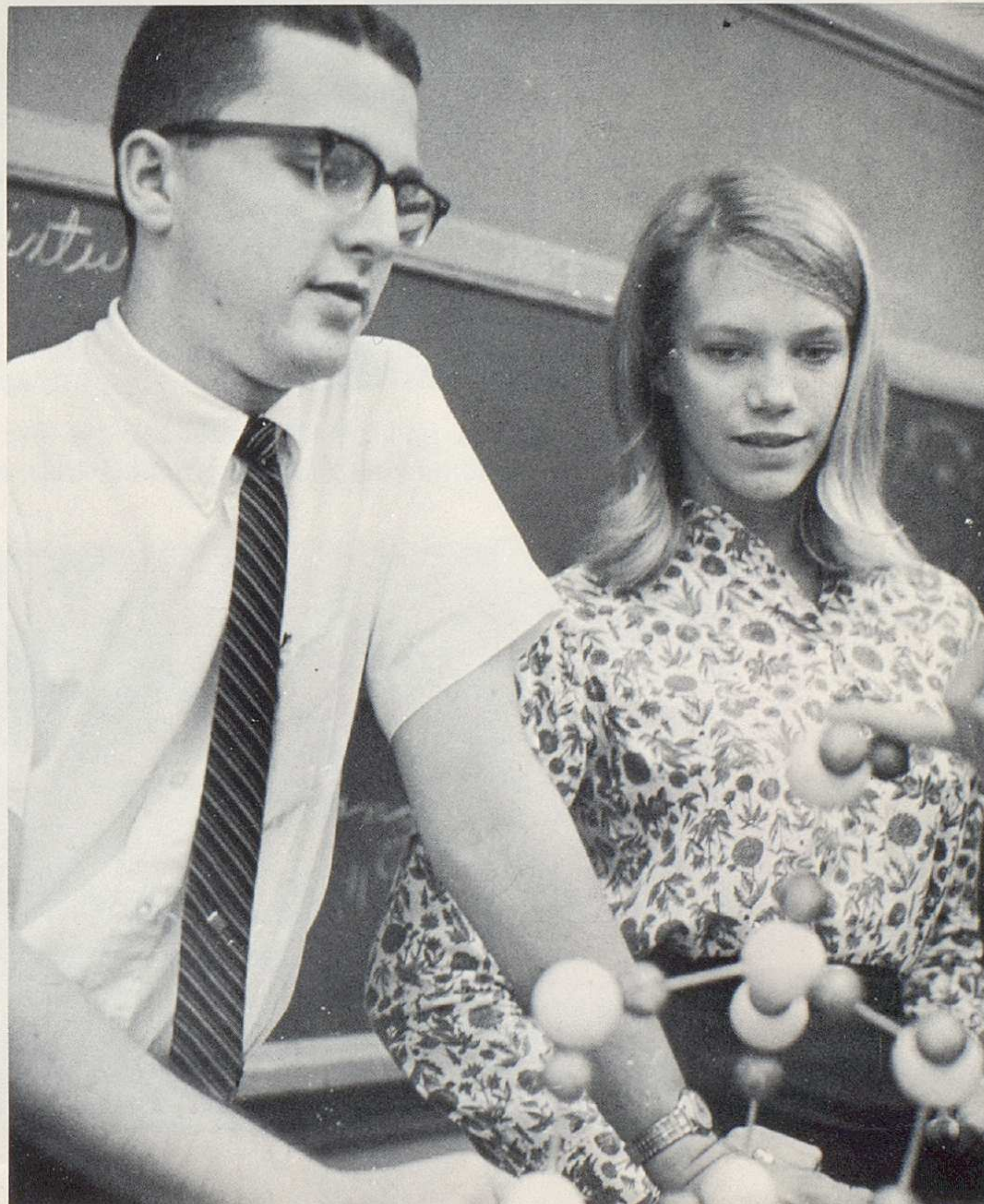
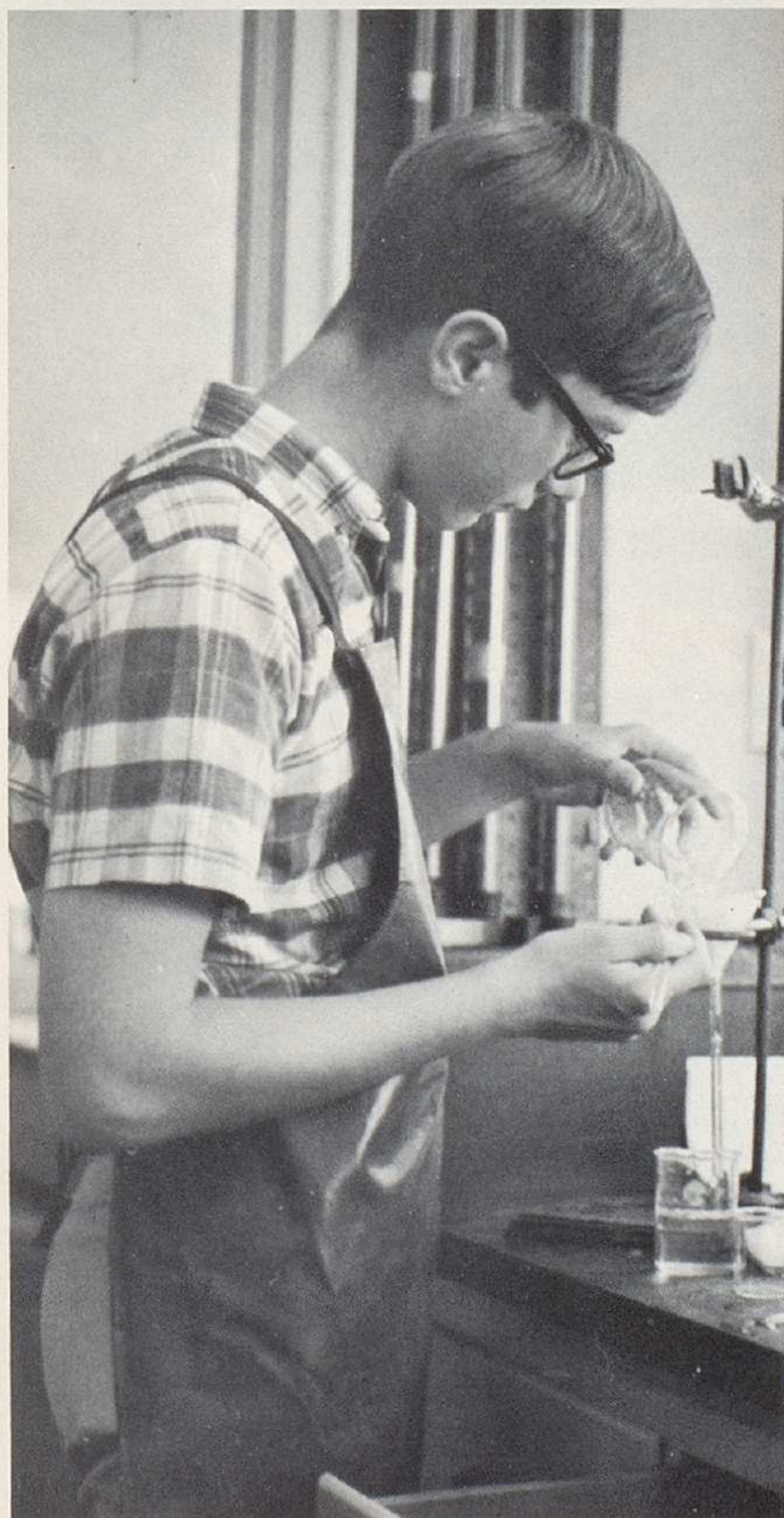
Patterns Are Universal

They offer bases for understanding and for future actions, and they can be extended and improved.





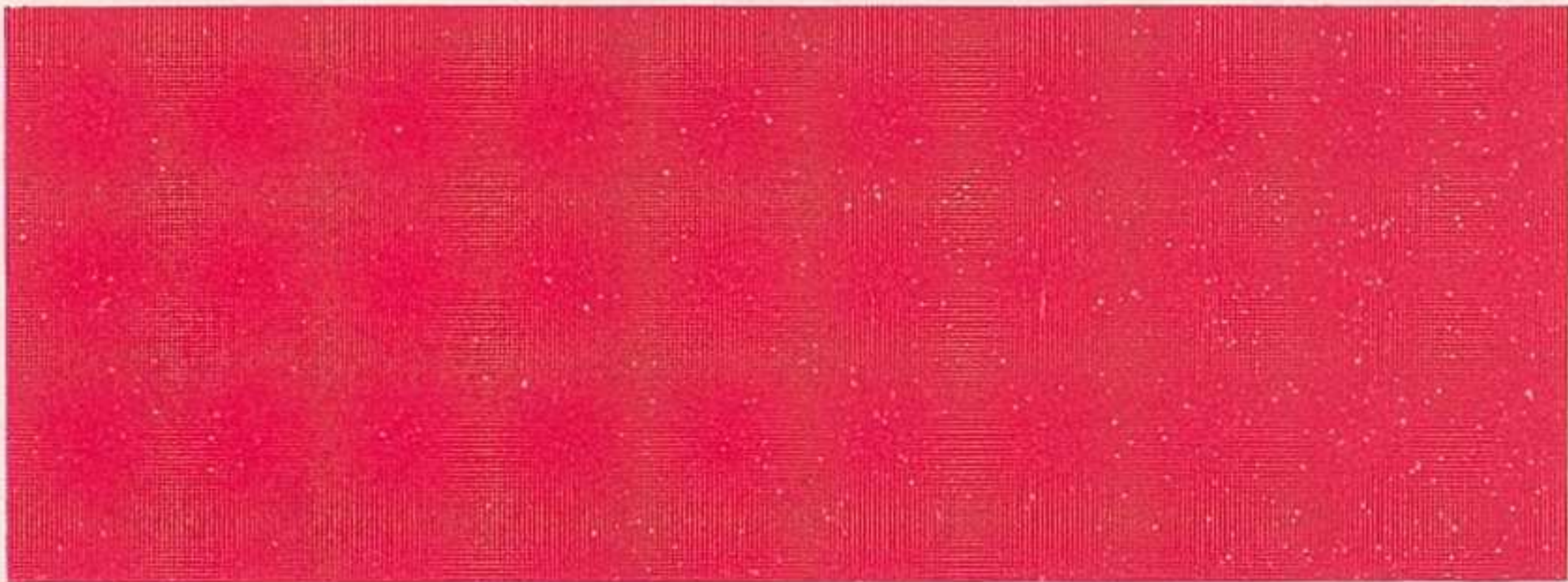
Patterns play a large part in school life — the format of classes, homework, and extracurricular activities.



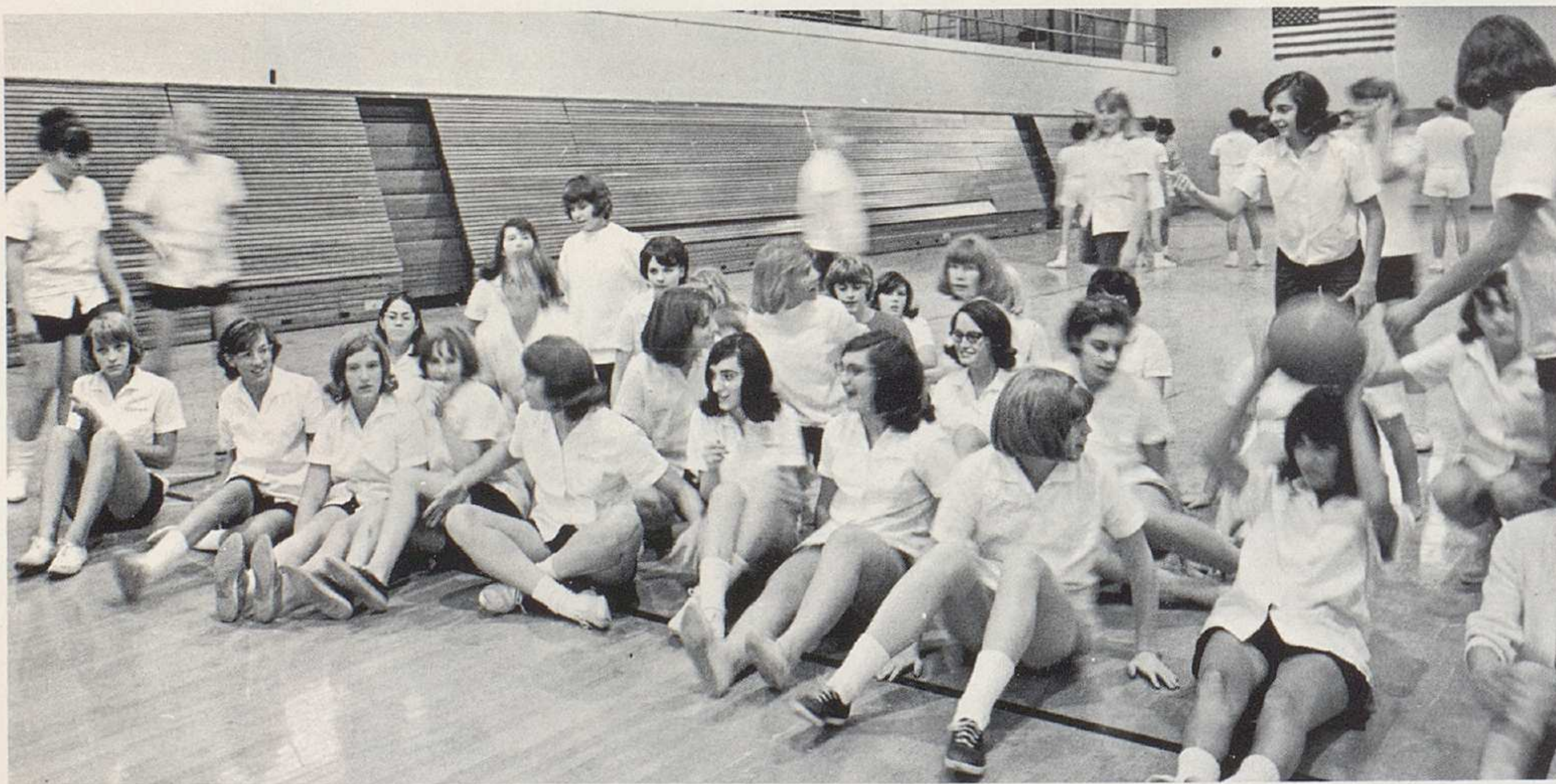


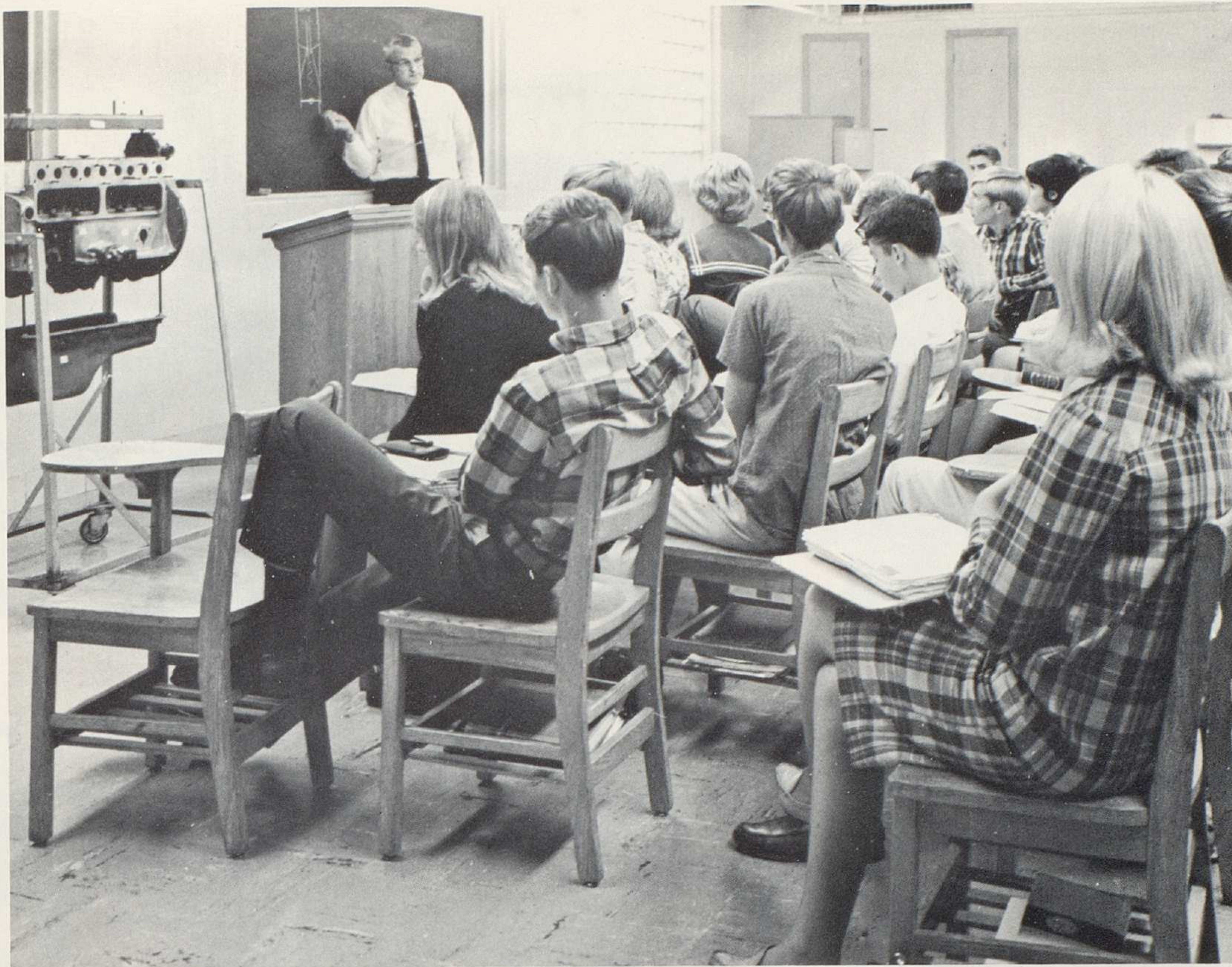
Electing officers, working on the Prom, and giving monologues are traditional patterns that round out the education of the student.

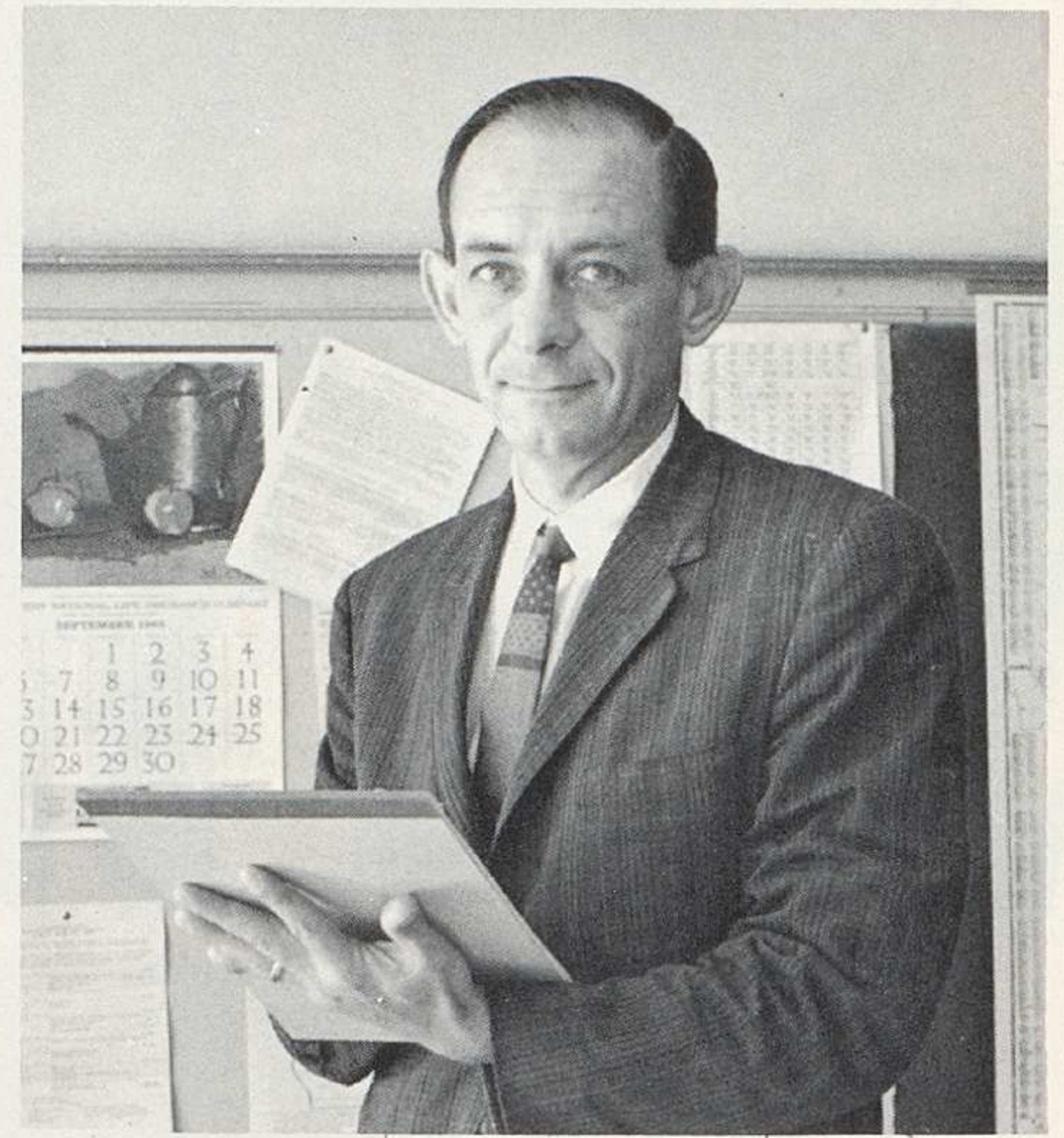

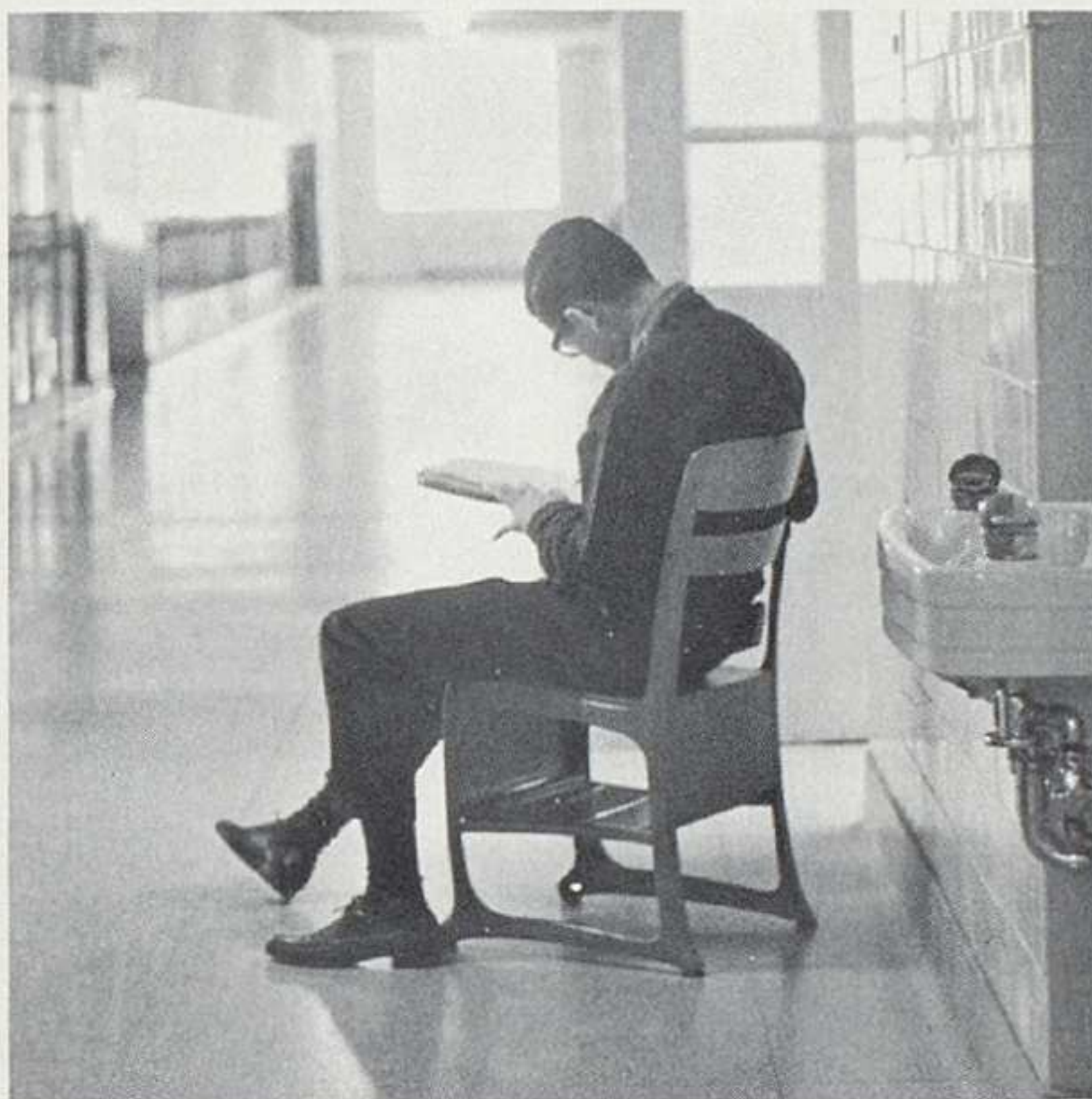

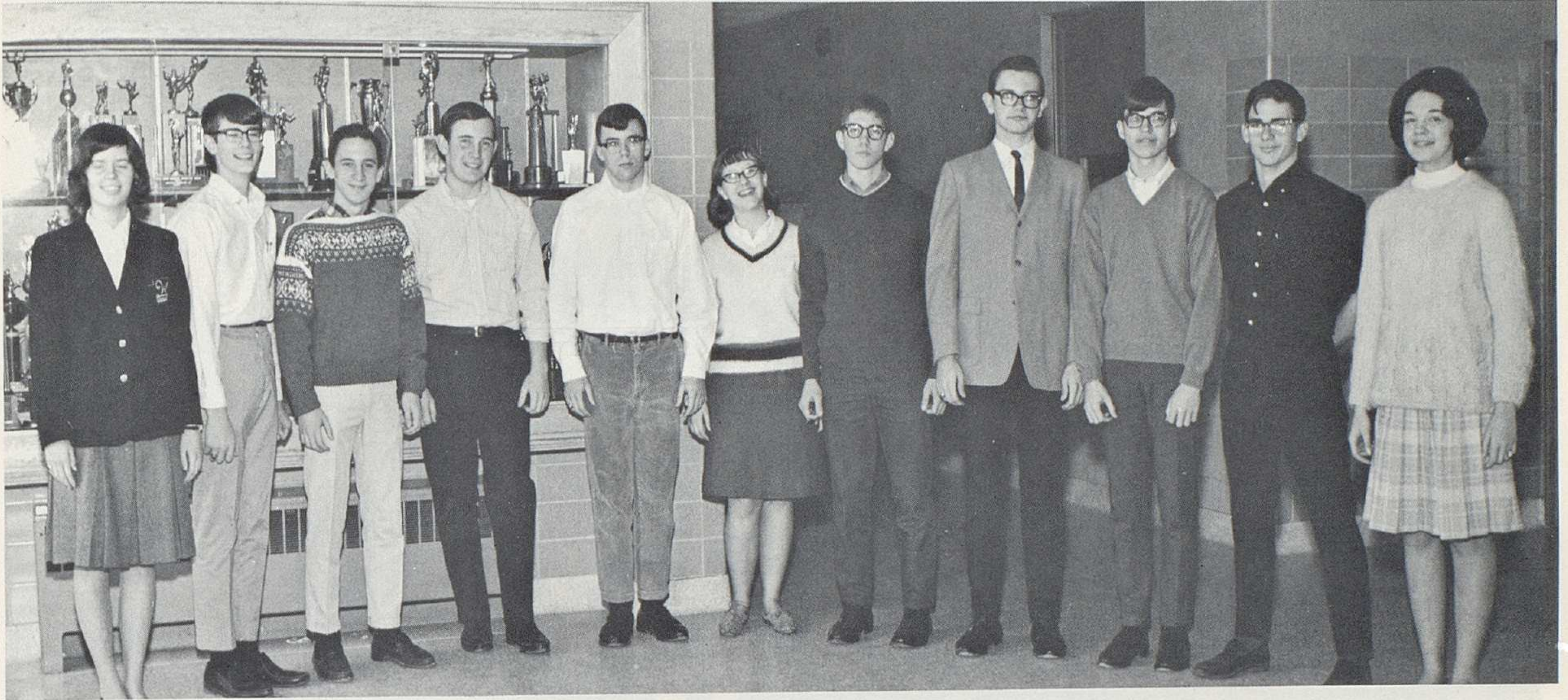

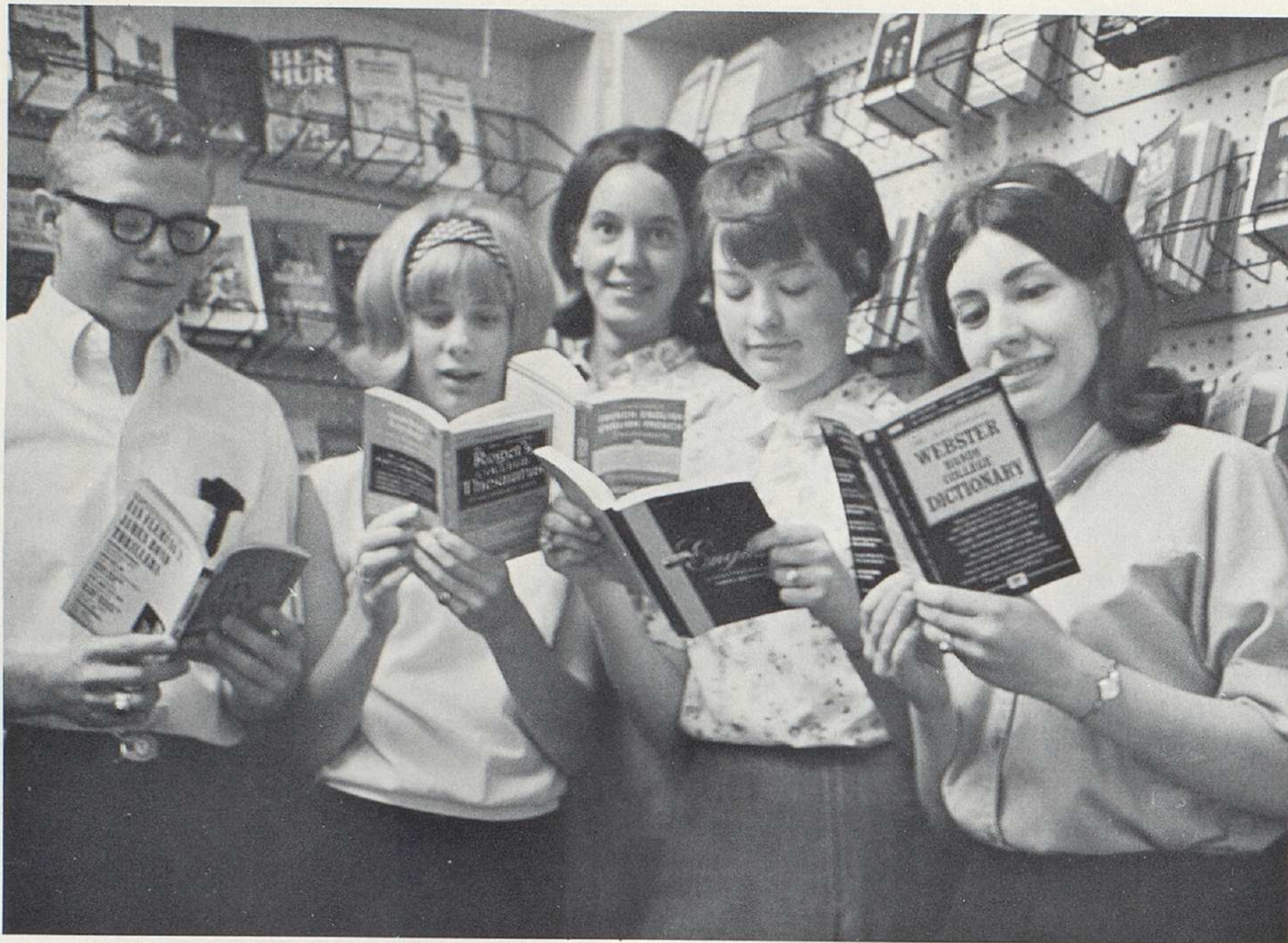

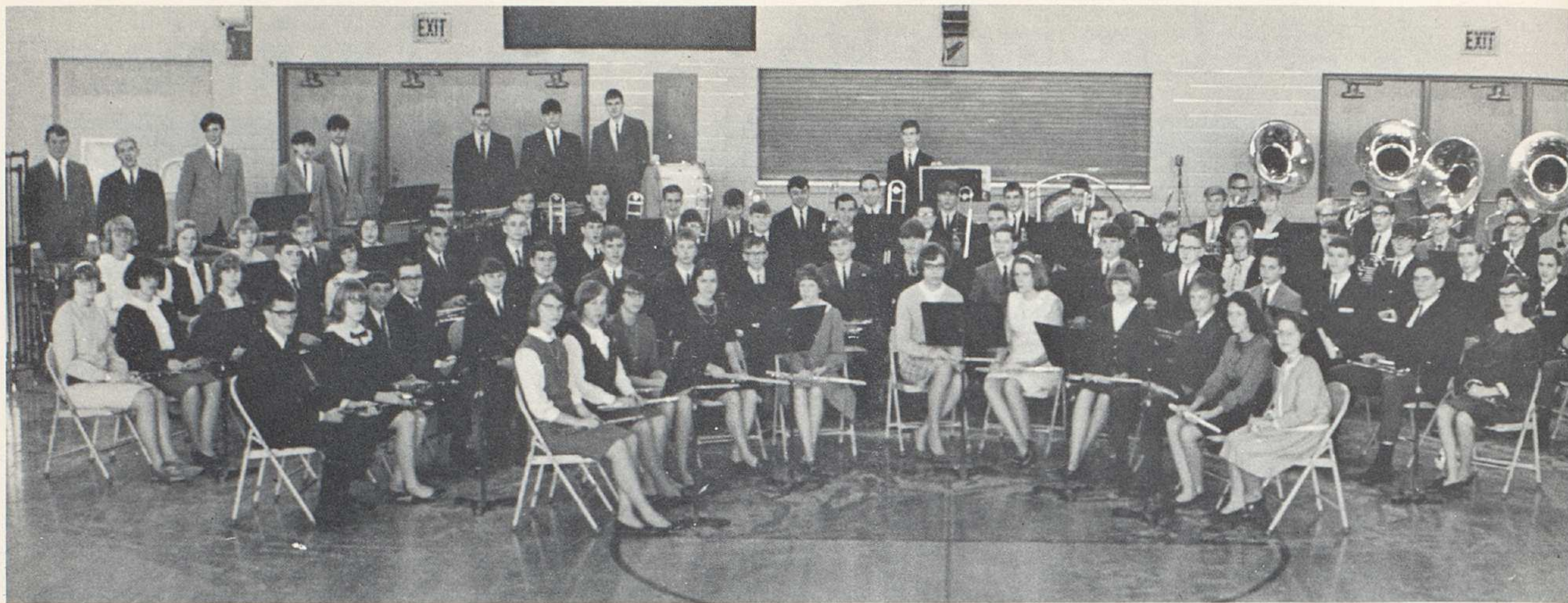

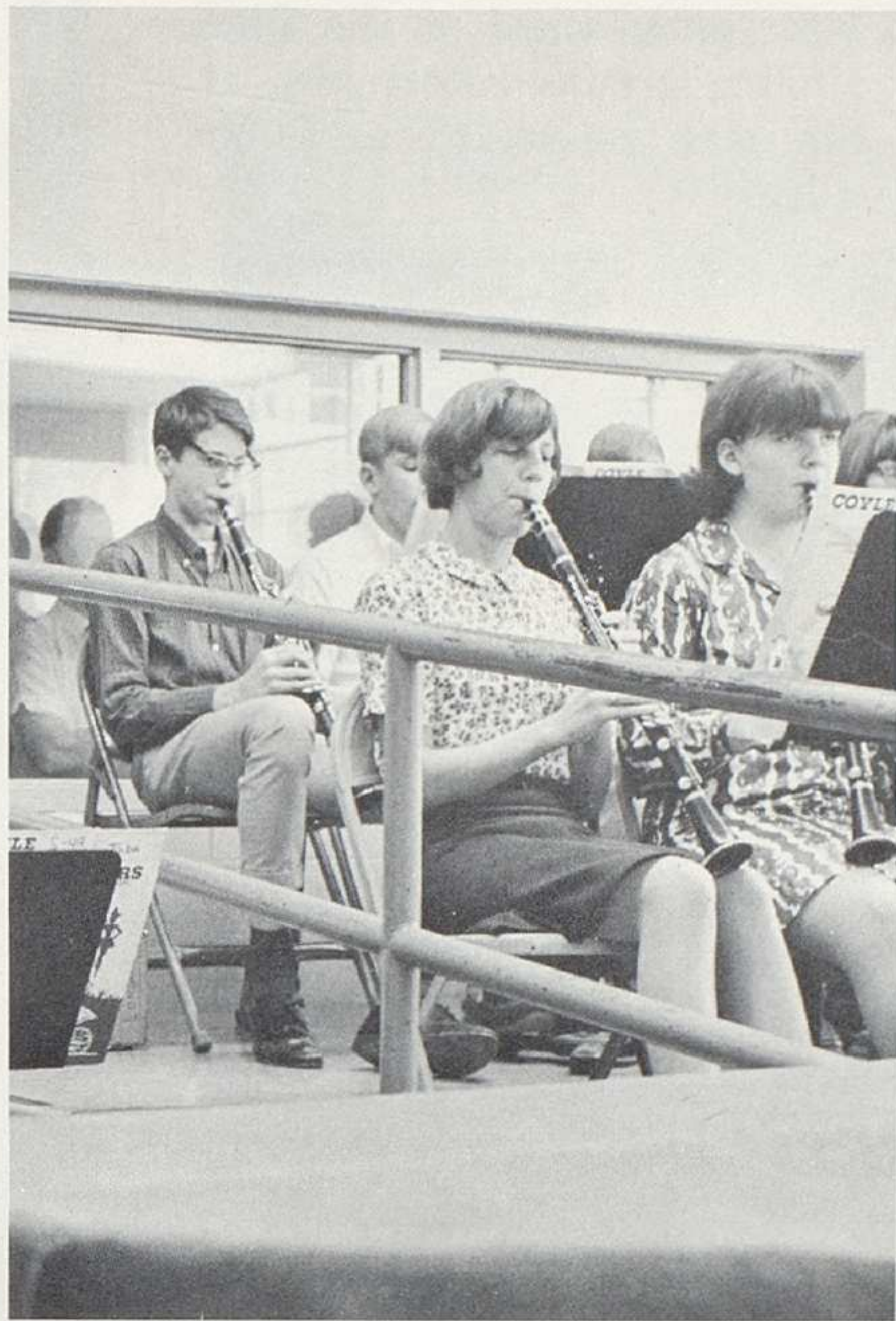

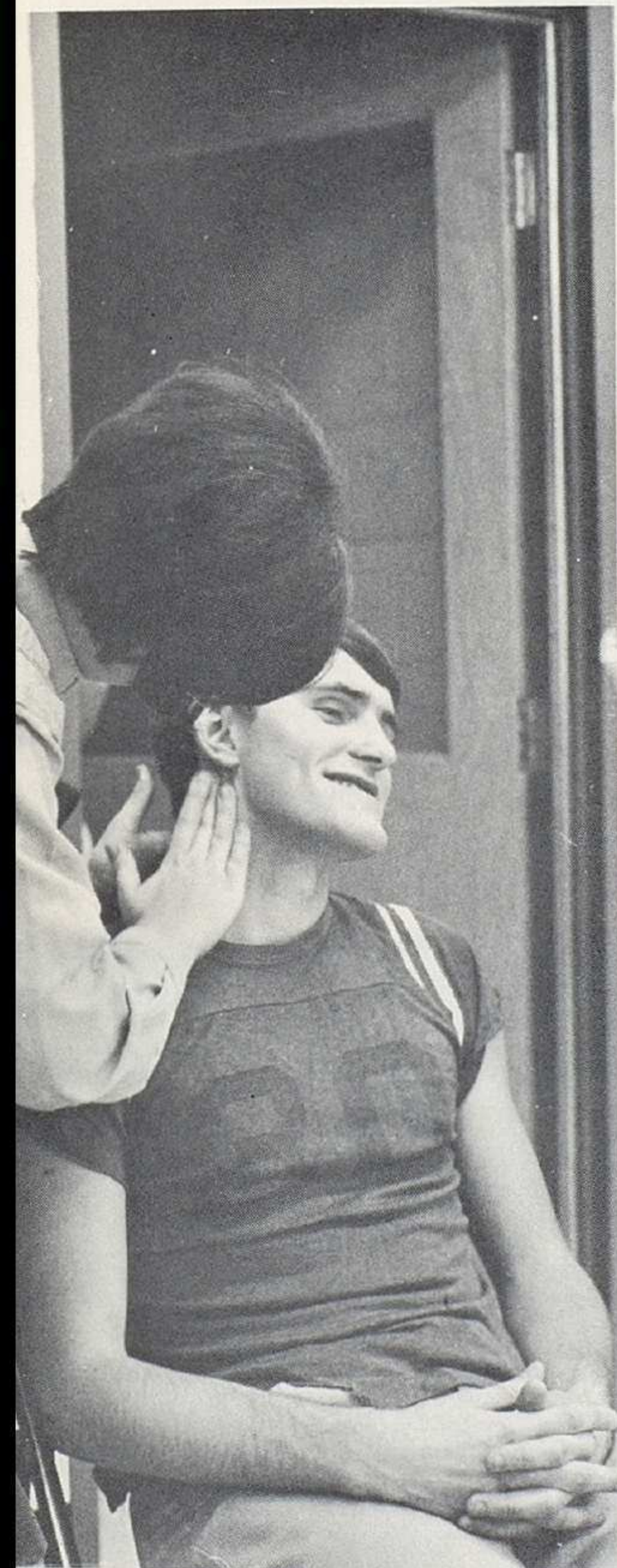

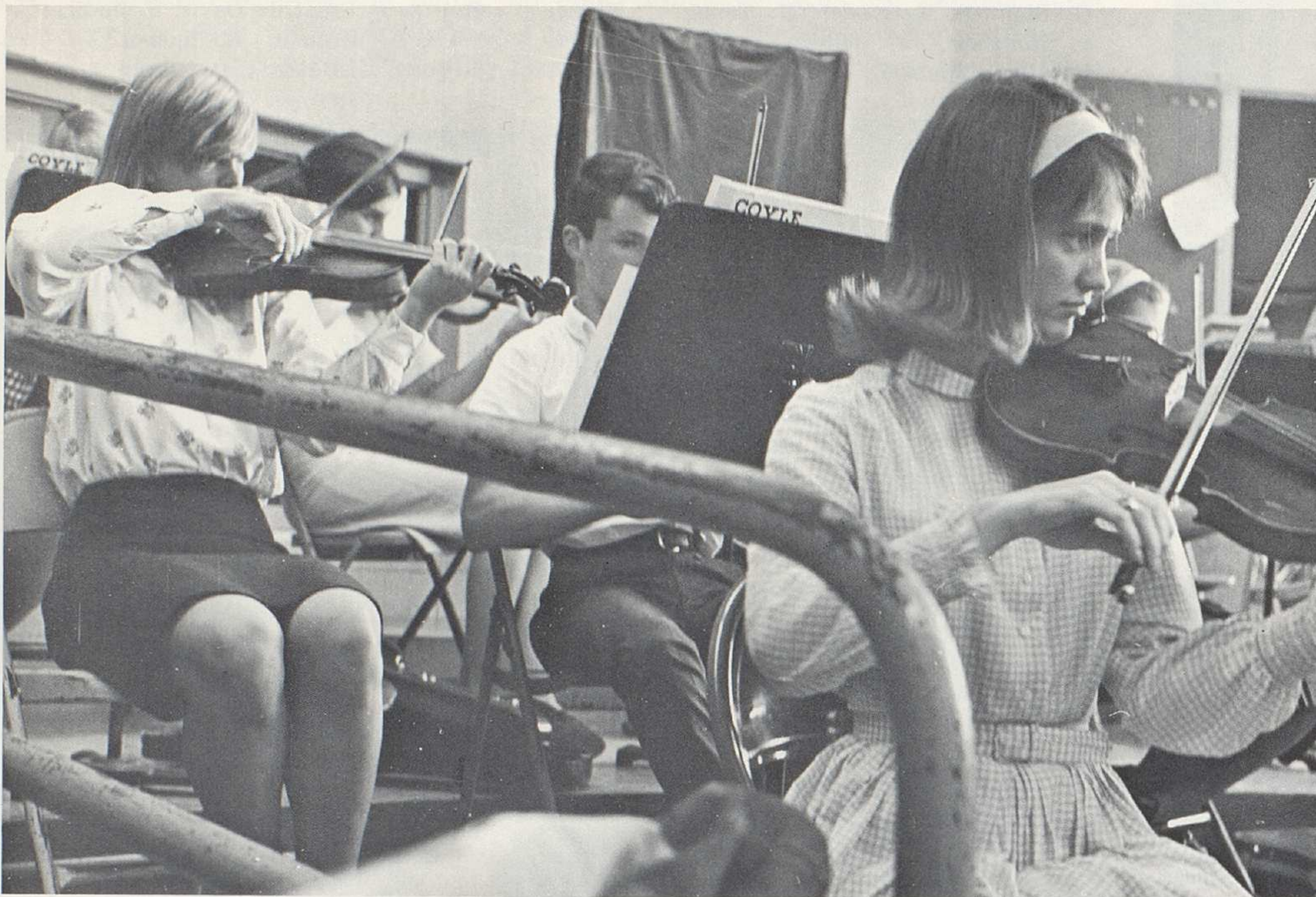

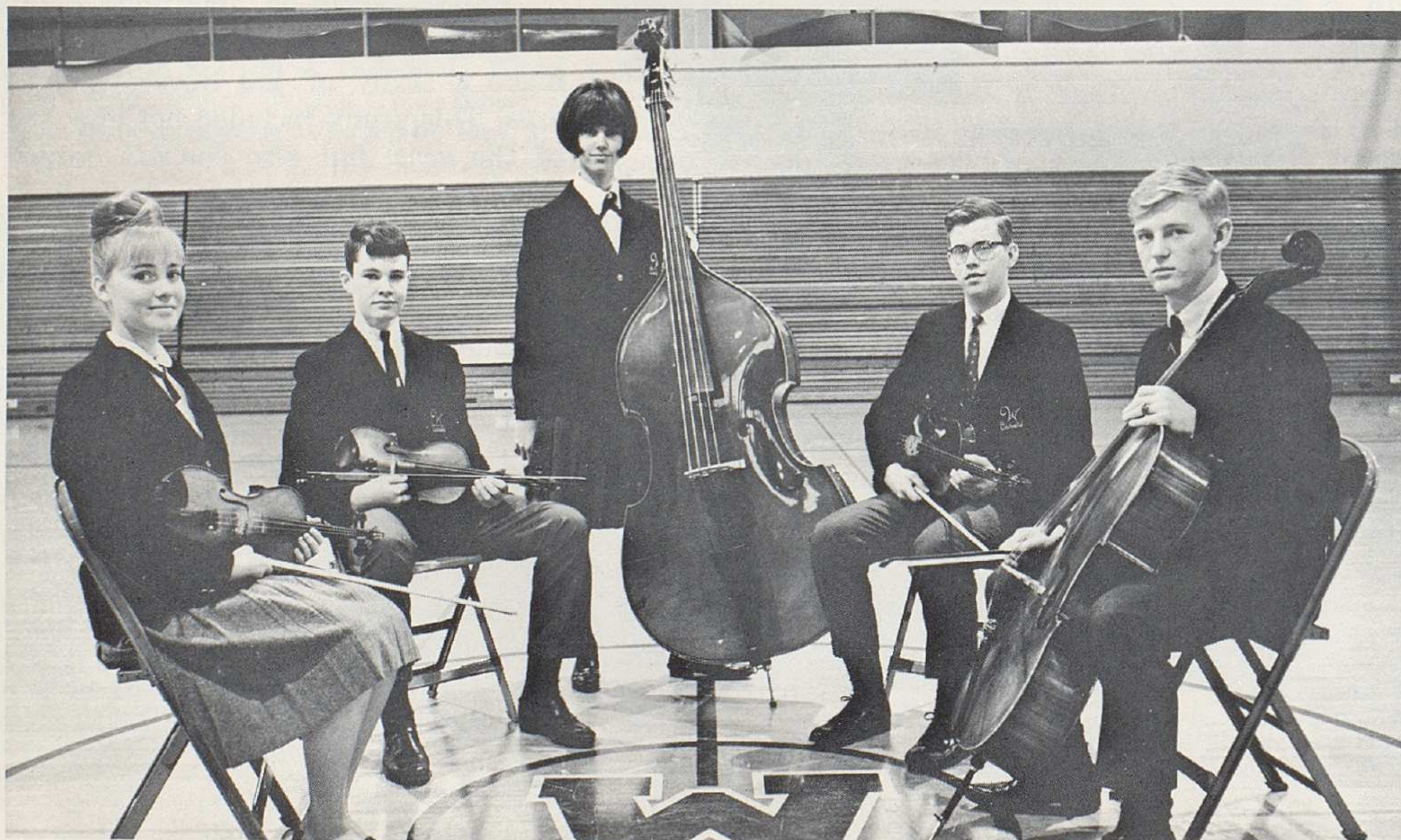

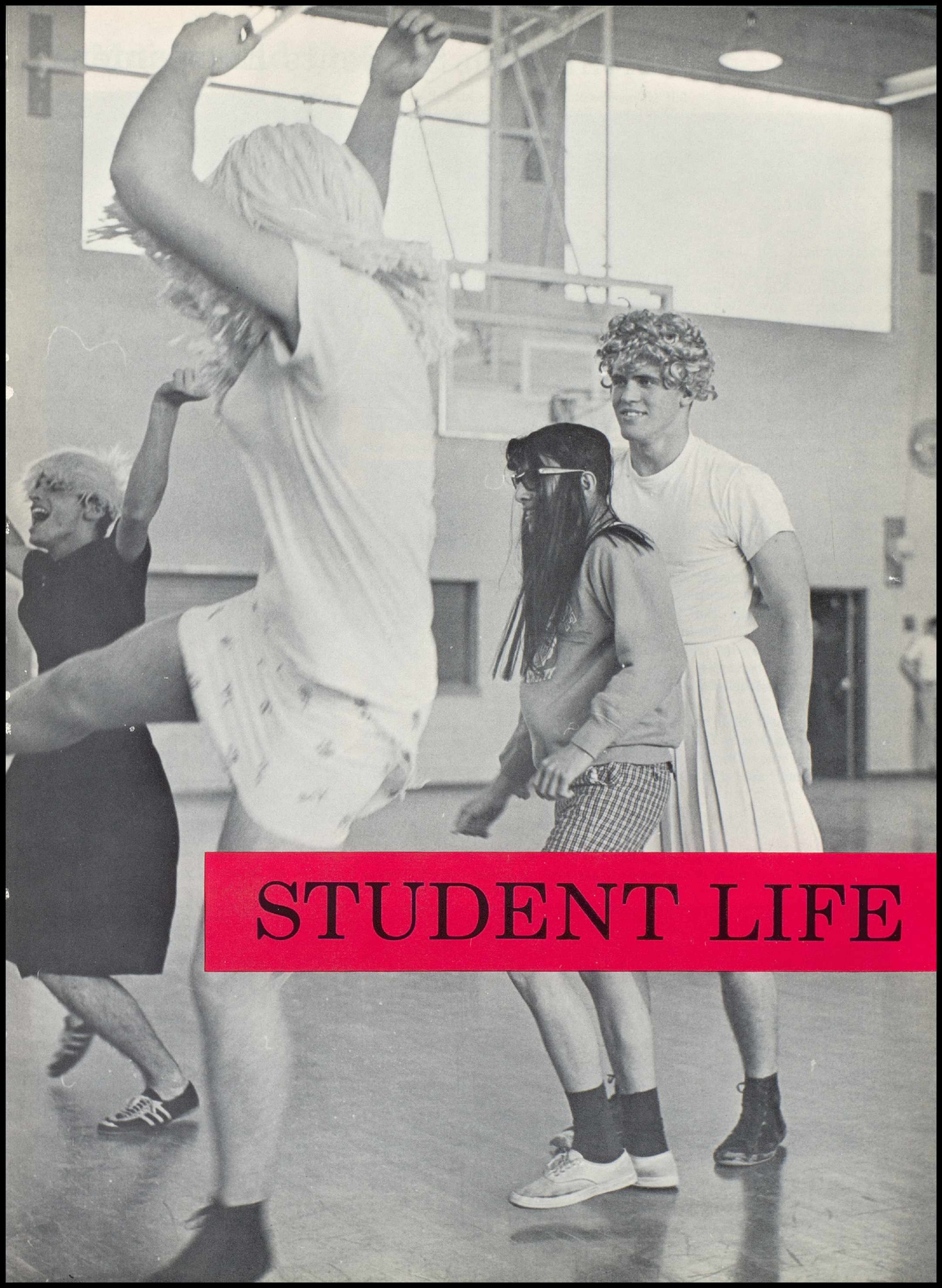

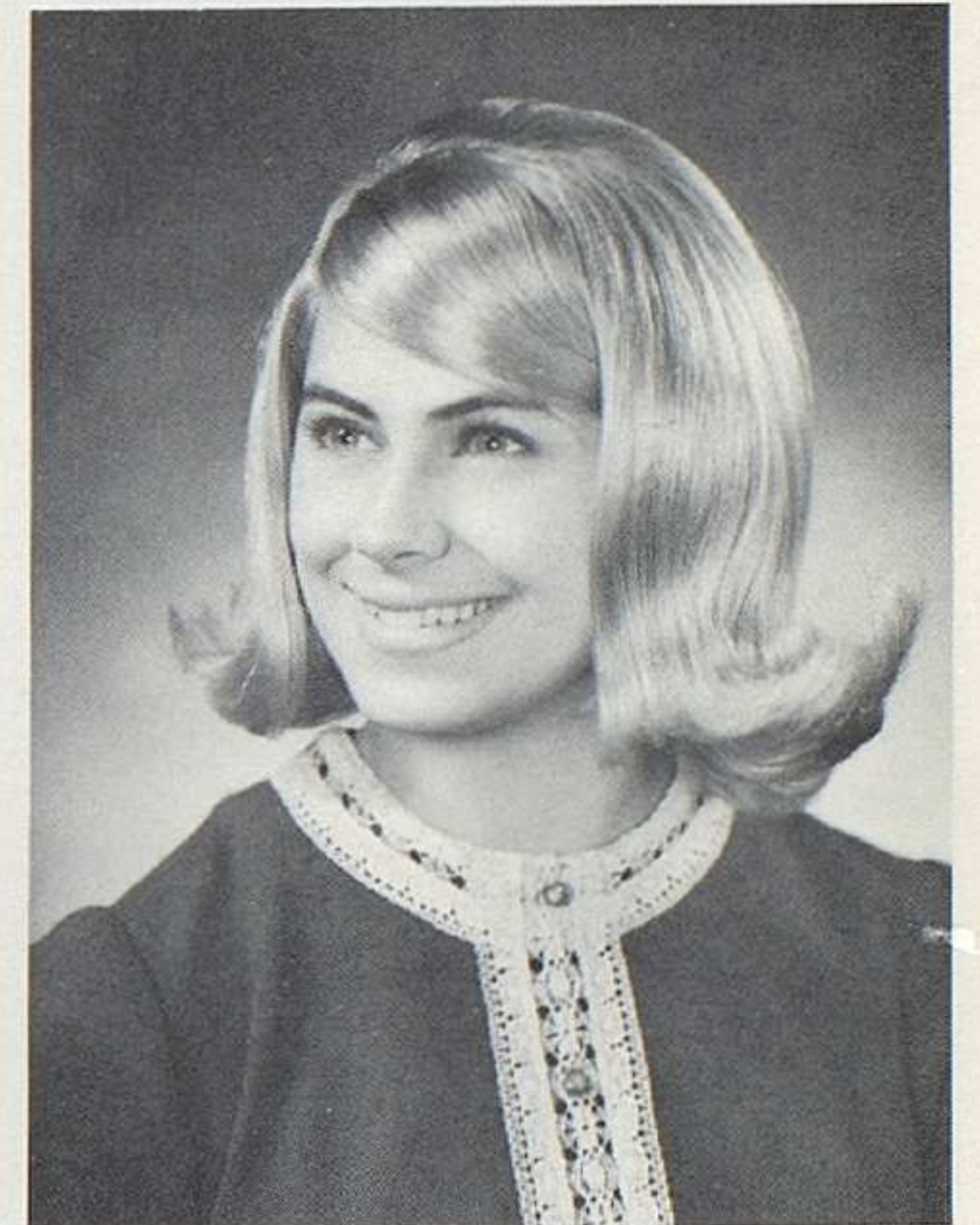

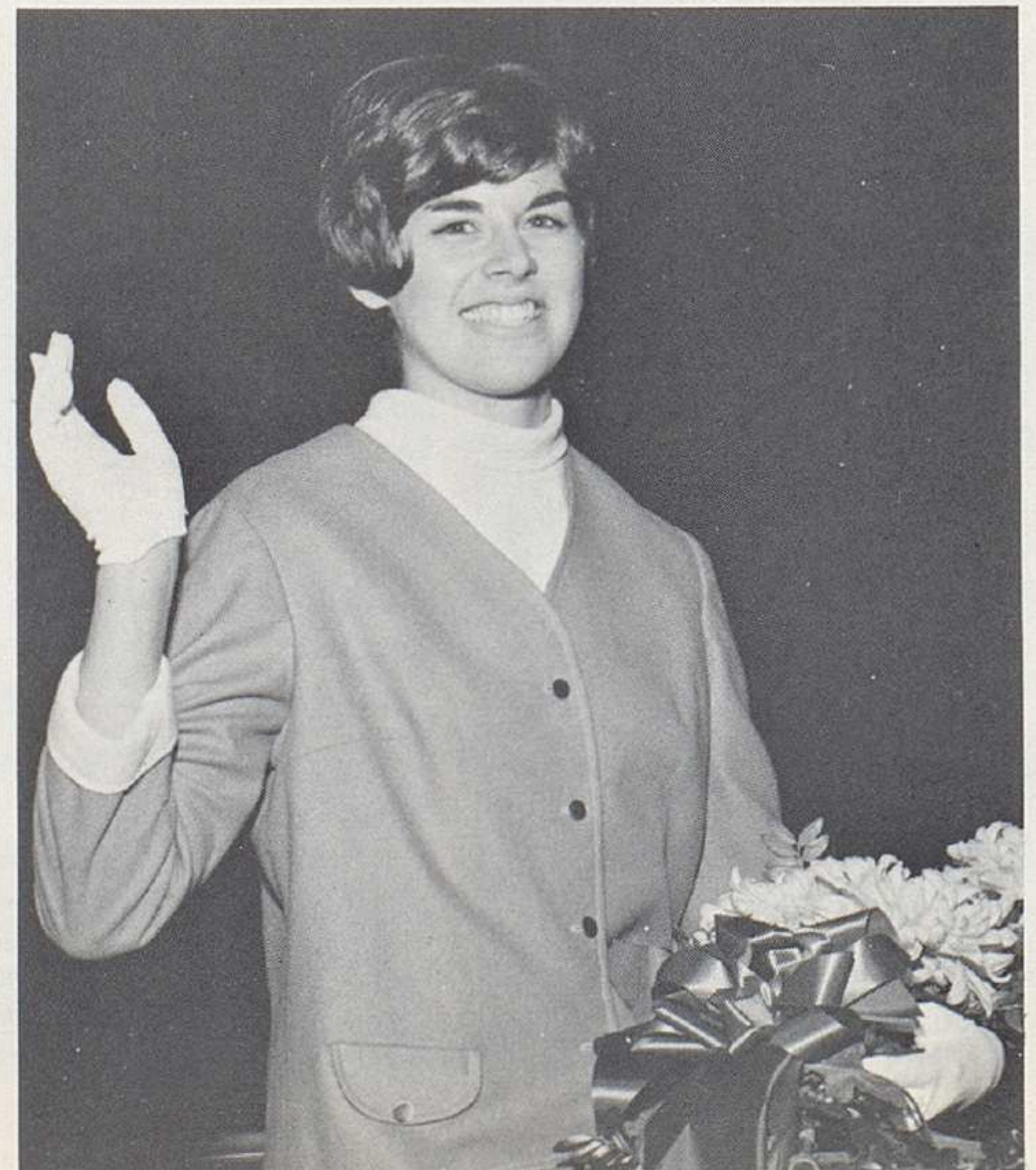

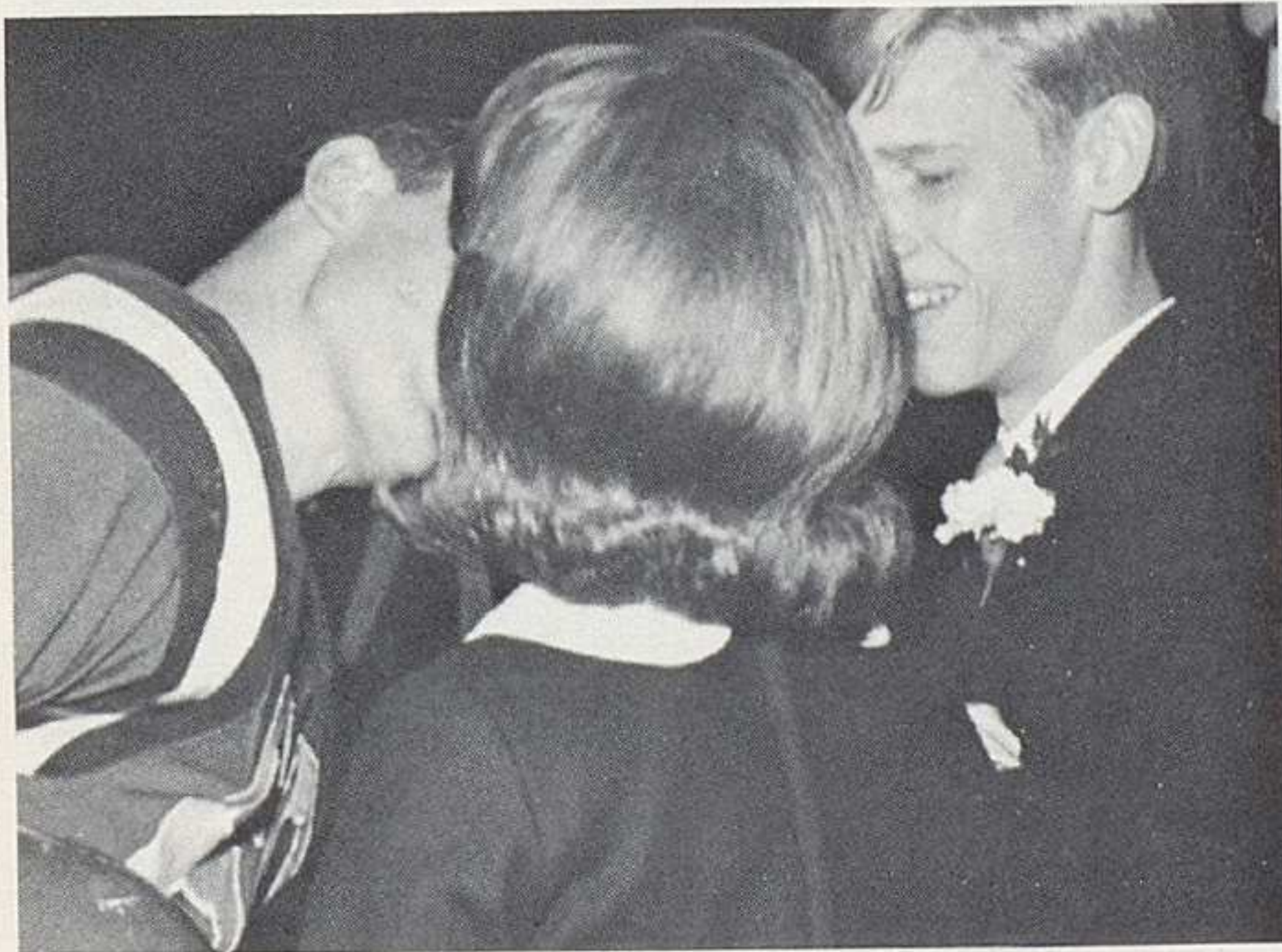


Dance Climaxes Homecoming Weekend

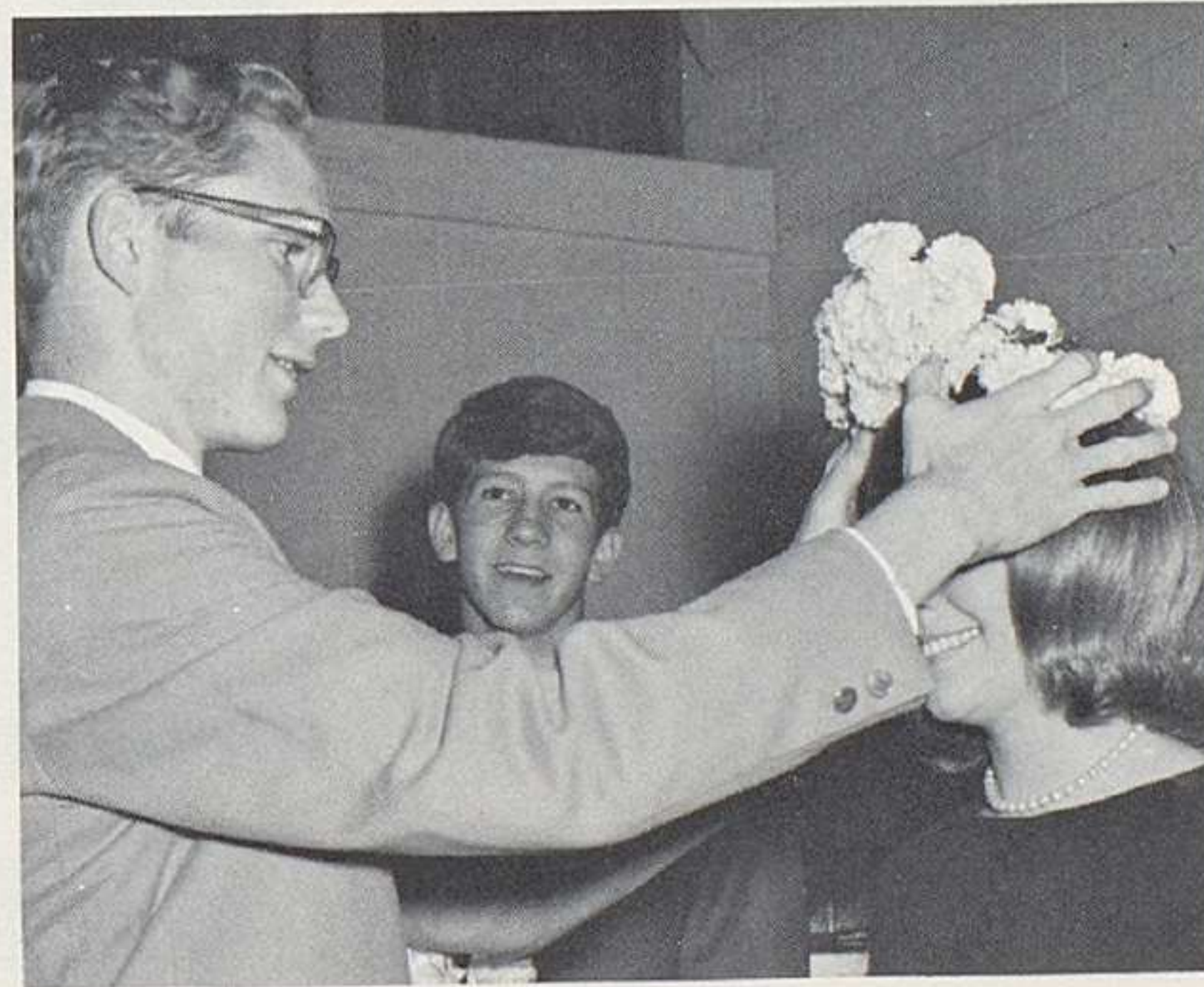

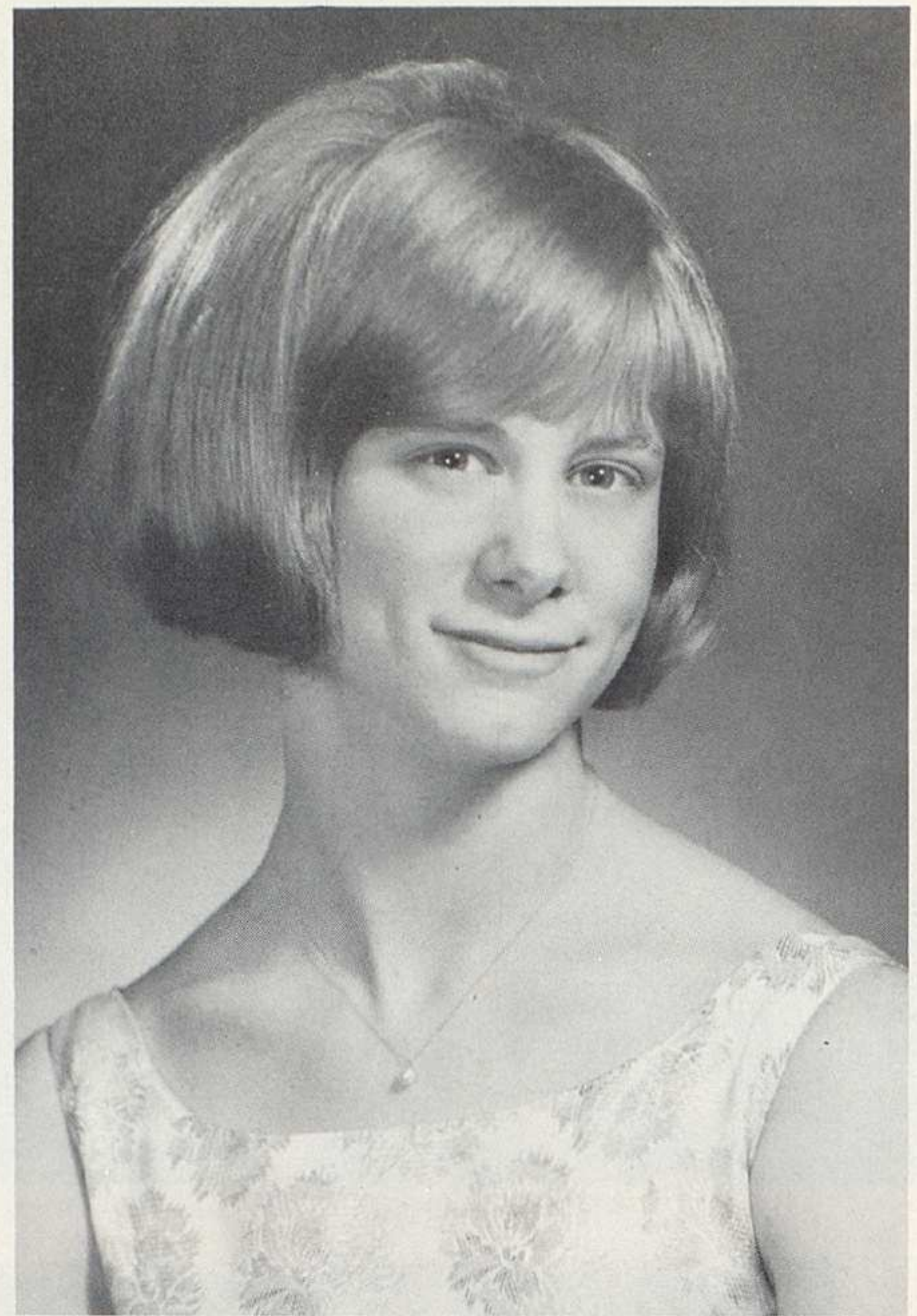

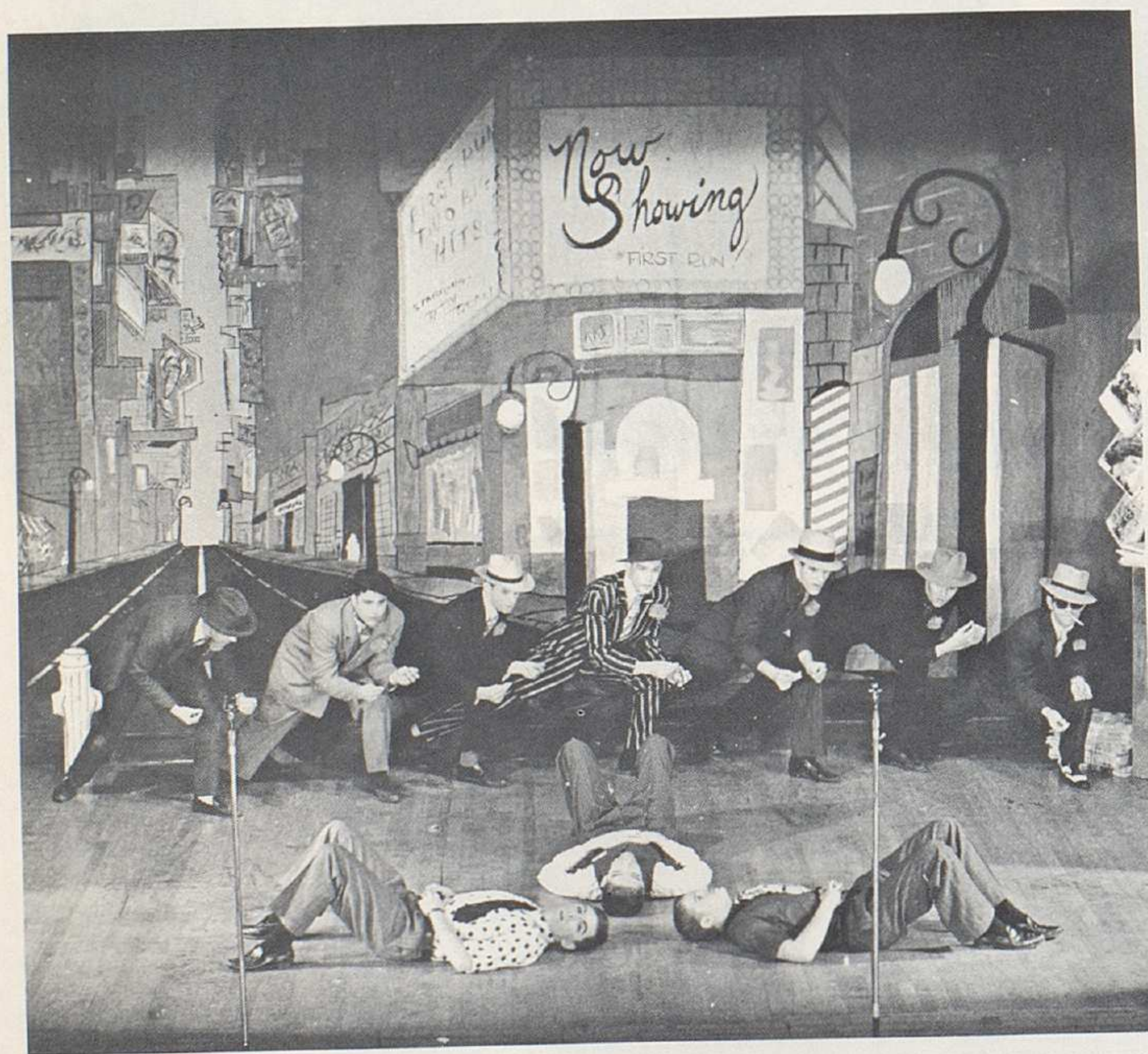

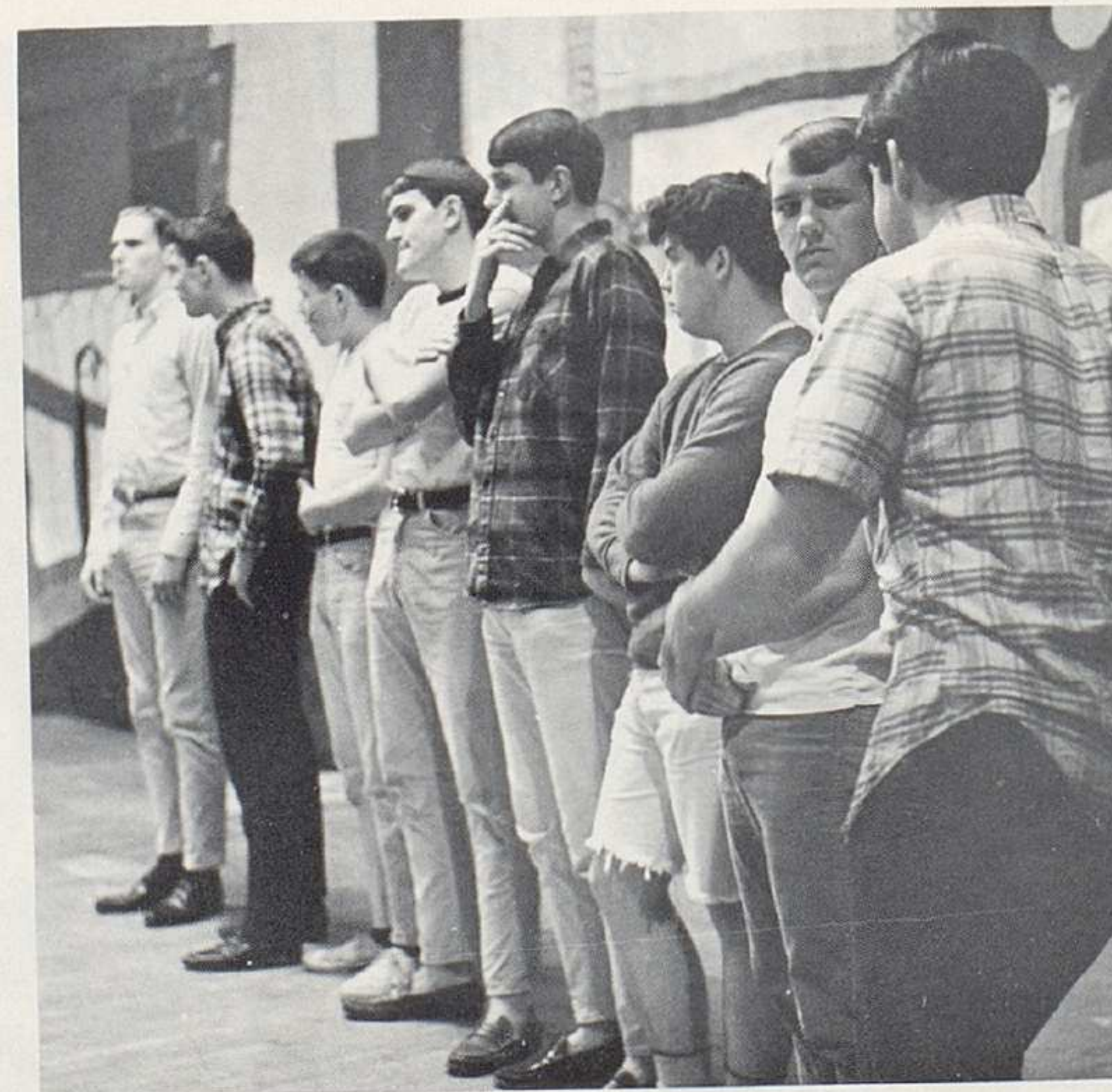

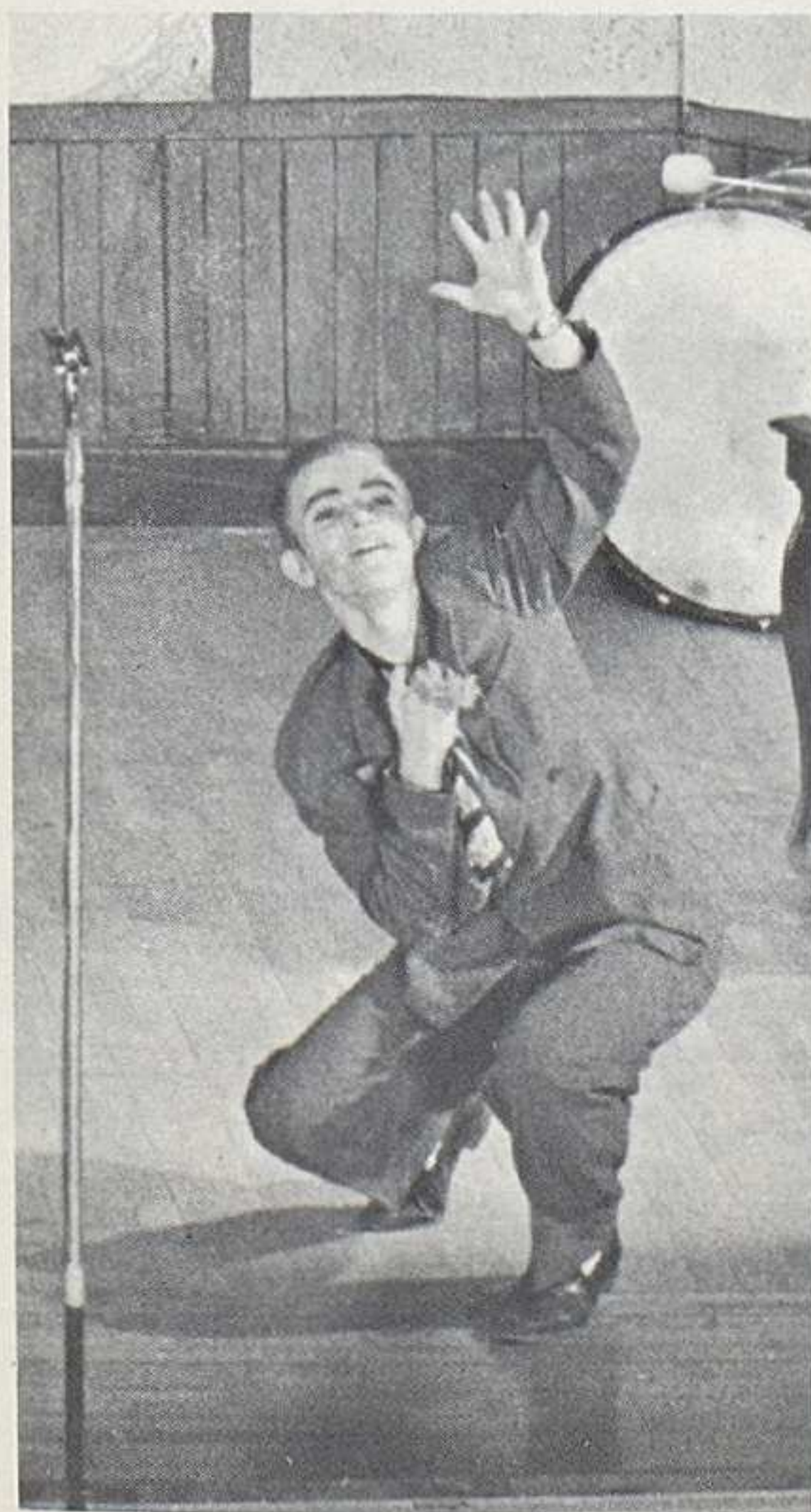

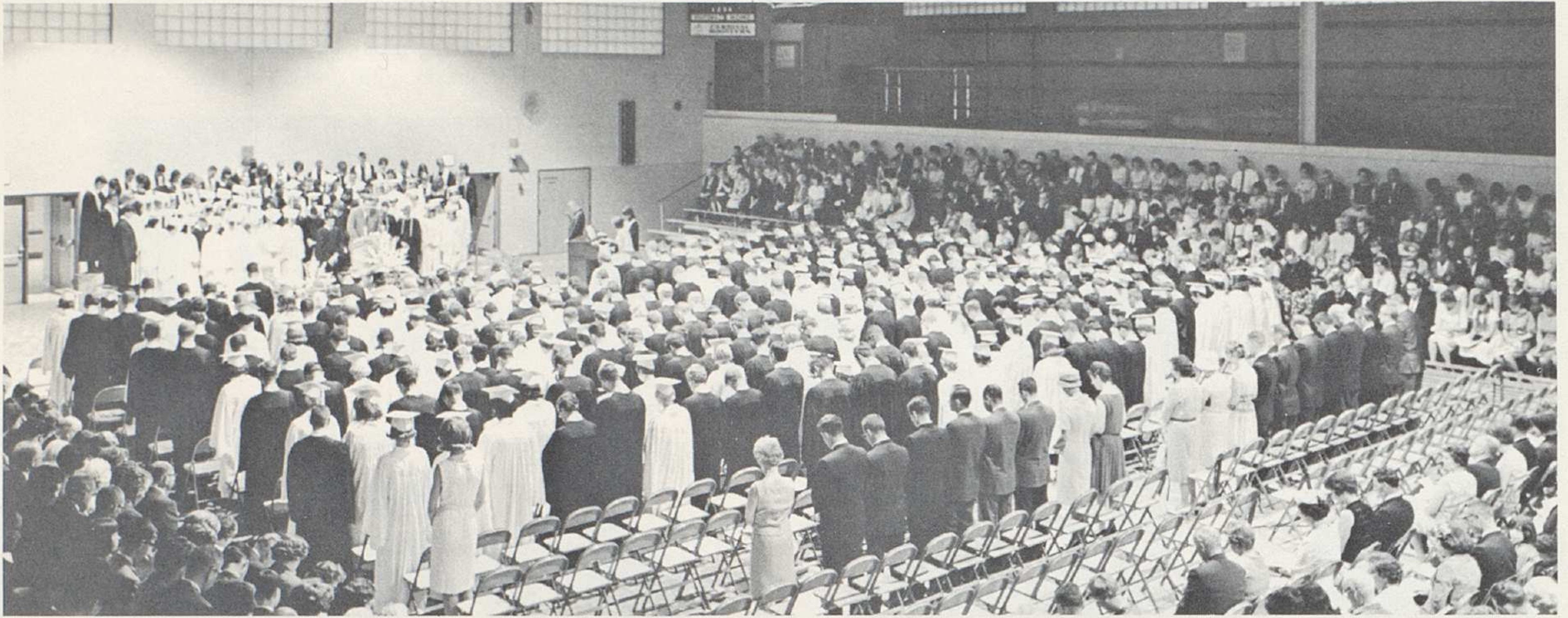

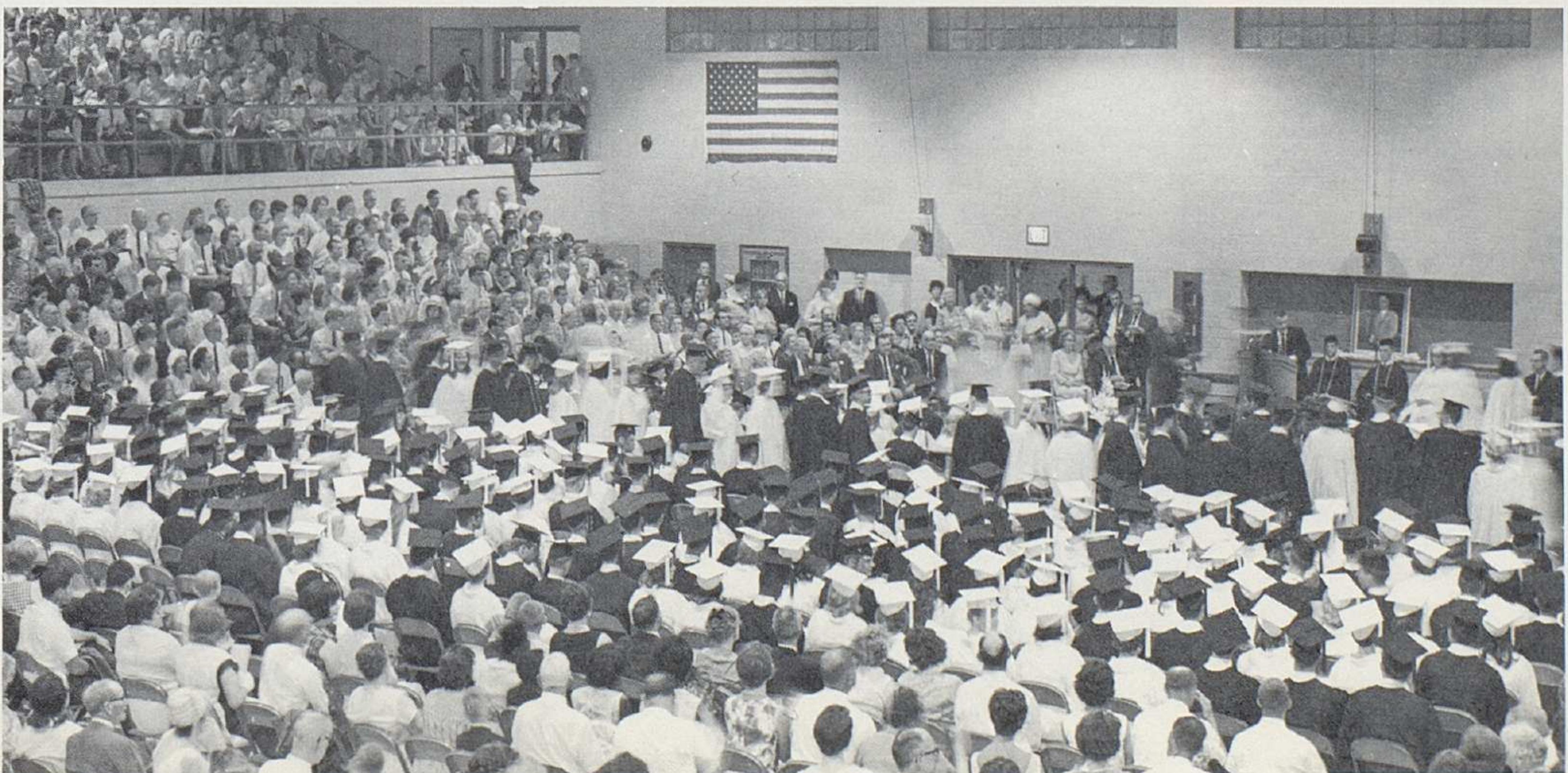

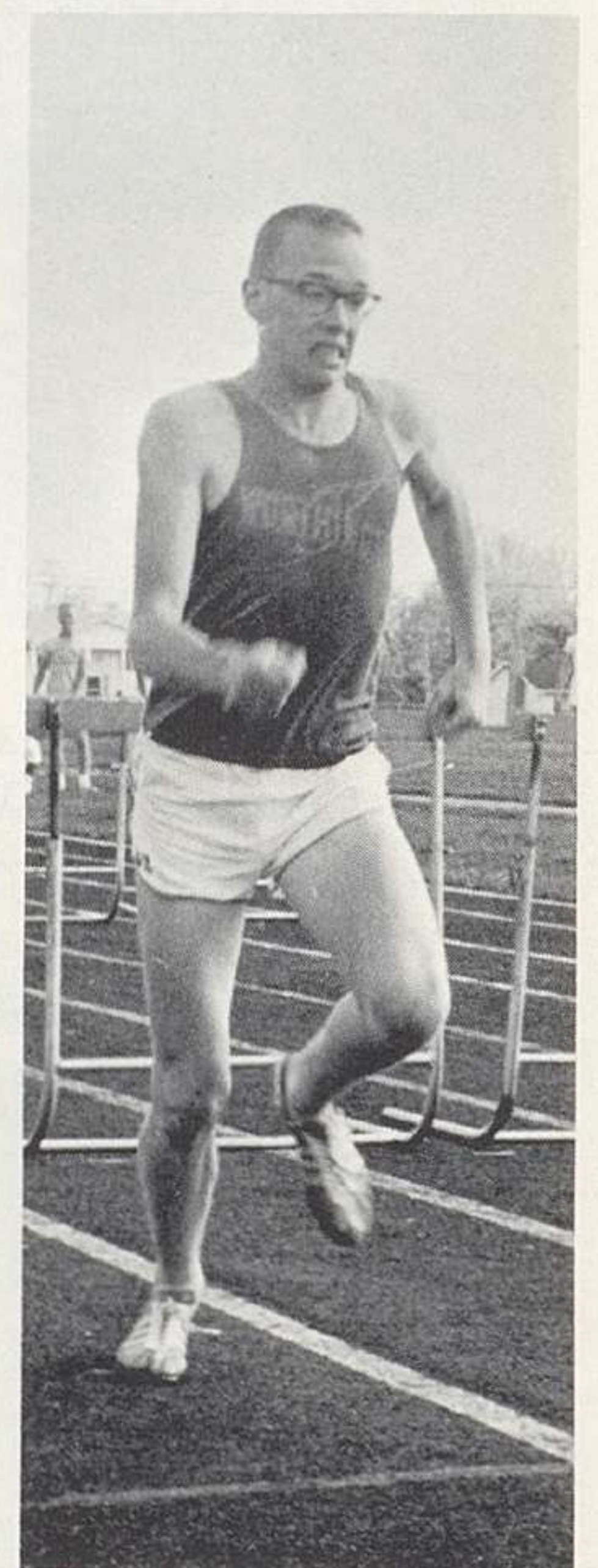
Trackmen Achieve Speed And Agility

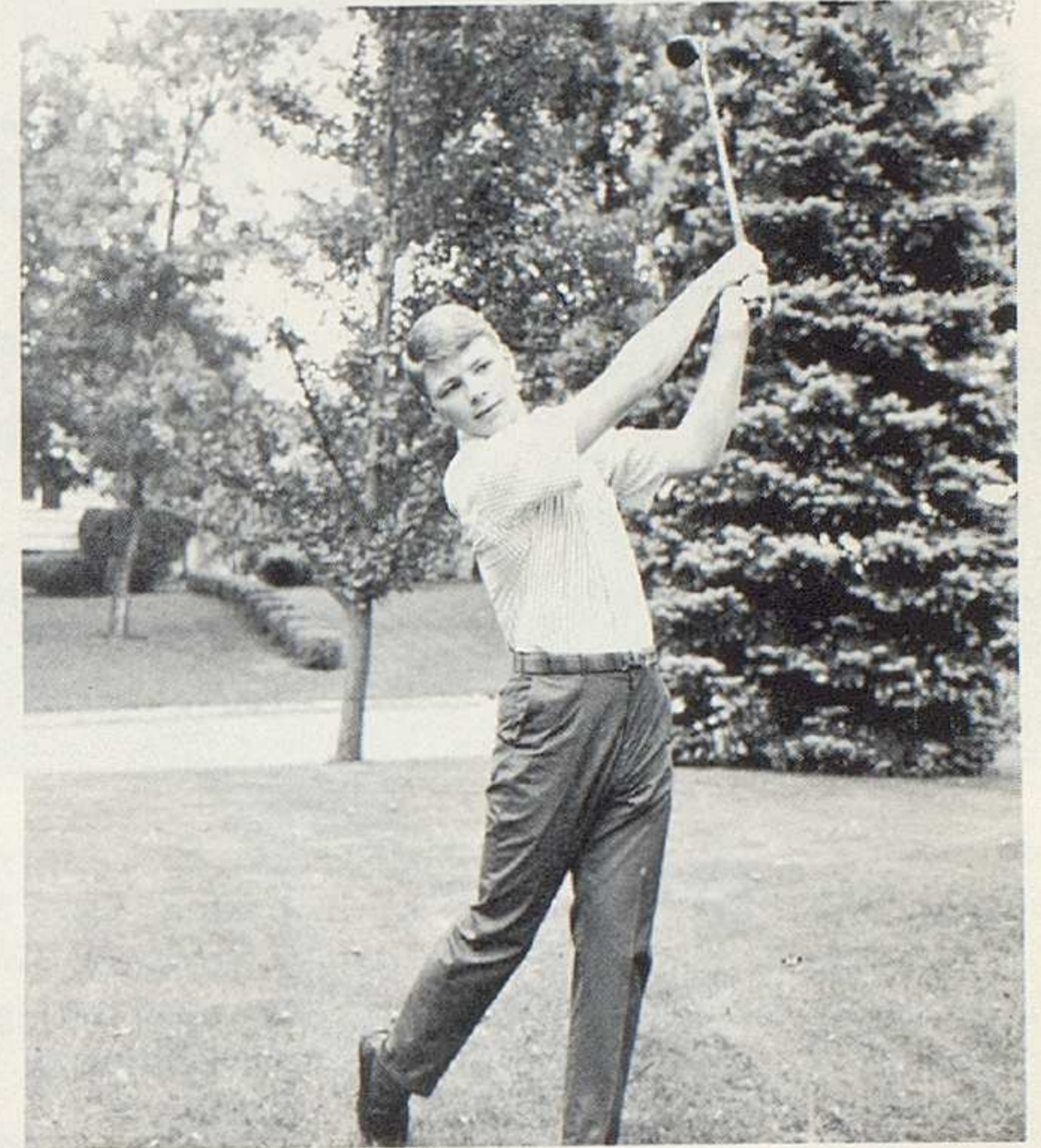

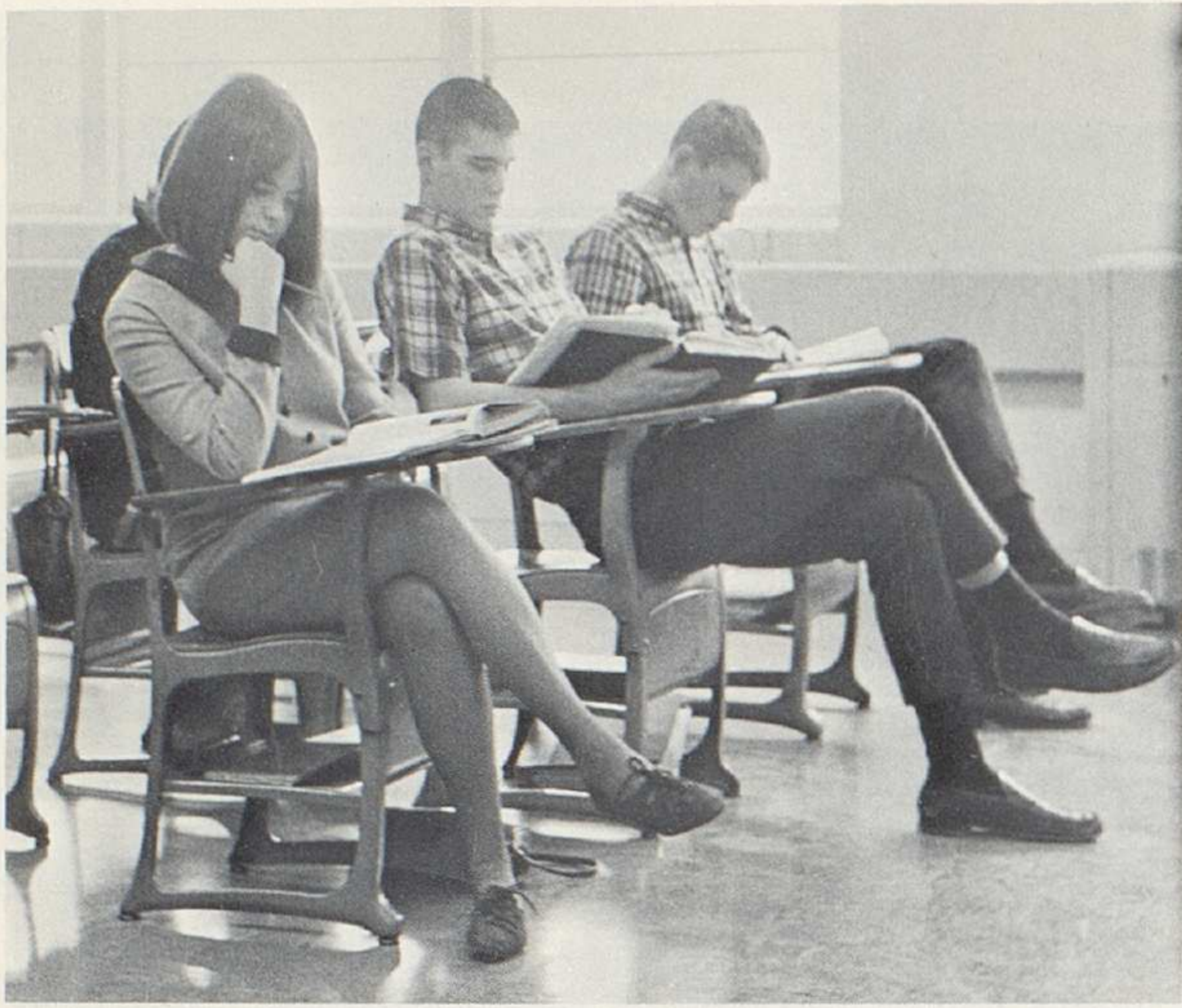
