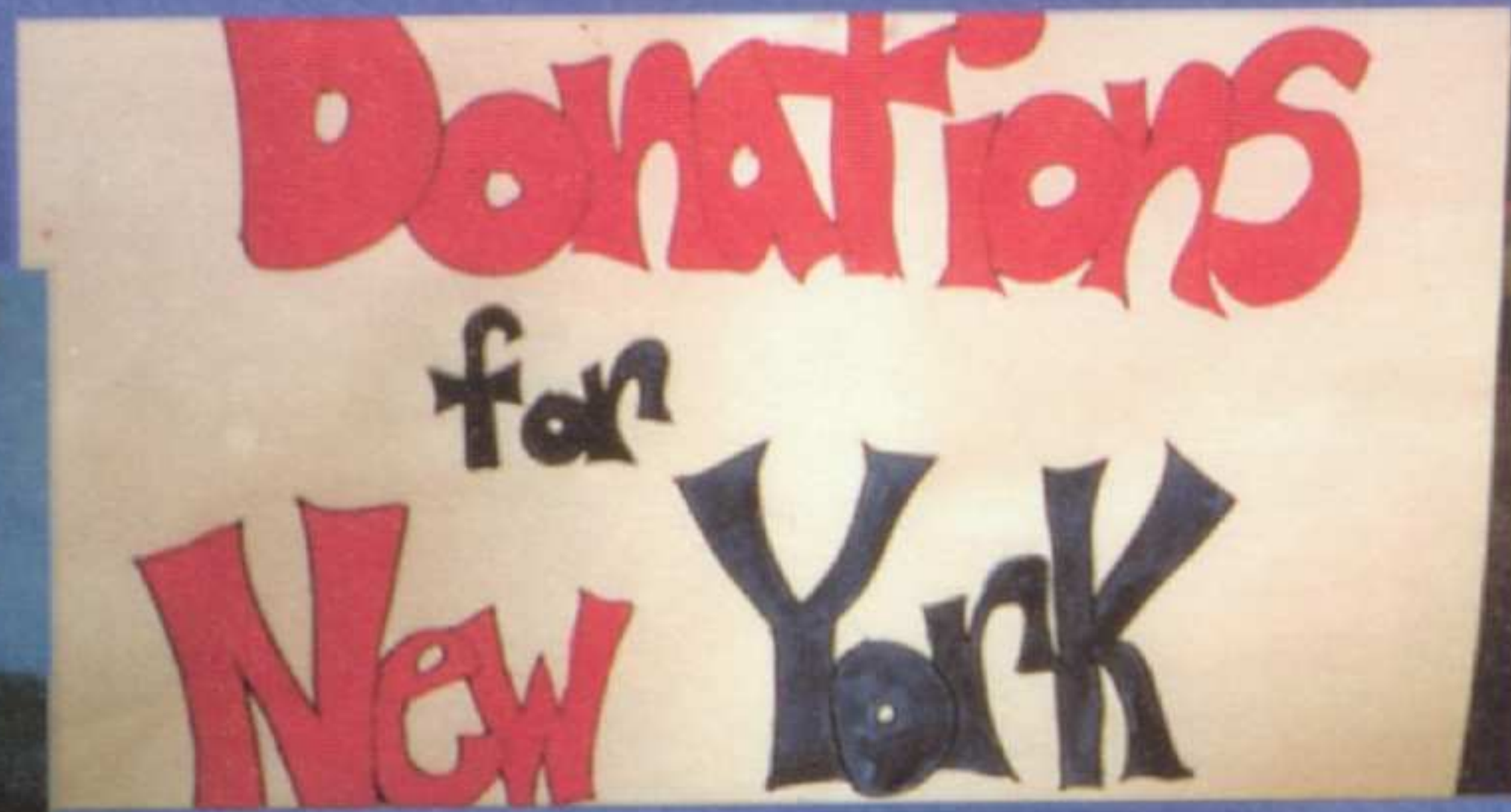
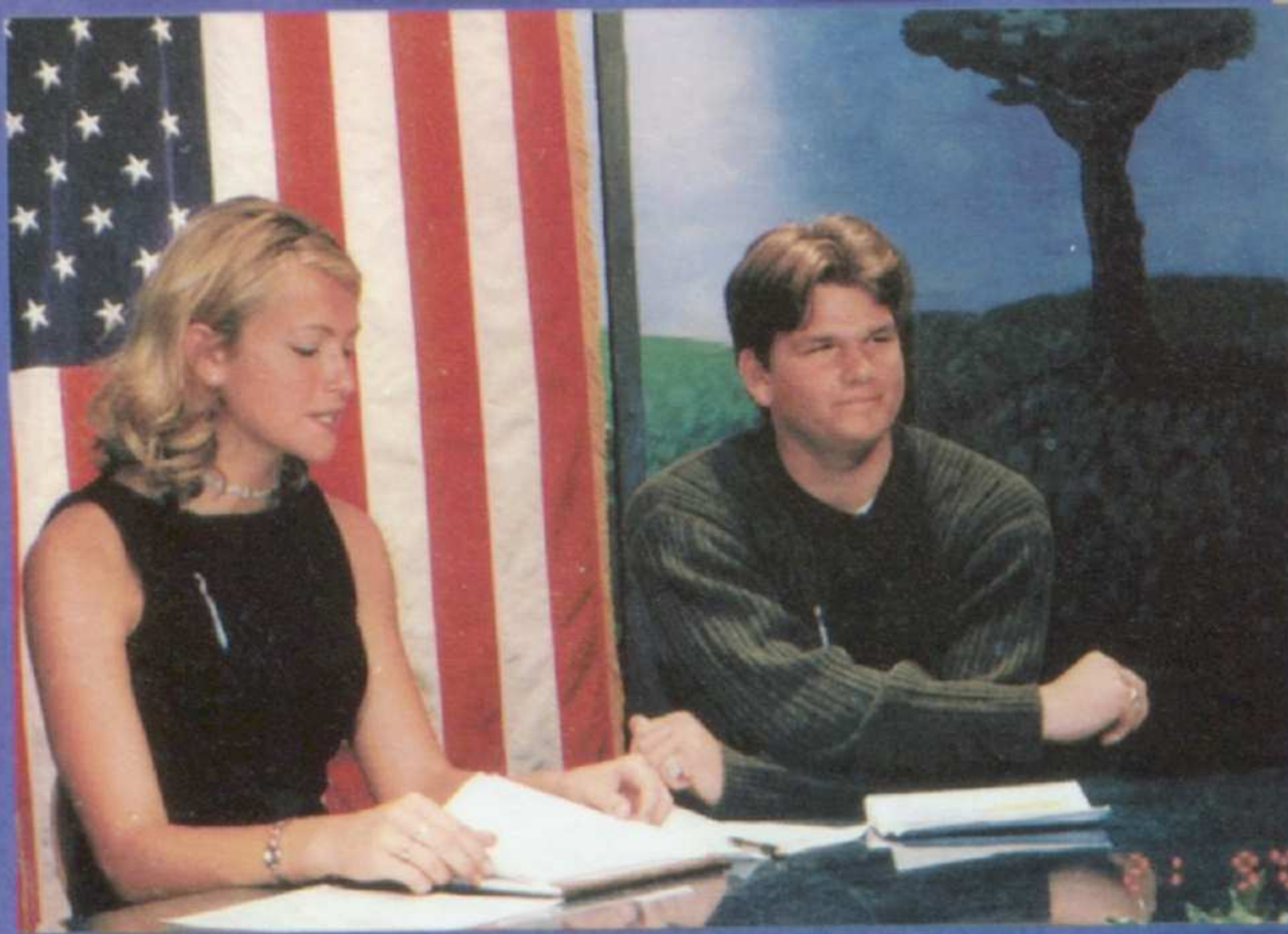
For the present generation, Tuesday, September 11 will go down as its own Day of Infamy. The suicide attacks began when a single passenger plane, hijacked en route to Los Angeles, slammed into New York City's World Trade Center at 8:45 a.m. Within 20 minutes a second plane struck the towers. Another dove into the Pentagon and a fourth plummeted to the earth outside of Somerset, Pennsylvania. In the end, the Twin Towers of the Trade Center had toppled and the Pentagon was smoldering.

There was no denying the enormity of what had happened, It looked to be days, if not longer, before the toll in deaths, injuries and property loss could be added up. Many had escaped before the buildings collapsed, but it was clear that thousands had not. Chilling images showed desperate employees leaping to their deaths from windows. Hundreds of emergency workers entered the buildings after the initial explosions to help with the rescues. As a result of their heroic efforts, hundreds would remain missing.

September 11 is not a day anyone is soon to forget, the video of the towers collapsing plays endlessly in our heads, we hear the recorded voices of phone calls of those who died, each time a siren goes off we fear the worst. The victims of these attacks did not die in vain however. As President Bush put it: "Terrorist attacks can shake the foundations of our biggest buildings, but they cannot touch the foundation of America." America has become reunited and everyone is working together to her back on her feet. As President Bush has made known, we will fight back, and we will be victorious.

On September 21, Thomas Worthington hosted a telethon to raise money for the American Red Cross in response to the terrorist attacks of September 11. Over \$28,000 was collected from the community on this day.

The Communications Technology class, taught by Nancy Beattie and Ron Charlton, put on the five hour, live show with little training on how to run a production. However, they pulled it off by providing entertainment, interviews, and a sense of togetherness with our community.

The Army, Navy, Marines, Principal Scot Prebles, Superintendent Rick Fenton, City Manager Dave Elder, Football coach Dan Sparks, as well as many other guests voiced their opinions and feelings dealing with this tragedy. TWHS Student Council collected thousands of dollars from passing cars on Route 161. Donations also came in from area businesses including \$5000 from manager of Jubilee Foods, Joe Cousins.

While television anchors worked hard interviewing the many guests. Backstage and camera crews also contributed countless hours of effort to the show. Mr. Charlton created a touching opening video with memorable pictures of the attacks.

Mrs. Beattie accurately summarized the day by saying, "I've never been involved in a school activity in 19 years of teaching that was so all inclusive. Everyone every teacher, student, administrator, and staff should be proud of what they did. This was not a small undertaking. This was huge."

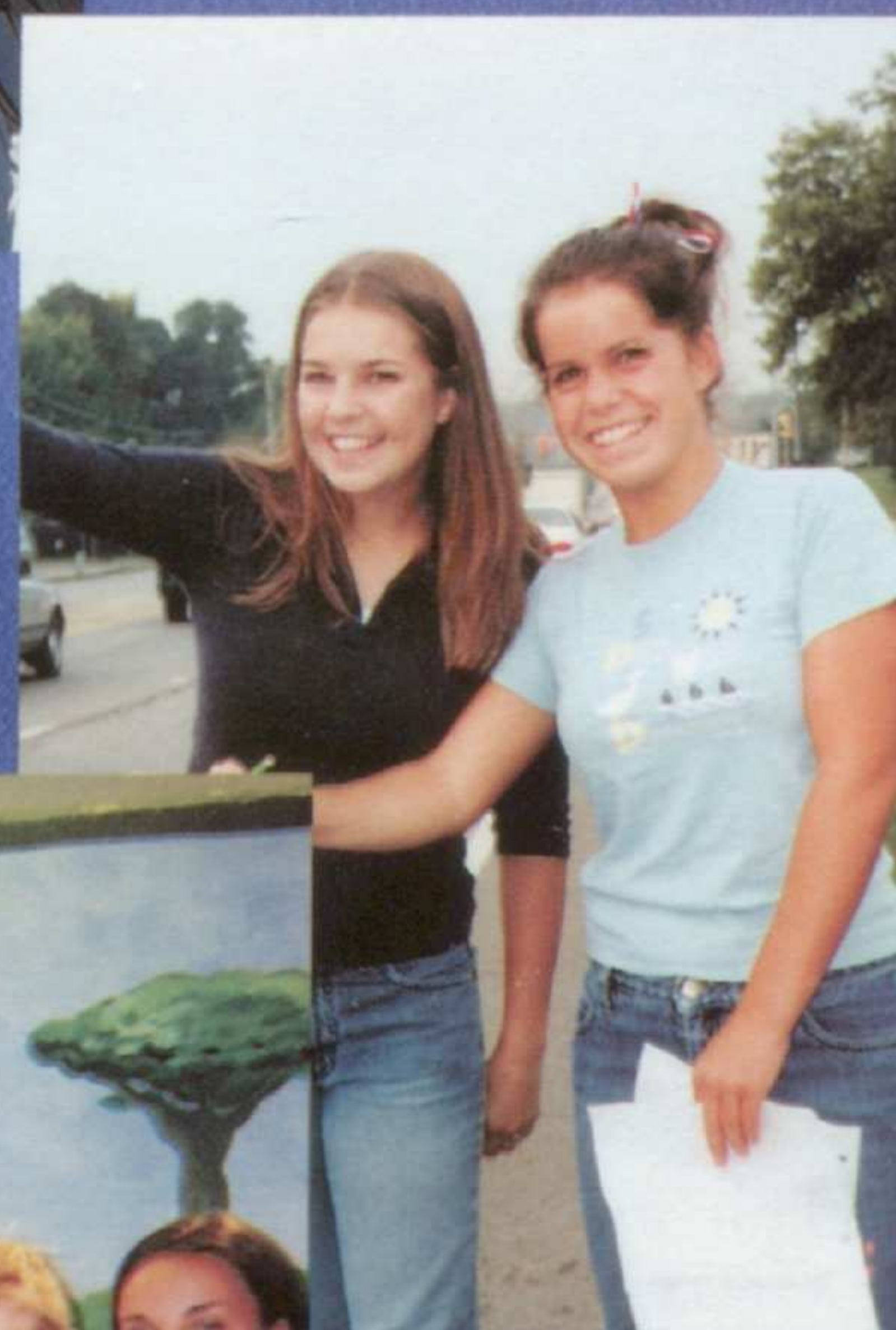

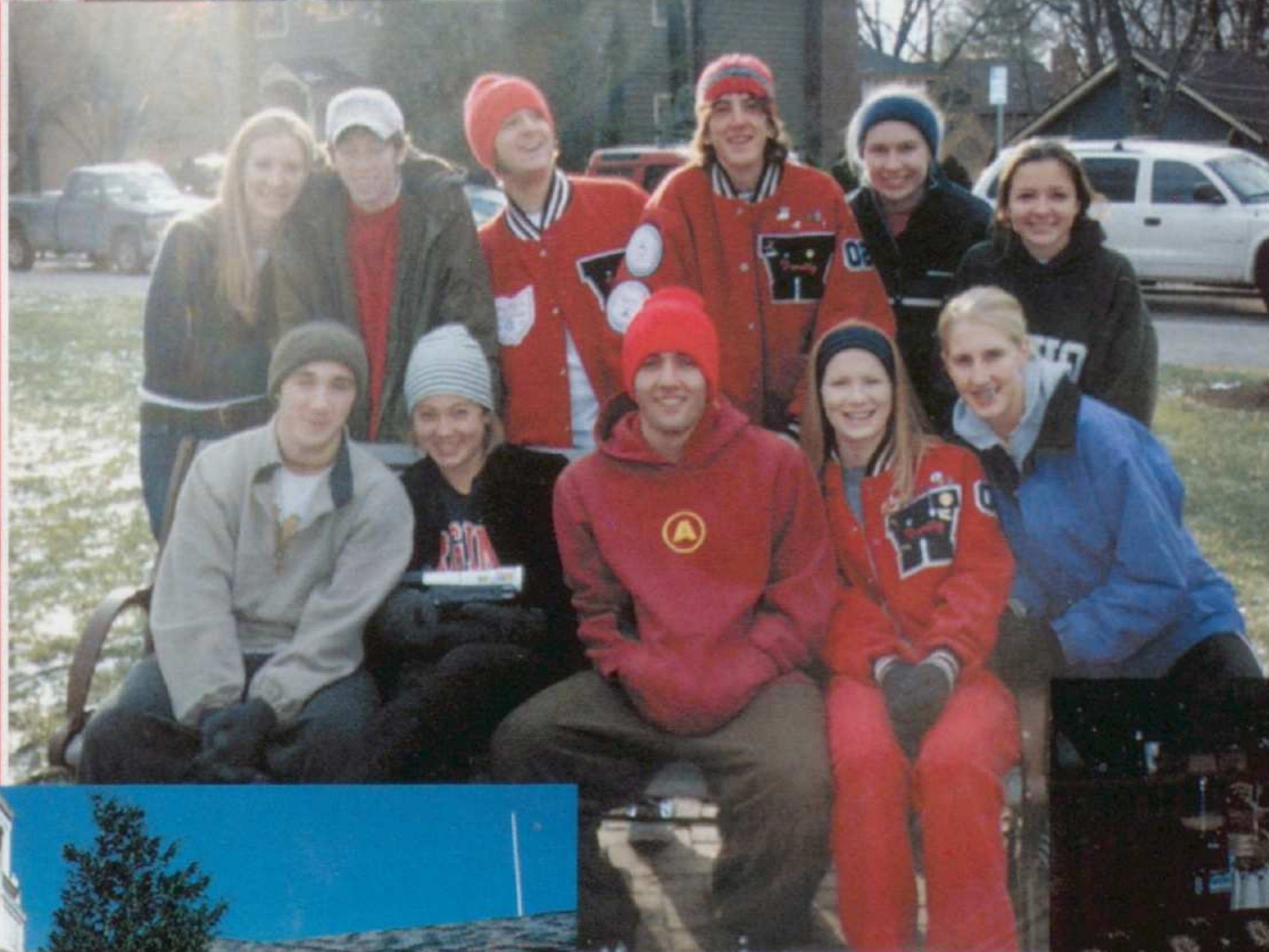

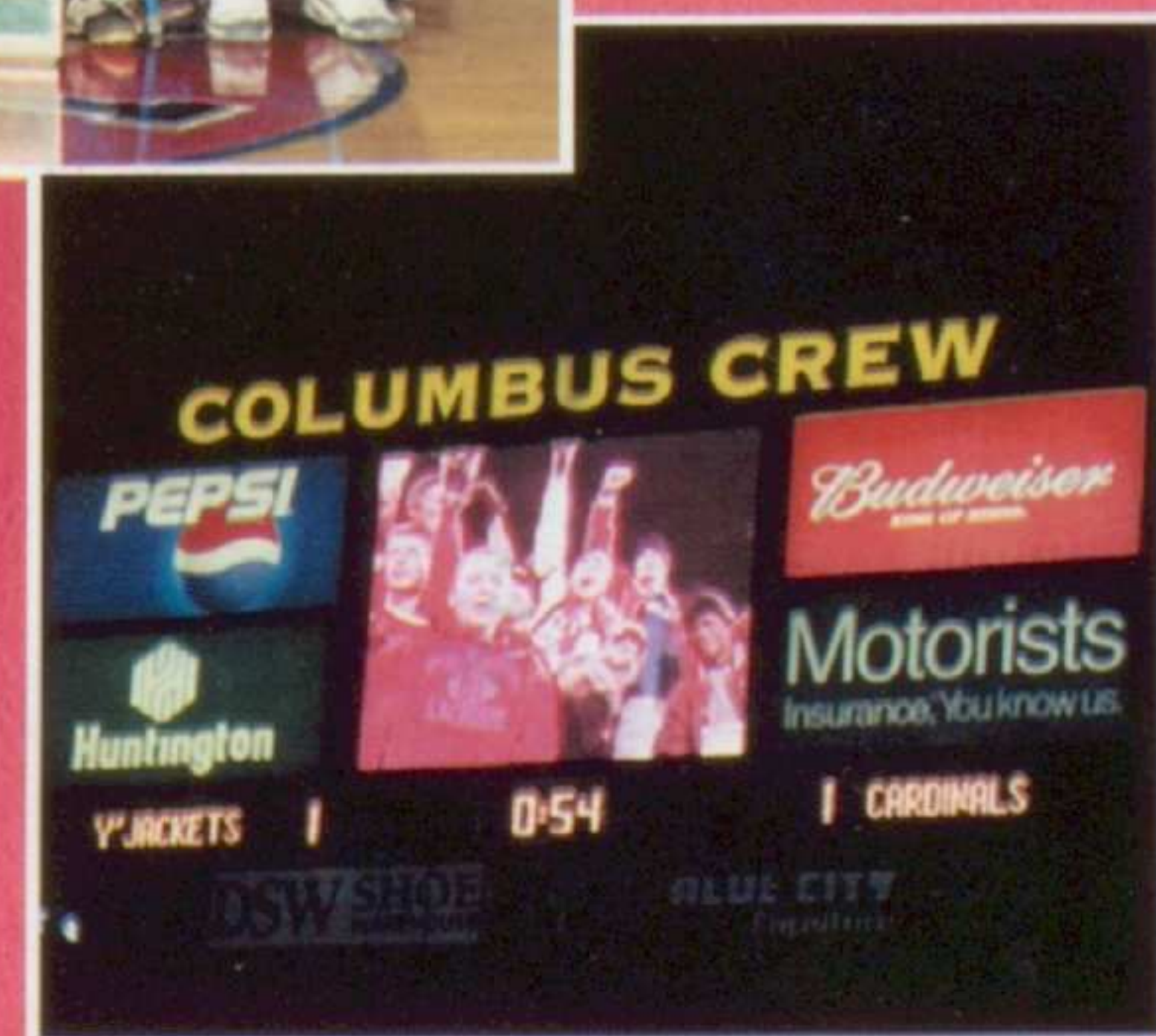

A Day in the Life

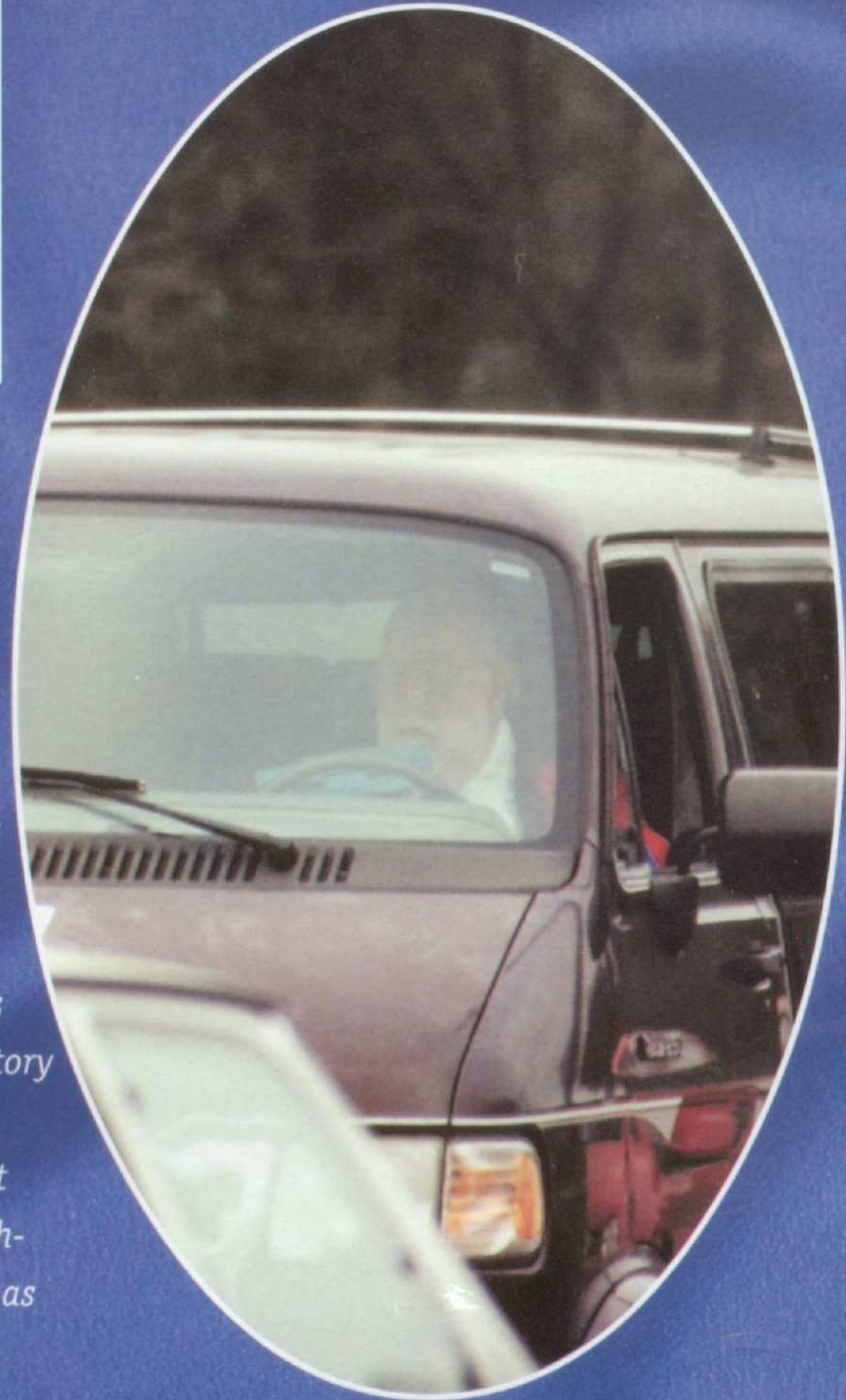

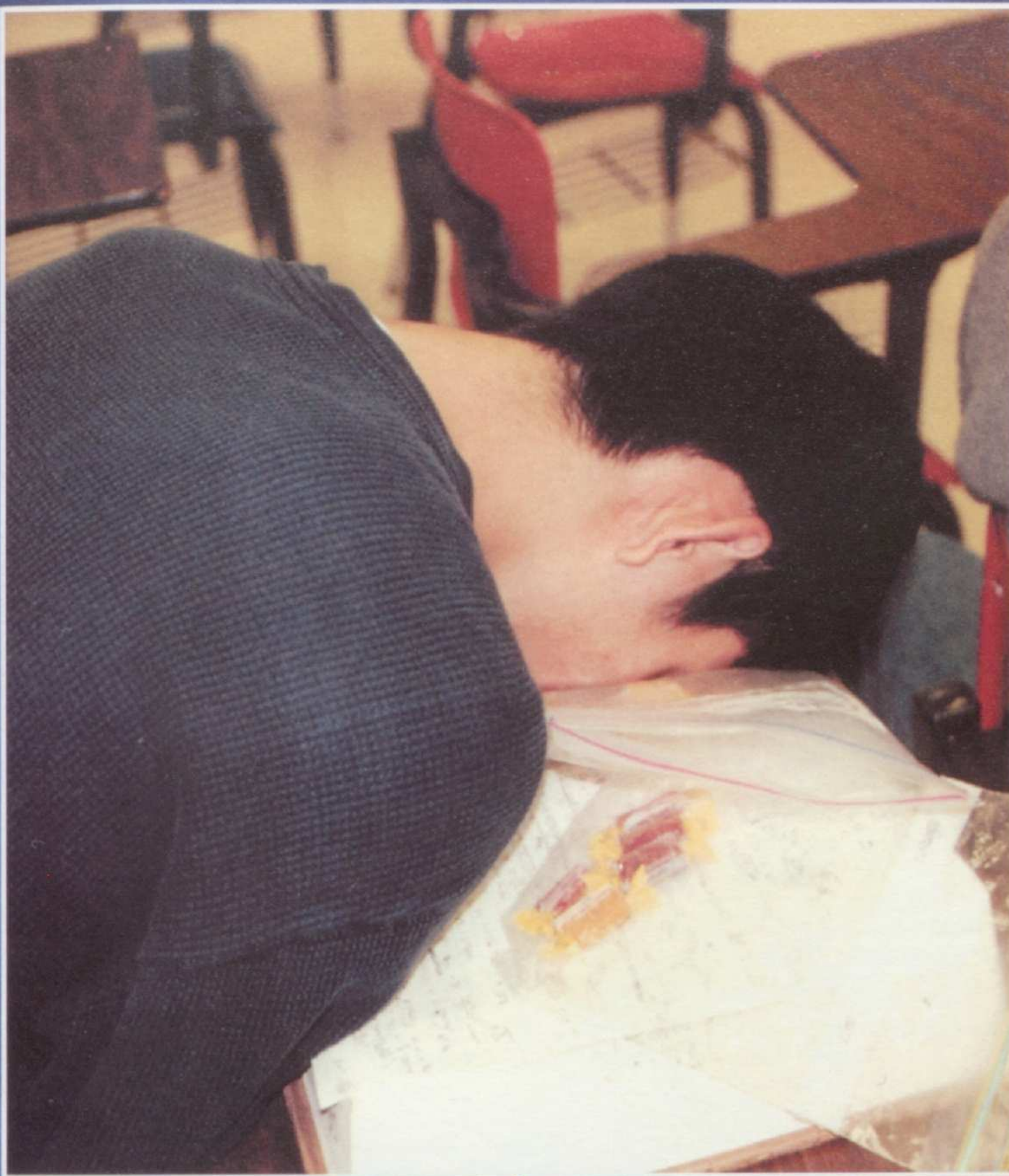

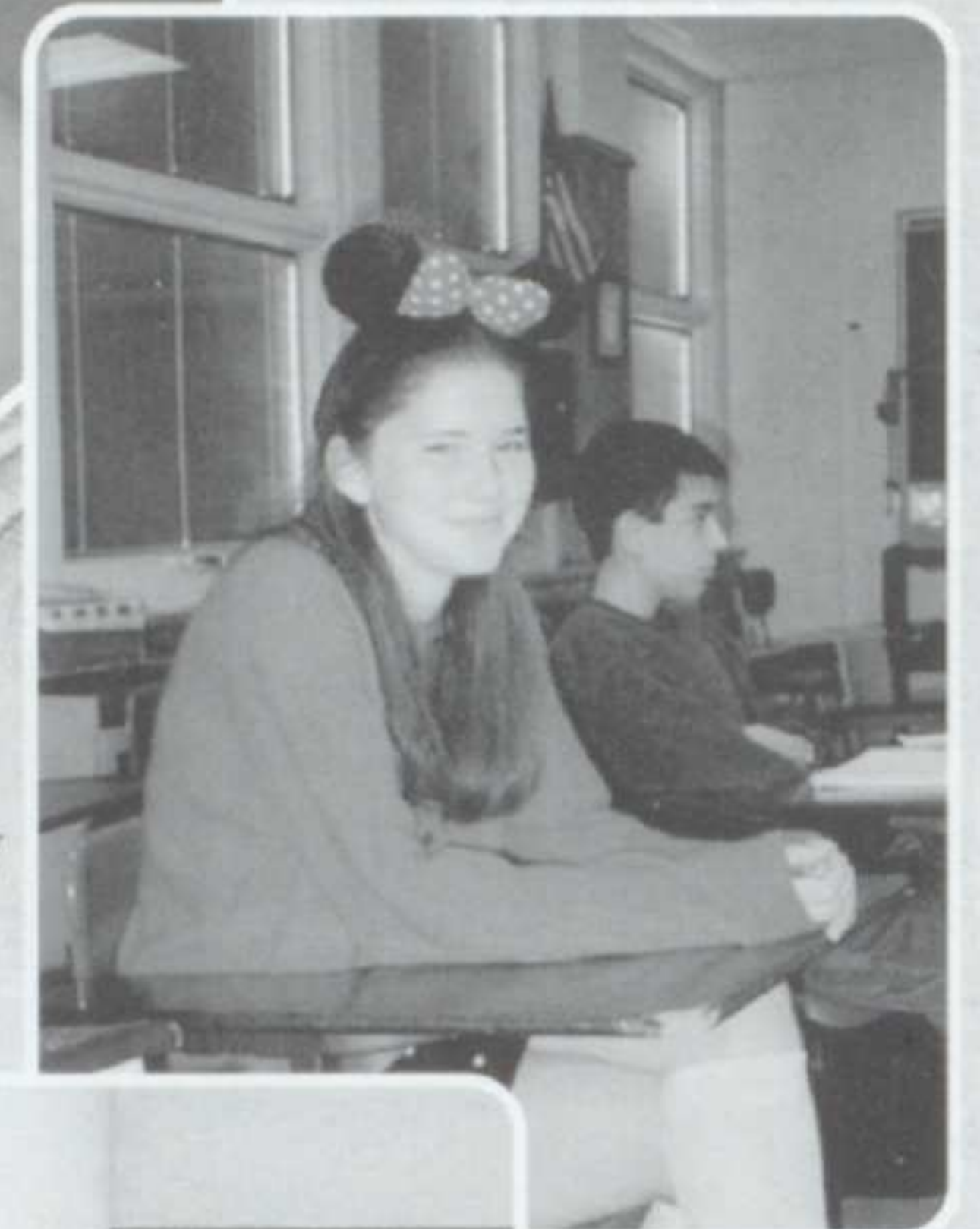

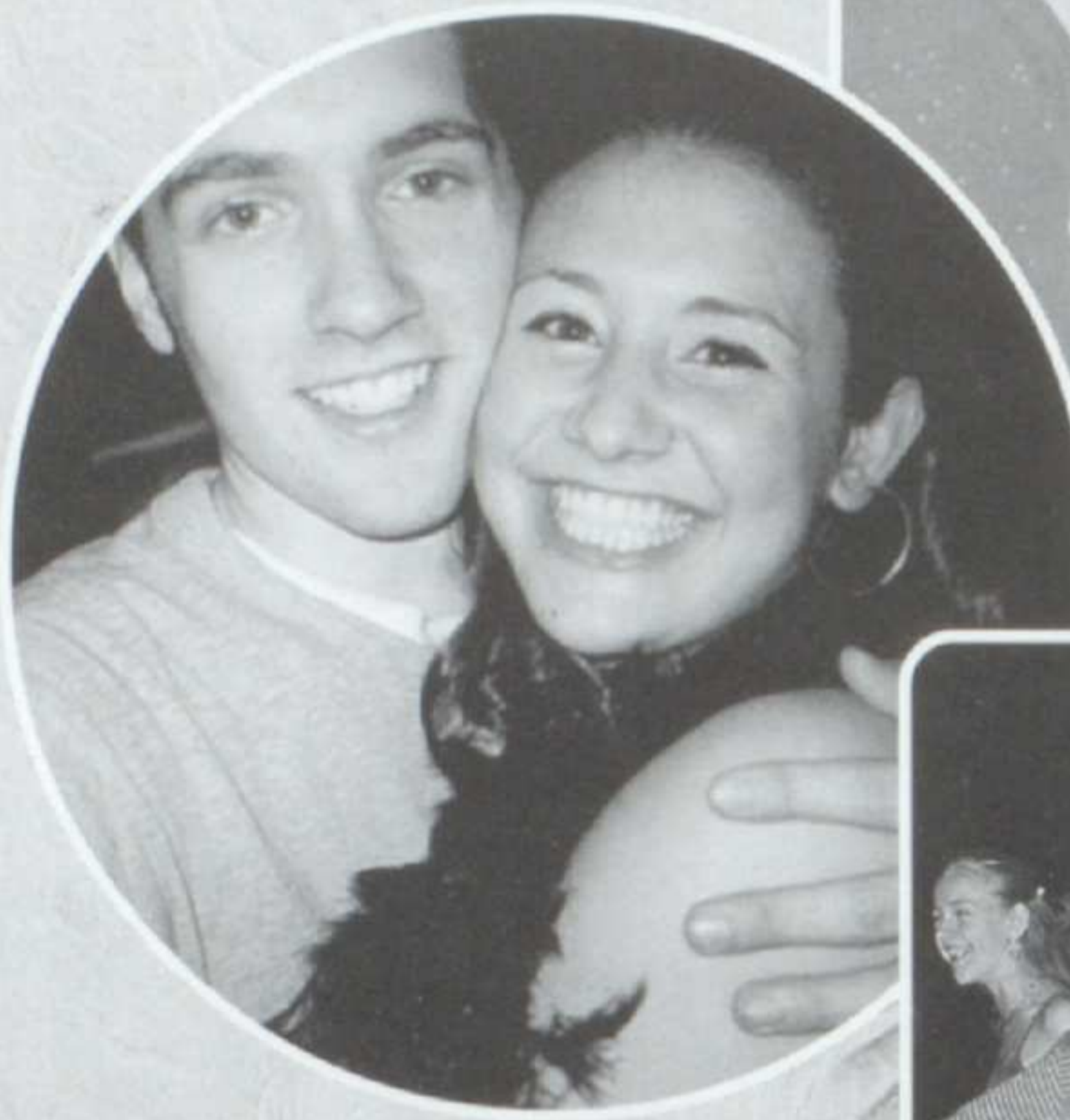
Winter Dance

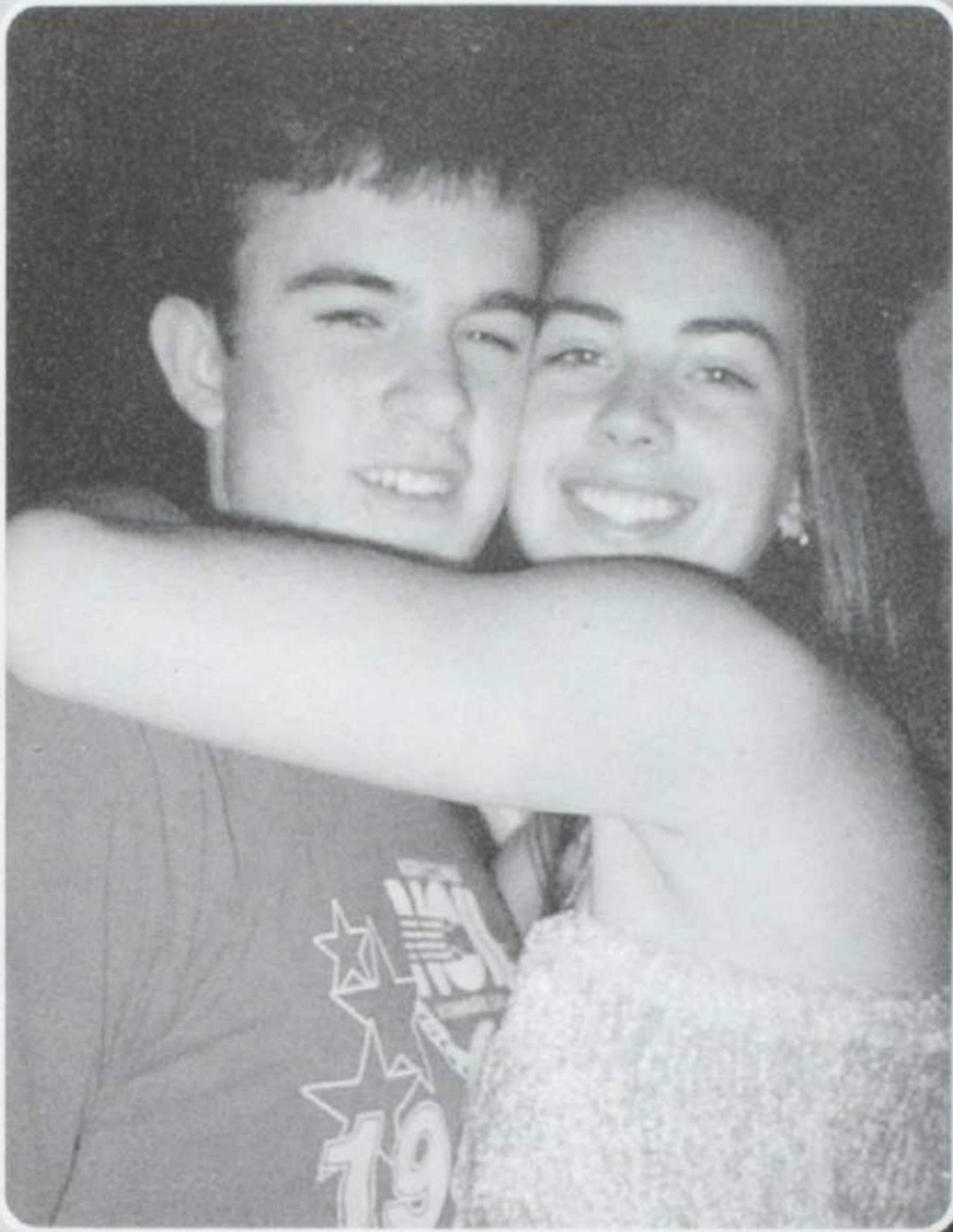

Not only was the American Heart Association collection successful, but from looking at the smiles on the faces of students as they left, the dance was a success as well.

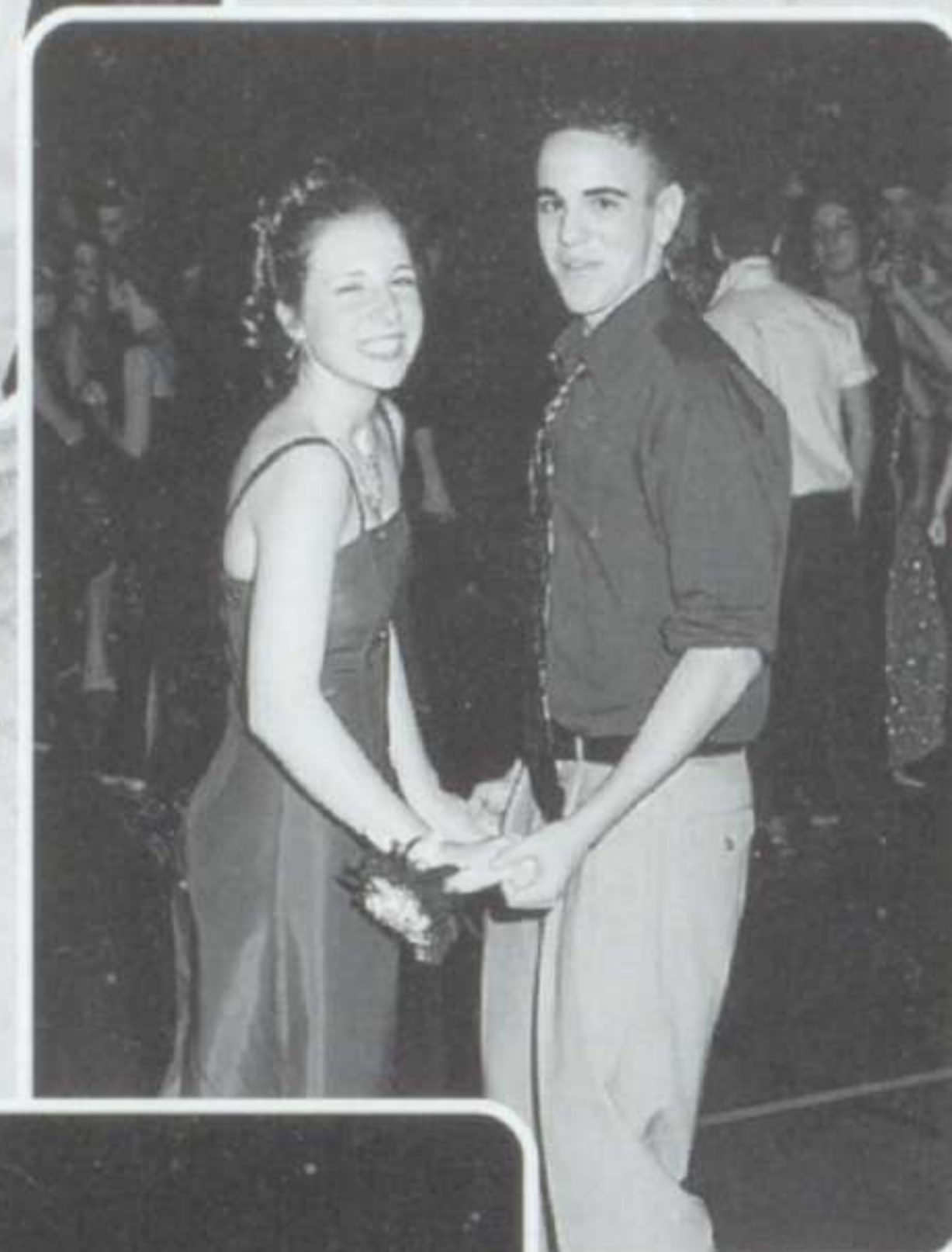

Although figuring out a name for this year's prom was a small feat, "A Night on the Town" turned out to be the perfect name for the perfect evening.

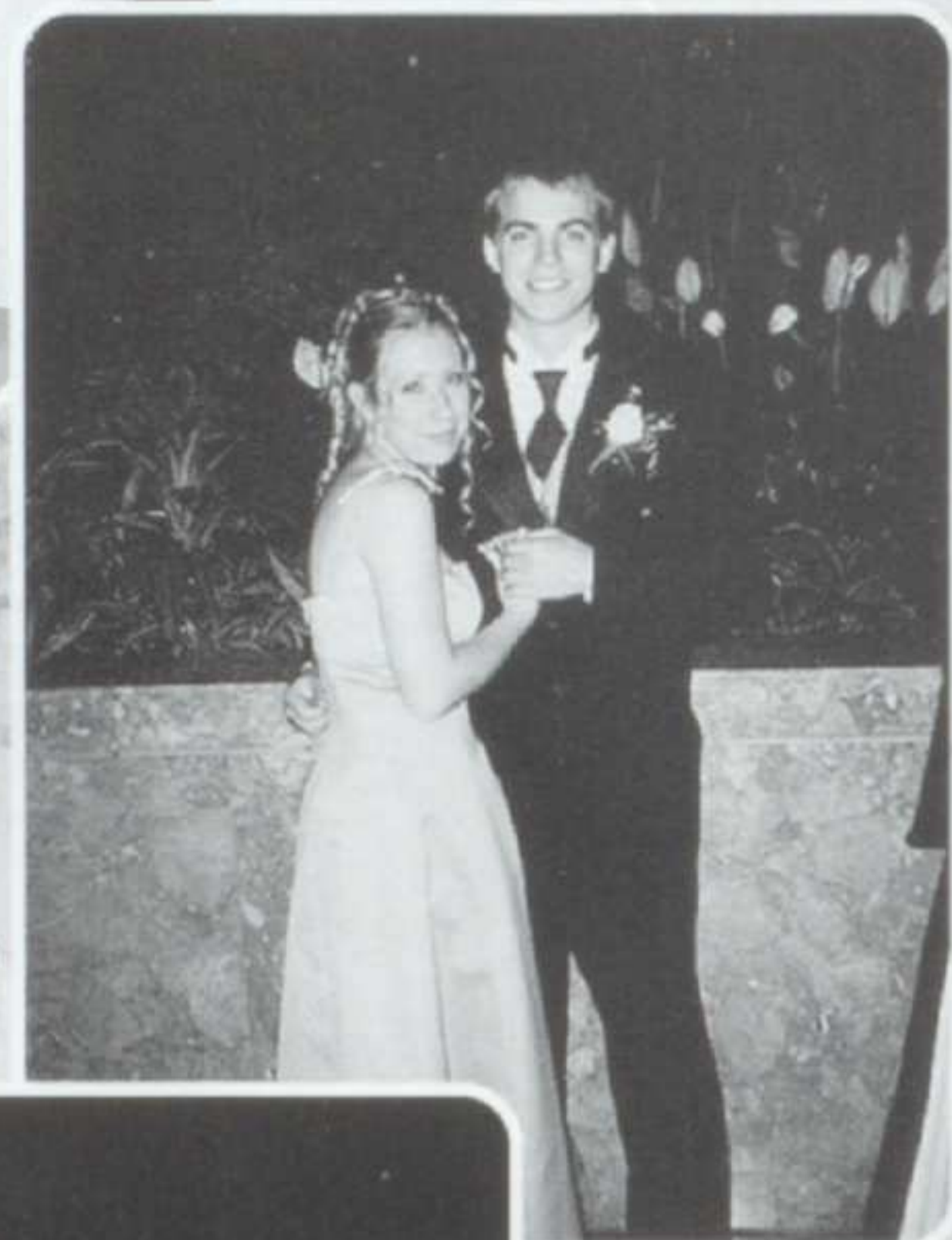

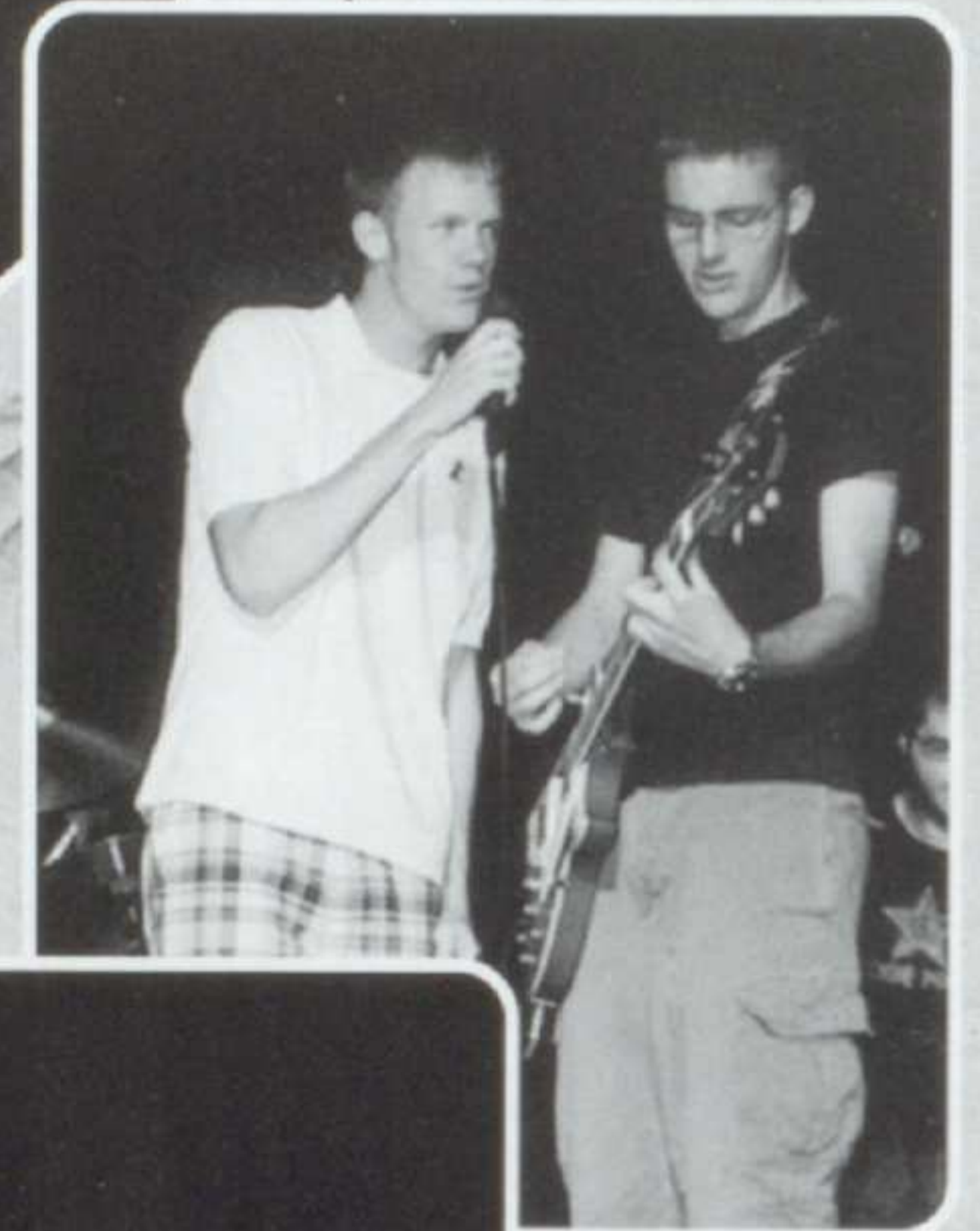
Talent Show

The food was great, the games were fun, and the prizes were plentiful. I think you could say it was a great party.

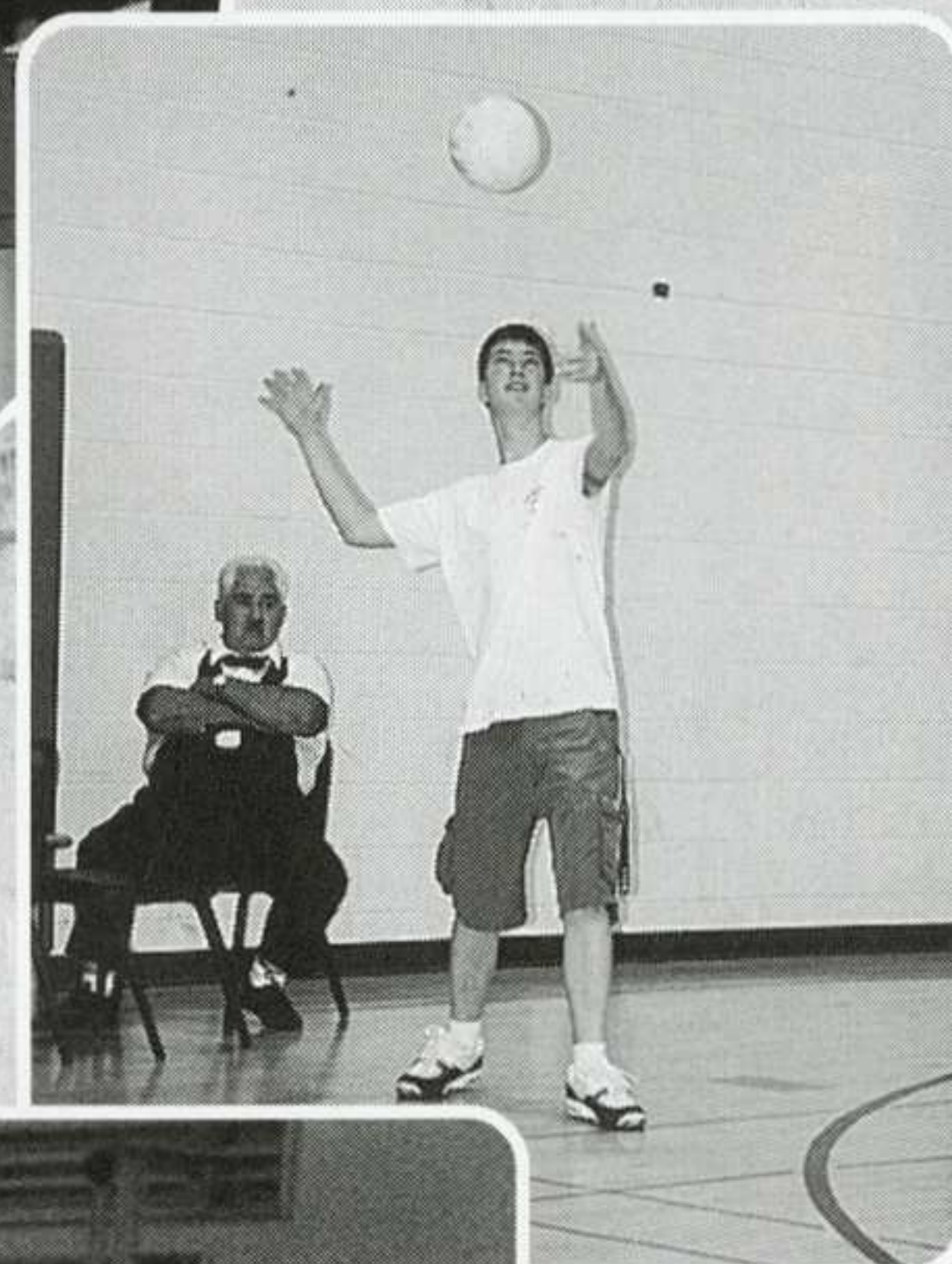

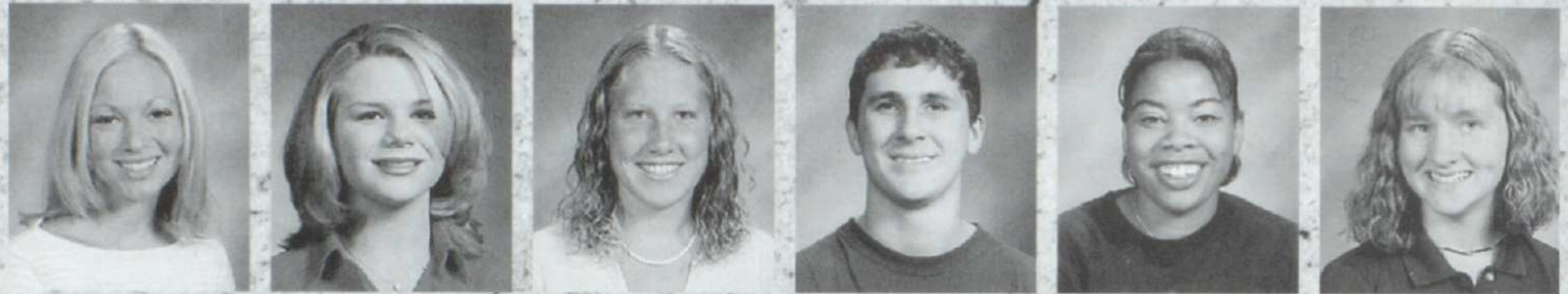
The world will never be the same after this tragic event. But hopefully the students of Thomas Worthington have changed their own way of looking at the world for the better.

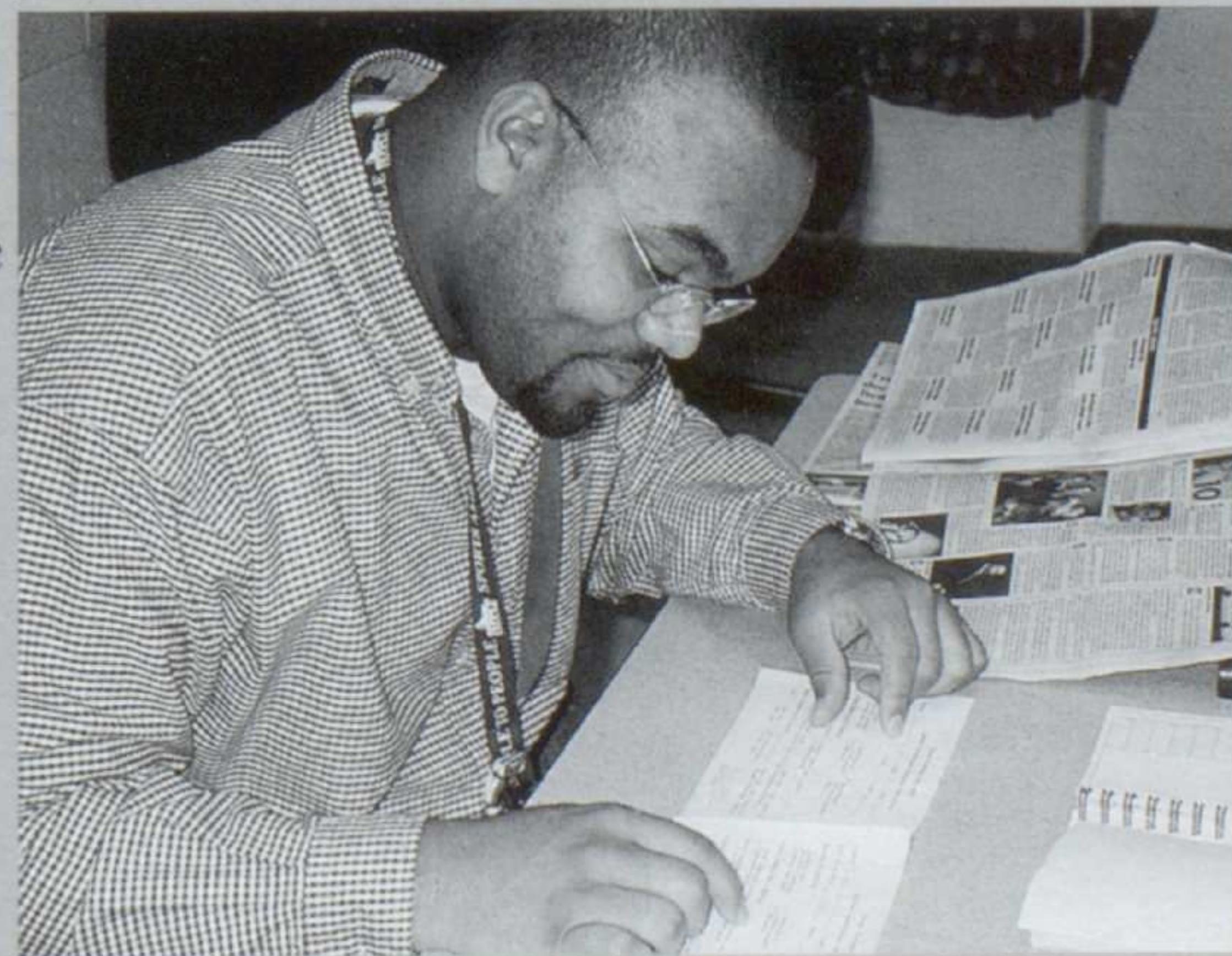
A Tale of Two Millers

details of these escapades.

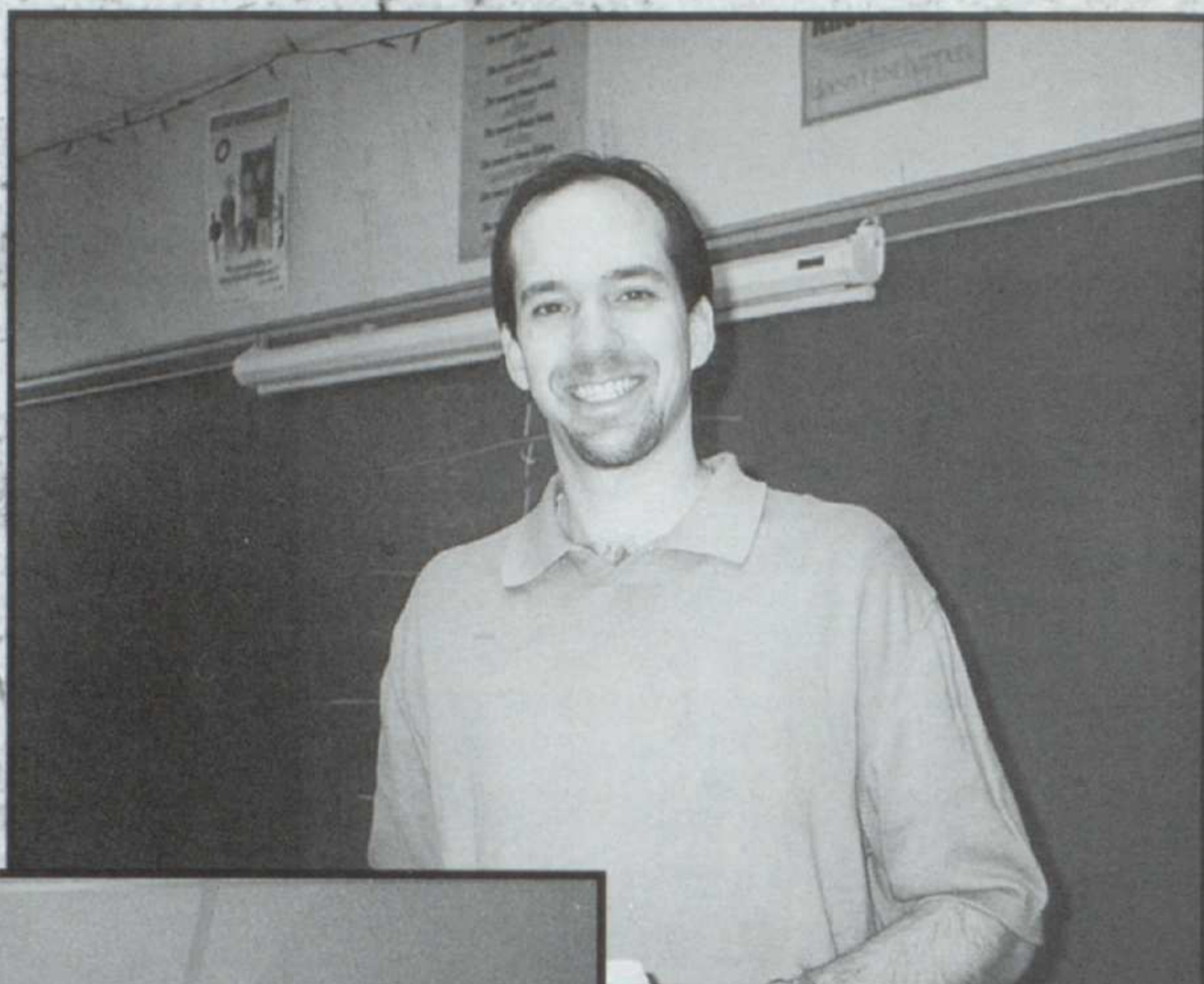

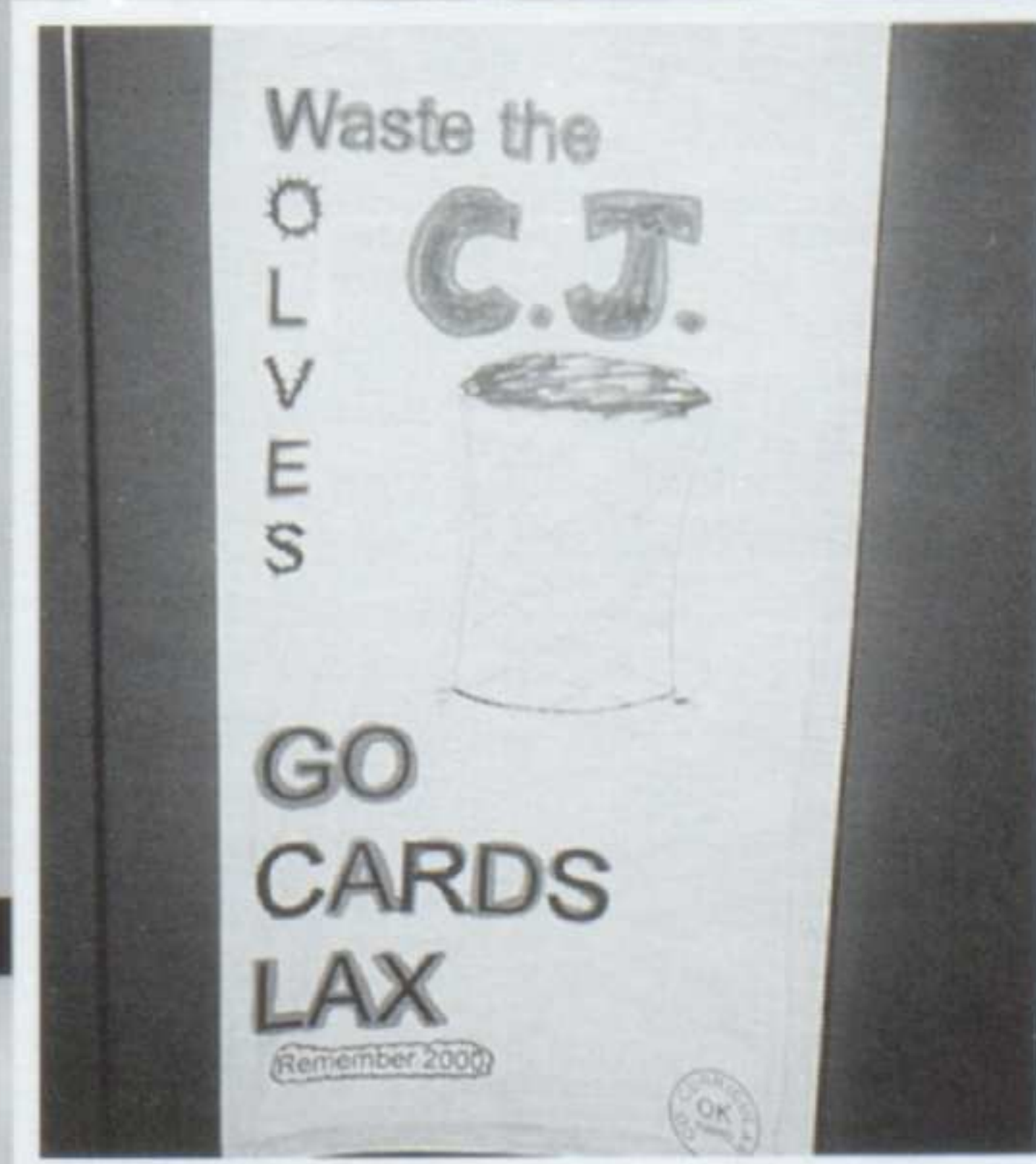
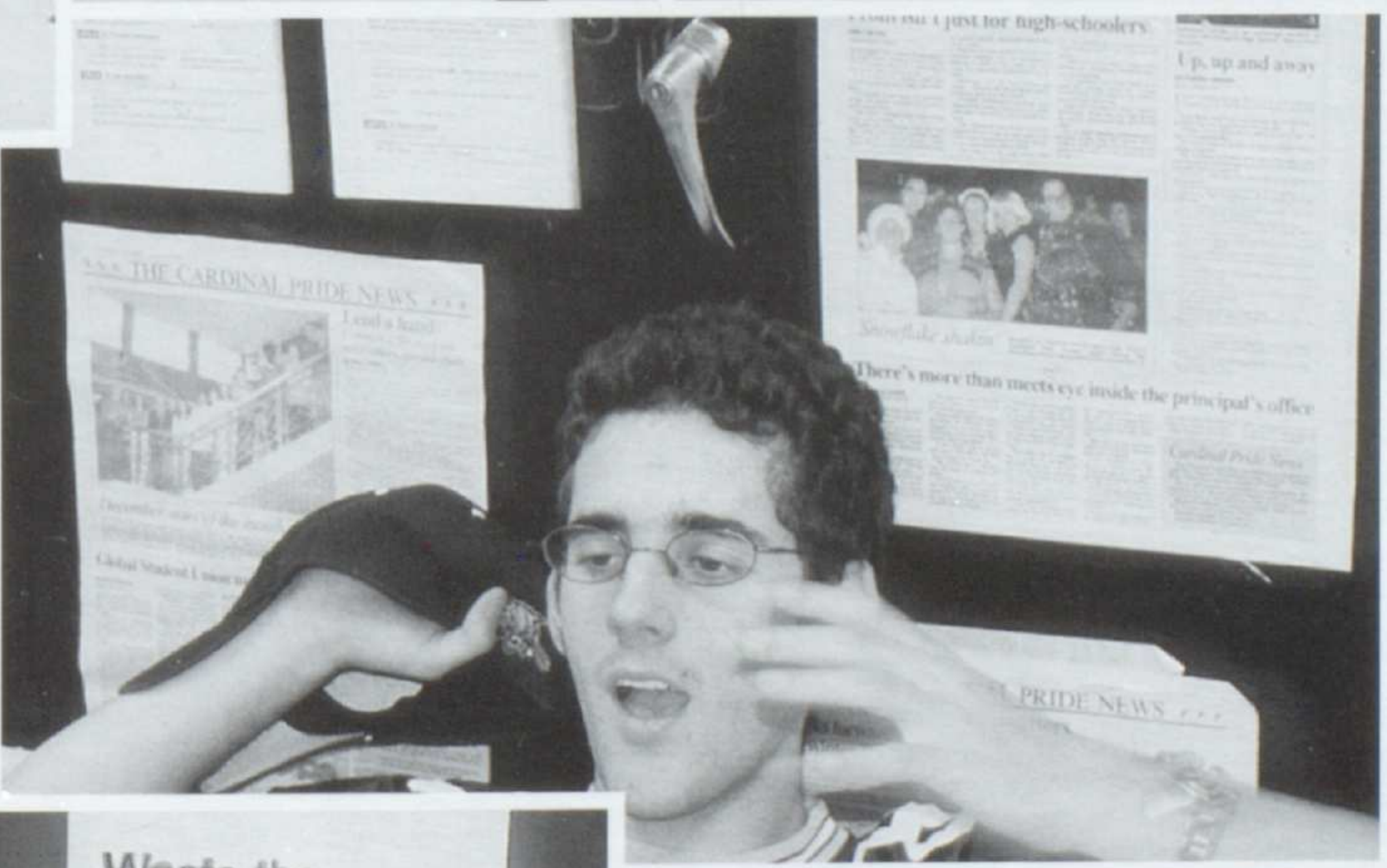
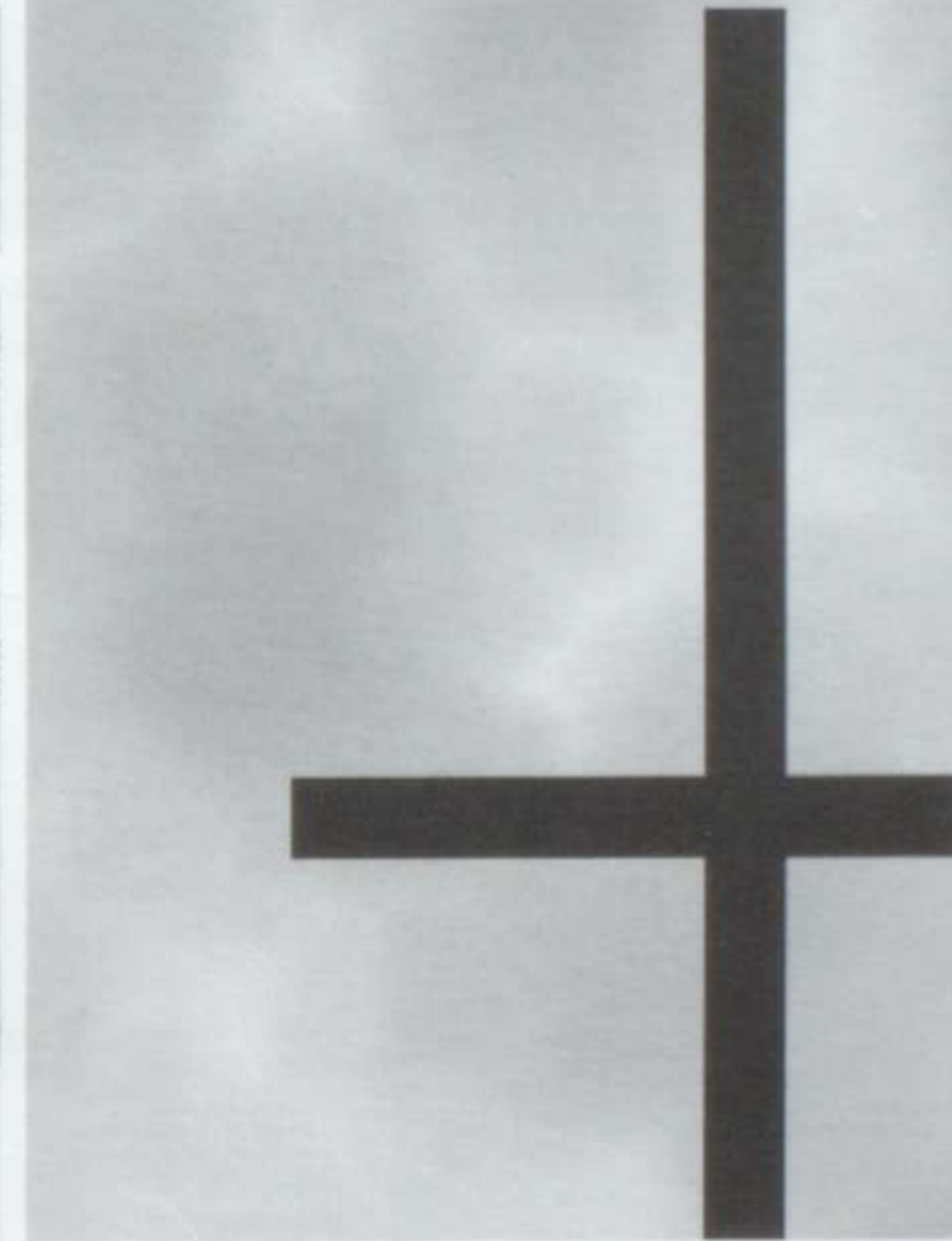
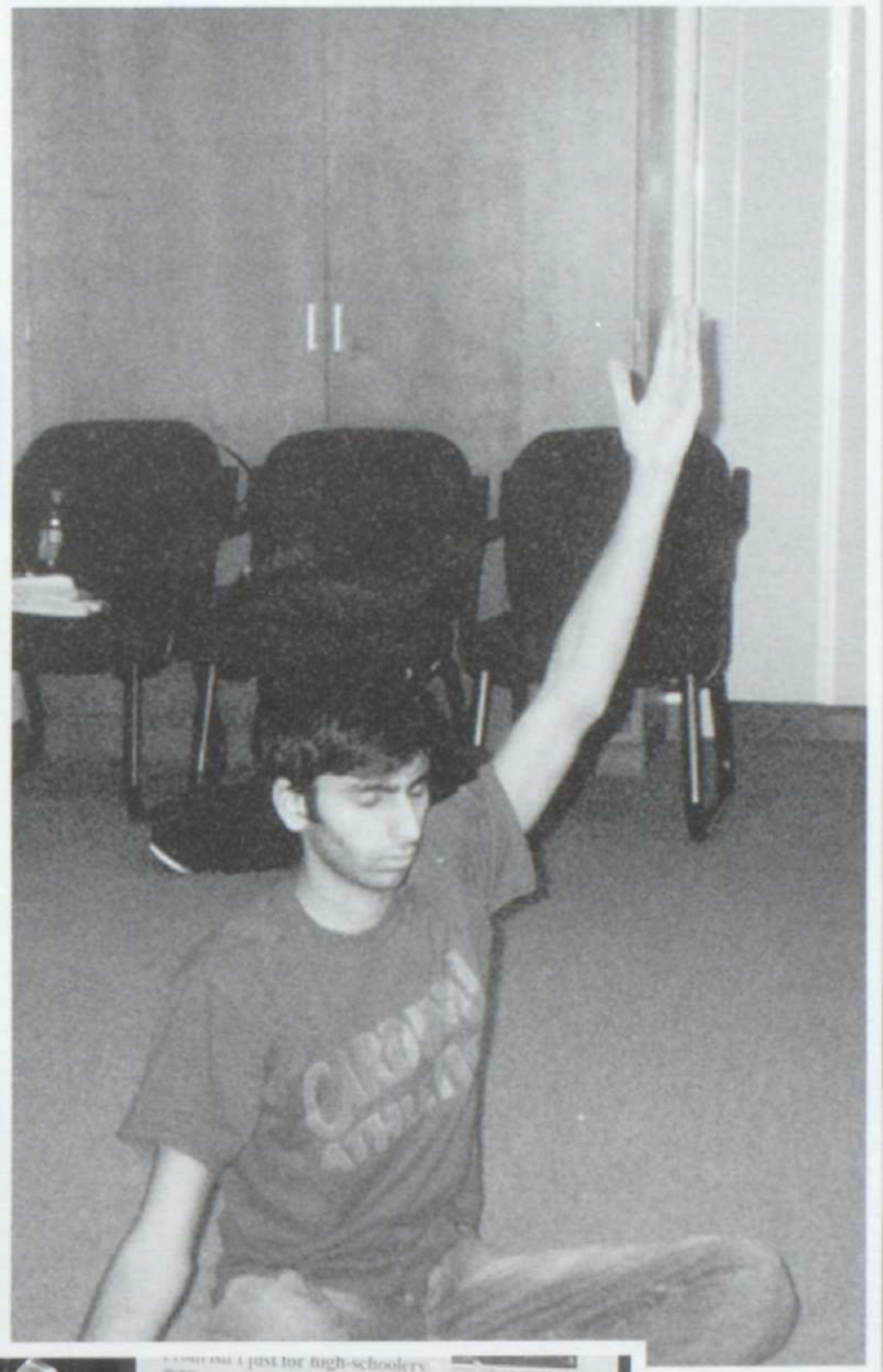
The most memorable moments, for Mr. Prebles, have been the individual accomplishments of the students, including all the little

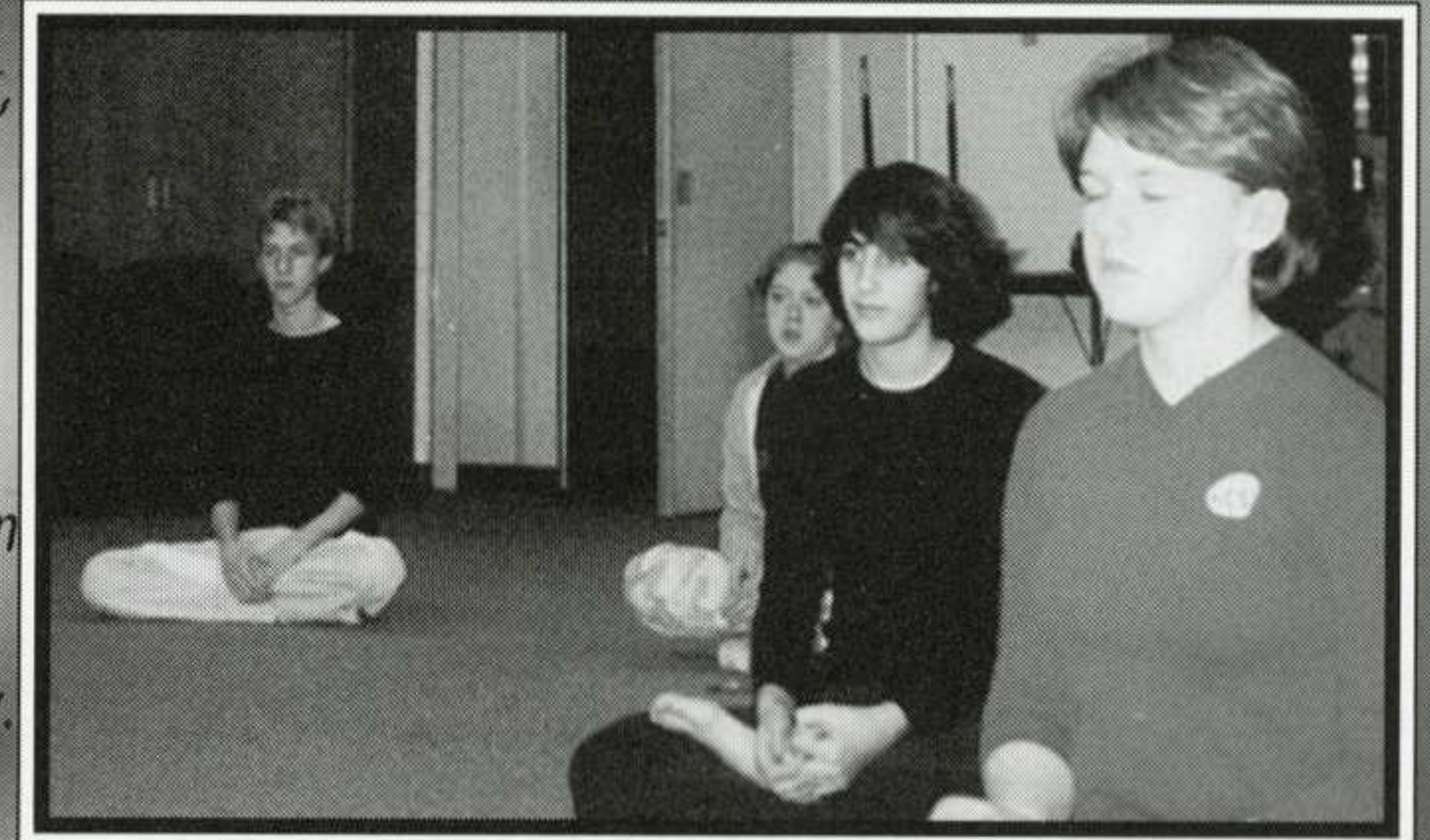

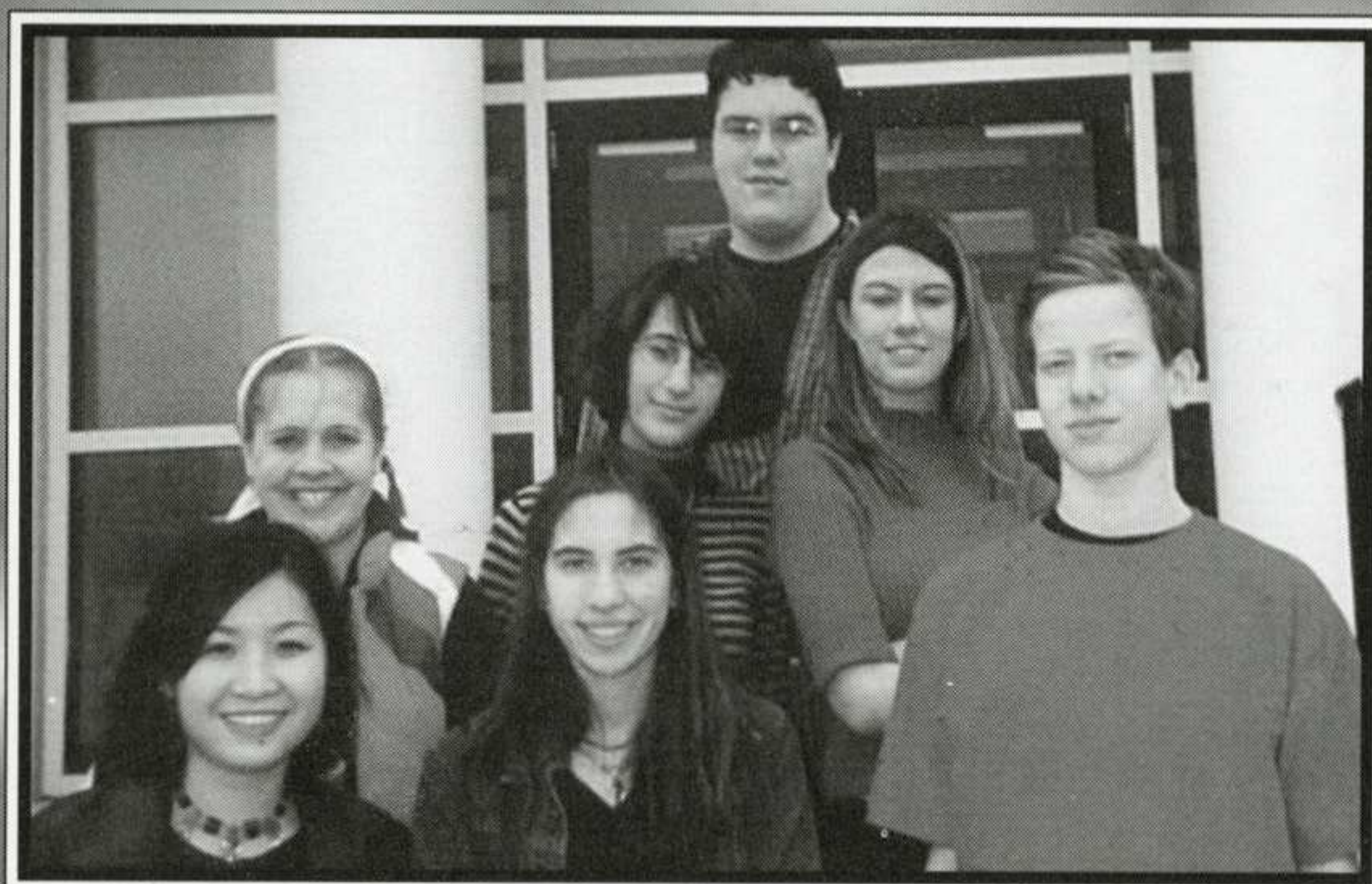

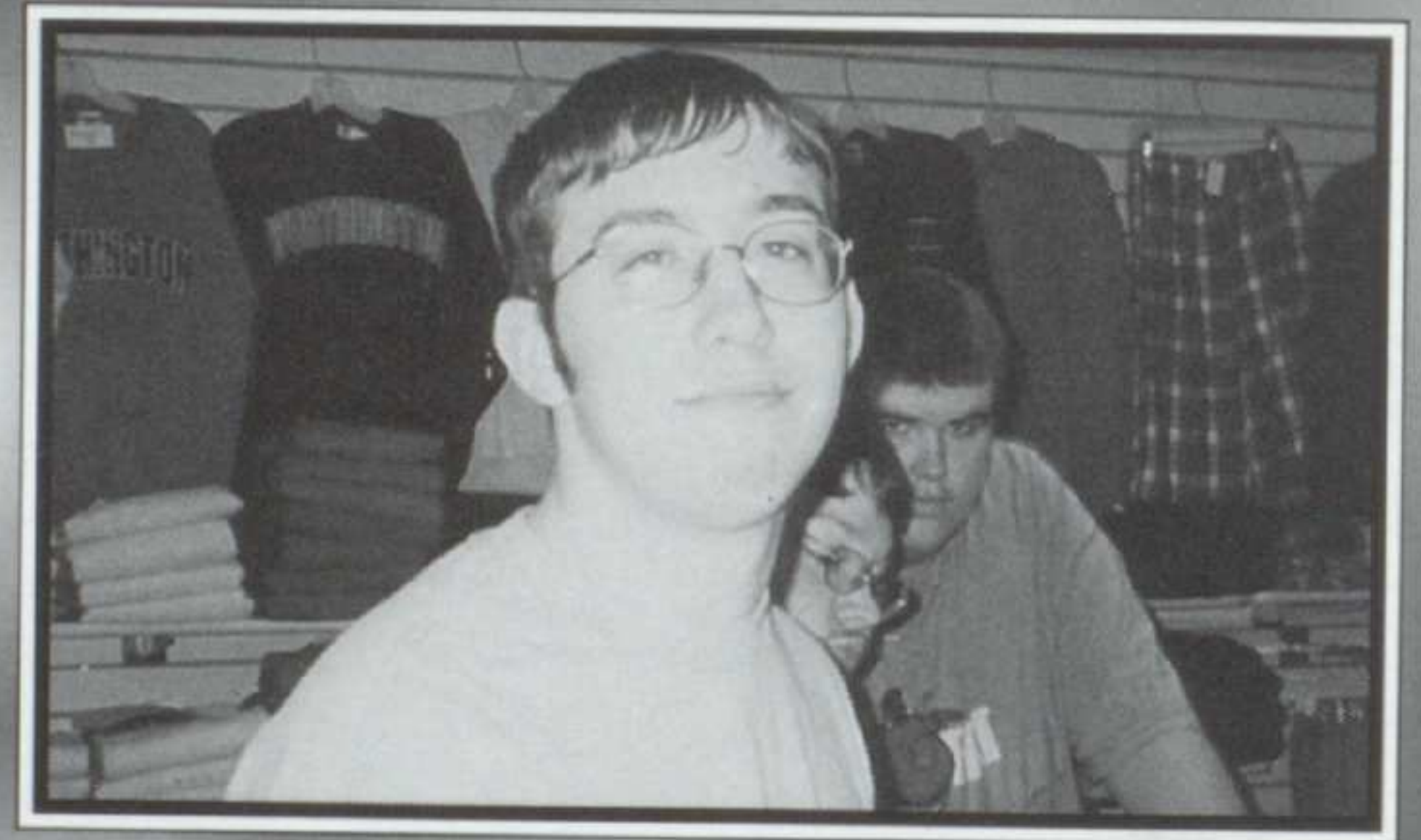
DECA

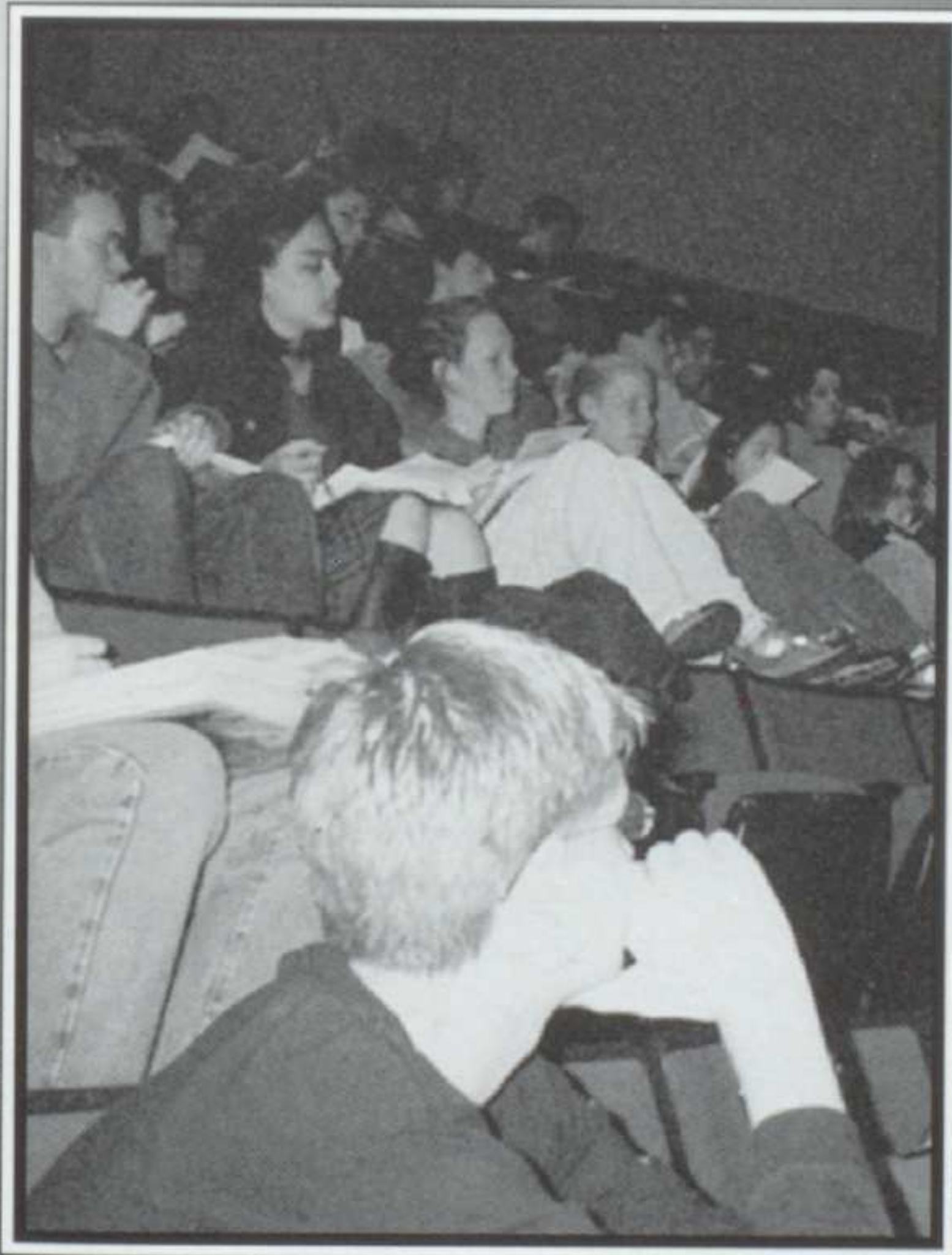

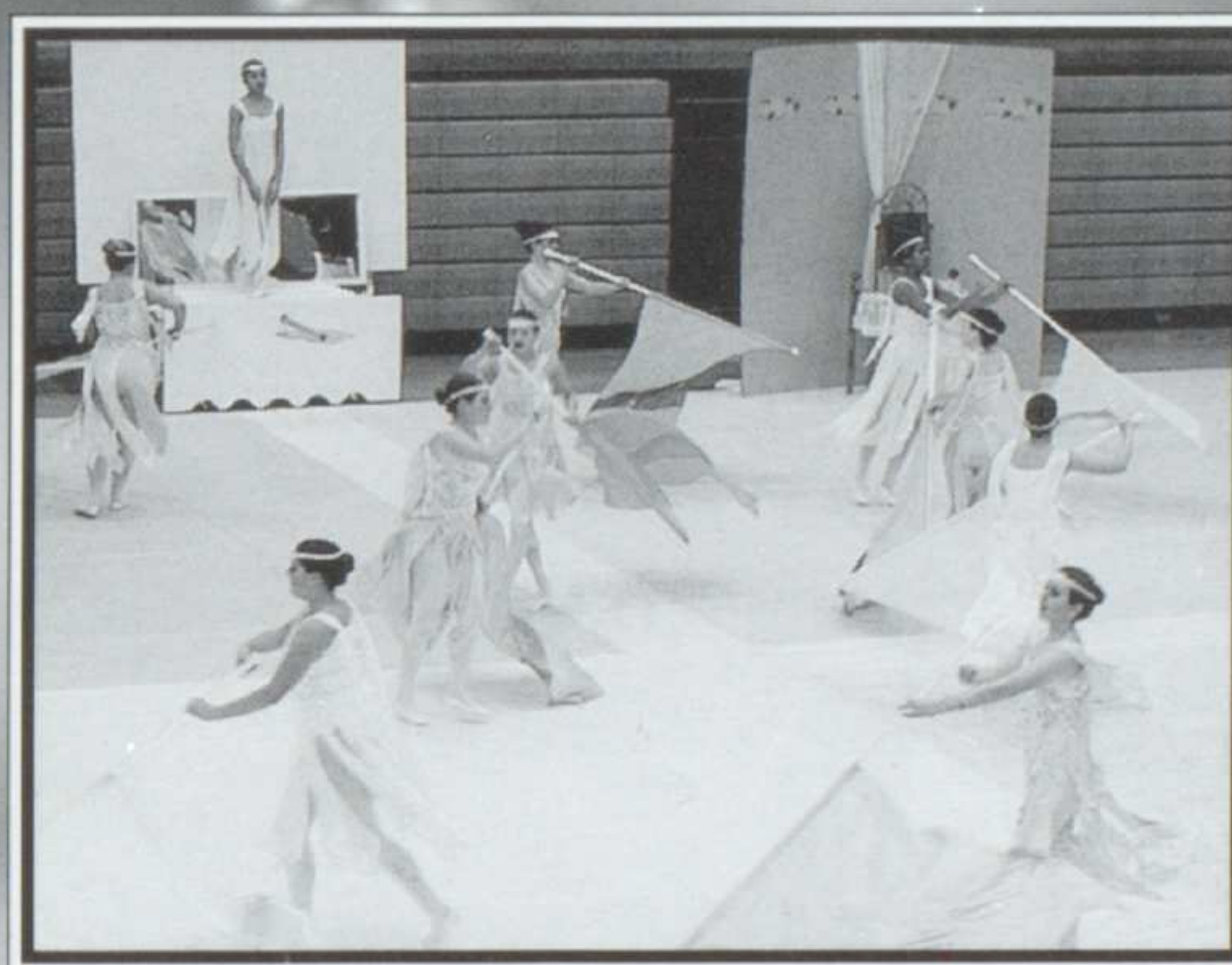

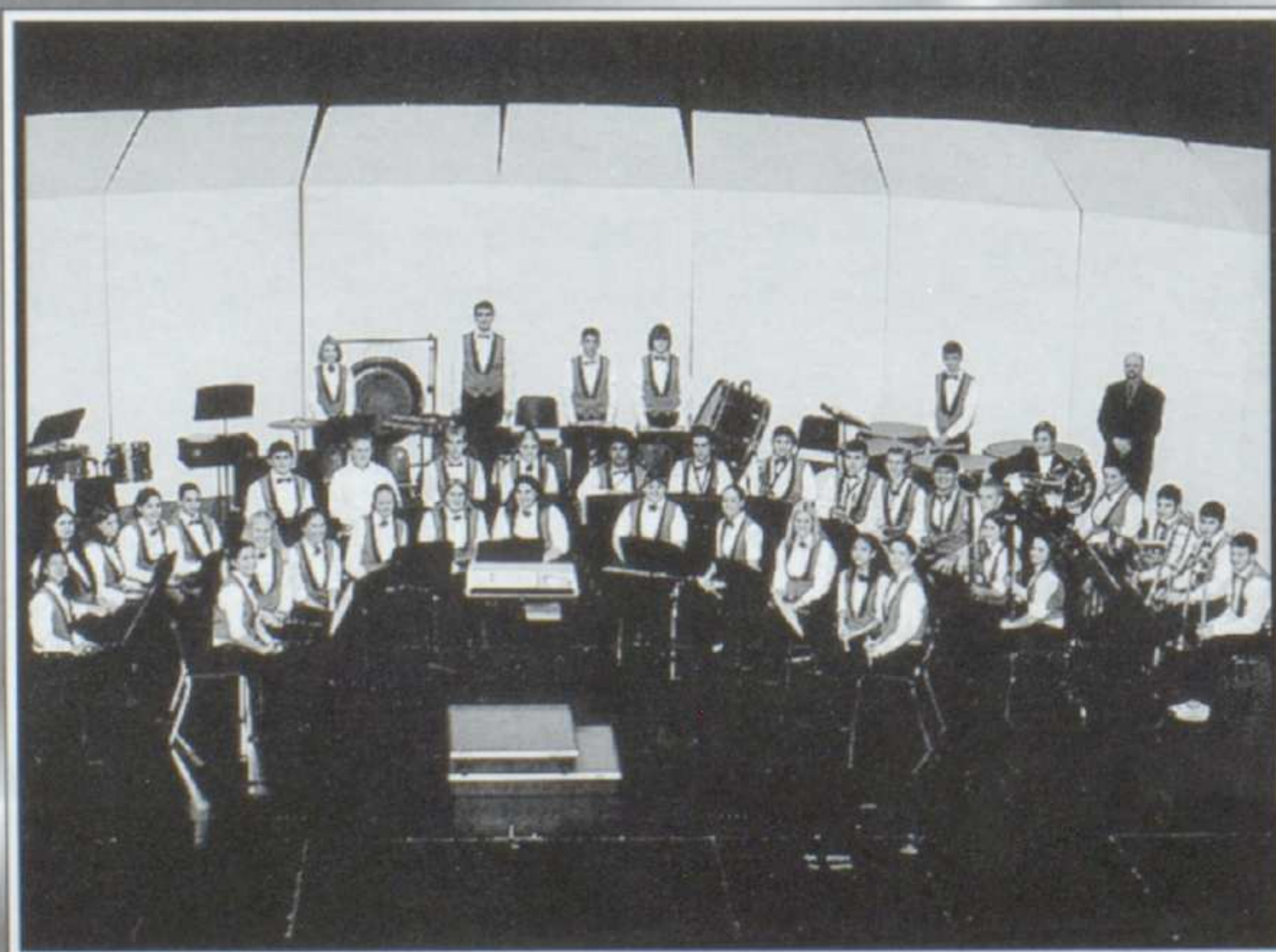

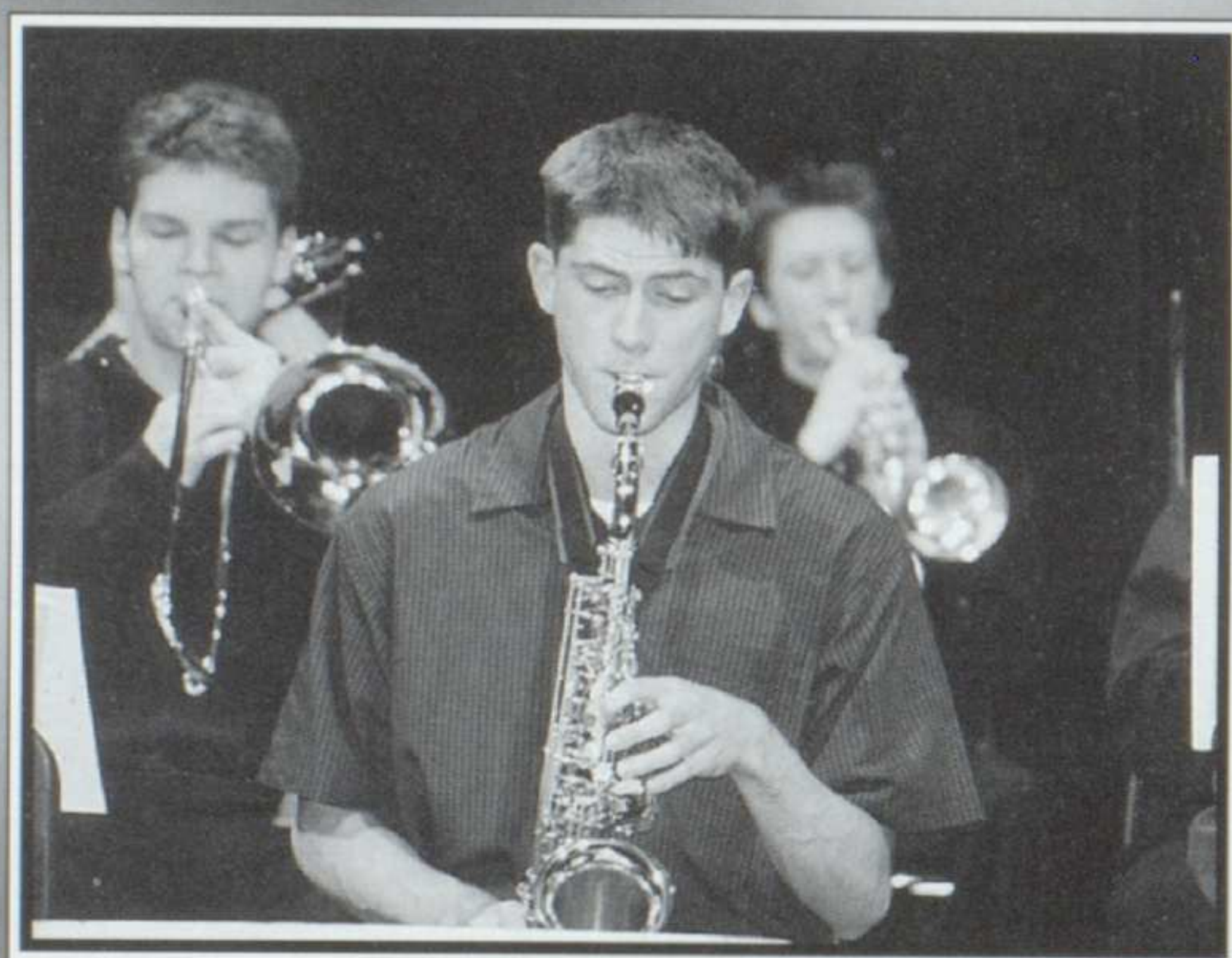

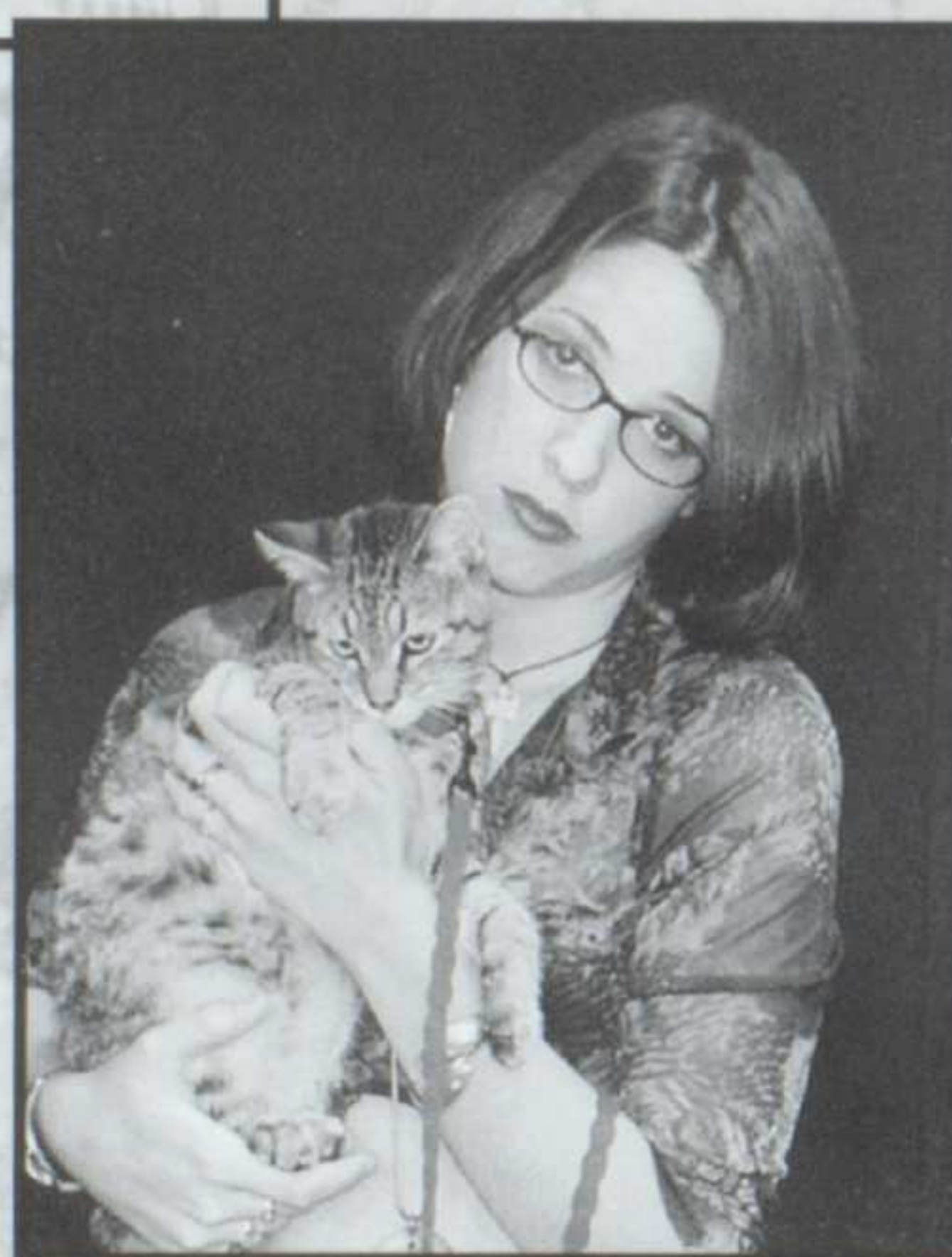

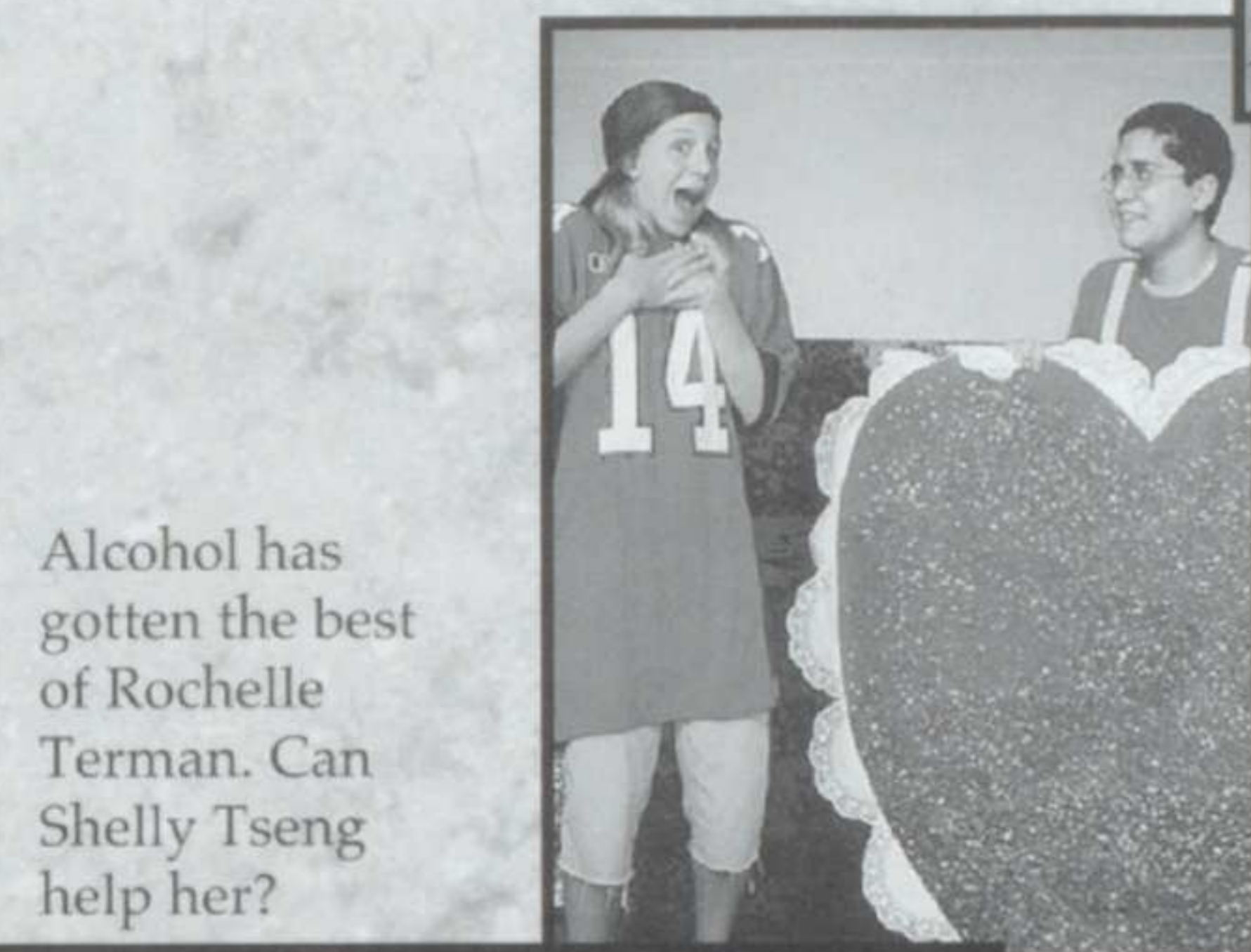

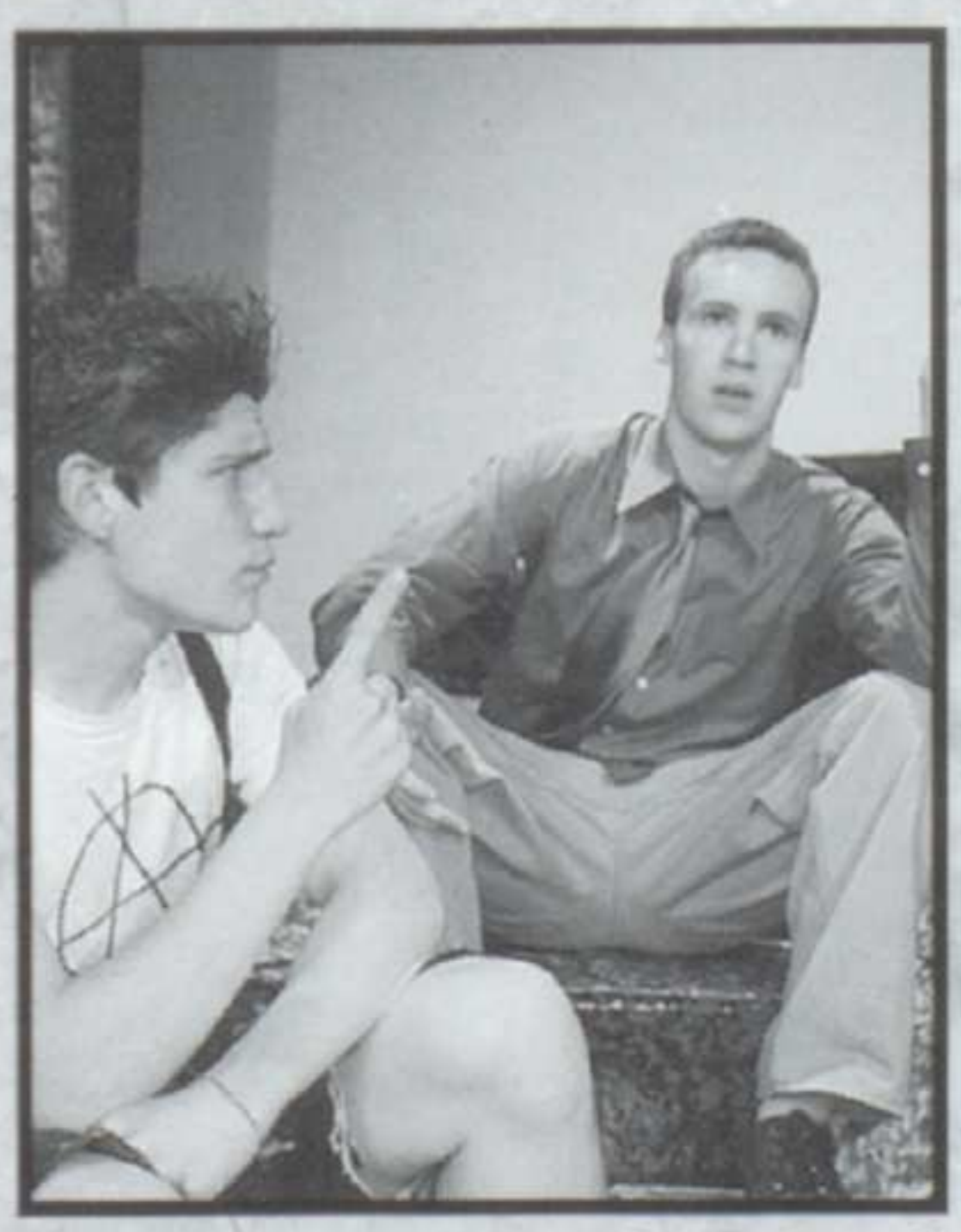

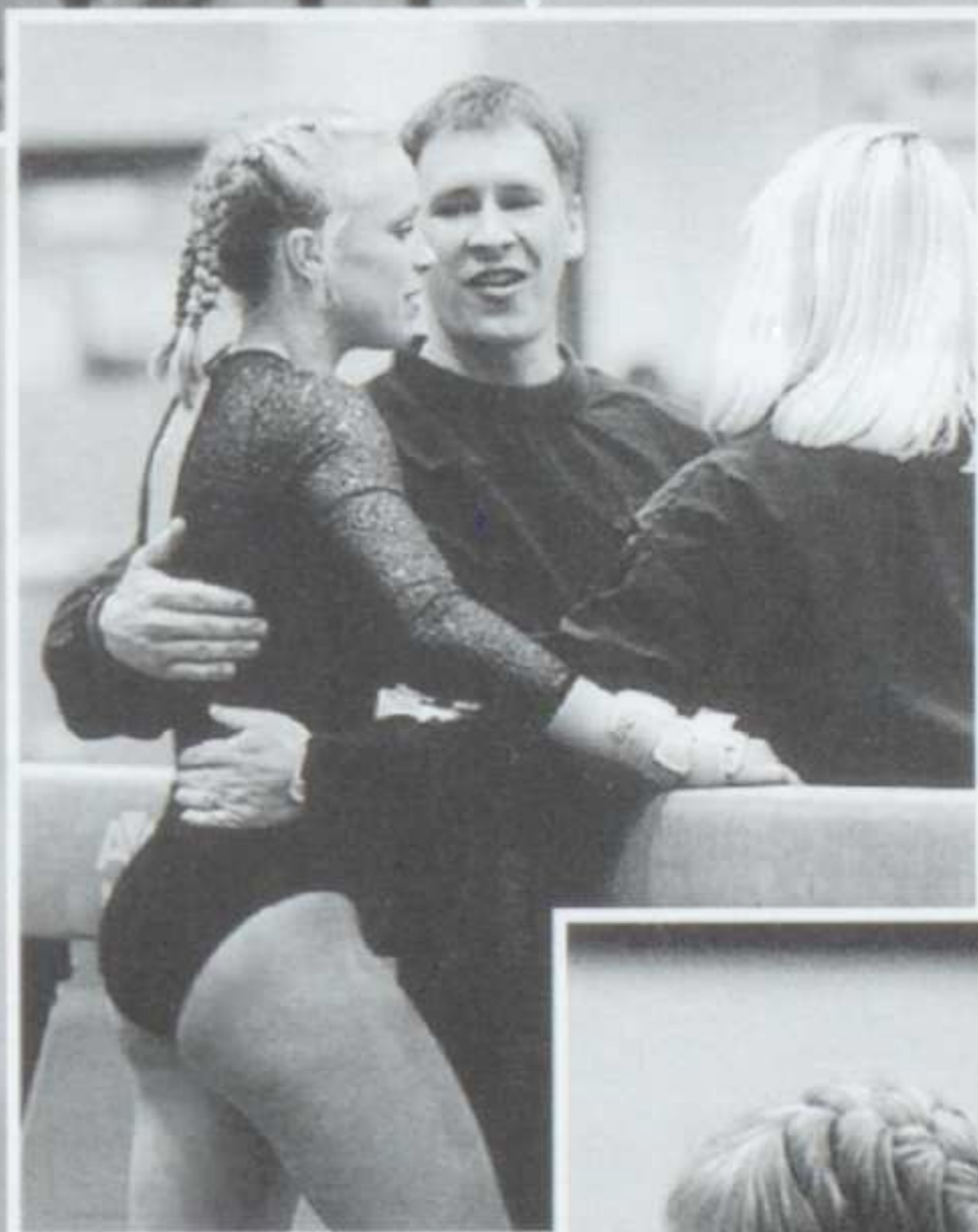

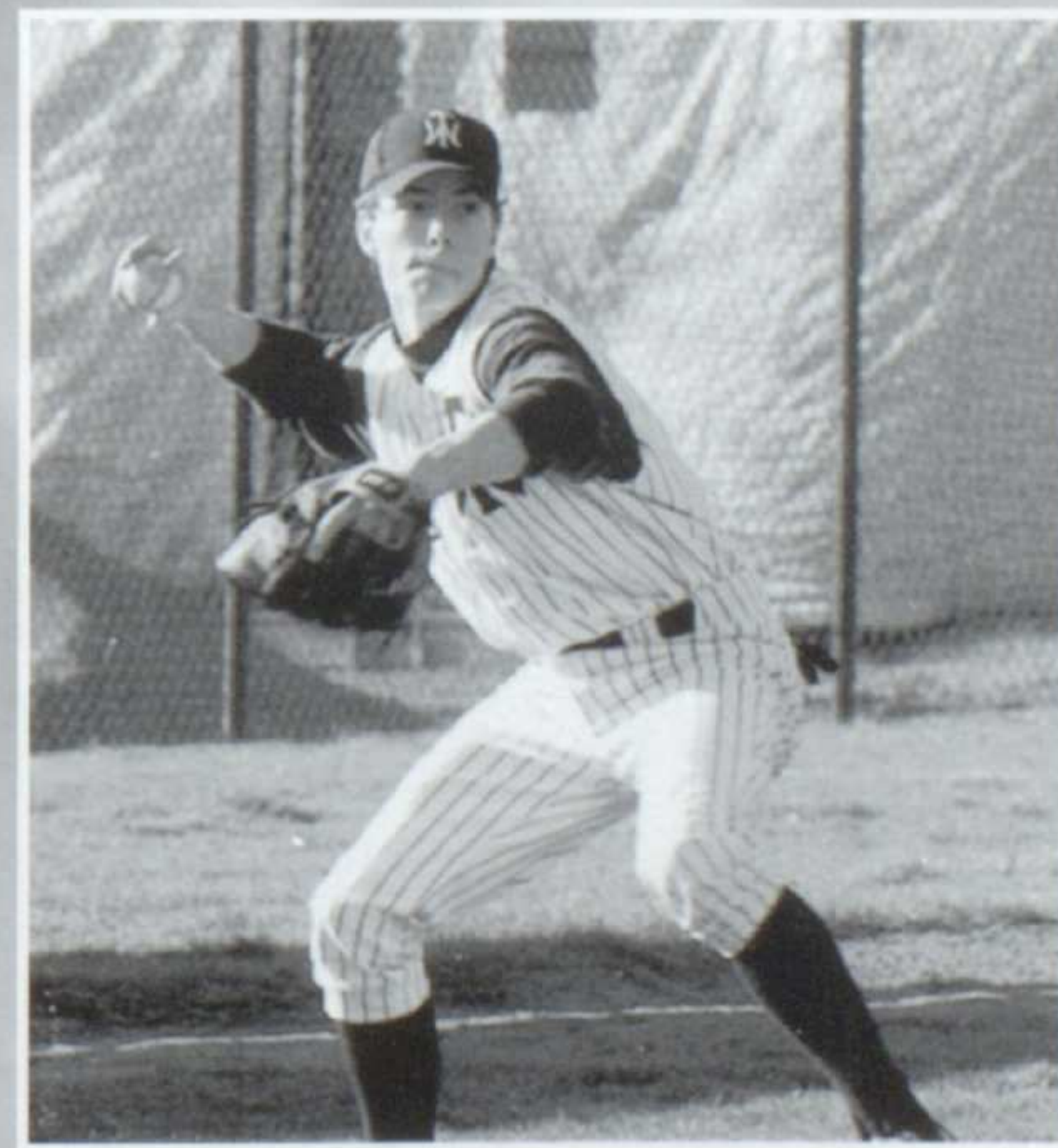

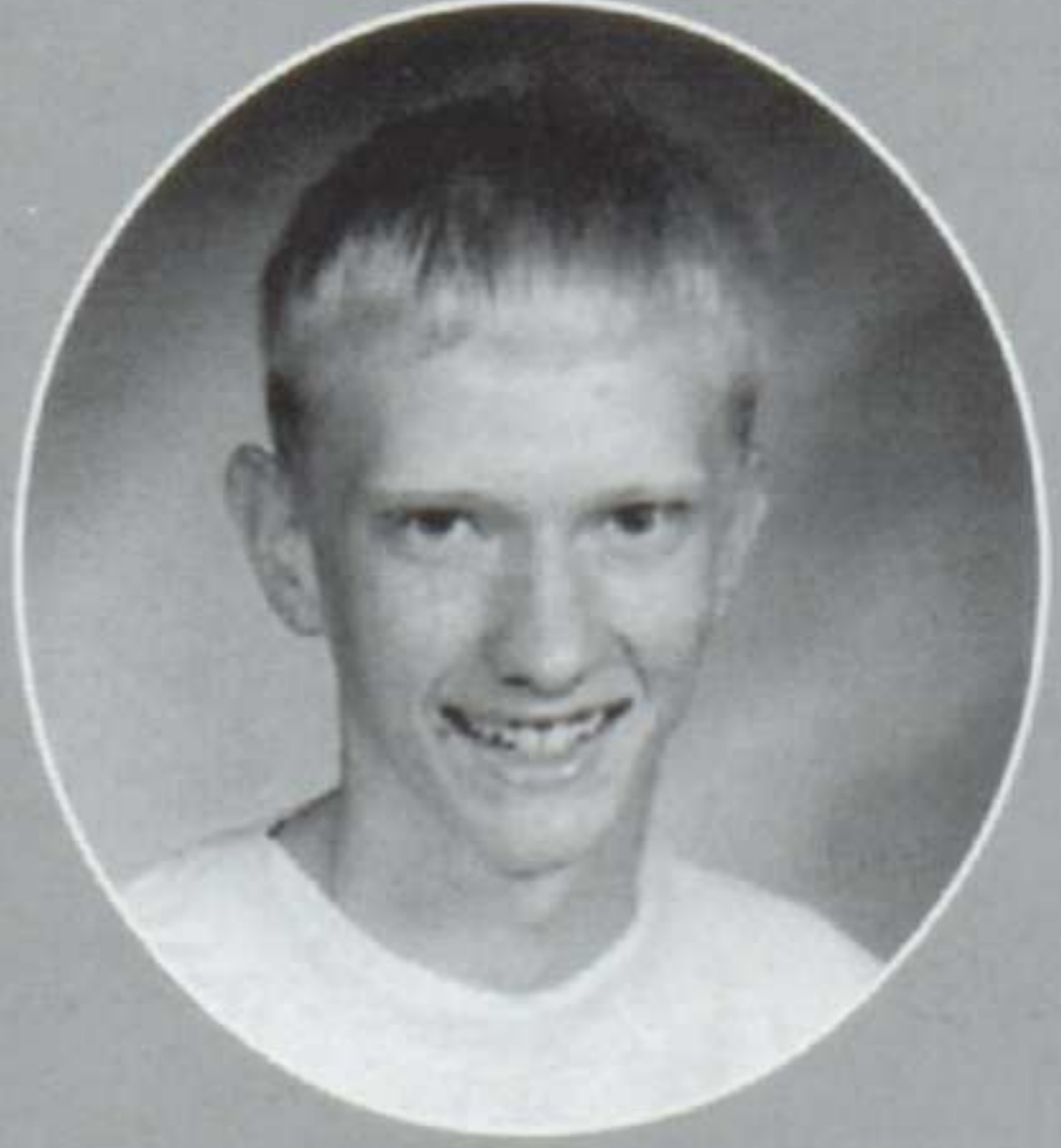
