The Northwestern trip visited the Rocky Mountains, Yellowstone National Park, and the Laubins, went on a float trip, and hiked high in the mountain areas.

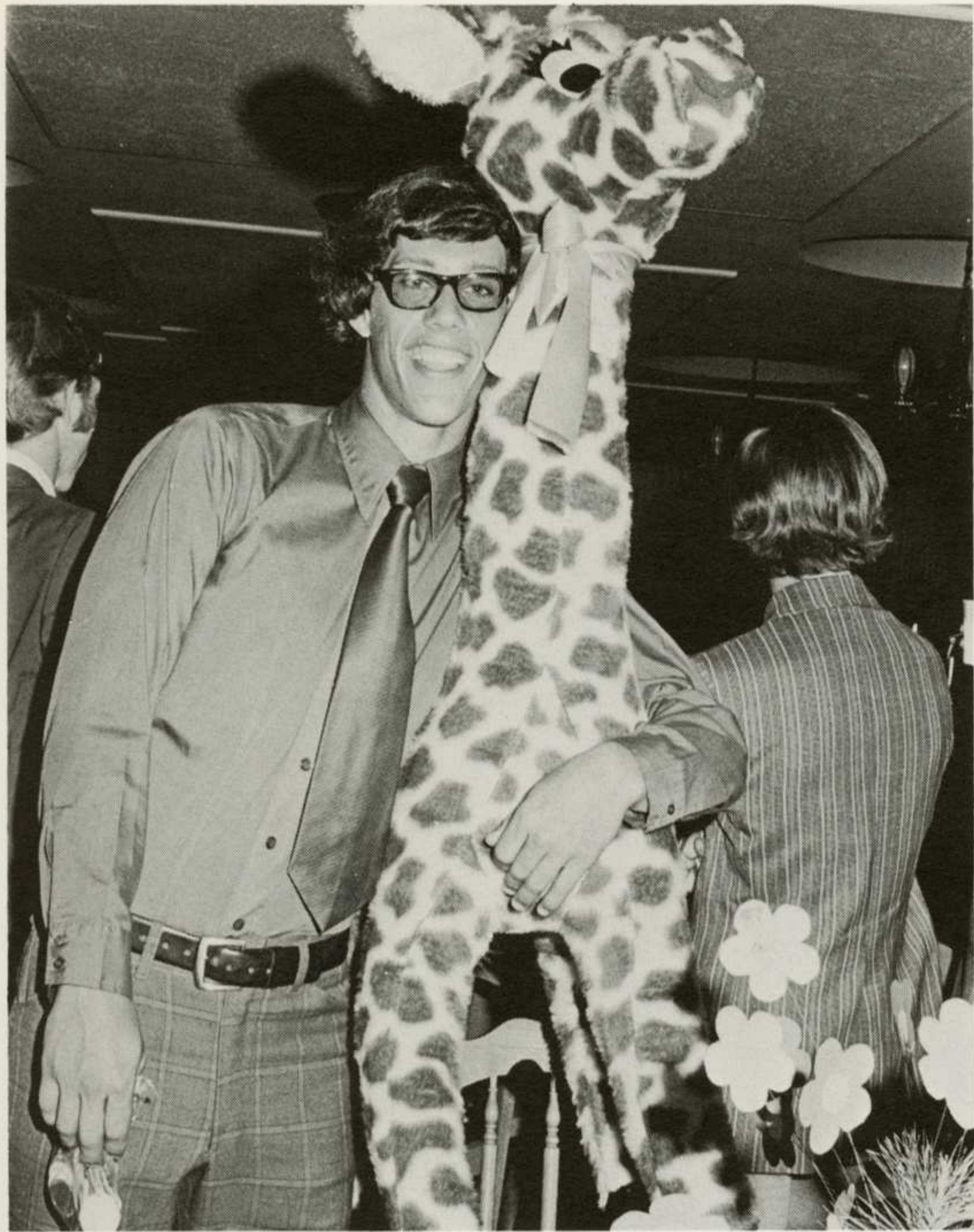

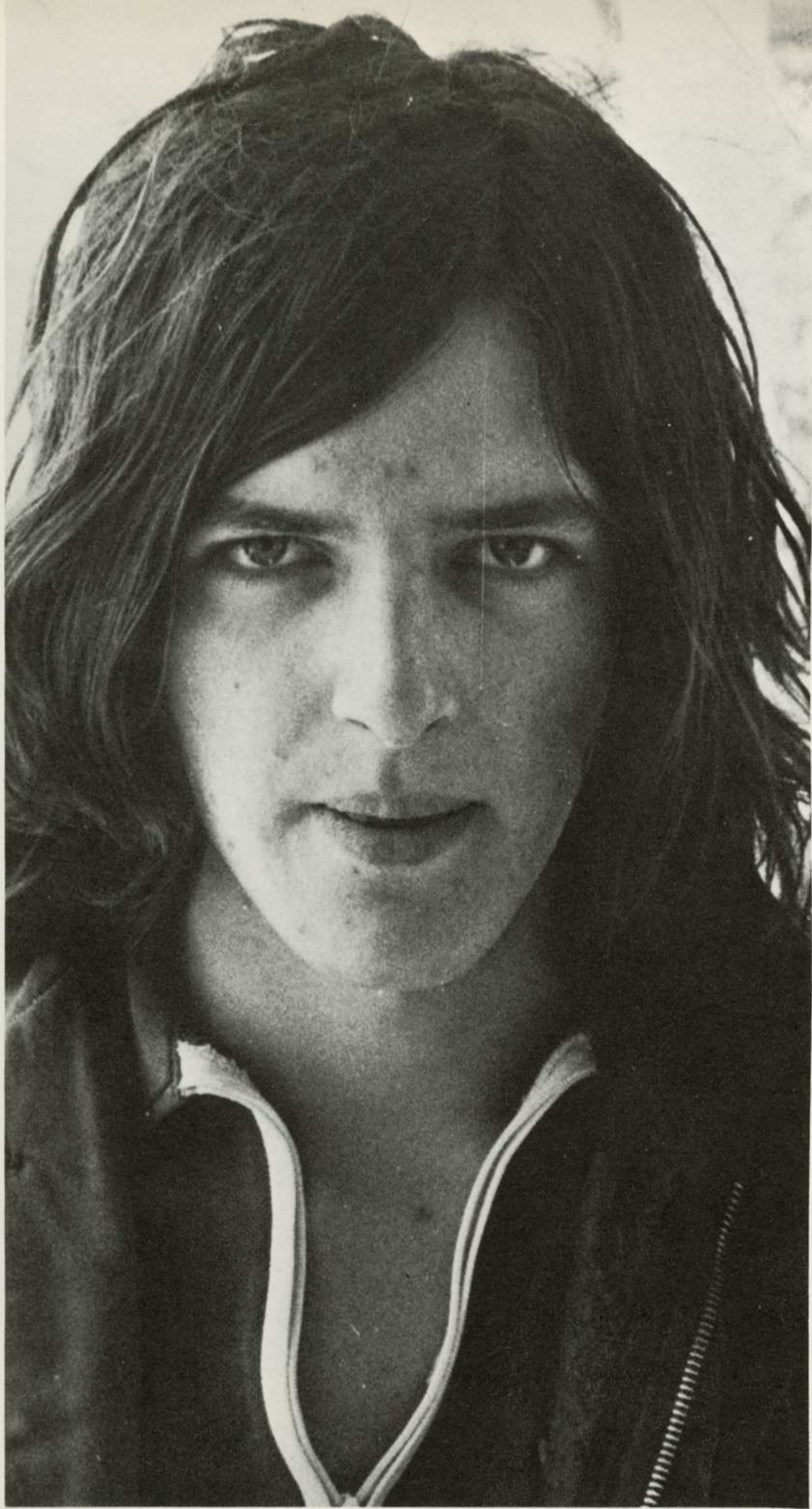

The American Field Service Club achieved a very successful year in 1970-71. Our AFS students this year were Kongkeaw Witchwot (known as Kae-Kae), from Thailand and Jean-Philippe Pernet, from France. Both Kae-Kae and Jean-Philippe, along with several other area AFS'ers, spoke at the AFS assembly which was part of the annual AFS day in January. Several money-making ventures were successfully completed, including an AFS Christmas sale. Money earned was used to help sponsor exchange students going to and coming from Worthington. Meetings consisted of several interesting programs, such as hearing a speaker from Turkey and seeing Kae-Kae perform dances of Thailand.

Student Council effected some rather interesting changes this year, including some in its own structure. The changes insured that future council candidates will have to run actively for office and will be elected at large by only those students who have registered to vote. This registration process was enacted for the purpose of "Weeding out" apathetic voters and candidates. Council will also be smaller—a streamlined 48 rather than a cumbersome 148 member.

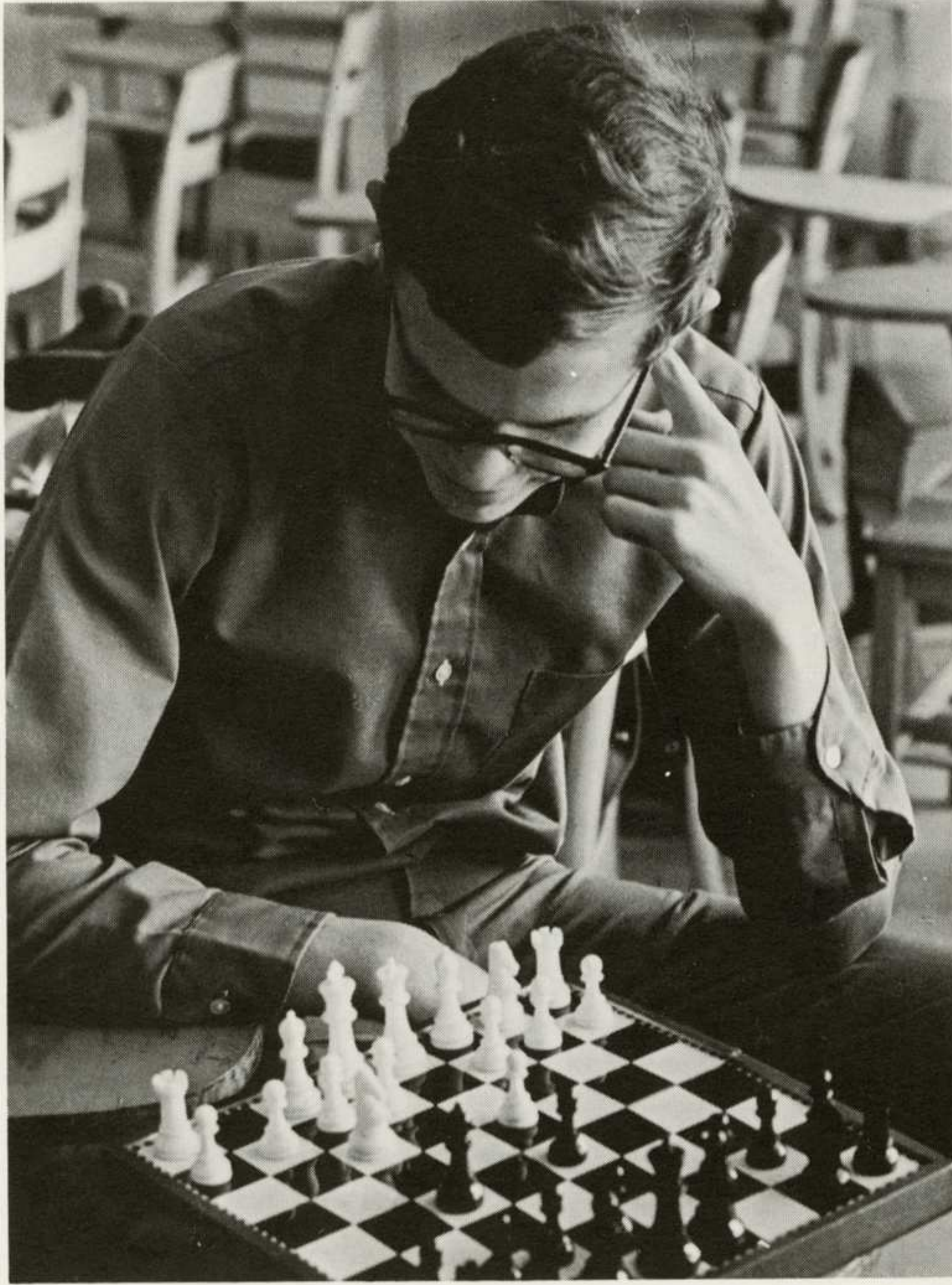
In addition to reorganizing its own structure, this year's Student Council also proposed a lunch option program, created a Beautification Committee, and initiated a parliamentary position.

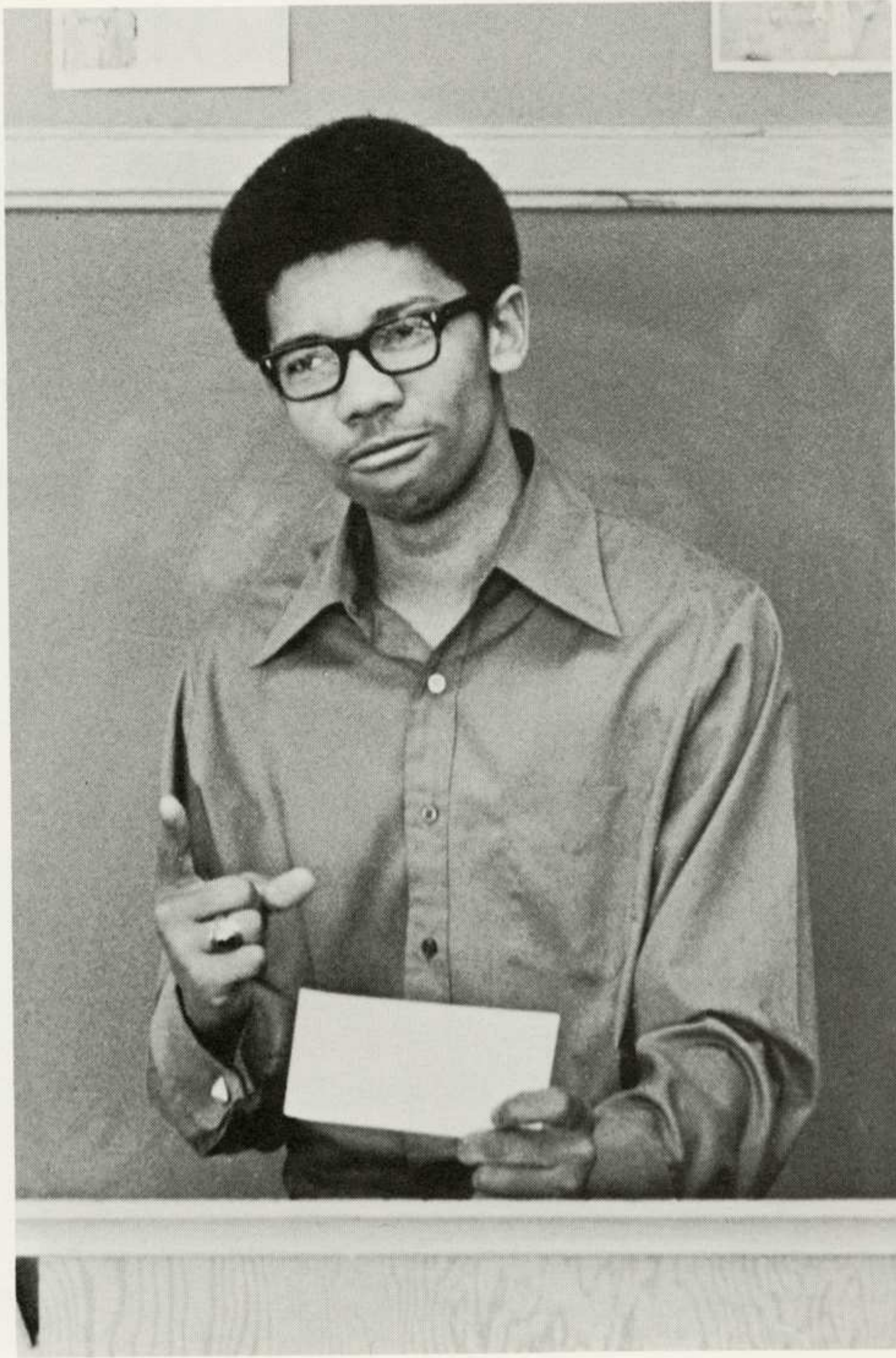

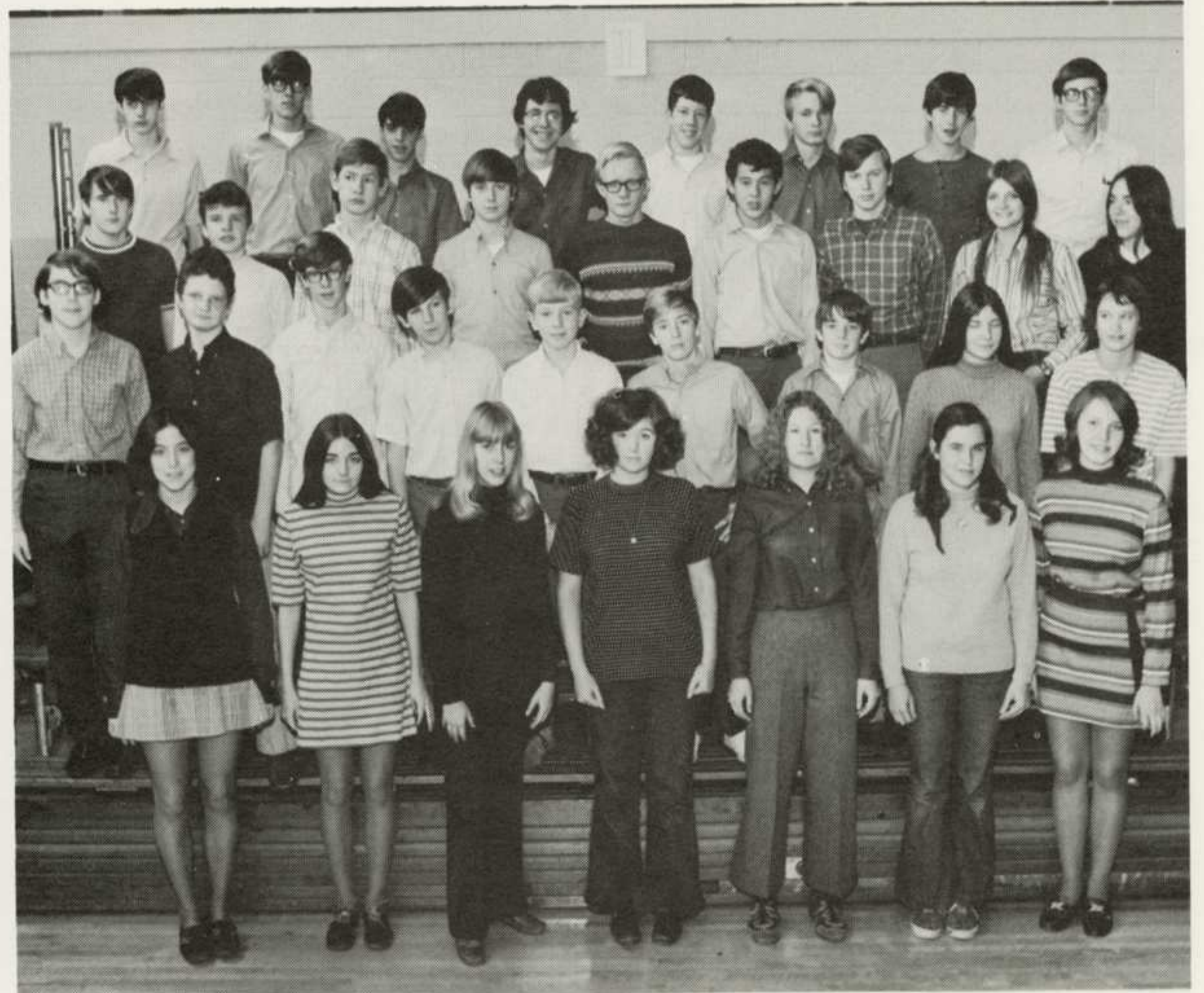

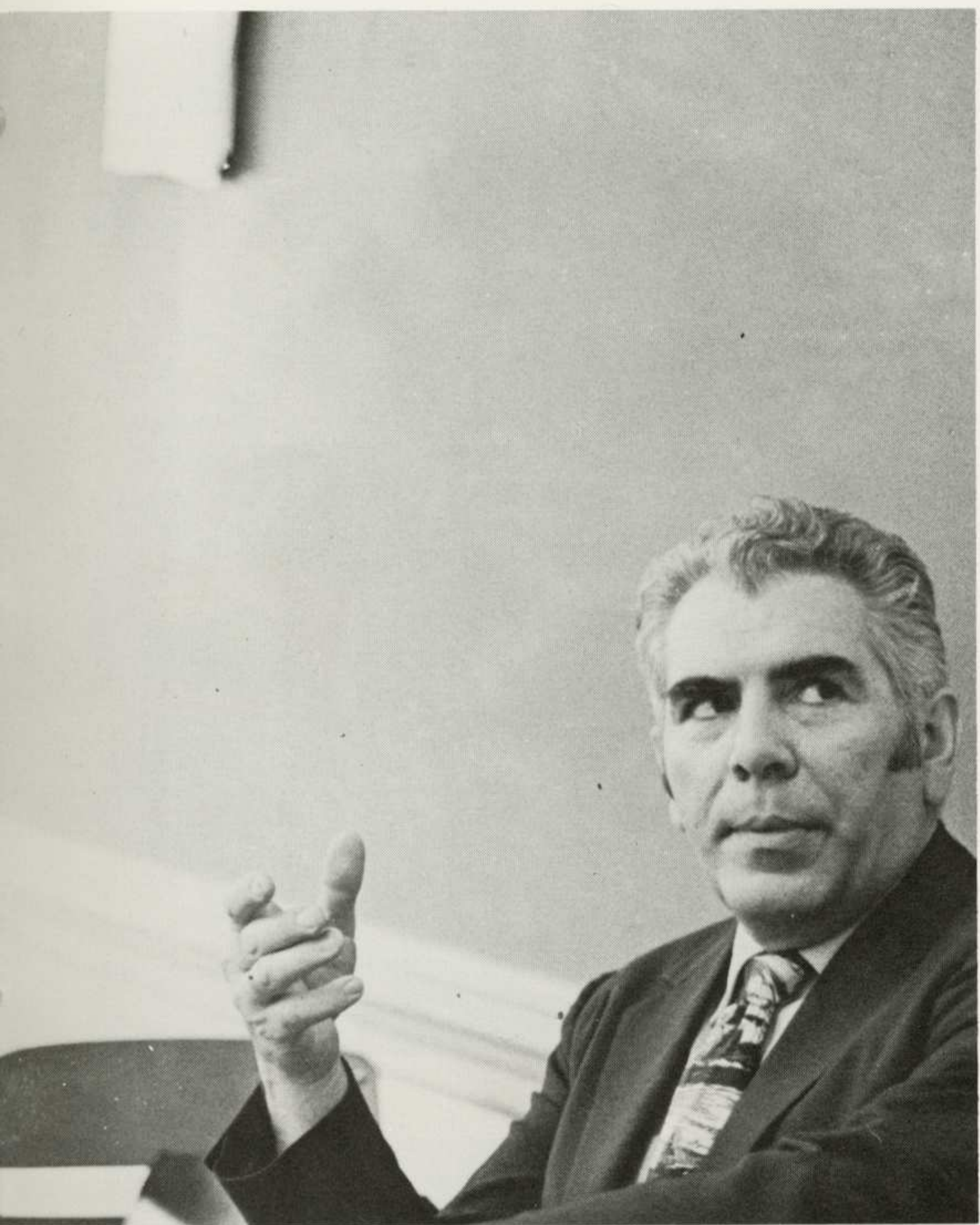

Perhaps the most well-traveled group of Worthington, the ecology club rounded out a year among the earth's finest ecosystems, with several hiking trips to Hocking Hills and Clifton Gorge, a canoe trip down the Mohican River, and a caving trip to Carter Caves. The club helped sponsor a newspaper collection truck at the high school and the earth fair in March. The earth fair was co-sponsored by ecology club and the advanced biology classes to raise money for O.P.I.A.G., The Ohio Public Interest Action Group. The Action Group was a brainchild of Ralph Nader to give individuals in the state financial, scientific and legal aid to improve ecology.

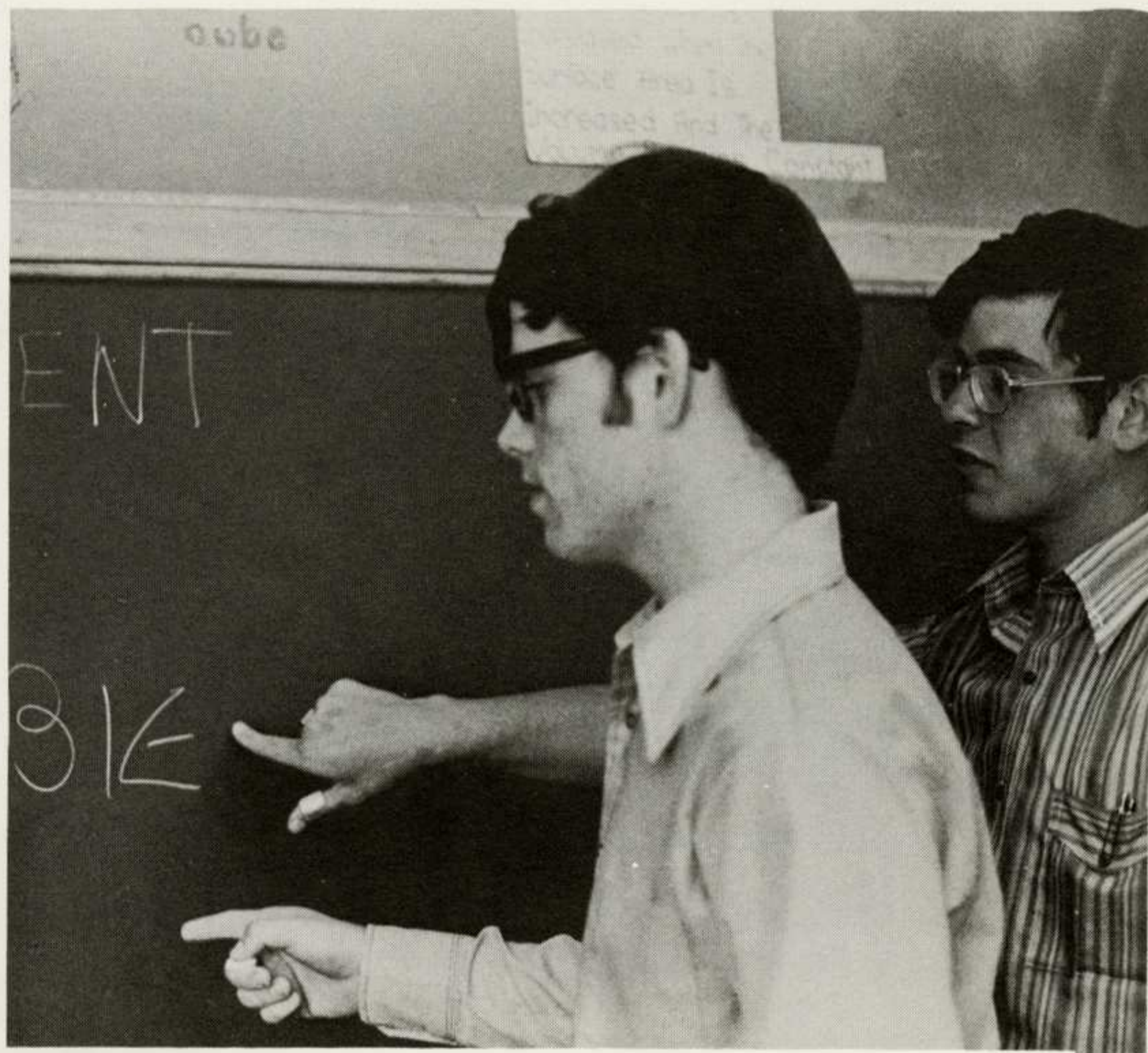


science, geonomy, radio clubs make waves frequently

The radio men co-waxed into a chrysalized component working toward transforming themselves from oscillating novices to licensed operators. The Race Relations study group held weekly meetings for rap sessions and social gatherings; many Blacks attended Vanguard meetings also. The Vanguard is an organization of Black students in greater Columbus to discuss the racial problems of the school and community and possible solutions to those problems.

The group planned the activities of Black Experience Week. They presented the play **The Man Nobody Saw**. They arranged for Charles Ross, director of Black Studies at O.S.U., to speak at an assembly. His remarks about Black Nationalism proved controversial and stimulating to students. Artistic displays in the showcases were created. Evaluations showed that students wanted Black Experience Week repeated.

The Soul Food Dinner was prepared by the students and held in the East Cafeteria. Fried chicken, chittlings, sweet potatoes, rolls, greens, black-eyed peas—a variety of delicious foods were served. Posters and records by Black artists provided sensual stimulation. The group also took children from the ghetto on an all day picnic in early May.

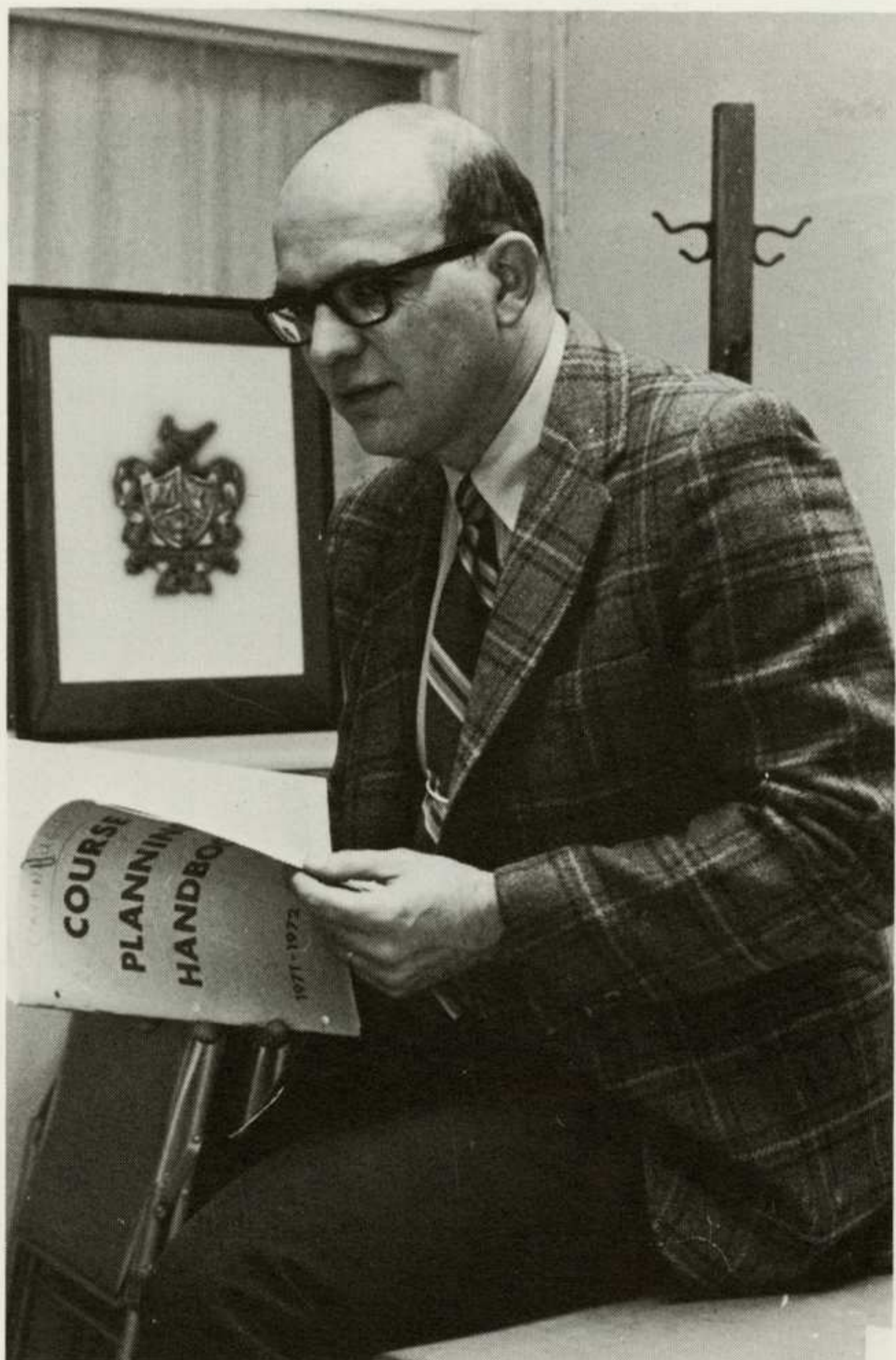
communications is their goal

After one semester, Worthington High School's new principal, Mr. David Cavanaugh, described the students as "tops." He said he was very happy here and thought the community was very supportive and interested in the school.

Mr. Cavanaugh came to Worthington after working in schools in Dayton and Oxford, Ohio. Mr. Wilcox, a new assistant principal, Mr. Merilees, and Mr. Cavanaugh all worked to effect several new programs. Ninth period release and lunch option worked well, primarily due to the students' recognition of their rights and responsibilities. Mr. Cavanaugh had great confidence in Student Council and lunched with the officers weekly.

Many administrative committees were at work in the school. The Advisory Cabinet helped develop policy, evaluated curriculum and improved communication between the administration and the departments. The Guidance Council handled special student requests and problems with faculty and guidance. The Athletic Board, Library Committee, Activities Committee, Social Committee, and Sunshine Committee were active. The Student-Faculty Advisory Committee provided feedback to the administration and human relations through dialogue between faculty and students.

The Community Conference Committee had regular free and open forums between all phases of the school and representatives of the community. The In Service Education Committee was given three questions to examine: Where is education at WHS now? Where should it go? How can we achieve the goals? Mr. Cavanaugh's desire is a flexible schedule with free time for independent study and small group counseling. Proper facilities would be required; rooms would be needed for large group instruction, seminars, resource areas for each department, open labs, and student lounges.

The guidance department revised the career orientation program and developed a program to be included in the Interdisciplinary Studies course next year. The consulting psychological services were expanded. A brochure about the guidance department was sent to the parents of sophomores to acquaint them with the new services of the department.

Next year, twenty-eight one semester English courses will be offered. In the meantime, many new approaches were used this year. Freshman and sophomores used supplementary texts of contemporary literature from the **Voices of Man** series. **The Black American Experience**, an anthology, was utilized by the sophomore classes to create an awareness and understanding of Blacks through Black literature.

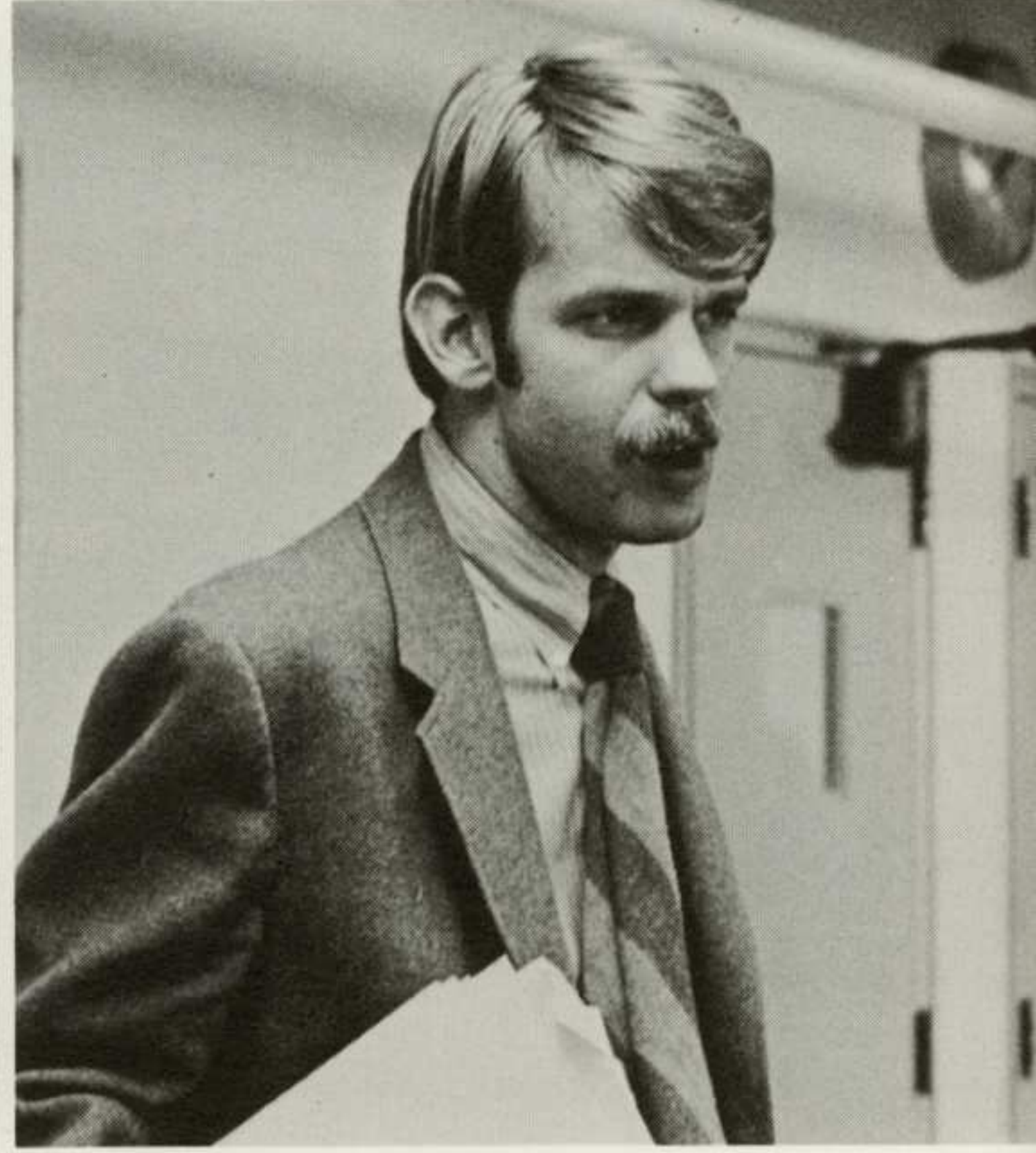
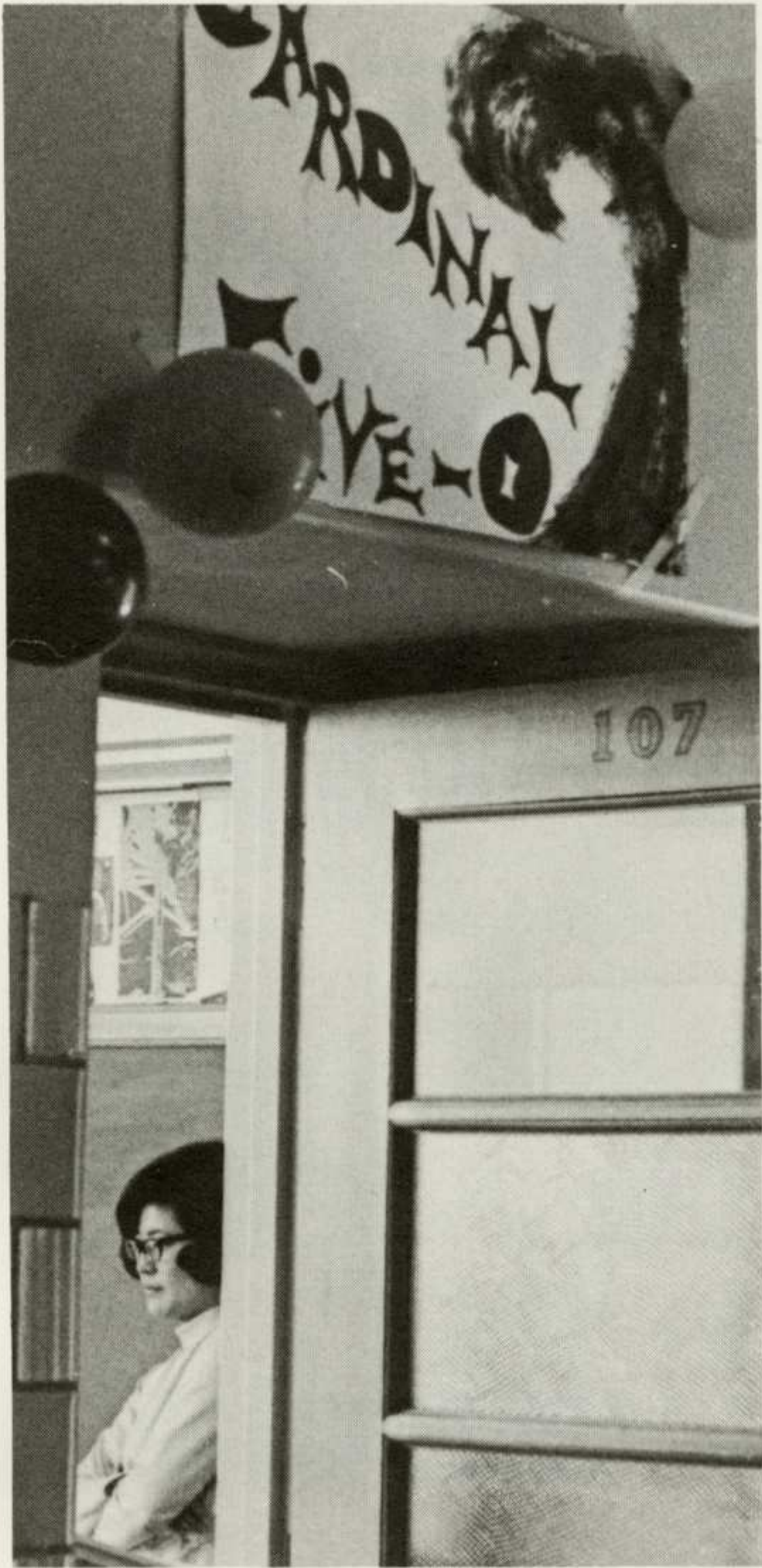

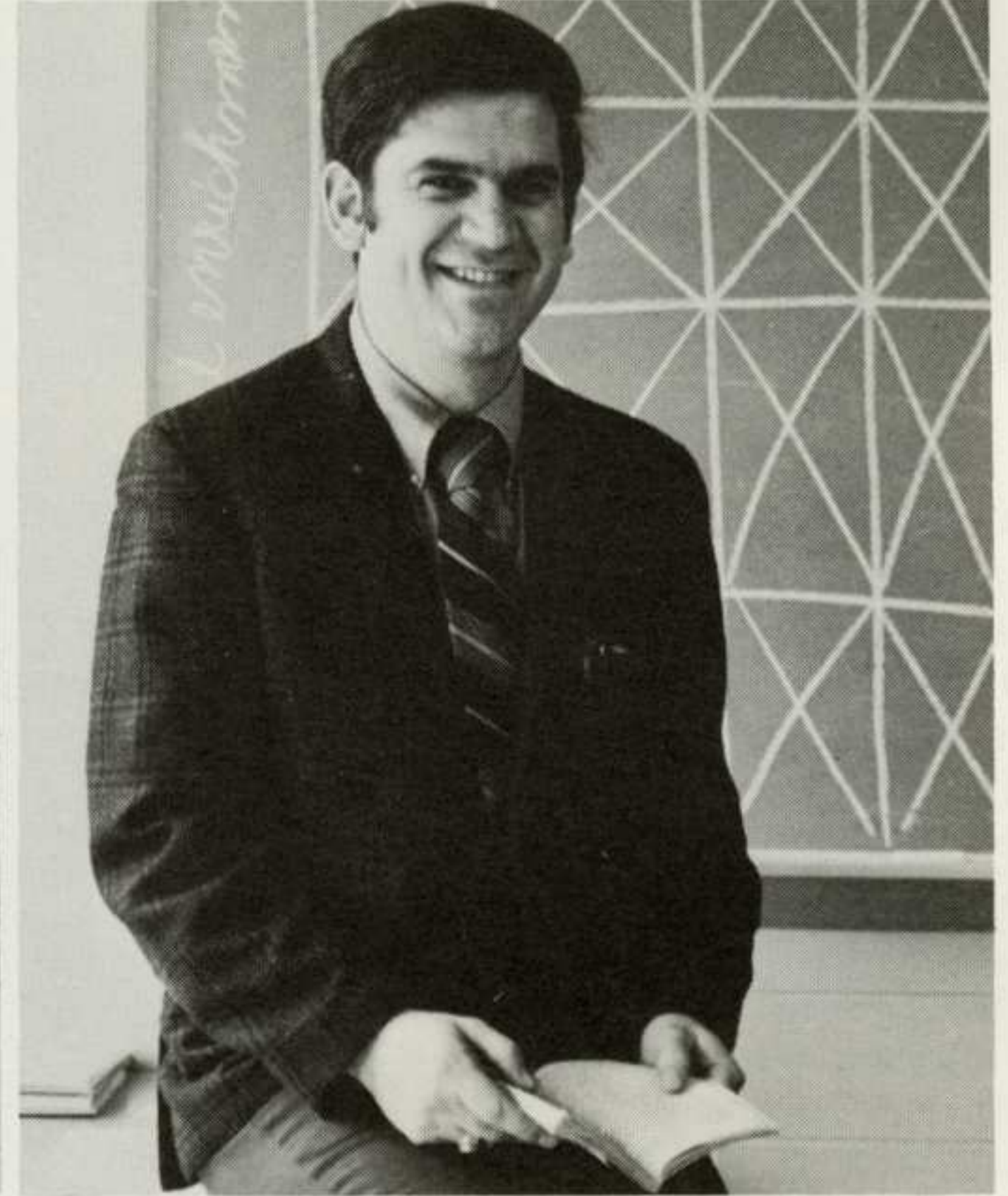
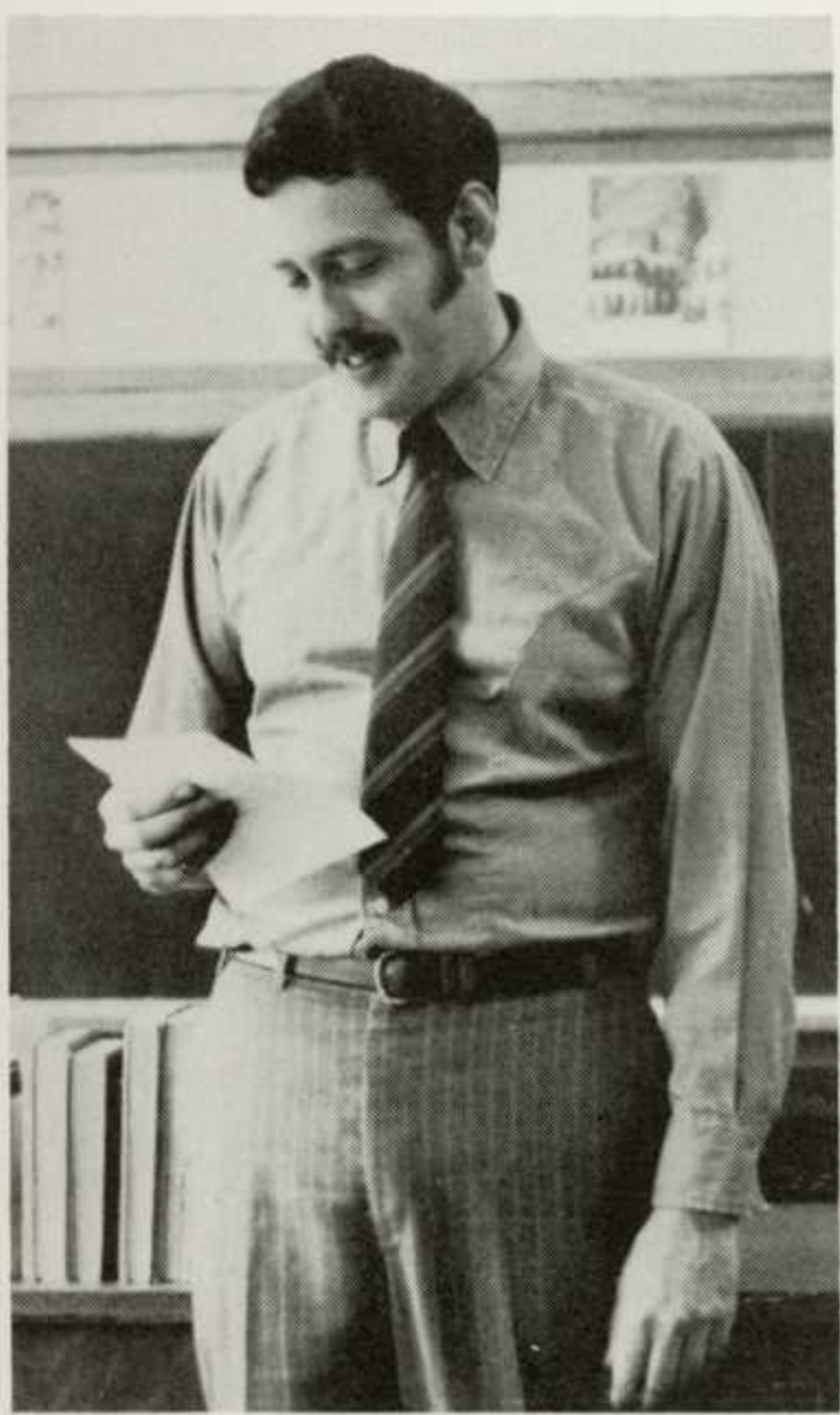
five complete language courses, conversational, cultural aspects are emphasized

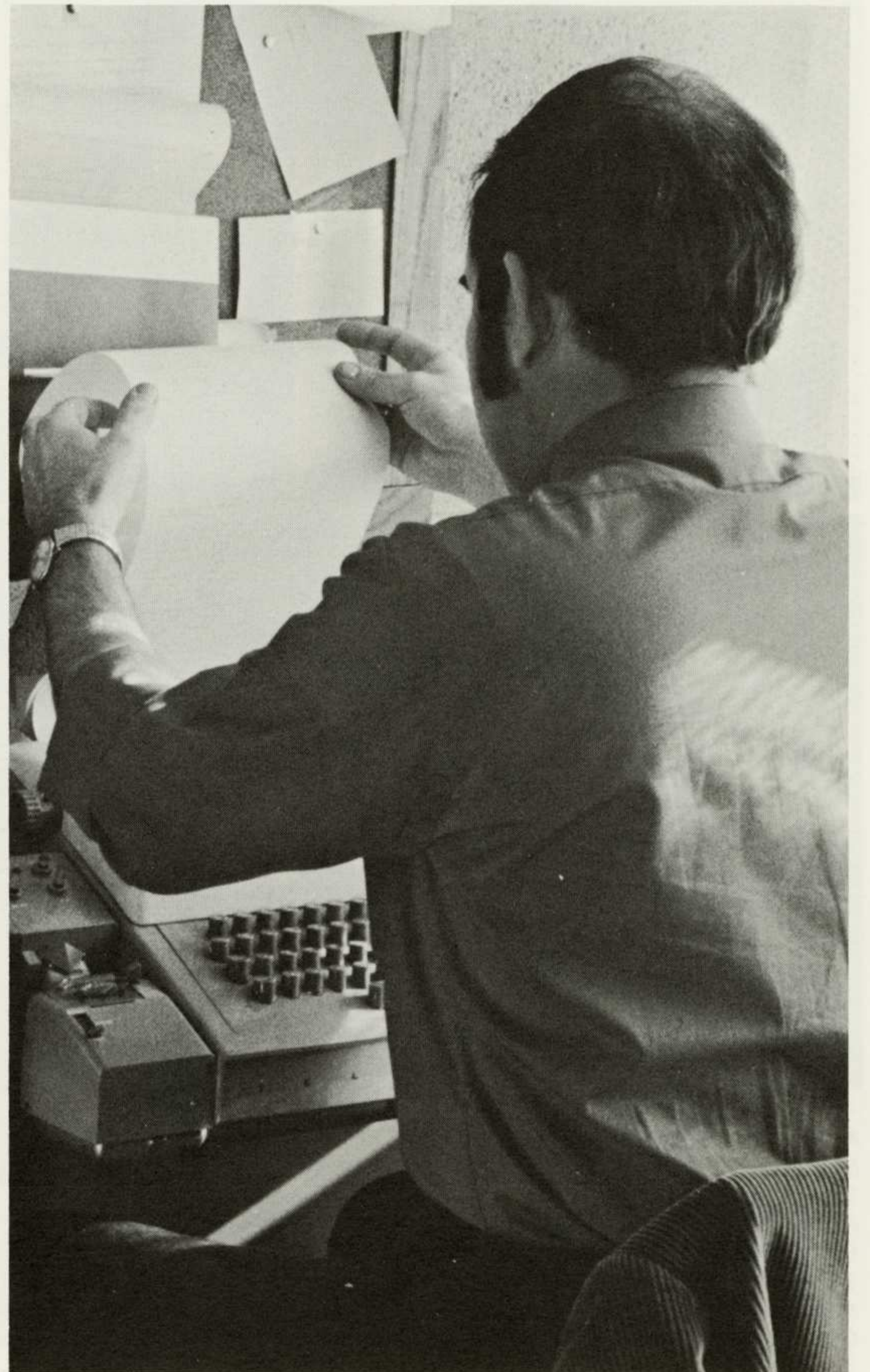
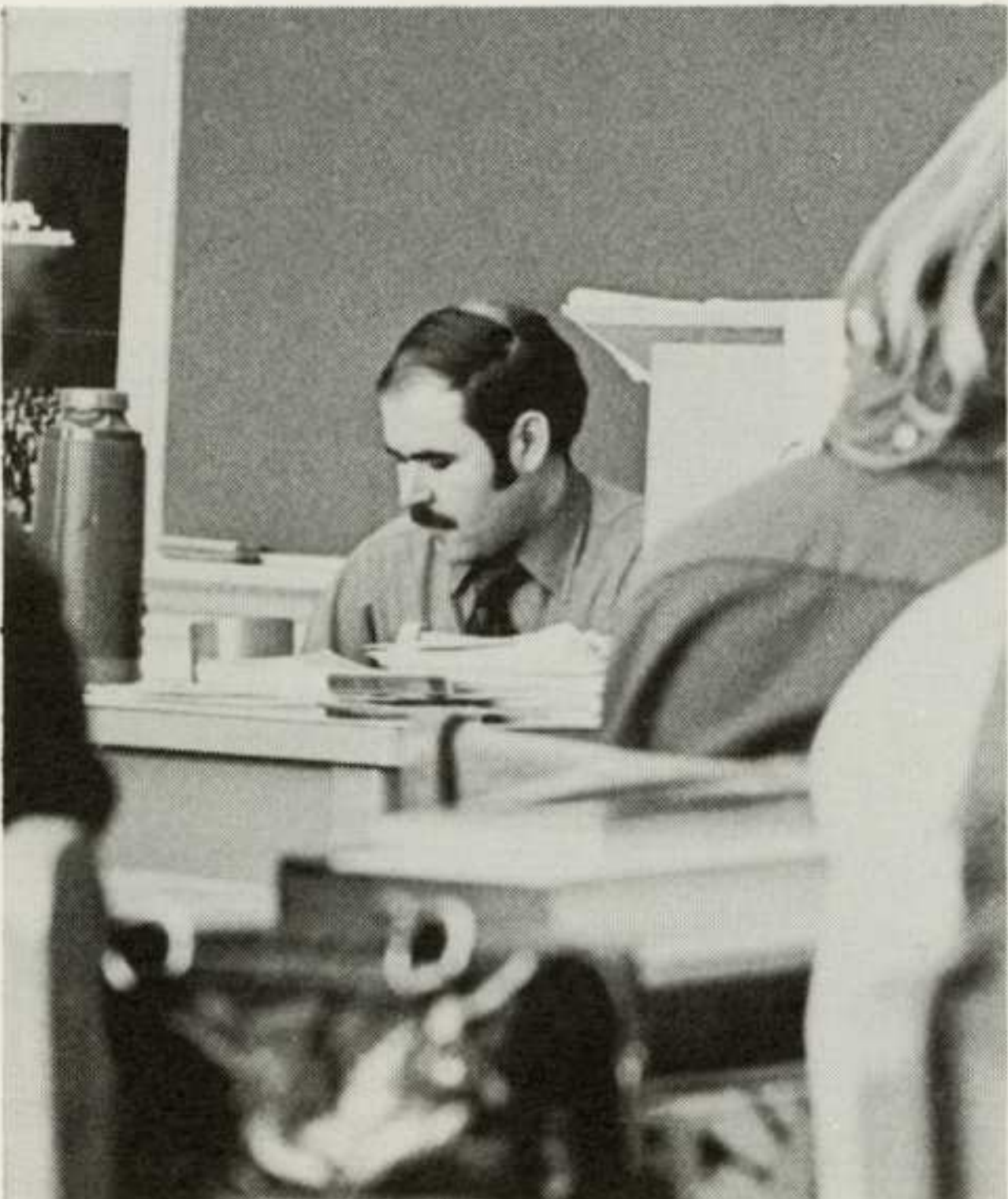
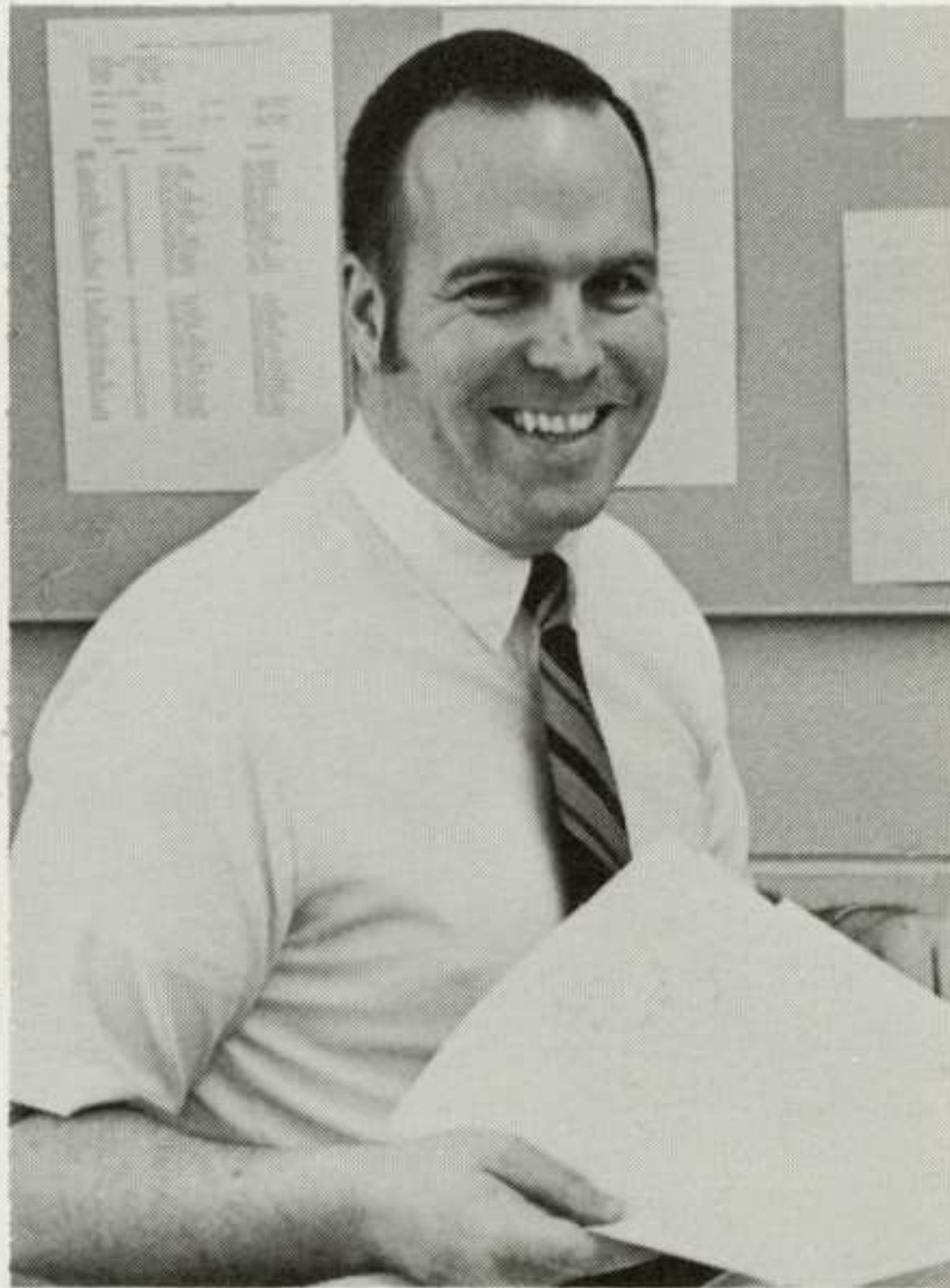
Worthing High School's social studies department, under the leadership of department chairman Mr. John Steitz, revived its curriculum this year to meet the broadening interests of students. The senior government course was revised to a one semester course. This left a semester available for seniors to take an elective, from behavioral sciences, minorities studies, comparative political systems and economic geography. The behavioral sciences classes studied racism, adolescent behavior, and educational theories. The minorities studies classes investigated the culture and history of American's important minority groups. The comparative political systems course contrasted the different forms of government. Economic geography students learned of economic resources and how these resources effect the politics of the world's nations.

Humanities seminar inquired into philosophies of such famous writers as Albert Camus and Ayn Rand. Also, the different religions of the world as well as current issues were studied.

ecology spurs study; projects in physics show new awareness



The WHS science department failed to create life in a test tube or construct any workable nuclear weapons, but science courses were not without interest. Biology classes concentrated on ecology and played an active role in environmental clean-up. This year the advanced biology class coordinated Earth Week efforts with OPIAG and Ecology Club. Another project included a study of ecological systems at Brookside Pond. In chemistry, enterprising students carefully synthesized Christmas candy and later sampled the vitamin C content in various brands of orange juice. A laser, along with a variety of other ostentatious scientific machinery occupied the attention of the physics students during the year. The physics department also initiated an independent study course in which a student could receive a graduated amount of high school credit depending upon the number of hours he worked on an individual science project. The Physics 500 was a new project where students created, or attempted to create frictionless, fast-moving vehicles for a model car race.

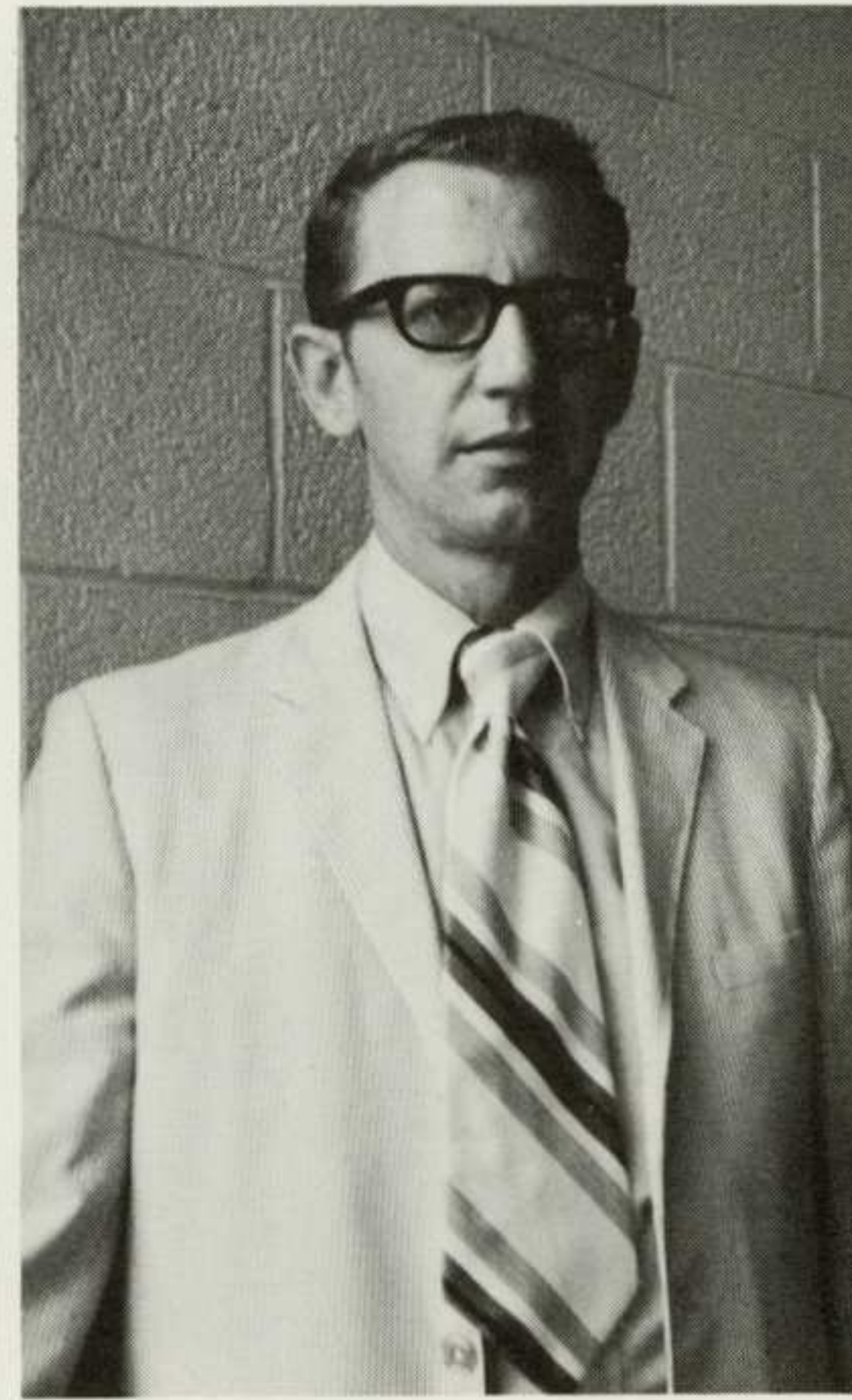
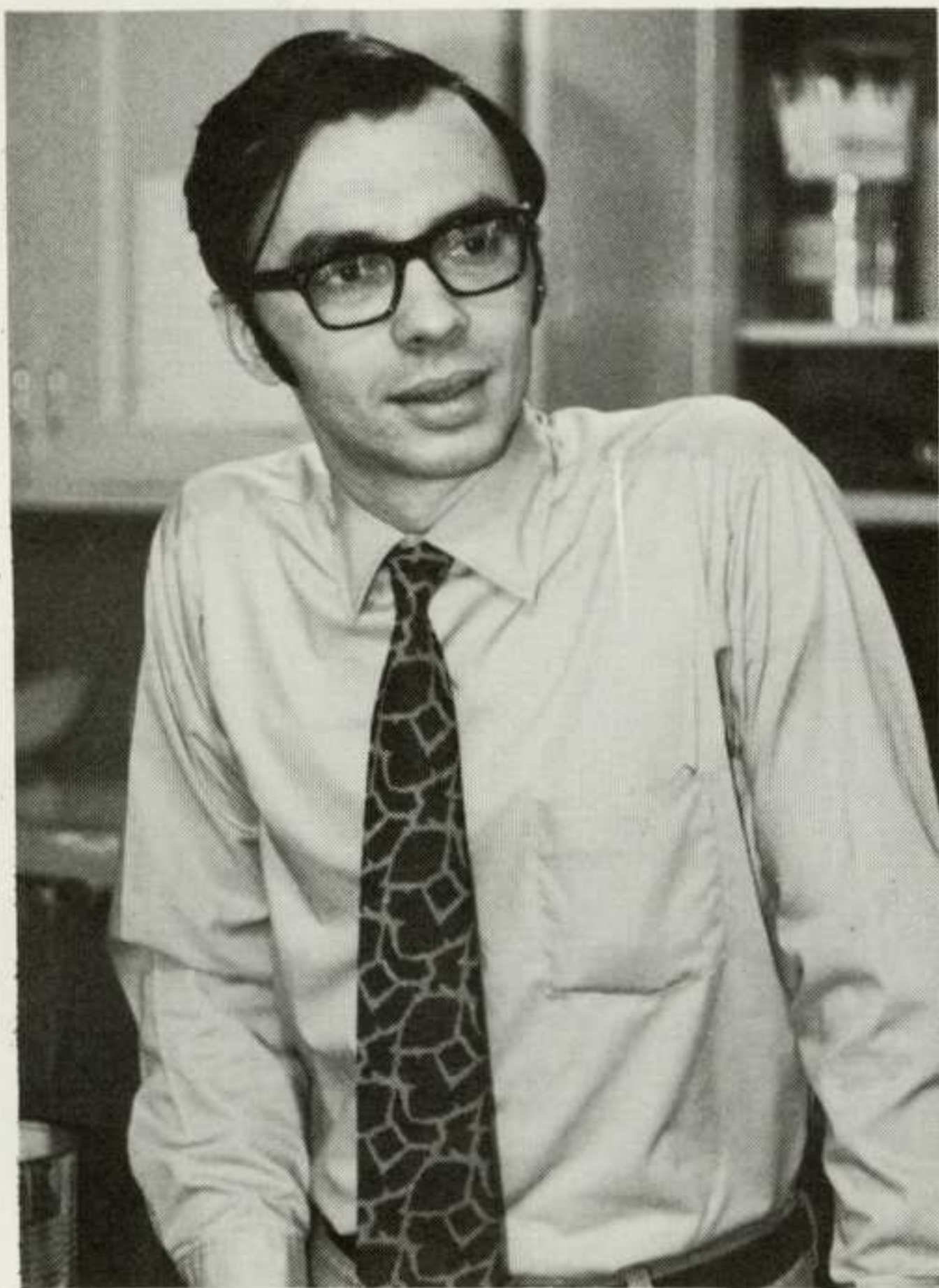
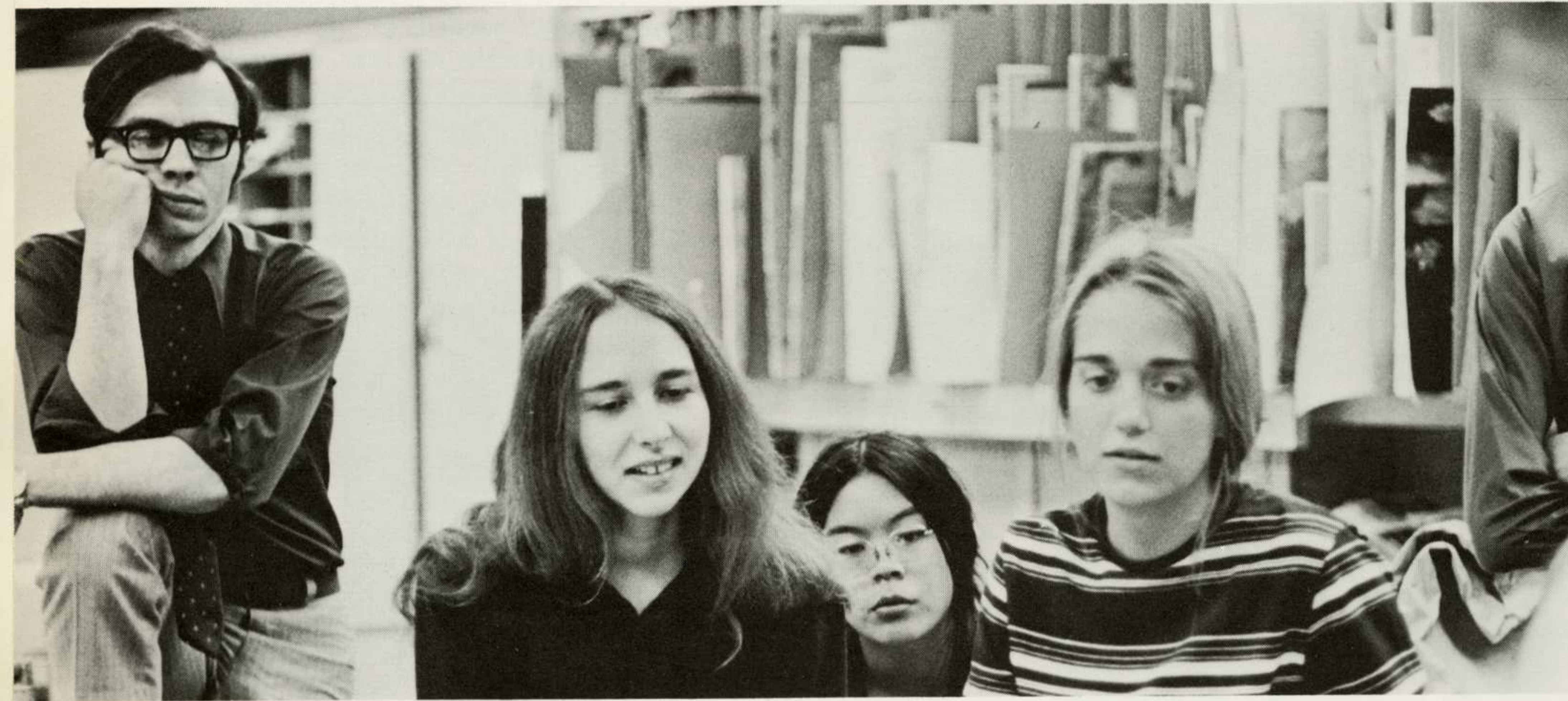

fitness stressed in health and gym

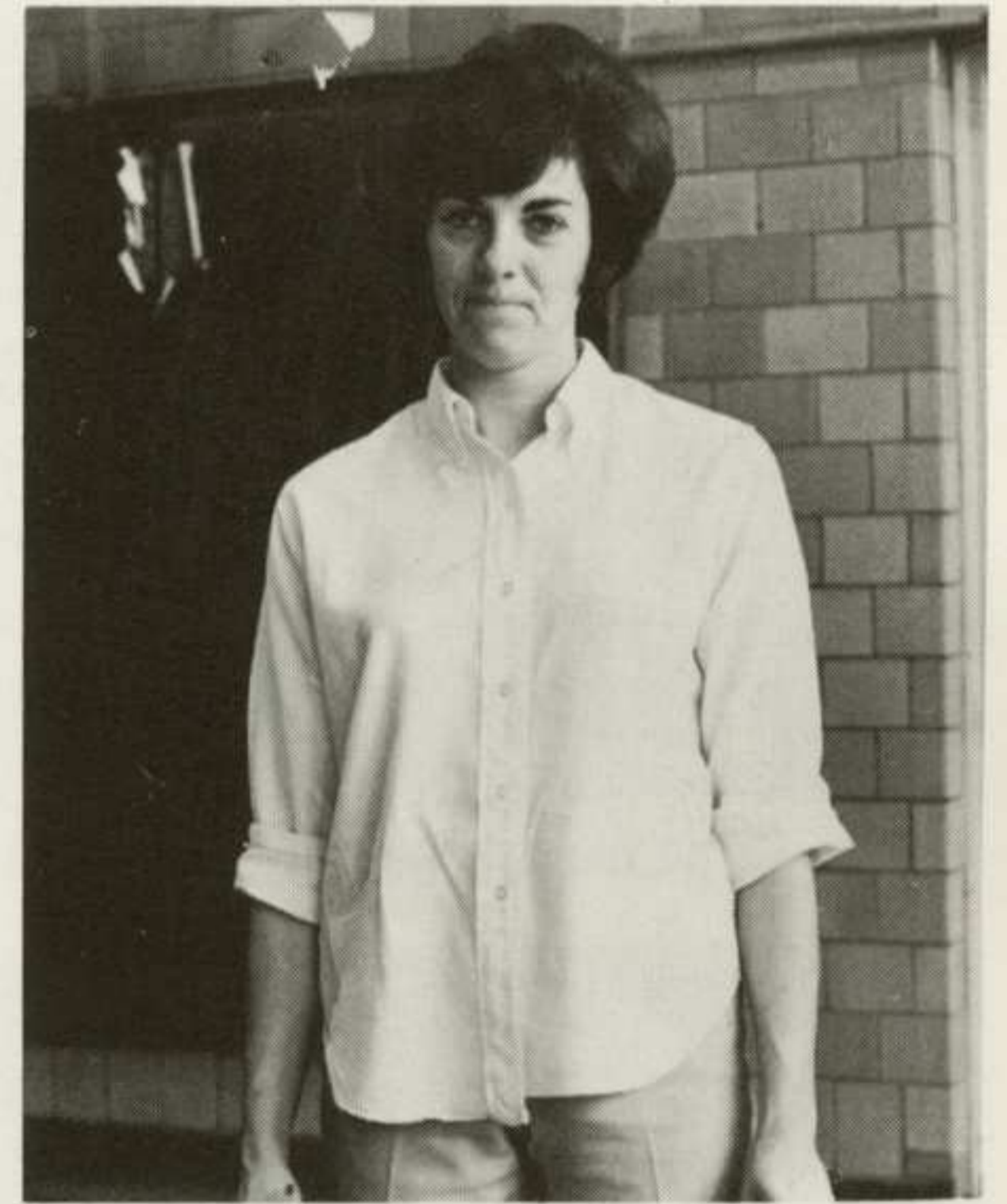
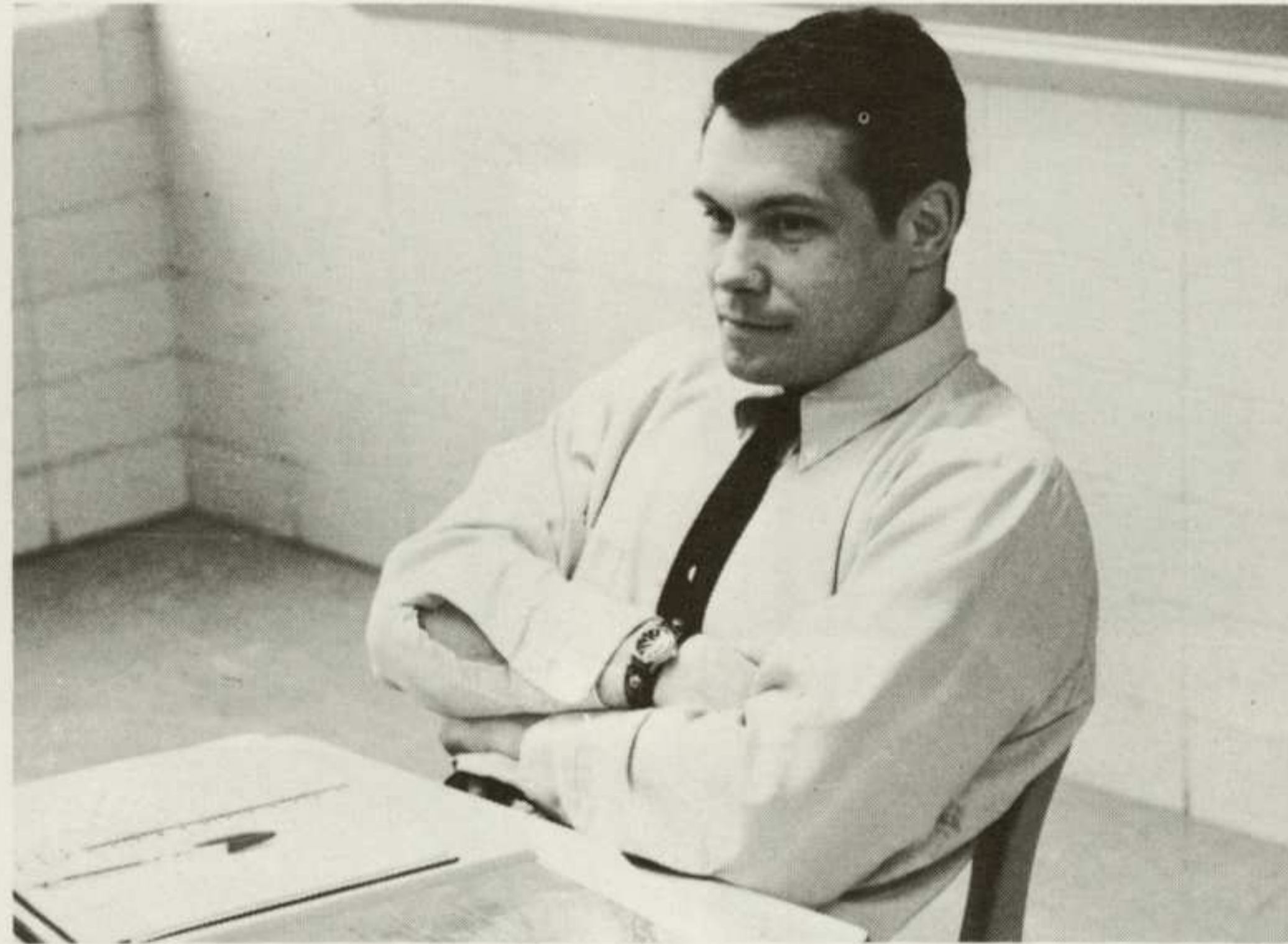


The health office had many visitors. Mrs. Knouff's trained eye knew a put-on when she saw it, and slackers went back to class. She ably applied her training to problems ranging from scratches and cuts to broken legs.

The driver education teachers gave careful instruction in the methods of driving shift and automatic cars. Movies and materials on driver safety were stressed. A simulator shared with several schools in the area, provided students with an opportunity to practice skills before using the actual road.

The health classes added a section on human personality development and human relations. The annual topics of smoking, drinking, and tripping were discussed.

Gym classes exercised muscles and provided relaxation from the usual school classes. The game of horseshoes was brought to life at WHS again.

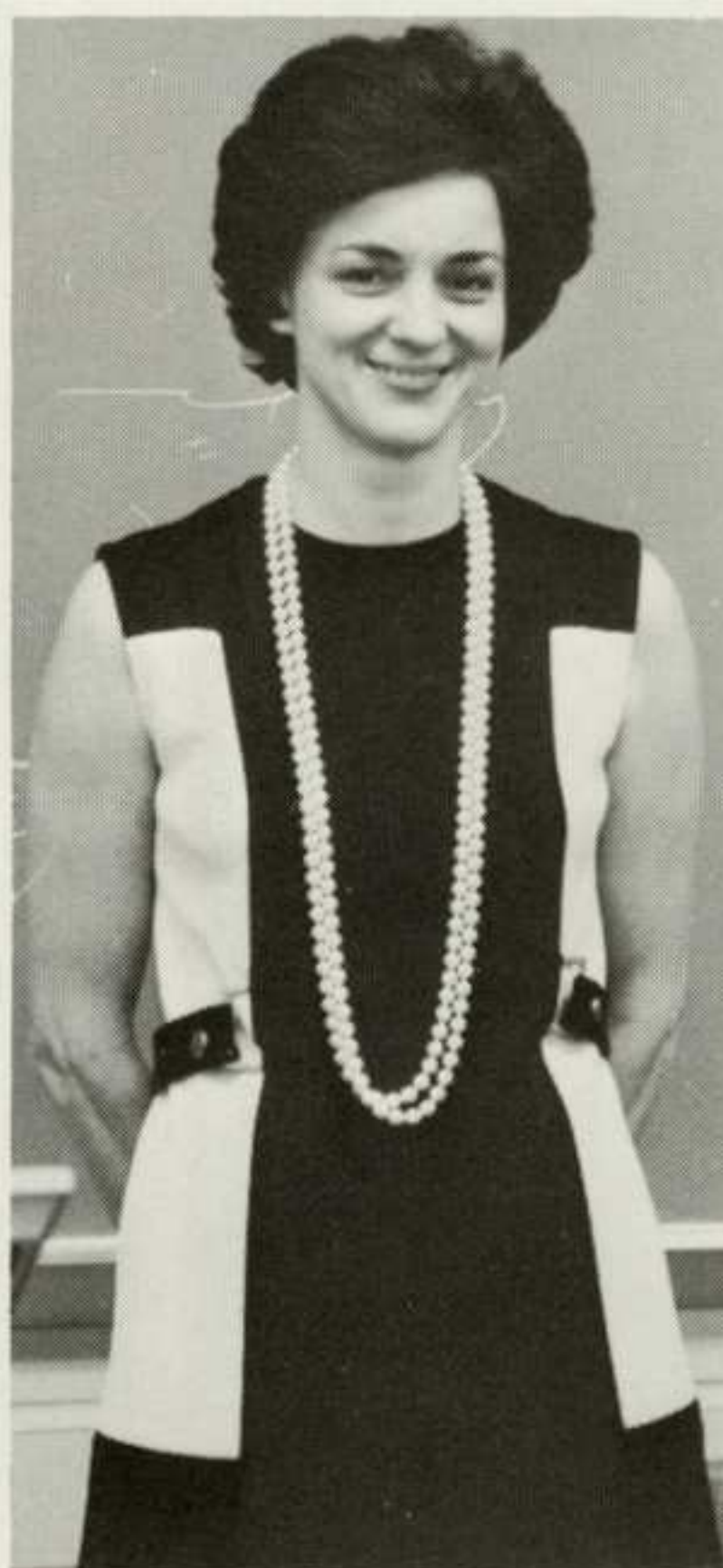
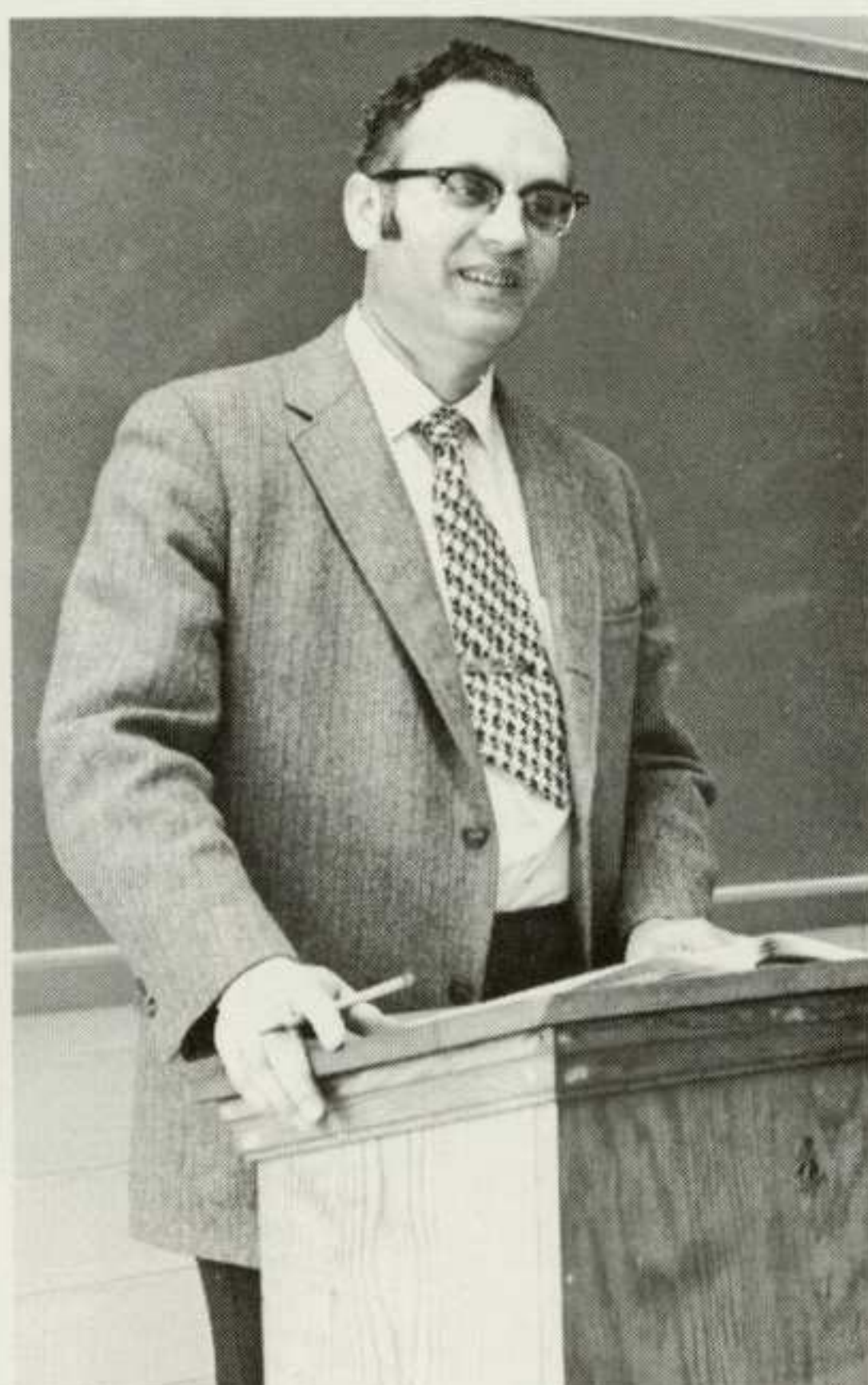
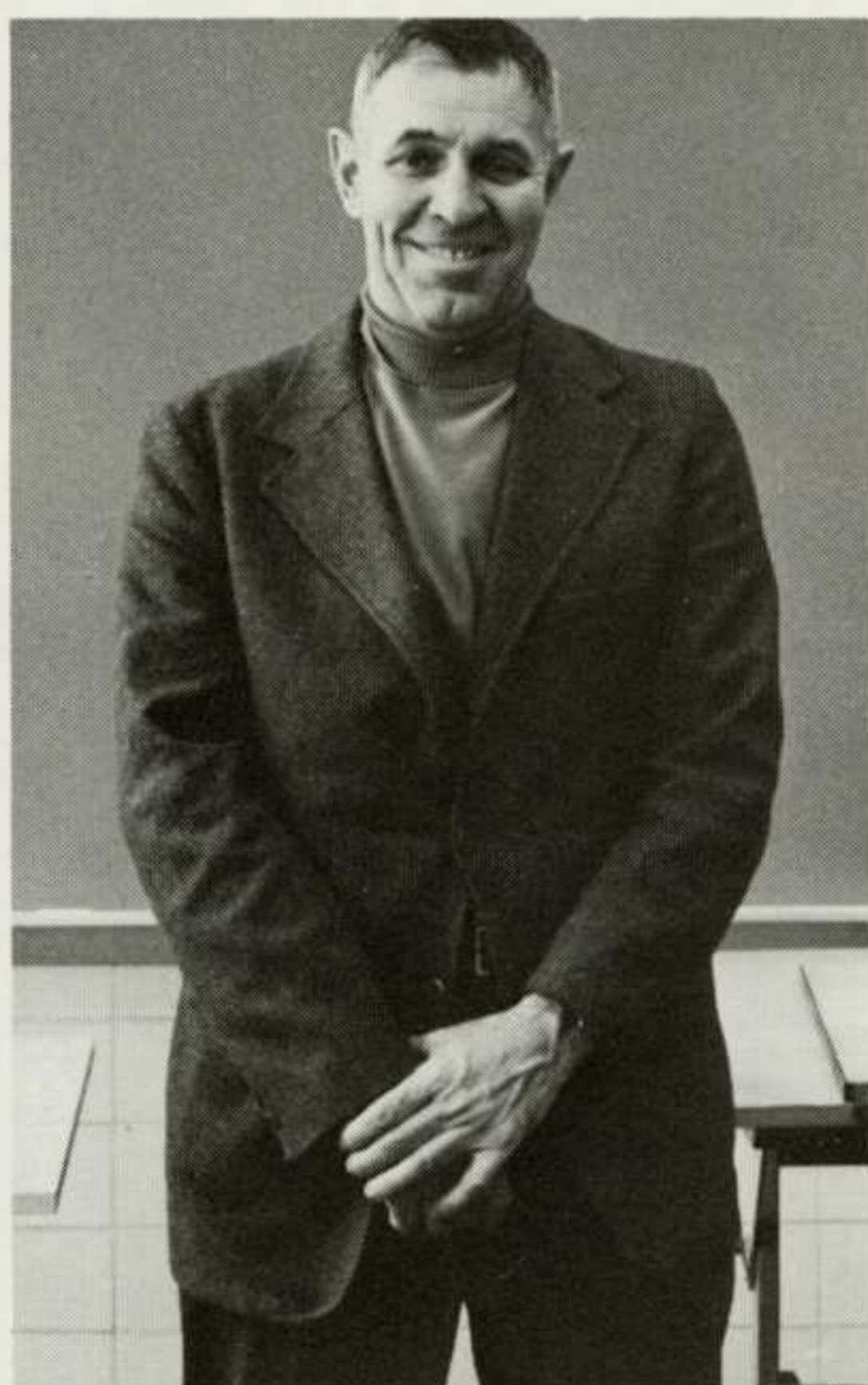
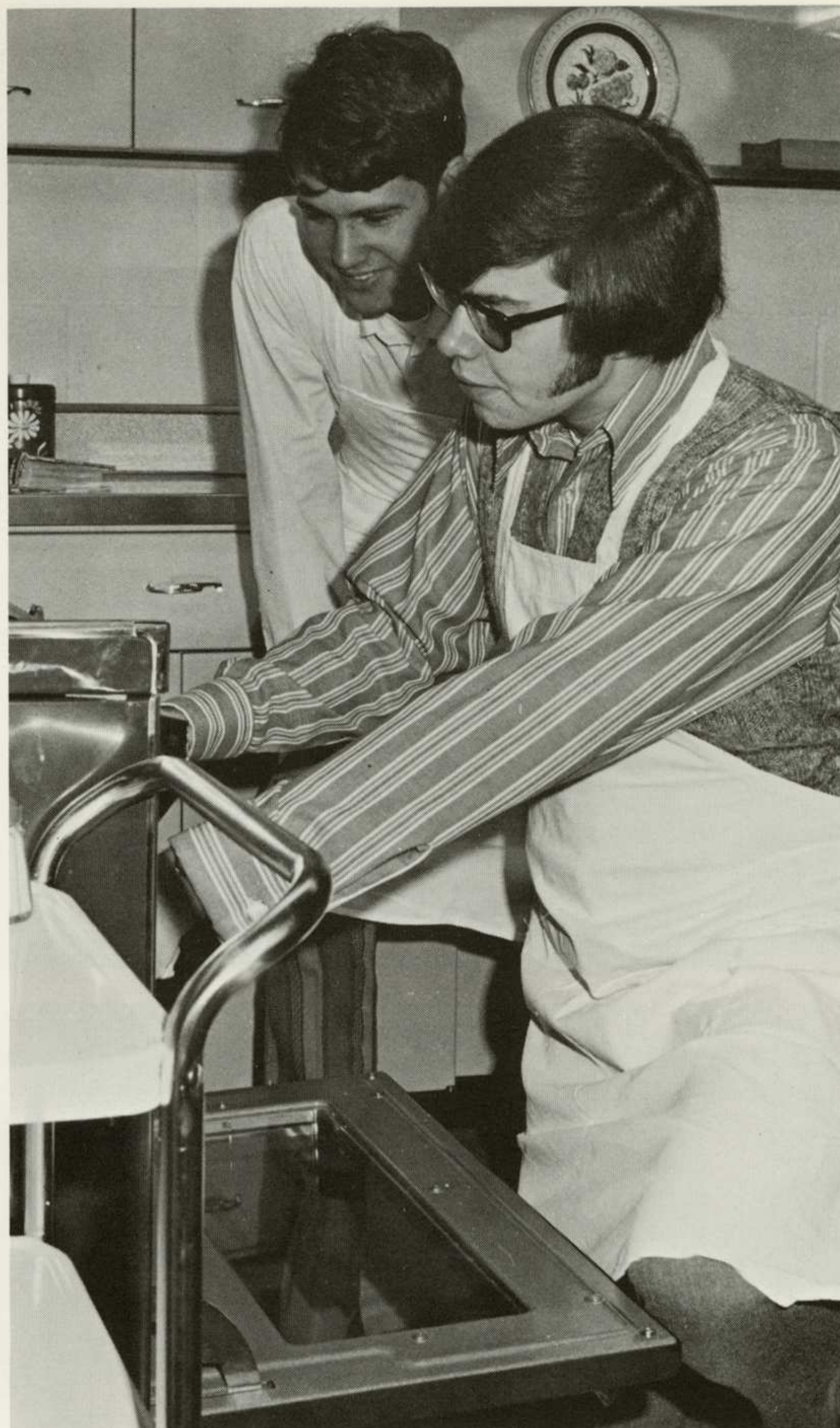

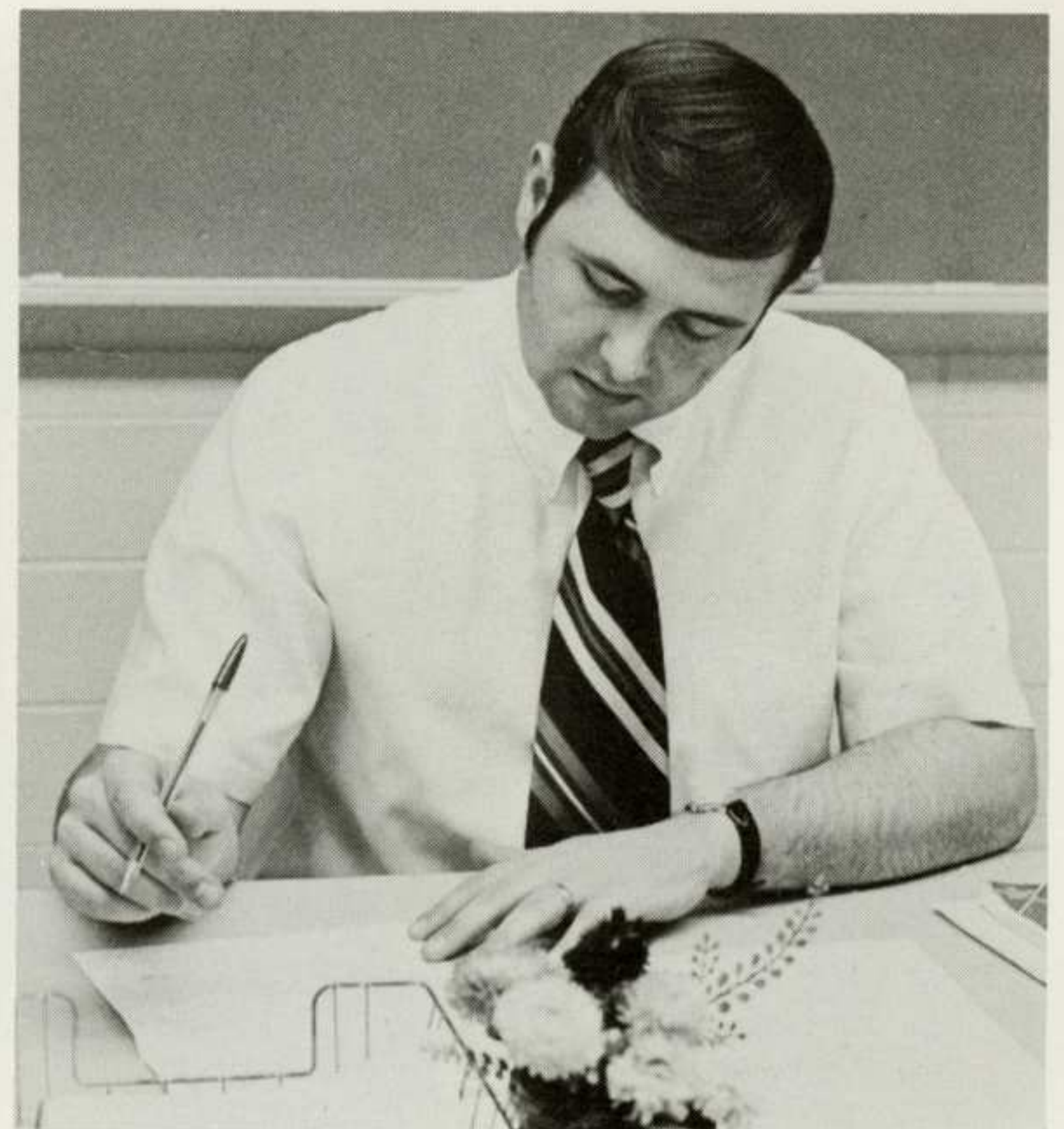
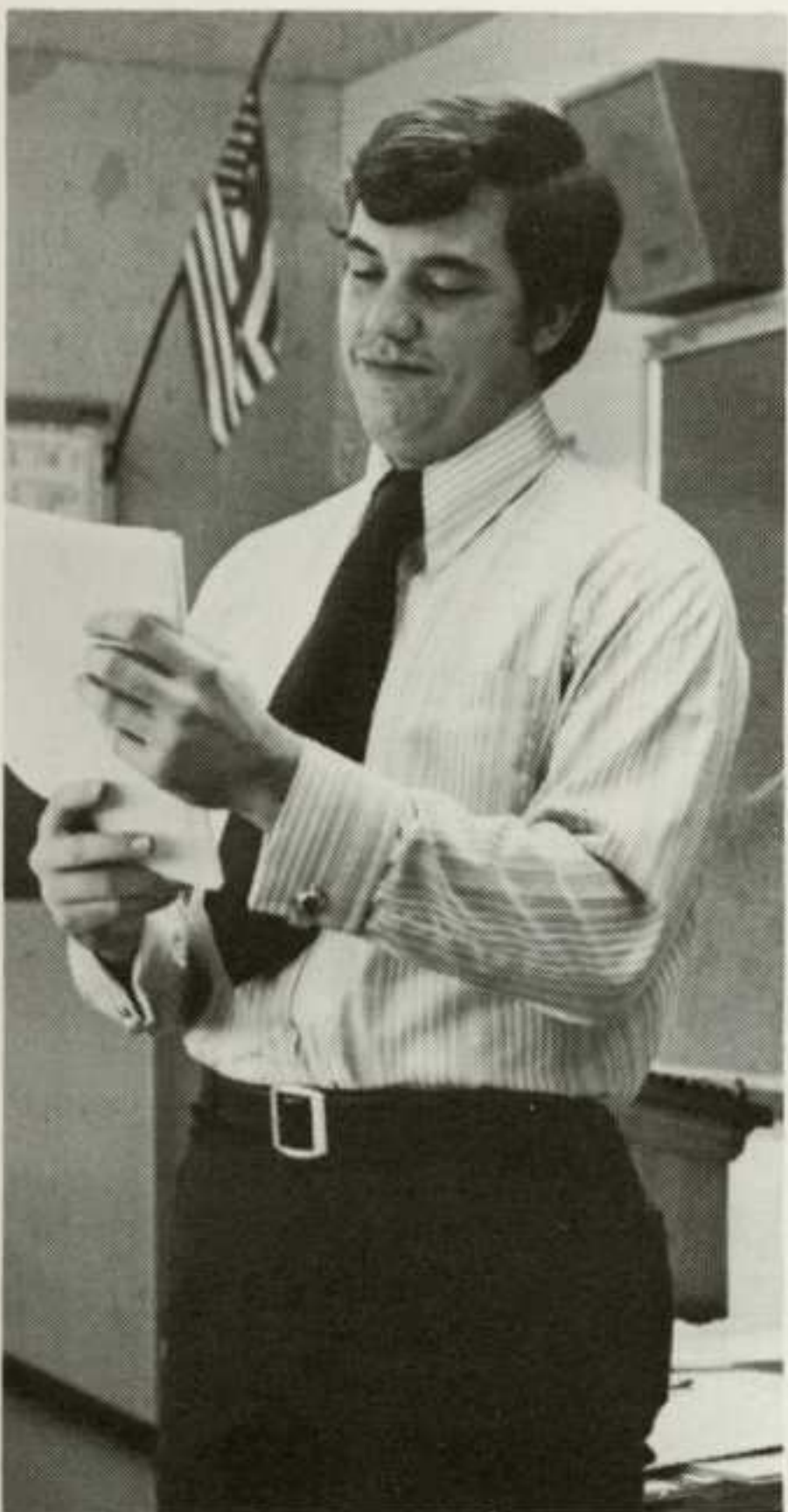
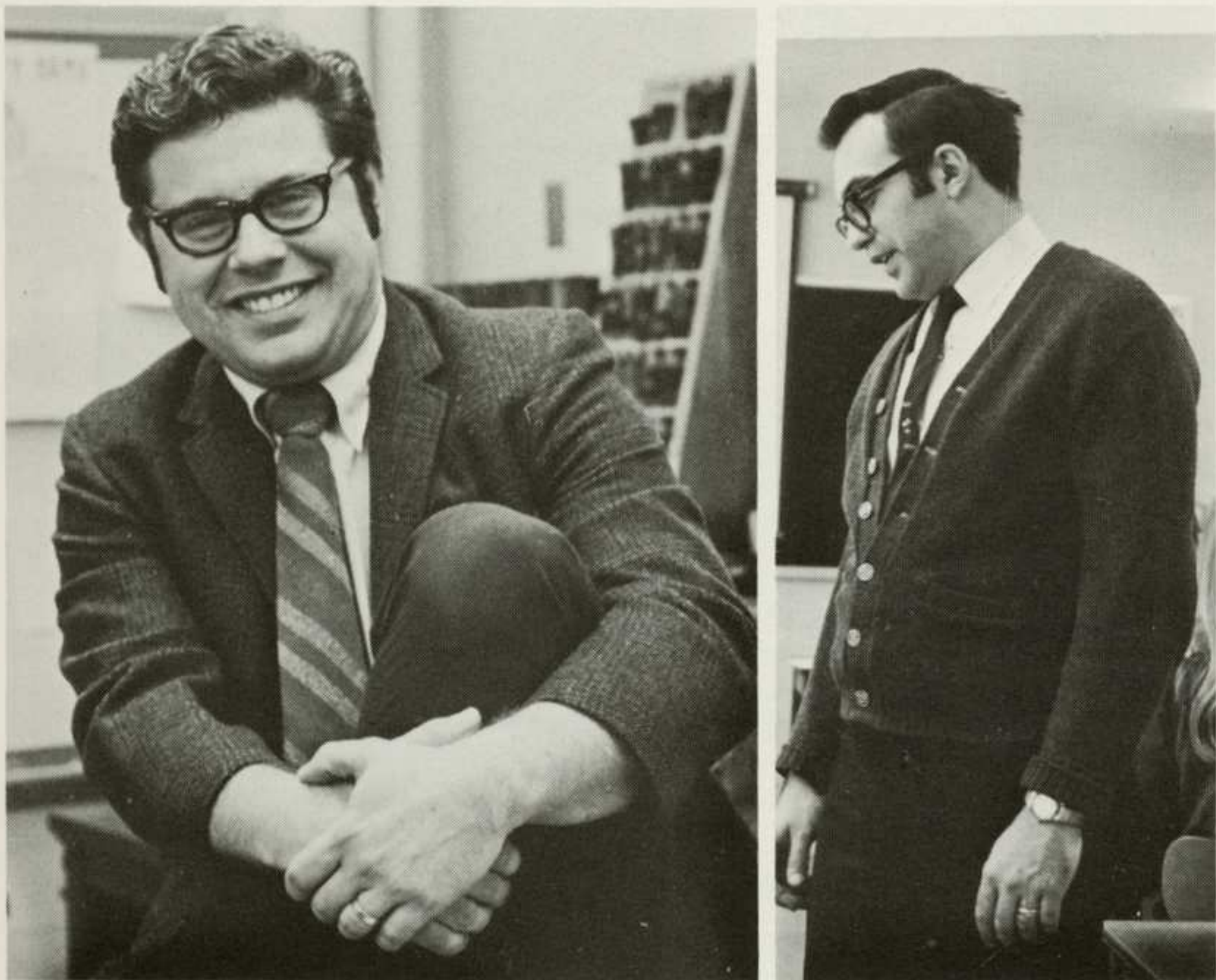
valuable skills

Business programs thrived with an enthusiastic enrollment in DCT (Diversified Cooperative Training), VICA (Vocational Industrial Club of America), COE (Cooperative Office Education), DE (Distributive Education), and OWE (Office Work Experience).

The home economics department, which until this year was concerned only with girls, sparked new interest this year by offering a similar course for boys. Having mastered the basic techniques of cooking, sewing, and the like, those taking advantage of this course will be able to fend for themselves or contribute to the making of a happy home in years to come.

At the other end of the spectrum are the vocational arts, commonly known as shop. Here boys and girls can lay the groundwork for a lifetime vocation in wood working, metal working, electricity, printing, or drafting.

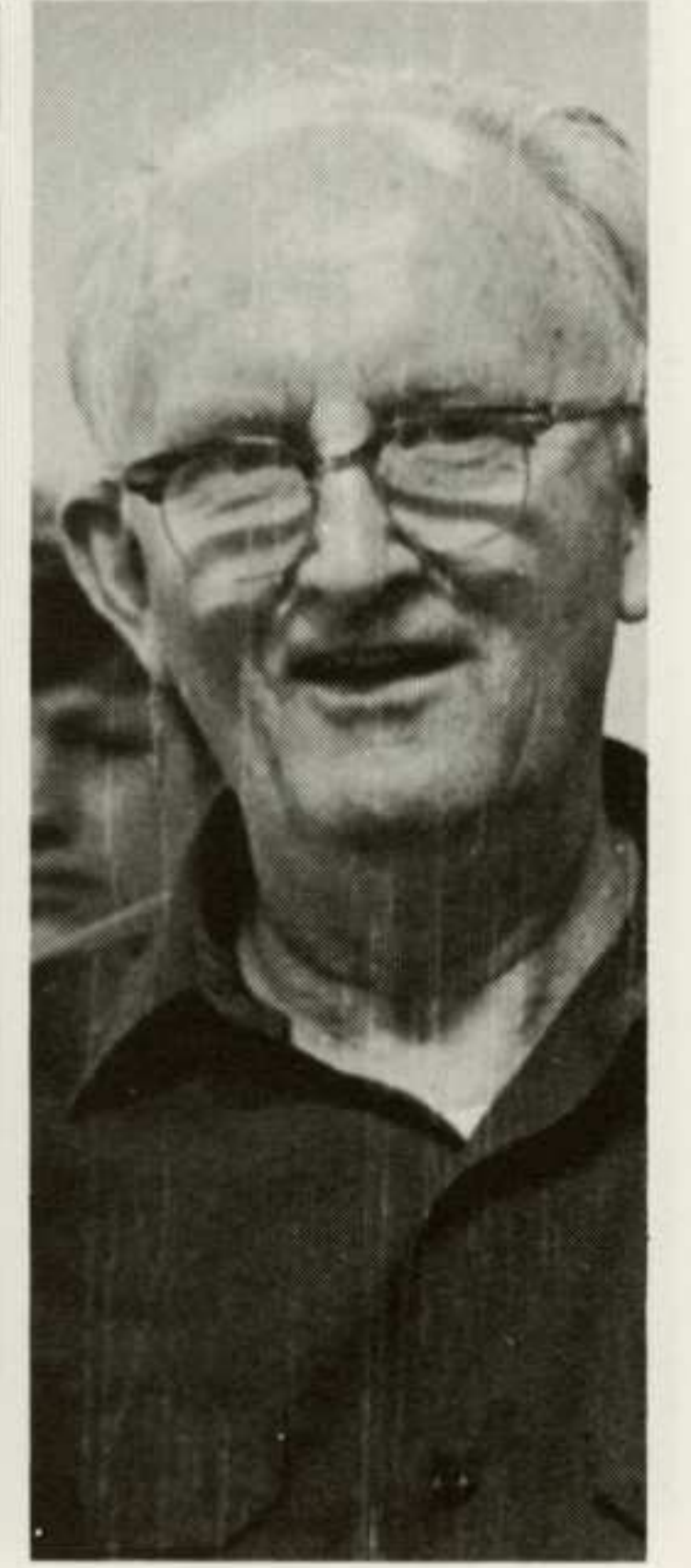
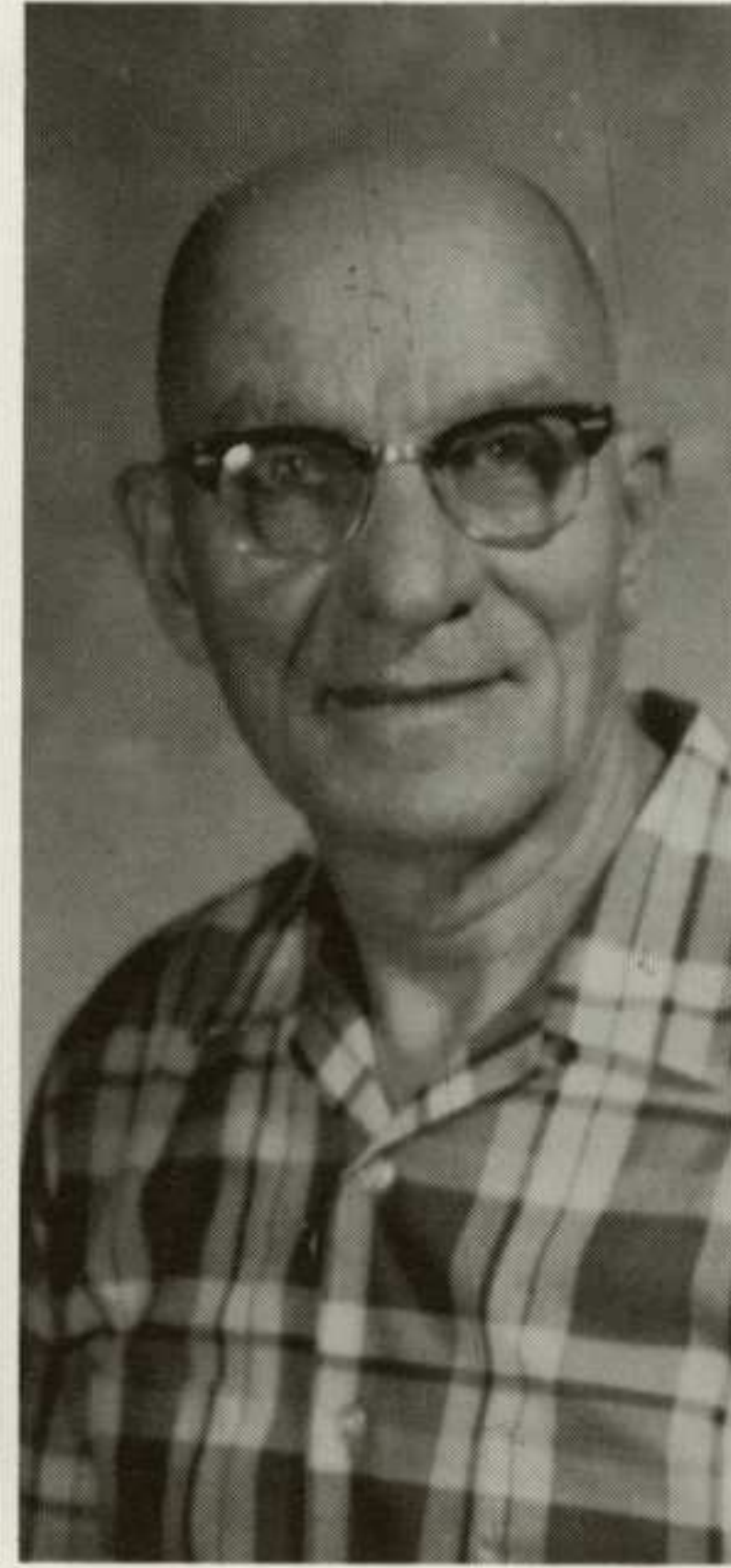
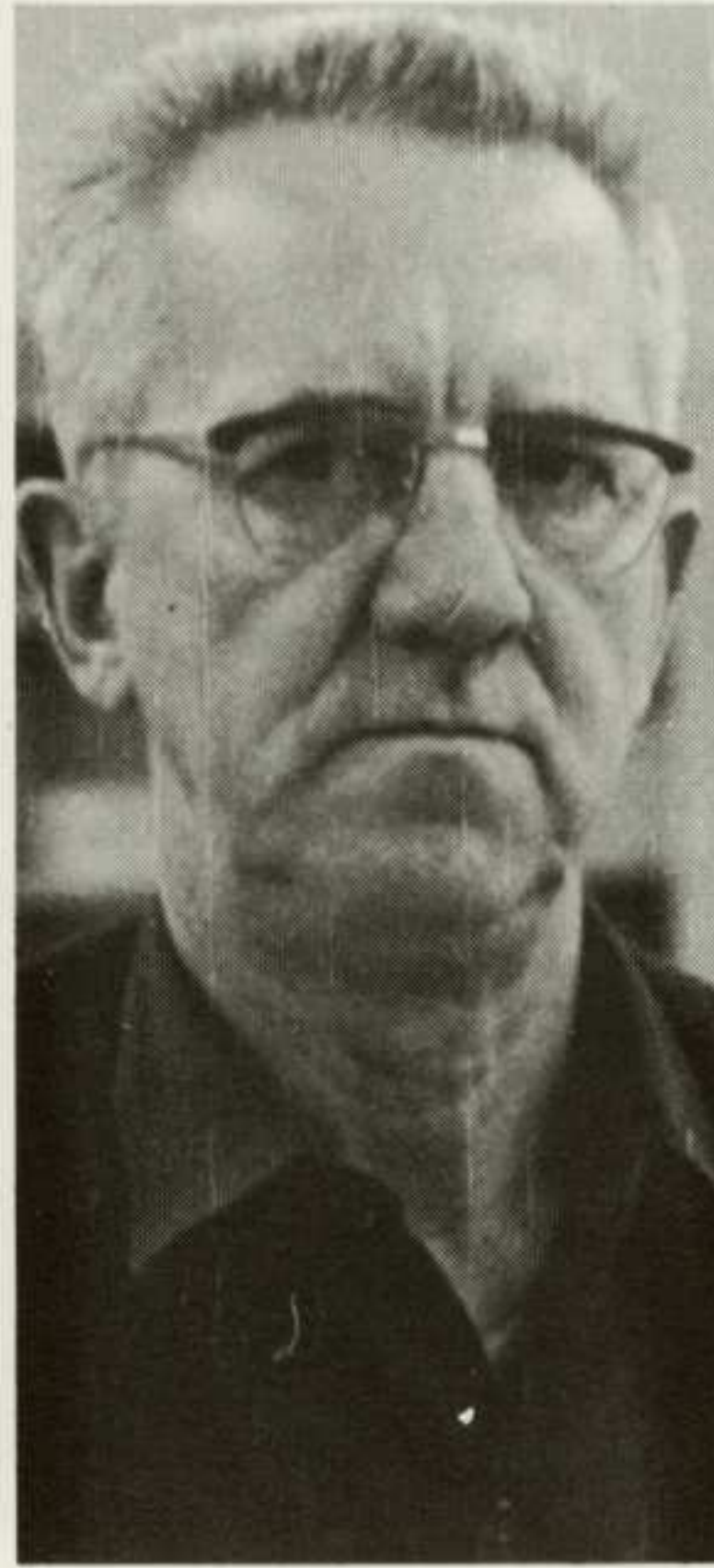

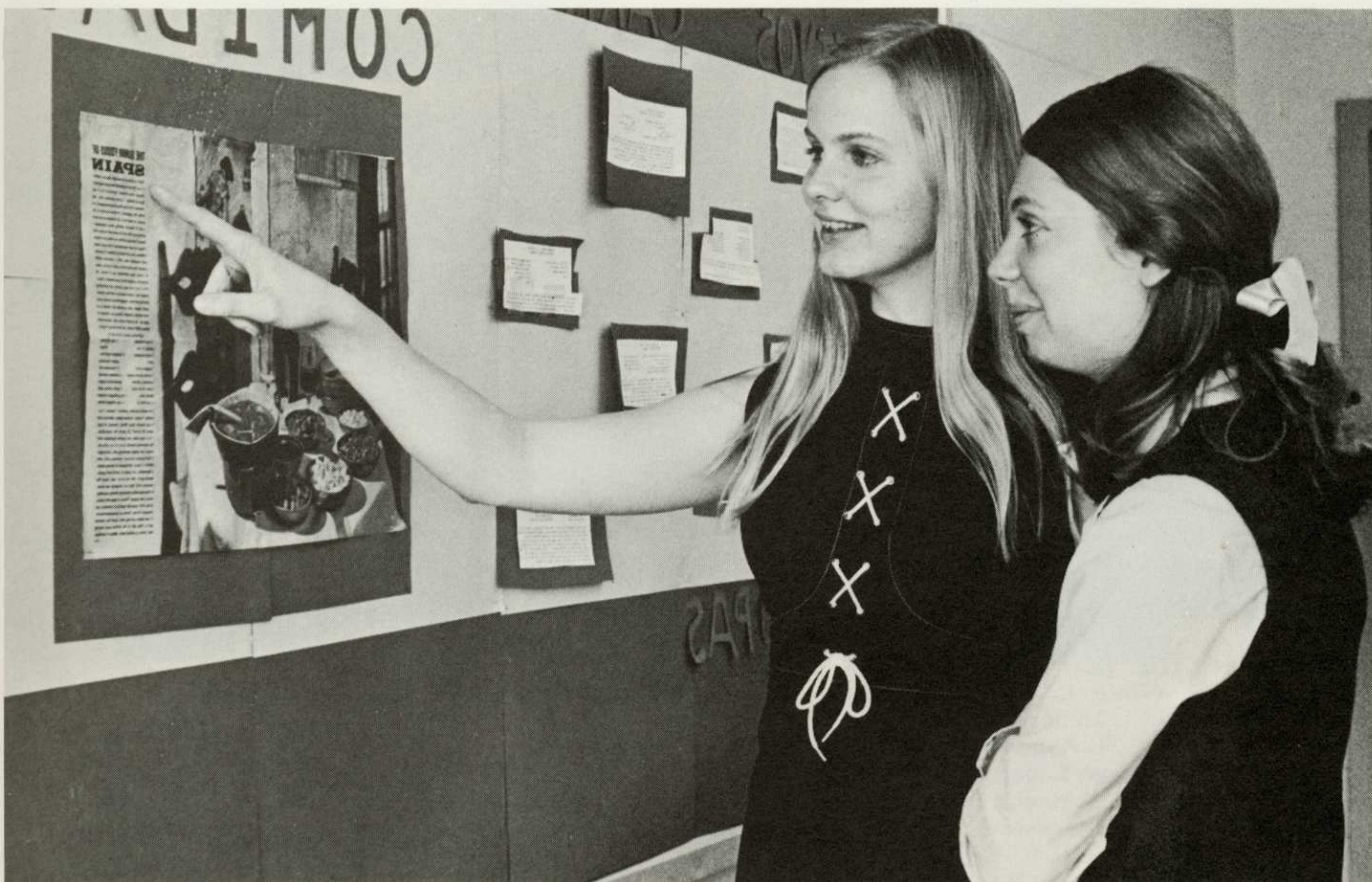


spanish, russian groups and shns help to encourage bilingual speech

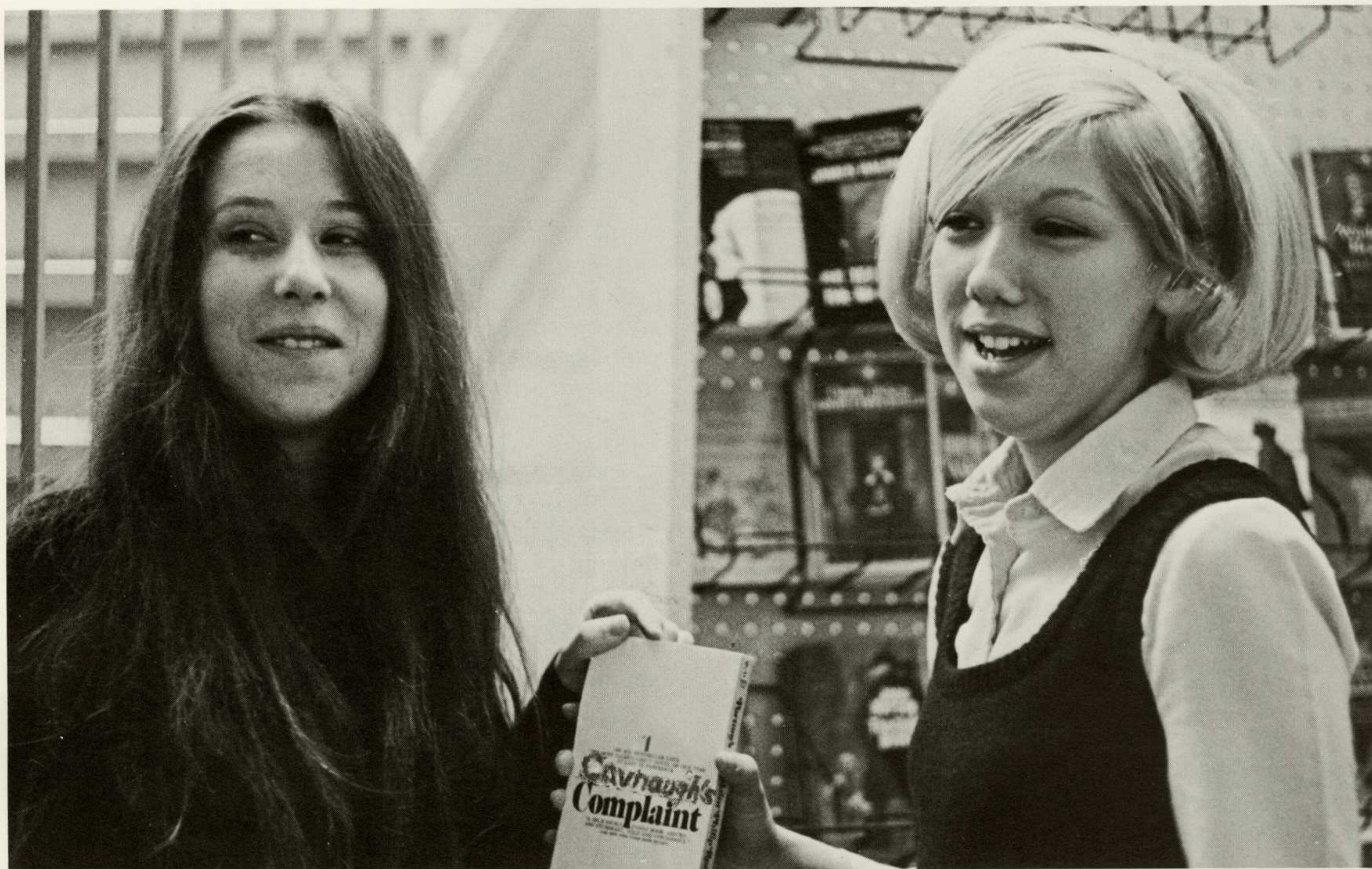

fta helps schools while nhs honors top whs students

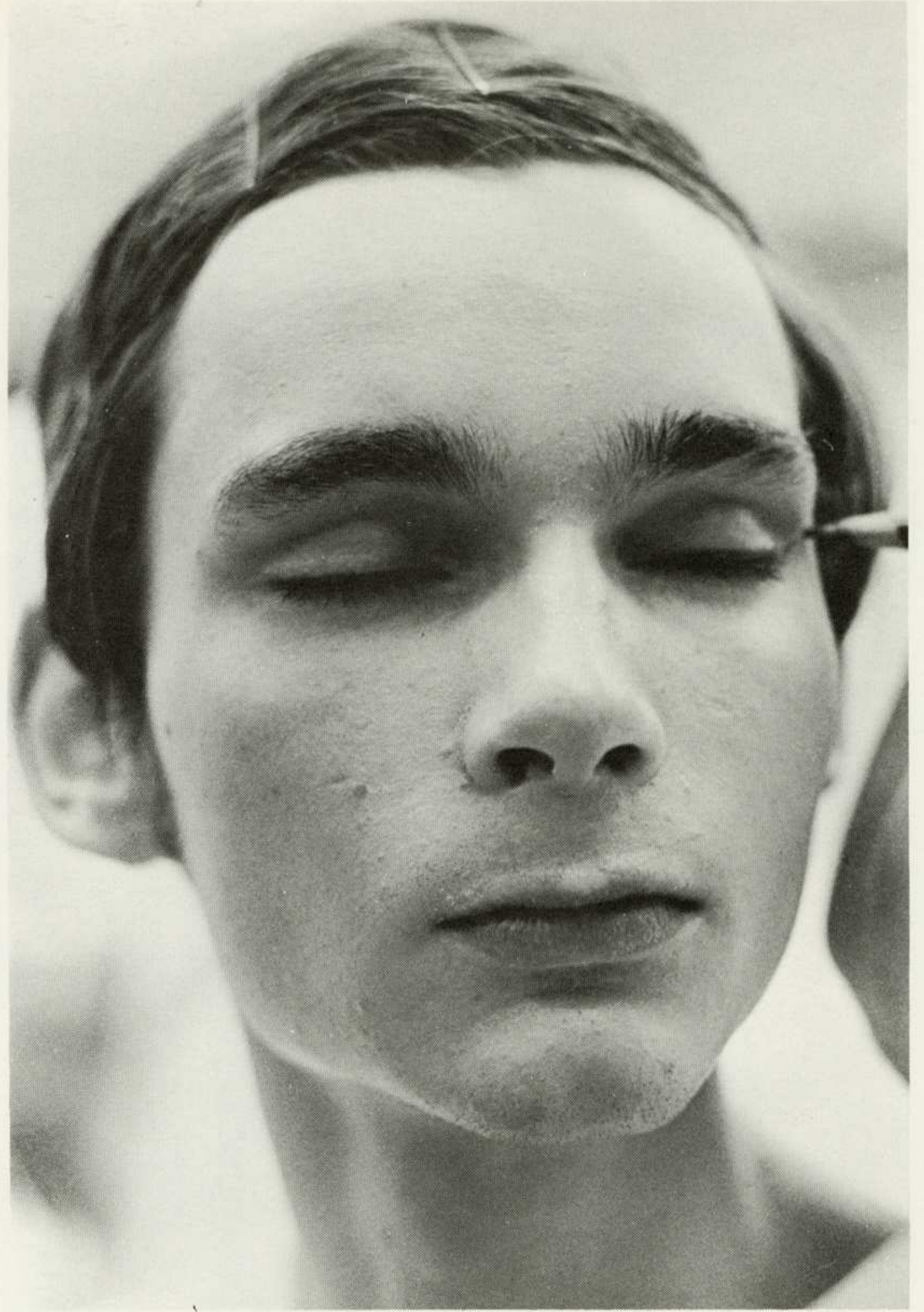

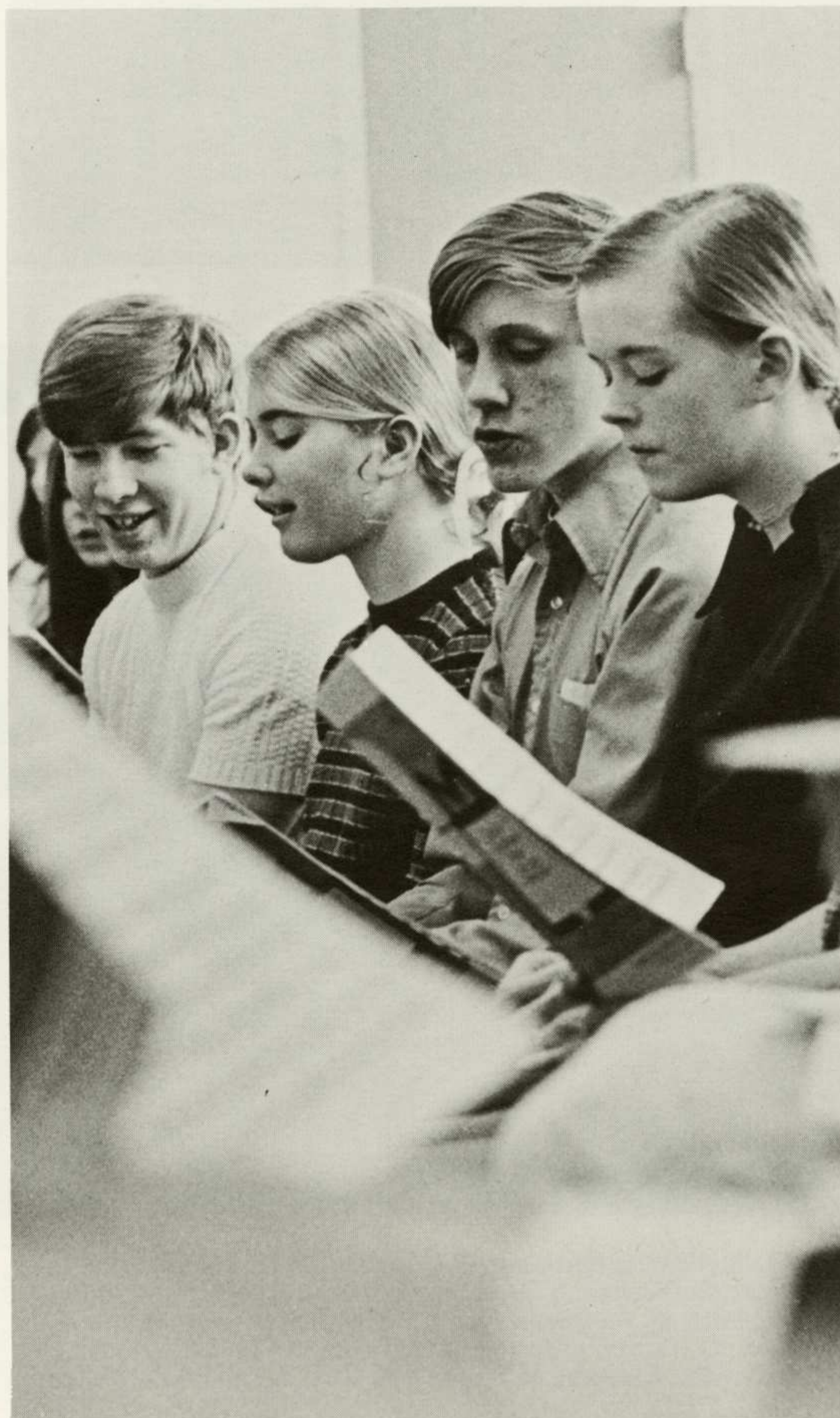

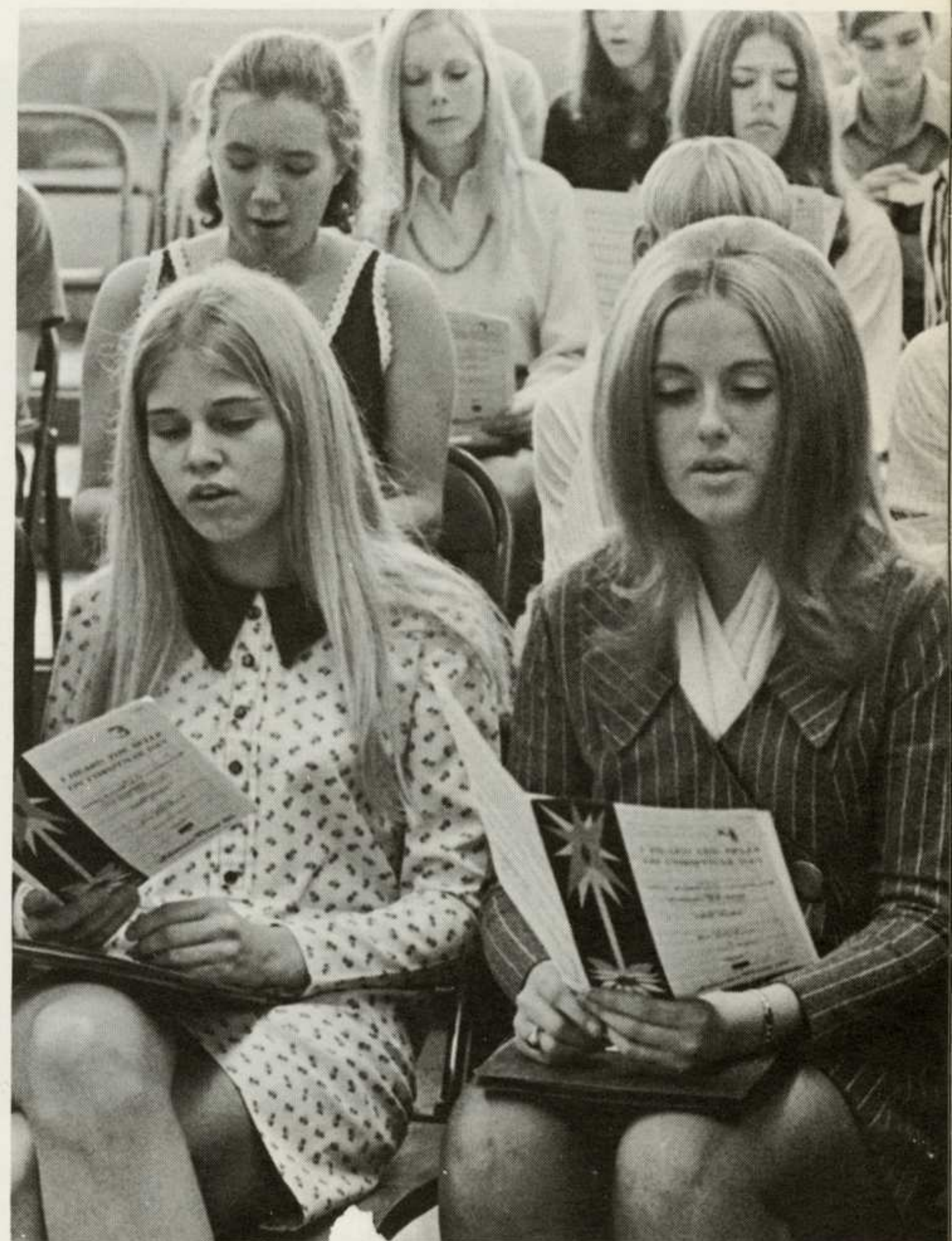

The orchestra improved greatly this year under the direction of Mr. Mencer, who moved to the High School from his last year's post as Kilbourne Orchestra conductor. Several violinists joined the orchestra during the year to alleviate the initial shortage and effect a more balanced sound. The community had opportunities to hear this musical group at its winter concert, its spring concert, the spring music festival and a Memorial Day weekend program in concern for our POW'S in Southeast Asia.

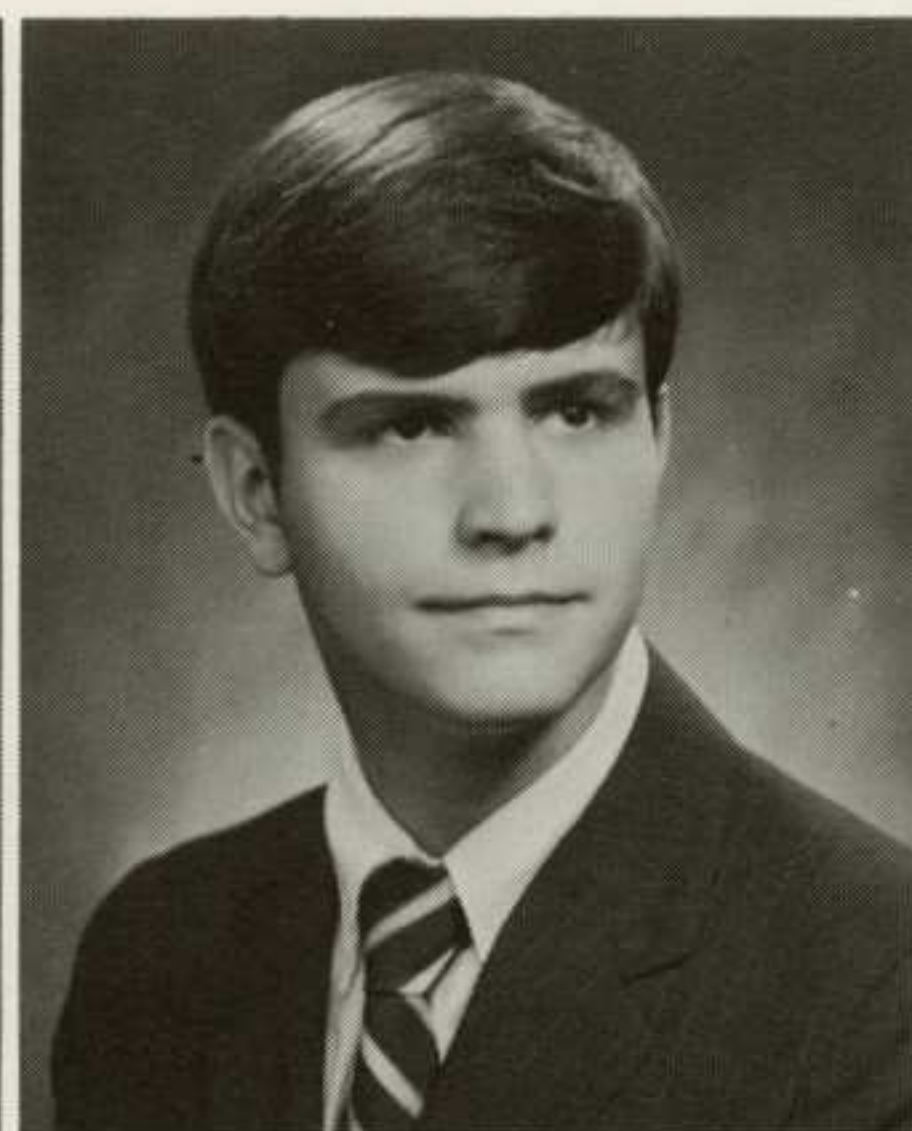
seniors follow traditions and set new ones

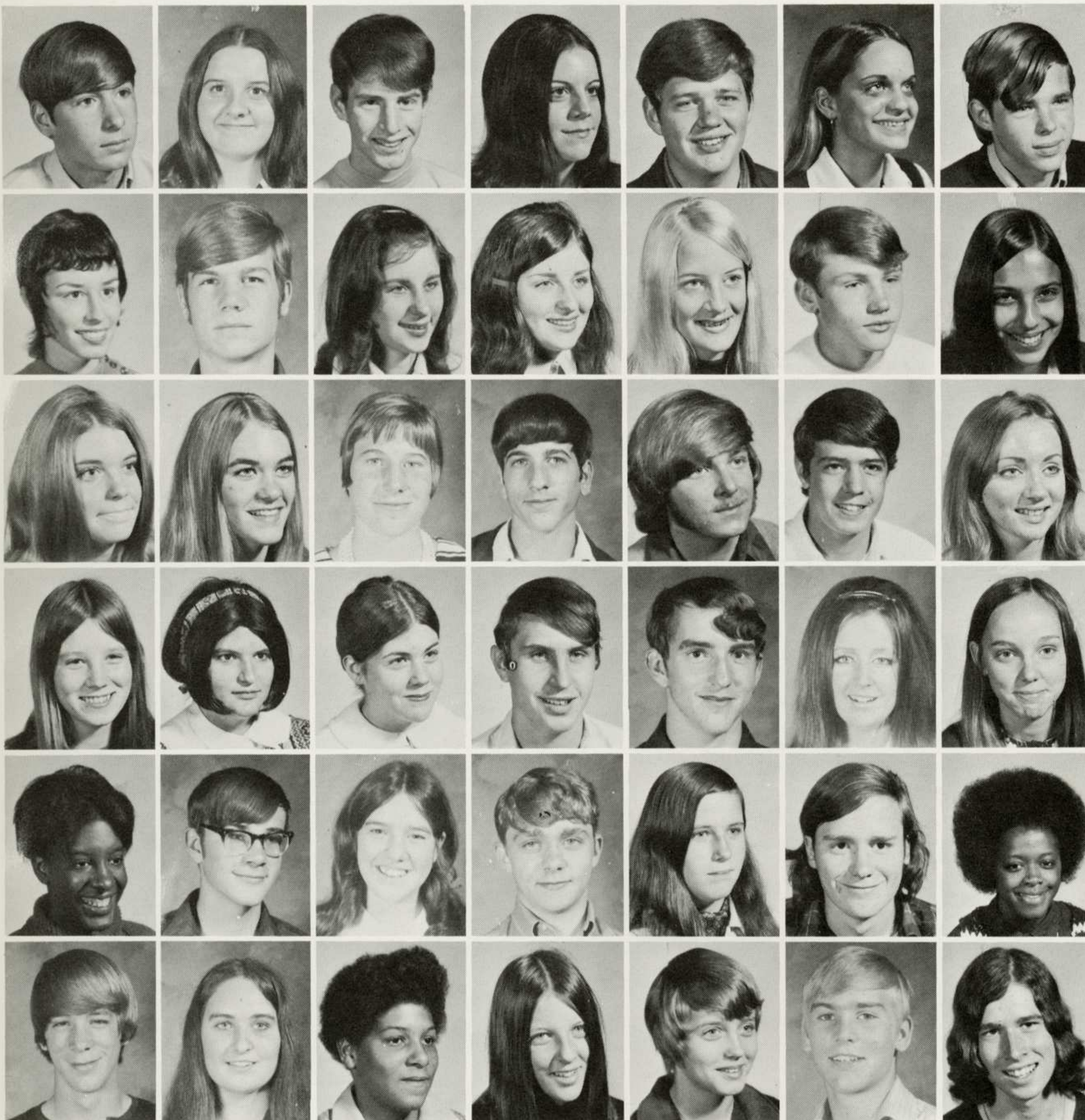


leadership is dynamic, bold for junior class

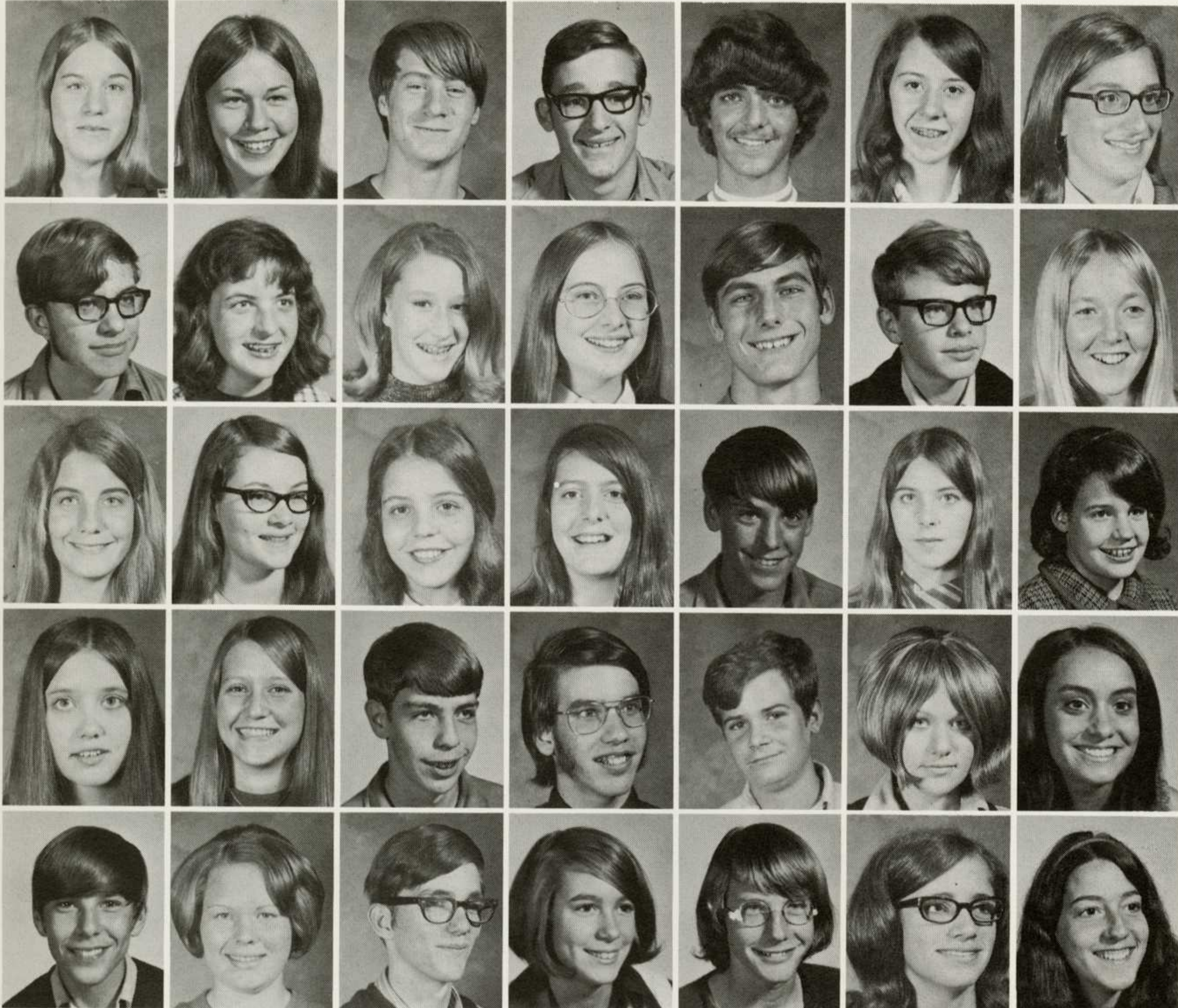


sophomores are rewarded by great year

It must be the proper consistency to assure that the pottery will dry over a period of several weeks without cracking. The clay must be kneaded to eliminate any air pockets which could possibly explode while the project is being fired. Mark Witiak displays great dexterity in smoothing the inside bottom surface of his bowl. All the clay was carefully centered on the wheel before he began his work. A steady rhythm must be maintained in moving the wheel.

cardinal x-country has success in occ, district



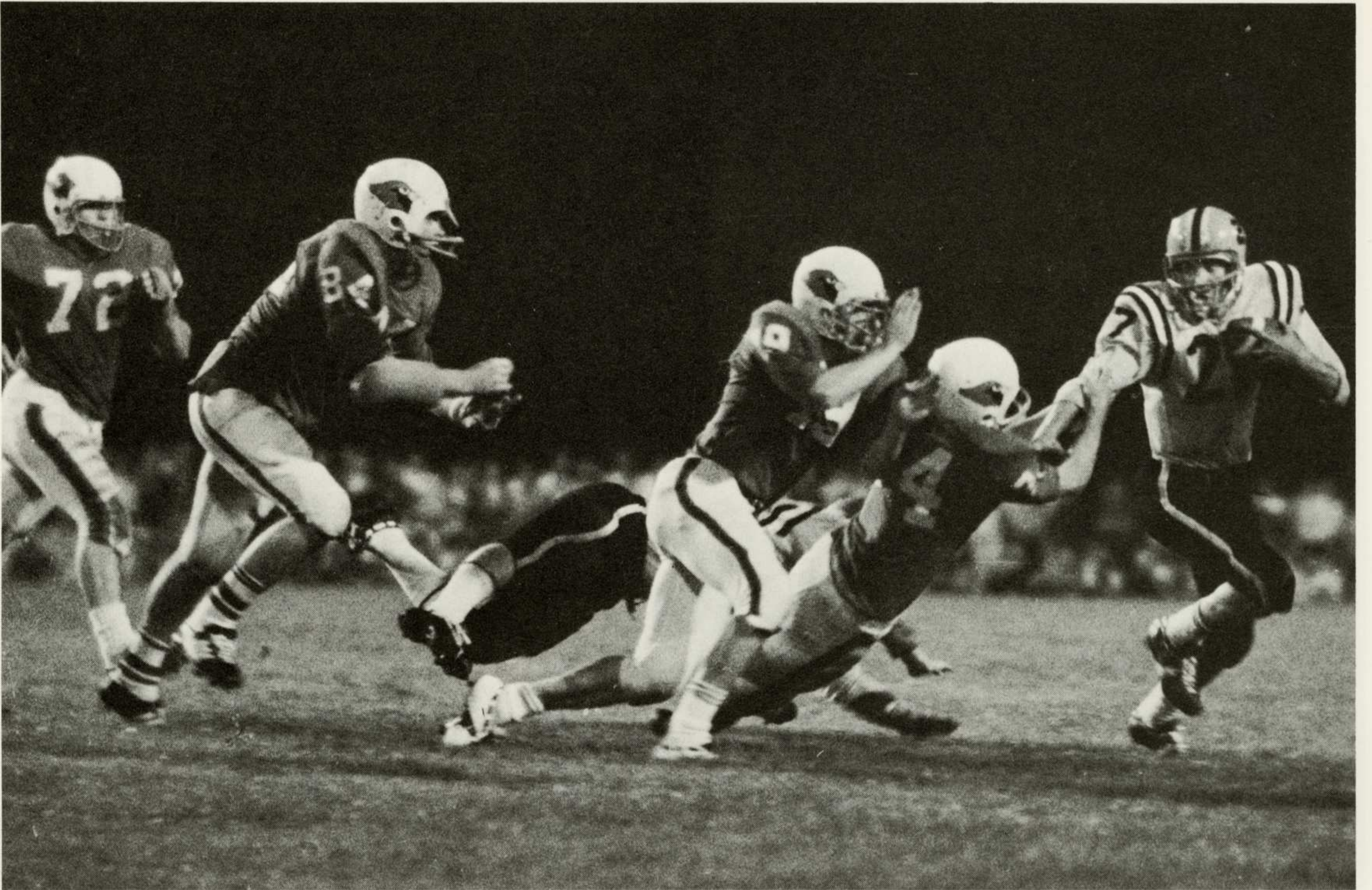
Coach Les Eisenhart's 1970 cross-country team had a very successful season, winning the OCC and District crowns, but faltered to a disappointing tenth place finish in the State meet. Captain Tom Bryant led this year's highly spirited team throughout the season to an impressive 11-0 dual meet record which included shutouts against Whetstone, West, Walnut Ridge, Westerville and Dayton Chaminade. In mid-season, the team finished fourth among the twenty-eight best teams in the state at the Ashland Invitational. Three weeks later, the Cards took third against a similar field at the Miami University Invitational.

The WHS thinclads went on to win the OCC title with a low score of 29, then they successfully defended their eleventh consecutive District crown with a low score of 24. 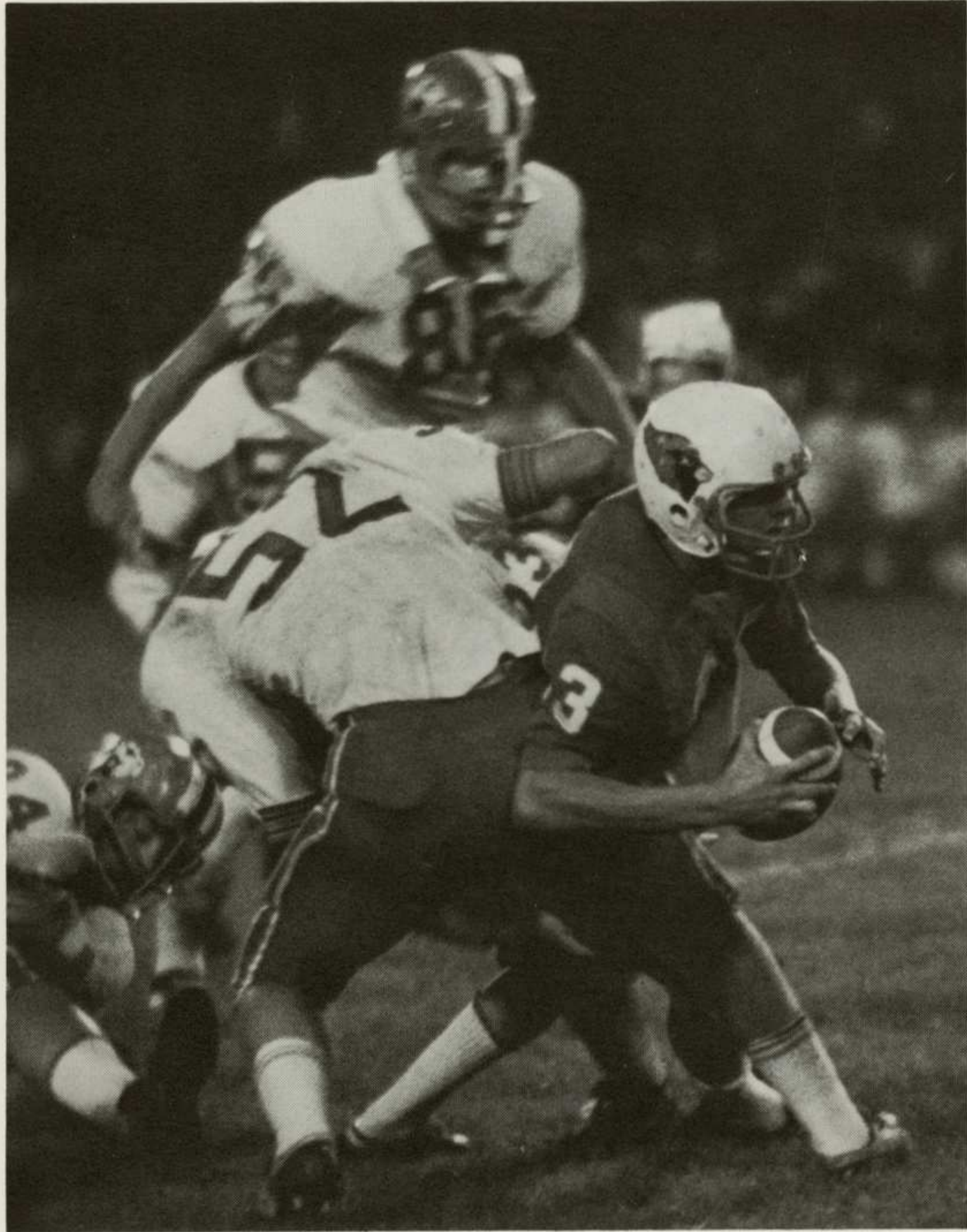

Mark Phleiger will follow Skip Steinman as team captain for the 71-72 season. Prospects for next year's team will be better when the pool is built.

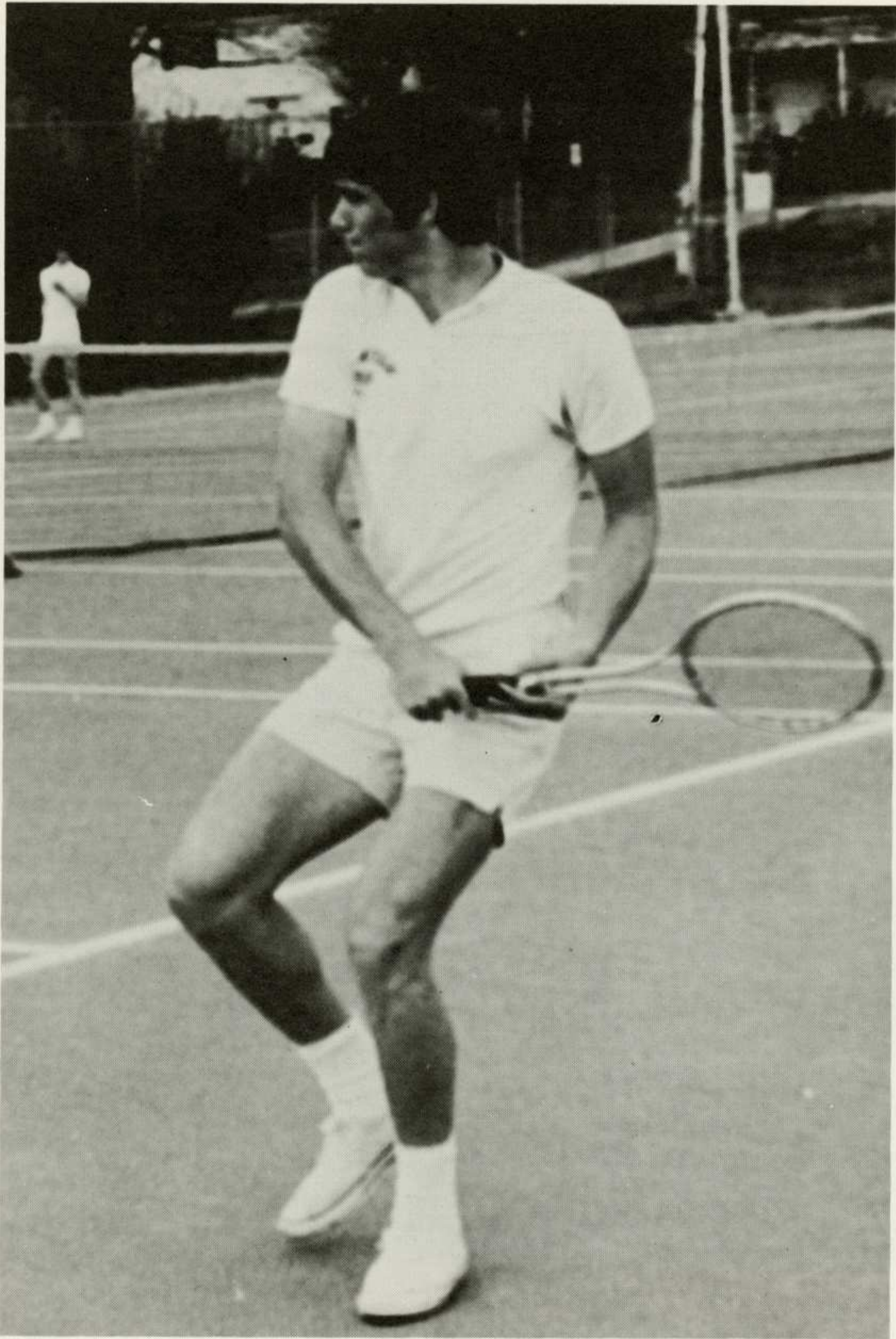

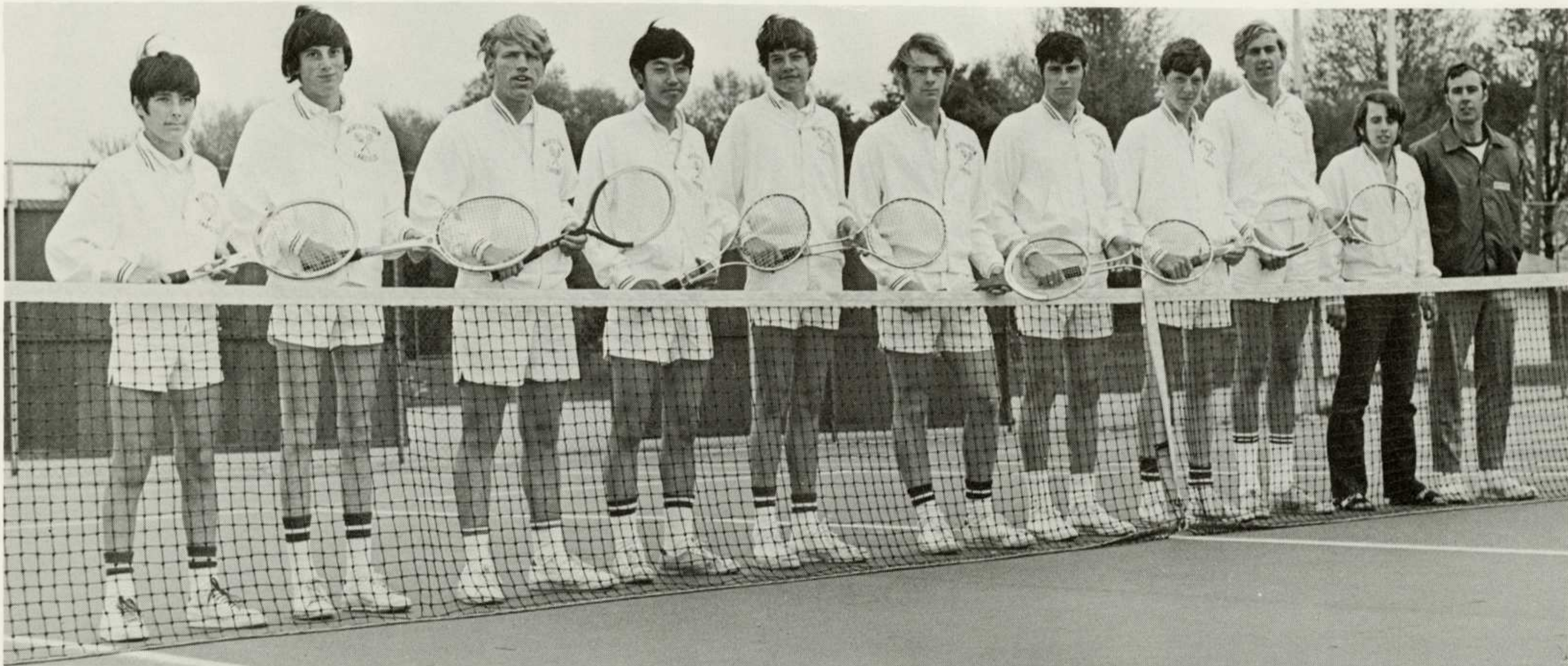


bad courts foiled, tennis team wins conference crown on others' courts

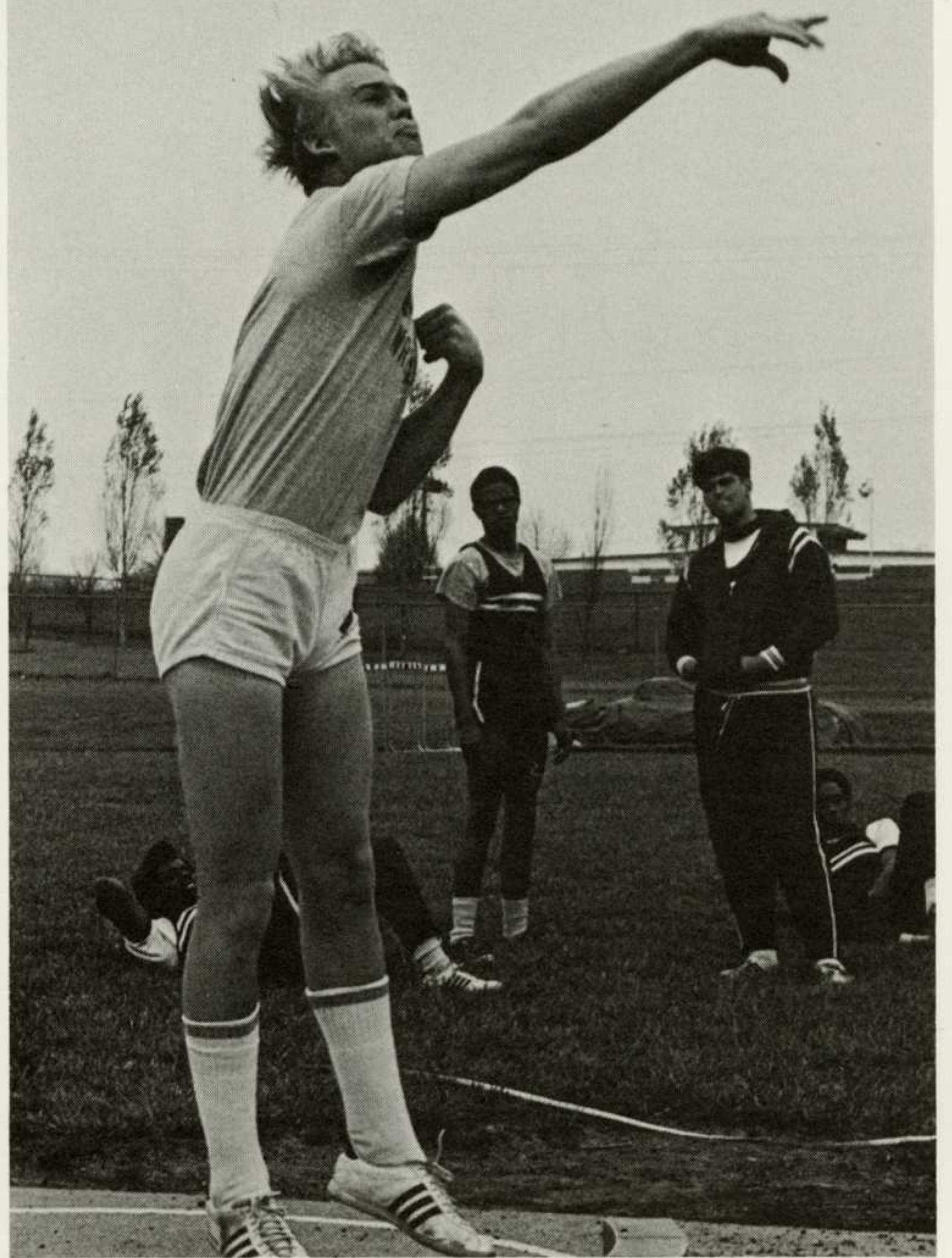

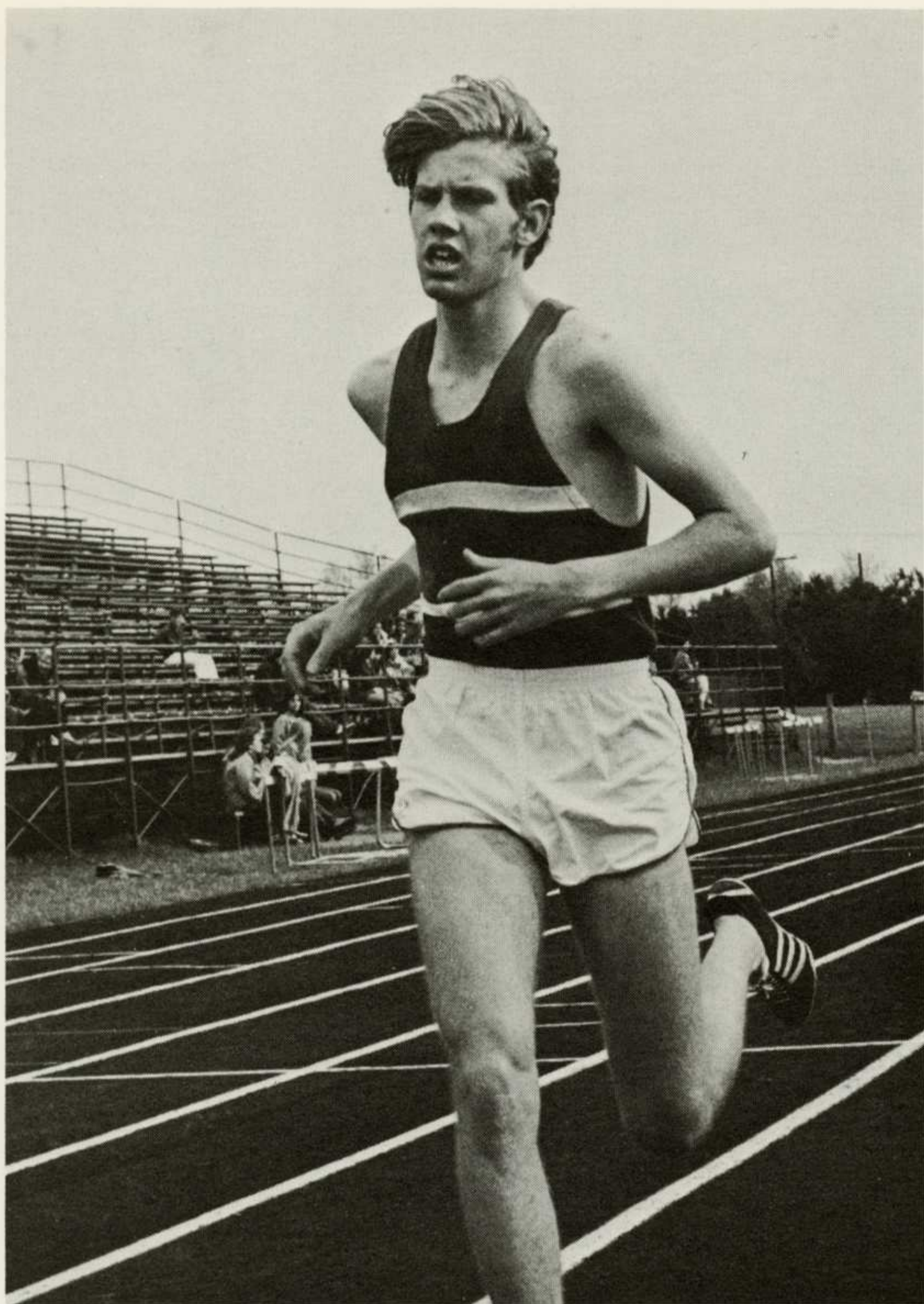

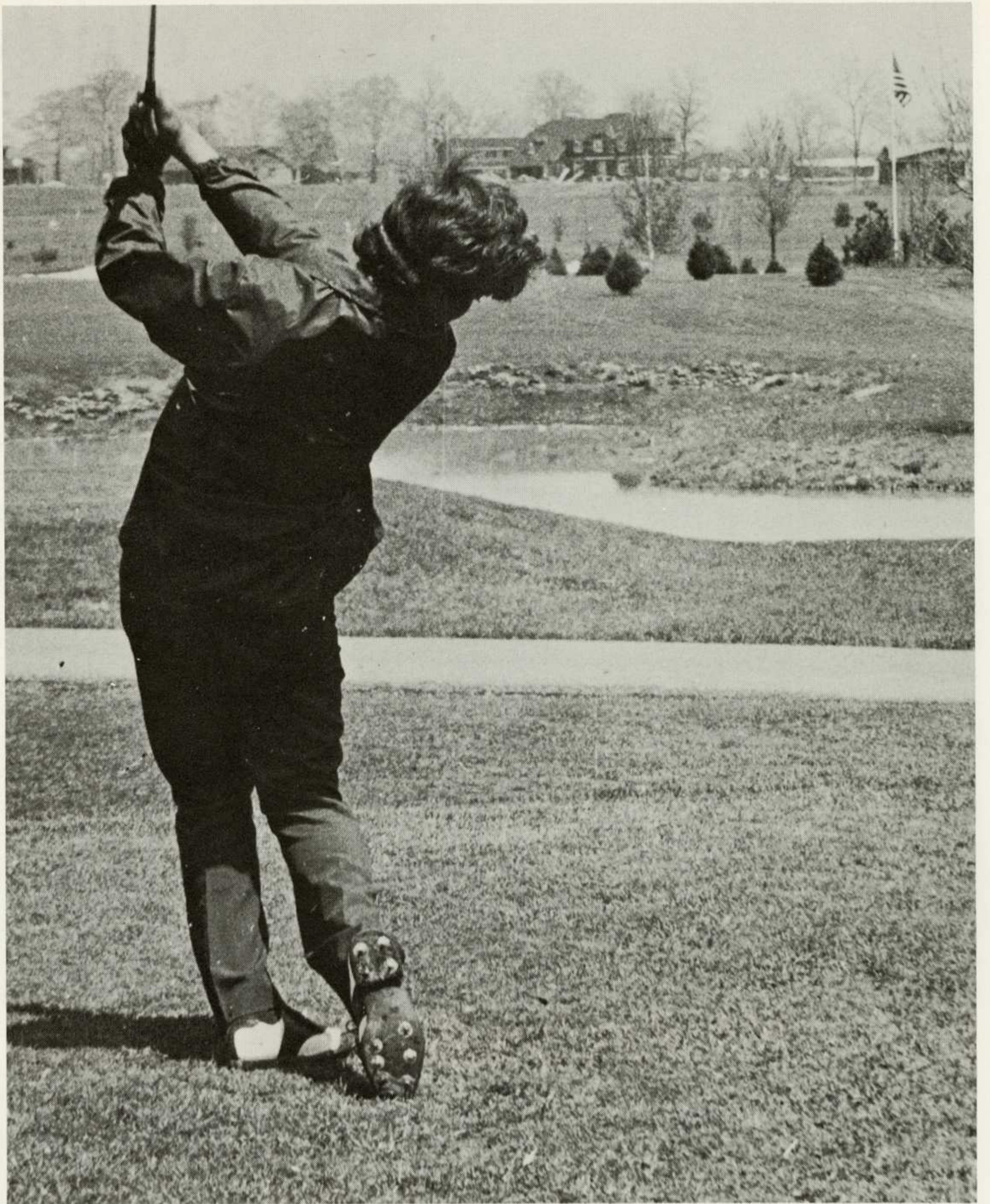

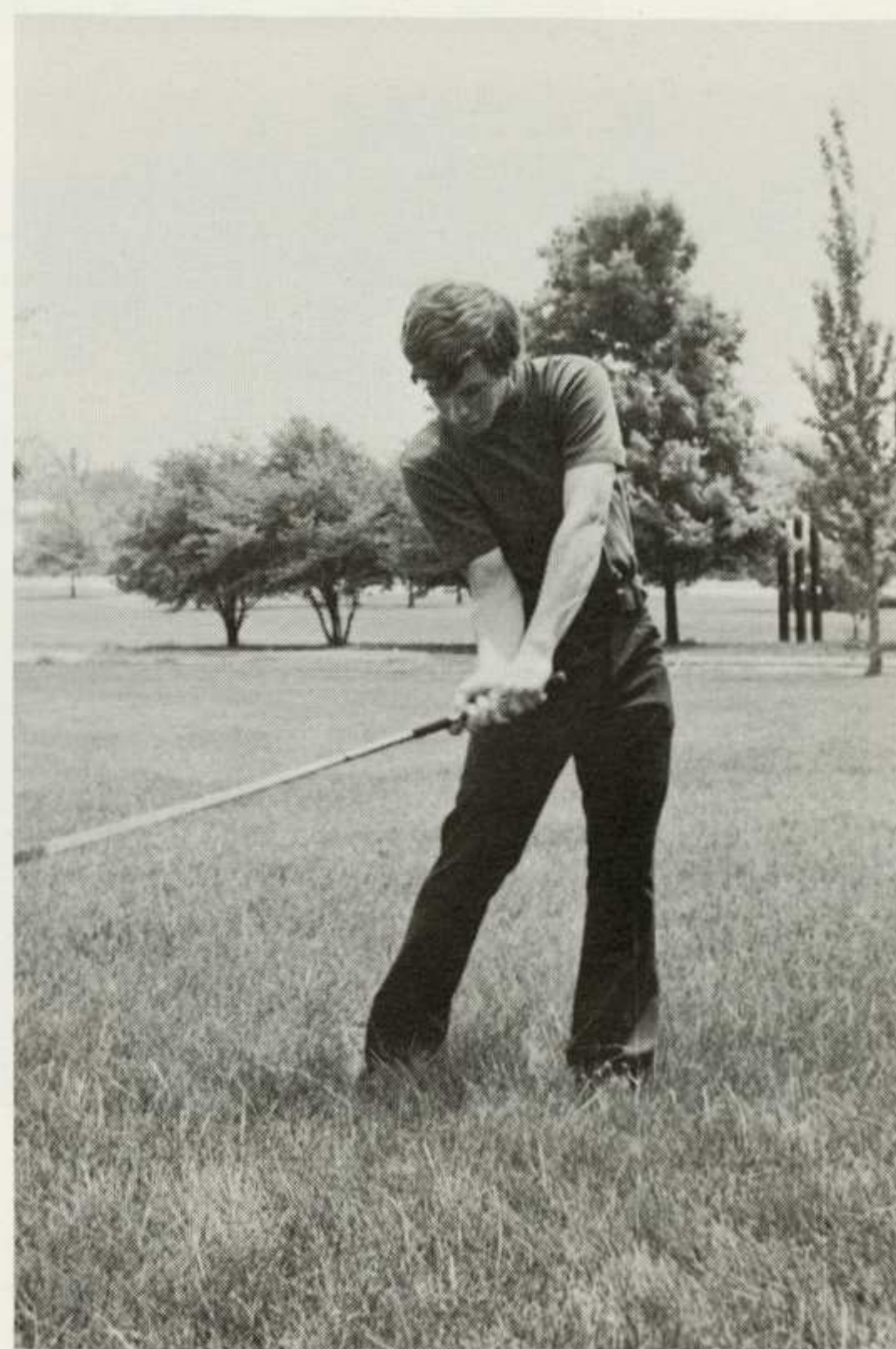
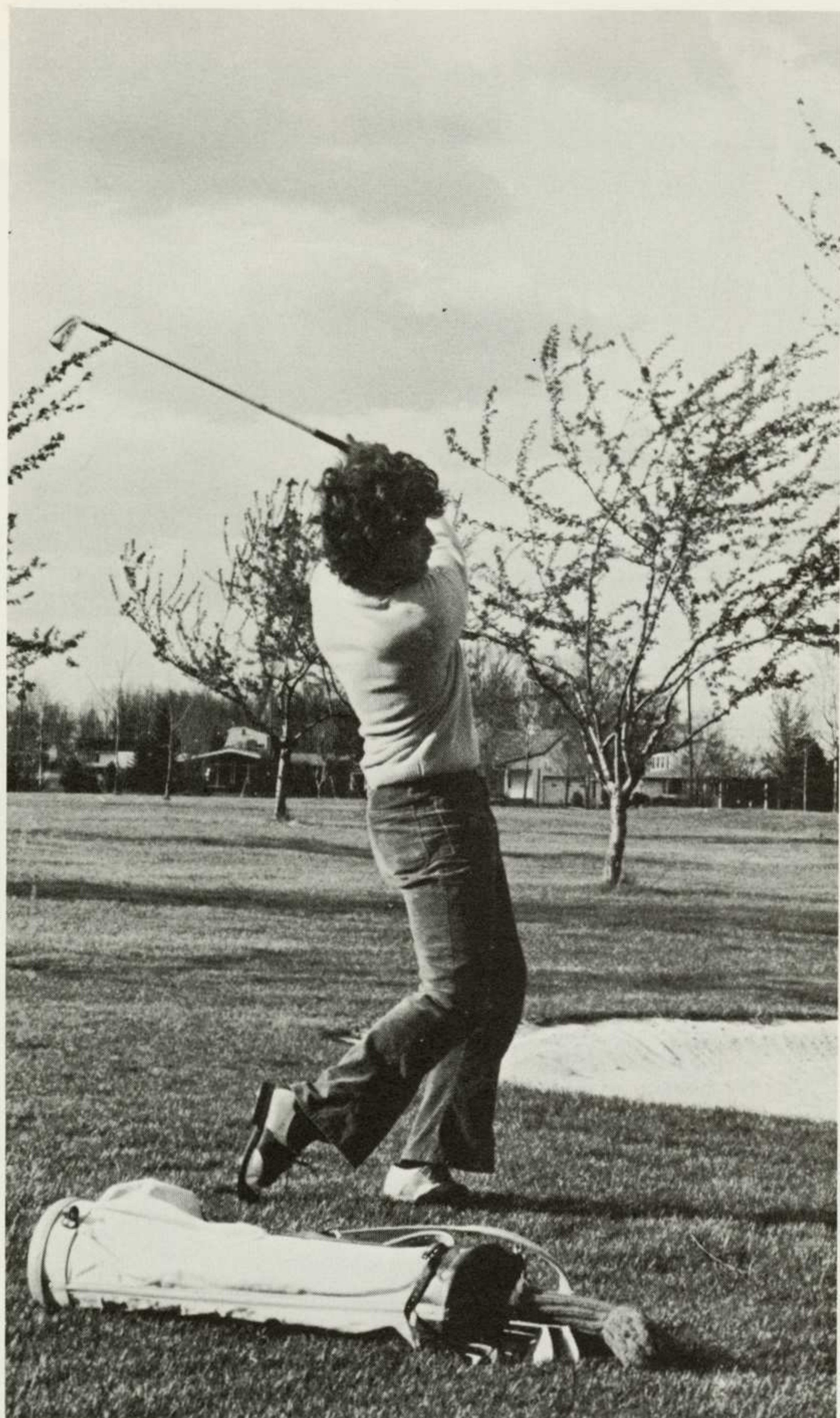
underclassmen on varsity golf team help to achieve a league record for second place

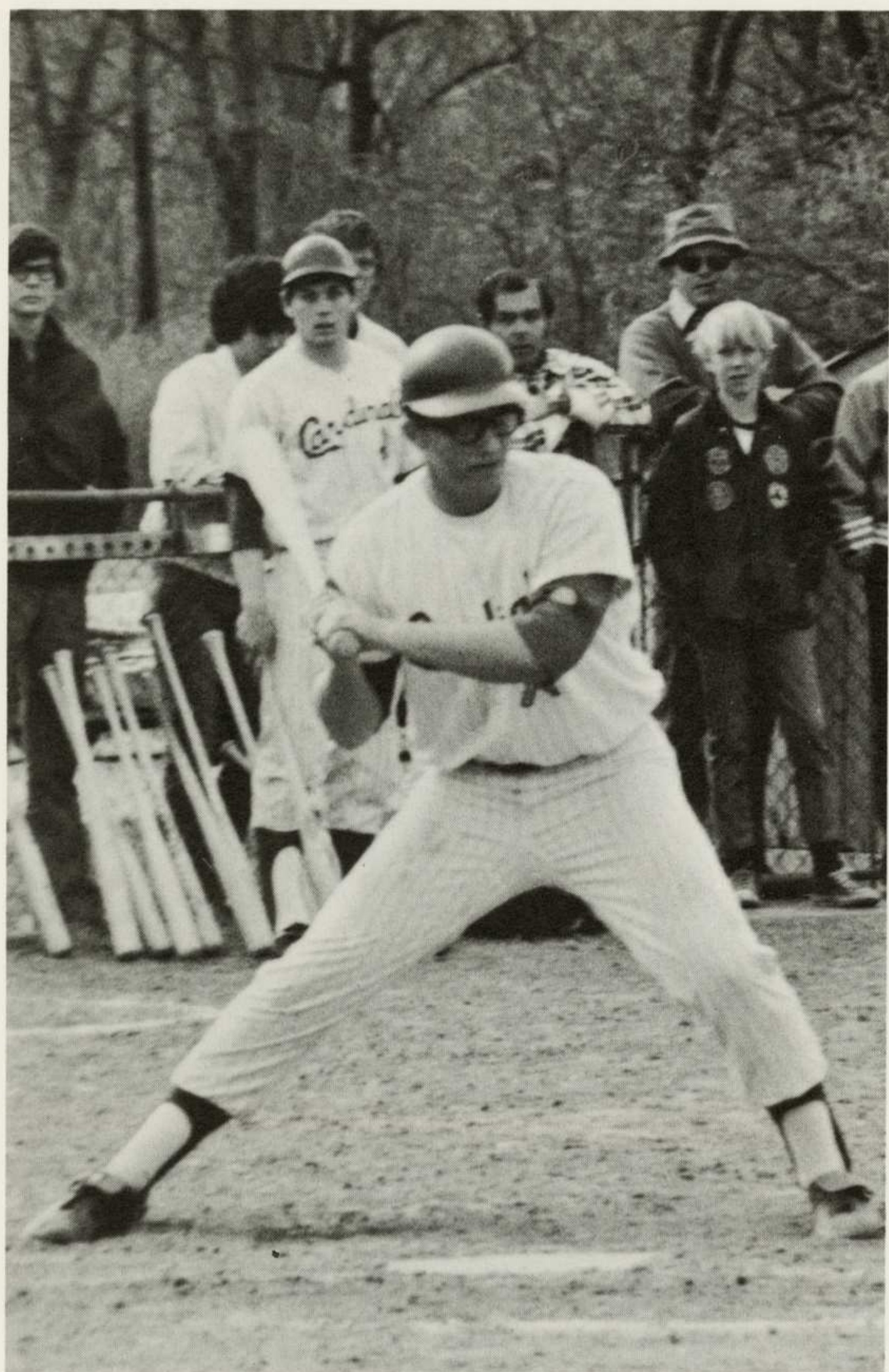

shutout pitching helps whs batmen power their way to first occ title

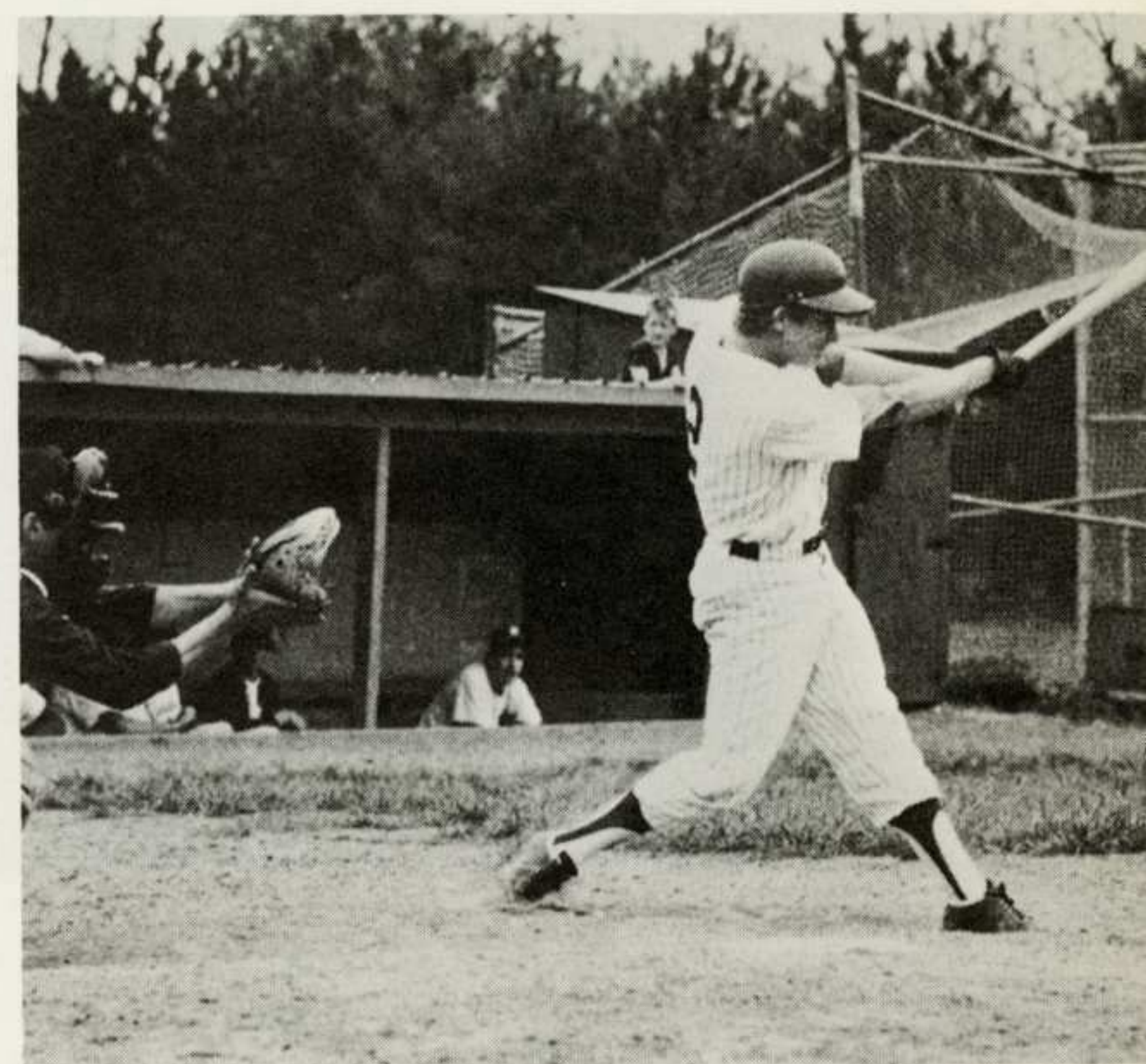

In one game the Cards made 27 runs in contrast to the 5 of their opponents'. With the almost perfect record of 13-1, the team won first place in the Ohio Capital Conference for the first time in many years.

Jack Woods, Jack Savage, and Kenny Foster were among the important players for the team; they are also the seniors who will not be returning next year. These boys had excellent batting averages. Savage earned a starting position in the East-West All-Star game. He was also named outstanding sportsman in baseball in the central Ohio area by the Spectator.

Important players for next year include Bill Atha, Tom Harbrecht, Clint Nicely, and Bob Monahan. Leading the pitchers will be Tim Riggs and Dave Dawson.

In analyzing the 1971 season, Coach Cozze said that the Cards had one of the best seasons he could remember. The pitchers had the best record in the league, with an earned-run average just over 1.0. Offensively, the Cards represented one of the most awesome threats in the area. Reliable sources said that we probably had the most home runs in the league and batted most pitchers right off the mound. ski clubs handle trips to many resorts

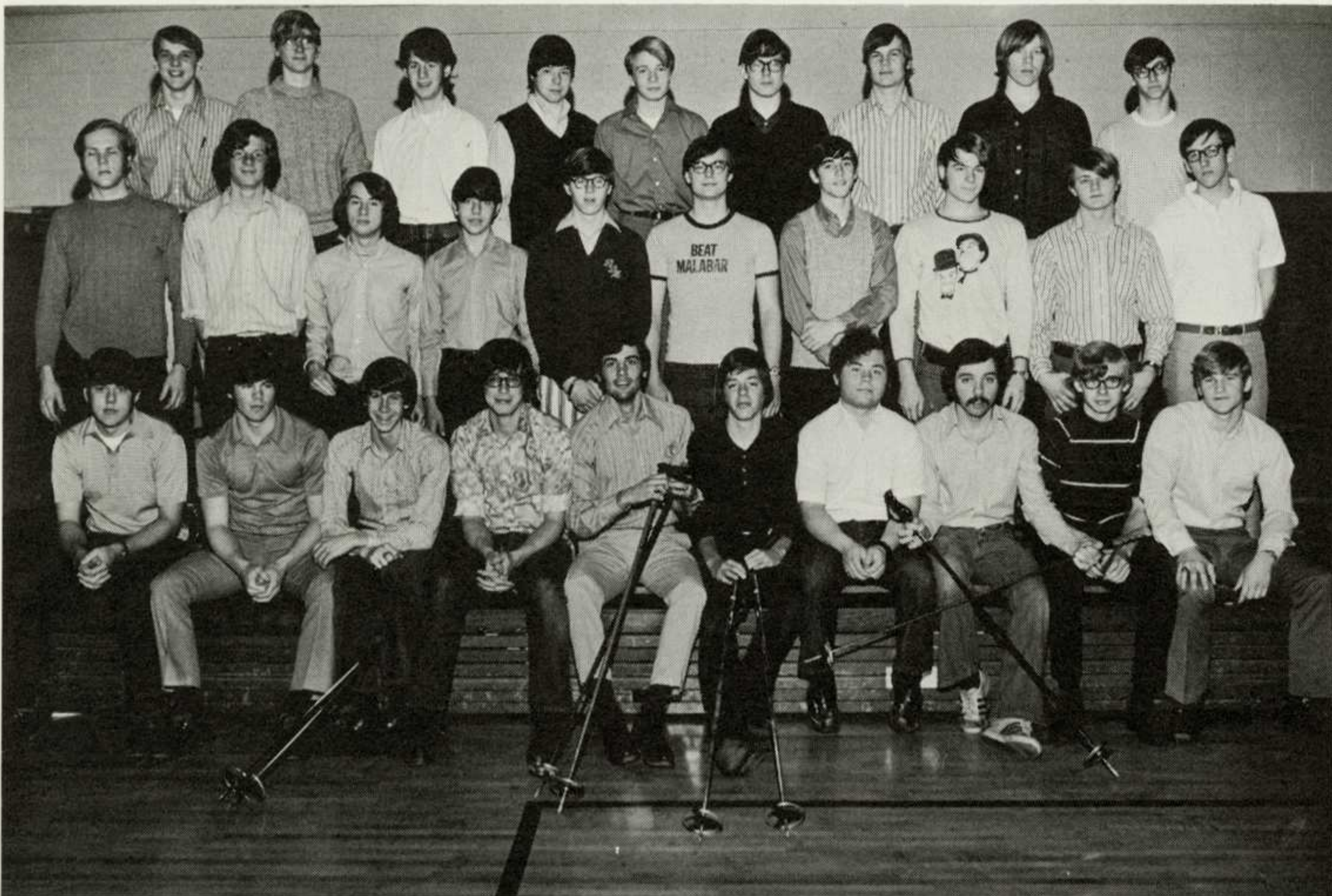

track, wrestling, swim clubs cheer teams to victory



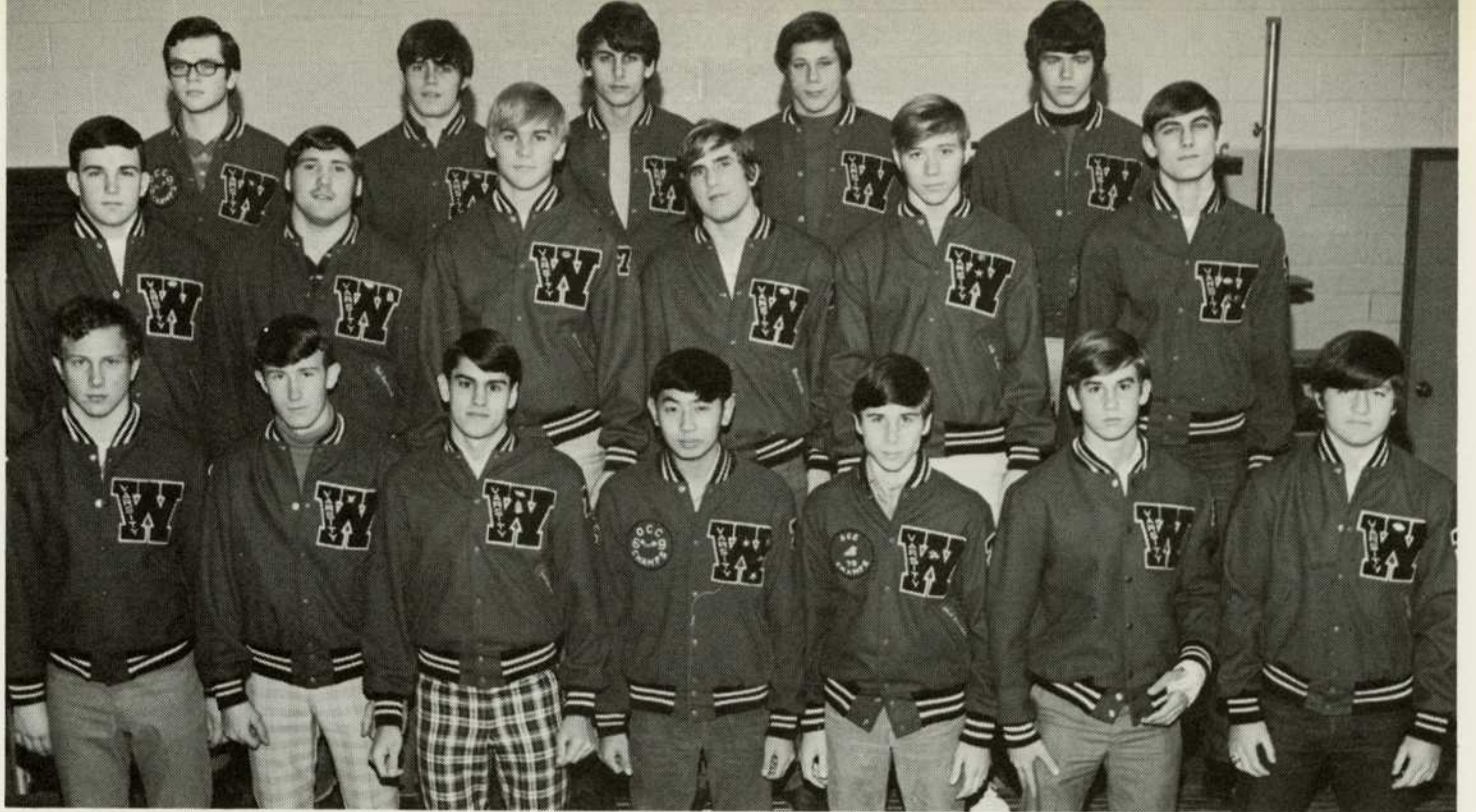
