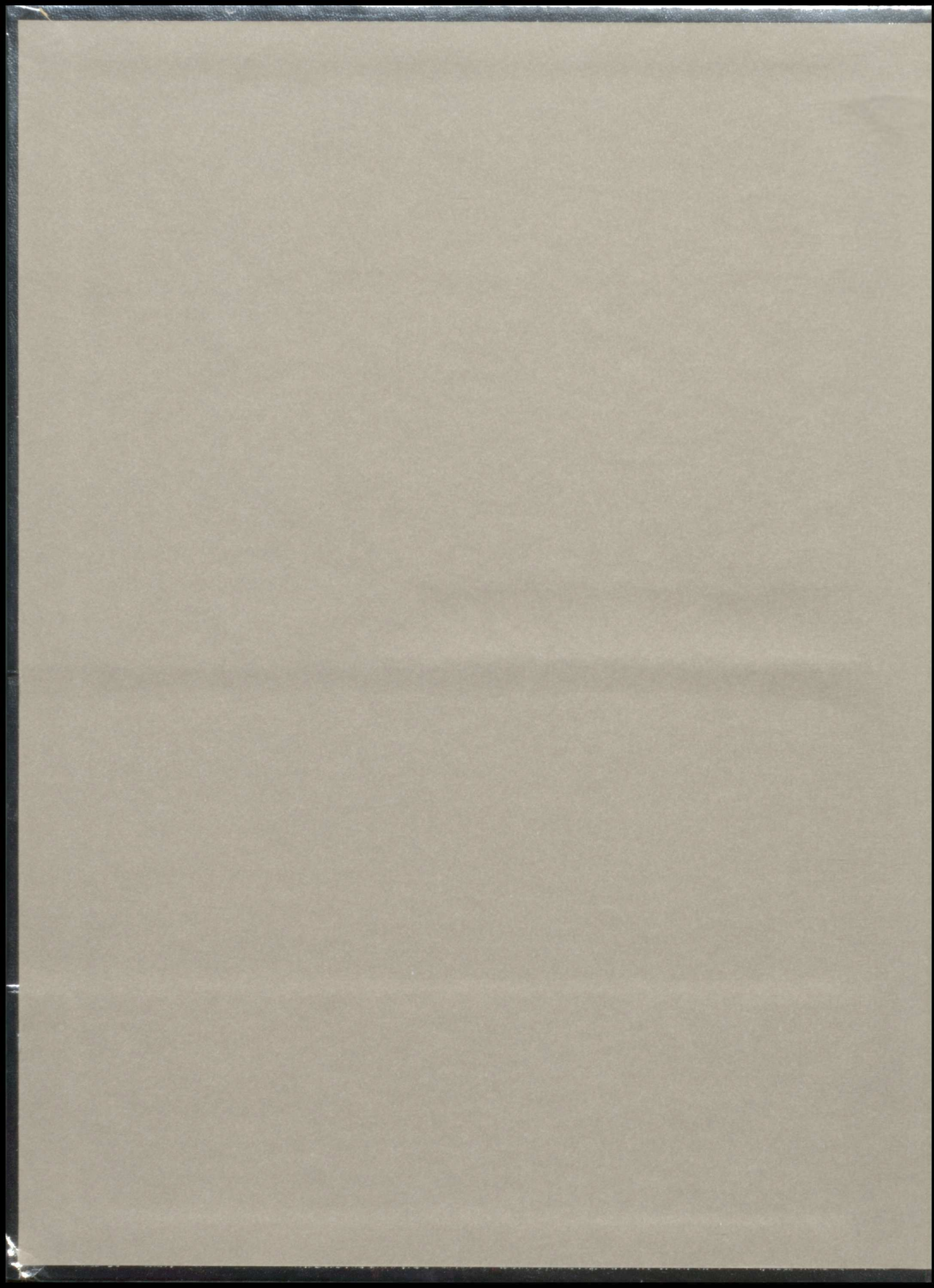
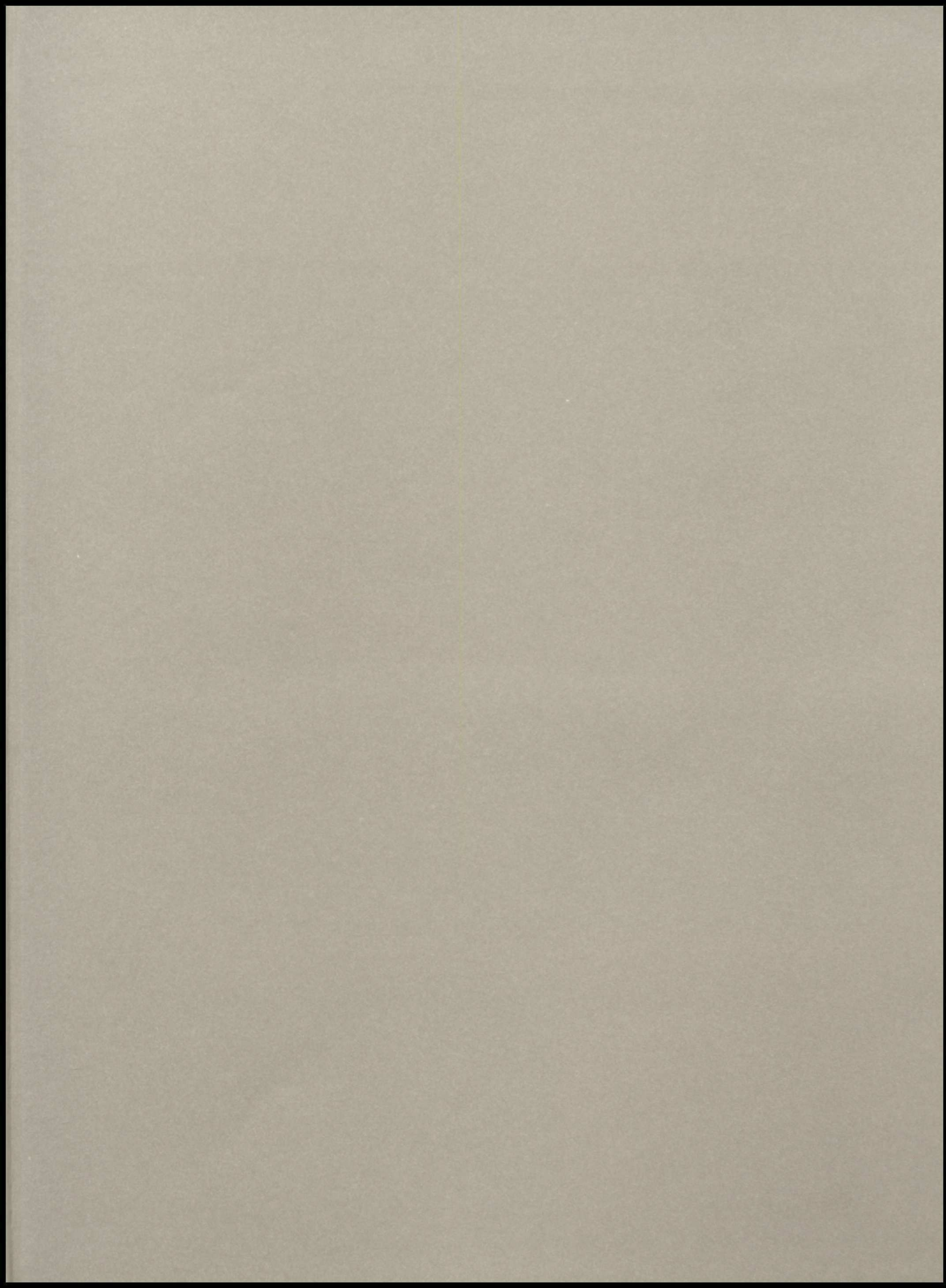
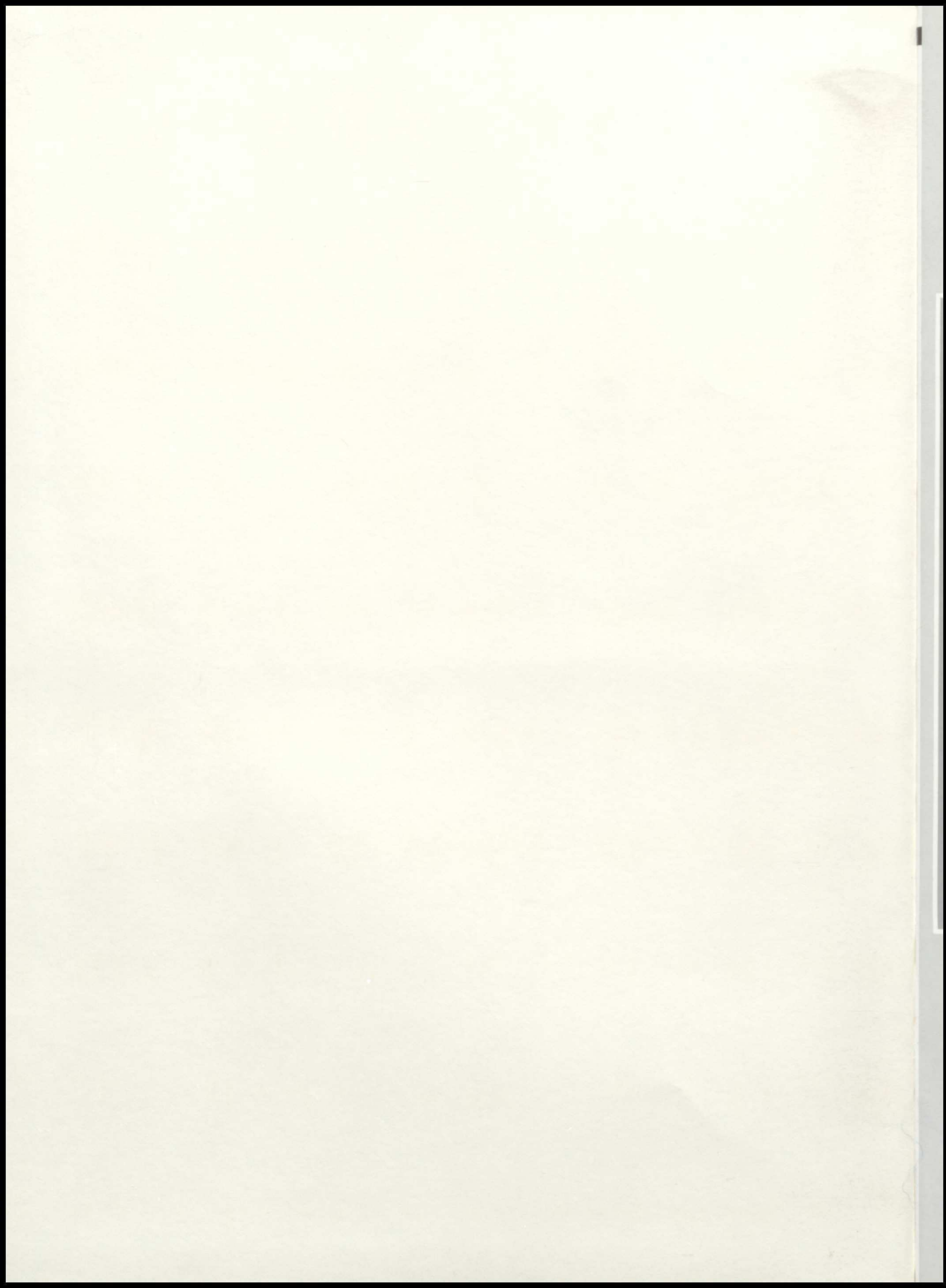

Living up to the statement that Worthington High School is “a shade above the rest” is quite a task; however, our school has succeeded in establishing this very reputation for itself.

“Excellence in Worthington is a tradition,” Vice-principal Ron Porta explains. “We work very hard to ensure that each student receives an education that borders on his potentials. This has come to be expected in our system; however, these expectations weren’t fulfilled overnight.”

This is true. Drama instructor Bronwynn Hopton feels that the tradition in Worthington’s theater department has made it the exceptional program that it is today. “Drama in Worthington is a shade above the rest because it is constantly being built upon. We have a twenty year tradition going. As staff members come and go, they continue to add to our program instead of taking away from it.”

Worthington’s drama department has built itself up to the point where they are able to publicly perform three major productions as well as six or seven additional plays each year. This tradition is largely due to Worthington’s many facilities.

“I feel that facilities enable things to go really well,” states Mark Hutsko, the choir director who filled this position in the fall of 1987. “Our music wing is a relatively new addition. Having this space gives us a distinct advantage over many schools, thereby making us a shade above the rest.”



While the facilities are important, it is also the faculty that contributes to Worthington's success. The science department is one area that has benefited from many qualified teachers. Noel Guity, chair of this department, feels that Worthington's high caliber education is credited to the many well-trained professionals on our staff. “More teachers equals more opportunities for our kids,” he states.

Dr. Brian Knutson furthers this point of view. “This school has a very strong staff who challenge our students every day. Education is a highly valued commodity in our community.”

As well as the teachers who make up the staff at Worthington, the administrators also promote excellence in our school system. Cheryl Geyer, founder of the Severe Behavior Handicap program, presented her concerns to the Worthington school board in 1979. “It takes a very special school system to support a new program such as this,” she states. “With the board's interest and involvement, the SBH program has contributed to make Worthington, a shade above the rest.”

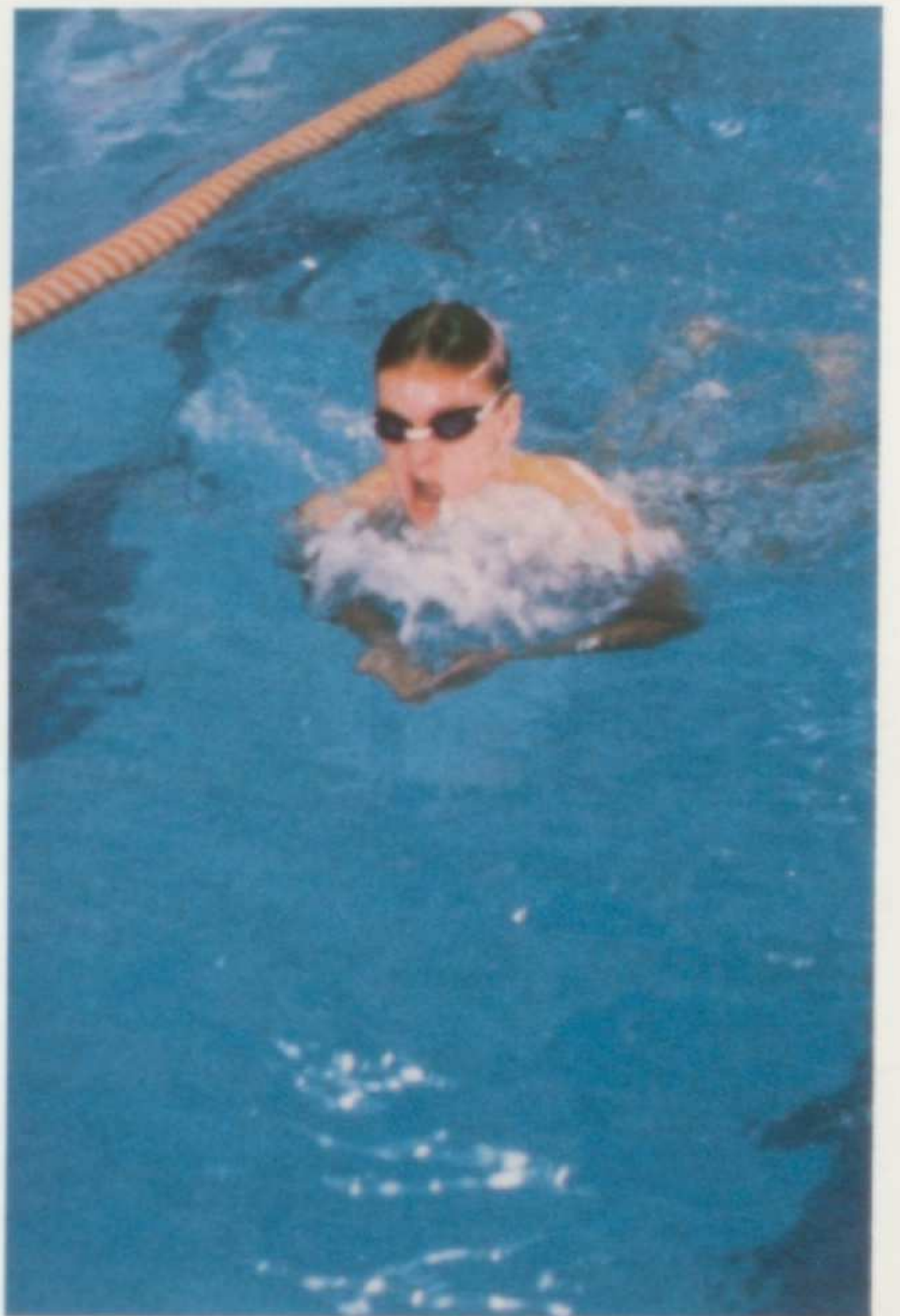
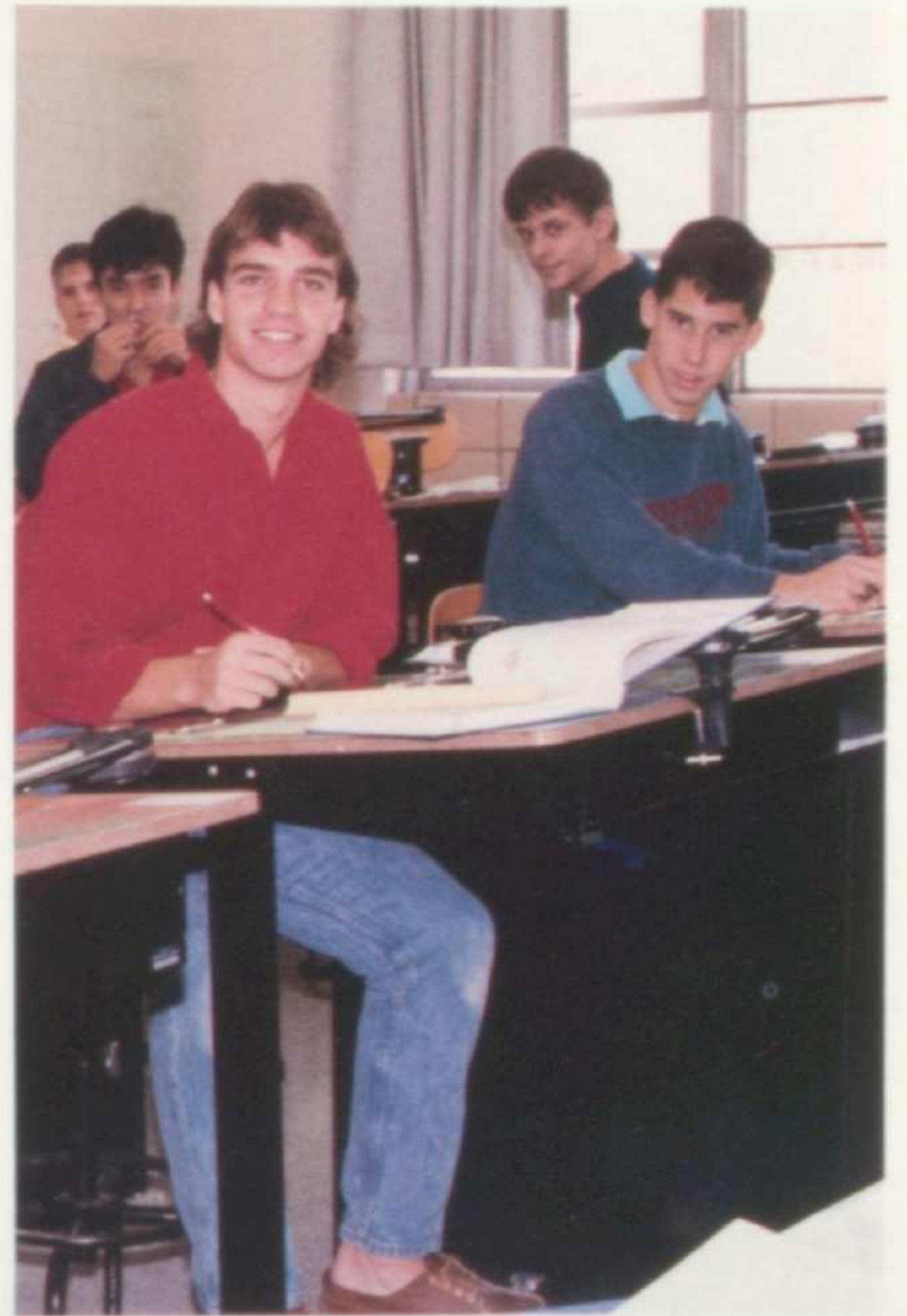

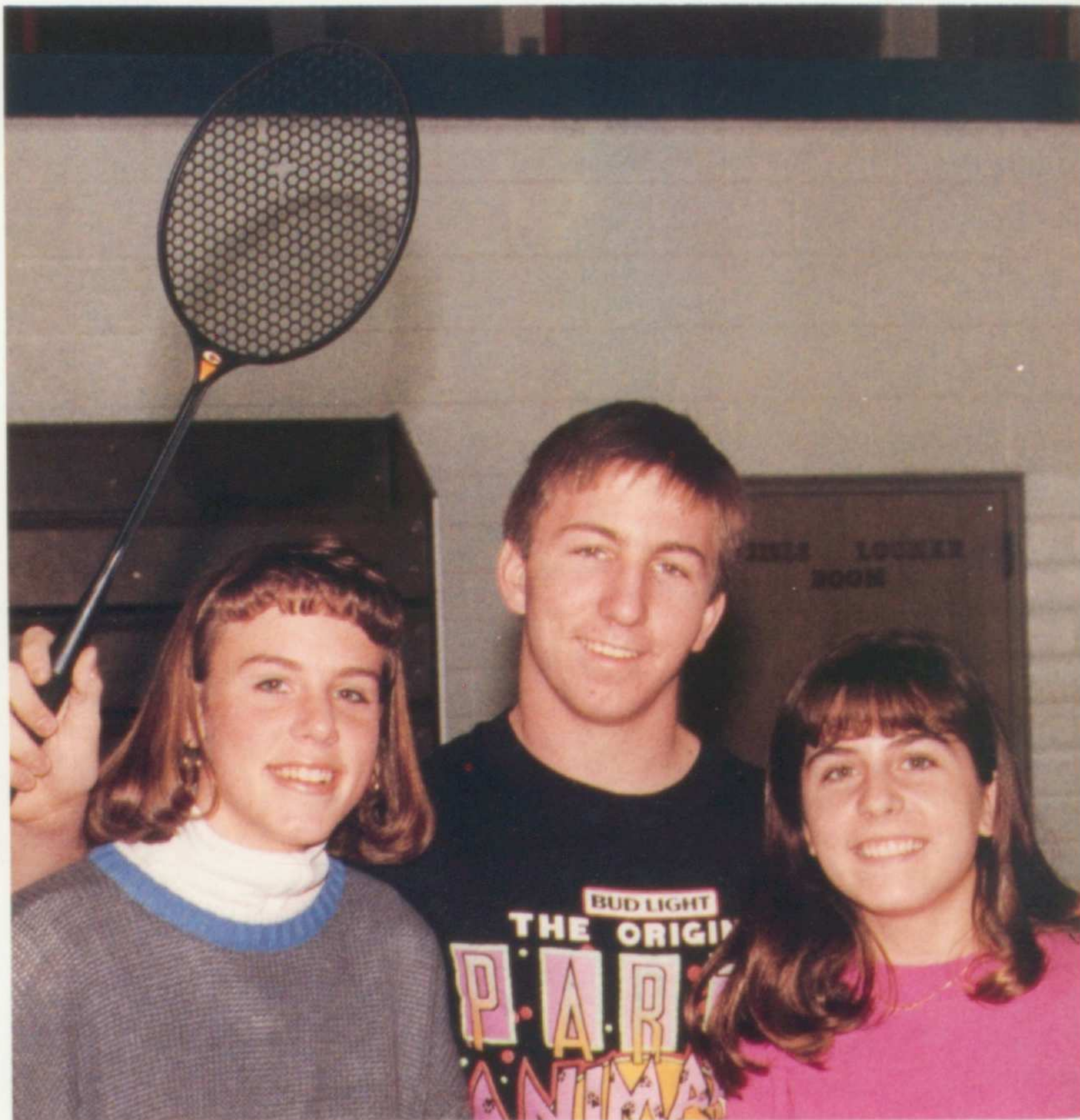

Seils continues, “We find a lot of financial as well as moral support within the community. Our games never fail to produce large turnouts; there are always a number of fans who come to root the teams on.” He also feels that the talent and dedication the kids demonstrate put Worthington a shade above the rest.

Worthington students’ dedication to their school is definitely not something to be forgotten. Their pride in the school is evident both in and out of class. Senior Lora Chosy explains, “Our school has something for everyone,



and that makes it unique.” Julie Hoffman adds, “Worthington has so many activities that it’s hard not to get involved. Everybody has an area that they can fit into.”

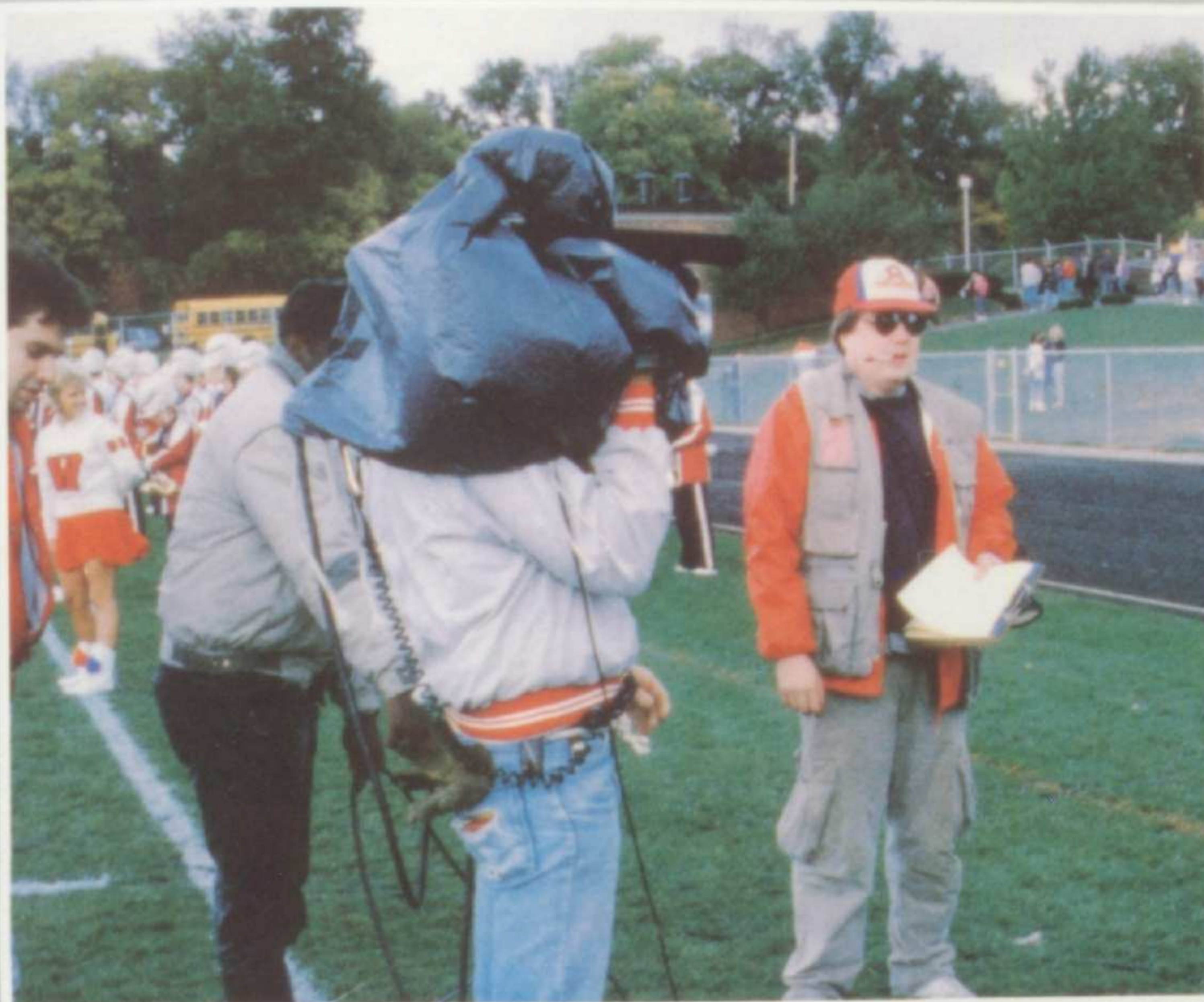

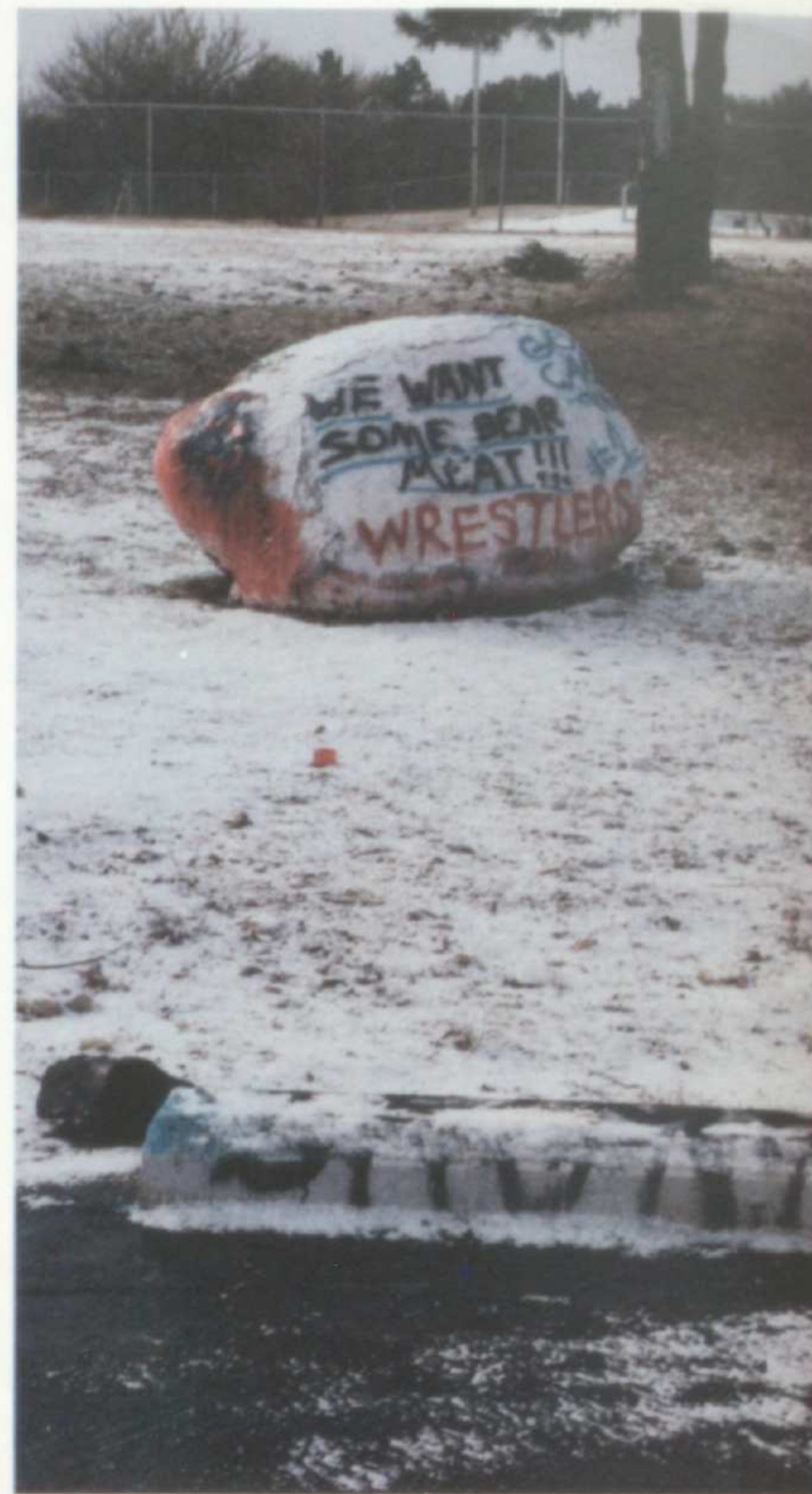
“ . . . A handful of students go beyond achieving average goals . . . ”

Excellence is a standard at Worthington High School. Many students achieve various goals during their high school careers. There are also a handful of students who go beyond achieving average goals. These students are recognized in the Worthington High School Hall of Fame. The constitution of the Hall of Fame states the general requirements; how, when, and why they are chosen.

The general category generally stresses the achievements in scholarship, leadership, and athletics. Any student who has shown outstanding achievement in any one area and has participated with merit in the remaining phases of school life will be considered for candidacy. In any given year, as many as three students may be selected and so honored. No minimum is suggested.

Students who are chosen are seniors. They must also have attended Worthington for at least two years. No one is excluded because of race, color, creed, or sex.

Students named to the Hall of Fame are nominated by the student body and chosen by a student faculty committee. Nominations by the student body are made only by juniors and seniors. No more than the top fifteen nominees by virtue of the number of votes they received from the student body will be accepted for consideration by the student-faculty committee.

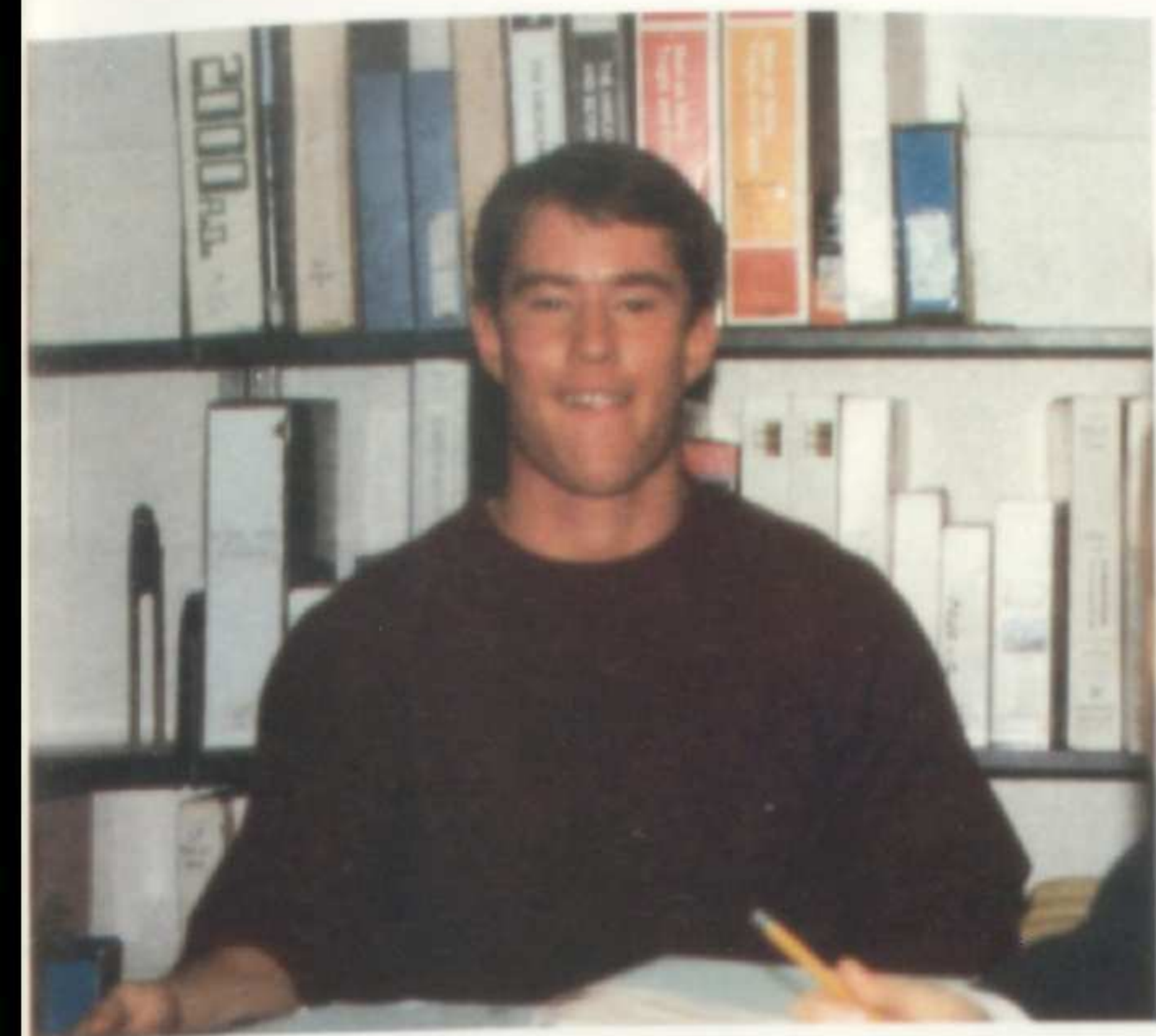

A special ballot form listing all nominees is made available to the committee and all members of the committee must use the special pencils provided to mark the ballots in order to ensure absolute secrecy. The first ballot is used to select the top three nominees. The same ballot and procedure are used to name recipients.

The first person in the Hall of Fame is James Baily, who graduated in 1956. He played basketball all four years,



football for three years, and baseball for four years. He also participated in Hi-Y for four years, student council four years, (President his fourth year,) class president two years, NHS two years, plus the operetta one year. He maintained a 4.0 grade point average throughout all of this.

Many students hope to some day have their portrait hanging in the Hall of Fame. A few will find their picture on the famous wall because the students that go to Worthington High School take pride in their Alma Mater and would like to see Worthington stay as it has been for a long time: “A shade above the rest.”

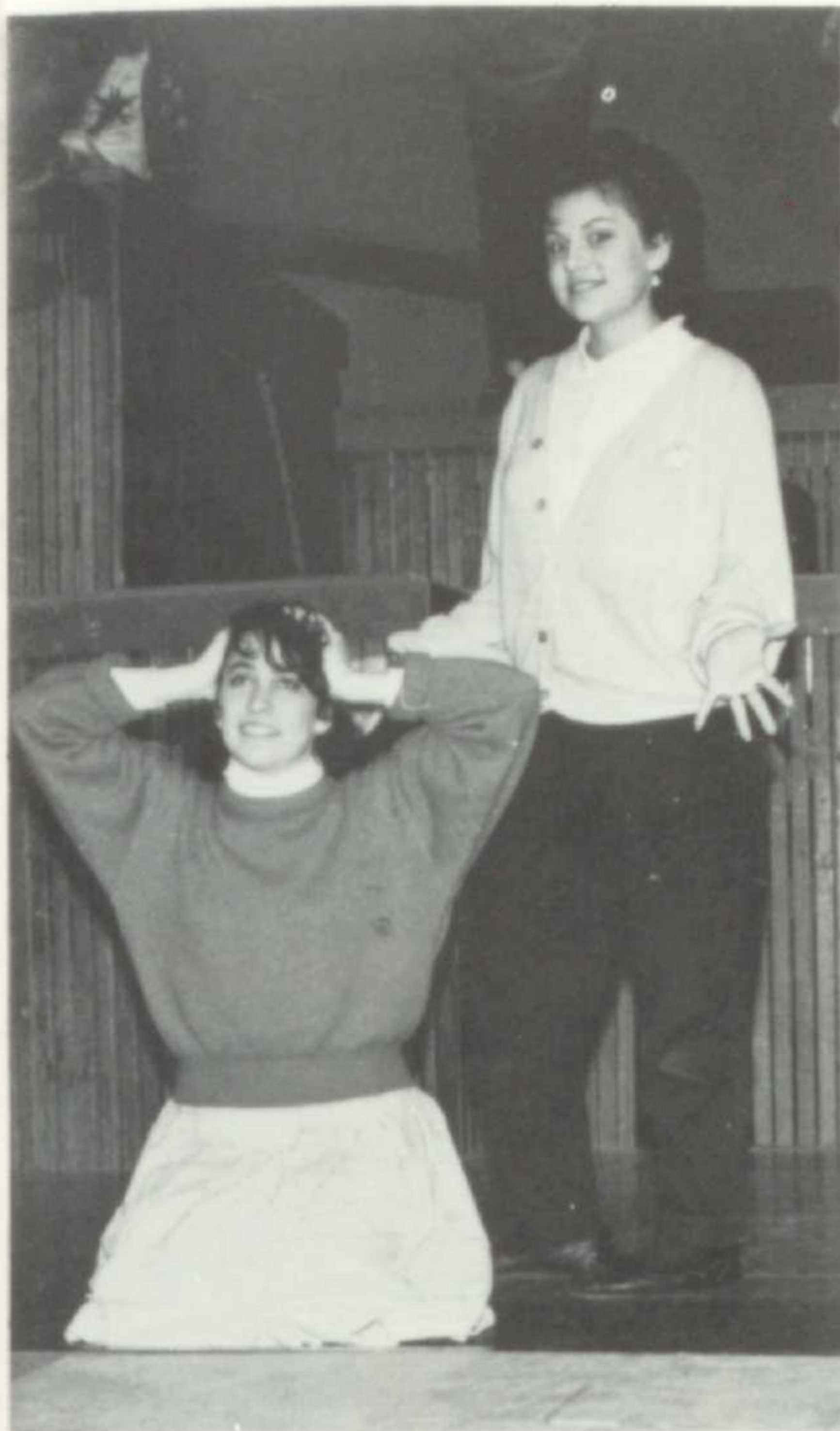

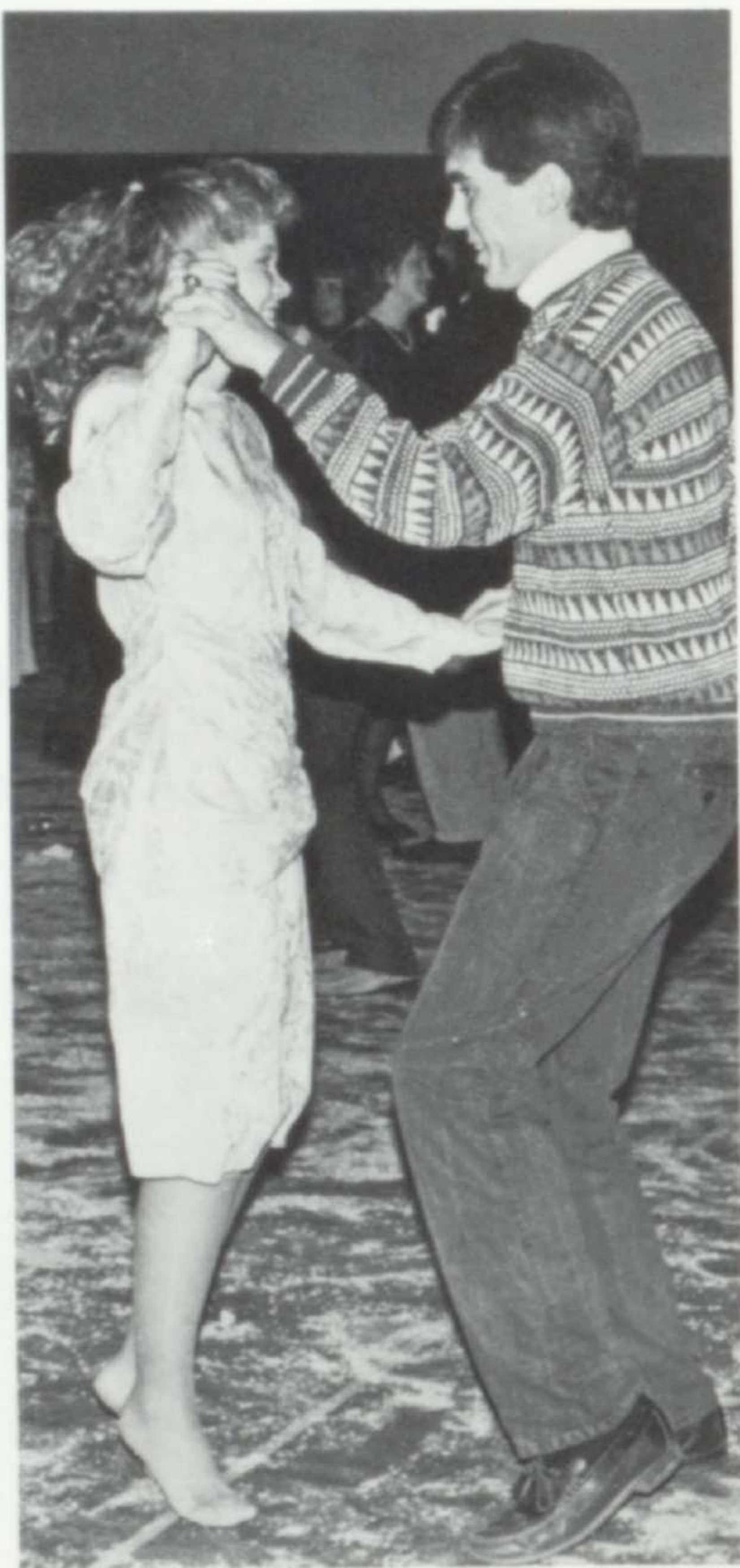

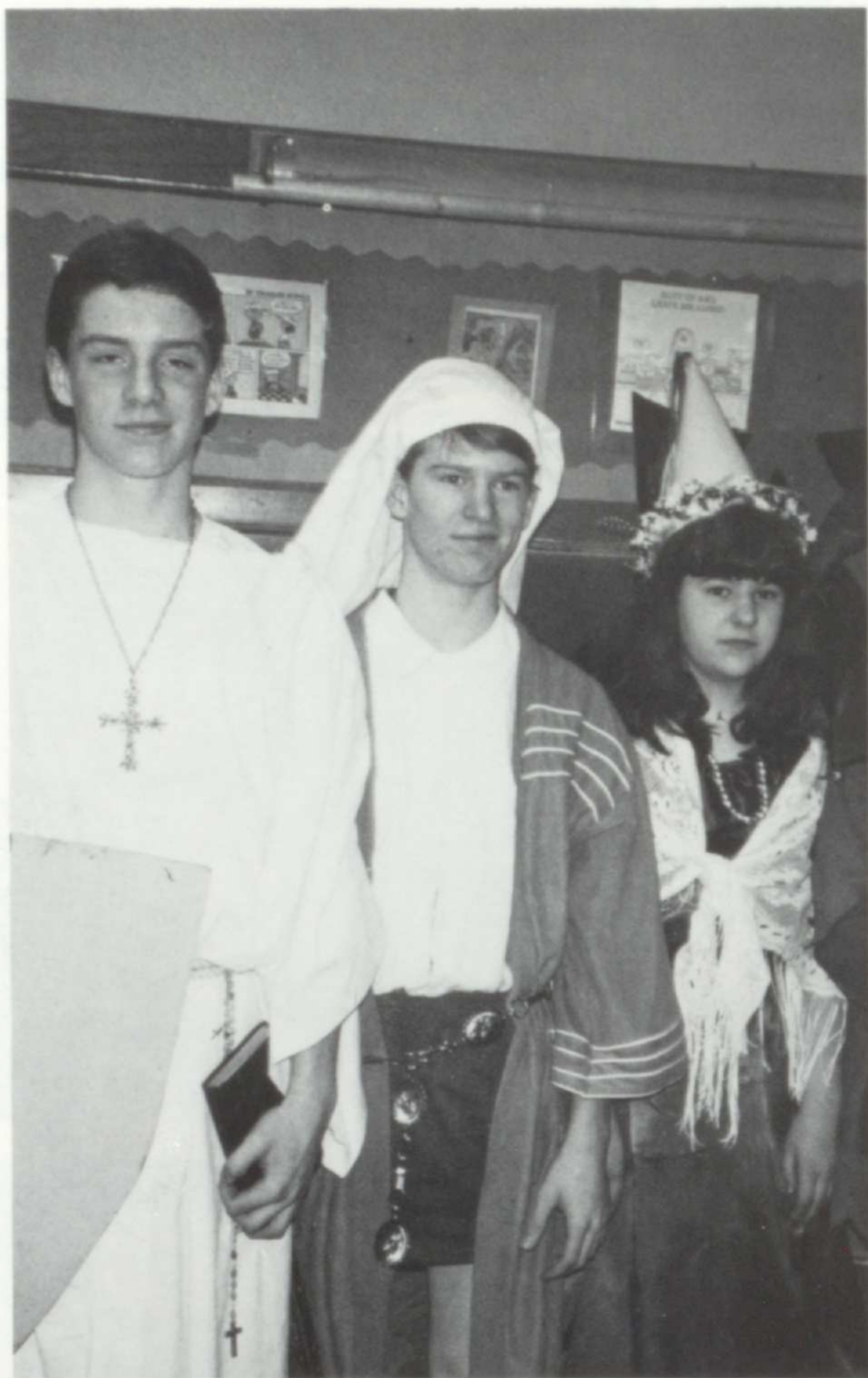

the Worthington Library to view videos on the Renaissance Days. The videos portrayed the life of the people and activities during the Renaissance times.

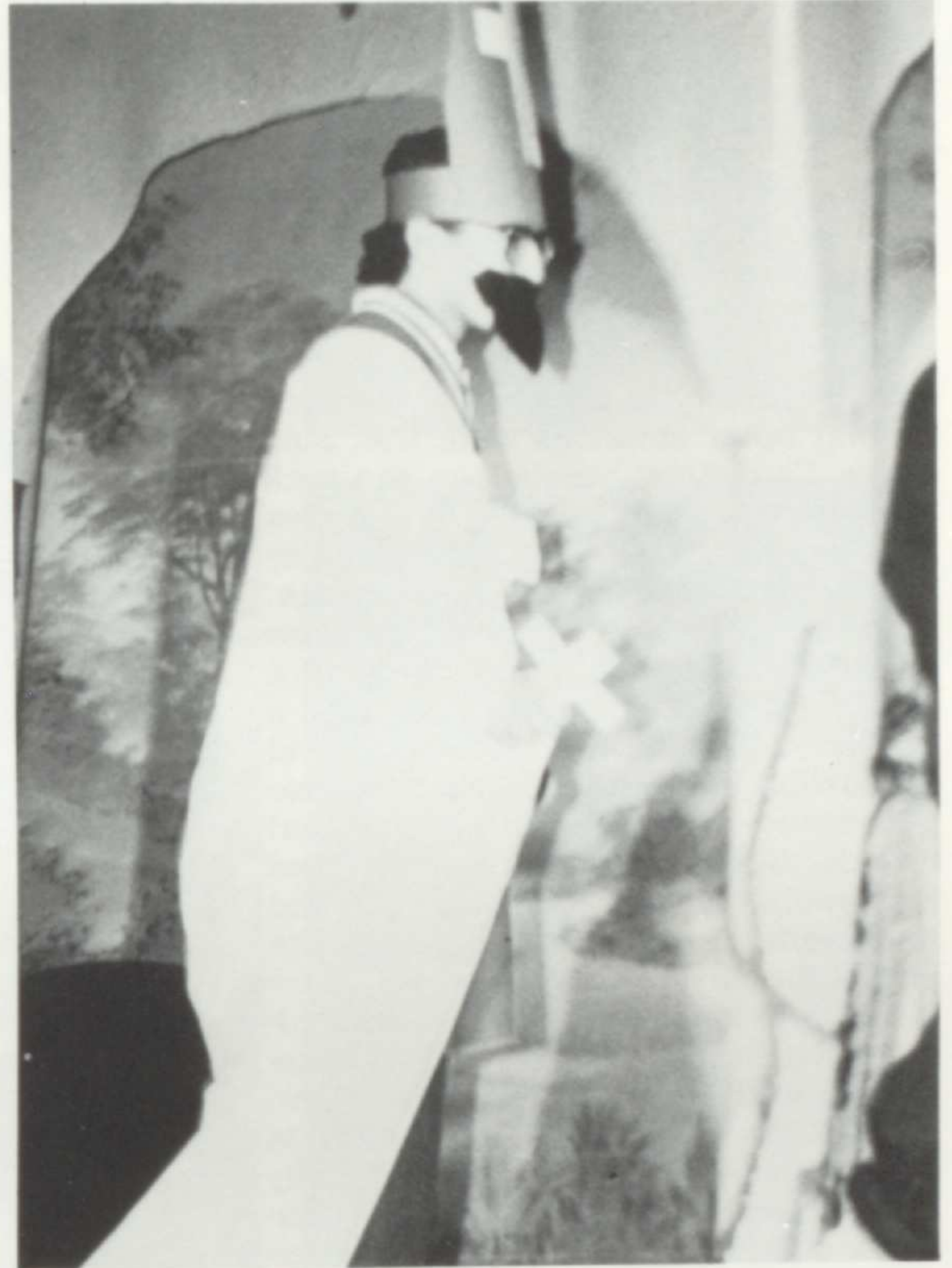
To walk through the halls of Kilbourne was truly a walk back through time. All sorts of handmade shields were hung upon the walls.

The Senior dinner is meant to be a casual gathering for all seniors.

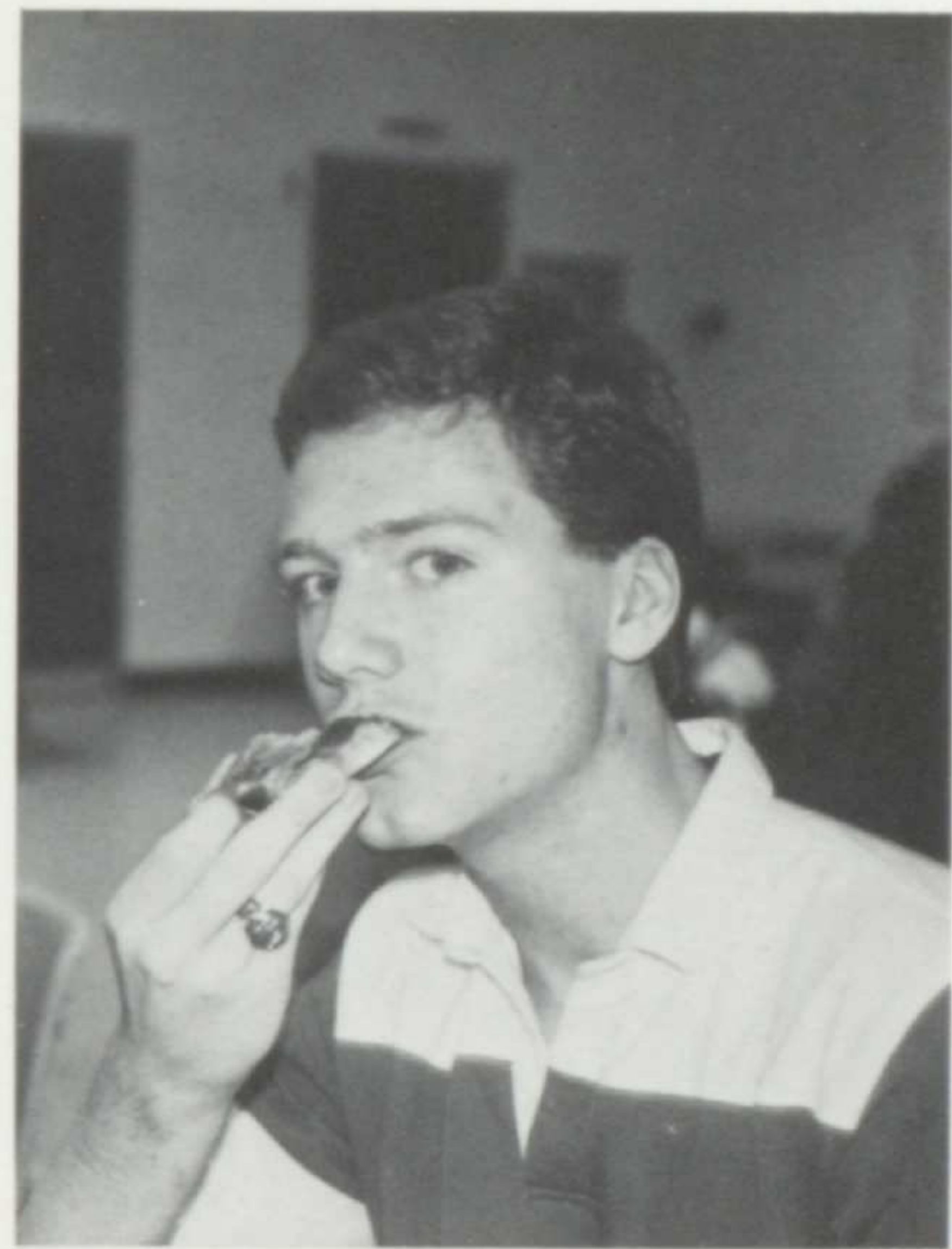
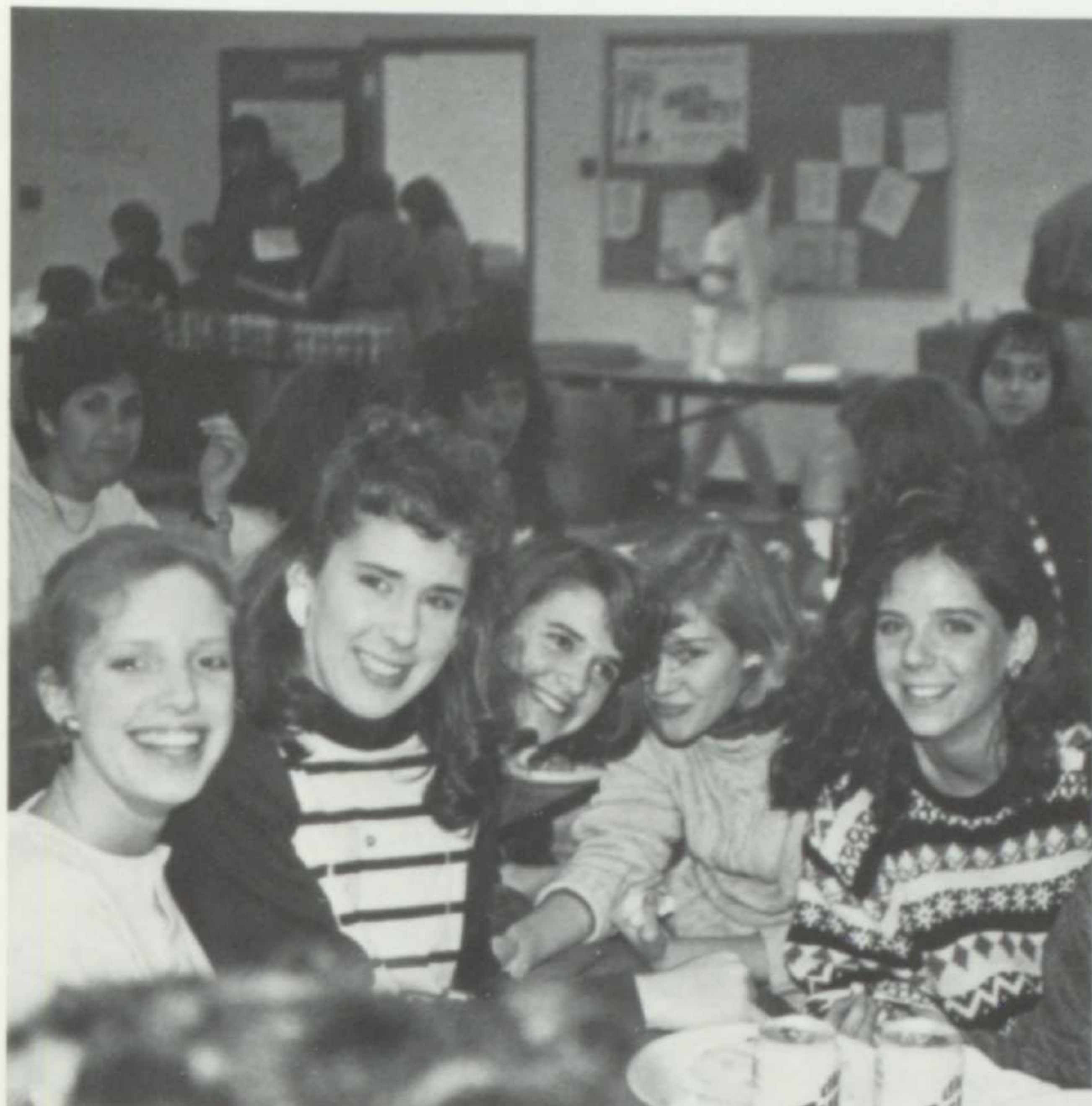

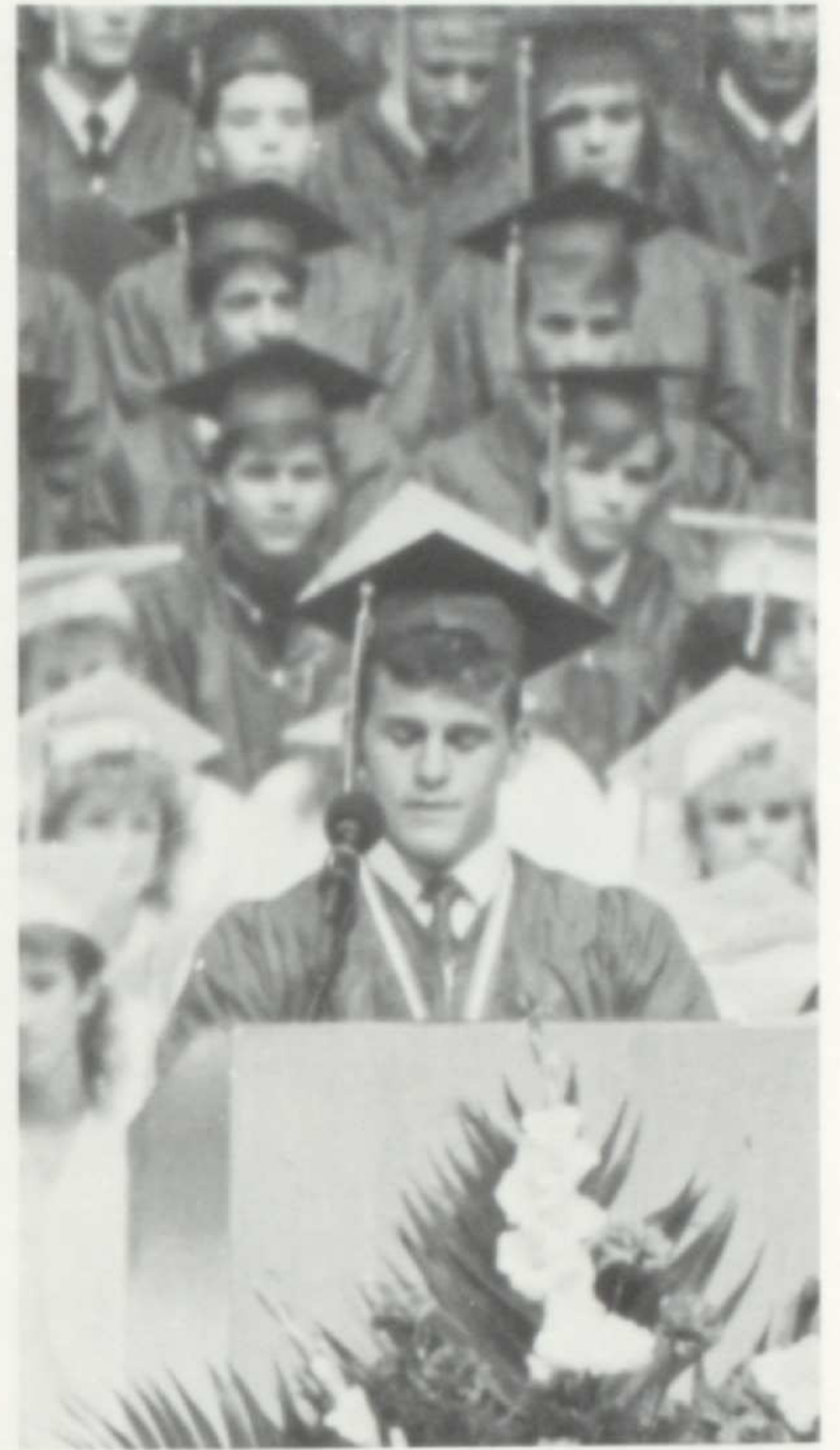
June 7, 1988 marked the beginning of an end for Worthington High School's Class of '88. It was on this day, after years of hard work, that the 109th annual commencement was held.

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"There is no cure . . . other than graduation."

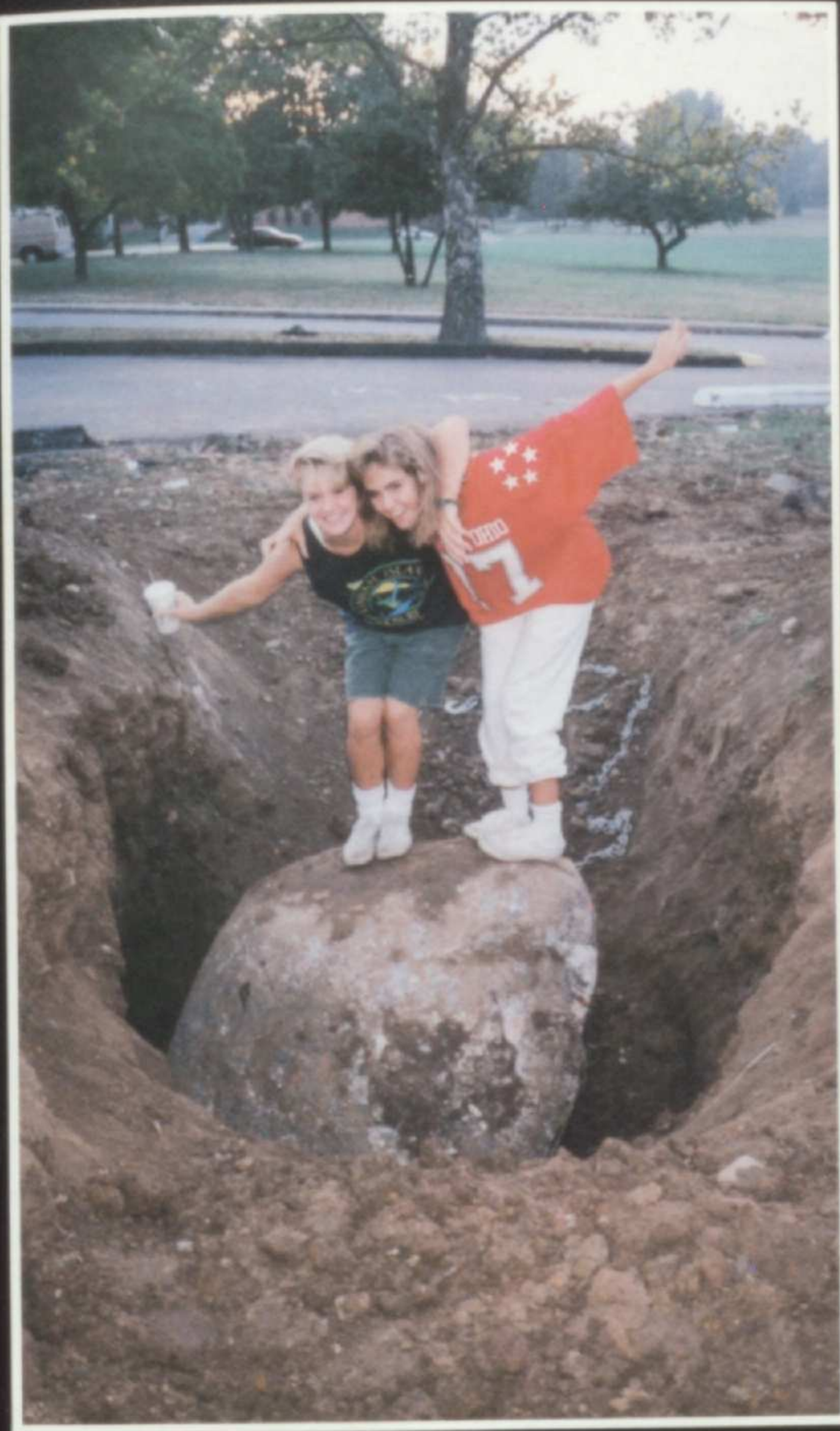

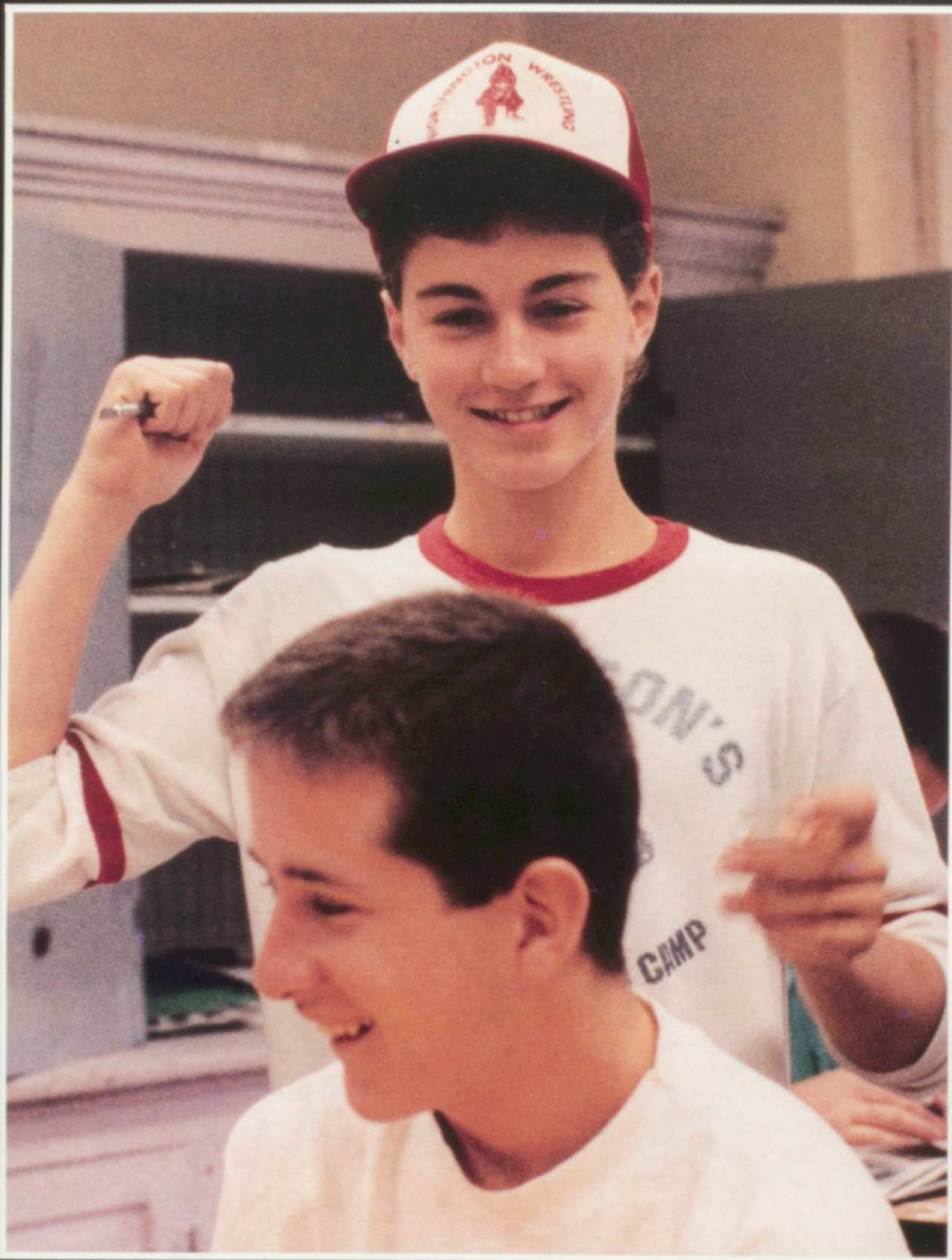

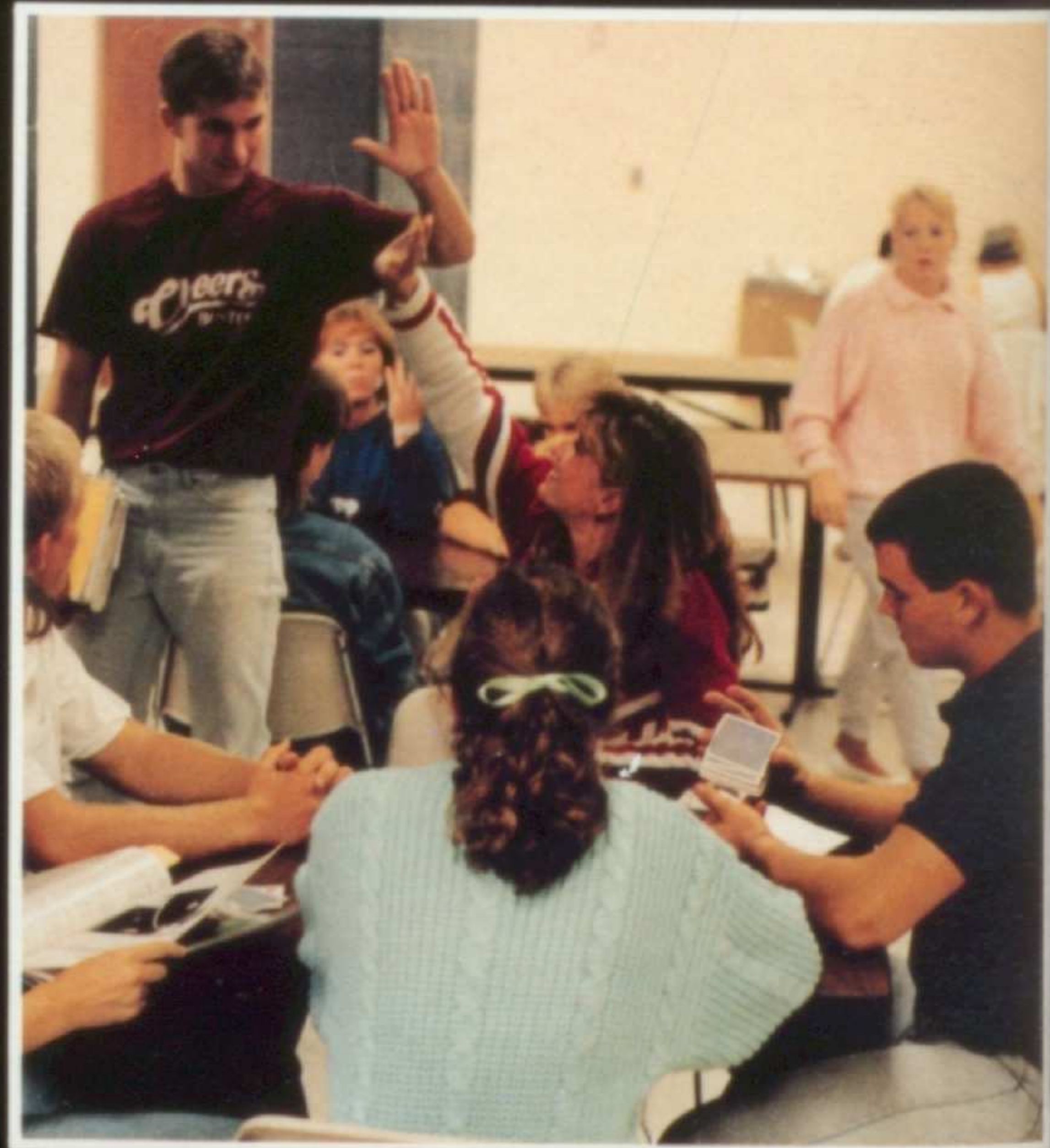

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great opportunity for one to develop creative skills.

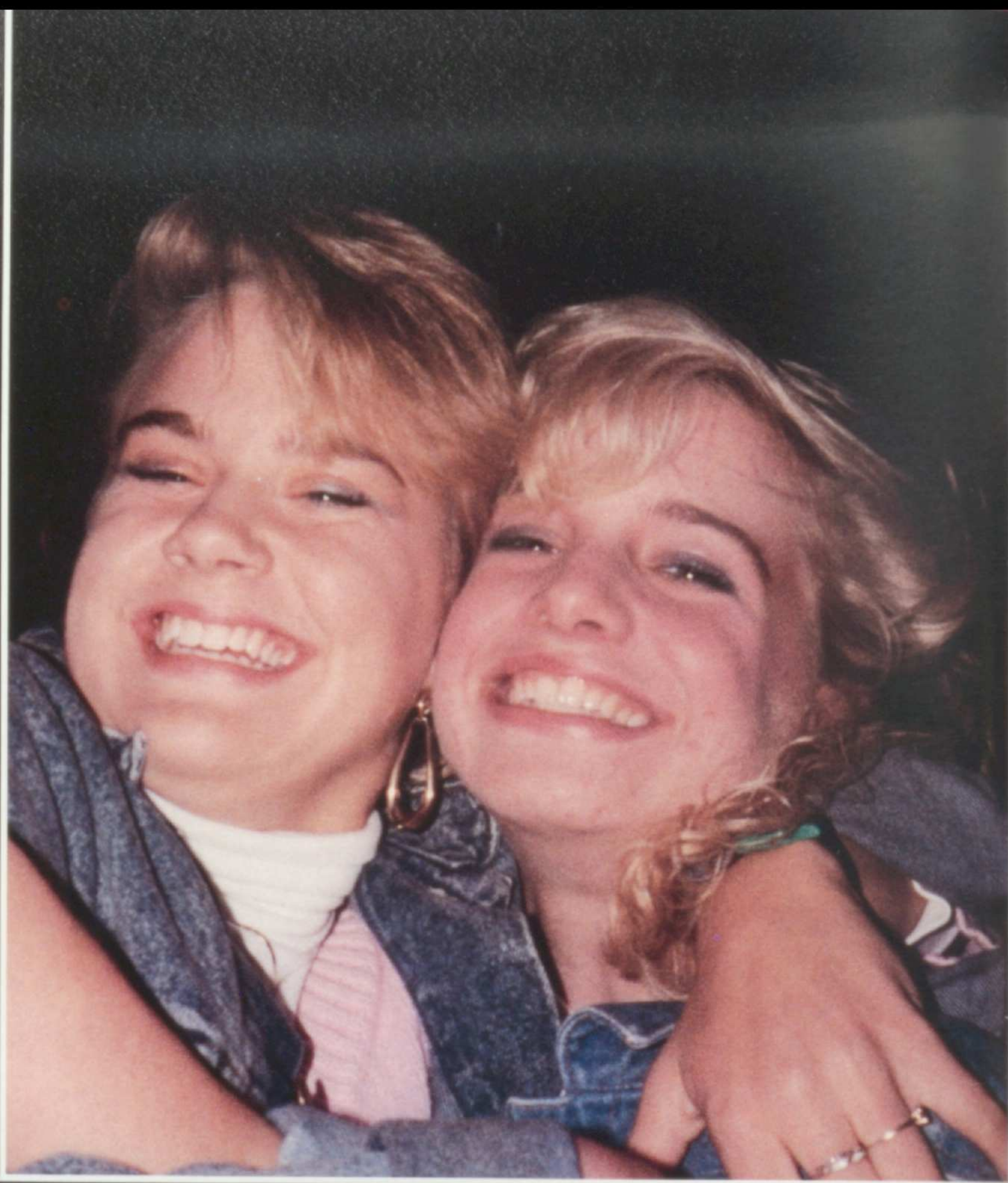

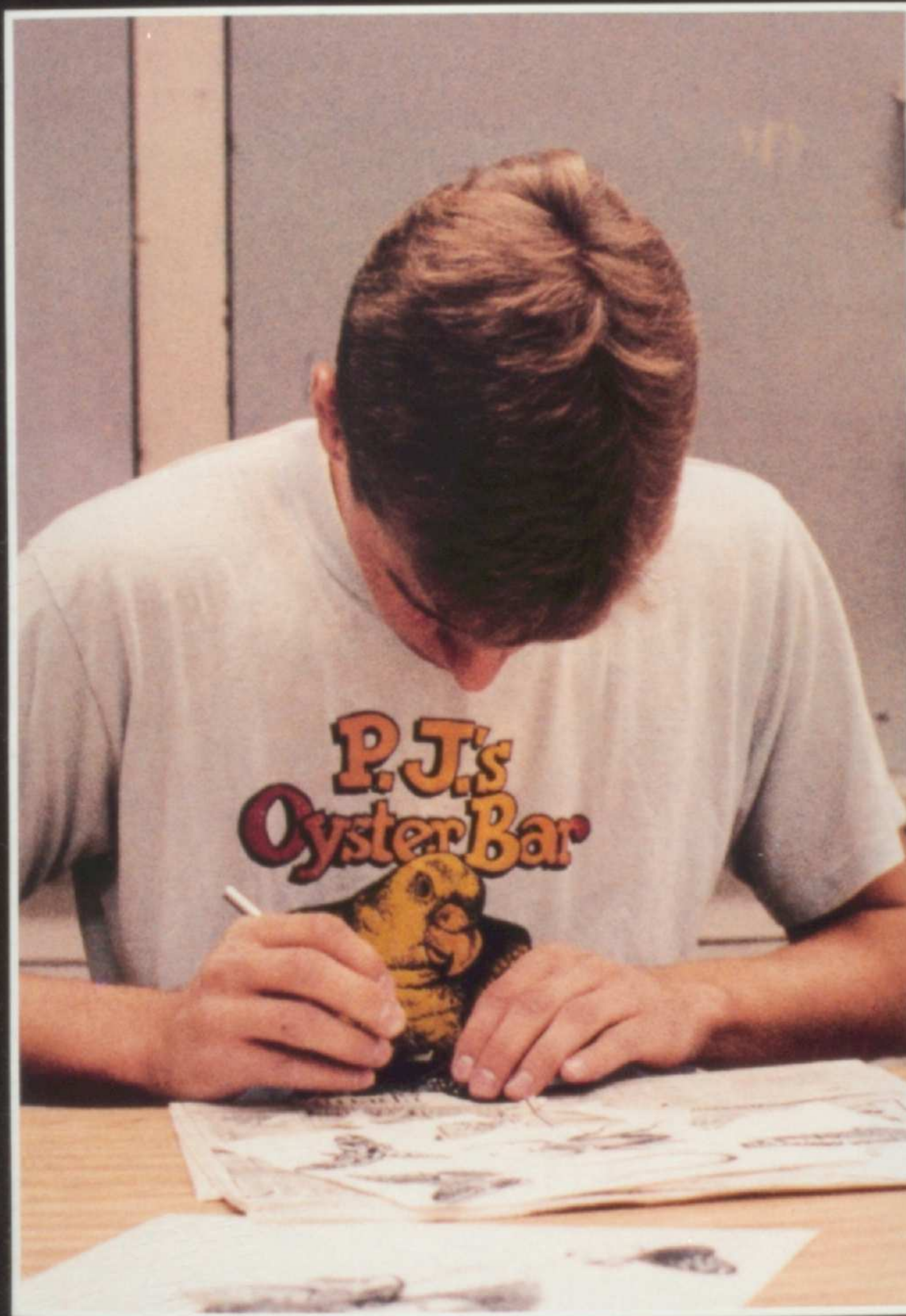

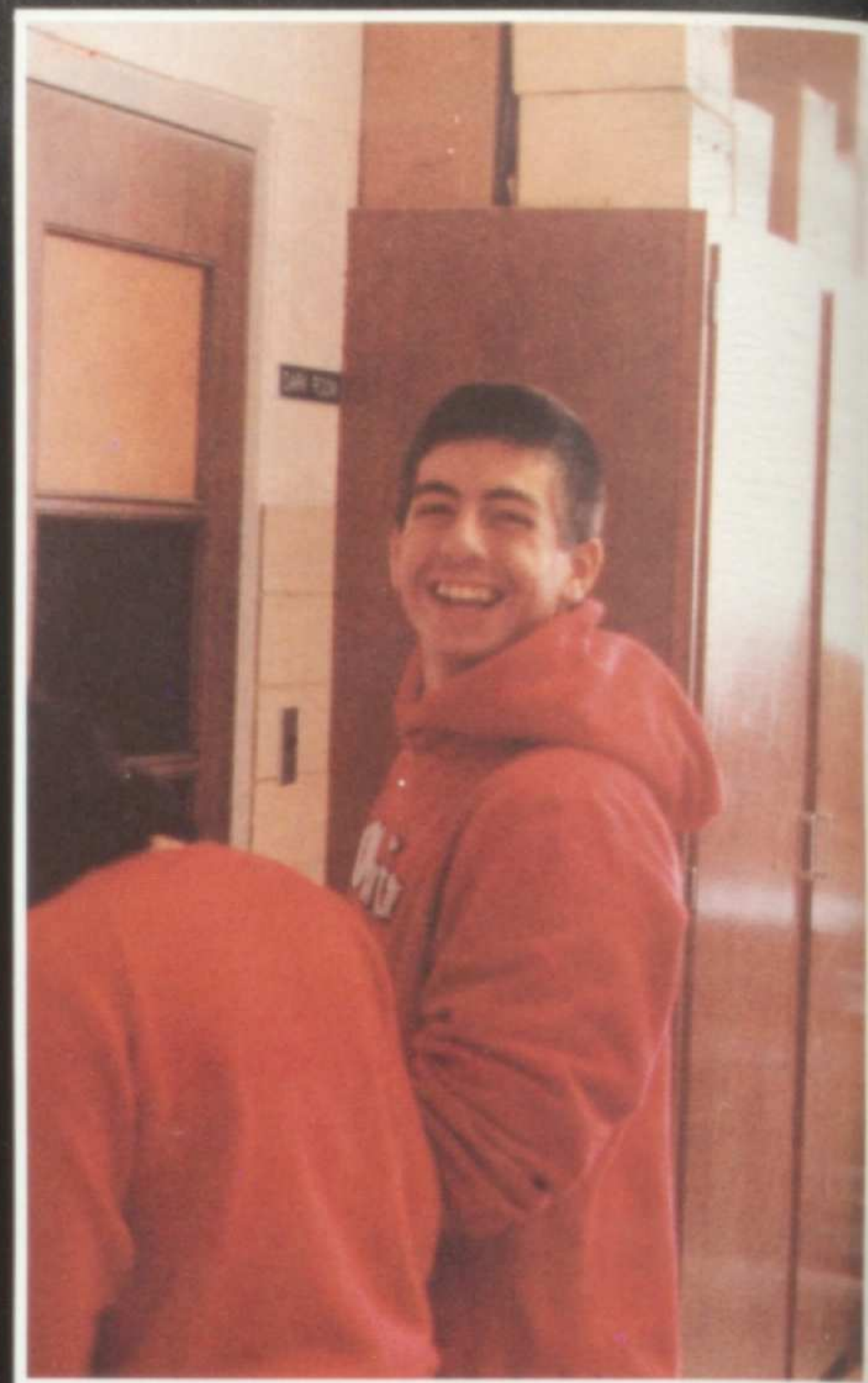

## SATs and ACTs Worry Students

Every year a large portion of the junior and senior classes find themselves spending four hours on a Saturday morning taking the SAT or ACT tests. The SAT, Scholastic Aptitude Test, and ACT, American Collegiate Test, are often required as one decisive factor in college acceptance. The SAT measures one's math and English skills, whereas the ACT tests the student in math, English, social studies, and science. In the opinion of Robin Pritchard, "The SATs measure the exposure you've had and ability to apply abstract concepts, whereas the ACT seems to test what work you've put into learning basic school subjects."

There is a difference of opinion, though, on whether these tests are an accurate way of measuring intelligence and adaptability to college. Jacquie

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Spratt says, "Colleges shouldn't base their decisions so much on SAT and ACT scores. It's not how smart you are. It's how hard you're willing to work." In addition, Ann Miller believes, "They are not fair because some kids test well, others don't. Colleges shouldn't base their entrances on them." Amy Zepp goes so far as to say that the tests should be banned.

On the other hand, some people find the tests a good challenge to prove a person's academic ability. Tienfong Ho says, "It is possible to study for these tests, but it takes an incredible amount of time and perseverance. Those students who are willing to put effort into the tests usually do well. These tests will help single out those students from the rest."

The SAT and ACT tests are merely one factor used to judge a student's ability. However, for many people who are on the borderline for college entrance, good test scores are a definite bonus. Andy Jacobson truly enjoys taking the test. He says, "I love them. Everyone should take them several times."

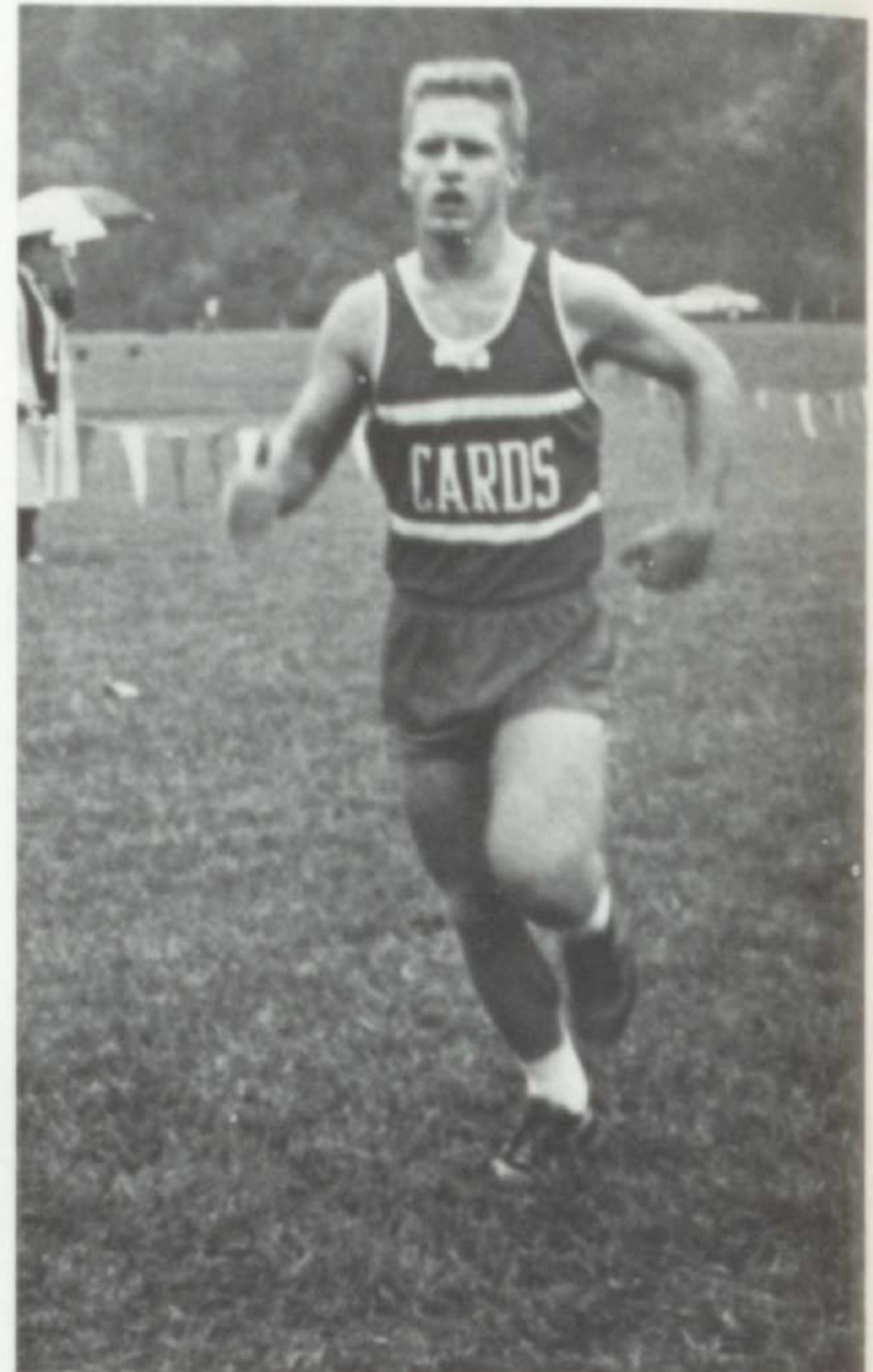
# Most Successful Team to Date

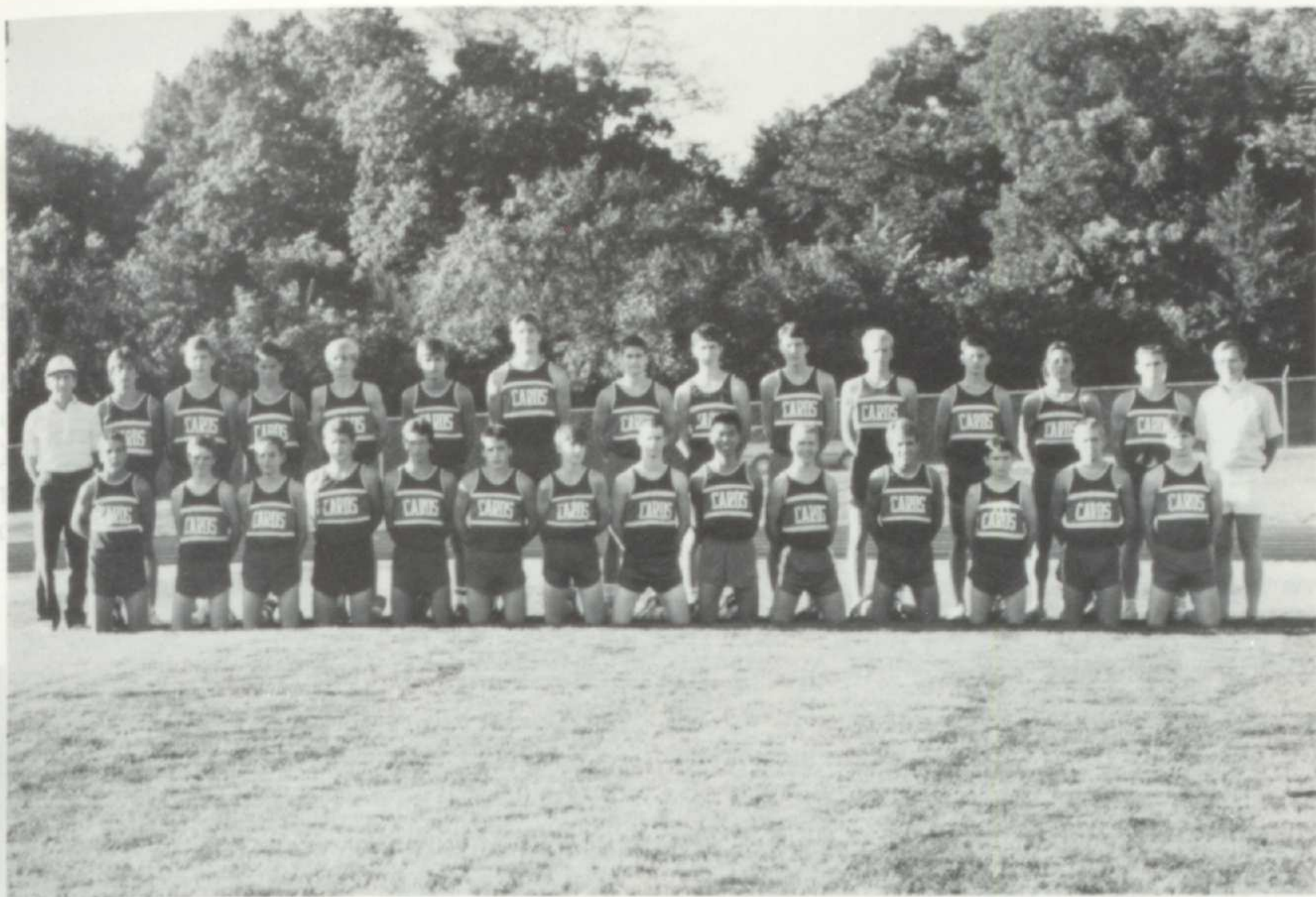

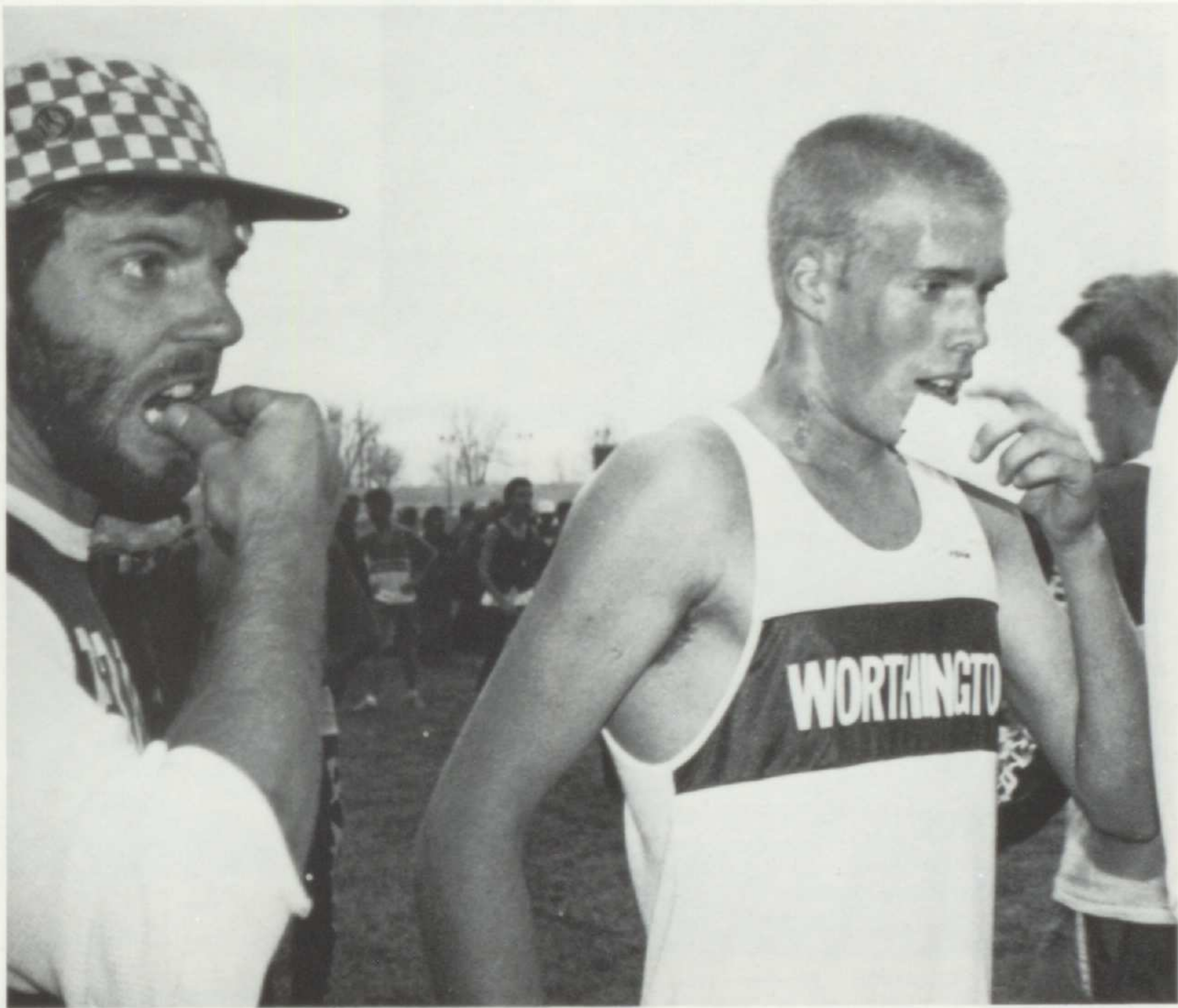

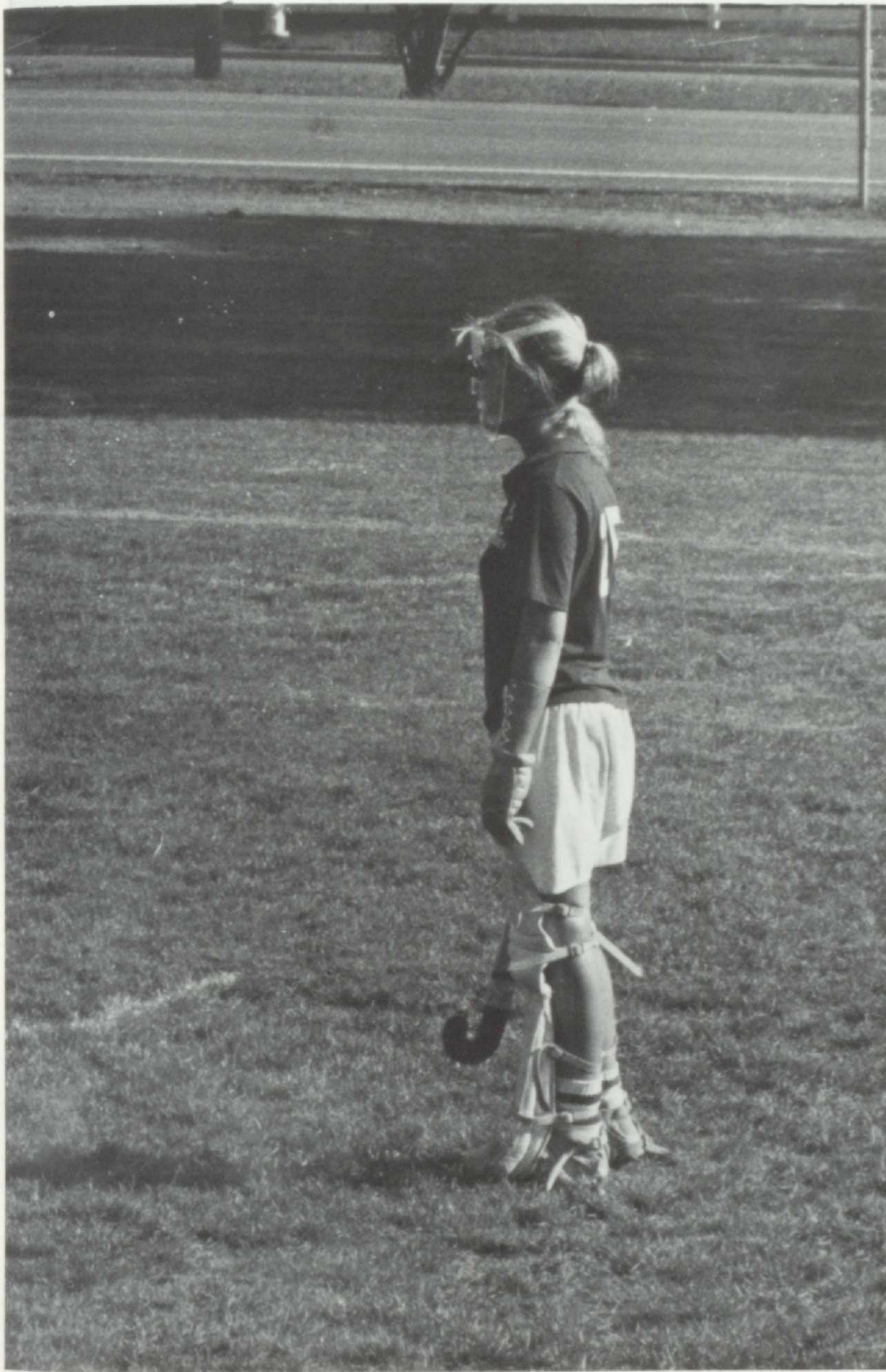
# Hockey is second in League

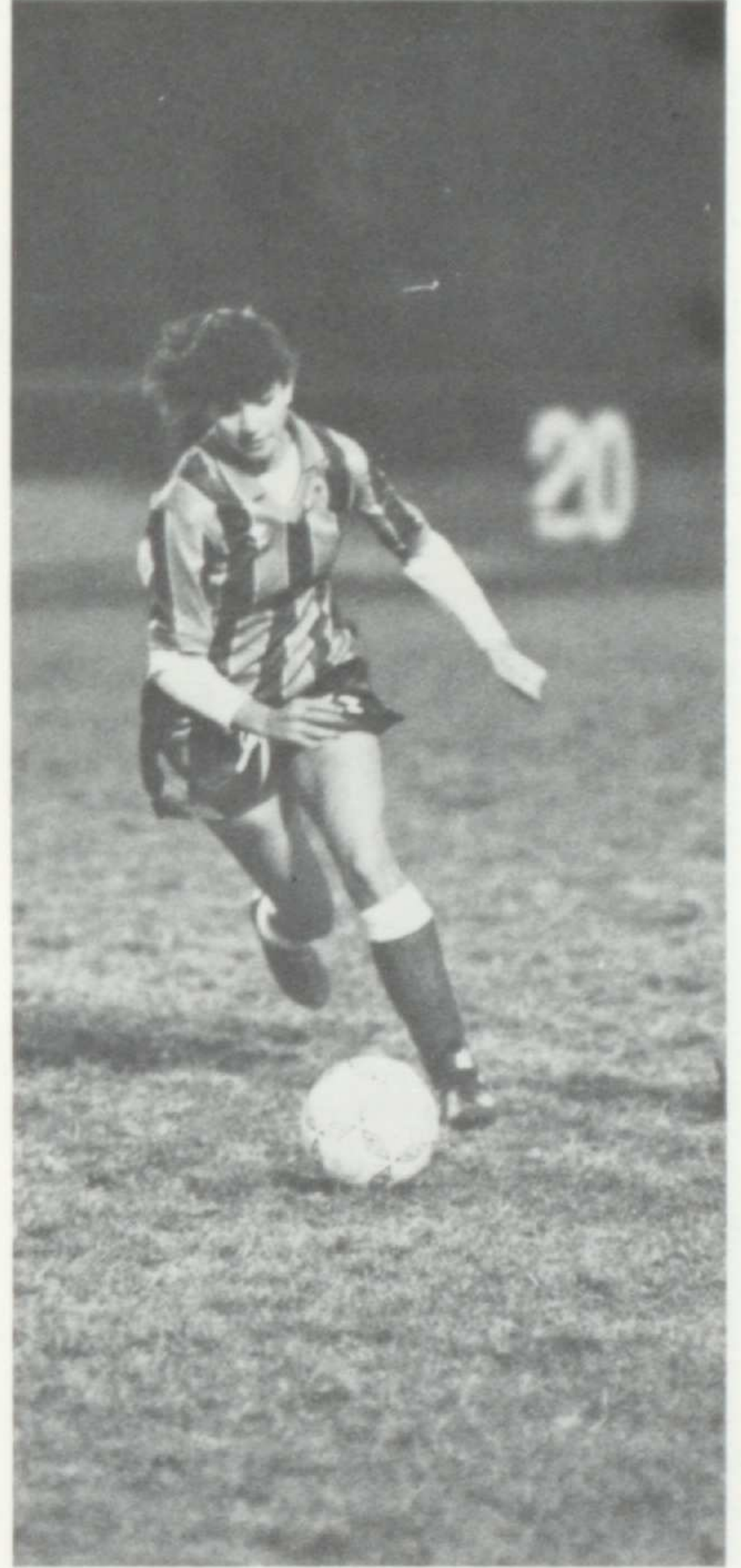
# Lady Cards are the team to beat

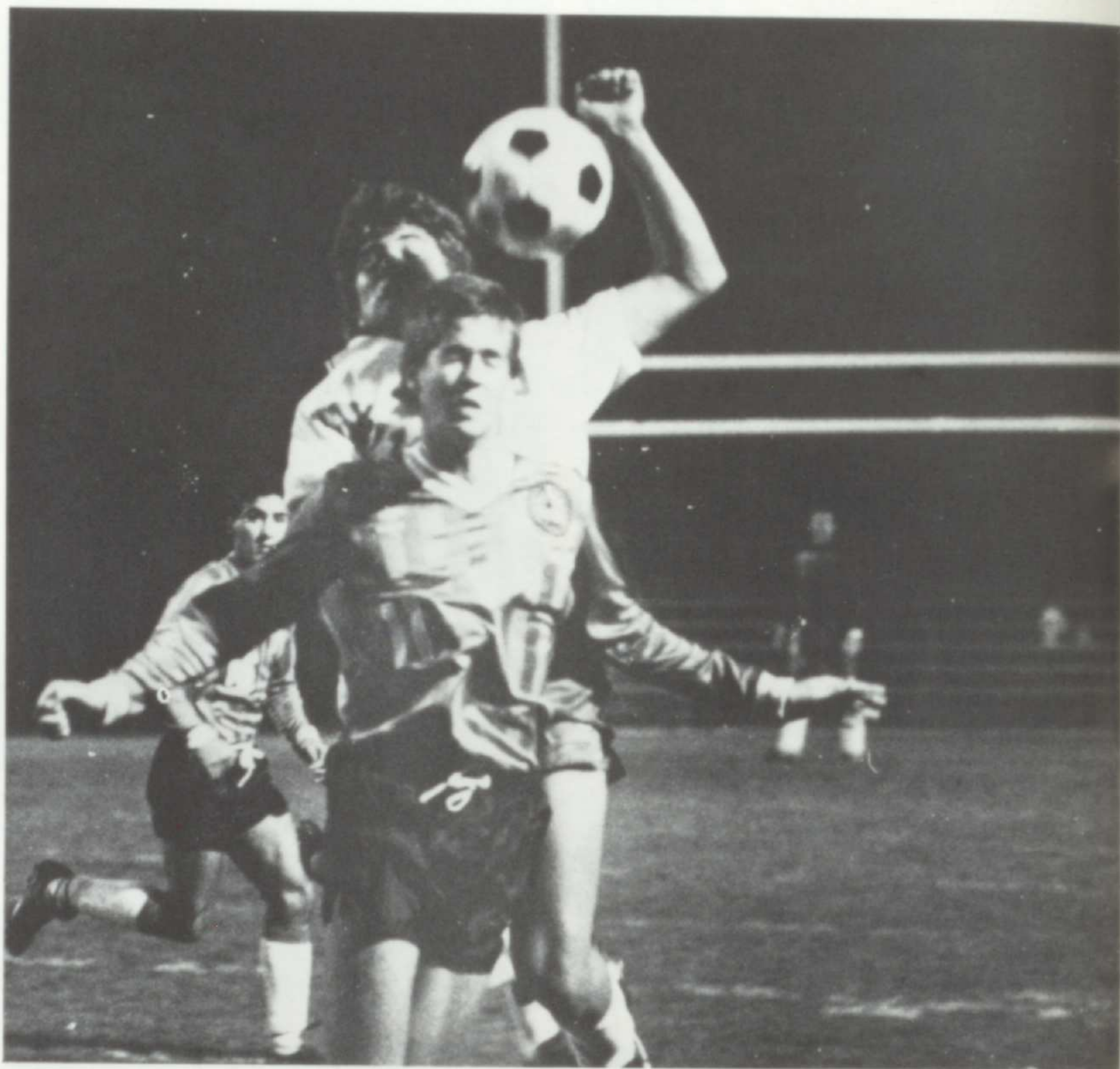

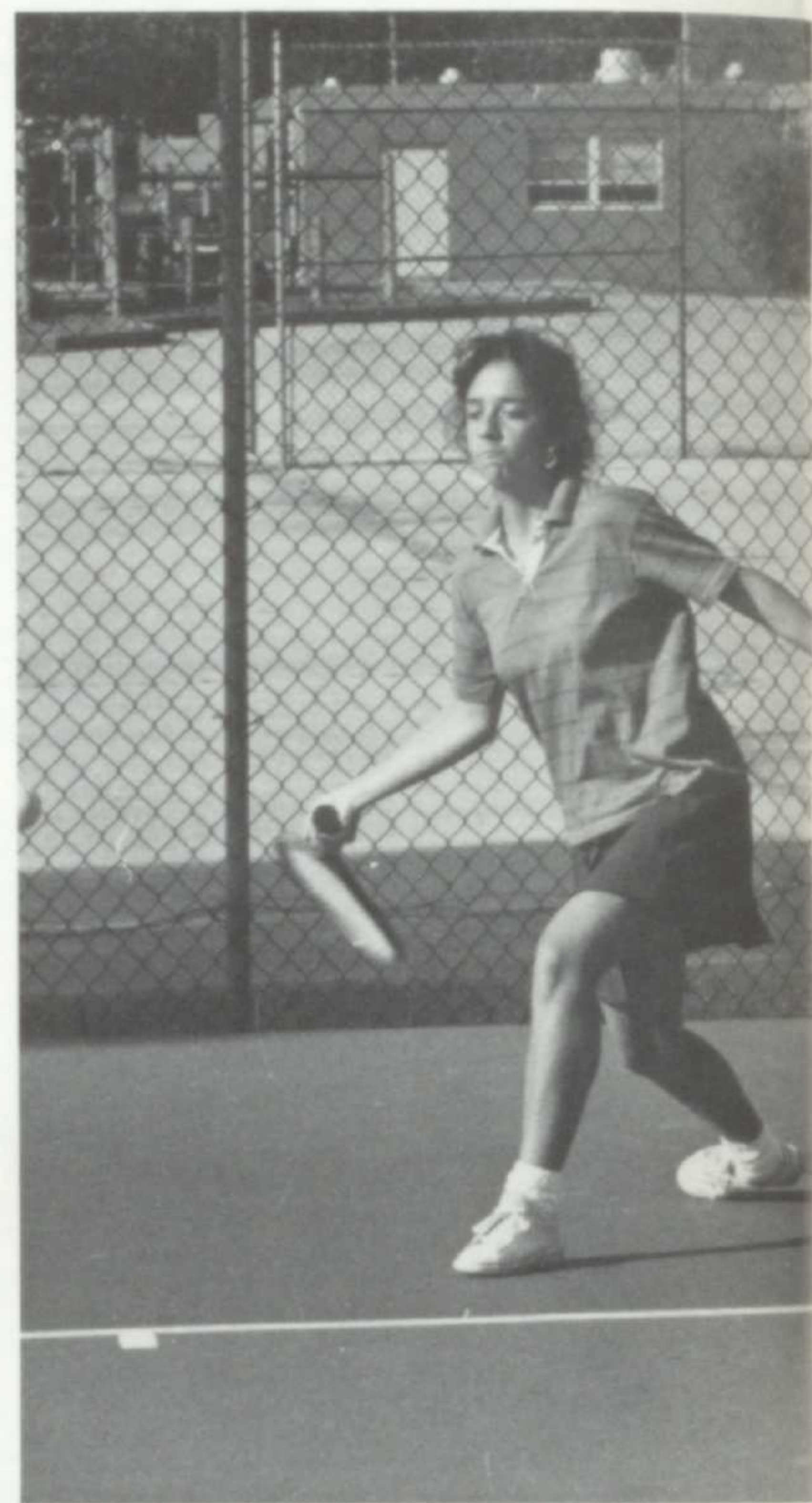
# Kristin Osmond is State Champ

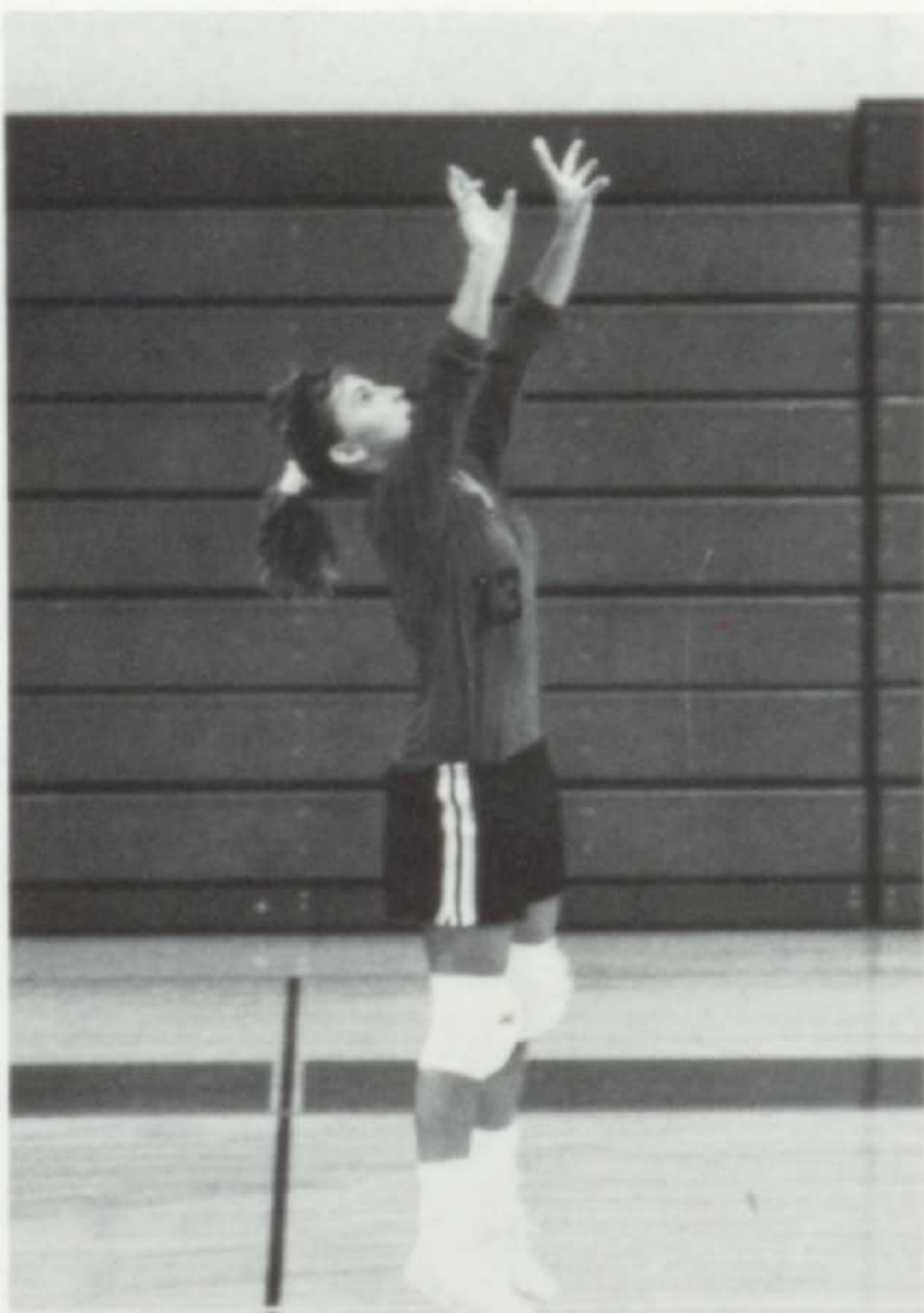

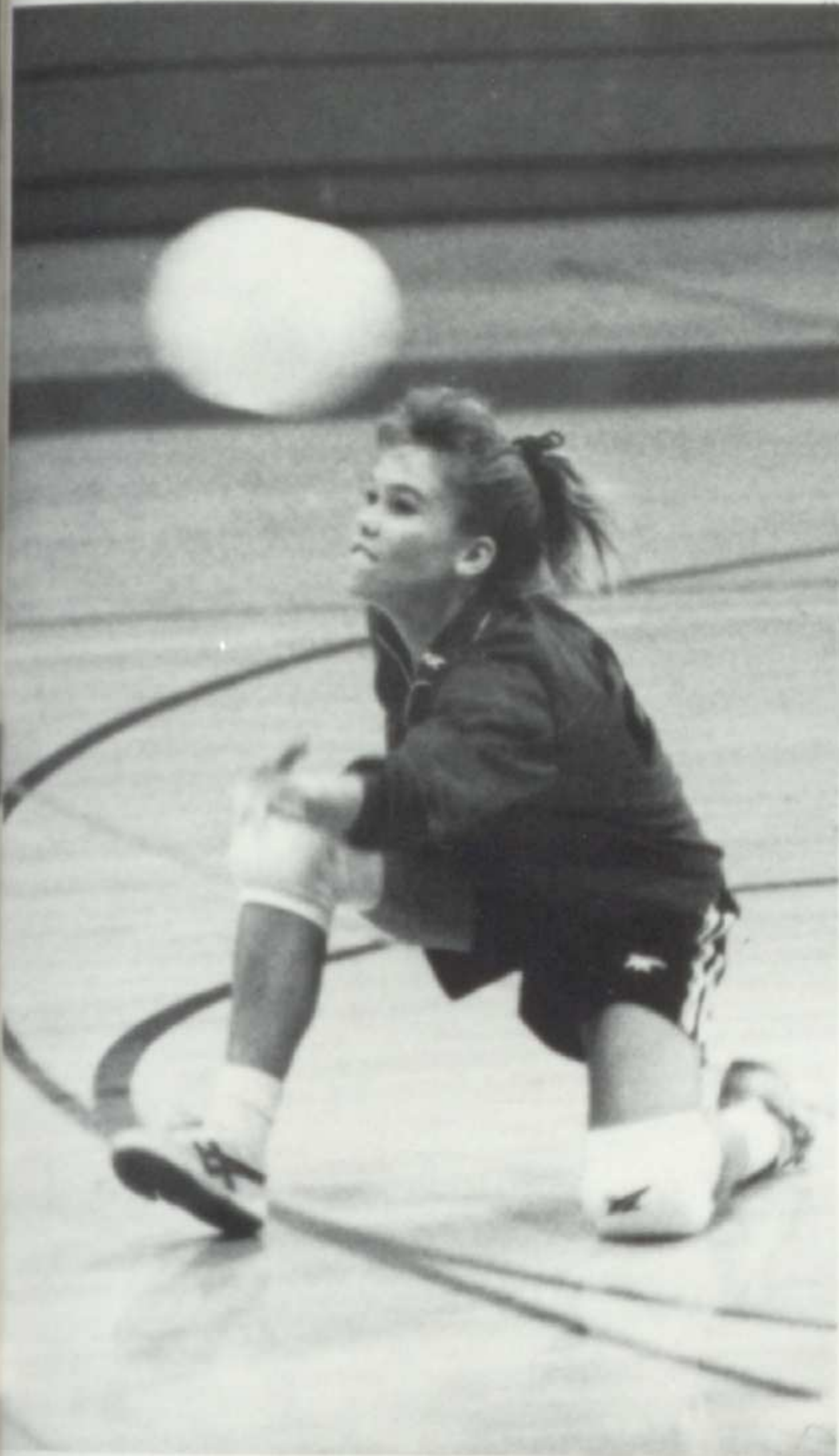
# Spikers turn record around

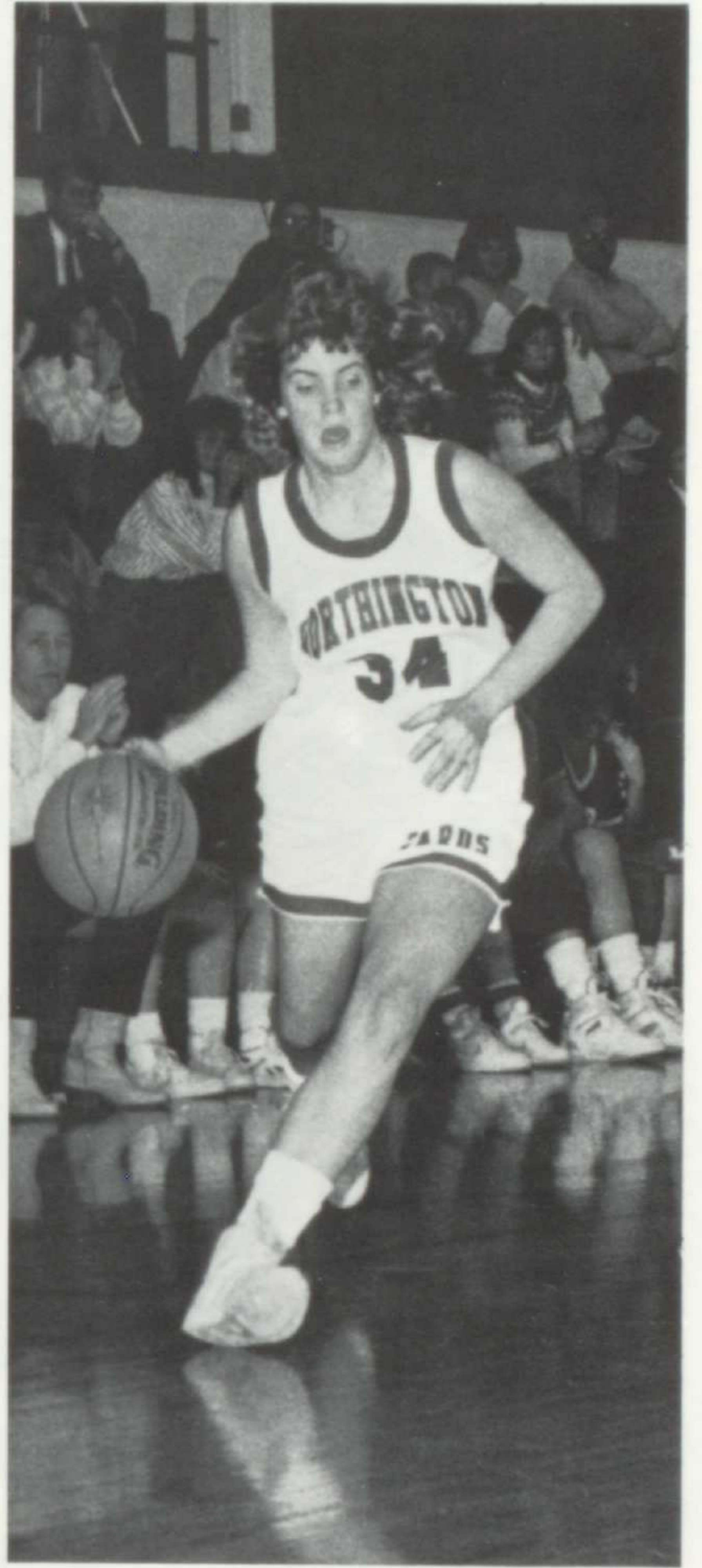
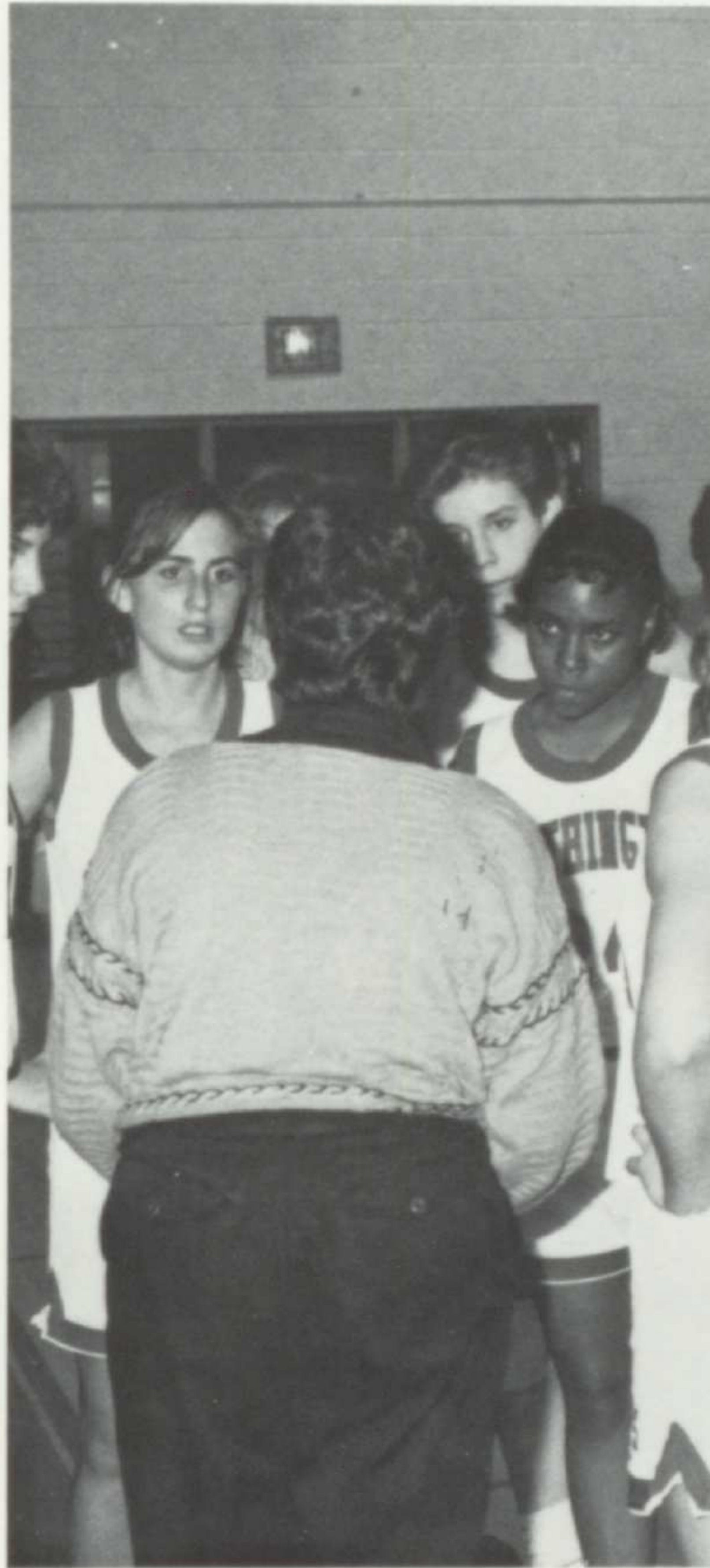
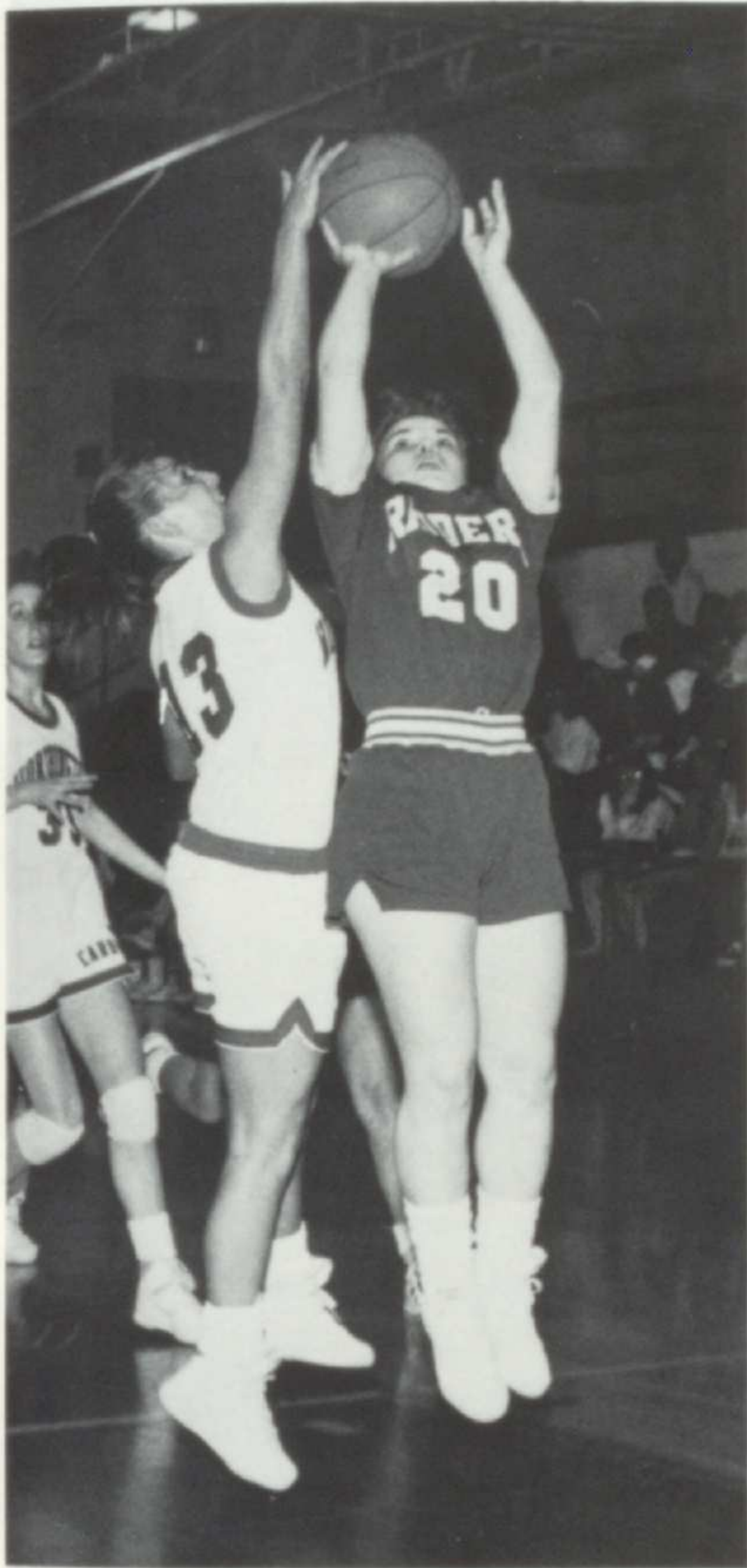
# Lady Cards have rebuilding season

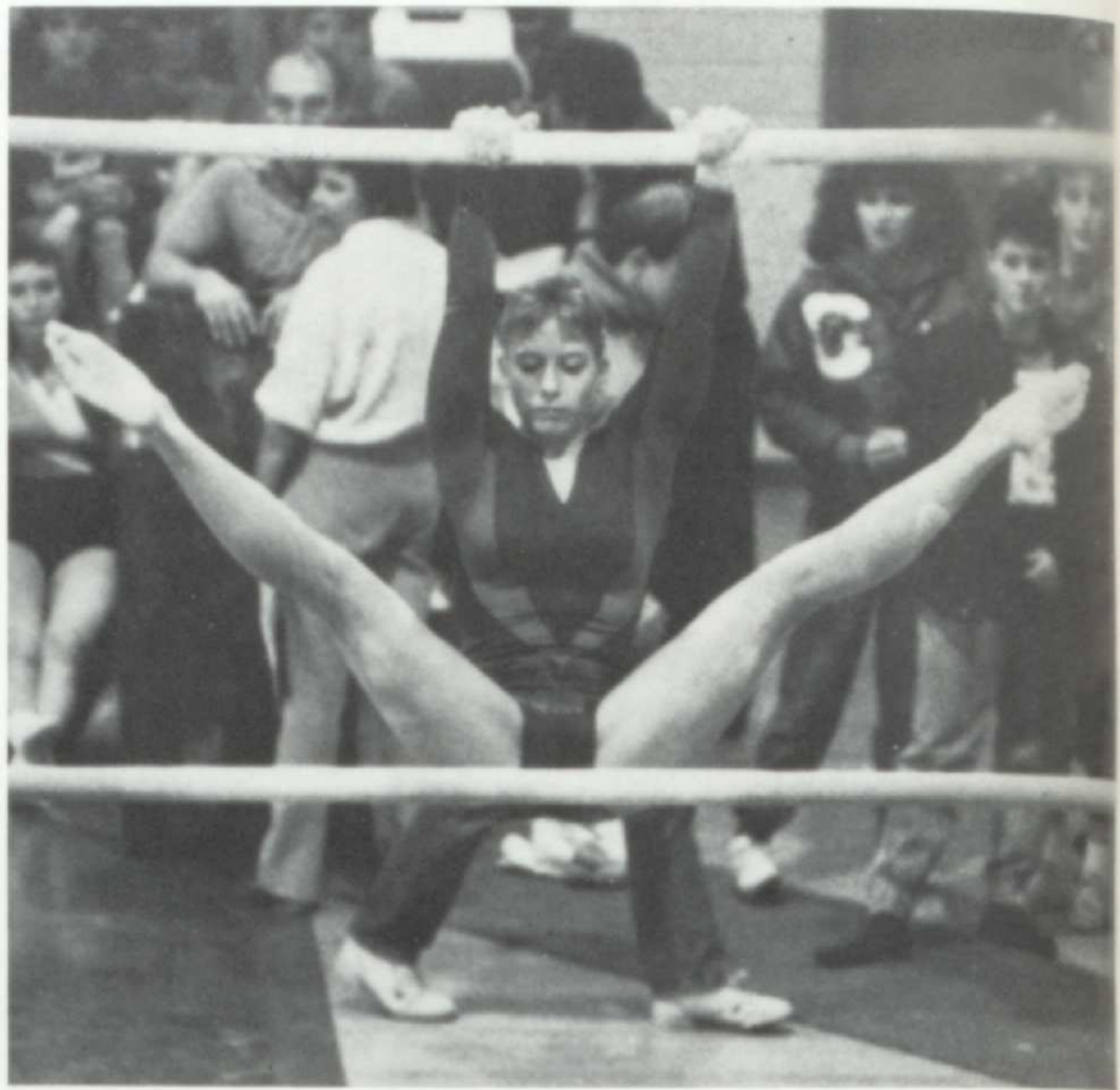

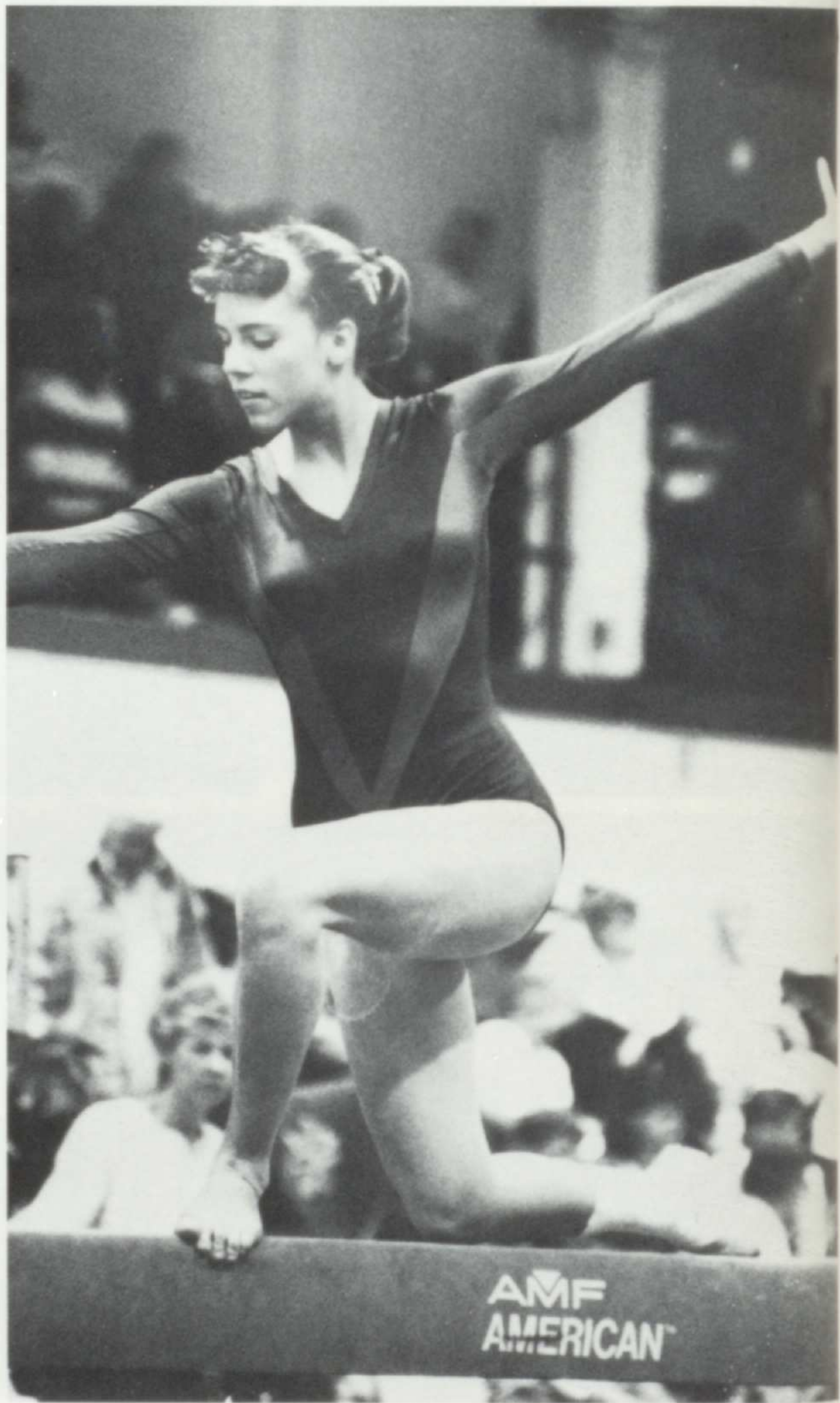

# Gymnasts capture fourth at State

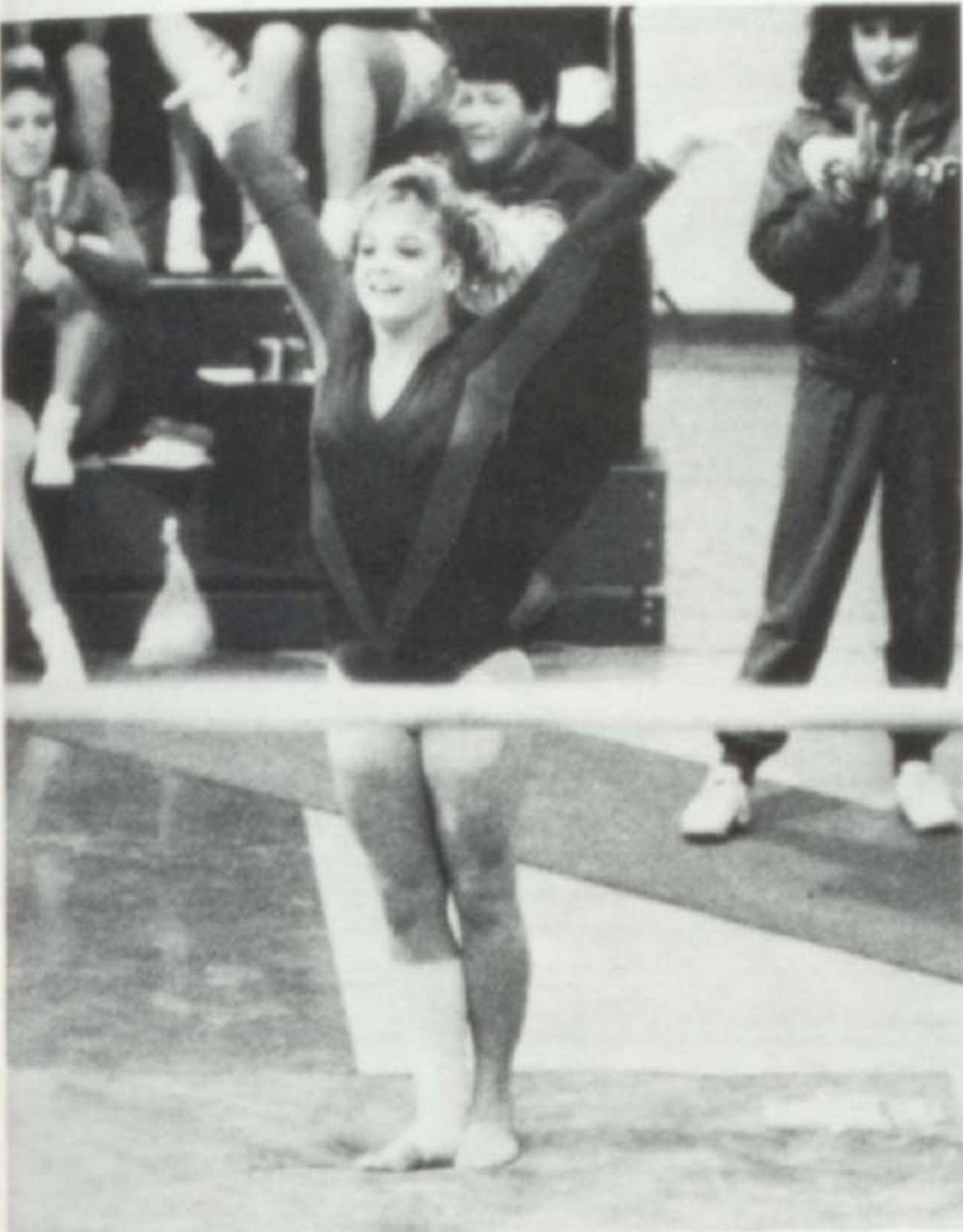

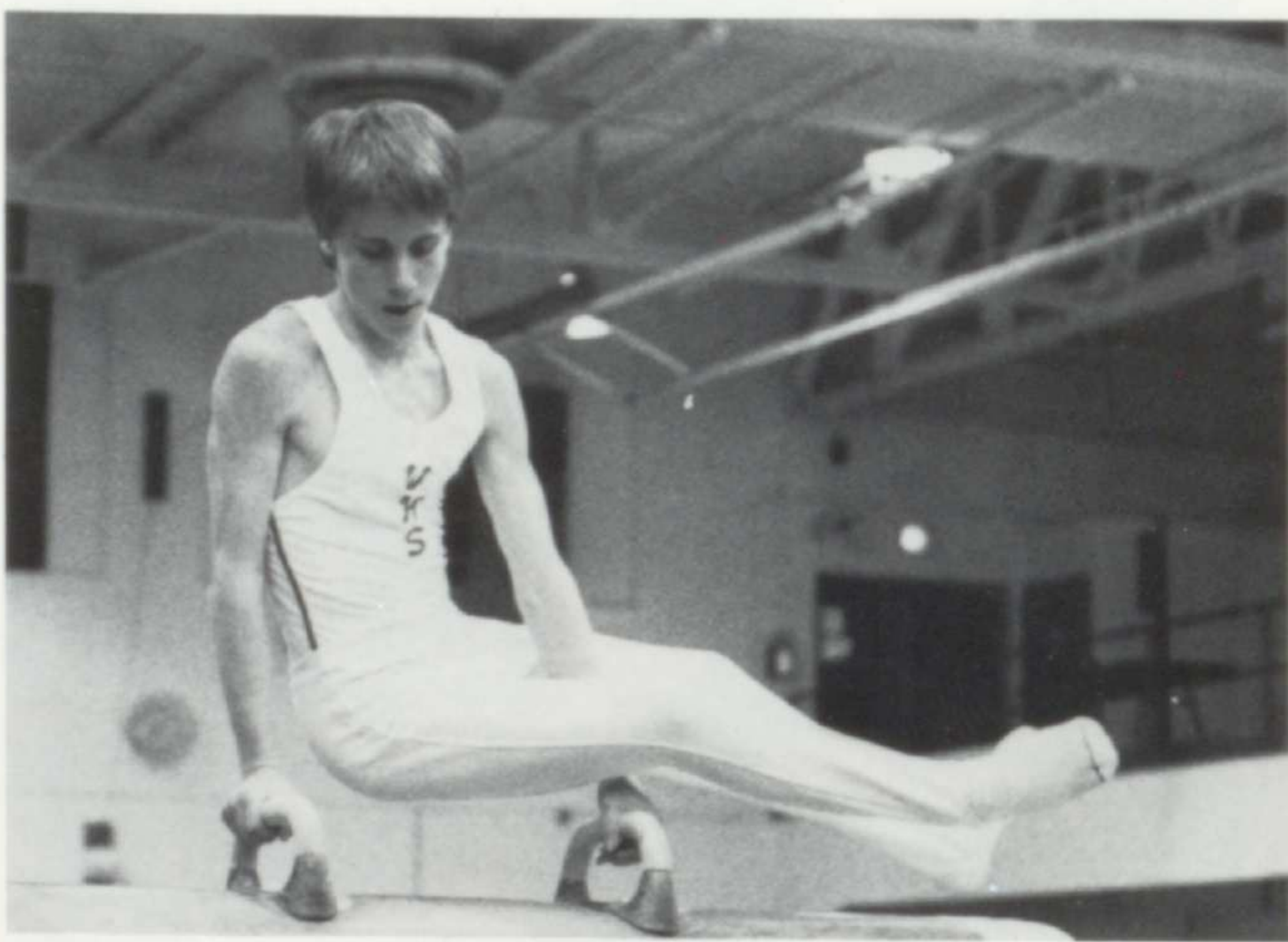
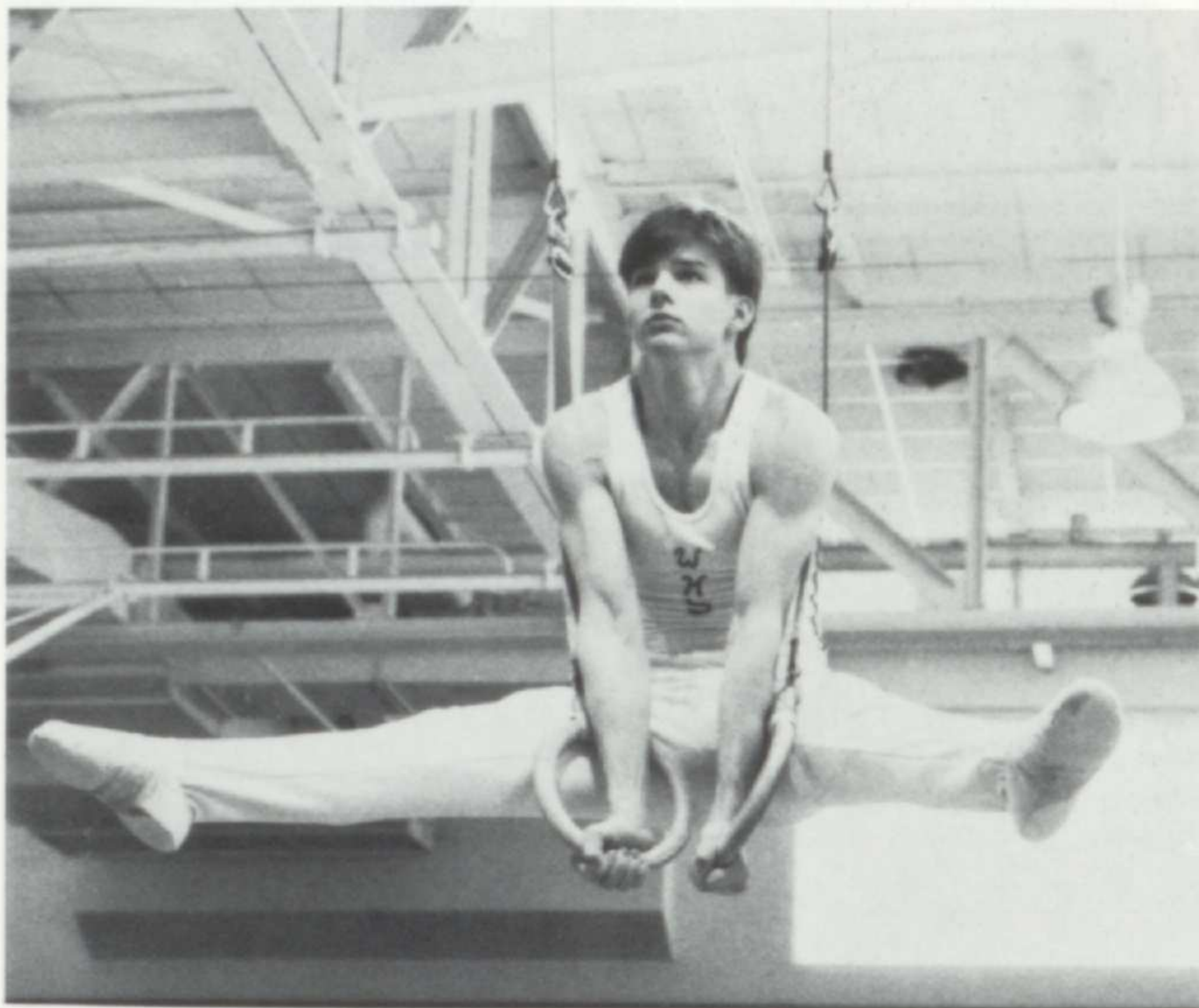
# Mens' gymnasts fifth at States

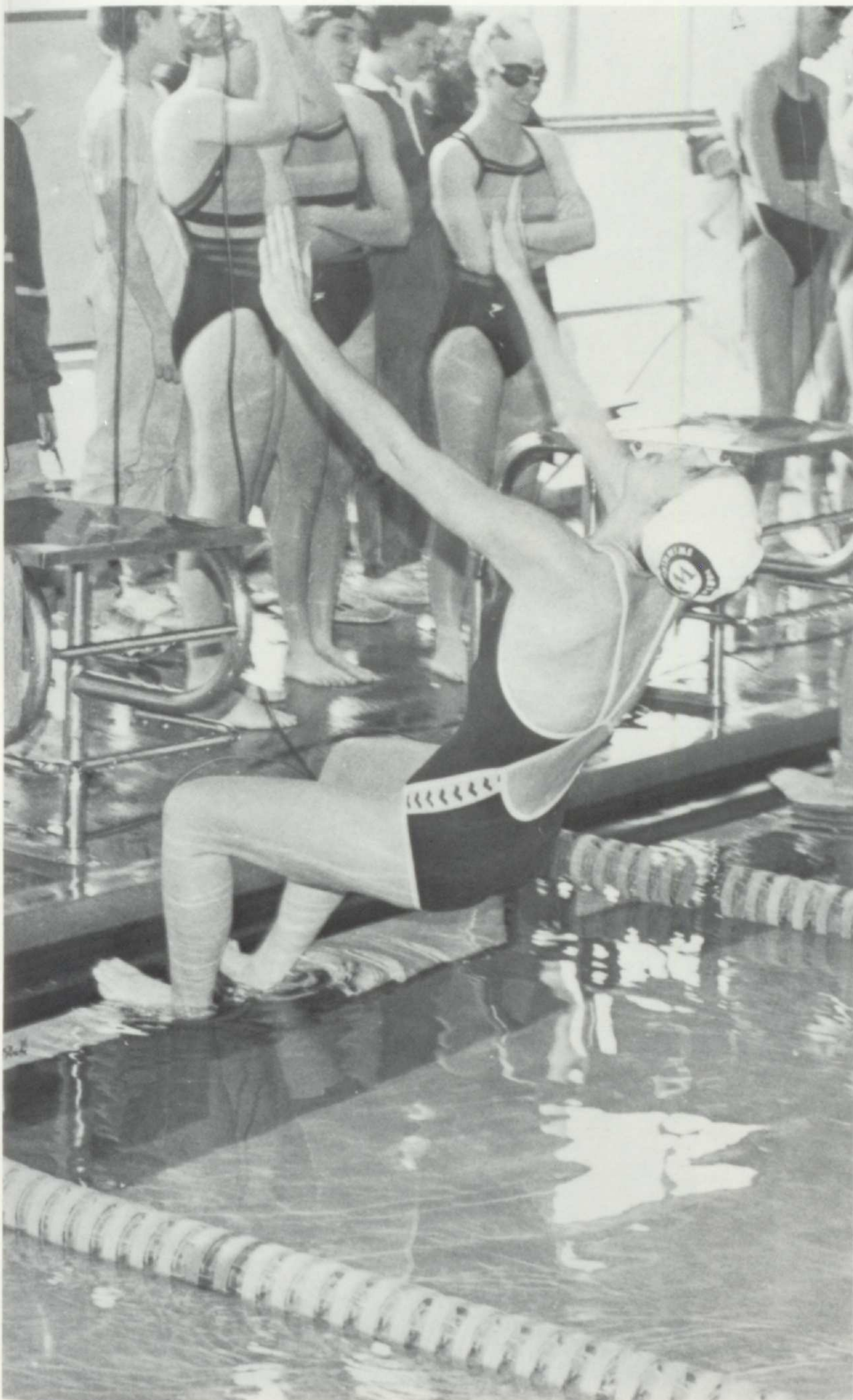
# Swimmer breaks record

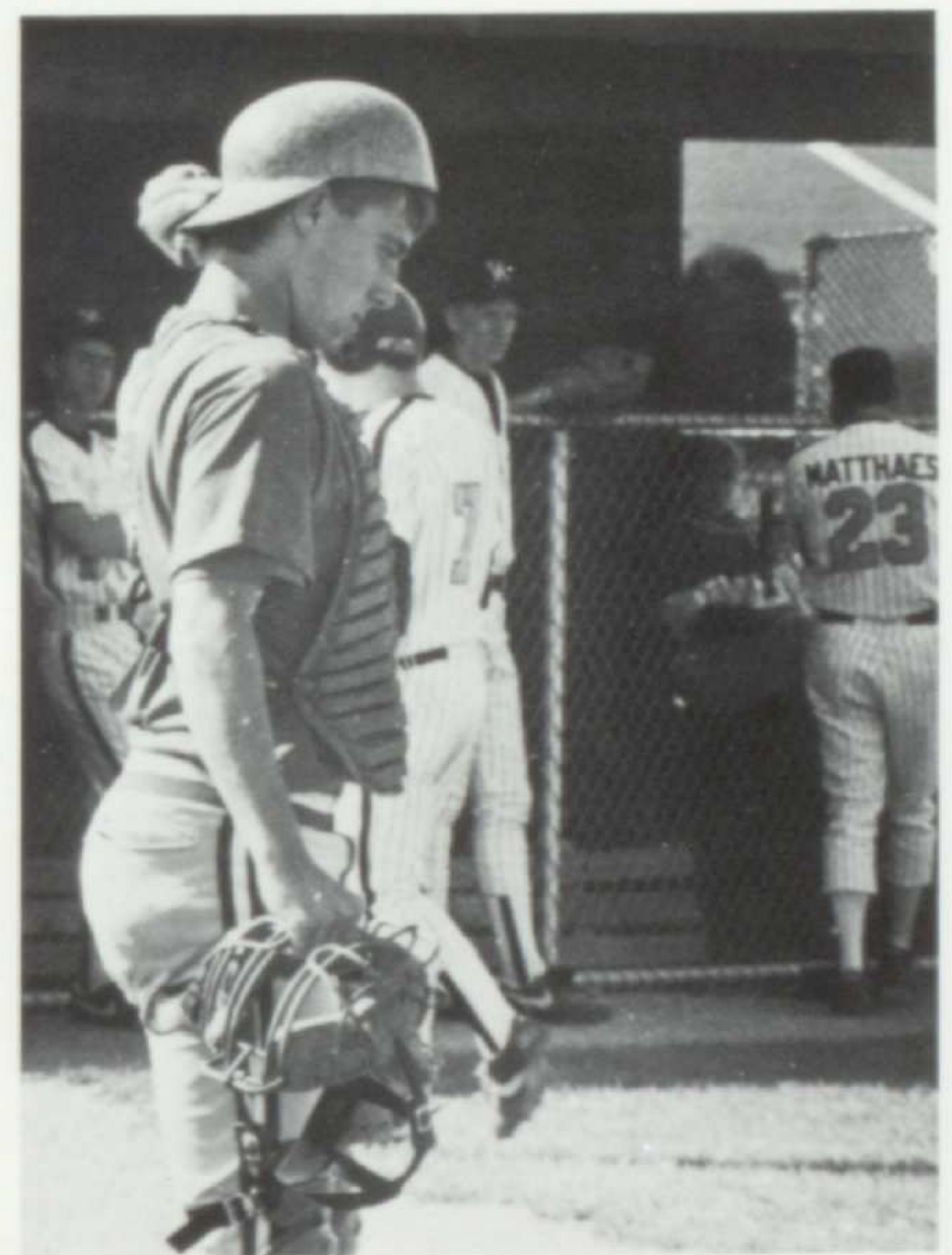

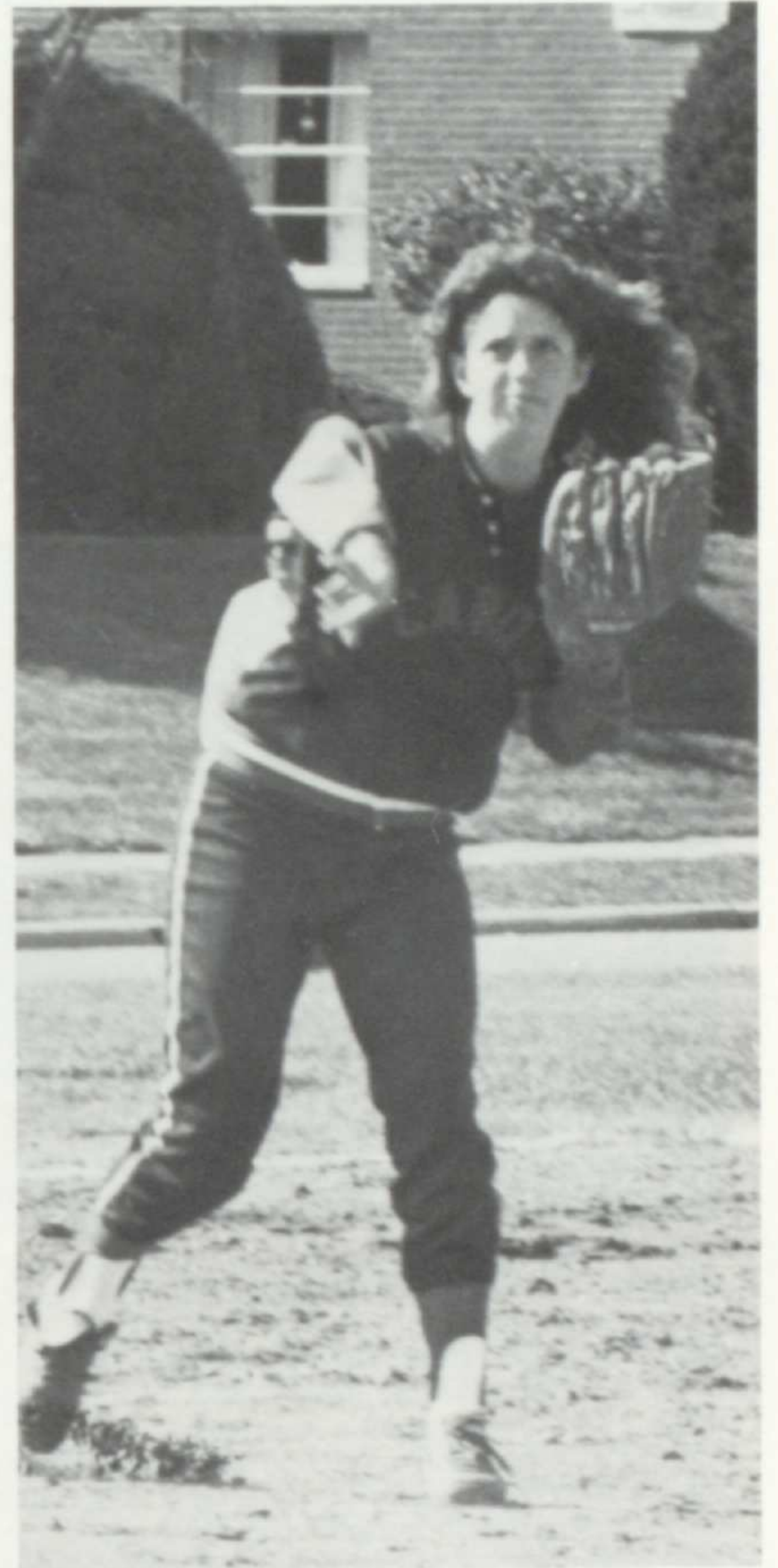

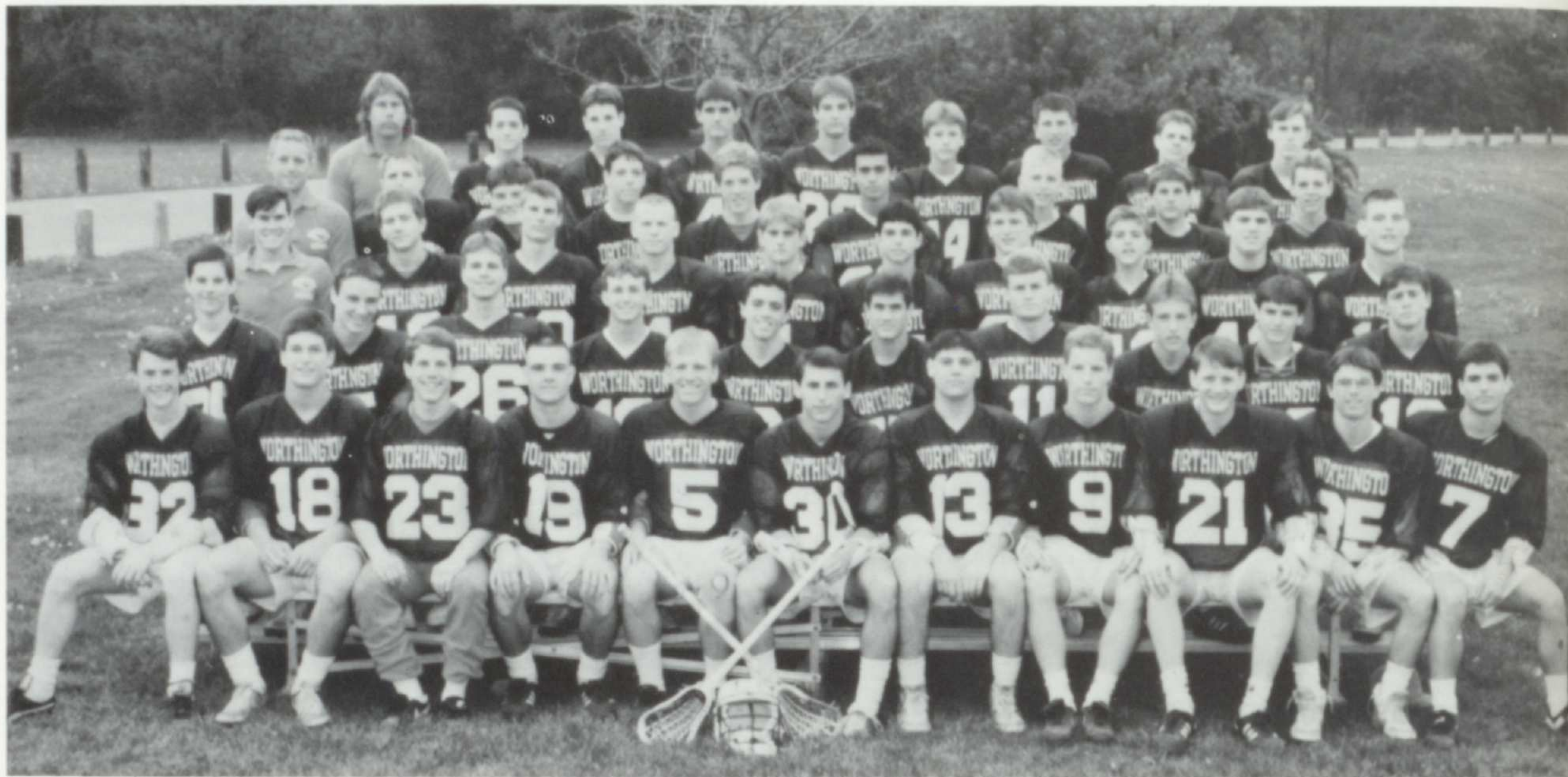
# The team had an 8-1 record

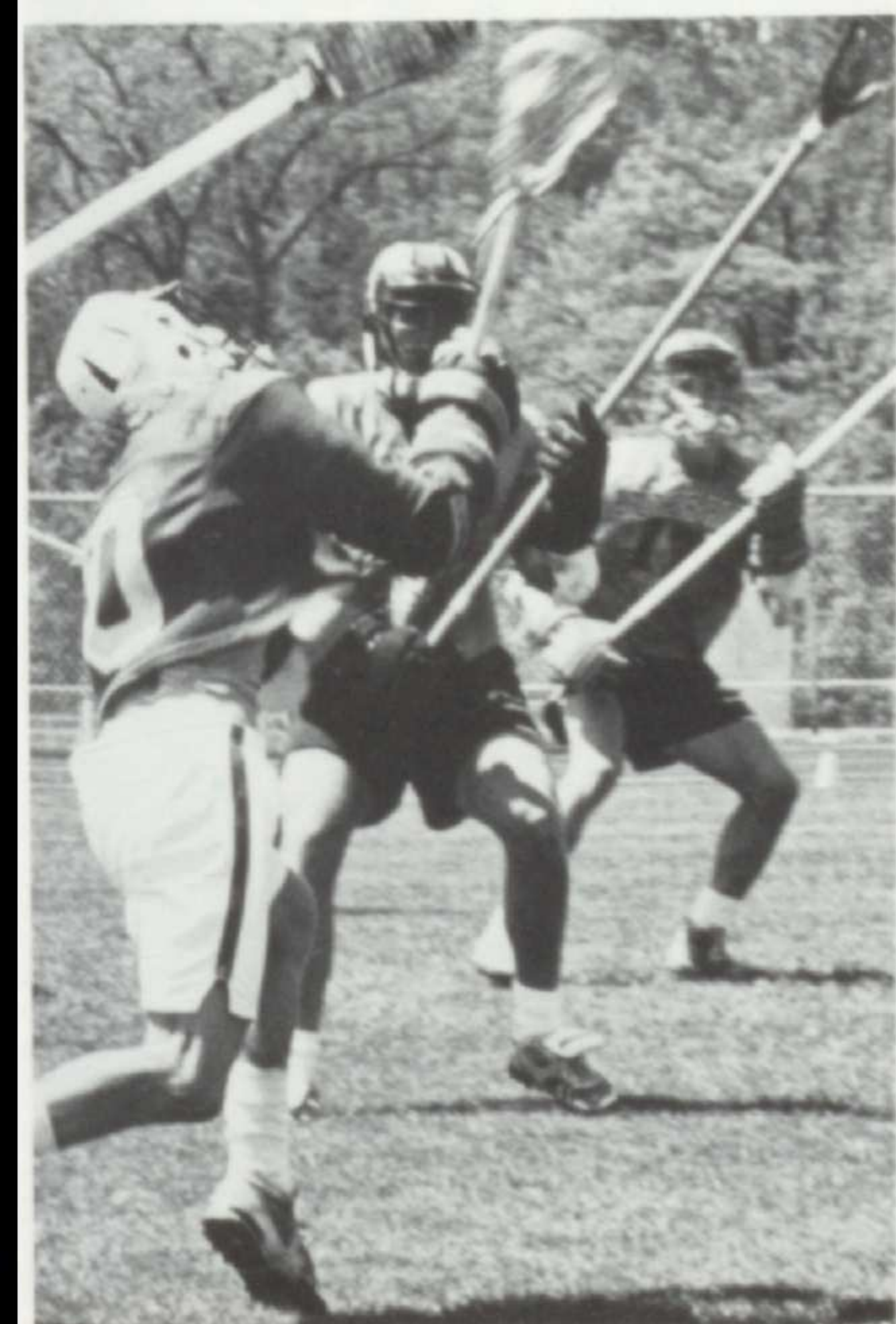

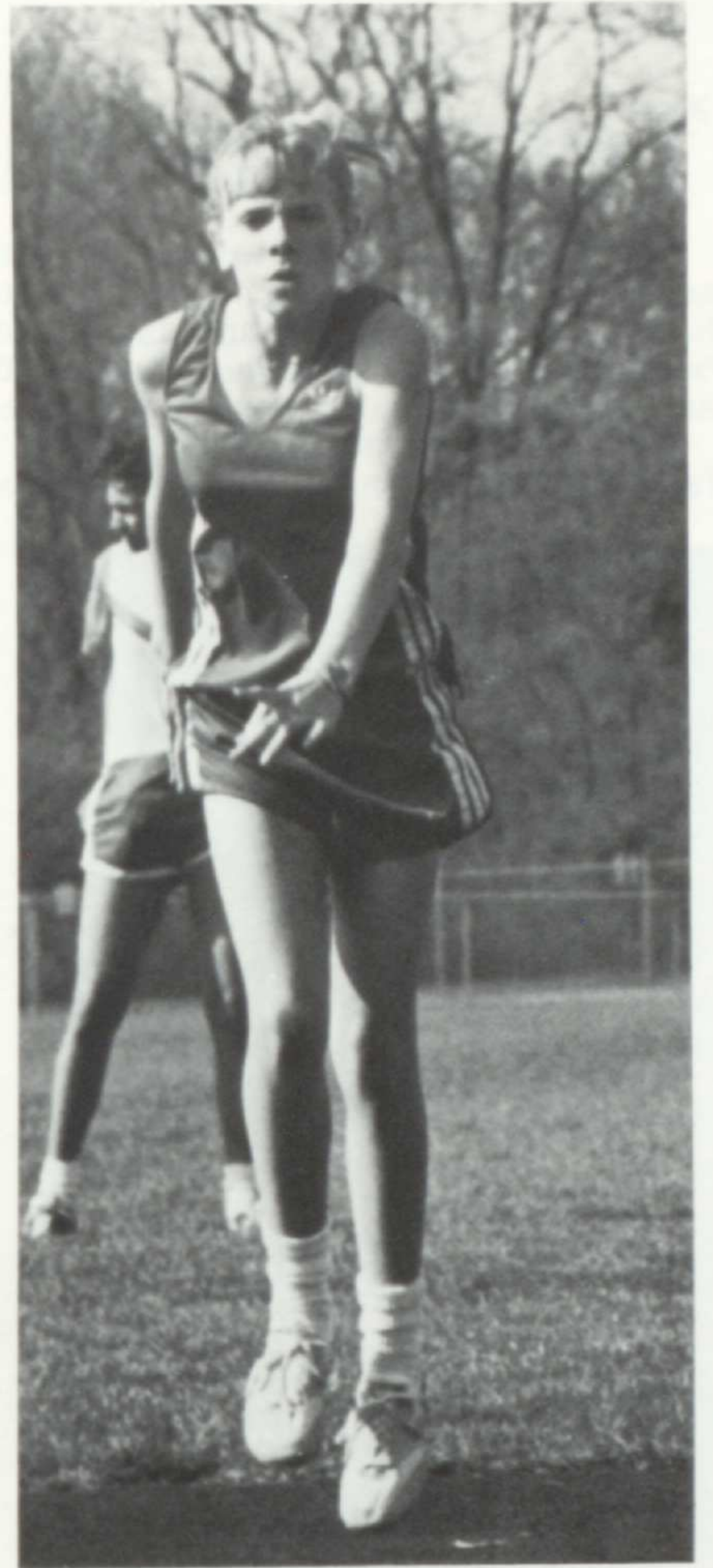

With new coach Mike Crowley, the team went 5-2 in the O.C.C., making

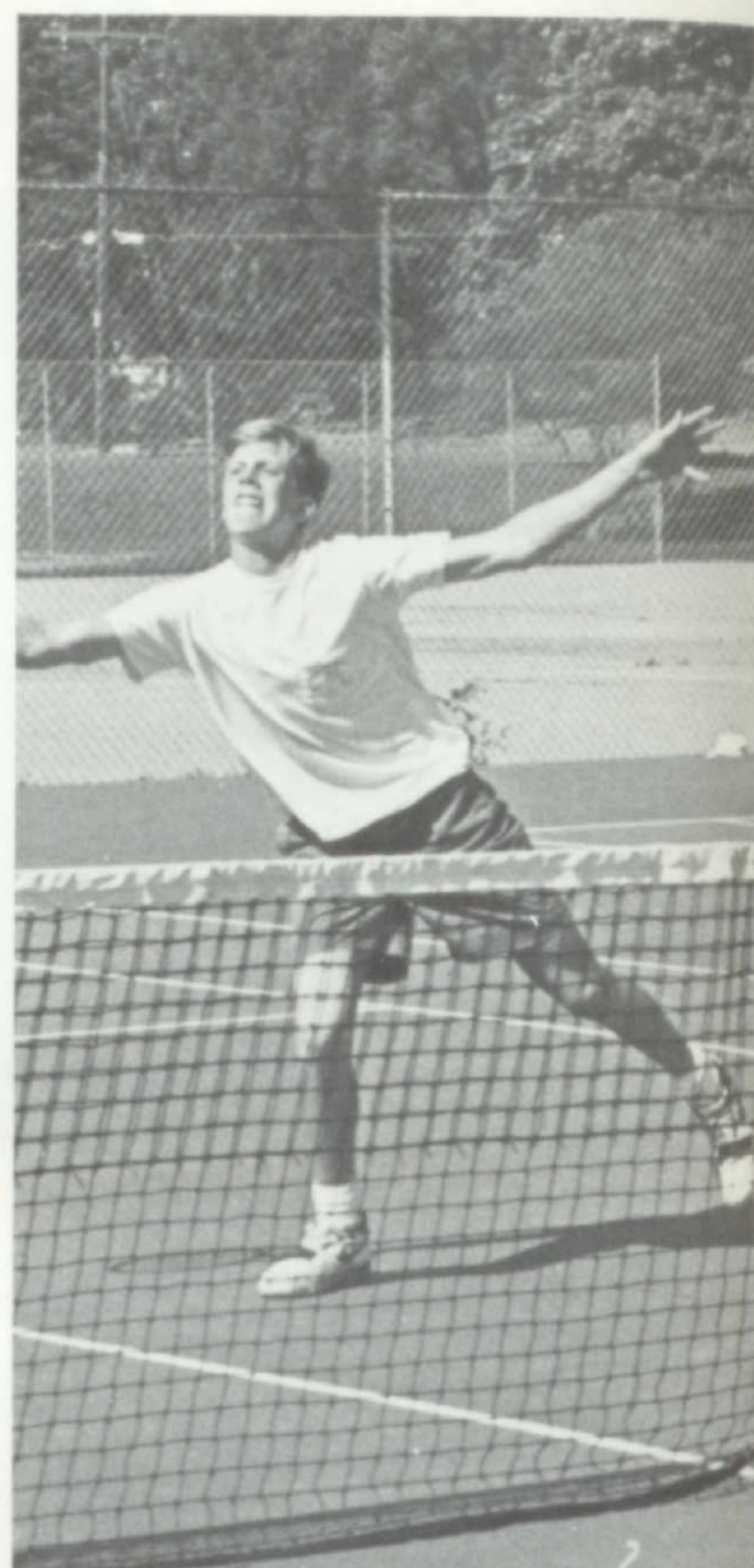
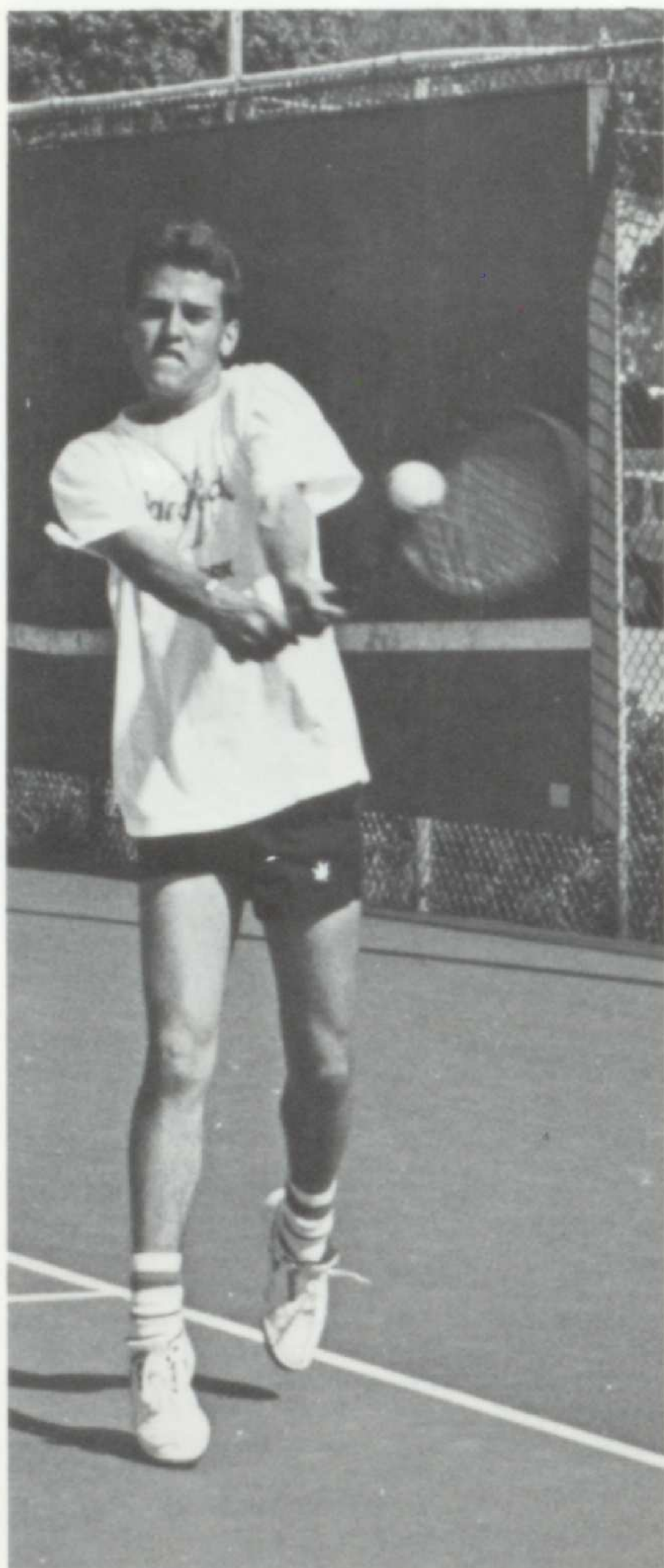
them third. They won their last match to Westerville South, four matches to one. Steve Schwane-kamp, Scott Bucher, and Pete Rodocker led the team.

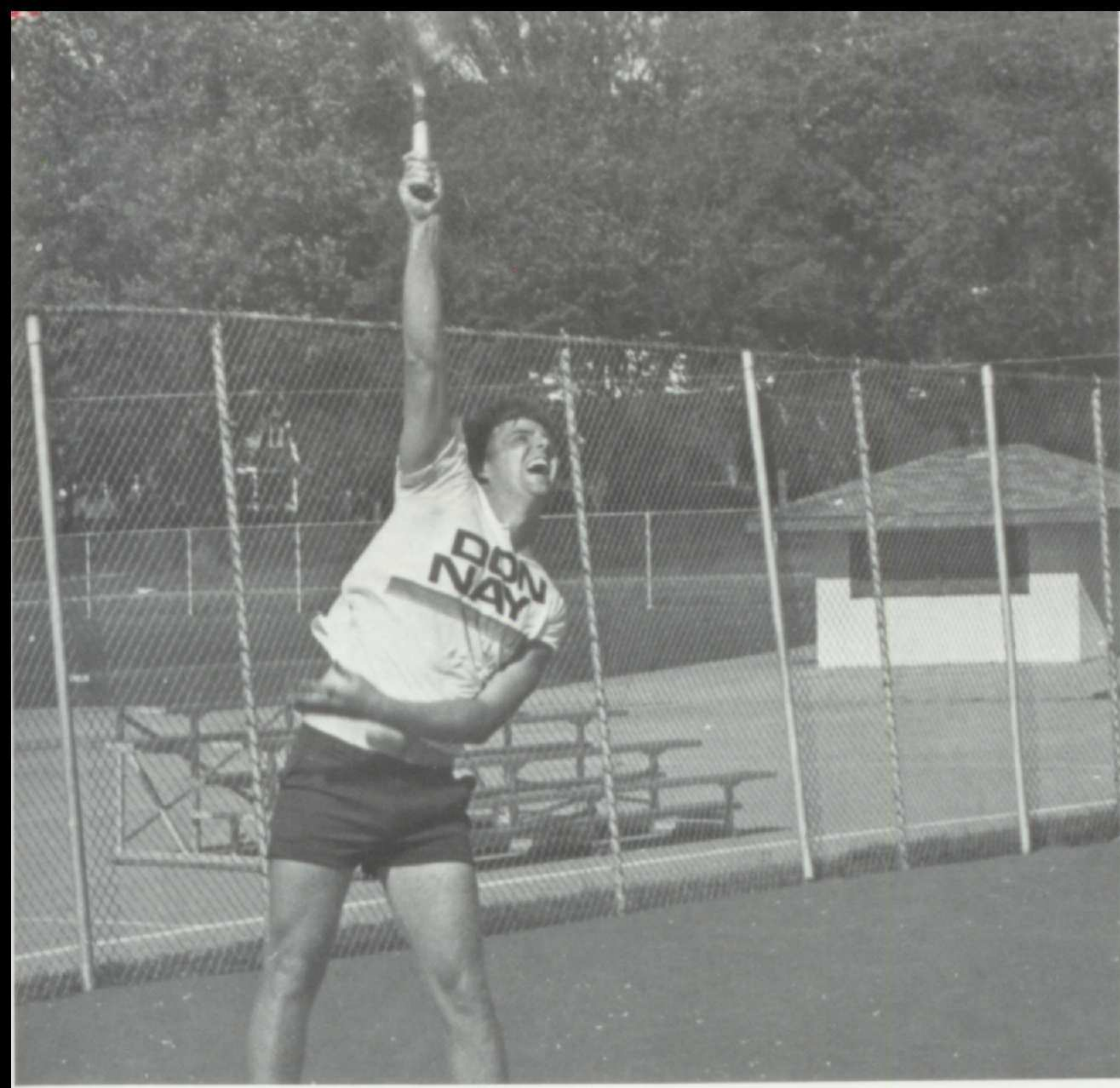

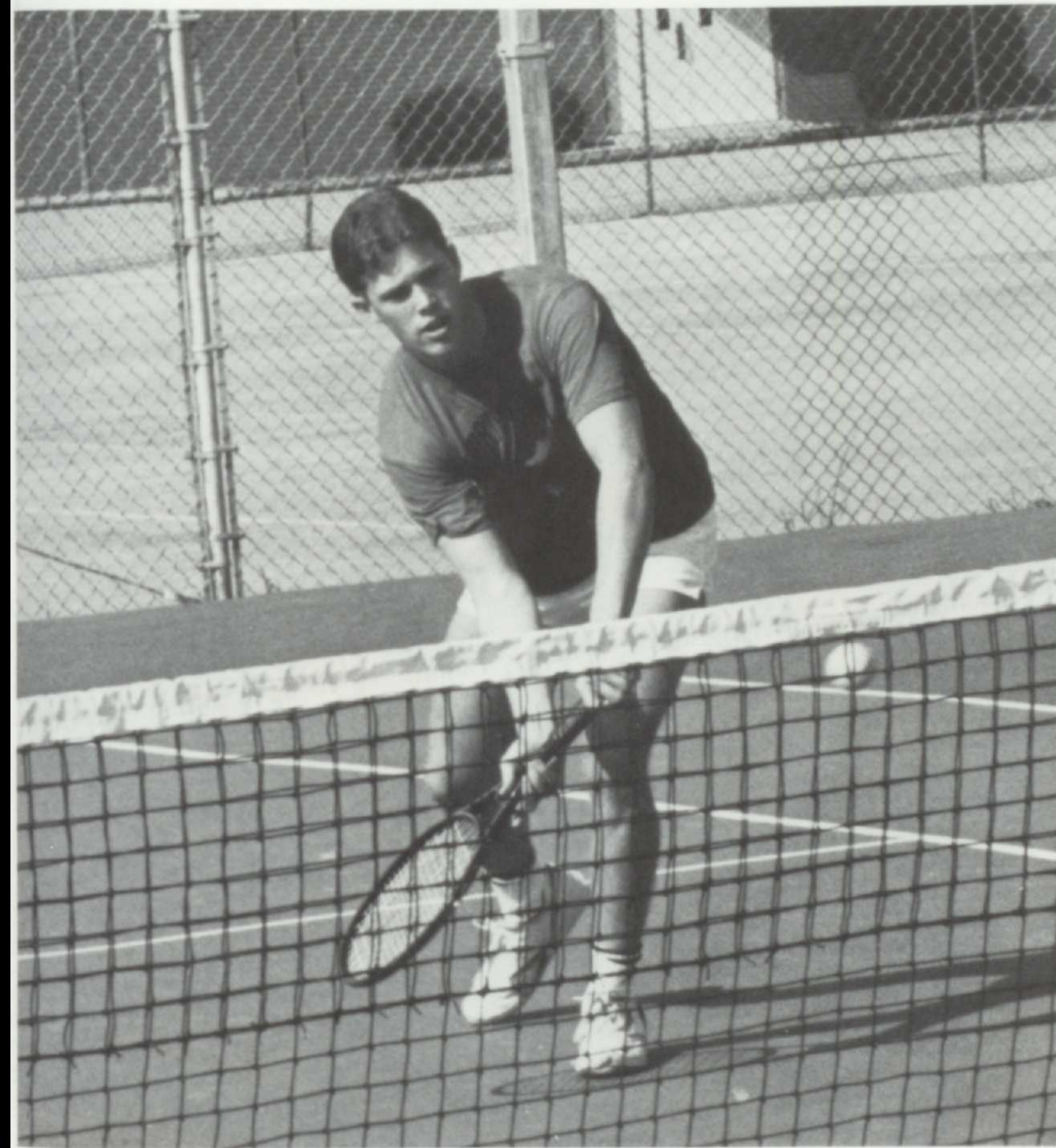

# Speaking in different tongues

"I like it here, that's for sure," says Helle Solberg, one of the six foreign exchange students at Worthington.

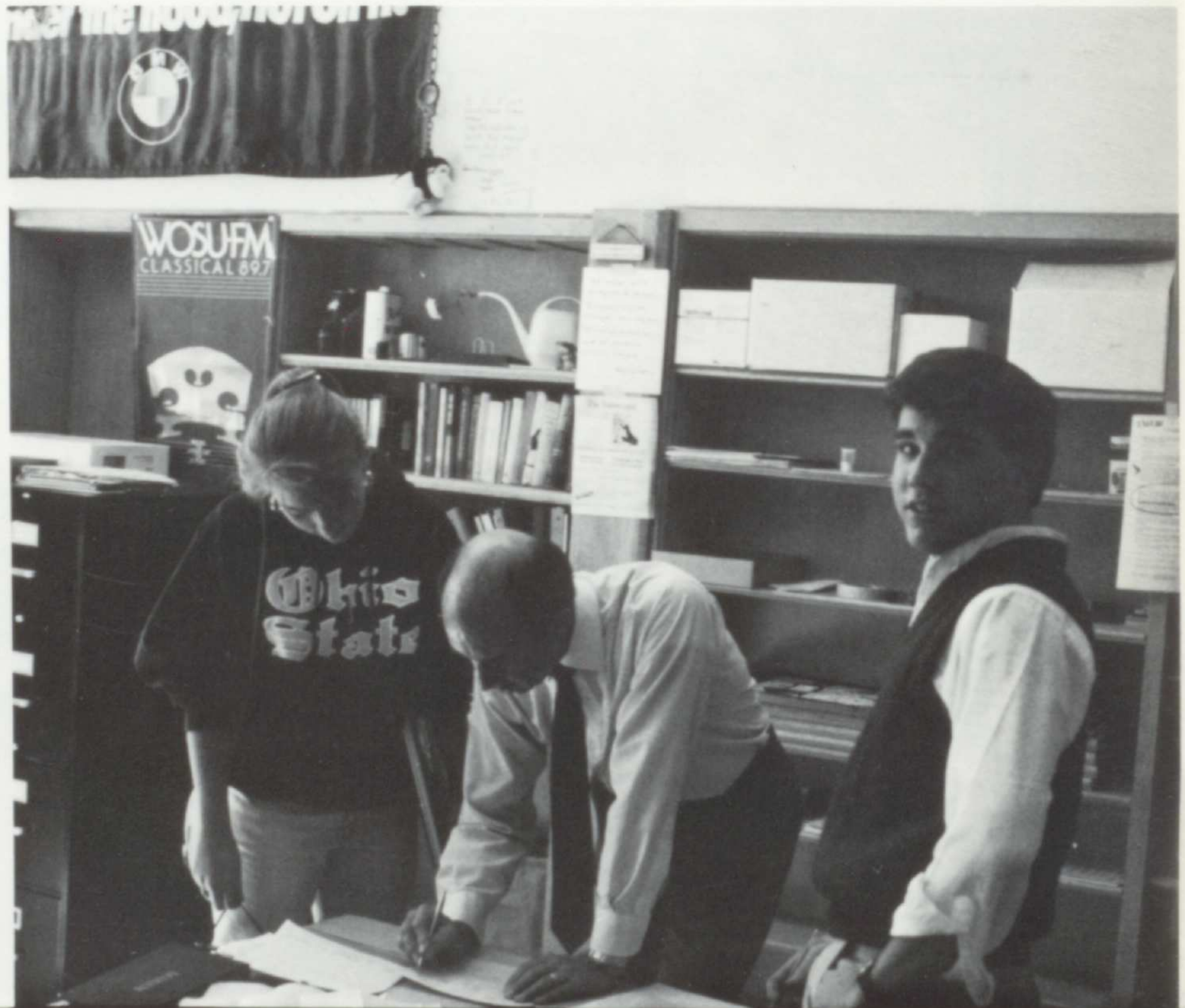

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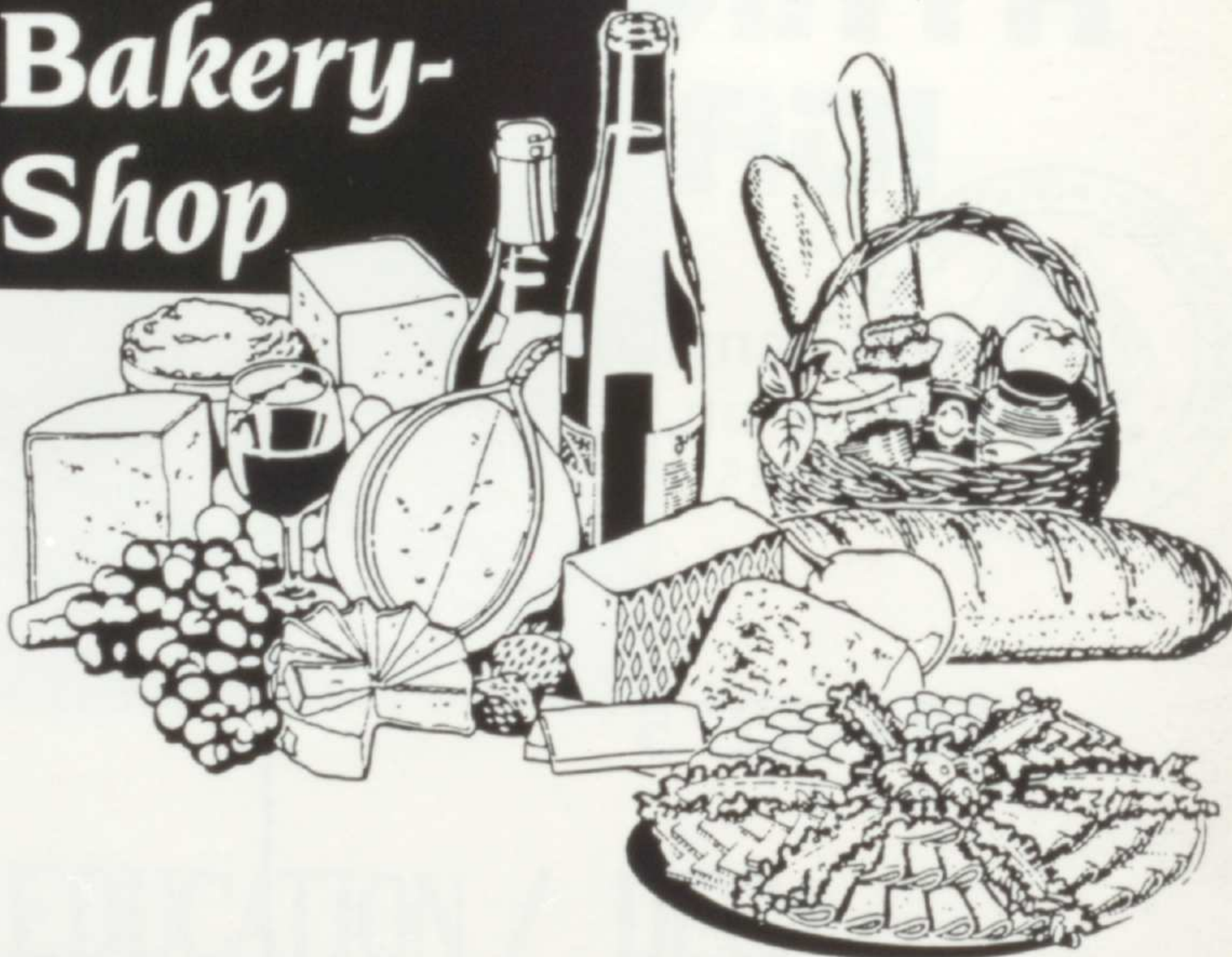

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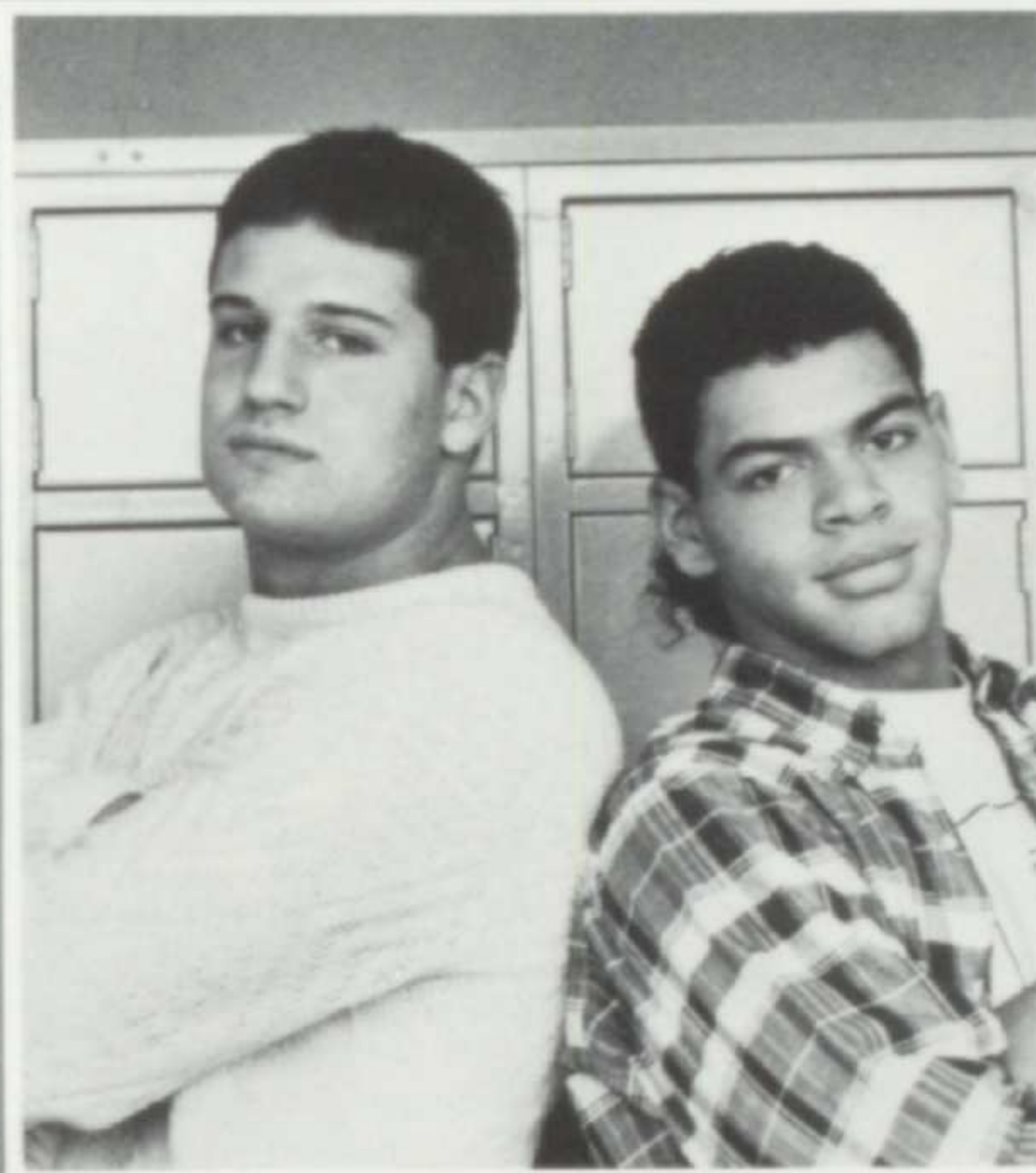

It is easy that Worthington is truly a shade above the rest. Students and staff continually go the extra mile and never settle for second best. Worthington graduates have gone on to do great things, and will continue to do so for years to come. Worthington's longtime tradition of excellence has never been compromised, and because of this graduates, students, and staff are held in high regard wherever they go. This is as should be, as they are "A Shade Above the Rest."

## Experienced teachers talk

Many Worthington High School teachers have been teaching since before you were born. Some were even teaching when your parents were in school. Twenty-two teachers and ten administrators have more than twenty years of experience under their belts. Mr. William Damsel has been teaching world history since 1957. He's been teaching at Worthington for the past ten years and has the most experience of all the classroom teachers here. Dr. Robert McCollins has been one of Worthington's most respected counselors since 1967 and has thirty-two years of experience in the educational field.

Mr. Damsel had a few things to say about academic changes over the past thirty-one years. He remarked that kids today are more knowledgeable in mathematics and the sciences. "But," he added, "students aren't doing quite as well with basic English and social studies skills. T.V. helps, but they are weak in geography of the world, the nation, and the state."

Dr. McCollins was less negative, stating that over time many opportunities have been created for students. "There is wider curriculum today. When I first started counseling, kids could only take the basics: English, math, sciences, several social studies courses."

Both Mr. Damsel and Mr. McCollins commented on the similarities between teenagers' attitudes and behavior today and those of the teenagers in the late '50's and early '60's. However, Mr. Damsel was explicit about his observations of a negative trend among students' attitudes: a general unappreciation of education and the placement of social life above academics.

Mr. McCollins took a different stand. "There is a fair measure of pressure on students to achieve, to compete."

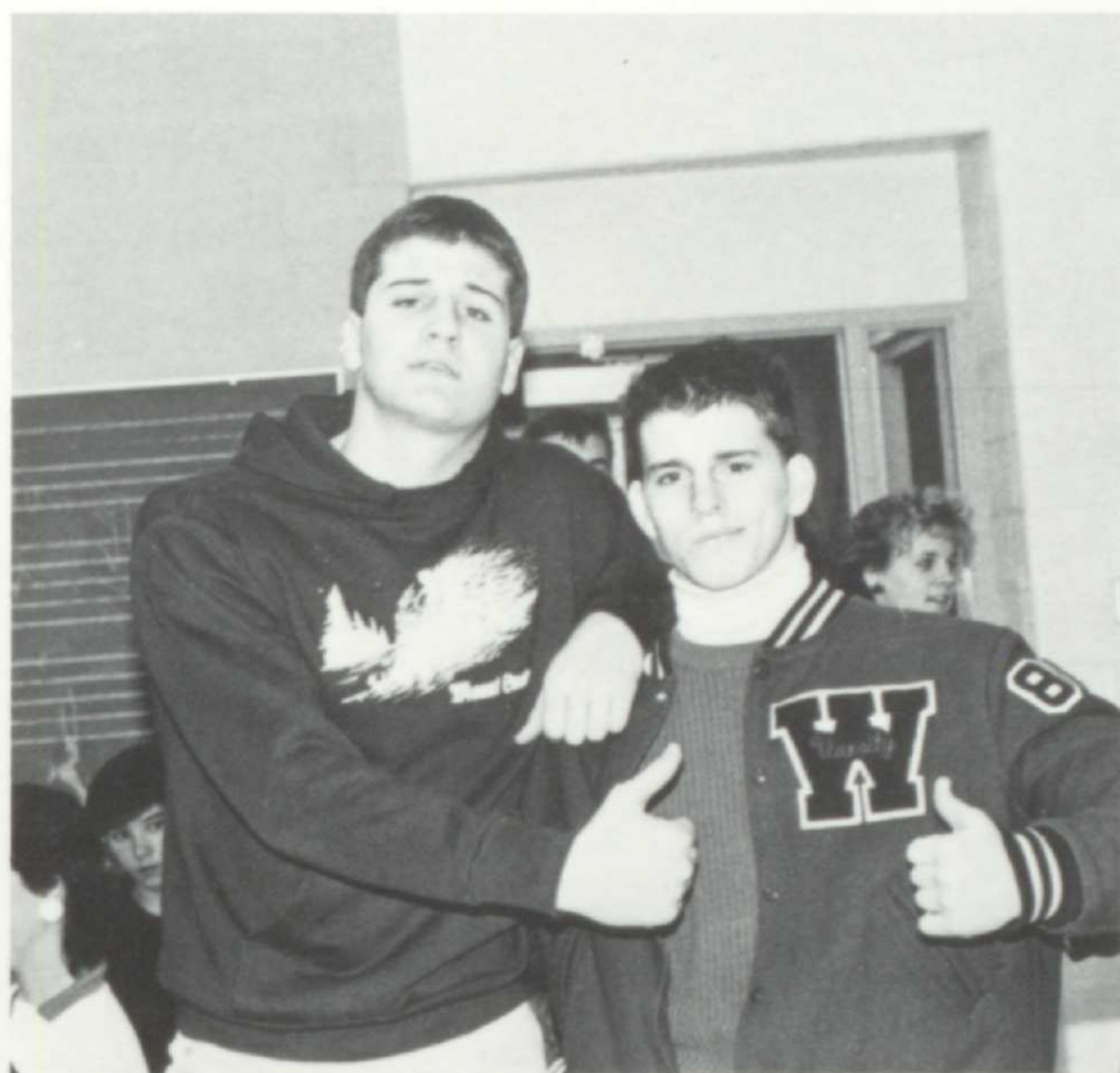

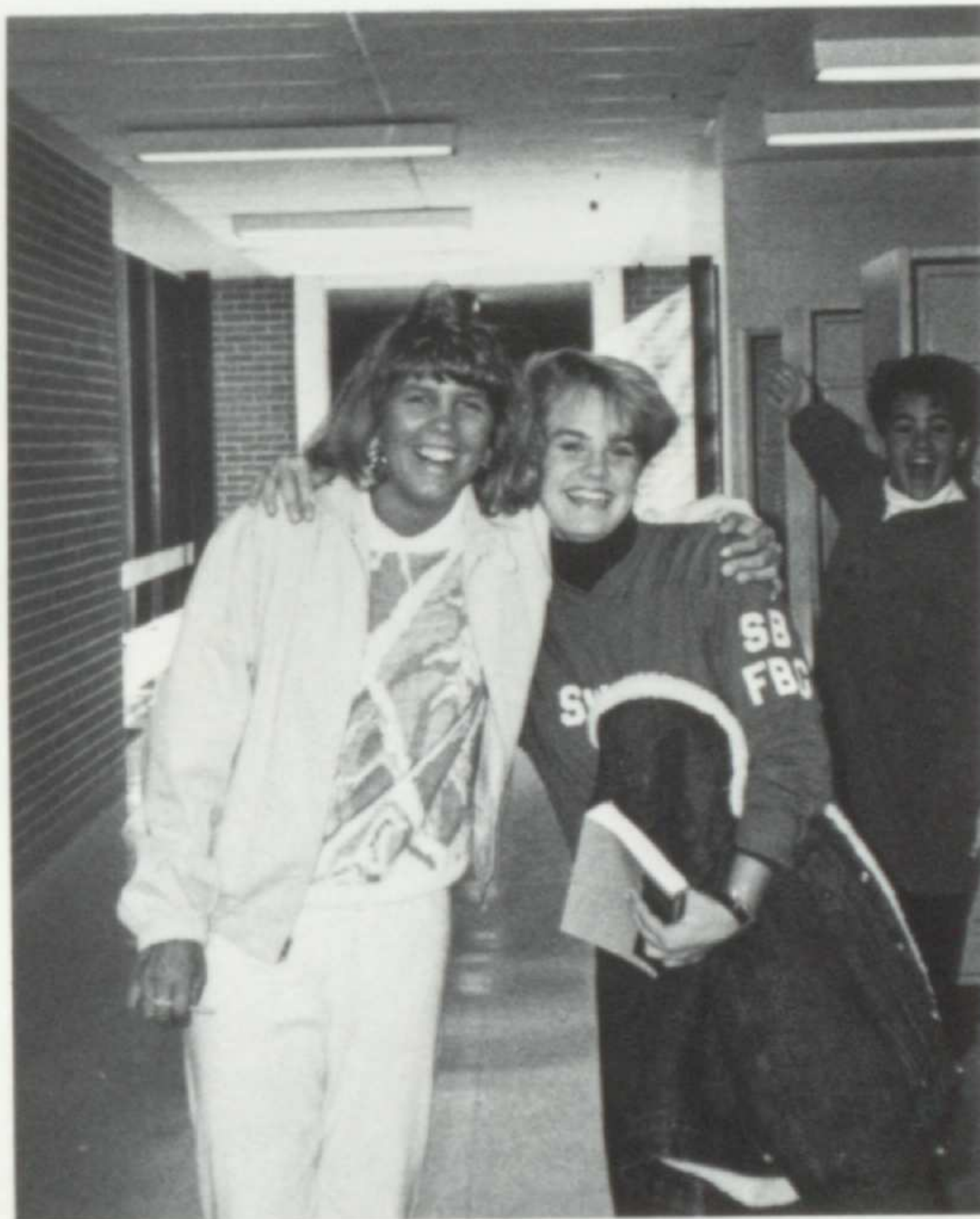
## Experienced teachers continued . . .

Dr. McCollins continues, "This produces a lot of stress. Successful Worthington parents often have high expectations of their children; the community pressure is there. That's good and bad. Students today are more goal-oriented. They are more realistic about their future, more directed."

Dr. McCollins stated that during the Vietnam era, there was a lot of unrest among the students. There were no riots as there were at Ohio State; however, there was a large anti-establishment, anti-authority attitude. He expressed relief that the students of 1988 are totally different --not better or worse, just different. "The 'Us versus Them' is all gone. They, the students of the 1980's, are well educated, positive, have good values . . . (and are) a good group."

When asked what their students think of them, both men were hesitant to answer, but replied honestly. Mr. Damsel chuckled and said, "I'm rather military. I hope they think that I am fair to them. I want to be able to say I treat them fairly." Dr. McCollins said that he's given a full range of impressions on students, depending on the amount of time he spends with them. He feels satisfied when he knows he's made a difference in someone's life. It is hard for a counselor to remember individual students for thirty-some years, but some students will remember an individual counselor all their lives, and often have a counselor to thank for their successes.

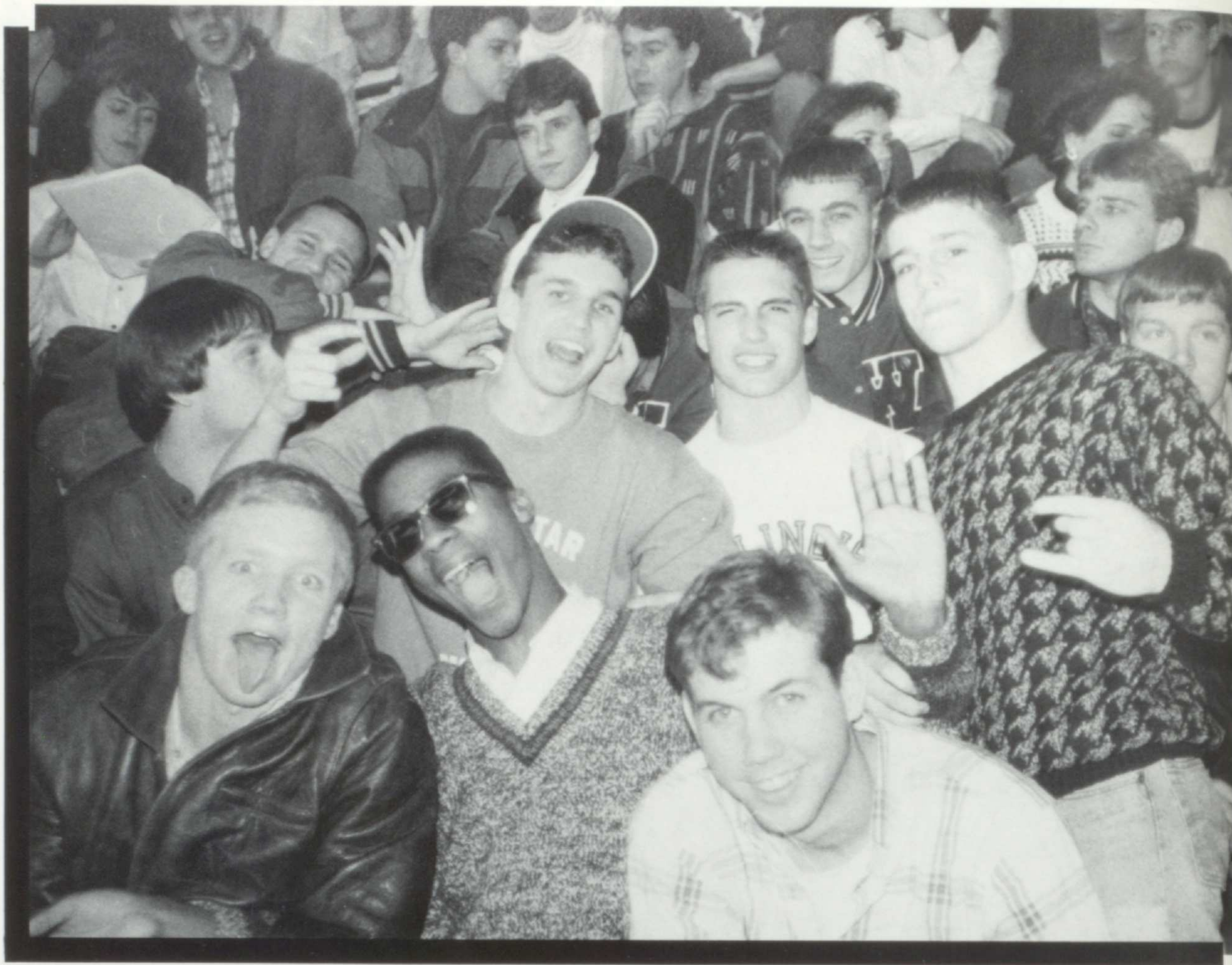

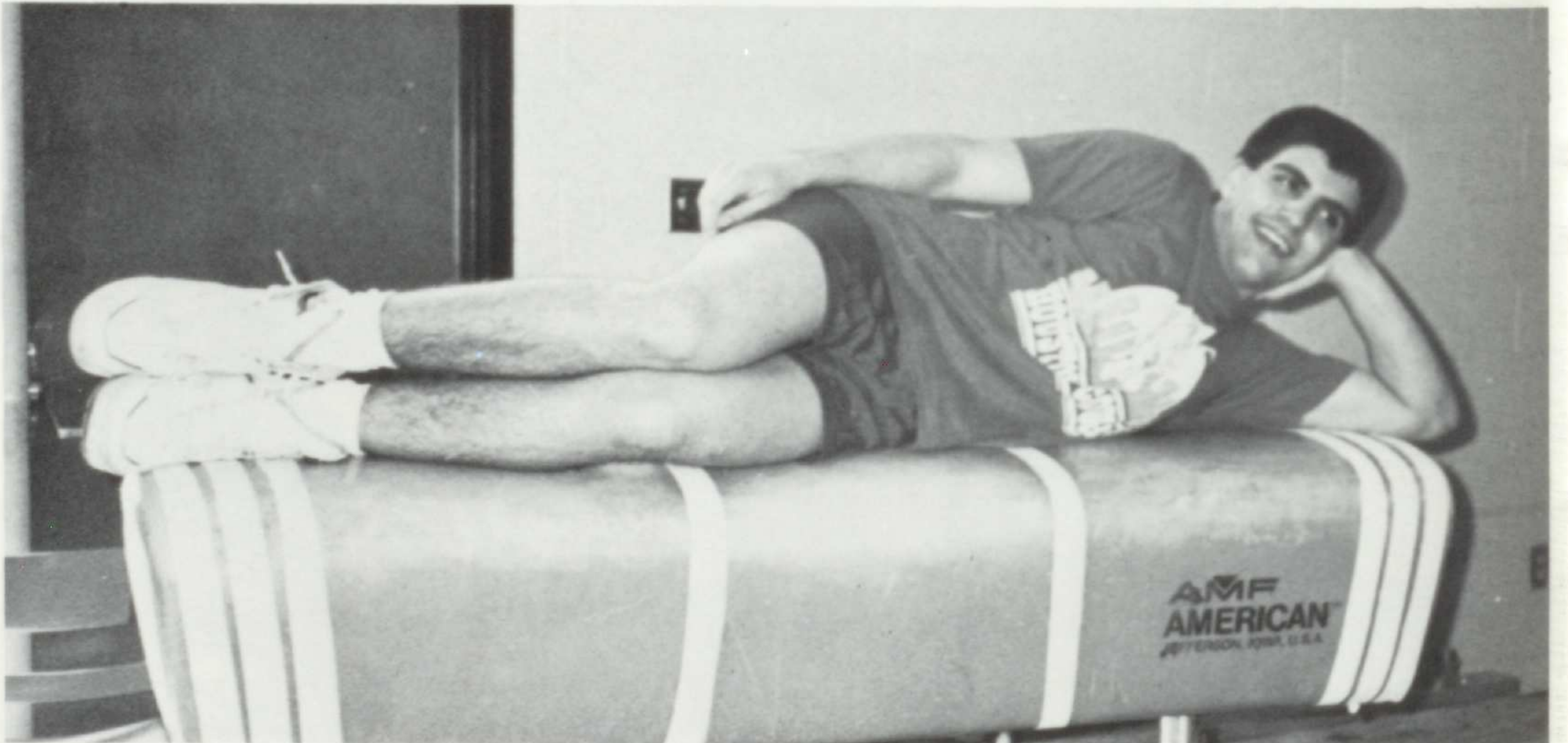
The general consensus, however, is that brothers and sisters are nice to have around. As Neil Diamond sings, "He ain't heavy, he's my brother."



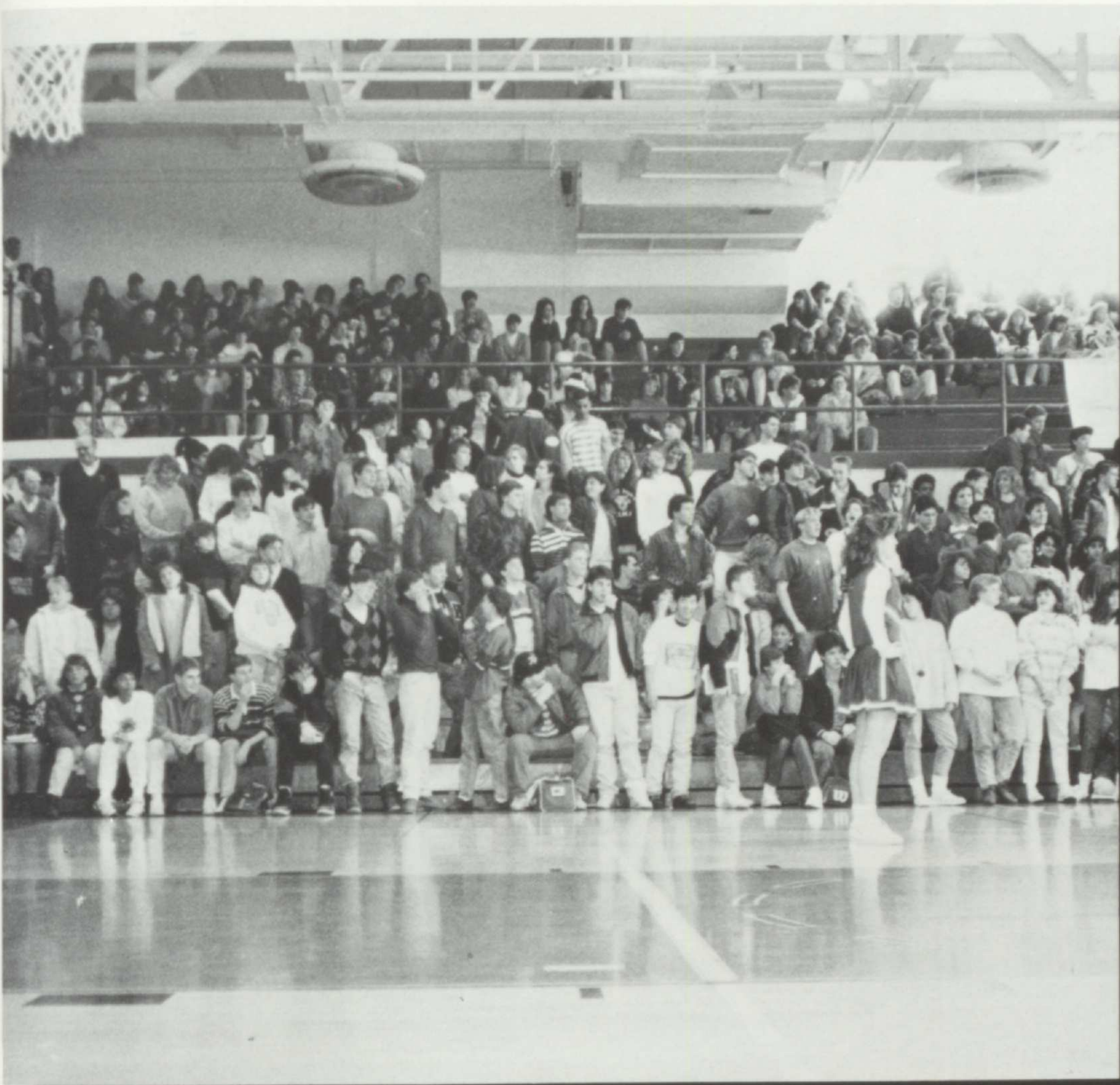
