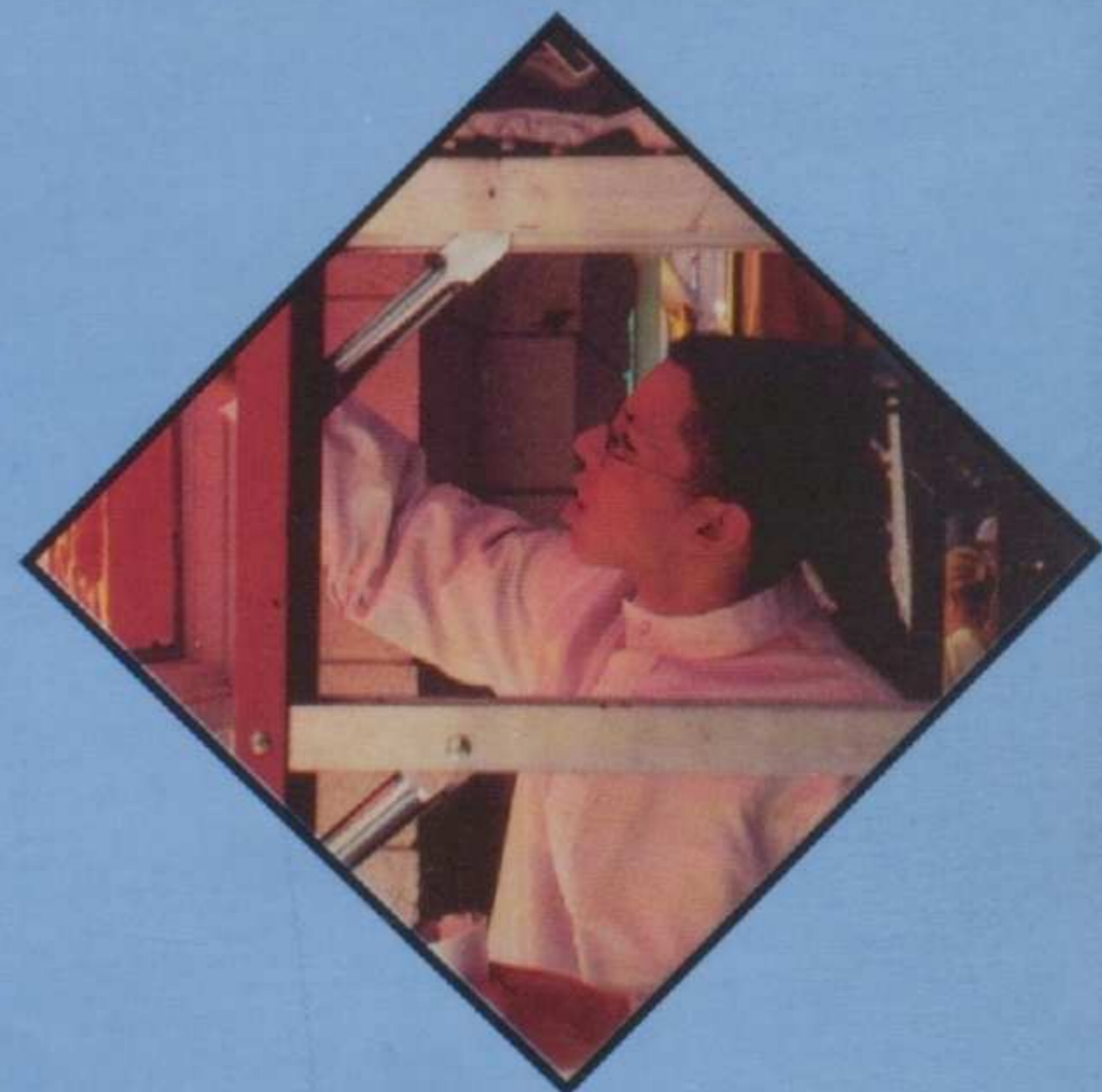

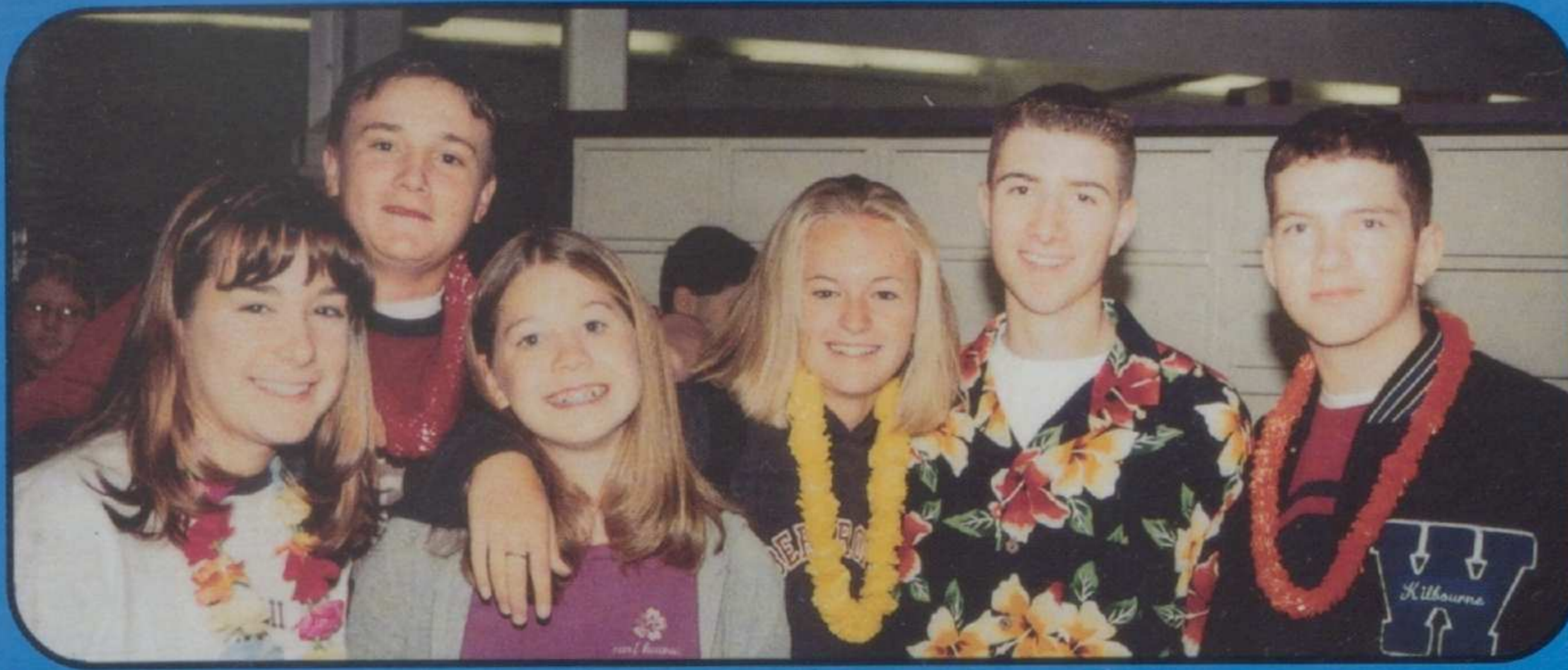

While it is solely an individual effort to stay healthy, our school also tries to help its students by offering

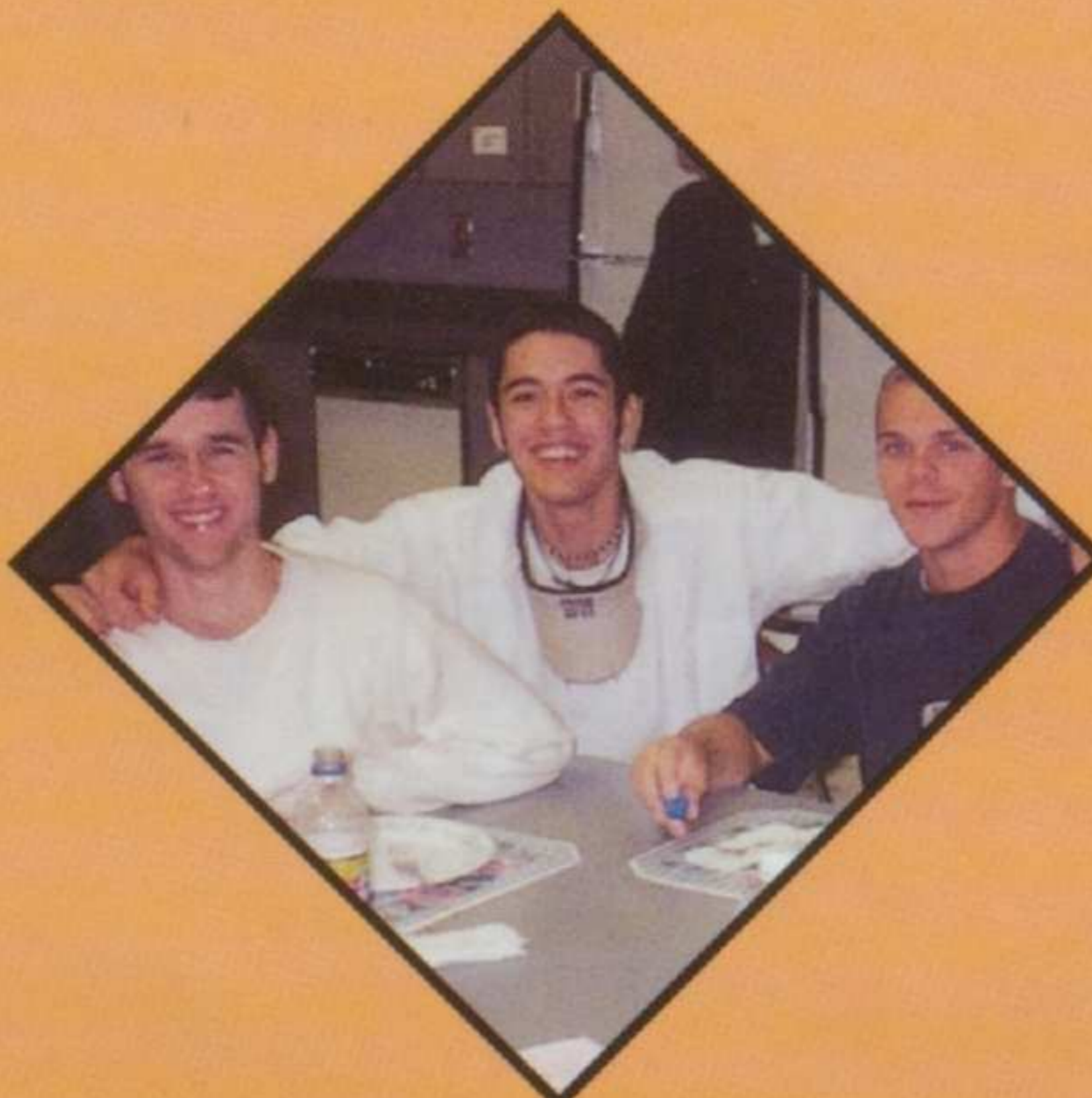

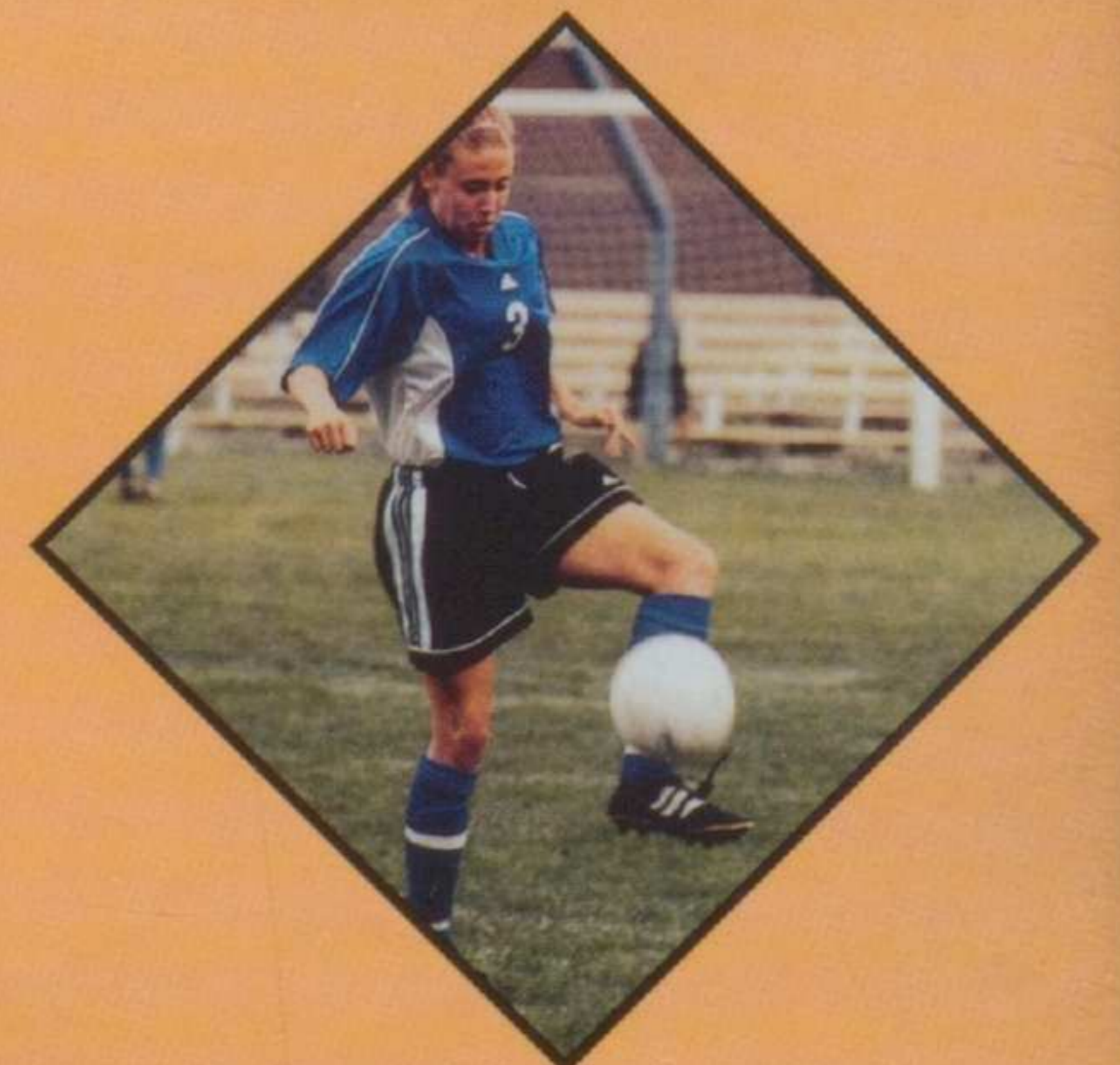

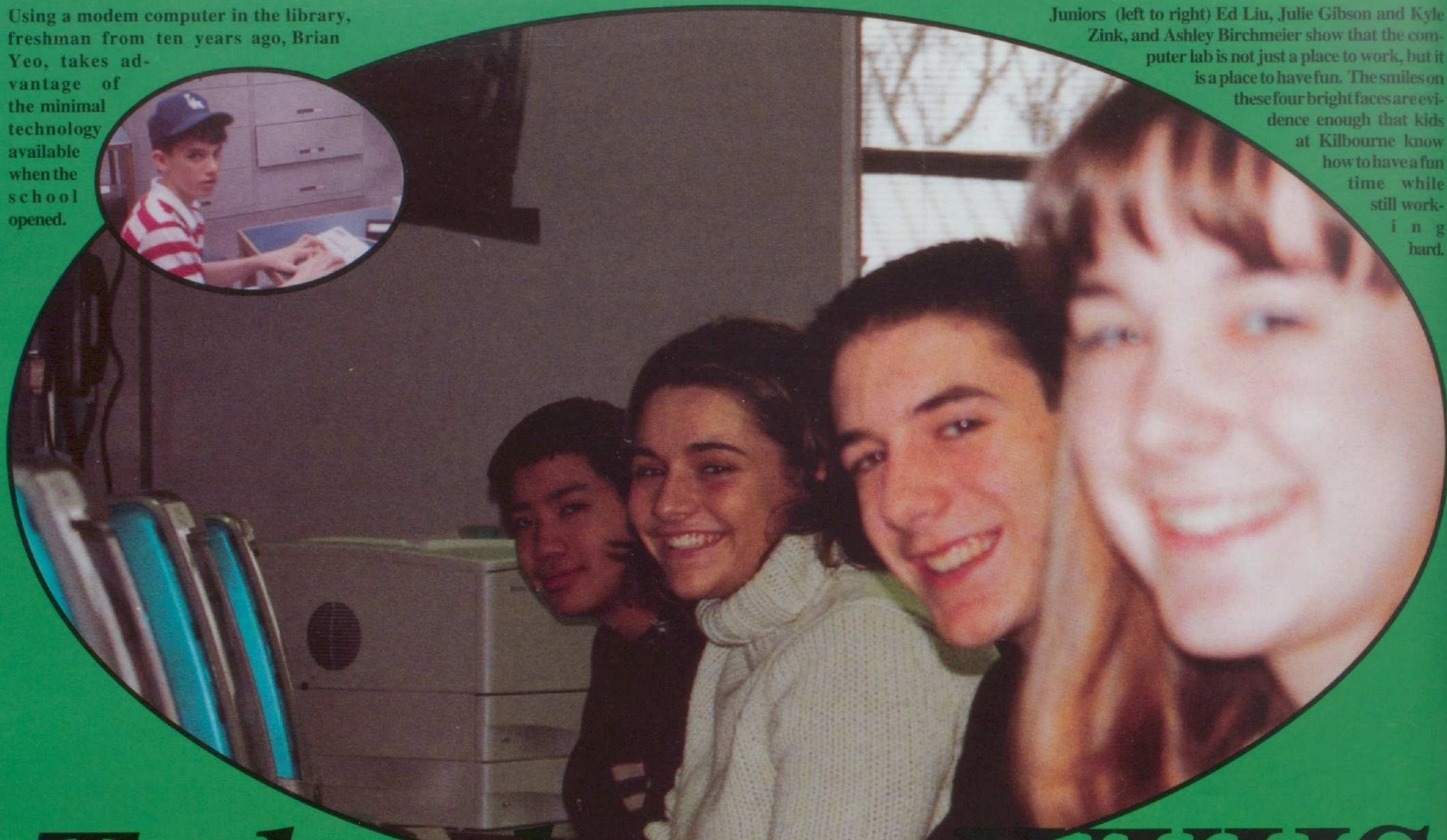

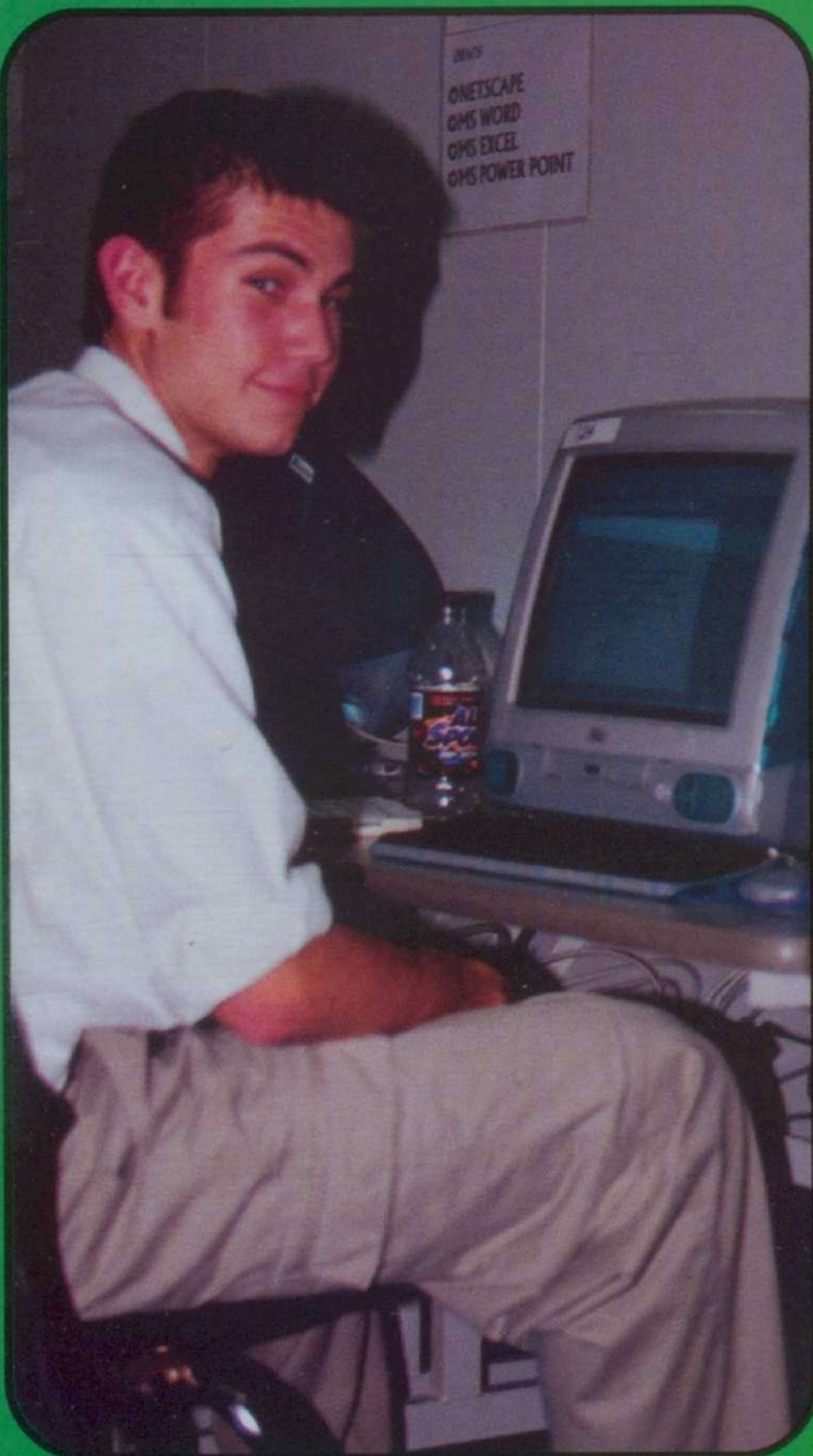

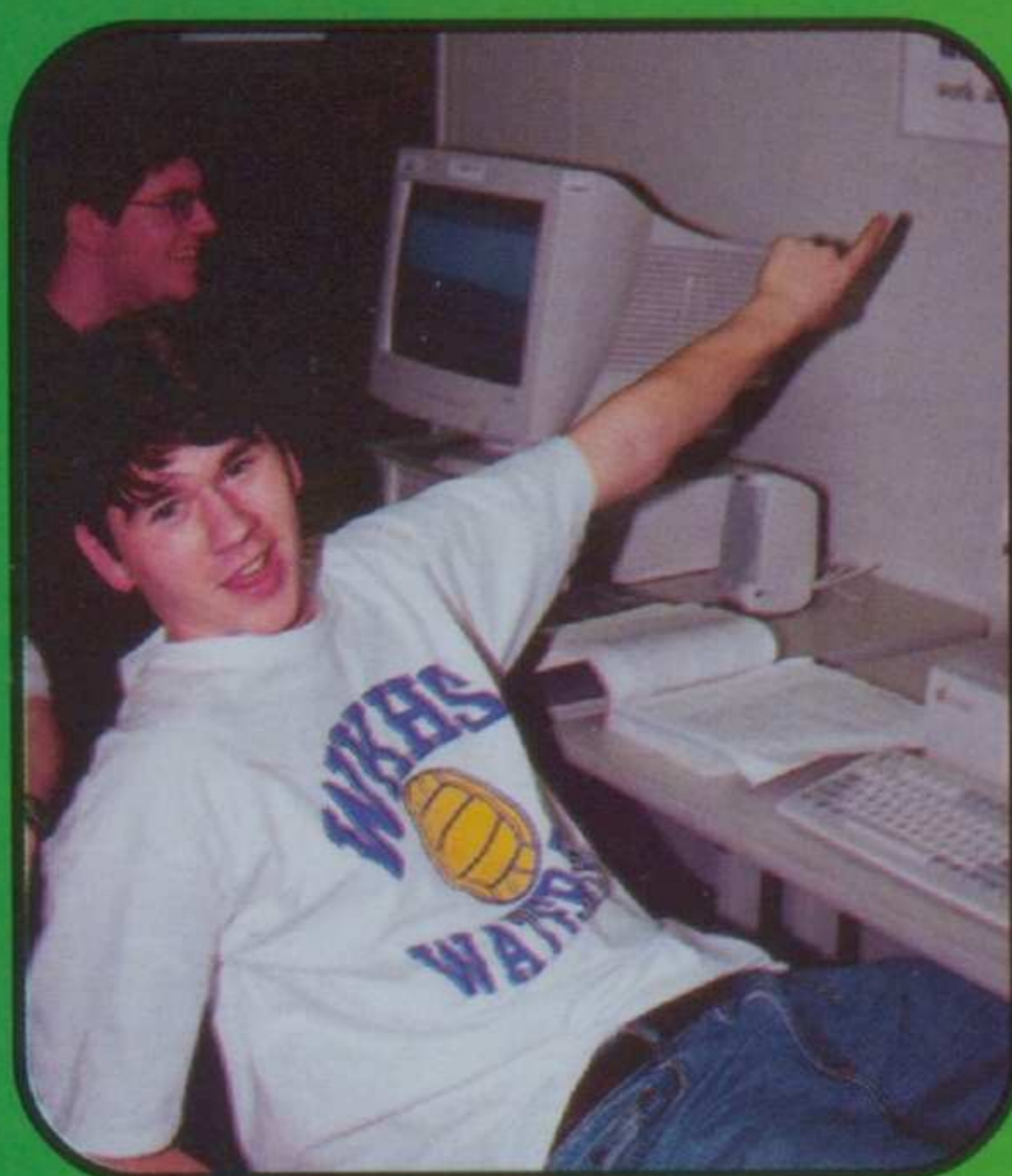

# Our Study Habits

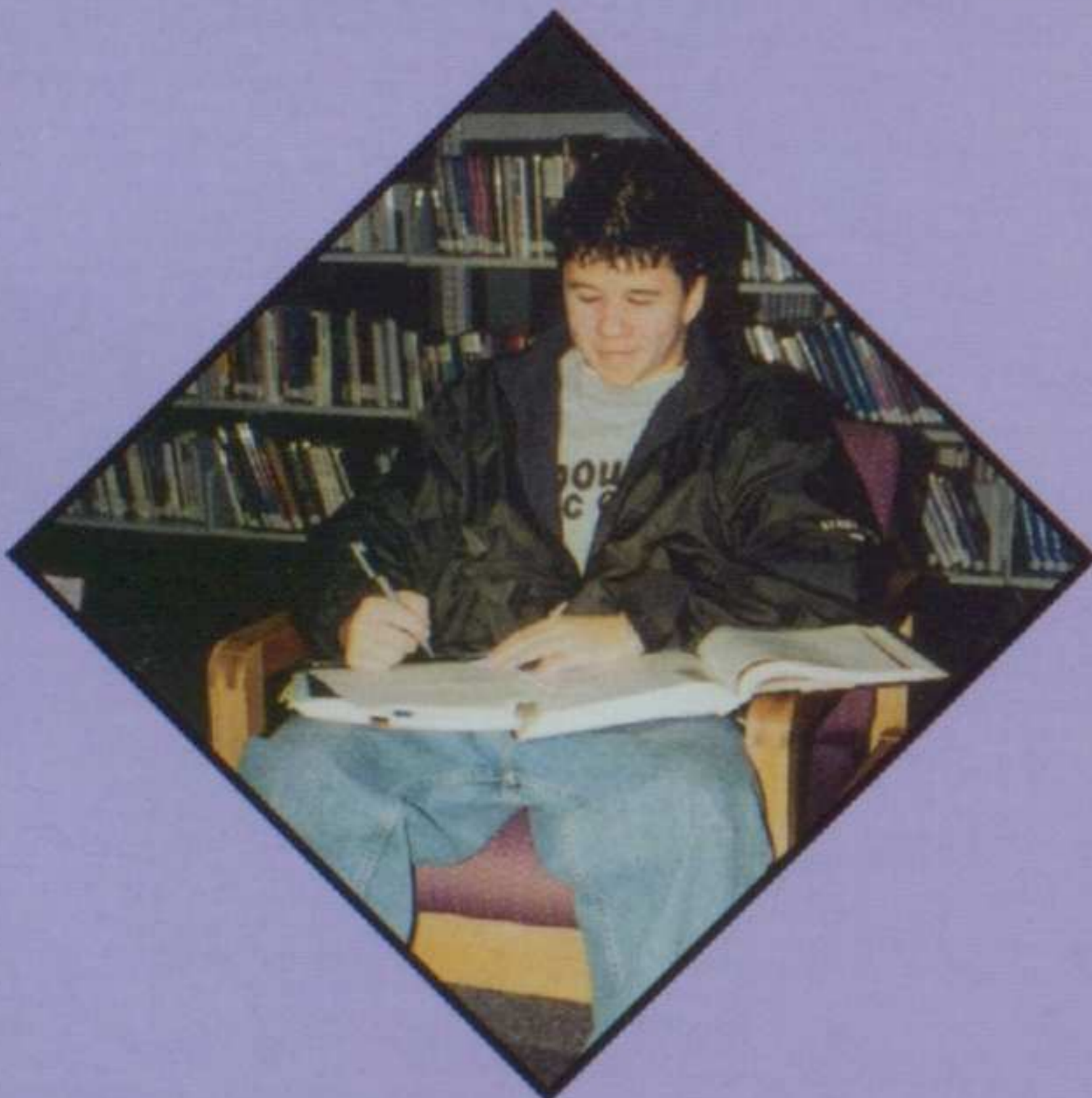

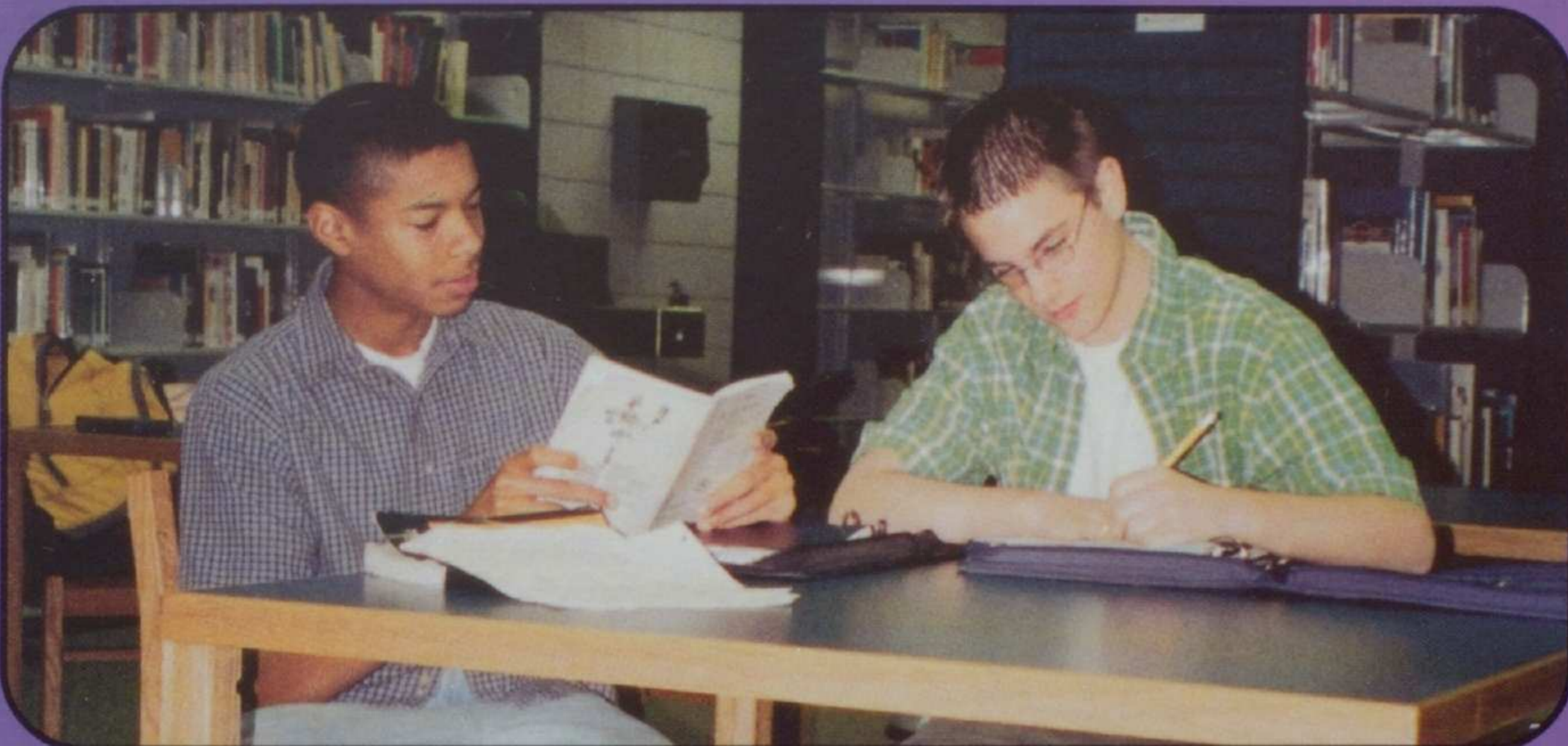

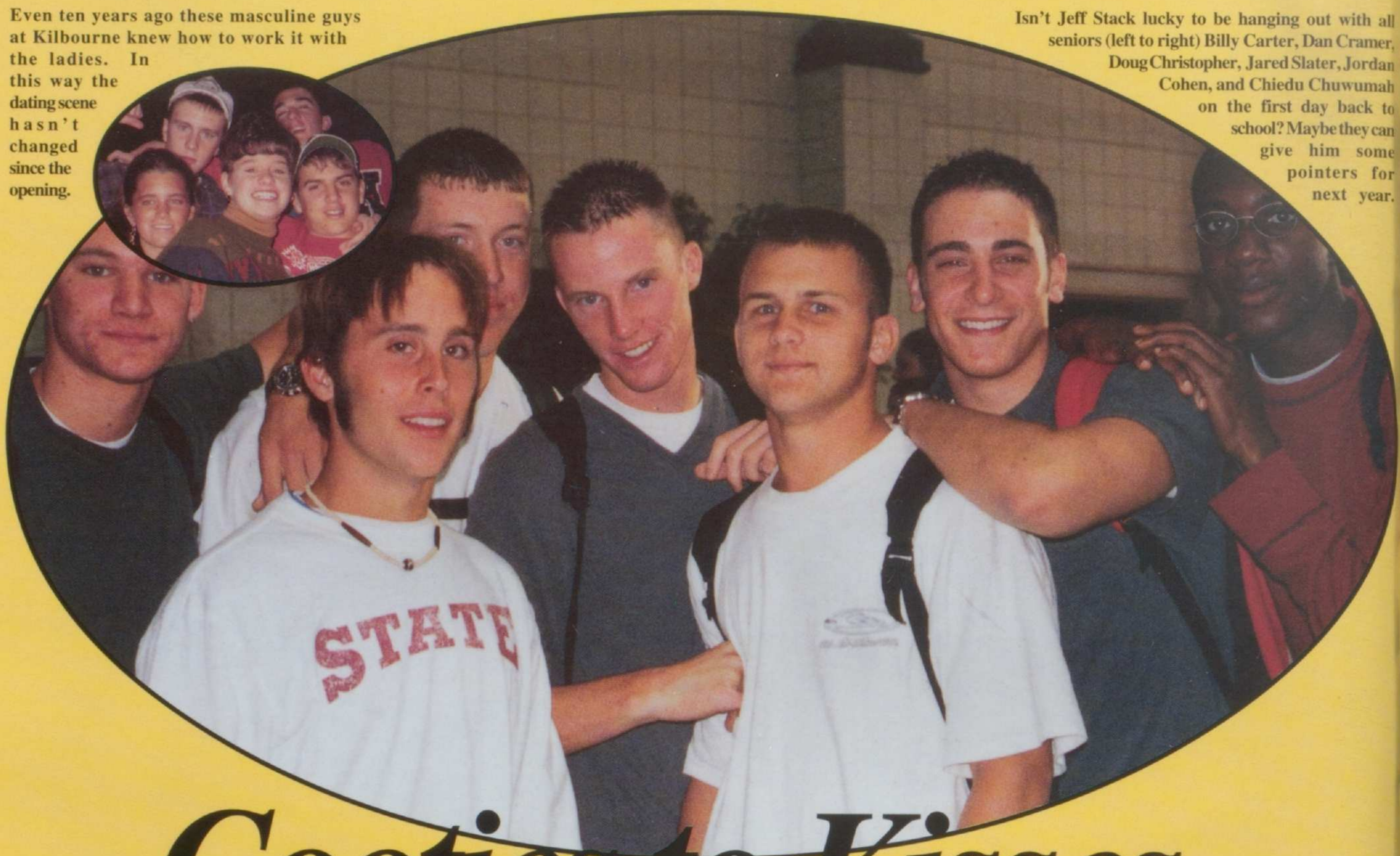

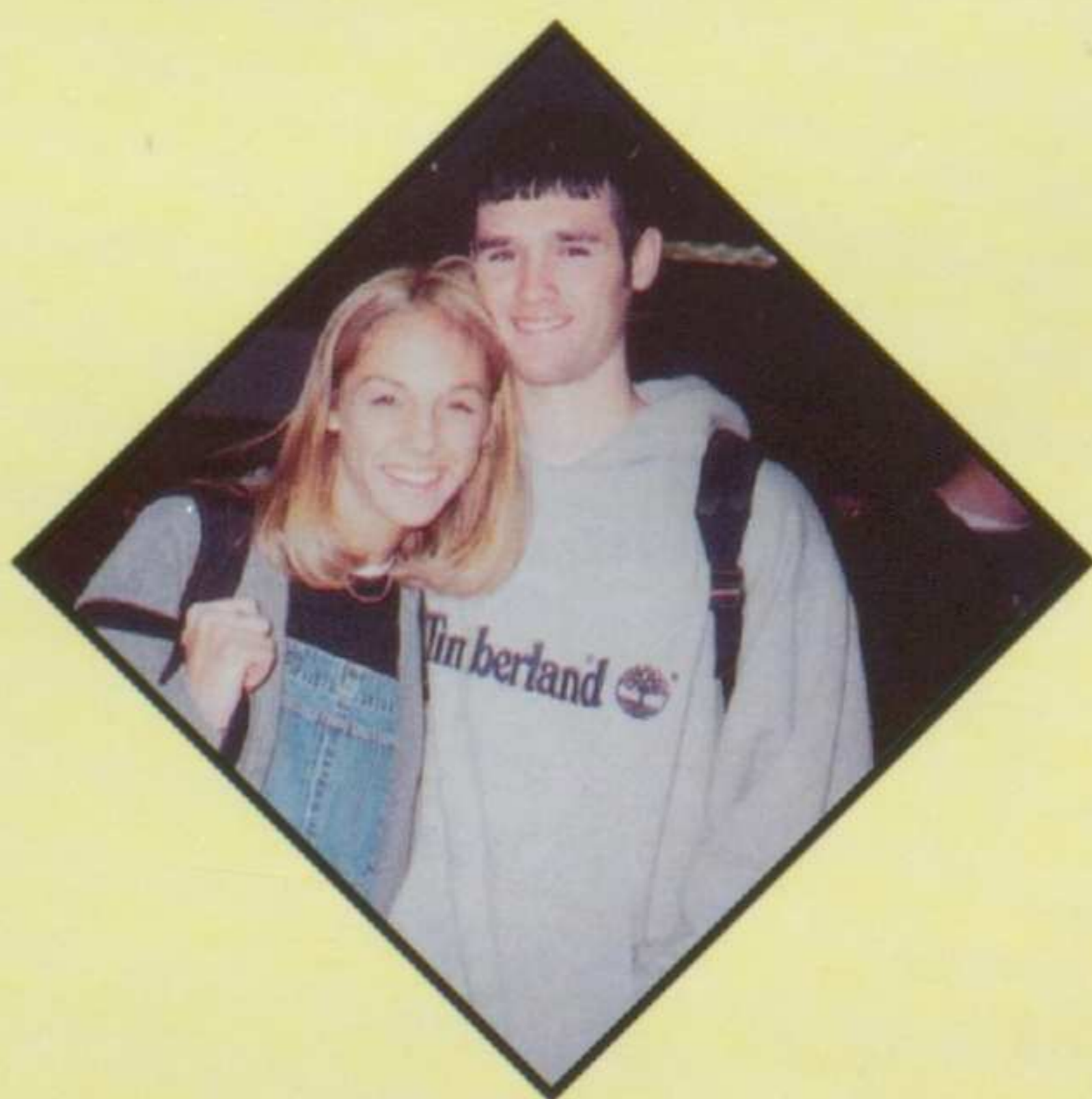

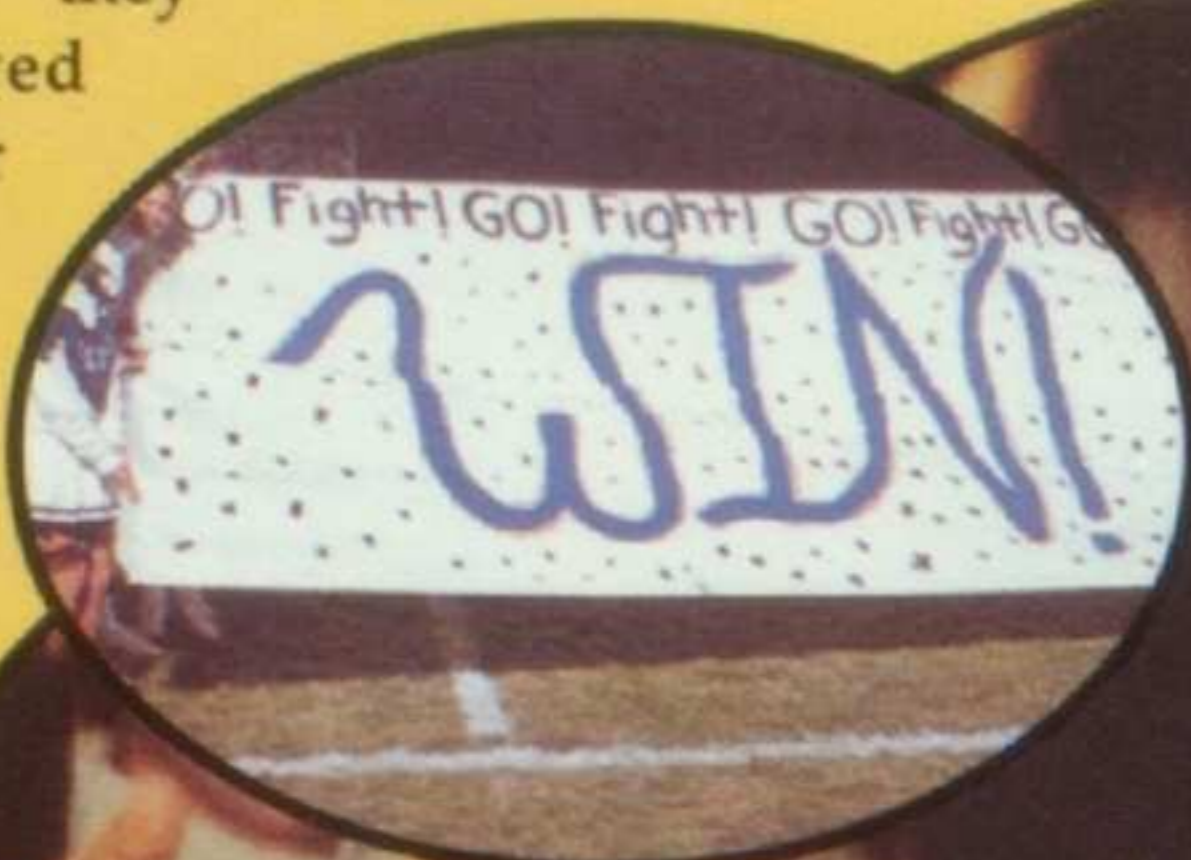

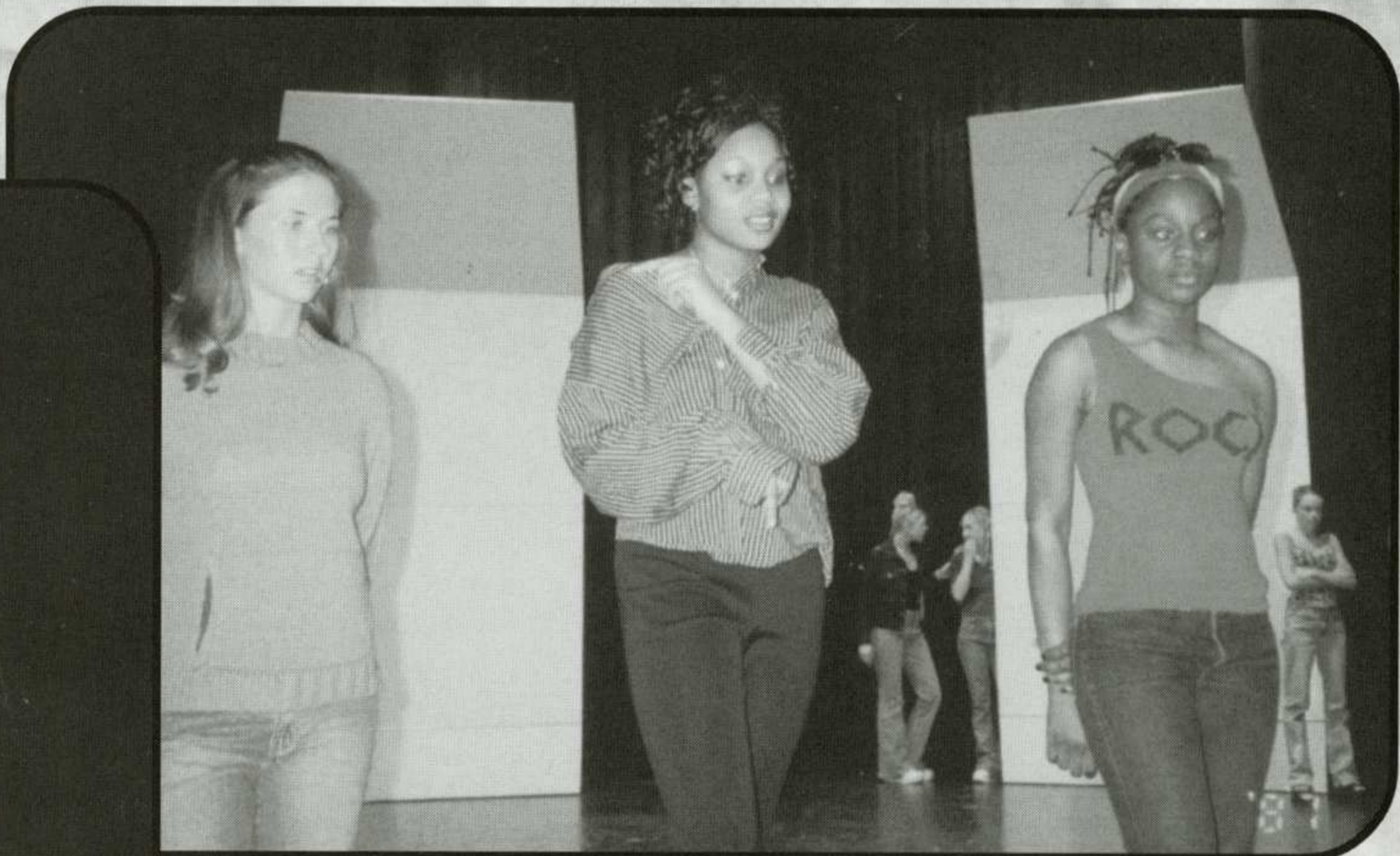
The show could not go on without the helping hands of many other people. Mr. Sanders, the DECA/marketing teacher advised the organizers

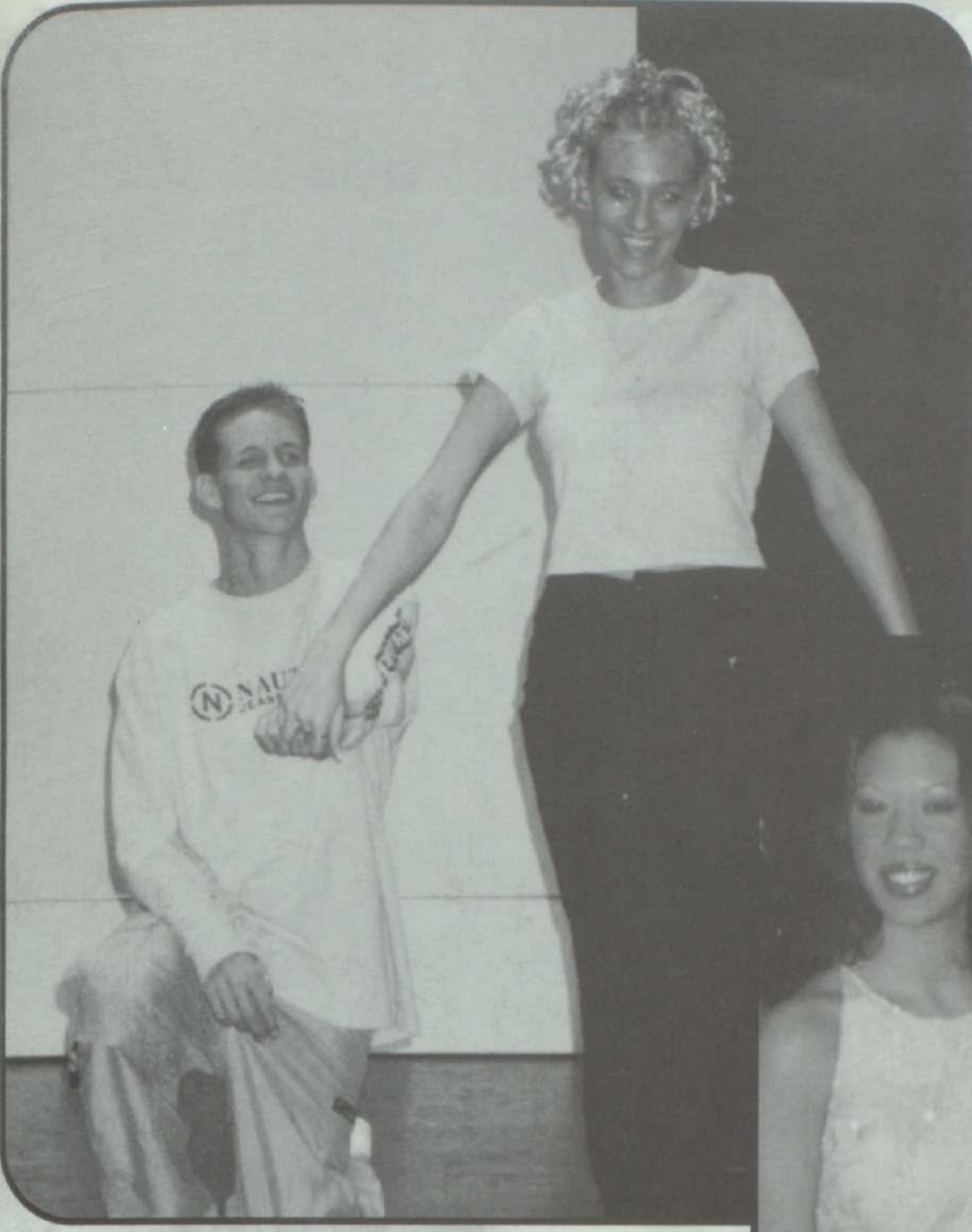

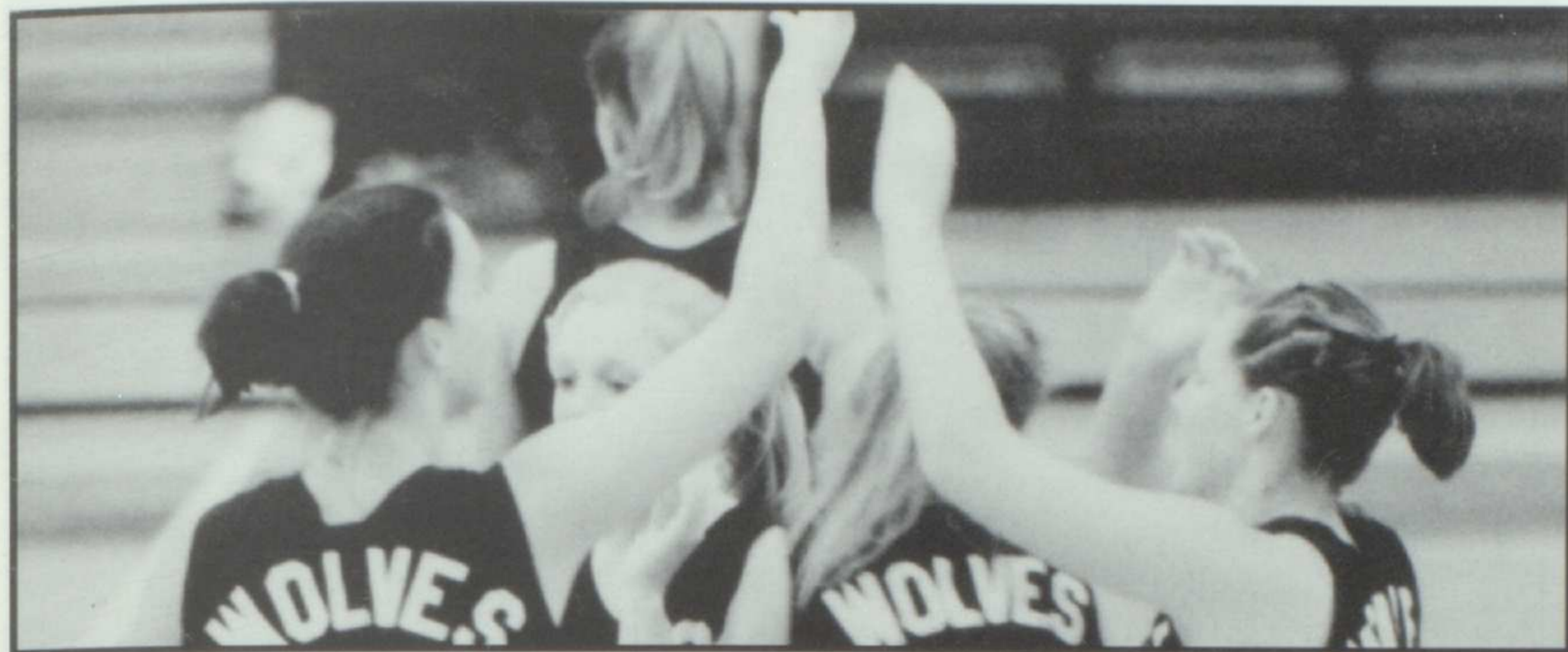

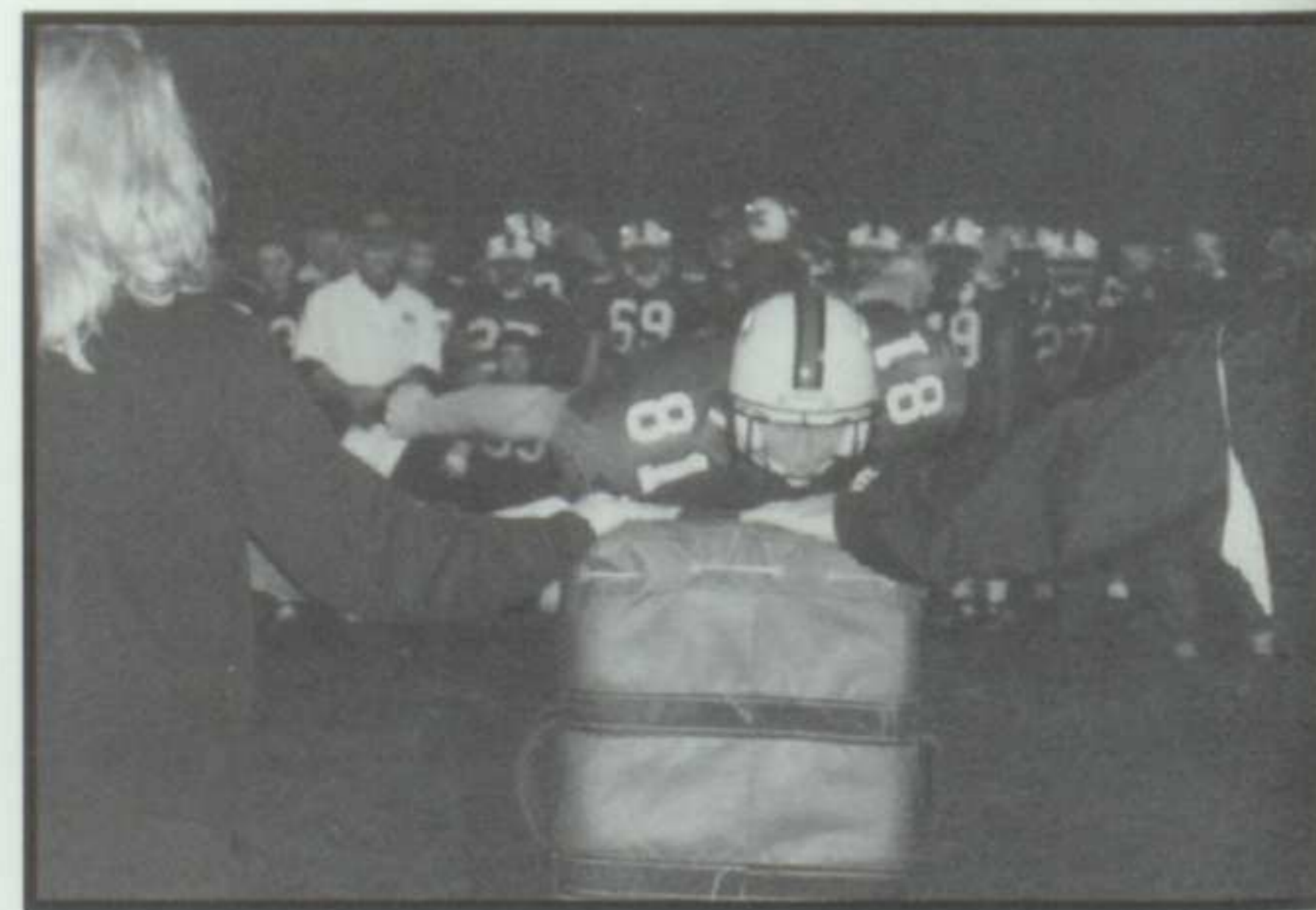

The Lady Wolves surprised many teams this year and proved themselves by receiving a poll ranking of third in the state and tenth in the region. With nine strong

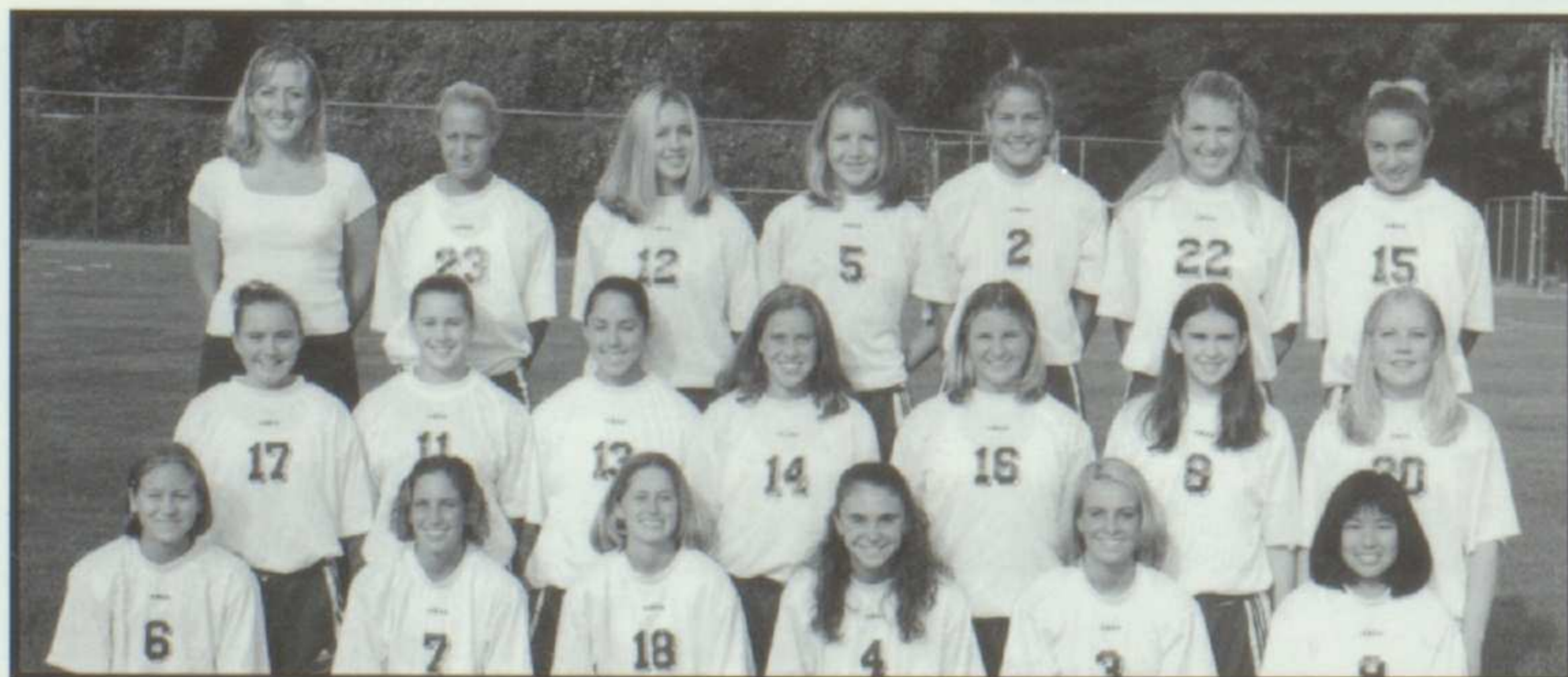
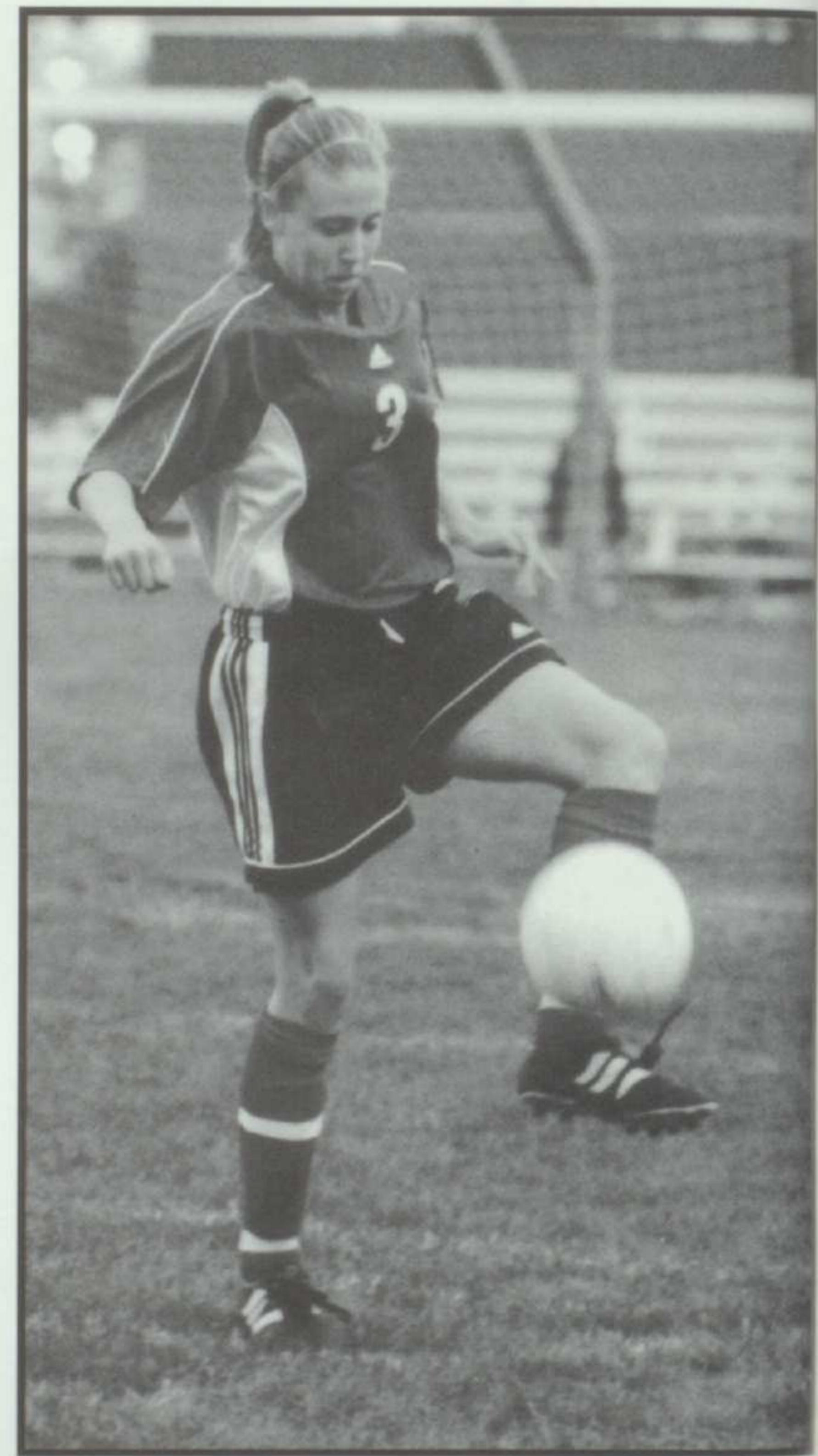

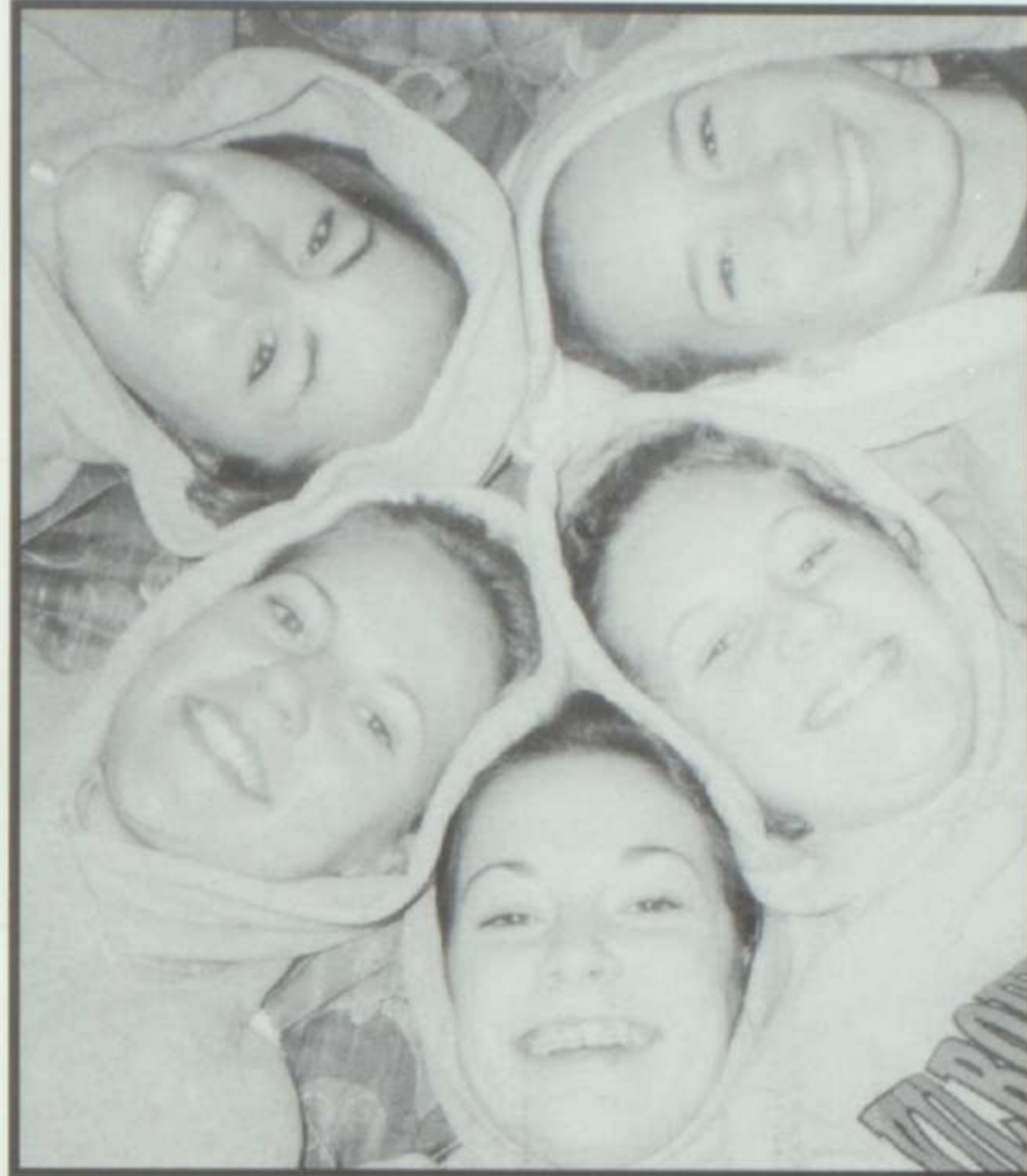

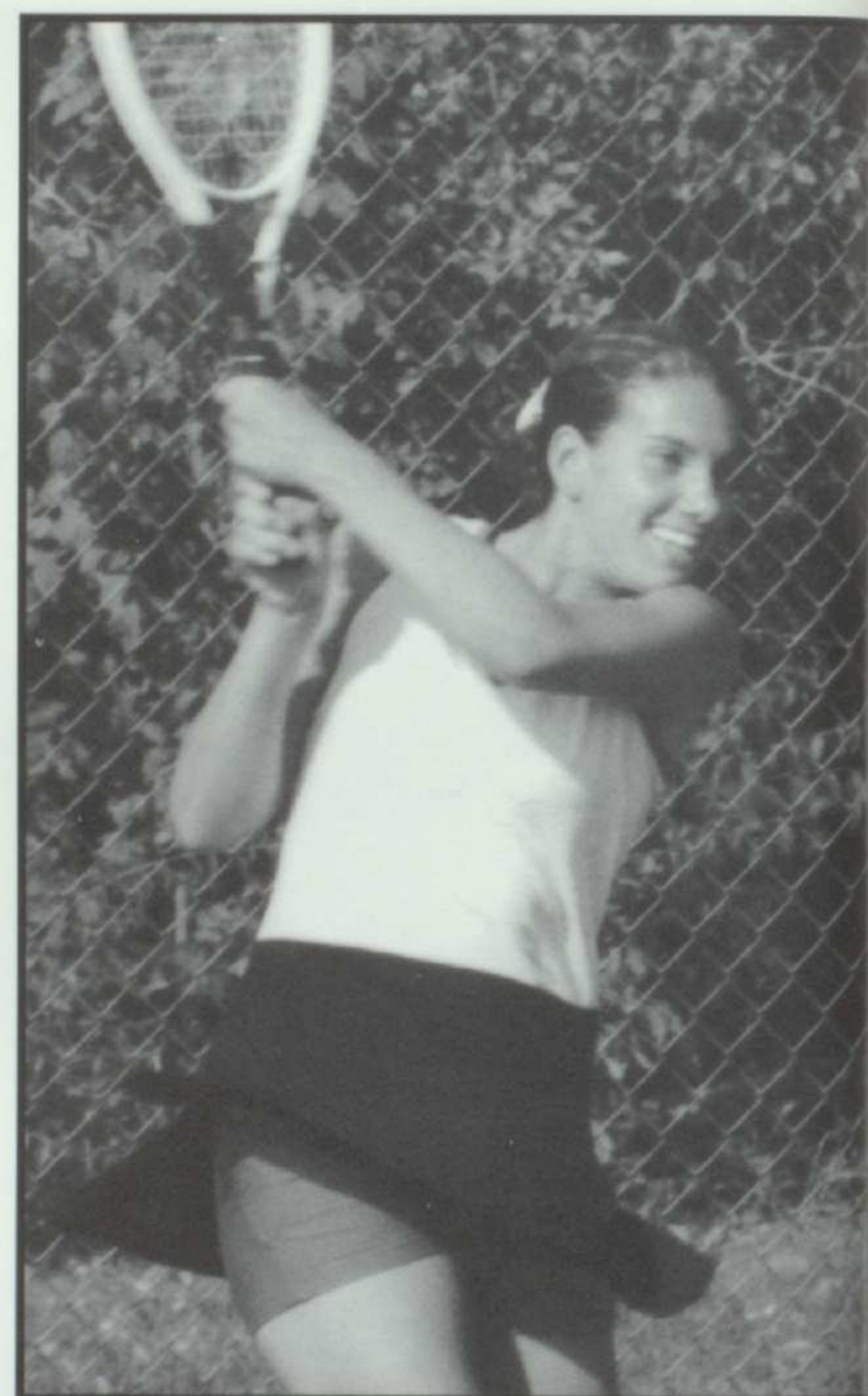
"It also helped improve our game." They worked together the entire season to

It is obvious that talented athletes fill the tennis team. The girls did a terrific job this season. Nice work, Wolves.

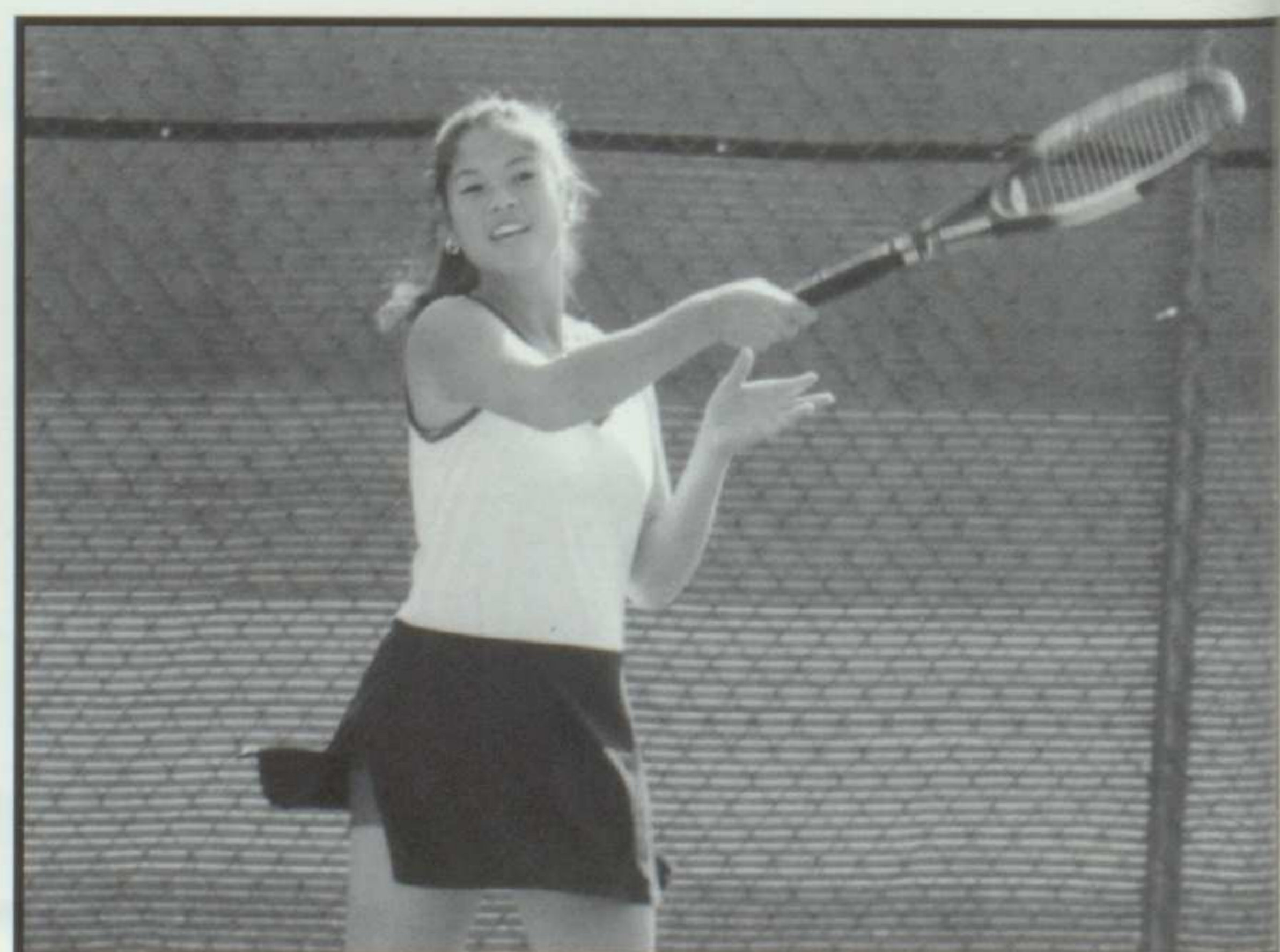

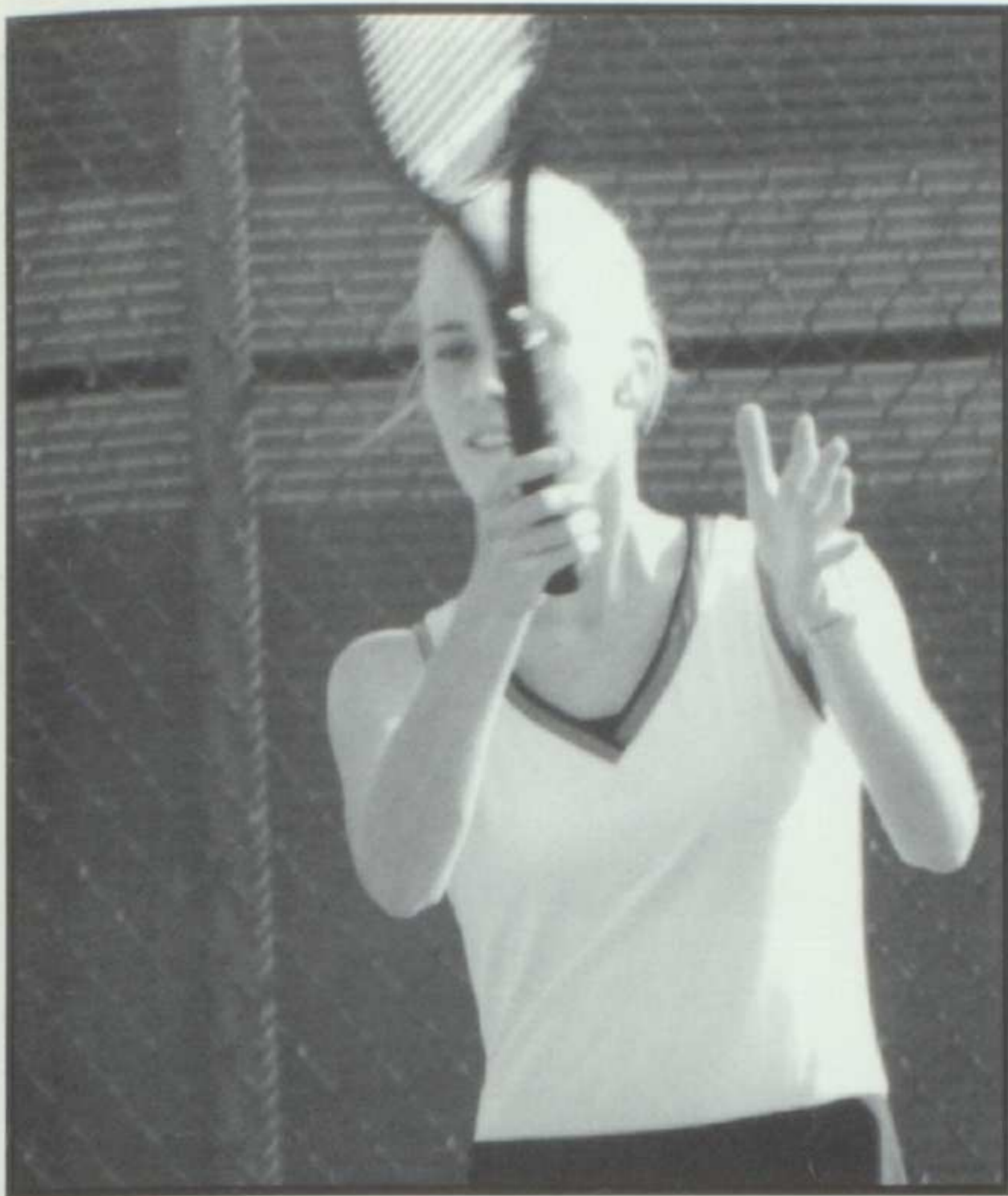

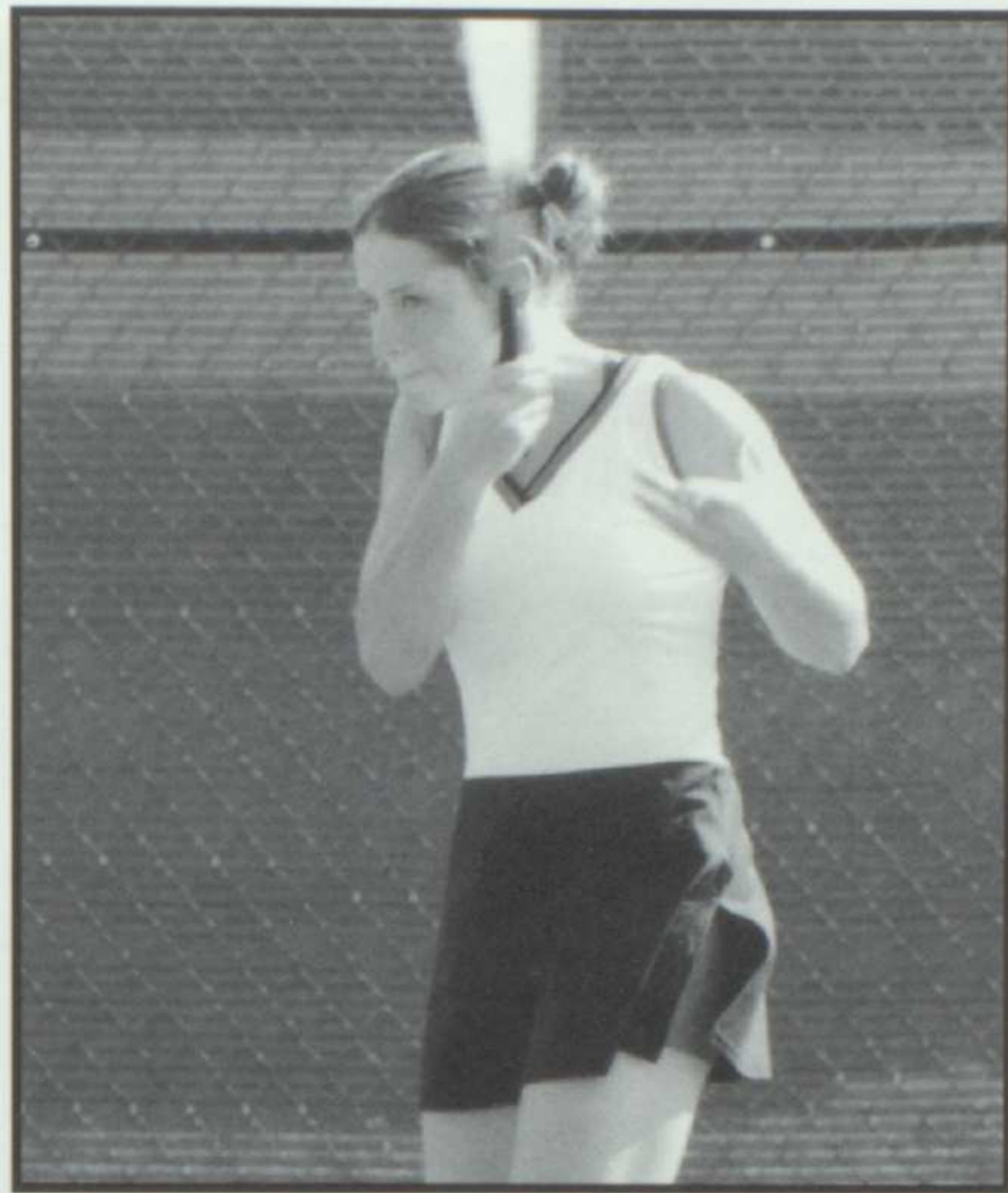

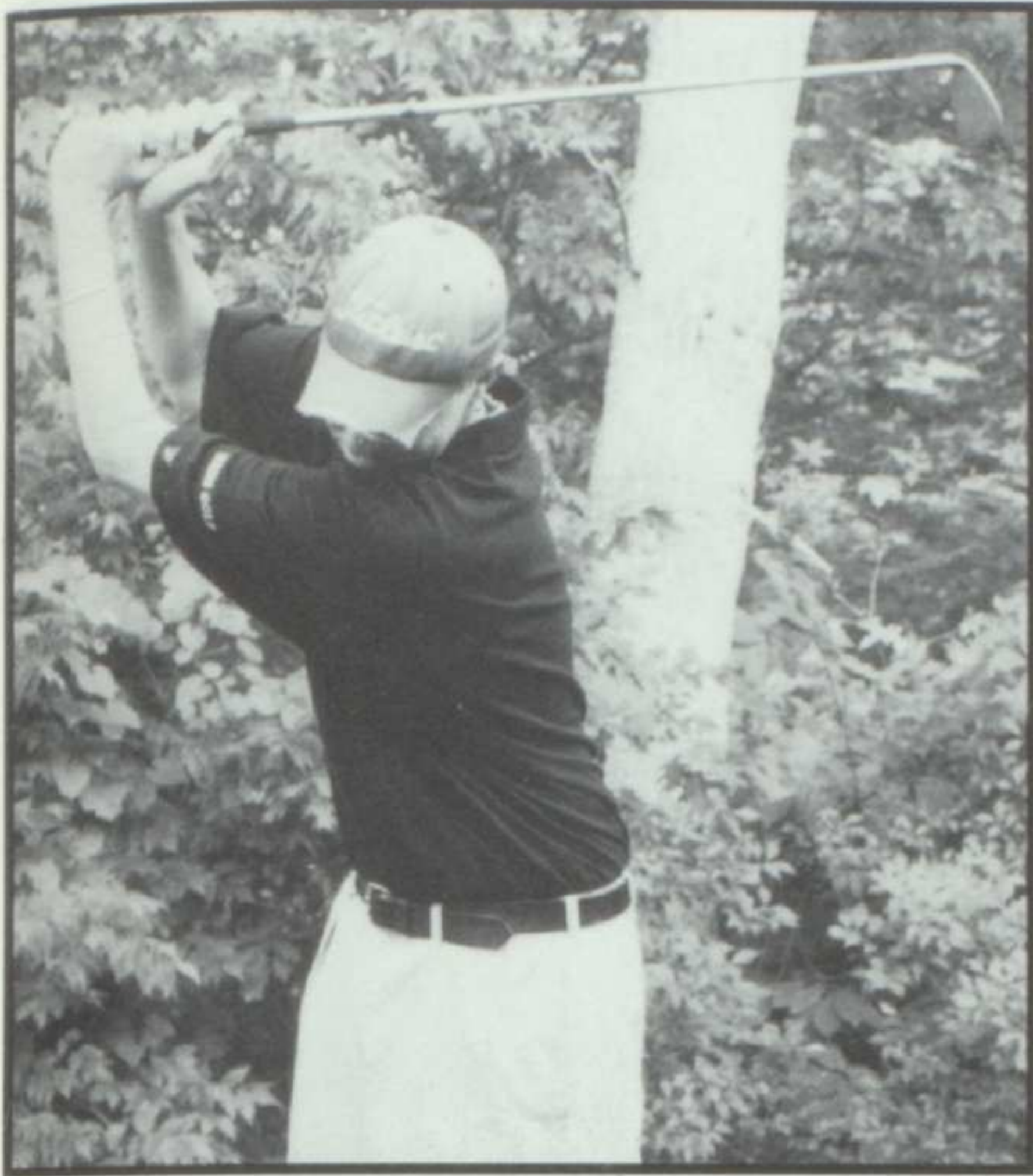

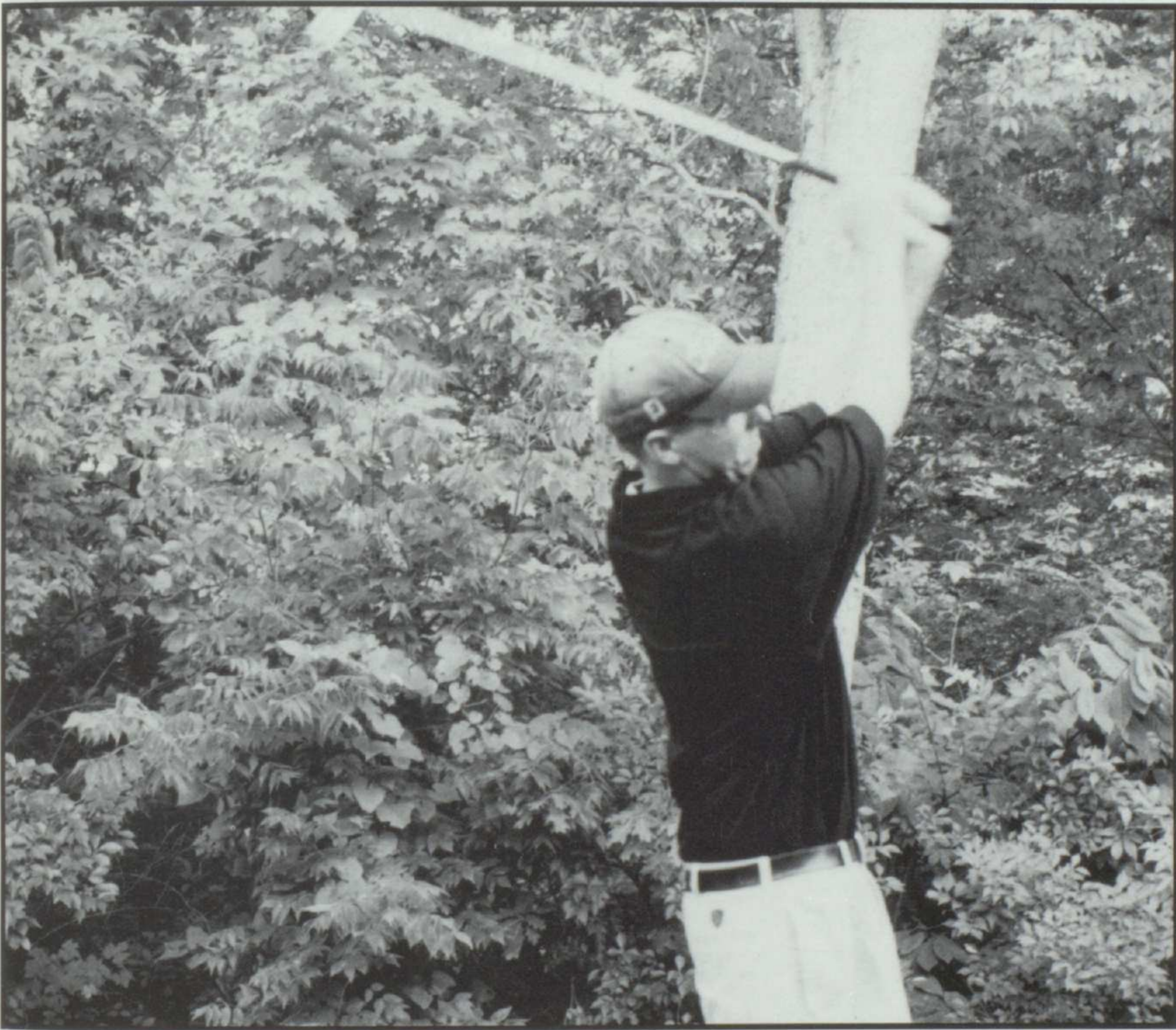

They finished out 72-23, placing third in OCC

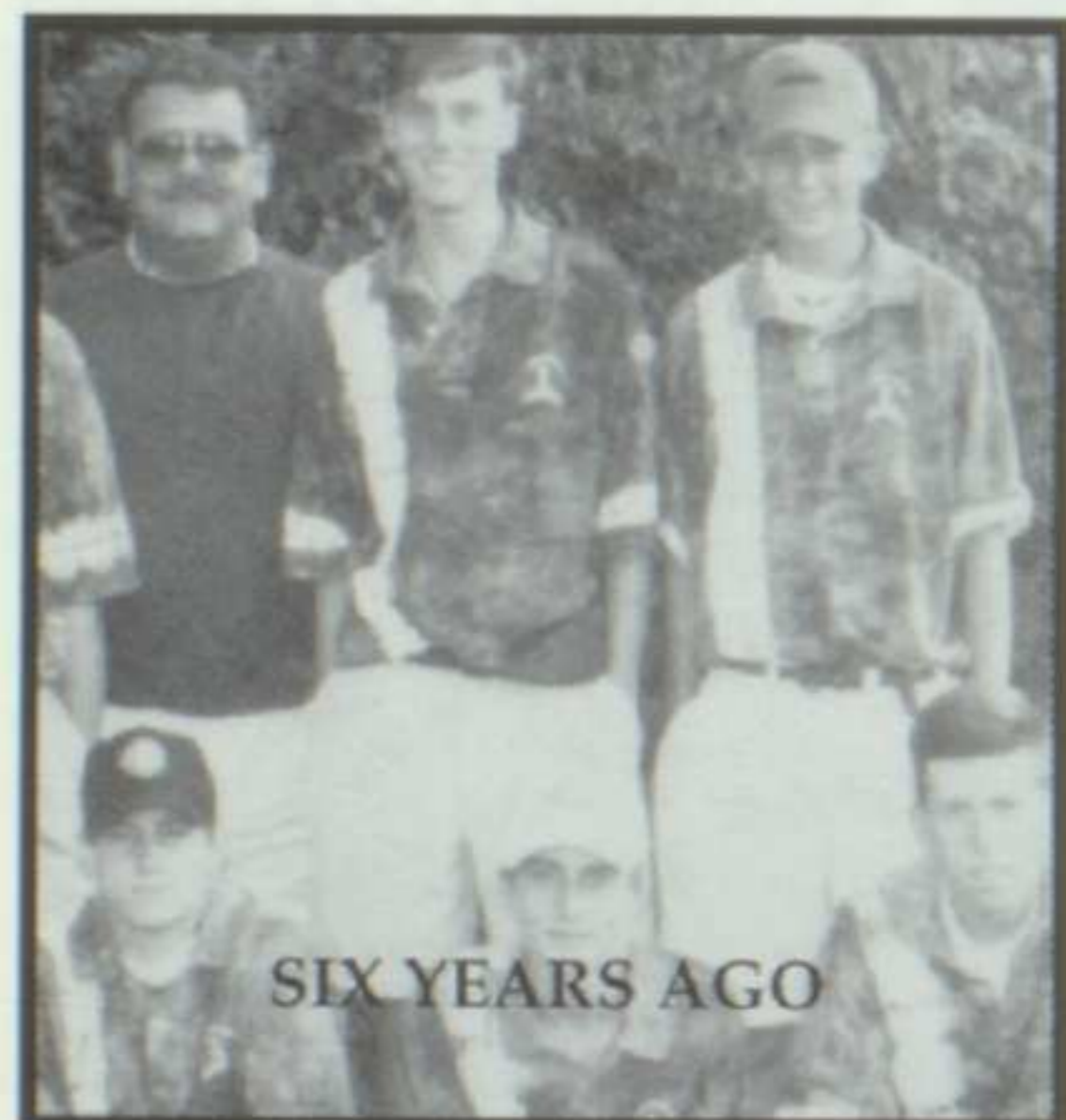
behind winner Dublin Coffman and runner-up Arlington. They also placed third in the district, quite an accomplishment for the ladies.

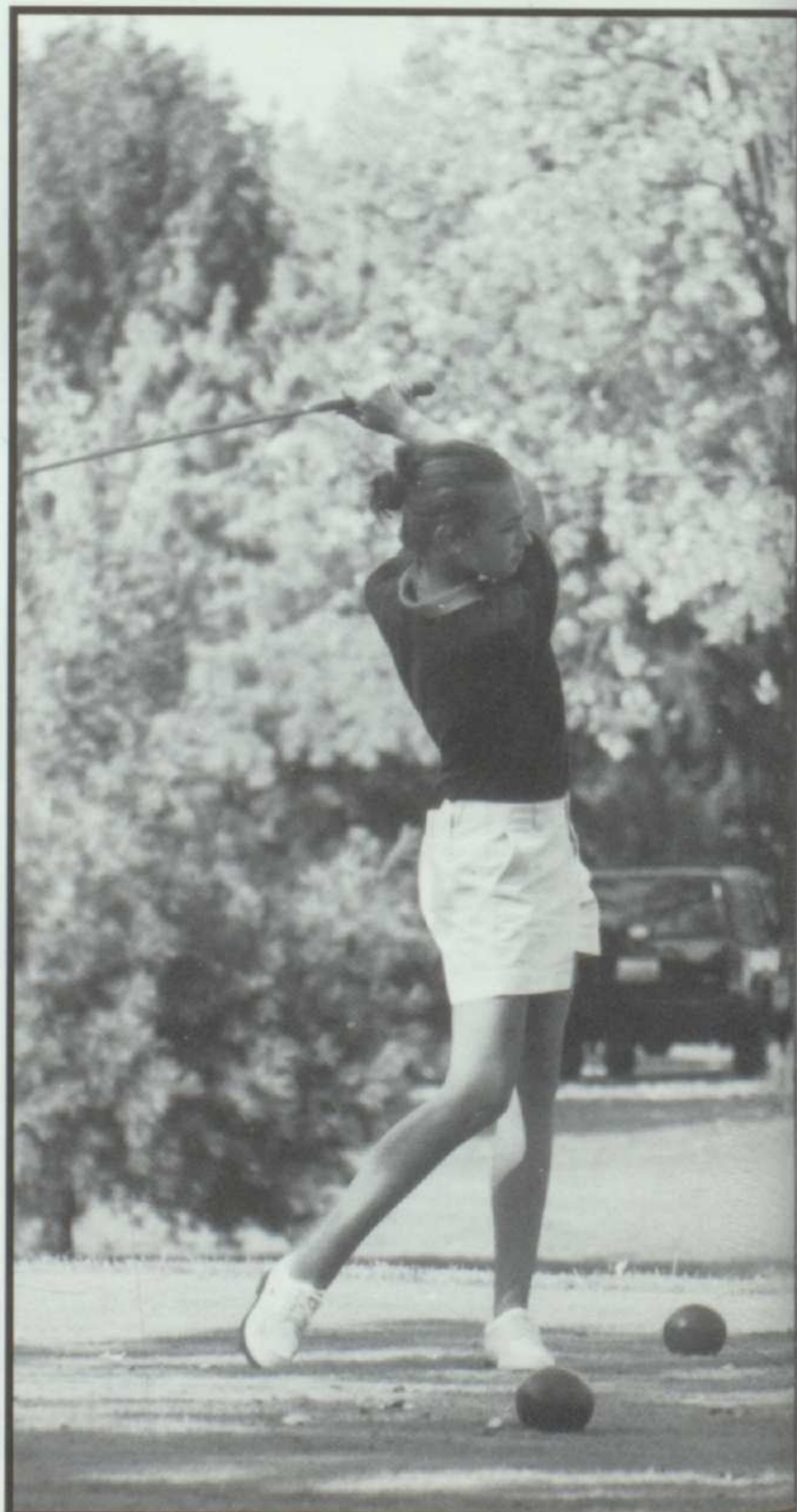
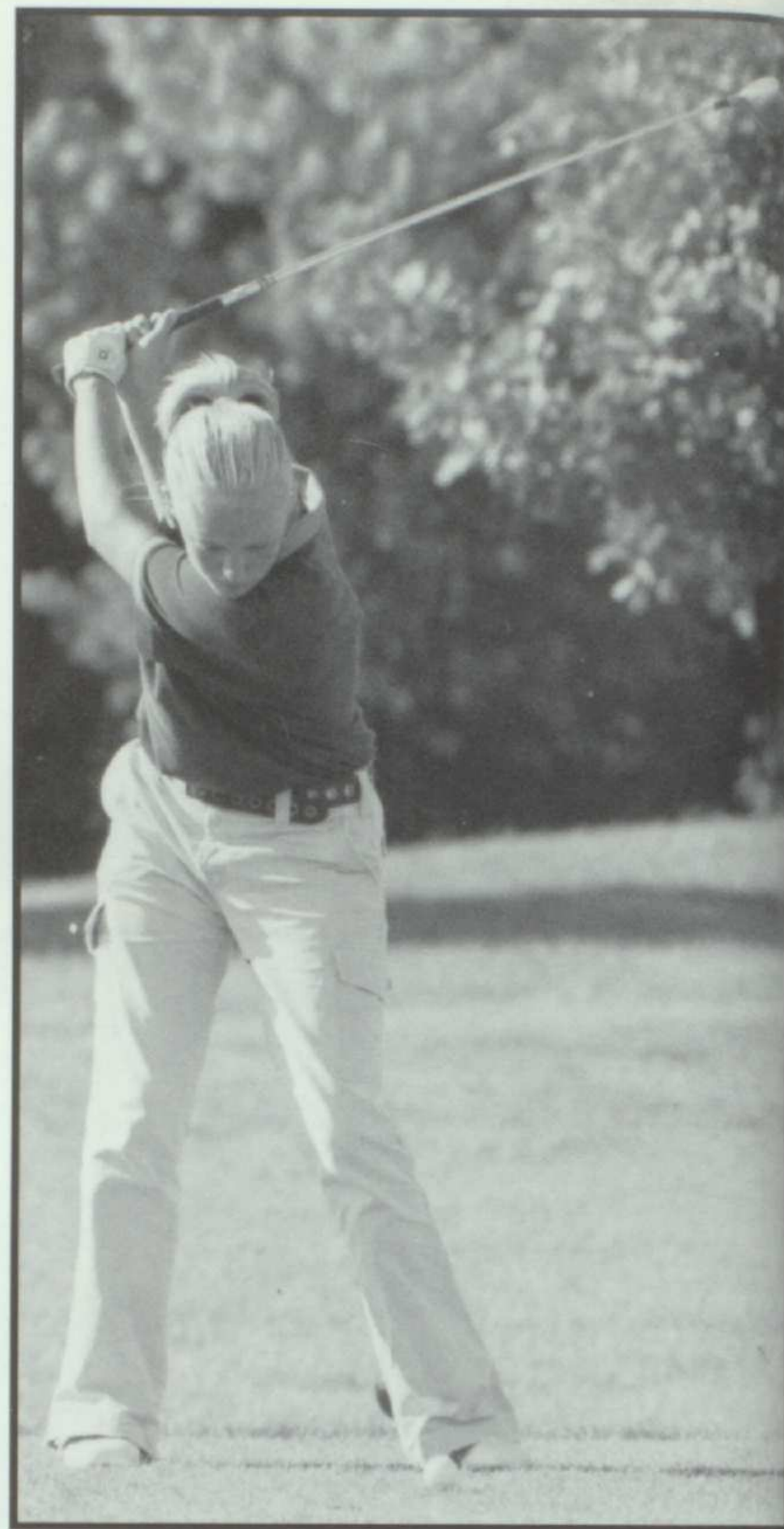

hours and then repeated practice after school for two more hours. Dedication was a dominant quality among the boys water polo team this year.

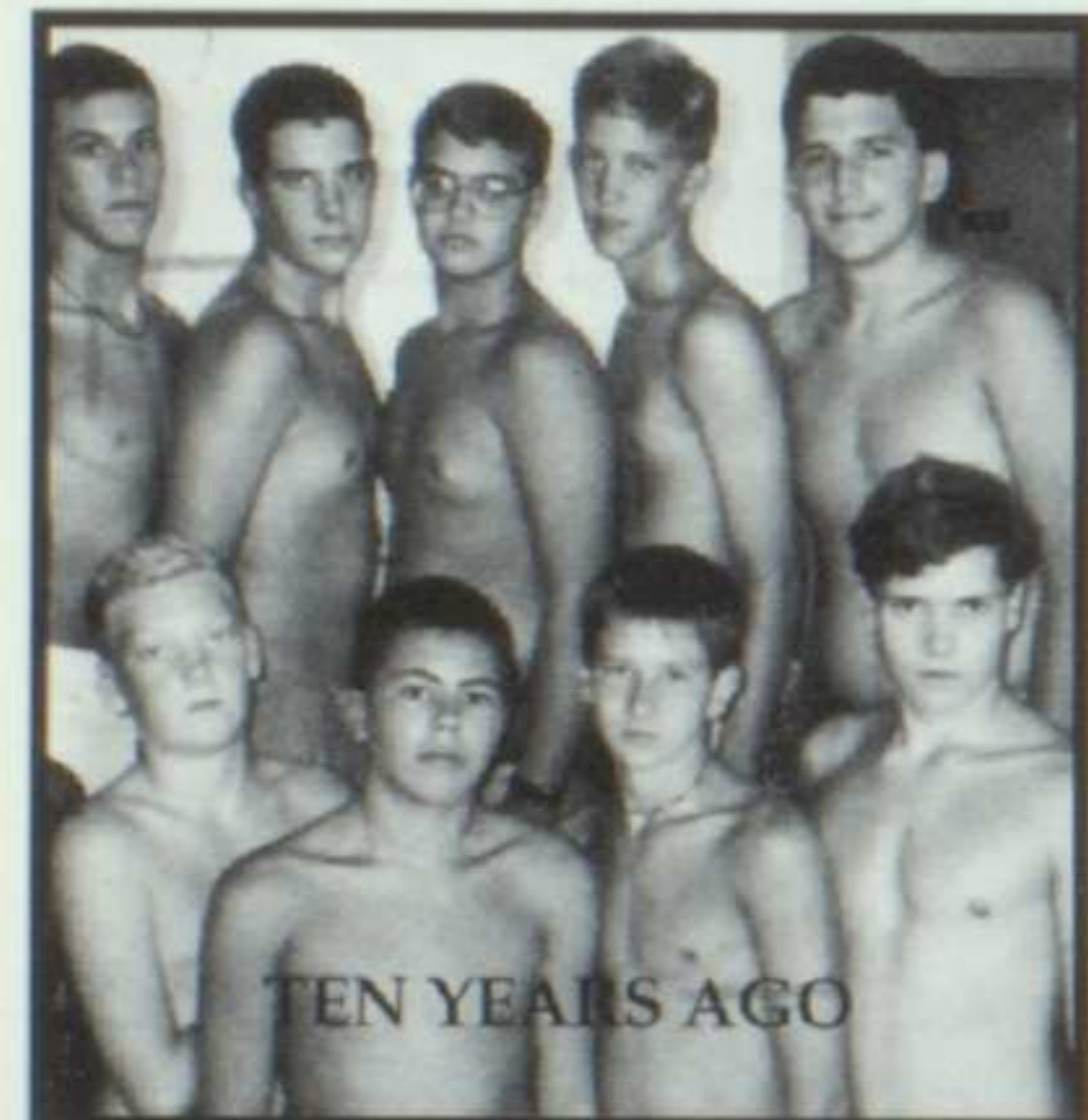

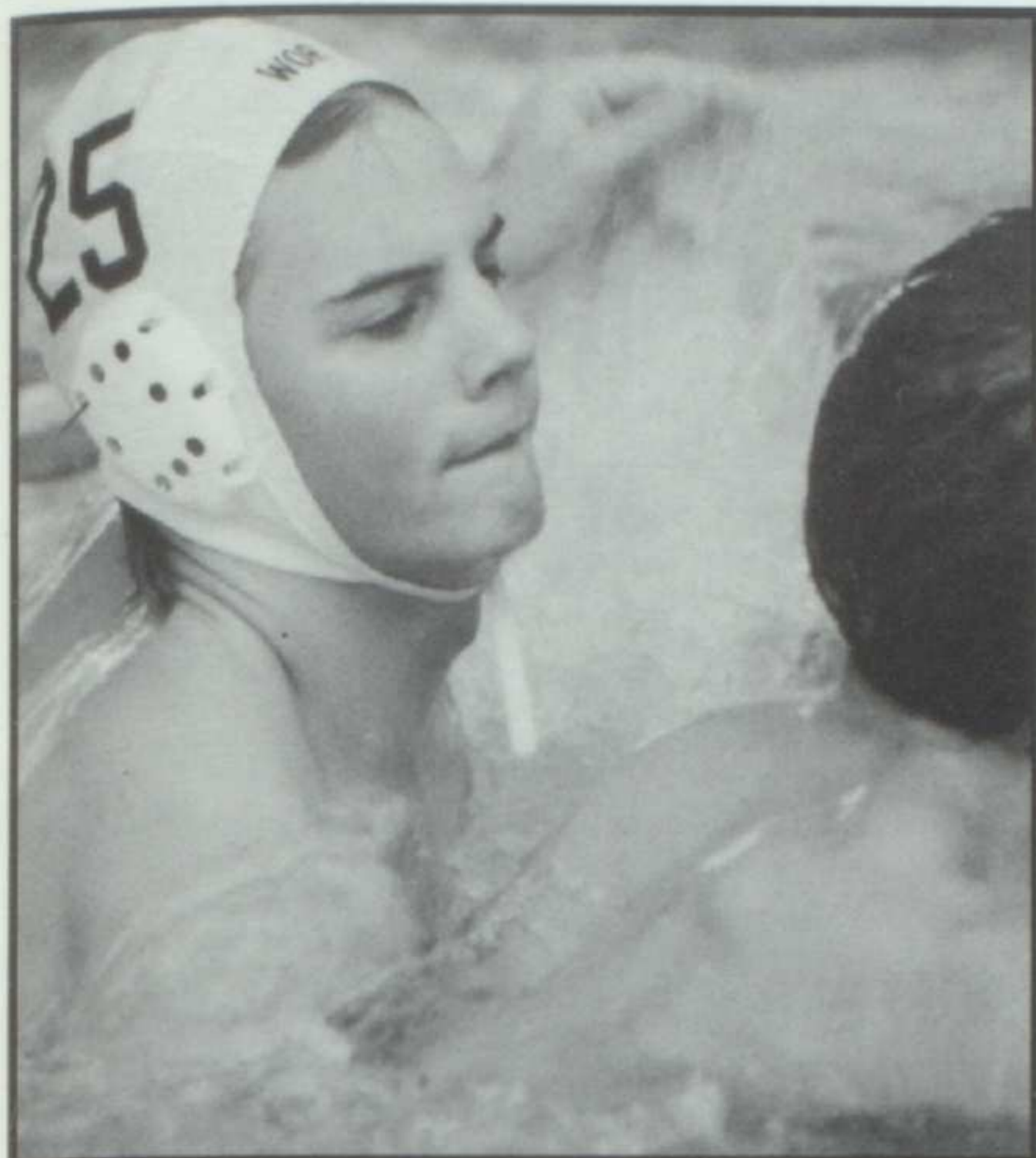

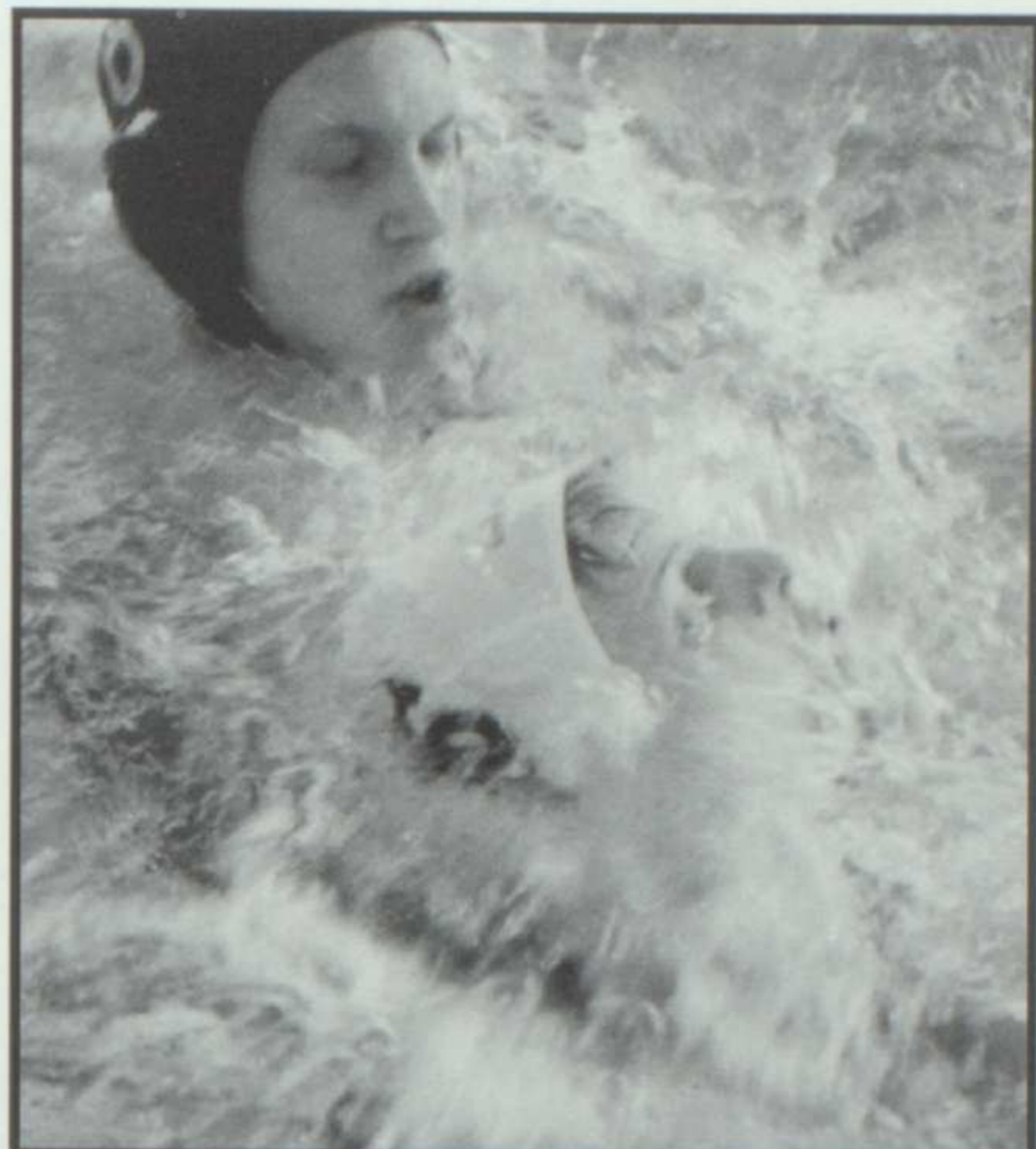

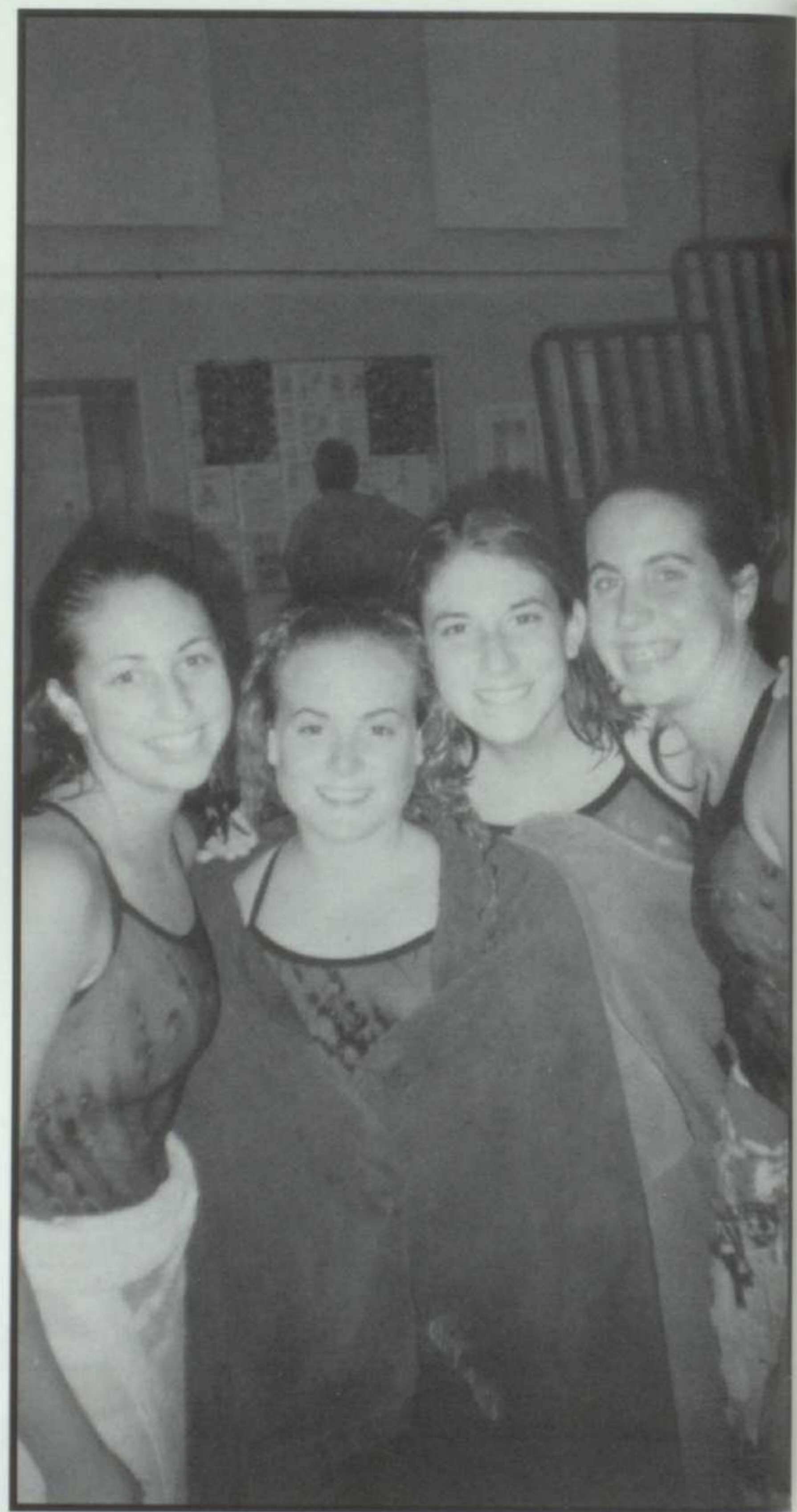

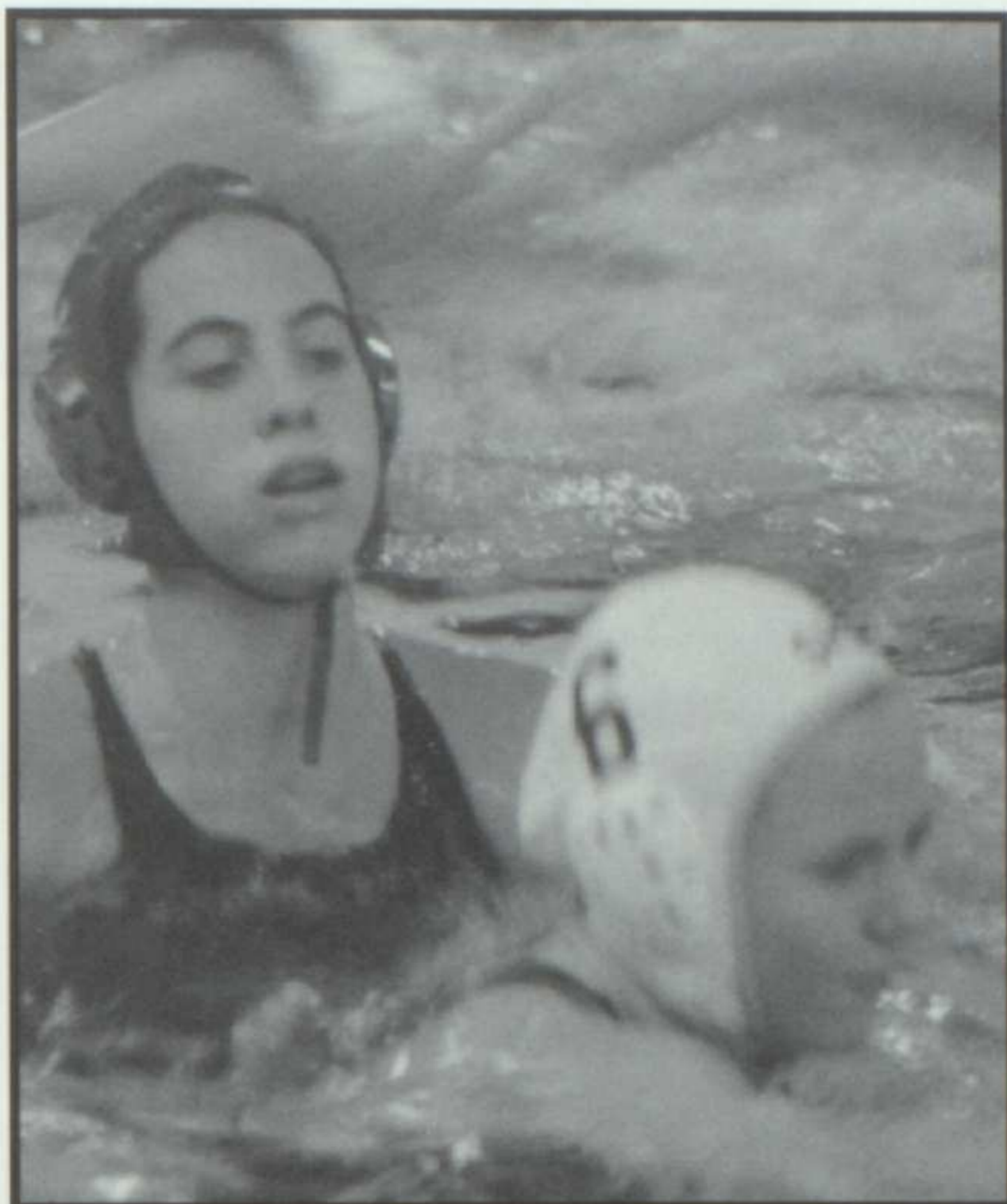

under the direction of veteran coach Roger Johnson, the runners finished third in the district.

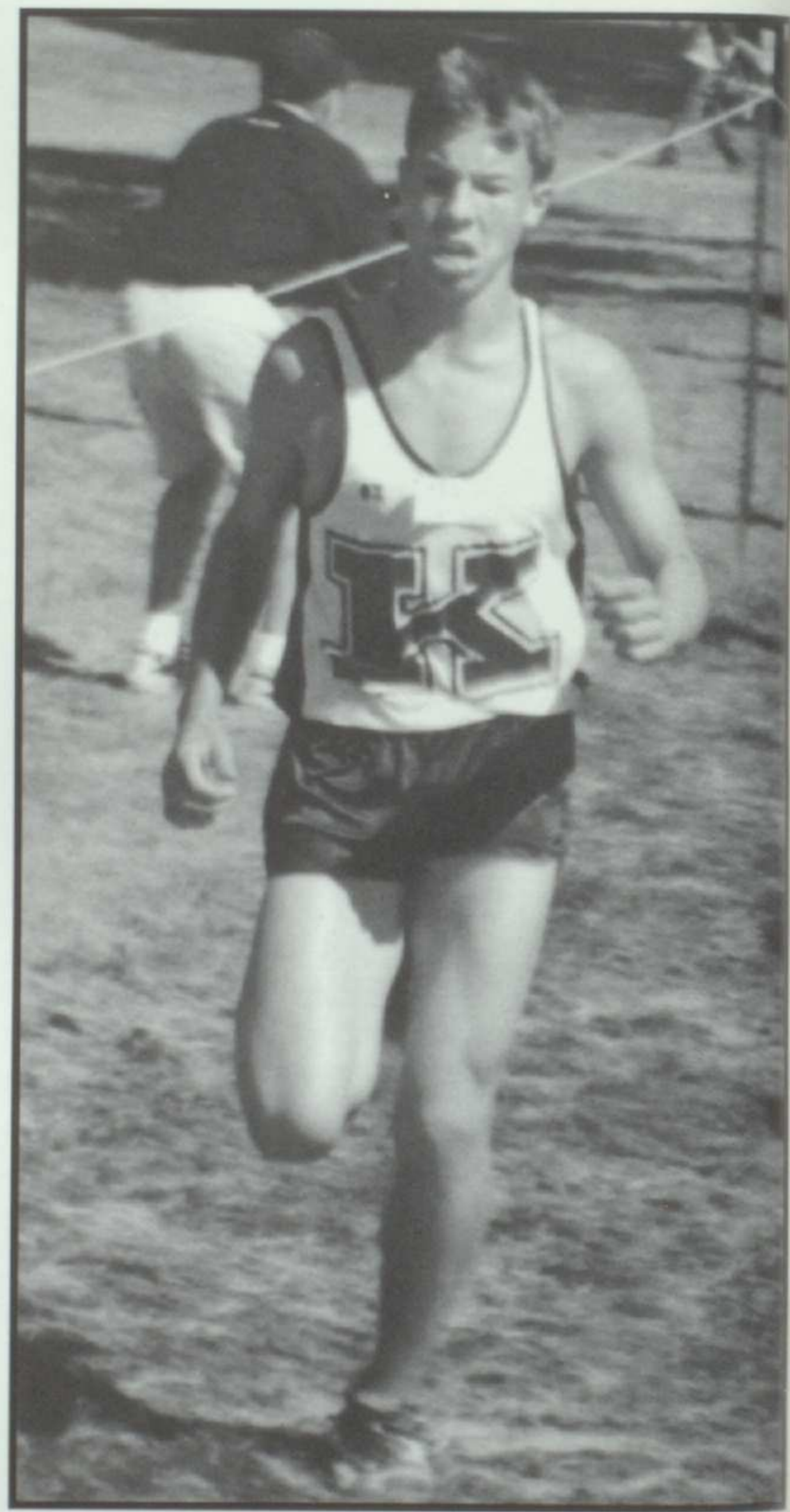
Following this philosophy, coaches Mike

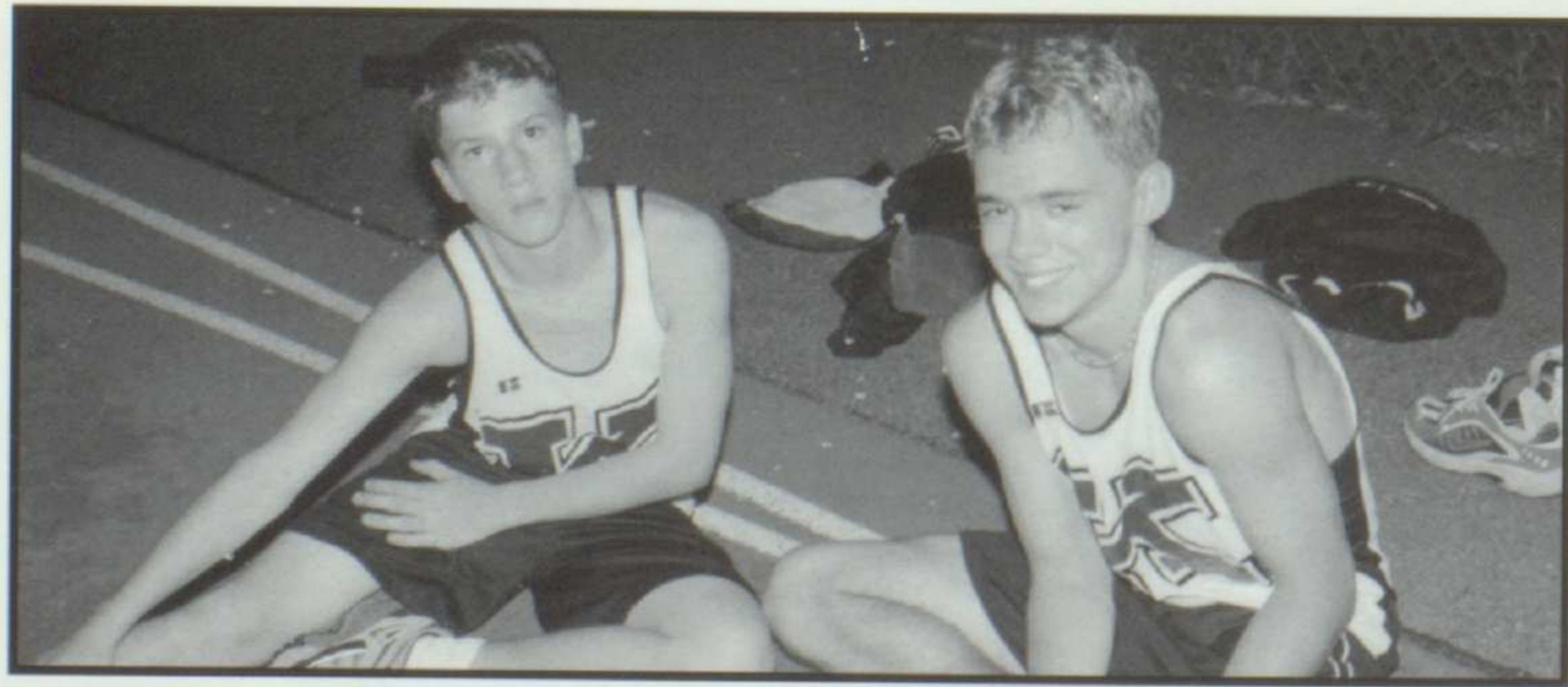

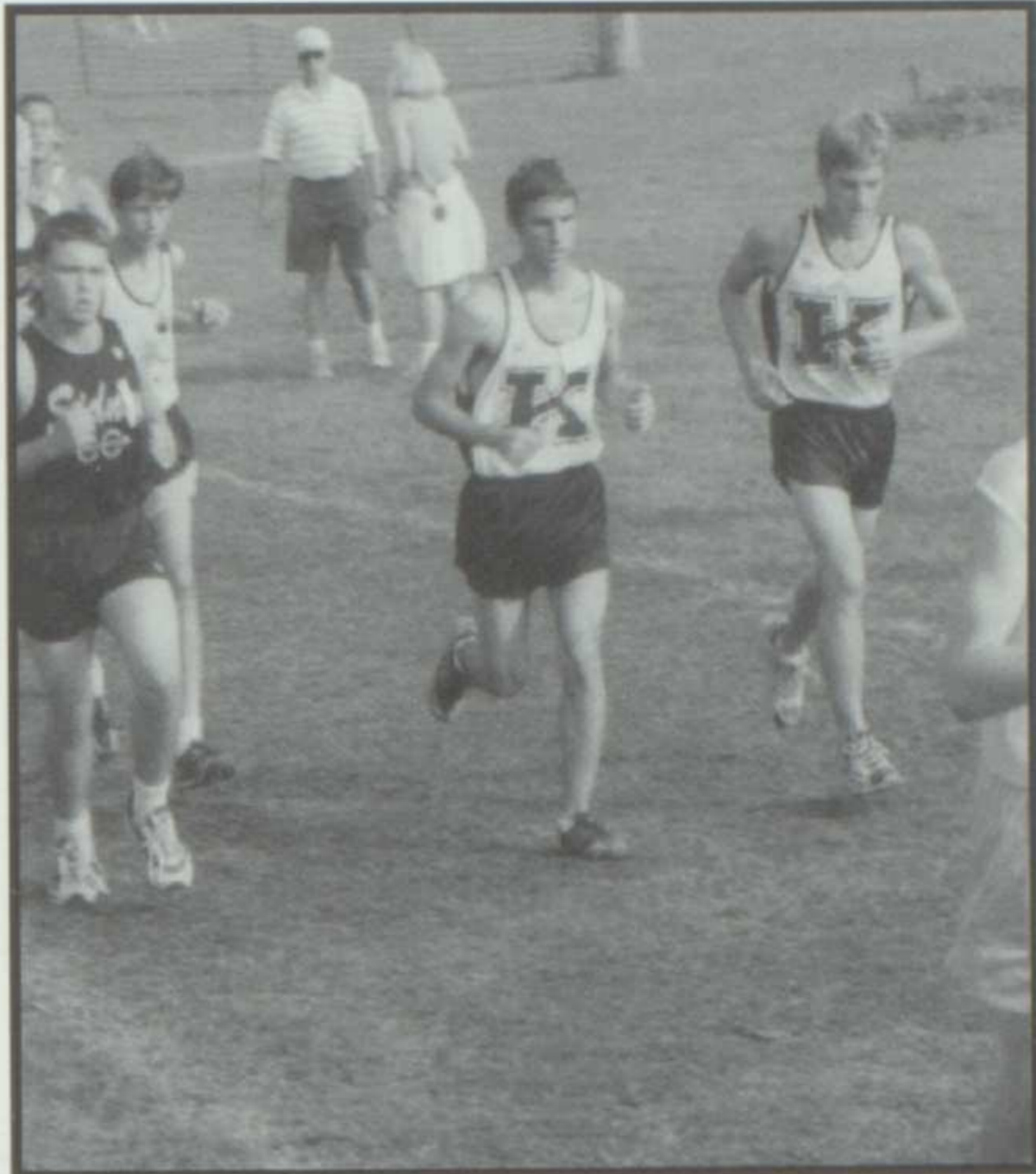

The female runners were happy to be in each other's company while having a great time as part of the girls cross country team. The girls practiced almost every day,

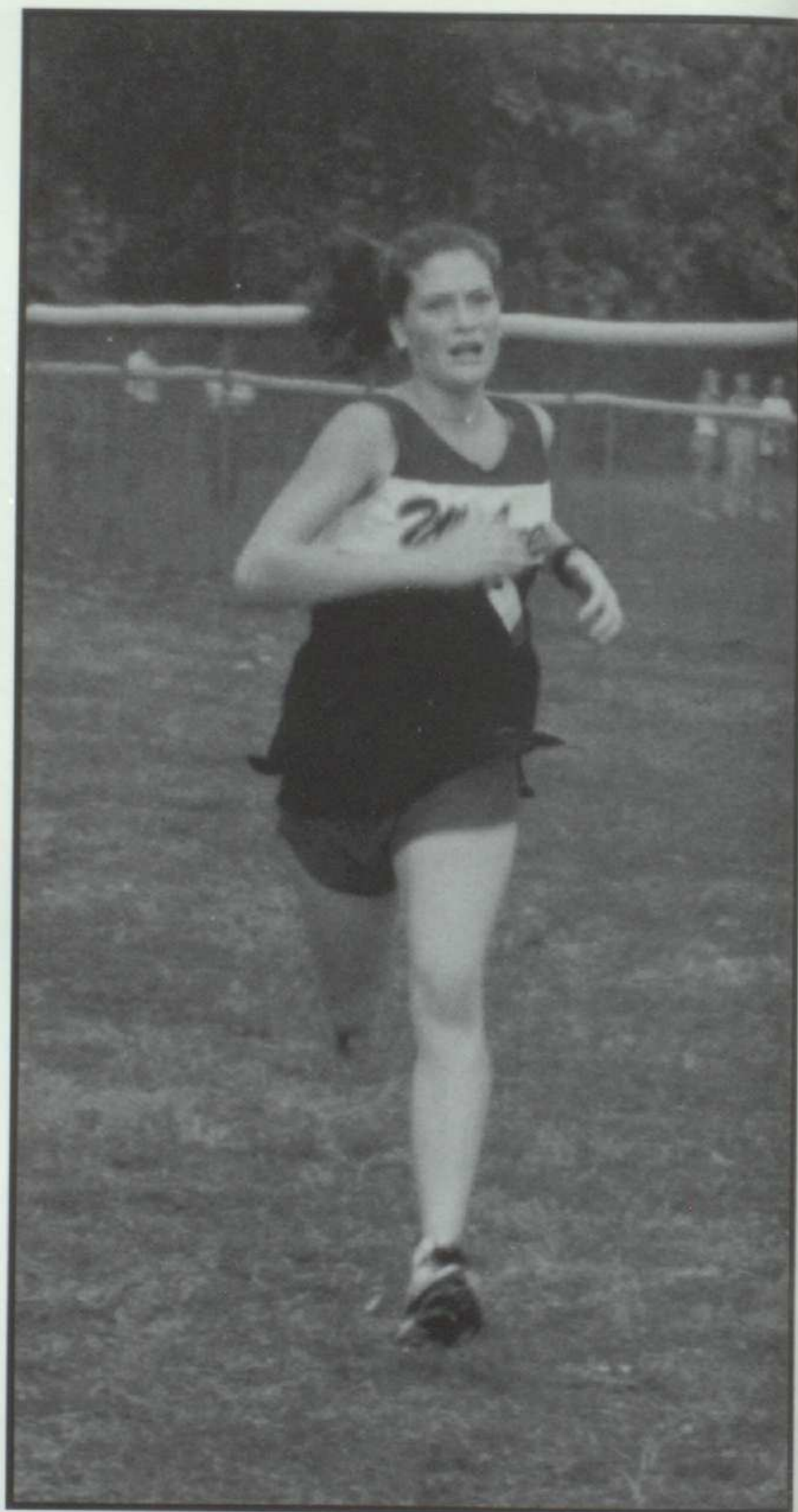
switching between their endurance runs in the Hills and their power runs on the track. They were committed to helping each other which meant that they would improve as individuals as well as a team.

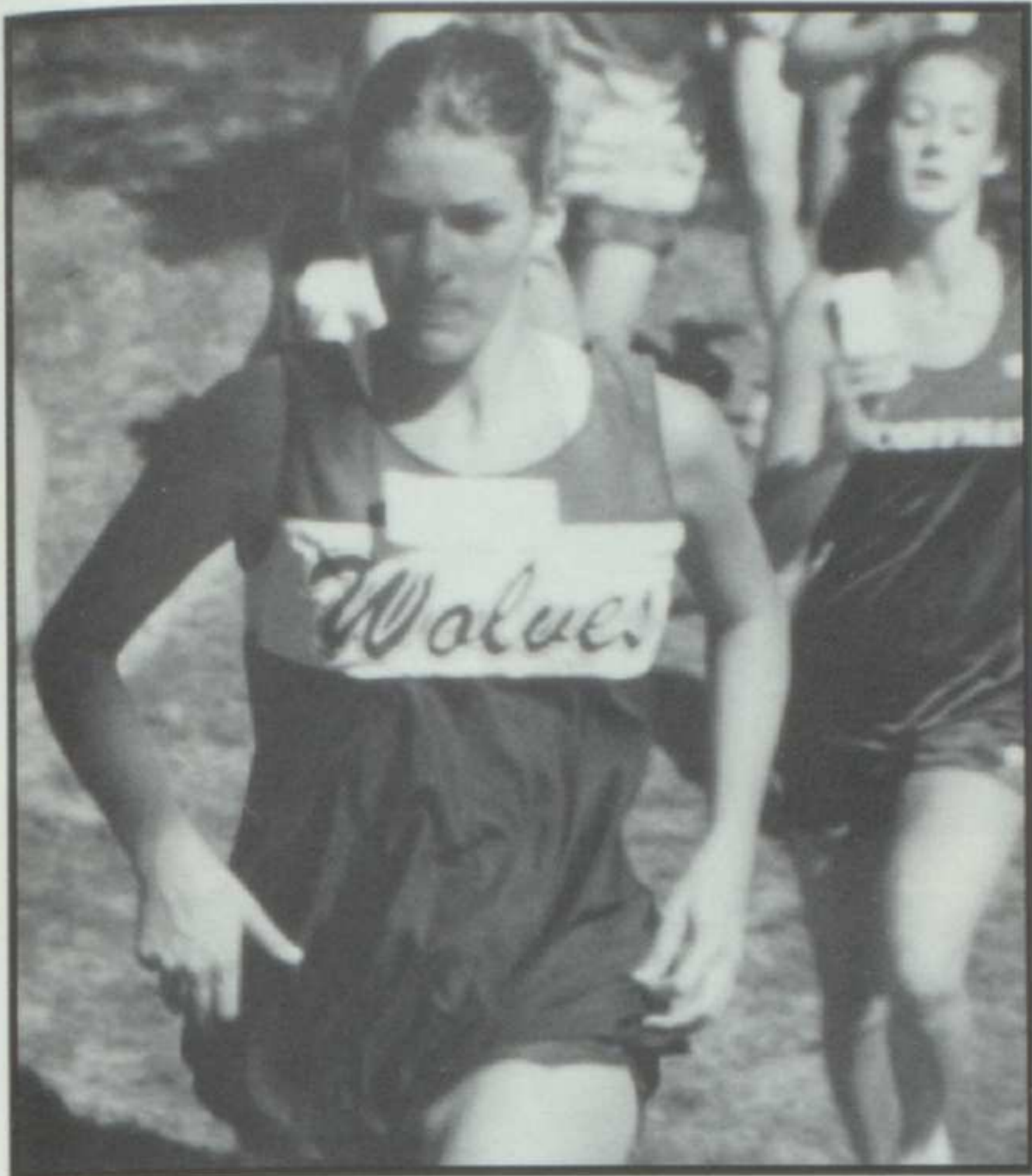

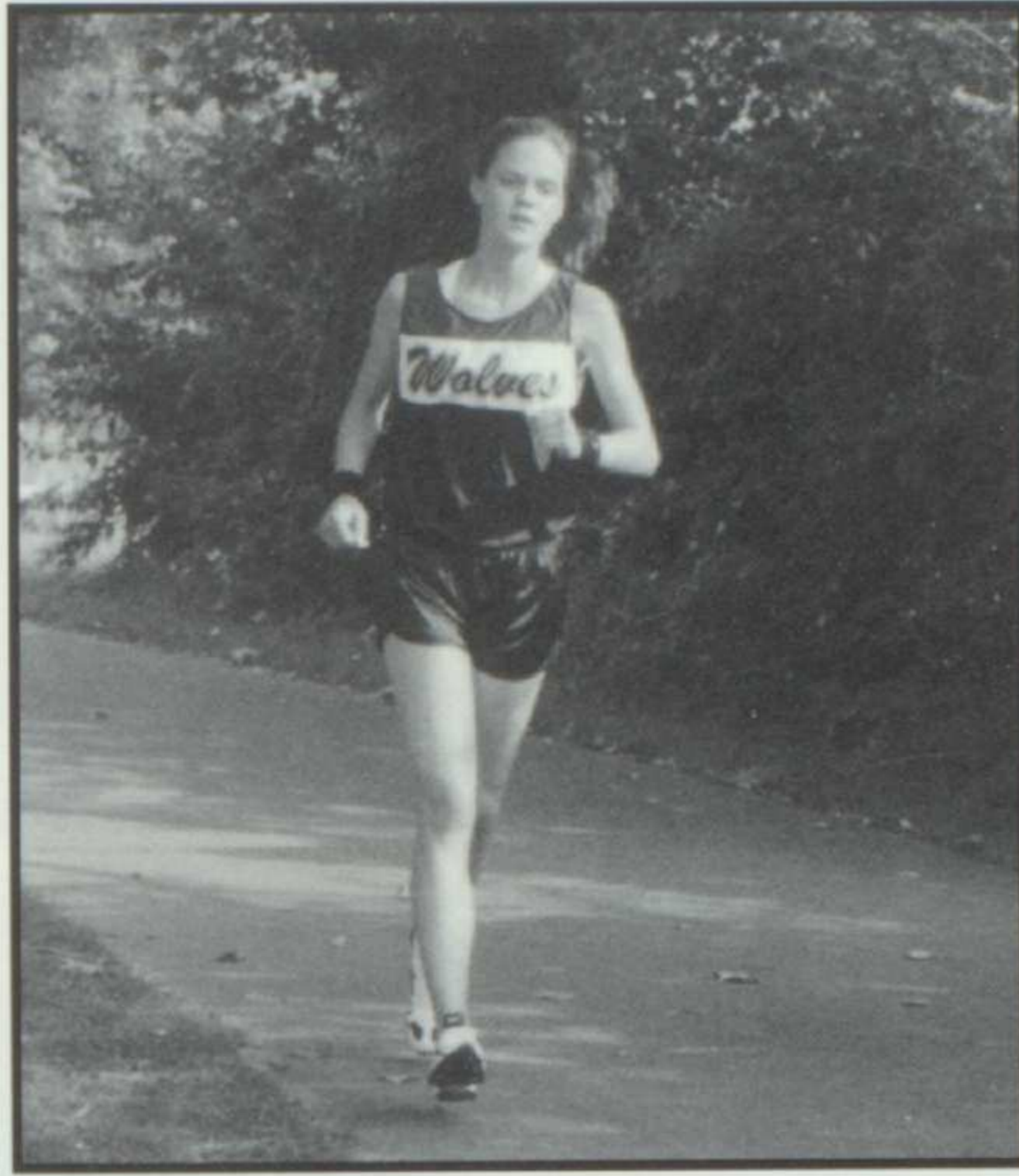

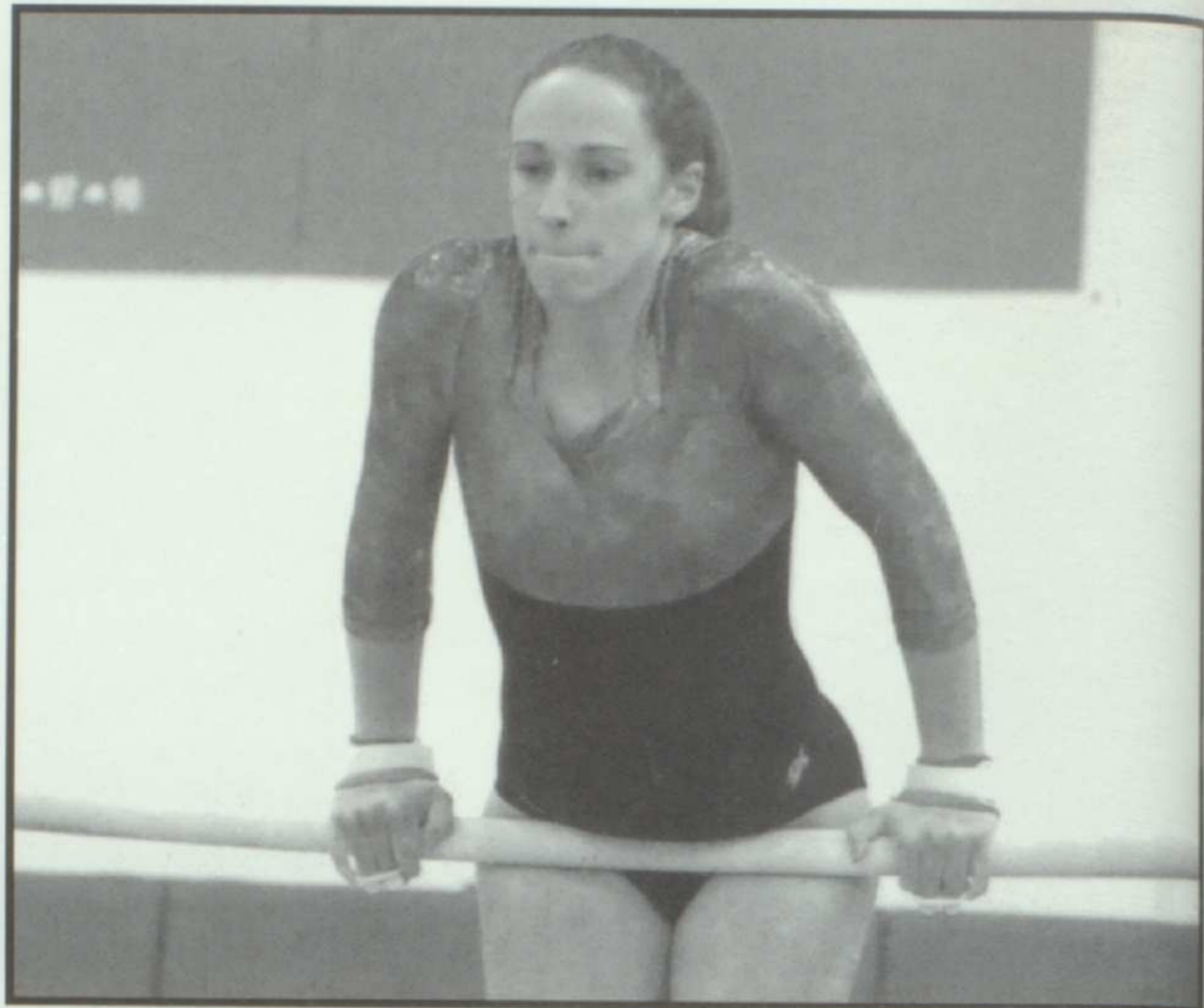

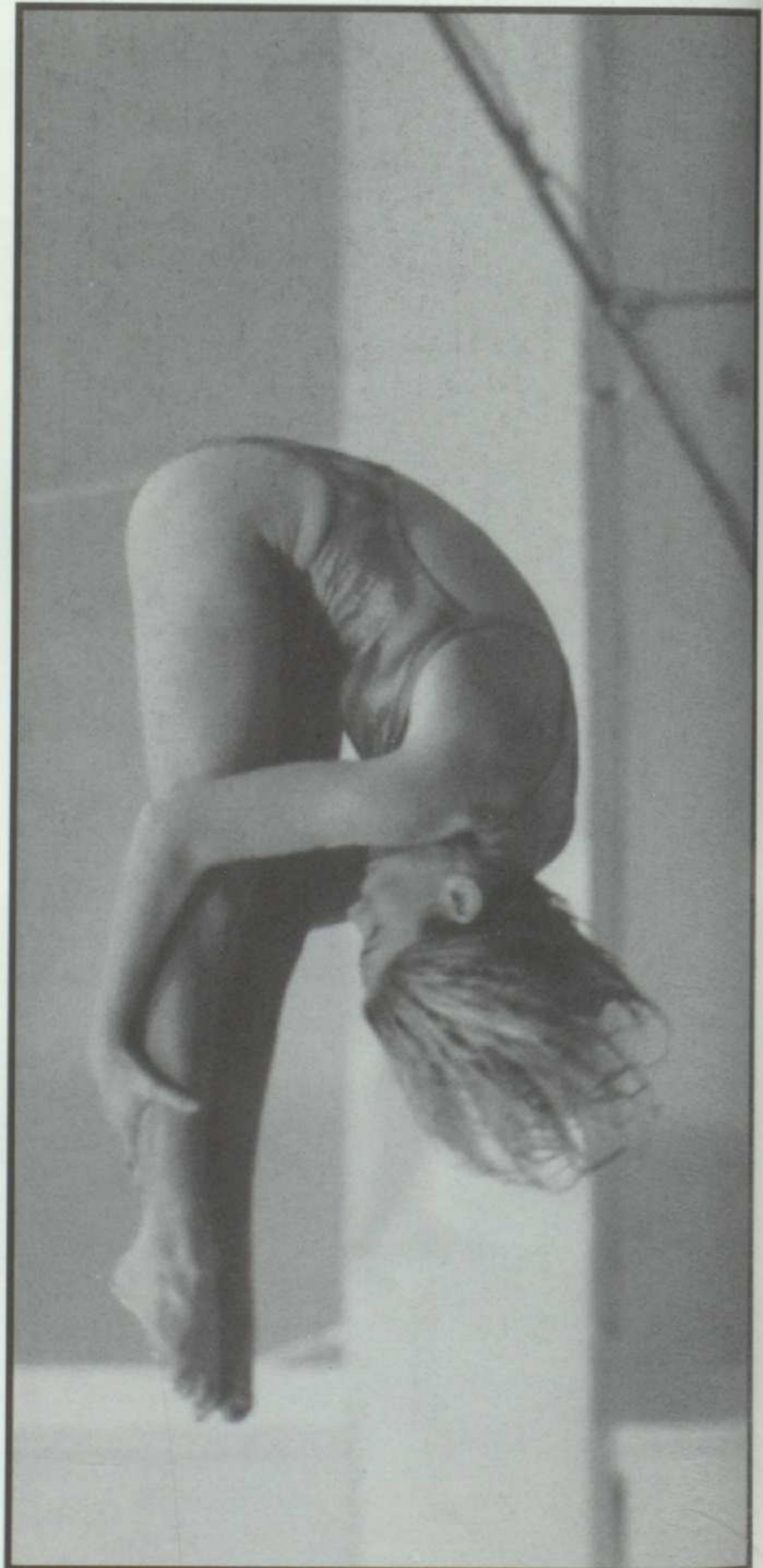

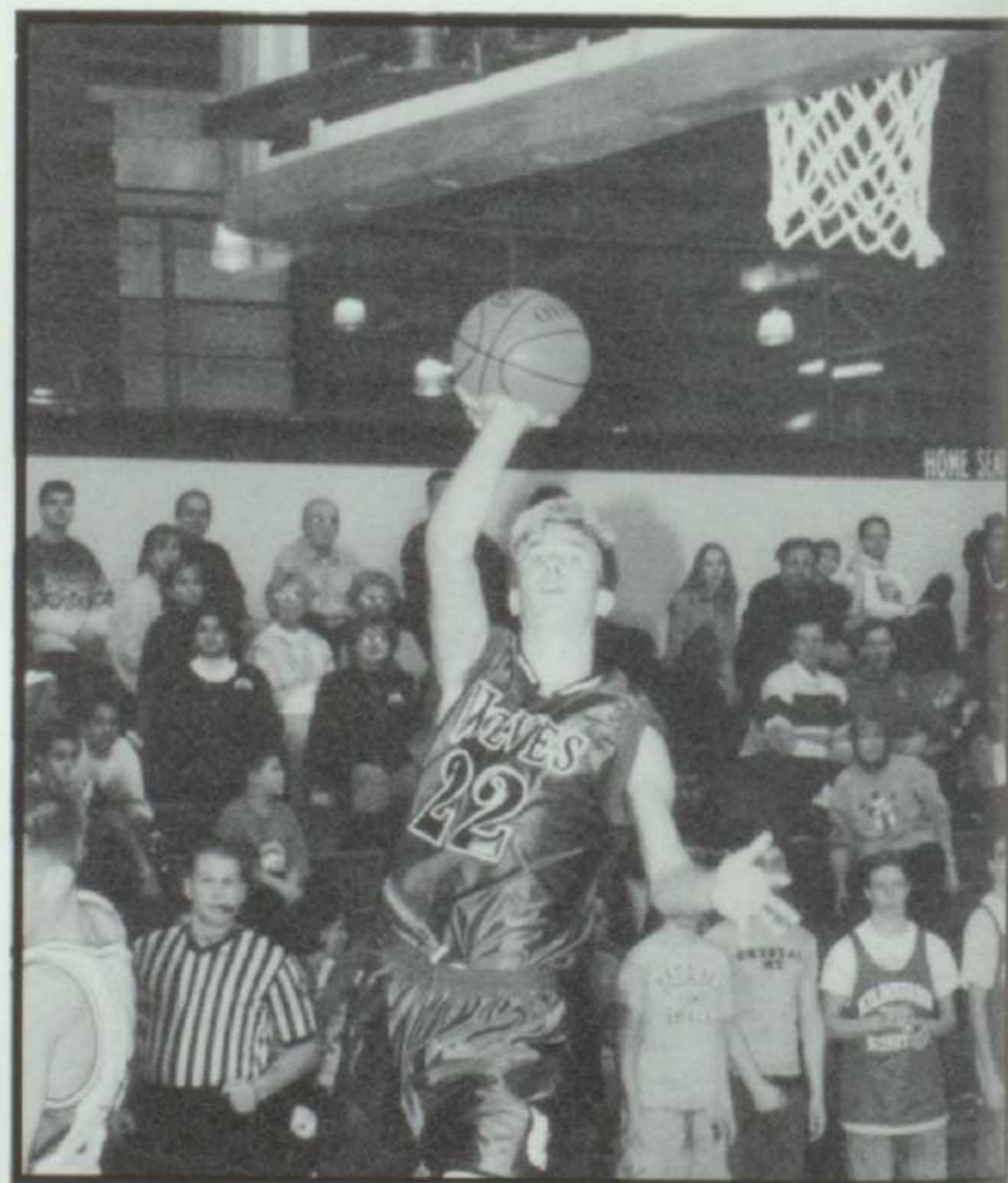

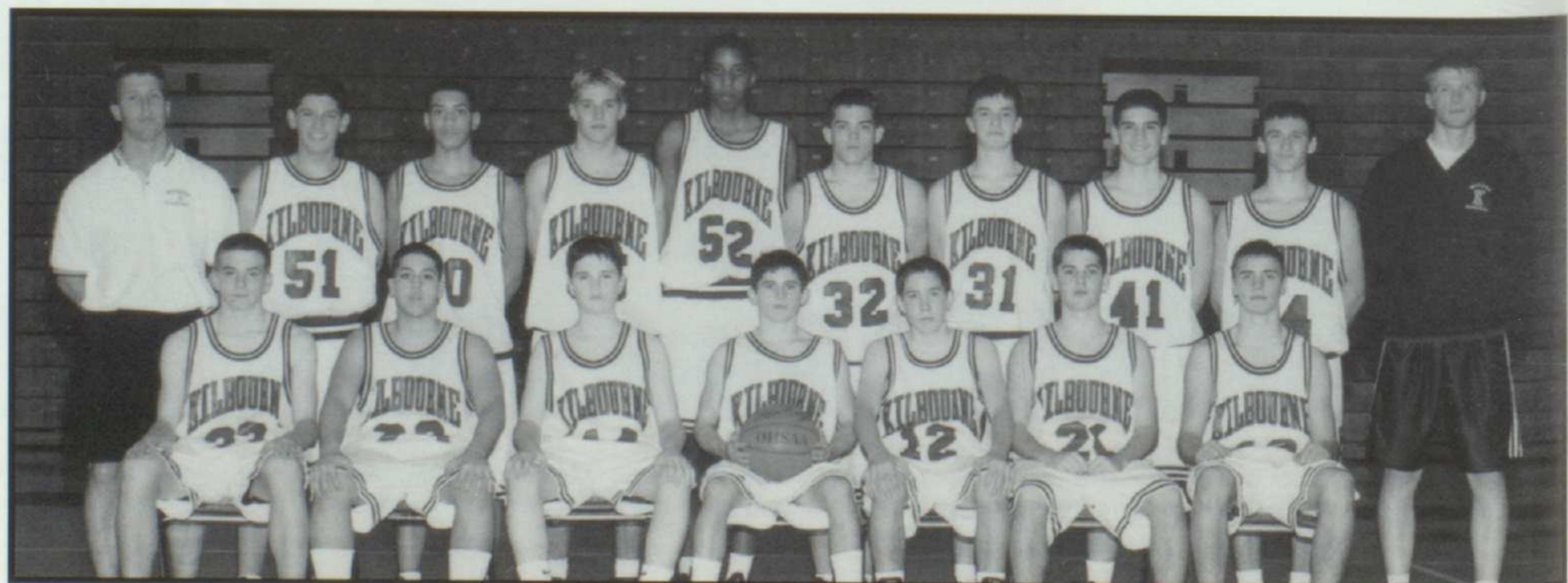
underclassmen will have to step up the level of play the returners set."

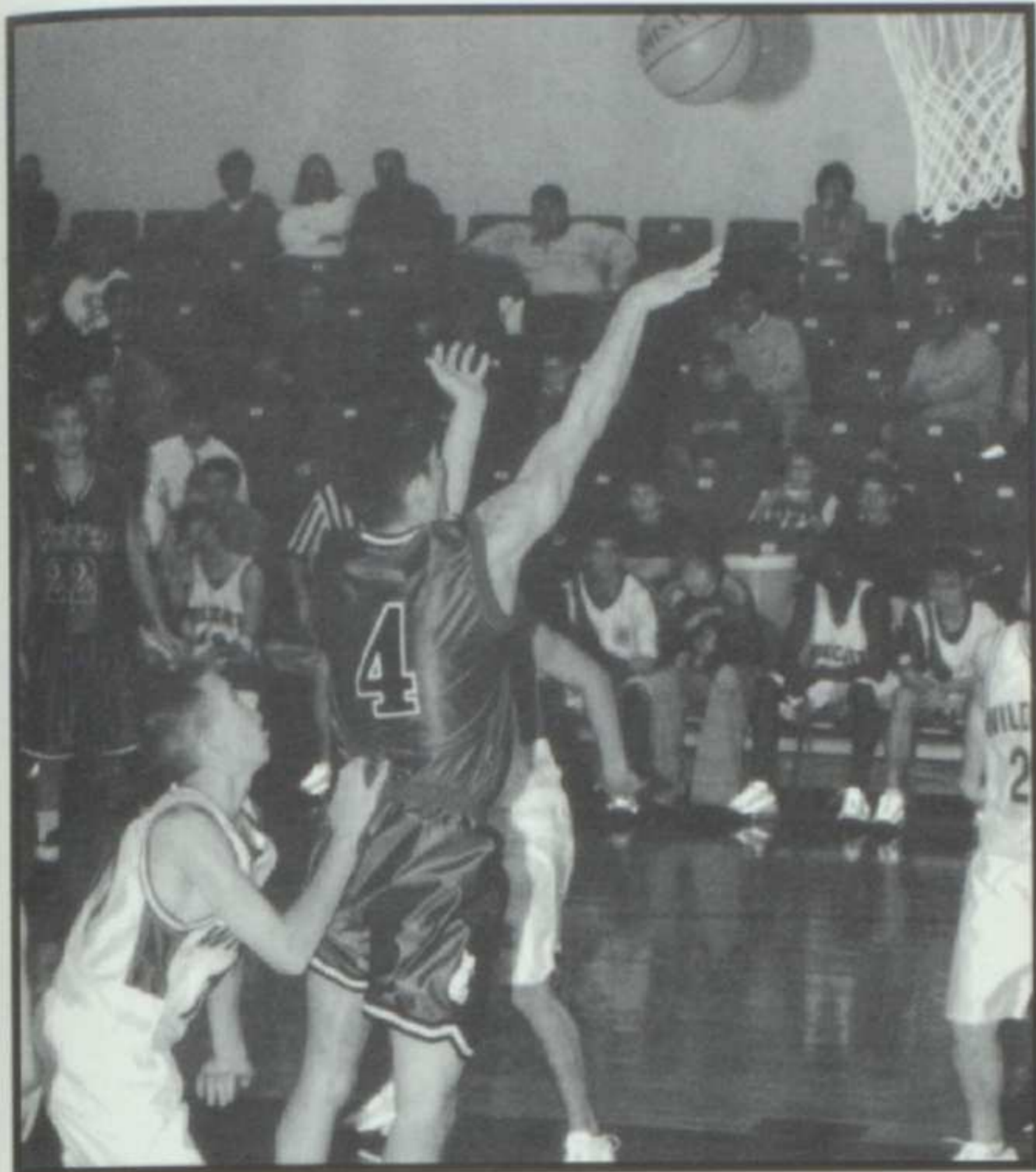

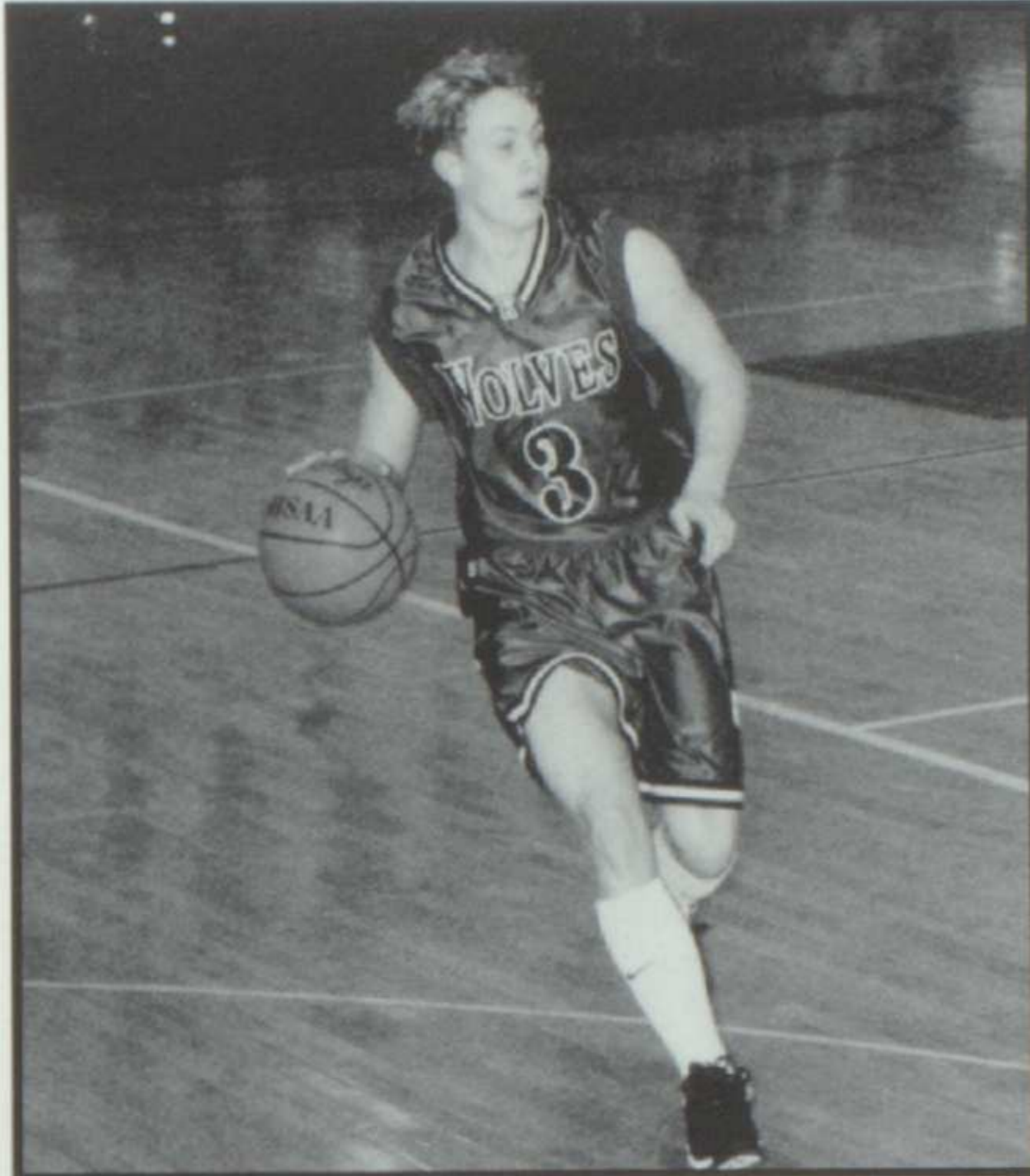

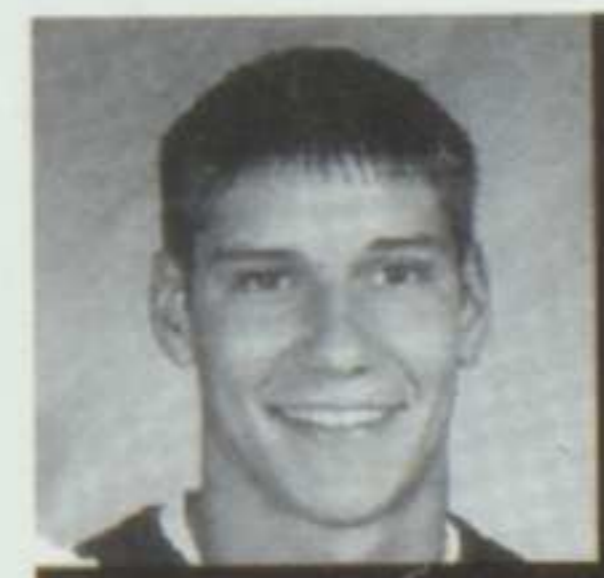

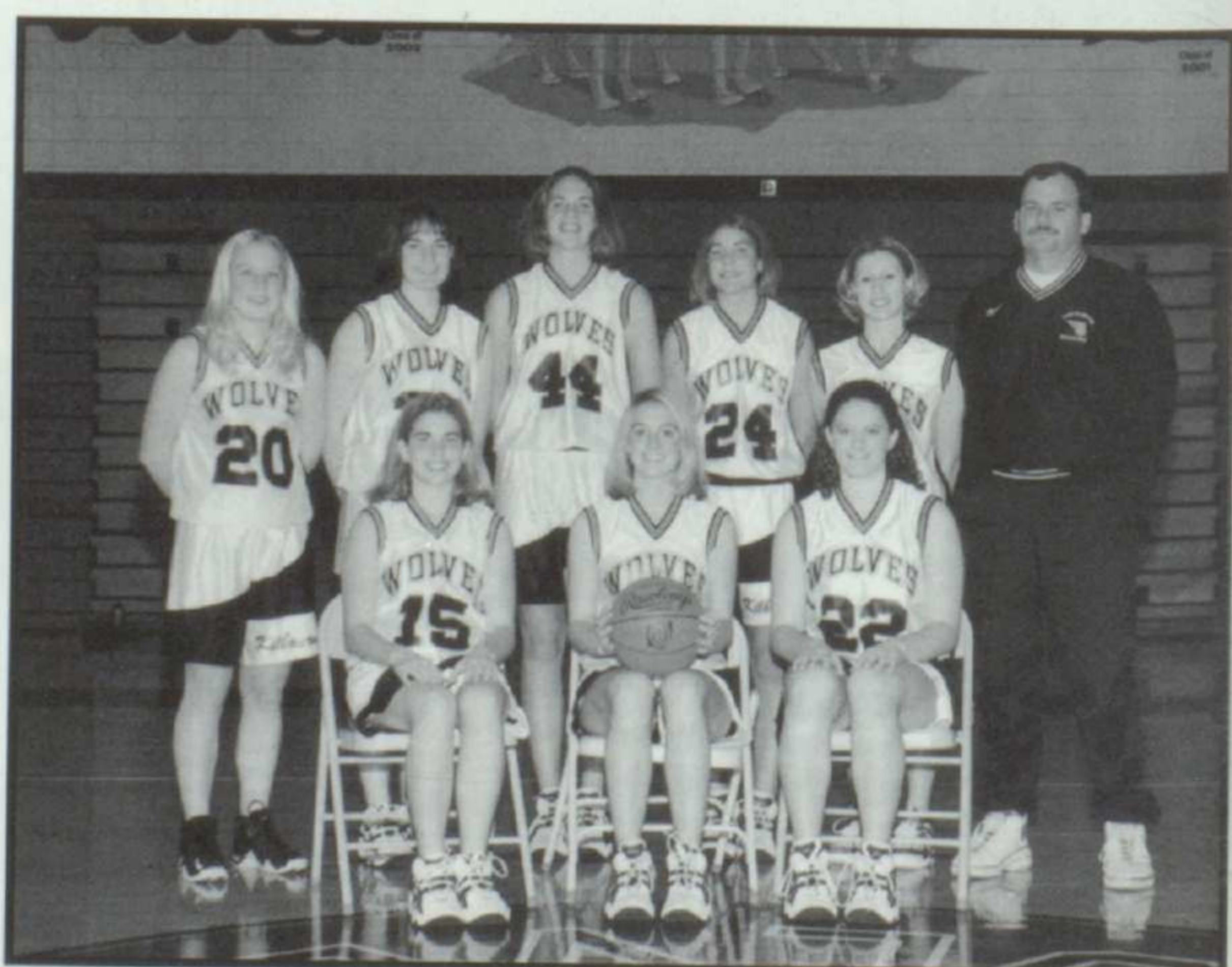

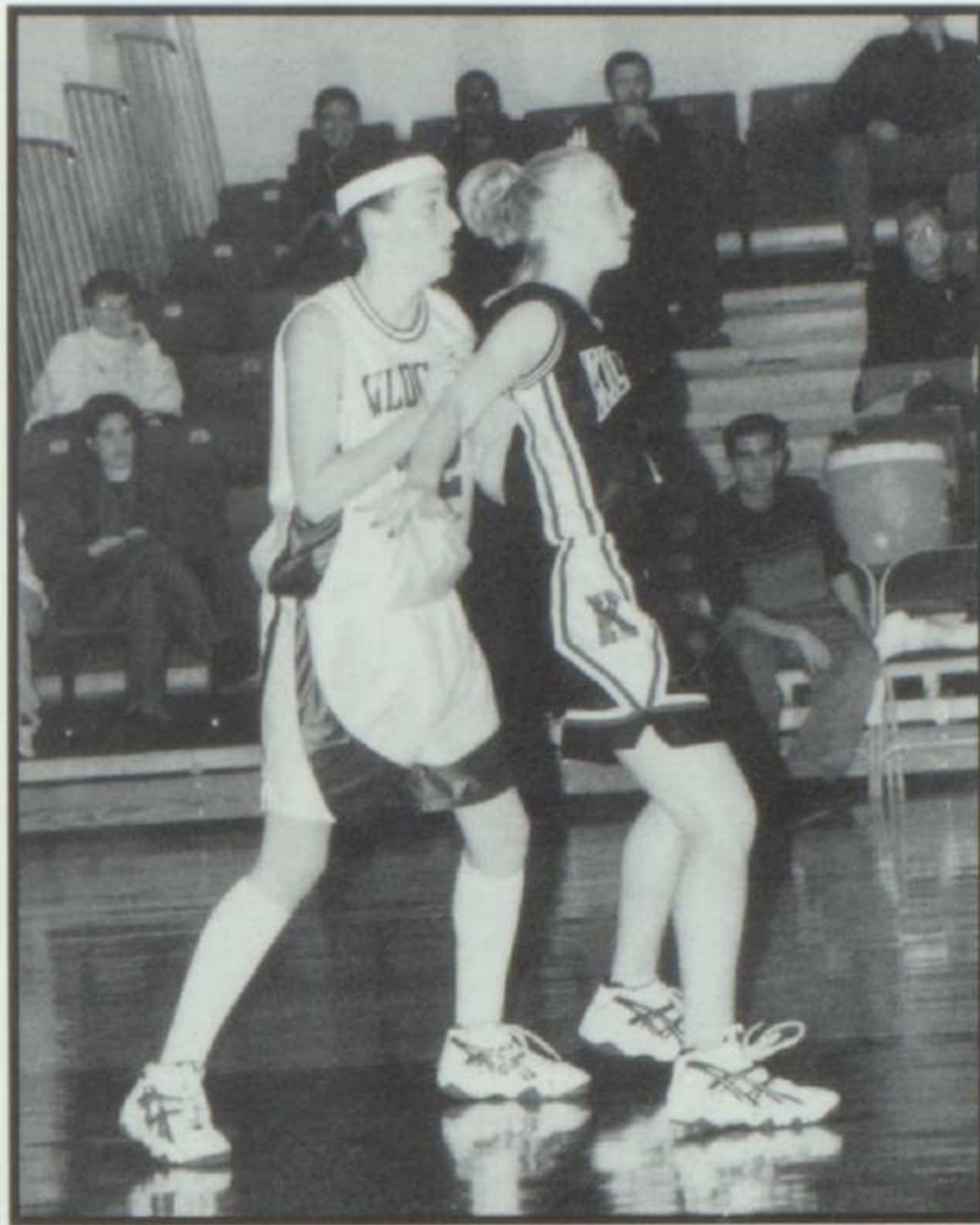

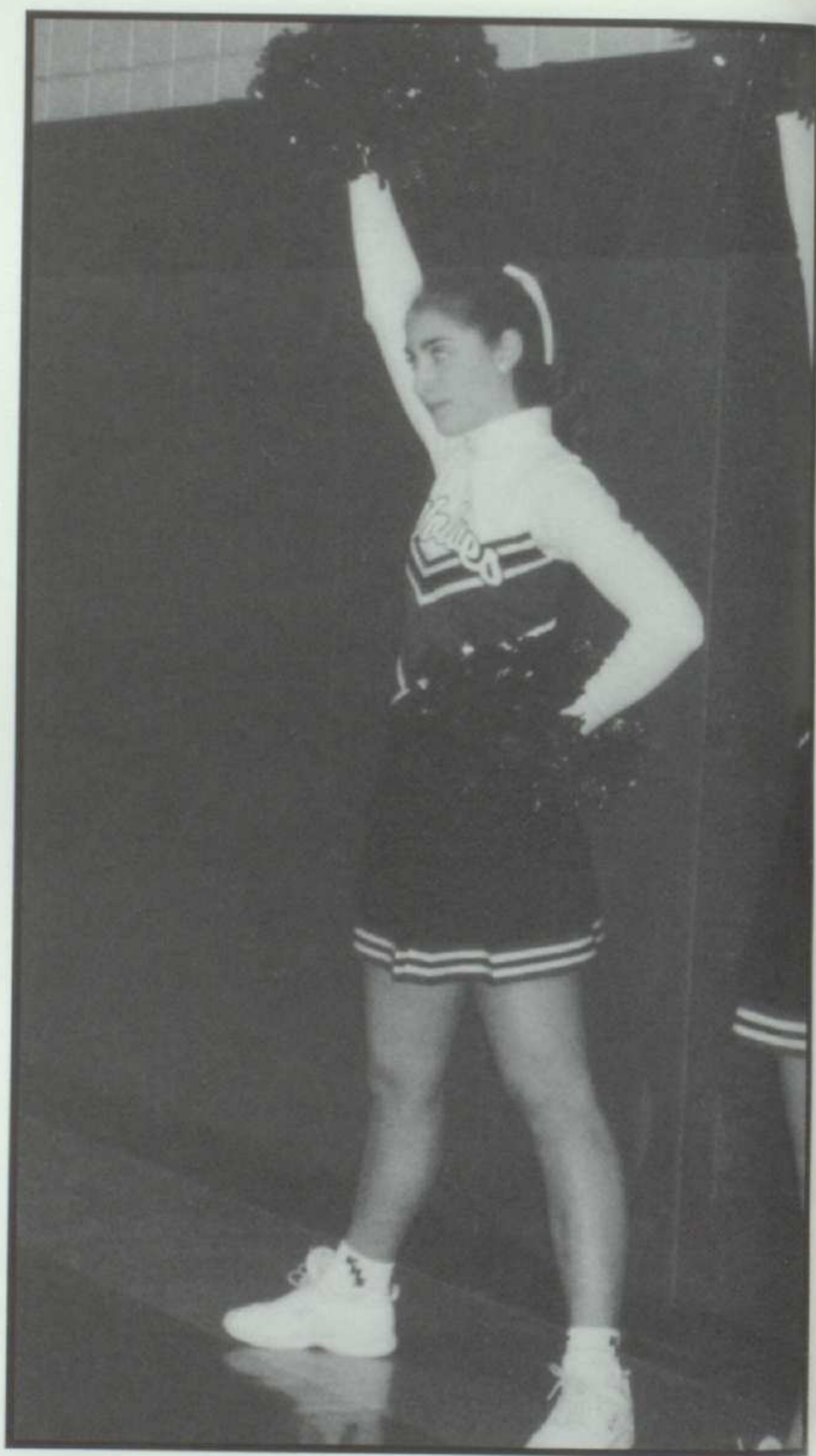
After spring tryouts, they began practice in the summer. The girls dedicated hours in and out of season to their competitions.

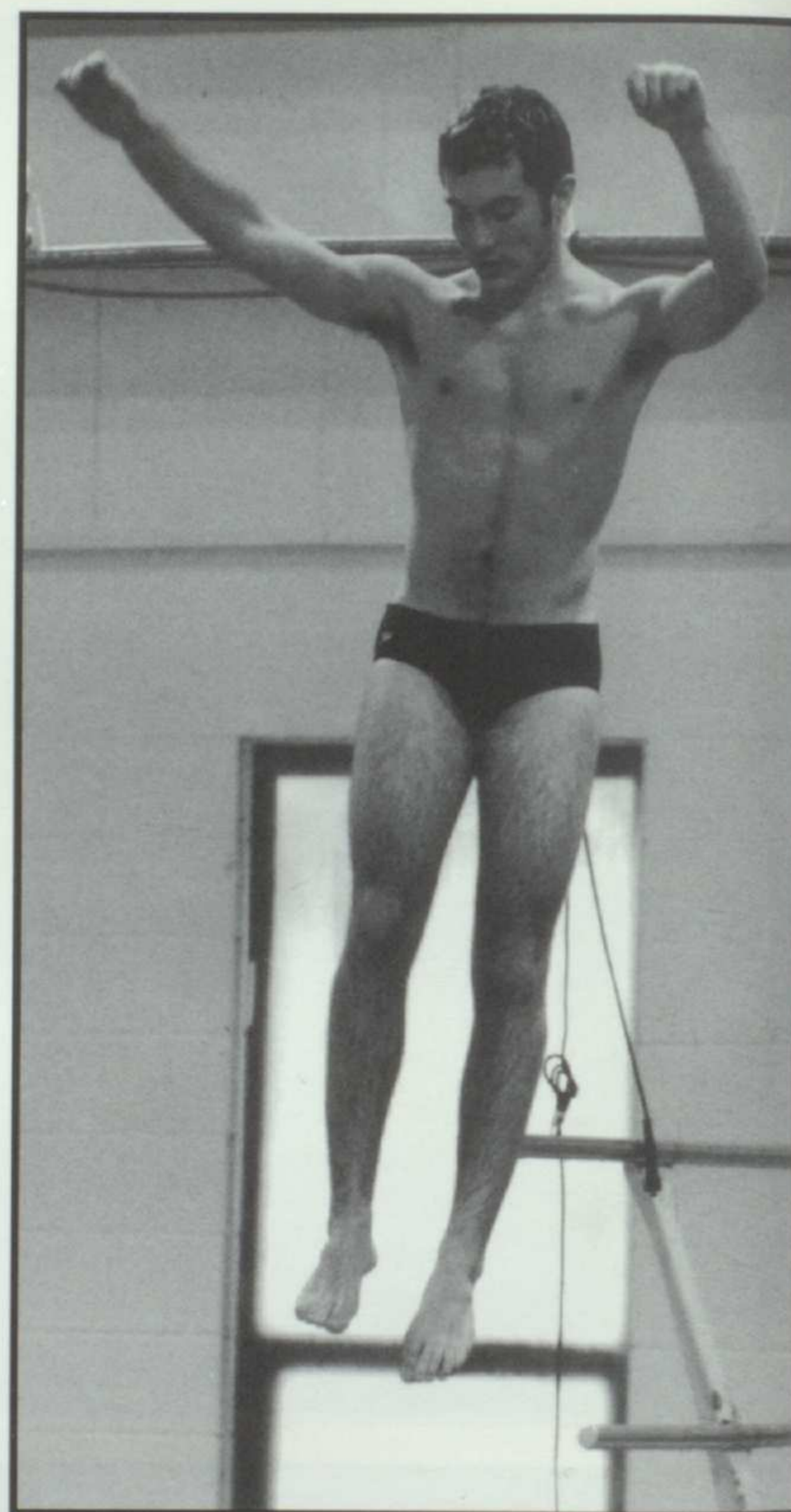
Each diver learns a number of different

dives including back dive, inward, reverse and front dives. Each swimmer perfects the different swimming strokes including the back stroke, butterfly, and breast stroke.

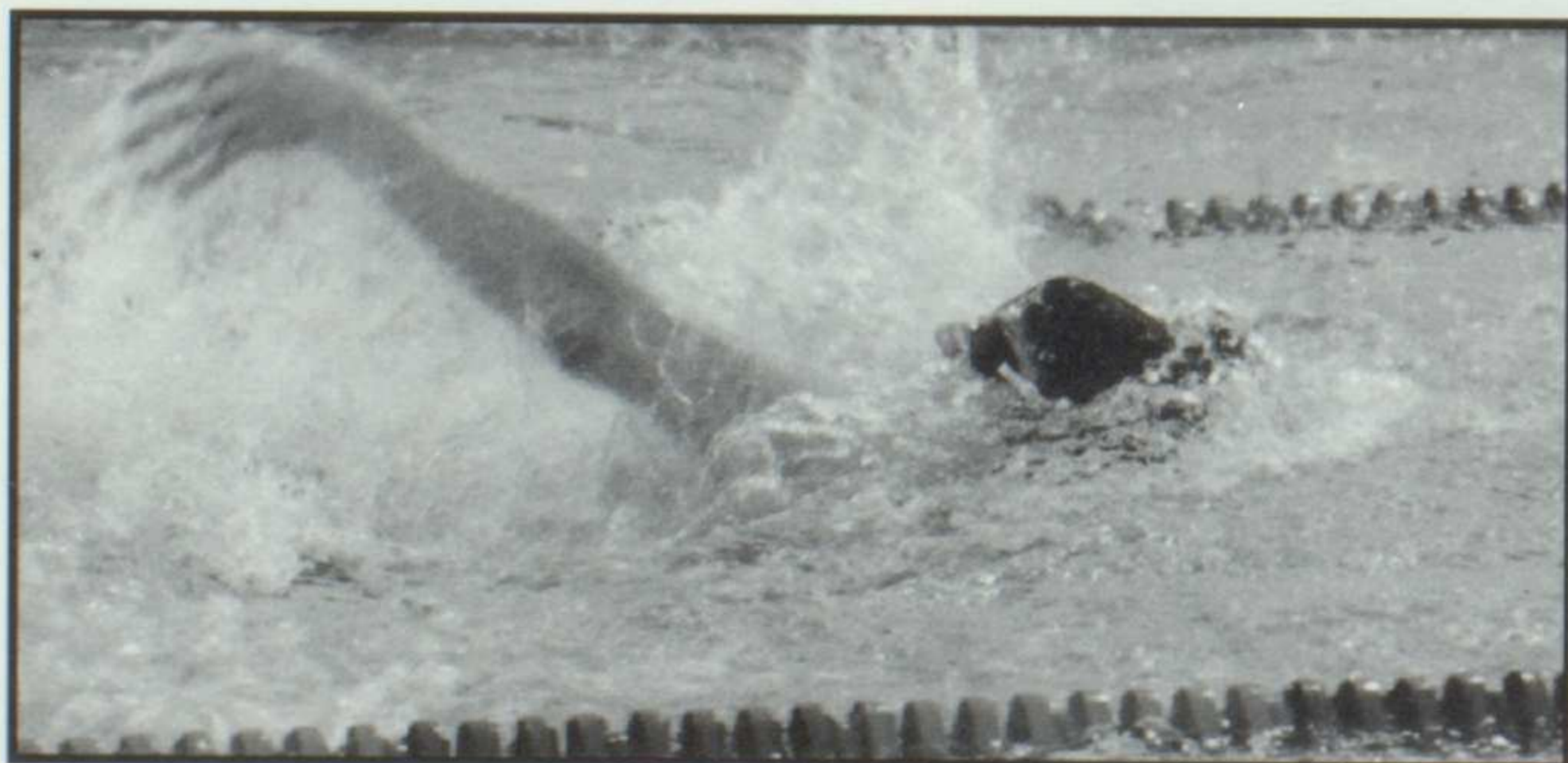

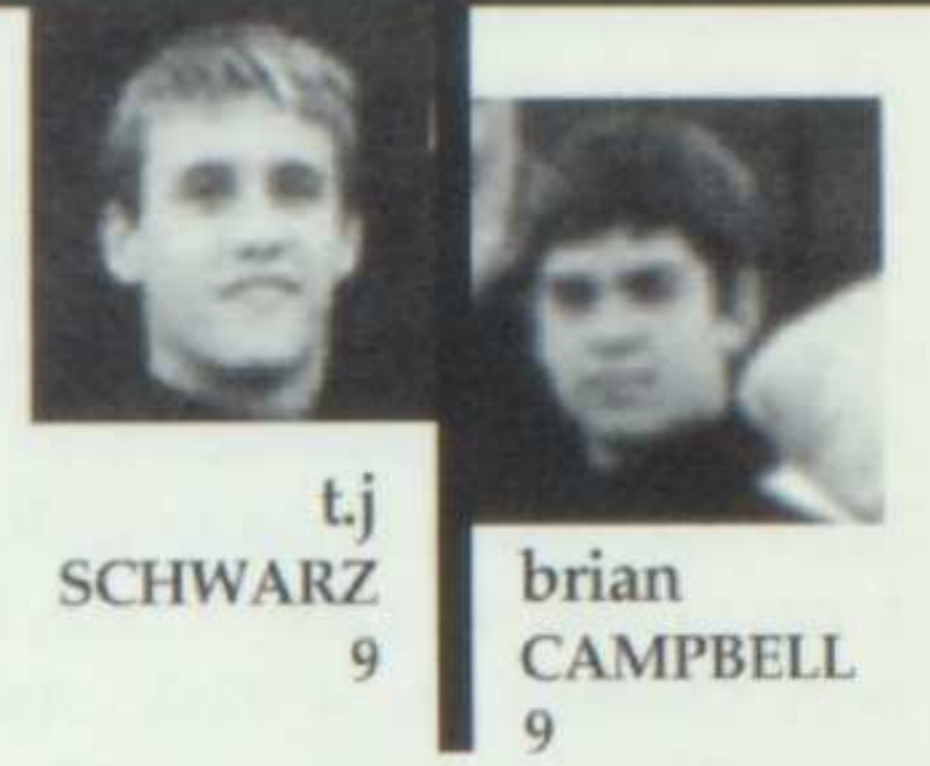

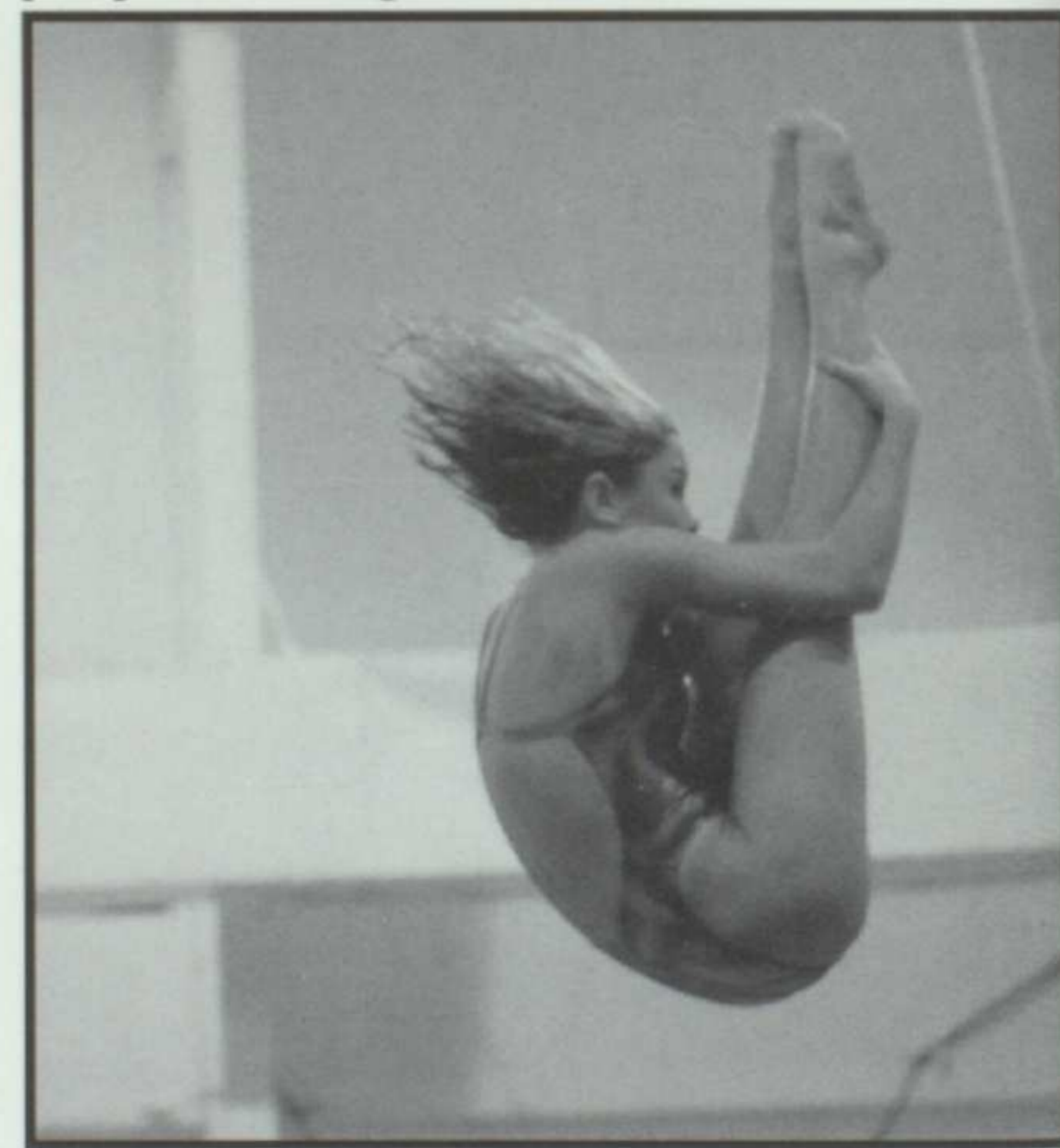

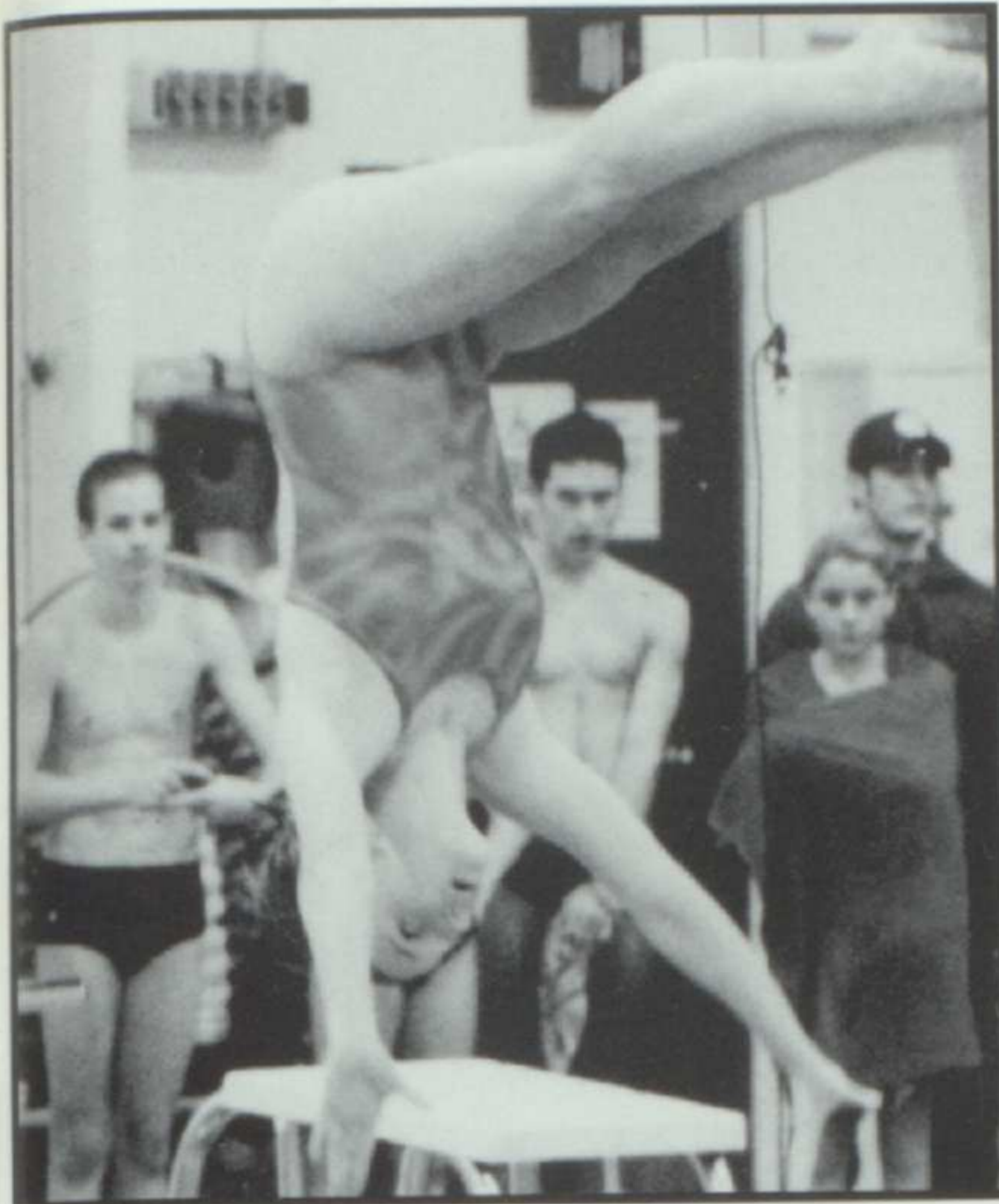

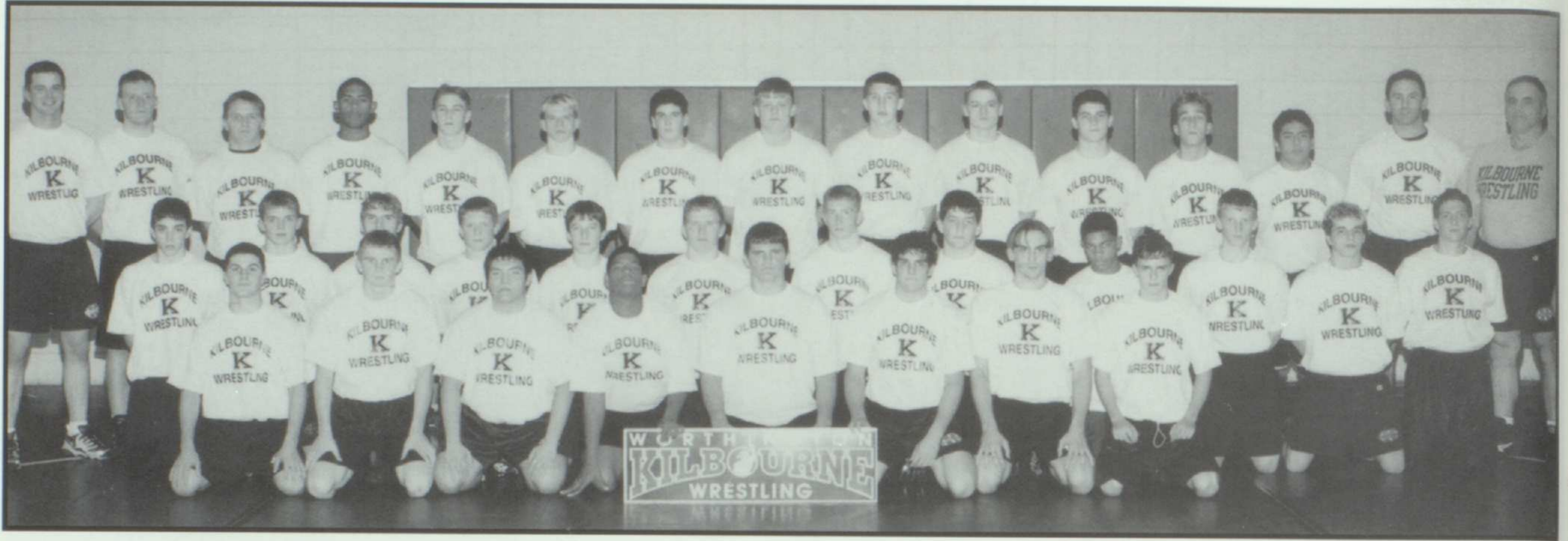

said senior Scott Shaffer when questioned about his coach. "He has coached me all four years of high school, and I couldn't have asked for anyone better."

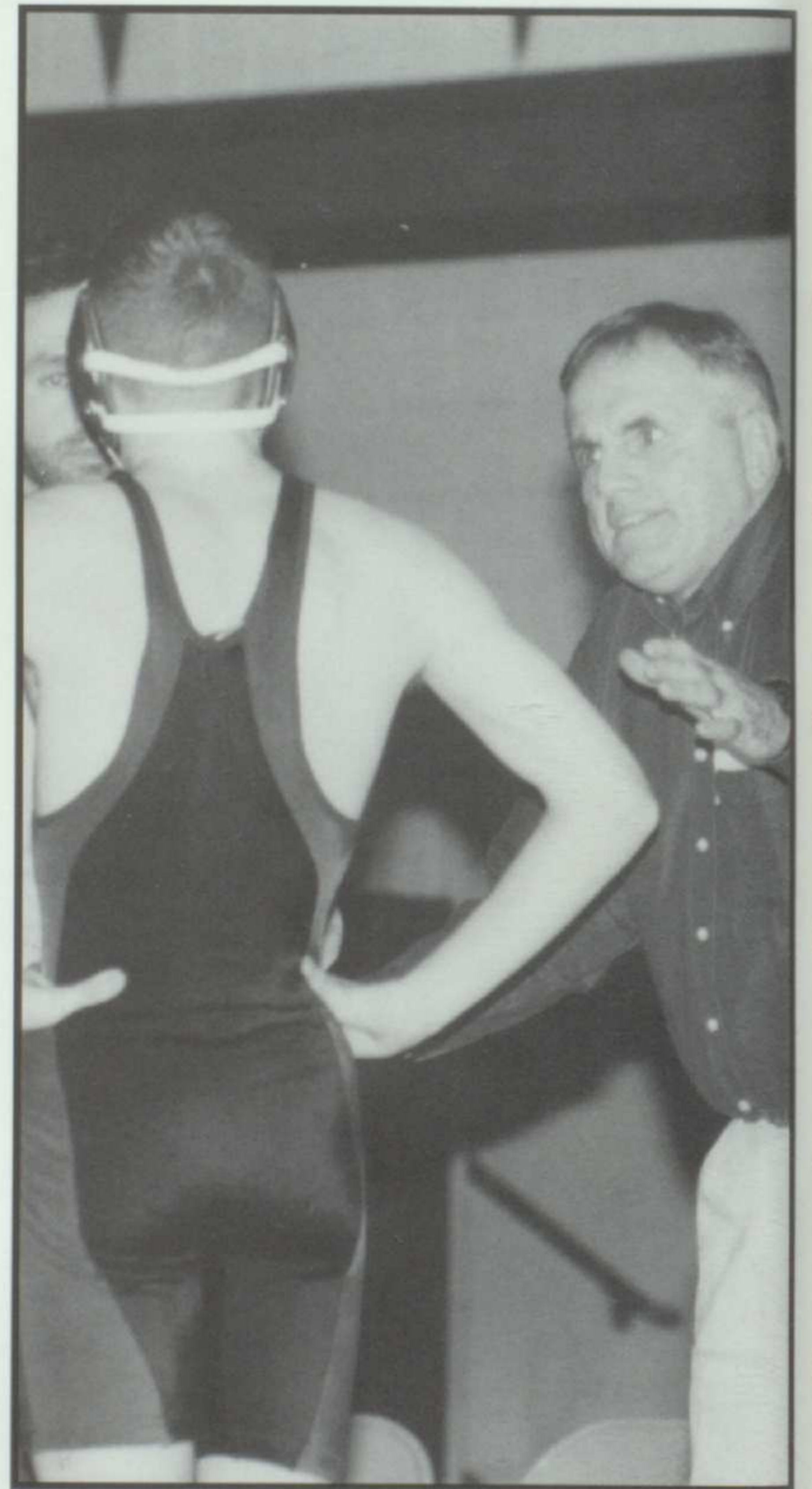

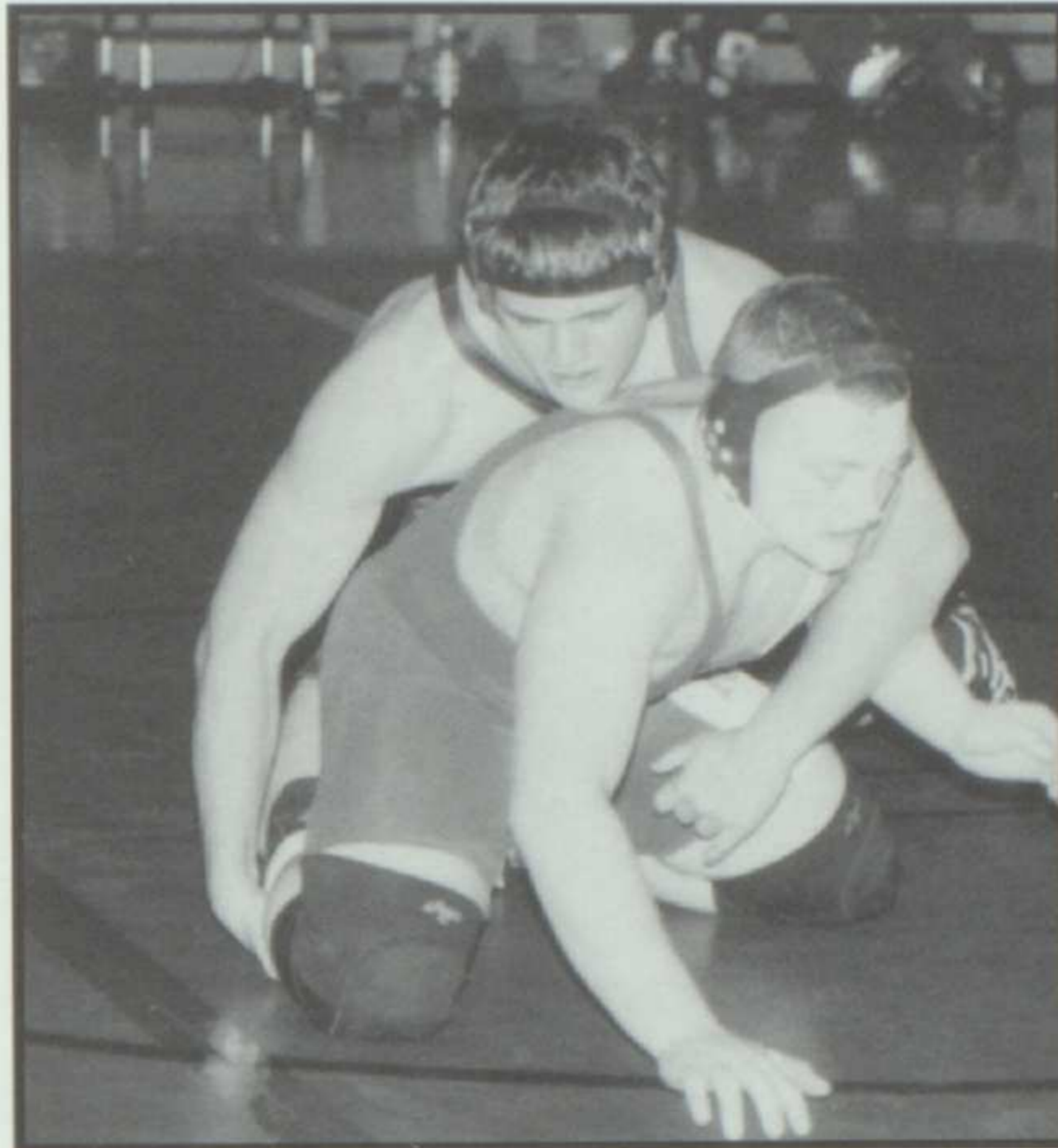

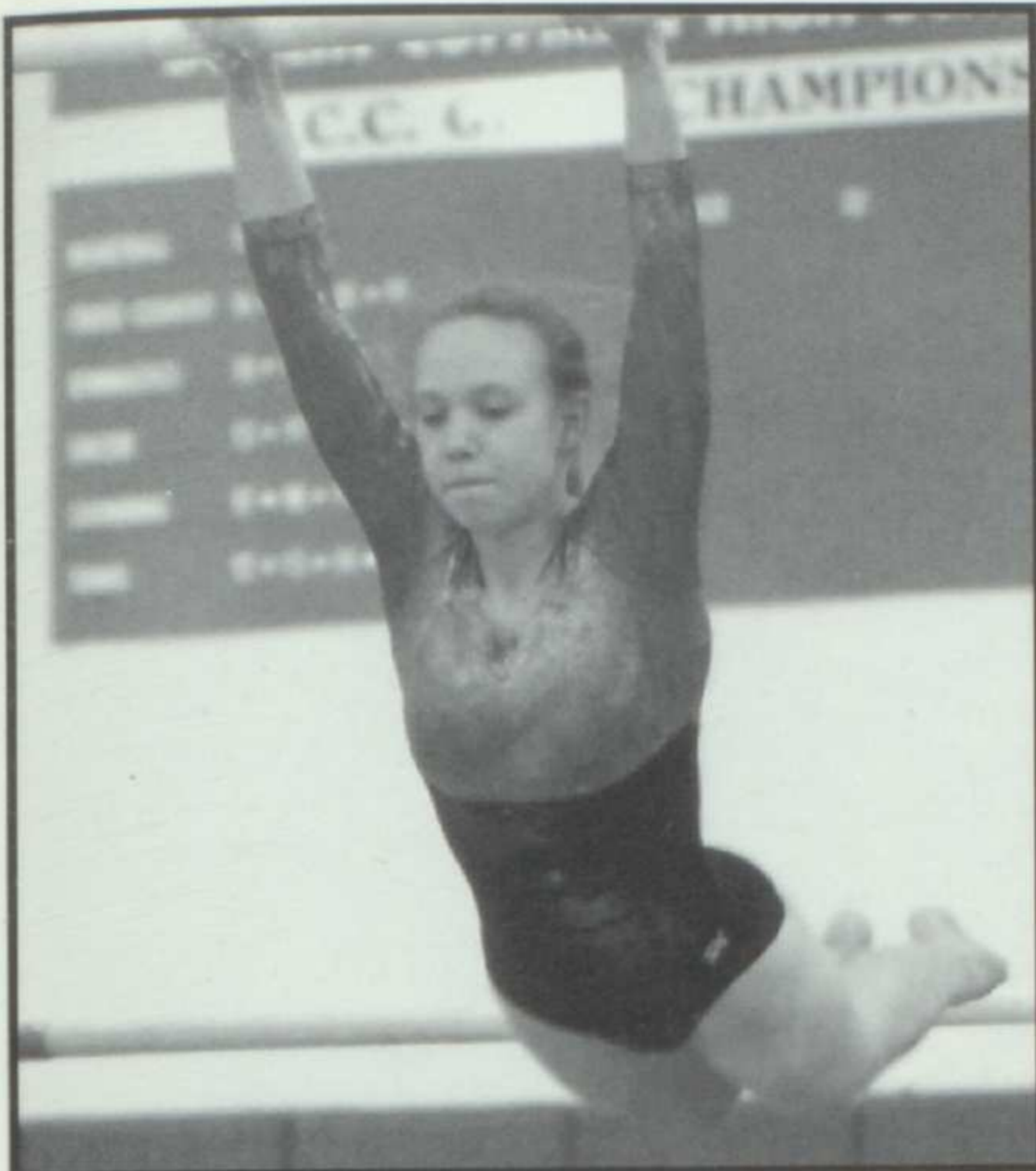

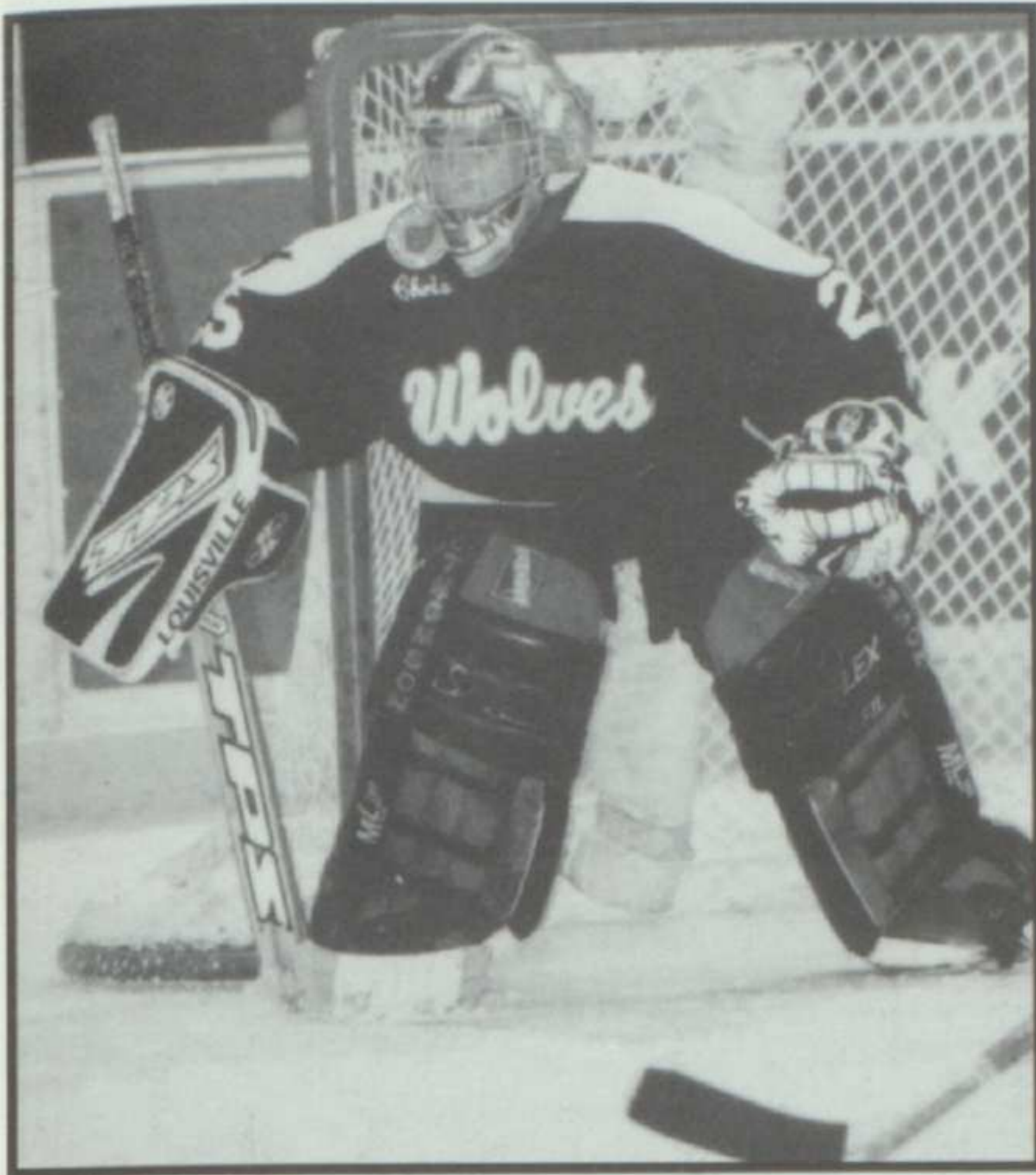

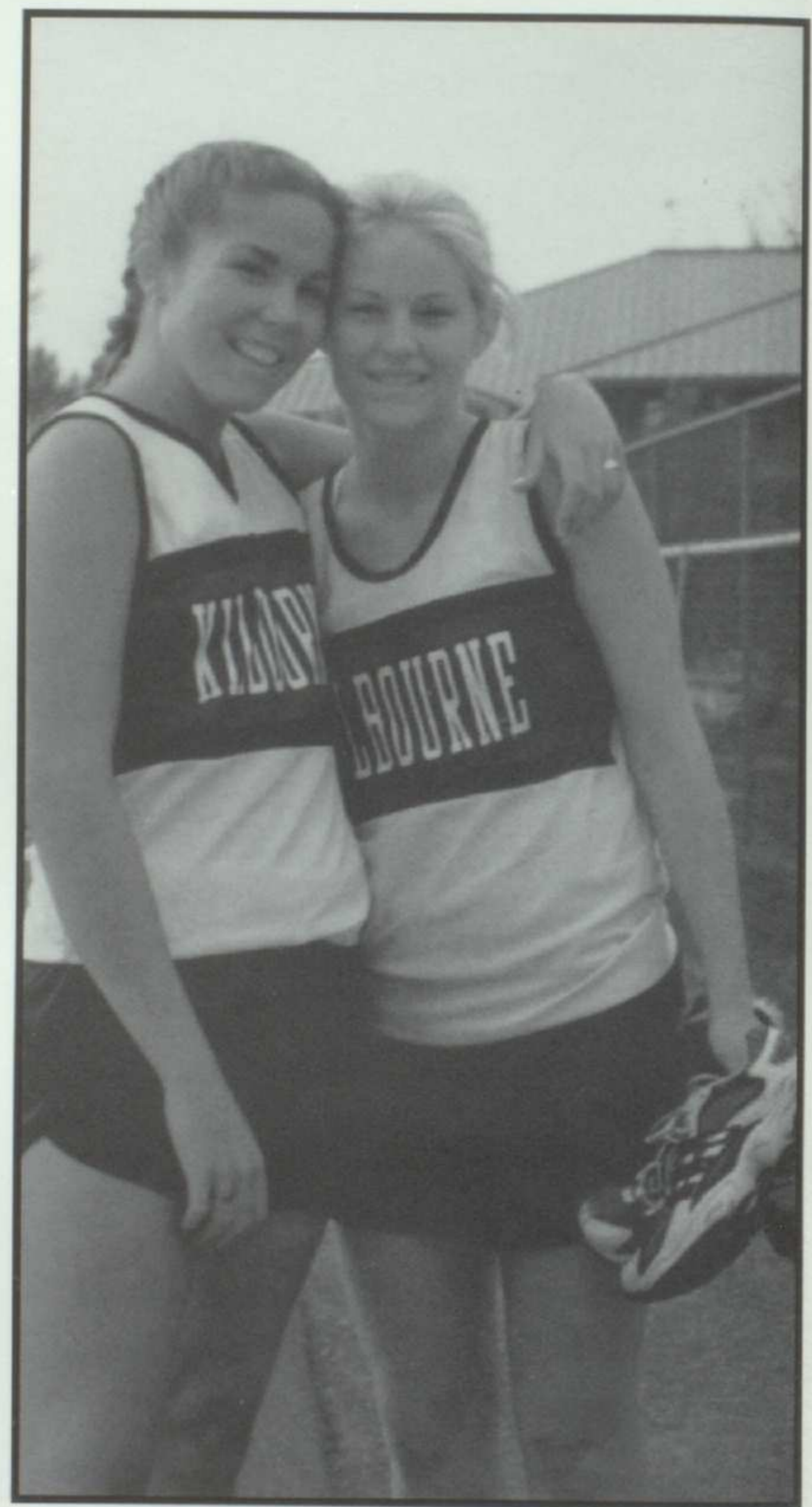
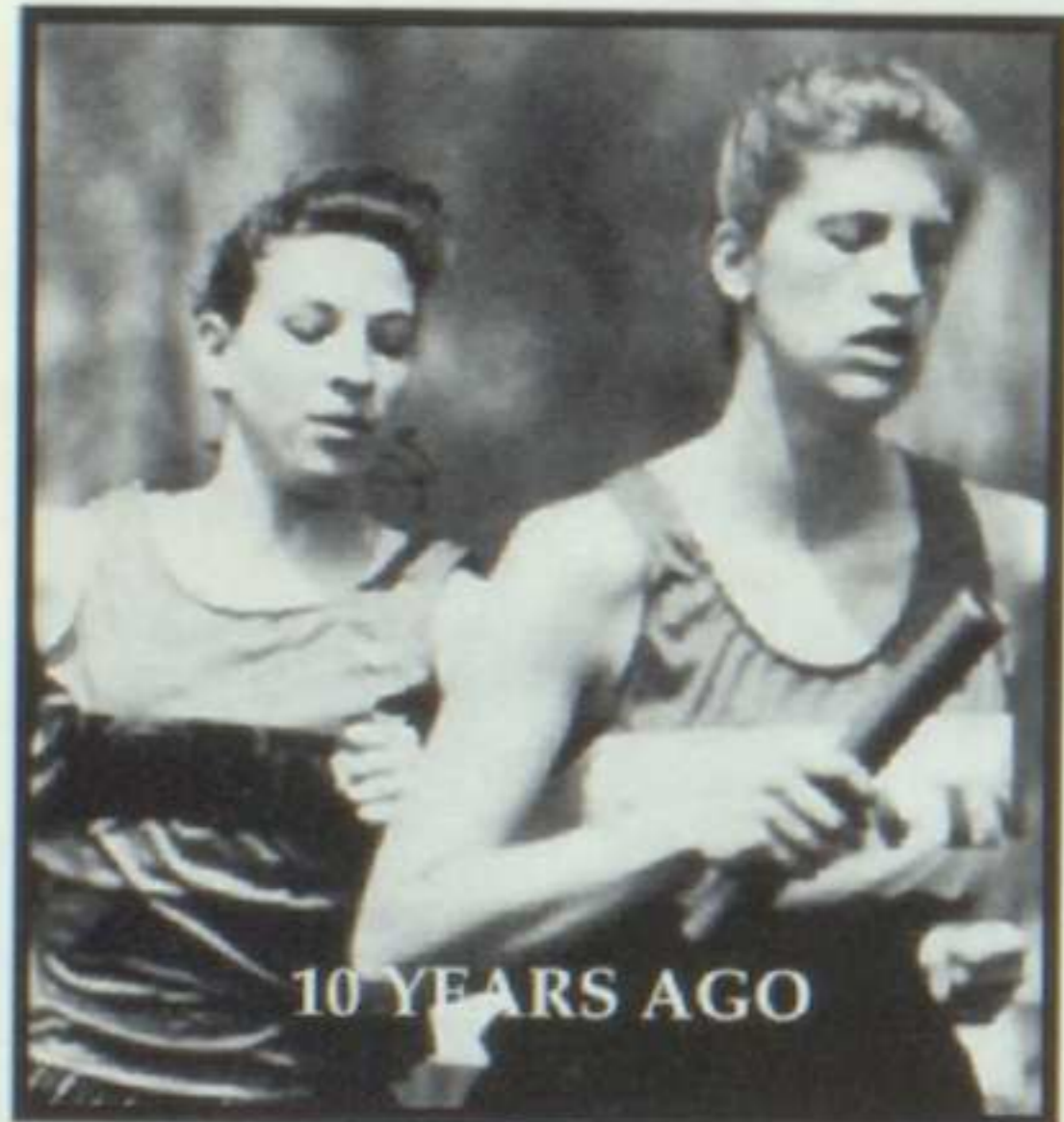
Senior and captain Kasie Dyer said, "I was really proud of the team and how far we came this year. It was a real improvement from last year, and I hope the success continues."

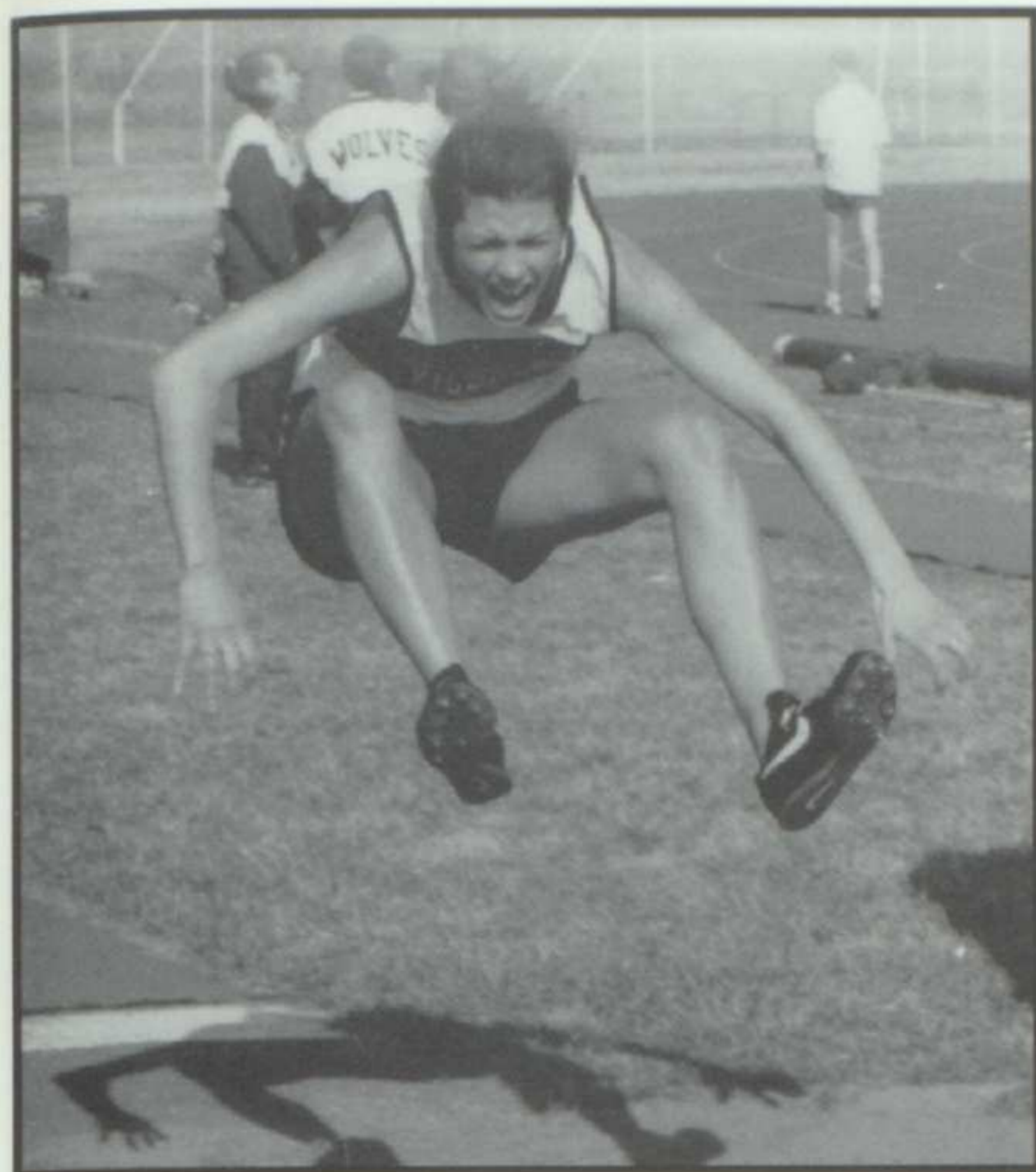

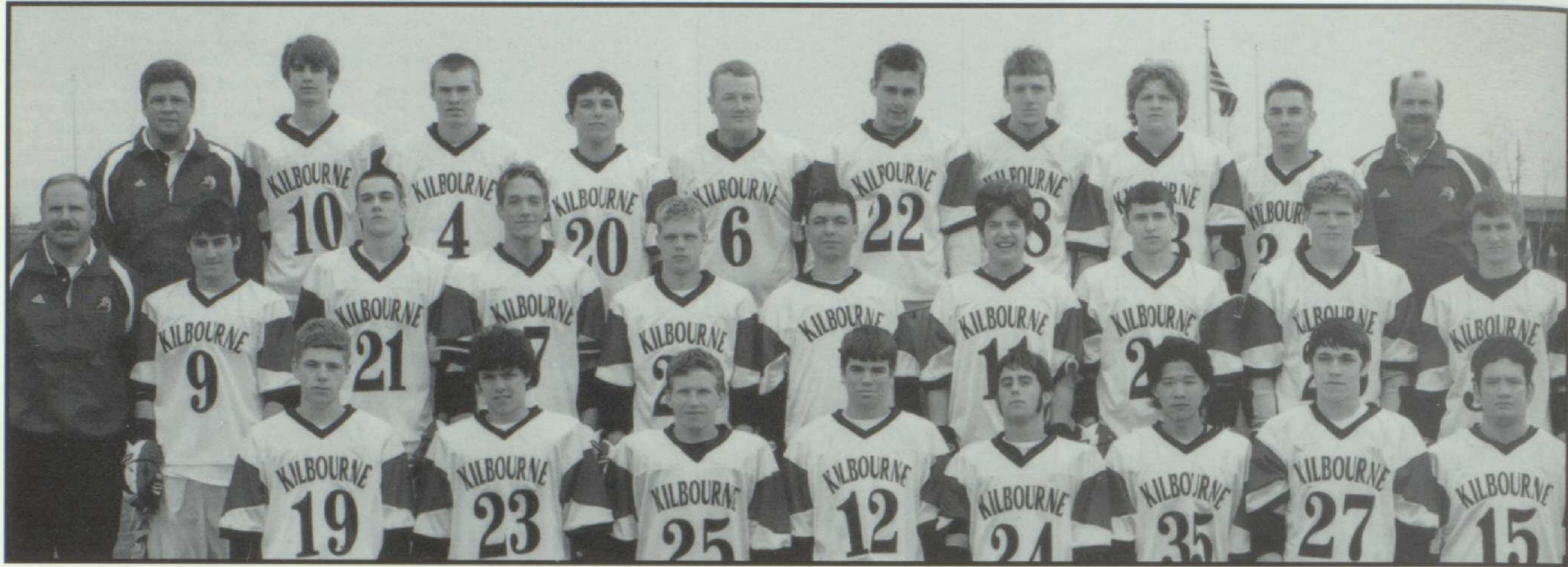

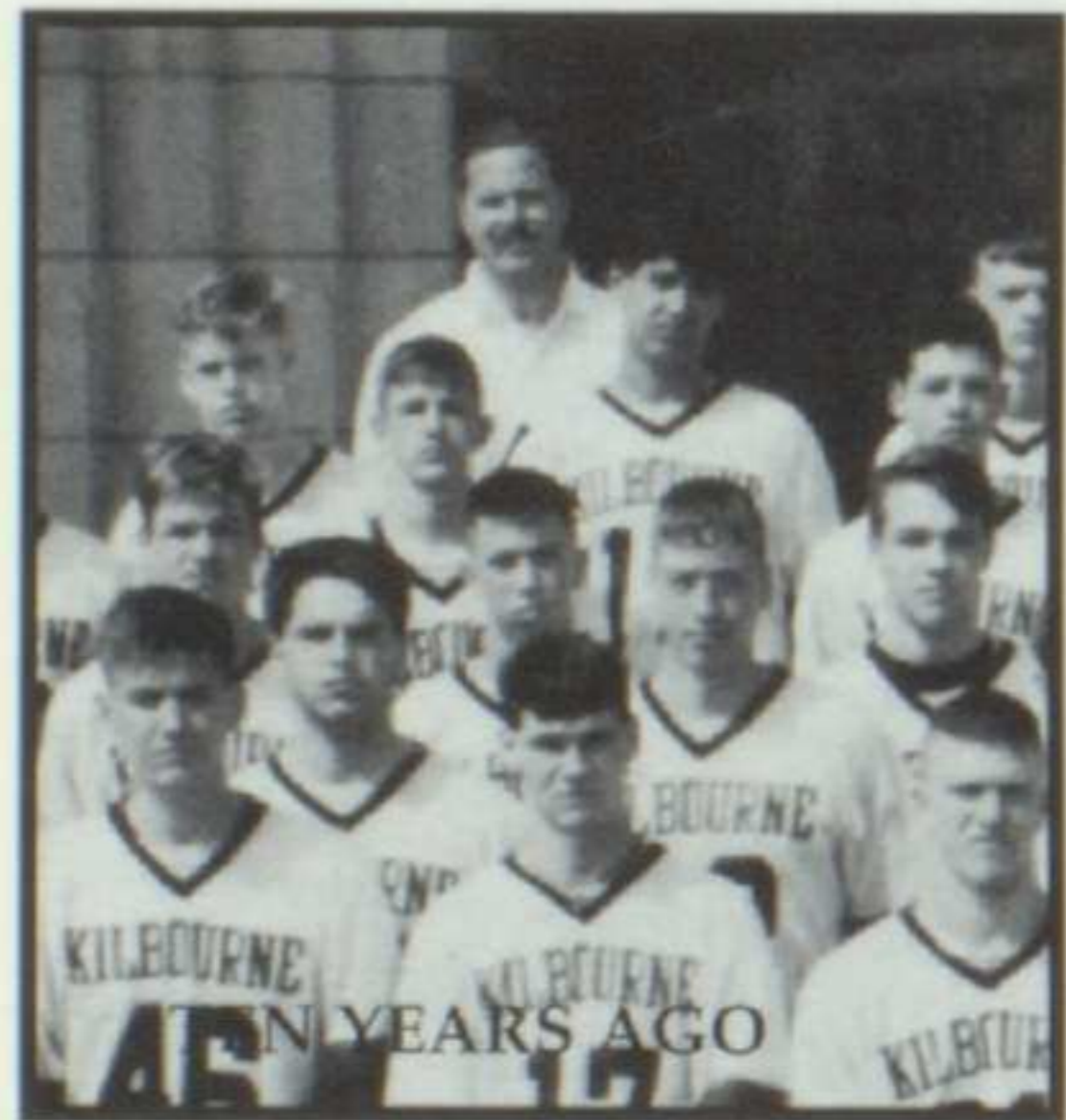

Stack, and Dustin Caldwell, will continue the excellence through their fine leadership.

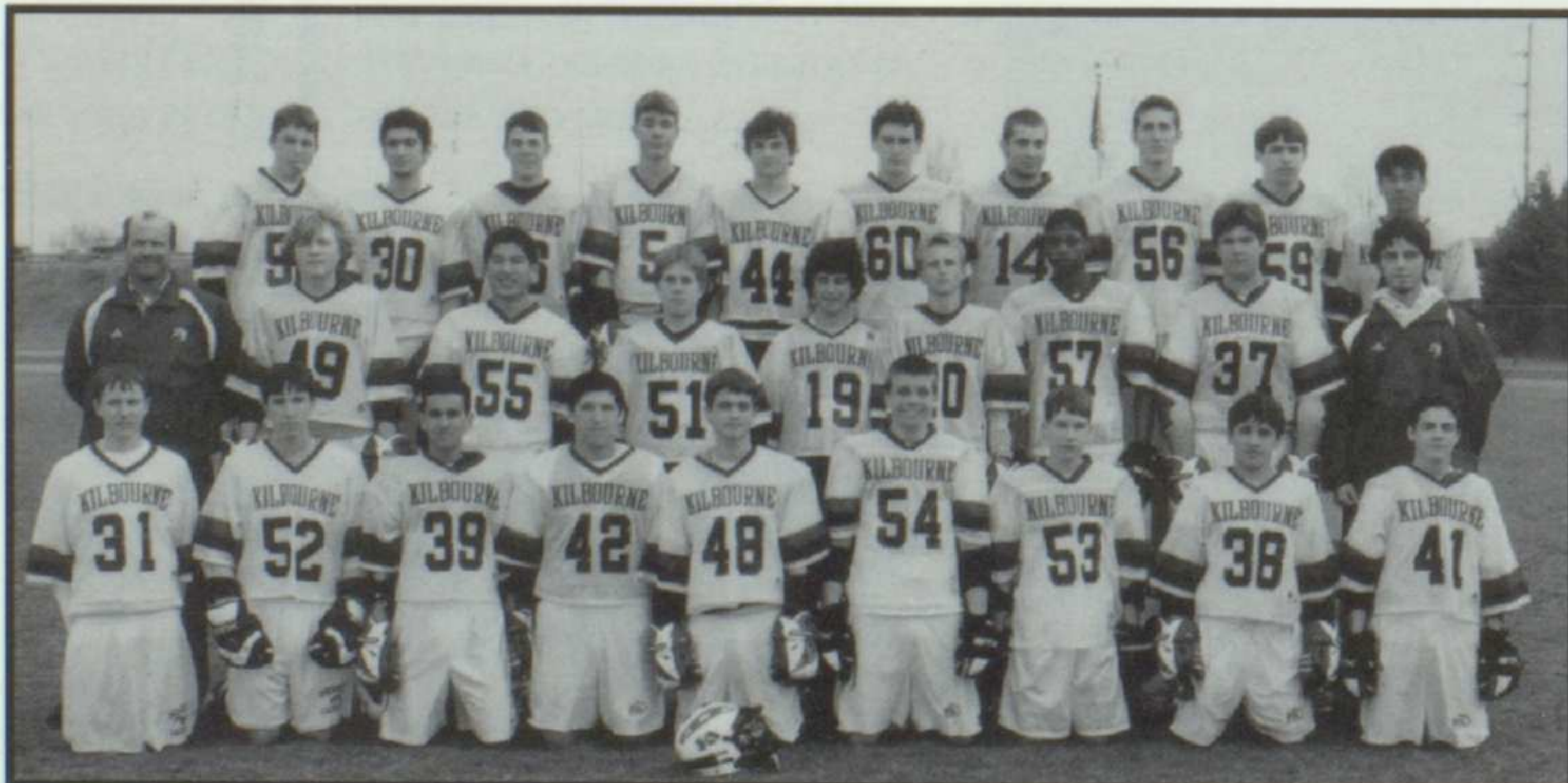

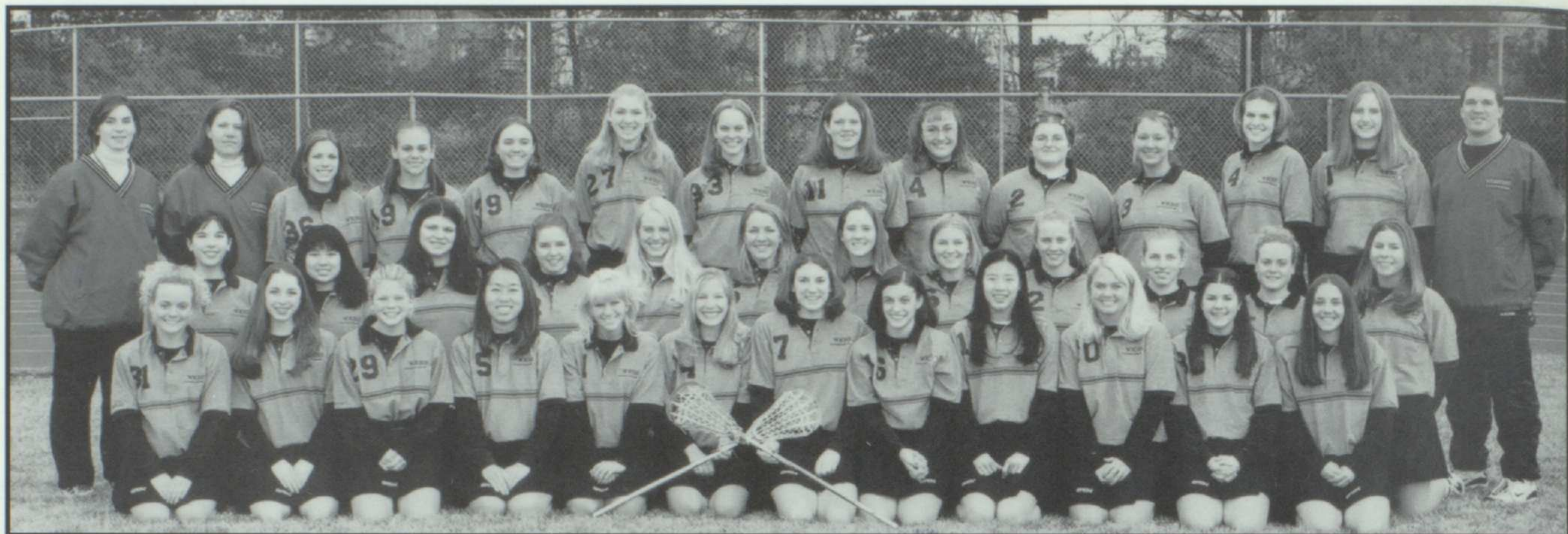

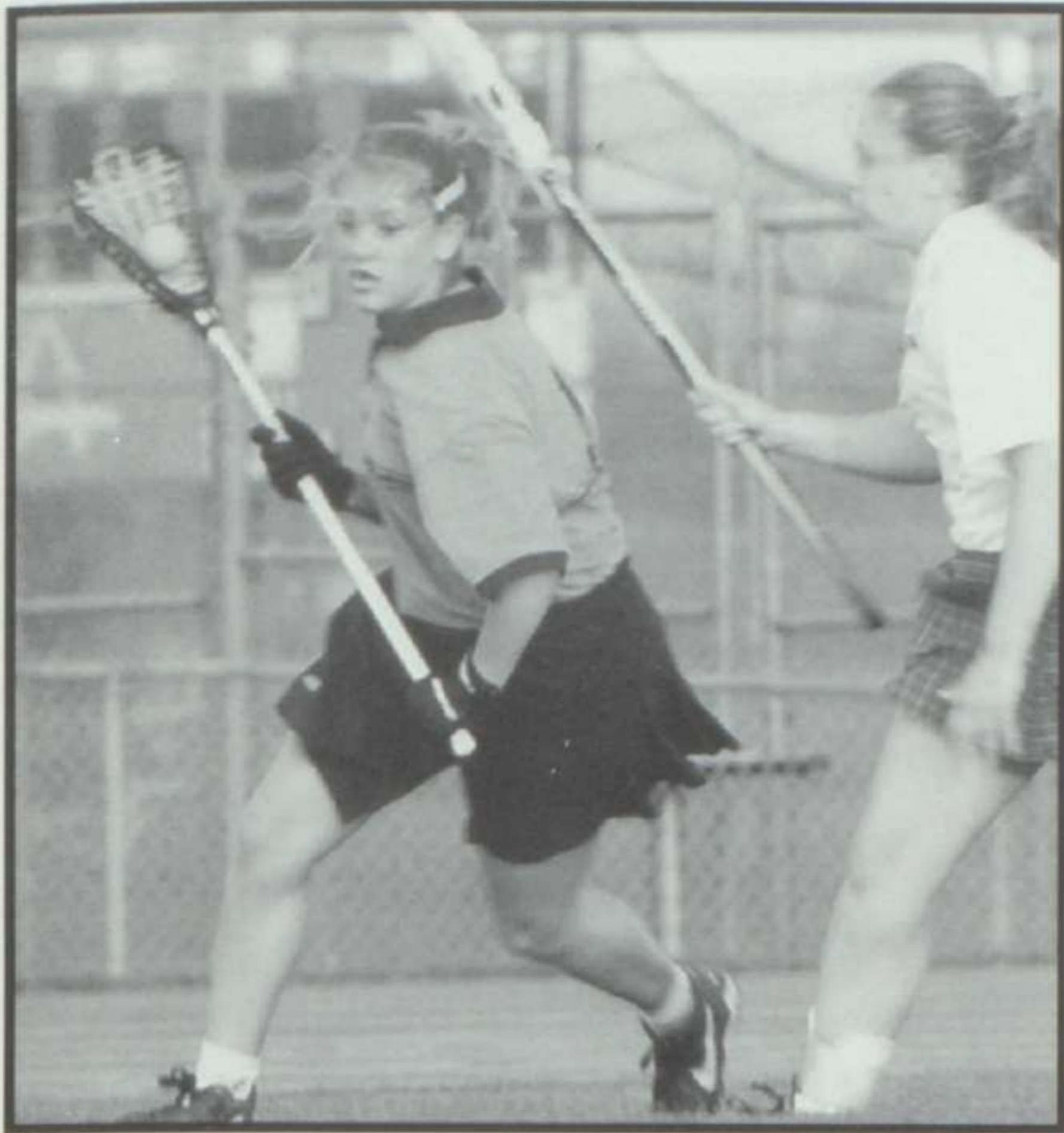

The team spent their spring break together in Cocoa Beach, Florida. Here they played many games to gain needed experience while they had a great time as well. They proved

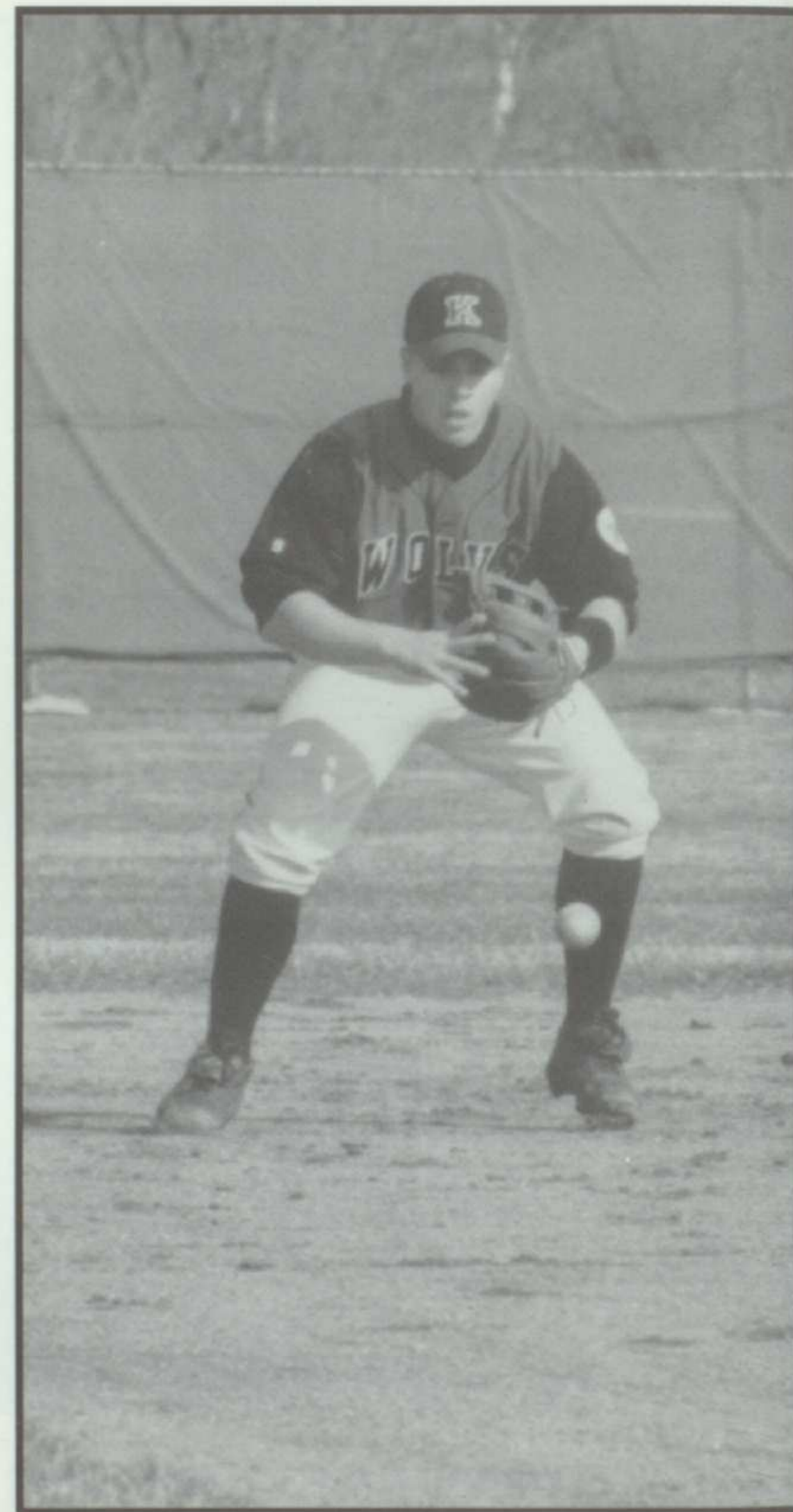
themselves by winning four out of the five games played. This was a great accomplishment; hopefully, they will finish just as well next spring break!

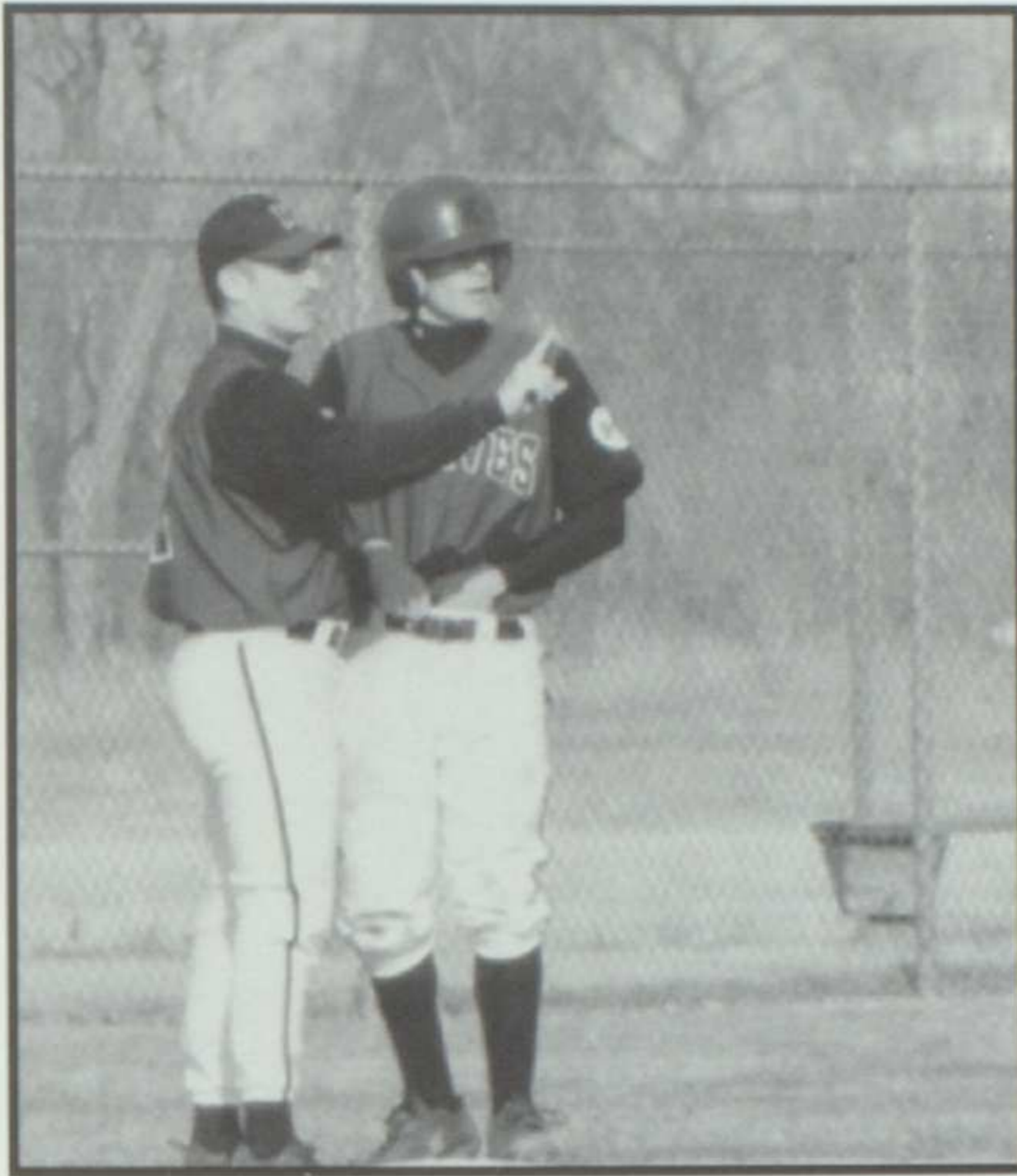

Although the team's win/loss record was not as successful as they had hoped, the players worked hard, played hard, and learned together as a team.

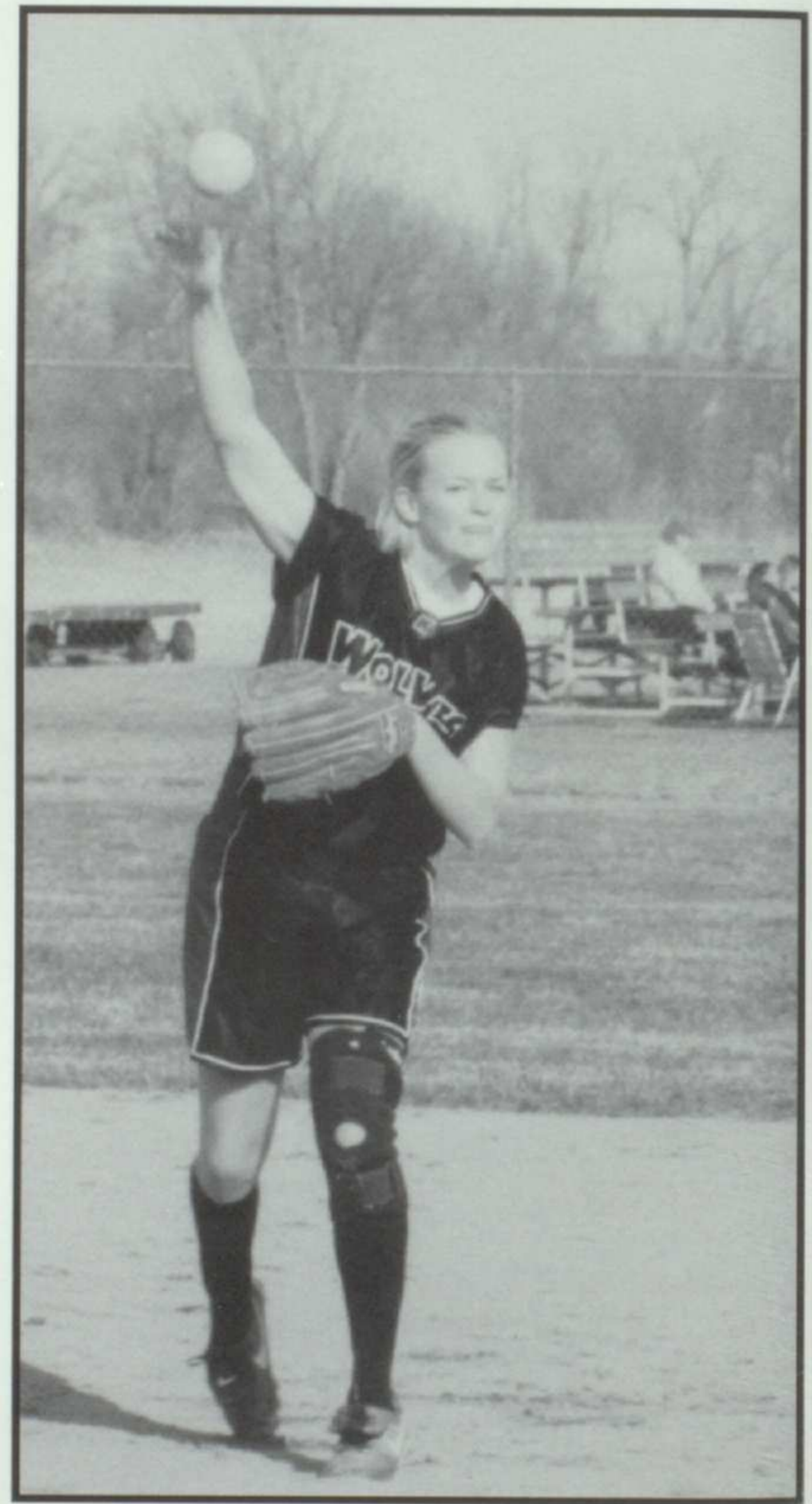
The seniors Jessie Toney, Alyssa Franks, Jodi Metzimir and Julie Mearhoff were central to establishing the cohesiveness of the whole group.

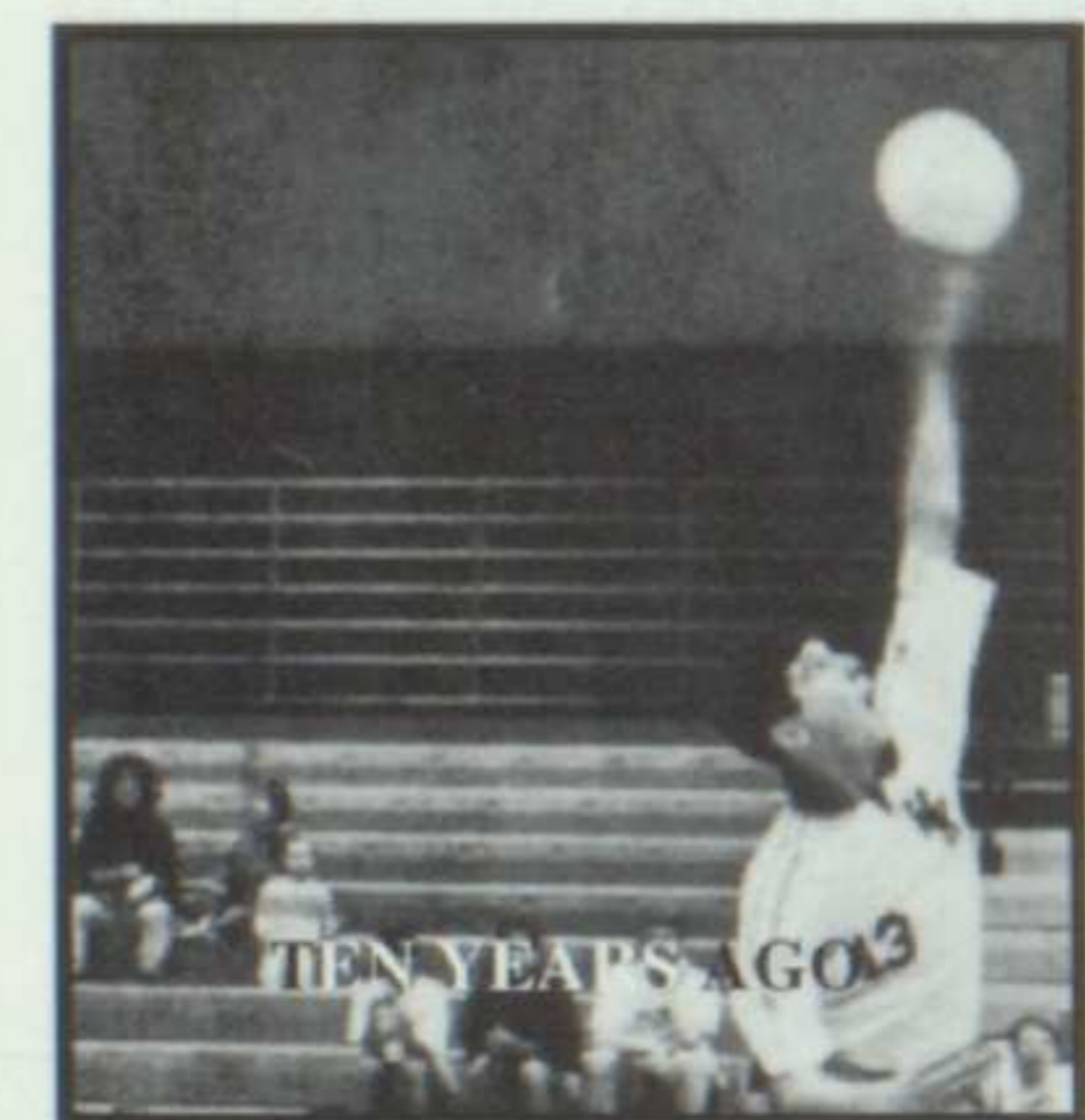

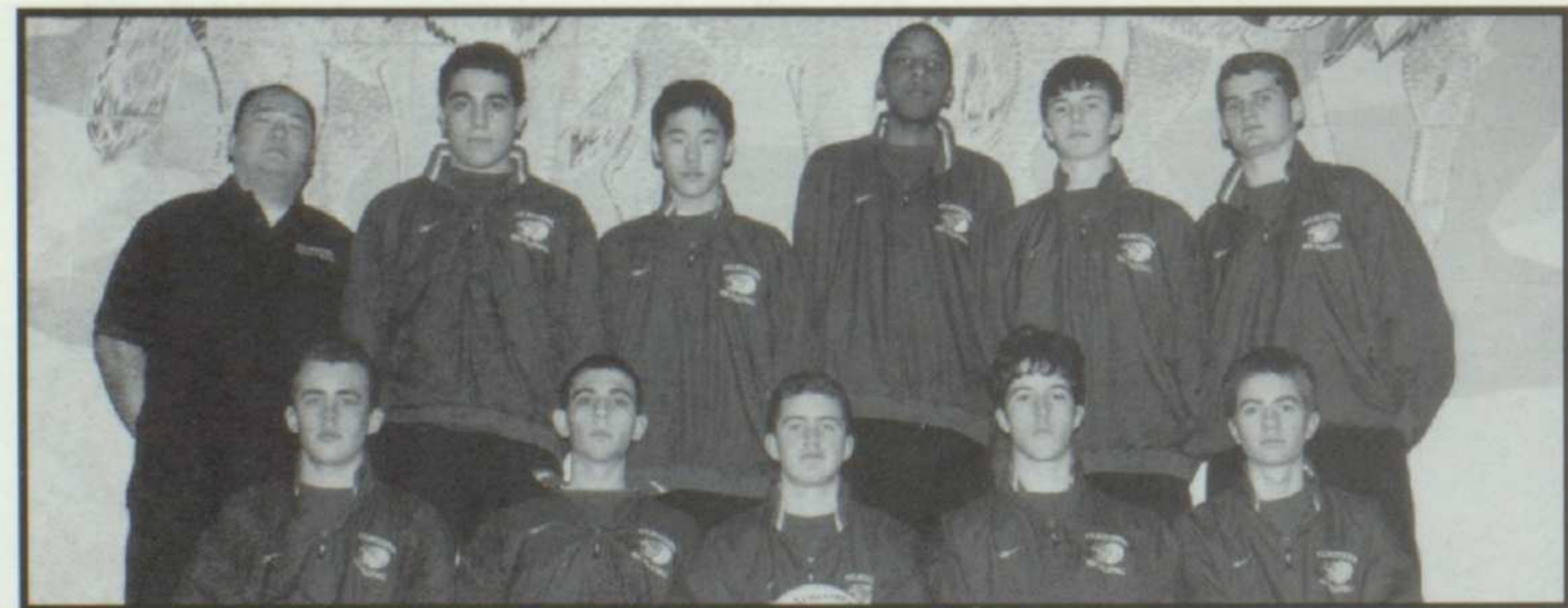

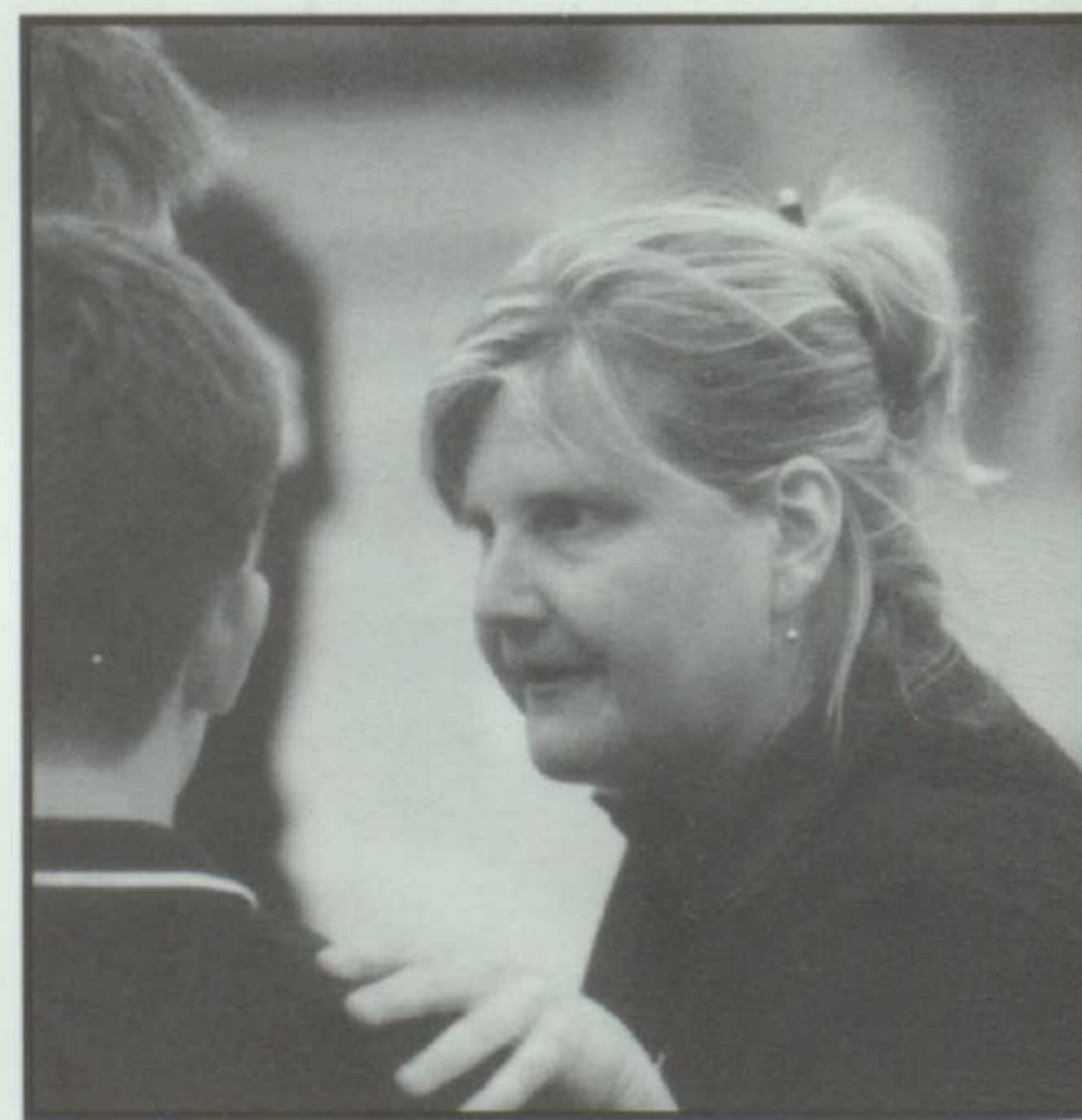

coach's demands, we should do well.” The other two captains next year are Kyle Zink and Brian Elsea.

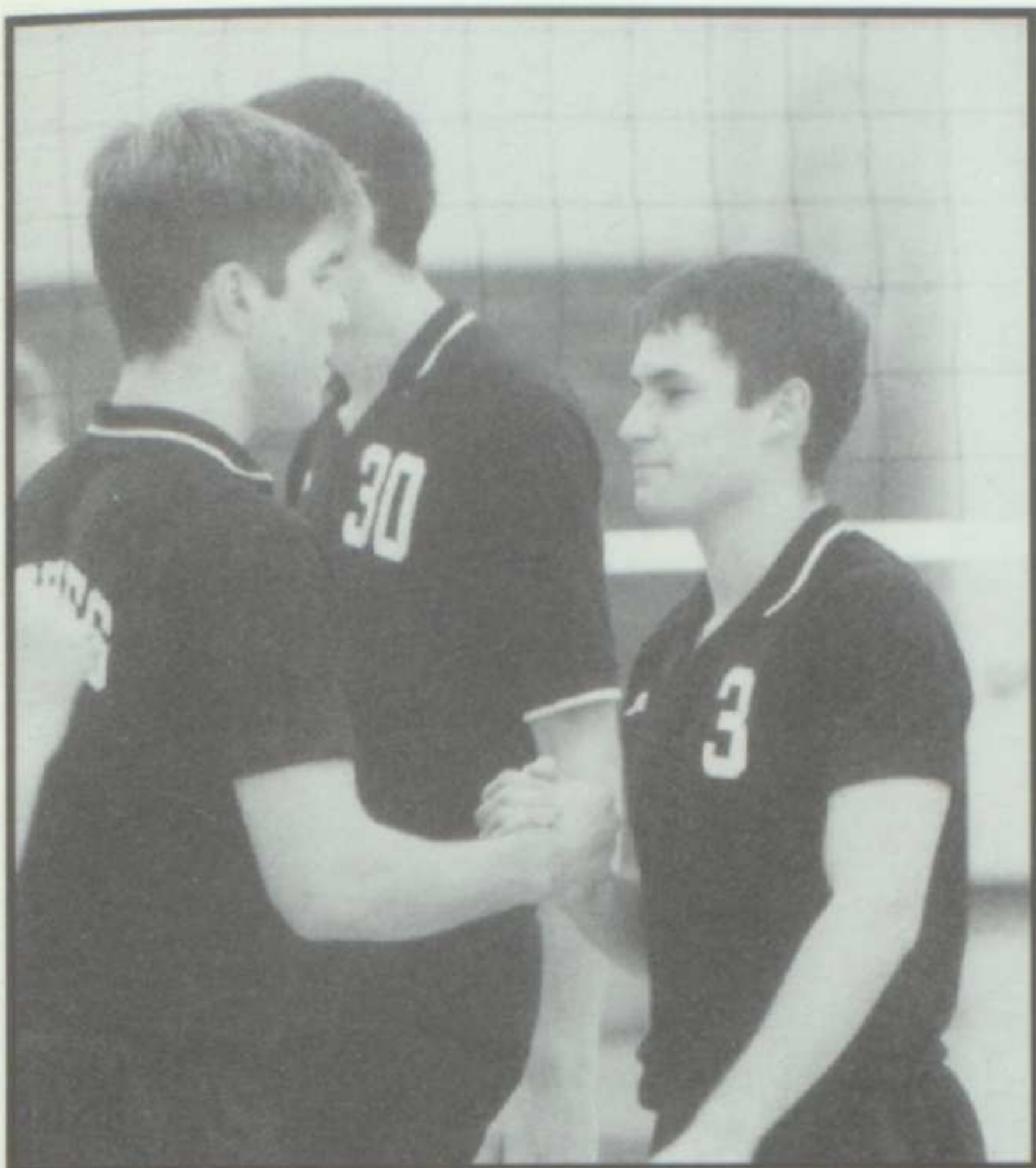

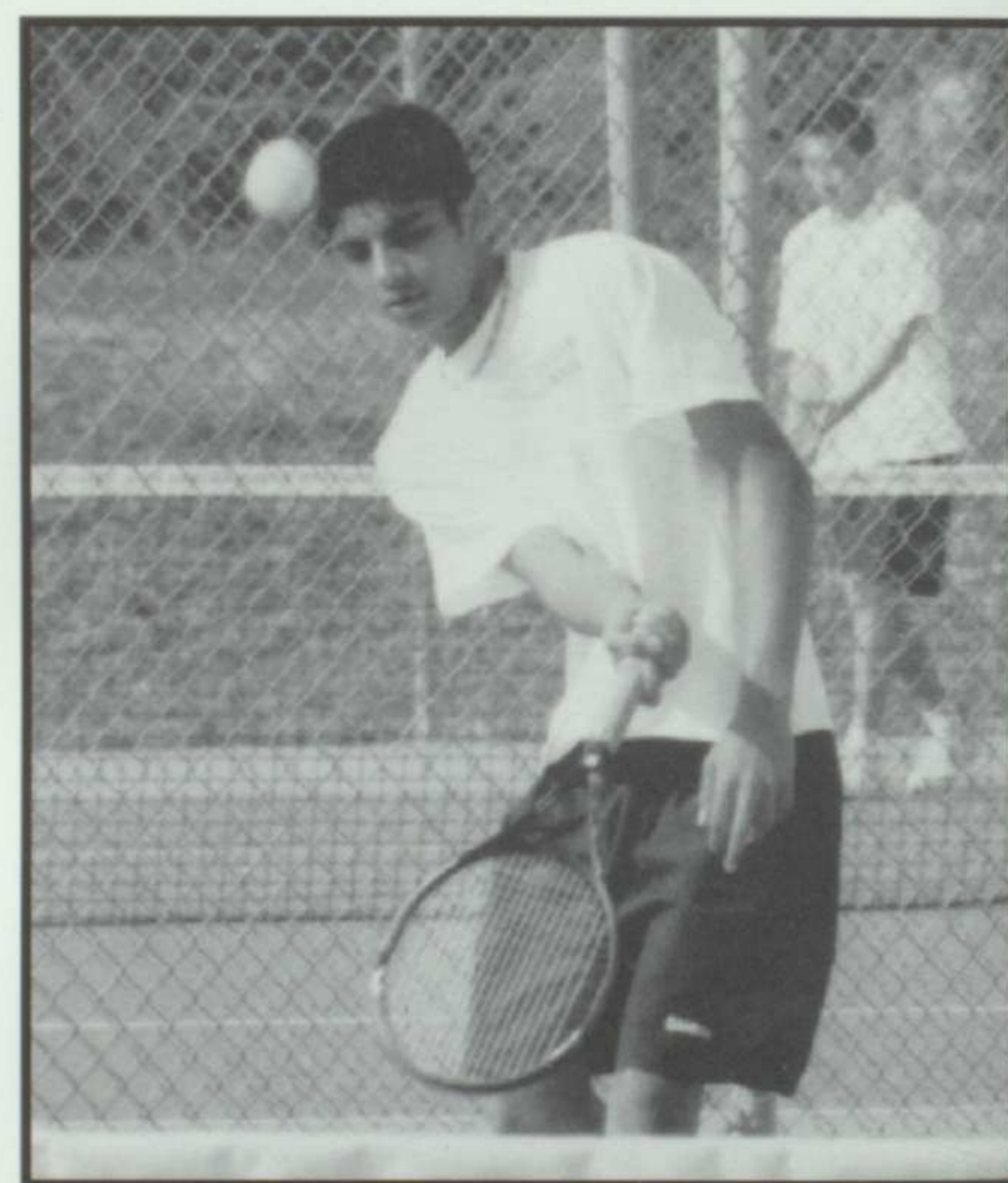
Play opened well with a win over Upper Arling-

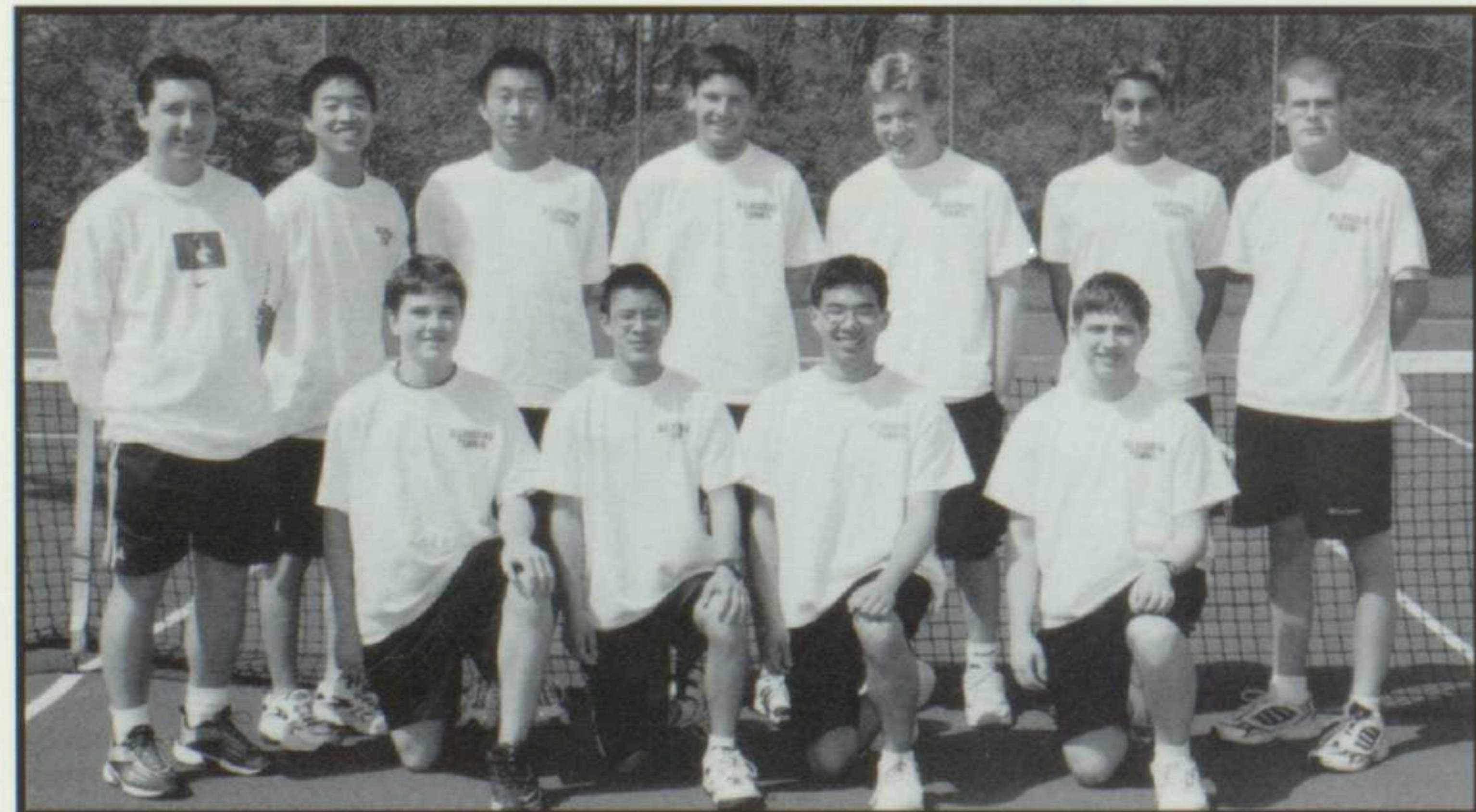

work as well as the talent left on the team, anything is possible." Good luck next year, boys!

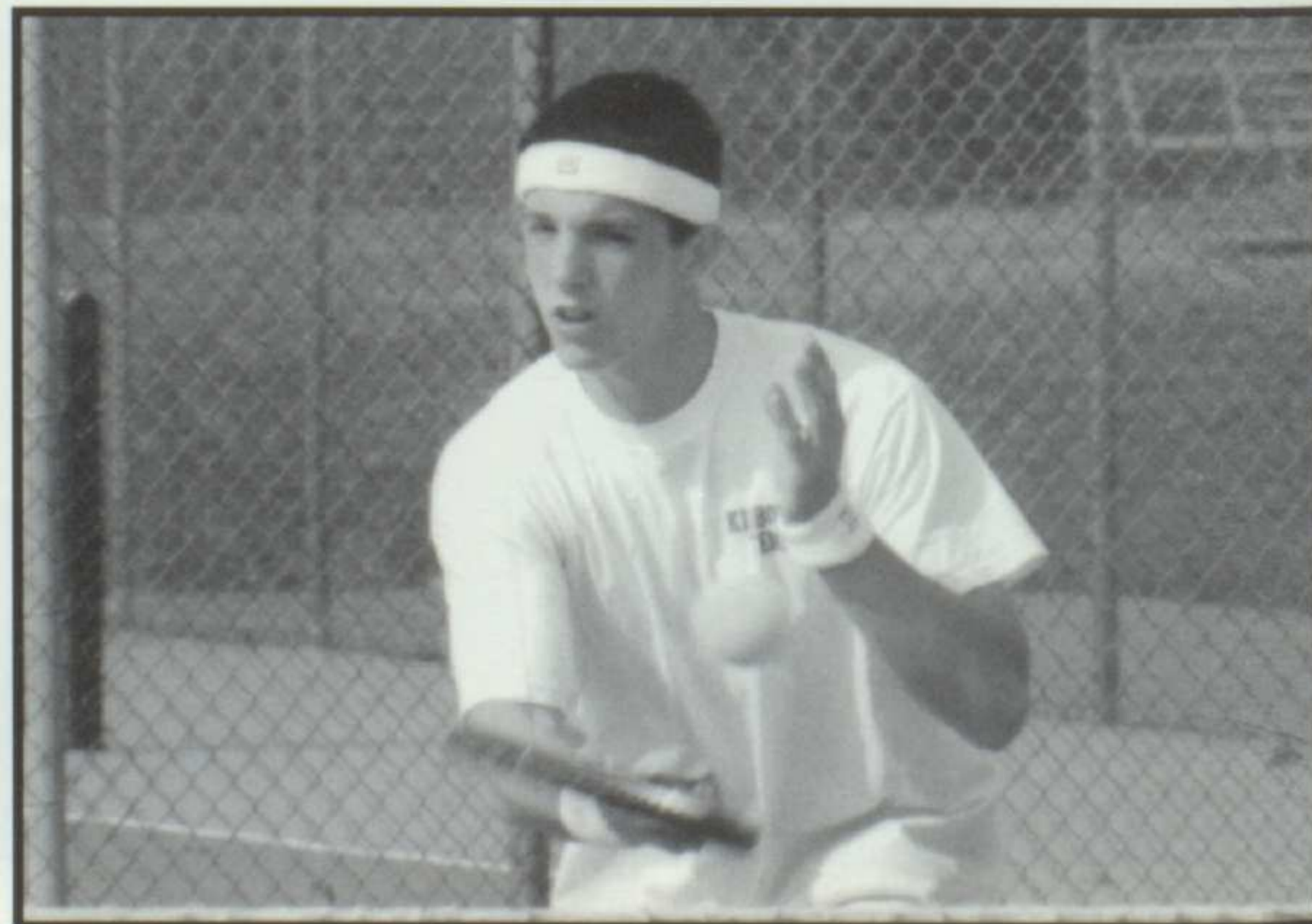

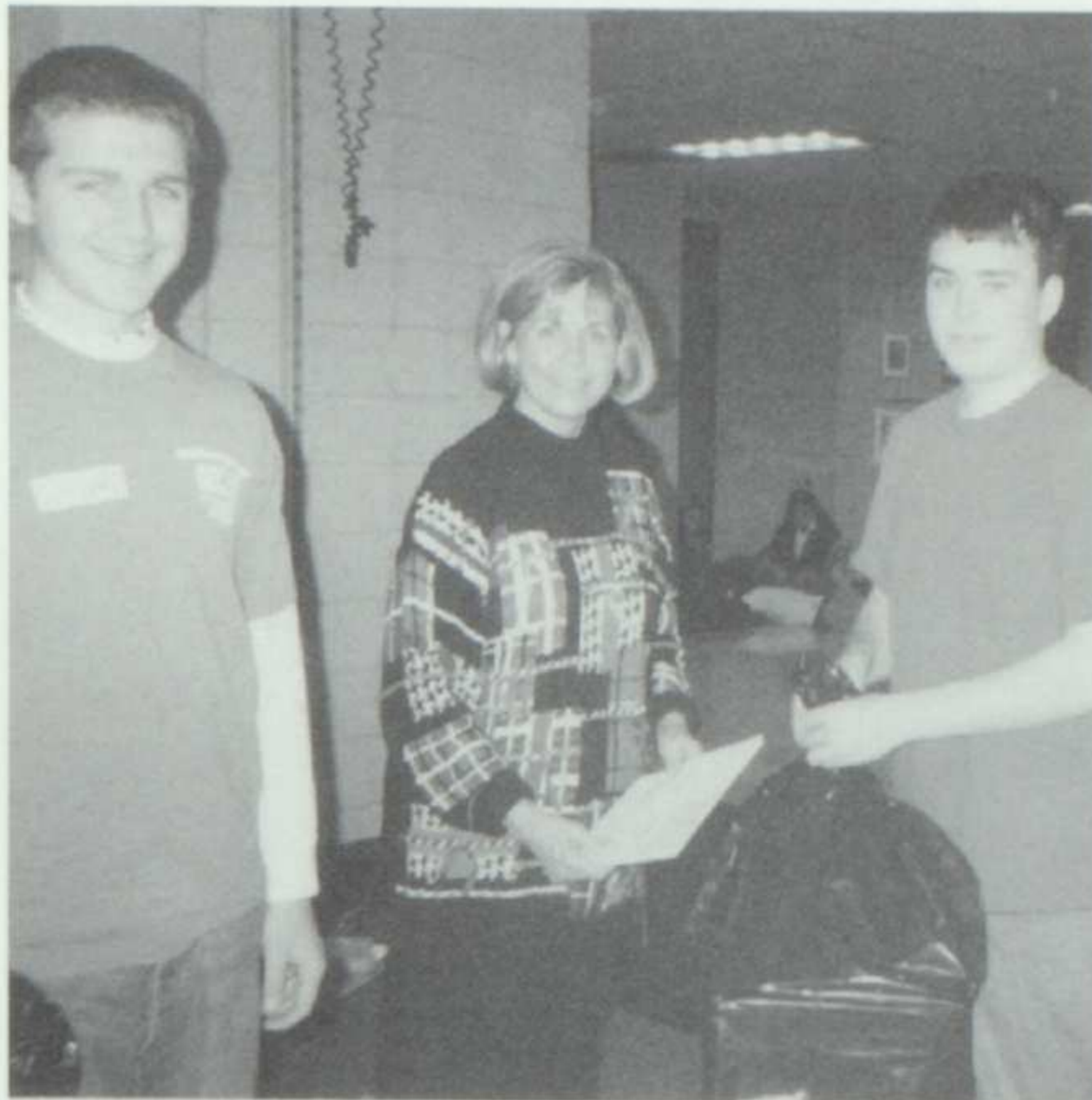

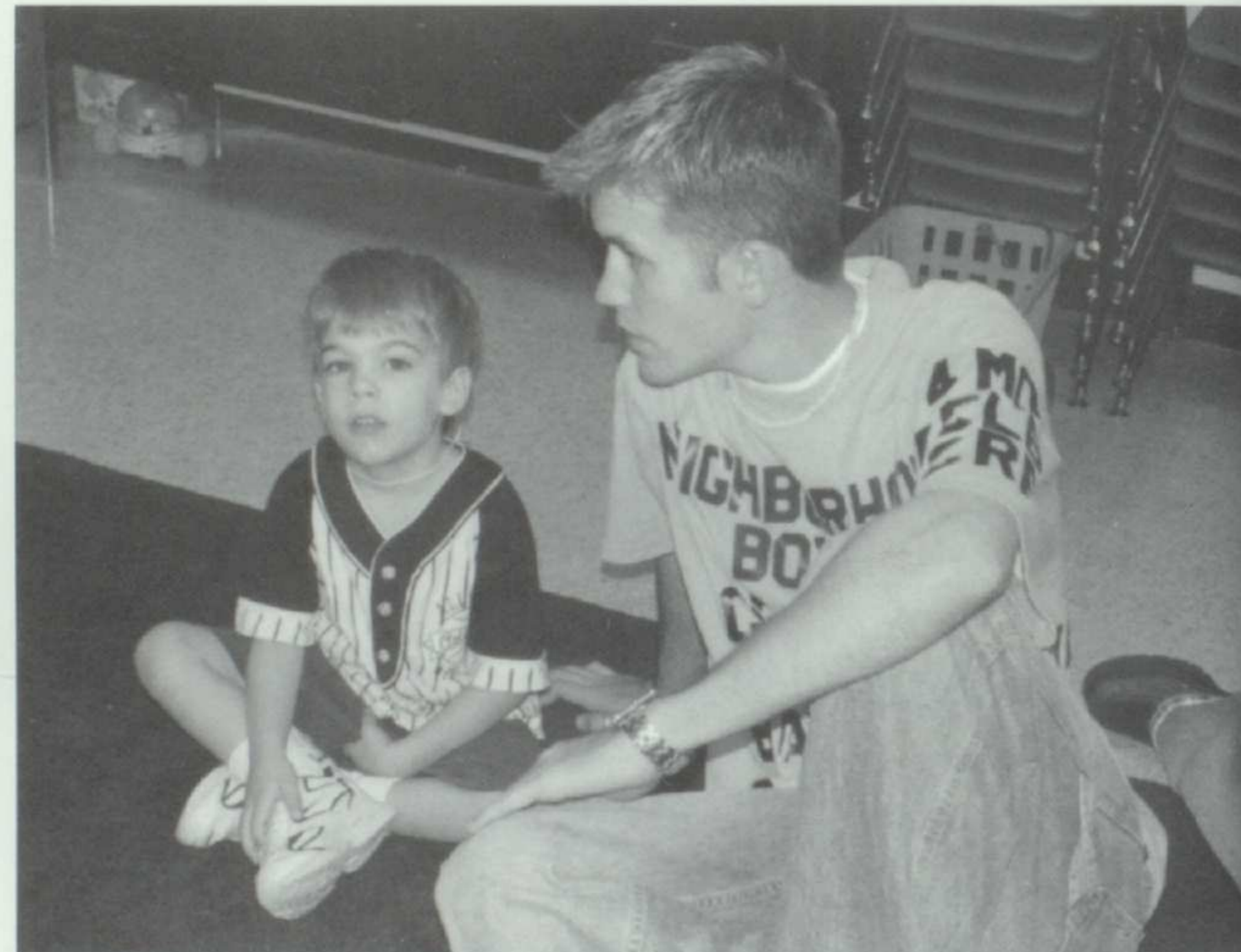

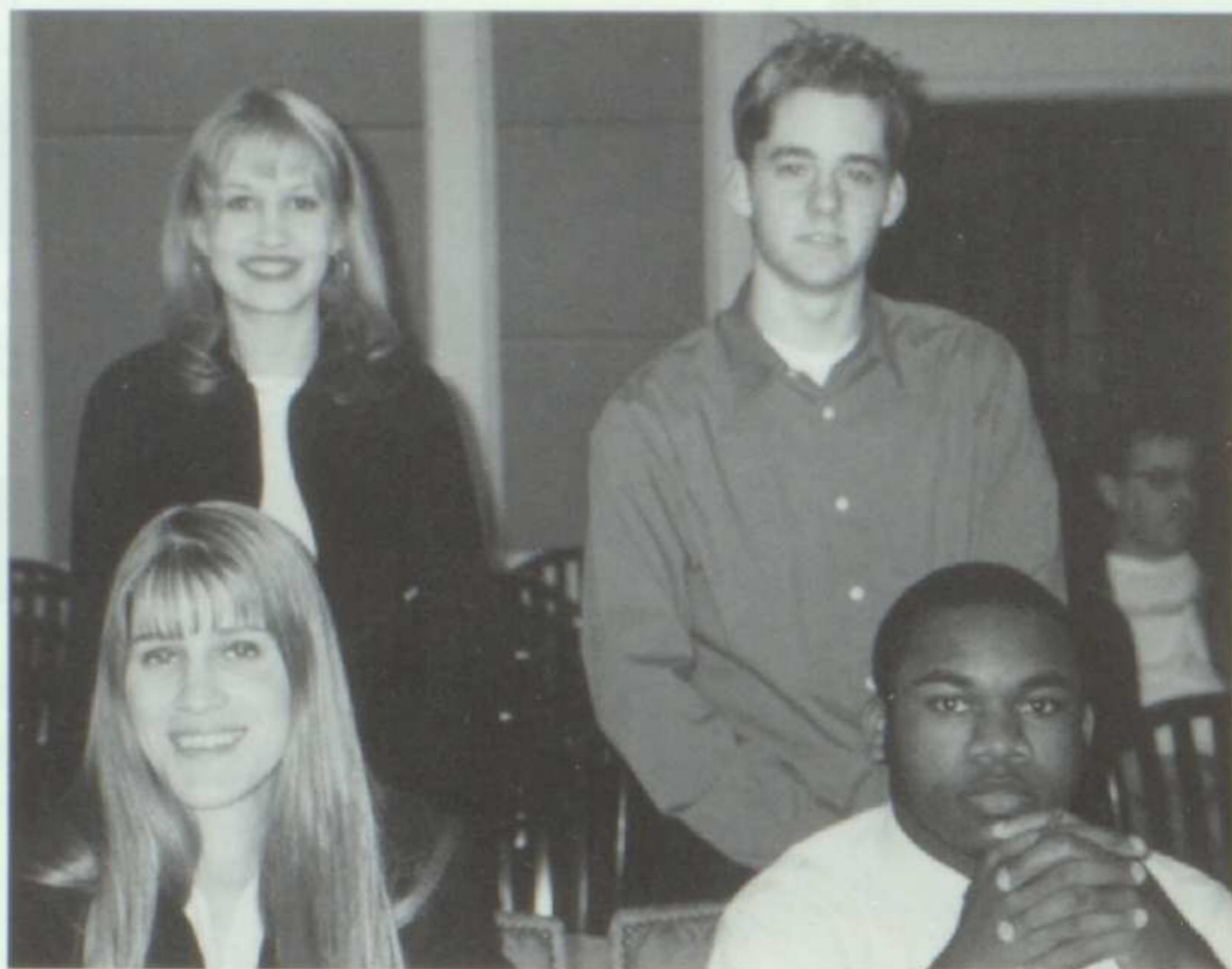

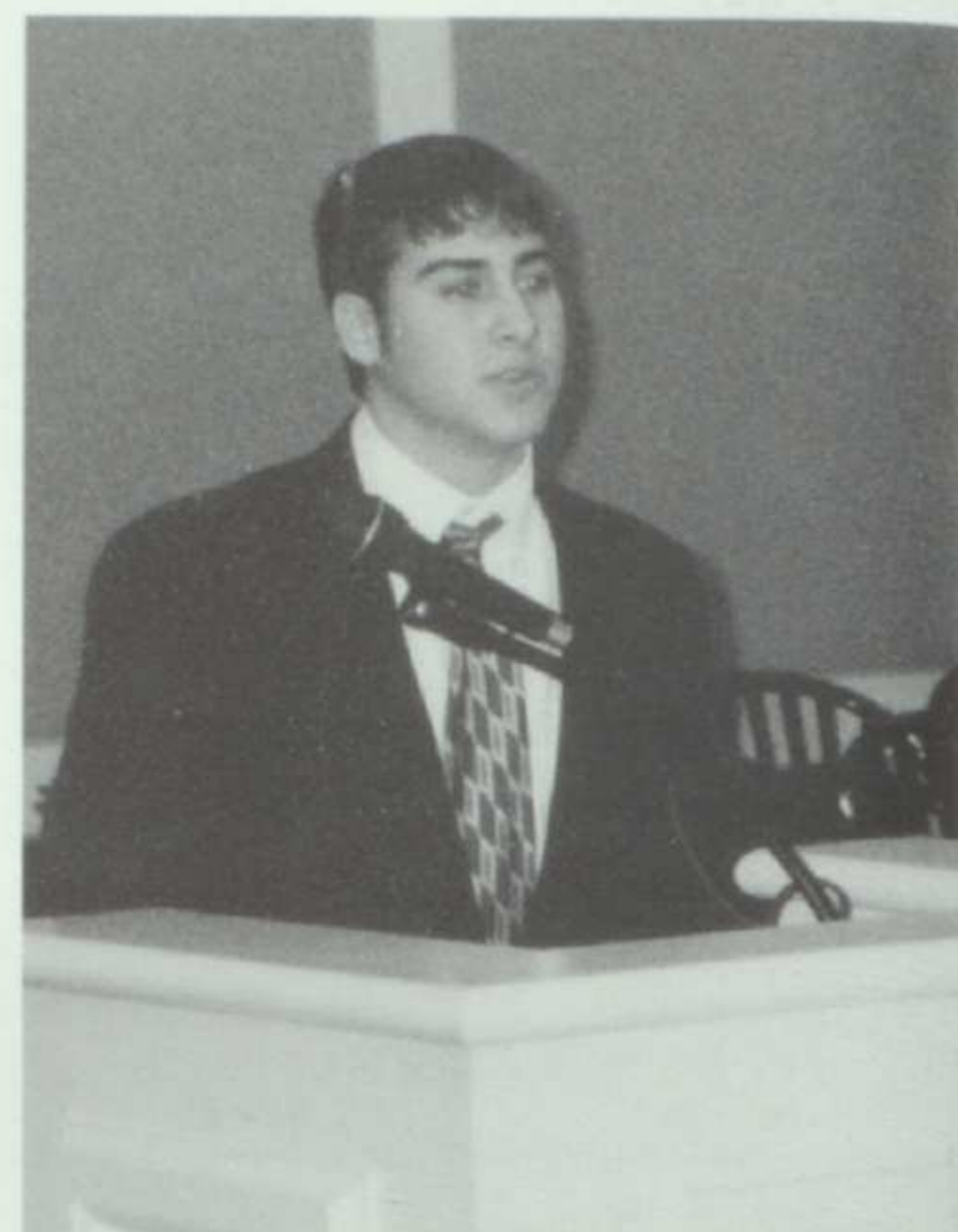

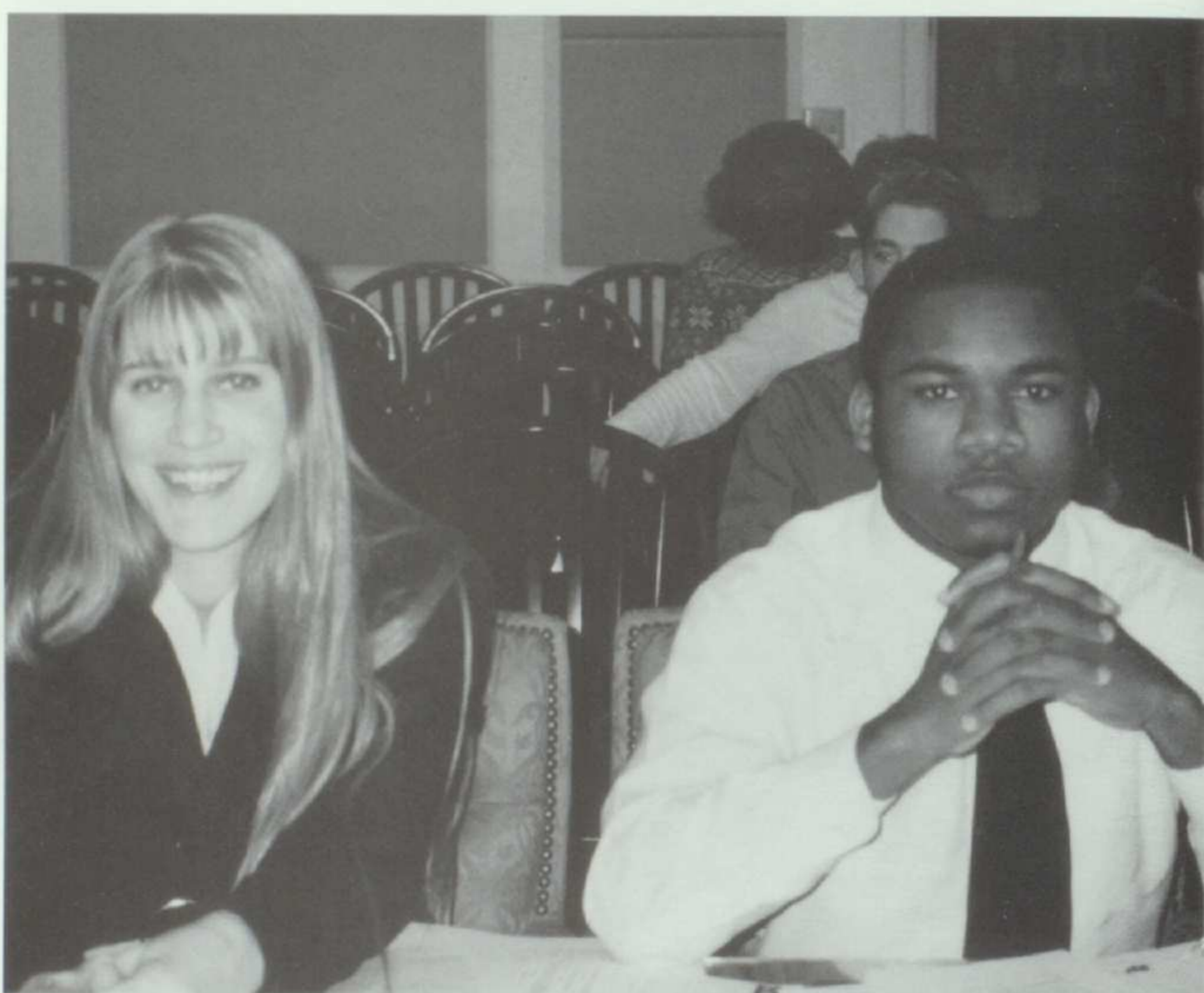

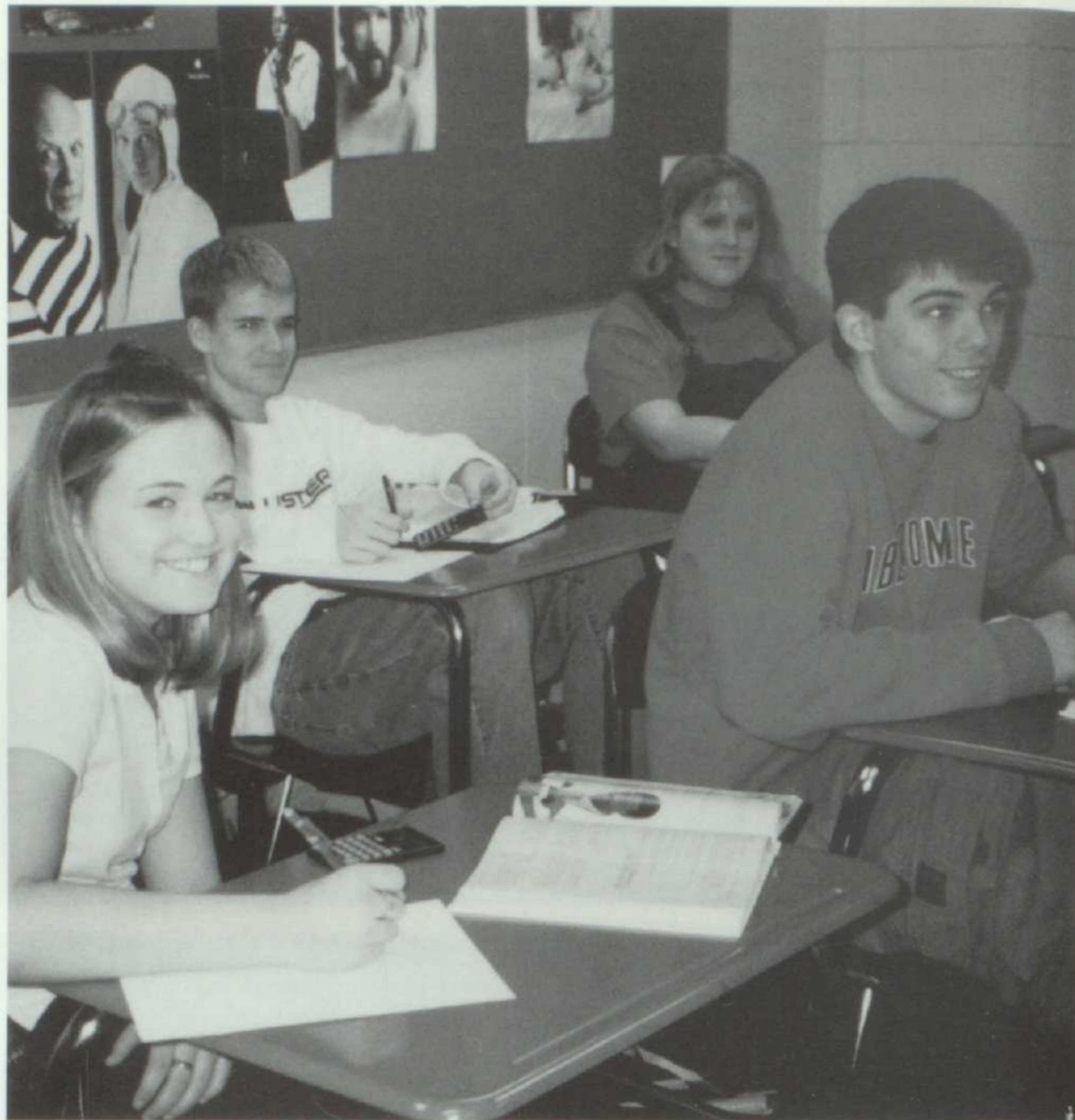

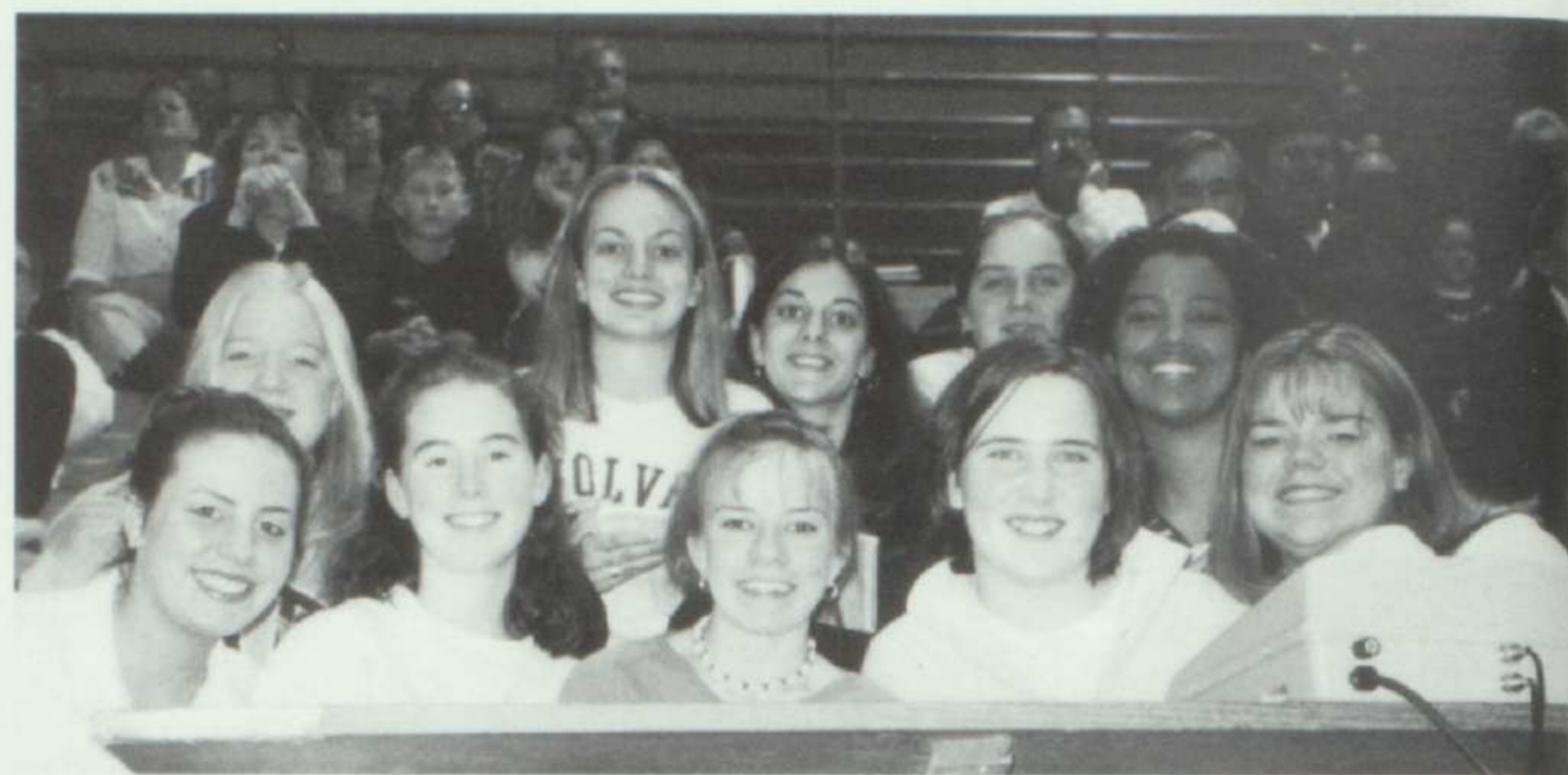

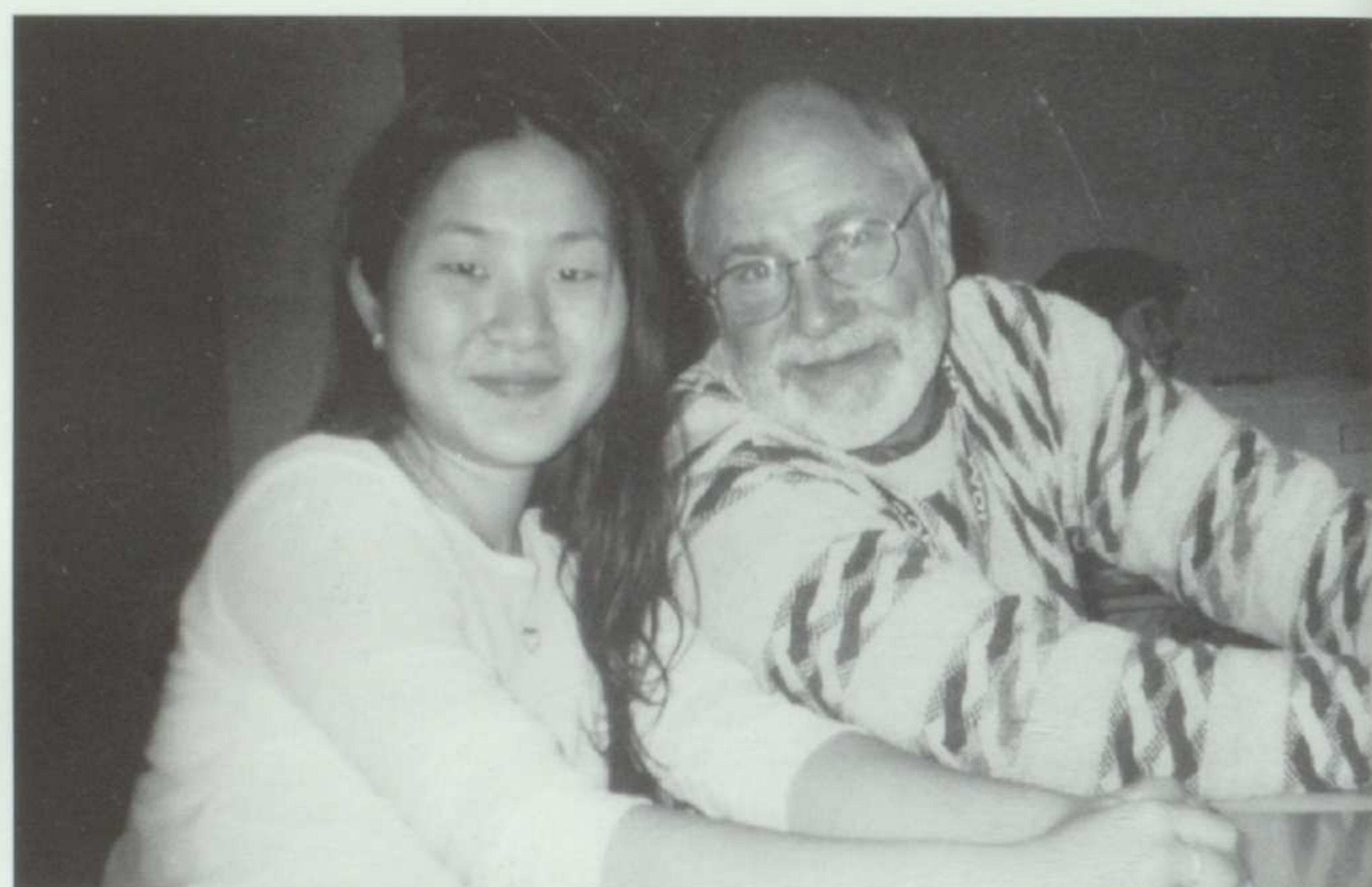

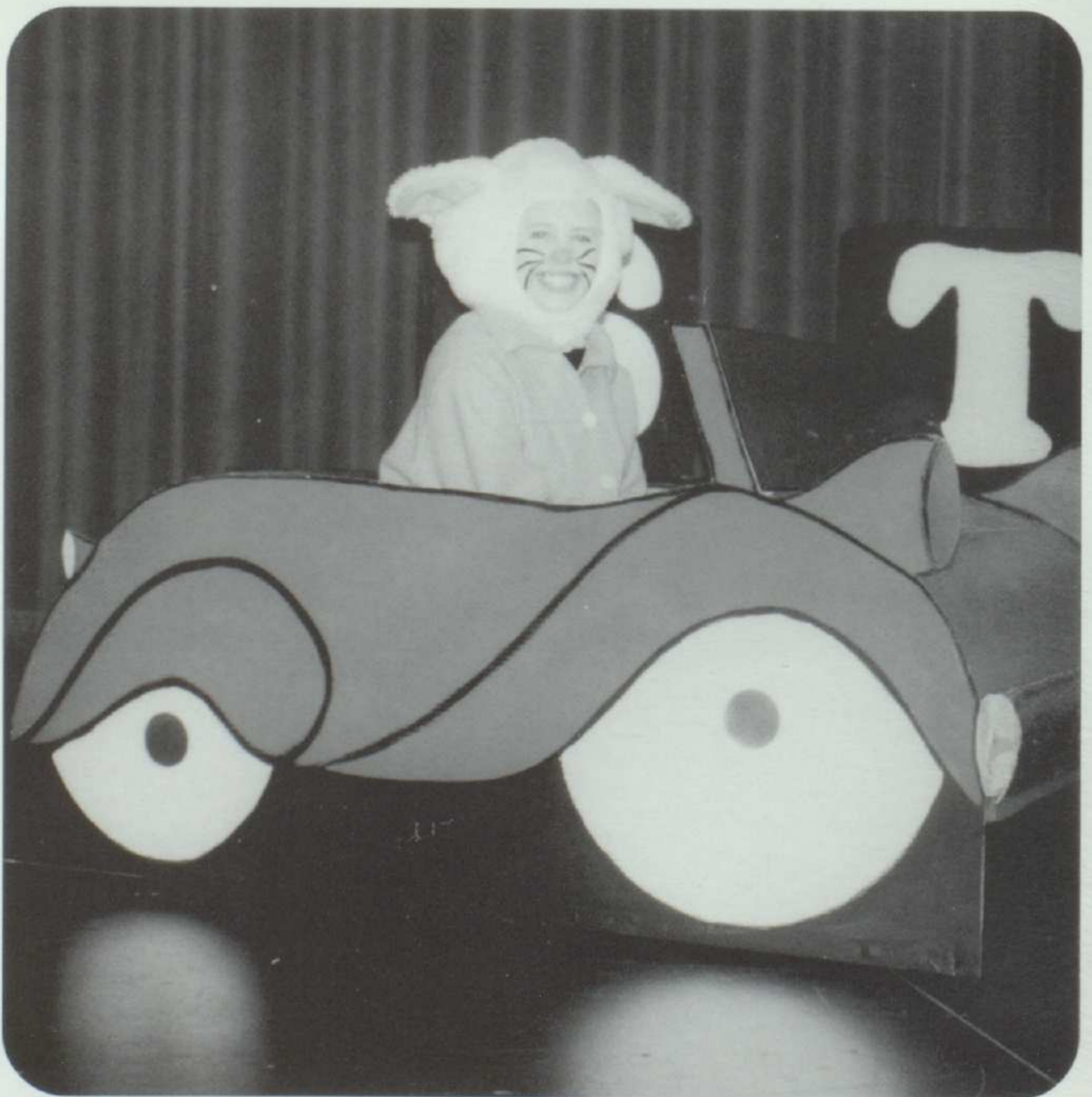

# God verses The King...

## in A Man for All Seasons

Robert Blot's *A Man for All Seasons* is a play of words and eloquent speech. It is almost poetry. In it, Sir Thomas More struggles for moral integrity against a corrupt monarch during a time of turmoil and corruption. A deeply religious and pious man who loves his family, More is the Chancellor of England in a time when morality is dangerous. His steadfast belief in the supremacy of God ultimately leads to his demise.

King Henry the VIII of England is in power and married to Catherine of Spain. Without a male heir to carry on the Tudor name, Henry grows impatient and divorces Catherine to marry his mistress Ann Boleyn. He wants the consent of the Pope because divorce is illegal in the Catholic Church. Determined to have his way, Henry goes to extreme measures - even murder. When the Pope refuses the divorce from Catherine, he breaks away from the Catholic Church and forms the Church of England. In this new church, the King is the supreme head and has the power to grant himself a divorce.

Henry wants no opposition in his quest to become head of the Church of England so he creates the Act of Supremacy. Along with the act comes an oath: every person living in the country has to swear to recognize Henry as the head of the church and all of his children as heirs to the throne. Those who do not are tried for treason, and in most cases, put to death. More refuses to swear an oath but remains silent as to why.

Imprisoned in the Tower of London in 1534, More does not come to trial for over a year because his silence disallows any case against him. He is kept in a cell without seeing his family or daylight. While in prison, the king's officials ask More to take the oath several times, but he continues his silence. His health begins to fail as the King grows weary of More and his so-called disrespect. Once friends, the King now wants More's consent or he wants him dead.

In 1535 in the Hall of Westminster, the court calls More on the charge of high treason. He maintains that his silence is not denial, but under the maxim of the law, *qui tacet consentire*, silence gives consent. Found guilty of high treason, More doesn't reveal the reason for his silence until his execution in July of 1535. He believes that the King in all of his majesty cannot be higher than the church because of its spiritual supremacy. He stands before God and his family, crosses himself, and says to the crowd, "I am the King's good servant, but God's first."

The audience for this well-staged drama was completely intrigued and astonished by the superior quality of the performance.

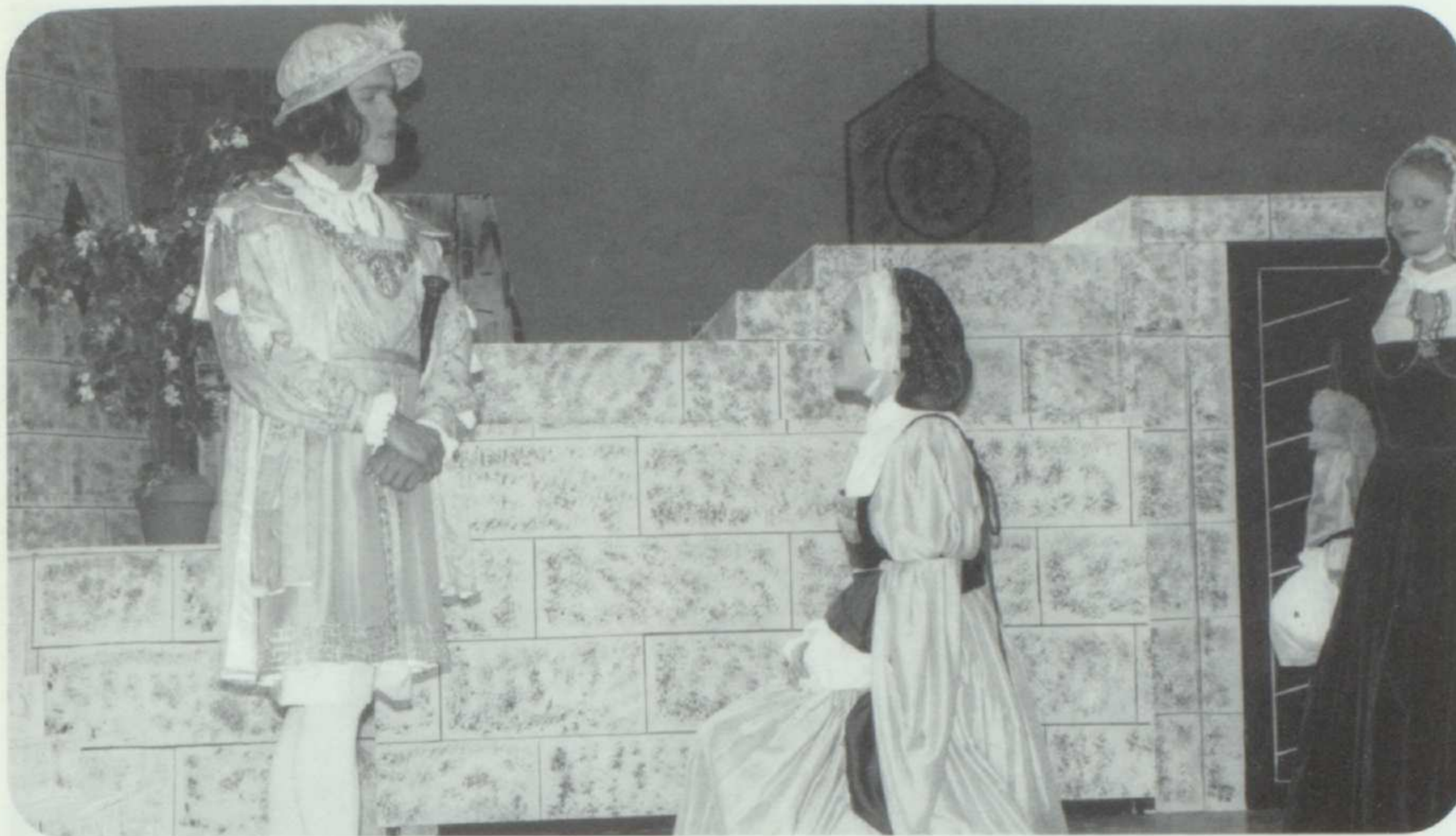

# A Love Story...

## evolves in Brigadoon

In the dense forest of Scotland at 5A.M., we meet two lost hunters, Tommy Albright and Jeff Douglas, from New York City, during their conversation about Tommy's life. Jeff, who drinks too much, does not understand Tommy's dissatisfaction with his good job, a beautiful fiancée, and friends who care about him. However, Tommy is just not happy. Just then, they hear a distant melody, and they see a small town appearing in the highland mist. Confused because no towns are listed on the map, they check it out.

Tommy and Jeff arrive in Brigadoon and meet the villagers who are awed and curious about them. When Tommy asks questions about their location and why the town is not on the map, no one gives a straight answer. However, the villagers invite them to stay and enjoy the Market Fair in MacConnachy Square. The vivacious Meg Brockie, who has taken a liking to Jeff, escorts him off. Tommy stays in MacConnachy Square and meets Charlie Dalrymple, who vows that his "rovin'" days are over and that he'll go home with Bonnie Jean.

When Fiona MacLaren introduces herself to Tommy, it is love at first sight. Tommy tells her that he is engaged but only marrying his fiancée because he has no other options. Tommy and Fiona go to a nearby hill where they gather heather for Charlie and Jean's wedding. They stare longingly into another's eyes as it begins to rain.

Meanwhile, Meg has taken the tired Jeff to her shed for a nap. Meg, however, has different plans and tries to impress him with her many romantic escapades but nothing happens.

At the MacLaren house, Jean, the bride-to-be, is packing her belongings when Harry Beaton arrives declaring his love for her and his wish to find a better life. He leaves dejectedly. When Charlie arrives to sign the family *Bible*, he tries to see Jean but leaves since it is bad luck for the groom to see the bride before the wedding.

When Tommy and Fiona arrive after gathering heather, they have fallen in love. Starry-eyed, Tommy declares, "I'm in Love." Then Tommy spots the family *Bible* and notices none of the dates match. Charlie signed the *Bible* on today's date, but in 1746, not 1946. Tommy asks Fiona about this, but she avoids answering, telling him that only Mr. Lundie, the school master, can give the explanation. Confused, he exits to find him.

Mr. Lundie explains why Brigadoon is different. Two hundred years ago witches, who were taking people away from the way of God and putting the devil in their souls, had overrun the highlands. Mr. Forsythe, Brigadoon's minister who feared for the people of the village, asked God for a miracle. He sacrificed himself to make the town and its people disappear into the highland mist, only to reappear every hundred years. When the people go to bed at night and wake the next morning, it is one hundred years later. They aren't in any century long enough to be touched by it. If any inhabitant of Brigadoon were to leave, however, the town would vanish forever. Strangers may come and go, but no one of Brigadoon may leave. Tommy asks if a stranger may live there, and Mr. Lundie tells him that anyone who loves Brigadoon or a person in Brigadoon may stay.

Following the wedding the townspeople break into joyous celebration and dance. Harry Beaton interrupts the celebration by threatening to leave and ruin the miracle. When he runs off, the men follow in a heated chase. Harry evades the townsmen but slips on a rock, hits his head, and dies, thus protecting the miracle.

Tommy tells Fiona that he is in love with her and cannot live without her. She feels the same way. When the men return to the wedding celebration telling every one they have stopped Harry, more dancing follows until the villagers march out leaving Tommy and Jeff. Tommy tells Jeff he is not coming back to New York, but Jeff is not going to let his friend make this mistake so he talks him out of it. They leave as Brigadoon disappears for the next one hundred years.

They return to New York, but Tommy calls off the wedding and returns to Scotland, just to see where Brigadoon once was. Looking around for any sign of Brigadoon, Tommy and Jeff are about to leave when they hear that same distant melody. In disbelief, Jeff takes out his flask and sits on a tree stump. Tommy turns to see Mr. Lundie and Fiona emerging from the mist. "You must really love her, lad, you woke me up." Tommy embraces Fiona, and they disappear into the highland mist. Jeff walks away laughing.

# Who done it...

## in this murder drama *Nine Girls*

Wilfrid Pettitt's *Nine Girls* opens, as many suspense-murders, on a dark and stormy night. Jane, a recent medical school graduate, leads young sorority member Phyllis into an old abandoned cabin, finally unveiling the story of why the cozy cabin was deserted so many years ago.

The rest of the play is a flashback, opening on a stormy spring evening as studious Jane waits with debutant Eve, bohemian Freida, and worrisome Alice for the arrival of the girls they plan to initiate as new members, Tennessee and Shirley. The entrance of drama queen Sharon known to most as Glamourpuss is a grand one. She brings with her the new pledges, and the excitement level rises. Sporty tomboy, Stella aka "Shotput," brings worry and fear to the group as she announces with her arrival that fellow sorority member Paula, Alice's best friend, is missing.

Mary, best friend to Eve and outcast of the sorority, enters on this dismal scene and consoles the girls in their worried state. Although the weekend begins lightly and humorously, the atmosphere takes a turn when they learn of the death of sorority member, Paula. The climax of act one occurs when the older members leave Alice and Mary behind, in order to visit the ranger station. Mary's situation, how she fell in love with best friend Eve's cousin Ray and how Paula stole him away from her, comes to light. This was too much for Mary and in a confrontation, she had accidentally kills Paula! Now that Alice knows too much, she too has to die.

When the girls return and make the discovery that Alice is also dead, seemingly by suicide, only Eve suspects that a killer is about. As the girls prepare to leave, Eve and Mary have several heated discussions where they consider the possibilities. Eve is sure that it is one of the girls who killed Paula and Alice so everyone is a suspect. Mary says that this is ridiculous. . . "If you're saying that you suspect one of our girls..." Suspicion rises as Mary tampers with Eve's car. Eve finds other clues that lead her closer and closer to the identity of the murderer. Deciding that she's had enough of Eve's nosiness, Mary traps Eve at the cabin after all the others have left. Jane, Shotput and Frieda bust in just as Mary is about to strangle Eve. With her true colors revealed, Mary has only one choice other than to turn in herself: suicide. She pulls the pills that she used to poison Alice with from her purse and throws them into the fireplace, taking the higher road.

Jake eventually figures himself out and the voices disappear. Finally, he can have a normal life with Maggie. As the story ends, the two start over with a clean slate, while the audience decides for themselves what happens to them next.

Mr. DePinna, an old bald little man, came to the house to deliver ice eight years ago...and just stayed. Paul is blowing things up in the basement while Essie is dancing while her Russian instructor, Mr. Kolenkov. Ed is playing the xylophone. He convinces Mr. Kirby that his Wall Street job is killing him and that life should be more fun. Alice decides to marry Tony, and Grandpa skips out on his income tax. They all live happily ever after.

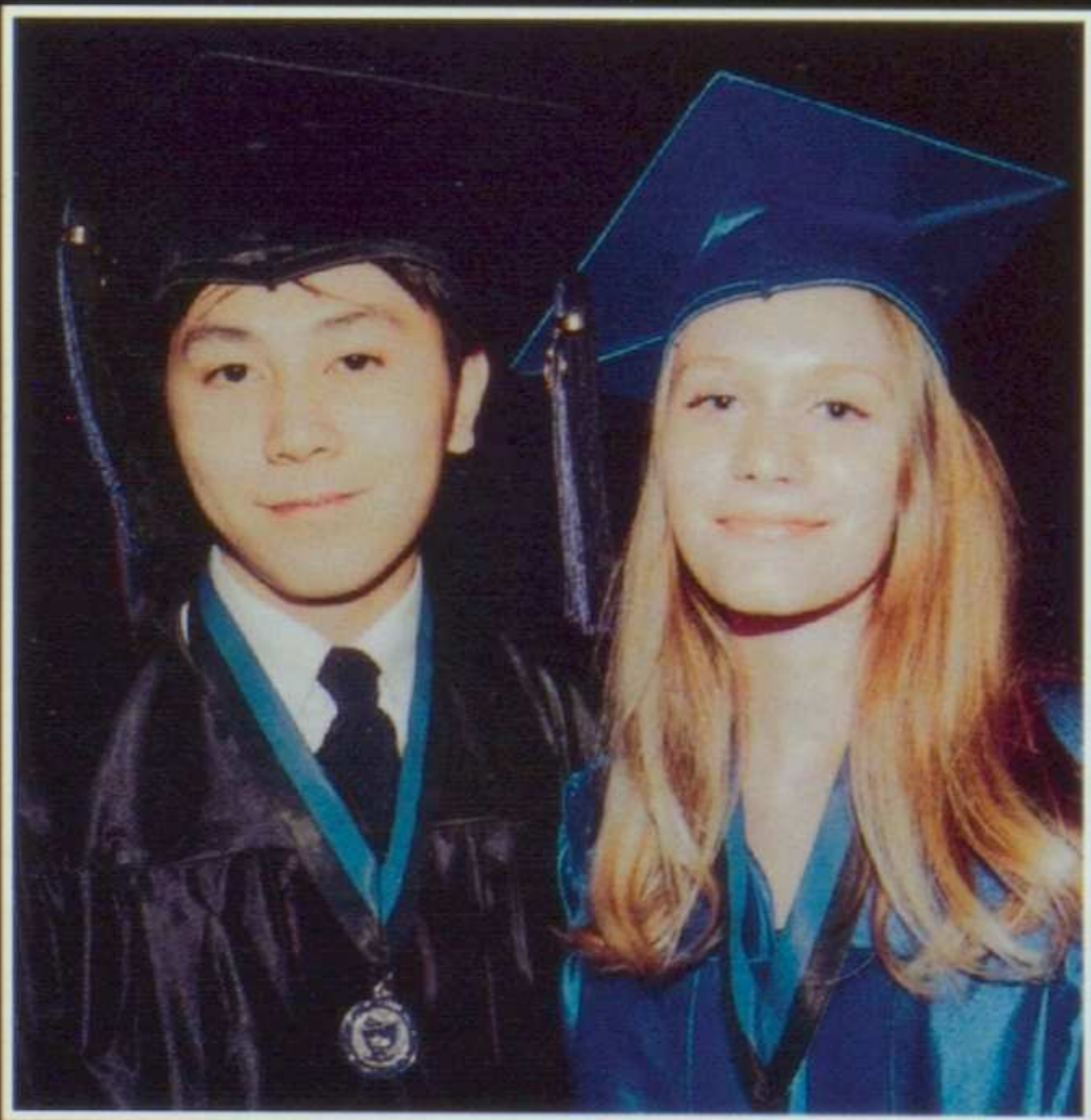

# Learning at Linworth

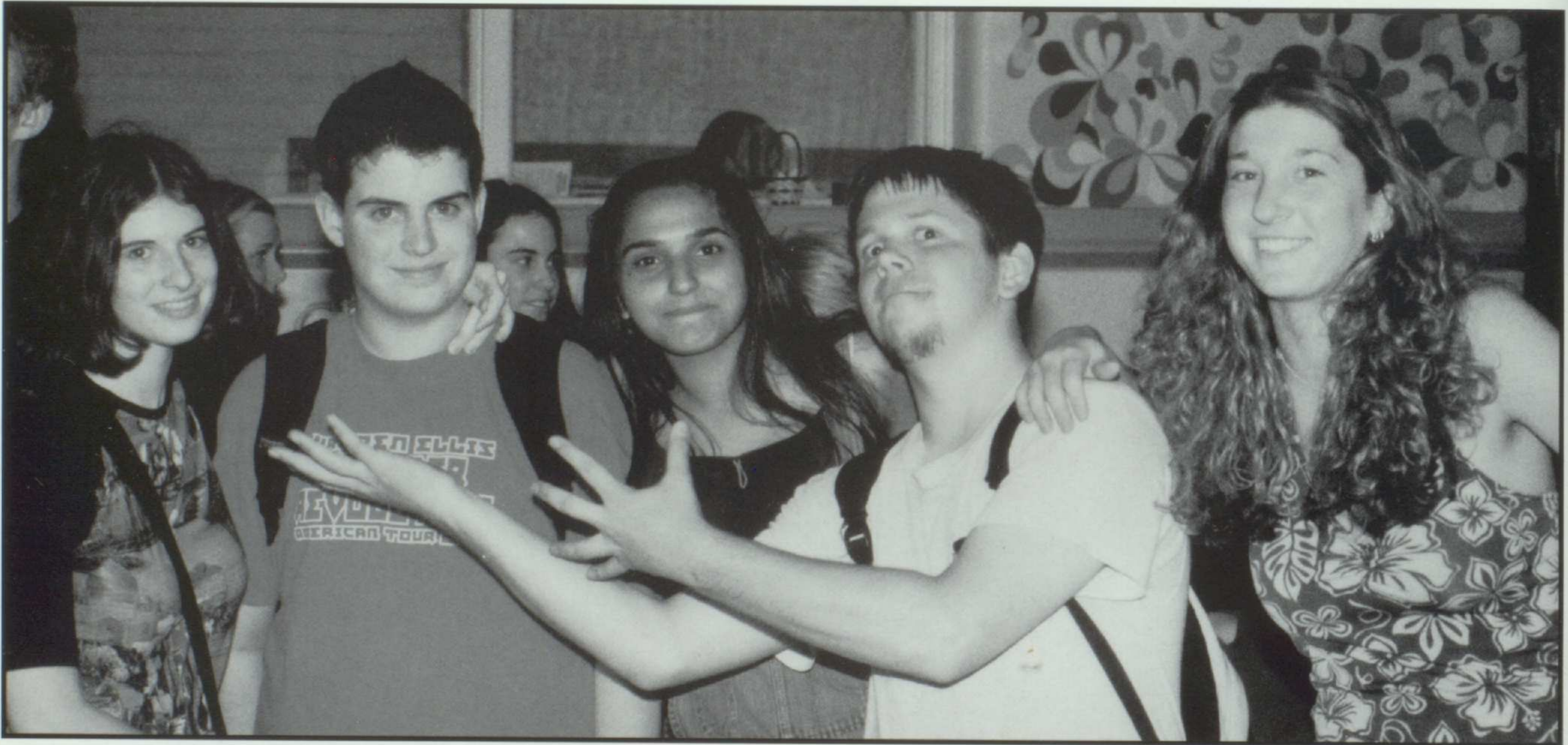
Before the split of Worthington High School, Linworth was the only alternative choice of high school for students. As the student population grew in number on main campus and at Linworth, Kilbourne became a reality because of overcrowding. Yet staff has always realized that some students learn differently than others and could possibly work better in a smaller environment; thus, Linworth Alternative School continued despite the construction of a new high school.

Linworth has now grown to educate one hundred and eighty students, up from its earlier capacity of one hundred and fifty. Of those students, sixty percent are from Thomas and forty percent are from Kilbourne. The current teacher-leader is Mr. Harvey, better known as Wayne. The students call the teachers by their first names so their relationships are more of a peer type and less of a teacher-student interaction. The relationship students have with faculty is on more of a social level than many teacher relationships with students here or at Thomas. This environment helps students relax and feel more comfortable at school.

Feeling comfortable at school is a very important aspect to students' learning ability. At Linworth the student body often holds town meetings where students make proposals and suggestions that they feel would help the school and its environment. The students are allowed to propose almost anything they would like to change. The rest of the student body then votes on the proposals, and the majority rules. For example, students have voted on whether the paintings and artwork throughout Linworth should be changed. Currently, on the wall of the walkway from downstairs to upstairs is a painting of a red dragon. Students apparently like this picture because it has stayed there.

As long as students want to learn in a different environment what they need to know for their futures, they will continue to choose Linworth. They feel it offers them more than WKHS and TWHS. The students that make the choice to attend Linworth are no different from students here; they just choose a learning environment that they feel best suits them. That's what school should be all about.

## *Largest Book Award in the Country!*

This year Worthington Kilbourne celebrated the fifth annual Junior Book Award ceremony by honoring 195 student, 30 more students than last year. Colleges, universities, and alumni associations across the country were invited to participate in the ceremony. The Junior Book Awards acknowledges deserving juniors and also promotes awareness between students and the colleges available to them. 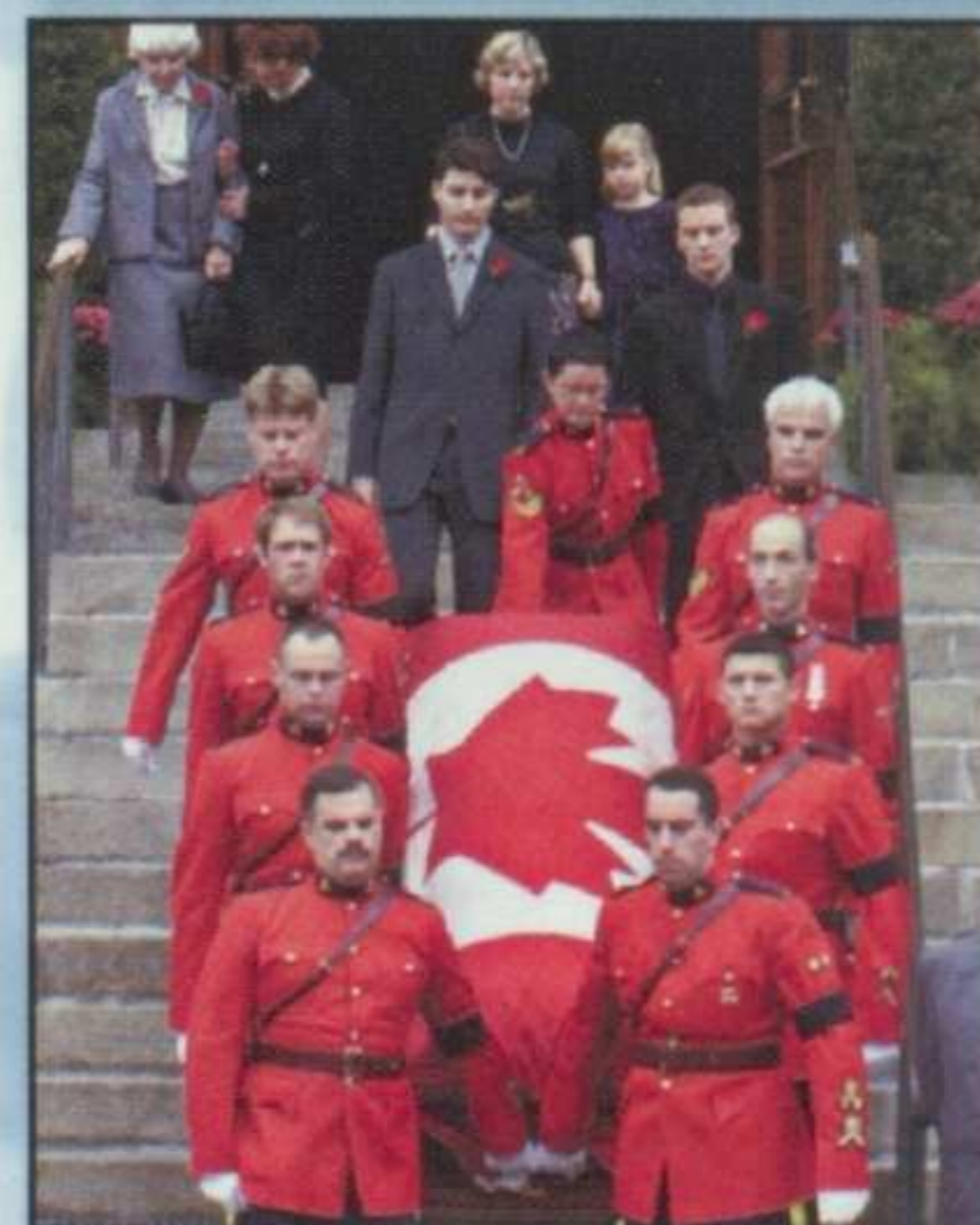

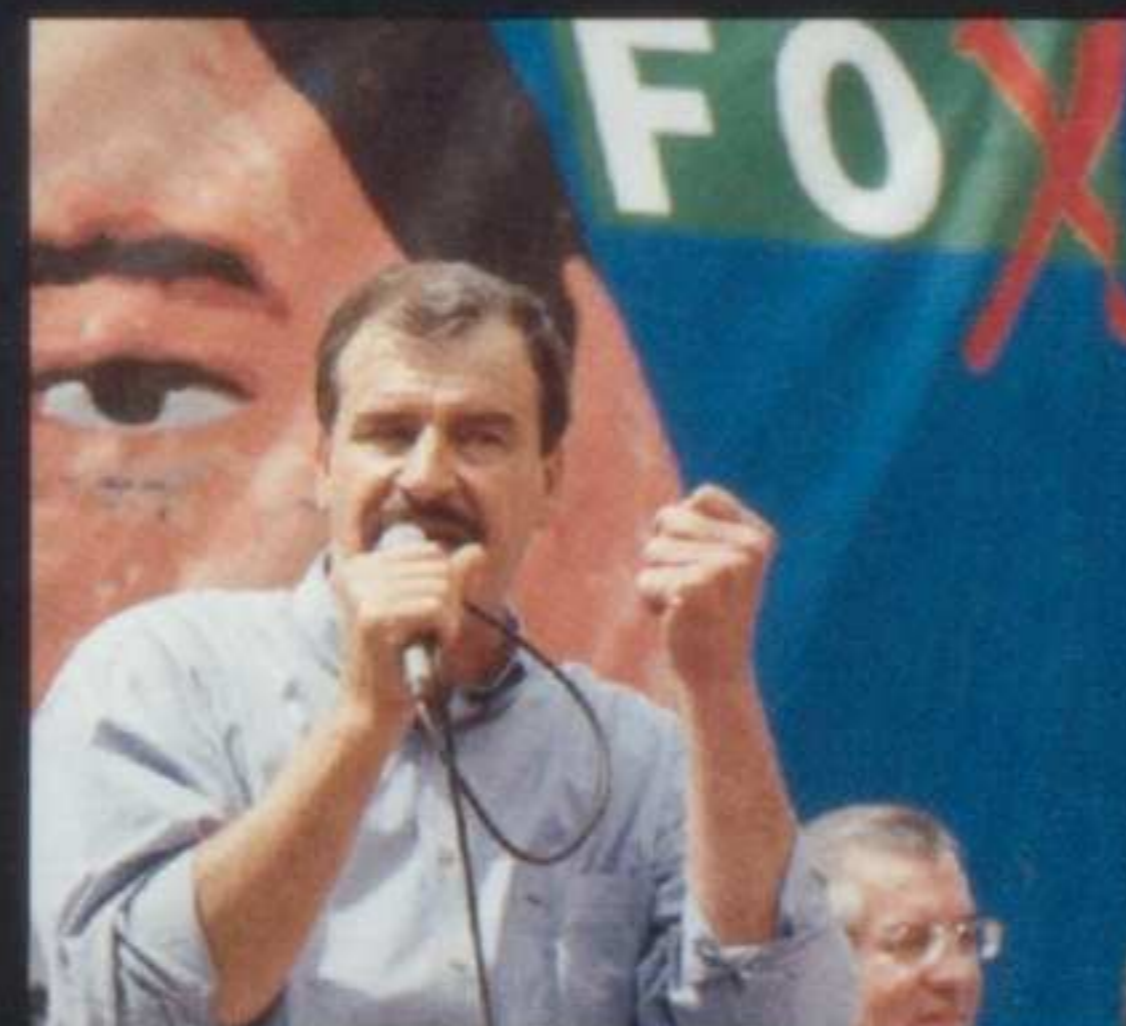

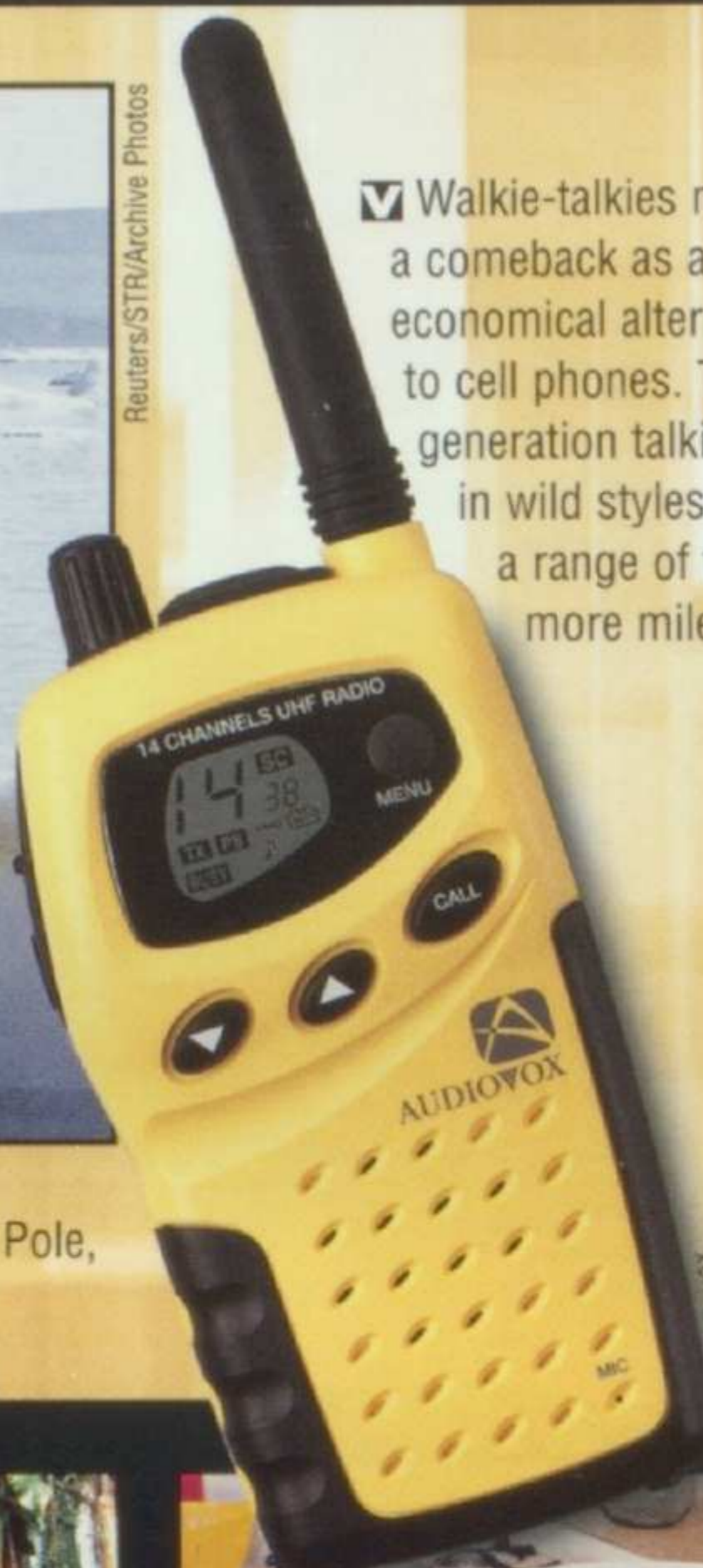

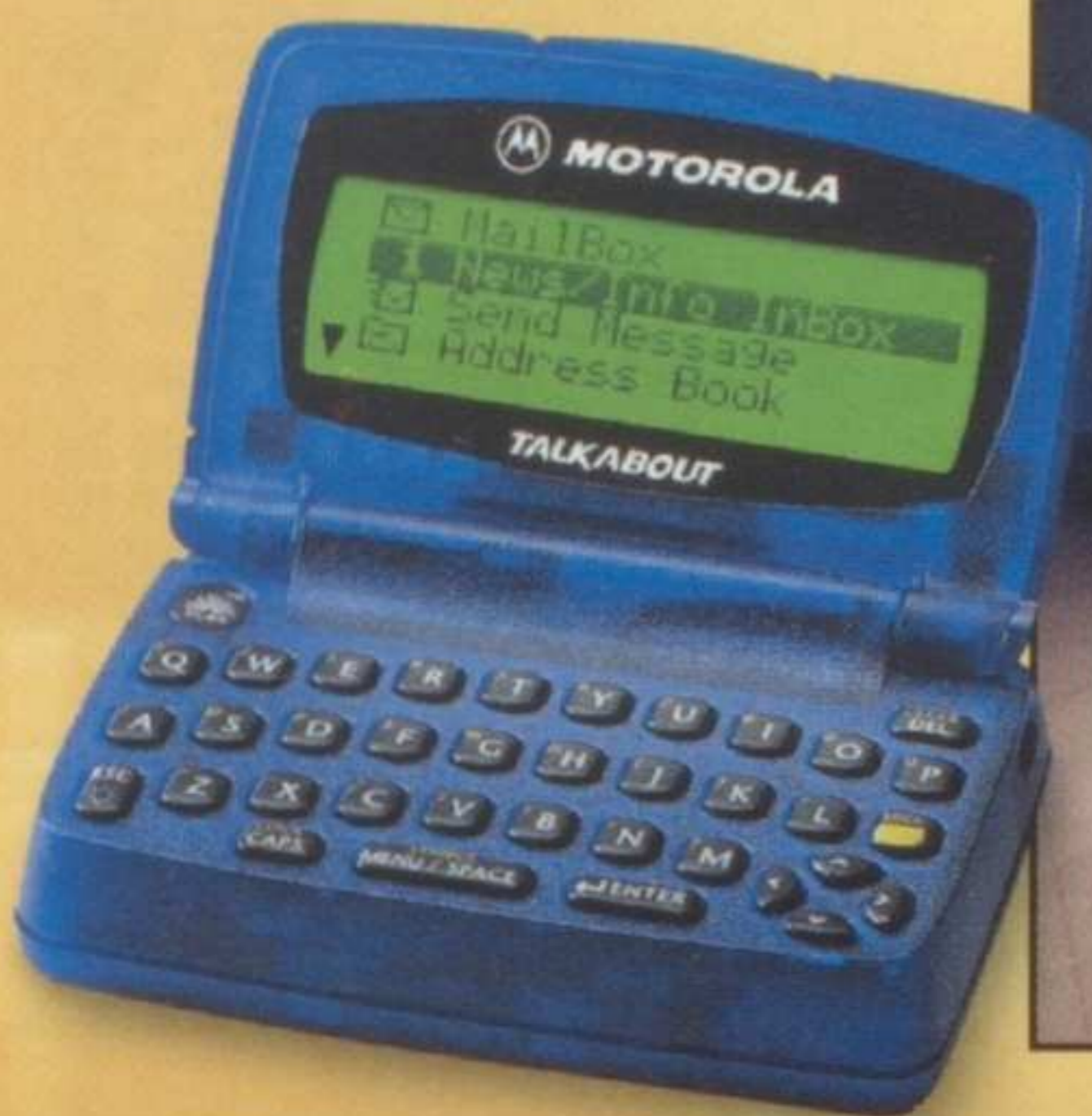

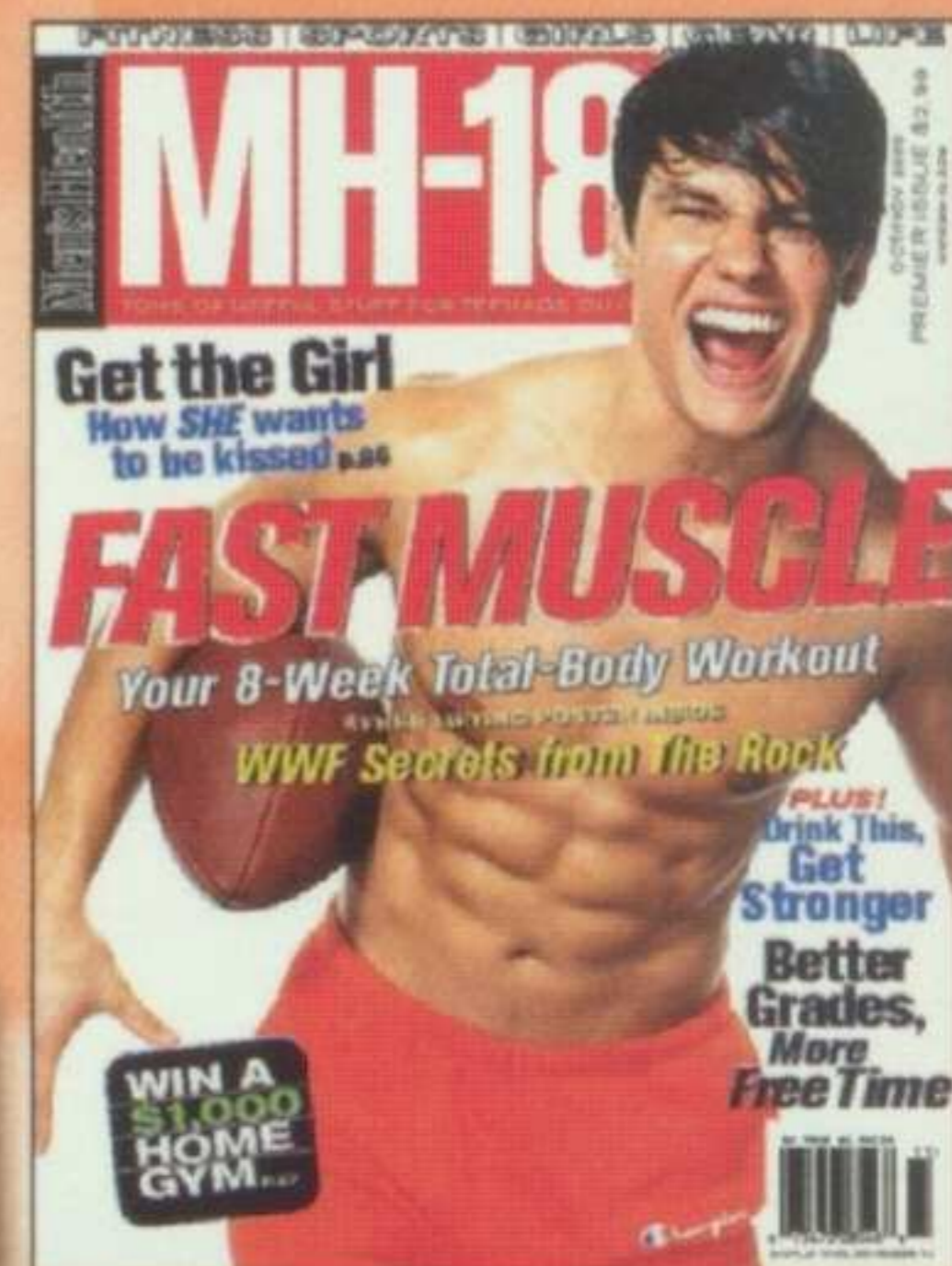

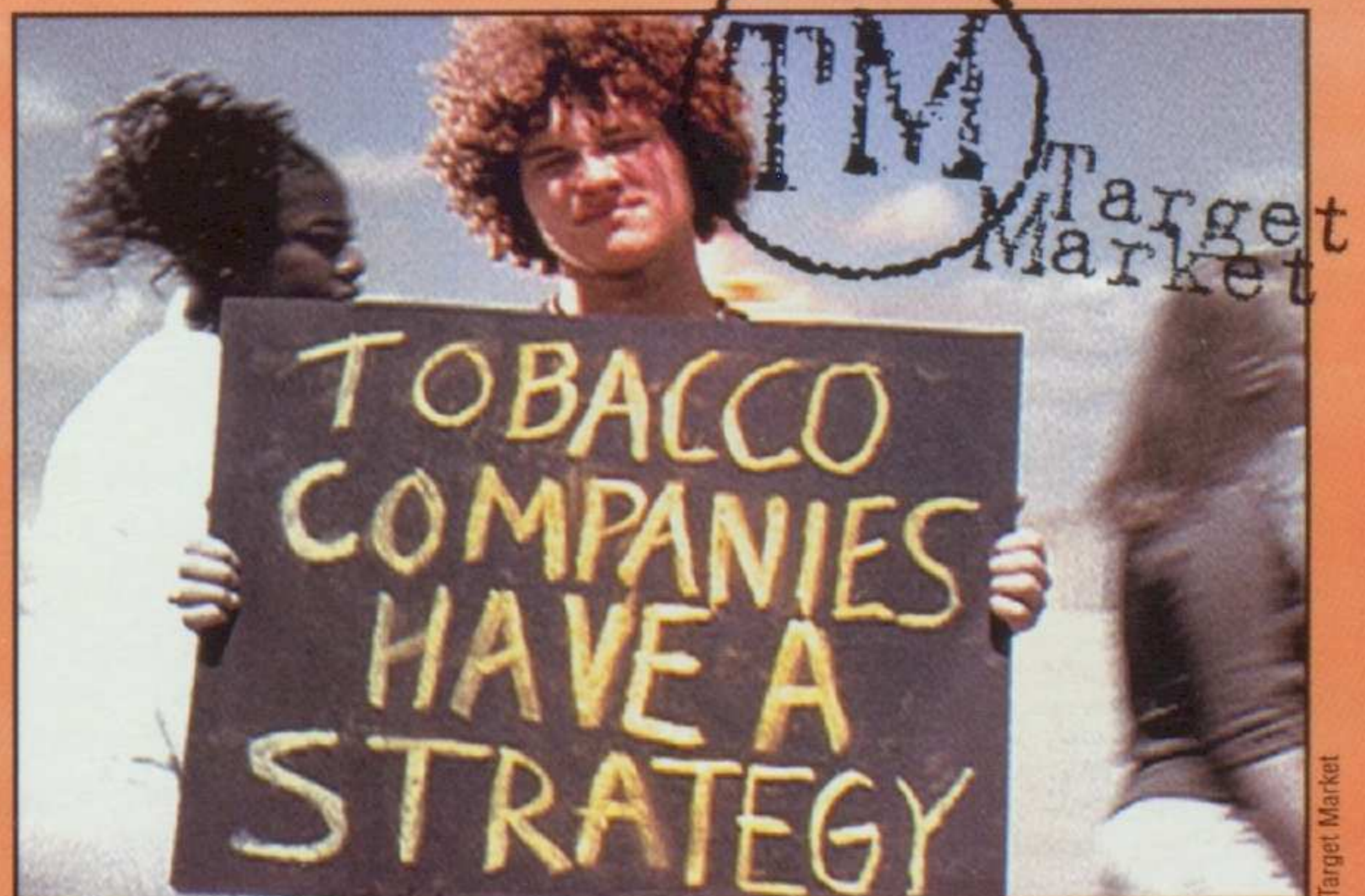

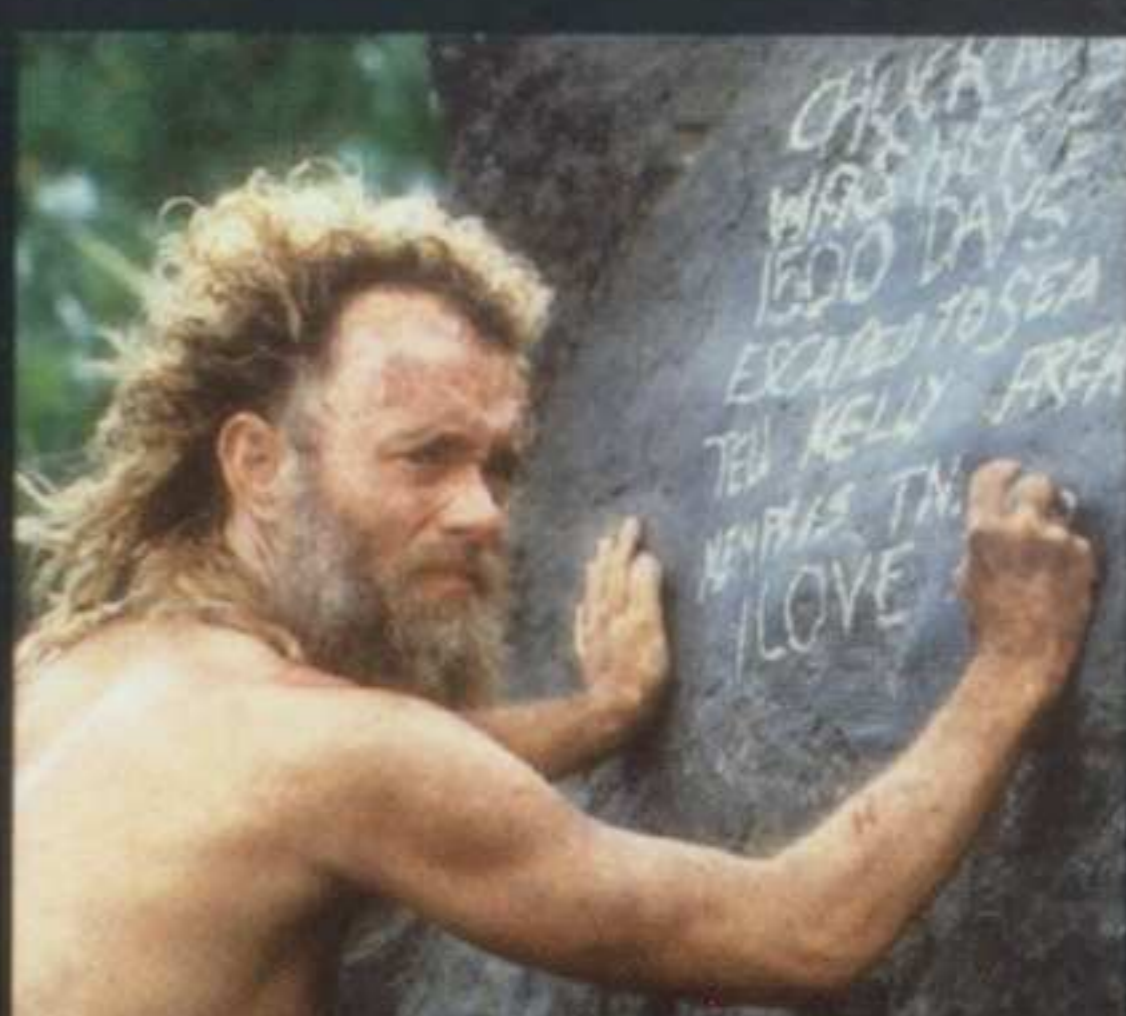

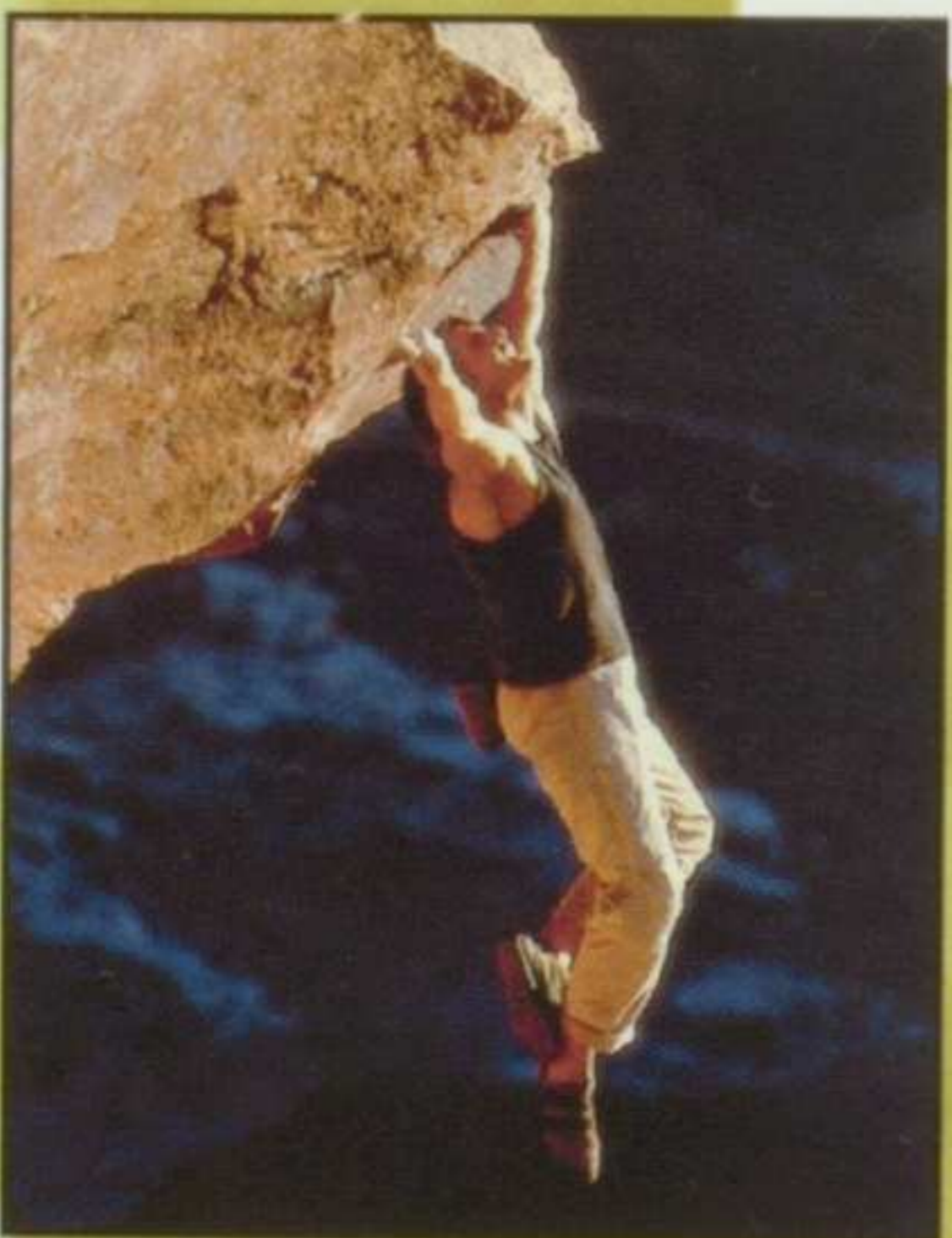

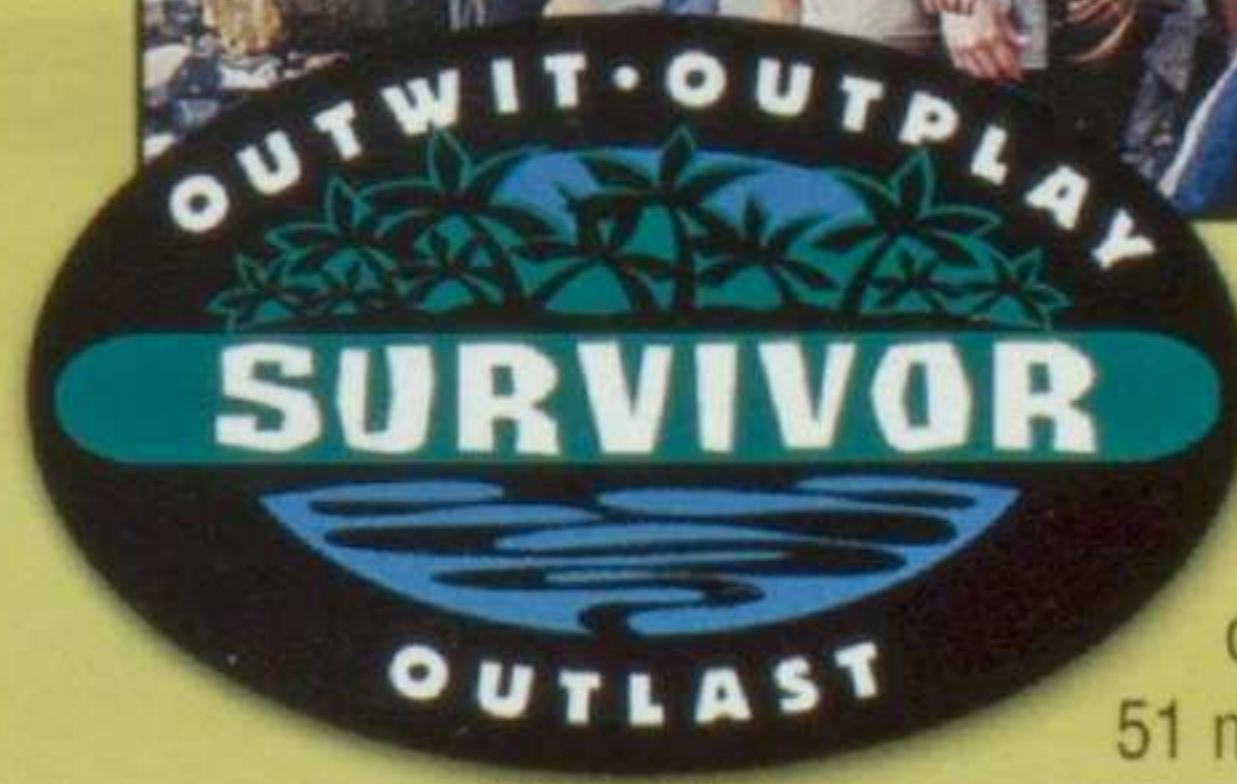

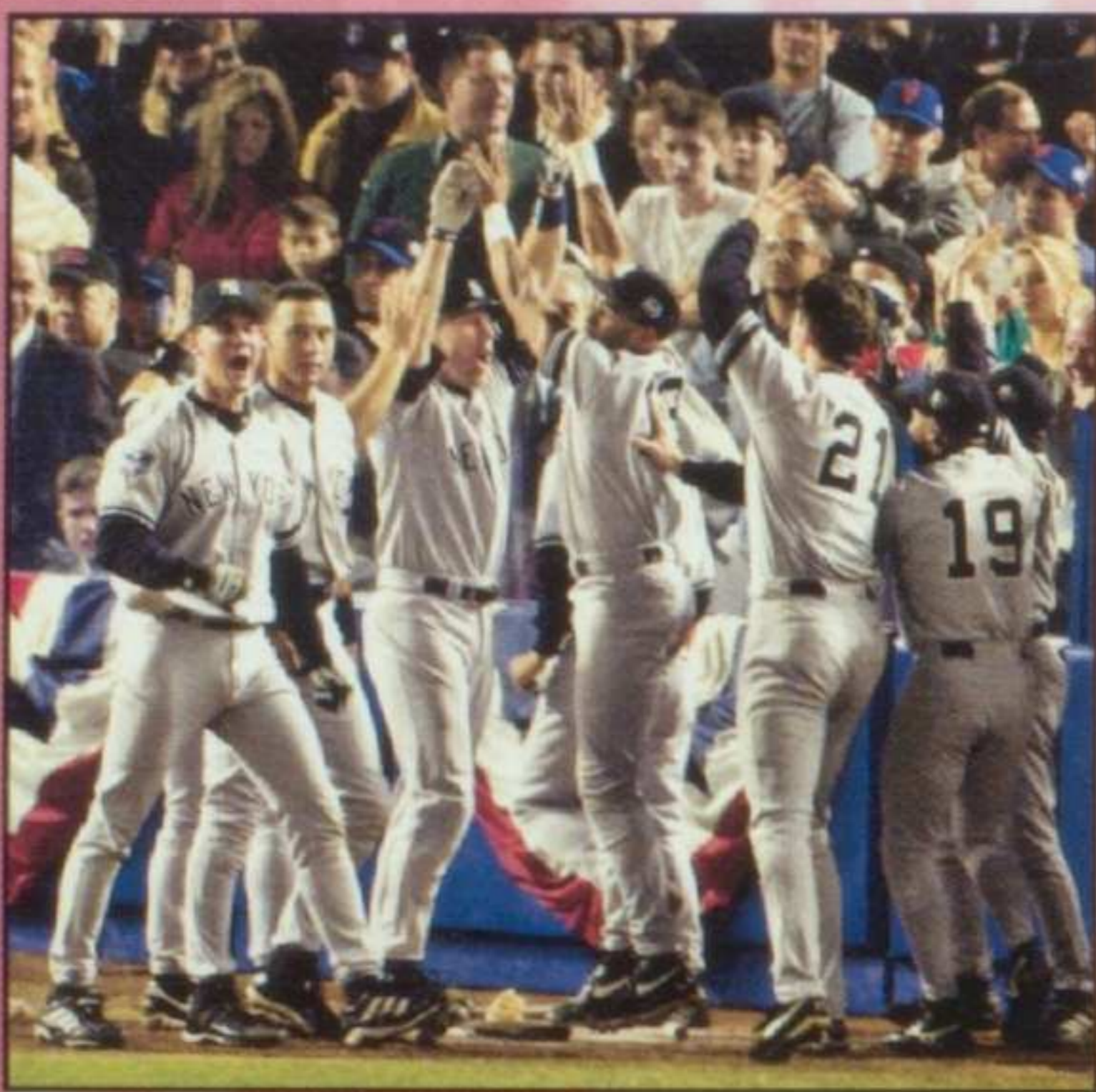

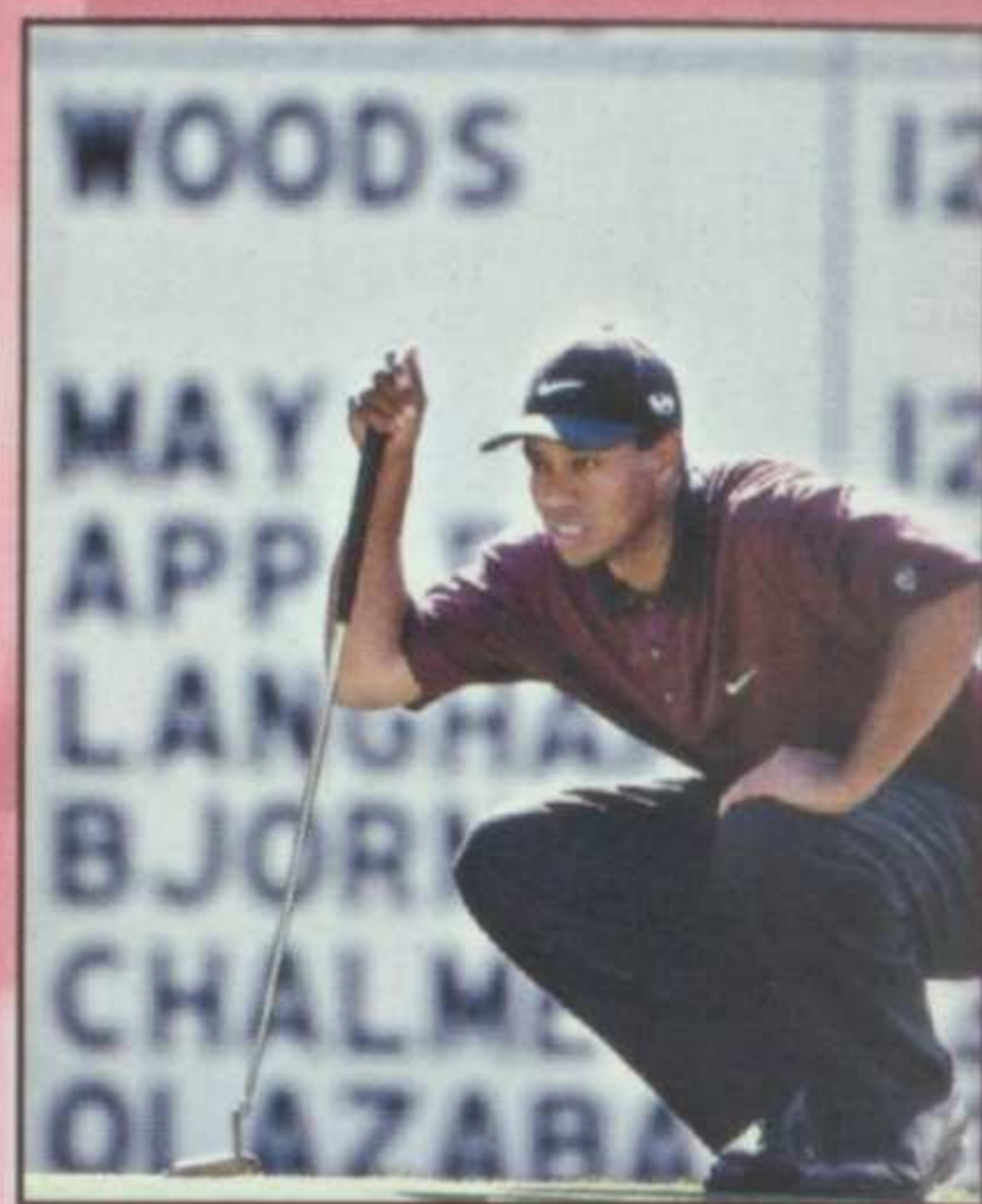

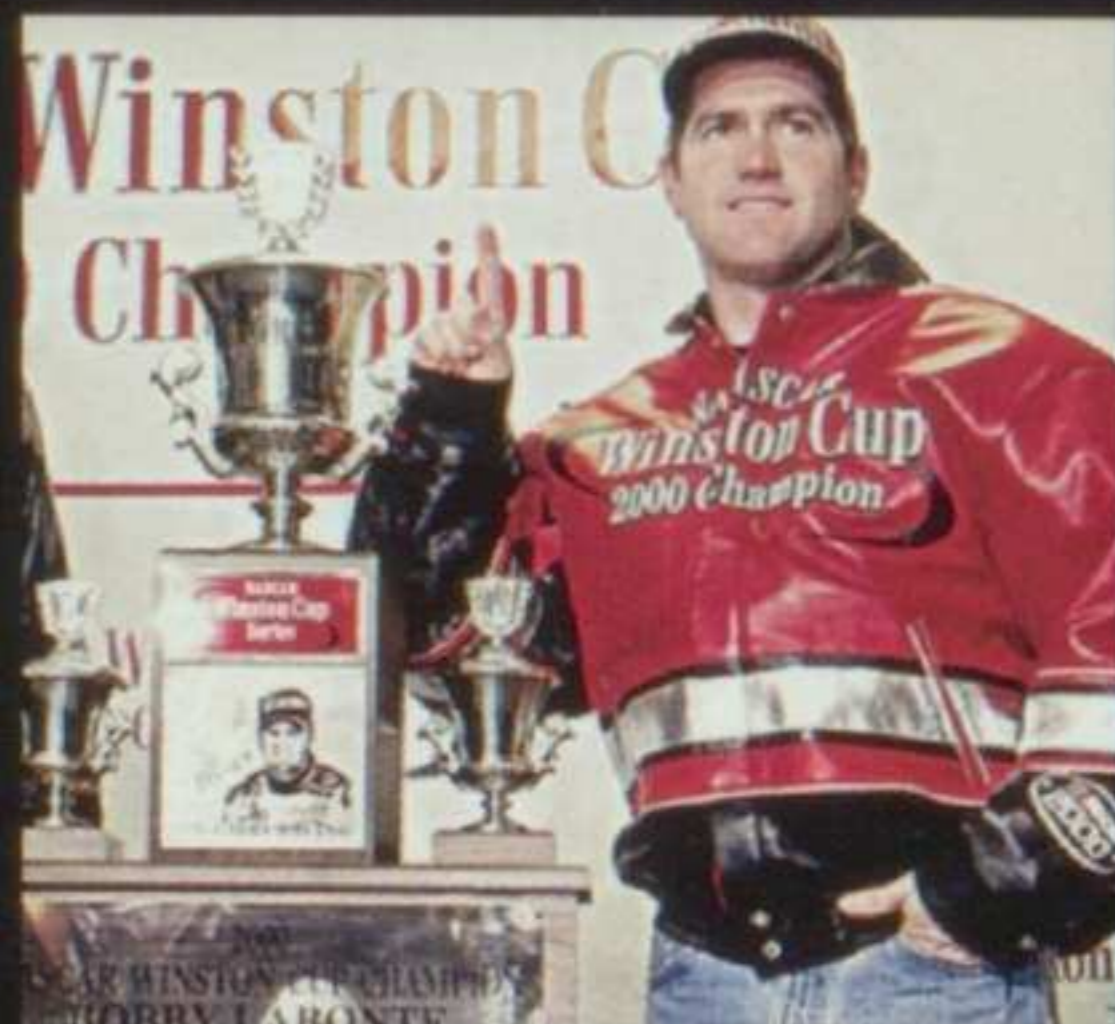

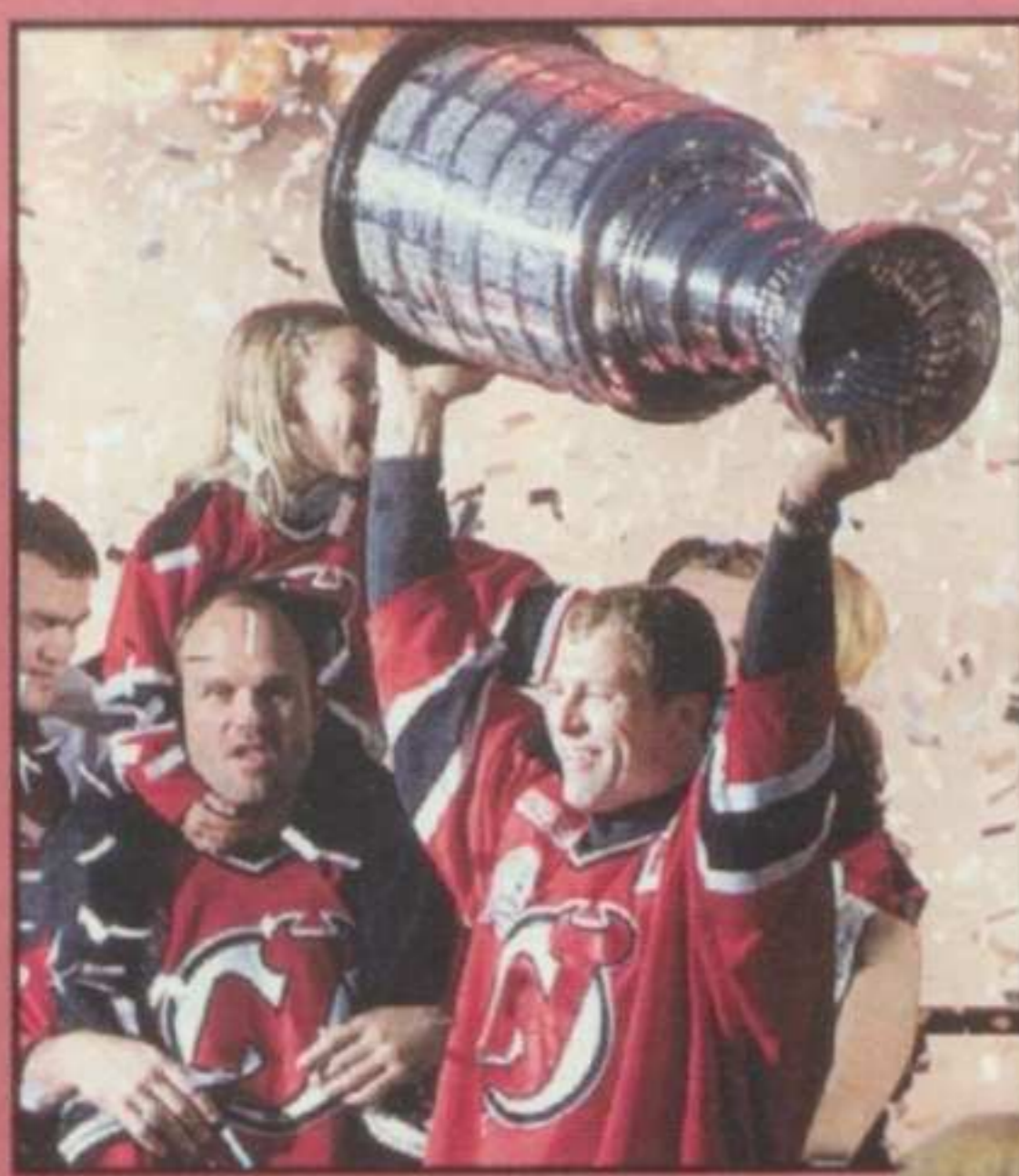

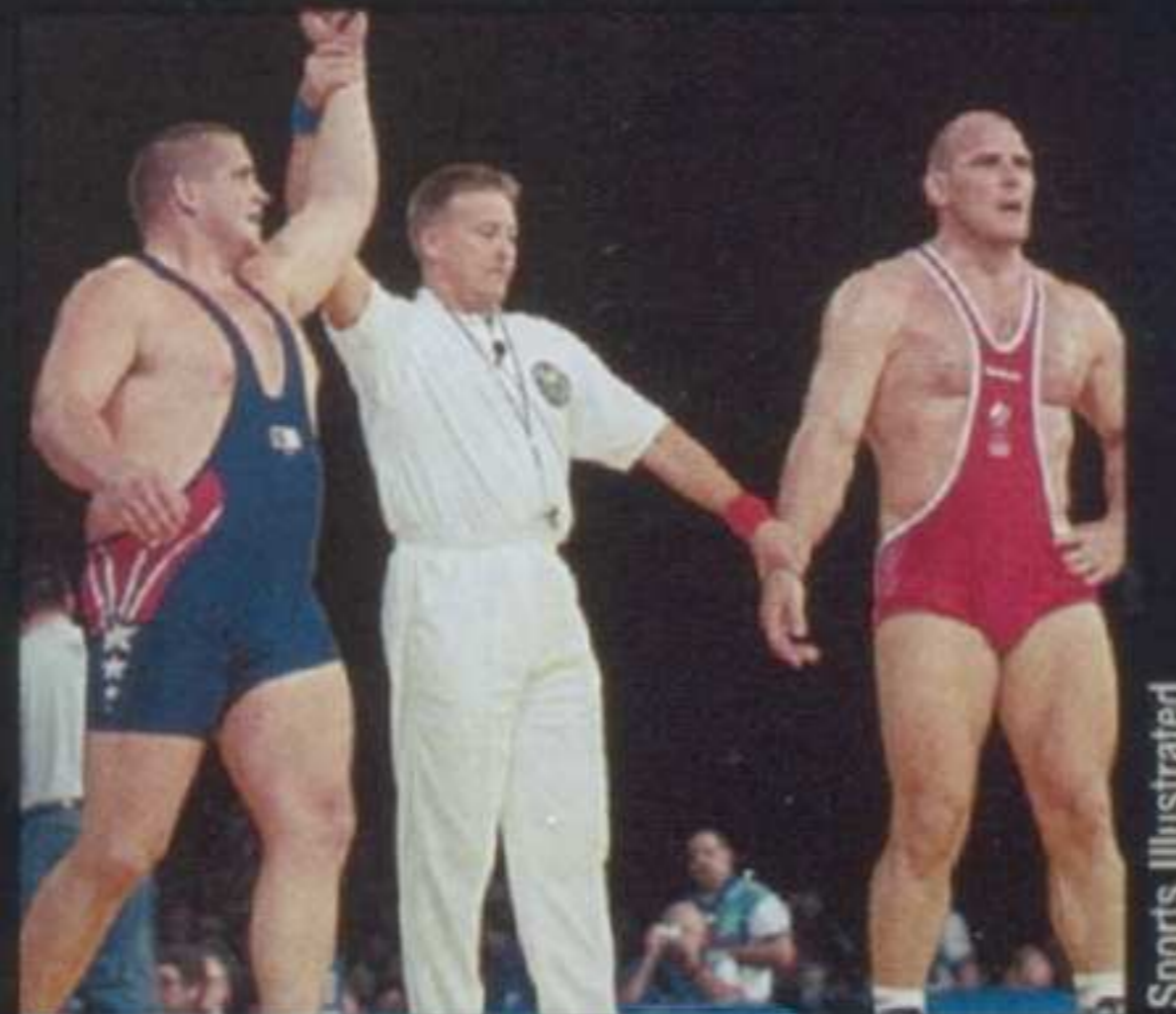

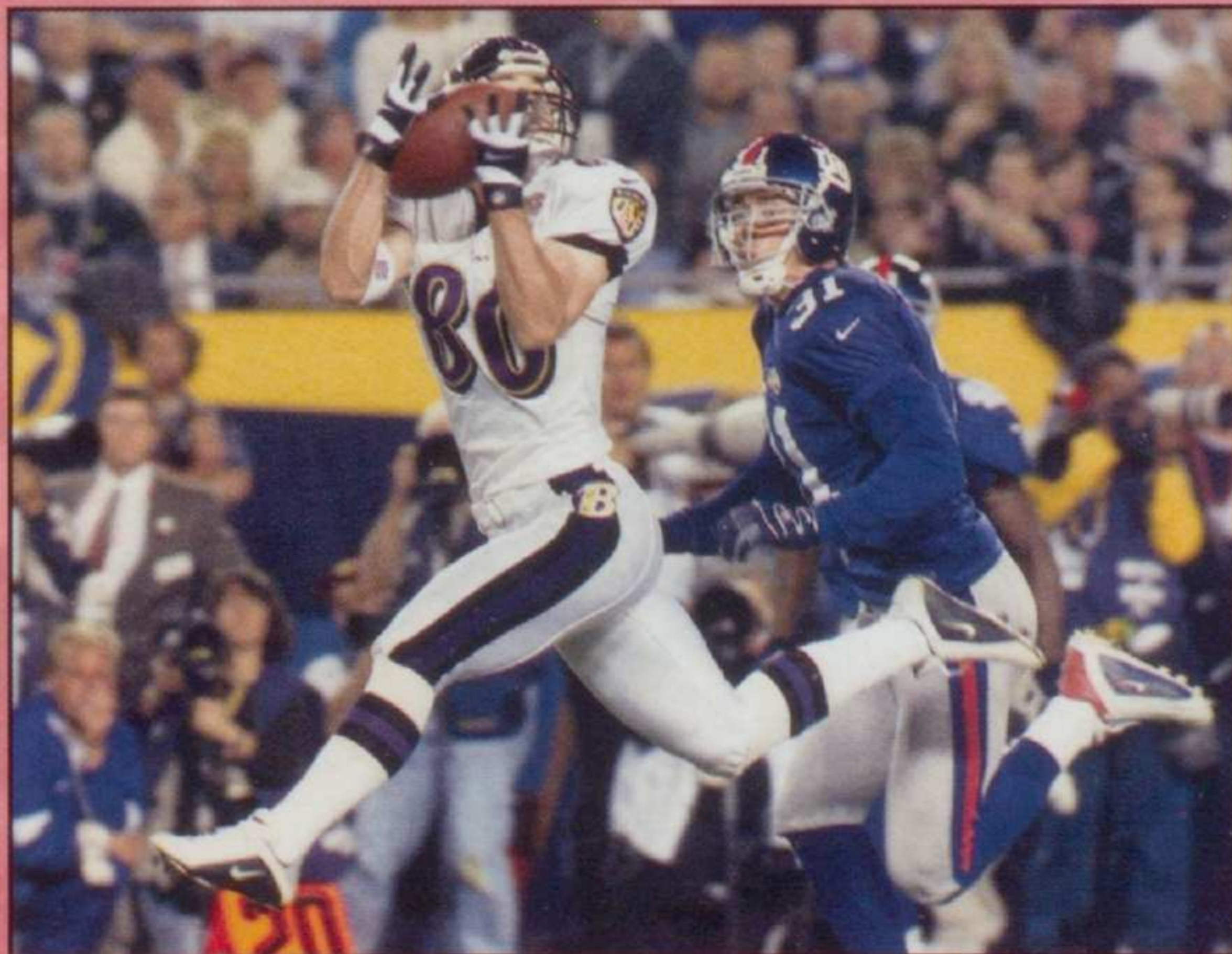

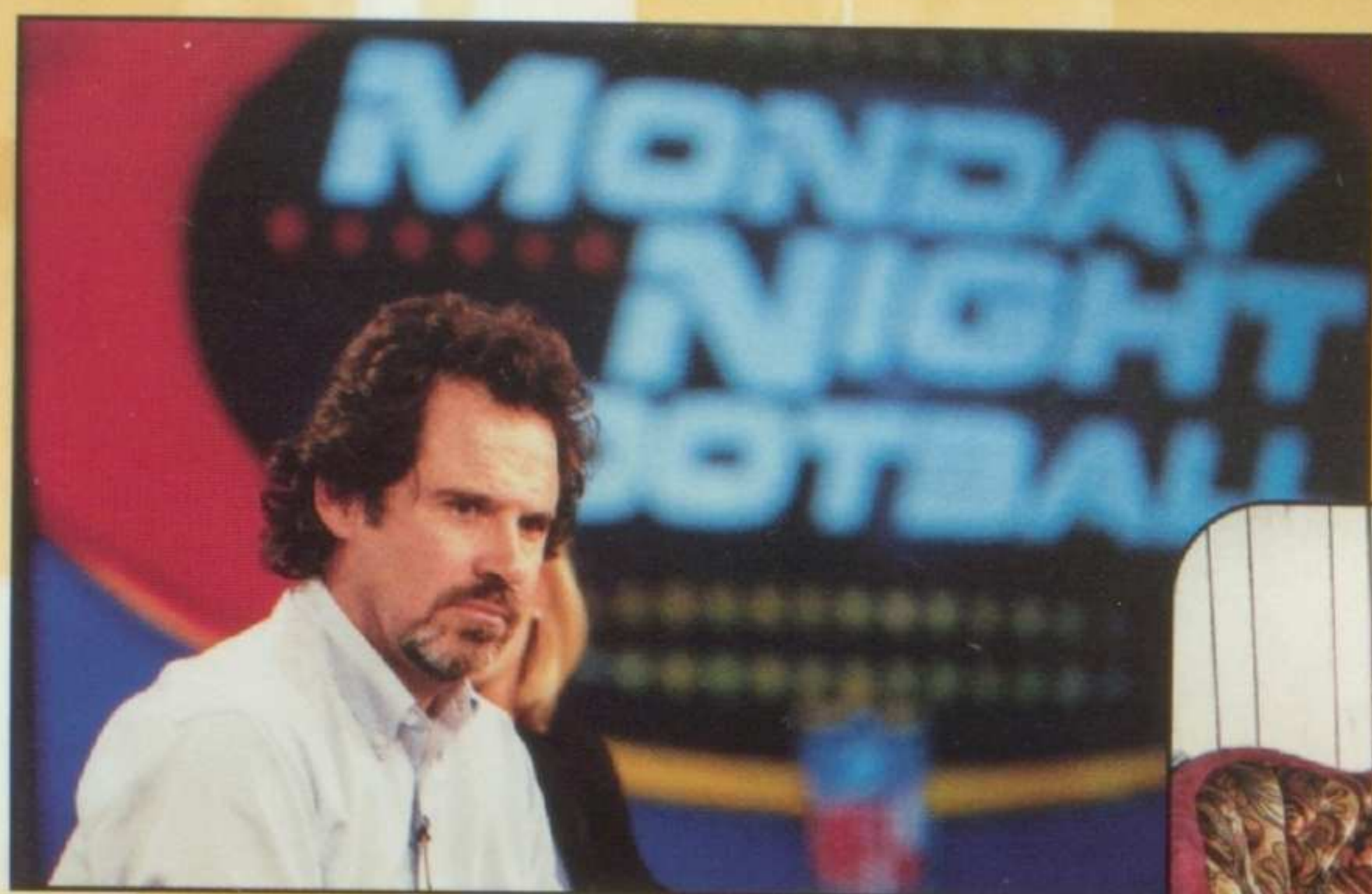

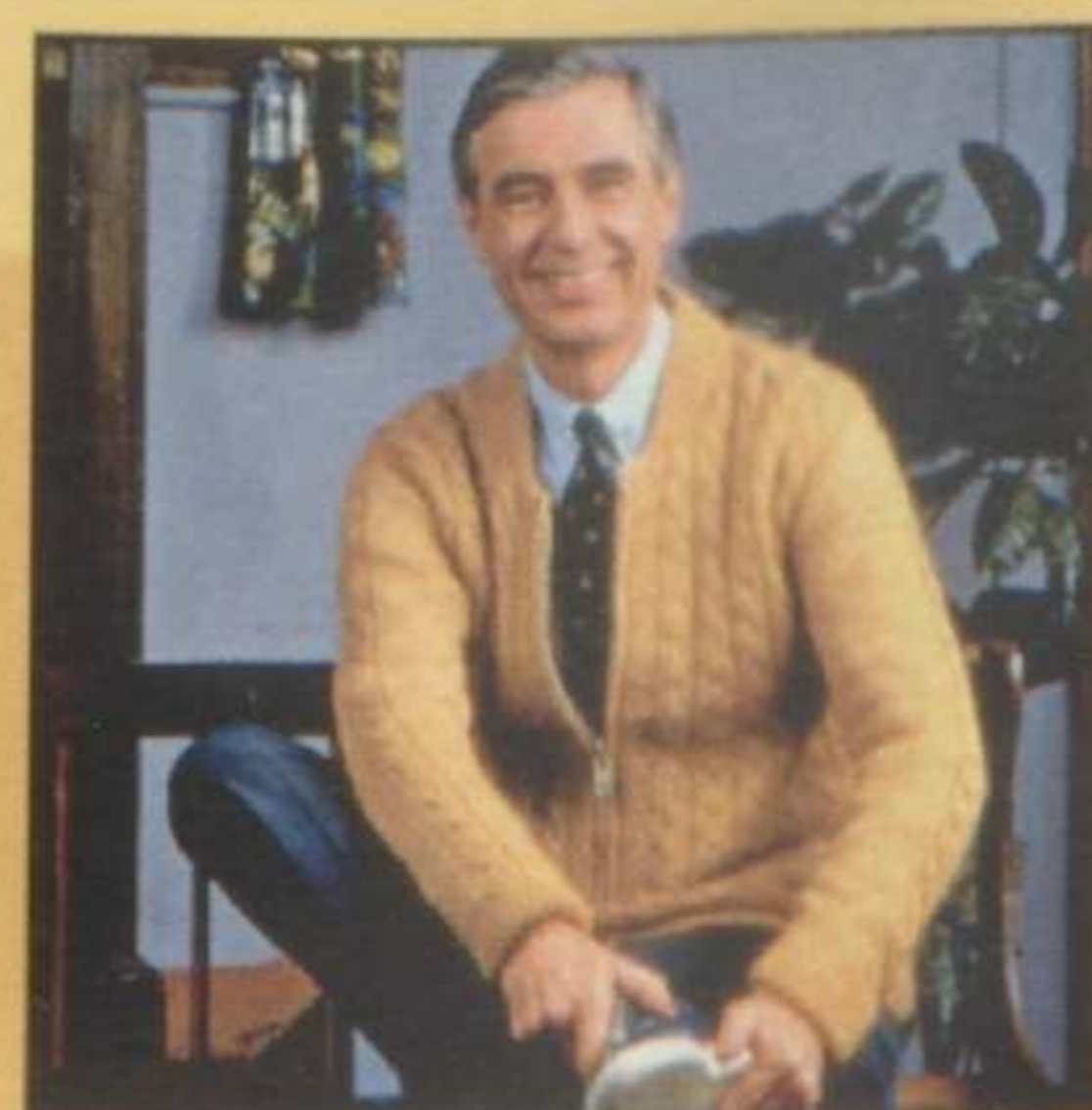
