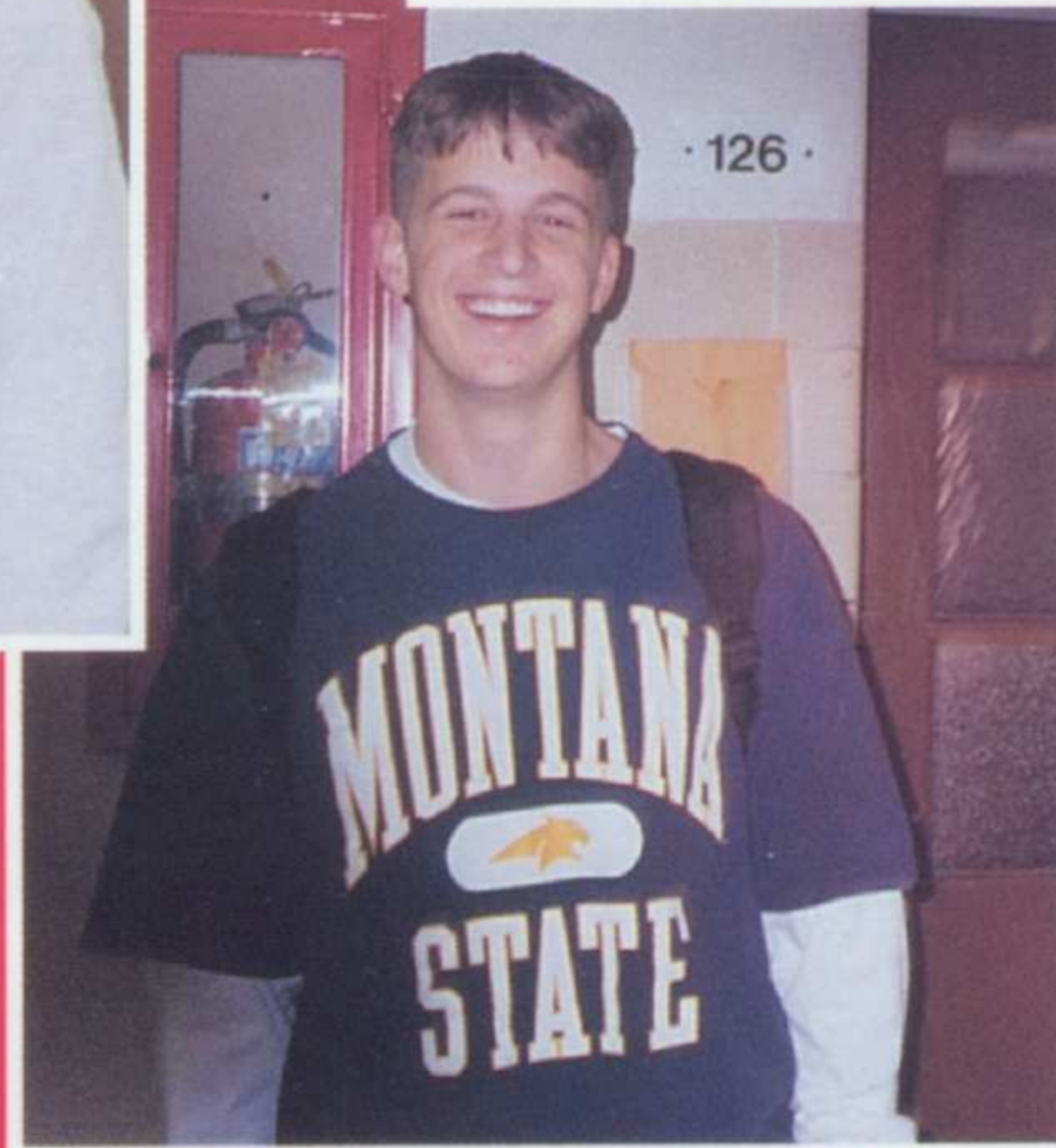
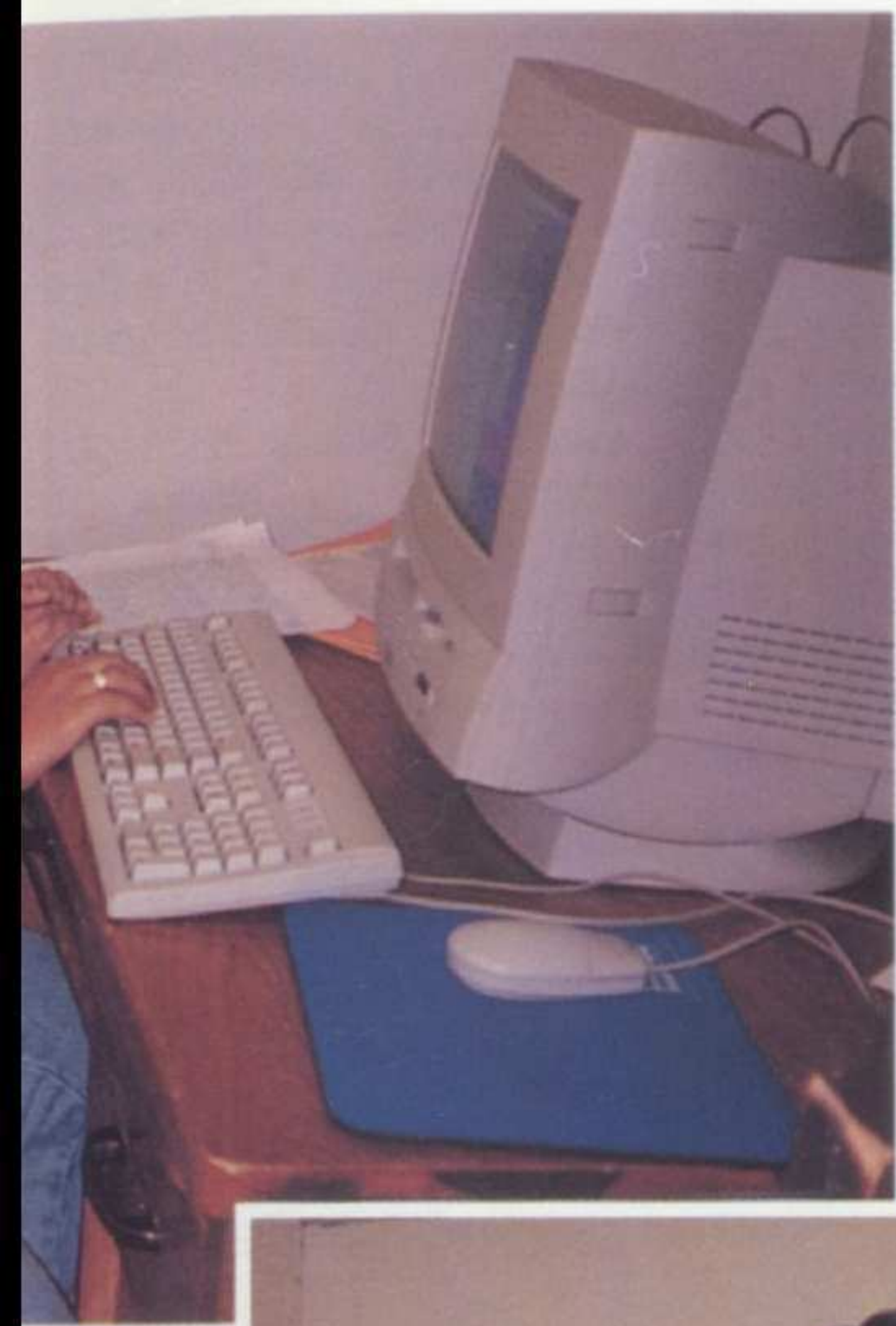

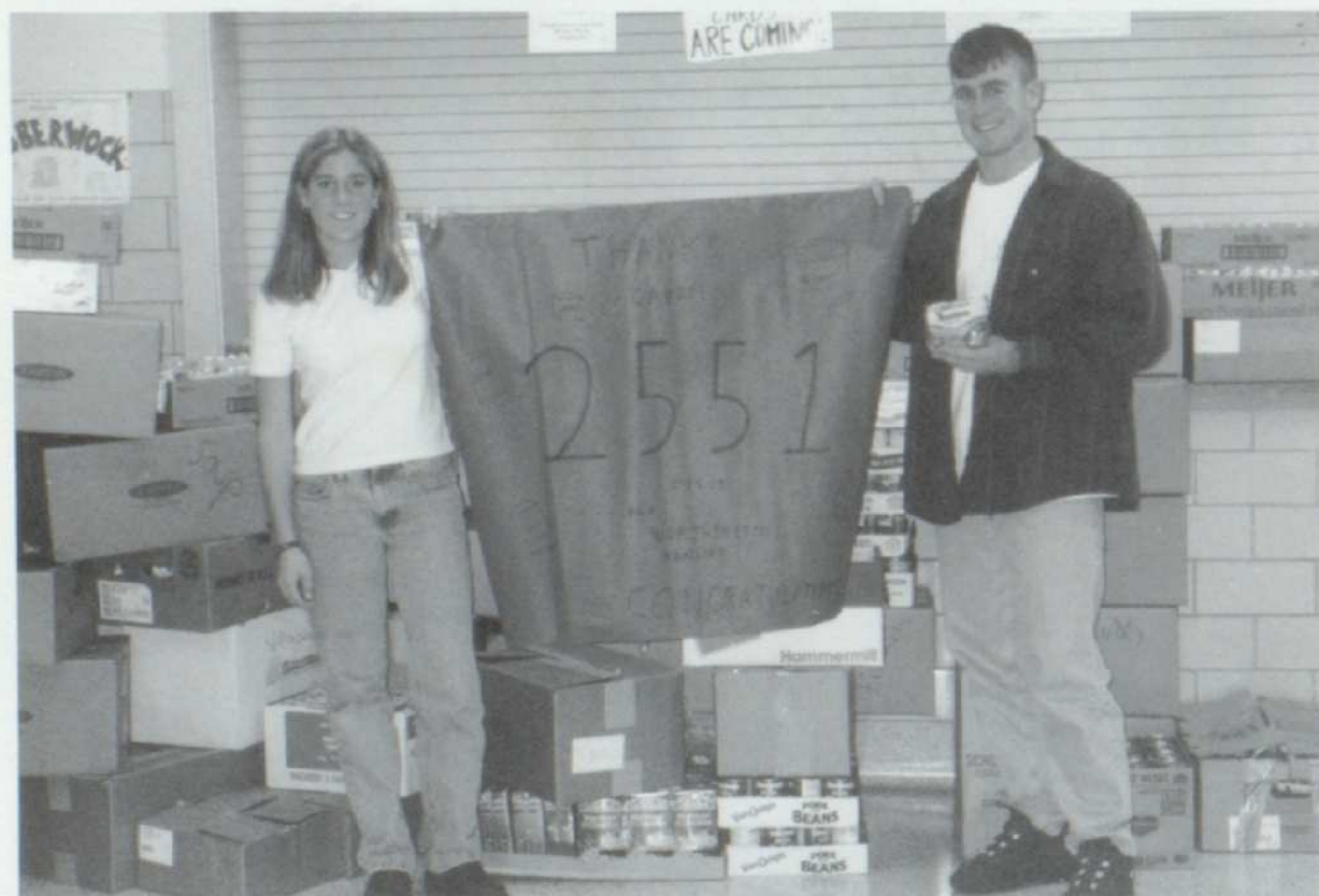

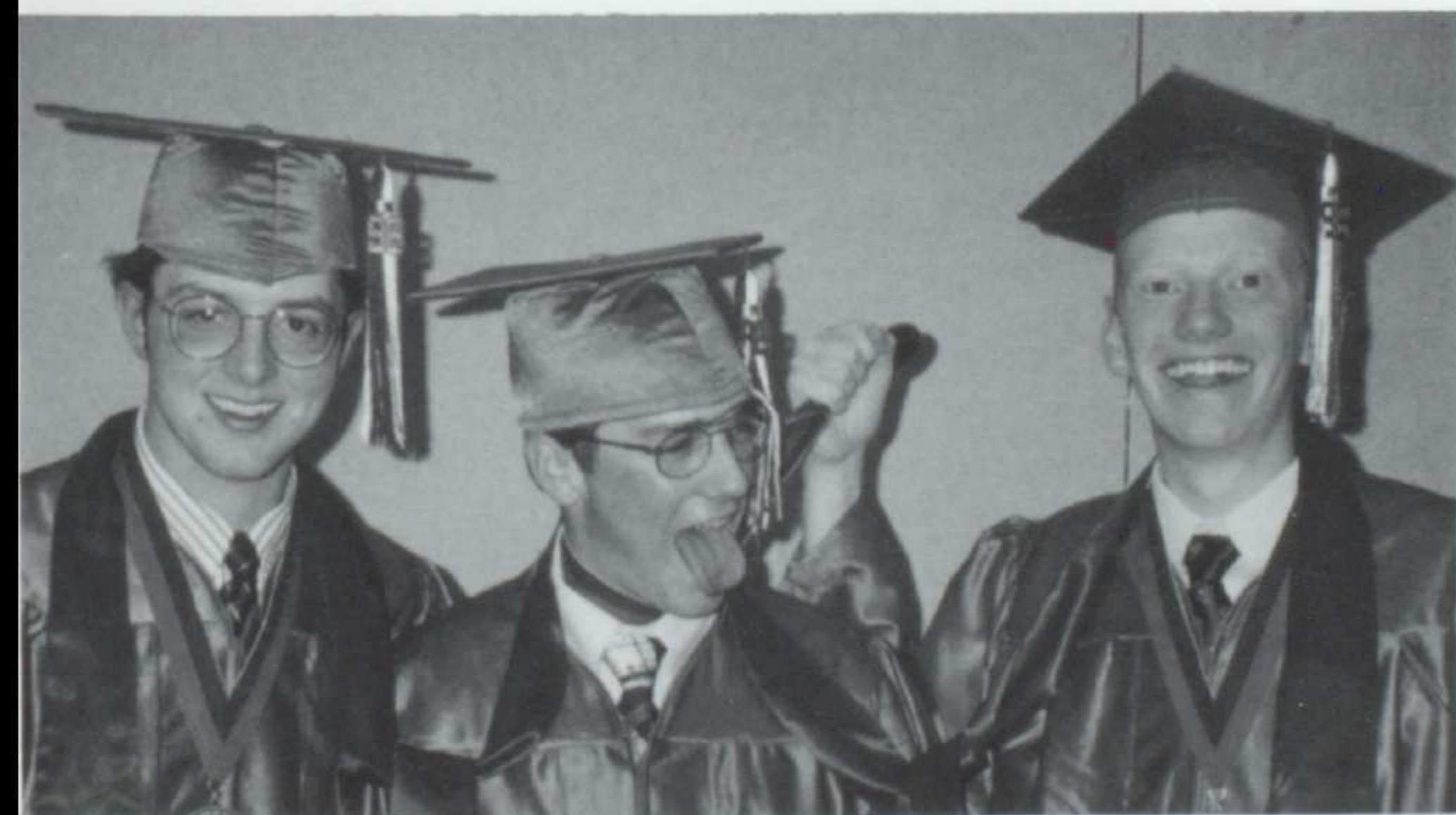

Freshman Cardinal Spirit Day

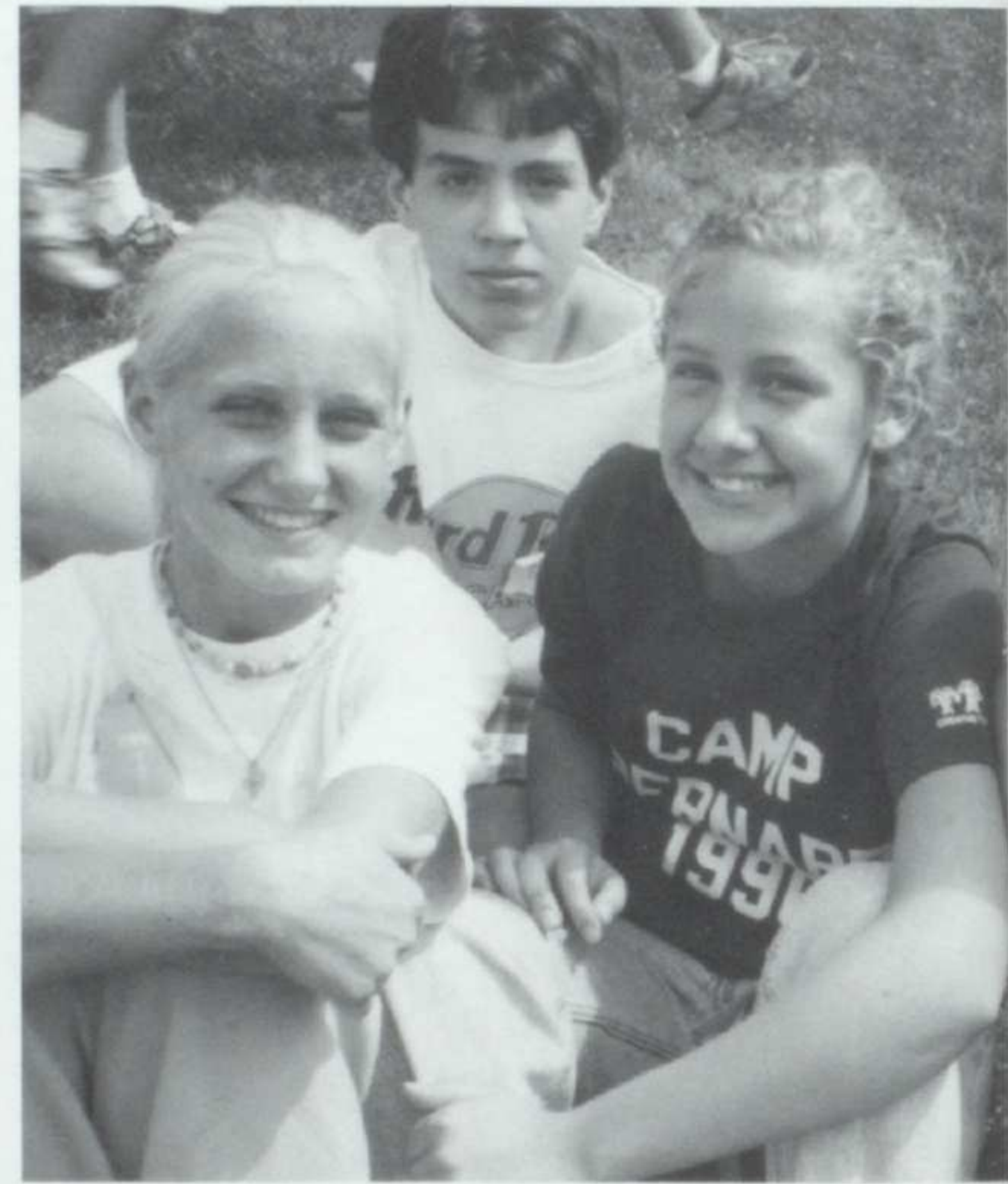

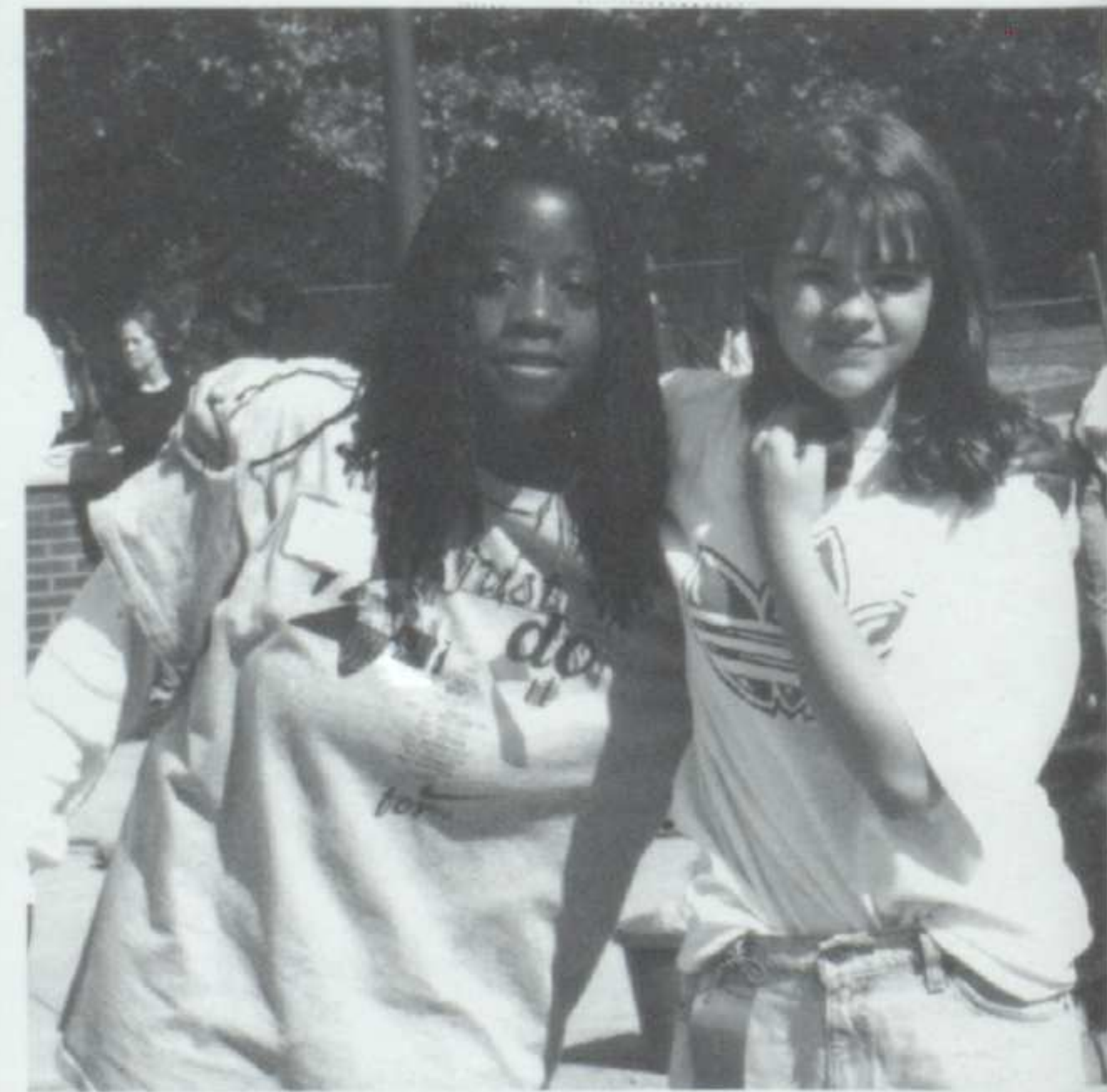

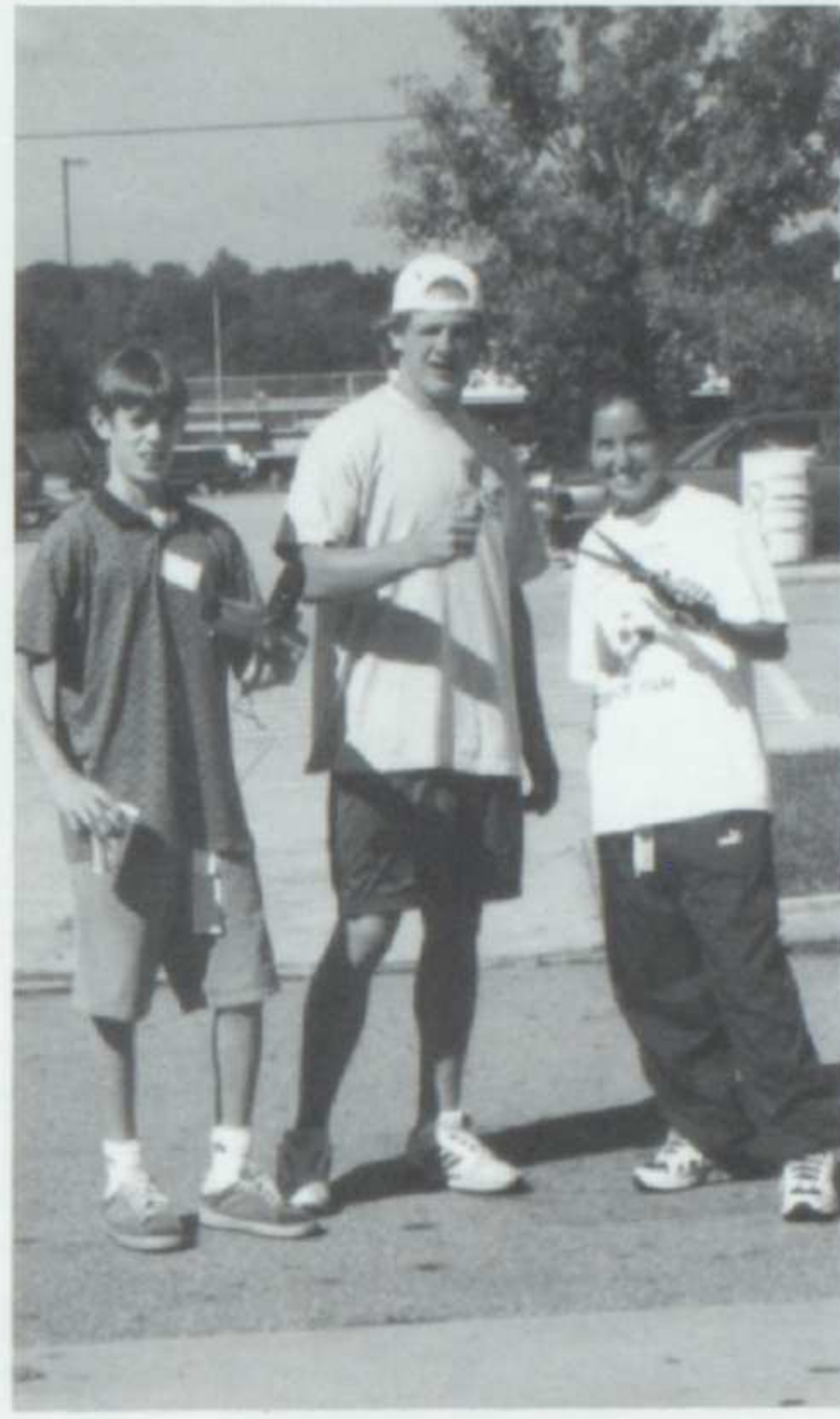

From grass skirts to bellbottoms, spirit shone throughout the joyful halls of Thomas Worthington.

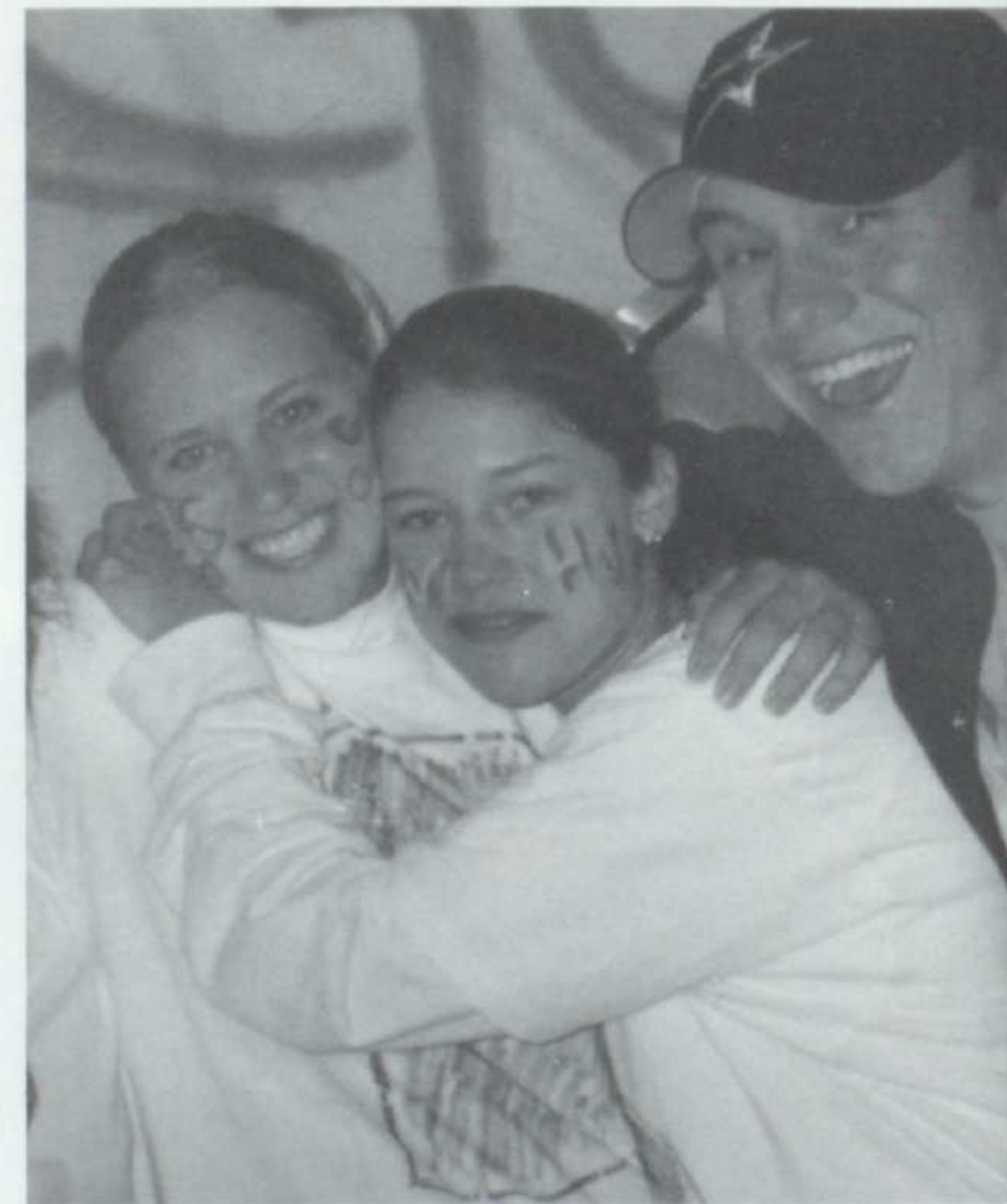

Homecoming was exciting and everyone who attended had a wonderful time!

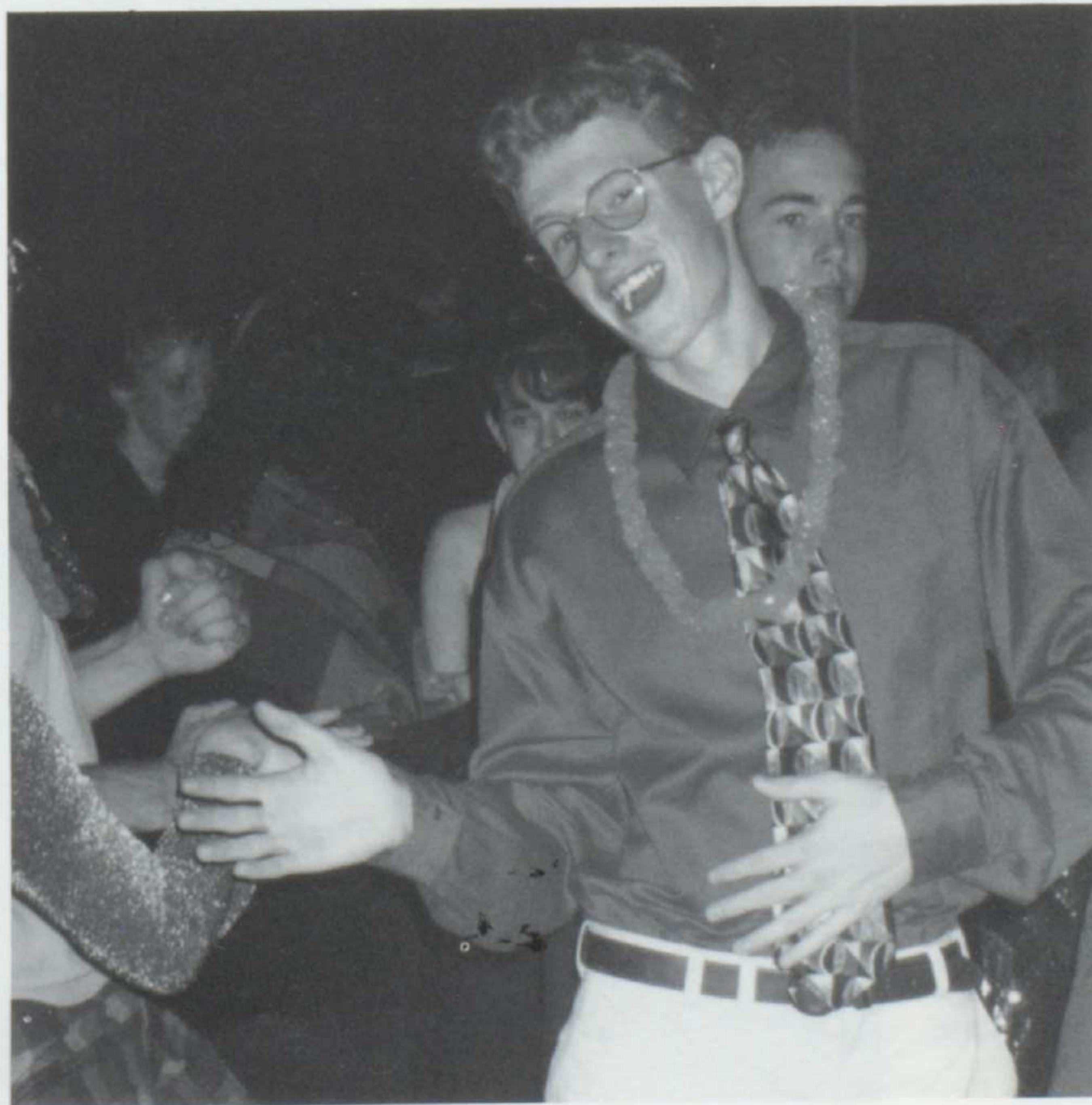
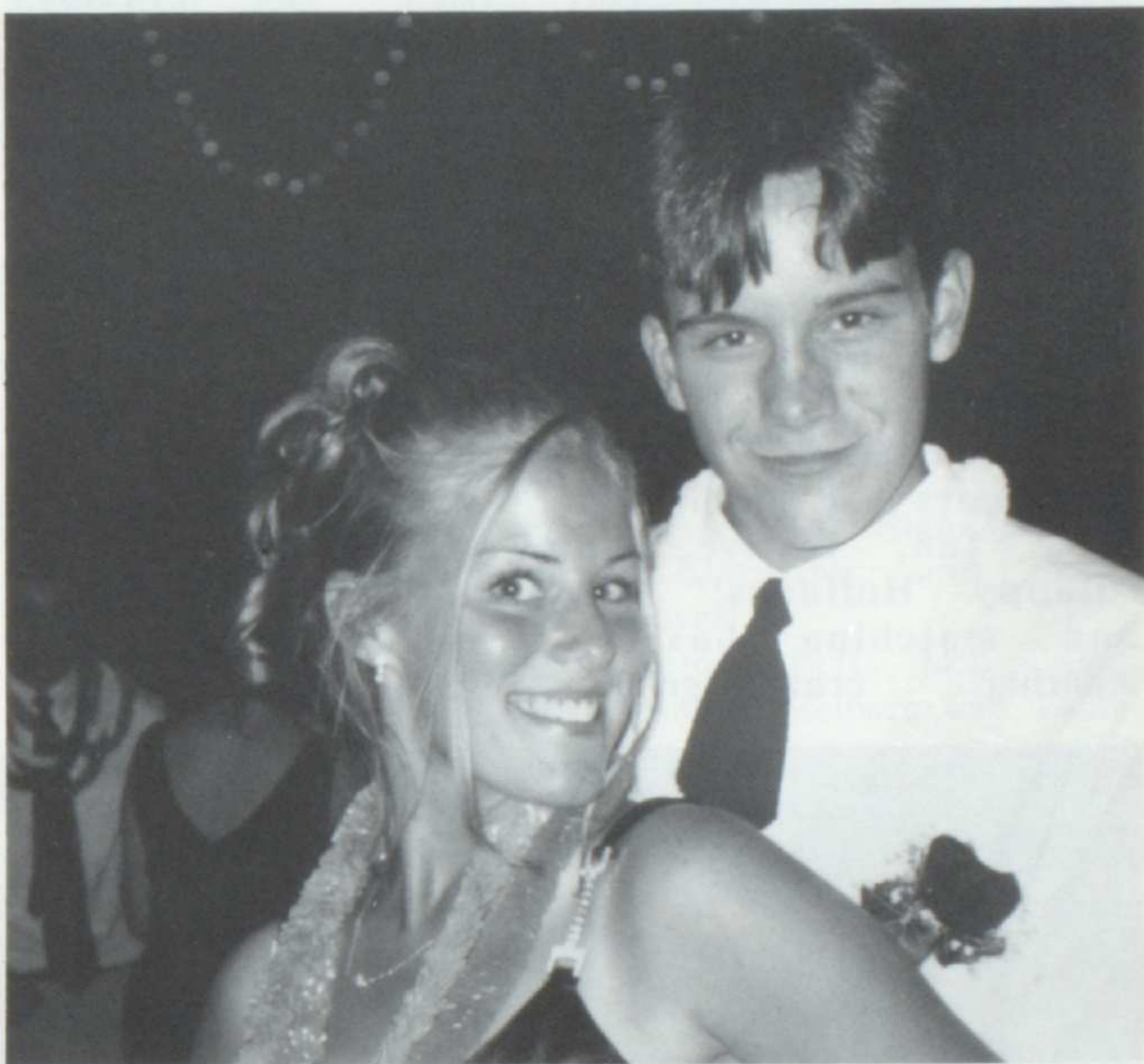
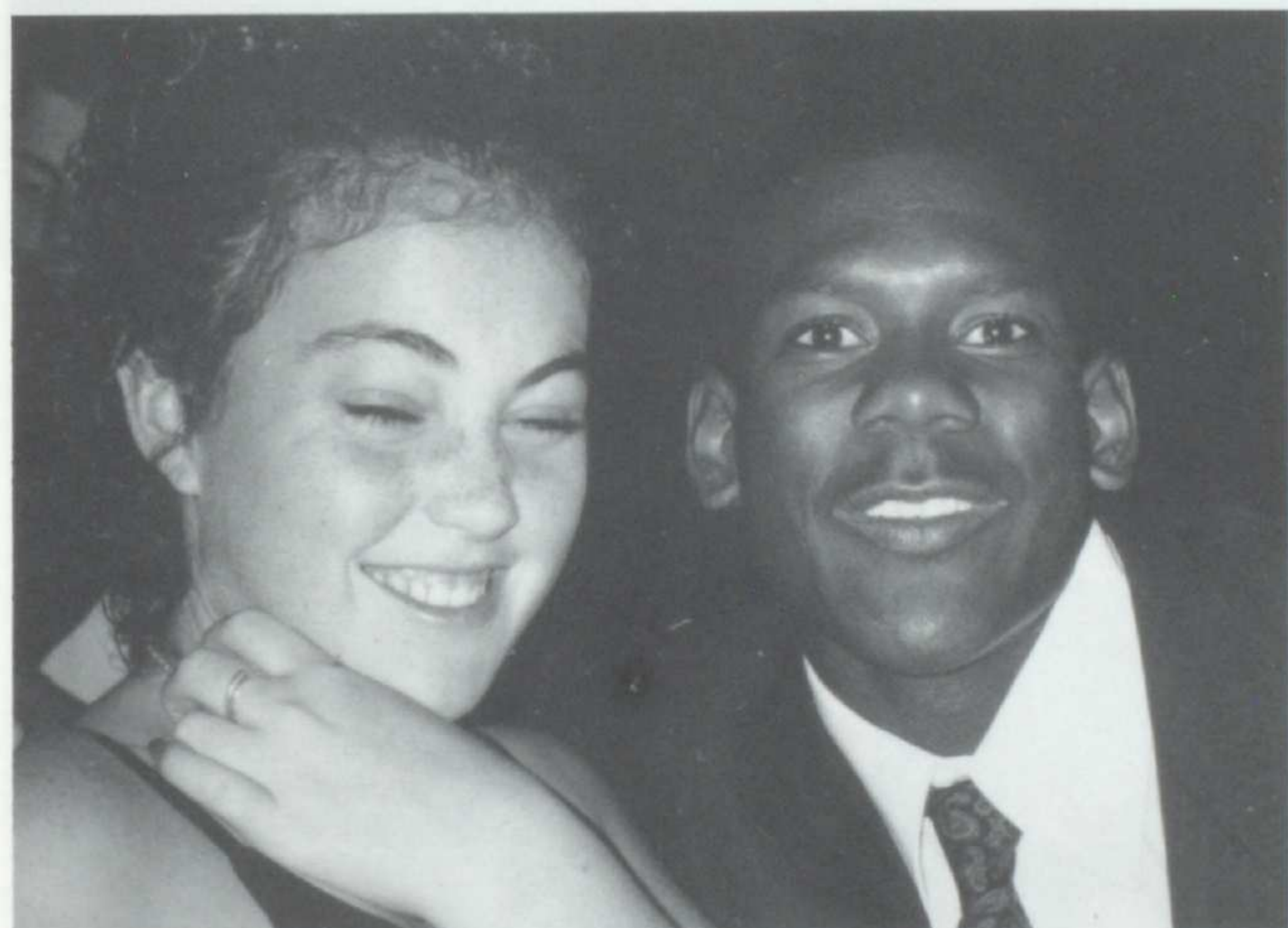

Another crazy group of

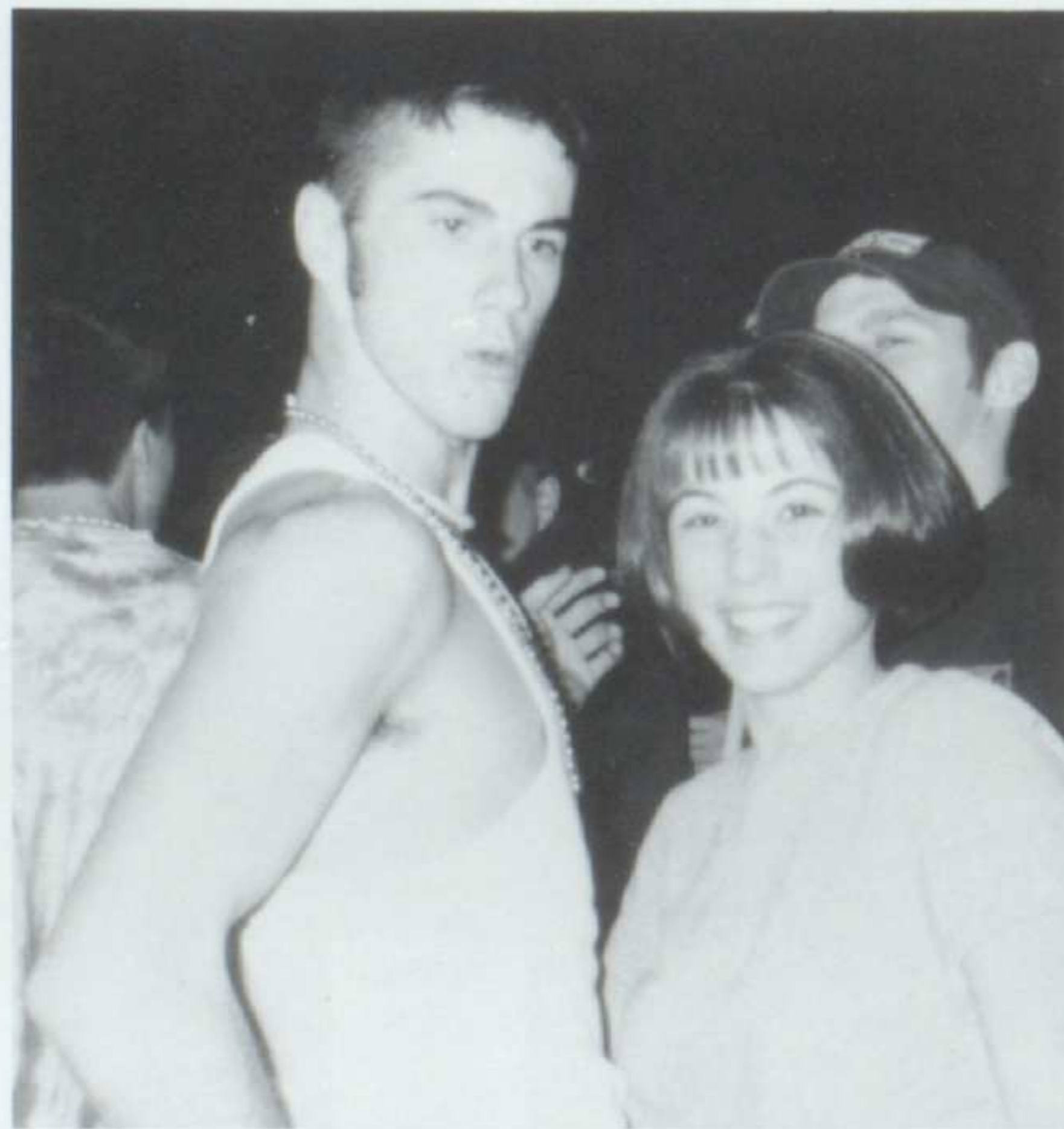
senior girls wore matching outfits and highly suggestive, green mistletoe.

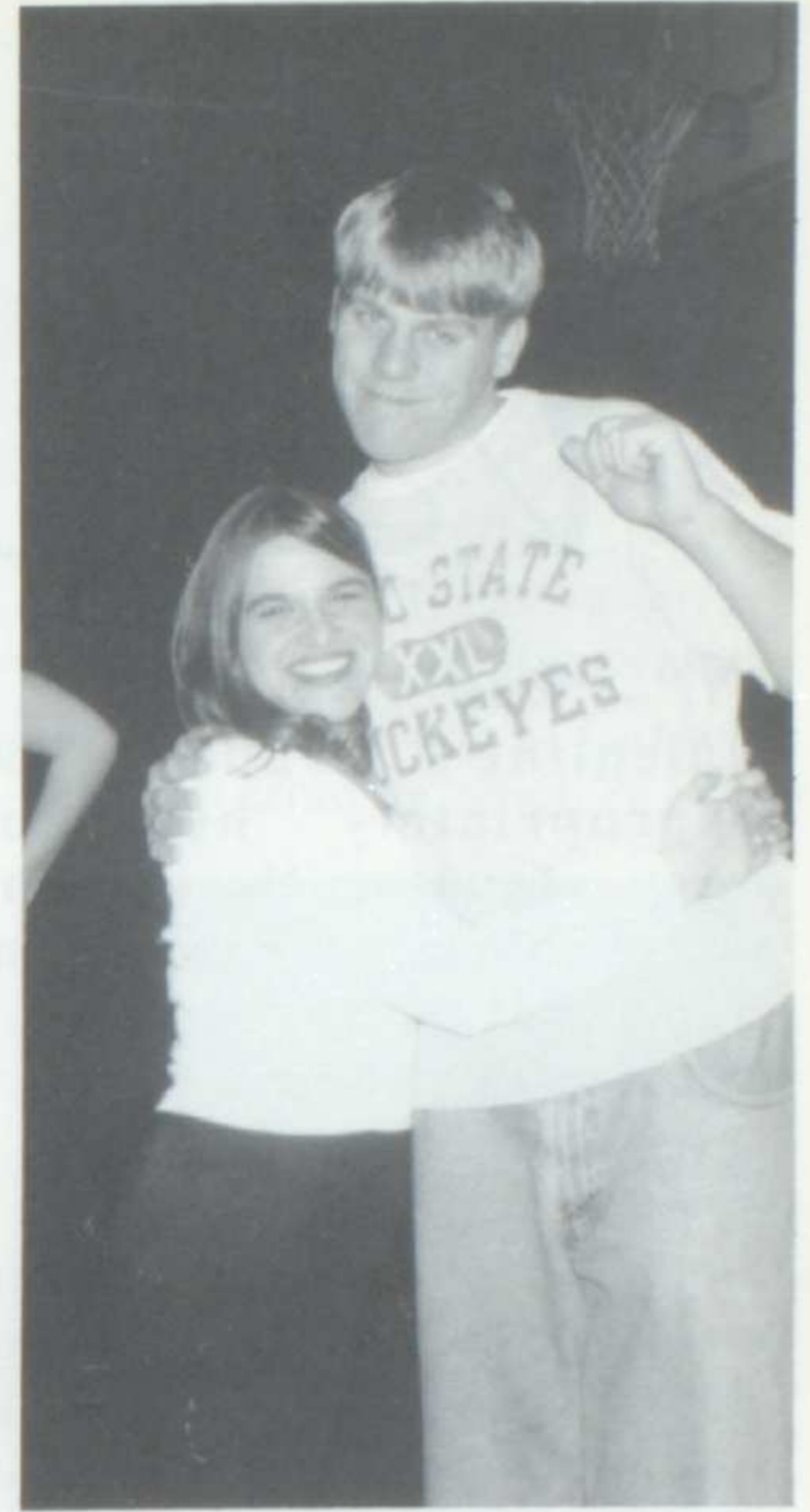
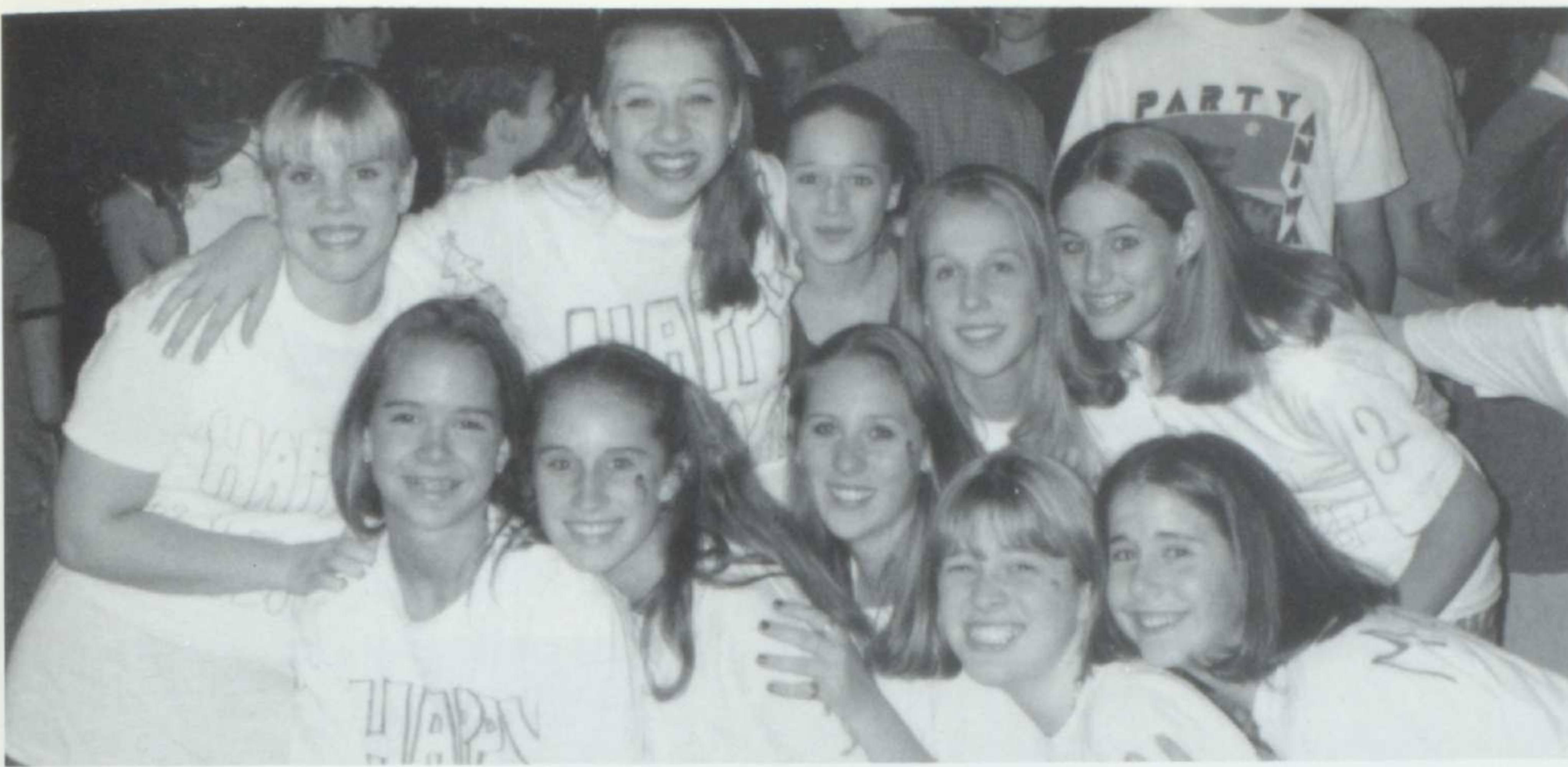

According to senior, Katie Huber, "The D.J. completed the mood of the dance."

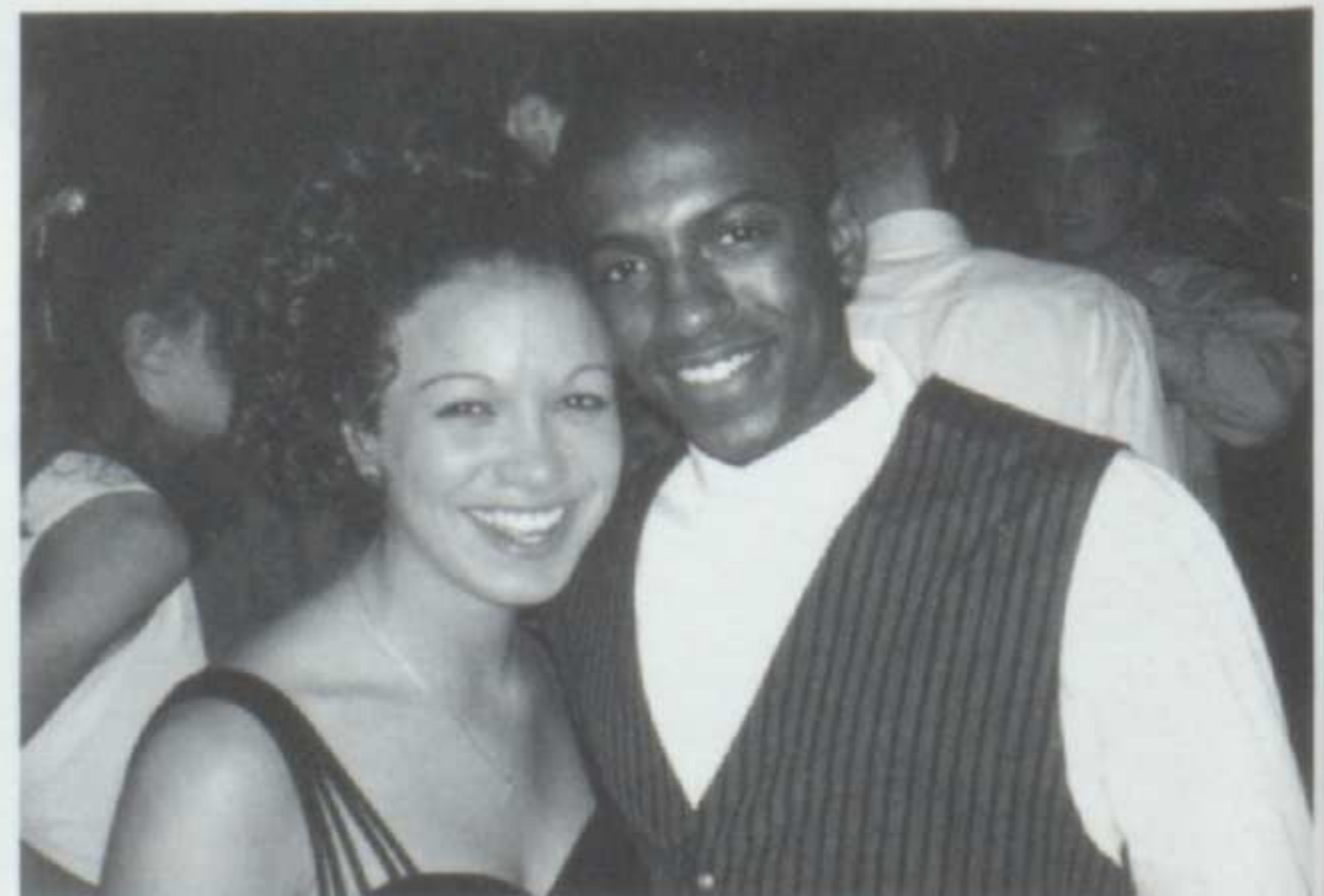
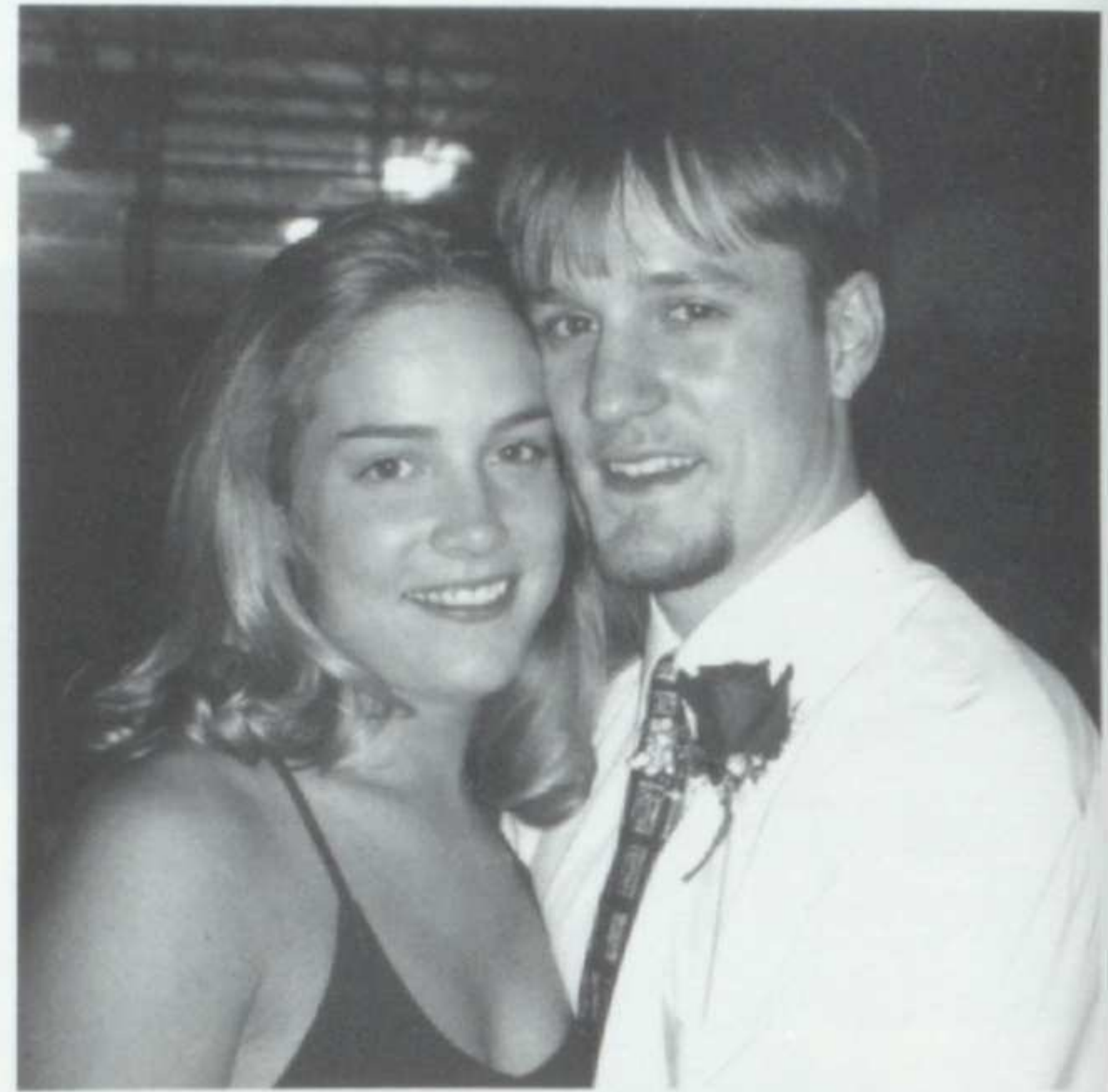

Graduation

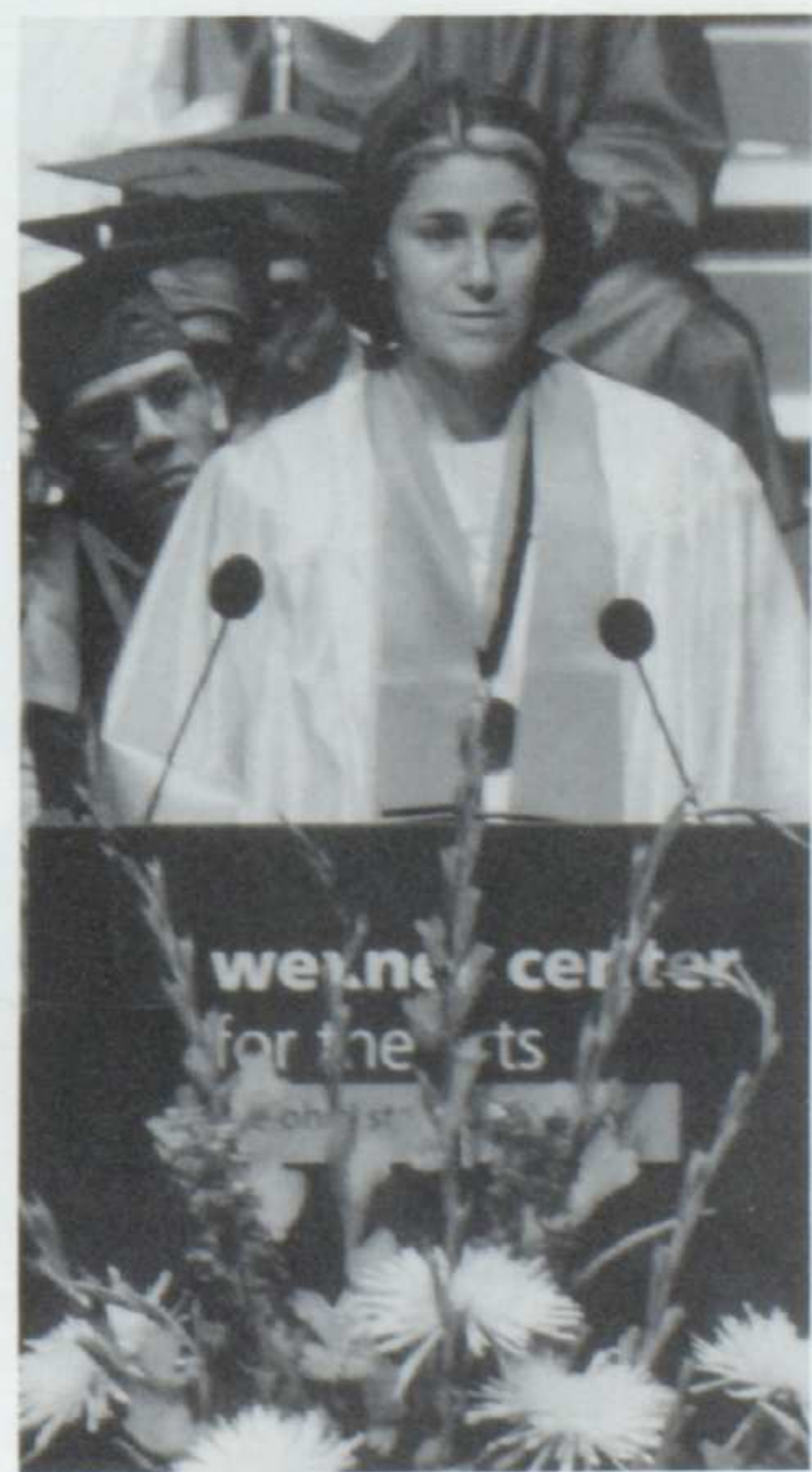
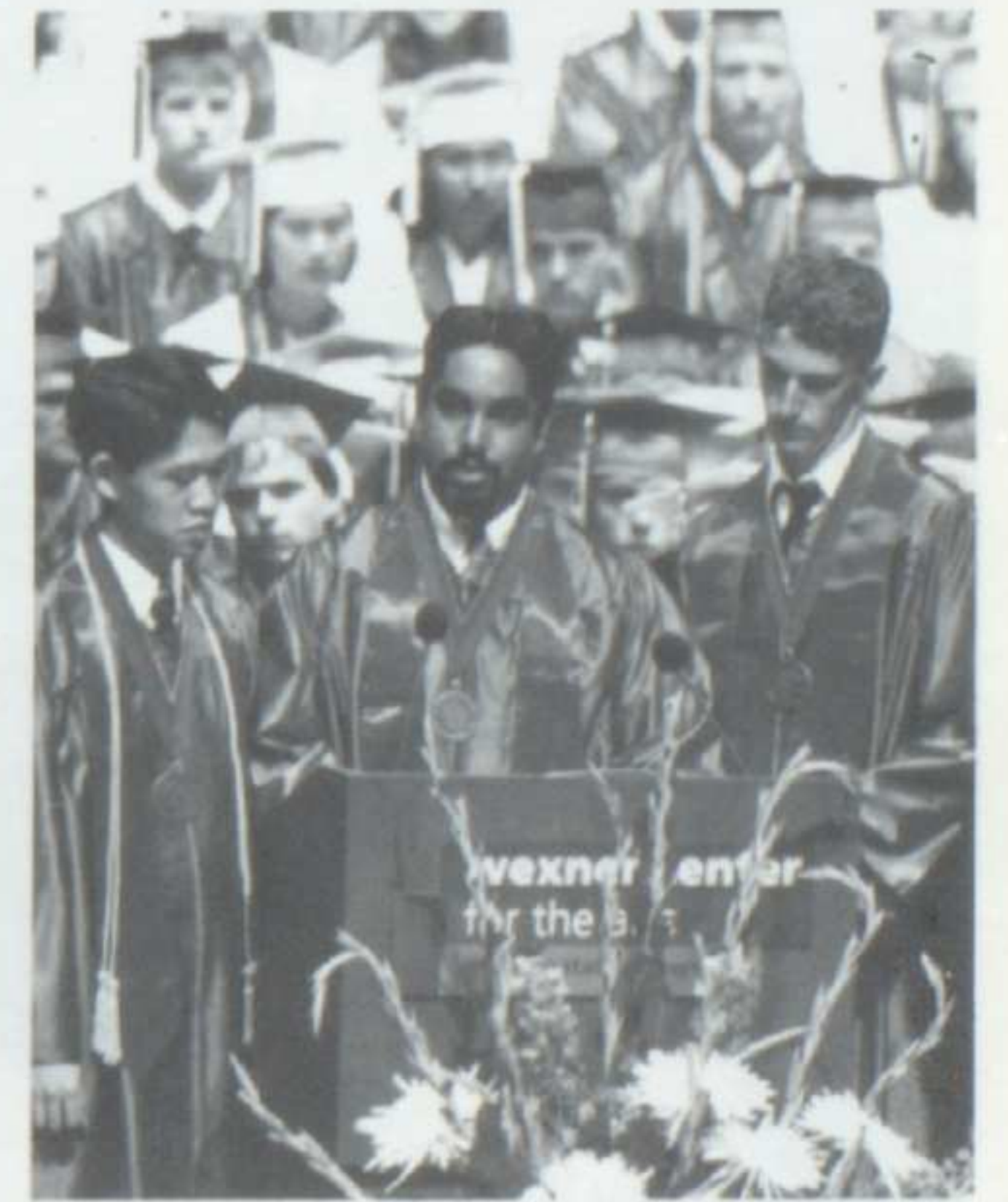

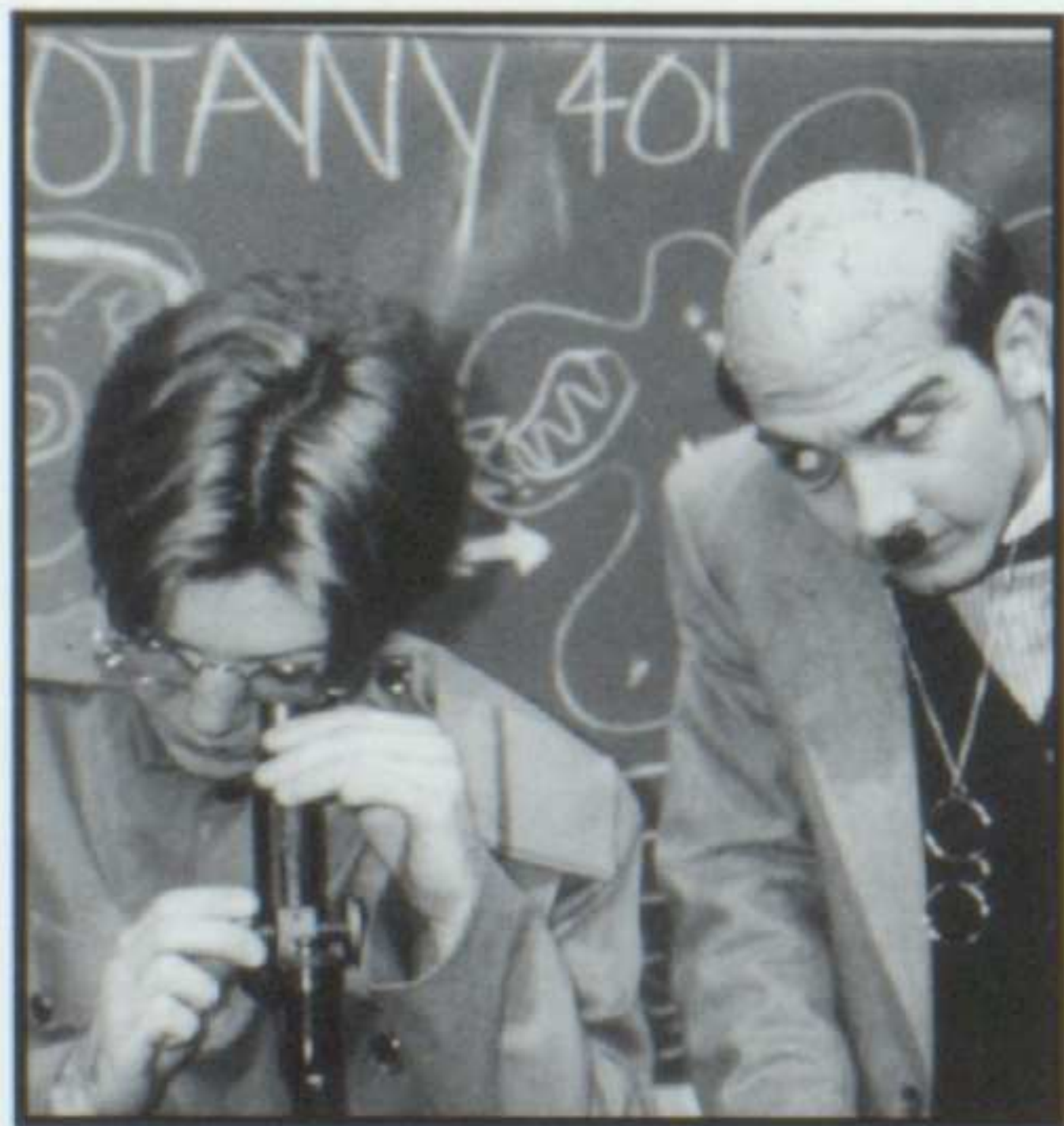

Dancing at Lughnasa



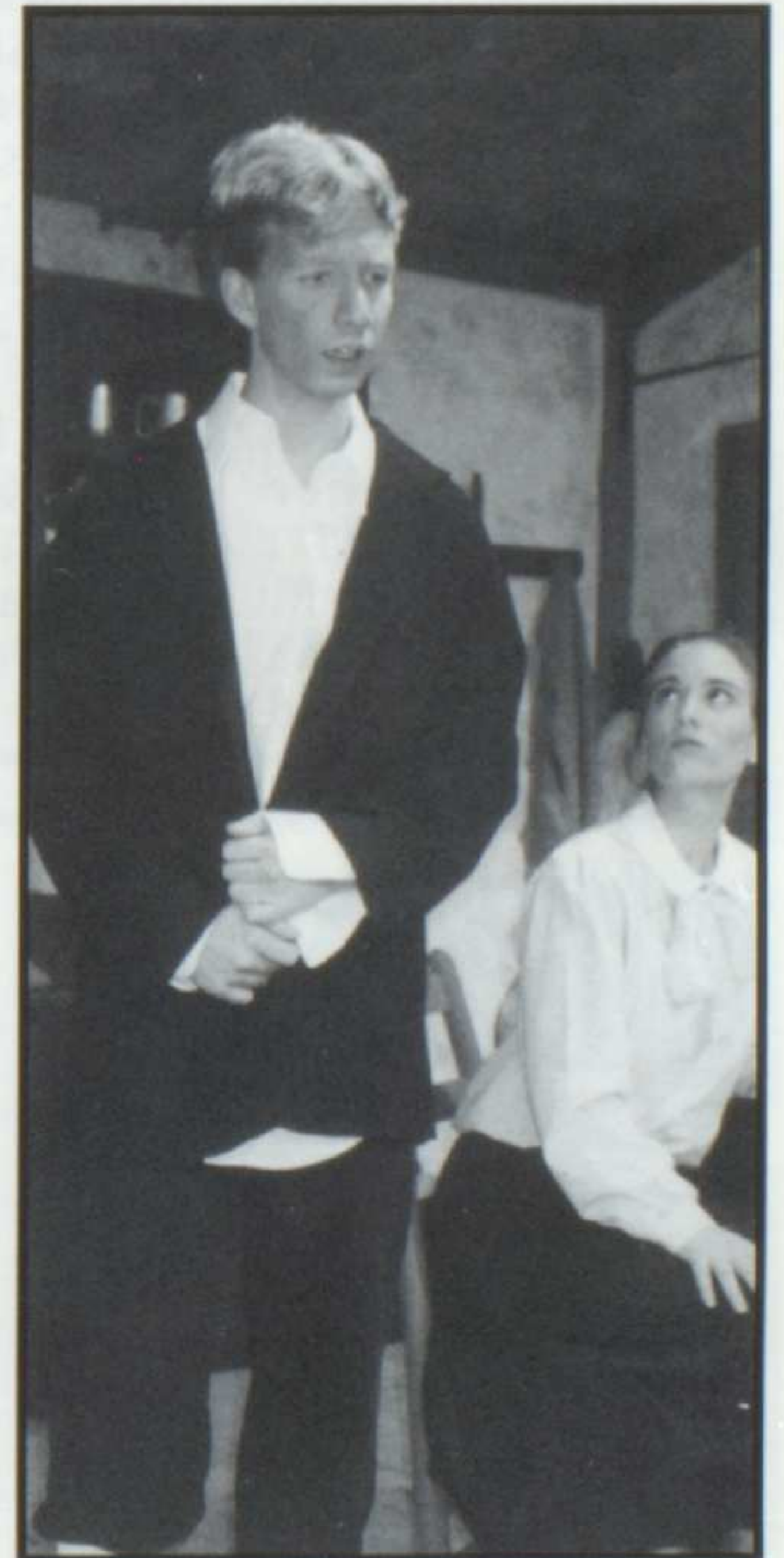

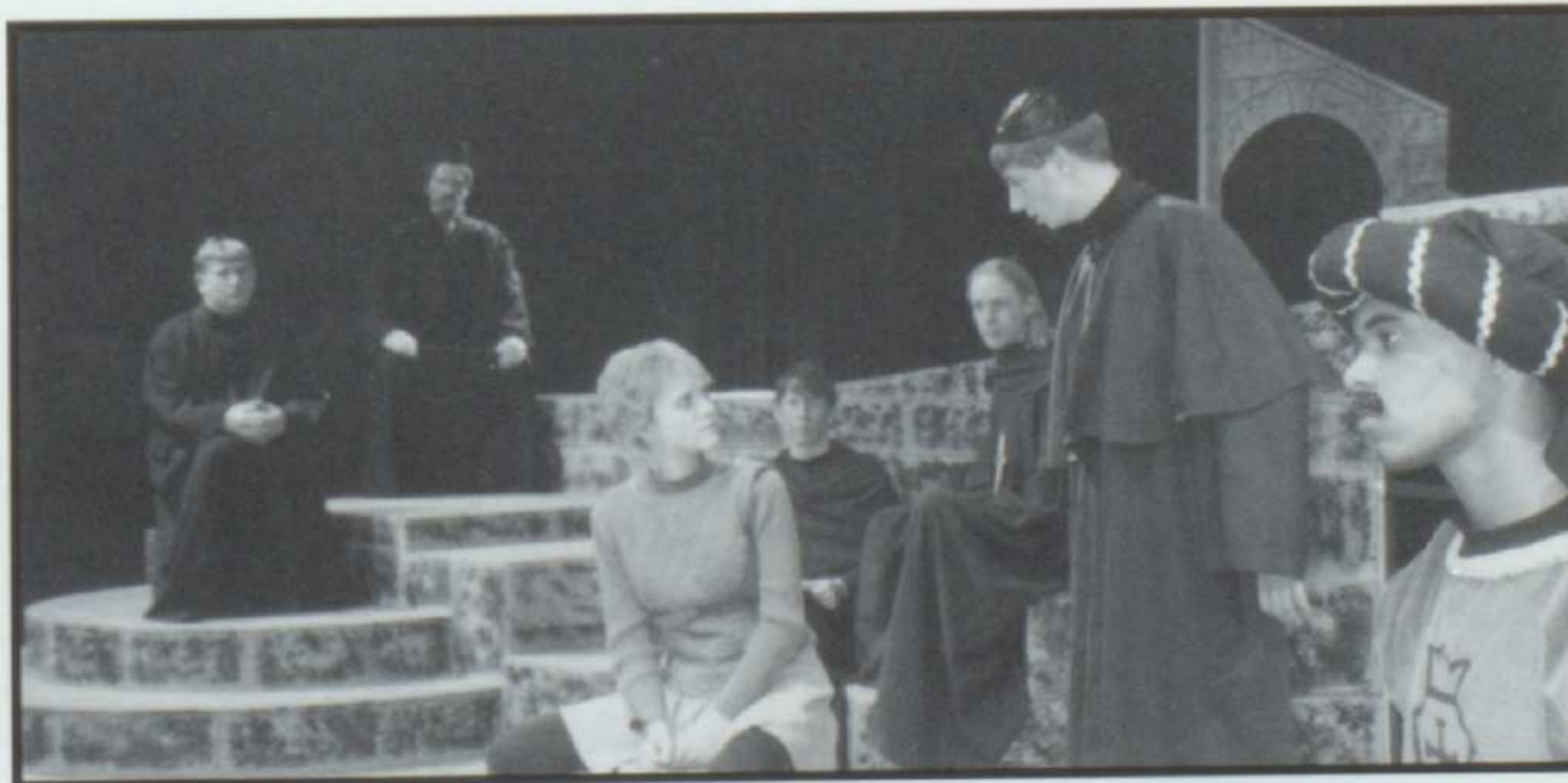
The Lark

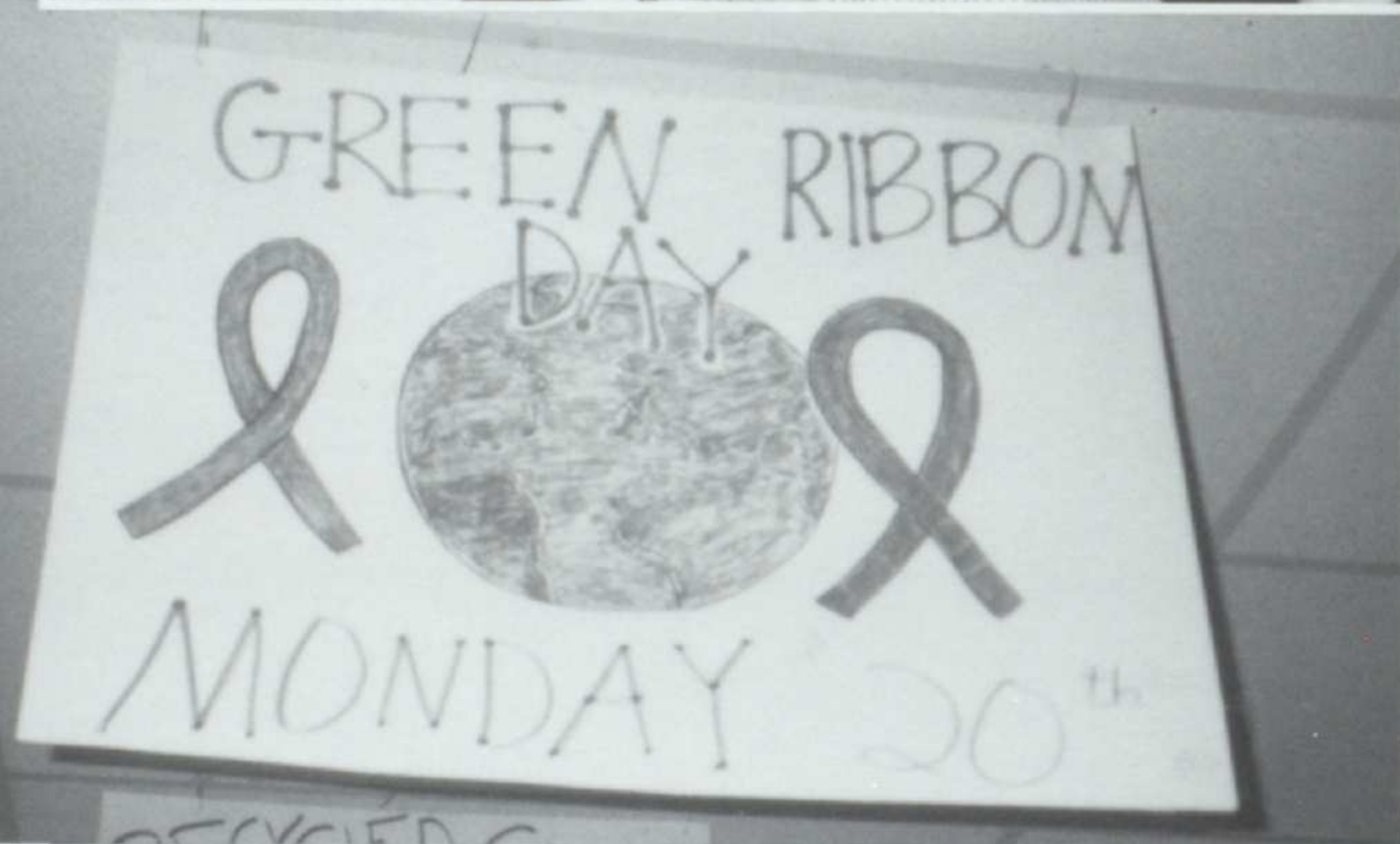

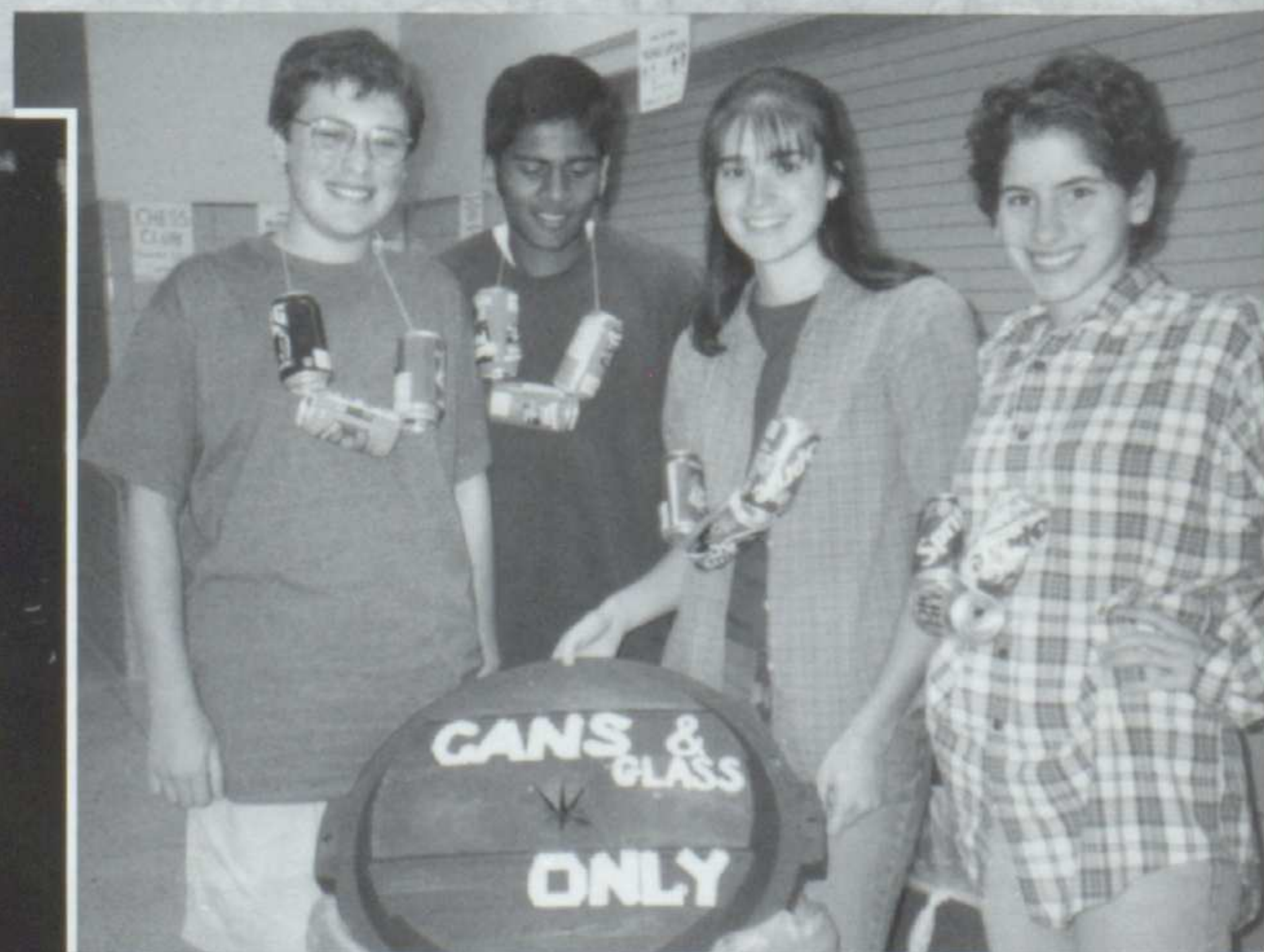

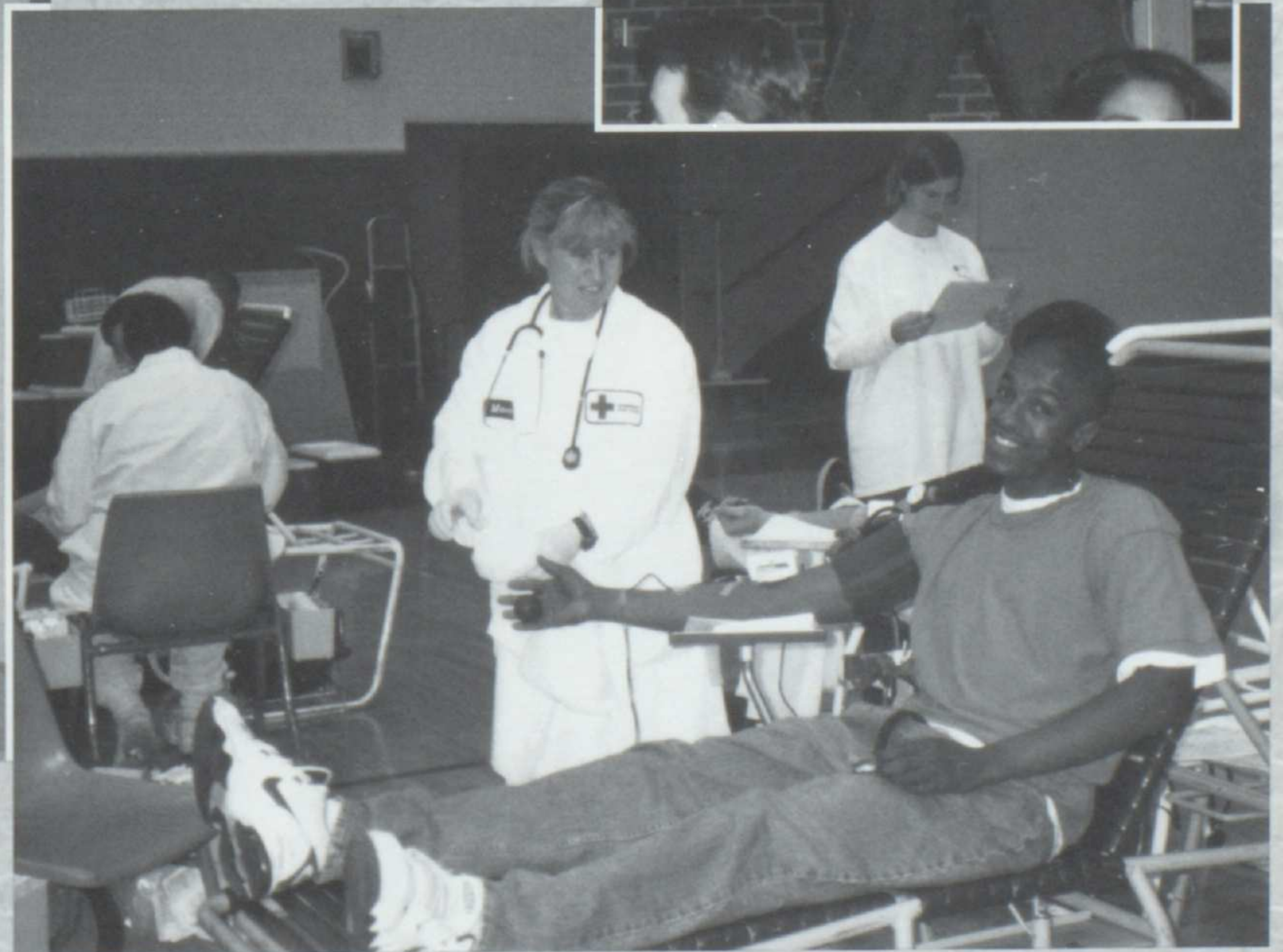

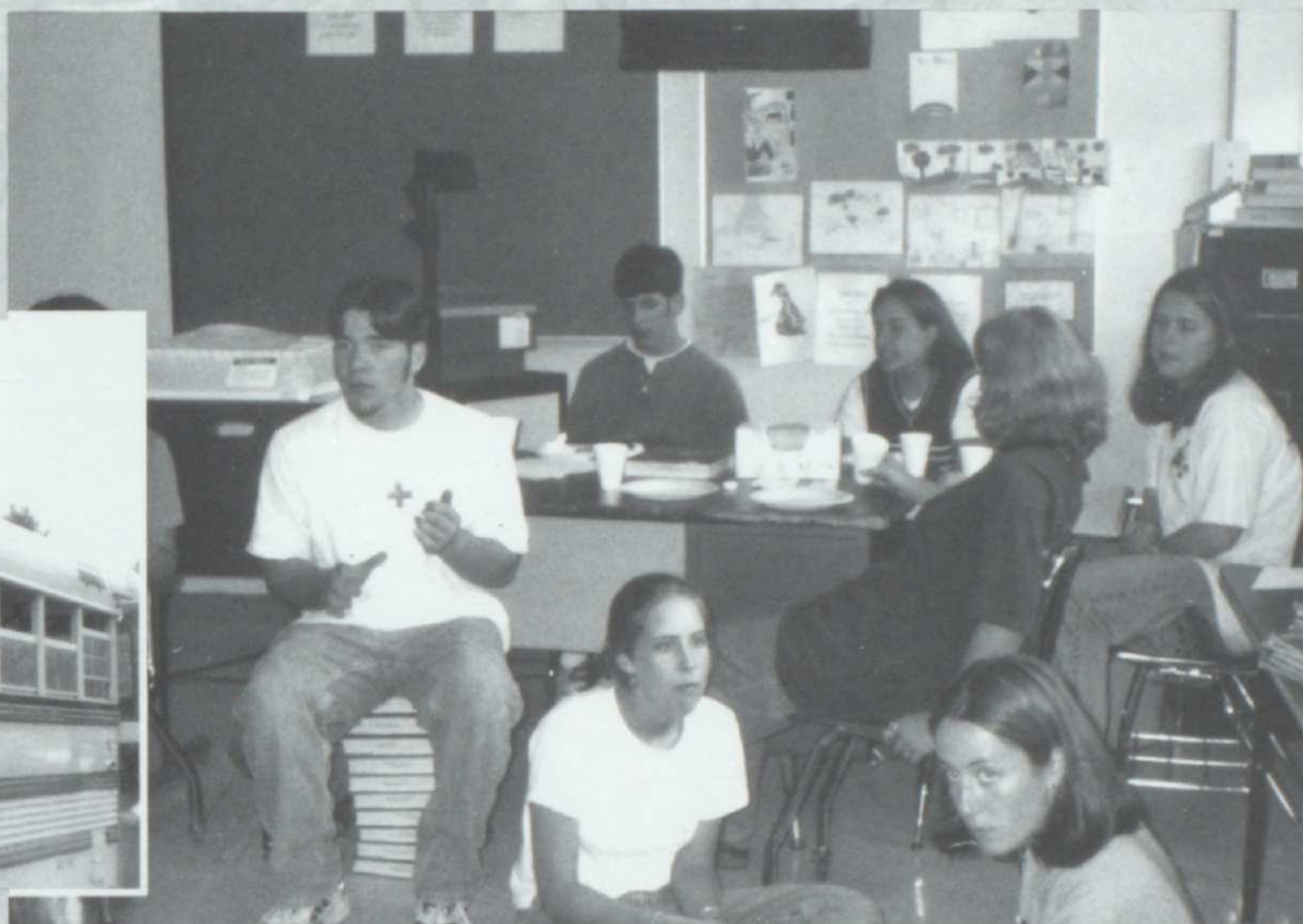

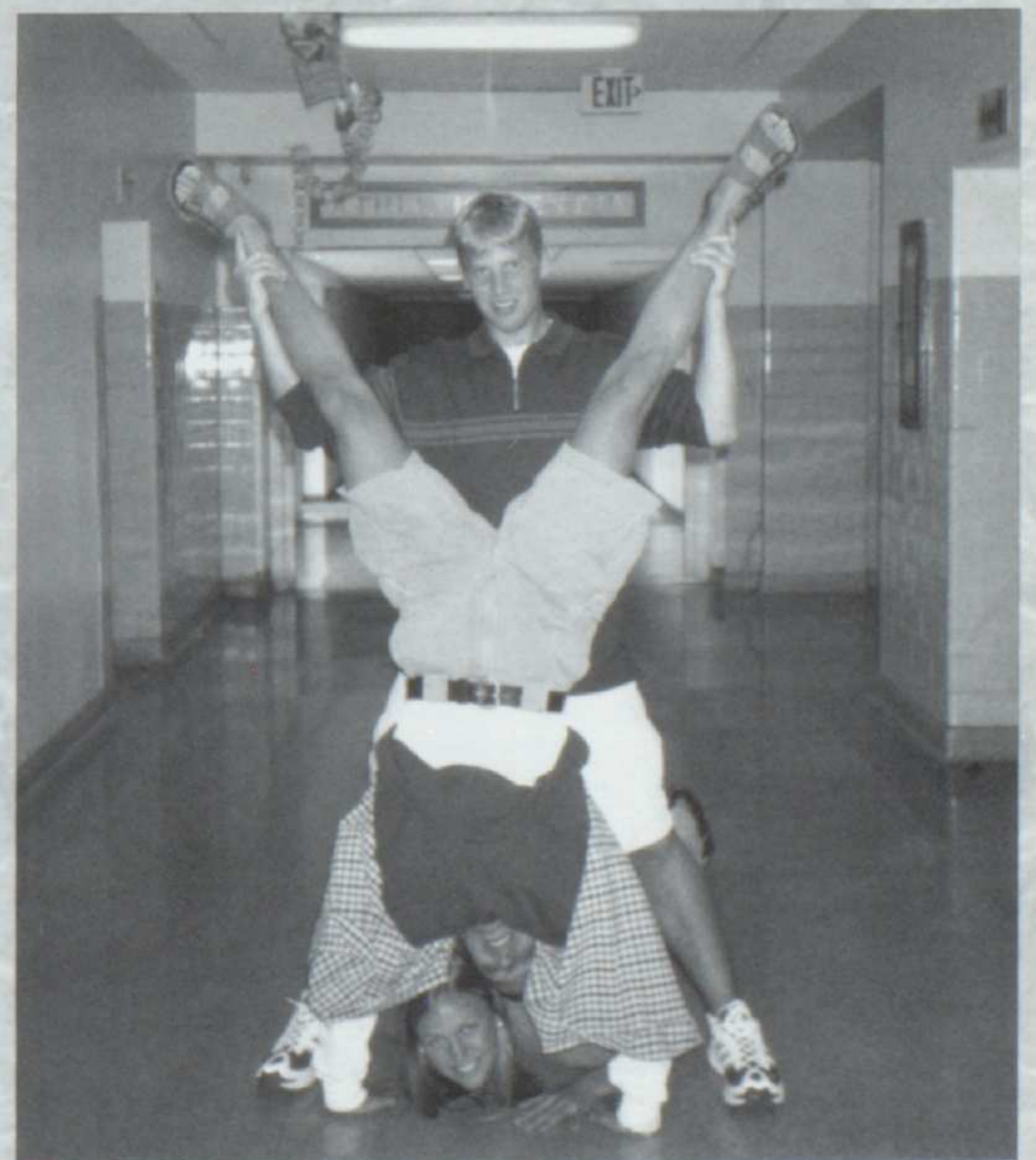

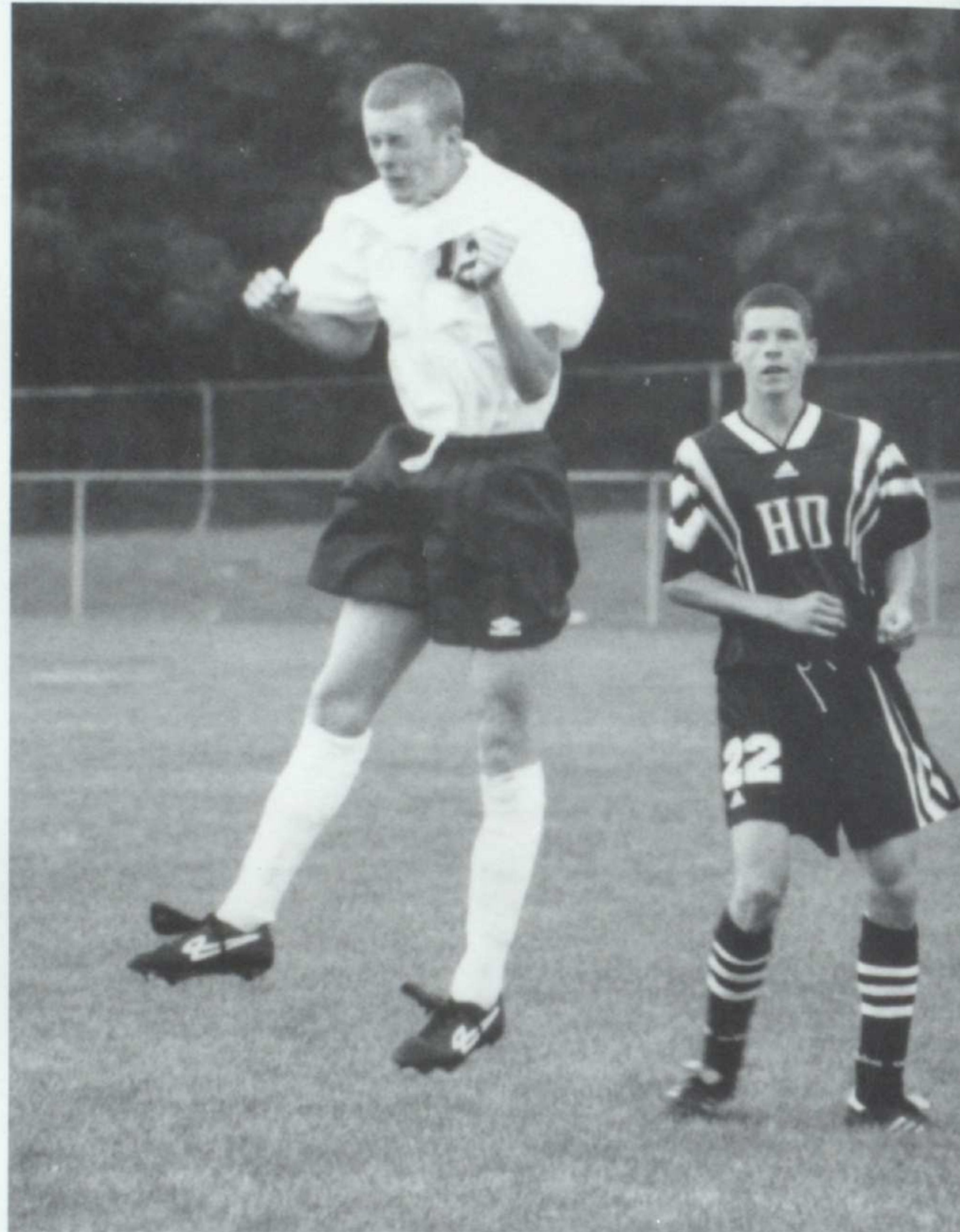
BOYS SOCCER

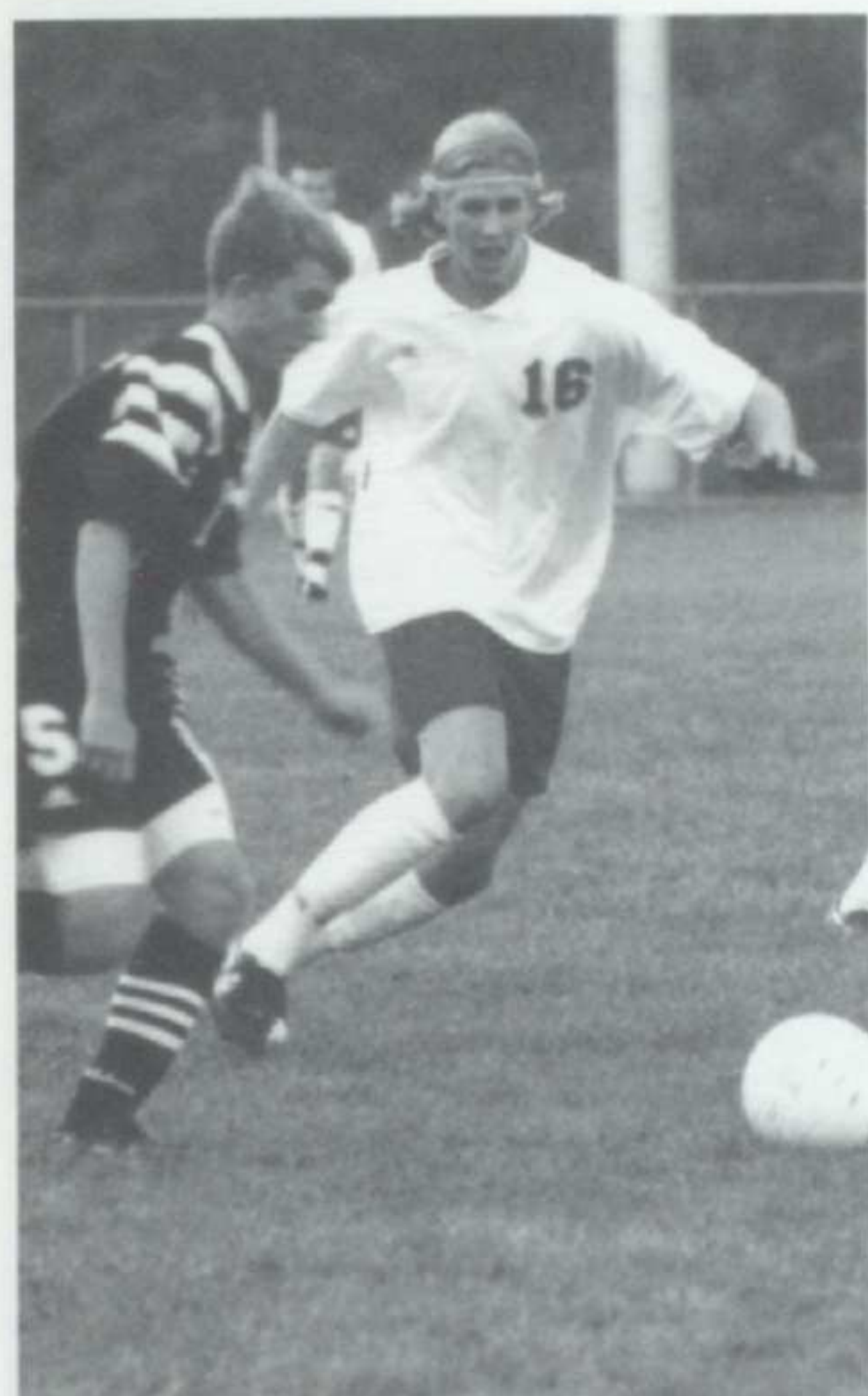

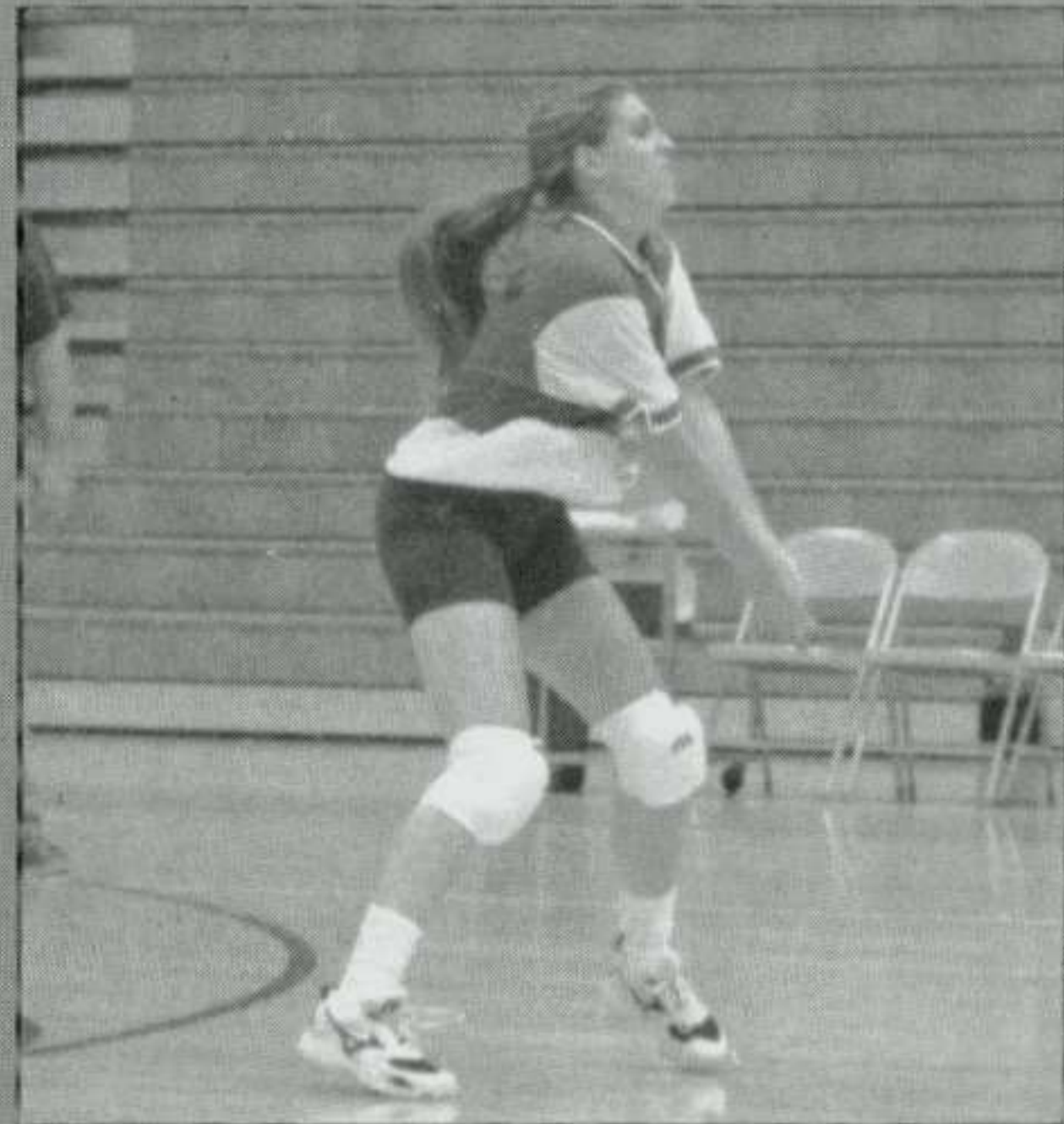

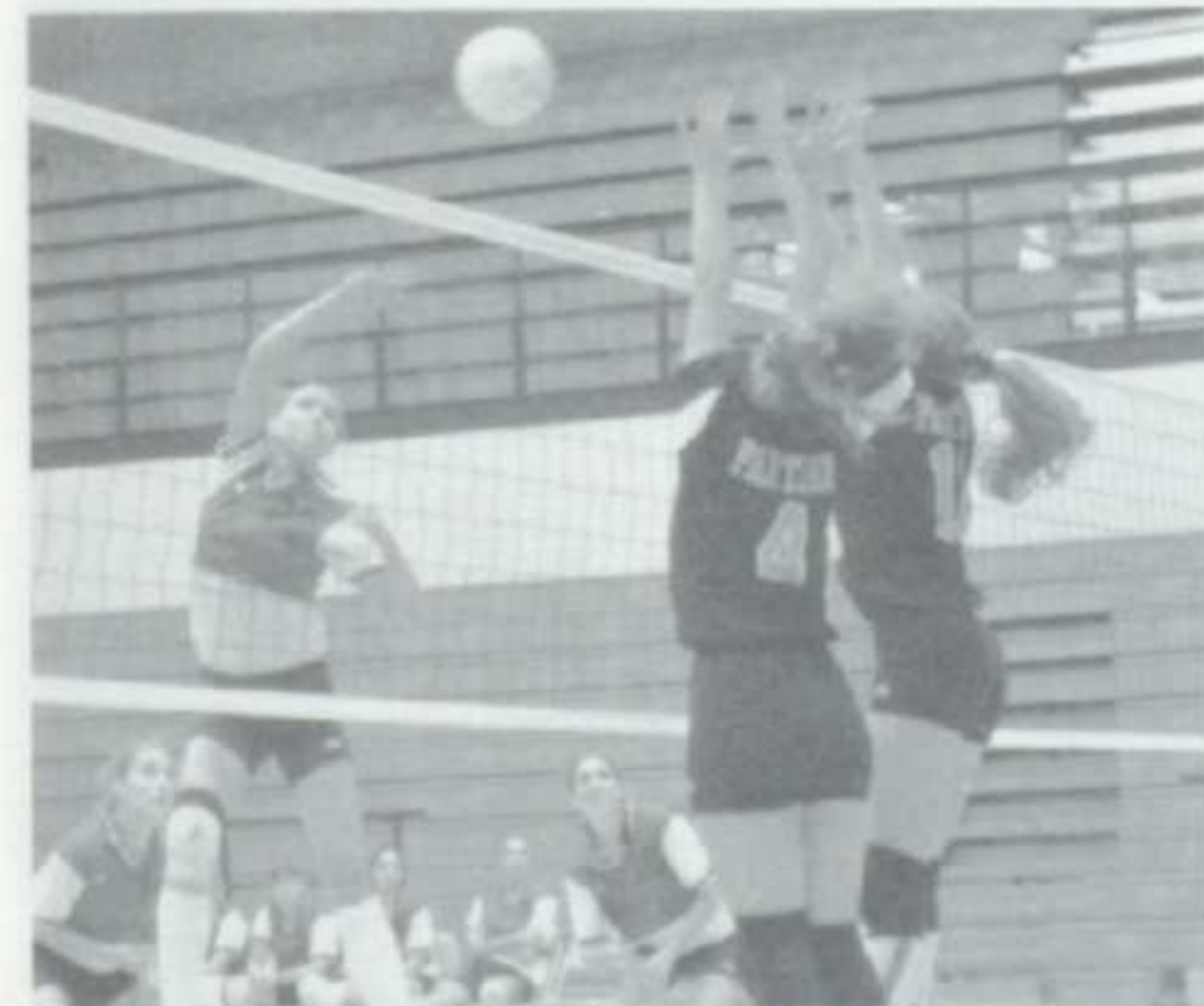

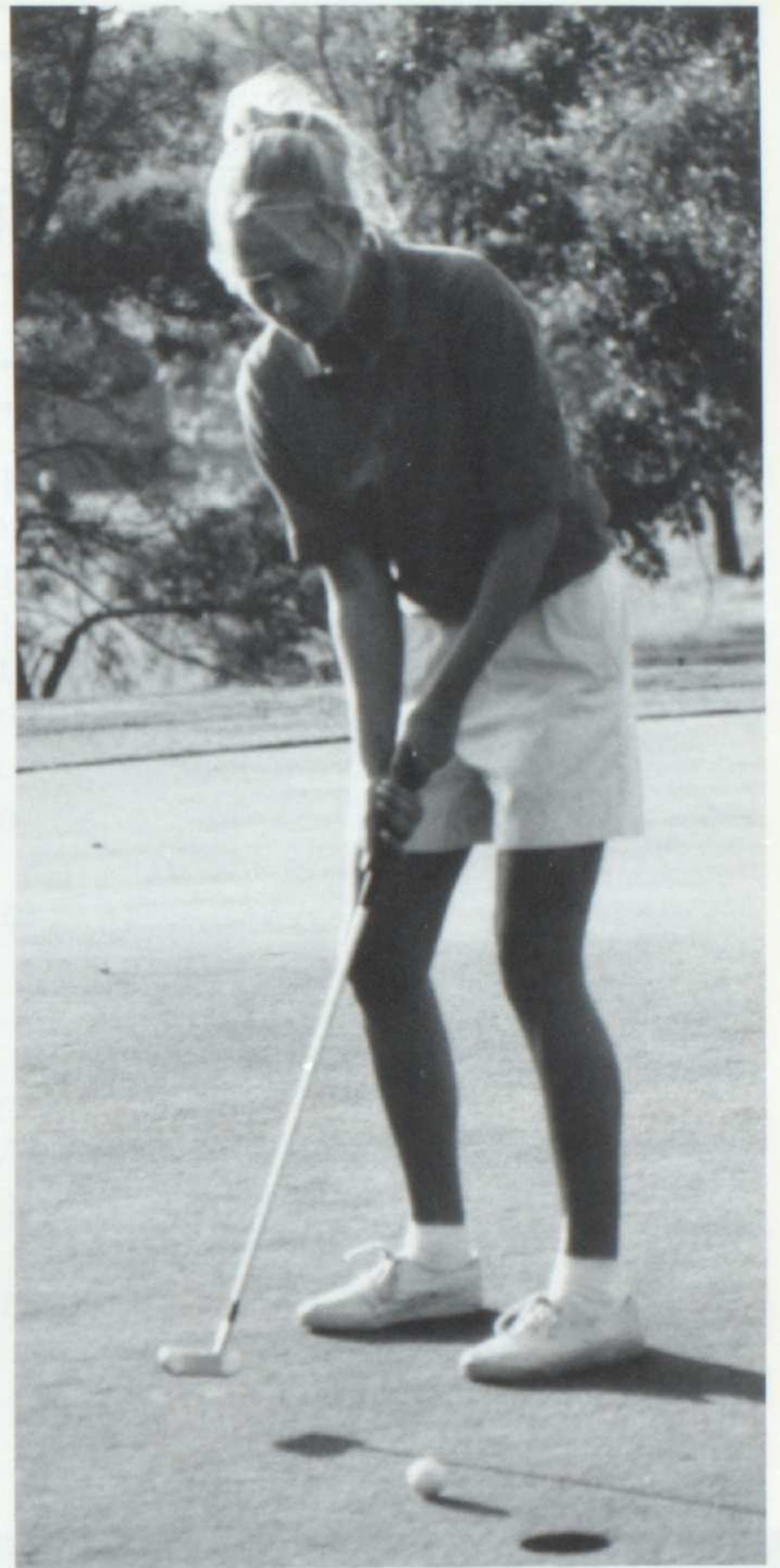

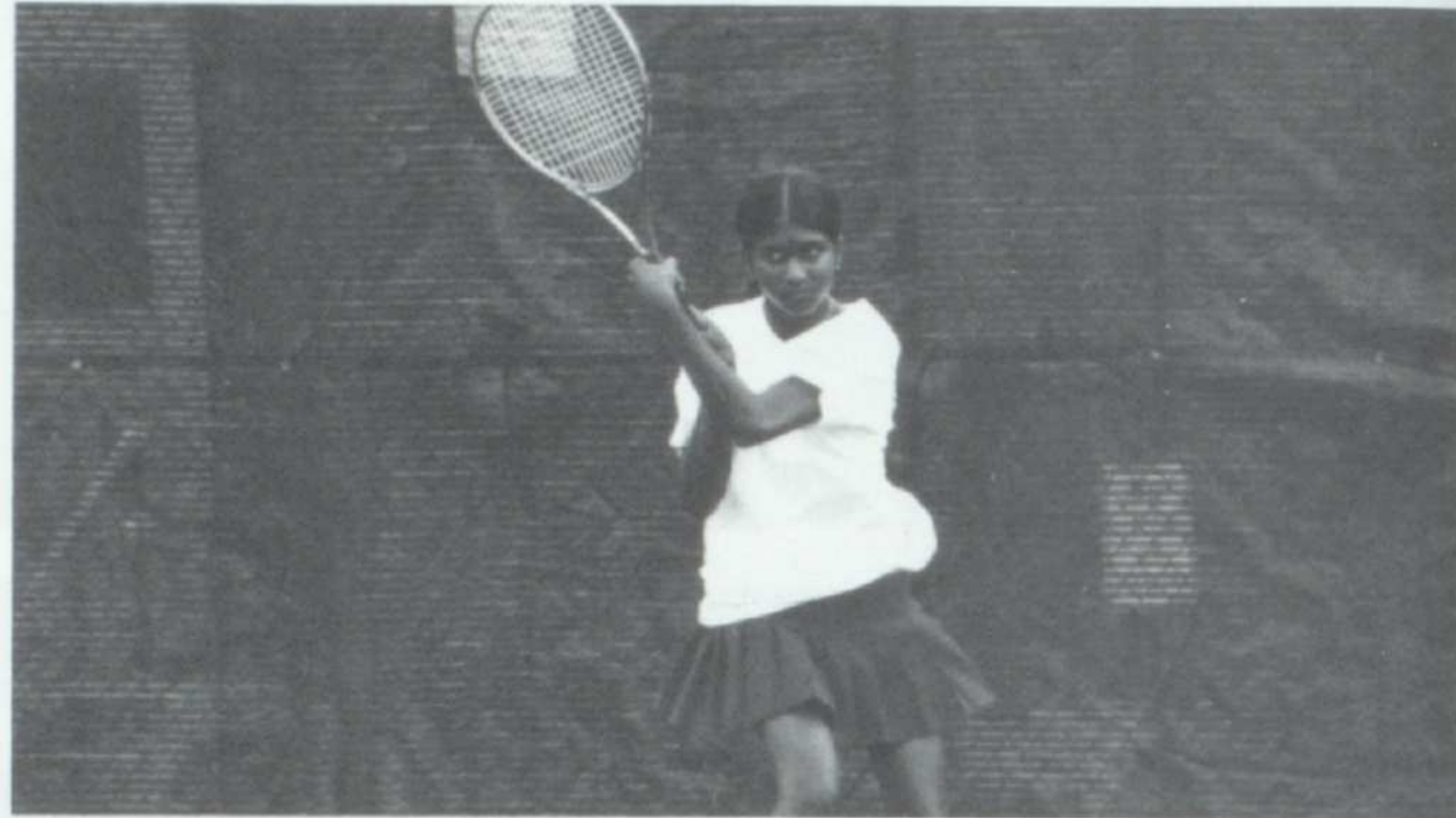

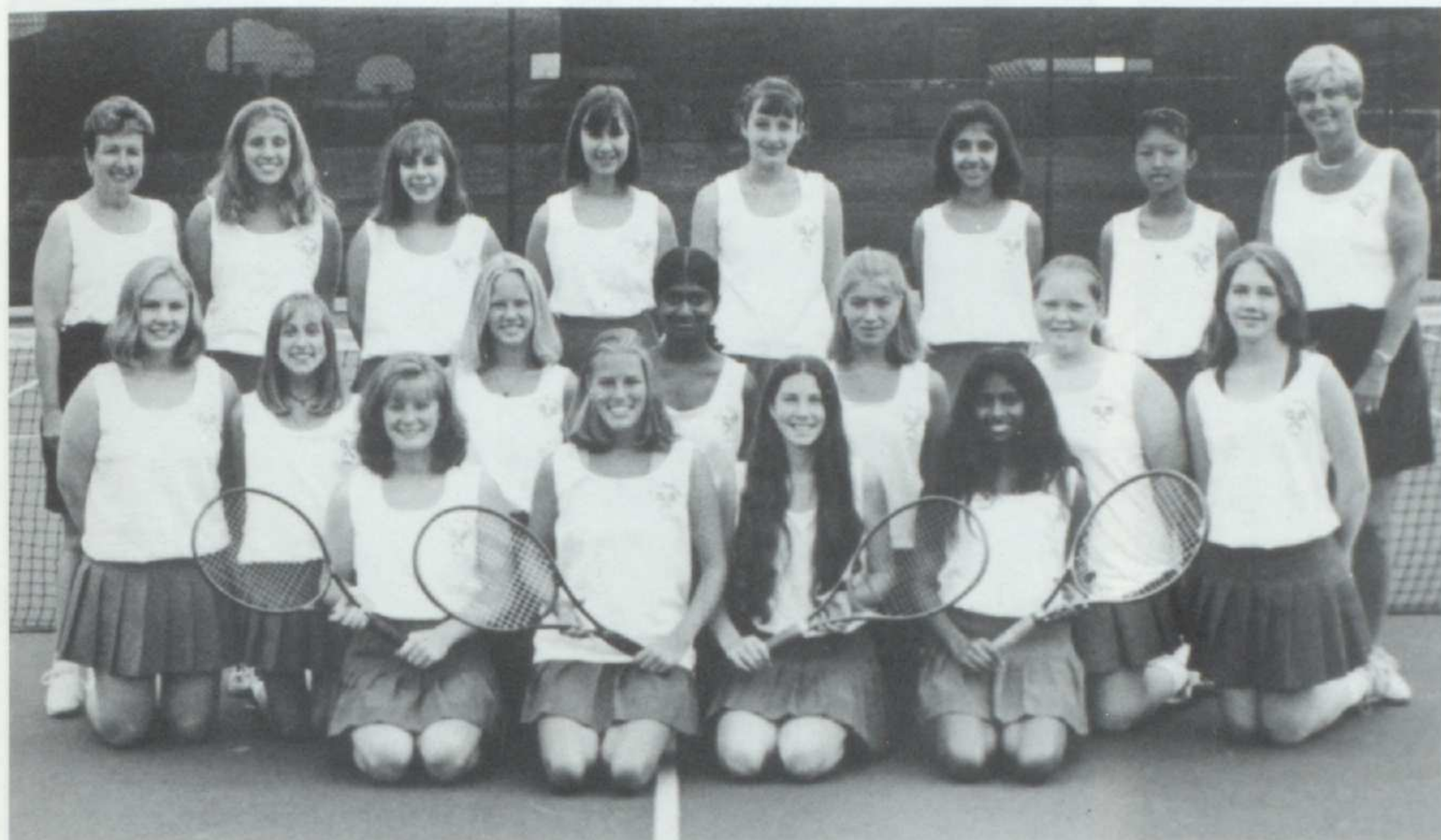

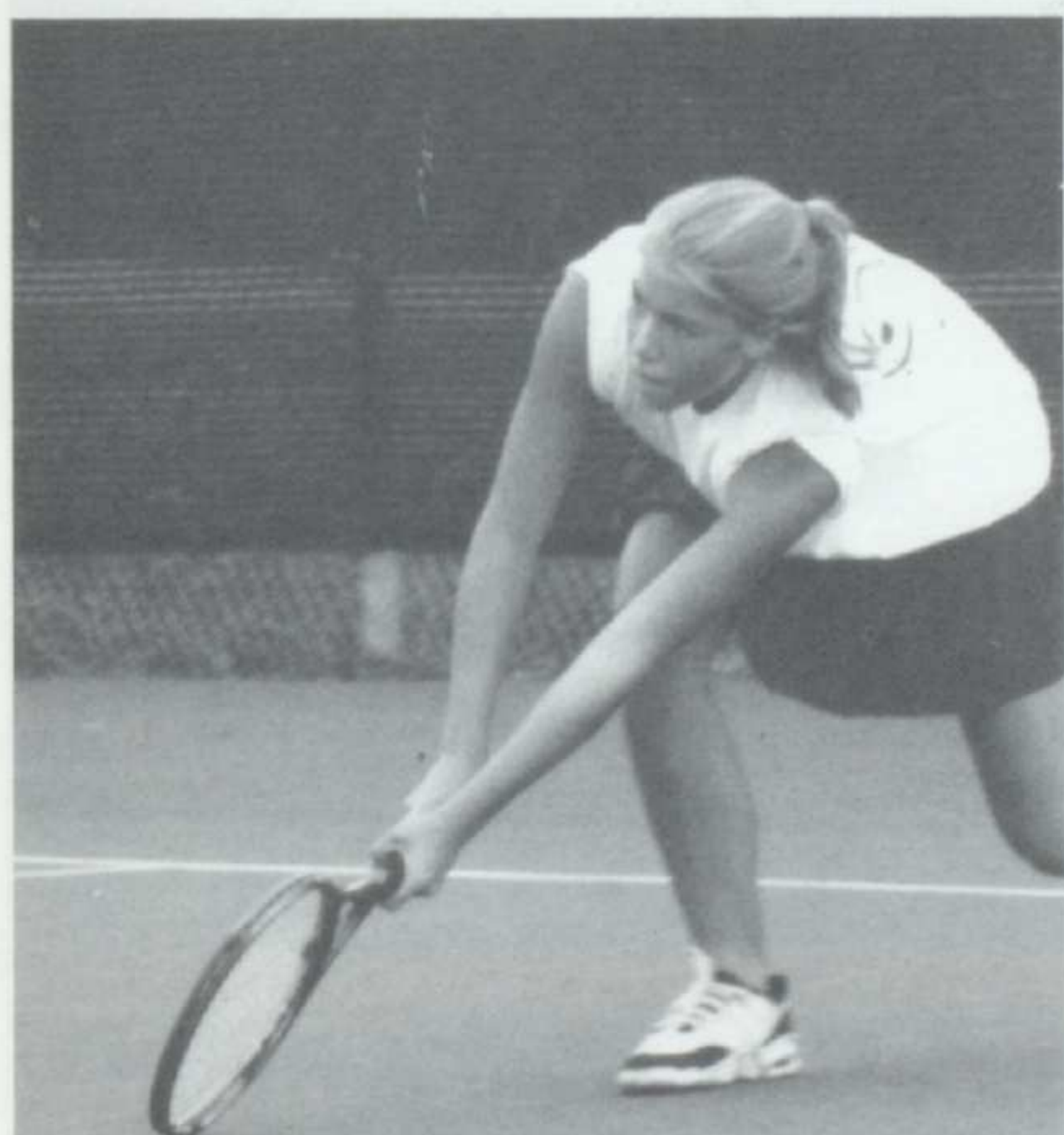

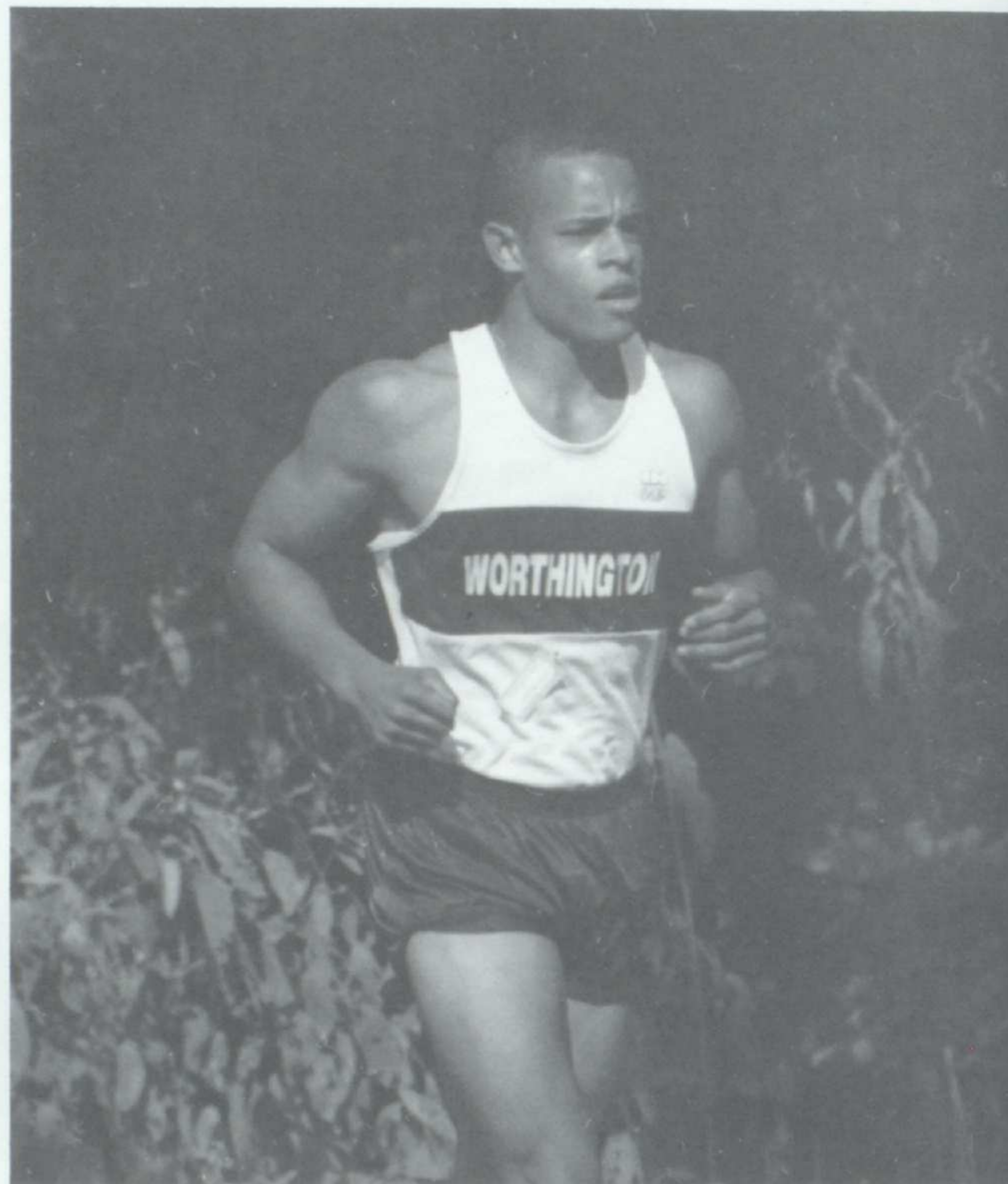

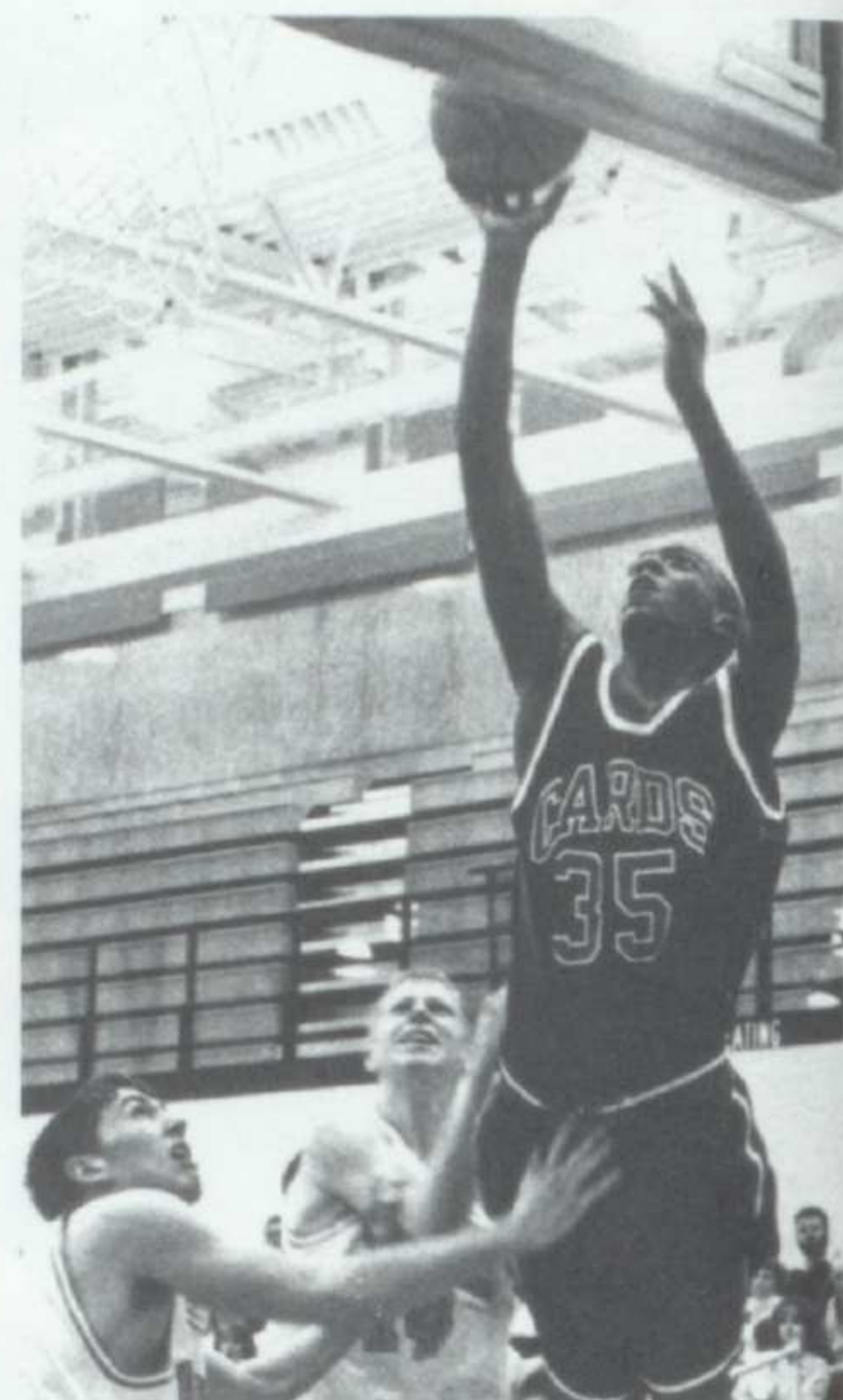
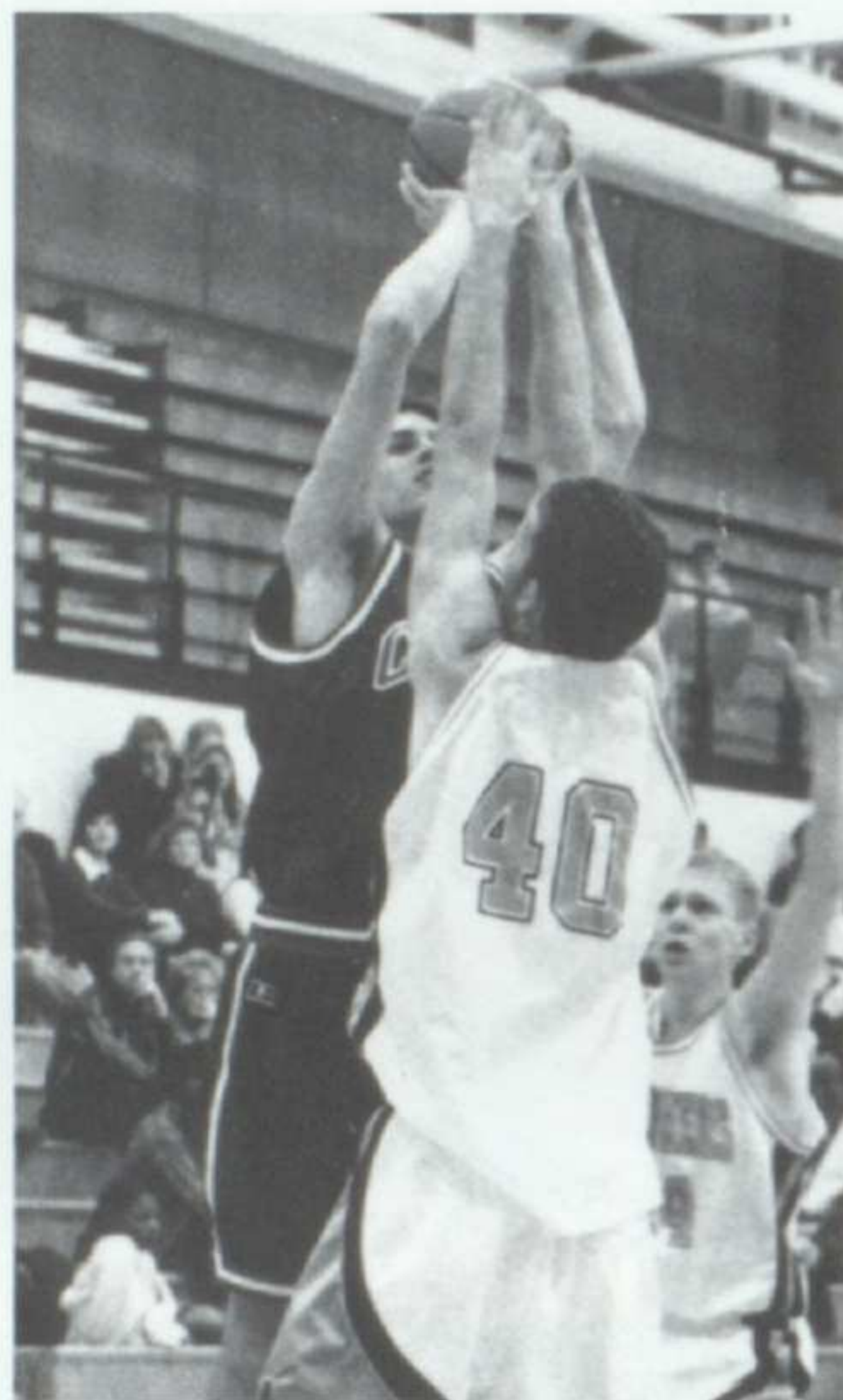
BOYS BASKETBALL

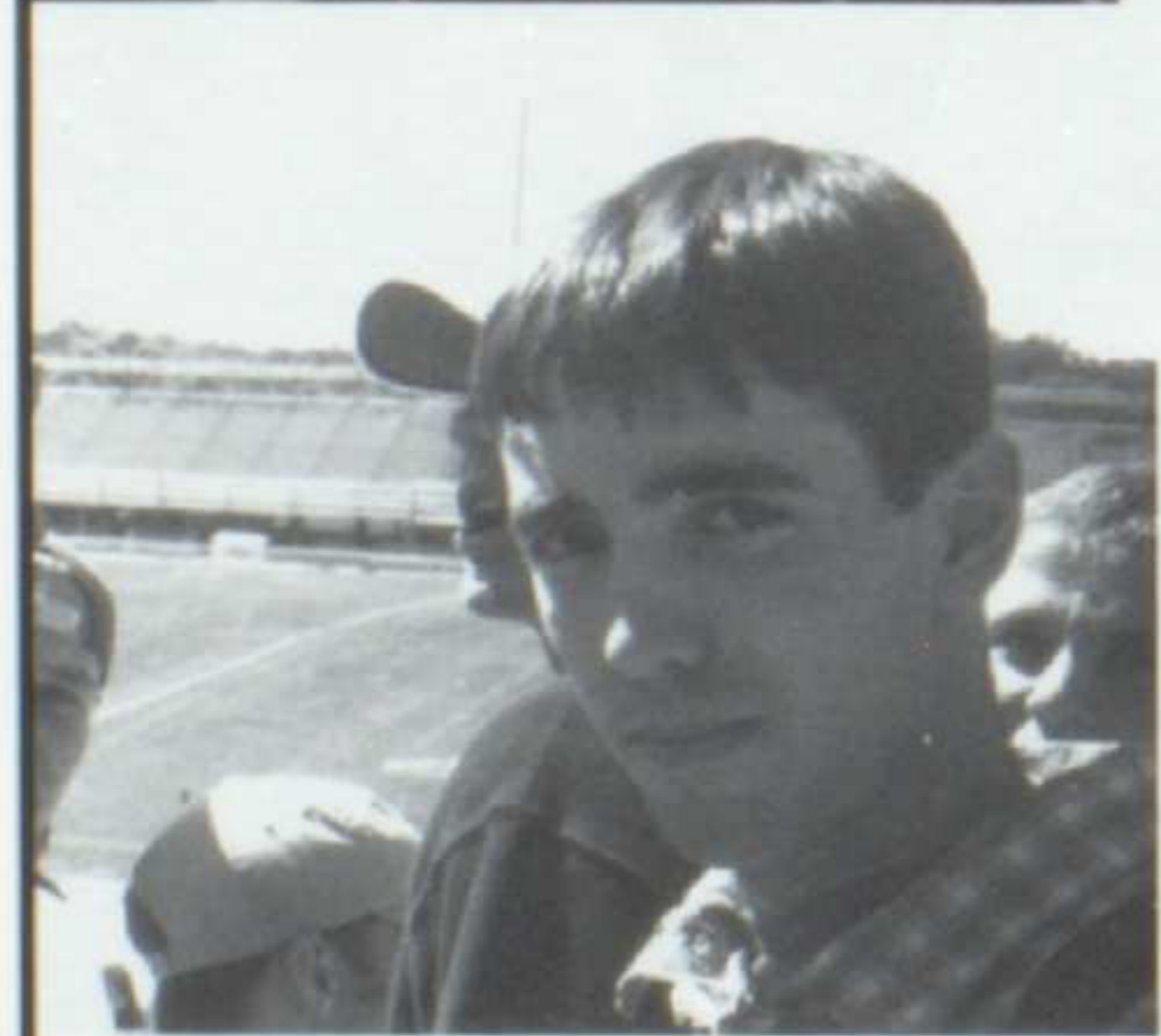

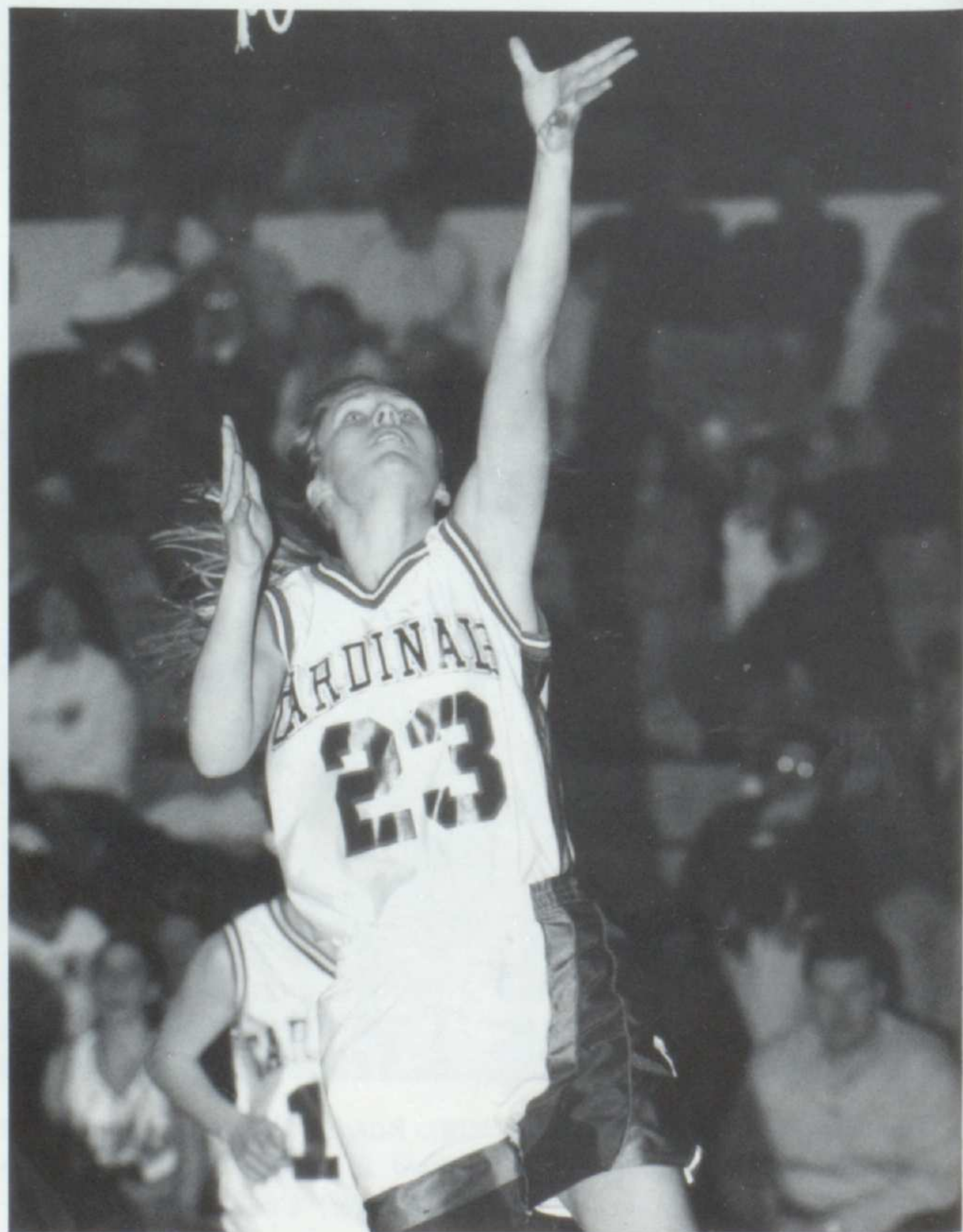
GIRLS BASKETBALL

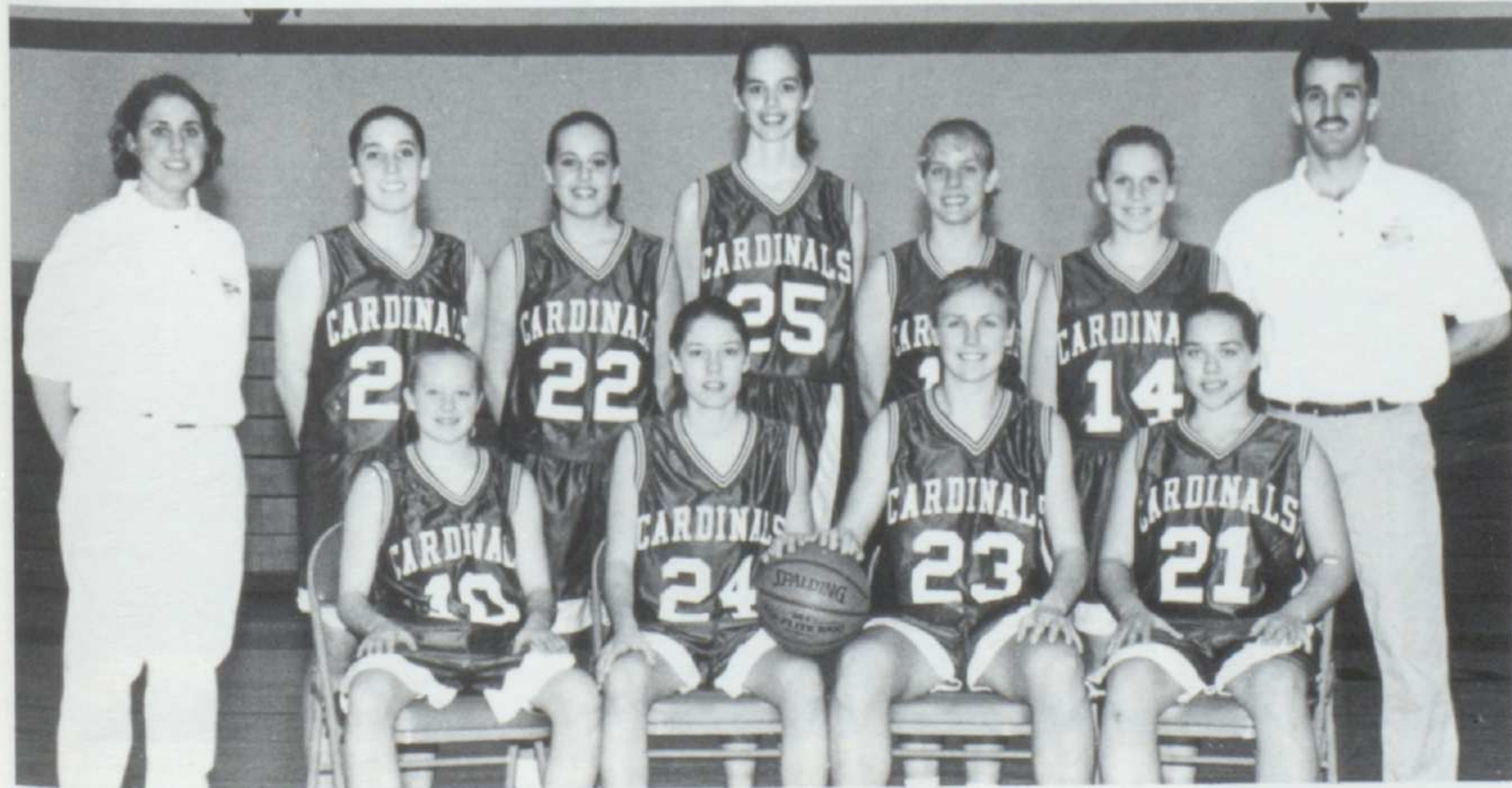

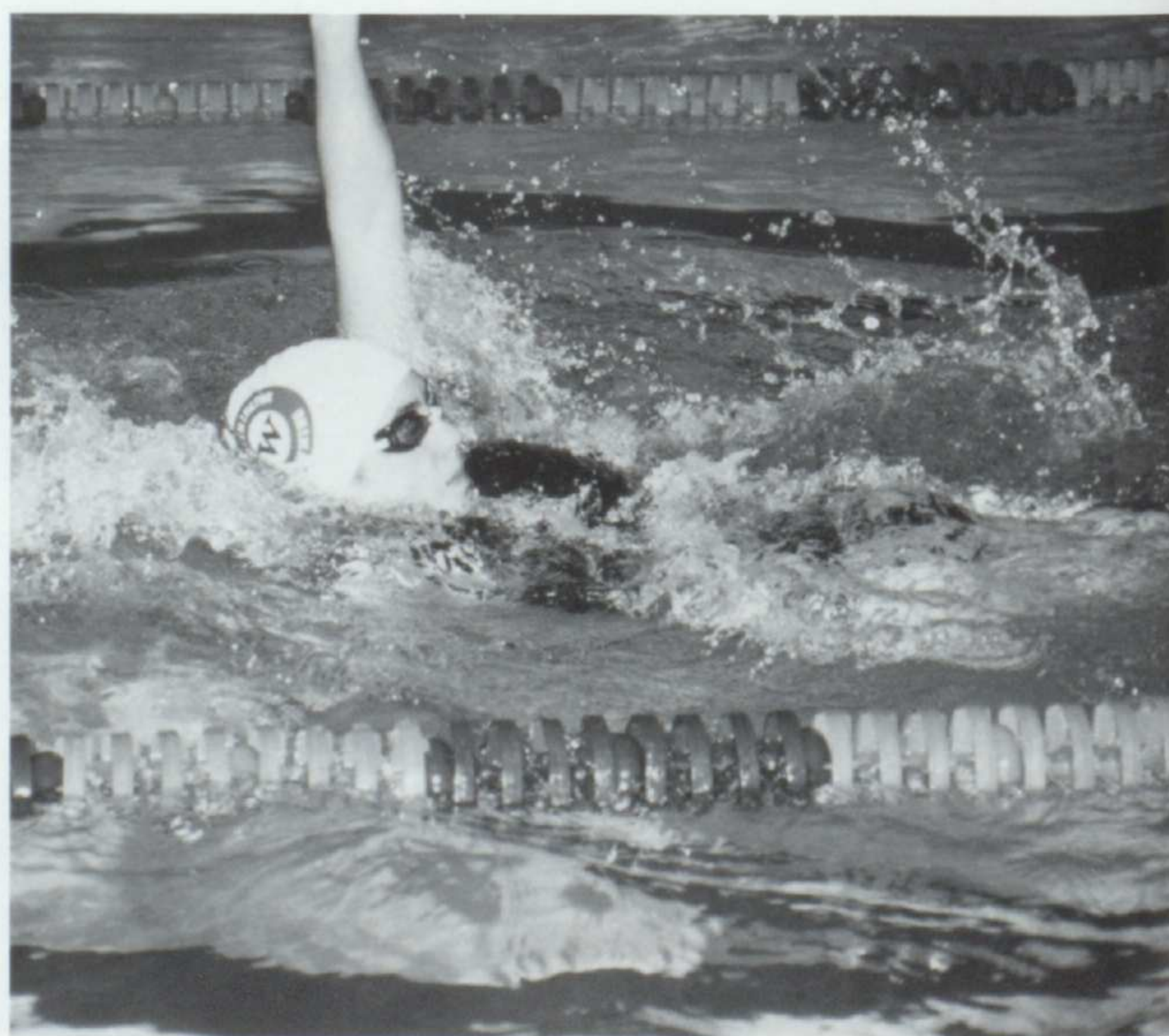

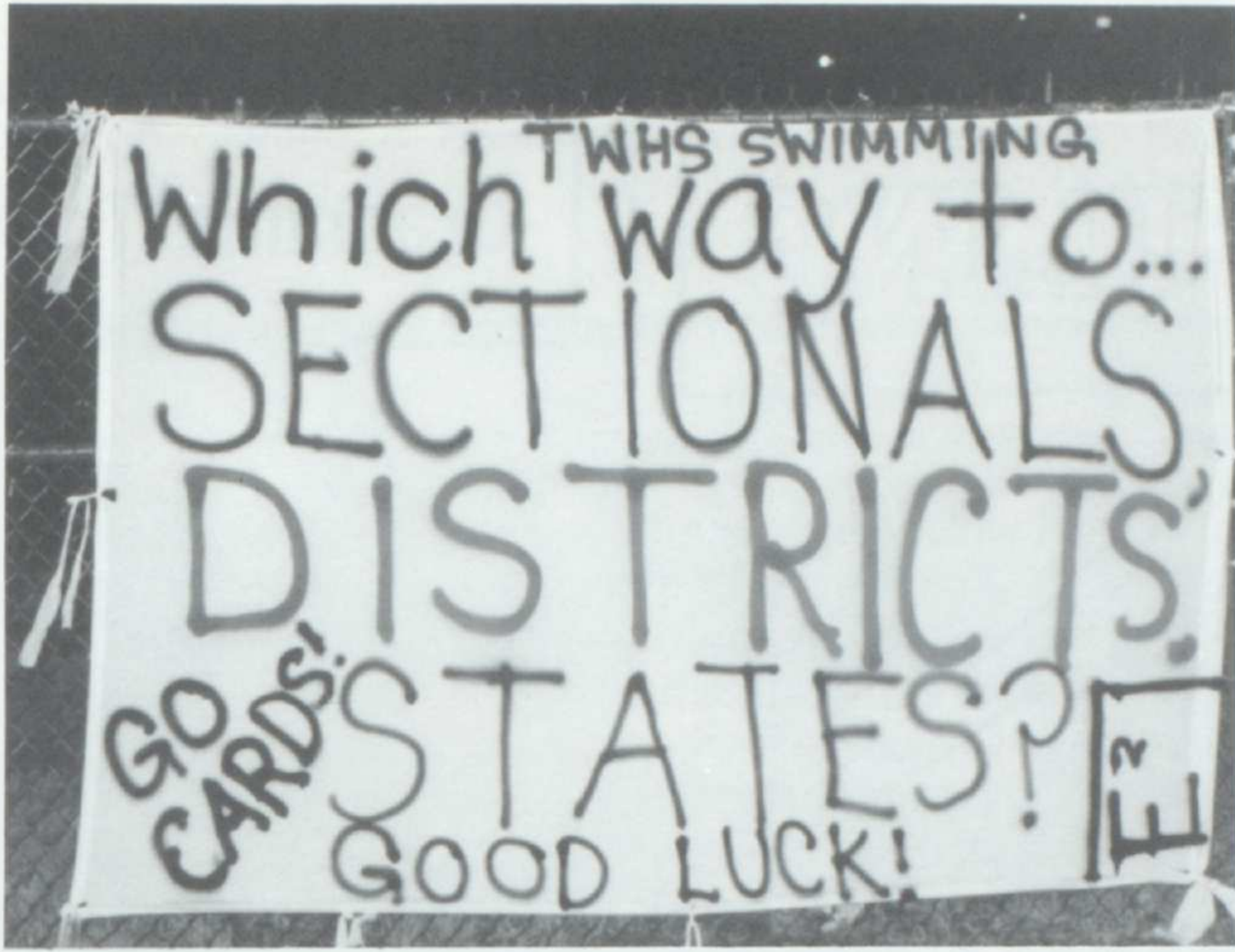

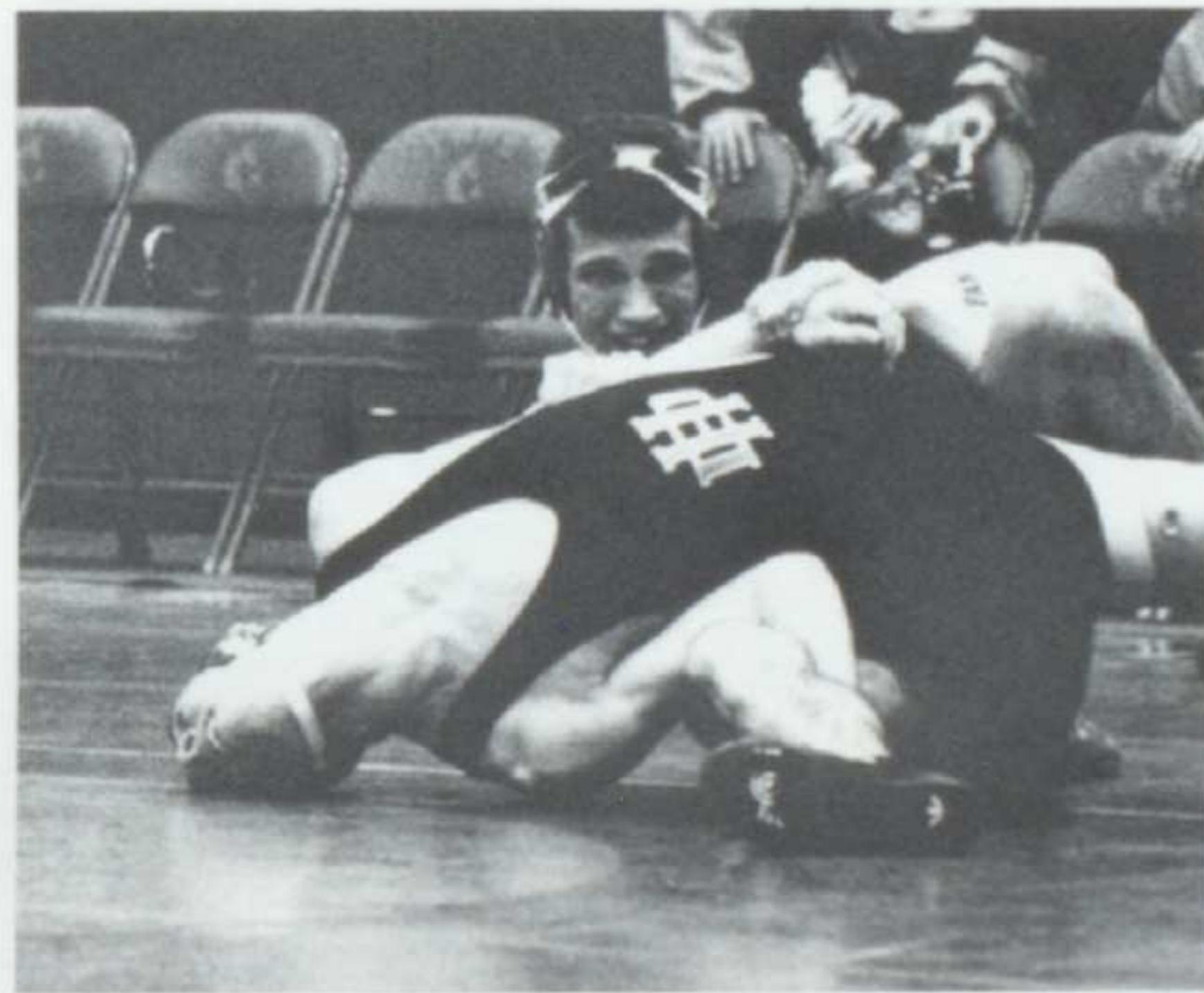

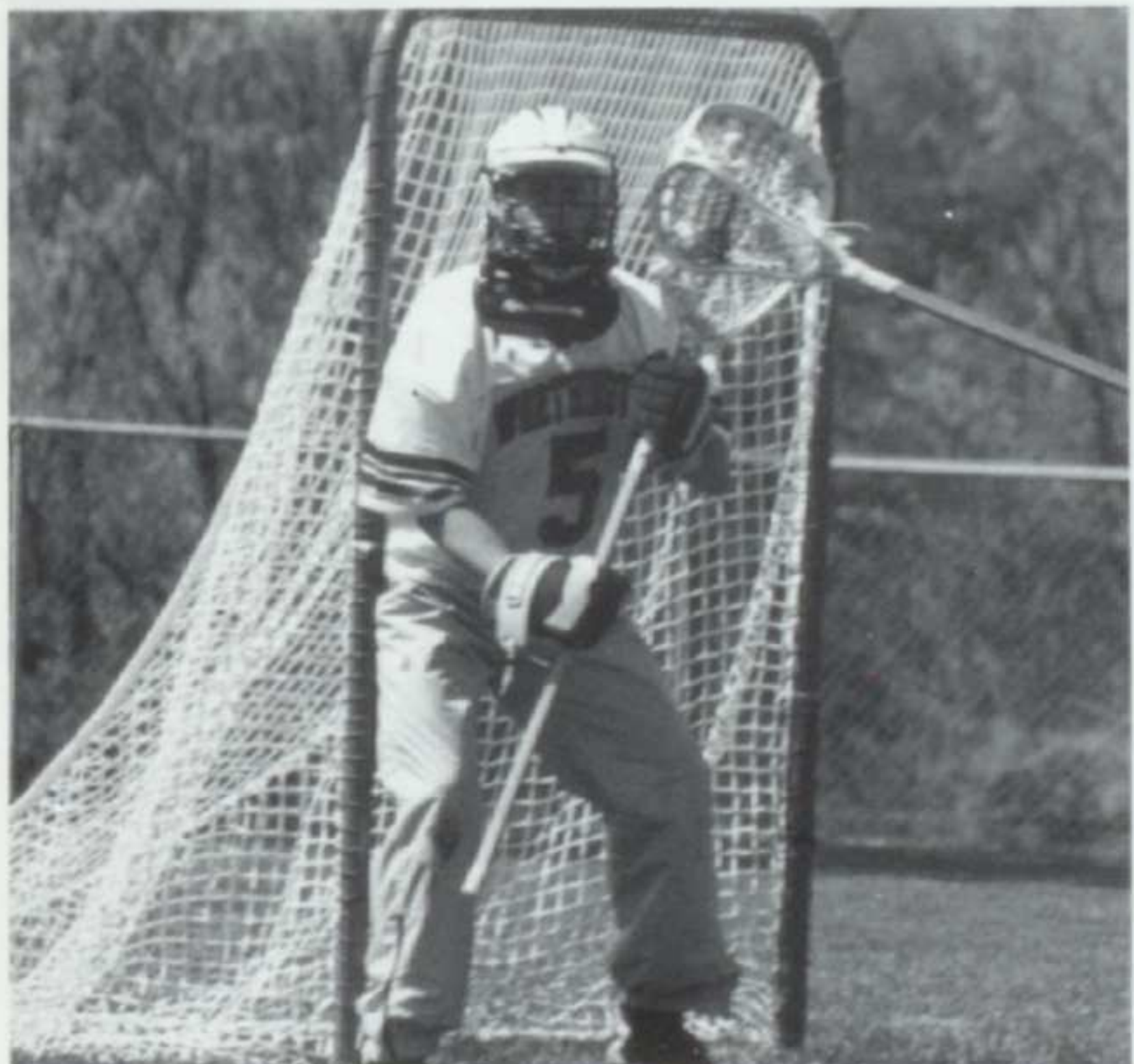

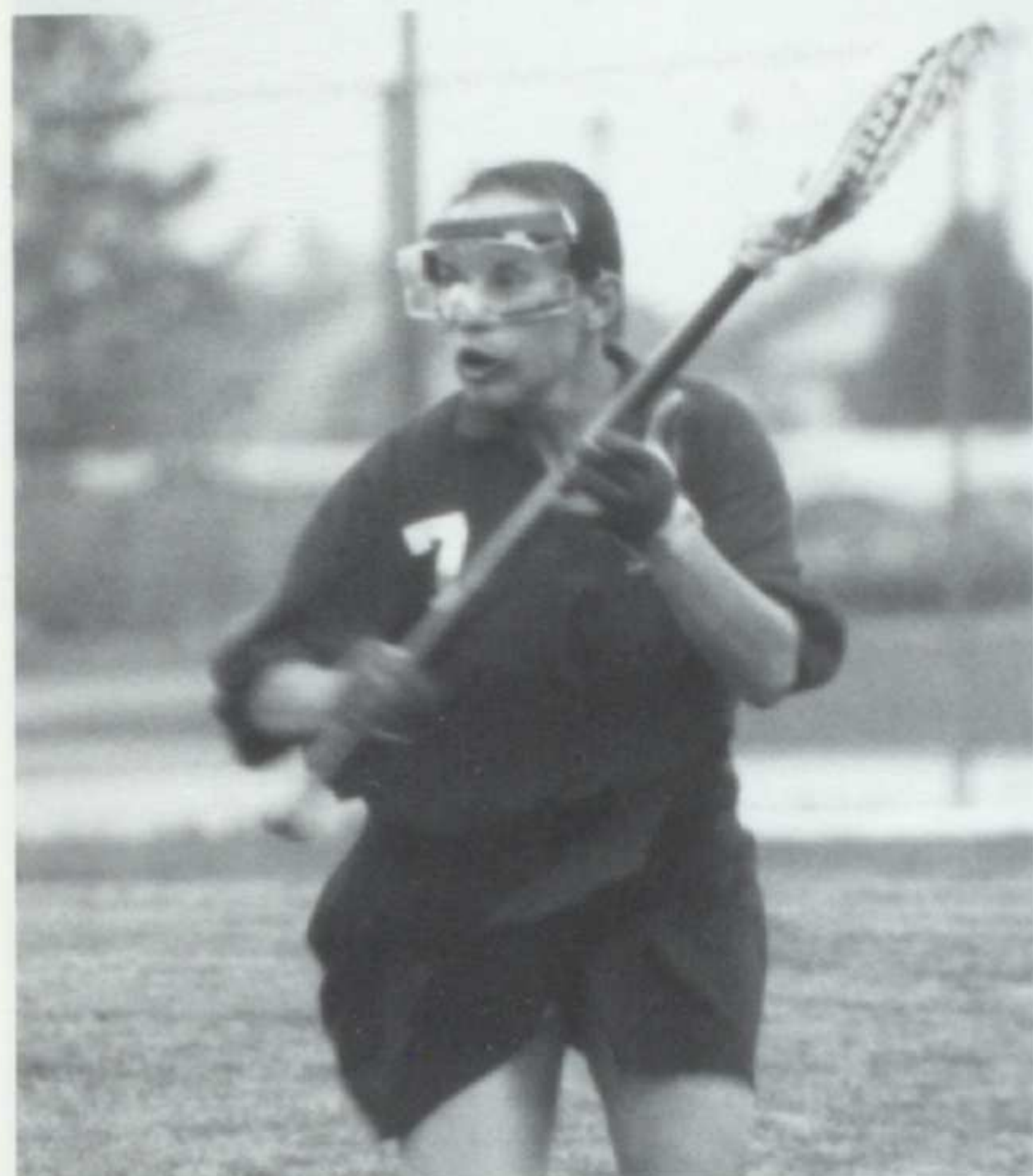

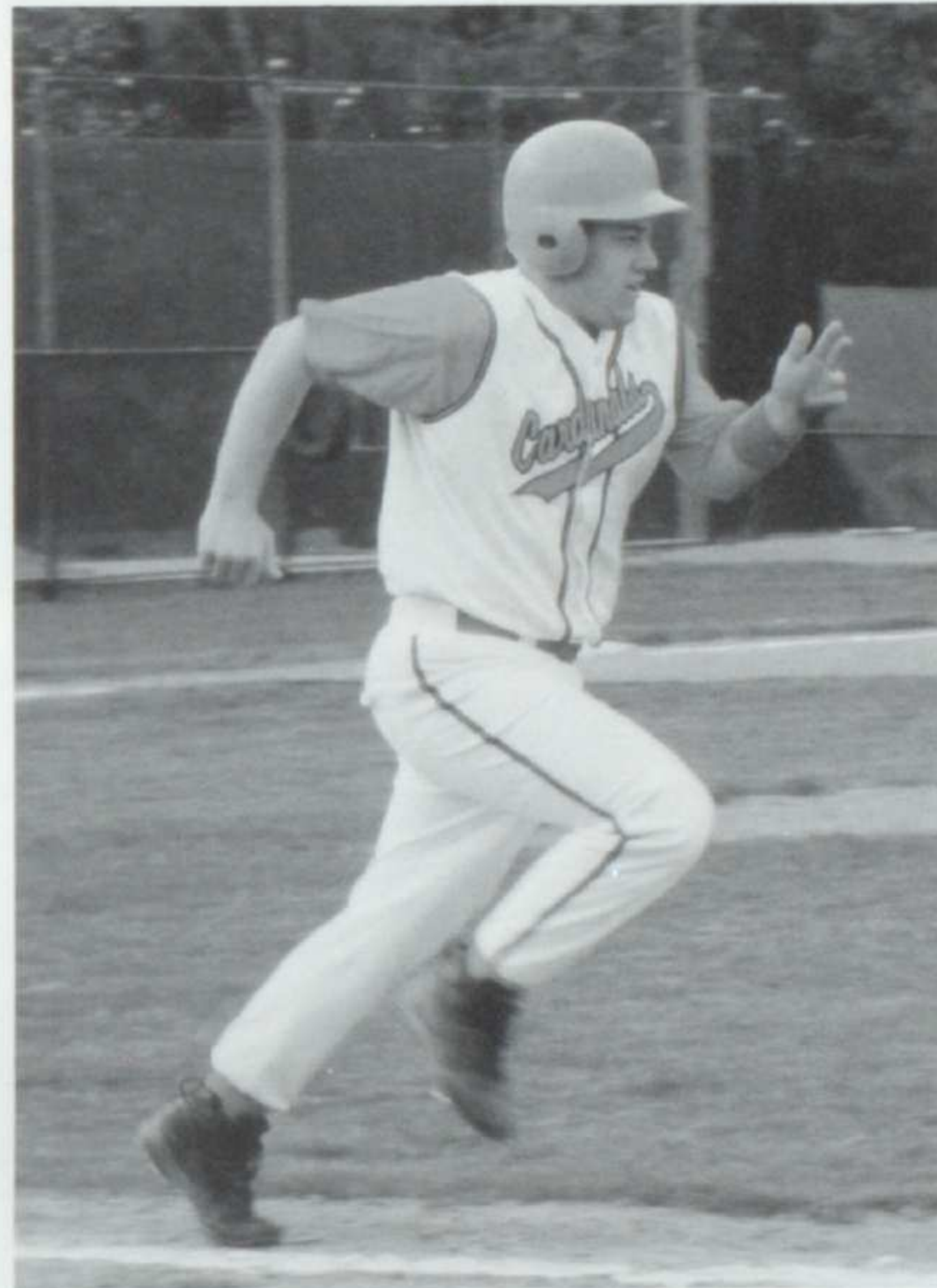

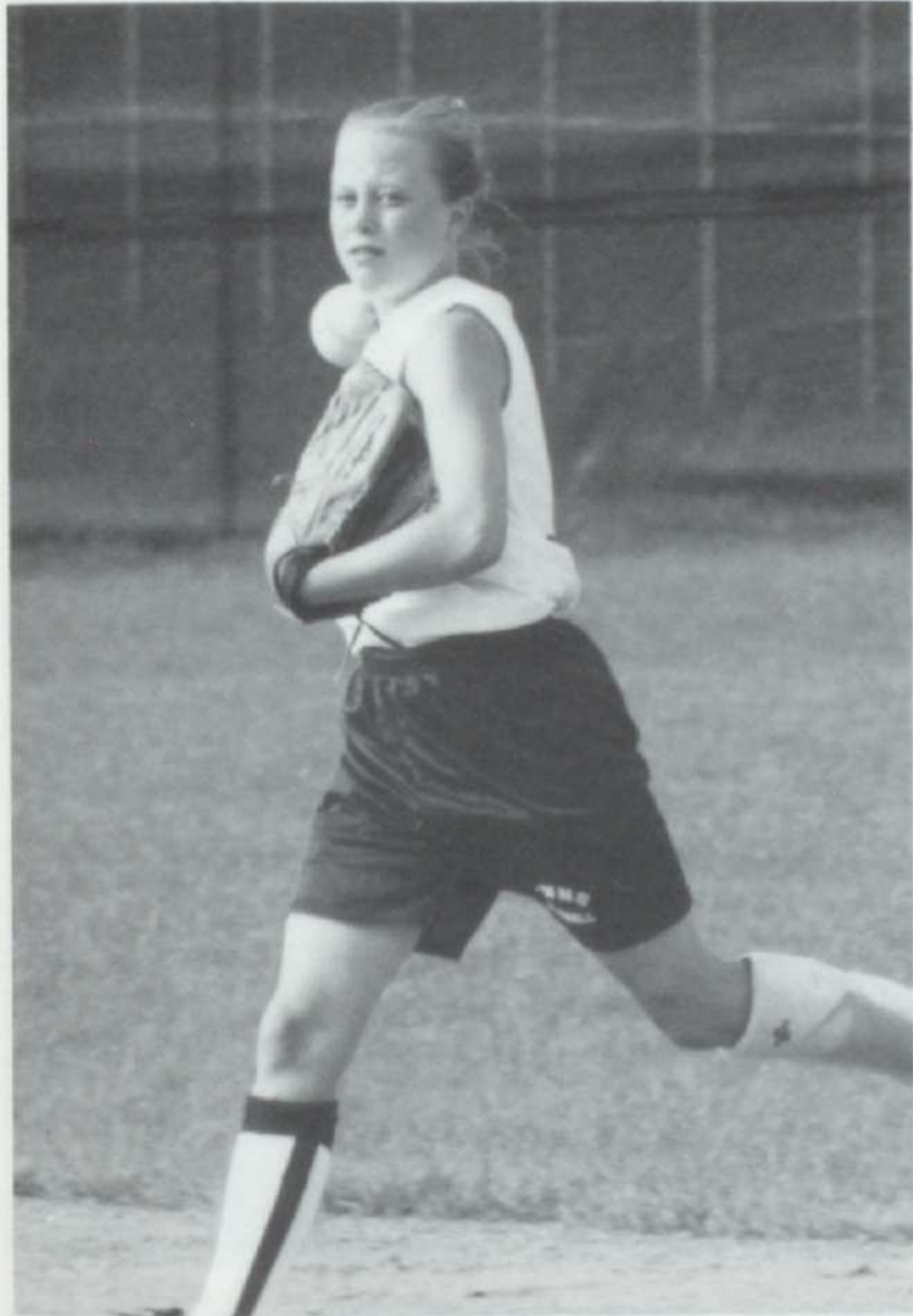

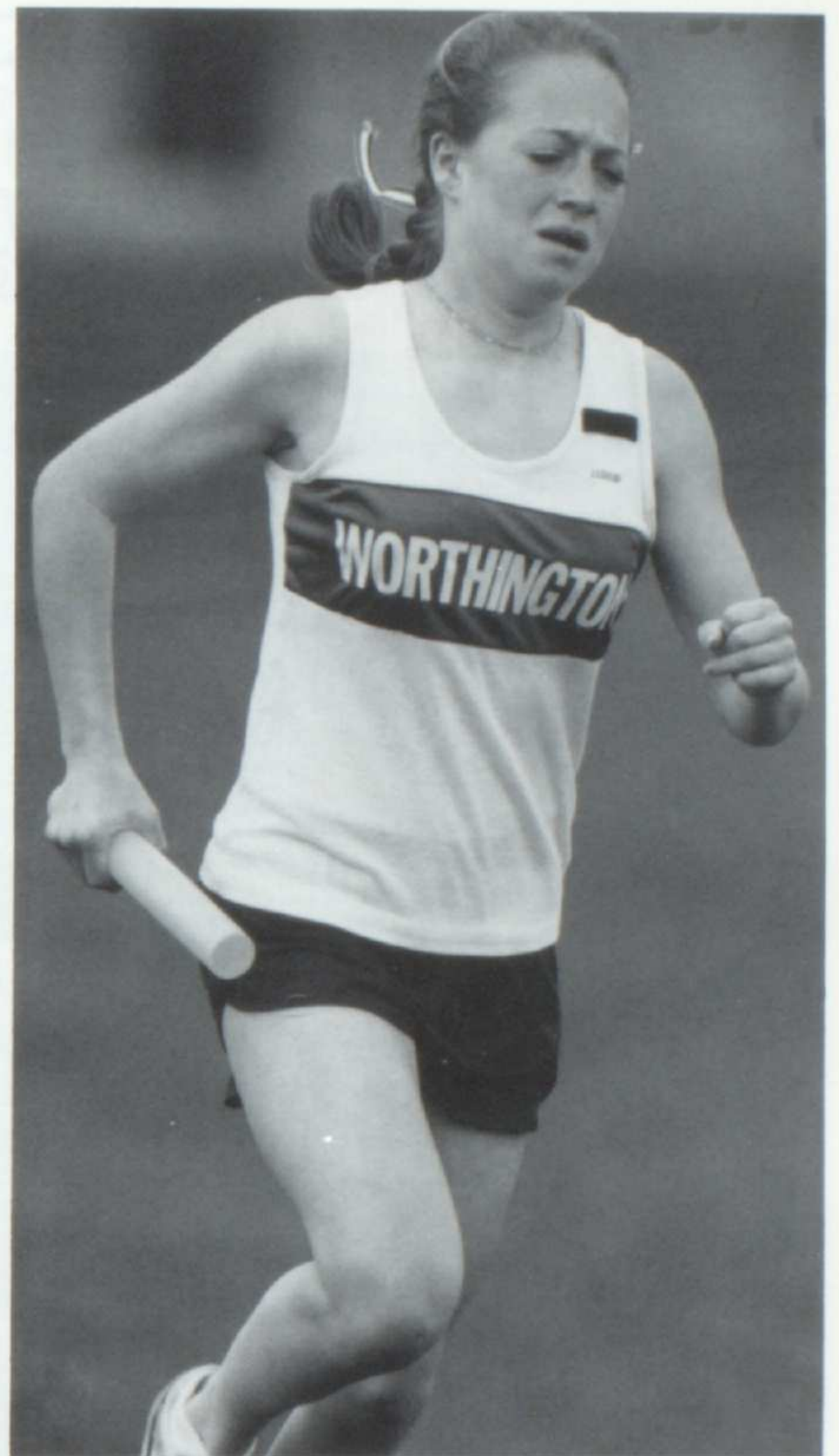

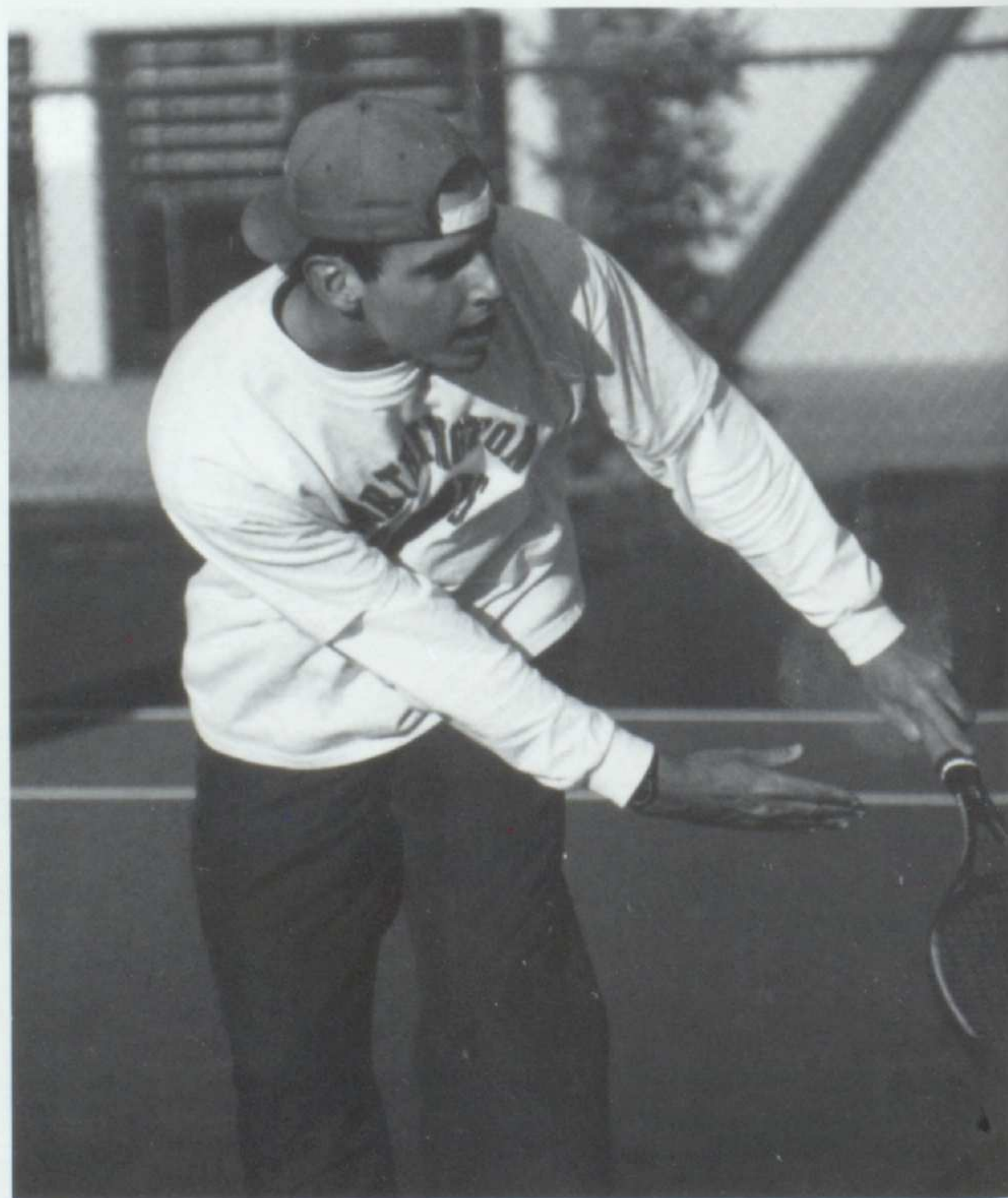

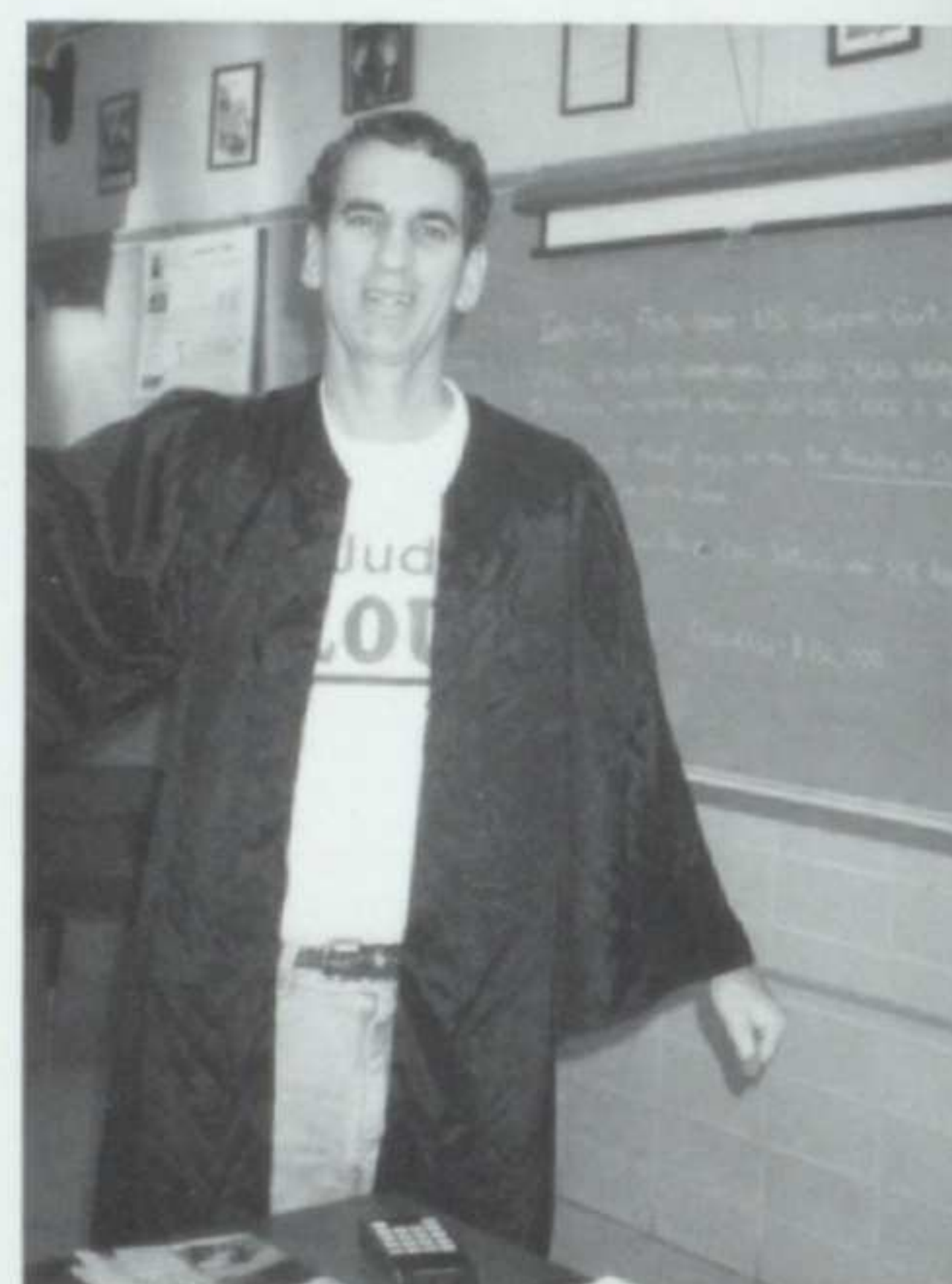

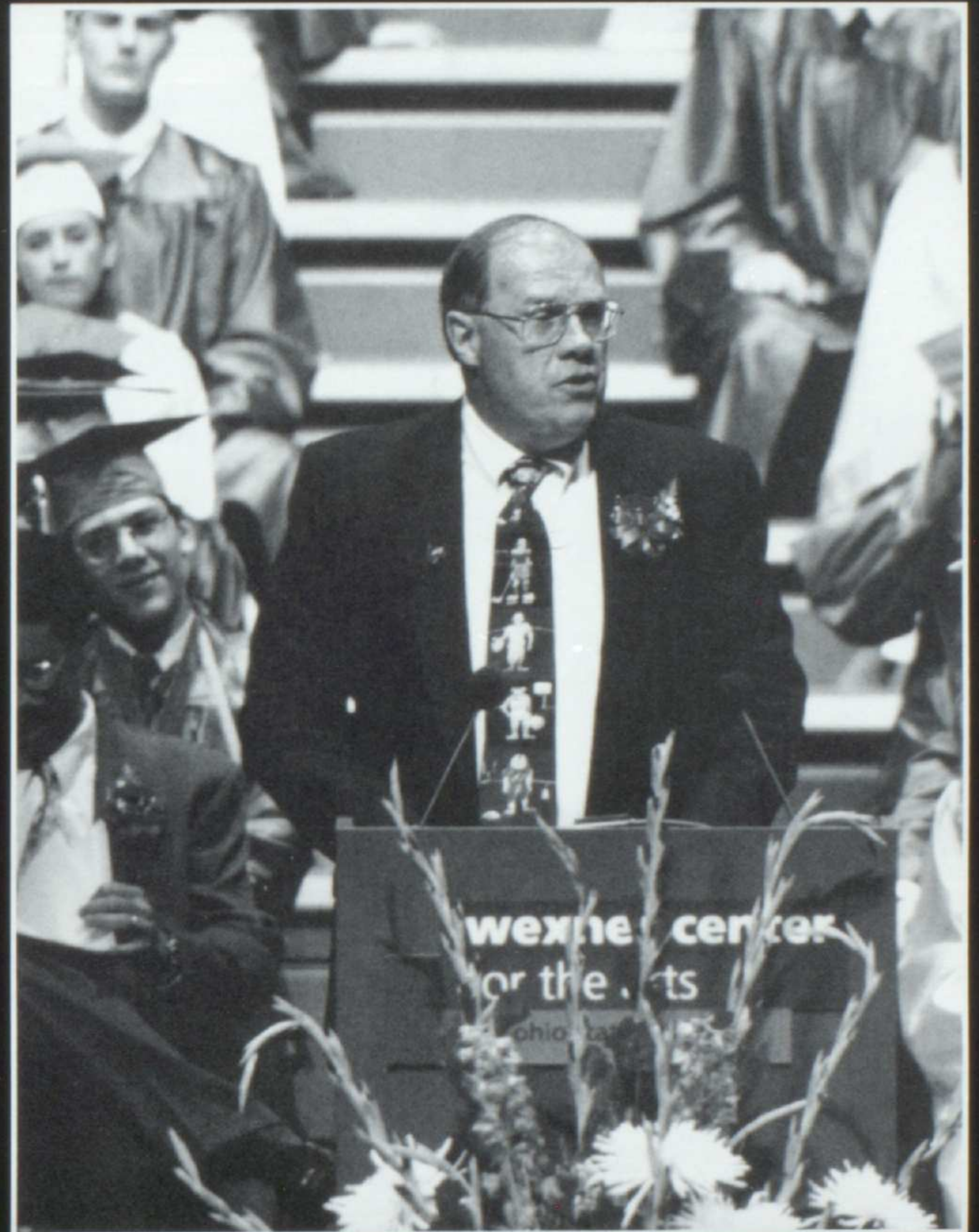

Linworth

The Linworth Alternative Program (AP) is a hidden place. It is not only removed from Thomas Worthington's view, located up the road at 2075 Dublin-Granville, but it is also camouflaged by rumors. No, not everyone at the AP wears black and smokes. No, Linworth is not a school for delinquents. No, AP students are not exempt from homework. Linworthians go through a love/hate process with these misconceptions, sometimes appreciating their uniqueness, and sometimes frustrated by ignorance about this unique program.

The Linworth campus houses about 180 students from Thomas and Kilbourne and 10 staff members. Linworth provides a comfortable learning environment for students, and it gives them the option to pursue further interests. The main focus of this alternative campus is experiential education. While attending classes at both Linworth and their main campus, students are also involved in independent study, student-run government, student-designed courses, week long internships, and finally, two nine-week internships during the second semester of their senior year, called Walkabout.

The atmosphere of Linworth is relaxed, and the program gives students more freedom than most high schoolers. For example, there are no study halls; students can plan their free time as they wish. Many choose to gather in the Big Room, the central area of the school, for card games, guitar practicing, or catching up on sleep. Teachers are addressed by their first names. Students and teachers

are often found in one-on-one situations, whether it involves talking about a recent test, community service, Shakespeare, or last night's South Park episode. There is no cafeteria so students are allowed one hour of "sign-out" per day to get lunch. The nearby Wendy's is the usual for many students without vehicles. There are no locks on lockers, and many feel comfortable leaving their belongings out during classes. The walls are creatively decorated with student artwork, poems, posters, and signs. Each week the entire school gathers for Town Meetings, where anyone can bring up any topic they wish, and every student has a vote on each issue. Problems within the community are addressed and mediated by, Fairness Committee, which is composed of both students and staff. None of these freedoms would be possible, however, if the community did not respect and trust each other. Respect and trust are the basis upon which Linworth is built.

Although you may hear a senior occasionally giving exasperating excerpts from the annual "Linworth is going downhill" schpiel, Linworth continues, and will--sometimes to our horror and denial--go on without us. It has already survived long enough to produce 25 successful senior classes, and hopefully this will continue for many more years to come.

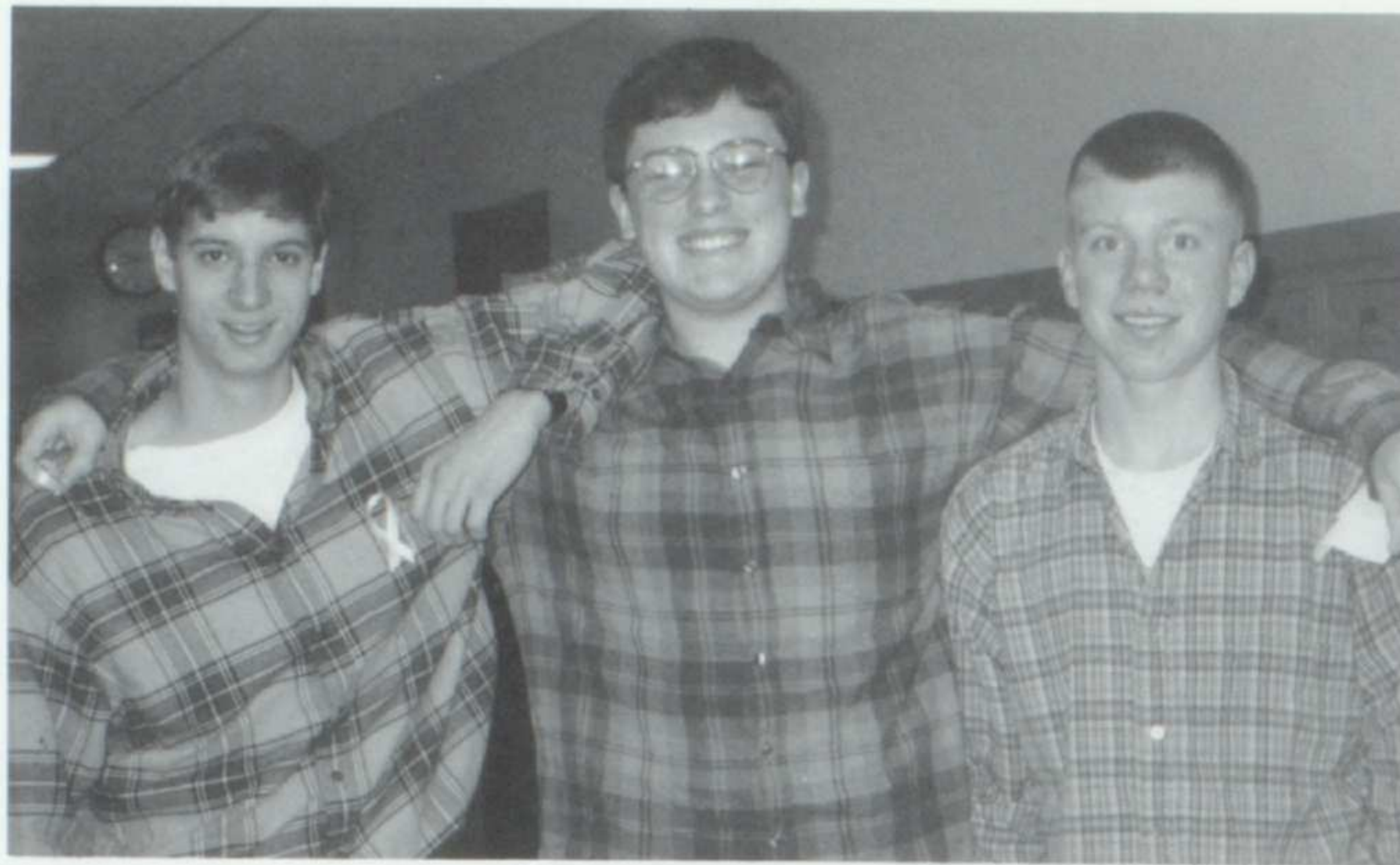
