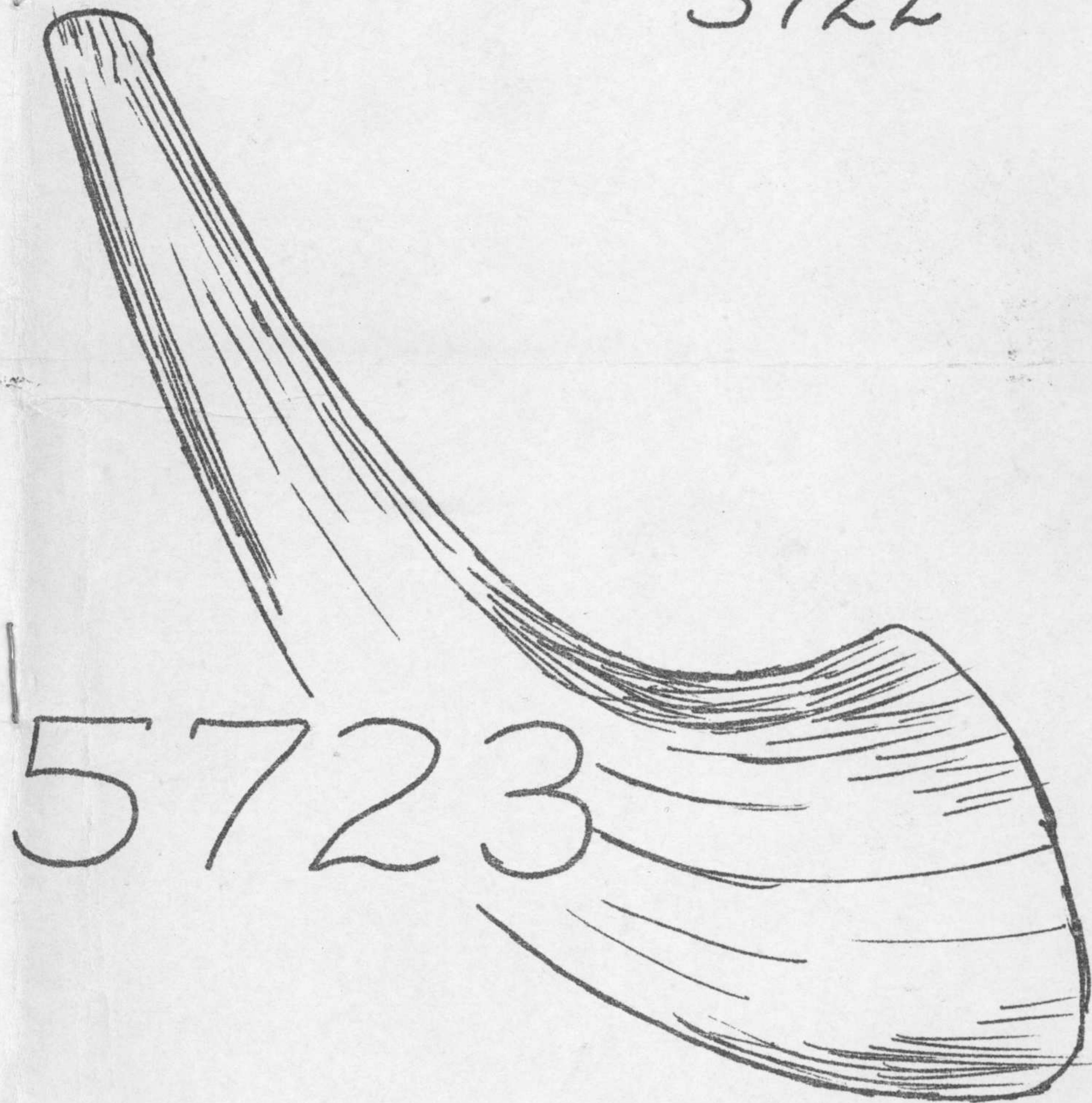

Services will be held in the Synagogue. Due to the large number of people who will be attending these services, seating will be arranged in both the Sanctuary and the Social Hall. At present all seats available have been reserved.

The Congregation Board wishes to inform the membership concerning the arrangements which have been made for the Student Rabbi for the High Holy Days. The Union of American Hebrew Congregations assigns Student Rabbis to their affiliated congregations only. However, in recognition of the fact that Beth Tikvah wishes to remain unaffiliated at this time, the UAHC has agreed to accept a contribution from the Congregation in recognition of the services they have provided to Beth Tikvah.
